### Mumbai's next mayor will be 'Hindu-Marathi' and from ruling Mahayuti: Fadnavis

MUMBAI: (Jan 2) As political campaigning heats up for the city's top civic post, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said on Friday that the next Mayor of Mumbai will come from the ruling alliance and will be "both Hindu and Marathi." His comments come as the push for the important Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) elections builds, with polling set for January 15 and results to be announced on January 16. "The Mumbai mayor will be from the Mahayuti (BJP-led ruling alliance). The Mumbai mayor will be a Hindu and a Marathi person," Fadnavis said, responding to a question. The issue had snowballed after Mumbai BJP president Ameet Satam recently remarked that his party would not allow any "Khan" to become the city's mayor, triggering sharp reactions from the Shiv Sena (UBT) and the Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS). After uniting with Sena (UBT) chief and his cousin Uddhav Thackeray recently, MNS president Raj Thackeray had declared that "Mumbai's mayor will be Marathi, and he will be ours".

### 200 parrots die of food poisoning in MP's Khargone district

KHARGONE: At least 200 parrots have died on the banks of the Narmada River in Madhya Pradesh's Khargone district due to food poisoning, officials said on Friday. The carcasses were found in the last four days near an aqueduct bridge on the riverbank in the Badwah area, and a post-mortem report has ruled out bird flu as the cause, they said. Some parrots were alive during rescue operations, but the toxicity of the food was so severe that they died shortly thereafter, District wildlife warden Tony Sharma said. The deaths triggered panic in the area after a suspected bird flu scare, but veterinary examinations found no trace of the infection. Forest department officials have banned feeding near the aqueduct bridge and deployed staff at the site for strict enforcement. Viscera samples from the birds were sent to Jabalpur for further examination, officials said. According to officials from the veterinary department, food poisoning and improper diet have caused the deaths.

### Interfering in India's matter, says BJP on Mamdani's note for Umar Khalid

New Delhi (TSIT): The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Friday, January 2, accused New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani of "interfering" in India's internal matter by writing a note on jailed activist Umar Khalid and asserted that India will not tolerate any such effort.Questioning Mamdani's locus standi of commenting on India's internal matters, BJP national spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia also cautioned the New York City Mayor against such efforts, asserting, "If India's sovereignty is challenged, 140-crore Indians will stand united under the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership."People of India

## Estimates for Musi River project to be ready March 31, says CM Revanth

Hyderabad (TSIT) : Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy announced on Friday that estimates for the prestigious Musi Rejuvenation Project will be finalised by March 31 this year, and the works will start by inviting tenders immediately. Speaking in the Assembly, he noted that the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has already agreed to provide a loan of Rs 4,000 crore for the Musi project.The Central government has also given its approval for the development of the Gandhi Sarovar under the Musi project. CM Revanth Reddy noted that Babu Ghat was constructed at the confluence of the Musi and Eesa rivers, where Mahatma Gandhi's ashes were immersed.

"Once the DPR (Detailed Project Report) is ready, we will give a PowerPoint presentation to all the MLAs and seek their suggestions," the Chief Minister said while making an intervention during the question hour. He stated that strict action had already taken on the pollution of Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar reservoirs through drainage from the farmhouses of the influential families. He said when the city was flooded in 1908, the Nizam

government constructed the Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar projects as a permanent solution to the flood problem. The two reservoirs are still quenching the thirst of the people of Hyderabad, the CM noted. He revealed that as part of the development of the Musi project, he and his Cabinet colleagues visited London (the Thames River), New York, Japan, South Korea, and Singapore.He said all

world-class cities have protected their river basins. After studying the development of global cities, the

government is preparing plans to ensure that clean water flows in the Musi River throughout the year. CM Revanth Reddy pointed out that in Gujarat, 60,000 families were relocated during the Sabarmati River cleanup. The Ganga River was also cleaned up, and a riverfront was developed in Uttar Pradesh. Stating that BJP leaders promoted these structures as a sign of development, the Chief Minister took exception to the opposition parties for obstructing the Music Project.

### Revanth spreading falsehood on Musi rejuvenation: KTR

Hyderabad (TSIT) : Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) working president K. T. Rama Rao on Friday accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of spreading falsehoods in the Assembly on the Musi River rejuvenation.

Rama Rao alleged that the Chief Minister is using the project as a cover for what he termed the "biggest corruption

conspiracy in Telangana's history."KTR, as the BRS leader is popularly known, said the Chief Minister had no vision whatsoever to cleanse the Musi and remarked that poison runs through every nerve of Revanth Reddy, driven by anger against those questioning his alleged illegal wealth and opposing the Musi project in its present form.

## Andhra captures 25.3 pc of all proposed investments in India

Amaravati, Jan 2 : Andhra Pradesh has firmly established itself as India's leading investment destination, capturing a remarkable 25.3 per cent of all proposed investments in the first nine months of the financial year 2025-26, according to a report by Bank of Baroda.

The state now stands well ahead of peers such as Odisha (13.1 per cent) and Maharashtra (12.8 per cent), signalling a decisive shift in India's industrial and investment momentum toward the eastern and southern corridors. The report highlights that over half of India's total proposed capital investment (51.2 per cent) is now concentrated in just three states - Andhra Pradesh,

Andhra Pradesh has firmly established itself as India's leading investment destination, capturing a remarkable 25.3 per cent of all proposed investments in the first nine months of the financial year 2025-26, according to a report by Bank of Baroda.

Odisha and Maharashtra - with Andhra Pradesh emerging as the clear frontrunner. Overall, investment announcements across the country during the first nine months of the current fiscal touched Rs 26.6 lakh crore, marking an 11.5 per cent increase compared to the same period last year. Commenting on this milestone on social media platform X, Minister for IT,

Electronics and Communications, Human Resources Development and RTG, Nara Lokesh, said, "Andhra Pradesh isn't catching up, it's pulling ahead. This is the result of consistent reforms, speed in decision-making and an unambiguous commitment to investors. Our focus has been clear, create a predictable policy environment, enable industry at scale and deliver on the ground."

