SEVEN KILLED, 12 INJURED AS BUS FALLS INTO GORGE IN ALMORA

DEHRADUN: Seven people were killed and about 12 injured after a bus fell into a gorge in Uttarakhand's Almora district, police said on Tuesday. The accident occurred in the Bhikiyasain area when the bus was en route to Rammagar in Nainital from Dwarahat in Almora. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Devendra Pincha said. According to the SSP, 18 to 19 passengers were on board when the driver lost control of the



vehicle, and it fell into a gorge, six kilometres ahead of Bhikiyasain. Upon receiving information about the accident, the police, along with State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams, reached the spot and launched rescue and relief operations, he said. Six people died on the spot in the accident, while another succumbed to injuries on the way to hospital, the officer added. SSP Pincha said 12 people, including the driver, were injured in the accident and rescued from the gorge.

**FOG DISRUPTS DELHI AIRPORT OPS; 118 FLIGHTS CANCELLED, 16 DIVERTED'**



**New Delhi:** At least 118 flights were cancelled, 16 flights diverted and 130 services delayed at the Delhi airport on Tuesday as dense fog disrupted operations. The Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA), operated by DIAL, handles around 1,300 flights daily. An official said 60 arrivals and 58 departures were cancelled while 16 flights were diverted at the airport. Information from flight tracking website FlightRadar24.com showed that 130 flights were delayed on Tuesday morning at the airport and the average delay time for departures was around 28 minutes. In a post on X in the morning, Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) said all flight operations continue as normal and flights that are not CAT III compliant may get affected. CAT III compliance allows pilots to operate flights in low visibility conditions.

Against the backdrop of fog and low visibility conditions, the civil aviation ministry on Tuesday said airlines have been instructed to strictly comply with passenger facilitation norms.

## CM Revanth outlines roadmap for planned urban development

**HYDERABAD:** Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday directed newly appointed zonal commissioners to move beyond routine administration and adopt an outcome-driven approach to urban governance, with a special focus on the Core Urban Region within the Outer Ring Road.

Reviewing urban administration, the Chief Minister said the government had taken a conscious decision to develop the core urban economic region in a planned and systematic manner in line with the Telangana Rising 2047 Vision Document, which aims for sustainable and inclusive growth. He said the city under the CURE (Core Urban Region Economy) framework has been reorganised into 12 zones, 60 circles and 300 wards to strengthen decentralised governance and accountability. Emphasising daily monitoring and effective planning, he said the objective was to put urban governance firmly on track. Describing solid waste manage-

ment as Hyderabad's most complex challenge, the Chief Minister announced a comprehensive cleanup of the core urban region and made it clear that zonal commissioners would be personally responsible for resolving issues in their respective zones. He instructed them to be present in the field every day. The Chief Minister announced a complete ban on plastic in the city and stressed the need to protect lakes and nalas from encroachments. He also said diesel buses and

autos operating in the CURE area would be gradually replaced with electric vehicles to reduce pollution.

To strengthen monitoring, he directed officials to install CCTV cameras near lakes, nalas and garbage dumping points, conduct special sanitation drives for three days every month, and undertake garbage clearance drives every ten days. He asserted that there should be no garbage on roads and no visible potholes. He further instructed officials to leverage technology for transparent delivery of civic services

such as birth and death certificates and trade licences through online platforms. Regular coordination with colony welfare associations and apartment associations was also emphasised.

Calling for a transition from good governance to smart governance, the Chief Minister directed agencies including the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation, HYDRAA and the Water Works department to begin desilting of

nalas from January. He also stressed the importance of adequate street lighting, effective mosquito control and preventive measures against seasonal diseases.

The Chief Minister said zonal commissioners must respond promptly to public grievances received through toll-free numbers and prepare five-year action plans for their zones. He concluded that coordinated efforts by all departments were essential to securing a better future for the city.

## Union Minister Bandi Sanjay inquires into tiger migration in Karimnagar

Karimnagar, December 30 (TSIT): Union Minister of State Bandi Sanjay on Tuesday inquired about reports of a tiger roaming in several villages of Karimnagar Rural Mandal,

creating concern among local residents and farmers. Following the reports, the Union Minister spoke over the phone with Karimnagar District Forest Officer (DFO) Balamani and direct-

ed forest officials to take all necessary precautionary measures to ensure that farmers and villagers do not panic. He also advised people in rural areas to remain vigilant.

## TUWJ Seeks Amendments to GO 252 on Journalist Accreditation

Hyderabad TSIT: The Telangana State Union of Working Journalists (TUVJ) has urged the State government to make certain amendments to Government Order (GO) 252, which

lays down new guidelines for the issuance of accreditation cards to journalists.

A delegation of TUWJ, led by its State President K. Virahath Ali, met State Revenue, Information & Public Relations, and Housing Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy at the Secretariat on Tuesday and submitted a memorandum detailing the union's concerns and suggestions.

Explaining the issue, Virahath Ali said the union had conducted an in-depth study of GO 252 following feedback from journalists across the State and found several gaps that need correction. He pointed out that in the past, desk journalists were not treated on par with reporters in the matter of accreditation cards. He demanded that under the revised GO, all welfare schemes extended to journalists including bus passes should be made

applicable uniformly to reporters and desk journalists without any discrimination.

The TUWJ also sought clarity on provisions related to cable television channels, stating that certain clauses in GO 252 were ambiguous and required clear definitions. For Greater Hyderabad and other major cities, the union proposed that accreditation cards be issued, based on office recommendations, to print and electronic media journalists working from Delhi, as well as to video journalists and camera persons.

Highlighting the special status of Urdu, the TUWJ said that since Urdu is an official language of the State, Urdu newspapers should not be compared with other languages purely on circulation and grading. Instead, areas where Urdu publications are circulated should be identified and a special category should be created to issue accreditation cards to Urdu journalists at district and mandal levels.

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## Telangana Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Rejects Harish Rao's Allegations

Hyderabad: Telangana Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy on Tuesday strongly refuted allegations made by former minister T. Harish Rao on irrigation issues, terming them a "continued tirade of lies" and misleading claims against the state government.

Responding to Harish Rao's charge that the Telangana government had failed to act against the proposed Polavaram-Banakacherla link project, Uttam Kumar Reddy asserted that the Congress government had taken decisive legal steps to safeguard Telangana's water interests. He pointed out that the state government has filed a writ petition in the Supreme Court of India chal-



lenging what it considers illegal diversion of Godavari waters by Andhra Pradesh.

"This is for the information of all that the writ petition filed by the Telangana government is WP No. 1258, and it is listed on

Monday, January 5, before the Chief Justice of India in Court No. 1 as Item No. 11," the minister said, adding that the move clearly demonstrates the government's proactive approach, contrary to allegations of inaction.

The minister was responding to Harish Rao's claim that the Central Water Commission (CWC) had allegedly granted permission for diversion of 200 TMC of Godavari waters, which, he said, would severely affect Telangana. Rejecting the allegation, Uttam Kumar Reddy clarified that the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti has neither accorded permission for construction of the Polavaram-Banakacherla link project nor allowed the Andhra Pradesh government to prepare a Detailed Project Report (DPR). He said the ministry has categorically informed Andhra Pradesh that preparation of the DPR cannot proceed without in-principle approval.

## South Central Railway urges people not to fly kites near railway traction lines

Hyderabad, Dec 30 : South Central Railway has appealed to people to avoid flying kites near railway traction lines during the upcoming Sankranti festival.

The South Central Railway (SCR) observed with serious concern that several incidents of electrocution have occurred due to kite flying in the vicinity of railway premises, including yards, tracks and nearby civil localities.

During the previous Sankranti festival sea-



son, multiple cases were reported across various zones of Indian Railways, wherein individuals suffered severe electric shocks or fatal injuries after coming into contact with kite threads entangled with 25 kV Overhead Electric Traction (OHE) lines.

Use of Chinese-imported kite threads, which are often metallic or chemically treated and act as conductors of electricity. When such threads come in contact with live overhead traction equipment, they pose a grave threat not only to human life but also to critical railway electrical infrastructure, potentially leading to service disruptions and safety hazards for passengers and Railway staff," the SCR said in a statement.

## Temporary relaxation in liquor sale timings for New Year

Mancherial, Dec 29, TSIT: The Telangana government has announced a temporary relaxation in restrictions on liquor sale and service timings in view of New Year celebrations. Prohibition and Excise Commissioner C. Hari Kiran issued orders to this effect on Tuesday. As per the orders, bars holding 2B licences, in-



house licence holders (C1 and TD1), and venues operating under event permits (EP1) issued by the Telangana State Tourism Development Corporation (TSTDC) will be allowed to serve liquor up to 1 a.m. on the night of December 31. In addition, retail liquor outlets holding E4 licences have been granted special permission to

remain open until midnight on December 31. Officials clarified that the relaxation would be applicable only for the New Year period and would not alter existing regulations. The Commissioner directed Prohibition and Excise officials in all districts to take necessary steps to ensure effective implementation of the orders.

