HM Amit Shah to inaugurate Growth Summit in MP

BHOPAL (TSIT): Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah will inaugurate a major state-level event titled 'Abhyudaya Madhya Pradesh Growth Summit – Investment to Employment' on December 25, at the Mela Ground in Gwalior. Mohan Yadav will also participate in the event, which coincides with the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister and Bharat Ratna recipient, the late Atal Bihari Vajpayee, a government statement issued here on Wednesday said. Key activities include the distribution of land allocation documents and letters of intent, alongside honouring investors who have successfully set up and operationalised employment-generating industrial units.

Telangana ACB uncovers assets worth over Rs 100 crore amassed by govt official

Hyderabad, Dec 24 : Telangana's Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) is continuing its probe against an official of the Telangana transport department who allegedly amassed assets worth over Rs 100 crore. The officials probing the disproportionate assets case against Mood Kishan, Deputy Transport Commissioner, Mahabubnagar district, were shocked to find the properties owned by him. Though the document value of his properties is pegged at Rs 12.72 crore, their actual market value is estimated to be over Rs 100 crore. The 31-acre agricultural land he holds in Sangareddy district near Hyderabad alone is estimated to be worth over Rs 60 crore.

CM Revanth Vows 2/3 Majority for Congress in Next Assembly Polls

HYDERABAD TSIT: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday declared that the Congress will return to power with a resounding two-thirds majority in the next Assembly elections, asserting that the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) and its president K. Chandrashekhara Rao (KCR) would not come back to power. Addressing a gathering of newly elected Sarpanches and ward members of Gram Panchayats from the Kodangal Assembly constituency at Kosgi, the Chief Minister expressed confidence that Congress would win 87 of the 119 Assembly seats in the 2029 elections. In the event of delimitation, he said the party would secure 100 out of 150 seats.

Revanth Reddy criticised KCR over his recent political remarks and said Congress would not be intimidated by such comments. He challenged the former Chief Minister to an open debate in the Assembly on issues including the Kaleshwaram project, Krishna and Godavari river water sharing, and alleged phone tapping.



CM Revanth Announces financial support for Gram Panchayats and highlights key welfare schemes

Referring to the phone-tapping issue, he said even KTR's sister had spoken publicly on the matter, while the BRS leadership failed to respond meaningfully.

The Chief Minister alleged that the previous BRS government neglected the Palamuru region for a decade and failed to complete irrigation projects, resulting in injustice to the area. He said

the present government has resumed works on stalled projects and is committed to equitable regional development.

Announcing financial support for local bodies, Revanth Reddy said Rs.10 lakh would be sanctioned to major Gram Panchayats and Rs.5 lakh to minor Gram Panchayats under a Special Development Fund. Additional assistance would also be extended through Chief Minister's discretionary funds, besides allocations from State and Central schemes. He called upon local representatives to work beyond party lines for development now that elections were over.

No mining, no dilution: Central govt throws full shield over Aravallis

NEW DELHI (TSIT) : In a decisive move to curb illegal mining and strengthen ecological protection, the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) has directed state governments to impose a "complete ban on the grant of any new mining leases in the



Aravallis", covering the entire mountain range from Delhi to Gujarat. The Ministry said the prohibition will apply

uniformly across the entire Aravalli landscape, underscoring that the objective is to "preserve the integrity of the range as a continuous geological ridge" extending from Gujarat to the National Capital Region and to bring an end to all unregulated mining activities.

Will move SC to challenge Kuldeep Singh Sengar's bail: Unnao rape survivor

NEW DELHI (TSIT): As former MLA and Unnao rape case convict Kuldeep Singh Sengar secured conditional bail by the Delhi High Court, the rape survivor expressed deep anguish over the decision, saying she was unhappy with the judgment, and alleged that BJP leader Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh has influenced the outcome.

The survivor said she would approach the Supreme Court to challenge the High Court's order. Former BJP MLA Sengar was convicted of kidnapping and raping the minor girl in 2017. On Tuesday, the Delhi High Court suspended the jail sentence of Sengar.

A bench comprising Justices Subramonium Prasad and Harish Vaidyanathan Shankar granted him bail, directing him to furnish a personal bond of Rs 15 lakh along with three sureties of the same amount. Reacting strongly to



the development, the survivor told IANS, "I want to say only this, that I am not happy with this High Court judgment. I felt that I could have ended my life, but then I thought about my children and my family. But then I thought that God has given me life, so I should fight for justice."

She also pointed to what she described as a glaring injustice in the legal process, referring to her uncle, whom she said was falsely implicated in a two-decade-old case filed by Sengar's brother, Atul Singh. According to her, despite filing multiple bail applications, her uncle has not been granted relief.

Chennai students win NASA award for affordable, homegrown satellite internet

CHENNAI (TSIT) A team of Chennai-based engineering students has beaten over 18,000 projects worldwide to win the "Most Inspirational" award at the NASA International Space Apps Challenge 2025.

Their project, "Photonics Odyssey" or AakashNet, aims to bridge the digital divide in India by delivering high-speed, low-cost internet to the country's most remote villages. "AakashNet conceptually adopts the working philosophy long demonstrated by ISRO," Prasanth Gopalakrishnan, a second year electronics and communication engineering student of SRM Easwari Engineering College, said. At the NASA International Space Apps Challenge, one of the world's largest annual global hackathons, the team's submission made it to the top 10 projects, winning the 'Most Inspirational' award.

Launched in 2012, the challenge hopes to foster innovation using NASA's free and open data from satellites, telescopes and missions and create solutions for Earth and space. Now that the team's proposal has the "NASA stamp", Gopalakrishnan is confident of "institutional support" to develop this as a public digital utility. "Most global satel-

lite internet systems follow a strongly commercial model. Their hardware is manufactured abroad using imported materials and technologies, and when these systems are brought into India, the final cost often becomes too high for large sections of the population," said Gopalakrishnan. Gopalakrishnan said this

is where ISRO's working philosophy — which has consistently delivered highly reliable space technology at globally unmatched cost efficiency without compromising performance or safety — served as an inspiration to the team.

"Using publicly available information and real-world system constraints, our project explores how a similar India-first, efficiency-driven approach could be applied to satellite broadband infrastructure," he said. His winning team comprised Rajalingam N, Rashi Menon and Sakthi Sanjeev Kumar from electronics and communication engineering department as well as Deeraj Kumar and Manish Varma D from computer science engineering department, specialising in Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning.

ISRO successfully launches BlueBird Block-2 satellite into orbit

NEW DELHI, DEC 24 : In yet another historic feat, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Wednesday successfully launched LVM3-M6 rocket, carrying United States' new generation BlueBird Block-2 communication satellite.

"Mission Success. The LVM3-M6 mission has successfully placed the BlueBird Block-2 satellite into its intended orbit," said ISRO in an X post. The communication satellite, weighing 6,100 kg, is the heaviest payload to be placed into the Low Earth Orbit (LEO) in LVM3 launch history. The previous heaviest was the L V M 3 - M 5 Communication Satellite 03, weighing about 4,400 kg that was successfully launched by ISRO on November 2 in the Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO).

The satellite is part of a next generation of BlueBird Block-2 communication satellites, designed to provide space-based cellular broadband connectivity directly to standard mobile smartphones.

This mission marks the 6th operational flight of the LVM3 launch vehicle. It also represents a significant leap in telecommunications technology, as the massive 6,100 kg payload is designed to provide high-speed 4G and 5G connectivity directly to smartphones.

"Kudos Team ISRO for the successful launch of LVM3-M6 carrying BlueBird Block-2. With the visionary patronage of PM Narendra Modi, ISRO continues to achieve one success after another, reiterating India's growing prowess in Space tech-



nology," said Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh in an X post.

BlueBird communications satellite, developed by the US-based AST SpaceMobile, will be launched on board India's most powerful rocket LVM3. It is one of the heaviest commercial satellites, weighing 6.5 tonnes. The Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellite arrived in India from the US on October 19.

This is the second collaboration between the US and ISRO. In July, the ISRO successfully launched the \$1.5 billion

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday lauded the successful take off of Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM3)-M6, carrying BlueBird 6, calling it a "significant stride" in India's space sector. India's Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM3)-M6, carrying BlueBird 6, took off from Andhra Pradesh's Sriharikota on Wednesday.