## Centre constitutes committee to examine water disputes between Telangana & AP

New Delhi (TSIT): Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, on Friday notified the constitution of a high-level committee to examine and address issues related to the utilisation of river waters between the Telugu States of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

The decision follows discussions held under the framework of cooperative federalism, with the Centre extending continuous support over the past 11 years to resolve inter-State water disputes between the two States. The newly constituted committee will examine the issues from a technical perspective and facilitate their resolution.As part of its ongoing efforts, the Government of India had earlier notified additional terms of reference to the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II on October 6, 2023, to address the

Krishna river water dispute. Although the original two-year tenure concluded on August 1, 2025, the Tribunal's term was extended by one more year till July 31, 2026, as discussions on the utilisation of Krishna waters are still underway.Under Chapter IX, Section 84 of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, an Apex Council comprising the Union Minister for Jal Shakti and the Chief Ministers of Telangana and Andhra

Pradesh was constituted to resolve disputes related to Krishna and Godavari river waters. In this context, an Apex Council meeting was held in New Delhi on July 16, 2025, under the leadership of Union Jal Shakti Minister C. R. Patil, with the Chief Ministers of both States participating.

During the meeting, both Chief Ministers raised concerns over inter-State water disputes, following which it

was decided to form a joint technical committee comprising representatives of the Centre and both States. After receiving nominations from the Telangana Government on December 23, 2025, the Ministry of Jal Shakti formally notified the committee on Friday.The committee will be headed by the Chairperson of the Central Water Commission.Members from Telangana include the Advisor to the Water Resources (Irrigation) Department, the Principal Secretary (Irrigation), the Special Secretary to the Government, and the Engineer-in-Chief. Andhra Pradesh will be represented by the Special Secretary (Water Resources-Irrigation), Advisor (Irrigation), Engineer-in-Chief (Irrigation), and the Chief Engineer.

## Govt directs Elon Musk-led X to remove vulgar, unlawful content

New Delhi (TSIT) The government on Friday issued a stern notice to Elon Musk-led social media platform X to immediately remove all vulgar and unlawful content, especially generated by its AI app Grok or face action under the law.The Ministry of Electronics and IT has issued a notice to the Chief Compliance Officer for India operations of X for failure to observe statutory due diligence obligations under the Information Technology Act, 2000, and the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines

and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021. "...X is hereby directed to...remove or disable access, without delay, to all content

already generated or disseminated in violation of applicable laws, in strict compliance with the timelines prescribed under the IT

An action taken report has been sought for immediate compliance to prevent the hosting, generation, publication and transmission of obscene, indecent and sexually explicit content through the misuse of AI based services like 'Grok'

Rules, 2021, without vitiating the evidence in any manner," the order dated January 2 said.

The ministry has

sought an action taken report towards immediate compliance for the prevention of hosting, generation, publication, transmission, sharing

or uploading of obscene, nude, indecent and sexually explicit content through the misuse of AI-based services like 'Grok'. "It is reiterated that non-compliance with the...requirements shall be viewed seriously and may result in strict legal consequences against your platform, its responsible officers and the users on the platform who violate the law, without any further notice, under the IT Act, the IT Rules, the BNSS, the BNS and other applicable laws," the order said.

Kuppam: In connection with the Kangundi Bouldering Festival – 2026, scheduled to be held from January 6 to January 10, 2026, at Kangundi in Kuppam Mandal, Shri Vikas Marmat, IAS, Project Director of the Kuppam Area Development Authority (KADA), along with APSRTC Vice Chairman Shri P.S. Muniratham, inspected the festival arrangements. Mandal-level and divisional-level government officials also participated in the inspection.



During the review, the officials thoroughly assessed the selected venue for the festival, safety measures, transportation facil-

ities, drinking water supply, power arrangements, medical facilities, and other essential amenities. Instructions were issued to all departments to work in close coordination to ensure a smooth and hassle-free experience for tourists and visitors during the festival. The officials emphasized the importance of coordinated efforts to successfully conduct the event and promote adventure tourism in the region.

## House seeks continuation of Mahatma Gandhi NREGA in its present form

Hyderabad: The House on Tuesday adopted a resolution reaffirming its strong commitment to the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) and urging the Union Government to continue the scheme in its existing form, without diluting its core objectives and rights-based framework.

Recalling that the MGNREGA was introduced in 2005 by the UPA Government under the leadership of Dr. Manmohan Singh to provide livelihood security to rural poor, the resolution noted that the Act came into force on February 2, 2006, with the objective of addressing poverty, unemployment, distress migration, exploitation of unskilled labour, and wage inequality between men and women. The House observed that the scheme guarantees at least 100 days of wage employment per year to every rural household, ensuring

minimum wages and economic security. Over the past two decades, around 90 per cent of beneficiaries in the State have been from SC, ST, and BC communities, while women constitute nearly 62 per cent of the total workforce under the scheme. Dalits, tribals, persons with disabilities, particularly vulnerable tribal groups, landless labourers, and other marginalised sections have benefited the most. Expressing serious concern over the proposed “Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Aajeevika Mission (Rural) Act VBG RAMG 2025,” the House stated that the new legislation weakens the rights of the rural poor and undermines the spirit of the existing employment guarantee law. It noted that rural women and vulnerable communities, who largely depend on MGNREGA for livelihood security, would be adversely affected due to the absence of assured employment.

## Mahila Congress condemns rise of hate politics, calls for moral and inclusive leadership

Hyderabad: Telangana Pradesh Mahila Congress strongly condemned the growing normalisation of hate politics across South Asia, citing the killing of Khokon Chandra Das in Bangladesh as a serious warning sign. Vice President Dr. Rekha Goud Boyalapalli said moral leadership and the claim of being a “Vishwaguru” cannot coexist with exclusion, violence, and majoritarian rhetoric. She stressed that true global leadership must be rooted in secularism, justice, and constitutional values, and urged India to reject hate-based politics, strengthen institutions, and uphold inclusion to protect minorities and democratic principles.