## Indian Railways completes electrification of Sakleshpur-Subramanya Road ghat section

New Delhi: Indian Railways has achieved a major engineering milestone with the completion of electrification of the Sakleshpur-Subramanya Road Ghat Section, one of the most difficult and technically challenging terrains on its network. The milestone was marked by the successful electric locomotive trial conducted on December 28, 2025, making the section fully ready for electric train operations.

With the electrification of this ghat stretch, the entire Bengaluru-Mangaluru rail route is now fully electrified. This is expected to significantly improve rail connectivity, operational efficiency and environmental sustainability in the region. The project will also enable the operation of Vande Bharat and other fast electric trains, providing faster, cleaner and more reliable travel to the coastal belt.

The electrified ghat section spans 55 km between Sakleshpur and Subramanya Road and passes through extremely complex terrain. The stretch has no approach road to the railway track and features a steep ruling gradient of 1 in 50, along with 57 tunnels, 226 bridges and 108 sharp curves. The area is also highly prone to landslides, particularly during the monsoon, making electrification a formidable challenge.

The electrification work began in December 2023 and included the construction of five switching stations and complete overhead equipment installation. To ensure safety and reliability, the maximum distance between traction poles was restricted to 67.5 metres. Tunnel electrification required special measures, with



427 main brackets and 427 spare brackets installed across 57 tunnels. Detailed geological studies were conducted with the support of the National Institute of Rock Mechanics and Bangalore University, and pull-out tests were

carried out at every bracket location to ensure anchoring strength.

Work on the steep gradients required specialised equipment and careful planning. The project faced frequent disruptions due to heavy rainfall, landslides, soil erosion and rockfalls, while materials had to be transported by rail to reach remote and inaccessible locations. Strict safety protocols were followed to ensure uninterrupted train operations throughout the construction period.

With electrification now complete, the section will see reduced fuel consumption, lower emissions and more efficient train operations. It will also strengthen economic and commercial linkages between Bengaluru and the port city of Mangaluru, as well as other coastal commercial centres, facilitating smoother passenger and business travel.

Highlighting the significance of the achievement, Union Minister for Railways, Information and Broadcasting, and Electronics and Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw said that Vande Bharat trains would now be able to operate on this route up to Mangaluru.

Indian Railways has already electrified more than 99 per cent of its broad-gauge network. Since 2014, over 46,900 route kilometres have been electrified, compared to 21,801 route kilometres in the nearly six decades prior. Once the remaining small sections are completed, India will have one of the largest fully electrified railway networks in the world, reinforcing Indian Railways' commitment to clean energy and sustainable transportation.

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## Mamata questions infiltration claims and central projects allegations

Kolkata, Dec 30: West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday strongly countered Union Home Minister Amit Shah's remarks on infiltration, questioning how attacks like the Pahalgam terrorist strike and the Delhi car blast occurred if infiltrators were allegedly entering only through West Bengal.

Speaking at a public meeting in Barjora, Bankura district, Banerjee described Shah as "Dushasana," accusing him of coming to Bengal with destructive intentions. "Dushasana, a disciple of Shakuni, has come to Bengal to gather information. As soon as elections come, Dushasana and Duryodhana start arriving. One is terrified to look into their eyes, as if something bad may happen."



pen. They don't want Sonar Bangla; they want to destroy the state," she said. Responding to Shah's earlier claims that her government allowed and protected infiltrators, Banerjee asked pointedly, "If infiltrators only enter from West Bengal, then who carried out the Pahalgam attack? Who was behind the Delhi incident? If there are no infiltrators in Kashmir or other

states, how did such incidents take place?"

The CM also refuted allegations that her government had refused to provide land for Central projects. "You claim the Mamata Banerjee government didn't allot land for Central projects. Then who provided land at Bongaon's Petrapole, at Andal for the new airport, and for the railway tracks? Eastern Coalfield Limited is functioning—who gave land in

Ghokshadanga and Changrabandha? These are lies," she said. Banerjee further criticised Shah's repeated claims that the BJP will form the state government after Assembly elections. "Earlier, they said they would win 200 seats. Now they talk about a two-thirds majority. They are trying to manipulate voter lists through Special Intensive Revision. At least 58 people have already lost their lives. Don't you feel ashamed?" she said.

She also denounced efforts to remove names from electoral rolls, particularly targeting Matua, minority, and Hindu communities, while rejecting attempts to label her as Bangladeshi. "I was born in Birbhum," she emphasized, highlighting her roots amid the political controversy.

## Fresh arrests of Indian fishermen by Sri Lankan navy spark tension in Rameswaram

Chennai, Dec 30: Tension resurfaced in the coastal town of Rameswaram on Tuesday after the Sri Lankan Navy detained three Indian fishermen and confiscated their fishing trawler in the early hours, alleging illegal fishing in Sri Lankan waters. The latest incident has once again highlighted the persistent and unresolved problem of fishermen from Tamil Nadu being apprehended while operating in the sensitive Palk Strait region.

Officials from the Rameswaram Fisheries Department identified the arrested fishermen as Rooban, Nagarajan and Prabhu. The three had departed from the Rameswaram fishing harbour late on Monday night after obtaining official clearance.

While engaged in fishing near the waters off Neduntheevu (Delft Island), their mechanised trawler was intercepted by a Sri Lankan Navy



patrol. The fishermen were taken into custody, and their boat was seized and transported to the Karainagar Naval Base in northern Sri Lanka.

Authorities said that 415 fishing tokens were issued on Monday, allowing fishermen from the

region to venture into the sea. Most of the boats were expected to return by Tuesday evening. However, news of the arrests quickly spread, causing anxiety among families waiting for their relatives to return.

## Around 170 sheep die mysteriously near Rashtriya Prerna Sthal; CM Yogi orders probe

Lucknow, Dec 30: Mystery shrouds the death of around 170 sheep near the Rashtriya Prerna Sthal area in Uttar Pradesh's capital Lucknow, prompting authorities to send samples for examination to determine the exact cause of death. Police said it is yet to be ascertained whether the sheep died due to disease, poisoning, consumption of waste material or negligence. Samples have been sent for post-mortem and laboratory testing.

Taking serious note of the incident, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has ordered a detailed probe into the matter. The state government also announced a compensation of Rs 10,000 per sheep for the affected owners.

Charu Khare, founder of NGO Aasra – The Helping Hands Trust, submitted an application to the Madioan police station stating that the sheep died suddenly in the area a few days after an event was held at Rashtriya Prerna Sthal.

"Prima facie, it is not clear whether the sheep consumed some waste material or were deliberately poisoned by unknown persons," Khare said, demanding a thorough investigation.

She stressed that post-mortem examina-



tions must be conducted to establish the exact cause behind the mysterious deaths. "If any laxity is found or poisoning is confirmed, strict action should be taken against those responsible. Our organisation will extend all possible support to the investigation," she added.

## How A Pak-Friendly BNP Is Now In Pole Position In Bangladesh

The baton has passed. Bangladesh's first woman Prime Minister, Begum Khaleda Zia, breathed her last this morning in Dhaka. Her legacy includes keeping the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) firmly together, even strengthening it, after the death of her husband, President Ziaur Rahman. She will be remembered for joining hands with Sheikh Hasina in bringing a peaceful end to President Hussain Muhammad Ershad's dictatorship and ensuring Bangladesh's return to democracy through the 1991 elections, which she won. Relations with India under the BNP rule have never been comfortable, and the legacy of BNP's strong links with Pakistan and with Jamaat-e-Islami has a lot to do with this.

On the face of it, Tarique Rahman's return to Dhaka on Christmas Day 2025, and now the passing away of his mother, Begum Khaleda Zia, have placed the BNP in pole position to win the forthcoming general elections in Bangladesh, scheduled for February next year. However, it is important not to get carried away by the media hype generated by print, electronic and social media outlets, most of which are thoroughly controlled and managed by the Yunus regime.

## The BNP And the Jamaat

The BNP and the Jamaat-e-Islami have been political allies for a quarter century, since 2001. Their ideological alliance is far older, going back to their shared support for the tenets and values that sided with Pakistan and opposed everything that the 1971 Liberation War stood for. The constitution of Bangladesh, adopted in 1972 under Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, had, as its four pillars, the principles of democracy, secularism, socialism and nationalism. In addition, Sheikh Mujib banned religion-based political parties and revoked the citizenship of Ghulam Azam, the Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami during the Liberation War, responsible for untold war crimes against the minorities, against women, against intellectuals and all those supporting the Awami League. Under President Zia (who seized control after the assassination of Sheikh Mujib and later founded the BNP), all these provisions were reversed. Ghulam Azam returned to Dhaka on a Pakistani passport in August 1978, during the military rule of General Zia. The ban on religion-based political parties was reversed, and a special "Citizenship Act" enacted in 1978 provided the legal framework for Ghulam Azam to eventually regain his Bangladeshi citizenship through a court order in 1994 (when Begum Khaleda Zia was Prime Minister) after a long legal battle.

