India test-fires 2 Pralay missiles off Odisha

Bhubaneswar (TSIT): India on Wednesday validated the battlefield salvo mode of its indigenously developed quasi-ballistic missile Pralay, launching two rounds 30 seconds apart from a single mobile launcher at 10:30 am from Abdul Kalam Island, Odisha, the Defence Ministry said.

Both 150-500 km-range, solid-propellant weapons followed identical trajectories and hit their designated impact points within circular-error probability, tracking radars at Integrated Test Range, Chandipur, confirmed. The user-evaluation trial, witnessed by Army, Air Force and DRDO teams, paves the way for induction into the Strategic Forces Command.

congratulated Research Centre Imarat-Hyderabad and industry partners BDL & BEL for “establishing reliable, ripple-fire capability essential for modern theatre operations”.

713 Cr Released Towards Pending Employees' Bills

HYDERABAD (TSIT): The State government has released 713 crore towards clearing pending bills payable to government employees for the month of December, following orders issued by Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu, Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister.

Acting on the Deputy Chief Minister's directions, officials of the Finance Department released the bills on Wednesday, providing relief to employees awaiting settlement of long-pending dues. It may be recalled that the Praja Government had earlier assured employee unions that Rs.700 crore would be released every month towards pending bills. By the end of June, the government had released Rs.183 crore. Subsequently, from August onwards, a minimum of Rs.700 crore has been consistently released each month, in line with the assurance given.



Telangana secures Rs.22,000 crore tourism investment pledges.

HYDERABAD (TSIT): Telangana secured investment commitments worth Rs.22,324 crore in the tourism sector during 2025, marking the year as a major turning point in positioning the state as a global tourism destination.

In its year-end review released on Wednesday, the Tourism Department described 2025 as a watershed year, driven by the “Telangana Tourism Policy 2025-2030.” The investments are expected to generate nearly 90,000 employment opportunities across the state.

A major share of the inflows came through the



Tourism Conclave 2025, which attracted 30 projects with investments of Rs.15,279 crore, while the Telangana Rising Global Summit contributed another Rs.7,045 crore. International investors committed to large-scale projects in convention, cultural, and wellness

tourism segments. The year also witnessed significant global exposure with Hyderabad hosting the Miss World 2025 pageant, showcasing Telangana's infrastructure and safe, visitor-friendly environment. The state further created history during the Bathukamma festival by achieving two Guinness World Records for the tallest floral arrangement and the largest folk dance performance.

Focusing on safety and technology, the depart-

ment launched an 80-member Tourist Police force and introduced digital initiatives such as a Unified Online Tourism Portal, GIS mapping, and Digital Travel Cards. Infrastructure development gained momentum with 78 of 123 state projects completed, alongside Rs.275 crore worth of works under central schemes.

Looking ahead, the department unveiled its 2026 roadmap, featuring heli-tourism circuits, premium destination wedding hubs, and a series of international festivals to kickstart the new year.

EAM Jaishankar meets Pakistan's National Assembly Speaker in Bangladesh



Dhaka, Dec 31 : External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar briefly met Pakistan's National Assembly Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq in Dhaka on Wednesday, just ahead of funeral of Bangladesh's former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia. The social media account of Bangladesh's Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus shared the picture of Sadiq and EAM Jaishankar meeting. “Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, exchanges greetings with Indian External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar in Dhaka on Wednesday ahead of the funeral programme of former Bangladesh Prime Minister Khaleda Zia,” it wrote on X.

Earlier in the day, EAM Jaishankar arrived in Dhaka to represent

the wake of a democratic transition following the upcoming elections. Sharing photos of EAM's meeting with Tarique Rahman, Bangladesh's High Commissioner to India, Riaz Hamidullah, posted on X stating “HE Dr S Jaishankar Hon. External Affairs Minister, in Dhaka, conveys condolences of the people and Govt of India as Bangladesh mourns passing of former Bangladesh Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, recognised her contribution to democracy and expressed optimism to strengthen India Bangladesh ties following democratic transition in Bangladesh thru the upcoming election (Feb 2026).” Khaleda Zia, a three-time Prime Minister and long-time chairperson of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party, died early Tuesday morning after a prolonged illness. She was 80.

She was laid to rest with full State honours on Wednesday afternoon beside her husband, country's former President Ziaur Rahman, at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar in Dhaka, according to local media reports.

On Tuesday, PM Modi had expressed his deep sorrow over the demise of Bangladesh's former PM and the BNP chairperson, remembering her as a historic leader whose contributions to Bangladesh and relations with India will always be remembered.

Don't judge people by caste, wealth or language: Mohan Bhagwat

Raipur: Asserting that the country belongs to everyone, RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat on Wednesday called for social harmony, urging people to rise above divisions of caste, wealth, and language to treat “everyone as one's own.” The RSS chief also encouraged families to dedicate one day each week for collective activities like meals, prayers, and discussions to foster connection and combat loneliness. Addressing a ‘Hindu Sammelan’ at Sonpairi village in Chhattisgarh's Raipur district, Bhagwat said that the first step toward social harmony is the removal of discrimination and separation from one's mind.

“The entire country belongs to everyone, and this spirit is true social harmony,” Bhagwat said and insisted that public facilities like temples, water bodies, and cremation grounds must be open to all Hindus without exception.

People should not judge anyone by their caste, wealth, language or region and treat everyone as their own, he said. “The entire India is mine,” he said, describing this approach as samajik samrasta (social harmony).

Assam couple lynched, burnt alive over witchcraft allegations

Karbi Anglong: In a horrific incident of mob violence rooted in superstition, a married couple was brutally killed after being accused of practising witchcraft in Assam's Karbi Anglong district. The incident occurred on Tuesday at No. 1 Beloguri Munda village in the Howraghat area. The victims were identified as 43-year-old Gardi Birowa and his 33-year-old wife, Mira Birowa. According to reports, a group of villagers forcibly entered the couple's house and attacked them with sharp weapons. After assaulting the couple, the attackers set the house on fire, resulting in both victims being burnt alive inside the premises.

India's broadband subscriber base surpasses 1 billion mark in Nov: Govt

New Delhi (TSIT): The broadband subscriber base in India crossed the 1 billion (100 crore) mark in the month of November, the government said on Wednesday.

In the last 10 years, the Broadband subscriber base in India has increased by more than six times. There were 131.49 million (13.15 crore) broadband subscribers at the end of November 2015, which grew to 1 billion (100.37 crore) at the end of November 2025, according to the Ministry of Communications.

Meanwhile, the total number of Internet subscribers in India increased from 1002.85 million at the end of the April-June quarter (Q1 FY26) to 1017.81 million at the end of the July-September period (Q2 FY26), registering a quarterly growth of 1.49 per cent, recent data from Telecom

Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) showed. As per the data, out of 1,070.81 million internet subscribers, the number of Wired Internet subscribers is 44.42 million, and the number of Wireless Internet subscribers is 973.39 mil-

lion. Meanwhile, the broadband Internet subscriber base increased by 1.63 per cent from 979.71 million at the end of June to 995.63 million at the end of September this year. The narrowband Internet subscriber base decreased from 23.14 million in the June quarter to 22.18 million at the end of the September quarter.

At the same time, wireline subscribers decreased from 47.49 million at the end of the April-June quarter to 46.61 million at the end of the September quarter, with a quarterly rate of decline of 1.84 per cent. On a year-on-year (YoY) basis, wireline subscriptions increased by 26.21 per cent at the end of the July-September quarter. Monthly ARPU for wireless service increased by 10.67 per cent YoY in the quarter as well.

ARAVALLI ROW: SC asks expert committee to consult stakeholders; sets out parameters for examining crucial issues

New Delhi (TSIT): The Supreme Court has asked a new expert committee set up by it to consult stakeholders to resolve critical ambiguities and to provide definitive guidance on issues relating to definition of Aravalli Hills. A three-judge special vacation bench led by Chief Justice of India Surya Kant – which on Monday ordered to keep in abeyance its November 20 order that was based on a previous committee's recommendations – also set out parameters for the new panel to approach these issues.

It said that prior to the implementation of the committee's report, or the execution of the directions contained in its November 20 judgment, “a fair, impartial, independent expert opinion must be obtained and considered, after associating all requisite stakeholders.” It asked



the panel to examine if the definition of ‘Aravalli Hills and Ranges’, restricted exclusively to the 500-meter area between two or more Aravalli Hills, creates a structural paradox wherein the geographical scope of protected territory is significantly narrowed. Consequently, it should be determined if this restrictive demarcation has inversely broadened the scope of ‘non-Aravalli’ areas, thereby facilitating the continuation of unregulated mining and other disruptive activities in terrains ecologically contiguous but technically excluded by this definition, it said.

