SEVEN KILLED, 12 INJURED AS BUS FALLS INTO GORGE IN ALMORA

DEHRADUN: Seven people were killed and about 12 injured after a bus fell into a gorge in Uttarakhand's Almora district, police said on Tuesday. The accident occurred in the Bhikiyasain area when the bus was en route to Rammagar in Nainital from Dwarhat in Almora. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Devendra Pincha said. According to the SSP, 18 to 19 passengers were on board when the driver lost control of the



vehicle, and it fell into a gorge, six kilometres ahead of Bhikiyasain. Upon receiving information about the accident, the police, along with State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams, reached the spot and launched rescue and relief operations, he said. Six people died on the spot in the accident, while another succumbed to injuries on the way to hospital, the officer added. SSP Pincha said 12 people, including the driver, were injured in the accident and rescued from the gorge.

FOG DISRUPTS DELHI AIRPORT OPS; 118 FLIGHTS CANCELLED, 16 DIVERTED'



New Delhi: At least 118 flights were cancelled, 16 flights diverted and 130 services delayed at the Delhi airport on Tuesday as dense fog disrupted operations. The Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA), operated by DIAL, handles around 1,300 flights daily. An official said 60 arrivals and 58 departures were cancelled while 16 flights were diverted at the airport. Information from flight tracking website FlightRadar24.com showed that 130 flights were delayed on Tuesday morning at the airport and the average delay time for departures was around 28 minutes. In a post on X in the morning, Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) said all flight operations continue as normal and flights that are not CAT III compliant may get affected. CAT III compliance allows pilots to operate flights in low visibility conditions.

Against the backdrop of fog and low visibility conditions, the civil aviation ministry on Tuesday said airlines have been instructed to strictly comply with passenger facilitation norms.

CM Revanth outlines roadmap for planned urban development

HYDERABAD: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday directed newly appointed zonal commissioners to move beyond routine administration and adopt an outcome-driven approach to urban governance, with a special focus on the Core Urban Region within the Outer Ring Road.

Reviewing urban administration, the Chief Minister said the government had taken a conscious decision to develop the core urban economic region in a planned and systematic manner in line with the Telangana Rising 2047 Vision Document, which aims for sustainable and inclusive growth. He said the city under the CURE (Core Urban Region Economy) framework has been reorganised into 12 zones, 60 circles and 300 wards to strengthen decentralised governance and accountability. Emphasising daily monitoring and effective planning, he said the objective was to put urban governance firmly on track. Describing solid waste manage-



ment as Hyderabad's most complex challenge, the Chief Minister announced a comprehensive cleanup of the core urban region and made it clear that zonal commissioners would be personally responsible for resolving issues in their respective zones. He instructed them to be present in the field every day.

The Chief Minister announced a complete ban on plastic in the city and stressed the need to protect lakes and nalas from encroachments. He also said diesel buses and

autos operating in the CURE area would be gradually replaced with electric vehicles to reduce pollution.

To strengthen monitoring, he directed officials to install CCTV cameras near lakes, nalas and garbage dumping points, conduct special sanitation drives for three days every month, and undertake garbage clearance drives every ten days. He asserted that there should be no garbage on roads and no visible potholes. He further instructed officials to leverage technology for transparent delivery of civic services

such as birth and death certificates and trade licences through online platforms. Regular coordination with colony welfare associations and apartment associations was also emphasised.

Calling for a transition from good governance to smart governance, the Chief Minister directed agencies including the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation, HYDRAA and the Water Works department to begin desilting of

nalas from January. He also stressed the importance of adequate street lighting, effective mosquito control and preventive measures against seasonal diseases.

The Chief Minister said zonal commissioners must respond promptly to public grievances received through toll-free numbers and prepare five-year action plans for their zones. He concluded that coordinated efforts by all departments were essential to securing a better future for the city.

During the interaction, the economists shared strategic insights on enhancing productivity and competitiveness across the manufacturing and services sectors. The participants also noted that the unprecedented flurry of cross-sectoral reforms in 2025, and their further consolidation in the coming year, will ensure that India continues to chart its path as one of the fastest growing global economies by strengthening its foundations and unlocking newer opportunities.

The discussion focused on accelerating structural transformation through increased

household savings, robust infrastructure development, and the adoption of cutting-edge technology. The group explored the role of artificial intelligence as an enabler of cross-sectoral productivity and also discussed the continued scaling of India's Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI). Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, principal secretaries to Prime Minister PK Mishra and Shaktikanta Das, Niti Aayog vice chairman Suman Bery, Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) V Anantha Nageswaran, Niti Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam, and other members of the Aayog were present in the meeting.

Education key to tribal and regional development: Prez Murmu

Gumla (Jharkhand), Dec 30 : President Droupadi Murmu on Tuesday called upon the tribal community, especially the youth, to remain rooted in their cultural heritage while embracing modern education, science, and technology for overall development.

Addressing the inter-state socio-cultural gathering 'Kartik Jatra' at Raidih block in Jharkhand's Gumla district, the President emphasised that preserving tribal identity and traditions is essential even as society progresses. "Education is the

greatest asset for development. The holistic progress of society and the state is possible only through its expansion and dissemination," she said.



Paying tributes to eminent tribal leader Pankhraj Saheb Kartik Oraon, a native of Gumla, President Murmu described him as a source of

inspiration. "Despite receiving education abroad, he devoted his life and thoughts to his land and people, viewing education as the most powerful

instrument of social change," she said, adding that the Kartik Jatra reflects the same spirit even today. She noted that Kartik Oraon's dream of establishing a university in Gumla would soon be realised.

Highlighting the region's significance, the President said the area connecting Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, and Odisha is rich in rivers, forests, plateaus and mountains, and has preserved some of the country's oldest traditions. Calling her visit to Jharkhand a pilgrimage, she said it was the birthplace and workplace of Lord Birsa Munda, who is revered

nationwide as a symbol of social justice and tribal pride. She also recalled renowned social reformer and freedom fighter Jatra Tana Bhagat, who was born in Gumla and led a non-violent movement against British rule inspired by Mahatma Gandhi's ideals.

Remembering Param Vir Chakra awardee Shaheed Albert Ekka, she said his unparalleled bravery during the 1971 India-Pakistan war remains a matter of national pride. President Murmu praised the rich cultural heritage of the tribal community, noting that its music, dance, drama and art traditions are exceptionally vibrant.

Mamata questions infiltration claims and central projects allegations

Kolkata, Dec 30: West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday strongly countered Union Home Minister Amit Shah's remarks on infiltration, questioning how attacks like the Pahalgam terrorist strike and the Delhi car blast occurred if infiltrators were allegedly entering only through West Bengal.

Speaking at a public meeting in Barjora, Bankura district, Banerjee described Shah as "Dushasana," accusing him of coming to Bengal with destructive intentions. "Dushasana, a disciple of Shaka, has come to Bengal to gather information. As soon as elections come, Dushasana and Duryodhana start arriving. One is terrified to look into their eyes, as if something bad may happen. They don't want



Sonar Bangla; they want to destroy the state," she said. Responding to Shah's earlier claims that her government allowed and protected infiltrators, Banerjee asked pointedly, "If infiltrators only enter from West Bengal, then who carried out the Pahalgam attack? Who was behind the Delhi incident? If there are no infiltrators in Kashmir or other

states, how did such incidents take place?" The CM also refuted allegations that her government had refused to provide land for Central projects. "You claim the Mamata Banerjee government didn't allot land for Central projects. Then who provided land at Bongaon's Petrapole, at Andal for the new airport, and for the railway tracks? Eastern Coalfield Limited is func-

tioning—who gave land in Ghokshadanga and Changrabandha? These are lies," she said. Banerjee further criticised Shah's repeated claims that the BJP will form the state government after Assembly elections. "Earlier, they said they would win 200 seats. Now they talk about a two-thirds majority. They are trying to manipulate voter lists through Special Intensive Revision. At least 58 people have already lost their lives. Don't you feel ashamed?" she said.