It was under President Zia (father of Tarique Rahman) that the Constitution of Bangladesh was amended to replace the word secularism with the phrase that "absolute trust and faith in the Almighty Allah shall be the basis for all actions", thereby legitimising political Islam. Today, the BNP does have a moderate faction. This group has fought hard for early elections in Bangladesh, resulting in the Yunus regime being forced to declare the dates of February 2026 after their initially declared plan (supported by Jamaat-e-Islami) of no elections for four years, and elections only after completion of the so-called "reform process". The moderate group within the BNP also opposed the ban on the activities of the Awami League (imposed by the Yunus regime in May 2025) and supported the Awami League's participation in the February 2026 elections. However, this faction's position within the BNP is weak, and they are inevitably overruled by the much stronger pro-Jamaat-e-Islami faction. It is estimated that more than half the BNP membership is pro-Jamaat.

## Tarique's Closeness To The Jamaat

Tarique Rahman has almost always been associated with the pro-Jamaat faction of the BNP. He has been politically active since the late 1980s but came into prominence during his mother Begum Khaleda Zia's second term as Prime Minister, from 2001 to 2006, when the Jamaat-e-Islami was the principal alliance partner. During these years, Tarique ran Hawa Bhaban, the power centre recognised as the de facto PMO. His involvement in directing/coordinating the Chittagong Arms Haul (April 2004), and equally in the grenade attack on Sheikh Hasina's political rally in Dhaka (August 2004), has been written about extensively. However, what often escapes attention is the close involvement of Pakistan in the planning of each of these incidents, including participation in meetings with Tarique Rahman in Dhaka and overseas. These were highlighted during the separate hearings (for each of these two incidents) in the legal trials held in Dhaka after 2009.

## Will Haryana CM Dare to Order High-Level Probe into Rs.1,500-Crore Scam?

A major scam worth Rs. 1500 crore in Haryana's labour department has unearthed the fraudulent working in the Haryana government, which publicizes itself as the government having its motto 'Zero Tolerance Against Corruption' and claims that there is no difference between its words and actions. Political observers analyse that it may shake or even uproot the BJP led state government, if a proper investigation is ordered pertaining to the last ten-year period, the scam may go onto sky height as this amount of Rs. 1500 crore is being reported for the small duration between August 2023 and March 2025. Former Union Minister and present Member of Parliament, Kumari Selja, has commented that the scam of nearly ?1,500 crore in the Haryana Labour Welfare Board, along with the detection of 91 percent fake work slips and 87 percent fake labour registrations across 13 districts, is the biggest proof of the BJP government's corrupt governance. These figures clearly show that the BJP government has turned schemes meant for the welfare of workers into a means of loot. The schemes that were intended to provide dignity, security, and support to hardworking labourers have been sacrificed to corruption under political patronage. This is not merely negligence, but a well-planned and organised act of corruption, amounting to a direct attack on the rights of the poor and the working class. The Congress party demands a high-level investigation into the entire scam and strict action against those responsible. Former Haryana Chief Minister and presently Leader of the Opposition, Bhupinder Singh Hooda, said that the BJP government is setting a new record in cor-

ruption every day. A recent report reveals that there has been a 186 percent increase in corruption cases between 2021 and 2023. This revelation is based on the NCRB report, which mentions cases registered under the Prevention of Corruption Act and relevant sections of the IPC. This situation exists even though the government suppresses major corruption cases and prevents their investigation. Despite this, a new scam surfaces almost daily, which the government cannot hide despite its best efforts. Bhupinder Singh Hooda said that the BJP has hollowed out Haryana's economy through a series of scams. Today, the common people, as well as economists and intellectuals, have lost faith in the government because Haryana's economic situation has become extremely worrying. From 1966 to 2014, the state had a debt of approximately 60,000 crore rupees, which has now increased to more than 5 lakh crore rupees. This reflects the state's dire economic condition. In the NITI Aayog's Fiscal Health Index, Haryana has slipped to 14th position among 18 states. A debt-to-GSDP ratio of over 31% indicates that the state is trapped in a deep debt crisis. Indirectly indicating through another example that the scam in question is not limited to a particular department, Hooda highlights the recent paddy procurement scam and alleges that this is a case in point, which occurs every harvest season. The revelations in this scam are shocking. In the Asandh mandi (grain market), 570 trips by 112 vehicles were shown on paper, but no actual paddy was transported. The paddy was only bought and transported on paper. This resulted in a scam of Rs 39.24 crore. In the Gharaundera mandi, the revelations regarding paddy procurement were so shocking that everyone was left stunned. Here, 11,628 quintals of paddy were shown as purchased through fake gate passes without any actual arrival of paddy. Not only that, even motorcycles and auto-rickshaws were shown as being used for paddy transportation, resulting in a scam of Rs 2.56 crore. This entire paddy scam amounts to hundreds of crores of rupees, but the government is trying to suppress it by tak-

ing action only against small employees, while the big culprits, the real perpetrators, are being protected. While exposing Rs.1,500-Crore Work Slip Scam in his own department and further recommending for a High-Level Probe to the Chief Minister, Haryana Labour Minister Anil Vij has landed the CM Nayab Singh Saini in hot waters, who always claims a corruption-free Haryana. A press release, on 29th December, by Haryana's Labour Minister Anil Vij, reportedly claims that due to the vigilant and stringent oversight serious irregularities related to work slips (work receipts) prevailing for a long time in the Haryana Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, functioning under the Labour Department, have come to light. Preliminary investigations suggest that the scam could amount to approximately Rs.1,500 crore. Considering the gravity of the matter, minister Vij has written to the Chief Minister, recommending a thorough investigation by a reputed agency. Sharing details, the Labour Minister said that recently he chaired a meeting of the Board, during which irregularities were found not only in the appointment of Board members but also in the distribution of benefits under welfare schemes meant for construction workers. Following this, he ordered an immediate inquiry.

## MODUS OPERANDI

Minister Vij stated that initial investigations were conducted in Hisar, Kaithal, Jind, Sirsa, Faridabad and Bhiwani districts, where large-scale irregularities were detected. Subsequently, instructions were issued to Deputy Commissioners of all districts to constitute district-level committees comprising a Labour Department officer along with three other officers. These committees are carrying out physical verification of online work slips issued between August 2023 and March 2025. The verification process began around four months ago, and 100 percent verification has been completed in 13 districts so far.

The Labour Minister informed that in the 13 districts—Karnal, Rewari, Nuh (Mewat), Mahendragarh, Gurugram, Jhajjar, Palwal, Panipat,

Rohtak, Sonipat, Panchkula, Sirsa and Kaithal—a total of 5,99,758 work slips were issued. Of these, only 53,249 were found to be valid, while 5,46,509 were declared invalid. Similarly, out of 2,21,517 labour registrations, only 14,240 workers were found eligible after verification, whereas 1,93,756 registrations were found to be invalid.

Mr. Vij said it has become clear that in many places entire villages were fraudulently registered and work slips were generated so that ineligible persons could avail benefits of government schemes. On an average, a worker receives benefits worth around Rs.2.5 lakh under various schemes, which could result in a massive financial loss to the government. He said that "Those who are not eligible are availing benefits. This is outright loot, causing the government a financial loss running into hundreds of crores."

He further said that the verification committees are examining all aspects, including authenticity of workplaces, actual participation in construction activities, employer details, local inquiries and field inspections. During the verification period, RTS timelines were stopped, SARAL Centres were instructed not to accept new applications, and necessary information was issued to all grievance redressal platforms including CM Window, Jan Samvad, CPGRAMS, HHRC, HRTSC etc. Vij clarified that already approved pension schemes have not been stopped, while benefits under death, accident and funeral assistance schemes are being released on priority.

Minister Vij added that the Haryana Government implements several welfare schemes for construction workers, including maternity and paternity benefits, education assistance, scholarships, reimbursement for technical education, pensions, marriage assistance, medical aid, housing loans and accident compensation, aimed at empowering genuine workers. These benefits should reach only those workers who are duly registered after verification of at least 90 days of work. The Labour Minister reiterated that there will be no compromise on corruption at any level and strict action will be ensured against those found guilty.

about its social impact. Parallel to the dazzling growth figures, the reality of unemployment and inflation in 2025 remained equally stark. Educated youth had degrees, but no jobs. The uncertainty of recruitment exams, delayed results, and instability in the private sector put an entire generation under psychological pressure. Inflation robbed the common man of balance in his kitchen. Pulses, vegetables, gas, education, and health—everything became more expensive, but incomes did not rise in the same proportion. This economic imbalance gradually transformed into social discontent. In 2025, the plight of farmers and laborers remained undisclosed. Weather vagaries, lack of fair crop prices, mounting debt, and policy-level neglect kept farmers in constant insecurity. At times, dialogue was stalled, and at others, attempts were made to suppress movements. Ironically, those who feed the nation face the most uncertain future. The plight of laborers was no different. Millions of people working in the unorganized sector remained deprived of social security, stable employment, and a dignified life. The hands that build the edifice of development are often the most tired and least secure. The deplorable state of public education and healthcare systems was further exposed in 2025. The poor condition of government schools and hospitals is no longer a state problem, but a national challenge. Teachers continue to work under resource constraints and administrative pressure, while health workers continue to perform their duties in an environment of excessive workload, limited facilities, and insecurity. Privatization has provided choice, but not equality. Education and healthcare have gradually become commodities rather than rights, and those who were already socio-economically disadvantaged have suffered the most.