TN Cabinet to meet on Jan 6 ahead of Assembly session; key decisions expected

The meeting is expected to play a crucial role in shaping the government's legislative agenda and policy direction for the upcoming session.

CHENNAI: The Tamil Nadu Cabinet will meet on January 6 at the Secretariat in Chennai under the chairmanship of Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, ahead of the commencement of the State Legislative Assembly session scheduled to begin on January 20.

The meeting is expected to play a crucial role in shaping the government's legislative agenda and policy direction for the upcoming session.

A major focus of the Cabinet meeting will be the preparation of the Governor's address, which traditionally outlines the government's priorities, achievements and policy roadmap for the year ahead. Ministers are expected to deliberate on key themes, welfare initiatives and developmental programmes to be highlighted in the address to the House.

The meeting is also



likely to take up long-pending demands raised by government employees, including teachers and nurses, who have been staging protests seeking resolution of service-related issues.

Of particular importance is the report submitted by the committee constituted to examine pension-related reforms for government employees. The committee has reportedly submitted its final recommendations

to the Chief Minister, and the Cabinet is expected to discuss the report and take decisions on the future course of action regarding pension benefits and related matters.

In addition to employee welfare issues, the Cabinet is expected to consider approvals for various industrial and infrastructure projects. These proposals align with the State government's broader push to attract investments,

strengthen industrial growth and generate employment opportunities. The January 6 Cabinet meeting assumes added significance as it comes just weeks before the Assembly session, during which the government is expected to face opposition scrutiny on governance, economic performance and welfare delivery.

Decisions taken at the meeting are likely to shape the tone and content of the forthcoming Assembly session and signal the government's policy priorities for the year ahead.

With expectations running high among government employees, industry stakeholders and the public, the outcomes of the Cabinet deliberations are being closely watched as an indicator of the government's policy direction in the months to come.

TN contract nurses end protest after govt assures permanent appointments

CHENNAI: Contract nurses, recruited through the Medical Services Recruitment Board (MRB) in Tamil Nadu, have called off their prolonged protest after the state government assured them of permanent appointments and other long-pending benefits. The agitation, which continued for several days across the state, culminated in a breakthrough following talks with senior government officials and Health Minister Ma Subramanian.

Thousands of nurses working in government hospitals and primary health centres had been staging continuous protests, demanding regularisation of their services.

On December 18, hundreds of nurses gathered in Chennai, staging a major demonstration near Chepauk, asserting that despite years of service, their demands remained

unaddressed. According to the Tamil Nadu Nurses Development Association, the issue dates back nearly a decade. Between 2014 and 2015, the MRB recruited nurses on a temporary basis, assuring them that they would be regularised after two years of service.

Since then, around 15,300 nurses have been appoint-

ed through this route. While nearly 7,000 of them have since been absorbed into permanent posts, around 8,300 continue to work on a contractual basis. The protesting nurses pointed out that the DMK, while in opposition, had promised in its 2021 Assembly election manifesto to regularise all temporary nurses.

Clause 356 of the manifesto specifically assured the filling up of vacant posts in government hospitals and the regularisation of contract-based doctors and nurses. However, as the government nears the end of its term, the nurses alleged that the promise remained unfulfilled.

Vande Bharat sleeper train clears 180 kmph high-speed trial

NEW DELHI: Indian Railways on Wednesday successfully completed the final high-speed trial of the indigenously developed Vande Bharat Sleeper Train -- marking a major step forward in India's



push for modern and self-reliant rail technology. The trial was conducted under the supervision of the Commissioner of Railway Safety on the Kota-Nagda section, where the train achieved a top speed of 180 kmph. According to the ministry, the train performed well across all safety and technical parameters, and the trial was declared successful. During the high-speed run, detailed checks were carried out on ride stability, vibration and oscillation behaviour, braking systems, emergency braking response, and other critical safety features.

The train was found to be stable and safe even at high-

PG assistantships rise by 50% in TN government engineering colleges



CHENNAI: The number of postgraduate assistantships offered to students in government engineering colleges under the Higher Education Department has increased by nearly 50% in the past 4 years.

The financial support is provided to non GATE students admitted to ME and MTech programmes

in State-owned engineering colleges through the single window counselling process conducted by Anna University and the Directorate of Technical Education.

A senior official in the department said, "The number of beneficiaries had increased from 666 in 2022 to 986 in 2025. The assistance is remitted every month directly into the students' Aadhaar-linked nationalised bank accounts through ECS. The number of beneficiaries is expected to exceed 1,000 in 2026."

OPS plays DMK over 'brutal assault' on migrant Odisha worker in TN's Tiruttani

CHENNAI: The All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) Workers' Rights Retrieval Kazhagam on Wednesday strongly condemned the "brutal attack" on a migrant worker from Odisha in Tamil Nadu's Tiruttani, blaming the DMK government for what it described as the growing menace of drugs and lawlessness in the state. In a statement, AIADMK founder and former Chief Minister O.



Panneerselvam said the shocking incident, in which a group of teenage boys allegedly assaulted a man with sickles, had shaken the conscience of the public.

He said the attack "exposed" the alarming extent to which drug abuse had penetrated society, particularly among the youth.

"The fact that four minors could commit such a heinous crime under the influence of narcotic substances

shows how Tamil Nadu has increasingly become a haven for drugs," Panneerselvam said.

He accused the DMK government of failing to curb the spread of narcotics and warned that the situation posed a serious threat to public safety and social order.

Tamil medium till class 5, Union Minister insists on NEP in Tamil Nadu

MADURAI: Amid continued opposition from the ruling DMK government, Union Minister for Education Dharmendra Pradhan on Wednesday asked the State to implement the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020. He stated that Tamil should be the medium of instruction up to class 5 per the policy. The State government has been against the NEP, claiming the imposition of Hindi

under the three-language formula. In August 2025, it rolled out the draft State Education Policy with a two-language formula in counter to NEP. I am hopeful that the local government will encourage the Tamil language in the early stages. If we take care of the children, they will be the future leaders of our society," Union Minister Pradhan told reporters in Madurai.

Road map for socially relevant medical education in Tamil Nadu

A patient walks into a Primary Health Centre in Tamil Nadu at midnight with chest pain. Another is brought after a road traffic accident. Will the young MBBS doctor on duty be confident and competent to manage these emergencies safely? This question at the heart of the debate on medical education reforms in India today.

Tamil Nadu's public health system is well recognised, with low maternal and infant mortality, extensive primary care, and a functioning referral network. Medical education in Tamil Nadu has long aligned with this vision, producing doctors for government facilities. Yet, current national reforms raise concerns that this alignment is being eroded. Two policies have reshaped medical education over the last decade: The introduction of Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) in 2019 and the centralised National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) for undergraduate and postgraduate admissions.

These have been introduced to improve quality and transparency, but their unintended consequences challenge Tamil Nadu's focus on social accountability. Indian medical education, guided by the Bhore Committee's vision of a 'basic doctor' who can address community health needs, has aligned closely with Tamil Nadu's vision of equitable health care.

CBME has, however, shifted focus to producing market-oriented 'world-class' doctors. While intended to ensure minimum competence, the numerous and prescriptive competencies, documentation, and reporting requirements have fragmented teaching and assessment, rather than strengthening clinical training. Faculty spend an increasing amount of time to complete paperwork instead of bedside teaching. The autonomy of teachers and institutions to prioritise local health needs has diminished, and the focus on clinical training and community exposure has reduced. As a result, the "hidden curriculum" of mentoring, role-modelling, instilling ethics, and promoting good clinical practice has weakened. Students report rising stress, declining engagement with clinical learning, and a growing perception that undergraduate education is no longer oriented towards a functional basic doctor. Faculty surveys echo these concerns, highlighting excessive check-



lists, assessment burdens, and declining clinical preparedness of graduating interns.

Reports from internship postings are particularly worrying. Many interns lack confidence in handling basic emergencies or performing common procedures such as intravenous cannulation, catheterisation, wound suturing, or initial resuscitation. These gaps will directly affect patient safety, especially in peripheral health facilities where young doctors are the first point of care.