In a post on X, PM Modi said, "A significant stride in India's space sector... The successful LVM3-M6 launch, placing the heaviest satellite ever launched from Indian soil, the spacecraft of USA, BlueBird Block-2, into its intended orbit, marks a proud milestone in



India's space journey." "It strengthens India's heavy-lift launch capability and reinforces our growing role in the global commercial launch market. This is also reflective of our efforts towards an Aatmanirbhar Bharat. Congratulations to our hardworking space scientists and engineers. India continues to soar higher in the world of space!" he added.

NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar Mission (NISAR), aimed at taking high-resolution Earth scans with a capacity to penetrate through fogs, dense clouds, and ice layers. AST SpaceMobile has

already launched five satellites -- BlueBird 1 to 5 -- in September 2024. With an aim to expand this network further, the company has partnered with more than 50 mobile operators worldwide.

CM Vijayan slams attacks on Christmas celebrations

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM : Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Wednesday strongly condemned attacks on Christmas celebrations across the country, warning that any attempt to undermine constitutional freedoms and Kerala's pluralistic ethos would not be tolerated. Vijayan said this while speaking to the media on Christmas eve here.

"The incidents of violence and intimidation targeting Christmas observances were deeply disturbing and aimed at dimming a message of peace and humanity that resonates across the world," said Vijayan. He said that widespread attacks on Christmas-related events in states including Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, Haryana, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Bihar and Jharkhand are disturbing.



Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences Confers B.Des Degree on Gadde Ansley Hansita



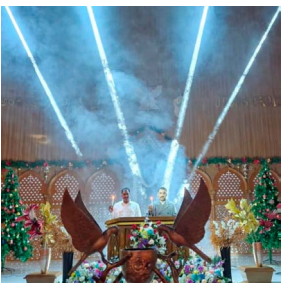

on education models, and success stories from T-Hub and WE-Hub inspire the next generation of scholars and entrepreneurs. Plans are afoot for a full-fledged T-SAT mobile app on the lines of SWAYAM-NPTEL, but customised for Telangana's syllabi and linguistic diversity.

Perhaps the most innovative aspect of T-SAT's evolution is its expansion beyond classrooms into a genuine multi-departmental public communication platform. The Health department uses it to train ASHA workers and ANMs on new protocols and to run vaccination and disease-awareness campaigns. Women & Child Welfare reaches anganwadi staff with early childhood education modules and POSHAN Abhiyaan updates. Farmers receive real-time crop advisories, pest alerts and modern irrigation techniques from the Agriculture department. Panchayat Raj functionaries undergo governance training; electricity linemen learn grid-safety norms; revenue officials disseminate information on Dharani and Bhubharati portals; forest guards are sensitised to biodiversity laws; and even temple staff receive modules on disaster preparedness and digital donations. Road-safety campaigns, energy-conservation drives, municipal tax awareness programmes and labour-law education complete a spectrum that is breathtaking in its range. This convergence has been made possible by seamless collaboration with some of India's finest educational organisations — Dream a Dream, Agastya Foundation, Rishi Valley, SECMOL Ladakh, Gyan Shala, PRATHAM, and the Indian School of Business — whose best practices have been digitised and made freely available to every child and citizen of Telangana.

Two years is a short span in the life of any government, yet the distance travelled by T-SAT is nothing short of remarkable. It has democratised access to quality education, bridged urban-rural and privilege gaps, empowered women, upskilled youth, and brought government services into the living rooms of the poorest households. In an age when public broadcasting is often dismissed as a relic, Telangana has shown how a satellite network, guided by political will and administrative imagination, can become a powerful engine of social justice and inclusive growth. As the "Praja Palana Vijayotshavulu" draw to a close, T-SAT stands as a luminous example of what people-centric governance can achieve when technology is harnessed not for spectacle, but for service. It is a story worth celebrating and emulating.

Railways to extend AI-based system on 981-km track in Northeast to protect wild animals

NEW DELHI: Days after eight elephants were killed in Assam after a herd crossing the tracks was hit by a Rajdhani Express, the Railway ministry has announced that an AI-based system in place to detect presence of wild animals around rail lines will be extended to a further 981-km track in the north-eastern region.

The ministry has announced the award of a tender to install the AI-enabled Intrusion Detection System (IDS).

The IDS, which gives early alerts to loco pilots in case elephants come on the railway track, has already been implemented at 141-route km section on pilot basis on the Northeast Frontier Railway. These are Madarihath-Nagrakata under Alipurduar division, Habaipur-Lamsakhanga-Patharkhola-Lumding under Lumding division, Rangiya division's Kamakhya-Azara-Mirza



section and Titabar-Mariani-Nakachari under Tinsukia.

The incident took place early morning on December 20 when the Sairang-New Delhi Rajdhani Express hit the herd in Changjurai village in Assam's Hojai district. Five coaches and the train's engine also derailed.

"Indian Railways has already deployed Artificial Intelligence (AI) enabled Intrusion Detection System (IDS) using Distributed Acoustic System (DAS) for detecting presence of elephants on railway tracks. With the new ten-

der, the total coverage will extend to 1,122 route km," the ministry said. Elaborating on the functioning of the IDS, the ministry said the system generates real-time alerts for loco pilots, station masters and control rooms about the movement of elephants in proximity of railway tracks, enabling timely preventive action.

Besides ISD, the ministry said that AI-based cameras will be installed to alert loco pilots 0.5 km in advance to save lions, tigers and other wild animals along with elephants. "Indian Railways has been taking continu-

ous efforts to prevent wildlife casualties, particularly elephants, on railway tracks through technology-based solutions," it said.

"The deployment and expansion of the AI-enabled Intrusion Detection System using Distributed Acoustic System (DAS) reflects Indian Railways' commitment to wildlife conservation and safe train operations," it added.

On October 20, the Northeast Frontier Railway zone said that IDS would be rolled out in its network by April, 2026 to prevent the death of elephants by speeding trains. The NFR had first installed IDS at two locations of the Lumding and Alipurduar divisions in 2022. "The target date for completion of this expanded project has been set for April 2026, by which the system is expected to be fully functional across all identified elephant corridors," the NFR had said.

Thackeray cousins want power, not development of Mumbai: Shinde



MUMBAI: Maharashtra deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on Wednesday alleged that the Thackeray cousins have come together only for power, and lack any kind of program for Mumbai's development.

Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray and Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) president Raj Thackeray earlier in the day announced the alliance of their parties ahead of the January 15 Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) elections. Talking to reporters here, Shinde,

who heads the rival Shiv Sena faction, said there was no mention of development at the cousins' press conference. "Those who deviated from (late Shiv Sena founder) Balasaheb Thackeray's ideology have been taught a lesson in the assembly elections last year and the recent municipal council and nagar panchayat polls," he said.

"They have no development agenda, their goal is only to get power. These people drove Marathi-speakers out of Mumbai. The assembly polls and recent local elections have shown which is the fake and which is the real Shiv Sena," said Shinde who rebelled against Uddhav Thackeray's leadership and split the party in June 2022. He also accused the Thackerays of blocking development projects, and said the Mahayuti government introduced cluster development and expedited redevelopment projects.

Delhi's AQI moves from 'severe' to 'very poor' category



NEW DELHI: Delhi's air quality saw some improvement on Wednesday morning, with the AQI moving to 'very poor' from 'severe' the day before, according to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

The national capital's Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 336 in the morning, as against 415 on Tuesday, the CPCB data showed.

Of Delhi's 40 air quality monitoring stations, 36 recorded AQI in the 'very poor' category. Nehru Nagar recorded the highest reading of 392, the CPCB's Sameer app showed.

An AQI between 0

and 50 is considered 'good', 51 to 100 'satisfactory', 101 to 200 'moderate', 201 to 300 'poor', 301 to 400 'very poor', and 401 to 500 'severe'.

Fog and smog reduced visibility in some parts of Delhi early in the morning.

Delhi recorded a minimum temperature of 10.2 degrees Celsius, 2.7 notches above normal. The maximum temperature is expected to hover around 19 degrees Celsius, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said.

The humidity level stood at 100 per cent. The IMD has forecast moderate fog during the day.

SCR to run Christmas-New Year special trains between Hyderabad and Mumbai

Hyderabad: In view of the additional rush of passengers during the Christmas and New Year season, South Central Railway (SCR) has announced the operation of special trains between Hyderabad and Lokmanya Tilak Terminus (LTT), Mumbai.