2025 was also a disturbing year for democracy. The tendency to equate dissent with anti-national sentiment narrowed public discourse. Growing pressure on writers, journalists, and social activists signaled that questioning power had not been completely silenced. This resistance was not just attempts to restrict expression, and questions raised about the autonomy of constitutional institutions reminded us that democracy doesn't survive solely on the electoral process. It thrives on a free press, fearless citizens, and accountable institutions. The politics of religion and identity repeatedly divided society in 2025. Religious fanaticism, mob mentality, and moral policing challenged the fundamental concepts of equality, fraternity, and secularism enshrined in the Constitution. Religion, which should have been a personal sphere of faith, became a tool of power and politics. The result was increased distrust in society, a breakdown in communication, and a deepening of fissures in human relationships.

Amidst all this gloom, 2025 also offered some tangible glimmers of hope. Youth asked questions, students raised their voices, farmers and workers organized and demanded their rights. Civil society organizations and independent journalism proved that Indian democracy had not been completely silenced. This resistance was not just

against power, but also against the social apathy that slowly erodes us from within. 2025 made it clear that development cannot be measured solely by GDP figures. Unless villages are safe, farmers are confident, laborers live with dignity, teachers and health workers are protected, and students are free from fear about the future, 'Developed India' will remain just a catchy slogan. Technology is meaningful only when it is connected to human emotions, and governance can be considered successful only when its impact reaches the last person in line. The biggest lesson of the past year, and especially of 2025, is that the responsibility to save India lies not only with governments but also with conscious citizens.

In a democracy, silence is not neutrality; it often becomes injustice's strongest ally. When we remain silent in the face of injustice, we unwittingly stand in its favor. 2025 made us realize that silence is no longer an option. Questioning, expressing disagreement, and maintaining dialogue are the greatest acts of patriotism today.

## 2025: The Year India Boarded The 'Reform Express'



In the recent past, India has demonstrated an ability to act decisively and boldly in moments of crisis—and 2025 was no exception. Confronted by a fresh geo-economic shock triggered by Trumponomics, New Delhi returned to a familiar playbook, using the pressure of external disruption to push through a fresh wave of long-pending economic reforms. However, what makes this moment stand out is the politically sensitive nature of some of these measures. Reforms such as changes to labour laws have long been acknowledged as necessary, yet avoided by successive governments—precisely because they are politically sensitive. The crisis triggered by Trumponomics created the space, and a spate of key electoral wins in assembly elections provided political momentum to finally convert intent to execution. And clearly, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) is not done. A few weeks ago, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman told a public gathering that the upcoming Union Budget will press ahead with more reforms, including effecting a complete overhaul of the customs duty structure—bringing it on par with the soft touch employed by regulators while randomly scrutinising direct tax filings. And then this weekend, Prime Minister Narendra Modi took to X to renew his government's commitment to economic reforms. The context was the conclusion of the annual meeting of chief secretaries convened in New Delhi and addressed by the Prime Minister. "This conference of Chief Secretaries," the PM posted on X, "has taken place at a time when India is witnessing next-generation reforms. India has boarded the Reform Express. And, the primary engine of this Reform Express is India's youth, our demography. That is why, it is our endeavour to empower this demography." The obvious question then: has India, under NDA, pivoted from reforms of stealth to one of conviction? The Reforms Playbook India's previous approach to reforms followed a pattern.

## We are not ready to gift anything to encroachers: Shivakumar



Bengaluru: Stating that encroachments were not acceptable, Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar today said there was no question gifting anything to the encroachers.

Speaking to reporters at his Sadashivanagar residence, he said, "There is no appeasement politics. We will take action against those who facilitated the encroachment. The evictees have given statements that some people collected money and allowed them to set up their sheds there. We will

give housing through Pradhan Mantri Awas scheme to the eligible evictees on humanitarian ground."

"They have said that land rights were issued sometime back and I have asked officials to review these claims. Some outsiders have also encroached the land more recently. We will check the original settlers and rehabilitate them," he said. Asked about criticism by Kerala MPs of his statement that it was an internal matter of the state, he said, "We

are running our government well. They can give whatever statement they want, we will not allow encroachments. They have not even delivered on their promises during previous floods and they don't have any rights to talk about our state. We know how to govern our state."

National leaders will respond to Pak comments.

Asked about Pakistan's External Affairs Minister's comments on Kogilu encroachments, the DCM said, "Senior national leaders will respond to this." Asked about evictees having ID cards from two states, he said the officials would investigate that. Asked if all evictees would be given accommodation, he said, "We will rehabilitate only the genuine eligible evictees. We are not regularizing it but will provide housing only to eligible locals."

## Bengaluru demolition row: Karnataka govt to allot alternative houses from Jan 1 after AICC intervention



Bengaluru, Dec 29 : After the intervention of the All India Congress Committee (AICC), the Congress-led Karnataka government, on Monday, announced alternative houses for those who lost shelter during the demolition drive carried out at the government land in Kogilu Layout in Bengaluru.

Addressing a joint press conference, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah along with State Congress President and Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar, made the announcement in Bengaluru after holding a high-level meeting in this regard.

"Though the people were living in illegally constructed houses, alternative housing is being provided on humanitarian grounds," the Karnataka govern-

ment said. The Chief Minister said that the state government has constructed one lakh houses precisely with the objective of providing shelter to the poor.

CM Siddaramaiah also added, "New houses will be provided to those who lost sheds on January 1, New Year's Day. The decision has been taken to provide alternative

houses within a 7-km radius of Kogilu."

He also warned that strict action will be initiated against the State Revenue Department and civic body officials if government land is illegally encroached upon in future.

Siddaramaiah said that the decision was made after discussions with Deputy Chief Minister Shivakumar,

Housing Minister Zameer Ahmad Khan, Revenue Minister and local MLA Krishna Byregowda regarding alternative arrangements, it was decided to allot houses at Baiyappanahalli.

"At Baiyappanahalli, in Survey No. 23, there are about 1,087 houses. After receiving the verified list from officials, houses will be allotted to the beneficiaries in the multi-storey buildings there. Baiyappanahalli is only about seven km from Kogilu," the Chief Minister added.

"Each house has been constructed at a cost of nearly Rs 11.20 lakh. Subsidies from the state and Central governments are available for general category beneficiaries as well as Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes," he said. "In addition, he has instructed that Rs 5

lakh per house be provided by the Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA). For general category beneficiaries, the total subsidy comes to Rs 8.70 lakh, while for SC/ST beneficiaries it comes to Rs 9.50 lakh. The remaining amount will be provided as a loan - Rs 2.5 lakh for general category beneficiaries and Rs 1.70 lakh for SC/ST beneficiaries.

Housing Minister Zameer Ahmad Khan has agreed to facilitate the loans after verification," the Chief Minister added.

"Verification will be carried out over the next two days. The responsibility of ensuring that houses are provided for occupation on January 1, marking the beginning of the New Year, has been entrusted to Housing Minister Zameer Ahmad Khan," he said.

## Bengaluru: Govt schools to hold mandatory PTMs once every two months after mega meet's success

Bengaluru, Dec 30 : Encouraged by the overwhelming response to the state's first-ever mega Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM), the Department of School Education and Literacy has decided to make PTMs mandatory once every two months in all government schools across Karnataka.

In a circular issued to schools, the department has outlined a structured schedule under which parents must be invited compulsorily every two months. During these meetings, parents will be briefed on their children's academic performance, progress in extracurricular activities and any shortcomings or negative remarks, officials said.

Teachers, however, pointed out that PTMs are a relatively new concept in government schools. "Earlier, even convincing parents to visit schools, especially in rural areas, was difficult. But after the mega PTM, many parents are now happy and willing to interact with teachers," said Chandrakala, a head teacher at a government high school. Unlike private schools, where PTMs are routine, this was the first time state-run schools adopted the practice on such a scale. The department has said that an annual PTM calendar will be issued, and all schools must strictly adhere to it, with a minimum of five PTMs planned in an academic year.

Speaking to reporters at Vidhana Soudha, Shivakumar said he shared a cordial relationship with the people of Kerala and held them in high regard. He stated that the BJP was attempting to create unnecessary confusion for political reasons. He also noted that party leaders had offered suggestions on the issue,

which he had accepted.

Referring to development initiatives, the Deputy Chief Minister said works worth Rs 5,000 crore would be taken up under the Krishna Bhagya Jal Nigam. He added that priority was being given to land acquisi-

tion for the Upper Krishna Project, for which an estimated Rs 70,000 crore would be required.

On his resolutions for 2026, Shivakumar said good governance remained the Congress government's primary goal. He expressed hope for good rainfall next year, said the government's guarantee schemes would continue to empower people, and confirmed that local body elections would be held.

Responding to questions on leadership and power transfer, he said good governance would continue under the Congress government for the next several years and declined to comment further, stating such discussions could wait until 2026.