## Biodiversity authority releases Rs 45 lakh for Red Sanders growers in Andhra

New Delhi, Jan 2 : The National Biodiversity Authority (NBA) has continued its series of Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) disbursements with the release of Rs 45 lakh (around \$50,000) to Red Sanders cultivators in Andhra Pradesh through the State Biodiversity Board, an official said on Friday.



With this disbursement, India's cumulative ABS releases have now exceeded Rs 143.5 crore (approximately \$16 million), the official from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change said.

The initiative underscores the economic opportunity available to Red Sanders cultivators, who derive dual income benefits -- first, through the lawful sale of cultivated Red Sanders wood and logs, and second, through monetary benefits under the ABS mechanism mandated by the Biological Diversity Act, 2002.

So far, the NBA has released over Rs 104 crore (around \$11.5 million) to Andhra Pradesh towards Red Sanders conservation, protection and benefit claimers, and more than Rs 15 crore (about \$1.66 million) to other states, including Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Odisha and Telangana.

In the last three months alone, the NBA released ABS funds amounting to Rs 5.35 crore to over 220 Red Sanders farmers from Andhra Pradesh,

Tamil Nadu and Telangana.

The NBA's ABS framework not only ensures fair and equitable sharing of benefits but also actively promotes sustainable utilisation practices, discouraging illegal trade and over-exploitation, the statement said.

By linking conservation outcomes with tangible bio-economic returns, the ABS framework has transformed Red Sanders from a strictly protected species into a livelihood-supporting asset for farming communities.

## Kavitha reacts strongly to Revanth Reddy's 'KCR deserves hanging' remark

Hyderabad, Jan 2 : Reacting strongly to Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's remark that it would not be wrong even if his predecessor K. Chandrasekhara Reddy (KCR) is hanged for the "injustice" caused to the State in utilisation of river waters, Telangana Jagruthi leader and Rao's daughter K. Kavitha said on Friday that Revanth Reddy should be hanged twice.

Kavitha took strong exception to Chief Minister Reddy's remark. She said that her blood is boiling to hear that the leader who led the Telangana movement should be hanged. "Revanth Reddy should be hanged not once but twice," she said. She said this while talking to reporters on the premises of the Telangana Legislative Council.



Kavitha said KCR should speak in the Assembly on the Krishna river water issue to shut the mouths of the Chief Minister and his ministers who are criticising him. She said that for BRS to survive, KCR should come to the Assembly and speak. She feels that

Kavitha said he came to the Council to request Chairman G. Sukhender Reddy to accept her resignation. Kavitha had submitted her resignation as a Member of the Legislative Council in September. Her action came after KCR suspended her from BRS for "anti-par-

ty" activities.

Following her suspension, she also resigned from the party and has been carrying on her political activities under Telangana Jagruthi, a cultural organisation she had floated during the Telangana movement.

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy had said on Thursday that it would not be wrong if KCR and his nephew Harish Rao were hanged for the injustices caused to Telangana in the utilisation of river waters during the BRS regime. The Chief Minister made the remarks at a PowerPoint presentation made by Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy to the ruling Congress leaders on river water issues on Thursday evening.

## Rare Pancreatic Tumor Successfully Removed at KIMS Kondapur

Hyderabad, 02 January, 2026: A 55-year-old woman from Mauritius was experiencing sudden and severe drops in blood sugar levels. # Contaminated water claims life of 6-month-old in Indore, family rejects compensation

Indore, Jan 2: A six-month-old child, born after 10 years of prayers and vows, died after allegedly consuming contaminated water in Madhya Pradesh's Indore, in an outbreak that has claimed at least seven lives, plunging families in the area into deep grief. An eerie silence prevails in the Marathi Mohalla of Bhagirathpura, where baby Avyan Sahu lived with his family. A simple act of diluting packaged milk with water from a municipal tap reportedly proved fatal for the infant, who died on December 29. The state government has announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh each for fami-

Avyan's family said they have refused the compensation. "We have not taken any compensation from the state government so far. Our child is gone. Will money bring him back? Money is not greater than a child," Avyan's grandmother, Krishna Sahu told PTI.

She said Avyan was born after a decade of fervent prayers and vows made by the family. "We prayed for years and made a vow at Hussain Tekri Dargah. My prayers were answered, but I never imagined that the baby would leave us so soon," she said, breaking down.

According to the family, the child was healthy



and weighed around five kilograms. “He used to play in his mother’s lap.

One day, he suddenly developed diarrhoea. We started medicines on a

doctor's advice, but his condition worsened and he was taken to hospital, where doctors declared him dead," Sahu said.

Due to insufficient breast milk, the infant was fed packaged milk and milk powder mixed with tap water. The family alleged that contaminated water was the cause of his death.

Residents of Bhagirathpura claimed that around 15 people have died over the past year due to vomiting and diarrhoea linked to contaminated drinking water, with Aryan being the youngest victim. However, the health department said only four deaths were officially recorded in

the outbreak. Neighbour Anita Sen said the tragedy has left families terrified. "There is a one-month-old girl, a four-year-old child and a 10-year-old girl in my house. The government must ensure that no mother loses her child due to contaminated water," she said.

New Delhi, Jan 2: Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) national president Abhay Singh Chautala has stirred controversy by suggesting that India should witness movements similar to recent youth-led protests that toppled governments in Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, and Nepal. In a widely circulated video,

Chautala said, "In Sri Lanka, the way the youth of Bangladesh forced the government to leave the country, the way the youth of Nepal forced the government to leave the country, the same tactics will have to be implemented in India too to throw the present government out of power."