Train No. 07458 Hyderabad-LTT Mumbai Special will depart from Hyderabad at 5.30 pm on December 28, 2025, and arrive at LTT Mumbai at 10.40 am the next day. In the return direction, Train No. 07459 LTT Mumbai-Hyderabad Special will leave LTT Mumbai at 3.20 pm on December 29, 2025, and reach Hyderabad at 9.00 am the following day. These special trains will have stoppages at Begumpet, Lingampalli, Vikarabad, Tandur, Wadi, Kalaburagi, Solapur, Pune, and Kalyan stations in both directions. The trains will consist of First AC, Second AC, Third AC, Sleeper Class, and General Second Class coaches, providing convenience to passengers travelling during the festive season.



3 minors caught for stone-pelting on Vande Bharat Express in Bihar



Muzaffarpur, Dec 24: The Railway Protection Force (RPF) on Tuesday evening apprehended three minors for allegedly damaging three windows of the Vande Bharat Express by pelting stones at the train while it was passing through Muzaffarpur district in Bihar, officials said on Wednesday.

Superintendent of Police (Rail) Beena Kumari said the minors were caught in the Kaparpura area near Kanti, a few hours after the incident. "During the investigation, it came to light that the minors threw stones at the running train while playing near the railway track," she added. The incident damaged windows of coaches C7, C4 and E1.

Legal formalities are being completed in the matter, the SP said. The Vande Bharat Express (Train No. 26502), running between Gorakhpur and Patna (Patliputra Junction), was attacked near Chakia station while travelling towards Muzaffarpur from Narkatiaganj.

This marks the fourth stone-pelting incident targeting the Vande Bharat Express in the region. In August, a similar attack near Chakia in East Champaran damaged a window, leading to the apprehension of three minors. In July, another stone-pelting incident near Mohammad Balami village in Muzaffarpur caused damage to a coach window.

Will move SC to challenge Kuldeep Singh Sengar's bail: Unnao rape survivor

NEW DELHI: As former MLA and Unnao rape case convict Kuldeep Singh Sengar secured conditional bail by the Delhi High Court, the rape survivor expressed deep anguish over the decision, saying she was unhappy with the judgment, and alleged that BJP leader Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh has influenced the outcome. The survivor said she would approach the Supreme Court to challenge the High Court's order. Former BJP MLA Sengar was convicted of kidnapping and raping the minor girl in 2017.

On Tuesday, the Delhi High Court suspended the jail sentence of Sengar. A bench comprising Justices Subramonium Prasad and Harish Vaidyanathan Shankar granted him bail, directing him to furnish a personal bond of Rs 15 lakh along with three sureties of the same amount.

Reacting strongly to the development, the survivor told IANS, "I want to say only this, that I am not happy with this High Court judgment. I felt that I could have ended my life, but then I thought about my children and my family. But then I thought that God has given me life, so I should fight for justice." She also pointed to what she described as a glaring injustice in the legal process, referring to her uncle, whom she said was falsely implicated in a two-decade-old case filed by Sengar's brother, Atul Singh. According to her, despite filing multiple bail applications, her uncle has not been granted relief.

"On the other hand, the one who raped me, who got my father killed at the hands of his brother, is getting bail from the court. This means he is a powerful man with money," she said. Making serious allegations, the survivor claimed political backing was behind the decision. Reacting strongly to the development, the survivor told IANS, "I want to say only this, that



am not happy with this High Court judgment. I felt that I could have ended my life, but then I thought about my children and my family. But then I thought that God has given me life, so I should fight for justice." She also pointed to what she described as a glaring injustice in the legal process, referring to her uncle, whom she said was falsely implicated in a two-decade-old case filed by Sengar's brother, Atul Singh. According to her, despite filing multiple bail applications, her uncle has not been granted relief.

"On the other hand, the one who raped me, who got my father killed at the hands of his brother, is getting bail from the court. This means he is a powerful man with money," she said. Making serious allegations, the survivor claimed political backing was behind the decision. "He has all the backing from Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh. I think they have bribed the judge. That is why this decision was taken. This is an injustice. I will go to the Supreme Court," she told IANS. The survivor also spoke about alleged police high-handedness during a recent protest. She said she and her family members were forcibly stopped from holding a dharna near India Gate. "When we went to India Gate, the

police did not let us hold a dharna. The police belong to the BJP. They picked me up in an improper manner. I have 250 stitches all over my body, despite that I was improperly picked up and thrown into the bus," she alleged. She further claimed that she was taken to a police station and later released, adding that social activist Yogita Bhayana, who was accompanying her during the protest, was also treated in a similar manner.

Meanwhile, the survivor's mother voiced grave fears about the safety of her family following Sengar's release on bail. "They have tried to kill us several times. We are not happy with the decision. They will find us, torture us and kill us. My husband was brutally killed, my brother-in-law is in jail, my sister-in-law and her sister were also killed; they will kill us all," she said, adding that the authorities had withdrawn the family's security cover.

Expressing loss of faith in the judicial process, the mother told IANS, "Now, I do not have any trust in the Delhi High Court. How can they grant bail to such a powerful man who has committed such a heinous crime?" The Unnao rape case has been marked by a series of tragic incidents involving the survivor's family.

Congress Bets On Priyanka Gandhi

Before Priyanka Gandhi Vadra finally joined active politics, adoring Congress folk used to call her the party's "Brahmastra", that is, the 'ultimate weapon'. Considering the buildup, many may say that the ultimate weapon proved to be rather a dud. Even so, the Congress party considered politics to be 'PGV's' manifest destiny. In the Winter Session of Parliament, PGV did not disappoint her admirers in the party with her impassioned speech on the Vande Mataram controversy. Unlike her sibling, the Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, who often ends up courting controversy on the floor of the House with his fiery comments, she managed to score points against the Modi government all with a smiling face and a gentle but unyielding speech. The cordiality didn't end there. PGV went ahead making friends and influencing people with a chat over tea and snacks with Nitin Gadkari, the Union Minister of Transport. Reportedly, six projects in Kerala featured in the discussion. Gandhi also attended the Speaker's tea - the first person from the Gandhi family to do so after the 2024 election results - and wasn't hesitant to share details about it outside Parliament. Rahul's Striking Absence "Sources" says that even senior government ministers were impressed by her 'Vande Mataram' intervention - at a time when Rahul Gandhi, ironically, seemed to have decided that a trip to Germany to meet the Indian diaspora was more important than missing a week of the Winter Session of Parliament. Many also credit PGV for ensuring that Shashi Tharoor and Manish Tewari, two Congress leaders who have long been left out in the cold in the 'Rahul' scheme of things, were allowed to speak in the House. A senior Congress leader considered close to PGV rightly points out: "when the cat is away, the mice will play". PGV's improved public persona - even if orchestrated and intentional - has aroused frenzied debate in the Congress party, which has long been devoid of anything positive to talk about and dampened after a



string of election defeats from Maharashtra and Haryana to Delhi and Bihar.<So, what gives, and what is the big takeaway from the 'public display of affection' for PGV? I spoke to six senior Congress leaders before writing this column, and there is across-the-board unanimity that the Congress needs to give PGV a bigger public role, perhaps on par with Rahul Gandhi. They say she is far more accessible than her brother and much more pleasant to deal with, with an ability to say 'no' with grace. On the other hand, say senior leaders, Rahul Gandhi is seen as unapproachable and comfortable only with his own coterie of leaders, who keep giving him "unworkable advice"; "without hearing you out", says a leader, "he [Rahul] will deliver his decision", cutting you off mid-sentence and leaving the room. Priyanka, in contrast to all that, is perceived and even respected for being a "listener". Let Her Take The Lead The thing, however, is that PGV has always chosen to downplay her role and, at least publicly, defers to her older brother. Another Congress leader insists that though the two siblings share a very warm personal equation, it is high time the party utilised her qualities to complement Rahul's leadership. Can't be more diplo-

