### Six Killed as Water Tank Collapses at Nagpur Factory



Nagpur (TSIT) Six persons died after a water tank collapsed at an industrial unit on the outskirts of Nagpur city on Friday, a police official said. The incident occurred around 9.30 am at Avaada Electro Private Limited, a solar panel manufacturing factory located in MIDC Butibori area, the official said. While three persons had died at the time of the incident after getting trapped under the debris, three others who were rushed to hospital have also succumbed to injuries, he informed.

Earlier on October 6, the ED had attached assets amounting to Rs 11.14 crore of cricketers Shikhar Dhawan and Suresh Raina. ### Manipur security forces recover 16 abandoned IEDs in Churachandpur

Manipur: Security forces in Manipur on Thursday recovered 16 abandoned improvised explosive devices (IEDs) at Lungdeiphai Leinom village junction in the Kangvai area of Churachandpur district, officials confirmed on Friday. The explosives were neutralised by a bomb disposal squad. Officials said the recovery took place during a search operation in and around the village junction. The incident follows a suspected armed attack by a Kuki group two days earlier, which involved indiscriminate firing and bombings in Torbung Sabal Mamang Leikai in neighbouring Bishnupur district.

# 41 CPI (Maoist) Cadres Surrender in Telangana

## The Cadres handed over 24 firearms

HYDERABAD ■ (TSIT): In a major setback to the banned CPI (Maoist) organisation, forty-one underground Maoist cadres, including six senior leaders of Company Platoon Committee Member / Divisional Committee Member (CyPCM/DVCM) rank, surrendered before the Telangana Police on Friday in the presence of the Director General of Police (DGP), Telangana. During the surrender, the cadres handed over 24 firearms comprising one INSAS Light Machine Gun (LMG), three AK-47 rifles, five SLR rifles, seven INSAS rifles, one BGL gun, four .303 rifles, one single-shot rifle and two air guns, along with 733 live rounds of ammunition and eight BGL shells. Police officials stated that the surrender of such a large cache of arms has significantly weakened the operational and combat capability of the CPI (Maoist) in the region.



The surrendered cadres belonged to key formations of the CPI (Maoist), including the PLGA Battalion, Komaram Bheem Asifabad-Mancherla Divisional Committee, 2nd Central Regional Command Company, Cherla-Shabari Area Committee, Platoon-33 of the South Sub Zonal Bureau, South Bastar and Darbha Divisional Committees, and the Gangaloor Area Committee of West Bastar DVC. Many of them had remained underground for periods ranging from seven to

twenty-four years. The cadres stated that they were influenced by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's appeal on October 21, 2025, urging Maoists to abandon violence and rejoin the mainstream. Continuous pressure from security forces, shrinking support networks, harsh living conditions, declining health, prolonged separation from families, ideological disillusionment and internal leadership disputes were cited as reasons for surrender. Under the Telangana Government's Surrender and Rehabilitation Policy, a total eligible amount of Rs.1.46 crore will be disbursed after documentation, with an interim relief of Rs.25,000 already provided to each cadre. Police officials revealed that 509 Maoist cadres have surrendered in 2025 so far, reflecting the steady decline of the extremist organisation. # CM Naidu Seeks Centre's Support for Projects



AMARAVATI (TSIT): Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in New Delhi on Friday and sought substantial central support for various projects. These included the Purvodaya programme, the Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) scheme works, a transformative horticulture development package for Rayalaseema, and urgent assistance for the Polavaram-Nallamala Sagar Link Project to address persistent drought conditions in several districts. CM Naidu emphasised that the Purvodaya initiative is crucial for realising the Viksit Bharat vision, as it supports the holistic development of eastern states and strengthens India's national economic growth. According to an official release here, the Chief Minister explained that Purvodaya funds are essential for improving rural connectivity, modernising irrigation systems, developing infrastructure, expanding industrial corridors, establishing food-processing clusters, and enhancing healthcare and education facilities. Stressing that these interventions would significantly expand economic opportunities in rural Andhra Pradesh, he requested the Centre to prioritise State-specific needs and simplify administrative norms to ensure smooth implementation of Purvodaya projects. The Chief Minister also sought the expeditious release of funds under the SASCI scheme for several important projects. He requested immediate support for the construction of the Unity Mall in Visakhapatnam, the reconstruction of the historic Havelock Bridge under Akhanda Godavari, the Gandikota Tourism Project, and the completion of three working women's hostels in different districts.

## Traditional medicine restores life & health balance: Modi

NEW DELHI : While imbalances in life, gut health, sleep, and workplace are creating significant global health challenges, implementing traditional medicine can help restore balance and harmony and boost health, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Friday. Speaking at the concluding ceremony of the second WHO Global Summit on Traditional Medicine at the Bharat Mandapam here, the Prime Minister underscored India's growing leadership and pioneer-



ing initiatives in shaping a global, science-based, and people-centred traditional medicine agenda. The Summit, held from December 17 to 19, was jointly organised by the

World Health Organisation (WHO) and the Ministry of Ayush. Emphasising the theme of the event "Restoring balance: The science and practice of

health and well-being", PM Modi noted how India's age-old wisdom, Ayurveda, is centred around balance. "In Ayurveda, balance, that is, equilibrium, has been called the synonym of health. The one whose body maintains this balance is healthy," the PM said. "Today, we see imbalances in work-life, gut microbiome, sleep, and emotions creating global health challenges. Both studies and data indicate this. Thus, restoring balance is a global urgency," said PM Modi.

## 93 Indian Airports Switch to 100% Green Energy

New Delhi : A total of 93 airports in India have switched over to 100 per cent green energy use, Murlidhar Mohol, Minister of State for Civil Aviation, informed the Parliament.In a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha, the minister stated that four airports in the country, including Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad, and Bengaluru, have achieved the highest carbon accreditation level, five, as per the Airports International Council, and have become carbon neutral.

## Siddaramaiah asserts full-term CM amid Cong infighting

BELAGAVI (TSIT): Amid speculation over leadership change within the Karnataka Congress, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Friday asserted that he is the incumbent Chief Minister and will continue in office for the full term, while categorically denying that any power-sharing formula had been discussed within the party. The Chief Minister made the statement on the floor of the Assembly after BJP leaders questioned whether he would remain in office long enough to implement the assurances announced for the development of the North Karnataka region during the ongoing Belagavi session.

"The leadership issue is an internal matter of our party. We will follow the directions of the high command. However, I am the current Chief Minister and have completed two-and-a-half years in office. I will continue as the Chief Minister in the future as well," Siddaramaiah said, reiterating, "I am here and

I will continue to be the Chief Minister."Senior BJP MLA V. Sunil Kumar said he was raising the issue out of genuine concern. "Today, you have made announcements for North Karnataka. You should be in a position to implement them. You will remain as the Chief Minister, right?" he asked. In response, Siddaramaiah said that he would indeed remain in office. Leader of the Opposition R. Ashoka then sought clarity on whether the Congress Legislature Party (CLP) had decided if Siddaramaiah would serve a full five-year term or only a two-and-a-half-year term. The Chief Minister replied that no such decision regarding a half-term arrangement had been taken within the party. BJP MLA N. Munirathna followed up by challenging Siddaramaiah to make a categorical declaration. "Won't you thump the table and say that you will remain Chief Minister for five years?" he asked.