She also denounced efforts to remove names from electoral rolls, particularly targeting Matua, minority, and Hindu communities, while rejecting attempts to label her as Bangladeshi. "I was born in Birbhum," she emphasized, highlighting her roots amid the political controversy.

The Film Tourism Promotion Policy 2025 seeks to establish Rajasthan as a preferred destination for national and international film production. Recognising cinema as a catalyst for tourism, investment and employment, the policy offers subsidies of up to

30 per cent on eligible production expenditure, along with incentives linked to screen time and in-state shooting. It also provides full reimbursement of permission fees at government-controlled locations, a dedicated online film portal, a Rajasthan Film Directory

and special incentives for award-winning films. Scholarships for local youth to study at premier film and theatre institutions have also been announced.

Complementing this, the Rajasthan Tourism Policy 2025 outlines a long-term roadmap to

make the state one of the world's safest and most tourist-friendly destinations. The policy expands focus beyond heritage tourism to include religious, adventure, wellness, eco and astro tourism. It also emphasises digital innovation through virtual reality experiences, digital museums and smart tourism platforms, along with enhanced safety measures and infrastructure development.

Together, the two policies aim to convert global visibility into sustained tourism growth, strengthen local economies and present Rajasthan as a modern destination where culture, creativity and experience converge on the world stage.

Fresh arrests of Indian fishermen by Sri Lankan navy spark tension in Rameswaram

Chennai, Dec 30: Tension resurfaced in the coastal town of Rameswaram on Tuesday after the Sri Lankan Navy detained three Indian fishermen and confiscated their fishing trawler in the early hours, alleging illegal fishing in Sri Lankan waters. The latest incident has once again highlighted the persistent and unresolved problem of fishermen from Tamil Nadu being apprehended while operating in the sensitive Palk Strait region.

Officials from the Rameswaram Fisheries Department identified the arrested fishermen as Rooban, Nagarajan and Prabhu. The three had departed from the Rameswaram fishing harbour late on Monday night after obtaining official clearance.

While engaged in fishing near the waters off Neduntheevu (Delft Island), their mechanised trawler was intercepted by a Sri Lankan Navy

arrests quickly spread, causing anxiety among families waiting for their relatives to return. Strongly condemning the detentions, V.P. Jesu Raja, a leader of the Rameswaram fishermen's association, said the repeated arrests had left the community distressed and insecure.

India dismisses Pakistan's minority rights claims, cites its own record of persecution

New Delhi, Dec 29: India on Monday firmly brushed aside comments from Pakistan on alleged violence against minorities, asserting that Islamabad lacks the credibility to speak on the issue given its long-standing and well-documented record of persecuting religious minorities.

In a strong statement, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said it outrightly rejected the remarks made by Pakistan's Foreign Office spokesperson, underlining that Pakistan's systemic abuse of minorities is a matter of global record. The MEA said attempts by Islamabad to criticise others cannot hide its own failures in protecting fundamental rights.

"We reject the reported remarks from a country whose appalling record in this regard is evident to the world. Pakistan's entrenched and widespread victimisation of minorities across faiths is a well-established reality," the ministry said, adding that "no amount of finger-pointing can conceal these facts." India has repeatedly taken issue with Pakistan's comments on its internal matters. Just last month, New Delhi



sharply responded to Islamabad's statements regarding the hoisting of the national flag at the Ram Janmabhoomi Temple in Ayodhya, asserting that Pakistan has no moral authority to comment on religious freedom or minority rights elsewhere. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, during a weekly media briefing, reiterated that Pakistan would do better to examine its own human rights situation rather than issue "hypocritical" statements. He said Pakistan's history of discrimination, repression, and institutionalised mistreatment of minorities severely undermines its credibility on such issues. "We have seen the

remarks and reject them with the contempt they deserve. A country burdened with a deeply tarnished record of bigotry and repression has no standing to lecture others," Jaiswal said, urging Pakistan to focus inward on its own human rights challenges.

Concerns over minority persecution in Pakistan have also been highlighted by independent research. A recent report by the International Centre for Peace Studies pointed to the persistent targeting of minorities, particularly Hindus and Christians, and the use of religious identity and anti-India sentiment for political mobilisation. The report cited data from the Centre for Social Justice in Lahore, noting that 344 blasphemy cases were recorded in 2024 alone, while at least 421 minority women and girls were forcibly converted between 2021 and 2024, the majority of them minors. India has consistently maintained that issues related to its internal affairs are not open to external commentary, particularly from countries with troubling records on human rights and minority protection.

Around 170 sheep die mysteriously near Rashtriya Prerna Sthal; CM Yogi orders probe



Lucknow, Dec 30: Mystery shrouds the death of around 170 sheep near the Rashtriya Prerna Sthal area in Uttar Pradesh's capital Lucknow, prompting authorities to send samples for examination to determine the exact cause of death. Police said it is yet to be ascertained whether the sheep died due to disease, poisoning,

consumption of waste material or negligence. Samples have been sent for post-mortem and laboratory testing.

Taking serious note of the incident, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has ordered a detailed probe into the matter. The state government also announced a compensation of Rs 10,000 per

sheep for the affected owners. Charu Khare, founder of NGO Aasra – The Helping Hands Trust, submitted an application to the Madaon police station stating that the sheep died suddenly in the area a few days after an event was held at Rashtriya Prerna Sthal.

"Prima facie, it is not clear whether the sheep consumed some waste material or were deliberately poisoned by unknown persons," Khare said, demanding a thorough investigation.

She stressed that post-mortem examinations must be conducted to establish the exact cause behind the mysterious deaths. "If any laxity is found or poisoning is confirmed, strict action should be taken against those responsible. Our organisation will extend all possible support to the investigation," she added.

Calling the incident "serious and sensitive", Khare said the possibility of animal cruelty or negligence cannot be ruled out.

Madaon Station House Officer Shivinand Mishra told PTI that samples of the dead sheep have been sent for post-mortem examination and further action will be taken based on the reports.

Authorities have assured that all angles will be probed to ensure accountability in the case.

South Central Railway urges people not to fly kites near railway traction lines

Hyderabad, Dec 30 : South Central Railway has appealed to people to avoid flying kites near railway traction lines during the upcoming Sankranti festival.

The South Central Railway (SCR) observed with serious concern that several incidents of electrocution have occurred due to kite flying in the vicinity of railway premises, including yards, tracks and nearby civil localities.

During the previous Sankranti festival sea-



son, multiple cases or fatal injuries after coming into contact with kite threads entangled with 25 kV Overhead Electric Traction (OHE)

lines.“Use of Chinese-imported kite threads, which are often metallic or chemically treated and act as conductors of electricity. When such threads come in contact with live overhead traction equipment, they pose a grave threat not only to human life but also to critical railway electrical infrastructure, potentially leading to service disruptions and safety hazards for passengers and Railway staff,” the SCR said in a statement.