The introduction of NEET has further distorted educational priorities. It has fuelled a massive coaching industry, with many MBBS students enrolling for postgraduate NEET coaching from their first year itself, devoting substantial time to training in MCQs rather than focusing on clinical experience and developing clinical skills.

This undermines their clinical preparedness for independent practice and discourages graduates from working in the health system after their MBBS training. These developments have serious implications for public health in Tamil Nadu, which relies on MBBS graduates to ensure staffing in the system.

It is imperative to recapture the original spirit of the CBME and align it with the health needs of Tamil Nadu and across India. Towards this, we suggest the following steps: First, competence must be made practical and meaningful. Rather than ticking off numerous competencies, every graduate should be able to perform a clearly defined set of observable tasks aligned to the common health problems, such as fever, breathlessness, and chest pain; initiating basic resuscitation; performing common procedures; prescribing safely; and communicating with patients. Second, clinical training must be strengthened. Adequate bedside exposure, participation in patient care, mentoring by

senior clinicians and assessment in clinical settings should be ensured. Community-based training in primary and secondary care settings should be an essential requirement. Third, the internship should be restored as a true supervised pre-licensure year. Uniform rotations, involvement in clinical care and graded responsibility, structured feedback, assessment of important skills, and validated logbooks can ensure that the internship fulfils its role. Fourthly, greater weightage should be given to structured assessments in the workplace during clinical training. NEET and NExT should give importance to clinical skills and work-based performance during internship.

Fifth, CBME should serve as a guiding framework, rather than a rigid set of rules. Teachers should be encouraged to develop innovative education to meet the needs of students, patients and local communities. Colleges with strong track records of innovation should be allowed flexibility to tailor their education in line with their social mission and local health needs.

Finally, the impact of CBME and NEET must be systematically studied. Colleges should be encouraged to identify the difficulties that students and teachers face and evolve mechanisms to address these. Medical education in Tamil Nadu stands at a crossroads. As it risks losing its clinical emphasis, the State has the opportunity to lead a way forward by reaffirming a vital principle: Medical education must serve the health of the community. By encouraging colleges and teachers to strengthen the clinical training.

EDITORIAL

Bangladesh To Pak, An Embattled India Steps Into 2026

As 2025 draws to a close, India finds itself navigating a turbulent regional environment. The year has been marked by Pakistan's uneasy economic stabilisation and Bangladesh's dramatic political transition, both of which carry profound implications for India's security, diplomacy, and economic outreach in New Delhi's backyard. India's "Neighbourhood First" policy is facing its most gruelling stress test in decades. For years, New Delhi's regional strategy relied on a binary of "stable friends" and "managed foes". Today, that binary has collapsed into a kaleidoscopic mess of volatility. From the collapse of a pro-India regime in Dhaka to a near-kinetic escalatory cycle with Islamabad, the year-end report card for India's periphery reads like a geopolitical cautionary tale. The most seismic shift of 2025 remains the structural transformation of Bangladesh. After fifteen years of a "Golden Era" for India under Sheikh Hasina, India now faces a Dhaka that is ideologically fluid and strategically aloof.

An Increasingly Pak-Friendly Bangladesh

The interim government, led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, has spent the year trying to balance the revolutionary zeal of student leaders against the institutional vacuum left by the Awami League's collapse. For India, the implications are stark. The "security-first" pillar, where Dhaka actively suppressed anti-India insurgents from the Northeast, is no longer guaranteed; if anything, the opposite, with militants gaining sanctuary in Bangladesh, is a real risk, as is the prospect of Pakistan's ISI fishing in troubled waters around India's "soft underbelly" there. Following the assassination of a student leader, preposterously blamed by some on India (which has no interest whatsoever in promoting instability in Bangladesh), student leaders have increasingly used provocative rhetoric, with some openly threatening to provide refuge to separatist elements in India's "Seven Sisters" states, and one even brashly claiming that his country knows how to separate India from its North-East.

The resurgence of Islamist forces, notably the Jamaat-e-Islami, has added a layer of communal anxiety. Tensions surrounding the death sentence on the ousted Sheikh Hasina and Dhaka's demand for her extradition will continue to mount if New Delhi continues to host her, which it has little choice but to do. Throughout 2025, reports of violence against minorities and the targeting of Indian cultural assets have soured the "people-to-people" connect that was once the bedrock of the relationship. The recent lynching of a Hindu worker, Dipu Chandra Das, has inflamed passions on both sides, with protests engulfing diplomatic establishments in both countries. Meanwhile, Bangladesh grapples with energy shortages, inflationary pressures, and declining investor confidence. India's ambitious plans for regional connectivity through ports, rail, and energy grids depend heavily on stability in Bangladesh.

Look Beyond Sentiment

As we enter 2026, India must transition from a "legacy-based" diplomacy to a "transactional-plus" engagement. The emotional bond of 1971 is no longer enough to anchor ties with Bangladesh; New Delhi needs a new narrative that appeals to the "Gen Z" of Dhaka who did not live through the Liberation War. As the country heads toward elections in early 2026, India finds itself in an unfamiliar position: a bystander watching its influence being challenged by a younger, more nationalistic generation that views New Delhi's past support for the previous regime as an affront to their sovereignty. Questions loom over whether, with the lawlessness and intimidation in the streets, the forthcoming elections in Bangladesh would be free and fair - or whether they would even take place as scheduled.

While the East is a puzzle of political transition, the West remains a theatre of hard-nosed military posturing. The year 2025 saw the most significant military confrontation between India and Pakistan since 2019. The "Operation Sindoor" strikes in May, India's justified response to a major terror attack in Pahalgam, signalled that the Modi government's threshold for "strategic patience" has lowered further. However, Pakistan's response was not merely conventional: it involved a spate of missiles and drones, guided by real-time intelligence from Chinese satellites hovering over India. Islamabad's establishment of a new Army Rocket Force Command (ARFC) and its pursuit of hypersonic technologies suggest a shift toward "asymmetric deterrence".

How The Tripura Student Killing Holds A Tragic Mirror To Society

The brutal stabbing and subsequent death of 24-year-old MBA student Anjel Chakma in Dehradun, after he objected to racial slurs hurled at him and his brother, is more than an isolated crime. When an ordinary life ends in violence over identity in one's own country, while fetching groceries far away from home, it compels the nation to ask tough questions about prejudice, belonging and citizenship in modern India.

It is a stark reminder of deep-seated inequalities in Indian society.

On December 9, Anjel and his younger brother were shopping in Dehradun's Selaqui area when they were reportedly confronted by a group of men, allegedly intoxicated, who hurled racial slurs such as 'Chinese', 'chinki' and 'momo' - derogatory taunts aimed explicitly at the appearance and ethnic background of Chakma. The confrontation escalated within minutes, culminating in a fatal stabbing that left Anjel fighting for his life for more than two weeks before he succumbed to his injuries.

His haunting last words, "We are not Chinese, we are Indian. What certificate do we need to show?", echo far beyond Dehradun, capturing the heartbreak of many Indians whose belonging is questioned without evidence or justification.

Violence As A Pattern, Not An Exception

Like people from other states, residents of the northeastern states migrate across India for education and employment. Many pursue professional courses in educational institutions, while others seek opportunities in government services. Thousands of civil services aspirants from the northeast enrol in coaching centres in metros and Tier 2 and 3 cities. Similarly, many move to large cities for jobs in multinational companies, the hospitality sector, and other industries. Yet, the Dehradun tragedy is not an anomaly. For years, people from northeast India have faced discrimination and harassment in other parts of the country. Government-linked surveys and academic studies have repeatedly documented how this manifests in daily life, scar-



ring victims psychologically forever.

A study commissioned by the Indian Council of Social Science Research on racial discrimination and hate crimes against people from the northeastern states, published in 2021, found that "northeast India seamlessly fits (into a mainland) Indian's imagination of a Chinese person". It revealed that around 78% of respondents from the northeast believed physical appearance was the primary reason for prejudice against them in major Indian cities. A significant number reported experiences of offensive language, social exclusion and mistreatment - experiences severe enough to alienate patriotic citizens of northeast India.

Earlier data from the government's M.P. Bezbaruah Committee - constituted after a similar racist killing in 2014 - showed that about 86% of people from the northeastern states living in Delhi had faced some form of racial discrimination. These figures point to a persistent structural problem, not sporadic incidents. Cases of racial taunting, refusal of service, verbal abuse and physical assault have been reported repeatedly across Indian cities.