CHENNAI (TSIT): The Secular Progressive Alliance led by the ruling DMK, has announced a state-wide protest on December 24 against the Centre's newly passed legislation to replace the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act. ## LIVING FOR THE NATION

Patriotism has long been measured by sacrifice, often dramatised through martyrdom and moments of crisis. But a mature civilisation must eventually ask a harder question. What does it mean to live for the nation every single day? True nationalism is not forged only on battlefields or in moments of extreme heroism. It is sustained in ordinary life, in conduct, choices, discipline and collective purpose. To live for the nation is to place it above narrow identities without erasing diversity. It is to understand that caste, creed, region and language are social facts, not political weapons. When society fractures over small differences, it signals not passion but intellectual laziness. Civilisations decline not because of external enemies alone, but because internal cohesion weakens. Unity, therefore, is not a slogan, but a strategic strength. History repeatedly shows that truth alone does not command respect in a competitive world. Moral righteousness without capacity becomes vulnerable. Strength, whether it is economic, cultural, intellectual or social, is what allows values to travel beyond borders. This strength, however, does not emerge from confrontation for its own sake. Wisdom lies in discernment. In knowing when to assert, when to adapt, and when to outgrow conflict altogether. An impulsive society fights every problem whereas a wise one understands which battles elevate and which only exhaust. Living for the nation also means rejecting the false binary between personal success and collective duty. One does not need to renounce the world to serve it. Professional excellence, wealth creation, innovation and ambition are not anti-national. They are essential to nation-building, provided they are anchored in responsibility. A society where individuals rise but forget the collective soon finds that individual success itself becomes fragile. Equally important is cultural confidence. A nation unsure of its own traditions becomes vulnerable to imitation without understanding. Cultural pride is not hostility to the world. It is clarity about oneself. Wearing traditional attire, preserving languages, valuing family bonds and celebrating indigenous thought systems are not acts of regression. They are acts of continuity. Global engagement is meaningful only when rooted in self-respect. Perhaps the most profound idea embedded in the call to live for the nation is the recognition of every individual's importance. Societies are not built only by towering heroes. They are sustained by millions of small contributions. The quiet honesty of a public servant, the ethical choices of a business owner, the discipline of a student, the compassion of a neighbour, these are the invisible bricks of national strength. When people believe their role is insignificant, apathy sets in. When they believe they matter, nations rise. Finally, living for the nation demands emotional maturity. It requires keeping self-interests in check, resisting constant outrage, and cultivating patience. A great nation is not one that is perpetually angry, but one that is self-aware, resilient and purposeful. Patriotism, at its highest form, is civic responsibility, not performative emotion, not symbolic aggression, but sustained commitment. The future will belong to nations whose citizens can balance strength with wisdom, ambition with ethics, identity with unity. The challenge before us is to not just stop romanticising death for the nation, but start dignifying life lived consciously for it.

# Modi's Gulf, East Africa Visit SETTING STRATEGIC FOOTHOLDS

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's two-day state visit to Jordan on 15-16 December, marked a watershed moment in India-Jordan relations, coming 75 years after diplomatic ties were established after a 37-year gap since the last full-fledged visit by an Indian premier. The visit, the first leg of a three-nation tour which also took Modi to Ethiopia and Oman between 16-18 December, was framed by both sides as an opportunity to move the partnership from "symbolic" to "substantive". In a series of social media posts and a joint press briefing in Jordan, Modi highlighted a 'meaningful expansion' of cooperation across a wide spectrum of sectors.

PM Modi's four-day, three nation swing through Jordan, Ethiopia and Oman is meant to give India a diplomatic push in two key regions – the Horne of Africa and the Gulf – at a time when New Delhi is rolling out its 'Link West' and 'Africa Initiative' strategies. At the time of writing (17 Dec), Modi will leave from Ethiopia to Oman. This article, thus, covers the events in Jordan visit while hinting at the purpose of Prime Minister's visits to Ethiopia and Oman.

In Jordan, the most tangible results were the Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) signed on 15 December. The Agreements covered renewable energy, water resource management, digital public infrastructure and a twining of UNESCO sites of Petra, Jordan and Ellora in India. The cultural MoU includes the renewal of the India-Jordan Cultural Exchange Programme for 2025-2029 an initiative that the Prime Minister said would 'further deepen people-to-people ties'. In renewable energy, both countries pledged technical cooperation aimed at clean growth, energy security and climate responsibility. This echoes Modi's earlier statement that the partnership 'reflects a shared commitment to clean growth'.

Water security, a critical issue for both arid countries, was addressed with collaboration on water-resources management and development, with an emphasis on sharing best practices in conservation and technological innovation. Digital transformation received a boost through a Letter of Intent on sharing successful digital solutions and a call for collaboration between Jordan's National Payment System and India's Unified Payments Interface (UPI). The latter was part of a broader push to support Jordan's digital public infrastructure and inclusive governance.

Strategically, the visit reinforced a shared stance against terrorism. King Abdullah II conveyed strong support for India's fight against terrorism as both leaders condemned

terrorism in all its forms. This part of the outcome has reportedly sent shivers through the spine of terror organisations and their patrons in Pakistani military. Modi also praised Jordan's 'active and positive role' on the Gaza issue, underscoring the geo-political dimension of the bilateral dialogues. While King Abdullah II acknowledged India's 'rising influence' expressing confidence that their partnership would serve as a model for South-South Cooperation.

On economic and trade prospects, India is Jordan's third-largest trading partner, with bilateral trade valued at about 2.8b USD. Jordan supplies a significant share of India's fertilizer imports – particularly Phosphates and Potash – making it a key component of India's food security strategy. During the talks, Modi proposed raising bilateral trade to US 5b USD over the next five years, a target that reflects the ambition to deepen economic inter-dependence. The Prime Minister's 8-Point vision, presented to the King, outlined cooperation in trade, critical minerals, civil-nuclear energy, and capacity-building programmes, including the training of 10 master trainers over three years. Jordan expressed its intent to join Indian-led global initiatives such as the International Solar Alliance (ISA), the Global Bio Fuel Alliance, and the Coalition for Disaster Resilience Infrastructure, signalling a convergence of interests on climate and sustainable development.

The latest trade figures show that India imported 1.2m tonnes of Phosphates and 0.8 m tonnes of Potash from Jordan in the last fiscal year, accounting for roughly 12 per cent of India's total fertilizer imports. Both governments have agreed to launch a Joint Business Council to explore new sectors such as renewable-energy components, agri-tech and pharmaceuticals, aiming to double trade volume by 2030.

On strategic and security dimensions beyond economics, the visit cemented a security partnership that builds on the 2018-defence cooperation MoU. Discussions covered military training, defence-industrial collabora-

tion, counter terrorism, intelligence sharing and potential military exports. Modi's reference to Jordan's "firm stand against terrorism and extremism" highlighted a shared security outlook; while the King's support for India's counter terrorism efforts reinforced mutual trust.

The geo-political context is equally significant. Jordan's participation in the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) positions the Kingdom of Jordan as a linchpin in a multi-model connectivity project that could cut shipping cost by up to 30 per cent and reduce transit times by around 40 per cent. Modi's visit, therefore, was not simply a bilateral affair but also a step toward integrating Jordan into a broader regional architecture that links South Asia to the Mediterranean.

In the defence sector, India has offered to supply Jordan with advanced light-weight howitzers and to conduct joint training exercises at the Indian Army's training centre in Rajasthan. A Letter of Intent was also signed to explore co-production of spare parts, which could reduce Jordan's maintenance costs by an estimated 15 per cent over the next decade.

In cultural exchange and people-to-people ties, the Indian Diaspora in Jordan numbers around 17,500 employed mainly in textiles, construction, manufacturing and UN agencies. The twining of Petra and Ellora is presented as a 'Gateway for heritage conservation', tourism and academic exchanges. To nurture ties among the youth, India will offer 50 scholarships under the ICCR programme for Jordanian students to pursue undergraduate studies in engineering and technology with the first batch set to arrive in August 2026.

The outcomes of the December visit open up several avenues for future collaboration such as renewable-energy, joint ventures, with Jordan seeking to expand its solar capacity, Indian expertise through the ISA and private sector partnership could create large scale project, leveraging India's cost-effective solar technology. Similarly, digital infra-

structure and FinTech linking UPI – Jordan Payment-System could serve as a template for broader FinTech cooperation including cross-border remittances, E-commerce platforms and date-security standards.

There is also scope in water-management, technology transfer where Indian companies have notable experience – water recycling, drip irrigation and desalination. Opportunities can easily be explored in joint-investment in exploration of critical minerals and fertilizer that could secure supply chain for India's agriculture sector while providing Jordan with value-added industry.

Scope exists in defence and security collaboration, education and capacity building, tourism and heritage conservation which will boost both economies while supporting Jordan's ambition to become a technology hub. Such present initiatives and future scope collectively aim to transform the India-Jordan relationship into a dynamic, multi-sector partnership that can serve as a catalyst for broader regional integration and sustainable development.