## UP teen kills neighbour in self-defence during assault bid

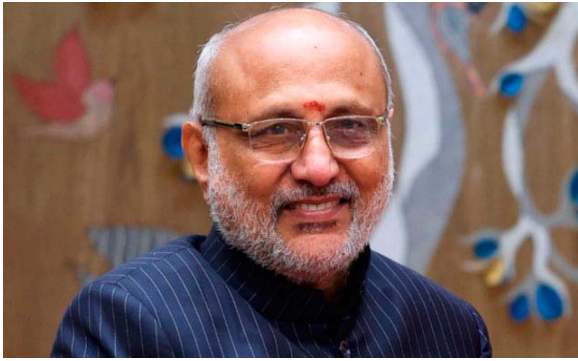
Banda, Jan 2: In a tragic New Year incident, an 18-year-old girl in Uttar Pradesh's Banda allegedly killed her neighbour while trying to protect herself from an attempted sexual assault, police said. The incident occurred when the man, a 45-year-old farmer, allegedly entered the girl's house in an intoxicated condition and tried to assault her. The girl was alone at home at the time. In an act of self-defence, she allegedly attacked him with an axe, resulting in his death. Police said the girl later reached a nearby police outpost and surrendered. Acting on the information, police rushed to the spot, recovered the body and took it into custody for further



legal formalities. The girl was subsequently arrested. Superintendent of Police Palash Agarwal said evidence collected so far indicated that the incident appeared to be an act of self-defence. He added that all available evidence would be placed before the court, which would take a final decision in the matter.

During the preliminary inquiry, police found that the farmer frequently visited the girl's house to meet her mother.

## Vice president C P Radhakrishnan on two-day Tamil Nadu visit; to attend convocation, cultural events



Chennai, Jan 2: Vice President C P Radhakrishnan will be on a two-day visit to Tamil Nadu beginning today, during which he will participate in a series of academic, cultural and public programmes in Chennai and Vellore. During his visit to Chennai, all arrangements have

been made for the convocation ceremony of Dr MGR Educational and Research Institute University, where the Vice President will deliver the convocation address. Graduands from various disciplines will be awarded their degree certificates at the ceremony. Later in the day,

Radhakrishnan will attend the Ram Nath Goenka Sahitya Samman ceremony in the city. He is also scheduled to grace a public reception at Kalaivanar Arangan and attend a civic reception hosted by the Tamil Nadu Governor at Chennai Lok Bhavan.

On the second day of his visit, the Vice President will travel to Vellore to attend a function there. He will also participate in the 9th Siddha Day celebration to be held in Chennai.

The visit is expected to highlight the Vice President's engagement with education, literature, traditional medicine and public outreach in the state.

## Cong worker's death: Karnataka BJP says govt targeting Janardhana Reddy, demands probe by High Court judge

Ballari (Karnataka), Jan 2 : Responding to the incidents of violence resulting in the murder of a Congress worker in Ballari, the Karnataka BJP on Friday accused the state government of targeting mining baron and BJP MLA Janardhana Reddy and demanded a probe by a sitting High Court judge regarding the shoot-out.

It may be recalled that supporters of MLAs Janardhana Reddy and Bharat Reddy clashed over the installation of banners to celebrate Valmiki Jayanti in front of Janardhana Reddy's residence on Thursday night. Janardhana Reddy's supporters opposed the installation of the banners, resulting in a quarrel that escalated into



stone pelting, lathi charge, and firing by both police and private gunmen. In the ensuing chaos, Congress worker Rajashekar sus-

ained a bullet injury and later died. Karnataka BJP State President B.Y. Vijayendra alleged, "The incident that occurred yesterday in front of MLA Janardhana Reddy's residence in Ballari is a government-sponsored, premeditated act carried out by Congress goons, and I strongly condemn it."

"I urge that adequate security be provided immediately to MLA Janardhana Reddy, former minister Sriramulu, and other key leaders of our party. I also demand that a commission be constituted under the leadership of a sitting High Court judge to investigate the incident," he demanded.

"Under the pretext of installing banners for the inauguration of the

Maharshi Valmiki statue, this incident was carried out by targeting Janardhana Reddy and his family. Democracy no longer exists in Ballari. With the connivance of the local MLA, his supporters appear to have resorted to criminal acts with the intent of disturbing the peaceful life of civil society and turning the city into one gripped by fear," he claimed. "After Janardhana Reddy rejoined the BJP, the strengthening of party organisation at the local level, and the renewed bonding between Janardhana Reddy and former Deputy CM Sriramuluru as in the past, has become intolerable for political miscreants," he said. "Ironically, local police stations have turned into offices of Karnataka Congress party. The local police have become handmaidens of the Congress, and had they taken preventive measures, this criminal act could have been prevented," Vijayendra slammed.

## Treat gig workers as human beings, not disposable data points: Raghav Chadha

New Delhi, Jan 2 : Gig workers must be treated as human beings, and not just disposable data points, said Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Rajya Sabha MP Ravagh Chadha on Friday. Chadha had extended strong support to gig workers across the country who observed a nationwide symbolic strike on New Year's Eve, demanding fair wages, better working conditions and social security from major delivery and e-commerce platforms. "I sat down with delivery riders of Zomato, Swiggy, Blinkit etc. This is not a rant. This is a conversation with those whose lives power our everyday comfort," the AAP MP shared in a post on social media platform.

The nationwide strike, called jointly by the Telangana Giga and Platform Workers Union (TGPWU) and the Indian Federation of App-Based Transport Workers (IFAT), saw thousands of delivery partners across several states log off their apps or reduce work significantly. The protest impacted services on one of the busiest commercial days of the year, with reports of delays and cancellations in multiple cities. "It's tragic that millions of delivery riders who helped build instant-commerce companies into what they are today.

# EDITORIAL

## 'Hijab' Policing, Work Diktats: How 'New' Bangladesh Is Failing Its Women

Early in 2024, I had met X, a lawyer from Bangladesh. Suave, articulate and glamorous, she was in Kolkata and planning to host with others a World Bengali Congress. She was despondent about how things were panning out politically in Bangladesh. Corruption, nepotism, and stagnation were what defined the days under Sheikh Hasina for her. We need change, she moaned. But even so, the Bangladesh National Party (BNP) was no alternative. Allied to the Jamaat-i-Islami Bangladesh, the BNP could not usher in the progressive change that Bangladesh needed, she said - it would be a regressive rule, anti-women and anti-minority. Moreover, X had other concerns - she had filed cases against members of the Jamaat for some of their anti-national, anti-women activities. Bangladesh, thus, she said, needed a third alternative. Though she was on Jamaat's hitlist, she continued to live and work in Dhaka. A few months later, in August, a 'third' alternative did emerge in the form of the interim government led by Nobel peace laureate Mohammed Yunus. This wasn't really what many had envisioned, but still, it brought hope for a new dawn in Bangladesh. Just months later, fearing for her life, X quietly left Bangladesh for safer shores abroad.