## DK Shivakumar clarifies remarks were against Kerala government, not Keralites



Bengaluru: Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Tuesday clarified that his recent comments were directed at the alleged interference of the Kerala government in Karnataka's affairs and not against the people of Kerala. He accused BJP leader Rajeev Chandrashekhar of misleading the public by twisting his statements.

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## Bengaluru court acquits former minister, JD (S) MLA Revanna in sexual assault case

Bengaluru, Dec 29 : A court in Bengaluru on Monday acquitted former minister and sitting JD(S) MLA H.D. Revanna in an alleged sexual assault case. Revanna is the son of former Prime Minister and Rajya Sabha Member H.D. Deve Gowda and the father of former MP Prajwal Revanna, who has been convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment in a rape and sex video case.

Judge K.N. Shivakumar ruled in his favour, dismissing the case under Section 354A (sexual harassment) of the IPC and declaring Revanna not guilty. The court observed that the complaint was filed after a considerable delay and noted that on that ground alone, Revanna was entitled to be cleared of the charges in the sexual assault matter.

Revanna had been accused under Sections 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty) and 354A (sexual harassment) of the IPC, based on a complaint registered at the Holenarsipur Police Station in Hassan district. While the High Court had earlier quashed the charge under Section 354, Revanna subsequently filed an application seeking discharge under Section 354A as well. Earlier, Revanna had been arrested and remanded to judicial custody in connection with the same case.

Addressing a meeting with representatives of various political parties at Hall-01 of the GBA Head Office, Rao shared details of the final electoral roll and discussed election-related matters with the participants.

He said that, as per the instructions of the Election Commission of India (ECI), November 1 was fixed as the qualifying date for the preparation of the electoral roll for the Bengaluru Teachers' Constituency of the Karnataka Legislative Council.

Accordingly, the draft electoral roll was pub-

lished on November 25. The period from November 25 to December 10 was provided for filing claims and objections. After scrutinising the applications received during this period, the final electoral rolls for 28 Assembly constituencies under the GBA jurisdiction were published.

Rao informed that the final roll for the Bengaluru Teachers' Constituency comprises 18,496 voters.

Speaking on the occasion, Special Commissioner

R. Ramachandran said that eligible teachers who were left out during the final revision could apply for inclusion up to the last date for filing nominations. He added that voter registration and updation would continue on an ongoing basis.

The meeting was attended by Additional District Election Officers from Bengaluru Central, South, North and Urban divisions, representatives of various political parties, and concerned officials.

## Building houses for encroachers sets a bad precedent, says opposition leader R. Ashok



Bengaluru: Leader of the Opposition R. Ashok on Tuesday alleged that the Congress government had set a wrong precedent by building houses for land encroachers, claiming it would encourage land mafia activities. He said the move marked the beginning of a "bad tradition" and questioned the government's intent and procedure. One leading contender, the hydrogen fuel cell, just got a big boost, thanks to fundamental research stemming from the Department of Energy's SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory, and the Toyota Research Institute (TRI), that was recently translated to practice in a fuel cell device via a collaboration between Stanford and Technion Israel Institute of Technology.

Hydrogen fuel cells have really great potential for energy storage and conversion, using hydrogen as an alternative fuel to, say, gasoline," said Michaela Burke Stevens, an associate scientist with SLAC and Stanford University's joint SUNCAT Center for Interface Science and Catalysis and one of the senior authors on the study. "But it's still fairly expensive to run a fuel cell."

The Cost Dilemma of Fuel Cells

The problem, Burke Stevens said, is that fuel cells typically rely on a catalyst – packed with expensive platinum group metals (PGM) – that boosts the chemical reaction that makes the system work.

That led Burke Stevens and her colleagues to search for ways to make the catalyst cheaper, but making such a fundamental change to a fuel cell's chemistry is a daunting challenge: Scientists often find a catalyst that works in their small lab setup doesn't work out so well when a company tries it in a real-world fuel cell. This time, the researchers balanced costs, by partially replacing PGMs with a cheaper alternative, silver; but the real key was to simplify the chemical recipe for getting the catalyst onto the cell's electrodes. Scientists typically mix the catalyst into a liquid and then spread it

onto the mesh electrode, but these catalyst recipes don't always play out the same way in different lab environments with different tools – making it difficult to translate the work to real-world applications.

"Wet chemical processes are not particularly resilient with respect to laboratory conditions," said Tom Jaramillo, director of SUNCAT, which made the collaboration possible.

To get around that issue, the SLAC team instead used a vacuum chamber for more controlled depositions of their new catalyst onto electrodes. "This high-vacuum tool is a very 'what you see is what you

get' type of method," said Jaramillo. "As long as your system is calibrated well, in principle, people can reproduce it readily."

### Collaborative Efforts and Practical Application

To ensure that others could reproduce their approach and apply it directly to full-scale fuel cells, the team worked with experts at Technion, who showed that the method worked in a practical fuel cell.


This project was not set up to do the fuel cell testing here, so we were really fortunate that the lead Stanford graduate student on the project, José Zamora Zeledón,

formed a connection with Dario Dekel and his PhD student John Douglan at Technion. They were set up to test the actual fuel cells, so it was a really nice combination of resources to put together," said Burke Stevens.

Together, the two teams found that by substituting cheaper silver for some of the PGMs used in previous catalysts, they could achieve an equally effective fuel cell with a much lower price tag – and now that they have a proven method of developing catalysts, they can start testing more ambitious ideas.

"We could try going entirely PGM-free," said Jaramillo. Dekel, a chemical engineering professor and director of the Grand Technion Energy Program at Technion, was equally excited by the partnership's potential. "This has great benefits for the research of fuel cells in the academy as well as for practical catalyst development in the fuel cell industry," he said. Looking forward, Jaramillo said, research like this will decide whether fuel cells can fulfill their potential. "Fuel cells are really looking exciting and interesting for heavy-duty transportation and clean energy storage," said Jaramillo, "but it's ultimately going to come down to lowering cost, which is what this collaborative work is all about."

## Micro-Ring Resonators: Advancing Laser Technology



EPFL researchers have developed a hybrid device that significantly improves existing, ubiquitous laser technology. The team at EPFL's Photonic Systems Laboratory (PHOSL) has developed a chip-scale laser source that enhances the performance of semiconductor lasers while enabling the generation of shorter wavelengths. This pioneering work, led by Professor Camille Brès and postdoctoral researcher Marco Clementi from EPFL's School of Engineering represents a significant advance in the field of photonics, with implications for telecommunications, metrology, and other high-precision applications. Innovative Integration for Improved Coherence and Visibility. The study, published in the journal Light: Science & Applications, reveals how the PHOSL researchers, in collaboration with the Laboratory of Photonics and Quantum Measurements, have successfully integrated semiconductor lasers with silicon nitride photonic circuits containing microresonators. This integration results in a hybrid device capable of emitting highly uniform and precise light in both near-infrared and visible ranges, filling a technological gap that has long challenged the industry. Semiconductor lasers are ubiquitous in modern technology, found in everything from smartphones to fiber optic communications. However, their potential has been limited by a lack of coherence and the inability to generate visible light efficiently," explains Professor Brès. "Our work not only improves the coherence of these lasers but also shifts their output towards the visible spectrum, opening up new avenues for their use." Coherence, in this context, refers to the uniformity of the phases of the light waves emitted by the laser. High coherence means the light waves are synchronized, leading to a beam with a very precise color or frequency. This property is crucial for applications where precision and stability of the laser beam are paramount, such as timekeeping and precision sensing. The team's approach involves coupling commercially available semiconductor lasers with a silicon nitride chip. This tiny chip is created with industry-standard, cost-efficient CMOS technology. Thanks to the material's exceptional low-loss properties, there is little to no light that is absorbed or escapes. The light from the semiconductor laser flows through microscopic waveguides into extremely small cavities, where the beam is trapped. These cavities, called micro-ring resonators, are intricately designed to resonate at specific frequencies, selectively amplifying the desired wavelengths while attenuating others, thereby achieving enhanced coherence in the emitted light. The other significant achievement is the hybrid system's ability to double the frequency of the light coming from the commercial semiconductor laser – enabling a shift from the near-infrared spectrum to the visible light spectrum. The relationship between frequency and wavelength is inversely proportional, meaning that if the frequency is doubled, the wavelength is reduced by half. While the near infrared spectrum is exploited for telecommunications, higher frequencies are essential for building smaller, more efficient devices where shorter wavelengths are needed, such as in atomic clocks and medical devices. These shorter wavelengths are achieved when the trapped light in the cavity undergoes a process called all-optical poling, which induces what is known as second-order nonlinearity in the silicon nitride. Nonlinearity in this context means that there is a significant shift, a jump in magnitude, in the light's behavior that is not directly proportional to its frequency, arising from its interaction with the material. Silicon nitride does not normally incur this specific second order nonlinear effect, and the team performed an elegant engineering feat to induce it: The system takes advantage of the light's capacity, when resonating within the cavity, to produce an electromagnetic wave that provokes the nonlinear properties in the material. "We are not just improving existing technology but also pushing the boundaries of what's possible with semiconductor lasers," says Marco Clementi, who played a key role in the project. "By bridging the gap between telecom and visible wavelengths, we're opening the door to new applications in fields like biomedical imaging and precision timekeeping."