Temporary relaxation in liquor sale timings for New Year

Mancherial, Dec 29, TSIT: The Telangana government has announced a temporary relaxation in restrictions on liquor sale and service timings in view of New Year celebrations. Prohibition and Excise Commissioner C. Hari Kiran issued orders to this effect on Tuesday. As per the orders, bars holding 2B licences, in-



house licence holders (C1 and TD1), and venues operating under event permits (EPI) issued by the Telangana State Tourism Development Corporation (TSTDC) will be allowed to serve liquor up to 1 a.m. on the night of December 31. In addition, retail liquor outlets holding E4 licences have been granted special permission to

remain open until midnight on December 31. Officials clarified that the relaxation would be applicable only for the New Year period and would not alter existing regulations. The Commissioner directed Prohibition and Excise officials in all districts to take necessary steps to ensure effective implementation of the orders.

Indian Railways completes electrification of Sakleshpur-Subramanya Road ghat section

New Delhi: Indian Railways has achieved a major engineering milestone with the completion of electrification of the Sakleshpur-Subramanya Road Ghat Section, one of the most difficult and technically challenging terrains on its network. The milestone was marked by the successful electric locomotive trial conducted on December 28, 2025, making the section fully ready for electric train operations.

With the electrification of this ghat stretch, the entire Bengaluru-Mangaluru rail route is now fully electrified. This is expected to significantly improve rail connectivity, operational efficiency and environmental sustainability in the region. The project will also enable the operation of Vande Bharat and other fast electric trains, providing faster, cleaner and more reli-

able travel to the coastal belt.

The electrified ghat section spans 55 km between Sakleshpur and Subramanya Road and passes through extremely complex terrain. The stretch has no approach road to the railway track and features a steep ruling gradient of 1 in 50, along with 57 tunnels, 226 bridges and 108 sharp curves. The area is also highly prone to landslides, particularly during the monsoon, making electrification a formidable challenge.

The electrification work began in December 2023 and included the construction of five switching stations and complete overhead equipment installation. To ensure safety and reliability, the maximum distance between traction poles was restricted to 67.5 metres. Tunnel electrification required special measures, with



427 main brackets and 427 spare brackets installed across 57 tunnels. Detailed geological studies were conducted with the support of the National Institute of Rock Mechanics and Bangalore University, and pull-out tests were

carried out at every bracket location to ensure anchoring strength.

Work on the steep gradients required specialised equipment and careful planning. The project faced frequent disruptions due to heavy rainfall, landslides, soil erosion and rockfalls, while materials had to be transported by rail to reach remote and inaccessible locations. Strict safety protocols were followed to ensure uninterrupted train operations throughout the construction period.

With electrification now complete, the section will see reduced fuel consumption, lower emissions and more efficient train operations. It will also strengthen economic and commercial linkages between Bengaluru and the port city of Mangaluru, as well as other coastal commercial centres,

facilitating smoother passenger and business travel.

Highlighting the significance of the achievement, Union Minister for Railways, Information and Broadcasting, and Electronics and Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw said that Vande Bharat trains would now be able to operate on this route up to Mangaluru.

Indian Railways has already electrified more than 99 per cent of its broad-gauge network. Since 2014, over 46,900 route kilometres have been electrified, compared to 21,801 route kilometres in the nearly six decades prior. Once the remaining small sections are completed, India will have one of the largest fully electrified railway networks in the world, reinforcing Indian Railways' commitment to clean energy and sustainable transportation.

How A Pak-Friendly BNP Is Now In Pole Position In Bangladesh

The baton has passed. Bangladesh's first woman Prime Minister, Begum Khaleda Zia, breathed her last this morning in Dhaka. Her legacy includes keeping the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) firmly together, even strengthening it, after the death of her husband, President Ziaur Rahman. She will be remembered for joining hands with Sheikh Hasina in bringing a peaceful end to President Hussain Muhammad Ershad's dictatorship and ensuring Bangladesh's return to democracy through the 1991 elections, which she won. Relations with India under the BNP rule have never been comfortable, and the legacy of BNP's strong links with Pakistan and with Jamaat-e-Islami has a lot to do with this.

On the face of it, Tarique Rahman's return to Dhaka on Christmas Day 2025, and now the passing away of his mother, Begum Khaleda Zia, have placed the BNP in pole position to win the forthcoming general elections in Bangladesh, scheduled for February next year. However, it is important not to get carried away by the media hype generated by print, electronic and social media outlets, most of which are thoroughly controlled and managed by the Yunus regime.

The BNP And the Jamaat

The BNP and the Jamaat-e-Islami have been political allies for a quarter century, since 2001. Their ideological alliance is far older, going back to their shared support for the tenets and values that sided with Pakistan and opposed everything that the 1971 Liberation War stood for. The constitution of Bangladesh, adopted in 1972 under Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, had, as its four pillars, the principles of democracy, secularism, socialism and nationalism. In addition, Sheikh Mujib banned religion-based political parties and revoked the citizenship of Ghulam Azam, the Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami during the Liberation War, responsible for untold war crimes against the minorities, against women, against intellectuals and all those supporting the Awami League. Under President Zia (who seized control after the assassination of Sheikh Mujib and later founded the BNP), all these provisions were reversed. Ghulam Azam returned to Dhaka on a Pakistani passport in August 1978, during the military rule of General Zia. The ban on religion-based political parties was reversed, and a special "Citizenship Act" enacted in 1978 provided the legal framework for Ghulam Azam to eventually regain his Bangladeshi citizenship through a court order in 1994 (when Begum Khaleda Zia was Prime Minister) after a long legal battle.

It was under President Zia (father of Tarique Rahman) that the Constitution of Bangladesh was amended to replace the word secularism with the phrase that "absolute trust and faith in the Almighty Allah shall be the basis for all actions", thereby legitimising political Islam. Today, the BNP does have a moderate faction. This group has fought hard for early elections in Bangladesh, resulting in the Yunus regime being forced to declare the dates of February 2026 after their initially declared plan (supported by Jamaat-e-Islami) of no elections for four years, and elections only after completion of the so-called "reform process". The moderate group within the BNP also opposed the ban on the activities of the Awami League (imposed by the Yunus regime in May 2025) and supported the Awami League's participation in the February 2026 elections. However, this faction's position within the BNP is weak, and they are inevitably overruled by the much stronger pro-Jamaat-e-Islami faction. It is estimated that more than half the BNP membership is pro-Jamaat.

Tarique's Closeness To The Jamaat

Tarique Rahman has almost always been associated with the pro-Jamaat faction of the BNP. He has been politically active since the late 1980s but came into prominence during his mother Begum Khaleda Zia's second term as Prime Minister, from 2001 to 2006, when the Jamaat-e-Islami was the principal alliance partner. During these years, Tarique ran Hawa Bhaban, the power centre recognised as the de facto PMO. His involvement in directing/coordinating the Chittagong Arms Haul (April 2004), and equally in the grenade attack on Sheikh Hasina's political rally in Dhaka (August 2004), has been written about extensively. However, what often escapes attention is the close involvement of Pakistan in the planning of each of these incidents, including participation in meetings with Tarique Rahman in Dhaka and overseas. These were highlighted during the separate hearings (for each of these two incidents) in the legal trials held in Dhaka after 2009.

Will Haryana CM Dare to Order High-Level Probe into Rs.1,500-Crore Scam?