Yet, despite these documented experiences and recommendations, legal recognition and enforcement of protections against racial discrimination remain limited. The Bezbaruah Committee had recommended legal and institutional reforms, including amendments to

the Indian Penal Code to criminalise racial insults and hate crimes, but progress has been slow.

The Rot Within

The killing of Anjel Chakma exposes several uncomfortable truths about India's social fabric.

Despite constitutional guarantees of equality, many Indians continue to assign "otherness" based on appearance, language or region. People from the northeast are often stereotyped as 'foreigners' or 'Chinese', even when they are Indian by birth and upbringing. This undermines the very idea of Indian citizenship and unity. Anjel's plea - a simple declaration of national identity - should never have been necessary. Worse, it was met with violence.

A recurring theme in surveys and interviews with migrants from the northeast is the lack of awareness among mainland Indians about the country's cultural, ethnic and linguistic diversity. Misidentifications - from being called 'Chinese' to caricatures about food or language - are not merely insensitive; they reveal ignorance of India's pluralism. From the perspective of a civilised society, killing someone for being perceived as 'Chinese' is equally abhorrent. This incident also highlights the wider landscape of everyday prejudice based on caste, class, religion and regional identity in India. The same social hierarchies and mindsets that fuel discrimination against Dalits, reli-

gious minorities and linguistic groups also enable bias against those who look different. When such prejudice goes unchecked, it can erupt into violence. Daily slurs and insults, if unchallenged, normalise exclusion and can escalate rapidly into deadly encounters.

The Cost Of Silence

The societal costs of ignoring racial prejudice are immense. They extend beyond individual tragedies to affect national cohesion and India's image as a diverse democracy. When students feel unsafe in institutions far from home, educational mobility suffers. When people face constant discrimination in the cities where they live and work, it erodes their sense of security and belonging. Such incidents also reverberate back to the regions the victims come from, fuelling resentment and alienation, with potential political consequences that deepen regional divides. The killing of a young student in Dehradun demands action. Conversations about race, identity and unity must move beyond social media to the mainstream, incorporating voices from all regions of the country. Alongside implementing laws that explicitly criminalise racial discrimination and violence, schools, colleges, law enforcement agencies, employers and communities must be trained to recognise and respond to racial bias and hate crimes effectively.

What Is Amit Shah's 'Mission Bengal'?

Union Home Minister Amit Shah arrived in Bengal for a three-day visit. This is not a tour marked by public rallies; instead, the focus is firmly on strategy. What exactly is Amit Shah's 'Mission Bengal'?

THE KEY FOCUS AREAS OF AMIT SHAH'S VISIT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Organisational Stocktaking

Amit Shah is concentrating on the party's organisational strengths and weaknesses. Taking stock of the BJP's organisational activities in West Bengal is a central objective of this visit. Shah is meeting organisational leaders at multiple levels, listening to opinions and complaints, and directly receiving feedback from district-level units and other entities, in addition to office bearers. He places a high priority on strengthening the party's campaign machinery.

2. The Matuas

Shah is placing particular emphasis on the Matua community. The SIR has created considerable confusion around Matua votes, with the Trinamool Congress running a campaign suggesting that the community feels insecure because of it. At a press conference, Shah sought to



counter this narrative, stating that there is no insecurity or fear among the Matuas. He even mockingly remarked that Mamata Banerjee has failed to win Matua support despite her efforts. This narrative is especially significant given the rivalry between Union Minister Shantanu Thakur and TMC leader Mamata Bala Thakur in Matua-dominated areas, where political competition and internal tensions run high.

3. Core Themes

What will be the BJP's principal campaign focus? Issues such as Hindu identity, alleged Muslim appeasement, the BJP's Hindutva agenda, and Mamata Banerjee's use of religious symbolism and temple-building are likely to dominate this election season.

4. Infiltration and the SIR

Infiltration is a central concern linked to the SIR process, but it also forms part of a broader, ongoing narrative. For the BJP, infiltration is not a new issue. Since the RSS's inception, it has been projected as a major concern. The party hopes to use the SIR to communicate its vision of a West Bengal free of infiltrators. The challenge is how to turn this into a major electoral issue beyond the administrative question of voter lists.

5. Coordination With RSS Amit Shah is also meeting Bengali RSS leaders to improve coordination. He is expected to visit the RSS headquarters in Bengal, Keshab Bhavan, signalling close cooperation between the RSS and the BJP. The aim is to demonstrate that there are no coordination

gaps.

6. Religious and Cultural Outreach

Shah is visiting ISKCON and Sister Nivedita's house, locations that Mamata Banerjee has also visited recently. Banerjee has worked closely with ISKCON, including supporting the Jagannath Temple in Digha. On December 5, she visited Sister Nivedita's house and addressed several site-related issues. Against this backdrop, Shah has prioritised these visits alongside Belur Math and Swamiji's ancestral home.

7. Leadership and Organisational Challenges

Amit Shah faces a significant challenge in what can be described as a leadership crisis within the Bengal BJP, alongside broader organisa-

tional weaknesses. Resolving these issues may require deeper public engagement.

8. Solving Internal Friction

The party is also marked by internal splits, miscommunication, and rivalry among leaders and organisational units. Shah has personally stepped in to address these problems, aiming to unify the party so it can move forward collectively.

9. Corruption as a Campaign

Corruption is another major focus. During a detailed press conference in Kolkata, Shah repeatedly raised the issue, naming TMC ministers, MLAs, MPs, and leaders who have been jailed on corruption charges. He urged the state BJP unit to turn corruption into a central campaign issue.

10. Projecting a 'New Bengal'

The BJP seeks to project a vision of a peaceful, development-oriented West Bengal free from corruption. Shah advised state leaders on countering Mamata Banerjee's claims regarding land acquisition and the BSF's role. He argued that border management issues persist because the state government has failed to provide land.

Trump-Xi Meet To G20 In Florida, What India Is Looking Forward To In 2026



The past year was one of the most momentous in recent times, made so by the arrival of a US president who is bent on transforming the world to his own image. The year not only saw a short India-Pakistan aerial war, but also an unexpected dent in the growing strategic ties between India and the US. The geopolitical result of this was a somewhat unexpected revival of the India-Russia friendship, which made a routine Putin-Modi summit stand out. Meanwhile, the Israel-Hamas war has wound down to a shaky ceasefire, even as peace negotiations continue to end the longer war between Ukraine and Russia. This was the year China successfully displayed its strength vis-à-vis the United States, and also the one country where renewables have surpassed coal as a source of electricity worldwide. It will

begin its ambitious 14th Five Year Plan in 2026 to consolidate its technical-industrial might. As for Pakistan, there will be little change in the country, which is living within illusions of its own creation. The year 2025 saw the terrible terrorist strike at the Baisaran meadow in Pahalgam, which led to Op Sindoor and the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty by India. When we look ahead to 2026, we can see the predictable sequence of annual meetings, visits and summits. You can be sure that the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the US will be directed by Trump himself and have his unpredictable trademarks. The G-20 summit, hosted by Donald Trump in Florida, will be a standout. But there will be equally important meetings of BRICS in New Delhi, the G7 summit in France, the ASEAN sum-

mits in the Philippines, the APEC summit in Shenzhen, and the COP 31 summit in Turkey. Note that Trump has already excluded South Africa from the G-20 and has declared that BRICS is an adversary grouping as far as the US is concerned. In terms of bilateral relations, without doubt, the most important will be the planned exchange of visits by Trump and Xi Jinping to each other's country, something that will have major consequences for global geopolitics. As of now, the only confirmed planned visit of Prime Minister Modi is to Italy, though no doubt he will participate in many of the multilateral summits and hold meetings with top leaders on their sidelines. New Delhi also hopes to finish its long-running negotiation with the US on its bilateral trade agreement by March 2026.