matic than that, said another leader when I asked him. However, irrespective of whether this sharp spotlight on PGV is organic or manufactured, public opinion about giving PGV a larger campaign role is undeniable and only growing, reflected in viral and much-liked social media reels of her Parliament speech. Sources also state that a bigger role for her is a clear possibility, though they scoff at rumours that Sachin Pilot, another young leader, may be roped in to re-energise the All India Congress Committee. Pilot has made it very clear that his focus was and remains Rajasthan. Another buzz in the Congress is about PGV replacing the general secretary in charge of organisation, KC Venugopal, who is close to Rahul Gandhi but, reportedly, not very popular among many Congress leaders. In any case, Venugopal is unlikely to leave Gandhi's side till he is declared the face for the Kerala elections due next year. Nonetheless, expect PGV to shed her self-imposed reticence and take the lead both within and without Parliament with other opposition parties. Her meeting with Prashant Kishor after his gigantic Bihar defeat was one of the first of many such planned meetings. As for her sibling, Rahul, he remains the chief

ideologue and the man to whom much of the party and his own family defer - for now at least. One of the that catapulted Revanth Reddy to the Chief Minister's chair in Telangana is his aggression. He does not believe in keeping it subtle when he wants to drive a point home. When he spoke about "sacrifices" by Sonia Gandhi that have enabled Christians to celebrate Christmas in Telangana, it was not so much about sycophancy as a well-thought-out political strategy. As expected, it caught everyone's attention and sent the political mercury soaring. The BJP has called it "Olympic-level sycophancy and boot-licking" and said this was an insult to Jesus Christ and the Christian community, and mockingly suggested that the Congress may next claim the Sun rises because of the Gandhi family. The BRS called it political theatrics and recirculated videos from when Revanth Reddy was in the Telugu Desam Party and had reportedly referred to Sonia Gandhi as "Bali Devatha" (Deity of Sacrifice), blaming her for the death of young people during the movement for a separate state. Examine the statement: "If people are celebrating Christmas in Telangana today, it is because of Sonia Gandhi's sacrifice."

Addressing a press conference at Karnataka Bhavan in Delhi, he said, "I love being a party worker more than holding any position in the party. That



is a permanent position for me. Since 1980, I have been a party worker, and I will continue to be a party worker in the future as well."When asked whether he would be happy continuing as Deputy Chief Minister for five years, Shivakumar replied, "I

will remain a party worker. The position of party worker is the only permanent position for me."

Responding to another question, Shivakumar said, "On this trip, I am not meeting anyone because I don't think anyone is here. I will not meet any national leaders in Delhi, as no one is currently in the city. AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge is in Bengaluru.

Deve Gowda Made Party in Supreme Court Writ on NICE Project

Bengaluru: Former Prime Minister H.D. Deve Gowda revealed that a writ petition concerning the Bengaluru-Mysuru Infrastructure Project (NICE) has been filed in the Supreme Court, and he has been named as a party in the case. Speaking at a press conference at JP Bhavan, he said the State Government, some farmers, and himself are included as parties.

Deve Gowda noted that the project, covering Bengaluru, Mandya, and Mysuru, involved the construction of five townships and concrete roads and had received the concurrence of the Finance Department during his tenure as Chief Minister, when Siddaramaiah was Finance Minister. He criticised the appointment of additional legal consultants for the matter, alleging that around Rs.55 lakh is being spent on lawyers despite the presence of State Government legal advisors.



"I still have the determination to fight. I have the strength to struggle," he asserted, highlighting the prevalence of contract workers in government institutions and unfilled vacancies, citing Victoria Hospital as an example. Deve Gowda also criticised the current State Government for blaming the Centre for every issue, saying such criticism is unproductive. He emphasised the importance of attending DISHA meetings with the Prime Minister and taking proactive steps for Karnataka.

receive their rightful money." On law and order, Ashok remarked, "The drug mafia is strong, and police transfers are rampant. Criminal activities have increased under Congress. A new hate speech bill curtails freedom of speech and targets opposition and media. We will appeal

to the Governor not to sign it."

He also highlighted issues left unaddressed in the House, including misuse of Dalit funds, ration card cancellations, wildlife conflicts, and stalled development projects. "Congress benches were empty, indicating weak leadership.

Infighting has hampered governance, and the high command has told them to resolve matters themselves," he added.

Ashok further criticized the state for failing to continue central government schemes, withholding funds, and failing to allocate land for railways and lakes. He raised concerns over wildlife, citing the deaths of 206 elephants, 61 leopards, 19 peacocks, and other animals under forest department custody, and lamented the cancellation of safaris affecting tourism and local livelihoods.

He concluded by pointing to the recent town panchayat election results, stating that BJP's majority reflected public dissatisfaction with the Congress government's misrule.

TN to regularise over 1,000 contract nurses in first phase; stir withdrawn



CHENNAI: The Tamil Nadu government on Wednesday announced that more than 1,000 contract nurses would be regularised in the first phase, following a series of negotiations with protesting nursing associations. The decision, taken on the instructions of Chief Minister M K Stalin, has led to the withdrawal of the nurses' agitation, Health and Family Welfare Minister Ma Subramanian said in

a statement. Contract nurses recruited through the Medical Services Recruitment Board (MRB) had been staging continuous protests demanding permanent appointments. Acting on the Chief Minister's directions, the Health Minister held talks with representatives of the contract nurses on December 19 and 22, and again on December 24, after placing their

demands before the Chief Minister. Based on the latest round of discussions, the government has decided to clear pending promotions and create new posts to facilitate the appointment of existing contract nurses to permanent positions. "As an immediate step, over 1,000 contract nurses will soon be absorbed into regular service. The remaining nurses will be regularised in a phased manner," the Minister said. Highlighting the government's record, Subramanian pointed out that of the 6,395 contract nurses appointed in 2015 during the previous AIADMK regime, only 1,871 were regularised up to 2020. In contrast, since the DMK government assumed office in 2021, as many as 4,825 contract nurses have been regularised over the past four-and-a-half years. In 2024 alone, 1,693 nurses were granted permanent status.

Chennai: CM Stalin flags off 20 AC luxury buses ahead of holiday rush

CHENNAI: To upgrade public transport services, Chief Minister MK Stalin on Wednesday flagged off the services of 20 multi-axle air-conditioned luxury buses at the Island Grounds in Chennai.

The buses have been procured at a cost of Rs 34.30 crore for the State Express Transport Corporation (SETC) and will be operated by the Tamil Nadu Transport Department on major inter-state and long-distance routes, connecting Chennai with Bengaluru, Coimbatore, Tiruchi, Madurai, Salem, Tirunelveli, Thanjavur, Nagercoil, Tiruchendur, Tiruppur and other key cities.

Each blue-coloured multi-axle bus is 15 metres long and has been procured at a cost of approximately Rs 1.75 crore. The buses have 51 semi-sleeper seats with knee-height recline for enhanced comfort. Large panoramic win-



dows, mobile charging points, modern safety systems, water bottle holders, separate space for luggage, surveillance cameras and advanced sensors have been incorporated into the design to improve passenger convenience and security. In addition, special fire-safety measures have been installed, with internal water sprinkler pipelines that automatically activate in the event of a fire, ensuring enhanced protection for passengers. The buses are equipped with emergency exits

with ample space, and dedicated protective mechanisms to reduce the risk of accidents. To mark the golden jubilee (1976-2025) of the nationalisation of bus transport in Tamil Nadu, CM Stalin also inaugurated the distribution of wall clocks to 1,05,778 transport employees at a cost of Rs 3.33 crore. Ministers MP Saminathan, SS Sivashankar and P Sekarbabu, Greater Chennai Corporation Mayor R Priya, Lok Sabha member A Raja, and senior officials were present.

The viewpoint, which falls under the Coonoor forest range, was shut from September 12 to carry out renovation works, including upgrades to pathways, toilets and installation of safety railings. With most of the work now completed, tourists are being permitted to visit the spot, Coonoor forest ranger Ravindranath said. Dolphins Nose is a popular natural viewpoint located about 12 km from Coonoor and is maintained by the Forest Department. It is a regular stop for tourists visiting Sims Park and other nearby attractions.

Panneerselvam likely to align with TVK after AIADMK reunification talks collapse

CHENNAI: Former Chief Minister O Panneerselvam is increasingly inclined to align his outfit, the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Thondarkal Urimai Meetpu Kazhagam (AIADMTUMK), with actor Vijay's Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), following the breakdown of reunification efforts with the AIADMK.