Modi's visit to Ethiopia is timed to mark 70 years of diplomatic relations. Ethiopia hosts the Africa Union headquarter, making it a strategic foothold for India's broader Africa outreach. For Ethiopia, India is one of its top trading partners and a major source of concessional loans. Modi's second visit to the Sultanate of Oman also coincides with 70th anniversary of India-Oman diplomatic ties and following Sultan Haithm bin Tariqu's state visit to India Dec 2023. Oman's location at the mouth of Strait of Hormuz makes it vital for India's security and maritime interest. In short, the Ethiopia leg is about cementing a strategic foothold in East Africa and expanding economic ties, while the Oman leg leverages a long-standing Gulf partnership, energy security and a pending Free Trade Pact, Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) that could boost bilateral trade beyond the current 10b USD. Also, such a pact with Oman should deepen India's influence in the Western Indian Ocean. ---INFA

# Something is rotten in the state of Goa

GOA, a tiny state on the western coast of India, is the land of my ancestors, who were Hindus. My maternal grandmother told me that our distant ancestors had arrived there with the sage Parshuram, who had fired an arrow that struck the fertile land of Goa, following which the Goud Saraswat community has been living there for aeons. The last time I met my grandmother was in 1952, when I arrived at her home unannounced with my books to prepare for the UPSC's civil services examination. She stayed alone in her huge house with an old woman for company and to cook her meals. I arrived after dusk. To my surprise, all the doors were open. Murders and thefts were rare in Goa in those times.

Goa has progressed into a state comparable to any other in the Indian Union, alive in a sense that it is afflicted by crime and corruption. When the colonial rulers, the Portuguese, were driven out in 1961, the state was merged into the Union of India. The two core services, the IAS and the IPS, were introduced and the judiciary reorganised on the lines of neighbouring states. At first, the local inhabitants were very happy. The new rulers were among their own and till the casino culture gained prominence in Goa, disaffection with those who ruled was minimal. The Congress gave way to the BJP, which ensnared most of

the rival legislators through the lure of office.

It can be safely said that till BJP leader Manohar Parrikar was the Chief Minister, crime and corruption had been checked despite the influx of citizens from northern states and the inroads of the casino culture. The current government led by Pramod Sawant has allowed the hold that Parrikar had on the administration to slip so badly that Herculean efforts will be needed to restore the rule of law. The fire that swept through the nightclub called Birch by Romeo Lane, killing 25 people – including 20 poor migrants who had shifted to Goa to make a living – sums up the sorry state of governance under Sawant's rule.

Two brothers, Gaurav and Saurabh Luthra, owned the nightclub, along with "sleeping partner" Ajay Gupta. The land had been leased to them by the owner, Surinder Kumar Khosla, though he knew that no construction was permitted there since it lay astride former salt pans.

It has been reported that Gaurav and Saurabh, both residents of Delhi, share their residential address with 42 firms, most of which are probably shell companies. The Enforcement Directorate would be well advised to ascertain if these firms are conduits for money laundering. As per a report in a leading English newspaper, when electoral bonds were the flavour of the season, the brothers or the companies they



controlled deposited Rs 37 crore in the scheme (which was later scrapped). This needs to be verified.

Now, the BJP, like any other political party, has to collect money by all means, fair or foul, in order to run its electoral machinery. In Goa, nightclubs and casinos present the politicians with easy pickings. The constructions that have changed the face of the Goan countryside are, of course, their prime source of funding.

The Luthra brothers were in Delhi when the fire struck their nightclub built with birchwood and having thatched roofs – all combustible material. They were informed telephonically within minutes of the disaster.

Immediately, they booked a flight to Thailand to avoid arrest. CM Sawant's minions went into top gear and managed to get the brothers arrested from Phuket. The government hoped that the public would forget that the real culprits were those who had shut their eyes to the illegalities.

Who are the officials who permitted the nightclub to operate brazenly on land on which no construction was permitted? If a politician has given the green signal, he or she should be exposed. Why have the erring officials not been named as co-accused along with the Luthra brothers and the landowner?

The officer in charge of the police station where the

nightclub was operating is reported to have sent a written report to his superiors. He alleged that he was told to "keep quiet". If that is so, there is no solace for law-abiding citizens of Goa if the senior officers who should have enforced the law are themselves complicit in the crime committed under their very noses.

My brother retired as the head of the Town and Country Planning Department in the Central government. He worked for five years after retirement as the Director of the School of Planning and Architecture in New Delhi. He told me that he is not abreast of the happenings in his previous department in Goa, though he lives in our

ancestral home in the village. I consulted him about this fiasco. His first comment was that the land on which the nightclub was built was an "eco-sensitive zone, subject to tidal action". According to the Goa Regional Plan (2001-21), which was approved in 2008, no construction can be permitted on such land.

The second mandatory requirement that was disregarded was that there has to be a minimum distance of 70 metres between any building and the spot which a fire tender can access. In the Arpora case, the fire tenders had to operate from a distance of 400 metres, which was obviously ineffective. Planners should have pointed out these

requirements to those empowered to permit construction.

Most native Goans feel that there is no governance in their state. It has collapsed beyond repair and only a change of guard can stem the rot.

The CM is attempting to shift the blame to officials. He has suspended a few of them and threatened not to spare any other who has not acted in good faith. He has not pointed a finger at any politician! But without political blessings, these violations could not have occurred. Goa is too small a state for its residents not to be aware of the levels to which corruption has risen.

The 20 migrants who lost their lives represented the India that has not benefited from PM Narendra Modi's development initiatives and the economic advances the country has made. There appears to be a sense of oblivion about the existence of this India when decisions have to be taken, like they have to be taken every day by those who rule. When Covid struck, our Prime Minister abruptly announced a lockdown. He forgot to factor in the poor migrants who were left without shelter and sustenance. PM Modi's acolytes in Goa apparently don't spare a thought for the migrants who go there to make a living. Forgetting about this parallel, poor India is inexcusable.

## Aware of existing conditions, tenders invited with a forward-looking approach: MB Patil

Bengaluru: Infrastructure Development Minister M. B. Patil said on Friday that the State Government is aware that permission from Bengaluru International Airport Limited (BIAL) is required to construct a second international airport near the State capital, and that the relevant condition remains valid until 2033. With this in view, and adopting a long-term perspective, the Government has initiated preparatory work well in advance, he said. He has responded to the matter raised during the recent session of Parliament regarding the proposed second international airport for Bengaluru. At the time of commissioning Kempegowda International Airport (KIA), a condition was imposed prohibiting the development of another airport within a 150-km radius until 2033. However, similar conditions have been relaxed in cities such as New Delhi



and Navi Mumbai to facilitate the development of second airports. This matter will be addressed appropriately at the appropriate time, he said.

Patil explained that several critical steps are involved in establishing an airport, including site identification, inspections, land acquisition and disbursement of compensation. Completing these processes alone would take at least five to six years. Approval from BIAL would be required only after these stages are completed. Therefore, tenders have been invited through the Karnataka State Industrial and Infrastructure

Development Corporation (KSIIDC) to prepare a location suitability report along with a comprehensive technical and financial feasibility study.

A period of five months will be provided for submission of the report to the Government. While preparing it, factors such as passenger density, potential for industrial and tourism growth, infrastructure availability, geographical features, rainfall patterns, sewerage, noise pollution and waste management will be taken into consideration. The Government is clear that Bengaluru requires another international airport, he said. A high-level team from the Airports Authority of India had earlier inspected the sites at Choodahalli and Somanahalli on Kanakapura Road, as well as another location on the Nelamangala-Kunigal Road, and submitted its report to the Government. Based on this assessment, the tenders have now been invited,

## Congress gave nothing to North Karnataka in Belagavi session: Opposition leader R. Ashok

Bengaluru : The Congress government has given nothing to North Karnataka in the Belagavi session. They have only told lies, said opposition leader R. Ashok, expressing outrage.

Speaking to reporters, he said that in every Belagavi session, discussions take place on the problems of North Karnataka. This time, the BJP had emphasized this issue. Even though discussions went on for a total of 21 hours, it was like washing tamarind fruit in a river (meaning it was futile). # Highways Clogged by Encroachments, Shrines and Statues

The primary motive behind the formation of National Highways (NH) in India is to provide a robust and efficient transportation network that connects different regions, promotes economic growth, and enhances national integration.