Rupee slumps 5pc in 2025, closes at 89.88 as foreign funds exit

Mumbai: The rupee slumped 5 per cent in 2025 as persistent capital outflows from foreign investors, alongside heightened dollar demand from importers, making it one of the worst-performing Asian currencies. On the last trading session of 2025, the rupee depreciated 13 paise to close at 89.88 against the US dollar as month-end demand and FPIs' dollar buying kept it lower. The domestic currency has exhibited a negative bias throughout the year, making it Asia's worst-performing currency in 2025, with foreign portfolio investors pulling out USD 16.5 billion from equities this year, further denting investor sentiments, forex traders said. At the inter-bank foreign exchange, the local unit opened at 89.89 against the dollar and touched an intra-day low of 89.95 and a high of 89.84 against the American currency. At the end of Wednesday's trading session, the rupee was quoted at 89.88 against the greenback, registering a fall of 13 paise over its previous close. On Tuesday, the rupee rose 23 paise to close at 89.75 against the greenback. On a year-on-year



basis, the rupee has plunged 4.95 per cent. It was quoted at 85.64 on December 31, 2024. Dilip Parmar, Research Analyst, HDFC Securities, said, "The rupee resumed its downward trajectory following Tuesday's pause, weighed down by a rebounding US dollar against major currencies. For the year 2025, the rupee emerged as the regional laggard, with spot prices whipped by tightening dollar liquidity, surging trade deficit, relatively high US Tariff and capital flows." "Since the Trump Administration took over, the rupee has been the worst performing currency

in the Asian Region, depreciating by more than 5 per cent during 2025, marking its highest depreciation in the last three years," said Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director, Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP. Meanwhile, the Reserve Bank, in its Financial Stability Report (FSR) on Wednesday, said the rupee had depreciated against the US dollar, reflecting falling terms of trade due to the impact of tariffs and a slowdown in capital flows. The report further noted that the Indian economy is likely to maintain strong growth, underpinned by robust

domestic demand, benign inflation, and prudent macroeconomic policies despite an uncertain and challenging global economic backdrop. "The domestic financial system remains robust and resilient, bolstered by strong balance sheets, easy financial conditions, and low financial market volatility. Nonetheless, there are near-term risks from external uncertainties — geopolitical and trade-related," it said. Bhansali further said that "consistent outflows by FPIs and stake sales by investors, demand from defence, oil and gold have all impacted the rupee as it fell to its lowest at 91.08

before reined in to control it and bring it up to current levels". Parmar added, "We anticipate a period of range-bound consolidation for USDINR, anchored between the 89.40 support and 90.26 resistance levels." Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.10 per cent higher at 98.33. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, was trading 0.13 per cent higher at USD 61.41 per barrel in futures trade. Forex traders said the USD/INR pair is trading under pressure due to multiple factors, including a shift toward risk aversion, driven by persistent capital withdrawals from foreign investors ahead of the holiday break, alongside heightened greenback demand from importers. On the domestic equity market front, benchmark-sensitive indices ended 2025 on a high, with the Sensex jumping 545.52 points to settle at 85,220.60, while the Nifty surged 190.75 points to 26,129.60. Foreign institutional investors offloaded equities worth Rs 3,597.38 crore on Wednesday, according to exchange data.

Economy growing at robust pace, banking sector remains sound: RBI

Mumbai: The Indian economy is growing at a robust pace, driven by strong domestic demand, low inflation, and the healthy balance sheets of banks, said a Reserve Bank report released on Wednesday. The domestic financial system remains robust and resilient, bolstered by strong balance sheets, easy financial conditions, and low financial market volatility, said the December 2025 edition of the Financial Stability Report (FSR). "Nonetheless, there are near-term risks from external uncertainties — geopolitical and trade-related," said the report, which reflects the collective assessment of the Sub-Committee of the Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC) on the resilience of the Indian financial system and risks to financial stability. It further said the health of the scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) remains sound with strong capital and liquidity buffers, improved asset quality and robust profitability. "Macro stress test results affirm the resilience of SCBs to withstand losses under hypothetical adverse scenarios and maintain capital buffers well above the regulatory minimum.



Stress tests also confirm the resilience of mutual funds and clearing corporations," it added. According to the report, the gross non-performing assets ratio of banks will improve further to 1.9 per cent by March 2027 under a baseline scenario. As of September 2025, the key ratio stood at a multi-decade low of 2.1 per cent, the central bank said in its half-yearly Financial Stability Report. "The aggregate GNPA ratio of the 46 banks may improve from 2.1 per cent in September 2025 to 1.9 per cent in March 2027 under the baseline scenario," the report said. The GNPA ratio may rise to 3.2 per cent and 4.2 per cent under adverse scenarios, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said, pointing to results of its stress tests. From a capital buffers per-

spective, the report said, the capital to risk-weighted assets ratio (CRAR) remained strong as of September, with state-owned banks at 16 per cent and private sector banks at 18.1 per cent. Banks will be able to withstand adverse economic shocks, the report said, listing out how the capital buffers will be impacted in adverse events. On the economy, the report noted that the real gross domestic product (GDP) growth surprised on the upside in both Q1 2025-26 and Q2 2025-26 at 7.8 per cent and 8.2 per cent, respectively, supported by strong private consumption and public investment. Centre approves 5-year moratorium on Vodafone Idea's AGR dues

New Delhi: The Union government on Wednesday, December 31, approved a major relief package for Vodafone Idea, freezing its outstanding dues and approving a five-year moratorium on payments, providing a critical lifeline to the debt-laden telecom operator. The Union Cabinet, headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, agreed to freeze AGR dues of Vodafone-Idea Ltd (VIL) at Rs 87,695 crore, which the struggling company has to start paying from 2031-32 fiscal and clear by 2040-41, sources aware of the decision said. AGR dues refer to payments owed by telecom companies to the government based on Adjusted Gross Revenue (AGR). It is the revenue on which telecom operators must pay license fees and spectrum usage charges. It is defined to include all revenues, even non-telecom income (like interest, rent, asset sales). Besides these outstanding, the AGR dues for FY2017-18 and FY 2018-19, which were finalised based

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on the Supreme Court order of September 2020, will now have to be paid over 2025-26 to 2030-31 fiscal without any change, they said. Vodafone Idea has been battling a prolonged financial crisis, driven by intense price competi-

tion, high debt, and massive AGR liabilities that arose from a change in the definition of AGR. The company has struggled with persistent losses, a shrinking subscriber base, and limited ability to invest in network

expansion, even as rivals accelerated 4G and 5G roll-outs. Repeated rounds of government relief and equity conversion of dues have kept the company afloat, but its long-term viability continues to hinge on sustained policy support, fresh capital infusion, and a turnaround in operating performance. Some had expected that the Cabinet would waive a part, if not all, of the AGR dues. But instead, it decided to give a moratorium, which would allow the company to recover. The dues that have been frozen will be reassessed by a committee based on audit reports, sources said, adding the outcome shall be binding on both parties. Sources said the decisions taken by the Cabinet were to protect the interests of the government, which now has a 49 per cent stake in VIL. It will also enable orderly payment of dues to the government, ensure competition in the sector and protect the interests of 20 crore consumers of the company.

Big Bullion Theory: Gold, silver retain sparkle in shaky geopolitical sands

New Delhi: Outsmarting all asset classes globally in 2025, gold and silver with massive returns and repeated record-breaking rallies redefined the precious metal market dynamics amid intensifying global political challenges, unstable tariff policies and persistent supply-chain disruptions. Marking one of the strongest performances for bullion in decades, silver prices surged more than 169 per cent during the year, while gold rallied over 76 per cent, reaffirming the role of precious metals as an anchor investment class in an extremely volatile world. In the domestic market, gold touched a lifetime high of Rs 1,42,300 per 10 grams on December 26, while silver scaled a record of Rs 2,41,000 per kg on December 30. Globally, spot gold began the year at around USD 2,657.16 per ounce and rallied to a peak of USD 4,550.11 per ounce on December 26, registering gains of up to 71.24 per cent. Spot silver, meanwhile, started the year at about USD 29.57 per ounce and soared to a peak of USD 83.63 per ounce on December 29, clocking robust returns of 182.82 per cent. The rally was initially triggered by the Fed's policy easing, but it gathered pace as President Donald Trump's return to the White House, with tariff rhetoric,



fuels uncertainty, central banks doubled down on bullion reserves, and supply constraints across metal markets. "Gold and silver surged over the past year on the back of a powerful mix of macro factors, such as structural demand and physical supply tightness, Naveent Damani, Head of Research, Commodities, Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd (MOFSL), told PTL. US Federal Reserve's Pivot Marks Inflection Point: The early momentum in bullion's remarkable rally in 2025 came from the US Federal Reserve's (Fed) policy easing, with the central bank delivering three cautious 25-