A large section of the AIADMTUMK functionaries has conveyed its readiness to move towards TVK, led by Vijay, to politically counter AIADMK General Secretary Edappadi K Palaniswami after he rejected repeated attempts at reunification.

A smaller section within the outfit has indicated its



willingness to support the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), reflecting divergent views among party functionaries.

Panneerselvam, who heads the AIADMTUMK, has decided to defer a final announcement until after the Pongal festival.

While postponing the decision by a few weeks, he has conveyed internally that he would no longer pursue reunification with the AIADMK and would instead focus on charting an independent political course based on prevailing ground realities. As part of this process, Panneerselvam held individual consultations with district secretaries to assess their preferences. Sources said more than 80 per cent of them favoured aligning with TVK, arguing that the NDA had distanced itself from him and that returning to the alliance for a limited number of seats would undermine his political standing.

Wonder land: Discovery of Harappa and Mohenjodaro 100 years ago

A hundred years ago, on September 20, 1924, John Marshall, the then Director-General of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), wrote in the Illustrated London News announcing to the world the discovery of Harappa in western Punjab and Mohenjodaro in Sindh. Daya Ram Sahni had begun excavating Harappa in 1921 and Rakhal Das Banerji initiated excavations at Mohenjodaro from 1922 onwards. It was only when the three sat together in June 1924 that they realised that similar artefacts had been found at both these sites and these belonged to a much earlier civilisation than what was historically known at the time. Very few wells existed at Harappa, suggesting that the residents would have relied on the Ravi river for water.

Prior to 1924, it was the Mauryan dynasty that marked the beginning of the historical period in the subcontinent. Thus, the significance of the discovery was fourfold — it was not just that our history was pushed back by several centuries, but we also got to know about cities that had once existed in the deep past and had long been forgotten, about which there were no references in our historical texts. Above all, it marked the beginning of the golden years of archaeological research in South Asia.

The discovery led to the search for more such cities that belonged to the Indus civilisation. What this discovery enabled was the recognition that there could be other ways of knowing the past and one that was not dependent on textual evidence. The discovery of Harappa and Mohenjodaro triggered a search for more such cities that belonged to the Indus civilisation and over the next several decades, hundreds of these sites — large, medium and small — were found in an area extending from Afghanistan to Baluchistan, Punjab and Sindh in Pakistan, as well as Haryana, Punjab, western Uttar Pradesh, northern Rajasthan and Gujarat in India. Other than Harappa and



Mohenjodaro, remains of three other big cities — Ganweriwala in the Cholistan desert in Pakistan, Rakhigarhi in Haryana and Dholavira in Gujarat — have been found. Equally important was the discovery of Indus objects in Mesopotamian cities and vice versa. The realisation that there were so many settlements in northwest India which used the same kinds of objects and that there had been contact between the Mesopotamian and the Indus people in turn triggered a host of questions for the archaeologists to think about and carry out further research. For instance, if similar objects are used across different sites, does this mean a common ideology, or do these mark social or political boundaries? Could finding Indus objects in Mesopotamian cities and Mesopotamian objects in Indus cities indicate movements of people and goods across seas?

Along with people and objects, seeds too were transported, introducing new crops. For instance, sesame may have been introduced to Mesopotamia due to contact with the Indus people. In the 1920s, the archaeologists remained focused on the large cities of Harappa and Mohenjodaro, but in 1931, a much smaller town, Chanhudaro

in Sindh, was excavated by NG Majumdar. With the partition of the subcontinent in 1947, the ASI turned its attention to Indus sites such as Kalibangan in Rajasthan, Lothal in Gujarat and Banawali in Haryana. Along with the ASI, several Indian universities too began excavating many of the smaller Indus sites in Rajasthan, Gujarat and Haryana.

The two largest Indus sites in India, Rakhigarhi and Dholavira, even though they had been discovered in the 1960s, were excavated by the ASI from 1990s onwards. It is also interesting to track the changing nature of archaeological research over the last 100 years. During the first 60 years or so, archaeologists limited the excavations to exposing the larger buildings and finding objects. However, from the 1980s, more attention began to be given to recovering micro artefacts, along with faunal and plant material. This kind of data helped us to better understand Indus crafts, technologies, agriculture and pastoralism. In the last two decades, there has been a further advancement in archaeological practices, including paleopathological studies of human skeletal remains, ancient DNA studies, starch and lipid residue analyses, climate proxy record about rainfall distribution and intensity, which have opened possibilities to understand matrilocality migrations, stress, trauma, climate change, health, diet and nutrition. At the same time, archaeologists have also

begun exploring issues related to households, women, children as well as social stratification and inequalities that may have marked Indus communities. Initially, it was thought that all the Indus cities were quite like each other, including the houses people lived in as well as the objects they used. However, with growing archaeological research, it soon became evident that there were substantial differences across various sites. For example, Harappa was not the same as Mohenjodaro, Dholavira or Rakhigarhi. Not just in the form of the cities and houses, but also in the kinds of objects found. There were divergent water management systems too across settlements. While numerous wells were found at Mohenjodaro, very few existed at Harappa, suggesting that the residents would have relied on the Ravi river for water. In contrast, at Dholavira, we come across stone-built reservoirs for storing water as well as dams built across seasonal streams. At Rakhigarhi, the residents would have relied largely on ponds and wells for water. In many ways, the history of archaeological research on the Indus civilisation over the last 100 years is the story of the discipline of archaeology in India. It was the discovery of Harappa and Mohenjodaro that got us attention from across the world. The announcement made people realise that South Asia had a civilisation that was almost as old as that in Egypt and Mesopotamia. As archaeological methods became more and more sophisticated, many of these were used to pose challenging questions about the Indus civilisation.

Describing the plan as "the main framework for ending the war", he said it proposed security guarantees from the US, Nato and Europeans for a co-ordinated military response if Russia invaded Ukraine again. On the key question of Ukraine's eastern Donbas, Zelensky said a "free economic zone" was a potential option. He told journalists that as Ukraine was against withdrawal, US negotiators were looking to establish a demilitarised zone or a free economic

zone. Any area that Ukrainian troops pulled out of would have to be policed by Ukraine, he stressed. "There are two options," Zelensky said, "either the war continues, or something will have to be decided regarding all potential economic zones." The 20-point plan is seen as an update of an original 28-point document, agreed by US envoy Steve Witkoff with the Russians several weeks ago, which was widely seen as heavily geared towards the Kremlin's demands. The Russians have insisted that Ukraine pulls out of almost a quarter of its own territory in the eastern Donetsk region in return for a peace deal. The rest is already under Russian occupation. Sensitive issues including questions over territory would have to be resolved "at the leaders' level", but the new draft would provide Ukraine with strong security guarantees and a military strength of 800,000, Zelensky explained.



Much of the updated plan resembles what came out of recent talks in Berlin involving US negotiators Witkoff and Jared Kushner with Ukrainian and European leaders. The setting then moved to Miami last weekend where US President Donald Trump's team spoke separately to Russian envoy Kirill Dmitriev and then Ukrainian and European officials. There now appears to be far more detail on the

territorial issue, although it is clear the Ukrainian side was unable to reach a consensus with the Americans. Zelensky explained that if Ukraine was prepared to pull its heavy forces back by five, 10 or 40km in the 25% of Donetsk it still held to create an economic zone, making it virtually demilitarised, then Russia would have to do the same "accordingly by five, 10, or 40km". Russian troops are currently about 40km (25

miles) east of Ukraine's "fortress belt" cities of Sloviansk and Kramatorsk, having captured the town of Siversk. Russian President Vladimir Putin is unlikely to be impressed by the kind of compromise being proposed for Donetsk. He said this month that Russia would take control of the entire east of Ukraine by force if Ukrainian troops did not pull out. However, Trump is pushing for a deal to end almost four years of full-scale war and the Ukrainian president believes Russia cannot afford to reject the US plan. "They cannot tell President Trump, 'look we're against a peaceful settlement'," Zelensky told reporters. "If they try to obstruct everything, then President Trump would have to arm us heavily, while imposing all possible sanctions against them." Zelensky made clear that if a free economic zone were established in Donetsk it would have to

be under Ukrainian administration and police - "definitely not the so-called Russian police". The current front line would then become the boundary of the economic zone with international forces on the ground along the contact line to ensure no Russian infiltration. Russia has so far rejected a European proposal to police any peace deal through a Coalition of the Willing as a "brazen threat". A referendum would need to be held on the whole peace plan, Zelensky said, and only a referendum could decide on the idea of a potential free economic zone in Donbas. He emphasised that an economic zone would also have to be set up around the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant currently occupied by Russia, and that Russian troops would have to pull out of four other Ukrainian regions - Dnipropetrovsk, Mykolaiv, Sumy, and Kharkiv.