**The statutory system NH is supposed to be maintained**

Under the National Highways Act, 1956, was enacted to develop and maintain a network of high-quality roads that connect major cities, ports, and industrial cen-

ters in the country. The Union government has invested heavily in the development of National Highways, with a focus on improving infrastructure, reducing congestion, and enhancing safety. By achieving these objectives, the National Highways aim to contribute to India’s economic growth, social development, and overall prosperity. India has a total of 599 National Highways (NH) covering a length of approximately 1,51,874 kilometers. These highways play a crucial role in connecting different regions and fostering economic growth and development throughout the country.

**Existing impediments on NH in many spots**

Contrary to the objective of national highways, some political party activists and other sector persons have extensively and haphazardly erected religious structures and statues on many National Highways across the country, causing serious disruption to road traffic and leading to accidents. Consequently, the National Highways Authority

approached the Supreme Court.

Finally the Supreme Court of India has directed all States and UTs to stop granting permission for installing statues or any structures on public roads, pavements, and utility

This ruling pertained to cases challenging unauthorized constructions, with courts stressing public funds should serve people, not glorify leaders through road encroachments.

The Supreme Court of India has directed all States and UTs to stop granting permission for installing statues or any structures on public roads, pavements, and utility areas that obstruct traffic, ensuring public safety and free movement, in orders from around 2013, applying this to National Highways too, while allowing essential traffic structures like streetlights. This ruling came from cases challenging unauthorized constructions, with courts stressing public funds should serve people, not glorify leaders through road encroachments.

“A total of 2,524 unauthorized statues have been erected in various government

lands across the Andhara Pradesh state alone. Among them, 38 are on national highways, 1,671 on state roads, and 815 on state highways. A government order (GO) was issued in 2013, prohibiting installation of statues on public roads, footpaths, sidewalks, and other public utility spaces.

As per the GO issued in 2019, no permissions have been granted for existing statues, nor for their removal. Collectors will take decisions based on the guidelines. It must be said that these haphazardly constructed statues, encroachments on roads, and religious structures are becoming a serious obstacle to national highways and severely undermining the central government’s objective.

Therefore, it is the responsibility of the respective state governments to immediately intervene, remove any statues or religious structures that are causing obstruction, regardless of who they represent, and uphold the purpose of the national highways, thereby implementing the Supreme Court orders.



# Catastrophe looming, CM Stalin cautions PM Modi; urges swift resolution to tariff row with US

Thousands of textile, leather export units on verge of collapse, lakhs of workers staring at joblessness

CHENNAI: From thousands of small and medium enterprises in textile and leather pushed to the brink of collapse to lakhs of jobs consequently hanging in balance, the punitive 50 per cent tariff imposed by the United States on exports from India is not merely an economic challenge but a looming humanitarian challenge, cautioned Chief Minister MK Stalin, urging Prime Minister Narendra Modi to immediately intervene and resolve the issue.

In a letter to the Prime Minister on Thursday, Stalin expressed his deep sense of urgency and concern over the crisis faced by exporters in Tamil Nadu, particularly the textile, leather and foot-



wear sectors. The State accounts for 28 per cent of textile and 40 per cent share in leather and footwear exports, both of which are now reeling under the tariff imposed by President Donald Trump.

Citing an example, the chief minister said exporters in Tirupur, called the knitwear capital of India, have reported a staggering loss of Rs 15,000 crore in confirmed orders. And, with new orders drying up at an alarming rate, these units were forced to enforce production cuts up to 30 per cent.

“This has translated

into a combined daily loss of Rs 60 crore in revenues for exporters in Tirupur, Coimbatore, Erode and Karur districts, pushing many small and medium enterprises to the brink of collapse. A similar dismal scenario is witnessed in our footwear clusters in Vellore, Ranipet and Tirupattur districts,” he said.

Pushed to a corner by tariffs, exporters are compelled to offer deep discounts to retain clients, which is eroding their viability. “The ripple effects are profound: lakhs of jobs hang in the balance, with the sectors

already witnessing layoffs and wage deferrals that threaten the stability of entire communities.”

This is not merely a short-term hurdle, but could prove to be disastrous in the long run, Stalin warned. International buyers are rapidly diverting orders to competitors like Vietnam, Bangladesh and Cambodia, which have a tariff advantage over India. “Once these markets are lost, regaining them would be an uphill battle, as entrenched supply chains rarely revert. This has ominous long-term implications for the future employment prospects of our youth, especially women.”

In the letter, the chief minister urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to prioritise the resolution of tariff deadlock through a bilateral agreement at the earliest possible juncture. “A swift decision would not only revive our exporters’ fortunes but also reinforce India’s position as a reliable global manufacturing hub,” Stalin added.

## Rs 7.7 Cr sports medicine wing to come up at Omandurar Hospital

CHENNAI: State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Ma Subramanian on Friday announced that a dedicated medicine wing for sportspersons, built at a cost of Rs 7.70 crore, will soon be inaugurated at the Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital (TNGMSSH) in Omandurar estate by the Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin.

Addressing reporters after presiding over an appreciation ceremony at the TNGMSSH, the Minister said the facility has emerged as a benchmark institution in advanced tertiary care. “Over the past four-and-a-half years, the hospital has successfully performed more than 20,000 interventional cardiology procedures and around 500 robotic surgeries, marking a major milestone in public healthcare delivery,” he said.

The minister noted that a state-of-the-art robotic surgery system was procured in 2022 at a cost of Rs 34 crore, enabling the hospital to offer advanced.

In a statement, TN BJP chief spokesperson Narayanan Thirupathy said the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme was originally enacted by Parliament in 2005 to ensure livelihood security for rural households and was renamed MGNREGS only in 2009.

(Gramin) Bill, 2025, replacing the old framework with a new, reform-oriented law aligned with contemporary needs and national infrastructure priorities,” Narayanan said.

He emphasised that the objective was adaptation

and reform, not a mere change in nomenclature funding trends, the BJP leader pointed out that the scheme’s allocation had increased from Rs 33,000 crore in 2014 to Rs 86,000 crore last year, and now stands at Rs 1,51,852 crore under the new Bill, with the Centre contributing 60%.

He rejected Chief Minister M K Stalin’s claim of reduced Central funding for sponsored schemes, stating that BJP-led governments had released Rs 84 lakh crore to States over the past decade, compared to Rs 22 lakh crore during the Congress-led UPA regime.

Under the new law, guaranteed employment has been increased from 100 to 125 days, with a 60-day pause during peak agricultural seasons to prevent disruption of farm activities. The scheme is fully digitised to eliminate irregularities, prioritises women, senior citizens and persons with disabilities, and empowers gram panchayats with greater authority.

## IIT-M, Google launch AI capacity-building programme for govt officials

CHENNAI: The Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IIT-M), through its Centre for Responsible AI (CeRAI) at the Wadhvani School of Data Science and Artificial Intelligence (WSAI), on Friday announced the launch of a new capacity-building programme aimed at training Indian government officials in the design, procurement and large-scale deployment of responsible artificial intelligence (AI) systems.

Developed in partnership with Google and the Digital Futures Lab (DFL), an independent interdisciplinary research studio, the initiative was unveiled



during the Conclave on Strengthening Human Capital for the AI Era, held at the IIT-M campus here. The programme seeks to equip government officials with critical technical, operational and governance capabilities required for the effective and ethical use of AI in public institutions. With AI increasingly shaping domains such as education, service delivery and digital governance, the

initiative addresses the urgent need for AI literacy, informed decision-making and robust oversight frameworks within the public sector.

Highlighting the significance of responsible AI adoption, B Ravindran, Head of WSAI, IIT-M, said that as AI systems begin to influence decision-making at scale, trust, inclusion and accountability must form the bedrock of their development and deployment. He noted that the conclave aims to foster open dialogue among diverse stakeholders and co-create policy-relevant, context-aware frameworks reflecting the realities of the Global South.