X's flight is a good barometer to gauge the change ushered in by the "revolution" that brought down Hasina's government. The initial days of chaos and violence were a matter of course for any spontaneous uprising against a creaking authoritarianism. In the ensuing months, however, matters got only worse. The Yunus-led government didn't just allow the genie of religious radicalism out of the bottle - it actively abetted it.

Sheikh Hasina had at least kept the lid on groups like Jamaat so that those like X could challenge them legally; the Yunus government, on the other hand, has freed all criminals and violators connected to the Jamaat from Bangladesh's prisons. It has also lifted the ban on the outfit and allowed sundry radical groups to flock to Bangladesh from around the globe, fuelled by funds and logistical support from powerful countries. Worse, he has allowed the Jamaat to be listed as a political party, which is now set to contest the elections as Bangladesh's largest party in the absence of the Awami League. Women have been one of the first casualties. Rokeya Prachi, a three-time National Award-winning actress, rues that Bangladesh is fast turning into what Afghanistan was earlier. Speaking over the phone from an undisclosed location, she tells me life has become unbearable for women there. Vigilant mobs roam the streets, enforcing dress codes upon women; those without a burqa or hijab are regularly targeted. Sexual violence against women, especially those even remotely connected to the Awami League, has become routine. Most concerning is the fact that such acts are now being video recorded and aired, she says. An Awami League card-carrying member, Prachi herself was physically assaulted when she went to pay respects to the late Sheikh Mujibur Rehman, the country's founding father, on his martyrdom day on August 15, 2024. Other women there were also harassed. Prachi has since gone underground, as have many others associated with the Awami League. No cases have been filed against the assaulters, no arrests made, she says. Such moral policing is not restricted to only women connected with the Awami League. Even civilians have started bearing the brunt of radicalism. In March this year, a female student at Dhaka University was harassed by a university employee for her "inappropriate" clothing. The employee was arrested but later released because of protests mounted by a group calling itself the 'Towhidi Janata', an ally of the Jamaat.

# WHEN HOLLYWOOD PATRIOTISM WINS OSCARS, BUT INDIAN FILMS GET CALLED 'PROPAGANDA'

Captain America charges into battle, shield raised high, the living embodiment of American moral superiority. Audiences worldwide erupt in cheers as he single-handedly defeats threats to freedom, his stars-and-stripes heroism never once questioned. The Mission Impossible franchise turns Tom Cruise into an invincible CIA saviour who routinely thwarts global catastrophes, preserving the American-led world order. The James Bond series, though British, has long served as an extension of Western triumphalism - licensed to kill in defence of empire and alliance, always emerging victorious with wit, gadgets, and unshakeable confidence. These icons of cinematic nationalism pack theatres, shatter box-office records, and collect awards. Hollywood and its allies sell superpower exceptionalism without apology, and the world applauds. This pattern stretches back decades. In an era when America was the undisputed superpower, films like the original Top Gun ignited a wave of patriotic fervour, turning naval pilots into rock stars and recruitment numbers skyward. Today, even amid national divisions, international scrutiny, and a palpable sense of decline in American exceptionalism, Hollywood persists in rallying audiences with tales of resilience. Oppenheimer (2023) portrays the atomic bomb's creation as a grim but necessary American genius, earning widespread acclaim and multiple Oscars. The biopic Reagan (2024) casts the former president as a steadfast Cold War hero. And Top Gun: Maverick (2022), still echoing in box office records, delivers pure adrenaline-fueled Americana. Acclaimed works like Zero Dark Thirty (2012) and Argo (2012) further elevated the myth of superpower America, depicting intelligence operatives as unflinching saviours who hunt terrorists and orchestrate daring rescues, affirming US dominance on the global stage. These films, showered with laurels including Oscars and critical praise from around the world, present American interventions as heroic



necessities. Take Top Gun: Maverick. Director Joseph Kosinski and star Tom Cruise craft a sequel that feels timeless. The aerial sequences are breathtaking, placing you right in the cockpit as pilots defy gravity and enemy fire. Cruise, older but undimmed, reprises Pete "Maverick" Mitchell with that signature cocky grin. He pushes experimental jets to impossible speeds, trains a new generation for a high-stakes mission, and leads them to victory. It is visceral filmmaking: the roar of engines, the strain of G-forces, the thrill of survival. You leave the theatre believing, once again, in American ingenuity and bravery. This is part of a grand Hollywood legacy, alongside films like American Sniper, Saving Private Ryan, and Independence Day. They present America as the guardian of freedom, the force that upholds order. The patriotism is never interrogated on a grand scale; it is embraced as entertainment of the highest calibre. Yet, a revealing double standard emerges when we turn to Indian cinema. Films like Argo, Oppenheimer, and Zero Dark Thirty - which glorify American intelligence triumphs, often glossing over moral complexities or historical controversies - are rewarded with laurels, including enthusiastic

praise from Indian critics who celebrate their technical brilliance and narrative drive. In contrast, a home-grown effort like Dhurandhar raises hackles among the same circles. They dismiss it as propaganda while framing Kashmir terrorism as a "secessionist struggle" - a euphemism that itself softens brutal reality. This selective outrage highlights how depictions of American supremacy are met with admiration, while assertions of Indian resolve provoke discomfort. India can, and should, aspire to the same unapologetic storytelling. Dhurandhar (2025), directed by Aditya Dhar, arrives as a bold entry in this vein. Released on December 5, 2025, this spy thriller stars Ranveer Singh as a deep-cover operative infiltrating hostile networks in Karachi's underworld, drawing inspiration from real events like the IC-814 hijacking, Parliament attack, and 26/11 Mumbai attacks. It plunges into the shadowy world of espionage, gang wars, and terror financing with unflinching intensity. Clocking in at over three hours, the film has become a massive cultural and commercial phenomenon, grossing over ₹1,000 crore worldwide and emerging as the highest-grossing Indian film of 2025. What makes