## Neuroscience Revolution: AI Precision in Tracking Moving Neurons

**E**PL and Harvard scientists develop an AI-based method for tracking neurons in moving animals, enhancing brain research efficiency with minimal manual annotation. Recent advances allow imaging of neurons inside freely moving animals. However, to decode circuit activity, these imaged neurons must be computationally identified and tracked. This becomes particularly challenging when the brain itself moves and deforms inside an organism's flexible body, e.g. in a worm. Until now, the scientific community has lacked the tools to address the problem.

Development of AI Method for Neuron Tracking

Now, a team of scientists from EPFL and Harvard have developed a pioneering AI method to track neurons inside moving and deforming animals. The study, now published in *Nature Methods*, was led by Sahand Jamal Rahi at EPFL's School of Basic Sciences. The new method is based on a convolutional neural network (CNN), which is a type of AI that has been trained to recognize and under-



stand patterns in images. The team has made their CNN accessible, providing a user-friendly graphical user interface that integrates targeted augmentation, streamlining the process from manual annotation to final proofreading. By significantly reducing the manual effort required for neuron

segmentation and tracking, the new method increases analysis throughput three times compared to full manual annotation," says Sahand Jamal Rahi. "The breakthrough has the potential to accelerate research in brain imaging and deepen our understanding of neural circuits and behaviors." This involves a process called

"convolution," which looks at small parts of the picture – like edges, colors, or shapes – at a time and then combines all that information together to make sense of it and to identify objects or patterns. The problem is that to identify and track neurons during a movie of an animal's brain, many images have to be labeled by hand because the animal appears very differently across time due to the many different body deformations. Given the diversity of the animal's postures, generating a sufficient number of annotations manually to train a CNN can be daunting.

### Targeted Augmentation

To address this, the researchers developed an enhanced CNN featuring 'targeted augmentation'. The innovative technique automatically synthesizes reliable annotations for reference out of only a limited set of manual annotations. The result is that the CNN effectively learns the internal deformations of the brain and then uses them to create annotations for new postures, drastically reducing the need for manual annotation and double-checking.

**iPhone 16 becomes highest selling phone in India: Report**

**Mumbai,** US-based tech giant Apple sold about 6.5 million iPhone 16 units in the first 11 months of 2025, making it the country's highest-selling smartphone, according to a new report.

The report from Counterpoint Research said that Apple outpaced Android rivals in the same period. The research firm's data found the gap is striking as iPhone 15 also made to the top five best-selling list.

The research firm said Apple's performance reflects changing buyer behaviour in a market, historically dominated by entry-level and mid-range devices.

Further, the change is underpinned by a strategic push by Apple to expand local manufacturing and reduce reliance on China. Apple recently opened three new Apple Stores in Bengaluru, Pune, and Noida, taking its total retail presence in India to five stores.

Financing options such as no-cost EMIs, cashbacks, and bank schemes have made high-end phones more attainable to more consumers. Apple Inc clocked the highest value of exports from India in November, shipping iPhones worth \$2 billion, as per latest industry data.

Apple clocked the highest value of exports from India in November, shipping iPhones worth \$2 billion. In November, a company filing showed that Apple India posted a record high domestic sales of \$9 billion in FY25, and one in every five iPhones made globally in FY25 was manufactured/Assembled in India.

The company's manufacturing in India contributed 12 per cent of Apple's global production value. The iPhone maker also began local assembly of high-end Pro and Pro Max models of iPhones in India for the first time.

The company filings showed that the Americas brought in \$178.4 billion in FY25 – nearly 43 per cent of Apple's global revenue – and a growing share of those iPhones were shipped from India.

**India poised to become 3rd-largest economy with GDP of \$7.3 trillion by 2030**

**New Delhi,**

With GDP valued at \$4.18 trillion, India has surpassed Japan to become the world's fourth largest economy and is poised to displace Germany from the third rank in the next 2.5 to 3 years with projected GDP of \$7.3 trillion by 2030, an official statement said on Monday.

The growth momentum further surprised on the upside, with GDP expanding to a six-quarter high in Q2 of 2025, reflecting India's resilience amid persistent global trade uncertainties.

Domestic drivers led by robust private consumption played a central role in supporting this expansion, according to the statement.

India's real GDP grew 8.2 per cent in Q2 FY2025, up from 7.8 per cent in the previous



quarter and 7.4 per cent in Q4 of 2024, led by resilient domestic demand amidst global trade and policy uncertainties. Real gross value added (GVA) expanded by 8.1 per cent, catalysed by buoyant industrial and services sectors.

High-frequency indicators point to sustained economic activity: inflation remains below

the lower tolerance threshold, unemployment is on a declining trajectory, and export performance continues to improve.

Furthermore, financial conditions have stayed benign, with strong credit flows to the commercial sector, while demand conditions remain firm, supported by a further strengthening of urban consumption.

"India is among the world's fastest-growing major

economies and is well-positioned, supported by benign inflation. Looking ahead, domestic drivers like favourable agricultural status by 2047, the centenary of India's independence, the effects of GST rationalisation, benign inflation, and the strong balance sheets of corporates and financial institutions are coupled with supportive monetary and financial conditions are expected to continue bolstering the economic activity.

External factors such as services exports are projected to remain robust, while the swift conclusion of current trade and investment negotiations offers additional upside potential.

Ongoing reforms are likely to further enable growth prospects. Present macroeconomic situation presents a rare "goldilocks period" of high growth and low inflation, said the statement.

**Trade pact with Australia anchors India's economic engagement in Indo-Pacific: Piyush Goyal**

**New Delhi,**

Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Monday said that as the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) negotiations advance with other nations, India-Australia trade pact continues to anchor the country's economic engagement in the Indo-Pacific, aligned with 'Make in India' and the vision of 'Viksit Bharat 2047'. From January 1, 2026, 100 per cent Australian tariff lines will be zero-duty for Indian exports, unlocking fresh opportunities for labour-intensive sec-

tors, Goyal informed.

On the third anniversary of the India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (India-Aus ECTA), the minister said that we are celebrating a partnership that has translated intent into impact. "Together, India and Australia are building a future of shared prosperity and trusted trade," Goyal posted on X social media platform. Over the past three years, the agreement has delivered sustained export growth, deeper market access, and stronger supply-chain resilience, benefiting Indian exporters, MSMEs,

farmers, and workers alike, according to Goyal. India's exports to Australia grew by 8 per cent in FY 2024, improving India's trade balance. Strong gains were witnessed across manufacturing, chemicals, textiles, plastics, pharmaceuticals, petroleum products, and gems and jewellery.

"Agri-exports recorded broad-based growth, with sharp increases in fruits and vegetables, marine products, spices, and exceptional growth in coffee. Gems & Jewellery exports rose 16 per cent in April-November 2025," said the minister.

**Govt offers 50 new blocks to investors to step up hunt for oil & gas**

**New Delhi,**

Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said on Monday that with the offering of 50 new blocks to investors for exploration and production of oil and gas, India's energy sector has reached "a transformative milestone".

The minister further stated that while 25 of these blocks are being offered under the 10th round of the oil exploration and licensing policy (OALP-X), another 55 fields across 9 contract blocks are being offered under the fourth



bidding round for discovered small fields (DSF-IV).

Besides, 16 blocks are being put on offer as part of Special CBM Bid Rounds 2025 and 2026. While 3 blocks are in the 2025 category, the other 13 blocks are for 2026.

"The quest to unlock the potential of India's sedimentary basins has gained a new thrust and momentum," the minister remarked in a post on X.

Puri said that India has now introduced a unified regulatory framework enabled by the Oilfields (Regulation and Development) Amendment

Act, 2025, which delinks petroleum operations from mining, and the PNG Rules 2025. The revenue-sharing contract model has been adopted to facilitate the ease of doing business.

He said that to make things easier for investors, a single license has been introduced for conventional and unconventional hydrocarbons. Exploration is allowed throughout the contract duration, while reduced royalty rates have been rolled out as an incentive. The norms also build in stabilisation for changes in law.

The usage of silver in electric vehicles could be of concern for Musk, who runs EV maker Tesla.

Silver prices in global markets retreated sharply after touching fresh intraday records of \$84 per ounce on the spot market. The white metal slipped as much as 8 per cent from its peak due to strong profit booking, snapping what could have been a seventh consecutive day of gains.

March silver futures on MCX are trading up 4.22 per cent intraday as of 10.10 am, at 2,49,282 per kilogram.

**India delivers 6 ambulances with modern medical equipment to Afghanistan**

**Kabul/New Delhi,** India has delivered a consignment of six ambulances to Afghanistan, amid growing healthcare cooperation between the two countries, according to a media report.

The ambulances are equipped with advanced medical equipment and can aid in transporting emergency patients and provide emergency health services. Sharafat Zaman Amarkhel, the Taliban spokesman for the Health ministry, was quoted as saying by Afghan media outlet AMU TV.

India's assistance can improve health services, especially emergency responses in Afghanistan, Amarkhel added.