## Deputy CM Udhayanidhi flags off upgraded Poonamallee e-bus depot, 125 new electric buses

CHENNAI: Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin on Friday flagged off the upgraded Poonamallee electric bus depot of the Metropolitan Transport Corporation, developed at a cost of Rs 43.53 crore, and inaugurated the operation of 125 new low-floor electric buses procured at an outlay of Rs 214.50 crore as part of the third phase of the electric bus rollout in Chennai.

The newly launched fleet includes 45 low-floor air-conditioned electric buses and 80 non-air-conditioned low-floor electric buses. Officials said the addition would strengthen electric bus services on major city



routes and enhance commuter comfort.

The launch is part of Chennai’s phased expansion of electric bus infrastructure. Chief Minister M.K. Stalin had inaugurated the electric bus depot at Vyasarpadi and flagged off 120 non-air-conditioned electric buses on June 30. On August 11, the Deputy Chief Minister launched the upgraded Perumbakkam electric bus depot, developed at a cost of Rs 49.56 crore, and introduced 135 low-floor electric buses, including 55 air-conditioned and 80 deluxe buses, at a cost of Rs 233 crore.

## No more Pit Bulls, Rottweilers in Chennai from Dec 20



CHENNAI: From December 20, 2025, applications for new pet licences for Pit Bull and Rottweiler breeds will be prohibited within the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) limits. The ban, initiated by the GCC’s Veterinary Department, seeks to stop the issuance of new licences and the renewal of annual licences for the two breeds, which the Corporation has classified as aggressive and posing a risk to public safety. According to the resolution passed, while existing licensed dogs will not be seized, owners of Pit Bull and Rottweiler dogs already holding valid pet licences will be required to use a leash and muzzle whenever the dogs are taken outside their homes. Failure to comply will attract a fine of Rs. 5,000.

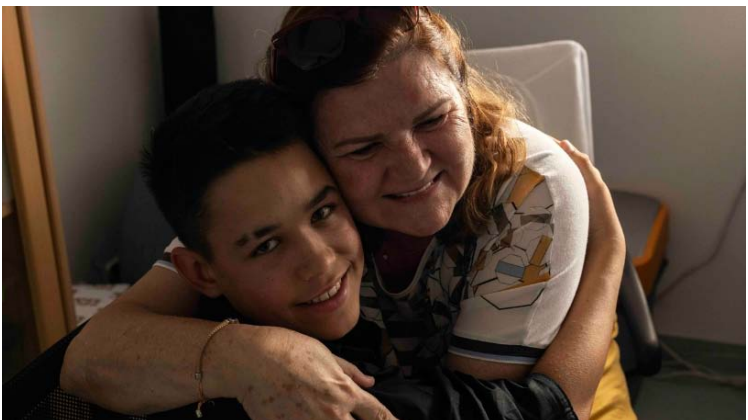
The Corporation has also proposed a penalty of Rs.1 lakh for persons who purchase or rear Pit Bull or Rottweiler dogs without a licence after the cut-off date. Officials said the move is aimed at preventing fresh ownership of the breeds within city limits. The proposal characterises Pit Bull and Rottweiler dogs as ferocious and aggressive breeds, linking them to a significant share of recent dog attack complaints and incidents involving harm to the public. It notes that while these dogs may behave normally in familiar surroundings and with known individuals, their conduct can become unpredictable in the presence of unfamiliar people or in new environments, particularly in public spaces and shared residential areas. Citing the fear and safety risks posed to the general public and the issue as a breed-specific concern, the council proposes stricter controls including licensing restrictions, mandatory leashing and muzzling, and steep penalties are necessary to prevent further incidents.

# Social connection linked to improved health and reduced risk of early death

The World Health Organization (WHO) Commission on Social Connection has released its global report revealing that 1 in 6 people worldwide is affected by loneliness, with significant impacts on health and well-being. Loneliness is linked to an estimated 100 deaths every hour—more than 871 000 deaths annually. Strong social connections can lead to better health and longer life, the report says.

“In this Report, we pull back the curtain on loneliness and isolation as a defining challenge of our time. Our Commission lays out a road map for how we can build more connected lives and underscores the profound impact this can have on health, educational, and economic outcomes,” said Dr Vivek Murthy, Co-chair of the WHO Commission on Social Connection, and former Surgeon General of the United States of America.

WHO defines social connection as the ways people relate to and interact with others. Loneliness is described as the painful feeling that arises from a gap between desired and actual social connections, while social isolation refers to the objective lack of sufficient social connections. “In this age when the possibilities to connect are endless, more and more people are finding themselves isolated and lonely,” said Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO



Director-General. “Apart from the toll it takes on individuals, families and communities, left unaddressed, loneliness and social isolation will continue to cost society billions in terms of health care, education, and employment. I welcome the Commission’s report, which shines a light on the scale and impact of loneliness and isolation, and outlines key areas in which we can help people to reconnect in ways that matter most.”

### SCALE AND CAUSES OF LONELINESS AND SOCIAL ISOLATION

Loneliness affects people of all ages, especially youth and people living in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC). Between 17–21% of individuals aged 13–29-year-olds reported feeling lonely, with the highest rates among teenagers. About 24% of people in low-income countries reported feeling lonely — twice the rate in high-

income countries (about 11%).

“Even in a digitally connected world, many young people feel alone. As technology reshapes our lives, we must ensure it strengthens—not weakens—human connection. Our report shows that social connection must be integrated into all policies—from digital access to health, education, and employment,” said Chido Mpemba, Co-chair of the WHO Commission on Social Connection and Advisor to the African Union Chairperson.

While data on social isolation was more limited, it is estimated to affect up to 1 in 3 older adults and 1 in 4 adolescents. Some groups, such as people with disabilities, refugees or migrants, LGBTQ+ individuals, and indigenous groups and ethnic minorities, may face discrimination or additional barriers that make social connection harder.

Loneliness and social isolation have multiple causes. They include, for instance, poor health, low income and education, living alone, inadequate community infrastructure and public policies, and digital technologies. The report underscores the need for vigilance around the effects of excessive screen time or negative online interactions on the mental health and well-being of young people.

### IMPACTS ON HEALTH, QUALITY OF LIFE AND ECONOMIES

Social connection can protect health across the lifespan. It can reduce inflammation, lower the risk of serious health problems, foster mental health, and prevent early death. It can also strengthen the social fabric, contributing to making communities healthier, safer and more prosperous. In contrast, loneliness and social isolation increase the risk of stroke, heart disease, diabetes, cognitive decline, and premature death. It also affects mental health, with people who are lonely twice as likely to get depressed. Loneliness can also lead to anxiety, and thoughts of self-harm or suicide. The impacts extend to learning and employment. Teenagers who felt lonely were 22% more likely to get lower grades or qualifications. Adults who are lonely may find it harder to find or maintain employment and may earn less over time.

## Theeya Vs Thooya war: Vijay adopts MGR’s anti-DMK slogan



COIMBATORE: Back on the ground to address a public meet in Erode, the first major event in the State after the Karur stampede in September, TVK president Vijay adopted anti-DMK phrases used by late AIADMK leaders MG Ramachandran and J Jayalalithaa to declare that the 2026 Assembly polls will be a battle between ‘theeya sakthi’ (evil force) DMK and ‘thooya sakthi’ (pure force) TVK.

Addressing his first major open public meet after the Karur stampede on September 27, the actor-turned-politician said, “I repeat that the battle is only between ‘theeya sakthi’ and ‘thooya sakthi’.

“Even MGR and Jayalalithaa used to

describe DMK as an evil force,” he said, adding: “Both Anna and MGR are Tamil Nadu’s assets. No one can either claim ownership or complain about invoking their legacy. The DMK loots under the pretext of following Periyar’s principles.” That was not the only invocation of the late AIADMK leaders. Listing out DMK’s unfulfilled poll promises, including scrapping NEET, waiving education loans, Rs 100 subsidy on cooking gas, Vijay echoed former chief minister Jayalalithaa’s style of asking the crowd, “son-nargale, senchangala? (They promised, but did they do?).

While all Dravidian outfits collectively claim Periyar’s legacy, Vijay’s calibrated appropriation of AIADMK founder MGR and his successor Jayalalithaa, whom the party celebrates as its mascots, is unlikely to go unchallenged.