Two police officers killed in explosion in Moscow



Three people - including two police officers - have been killed in an explosion in Moscow, Russian authorities have said. Two traffic police officers saw a "suspicious individual" near a police car on the city's Yeletskaia Street, and when they approached the suspect to detain him, an explosive device was detonated, Russia's Investigative Committee has said. The two police officers died from their injuries, along with another individual who was standing nearby. The blast took place close to the location where a senior Russian general was killed in a car bombing in the capital on Monday. Lt Gen Fani Sarvarov died after an explosive device - which had

been planted under a car - was detonated. Investigative Committee spokesperson Svetlana Petrenko said in a statement on Telegram that a criminal case was being investigated in Moscow "regarding an attempt on the lives of traffic police officers". The officers have been named by Russian media as Ilya Klimanov, 24, and Maxim Gorbunov, 25. Speaking to the Reuters news agency, Alexander, a resident who lives close by, said: "There was an explosion. It was loud bang - like with the car a few days ago." Russia said it suspected Ukraine was behind Monday's explosion, however Ukraine has not said whether it was involved in Fani Sarvarov's death.

UK social media campaigners among five denied US visas



Two British social media campaigners are among five people denied US visas after the State Department accused them of seeking to "coerce" American tech platforms into suppressing free speech. Imran Ahmed, an ex-Labour adviser who now heads the Centre for Countering Digital Hate (CCDH), and Clare Melford, CEO of the Global Disinformation Index (GDI), were labelled "radical activists" by the Trump administration and banned from entering the US. A French ex-EU commissioner and two senior figures at a Germany-based anti-online hate group were also denied visas. French President Emmanuel Macron called it "intimidation", while the UK government said it is "fully committed" to upholding free speech. "While every country has the right to set its own visa rules, we support the laws and institutions which are working to keep the internet free from the most

harmful content," a UK government spokesperson said. The US billed the measures as a response to people and organisations that have campaigned for restrictions on American tech firms, with Secretary of State Marco Rubio saying they belonged to a "global censorship-industrial complex". He said: "President Trump has been clear that his America First foreign policy rejects violations of American sovereignty. Extraterritorial overreach by foreign censors targeting American speech is no exception." Ahmed has links to senior Labour figures. He was previously an aide to Labour minister Hilary Benn, and Sir Keir Starmer's chief of staff Morgan McSweeney has served as a director of the group he founded. The US government labelled Ahmed a "collaborator" for the CCDH's purported past work with the Biden administration. News has contacted the CCDH for comment.

Brazil's Supreme Court allows Bolsonaro to leave prison for surgery



=Brazil's former president Jair Bolsonaro has been permitted to leave prison to undergo surgery on Christmas Day following approval from Brazil's Supreme Court, court documents show. Bolsonaro is currently serving a 27-year prison sentence for plotting a coup after he lost the last election in 2022. Justice Alexandre de Moraes on Tuesday granted permission for Bolsonaro to temporarily leave prison and be transferred to a hospital on

Wednesday for a hernia operation on 25 December. Bolsonaro, 70, has faced ongoing health complications since being stabbed in the abdomen during a 2018 presidential campaign. In April, the right-wing former president underwent intestinal surgery. By November, Justice Moraes, who also oversaw his trial, mandated that Bolsonaro be given full-time medical care. Flávio Bolsonaro, the former president's son, posted a video to X on Wednesday with the caption: "Keep praying for the president." Bolsonaro was found guilty in September for plotting a coup d'état after he lost the 2022 election to his left-wing rival, Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva. The former leader is serving his sentence in a federal police jail in Brasília, the capital.

VENEZUELA ACCUSES US OF 'EXTORTION' OVER SEIZURE OF OIL TANKERS

Venezuela has accused the United States of the "greatest extortion" at an emergency session of the UN Security Council in New York. Washington's seizure of two Venezuelan oil tankers was "worse than piracy," the Venezuelan ambassador to the UN said. The emergency meeting of the Security Council was called to discuss the seizure of the tankers, which took place off the coast of Venezuela earlier this month. The US has also said it was pursuing a third Venezuelan oil tanker. President Trump has accused Venezuela's President Nicolas Maduro of leading a drugs cartel and said gangs had operated with impunity for too long. On 16 December, Trump ordered a naval blockade of all sanctioned oil tankers entering



and leaving Venezuela. The US president has said the US will keep or sell the crude oil it has taken, as well as the vessels themselves. The US has been building up its military presence in the Pacific and Caribbean Seas in recent months, sending 15,000 troops and a range of aircraft carriers and warships to the area. It is the largest deployment to the region since the US invaded Panama in 1989,

Speaking at the UN Security Council meeting on Tuesday, Samuel Moncada said "we are in the presence of a power that acts outside of international law, demanding that Venezuelans vacate our country and hand it over." Regarding the US seizure of Venezuelan oil, he added: "We are talking about pillaging, looting and recolonisation of Venezuela. "The government of the United States does not have jurisdiction in the Caribbean." Referring to the Venezuelan oil industry, he said: "What does that have to do with drugs?" In response, the US Ambassador to the UN, Michael Waltz, told the Security Council the US does not recognise Mr Maduro as the legitimate leader of Venezuela.

Australia to deport British man charged with displaying Nazi symbols



A British national in Australia has had his visa cancelled and faces deportation for allegedly displaying Nazi symbols. The 43-year-old man living in Queensland was arrested and charged earlier this month, after allegedly using a social media account to post the Nazi swastika, promote pro-Nazi ideology and call for violence towards the Jewish community. The man was taken into immigration detention this week in Brisbane and is due to face court in January. Police have been cracking down on the use of prohibited symbols amid a recent rise in anti-semitism and right-wing extremism. Home Affairs

Minister Tony Burke said: "He came here to hate - he doesn't get to stay." "If you come to Australia on a visa, you are here as a guest," Burke told the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) on Wednesday. Last month, Burke also revoked the visa of Matthew Gruter, a South African national who

had been living in Australia since 2022, after he was seen attending a neo-Nazi rally in front of the New South Wales parliament. Like Gruter, the British man can appeal his visa being revoked. He can leave Australia voluntarily or wait to be deported to his home country. It is understood police are assessing

whether to delay deporting the man so he can face court next month. The BBC has contacted the UK Foreign Office for comment. Earlier this year, Australia tightened its hate crime laws, introducing mandatory jail terms for displaying hate symbols or performing a Nazi salute. Police began investigating the British man in October over alleged posts on X. The social media platform blocked his account, prompting him to create a new one with a similar name where he continued posting offensive and harmful content, police said. Authorities searched the man's home in Caboolture, on the outskirts of Brisbane.

TWO DEAD after Pennsylvania nursing home explosions



Two people have died and 20 others have been injured after two explosions and fire at a Pennsylvania nursing home caused a partial collapse of the building. Emergency crews were called to the Silver Lake Nursing Home in Bristol at about 14:00 local time (19:00 GMT) on Tuesday after receiving reports an initial explosion and an odour of gas, said fire chief Kevin Dippolito. Crews evacuated people from the building, and just "15 to 30 seconds" after they left, there came a second explosion and a fire, Mr Dippolito added. Authorities have suggested the cause could have been a gas leak, though their investigation is ongoing. In a statement to US media, local gas firm PECO said the explosion occurred while its crews responded to reports of a gas smell. PECO said it was not yet known whether its gas or equipment was involved. Images and videos posted on social platforms by local media outlets show a

partially collapsed building with massive flames billowing out of it. Recalling the effort to rescue people from the building after the first blast, Mr Dippolito told reporters that "there was one police officer who literally threw two people over his shoulders and ran" with them towards medical staff. Several people were trapped in the basement of the collapsed building but were rescued, Mr Dippolito also said. Five people whose whereabouts were initially unknown were later accounted for, said Charles Winik, the police chief. Debris was reportedly found scattered in the surrounding area. A man who lived a block away described hearing a "loud ka-boom" as he watched television. "I thought an airplane or something came and fell on my house," Willie Tye told the AP news agency, adding that he then saw "fire everywhere". Relatives of those living at the nursing home described their concern as they awaited news.