A major scam worth Rs. 1500 crore in Haryana's labour department has unearthed the fraudulent working in the Haryana government, which publicizes itself as the government having its motto 'Zero Tolerance Against Corruption' and claims that there is no difference between its words and actions. Political observers analyse that it may shake or even uproot the BJP led state government, if a proper investigation is ordered pertaining to the last ten-year period, the scam may go onto sky height as this amount of Rs. 1500 crore is being reported for the small duration between August 2023 and March 2025. Former Union Minister and present Member of Parliament, Kumari Selja, has commented that the scam of nearly ?1,500 crore in the Haryana Labour Welfare Board, along with the detection of 91 percent fake work slips and 87 percent fake labour registrations across 13 districts, is the biggest proof of the BJP government's corrupt governance. These figures clearly show that the BJP government has turned schemes meant for the welfare of workers into a means of loot. The schemes that were intended to provide dignity, security, and support to hardworking labourers have been sacrificed to corruption under political patronage. This is not merely negligence, but a well-planned and organised act of corruption, amounting to a direct attack on the rights of the poor and the working class. The Congress party demands a high-level investigation into the entire scam and strict action against those responsible. Former Haryana Chief Minister and presently Leader of the Opposition, Bhupinder Singh Hooda, said that the BJP government is setting a new record in cor-

ruption every day. A recent report reveals that there has been a 186 percent increase in corruption cases between 2021 and 2023. This revelation is based on the NCRB report, which mentions cases registered under the Prevention of Corruption Act and relevant sections of the IPC. This situation exists even though the government suppresses major corruption cases and prevents their investigation. Despite this, a new scam surfaces almost daily, which the government cannot hide despite its best efforts. Bhupinder Singh Hooda said that the BJP has hollowed out Haryana's economy through a series of scams. Today, the common people, as well as economists and intellectuals, have lost faith in the government because Haryana's economic situation has become extremely worrying. From 1966 to 2014, the state had a debt of approximately 60,000 crore rupees, which has now increased to more than 5 lakh crore rupees. This reflects the state's dire economic condition. In the NITI Aayog's Fiscal Health Index, Haryana has slipped to 14th position among 18 states. A debt-to-GSDP ratio of over 31% indicates that the state is trapped in a deep debt crisis. Indirectly indicating through another example that the scam in question is not limited to a particular department, Hooda highlights the recent paddy procurement scam and alleges that this is a case in point, which occurs every harvest season. The revelations in this scam are shocking. In the Asandh mandi (grain market), 570 trips by 112 vehicles were shown on paper, but no actual paddy was transported. The paddy was only bought and transported on paper. This resulted in a scam of Rs 39.24 crore. In the Gheraunda mandi, the revelations regarding paddy procurement were so shocking that everyone was left stunned. Here, 11,628 quintals of paddy were shown as purchased through fake gate passes without any actual arrival of paddy. Not only that, even motorcycles and auto-rickshaws were shown as being used for paddy transportation, resulting in a scam of Rs 2.56 crore. This entire paddy scam amounts to hundreds of crores of rupees, but the government is trying to suppress it by tak-

ing action only against small employees, while the big culprits, the real perpetrators, are being protected. While exposing Rs.1,500-Crore Work Slip Scam in his own department and further recommending for a High-Level Probe to the Chief Minister, Haryana Labour Minister Anil Vij has landed the CM Nayab Singh Saini in hot waters, who always claims a corruption-free Haryana. A press release, on 29th December, by Haryana's Labour Minister Anil Vij, reportedly claims that due to the vigilant and stringent oversight serious irregularities related to work slips (work receipts) prevailing for a long time in the Haryana Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, functioning under the Labour Department, have come to light. Preliminary investigations suggest that the scam could amount to approximately Rs.1,500 crore. Considering the gravity of the matter, minister Vij has written to the Chief Minister, recommending a thorough investigation by a reputed agency. Sharing details, the Labour Minister said that recently he chaired a meeting of the Board, during which irregularities were found not only in the appointment of Board members but also in the distribution of benefits under welfare schemes meant for construction workers. Following this, he ordered an immediate inquiry.

MODUS OPERANDI

Minister Vij stated that initial investigations were conducted in Hisar, Kaithal, Jind, Sirsa, Faridabad and Bhiwani districts, where large-scale irregularities were detected. Subsequently, instructions were issued to Deputy Commissioners of all districts to constitute district-level committees comprising a Labour Department officer along with three other officers. These committees are carrying out physical verification of online work slips issued between August 2023 and March 2025. The verification process began around four months ago, and 100 percent verification has been completed in 13 districts so far.

The Labour Minister informed that in the 13 districts—Karnal, Rewari, Nuh (Mewat), Mahendragarh, Gurugram, Jhajjar, Palwal, Panipat,

Rohtak, Sonipat, Panchkula, Sirsa and Kaithal—a total of 5,99,758 work slips were issued. Of these, only 53,249 were found to be valid, while 5,46,509 were declared invalid. Similarly, out of 2,21,517 labour registrations, only 14,240 workers were found eligible after verification, whereas 1,93,756 registrations were found to be invalid.

Mr. Vij said it has become clear that in many places entire villages were fraudulently registered and work slips were generated so that ineligible persons could avail benefits of government schemes. On an average, a worker receives benefits worth around Rs.2.5 lakh under various schemes, which could result in a massive financial loss to the government. He said that "Those who are not eligible are availing benefits. This is outright loot, causing the government a financial loss running into hundreds of crores."

He further said that the verification committees are examining all aspects, including authenticity of workplaces, actual participation in construction activities, employer details, local inquiries and field inspections. During the verification period, RTS timelines were stopped, SARAL Centres were instructed not to accept new applications, and necessary information was issued to all grievance redressal platforms including CM Window, Jan Samvad, CPGRAMS, HHRC, HRTSC etc. Vij clarified that already approved pension schemes have not been stopped, while benefits under death, accident and funeral assistance schemes are being released on priority.

Minister Vij added that the Haryana Government implements several welfare schemes for construction workers, including maternity and paternity benefits, education assistance, scholarships, reimbursement for technical education, pensions, marriage assistance, medical aid, housing loans and accident compensation, aimed at empowering genuine workers. These benefits should reach only those workers who are duly registered after verification of at least 90 days of work. The Labour Minister reiterated that there will be no compromise on corruption at any level and strict action will be ensured against those found guilty.

about its social impact. Parallel to the dazzling growth figures, the reality of unemployment and inflation in 2025 remained equally stark. Educated youth had degrees, but no jobs. The uncertainty of recruitment exams, delayed results, and instability in the private sector put an entire generation under psychological pressure. Inflation robbed the common man of balance in his kitchen. Pulses, vegetables, gas, education, and health—everything became more expensive, but incomes did not rise in the same proportion. This economic imbalance gradually transformed into social discontent. In 2025, the plight of farmers and laborers remained undisclosed. Weather vagaries, lack of fair crop prices, mounting debt, and policy-level neglect kept farmers in constant insecurity. At times, dialogue was stalled, and at others, attempts were made to suppress movements. Ironically, those who feed the nation face the most uncertain future. The plight of laborers was no different. Millions of people working in the unorganized sector remained deprived of social security, and the expansion of infrastructure—roads, railways, and airports—bolstered the image of a "fast-growing India." These achievements are undeniable, but this also calls for introspection, as the question is not just about development, but

stable employment, and a dignified life. The hands that build the edifice of development are often the most tired and least secure. The deplorable state of public education and healthcare systems was further exposed in 2025. The poor condition of government schools and hospitals is no longer a state problem, but a national challenge. Teachers continue to work under resource constraints and administrative pressure, while health workers continue to perform their duties in an environment of excessive workload, limited facilities, and insecurity. Privatization has provided choice, but not equality. Education and healthcare have gradually become commodities rather than rights, and those who were already socio-economically disadvantaged have suffered the most.

2025 was also a disturbing year for democracy. The tendency to equate dissent with anti-national sentiment narrowed public discourse. Growing pressure on writers, journalists, and social activists signaled that questioning power had not been completely silenced. This resistance was not just

against power, but also against the social apathy that slowly erodes us from within. 2025 made it clear that development cannot be measured solely by GDP figures. Unless villages are safe, farmers are confident, laborers live with dignity, teachers and health workers are protected, and students are free from fear about the future, 'Developed India' will remain just a catchy slogan. Technology is meaningful only when it is connected to human emotions, and governance can be considered successful only when its impact reaches the last person in line. The biggest lesson of the past year, and especially of 2025, is that the responsibility to save India lies not only with governments but also with conscious citizens.