basis-point rate cuts amid signs of cooling inflation, putting pressure on the US dollar, lending support for the bullion prices. "2025 marked a clear inflection point for the Fed, with three cautious 25-basis-point cuts delivered amid divided voting and visible political pressure. "...with Chair Jerome Powell's term ending in May 2026 and a potentially more dovish successor in the wings. Bullion is likely to react ahead of policy, keeping the bias constructive despite brief corrective phases," Damani said. Silver outshines due to the supply crunch: Silver has emerged

as an all-out performer of 2025, driven by strong industrial demand, amid constrained mine supply, and rising production costs. Silver has been facing shortages for five years due to mine shutdowns and China-led supply constraints, with a sixth straight shortfall likely in 2026 amid rising costs and firm demand. "Silver is entering 2026 with a fundamentally tighter setup than gold. With recent mine shutdowns and fresh supply constraints from China and elsewhere, next year is likely to mark a sixth straight deficit. This is no longer just a demand story; it is a structural supply squeeze," Damani of MOFSL said. Trump's tariff rhetoric fuels uncertainty, lifts safe-haven assets: The demand for safe-haven assets increased after Trump returned to power, a resurgence of trade uncertainties and tariff-related tremors globally. "Supply chains remain fragile, with tariffs and trade re-shoring creating hidden inflation pockets even as growth slows," Damani said, adding that "In this tug of war between inflation and growth, gold benefits as a balance-sheet hedge, while silver sits at the crossroads of industrial demand and physical scarcity, making both metals strategic rather than speculative assets in 2026."

New year celebration seen across the world



Heavy police presence in Sydney for New Year's celebrations after Bondi attack



Thousands of heavily armed police officers are patrolling the streets of Sydney as people mark the new year - a rare and stark sight in Australia, following the Bondi Beach mass shooting. Some officers were authorised to carry high-grade weapons as part of heightened security measures. The attack on 14 December targeted Australia's Jewish community and killed 15 people at a Hanukkah festival. New South Wales (NSW) Police said more than 2,500 officers would be on duty across the city. Official New Year's Eve parties were paused at 23:00 local time (12:00 GMT) for a minute's silence to commemorate the victims of the attack, while the Sydney Harbour Bridge was lit up by a white light to symbolise peace. Pictures from Sydney Harbour - where huge crowds gather every year to watch the city's famous fireworks display - show officers patrolling the crowds with longarm weapons. In the lead up to the event, Premier Chris Minns had warned that some people may find the sight "confronting", with police "carrying firearms and weapons that you haven't seen before".

Mali and Burkina Faso impose travel ban on US citizens in tit-for-tat move



Mali and Burkina Faso say they will bar US citizens from entering their countries in response to a similar move by the Trump administration. The two West African states were recently placed under full entry restrictions under US President Donald Trump's expanded travel ban. In separate statements, they said they would apply the same measures on US nationals. Burkina Faso's foreign affairs minister Karamoko Jean-Marie Traoré said his government was acting on the "principle of reciprocity", while Mali's foreign ministry called for "mutual respect and sovereign equality". The latter said it regretted the US's move, adding that "such an important decision was made without any prior consultation". Mali and Burkina Faso's decision comes days after Niger's state news agency reported that Niger had imposed a similar travel ban on US citizens, though no official statement has been issued by its foreign ministry to confirm this. The three countries are ruled by military juntas which seized power in coups. They have formed their own regional bloc, and have pivoted towards Russia after relations with other West African states and Western powers became strained. Earlier this month, the White House said that full-entry restrictions would be imposed on people from the three countries, as well as South Sudan, Syria and Palestinian Authority passport holders. The decision would come into effect on 1 January, and was intended to "protect the security" of the US, it said. The administration also moved Laos and Sierra Leone, which were previously subject to partial restrictions, to the full ban list, and put partial restrictions on 15 other countries, including Nigeria, Tanzania and Zimbabwe. The White House said the restrictions would remain in place until affected countries show "credible improvements" in identity management, information-sharing and cooperation with US immigration authorities.

Jailed HK tycoon's 'teeth rotting and fingernails falling off', daughter tells

The daughter of Jimmy Lai, the pro-democracy tycoon jailed in Hong Kong, has expressed concerns about her father's deteriorating health in prison, saying that his fingernails "sometimes fall off" and his teeth are rotting. Lai, 78, has been detained since December 2020 and faces life in prison. Earlier this month he was convicted of colluding with foreign forces under the city's controversial national security law (NSL). Hong Kong and Chinese authorities have denied that Lai has been mistreated in prison, saying he is in "good health". The BBC has seen a letter written by Lai's family urging UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer to call for Lai's release when he meets Chinese President



Xi Jinping next month. His daughter Claire Lai, who is in exile in London, told the BBC that she fears she "may never see him again". "Of course I worry that my father is going to be a martyr, and I don't want him to be a martyr. But I would not be here today, I would not be speaking out if I didn't think this was his best chance of reuniting with our family." She described her father as an "extremely robust and strong man" when he went to prison.

Russian claims of Ukrainian attack on government sites 'unfounded', EU's top diplomat says

The EU's top diplomat has called Moscow's claims that Ukraine targeted Russian government sites a "deliberate distraction" and an attempt to derail the peace process. Kaja Kallas' comments on social media appear to be a reference to the Kremlin's allegation that Ukraine attempted a drone strike on one of Vladimir Putin's residences. "No one should accept unfounded claims from the aggressor who has indiscriminately targeted Ukraine's infrastructure and civilians," Kallas wrote on social media. Earlier this week Moscow accused Ukraine of targeting Putin's private home on Lake Valdai in north-west Russia. Russia would review its position in the ongoing peace negotiations as a result, the Kremlin said.



Since Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov first shared the claims, Russian state media and politicians have discussed the alleged attack in increasingly incendiary tones. "The attack is a strike on the heart of Russia," said Andrei Kartapolov, head of the Russian parliament's defence committee. "After what [Ukraine] has done, there can be no forgiveness." Although the Kremlin ini-

tially said it saw no point in sharing proof of the alleged attack, on Wednesday the Russian army released what it said was evidence of the attempted strike. It included a map allegedly showing that the drones were launched from the Sumy and Chernihiv regions of Ukraine and a video of a downed drone lying in snowy woodland. The BBC hasn't been able to verify the

footage, and it is not possible to locate where it was taken. The profile of the wrecked UAV (unmanned aerial vehicle) bears similarities to Ukrainian-produced Chakluns - but because the components of the drone pictured are inexpensive and widely available online, they cannot be conclusively traced to the Ukrainian military. Russia's defence ministry also released a video of what it said was a local resident who described hearing noises like a rocket at the time of the alleged attack. However, one Russian investigative media outlet said it had spoken to more than a dozen residents of the area around Putin's residence and none had heard anything that could indicate 91 drones had approached or been shot down by air defences.

MACHU PICCHU TRAIN CRASH LEAVES ONE DEAD AND DOZENS INJURED

A train driver has died and at least 40 people have been injured in a head-on rail collision near Peru's most popular tourist attraction, Machu Picchu. Two trains collided on the single track leading to the ancient Inca town on Tuesday, according to a statement from the local government. It said that 20 ambulances had attended the scene and that injured people had been transferred to medical facilities in the nearby city of Cusco. The US embassy in Peru said that US citizens were injured in the crash, while the UK Foreign Office said it was "supporting a number of British nationals involved". Local media outlet Peru21



reports that hundreds of tourists remain at the scene awaiting evacuation, which has been hampered by difficult terrain around the crash site. At least 20 of the injured are in a serious condition, a health official told the Reuters news agency. The collision occurred on

the track linking Ollantaytambo Station and Aguas Calientes, the closest town to Machu Picchu. The journey between the two stations usually takes around 90 minutes. The two trains involved in the accident were operated by PeruRail and Inca Rail respectively.

"We deeply regret what has happened," PeruRail said in a statement, adding that its staff had "immediately" provided first aid to the train driver, the train conductor and the passengers involved in the incident. The cause of the accident has not yet been made clear. The crash comes amid an ongoing dispute between providers of transport to the Unesco world heritage site, with local communities unhappy with what they say is an insufficiently open bidding process. The trains and buses that take tourists to the ancient town have steep ticket prices and can be highly lucrative due to its limited accessibility.