Libya's army chief killed in air crash in Turkey

The Libyan army chief has been killed in an air crash in Turkey, Libya's prime minister has said. Gen Mohammed Ali Ahmed al-Haddad was on board a Falcon 50 aircraft flying out of the Turkish capital, Ankara, on Tuesday evening. He was killed along with four other military officials and three crew members. Turkish Interior Minister Ali Yerlikaya said signal with the business jet was lost at 20:52 local time (17:52 GMT) - about 42 minutes after it took off from Ankara's airport. The Tripoli-bound jet had issued an emergency landing request before contact was lost. The aircraft's wreckage was later found south-west of Ankara, and



its voice recorder and black box had been recovered. The emergency services are still trying to retrieve the bodies. An investigation is under way into what caused the crash. In a post on X, Yerlikaya wrote that police had spotted the debris near the village of Kesikkavak, in the Haymana district. In Libya,

Abdul Hamid Dbeibeh, the prime minister of the country's internationally-recognised Government of National Unity (GNU), said he had received news of the deaths of Gen Haddad and other senior Libyan military officials on board the jet. The prime minister called it a "great loss" for the nation.

Border villagers abducted and taken to Russia, says Ukraine

Fifty-two residents of a Ukrainian village have been taken to Russia by invading forces in a cross-border raid on the village of Hrabovske, authorities in Kyiv say. Thirteen Ukrainian soldiers were also captured in the border village in the north-eastern Sumy region. The attack occurred at night on Saturday, when about 100 Russian troops attacked the village, said Viktor Trehubov, a spokesman for Ukraine's military Joint Forces Task Force. The civilians were first rounded up in a church and then taken across the border to Russia, he told the BBC. It was unusual for invading forces to take civilians to Russia before establishing a firm presence in occupied



territory, he added. Russia has so far not commented on the fate of civilians from Hrabovske, but reports from Ukraine indicate they may have been taken to Belgorod, a major regional centre about 50 miles (80 km) inside Russia. "My friends' mother has been taken there. There is no way of contacting her even

though they tried," said Volodymyr Bitsak, a member of the Sumy regional council. "As far as I know, they've been taken to the city of Belgorod and are being held at an unknown location." Lt-Col Trehubov told the BBC on Tuesday evening that fighting was still ongoing in the southern part of Hrabovske.

Rohit, Kohli Smash Statement Hundreds On Vijay Hazare Trophy Return

Star Indian batters Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli smashed centuries on their return to action in the Vijay Hazare Trophy on Wednesday. Rohit, in his first appearance in the tournament after seven years, slammed a sensational 94-ball 155 as Mumbai thrashed Sikkim by eight wickets in their Elite Group C match in Jaipur. Kohli, who last played in the Vijay Hazare Trophy during the 2010-11 season, reached triple figures in 83 balls during Delhi's Elite Group D fixture against Andhra Pradesh. Rohit was named 'Player of the Match' for his efforts after he helped Mumbai chase down a below-par target of 237 in 30.3 overs. Kohli, on the other hand, led the charge in Delhi's pursuit of 299 against the Nitish Kumar Reddy-led Andhra Pradesh side. During his knock on Wednesday, Kohli achieved the milestone of 16,000 List A runs. Kohli's 16,000-run feat makes him only the second Indian player, after legendary batter



Sachin Tendulkar, to reach this figure in List A cricket. The 37-year-old now stands as the ninth player overall to breach this milestone, joining the ranks of cricketing legends like Tendulkar, Ricky Ponting, Kumar Sangakkara, Sir Vivian Richards, and others. Kohli's last appearance in the Vijay Hazare Trophy came during the 2010-11 season, where he



captained Delhi. He would go on to play in the NKP Salve Challenger Trophy in 2013-14 but had not participated in the Vijay Hazare for nearly a decade before this comeback. His return to the competition was eagerly anticipated, and his achievement was a fitting start to Delhi's campaign. Meanwhile, in Ahmedabad, wicketkeeper-batter Ishan Kishan made a strong case

for an ODI recall after blasting a 33-ball century for Jharkhand against Karnataka. Kishan's blazing ton is the second-fastest by an Indian in List A cricket, just one delivery behind Bihar captain Sakibul Gani's record 32-ball century against Arunachal Pradesh, which also happened earlier on Wednesday. Virat Kohli has once again etched his name

in cricketing history, reaching the remarkable milestone of 16,000 List A runs during his return to the Vijay Hazare Trophy on Wednesday. Playing for Delhi in their clash against Andhra Pradesh at the BCCI's Centre of Excellence, Kohli achieved the feat with his first run in the team's chase of 299. This landmark moment further cements his status as one of the greatest ever in the 50-over format. ISHAN KISHAN FIRES 33-BALL HUNDRED AS RECORDS TUMBLE IN VIJAY HAZARE TROPHY

Be it Vaibhav Suryavanshi, Sakibul Gani, or Ishan Kishan, Indian cricket found three knocks to cherish on the opening day of the Vijay Hazare Trophy 2025-26 campaign. While Suryavanshi and Gani scored 36-ball and 32-ball tons for Bihar on Wednesday, Ishan proved his worth by smashing a 33-ball hundred for Jharkhand. The trio's heroics with the bat kept cricket statisticians busy the entire day, compiling the standings of fastest hundreds in List A cricket history. As if the fireworks in Ranchi weren't enough for one day, Ahmedabad delivered its own cricketing aftershock in an Elite-group clash between Jharkhand and Karnataka. Jharkhand captain Ishan Kishan, who was recently named in India's squad for the T20 World Cup 2026, produced a blistering 33-ball century, securing the second-fastest ton on the all-time Indian list. Kishan's whirlwind innings sits just



behind Gani's record-breaking 32-ball effort and effectively demoted Suryavanshi's 36-ball hundred to fourth place, with the standings being shuffled thrice in a span of a single day. Finishing with a mammoth 125 off just 39 deliveries, Kishan propelled Jharkhand to a total of 412/9 after coming out to bat at the No. 6 spot. Earlier, Karnataka won the toss and opted to field. Jharkhand had a shaky start as opener Utkarsh Singh was removed for just eight runs. Shubh Sharma also departed early as Shreyas Gopal cleaned

him up for 15. Shikhar Mohan played a decent innings of 44 before Abhilash Shetty removed him in the 24th over. From there, Virat Singh and Kumar Kushagra took forward Jharkhand's innings, stitching a partnership of 129 runs for the fourth wicket before Kushagra was removed by Gopal for 63. Singh soon followed him back to the pavilion after making 88 runs in just 68 runs. Kishan gave Jharkhand the finishing touch to the innings with a 33-ball century, which powered Jharkhand to 412-9 in their 50 overs.

Faster Than Vaibhav Suryavanshi: Bihar Teammate Rewrites Record Books With 32-Ball 100

It is not often that you can overshadow the brute power-hitting of 14-year-old Vaibhav Suryavanshi, but that is exactly what his Bihar teammate Sakibul Gani did during their Vijay Hazare Trophy Plate match against Arunachal Pradesh on Wednesday. While Suryavanshi slammed his century in just 36 balls en route to an 84-ball 190, Gani smashed his own century even quicker - in just 32 deliveries - making it the fastest-ever List A century by an Indian. Gani went past Punjab batter Anmolpreet Singh's 35-ball ton against Arunachal Pradesh in 2024. Gani eventually ended unbeaten on an astonishing 128 off just



40 balls, hitting 12 sixes and 10 boundaries en route to his blitzkrieg. **READ | Vaibhav Suryavanshi Triggers Cricketing Quake, Bihar Smash 'World Record' 574 In 50 Overs** The combined efforts of Gani, Suryavanshi and wicketkeeper Ayush Loharuka (116 off 56) helped Bihar pile

up a gigantic total of 574/6 in 50 overs, making it the highest-ever total put up in professional one-day cricket. Suryavanshi's own 36-ball ton in the same match is the fourth-fastest by an Indian in List A cricket. Gani walked in to bat shortly after Suryavanshi's heroics had ended, with Bihar at

391/3 in 39.3 overs. At that point, Tamil Nadu's record of the highest one-day score (506) was in sight. However, Gani's efforts ensured that not only did Bihar create history, but they also obliterated Tamil Nadu's record. 26-year-old Gani hails from the city of Motihari in Bihar. A batting all-rounder, his stats suggest that he isn't the most destructive of hitters, possessing a List A strike-rate of only 71.95 before the match. However, on Wednesday, Gani unleashed his destructive best. Just five out of the 40 balls he faced were dots, with a total of 22 deliveries ending up beyond the ropes.