When we remain silent in the face of injustice, we unwittingly stand in its favor. 2025 made us realize that silence is no longer an option. Questioning, expressing disagreement, and maintaining dialogue are the greatest acts of patriotism today.

2025: The Year India Boarded The 'Reform Express'



In the recent past, India has demonstrated an ability to act decisively and boldly in moments of crisis—and 2025 was no exception. Confronted by a fresh geo-economic shock triggered by Trumponomics, New Delhi returned to a familiar playbook, using the pressure of external disruption to push through a fresh wave of long-pending economic reforms. However, what makes this moment stand out is the politically sensitive nature of some of these measures. Reforms such as changes to labour laws have long been acknowledged as necessary, yet avoided by successive governments—precisely because they are politically sensitive. The crisis triggered by Trumponomics created the space, and a spate of key electoral wins in assembly elections provided political momentum to finally convert intent to execution. And clearly, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) is not done. A few weeks ago, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman told a public gathering that the upcoming Union Budget will press ahead with more reforms, including effecting a complete overhaul of the customs duty structure—bringing it on par with the soft touch employed by regulators while randomly scrutinising direct tax filings. And then this weekend, Prime Minister Narendra Modi took to X to renew his government's commitment to economic reforms. The context was the conclusion of the annual meeting of chief secretaries convened in New Delhi and addressed by the Prime Minister. "This conference of Chief Secretaries," the PM posted on X, "has taken place at a time when India is witnessing next-generation reforms. India has boarded the Reform Express. And, the primary engine of this Reform Express is India's youth, our demography. That is why, it is our endeavour to empower this demography." The obvious question then: has India, under NDA, pivoted from reforms of stealth to one of conviction? The Reforms Playbook India's previous approach to reforms followed a pattern.

iPhone 16 becomes highest selling phone in India: Report

Mumbai, US-based tech giant Apple sold about 6.5 million iPhone 16 units in the first 11 months of 2025, making it the country's highest-selling smartphone, according to a new report.

The report from Counterpoint Research said that Apple outpaced Android rivals in the same period. The research firm's data found the gap is striking as iPhone 15 also made to the top five best-selling list.

The research firm said Apple's performance reflects changing buyer behaviour in a market, historically dominated by entry-level and mid-range devices.

Further, the change is underpinned by a strategic push by Apple to expand local manufacturing and reduce reliance on China. Apple recently opened three new Apple Stores in Bengaluru, Pune, and Noida, taking its total retail presence in India to five stores.

Financing options such as no-cost EMIs, cashbacks, and bank schemes have made high-end phones more attainable to more consumers. Apple Inc clocked the highest value of exports from India in November, shipping iPhones worth \$2 billion, as per latest industry data.

In November, a company filing showed that Apple India posted a record high domestic sales of \$9 billion in FY25, and one in every five iPhones made globally in FY25 was manufactured/Assembled in India.

The company's manufacturing in India contributed 12 per cent of Apple's global production value. The iPhone maker also began local assembly of high-end Pro and Pro Max models of iPhones in India for the first time.

The company filings showed that the Americas brought in \$178.4 billion in FY25 – nearly 43 per cent of Apple's global revenue – and a growing share of those iPhones were shipped from India.

India poised to become 3rd-largest economy with GDP of \$73 trillion by 2030

New Delhi,

With GDP valued at \$4.18 trillion, India has surpassed Japan to become the world's fourth largest economy and is poised to displace Germany from the third rank in the next 2.5 to 3 years with projected GDP of \$7.3 trillion by 2030, an official statement said on Monday.

The growth momentum further surprised on the upside, with GDP expanding to a six-quarter high in Q2 of 2025, reflecting India's resilience amid persistent global trade uncertainties.

Domestic drivers led by robust private consumption played a central role in supporting this expansion, according to the statement.

India's real GDP grew 8.2 per cent in Q2 FY2025, up from 7.8 per cent in the previous



quarter and 7.4 per cent in Q4 of 2024, led by resilient domestic demand amidst global trade and policy uncertainties. Real gross value added (GVA) expanded by 8.1 per cent, catalysed by buoyant industrial and services sectors.

High-frequency indicators point to sustained economic activity: inflation remains below the lower tolerance threshold,

unemployment is on a declining trajectory, and export performance continues to improve. Furthermore, financial conditions have stayed benign, with strong credit flows to the commercial sector, while demand conditions remain firm, supported by a further strengthening of urban consumption.

"India is among the world's fastest-growing major

economies and is well-positioned, supported by benign inflation. Looking ahead, domestic drivers like favourable agricultural status by 2047, the centenary of independence, the effects of GST rationalisation, benign inflation, and the strong balance sheets of corporates and financial institutions are coupled with supportive monetary and financial conditions are expected to continue bolstering the economic activity.

External factors such as services exports are projected to remain robust, while the swift conclusion of current trade and investment negotiations offers additional upside potential. Ongoing reforms are likely to further enable growth prospects. Present macroeconomic situation presents a rare "goldilocks period" of high growth and low inflation, said the statement.

Trade pact with Australia anchors India's economic engagement in Indo-Pacific: Piyush Goyal

New Delhi,

Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Monday said that as the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) negotiations advance with other nations, India-Australia trade pact continues to anchor the country's economic engagement in the Indo-Pacific, aligned with 'Make in India' and the vision of 'Viksit Bharat 2047'. From January 1, 2026, 100 per cent Australian tariff lines will be zero-duty for Indian exports, unlocking fresh opportunities for labour-intensive sectors, Goyal informed.

Govt offers 50 new blocks to investors to step up hunt for oil & gas

New Delhi,

Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said on Monday that with the offering of 50 new blocks to investors for exploration and production of oil and gas, India's energy sector has reached "a transformative milestone".

The minister further stated that while 25 of these blocks are being offered under the 10th round of the oil exploration and licensing policy (OALP-X), another 55 fields across 9 contract blocks are being offered under the fourth



bidding round for discovered small fields (DSF-IV).

Besides, 16 blocks are being put on offer as part of Special CBM Bid Rounds 2025 and 2026. While 3 blocks are in the 2025 category, the other 13 blocks are for 2026.

"The quest to unlock the potential of India's sedimentary basins has gained a new thrust and momentum," the minister remarked in a post on X.

Puri said that India has now introduced a unified regulatory framework enabled by the Oilfields (Regulation and Development) Amendment

Act, 2025, which delinks petroleum operations from mining, and the PNG Rules 2025. The revenue-sharing contract model has been adopted to facilitate the ease of doing business.

He said that to make things easier for investors, a single license has been introduced for conventional and unconventional hydrocarbons. Exploration is allowed throughout the contract duration, while reduced royalty rates have been rolled out as an incentive. The norms also build in stabilisation for changes in law.

India's industrial growth surges to 6.7 per cent in November

New Delhi,

The growth rate of India's industrial production surged to 6.7 per cent in November this year compared to the same month of the previous year after having slowed to 0.4 per cent in October due to the long holiday season in the festive month, according to figures released by the Ministry of Statistics on Monday.

The strong industrial growth was driven by an 8 per cent surge in the manufacturing sector, led by a robust performance in basic metals and fabricated metal products, pharmaceuticals, and motor vehicles.

Growth in the mining sector at 5.4 per cent has also rebounded due to the closure of the monsoon season and strong growth in metallic minerals such as iron ore. However, the



electricity sector remained a laggard with a negative growth of 0.15 per cent during the month.