Dhurandhar succeed so powerfully is its refusal to sugarcoat reality. It confronts the brutal truths of intelligence work, the moral ambiguities, the graphic violence of terror networks, and the high costs of national security, all rendered with high-calibre technical virtuosity. The set pieces are masterful - grounded yet explosive action sequences, immersive world-building in Karachi's Lyari gangs, and a pounding score that heightens every tense moment. The ensemble, including Akshaye Khanna, Sanjay Dutt, R. Madhavan, and Arjun Rampal, delivers layered performances amid relentless pacing. This is India's Zero Dark Thirty: a gritty, propulsive portrait of covert heroism that honours sacrifice without glossing over the darkness, blending fiction with historical inspiration to create a compelling national narrative. Such films are essential. They unite a vast, diverse nation, instilling pride and cohesion in challenging times. They showcase India's strength, ingenuity, and resolve to global audiences, countering outdated narratives and fostering a sense of shared identity. Just as Hollywood's patriotism is acclaimed without question, India's cinematic assertions of resilience and strategic depth deserve the same celebration.

# NATURE OF RELIGION: SERVICE OR SELFISHNESS?

They evolve through experience and knowledge passed down from generation to generation. However, traditions are only useful as long as they are in keeping with the times, wisdom, and humanity. Accepting traditions as set in stone hinders social progress. Today, there is a need to reconsider traditions—to understand their purpose and their relevance in the present. Service has been an important aspect of religion. Service means selflessly helping others. However, when a price is attached to that service, its nature changes. Charity is only considered charitable when it is given voluntarily. When it is given out of pressure, fear, or social prestige, it loses its sanctity. Unfortunately, today, charity is being levied as a compulsory fee in many places. This situation affects ordinary and emotional people the most. In times of grief, sorrow, or crisis, a person is mentally vulnerable. Exploiting their faith during such times is not only immoral but also inhumane. The purpose of religion is to protect humanity from breakdown, not to burden it further. The greatest danger of hypocrisy is that it gradually breeds distrust of religion. When people are repeatedly deceived and their emotions exploited, they either turn away from religion or begin to view every tradition with suspicion. This situation is detrimental to society, as a healthy form of religion plays a vital role in maintaining social balance. In today's educated and aware society, it is expected that individuals should test everything through logic and reason. Faith and reason are not in conflict. True faith is that which is in harmony with reason. If a tradi-

tion goes against humanity, morality, and compassion, changing it should be considered a righteous step. The role of religious institutions and those involved in religion is also crucial. They must understand that their responsibility extends beyond simply performing rituals, but also guiding society in the right direction. If religious leadership itself is driven by greed and self-interest, it is futile to expect morality from the public. The need of the hour is to transform religion into a medium of service, not a business. Society's responsibility is no less. Hypocrisy will never end until people become self-aware. Asking questions isn't unrighteous. Understanding and reflecting on the purpose of every tradition is a sign of intellectual maturity. Blindly accepting everything is neither faith nor religion. The role of the media and educational institutions is also crucial in this context. A balanced, rational, and sensitive discussion of religious issues will increase social awareness. The purpose of education is not just employment, but also the creation of rational citizens—citizens who can distinguish between faith and superstition. Today, we need to strive to return religion to its original form. A religion that offers peace, not fear; one that protects, not exploits; and one that preaches unity, not division. Faith must be transformed into a strength of the soul, not a means to self-interest. Ultimately, it's clear that the future of religion depends more on our thinking than on traditions. If we base our faith on conscience, compassion, and self-respect, hypocrisy will begin to disappear. True religion is one that transforms humans into better human beings. This is the greatest need and the greatest religion in today's times.

# How Mamata Banerjee Is Banking On 'Bengali Hinduism' To Counter BJP

At every rally and public event, Mamata Banerjee states that she does not practise appeasement of any particular religion and that her politics is secular. A few days ago, however, the West Bengal government announced it would build a Durga temple in New Town, Kolkata, where Mamata laid the foundation stone for the project. The project is called 'Durga Angan', and the invitation card for the inauguration ceremony was issued on behalf of the state government. The letter noted that West Bengal's traditional Durga Puja was recognised by UNESCO in 2021 as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity, and that the Durga Angan project was meant to preserve that tradition. During the ceremony, Mamata placed a red sari and a white dhoti at the site. The explanation offered was symbolic: Durga is where Shiva is, and Shiva is where Durga is - the merger of 'Gauri' and 'Hara'. Mamata also announced plans to build a Mahakal Shiva temple in North Bengal. The BJP leadership views these actions as a response to political pressure and to ease the perception that the Trinamool Congress engages in Muslim appeasement. Union Home Minister Amit Shah says that while building a Durga temple is not a problem and is, in fact, a good thing, Mamata's actions have come too late and may be seen as inauthentic. But what's behind this shift in Mamata's politics? It is undeniable that Hindutva has been central to the BJP's politics. With the BJP in power in most states, it has been able to spread its Hindutva agenda nationwide. To counter this, parties have had to take their own respective routes. Images of Rahul Gandhi wearing the sacred thread and taking a dip in the Ganga aren't a surprise anymore. Earlier, Rajiv Gandhi had sent Buta Singh to Ayodhya. Kejriwal, too, frequently visits temples before elections. However, the fact is that often, when opposition parties adopt Hindutva to counter the BJP, they often end up appearing like its B-



team. Mamata's case, however, is shaped by the distinct nature of Bengali Hinduism. For instance, Bengali Hindus are largely non-vegetarian, with fish considered auspicious in their culture. In several temples, fish offerings are still common. Shakta traditions are deeply influential. Bengalis are culturally pluralistic, shaped by both Aryan and non-Aryan influences. The Hinduism of Ramakrishna Paramahansa and Swami Vivekananda reflects this difference. Mamata Banerjee's composite cultural identity is also rooted in this Bengali tradition. Mamata never really foregrounded her religious identity in the past. Yet, like many Bengali Hindu women, she has always been personally devout. What has changed now is the public display of her religiosity. This approach helped her against the BJP in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. What will happen in 2026 remains to be seen. Mamata has also built a political narrative positioning Modi and Amit Shah as outsiders from Delhi, framing their presence as an attempt by an 'external' power to take control of Bengal. By saying "they are not Bengalis", Mamata isn't referring only to ethnic Bengalis but also Gujaratis,