Shubman Gill Vice-Captaincy Stunt Puts Ajit Agarkar In Line Of Fire: "Zero Planning"

Team India's T20 vice-captaincy strategy has backfired following Shubman Gill's omission from the T20 World Cup squad, forcing the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to reappoint Axar Patel as Suryakumar Yadav's deputy. While many have welcomed the decision to drop Gill based on form, former India international Mohammad Kaif criticised chief selector Ajit Agarkar for the "chaos" surrounding the leadership role. Kaif lambasted the board and the selection committee for what he described as a total lack of foresight regarding the World Cup squad. Axar Patel had originally been named vice-captain during the five-match series against England earlier this year,



but the management transferred the role to Gill upon his return to the side. However, after Gill was dropped following a dip in performance, the BCCI performed a U-turn to reinstate Axar. "The selectors knew there were better players

available for the T20 format," Kaif stated. "By sticking with Gill, they made a mistake that has set Indian cricket back. Over the last few months, they could have invested that time in players like Jaiswal, Samson, or Jitesh Sharma." Kaif argued

that the constant switching of deputies hindered Axar's development as a leader. "It is a loss for both Axar and the national team. If he had remained vice-captain, he would have been consistently involved in high-level team meetings and had the chance to refine his leadership skills. If Suryakumar Yadav were to pick up an injury, a better-prepared Axar would have known his squad inside out. That opportunity for growth was taken away from him," he remarked. While Kaif agreed that dropping Gill was the correct tactical move, he was scathing about the timing. "You backed Gill until the very last moment only to drop him at the finish line. It is the right call, but it has come far too late.

Japanese golf great 'Jumbo' Ozaki dies aged 78



Japan's most successful professional golfer, Masashi 'Jumbo' Ozaki, has died at the age of 78. Nicknamed Jumbo because of his length off the tee, Ozaki won 94 times on the Japan Tour and topped the country's order of merit 12 times. He was in the top 10 of golf's rankings for nearly 200 weeks and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2011. "While golf has long been popular in Japan, it was Ozaki who brought a new vitality to the game and his emergence spawned an unprecedented growth in the game in the country," said his profile on the World Golf Hall of Fame website., external Ozaki was a professional baseball player before switching to golf and winning his first tournament in 1973 at the age of 26, with his last coming when he was 55.

He had top 10 finishes at The Open, Masters and US Open and used to take a sushi chef with him when he played away from Japan "so that he and his entourage would feel more at home outside of their homeland". Ozaki also ventured into singing and had three singles in the Japanese charts in the late 1980s. A statement on the Japan Golf Tour Organisation (JGTO) website said Ozaki's son Tomoharu had announced his father had passed away after being diagnosed with colon cancer about a year ago. "The golf world has lost a truly great man," said JGTO chairman Yutaka Morohoshi., external "He long steered the men's professional golf world and overwhelmed others with his unparalleled strength."

"Yeah, it's a fantastic opportunity to get games under your belt and get used to the flow of T20 cricket. We haven't really played much T20 cricket this year. So yeah, it's going to be a great tournament," Rabada said during a



JioStar Press Room ahead of SA20 Season 4. Rabada believes that playing in different conditions across South Africa during the league will pose a healthy challenge for players ahead of the ICC showpiece. "I think the teams this season have balanced out really well. In the previous three seasons, the management and the people who are responsible for

picking the teams have figured out what it takes to do well in South Africa with the varying conditions around the country. "So, those are the challenges-playing well in the different regions of the country. And as a bowler, how you need to adjust to that. The batters are looking strong and it's really exciting. So, it's going to be fantastic prep, I guess, if chosen for the

World Cup," said Rabada. South Africa's T20 captain Aiden Markram, who will be leading Durban Super Giants in this edition of the SA20, concurred with Rabada's views. "Naturally, it's great that we'll be playing T20 cricket literally up until days before the World Cup starts. But I don't think you want to be putting too much energy into your SA20 teams and asking guys to worry about the World Cup," he said. "It's two completely separate events and I think it's important that the players treat it that way. When we get to the World Cup, guys would have had a lot of T20 games under their belt. So, hopefully, there's some good confidence and good form that we can take forward and take care of the World Cup when we get to Indian shores," said Markram.

DOES RELIGION HAVE A ROLE TO PLAY IN SPORT?



When Crystal Palace's Marc Guehi scored against Arsenal on Tuesday night, he did what he often does - point to the sky. Arsenal's Jurrien Timber - nicknamed 'Pastor Timber' by fans - followed suit when he scored in the penalty shoot-out at the end of the game. Both teams have influential players who have recently been discussing the importance of their Christian beliefs. And it's not just in football where we've seen contrasting headlines about professional athletes displaying their faith. Earlier this year, at the World Athletics Championships in Tokyo, GB sprinter Jeremiah Azu was warned not to wear a "100% Jesus" headband. But can your beliefs impact your performance - and how you are treated - in the sport you play? Sport governing bodies often have rules against displaying religious and political slogans during competition. Jeremiah wasn't formally punished for wearing his "100% Jesus" headband in a 400m semi-final, but World Athletics bosses

said they spoke to his team about the accessory. The 24-year-old says he now backs the rules separating religion from the track, but he's glad he did it. He tells BBC Newsbeat he believes his "strength" comes from his faith, and he wore the headband to show that. His father is a pastor, so Jeremiah says religion has always been a part of his life. "We read the Bible at home, we prayed at home," he recalls. He says his religion helps his performance in athletics. "As a Christian you have to be disciplined," he says, a trait he feels transfers over to track and field. "There's days where it's difficult to push, but I know I have to from the discipline I've got from my faith," he explains. Though Jeremiah says he's never felt "muted" when talking about his faith, up-and-coming athletes tell Newsbeat it's not always that simple. Semi-pro footballer Zainab El-Mouden, who plays for Chesham United FC Women, says there are challenges as a female Muslim player who wears a hijab.

“Haunted by My Words and Unable to Sleep for 36 Hours”: Shivaji Holds Press Meet, Apologises for His Remarks at the Dhandoraa Pre-Release Event

Actor Shivaji addressed the media at a specially convened press meet, offering a detailed and emotional apology for the remarks he made during the Dhandoraa pre-release event. Speaking with visible remorse, Shivaji said he deeply regrets using two unparliamentary words on stage and admitted that he realised the gravity of his mistake almost immediately after stepping down. He revealed that the impact of his words weighed heavily on him from the moment the event ended. “I couldn’t sleep for nearly 36 hours,” he said, explaining that he felt haunted by what he had said. The realisation, he noted, stayed with him continuously and pushed him to reflect on his responsibility as a public figure. Shivaji said the first apology he offered was to his wife, even before speaking publicly. Soon after, he released a video apology acknowledging his mistake. He admitted that his comments were born out of an emotional and protective instinct that surfaced after witnessing disturbing incidents at public events, including what happened to actress Nidhi Agerwal, followed by earlier incidents involving Samantha. He said these moments deeply shook him and pushed him into a heightened emotional state. Referring to how elders often speak about preserving culture and values, Shivaji said he spoke in a similar emotional line, but conceded that intent does not justify language. He acknowledged that the words he used were wrong and that speaking on a film-related public stage made the mistake even more serious. Reflecting on his public life, Shivaji pointed out that he has also been active in politics. He said that in all his years in public discourse, he has never used such language, not against political opponents and not in heated debates. His voice



faltered as he spoke about the consequences of this episode, admitting that he does not know how long it will take him to recover from it. With tears in his eyes, he said the impact would not be limited to him alone but would affect his family as well, reiterating his utmost respect for women. Explaining why he chose to hold a separate press meet, Shivaji said the decision was taken consciously in the interest of the film. He stated that he did not want his personal mistake to overshadow Dhandoraa, which he described as a content-driven film rooted in social reality.