Within the manufacturing sector, 20 out of 23 industry groups have recorded a positive growth in November. The top three positive contributors for the month of November are "Manufacture of basic metals" (10.2 per cent), "Manufacture of pharmaceuticals, medicinal chemical and botanical products" (10.5 per cent), and

"Manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers, and semi-trailers" (11.9 per cent). In the industry group "Manufacture of basic metals", which includes steel products, have shown a significant contribution in growth.

The figures on use-based classification show that the production of capital goods, which comprise machines used in factories, shot up by a double-digit 10.4 per cent over the same month of

the previous year. This segment reflects the real investment taking place in the economy, which has a multiplier effect on the creation of jobs and incomes going ahead. The consumer durables sector, comprising white goods such as refrigerators, TV sets and washing machines, also recorded a strong growth of 10.3 per cent, while non-durable goods such as soaps, cosmetics and processed foods clocked a 7.3 per cent growth during the month.

The infrastructure and construction sector clocked a strong 12.1 per cent growth during the month compared to the same month of the previous year on the back of big-ticket government projects being implemented in the highways, railways and ports sectors.

Sensex, Nifty extend losses for 4th day

Mumbai,

Indian stock markets

extended their losing streak for the fourth consecutive session on Monday, dragged down by heavy selling in information technology, realty, pharma and auto stocks.

The benchmark Sensex ended the day at 84,695.54, falling 345.91 points, or 0.41 per cent.

The Nifty also closed lower at 25,942.10, down 100.20 points, or 0.38 per cent, as selling pressure continued across key sectors. Analysts said that the Nifty slipped below the psychological 26,000 mark and its 20-day EMA, extending losses by nearly 100 points amid heightened volatility ahead of the monthly F&O expiry.

"The index formed bearish candlestick structures, reflecting near-term selling pressure, although it continues to hover around key short-term moving averages for now," they added.

A sustained break below the 25,900 zone could expose the index to further downside toward 25,800-25,700, as per experts. On the Sensex, stocks such as PowerGrid, Trent, HCL Tech and BEL were among the top losers, weighing on the index. However, some buying interest was seen in select counters, with Tata Steel, Asian Paints, Hindustan Unilever, Eternal, NTPC and Axis Bank ending the session with gains.

The broader market also remained under pressure. The Nifty Midcap 100 index declined 0.52 per cent, while the Nifty Smallcap 100 slipped 0.72 per cent.

India adds highest-ever 44.5 GW renewable energy in 2025: Govt

New Delhi,

India saw highest-ever renewable energy capacity addition in 2025 at 44.51 GW (till November) which is nearly double as compared to the 24.72 GW during the same period last year, the government said on Monday.

The total renewable energy installed capacity reached 253.96 GW in November 2025, which is an increase of over 23 per cent as compared to the 205.52 GW in November 2024.

Solar capacity addition is 34.98 GW, compared to the 20.85 GW during the same period last year. Solar energy installed capacity crossed 100 GW mark in January, 2025. The solar energy installed capacity has reached



132.85 GW in November, 2025 which is an increase of over 41 per cent as compared to the 94.17 GW in November 2024, according to Ministry of New and Renewable Energy.

Wind capacity also registered a substantial growth with capacity addition of 5.82 GW compared to 3.2 GW during the same period last year.

Wind energy's installed

capacity crossed 50 GW mark in March 2025. The wind energy installed capacity has reached 53.99 GW in November, 2025 which is an increase of over 12.5 per cent as compared to the 47.96 GW in November 2024.

In line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision outlined at COP-26, the government is working to reach 500 GW Non-fossil energy capacity by 2030.

IIT Bombay, NTPC complete drilling India's 1st CO2 storage well; second underway

Mumbai,

Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay and NTPC have successfully completed the drilling of India's first well for testing the viability of geological carbon dioxide (CO2) storage in sedimentary formations such as coal and sandstone, the institute said on Monday.

The collaboration, launched under the aegis of NITI Aayog in November 2022, brought together NETRA and the R&D wing of NTPC, and the Department of Earth Sciences, IIT Bombay, in building India's first geological storage atlas for coalbed methane-rich coalfields.

The atlas provided layer-by-layer simulation results with experimentally validated inputs for quantifying the potential for geological CO2 storage in four major coalfields. The country achieved its first dedicated well, reaching a depth of 1200m in September, for potential CO2 storage. The drilling site in Pakri Barwadih, in the vicinity of a coal mining area in Jharkhand's Hazaribagh, was completed

on November 15. Notably, a second well drilling was initiated on December 21. Both CO2 injection and plume monitoring using these wells will be implemented, the institute said.

"As India stands at the cusp of honouring net-zero commitments in line with the 'Panchamrit' climate goals announced by the Prime Minister, accelerating indigenous science and technology outcomes for commercialisation of Carbon Capture, Utilisation and Storage (CCUS) technologies will be crucial to the journey towards 'Atmanirbhar' and 'Viksit' Bharat commitments," said Dr. V.K. Saraswat, Member, NITI Aayog.

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Kabul/New Delhi,

India has delivered a consignment of six ambulances to Afghanistan, amid growing healthcare cooperation between the countries, according to a media report.

The ambulances are equipped with advanced medical equipment and can aid in transporting emergency patients and provide emergency health services, Sharafat Zaman Amarkhel, the Taliban spokesman for the Health ministry, was quoted as saying by Afghan media outlet AMU TV.

India's assistance can improve health services, especially emergency responses in Afghanistan, Amarkhel added.

The consignment is part of a commitment made during high-level talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Afghan Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi in New Delhi in October.

During the meeting, Jaishankar described the gift as "20 ambulances, a gesture of goodwill".

"India will also provide MRI and CT scan machines to Afghan hospitals and deliver vaccines for immunisation and cancer medicines. We have also supplied drug rehabilitation materials through UNODC and are open to doing more," the foreign minister had said.

Earlier this month, Afghan Health Minister Mawlawi Noor Jalal Jalali, held a meeting with Minister of Health and Family Welfare JP Nadda in the national capital and discussed ways to enhance bilateral cooperation in the healthcare sector.

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Russia's losses in Ukraine rise faster than ever as US pushes for peace deal

Over the past 10 months, Russian losses in the war with Ukraine have been growing faster than any time since the start of the full-scale invasion in 2022, BBC analysis suggests. As peace efforts intensified in 2025 under pressure from US President Donald Trump's administration, 40% more obituaries of soldiers were published in Russian sources compared with the previous year. Overall, the BBC has confirmed the names of almost 160,000 people killed fighting on Russia's side in Ukraine. BBC News Russian has been counting Russian war losses together with independent outlet Mediamazona and a group of volunteers since February 2022. We keep a list of named individuals whose deaths we were able to confirm using official reports, newspapers, social media, and new memorials and graves. The real death toll is believed to be much higher, and military experts we have consulted



believe our analysis of cemeteries, war memorials and obituaries might represent 45-65% of the total. That would put the number of Russian deaths at between 243,000 and 352,000. The number of obituaries for any given period is a preliminary estimate of the confirmed losses, as some need additional verification and will eventually be discarded. But it can indicate

how the intensity of fighting is changing over time. 2025 starts with a relatively low number of published obituaries in January, compared with the previous months. Then the number rises in February, when Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin talked directly for the first time about ending the war in Ukraine. The next peak in August coincides

with the two presidents meeting each other in Alaska, a diplomatic coup for Putin that was widely seen as an end to his international isolation. In October, when a planned second Russia-US summit was eventually shelved, and then in November, when the US presented a 28-point peace proposal, an average of 322 obituaries were published per day -