Marwaris, Maharashtrians and Hindi-speaking residents. Linguist Suniti Kumar Chattopadhyay explained extensively how the Bengali identity is rooted in language. It is this collective Bengali identity that Mamata is trying to tap to take on Delhi. As an opposition leader, Mamata is also positioning the election as a direct contest between herself and Modi, rather than between the West Bengal BJP and the Trinamool Congress. While the BJP relies on Modi's brand, Mamata is banking on her radical anti-Centre politics. There is no single axis to this election. The BJP, meanwhile, is looking towards new political formations to split the Muslim vote. It hopes that Humayun Kabir's party will make gains in North Bengal and that the ISF will weaken Mamata in the South. With Murshidabad's 21 seats and Malda's 10, these districts are key targets. Owaisi, too, is attempting to dent Mamata's Muslim support. In any case, many Muslim leaders have begun feeling that Mamata is overperforming Hindu religiosity and neglecting Muslim concerns. Mamata, however, counters this by warning Muslims that such fragmentation will only help the BJP.

K'taka CM says bullet fired into air accidentally hit Cong worker; probe on

Bengaluru/Ballari, Jan 2 : Commenting on the death of a Congress party worker during a violent clash between the groups of Congress MLA Nara Bharat Reddy and BJP MLA Janardhana Reddy in Karnataka's Ballari city, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said that a bullet fired into the air had accidentally hit the man. Speaking to reporters in Bengaluru on Friday, Siddaramaiah said, “There was a conflict over a banner issue. Shots were fired into the air. One of the bullets fired in the air hit Rajashekar, leading to his death. It has to be ascertained from which revolver the bullet was fired. Hence, I have ordered an investigation and sought a report in this regard.” “It has to be determined whether the bullet was fired from the revolver of a Congress



leader or a BJP leader. A probe has been ordered,” the Chief Minister said. According to sources, CM Siddaramaiah expressed his displeasure over the turn of events and refused to speak to MLA Bharat Reddy when other leaders attempted to connect him over the phone. The Chief Minister reportedly

said he would not speak to him. He later spoke to former Minister B. Nagendra and asked Kampli MLA Ganesh to visit the spot. ADGP (Law and Order) R. Hitendra, speaking in Ballari, said, “We have seized guns from private gunmen. A total of five guns have been seized

from both sides. The police used only tear gas to control the mob. We have recovered bullets from the spot and are investigating.” “The dispute over the installation of a banner resulted in a clash between two groups. Four separate cases have been registered in connection with the incident, including a suo motu case by the police. One complaint pertains to the death of the Congress worker. Another complaint has been registered alleging insult to Maharshi Valmiki, and a case has also been filed under Section 307.” ADGP Hitendra said. Minister for Housing and Waqf Zameer Ahmad Khan, who is also the Ballari district in-charge minister, said the Chief Minister has expressed his displeasure over the incident and assured that action will be taken against whoever is responsible. “The

quarrel began over a small issue and ended with the death of an innocent man. It is wrong to allege that certain leaders were targeted. I am also going to Ballari,” he said. Ballari city MLA Nara Bharat Reddy and other MLAs visited the residence of the deceased Congress worker and took part in the final procession and last rites. MLA Bharat Reddy said he would not make any comments until the final rites were completed. “Rajashekar was like my brother. He is no more, and we are in grief,” he said.Tension escalated in Karnataka's Ballari district after a Congress worker was shot dead on Thursday night. Police said the bullet was fired from a private revolver, though they had earlier stated that it was not clear who fired the fatal shot.

Bharat Reddy not afraid of hooliganism: Sriramulu

Bellary: BJP leader and former minister B. Sriramulu has demanded legal action against the people who fired shots at a firing incident in the city on Thursday night. Speaking at a joint press conference with MLA Janardhana Reddy at his residence in the city, he said, “They have come to attack us by shooting at them. Police fired and in the air, Satish Reddy's gunmen fired like in a movie. 0.76 bullets were found. This confirms that they fired from the outside. Many of our supporters were injured in stone pelt-ing. They were treated in the hospital and sent. It is recorded that Satish Reddy fired with eight gunmen like in Bihar. They said that the bullet found in the body of the deceased should be investi-

gated and they had come to throw petrol bombs. MLA Bharat Reddy said that he would burn the house. He alleged that it looked like he had come pre-arranged for that. We have no objection: We have no objection to the unveiling of the statue of Maharshi Valmiki. It is our wish that it should happen. He said, "Don't use Valmiki or caste, we will also help in the ceremony." He said, "It's not like they are behaving without culture. No provocation, no show of force. Whoever came to our houses and created a ruckus, let them investigate." I didn't do anything wrong, I didn't do it. The police protected us. I didn't

get the land for the expectation. It's Bharat Reddy's business to disturb Janardhana Reddy, he complained. Do you want to do all this for the unveiling of the statue? People know what Ramulu Valmiki did to the community. All I request from them is that you should grow politically. Don't speed, if you speed up, accidents will happen." He said, "I have informed the party's state and national leaders about the incident." They came to our houses and created a ruckus. Poor air quality: Karnataka flags Bengaluru, Hubballi-Dharwad, Kalaburagi, Davanagere

Bengaluru, Jan 2: Four major cities in Karnataka—Bengaluru, Hubballi-Dharwad, Kalaburagi, and Davanagere—have been classified as ‘non-attainment’ under the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) for failing to meet prescribed air quality standards, raising alarms over public health and environmental safety. Bengaluru, grappling with worsening air pollution, has deployed 12 mobile smoke-measuring vehicles, six of which are operational in the city. Equipped with sophisticated instruments, these units, in coordination with the transport department, Police, BMTC and KSRTC, conduct

joint operations targeting vehicles emitting smoke beyond legal limits. Officials confirmed that violators are being dealt with strictly under the law. Under the NCAP, Karnataka operates 43 manual air quality monitoring stations and 39 continuous ambient air quality monitoring stations. These stations track pollutants including sulphur dioxide (SO2), nitrogen dioxide (NO2), particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5), carbon monoxide (CO), ozone (O3), ammonia (NH3) and benzene. Data from manual stations is collected twice weekly over 24 hours, while continuous stations operate round the clock.