Eurostar services return to normal after major Channel Tunnel disruption



Eurostar and Le Shuttle services between the UK and France have resumed through the Channel Tunnel after major travel disruption on Tuesday. Thousands of passengers faced hours of delays after Eurostar cancelled most of its London to Europe services due to overhead power supply problem and a failed Le Shuttle train which blocked all routes. Repair work took place overnight and rail services through the tunnel in both directions resumed on Wednesday morning. But Eurostar urged passengers to check before travelling as it warned for possible knock-on delays and last-minute cancellations. Most of Eurostar's Wednesday morning services in and out of London St Pancras have departed. Only three - one towards Paris Gare du Nord; another destined for Brussels Midi and the other bound for Amsterdam Centraal - have been cancelled, according to Eurostar's

website. The high-speed rail firm apologised for any inconvenience caused to passengers. Eurostar said: "We plan to run all of our services today, however due to knock on impacts there may still be some delays and possible last-minute cancellations. "Customers are advised to check for live updates on the status of their train on the Eurostar website." Eurostar said one extra London to Paris service will run on Wednesday and that passengers are entitled to "enhanced compensation" which includes 100% refund of their ticket and 150% of their ticket price as an e-voucher. Le Shuttle services from Folkestone are running normally following earlier delays on Wednesday morning. However, there are still delays of an hour at Calais - although down from the earlier reported six hours. The Channel Tunnel accommodates Eurostar services as well as Le Shuttle vehicle-carrying trains between the UK and France.

HUGE CROWDS MOURN BANGLADESH'S FIRST FEMALE PM AT STATE FUNERAL

Hundreds of thousands of people travelled from across Bangladesh to the capital Dhaka on Wednesday to pay their final respects to former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia. Zia, who was the country's first female prime minister, died on Tuesday from a prolonged illness. She was 80. The mourners held out their hands in prayer and carried flags printed with her photographs as a motorcade carrying Zia's body - including the hearse wrapped with the national flag - drove on streets near the parliament house. Flags were flown at half-mast and thousands of security officers were deployed. "I have come this far just to say goodbye. I know I won't be able to see

her face, but at least I could see the [vehicle] carrying her for the last rites," Setara Sultana, an activist from Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), told the BBC. Sharmina Siraj, a mother of two, called Zia "an inspiration", noting that stipends introduced by the former leader to improve women's education made a "huge impact" on her daughters. "It is difficult to imagine women in leadership positions anytime soon," she told AFP news agency. India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, the Speaker of Pakistan's National Assembly Sardar Ayaz Sadiq and Bhutan's Foreign Minister Lyonpo DN Dhungyel were among those



who attended the funeral. Earlier in the day, Zia's body was taken to the house of her son Tarique Rahman, who was seen reciting the Quran beside his mother's office. The state funeral marks the end of Zia's extraordinary journey, from a homemaker to the first female prime minister of Bangladesh. Zia

was buried next to her husband Ziaur Rahman, who was assassinated in 1981 while serving as president - an incident that thrust Zia into the political limelight. She went on to lead the BNP in the country's first elections in 20 years. She was dubbed an "uncompromising leader"

after refusing to participate in a controversial election under military ruler General Hussain Muhammad Ershad in the 1980s. For several years, along with her bitter political rival Sheikh Hasina, she fought for democracy and against military dictatorship, enduring arrests. There was talk among Bangladesh's rulers at the time to keep the two "battling begums" - Zia and Hasina - out of politics in what was then known as the "minus two formula". But Zia eventually became prime minister, first in 1991 then again in 2001. During the time of the military-backed caretaker government in 2007, she was kept

under detention. In the last 16 years, under Hasina's Awami League government, Zia emerged as the most prominent symbol of resistance to Hasina's rule which many saw as increasingly autocratic. Zia's resilience drew admiration from her supporters, who say that despite various personal and political setbacks, years in opposition and convictions under Hasina's government, Zia never gave up, refused to compromise on her principles and stood her ground. The fact that hundreds of thousands of people, including those who didn't vote for her party, turned up for the funeral would be seen as a reflection of her popularity among the masses.

Not Rehman Dakait, Pakistan Star Called 'Chacha Dakait' After Celebrating Win With Dhurandhar's FA9LA Dance

Akshaye Khanna's dance steps on the track 'FA9LA' from the movie Dhurandhar have slowly reached iconic status. From Instagram Reels to YouTube Shorts, the song has become a viral pop-culture favourite. FA9LA is originally a Bahraini hip-hop song written and performed by Flipperachi and Daffy, with DJ Outlaw composing the music. The song already existed before the makers of Dhurandhar discovered it. Now, Pakistani cricketer Iftikhar Ahmed, whose nickname is Chacha, danced to the track after Khan Research Laboratories (KRL) clinched the President's Cup Grade-I.

In the movie Dhurandhar, the character of Rehman Dakait, played by Akshaye Khanna, dances to the track. After the dance, Iftikhar is now being called 'Chacha Dakait'. Rehman Dakait, born Abdul Rehman in 1976, grew up in Lyari, one of



Karachi's oldest and poorest neighbourhoods-an area long synonymous with crime, gang wars, and a deep-rooted crime-police nexus. According to a report, he was the son of Dad Mohammad and his second wife, Khadija. His family was already entrenched in the

underworld. Rehman Dakait's descent into crime began shockingly early. At just 13, he stabbed and injured a man who stopped him from bursting crackers in Lyari. Two years later, he escalated from violence to murder, killing two rival drug peddlers after a dispute.

The most disturbing chapter of his life unfolded in 1995. Months after escaping police custody, Rehman shot dead his own mother, Khadija, inside their home. He told the police that he killed her because "she became a police informant." However, it is widely

believed that he suspected her of having a relationship with a rival gang member-a detail that Dhurandhar does not shy away from depicting. In 1995, Rehman was arrested for possession of weapons and drugs. He spent around two and a half years in jail before pulling off a dramatic escape while being transported from Karachi jail to court. He fled to Balochistan, where he began rebuilding his criminal empire with renewed ferocity. By the early 2000s, Rehman Dakait had emerged as one of Lyari's most powerful ganglords.

By 2006, he had amassed immense wealth, properties, and political influence. He married three times and fathered 13 children. Reports also claimed that he owned property not just in Karachi and Balochistan, but even in Iran. Rehman Dakait's reign continued until 2009, when the Lyari Task Force tracked him using phone data.

Rishabh Pant Sent Blunt Message After T20 World Cup Snub: "Is He A Top 3 Batter?"

Rishabh Pant was not included in India's T20 World Cup 2026 squad and media reports claimed that he will not be included in the ODI series squad as well. It has been a tough period for the wicket-keeper batter who had his struggles with injury and has seen KL Rahul emerge as the top-choice wicket-keeper in ODIs. On the other hand, Dhruv Jurel and Ishan Kishan have also made their intentions clear with brilliant performances in domestic cricket. Former India cricketer Deep Dasgupta believes that Pant needs to understand his role in T20 cricket and even wondered whether he sees himself as a top-order hitter, a middle-order option, or a finisher in the format. "In T20 cricket, is he a top-three batter? Or is he a middle-order batter or is he a finisher? What's he? He needs to answer these questions," Dasgupta told India Today. "As far as I am concerned, he



is a top-three batter in T20I cricket. In ODIs, he is a good No.4 or No.5," he added. Dasgupta added that Pant needs to concentrate on his batting and keep scoring runs in the ongoing Vijay Hazare Trophy in order to make his case for a return to the national team. "I think he just needs to bat, and bat. He got a excellent 70-odd for Delhi. He just needs to keep scoring runs, playing white-ball cricket wherever he gets the opportunity - domestic or otherwise - and learn his trade, learn what suits him," he added. Rishabh Pant is

likely to be left out of the squad for the upcoming ODI series against New Zealand, according to a report by India Today. The report claimed that sources close to the selection committee have confirmed that the team management may opt for a different direction while choosing the squad for the three-match series. Pant's exclusion could pave the way for Ishan Kishan's return to the ODI setup after the Jharkhand cricketer impressed with stellar performances in domestic cricket.