twice the average in 2024. It is difficult to put increased Russian losses down to any one factor, but the Kremlin sees territorial gains as a way of influencing negotiations with the US in its favour: Putin aide Yuri Ushakov stressed recently that "recent successes" had had a positive impact. Murat Mukashev was among those who gambled on a quick peace deal, and it cost him his life. Mukashev was an activist who had never supported Putin's policies. Over the years, he had taken part in demonstrations against police violence and torture, and joined rallies for LGBT rights and the release of Alexei Navalny, the Kremlin's main opponent who died in prison in 2024. He had repeatedly condemned Russia's invasion of Ukraine on social media from 2022. Then, in early 2024, Mukashev was detained near his home in Moscow and charged with large-scale drug dealing. While his case was being tried he was offered a

contract with the defence ministry, according to his friends and family. They saw the heavy charges levelled against him as a typical ploy to get people to sign up. A 2024 law allows the accused a way out of a criminal conviction if they join up - an attractive option in a country with an acquittal rate of less than 1%. Mukashev refused the offer, and the court sentenced him to 10 years in a high-security penal colony. In prison in November 2024, he changed his mind. Friends said he was encouraged by Trump's promises to end the war quickly and decided he needed to sign up as soon as possible to secure his release before a peace deal was reached. "He saw this as a chance to be released instead of being imprisoned for 10 years of strict regime," reads a statement from his support group. There was no explanation of how he reconciled taking part in the war with his reluctance to kill.

French right pushes for national tribute to film star

Brigitte Bardot



French right-wing figure Éric Ciotti has called for a national tribute to honour film legend Brigitte Bardot, prompting objections from political opponents on the left. "France has a duty to honour its Marianne," said Ciotti, referring to the emblem of French liberty whose face Bardot was chosen to represent in the 1960s. Bardot died on Sunday aged 91. A petition launched by Ciotti since has attracted more than 23,000 signatures, and has the backing of some allies on the far right. But Socialist leader Olivier Faure has pointed out that national homages are for "exceptional services to the nation". Bardot was an iconic actress but she also "turned her back on republican values", Faure argued. Bardot has been hailed by President Emmanuel Macron as a "legend of the century" who embodied a life of freedom, and Ciotti, who leads the right-wing UDR party, has appealed to him to organise a national send-off. Ciotti said France should recognise

Great white sharks face extinction in Mediterranean, say researchers



Great white sharks in the Mediterranean Sea are in danger of disappearing, with illegal fishing contributing to their decline. This is according to research by US scientists, working in partnership with UK charity Blue Marine Foundation. They say some of the most threatened species - including

great white sharks - are being sold in North African fish markets. Great whites are one of more than 20 Mediterranean shark species protected under international law, meaning it is illegal to fish for them or to sell them. By monitoring fishing ports on the Mediterranean coast of North Africa.

Eurostar cancels all trains out of London as power outage hits Channel Tunnel



Eurostar has cancelled all trains out of London towards Paris, Amsterdam and Brussels until further notice after a power outage in the Channel Tunnel caused a Le Shuttle train to fail. Staff at London St Pancras International station have told Eurostar passengers to postpone their travel plans and re-book for a later date. By midday, at least a dozen Eurostar services between the UK, France, Belgium and the Netherlands had been cancelled - many more had also been delayed or altered. Train traffic will "gradually resume" this afternoon, according to the company which operates the Channel Tunnel. Elsewhere, Eurotunnel service Le Shuttle - which

carries road vehicles and passengers through the tunnel - has also suspended trains between Folkestone and Calais due to what it described as a "power supply issue" which occurred overnight.

National Rail

said the major disruption is expected to last until further notice. Eurostar said: "Services to and from London are suspended

until further notice due to overhead power supply issues in the Channel Tunnel, followed by a failed Le Shuttle train. "We advise our customers to re-book their journey for another day, with free exchanges available. "We apologise for the disruption and will continue to keep customers updated with the latest information."

According to Eurostar, passengers can rearrange their plans free of charge or can cancel their booking and get a refund or an e-voucher. The broken Le Shuttle train has been moved out of the Channel Tunnel and Eurotunnel expects to resume services around 15:00 CET (14:00 GMT). "Our teams are working to restore the situation as quickly as possible," Le Shuttle said in a statement. "Waiting times will be adjusted throughout the day. Eurotunnel apologises for the inconvenience and thanks its customers for their patience and understanding." On its website Le Shuttle says check-in and border control services are experiencing lengthy delays.

Saudi Arabia backs call for UAE to leave Yemen after strike on separatist-held port



Saudi Arabia has backed a demand from Yemen's presidential council for the United Arab Emirates to withdraw within 24 hours, after a Saudi-led coalition bombed what it said was a weapons shipment for UAE-backed separatists at the port of Mukalla. The Saudi foreign ministry accused the UAE of "pressuring" the Southern Transitional Council (STC), which seeks independence for southern Yemen, to launch recent offensives in the eastern provinces of Hadramawt and al-Mahra. The kingdom would take measures to confront what it considered such "highly dangerous" actions, it warned. The UAE's foreign ministry

denied that the shipment contained weapons and expressed "deep regret" at the Saudi statement. It strongly condemned "the allegations that it exerted pressure on, or directed, any Yemeni party to carry out military operations that would undermine the security of the sisterly king-

dom of Saudi Arabia or target its borders". The STC's leaders also said the ultimatum for the withdrawal of the UAE's forces had no legal basis, and insisted it would remain a "main partner" in the battle against the Iran-backed Houthi movement, which controls much of

north-western Yemen. Earlier on Monday, the head of the eight-member presidential council - which includes STC representatives - announced that he was cancelling a joint defence pact with the UAE and ordering its forces to leave "in the interest of safeguarding the security of all citizens, affirming commitment to Yemen's unity, sovereignty, stability, and territorial integrity". Rashad al-Alimi also declared a state of emergency for a period of 90 days, which he said was necessary to confront the Houthi and what he described as "the internal strife led by mutinous military elements that received orders from the United Arab Emirates".

Bangladesh's first female prime minister Khaleda Zia dies aged 80



Khaleda Zia, Bangladesh's first female prime minister and an arch-rival of ousted leader Sheikh Hasina, has died from a prolonged illness. She was 80 years old. Zia intended to run for parliament in February, when the country will vote for the first time since a popular revolution in late 2024 unseated Hasina.

Thrust into the political limelight following the assassination of her husband, then-president Ziaur Rahman, she went on to become Bangladesh's first female PM in 1991. Her career, which included spells in prison and house arrest, was defined by a bitter feud with Hasina. She was acquitted of corruption and allowed to travel to London for treatment only after Hasina lost power. Physicians said on Monday that Zia's condition was "extremely critical". She was put on life support, but it was not possible to provide multiple treatments at the same

Trump hopes to reach phase two of Gaza ceasefire 'very quickly'



Donald Trump said he hoped to reach phase two of the Gaza peace plan "very quickly", as he warned Hamas would "hell to pay" if it did not disarm soon. The US president, whose 20-point peace plan requires the militant group to disarm, made the comments as he met Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in Florida for talks on Monday. During a press conference with Netanyahu after their meeting, Trump said Israel had "lived up to the plan 100%", despite continuing attacks by its military in Gaza. The US president also said his country could support another major strike on Iran were it to resume rebuilding its ballistic missile or nuclear weapons programmes. In response to

concerned about what other people are doing or maybe aren't doing," he added. Since the ceasefire came into effect, at least 414 Palestinians have been killed by the Israeli military in Gaza, according to the Hamas-run health ministry. The Israeli military, which controls more than half of Gaza, has said it has only opened fire in response to ceasefire violations. It has blamed Hamas for the killings of three Israeli soldiers over the same period. During the press briefing, Trump also warned that the US would launch further attacks on Iran if it was found to be using different sites to develop nuclear weapons. In June, Trump claimed US air and missile strikes "obliterated" Iran's nuclear

facilities. Iran has denied seeking to develop nuclear weapons. "I hope they're not trying to build up again, because if they are we're going to have no choice but to eradicate that build up," he said. Trump said he "had been reading" that the country was using "possibly different sites" to those targeted in summer. Iran, which fought a 12-day war with Israel in June, on Monday denounced the reports as a "psychological operation" against Tehran. It said it was fully prepared to defend itself, and warned renewed aggression would "result in harsher consequences" for Israel. Trump and Netanyahu's talks also focused on other regional tension points, including Syria and the Hezbollah militant group in Lebanon.