“Why are you in jitters if TVK is not a concern? You trust in looted money, but I firmly believe in the support of people,” he said, adding that TVK will oppose only those in power and not those who are not in the contest,” he said.

## India’s forex reserves rise to \$688.94 billion amid strong FDI inflows

New Delhi, Dec 19: India’s foreign exchange reserves climbed by \$1.689 billion to \$688.94 billion for the week ending December 12, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reported on Friday.

Gold reserves rose by \$758 million, reaching \$107.741 billion, while Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) inched up by \$14 million to \$18.735 billion. The previous week, forex reserves had increased by \$1.03 billion to \$687.26 billion, with gold reserves rising \$1.188 billion to \$106.984 billion and SDRs increasing by \$93 million to \$18.721 billion. The RBI regularly monitors foreign exchange market developments and intervenes when necessary to ensure orderly trading conditions.

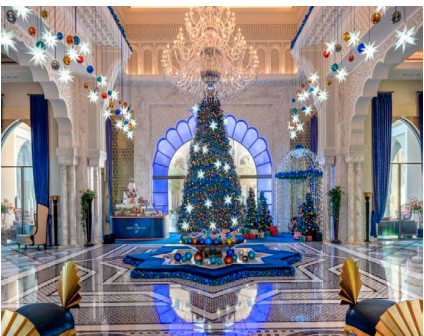
Meanwhile, India’s foreign direct investment (FDI) commitments have hit record highs this year. During the first half of FY 2025-26, total FDI inflows reached \$50.36 billion, marking a 16% increase over \$43.37 bil-



lion in the same period last year — the highest-ever first-half inflows for India. Gross FDI inflows have grown steadily from over \$34 billion in 2012-13 to more than \$80 billion in 2024-25.

Official data shows a robust rebound in the second quarter of the current fiscal year, with FDI inflows rising over 18% year-on-year to \$35.18 billion between April and September 2025. Analysts noted that the rising repatriation trend reflects India’s ability not only to attract foreign capital but also to deliver strong returns, enhancing its reputation as a reliable investment destination. The government has actively leveraged free trade agreements to promote export diversification and attract further foreign investment.

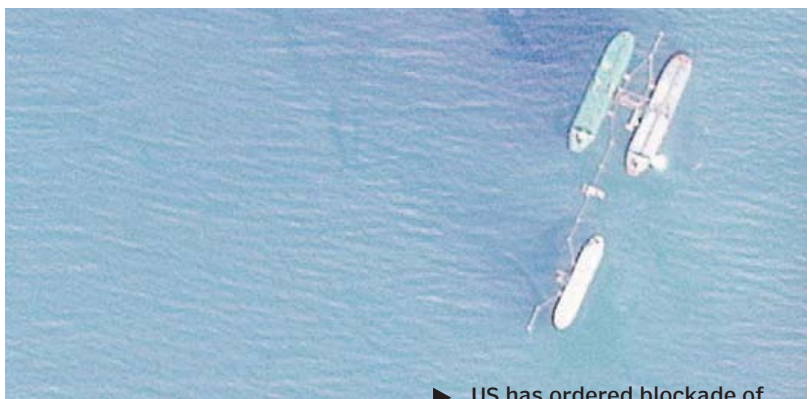

# China backs Venezuela

China voiced political support for Venezuela Thursday after the United States ordered a blockade of sanctioned oil tankers, denouncing what it called 'unilateral bullying' but offering no details on any concrete assistance to its long-time oil supplier

**Beijing, Dec 19 :** China opposed what it said was “unilateral bullying” after Washington ordered a blockade of sanctioned tankers entering and leaving oil-rich Venezuela, but did not say exactly how it would come to the South American country’s aid or offer any refuge for its embattled leader. Earlier this week, US President Donald Trump ordered a complete blockade of all sanctioned oil tankers attempting to leave Venezuelan waters, and those arriving, as Washington massed troops and warships in the region. China is the biggest buyer of Venezuelan crude, which accounts for roughly 4% of its imports, with shipments in December on track to average more than 600,000 barrels per day, analysts have said. Beijing opposes all forms of “unilateral bullying” and supports countries in safeguarding their sovereignty and national dignity, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi told his Venezu-

elan counterpart Yvan Gil on a phone call Wednesday. Wang did not name the United States or Trump in the official readout of the call. Wang also did not elaborate on the form or extent of the support that China might or could offer to Venezuela, with which Beijing previously said it had forged an ironclad friendship. The US is squeezing Venezuela’s principal source of revenue in its attempt to target terrorism, drug smuggling and human trafficking, according to Trump. Last week, the US Coast Guard seized an oil tanker off the coast of Venezuela. President Nicolas Maduro has said the US wants the OPEC nation’s crude oil resources, and the military build-up was to overthrow him. In an interview with Politico, Trump said Maduro’s days were “num-

bered”. For years, China has extended credit lines to Venezuela under loans-for-oil deals. In a meeting with Chinese President Xi Jinping in Moscow this year, Maduro told Xi that Venezuela was looking forward to expanding cooperation in trade and energy. At the same time, Beijing has been making an intense effort to co-exist with the US, its most important trading partner. After months of acrimonious dispute over trade and tariffs, Trump and Xi in October managed to hammer out a consensus on how to handle thorny trade issues. China says it opposes any acts that violate the UN Charter or encroach on the sovereignty and security of other countries.

## FRESH TENSIONS WITH CHINA US rolls out \$10bn Taiwan arms deal

**Washington, Dec 19:** The Trump administration has announced a massive package of arms sales to Taiwan valued at more than \$ 10 billion that includes medium-range missiles, howitzers and drones, drawing an angry response from China. The State Department announced the sales late Wednesday during a nationally televised address by President Donald Trump, who made scant mention of foreign policy issues and did not speak about China or Taiwan at all. US-Chinese tensions have ebbed and flowed during Trump’s second term, largely over trade and tariffs but also over China’s increasing aggressiveness toward Taiwan, which Beijing has said must reunify with the mainland. The eight arms sales agreements announced Wednesday cover 82 high-mobility artillery rocket systems, or HIMARS, and 420 Army Tactical Missile Systems, or ATACMS — similar to what the US had been providing Ukraine during the Biden administration to defend itself from Russia — worth more than \$4 billion. They also include 60 self-propelled howitzer systems and related equipment worth more than \$4 billion and drones valued at more than \$1 billion. Other sales in the package include military software valued at



more than \$1 billion, Javelin and TOW missiles worth more than \$700 million, helicopter spare parts worth \$96 million and refurbishment kits for Harpoon missiles worth \$91 million. China’s Foreign Ministry attacked the move, saying it would violate diplomatic agreements between China and the US; gravely harm China’s sovereignty, security and territorial integrity; and undermine regional stability. “The Taiwan independence’ forces on the island seek independence through force and resist reunification through force, squandering the hard-earned money of the people to purchase weapons at the cost of turning Taiwan into a powder keg,” said Foreign Ministry spokesperson Guo Jiakun. “This cannot save the doomed fate of Taiwan independence’ but will only accelerate the push of the Taiwan Strait toward a dangerous situation of military confrontation and war. The US support for Taiwan Independence’ through arms will only end up backfiring. Using Taiwan to contain China will not succeed,” he added.

## India resumes visa services in Dhaka



**Dhaka, Dec 19:** India Thursday resumed operations at its visa application centre in Dhaka, a day after closing it over escalated security concerns, but closed two other identical facilities in other parts of Bangladesh as anti-India protesters tried to march towards the Indian missions there. The Indian Visa Application Centre (IVAC) at southwestern Khulna and northwestern Rajshahi were closed on the grounds of security concerns amid strong protest marches towards the facilities that were stopped by security officials. In Rajshahi, “Bharityo Adhipotto Birodhi July 36 Mancha” tried to march towards the Assistant High Commission of India but police in riot gear blocked them near the mission

when a brief clash occurred as the protestors tried to break through the security barricades. The protesters raised anti-India slogans, according to the videos on social media. In Khulna, the protestors under a banner called ‘Unity Against Indian Hegemony’ tried to march towards the Assistant High Commission of India but army soldiers and navy sailors joined hands with police to thwart the marchers. “We had enforced a stringent vigil preventing them (protestors) from proceeding towards the mission. They left the scene after staging a ‘peaceful’ rally,” Khulna’s deputy commissioner of police Tajul Islam said. The reports said in both the rallies the protestors accused India of sheltering deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina and demanded her immediate return to be exposed to gallows.