The consignment is part of a commitment made during high-level talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Afghan Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi in New Delhi in October.

During the meeting, Jaishankar described the gift as "20 ambulances, a gesture of goodwill".

"India will also provide MRI and CT scan machines to Afghan hospitals and deliver vaccines for immunisation and cancer medicines. We have also supplied drug rehabilitation materials through UNODC and are open to doing more," the foreign minister had said.

Earlier this month, Afghanistan's Minister of Public Health, Mawlawi Noor Jalal Jalali, held a meeting with Minister of Health and Family Welfare JP Nadda in the national capital and discussed ways to enhance bilateral cooperation in the healthcare sector.

**India adds highest-ever 44.5 GW renewable energy in 2025: Govt**

**New Delhi,**

India saw highest-ever renewable energy capacity addition in 2025 at 44.51 GW (till November) which is nearly double as compared to the 24.72 GW during the same period last year, the government said on Monday.

The total renewable energy installed capacity reached 253.96 GW in November 2025, which is an increase of over 23 per cent as compared to the 205.52 GW in November 2024.

Solar capacity addition is 34.98 GW, compared to the 20.85 GW during the same period last year. Solar energy installed capacity crossed 100 GW mark in January, 2025. The solar energy installed capacity has reached



132.85 GW in November, 2025 which is an increase of over 41 per cent as compared to the 94.17 GW in November 2024, according to Ministry of New and Renewable Energy.

Wind capacity also registered a substantial growth with capacity addition of 5.82 GW compared to 3.2 GW during the same period last year. Wind energy's installed

**IIT Bombay, NTPC complete drilling India's 1st CO2 storage well; second underway**

**Mumbai,**

Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay and NTPC have successfully completed the drilling of India's first well for testing the viability of geological carbon dioxide (CO2) storage in sedimentary formations such as coal and sandstone, the institute said on Monday.

The collaboration, launched under the aegis of NITI Aayog in November 2022, brought together NETRA and the R&D wing of NTPC, and the Department of Earth Sciences, IIT Bombay, in building India's first geological storage atlas for coalbed methane-rich coalfields.

The atlas provided layer-by-layer simulation results with experimentally validated inputs for quantifying the potential for geological CO2 storage in four major coalfields.

The country achieved its first dedicated well, reaching a depth of 1200m in September, for potential CO2 storage. The drilling site in Pakri Barwadih, in the vicinity of a coal mining area in Jharkhand's Hazaribagh, was completed



on November 15.

Notably, a second well drilling was initiated on December 21. Both CO2 injection and plume monitoring using these wells will be implemented, the institute said.

"As India stands at the cusp of honouring net-zero commitments in line with the 'Panchamrit' climate goals announced by the Prime Minister, accelerating indigenous science and technology outcomes for commercialisation of Carbon Capture, Utilisation and Storage (CCUS) technologies will be crucial to the journey towards 'Atmanirbhar' and 'Viksit' Bharat commitments," said Dr. V.K. Saraswat, Member, NITI Aayog.

# Russia's losses in Ukraine rise faster than ever as US pushes for peace deal

Over the past 10 months, Russian losses in the war with Ukraine have been growing faster than any time since the start of the full-scale invasion in 2022, BBC analysis suggests. As peace efforts intensified in 2025 under pressure from US President Donald Trump's administration, 40% more obituaries of soldiers were published in Russian sources compared with the previous year. Overall, the BBC has confirmed the names of almost 160,000 people killed fighting on Russia's side in Ukraine. BBC News Russian has been counting Russian war losses together with independent outlet Mediamazona and a group of volunteers since February 2022. We keep a list of named individuals whose deaths we were able to confirm using official reports, newspapers, social media, and new memorials and graves. The real death toll is believed to be much higher, and military experts we have consulted



believe our analysis of cemeteries, war memorials and obituaries might represent 45-65% of the total. That would put the number of Russian deaths at between 243,000 and 352,000. The number of obituaries for any given period is a preliminary estimate of the confirmed losses, as some need additional verification and will eventually be discarded. But it can indicate

how the intensity of fighting is changing over time. 2025 starts with a relatively low number of published obituaries in January, compared with the previous months. Then the number rises in February, when Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin talked directly for the first time about ending the war in Ukraine. The next peak in August coincides

with the two presidents meeting each other in Alaska, a diplomatic coup for Putin that was widely seen as an end to his international isolation. In October, when a planned second Russia-US summit was eventually shelved, and then in November, when the US presented a 28-point peace proposal, an average of 322 obituaries were published per day -

twice the average in 2024. It is difficult to put increased Russian losses down to any one factor, but the Kremlin sees territorial gains as a way of influencing negotiations with the US in its favour: Putin aide Yuri Ushakov stressed recently that "recent successes" had had a positive impact. Murat Mukashev was among those who gambled on a quick peace deal, and it cost him his life. Mukashev was an activist who had never supported Putin's policies. Over the years, he had taken part in demonstrations against police violence and torture, and joined rallies for LGBT rights and the release of Alexei Navalny, the Kremlin's main opponent who died in prison in 2024. He had repeatedly condemned Russia's invasion of Ukraine on social media from 2022. Then, in early 2024, Mukashev was detained near his home in Moscow and charged with large-scale drug dealing. While his case was being tried he was offered a

contract with the defence ministry, according to his friends and family. They saw the heavy charges levelled against him as a typical ploy to get people to sign up. A 2024 law allows the accused a way out of a criminal conviction if they join up - an attractive option in a country with an acquittal rate of less than 1%. Mukashev refused the offer, and the court sentenced him to 10 years in a high-security penal colony. In prison in November 2024, he changed his mind. Friends said he was encouraged by Trump's promises to end the war quickly and decided he needed to sign up as soon as possible to secure his release before a peace deal was reached. "He saw this as a chance to be released instead of being imprisoned for 10 years of strict regime," reads a statement from his support group. There was no explanation of how he reconciled taking part in the war with his reluctance to kill.

## French right pushes for national tribute to film star

Brigitte Bardot



French right-wing figure Éric Ciotti has called for a national tribute to honour film legend Brigitte Bardot, prompting objections from political opponents on the left. "France has a duty to honour its Marianne," said Ciotti, referring to the emblem of French liberty whose face Bardot was chosen to represent in the 1960s. Bardot died on Sunday aged 91. A petition launched by Ciotti since has attracted more than 23,000 signatures, and has the backing of some allies on the far right. But Socialist leader Olivier Faure has pointed out that national homages are for "exceptional services to the nation". Bardot was an iconic actress but she also "turned her back on republican values", Faure argued. Bardot has been hailed by President Emmanuel Macron as a "legend of the century" who embodied a life of freedom, and Ciotti, who leads the right-wing UDR party, has appealed to him to organise a national send-off. Ciotti said France should recognise

## Great white sharks face extinction in Mediterranean, say researchers



Great white sharks in the Mediterranean Sea are in danger of disappearing, with illegal fishing contributing to their decline. This is according to research by US scientists, working in partnership with UK charity Blue Marine Foundation. They say some of the most threatened species - including

great white sharks - are being sold in North African fish markets. Great whites are one of more than 20 Mediterranean shark species protected under international law, meaning it is illegal to fish for them or to sell them. By monitoring fishing ports on the Mediterranean coast of North Africa.

## Saudi Arabia backs call for UAE to leave Yemen after strike on separatist-held port

Saudi Arabia has backed a demand from Yemen's presidential council for the United Arab Emirates to withdraw within 24 hours, after a Saudi-led coalition bombed what it said was a weapons shipment for UAE-backed separatists at the port of Mukalla. The Saudi foreign ministry accused the UAE of "pressuring" the Southern Transitional Council (STC), which seeks independence for southern Yemen, to launch recent offensives in the eastern provinces of Hadramawt and al-Mahra. The kingdom would take measures to confront what it considered such "highly dangerous" actions, it warned. The UAE's foreign ministry

denied that the shipment contained weapons and expressed "deep regret" at the Saudi statement. It strongly condemned "the allegations that it exerted pressure on, or directed, any Yemeni party to carry out military operations that would undermine the security of the sisterly kingdom of Saudi Arabia or target its borders". The STC's leaders also said the ultimatum for the withdrawal of the UAE's forces had no legal basis, and insisted it would remain a "main partner" in the battle against the Iran-backed Houthi movement, which controls much of

Chart-topping K-pop band NewJeans' record label, Ador, is suing one of the band's members in what is yet another twist in their bitter year-long feud. Hybe, the record label's parent company, confirmed to the BBC that it is suing Danielle Marsh, one of her family members, and ex-boss Min Hee-jin for \$30m (£22m) in damages as part of a contract break penalty. The band has been plunged into further turmoil as the return of Minji, another of its stars, remains uncertain, leaving the band with three members. Coming less than two months after reports that

NewJeans would return to the label as a band of five, this news dashes fans' hopes of a comeback. Many took to social media with the slogan: "NewJeans is five or nothing, while others questioned why Danielle was singled out. "Does this make any sense?" NewJeans without Danielle isn't NewJeans. Do you think you can just erase a member this easily? Give us back Danielle," one wrote in an X post. "It's not fair at all. Free NewJeans [all 5 members]," another wrote on Instagram. "All they wanted to do was to be [artists] and make their fans happy."