Do you think you can just erase a member this easily? Give us back Danielle," one wrote in an X post. "It's not fair at all. Free NewJeans [all 5 members]," another wrote on Instagram. "All they wanted to do was to be [artists] and make their fans happy."




Smriti Mandhana Misses Chance To Surpass Shubman Gill's World Record

Smriti Mandhana needed 62 runs in the fifth T20I against Sri Lanka on Tuesday to surpass Shubman Gill for a momentous world record. It was not to be. The India opener had already amassed 1,703 runs across formats (ODIs + T20Is) this calendar year - the most by any woman in a single year. With just 62 more runs, Mandhana would have become the leading run-scorer of 2025 across both men's and women's international cricket, surpassing Shubman Gill's tally of 1,764 (Tests + ODIs + T20Is). Mandhana scored 1,362 runs in ODIs and 341 in T20Is in 2025. However, Mandhana was not included in the playing XI for the fifth T20I in Thiruvananthapuram, as the team management decided to rest the star batter. ICC Verdict Out On Eden Gardens Pitch Where India Failed To Chase 124 vs South Africa

The Eden Gardens pitch that hosted the first India vs South Africa Test from November 14-16 drew a lot of flak after the hosts failed to chase a 124-run target. South African spinner Simon Harmer scalped eight wickets in the match as the Gautam Gambhir-coached Indian cricket team slumped to a 30-run loss. While several experts criticised the pitch, Gambhir did not agree. "It was not an unplayable wicket, there were no demons," he said. "This is exactly the pitch we were looking for. The curator was very, very helpful and supportive. This is exactly what we wanted, and this is exactly what we got. When you don't play well, this is what happens." While most former players did not agree



with the comment, the ICC seemed happy with the pitch on offer. It rated the pitch as "satisfactory," according to a report by TOI. This came a few days after the ICC rated the Melbourne Cricket Ground pitch, which hosted the Australia vs England Boxing Day Test, "unsatisfactory." The venue was handed

one demerit point as well. Coming back to Eden Gardens, Anil Kumble, a legendary spinner and former coach of the Indian team, expressed shock at some of Gambhir's remarks on the pitch. "If you look back at the legacy of Eden Gardens, there have been so many Test matches played here. I've

been coming here since I was an Under-19 kid, and I've never seen a pitch behave like this over three days in a Test match," Kumble said on JioHotstar after the match. "I did listen to what Gautam said; he mentioned that the team wanted something like this. Then I'm a bit confused because I know this is a young side." Dale Steyn, one of the finest South African pacers to have played the game, directly countered Gambhir's "no demons" statement. "He said there weren't demons in the pitch? I certainly saw quite a lot," Steyn, who was part of the same panel, said. "You know, as Anil was saying, some balls were spinning two feet past the bat, hitting the keeper on the shoulder."

How South Africa conquered Test cricket in 2025



From a certain vantage point, the health of Test cricket in South Africa appears terminal. For the first time since sporting isolation during apartheid, there will be no red-ball action in the country this summer. Instead, fans must make do watching Indian-owned T20 franchises compete in the SA20. The next time the Proteas take the field in whites on home soil will be October 2026, 21 months after hosting Pakistan in January this year. And yet the Test team itself has rarely looked in better shape, with 2025 proving a watershed year. Ryan Rickleton registered his country's first double century for nine years as Pakistan were swept 2-0. In June, a sublime fourth-innings 136 from Aiden Markram, allied to a nine-wicket match haul from Kagiso Rabada, carried South Africa to a five-wicket victory over Australia in the World Test Championship (WTC) final at Lord's. And with the choker's tag finally dislodged, and momentum behind them, South Africa are on track to qualify for another WTC final. Wiaan Mulder threatened Brian Lara's record for the

don't like any link-ups involving me," she said in a video posted by Kiddaan Entertainment. Suryakumar has not yet responded to these claims.



D Gukesh Stunned By 12-Year-Old Prodigy After 'Fatal' Blunder

In a result that has sent shockwaves through the chess world, reigning world champion D Gukesh suffered a stunning defeat at the hands of 12-year-old Sergey Skolkin at the FIDE World Blitz Championship 2025. The high-stakes clash in Doha saw the teenage Indian grandmaster succumb to a costly blunder under severe time pressure, proving that in the lightning-fast world of blitz chess, even the greatest can falter. Despite his world title, Gukesh found himself outmanoeuvred by the young FIDE Master in a tense third-round encounter. The match reached its breaking point on move 70. Playing with the black pieces, Gukesh was down a pawn and racing against the clock with just eight seconds left. His opponent, the Russian prodigy Skolkin, offered a rook exchange, a move that likely would have steered the game toward a draw. However, Gukesh, known for his aggressive "play-to-win" spirit, declined the trade and moved his rook to f4. The



gambit backfired almost instantly. Within moves, Gukesh lost his bishop and his final pawn. Facing an impossible position, the world champion was forced to resign just ten moves later. Commentators described the move as the "blunder of the round." Grandmaster Maurice Ashley noted that while Gukesh's fighting spirit is his greatest strength in classical chess, his refusal to settle for a draw proved fatal in this format. He said: "This blunder, we can all agree,

BBC Sport revealed on 18 December that the Eagles were advanced in their efforts to land the Wales international but decided not to make a formal move until after the two clubs faced each other in the Premier League on Sunday. There is now an agreement between the clubs for Johnson to move across London. However, the 24-year-old is yet to agree to join the Selhurst Park club. Johnson is set for talks over his future in the next 48 hours, amid interest from other Premier League sides. Bournemouth are among the clubs who rate him highly and see him as a potential replacement for Antoine Semenyo, should the Ghanaian leave in January. Tottenham manager Thomas Frank said the Wales international was available to face Brentford on New Year's Day. He said: "Brennan has been a top professional. He has trained well today and is ready in two days' time [for the game against Brentford]." Tottenham are in the market for a new attacker this January which would limit Johnson's opportunities even more. It is understood that they have an interest in RB Leipzig winger Yan Diomandé, 19, and Manchester City attacker Savinho, 21. BBC Sport disclosed earlier this month that Tottenham were open to selling Johnson, who was the club's leading scorer last season with 18 goals. He etched his name in Spurs folklore by scoring the winner in their Europa League final over Manchester United in Bilbao in May, ending the club's 17-year wait for a trophy.

ent for most of Nuvvu Naaku Nachav shoots. We even went to New Zealand together. I was there during dubbing as well.

Sravanti Ravi Kishore: You were supposed to direct Nuvve Nuvve next, right?

Trivikram: Yes. That's why I was involved in everything for Nuvvu Naaku Nachav.

Sravanti Ravi Kishore: Back then, you'd write a

script version and narrate the dialogue version to the director and producer. We didn't just hear what you wrote—we saw it.