Sara Tendulkar, Daughter Of Sachin Tendulkar, Targetted Over Video With Friends In Goa. Gets Support

Sara Tendulkar, who is an entrepreneur and the daughter of cricket great Sachin Tendulkar, is facing intense trolling on social media. The reason: a video of her with friends on the streets of Goa. While it cannot be confirmed when the video was shot, some social media users claimed it was filmed close to New Year's Eve. In the video, Sara can be seen strolling on the road along with her friends. Some social media users, however, made unsavoury comments as she was holding a bottle, which they claimed was a beer bottle. Some social media users even name-dropped Sachin Tendulkar in their comments. Sara, however, received support from a section of social media too. "What kind of



brain-dead mentality is this? How is Sara having a beer equivalent to Tendulkar promoting alcohol? And can't a daughter have a drink?" wrote one user. The left-arm orthodox Lennox tried to go with a fuller ball away from Phillips. He bowled it around the tramline, but the batter still smashed it away for a six over extra cover, surprising the fans as well as the commentators. Phillips ended up



scoring an unbeaten 90 off 48 balls, with the help of seven fours and four sixes. His innings had a strike rate of 187.50. He eventually earned the Player of the Match award as Otago won the game by 41 runs. Reacting to the switch in his batting stance,

Phillips told TVNZ, "I have done it for a little while in the nets, but never quite brought it out. Obviously it is a little bit of an interesting thing, the switch-around in a game of professional cricket... the other day I was stroking it better in the nets when I was left-

handed than when I was right-handed. So it sort of made sense to at least try and bring it out when there was nothing left to lose." In the Indian Premier League (IPL), Phillips is part of the Gujarat Titans squad. He played three matches for Rajasthan Royals in 2021, which happened to be his first season in the tournament. Two years later, Phillips represented Sunrisers Hyderabad in five matches. The player was then picked by GT for Rs 2 crore ahead of IPL 2025, and got retained by the franchise for the upcoming season.

Sarfaraz Khan Slams 157 Off 75 Balls In Vijay Hazare Trophy, Sends Big Message To BCCI Selectors



Vijay Hazare Trophy 2025: Sarfaraz Khan sent a stark reminder to the selectors ahead of the New Zealand ODI series, slamming 157 off just 75 deliveries during Mumbai's Vijay Hazare Trophy encounter against Goa on Wednesday. The 28-year-old was in blistering form, clearing the ropes 14 times and hitting 9 fours during his stay at the crease. After Goa opted to bowl first, Vasuki Koushik gave them an early breakthrough by dismissing Angkrish Raghuvanshi. However, Yashasvi Jaiswal and Musheer Khan steadied the ship before Sarfaraz dismantled the opposition with his explosive hitting. Having enjoyed a sensational run in domestic cricket, this knock came at the perfect time to stake his claim for the ODI series against New Zealand, which begins on January 11. In their last match, Shardul Thakur ticked all the boxes, right from winning the toss to blowing the Chattisgarh top order with a match win-

ning four-wicket burst, as Mumbai cruised to nine wicket victory to complete a group stage hat trick in the Vijay Hazare Trophy on Monday. At the Jaipuria Vidyalaya ground, Shardul won the toss and used the early morning nip to good effect to reduce Chattisgarh to 10 for 4 inside first five overs. Chattisgarh never recovered from the blow and were skittled out for 142 in 38.1 overs. While Shardul wreaked havoc in first half an hour, it was left-arm spinner Shams Mulani (5/31) who demolished the latter half of the Chattisgarh batting by bowling quick and stump-to-stump line. The last six wickets tumbled for 27 runs. The chase was a cakewalk as Angkrish Raghuvanshi (68 no off 66 balls) along with veteran Siddhesh Lad (48 no off 42 balls) added 102 runs for the unbroken second wicket to wrap it off in just 24 overs. Mumbai with 12 points consolidated their position on top of group C.

England Will Win Ashes In Four Years In Australia With This Bowler Being The 'Player Of The Series'

Former England cricketer Phil Tufnell has made a bold prediction about pacer Josh Tongue and the England Test team ahead of the fifth and final Ashes Test, set to get underway on January 4. Appearing on the Stick to Cricket podcast, the former England cricketer said that England will win the Ashes the next time they tour Australia, which is expected to take place in 2028-29. He also noted that pacer Josh Tongue will be the man of the series in the Australia vs England series. "Four years' time, Josh Tongue, man of the series, England winning the Ashes. Four years. Write that down," Tufnell said on the podcast.



Tufnell's comments come after Josh Tongue produced a man-of-the-match performance in the recently concluded Australia vs England Boxing Day Test of the ongoing Ashes series, helping the Three

Lions win their first match on the tour Down Under. Coming into the match 3-0, the Ben Stokes-led England defeated Australia by four wickets at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG) to rule out the

possibility of a clean sweep. Josh Tongue claimed a five-wicket haul in the first innings of the Boxing Day Test and followed it up with a two-wicket haul in the second innings, taking seven wickets in the match. He became the first England bowler to be named Player of the Match in an Ashes Test in Australia since Dean Headley in 1998. Tongue also earned a surprise call-up, as the Three Lions have included him in their T20 World Cup 2026 squad despite him never having played a limited-overs match for England. Along with the T20 World Cup squad, Tongue has also been included in Sri Lanka's tour squad.

Uganda Forced To Use 3 Goalkeepers During AFCON Match. This Is The Reason

The Africa Cup of Nations match between Uganda and Nigeria saw a bizarre incident as Uganda ended up using three different goalkeepers in the same game. With Uganda trailing in the second half, their 40-year-old first-choice goalkeeper Denis Onyango was forced to leave the pitch after suffering an ankle injury. He was replaced by Salim Jamal Magoola, but just 11 minutes later he was sent off for handling the ball outside the penalty area in an attempt to stop a shot from Victor Osimhen. As a result, Uganda had to introduce their third-choice goalkeeper, Nafian Alionzi. He played the remainder of the match, but Nigeria went on to win 3-1. Meanwhile, Senegal and Congo served notice of their intent with convincing wins at the



Africa Cup of Nations on Tuesday, when Tanzania and Tunisia grabbed the last places in the knockout stage. Senegal, the 2021 champion, survived Kalidou Koulibaly's sending off on his 100th appearance for the team by routing Benin 3-0 in Group D in Tangier. Congo finished second in the group on goal difference with a 3-0 win

over already eliminated Botswana in Rabat. Senegal, Congo and Benin were already assured of their places in the last 16. But Tanzania and Tunisia were not. They progressed from Group C by playing out a 1-1 draw that eliminated Angola. Feisal Salum's goal for Tanzania, which canceled out Ismael Gharbi's penalty, sent the

Taifa Stars to the last 16 as one of the six groups' best third-place finishers. Angola, which finished third in Group B, had been hoping for a favor from Tunisia to beat Tanzania and another from Nigeria, which complied by defeating Uganda 3-1. But Tanzania's goal proved the difference. Both Tanzania and Angola finished with two points and a goal difference of minus 1. Salum's goal meant the Taifa Stars had scored more in the group stage (Tanzania's three goals vs. Angola's two), meaning they go through to the next round. "I hope this will be a reminder to these players and the next generation of players on the potential of Tanzanian football," Taifa Stars coach Miguel Gamondi said.

ANDERSON BEATS VAN GERWEN TO REACH QUARTER-FINALS



Scotland's Gary Anderson got the better of long-standing rival Michael van Gerwen to reach the PDC World Championship quarter-finals. Having been part of the sport's elite for more than a decade, the pair's fourth-round tie was much anticipated and both players averaged more than 99 overall. Anderson, who lifted back-to-back world titles in 2015 and 2016, won the first two sets against 36-year-old Dutchman Van Gerwen - himself a three-time former champion and the third seed at this year's event. Although last year's runner-up pulled a set back, 55-year-old Anderson recovered to seal a 4-1 success and move into the last eight of the World Championship for the first time in four years. He will next face popular English debutant Justin Hood, who produced a finishing masterclass at eliminating 11th seed Josh Rock 4-0 during

the afternoon session. Meanwhile, world number two Luke Humphries and Dutch 10th seed Gian van Veen set up a blockbuster quarter-final on Thursday by winning their respective last-16 matches by a 4-1 scoreline. Unseeded Dutchman Kevin Doets averaged more than 111 to win the first set against England's Humphries, but was unable to maintain his exceptional start. The 2024 champion won 12 of the next 14 legs as he coasted to a comfortable victory with an overall average of 103.07. Humphries told Sky Sports: "I've felt like I've played well but I feel like that there's another level in me, which is important. If you're going to win this tournament, you have to have another level in you because that won't win you the World Championship. "Gian is a classy player. He's changed a lot, he's worked on his game and now he's a top player.

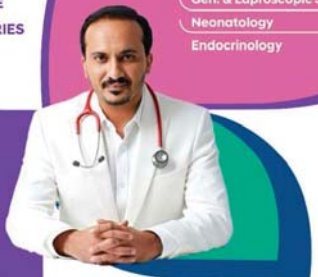
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