## Trump lists administration’s successes in year-end address

**New York/Washington, Dec 19:** US President Donald Trump touted his administration’s successes on immigration and in ending eight wars as he listed the various accomplishments of his second term in the White House in a year-end address to the nation. “Eleven months ago, I inherited a mess, and I’m fixing it,” Trump said as he began his 19-minute special prime time address to the nation Wednesday. Trump listed his administration’s achievements since he took office for a second term in January this year, including securing the border, “reverse migration”, bringing prices down, ending conflicts, using tariffs to bring billions of dollars into the country, enabling job creation and cracking down on immigration. “I’ve restored American strength, settled eight wars in 10 months, destroyed the Iran nuclear threat and ended the war in Gaza, bringing for the first time in 3,000 years peace to the Middle East, and secured the release of the hostages, both living and dead,” Trump said.



While Trump did not name the conflicts, he has throughout the year repeated his claim innumerable times that he ended wars between India and Pakistan, Thailand and Cambodia, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Kosovo and Serbia, Israel and Iran, Egypt and Ethiopia, as well as Rwanda and the Congo. He also touted his administration’s success in dealing with migrants coming into the country from around the world, taking up American jobs and driving up housing costs. Trump said that a major factor in driving up housing costs was the “colossal border invasion”. “We have never been invaded. This is the worst thing that frankly, in my opinion, the worst thing that the Biden administration did to our country is the invasion at the border,” he said. Trump said the Biden administration and its allies in Congress brought in “millions and millions” of migrants and gave them taxpayer-funded housing, while the rent and housing costs for Americans skyrocketed. He claimed that over 60 per cent of growth in the rental market came from foreign migrants. “At the same time, illegal aliens stole American jobs and flooded emergency rooms, getting free health care and education paid for by you, the American taxpayer,” Trump said. He claimed that for the first time in 50 years, the US is now seeing “reverse migration, as migrants go back home, leaving more housing and more jobs for Americans.” In the year before his election, all net creation of jobs was going to foreign migrants. “Since I took office, 100 per cent of all net job creation has gone to American-born citizens. Hundred per cent,” he said.

## Deposed PM Oli re-elected party chair

**Kathmandu, Dec 19:** Ousted Nepal Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli was Thursday elected as the CPN-UML’s chairman for the third consecutive term with a two-thirds majority. Oli was elected the Communist Party of Nepal- Unified Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML) chairman in a contest held three months after his government was forced to resign following a student-led protest. During the 11th general convention of the party that concluded Thursday, Oli secured 1,663 votes against his opponent Ishwor Pokharel, who received 584 votes, according to party sources. Pokharel, 71, had received the backing of former President Bidya Devi Bhandari, his rival in the presidential election. The convention started with a public meeting in the Bhaktapur district and concluded with the election of Oli and other office bearers and central committee members of the party. Shankar Pokhare, from Oli’s panel, was elected to the post of General Secretary of the party for the second term. He defeated Surendra Pandey, former finance minister, who contested the election from Pokharel’s panel. Among 19 office bearers of the party, 17 were elected from Oli’s panel, while two were from Pokharel’s panel. Prithvi Subba Gurung, Bishnu Paudel, Raghujhi Panta, Ram Bahadur Thapa and Gokarna Bishta have been elected to the post of Vice President. Among them, only Gokarna Bishta is from Oli’s rival team. Similarly, among three deputy general secretaries, Lekh Raj Bhatta, Yogesh Bhattarai and Raghupir Mahaseth, Bhattarai is from Pokharel’s team. All nine secretaries were elected from Oli’s team. Hundreds of cadres belonging to Oli took out a victory procession in Kathmandu’s Bhrikutimandap, where the general convention was held, soon after the election results were out.

The Proteas were in the match till opener Quinton de Kock (65 off 35 balls) and Dewald Brevis (31 off 17) were at the crease, but the visitors lost wickets quickly once the two departed in successive overs.

Chakravarthi (4/53) removed the dangerous Aiden Markram and Donovan Ferreira off consecutive deliveries in the 13th over to take the fight out of the South Africans by reducing them to 135 for 5 from 118 for 1 in 10 overs. Earlier, skipper Suryakumar Yadav's poor run with the bat continued as he scored just five runs but India still put up a big total with Varma and Pandya sharing a 115-

run stand for the fourth wicket.

Team India produced a stunning all-round performance to defeat South Africa by 30 runs in the fifth T20 match, clinching the series in style. Brilliant half-centuries from Tilak Varma and Hardik Pandya, followed by a magical bowling spell from Varun Chakravarthi, powered India to a memorable victory at the Narendra Modi Stadium, where fans witnessed a run-fest.

After winning the toss, South Africa captain Aiden Markram opted to field first. India got off to a solid start with openers Abhishek Sharma (34) and Sanju Samson (37) laying a strong foundation. Captain

**With Varma (73 off 42 balls) and Pandya (63 off 25 balls) in full flow, India scored a competitive 231 for 5 and then restricted the visitors to 201 for 8.**

Suryakumar Yadav had a brief stay at the crease, but the innings truly came alive when Tilak Varma and Hardik Pandya joined forces.

The duo launched a fierce counter-attack, dismantling the South African bowling with a flurry of boundaries and sixes. Hardik Pandya played a breathtaking knock, smashing 63 runs off just 25 balls, including five fours and five sixes. Tilak Varma anchored the innings beautifully, scoring 73 runs off 42 balls with ten fours and a six. Their

explosive partnership propelled India to a massive total of 231 for 5 in 20 overs. Chasing a daunting target of 232, South Africa responded positively. Opener Quinton de Kock played a superb innings, scoring 65 off 35 balls, while Dewald Brevis contributed a quick 31, keeping the visitors in the hunt. At one stage, South Africa looked capable of pulling off a remarkable chase.

However, India's bowlers rose to the occasion at crucial moments. Jasprit Bumrah broke the momentum by dismissing the dangerous de Kock, while Varun Chakravarthi turned the game on its head with a brilliant spell. The mystery spinner picked up four wickets, including two in a single over, ripping through South Africa's middle order. Bumrah was equally impressive, finishing with figures of 2 for 17 and applying the brakes with disciplined bowling.

In the end, South Africa were restricted to 201 for 8 in their 20 overs, falling short by 30 runs. India's comprehensive victory sealed.

# Eng's Ashes hopes hanging by a thread



**Adelaide, Dec 19:** Nearly four years of Ashes planning was left in smouldering ruins Thursday as England buckled under the heat and the pressure at Adelaide Oval to lurch towards a series-deciding defeat in the third test against Australia.

On a day when temperatures reached 40 degrees Celsius (104F) and fresh controversy erupted over the "Snicko" review technology, England were 213 for eight at stumps on day two, still 158 runs short of Australia's first innings 371.

England captain Ben Stokes (45 not out) was battling cramp and Jofra Archer (30 not out) showed courage to keep the ninth wicket intact for 45 runs, but the duo's late resistance could do little to make up for failures higher up the order.

Leading 2-0 in the series, Australia need only draw the match to retain the urn they have held since 2017/18.

But there was little sign the hosts would be content with anything less than another crushing win after their comfortable victories in Perth and Brisbane.

There was certainly no easing back into the action for Australia's returning captain Pat Cummins and recalled spinner Nathan Lyon, who combined to blitz England's top order before lunch.

"Pretty proud about how the boys went about it," Lyon told TNT Sports. "Pat's been phenomenal as captain as always, but the effort from our fast bowlers to get them 213-8 off 68 overs it's a pretty big effort so rest up, recover and we'll have another crack in the morning."

England lost 3-5 in a collapse that may have snuffed out the last flicker of optimism from having earlier denied Australia a 400-plus total on a flat wicket. Cummins threw his reha-

bilitated back into his work, removing Zak Crawley (9) caught behind in a partnership-breaking dismissal before Lyon struck with two wickets in four balls.