## Eurostar cancels all trains out of London as power outage hits Channel Tunnel



According to Eurostar, passengers can rearrange their plans free of charge or can cancel their booking and get a refund or an e-voucher. The broken Le Shuttle train has been moved out of the Channel Tunnel and Eurotunnel expects to resume services around 15:00 CET (14:00 GMT). "Our teams are working to restore the situation as quickly as possible," Le Shuttle said in a statement. "Waiting times will be adjusted throughout the day. Eurotunnel apologises for the inconvenience and thanks its customers for their patience and understanding." On its website Le Shuttle says check-in and border control services are experiencing lengthy delays.

## Bangladesh's first female prime minister Khaleda Zia dies aged 80



Zia, Bangladesh's first female prime minister and an arch-rival of ousted leader Sheikh Hasina, has died from a prolonged illness. She was 80 years old. Zia intended to run for parliament in February, when the country will vote for the first time since a popular revolution in late 2024 unseated Hasina.

Thrust into the political limelight following the assassination of her husband, then-president Ziaur Rahman, she went on to become Bangladesh's first female PM in 1991. Her career, which included spells in prison and house arrest, was defined by a bitter feud with Hasina. She was acquitted of corruption and allowed to travel to London for treatment only after Hasina lost power. Physicians said on Monday that Zia's condition was "extremely critical". She was put on life support, but it was not possible to provide multiple treatments at the same

## Trump hopes to reach phase two of Gaza ceasefire 'very quickly'



Donald Trump said he hoped to reach phase two of the Gaza peace plan "very quickly", as he warned Hamas would "hell to pay" if it did not disarm soon. The US president, whose 20-point peace plan requires the militant group to disarm, made the comments as he met Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in Florida for talks on Monday. During a press conference with Netanyahu after their meeting, Trump said Israel had "lived up to the plan 100%", despite continuing attacks by its military in Gaza. The US president also said his country could support another major strike on Iran were it to resume rebuilding its ballistic missile or nuclear weapons programmes. In response to

Trump's threat, Iran's supreme leader's top political adviser, Ali Shamkhani, said on X that any aggression towards Iran would be met with an "immediate harsh response". Asked how quickly Hamas and Israel should move to phase two of the peace plan, Trump said: "As quickly as we can. But there has to be disarmament." Speaking about Hamas, he said: "If they don't disarm as, as they agreed to do, they agreed to it, and then there will be hell to pay for them. "They have to disarm in a fairly short period of time". Trump also said reconstruction in Gaza could "begin pretty soon". The Gaza peace plan came into effect in October. Under the second phase, a technocratic government would be estab-

lished in the devastated territory, Hamas would disarm and Israeli troops would withdraw. The reconstruction of Gaza would then begin. But critics have suggested Netanyahu could seek to delay the process of the plan and instead push for Hamas to disarm before Israeli troops withdraw. The Israeli prime minister has been accused of not wanting to engage seriously

concerned about what other people are doing or maybe aren't doing," he added. Since the ceasefire came into effect, at least 414 Palestinians have been killed by the Israeli military in Gaza, according to the Hamas-run health ministry. The Israeli military, which controls more than half of Gaza, has said it has only opened fire in response to ceasefire violations. It has blamed Hamas for the killings of three Israeli soldiers over the same period. During the press briefing, Trump also warned that the US would launch further attacks on Iran if it was found to be using different sites to develop nuclear weapons. In June, Trump claimed US air and missile strikes "obliterated" Iran's nuclear facilities. Iran has denied seeking to develop nuclear weapons. "I hope they're not trying to build up again, because if they are we're going to have no choice but to eradicate that build up," he said. Trump said he "had been reading" that the country was using "possibly different sites" to those targeted in summer. Iran, which fought a 12-day war with Israel in June, on Monday denounced the reports as a "psychological operation" against Tehran. It said it was fully prepared to defend itself, and warned renewed aggression would "result in harsher consequences" for Israel. Trump and Netanyahu's talks also focused on other regional tension points, including Syria and the Hezbollah militant group in Lebanon.




## Smriti Mandhana Misses Chance To Surpass Shubman Gill's World Record

Smriti Mandhana needed 62 runs in the fifth T20I against Sri Lanka on Tuesday to surpass Shubman Gill for a momentous world record. It was not to be. The India opener had already amassed 1,703 runs across formats (ODIs + T20Is) this calendar year - the most by any woman in a single year. With just 62 more runs, Mandhana would have become the leading run-scorer of 2025 across both men's and women's international cricket, surpassing Shubman Gill's tally of 1,764 (Tests + ODIs + T20Is). Mandhana scored 1,362 runs in ODIs and 341 in T20Is in 2025. However, Mandhana was not included in the playing XI for the fifth T20I in Thiruvananthapuram, as the team management decided to rest the star batter. ## ICC Verdict Out On Eden Gardens Pitch Where India Failed To Chase 124 vs South Africa

The Eden Gardens pitch that hosted the first India vs South Africa Test from November 14-16 drew a lot of flak after the hosts failed to chase a 124-run target. South African spinner Simon Harmer scalped eight wickets in the match as the Gautam Gambhir-coached Indian cricket team slumped to a 30-run loss. While several experts criticised the pitch, Gambhir did not agree. "It was not an unplayable wicket, there were no demons," he said. "This is exactly the pitch we were looking for. The curator was very, very helpful and supportive. This is exactly what we wanted, and this is exactly what we got. When you don't play well, this is what happens." While most former players did not agree



with the comment, the ICC seemed happy with the pitch on offer. It rated the pitch as "satisfactory," according to a report by TOI. This came a few days after the ICC rated the Melbourne Cricket Ground pitch, which hosted the Australia vs England Boxing Day Test, "unsatisfactory." The venue was handed

one demerit point as well. Coming back to Eden Gardens, Anil Kumble, a legendary spinner and former coach of the Indian team, expressed shock at some of Gambhir's remarks on the pitch. "If you look back at the legacy of Eden Gardens, there have been so many Test matches played here. I've

been coming here since I was an Under-19 kid, and I've never seen a pitch behave like this over three days in a Test match," Kumble said on JioHotstar after the match. "I did listen to what Gautam said; he mentioned that the team wanted something like this. Then I'm a bit confused because I know this is a young side." Dale Steyn, one of the finest South African pacers to have played the game, directly countered Gambhir's "no demons" statement. "He said there weren't demons in the pitch? I certainly saw quite a lot," Steyn, who was part of the same panel, said. "You know, as Anil was saying, some balls were spinning two feet past the bat, hitting the keeper on the shoulder."

## How South Africa conquered Test cricket in 2025



From a certain vantage point, the health of Test cricket in South Africa appears terminal. For the first time since sporting isolation during apartheid, there will be no red-ball action in the country this summer. Instead, fans must make do watching Indian-owned T20 franchises compete in the SA20. The next time the Proteas take the field in whites on home soil will be October 2026, 21 months after hosting Pakistan in January this year. And yet the Test team itself has rarely looked in better shape, with 2025 proving a watershed year. Ryan Rickleton registered his country's first double century for nine years as Pakistan were swept 2-0. In June, a sublime fourth-innings 136 from Aiden Markram, allied to a nine-wicket match haul from Kagiso Rabada, carried South Africa to a five-wicket victory over Australia in the World Test Championship (WTC) final at Lord's. The high-stakes clash in Doha saw the teenage Indian grandmaster succumb to a costly blunder under severe time pressure, proving that in the lightning-fast world of blitz chess, even the greatest can falter. Despite his world title, Gukesh found himself outmaneuvered by the young FIDE Master in a tense third-round encounter. The match reached its breaking point on move 70. Playing with the black pieces, Gukesh was down a pawn and racing against the clock with just eight seconds left. His opponent, the Russian prodigy Skolkin, offered a rook exchange, a move that likely would have steered the game toward a draw. However, Gukesh, known for his aggressive "play-to-win" spirit, declined the trade and moved his rook to f4. The



gambit backfired almost instantly. Within moves, Gukesh lost his bishop and his final pawn. Facing an impossible position, the world champion was forced to resign just ten moves later. Commentators described the move as the "blunder of the round." Grandmaster Maurice Ashley noted that while Gukesh's fighting spirit is his greatest strength in classical chess, his refusal to settle for a draw proved fatal in this format. Bournemouth are among the clubs who rate him highly and see him as a potential replacement for Antoine Semenyo, should the Ghanaian leave in January. Tottenham manager Thomas Frank said the Wales international was available to face Brentford on New Year's Day. He said: "Brennan has been a top professional. He has trained well today and is ready in two days' time [for the game against Brentford]." Tottenham are in the market for a new attacker this January which would limit Johnson's opportunities even more. It is understood that they have an interest in RB Leipzig winger Yann Diomande, 19, and Manchester City attacker Saviño, 21. BBC Sport disclosed earlier this month that Tottenham were open to selling Johnson, who was the club's leading scorer last season with 18 goals.