Lyon's second dismissal was a peach, bowling Ben Duckett for 29 with a ball that gripped, turned and beat the outside edge.

It put the wily off-spinner second on Australia's all-time test wickets list on 564, one ahead of pace great Glenn McGrath and behind only Shane Warne.

Lyon's first wicket was a gift, though, as under-fire number three Ollie Pope surrendered it for three with a flick off his pads caught at midwicket.

**SNICKO IN THE SPOTLIGHT**

A Snicko controversy had engulfed day one and a new one flared late on day two.

England wicketkeeper Jamie Smith was at the centre of the confusion, first surviving a caught-behind appeal when on 16 then being given out caught behind for 22 when he appeared to completely miss a Cummins ball.

With third umpire Chris Gaffaney having to rule on both decisions, Snicko only appeared to muddy the waters rather than clear up matters.

Australia paceman Mitchell Starc said Snicko needed to be "sacked" after Smith's earlier reprieve, while Smith left the field furious when he was eventually dismissed.

When focus shifted back to the cricket, England ended up losing 3-9 to fall to 168 for eight courtesy of a two-wicket burst from pacer Scott Boland before Archer joined Stokes to push England past 200.

### Ketan wins women's 10m air pistol gold

**New Delhi, Dec 19:** Haryana's Ketan Malik overcame a strong field comprising Paris Olympic double medallist Manu Bhaker and was crowned the women's 10m air pistol national champion here Thursday. Ketan struck the gold with 240.0, ahead of Meenu Pathak of Delhi, who took silver with 238.4, and Surbhi Rao, who claimed bronze with 219.5. In the junior women's category, Vanshika Chaudhary from Uttar Pradesh emerged on top, edging out Anjali Shekhawat by 0.2 for gold, while Asian Games champion Palak Gulia secured bronze, and Army Marksman-ship Unit's Lakshita Bishnoi claimed the youth title after a narrow 0.6 victory over Rashmika Sahgal, with Sanskriti Bana completing the podium. The final followed an extensive qualification phase that saw over 900 shooters compete across 39 relays. Gulia topped the qualification with 582.24x. She was joined at the top by Bhaker, who also shot 582, finishing second on inner-10 count with 19x. In the final, Bhaker finished seventh with 137.2, followed by Anjali Choudhary on 110.1, while Mohini Singh ended fourth with 197.9 and Anjali Shekhawat placed sixth with 157.5.



# WFI tightens selection norms for wrestlers

**The wrestling body makes presence at national camp must; bars wrestlers from training independently**

**New Delhi, Dec 19:** The Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) has unveiled a new selection policy that makes attendance at national camps mandatory to be eligible for national selection, bars wrestlers from training independently and mandates Olympic Games quota-winning athletes to appear in a final one-bout selection trial.

The policy was discussed and cleared at WFI's recent General Council meeting during the National Camp in Ahmedabad.

It was also presented to the Sports Authority of India (SAI) for feedback and a review.

**No Nat'l camp, no India jersey**

"Participation in the National Coaching Camp is mandatory for all wrestlers, including elite and iconic athletes. To be eligible for the camp, a wrestler must have won a medal in the National Championship of the concerned year," the policy under the sub-head National Coaching Camps, stated.

"Once selected, wrestlers are required to train exclusively at the designated national camp. No athlete is permitted to train independently at any other venue," it added.

It means that Vinesh Phogat, who recently announced her comeback from retirement, will have to prove herself at the domestic level before being reckoning for a spot in the



national team.

The policy made it clear that a failure to attend the camp will make the wrestler "ineligible to participate in the selection trials".

The policy has also made a provision to keep a list of reserve wrestler, who will be asked to do the national duty in case of injury to selected athlete.

The WFI policy makes it clear that "past performances

will not be considered for selection trials." "We are not going to give trials exemption to anyone. No athlete can sit on past achievements. In the past, few athletes had asked for exemption which is not fair to up and coming wrestlers, WFI will give equal opportunity to all," a WFI official told PTI.

The policy mentions, that "to be eligible, a wrestler must

have won a medal in at least one of the following competitions of the concerned year: National Championship, Federation Cup and any other WFI-recognised competition."

**Selection trials must for international competitions**

The policy also states that trials are mandatory for teams representing India in major international competitions such as Olympic Games, Asian Games, Continental Championships and World Championships.

The objective of the trials is to provide fair opportunity, assessment of form and fitness, transparency, accountability and merit-based representation.

The WFI asserted that Olympic quotas are awarded to the nation and not to individual athletes and it reserves the right to conduct trials for Olympic participation.

WFI made it clear that quota winner will not compete in the initial trials and will fight it out with the winner of the trials and if he/she loses, will be given a second chance to reclaim the quota.

The selection committee will be headed by the WFI President. It will also include the Secretary General or Vice President and will have either a Dronacharya/Arjuna/Dhyanchand awardee apart from chief coach of that discipline and the foreign coach.

Apart from this, the chief coach can recommend barring a wrestler from trials on count of indiscipline or poor attendance. The selection committee may uphold the recommendation and WFI reserves the right to take disciplinary action against wrestlers found overweight during international competition.



MISSTERIOUS MOVIE REVIEW:

A Suspense Thriller with a Hint of Horror

Missterious is one of the small-budget films in recent times that generated positive buzz ahead of its release. The promotional content clearly hinted at a suspense thriller, and the presence of comedy legend Brahmanandam at the pre-release event further boosted audience curiosity. The film has now hit theatres, and here is a balanced review.

**Story**  
Kondapur Sub-Inspector Ramkhi alias Ram Kumar (Abid Bhushan) goes missing under mysterious circumstances. To crack the case, ACP Anand Sai (Balaraj Wadi) steps in. During the investigation, he questions architect Virat (Rohit Sahni) and his wife Shilpa (Meghna Rajput). What is the connection between Virat and Shilpa and SI Ramkhi's disappearance? Why did Ramkhi visit the villa purchased by Virat? How does Missira (Riya Kapoor) enter the story? And most impor-

tantly, who killed SI Ramkhi? These questions unfold through a series of twists, suspenseful turns, and surprises.

**Analysis**  
While watching Missterious, viewers may be reminded of familiar triangle love stories seen in everyday life. However, the director gives this routine setup a fresh spin by blending it with suspense, thriller elements, and a subtle horror layer. It is evident that the story has been written with care, keeping the genre's demands in mind. Being a suspense thriller, the director avoids unnecessary delays in character introductions and quickly moves into the core plot. Characters are introduced while the story progresses, ensuring that twists arrive at regular intervals. The identity of the killer remains a question mark until the climax, which helps keep the audience engaged. In this aspect, the director

succeeds to a fair extent. The interval block delivers an un-

expected twist, pushing the story to the next level. In the second half, the

addition of horror elements intensifies the suspense further. A major twist in the climax changes the course of the narrative and is likely to shock viewers who think they have already figured out the killer.

**Performances**  
Director Mahi Komatireddy has included three songs, all placed appropriately within the narrative, which works in the film's favour. Music director ML Raja provides suitable background score and songs that complement the thriller mood.

In terms of performances, most actors deliver solid work. Rohit Sahni, Riya Kapoor, Meghna Rajput, and Abid Bhushan perform convincingly in the lead roles. Balaraj Wadi stands out as the senior police officer with his trademark performance. Jabardasth fame Rajamouli gets a meaningful role and does justice to it, while Gaddam Naveen, though appearing briefly, performs within his scope.

One drawback is that most of the cast are relatively unfamiliar faces, which slightly affects the film's overall impact. With more attention to casting, the film could have benefited further.

**Technical Aspects**  
ML Raja's music enhances the suspense-thriller atmosphere effectively. Cinematographer Parvathu Devendra Suri deserves praise for his visuals. However, since he also handled editing, tighter editing in certain portions would have improved the pace. Production values are decent and suit the scale of the film.

**Verdict**  
Missterious is a suspense thriller that goes beyond the genre by adding a horror touch. Despite a few shortcomings, it manages to keep viewers hooked with its twists and climax. It is a film worth watching at least once for fans of suspense and thriller movies.