GRAAM survey appears to be pleasing / supporting the Election Commission of India, while questioning its intent and political use

Bengaluru: Mysuru-based NGO GRAAM (Grassroots Research and Advocacy Movement) released a survey claiming 85% of people in Karnataka have accepted the EVM system. B.K.Hariprasad and Ramesh Babu General Secretary - A I C C Chairman-KPCC Media & Communication released press statement that, There survey was conducted under the aegis of Karnataka Monitoring and Evaluation Authority (KMEA) and linked to the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) machinery. Though projected as an independent civil society survey, it was institutionally connected to the election administration framework. Key Claims Made by the Survey: 83–85% respondents trust EVMs. 90% respondents believe elections are free and fair. The survey highlights confidence in the Election Commission's

conduct. Media headlines selectively focused only on “public trust in EVMs”, ignoring other electoral malpractices. Why the Report Appears to Please the Election Commission of India survey Framing is Pro-ECI: Questions are framed around belief and perception, not verifiable audit, transparency, or accountability. No serious probing on: EVM malfunction complaints, VVPAT mismatch concerns, Demand for 100% VVPAT counting This conveniently supports the ECI's longstanding position that EVMs are beyond doubt. Timing Raises Serious Questions: The survey was publicized amid national debate on EVM credibility. Comes at a time when, Opposition parties are raising concerns on electoral integrity, Courts are hearing petitions on EVM-VVPAT verifica-

tion. The timing makes it appear like a defensive narrative-building exercise for ECI. GRAAM is founded by R Balasubramaniam who is member of Modi's think tank and has written a Modimala. Selective Highlighting of Findings: While the survey reportedly notes: Influence of money power inducements and misuse of schemes, These findings were downplayed, while EVM acceptance was amplified. This selective projection serves ECI's image management, not electoral reform. Methodological and Democratic Concerns: Survey commissioned through government-linked agencies, not an independent constitutional or judicial body. Sample size (5,100 respondents) is small compared to Karnataka's massive electorate. Urban, educated, first-time voters and marginalised voices may not

be adequately represented. Public “trust” is treated as a substitute for institutional transparency, which is dangerous in a democracy. Contradiction with Ground Reality: Despite this survey, Karnataka Government itself has recommended ballot papers for local body elections, citing erosion of confidence. If EVM trust is truly so high, why is the state seeking ballot papers? This contradiction exposes the artificial optimism of the survey conclusions. The GRAAM survey does not strengthen democracy, does not address transparency concerns, functions as a perception-management report, It helps the Election Commission defend itself, instead of encouraging reforms. Democracy does not survive on manufactured consent or perception surveys.

## Sensex opens 227 points higher, Nifty above 26,000; Tata Steel up 3%

Benchmark stock market indices opened higher on the last trading day of 2025, as metal stocks rallied after India imposed a 3-year import tariff of 11–12% on select steel products, a move aimed largely at checking a surge in shipments from China.  
The S&P BSE Sensex was up 185.43 points to 84,860.51, while the NSE Nifty50 added 76.75 points to 26,015.60 as of 9:29 am.Dr. VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Investments Limited, said that the market has the potential for a directional move upwards but is being weighed down by sustained FII selling and absence of fresh triggers like positive news on the US-India trade front."The coming days are going to be eventful, starting with the auto sales data for December, Q3 corporate results, expectations from the budget and other news relating to global economy like the possible Fed action in 2026," he added.Tata Steel led the gainers, rising 2.13%, followed by Titan Company, which was up 0.97%. Bharat Electronics gained 0.88%, Axis Bank moved higher by 0.76%, and Hindustan Unilever added 0.71%, supporting the index in early trade.  
Bajaj Finserv was the biggest laggard, falling 1.06%. Tata Consultancy Services slipped 0.51%, Bajaj Finance declined 0.45%, Tech Mahindra was down 0.45%, and Mahindra and Mahindra lost 0.40%.The Q3 results have to be watched carefully for indications of uptick in earnings. This is significant since there is lot of hope that there will be a rebound in earnings, going forward," said Vijaykumar.  
"Earnings growth will be the single most important factor determining the market trend in 2026. The FII flows in 2026, too, will depend on the earnings performance and expectations surrounding that," he added.

## Retail rush and SIPs drive Rs 14 lakh crore jump in mutual fund assets in 2025

**New Delhi.(Agency)**  
Mutual fund industry extended its bull run in 2025, adding a staggering Rs 14 lakh crore to its asset base and pushing total AUM to a record Rs 81 lakh crore by November, powered by surge in retail participation and record SIP inflows.  
Venkat Chalasani, Chief Executive Officer of AMFI, told PTI that the industry's outlook remains positive, with steady SIP inflows continuing to offset foreign portfolio investor outflows and strengthening market resilience.Going ahead, fund flows are likely to be guided by valuations and global developments, with investors increasingly favouring large-cap, diversified and hybrid strategies, he added.  
The year 2025 also witnessed a robust net inflow of Rs 7 lakh crore, along with a sharp increase of 3.36 crore in the investor base, while SIPs alone contributed about Rs 3 lakh crore, according to data from Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI).  
These inflows lifted the industry's assets under management (AUM) by 21 per cent from Rs 67 lakh crore at the end of 2024 to Rs 81 lakh crore by November-end.While the pace of growth was lower than the 31 per cent rise recorded in 2024 and the 27 per cent increase in 2023, the longer-term trend remains strong. The industry had posted a 7 per cent growth in 2022 and nearly 22 per cent in 2021, and has collectively added Rs 50 lakh crore to its asset base over the last five years.

## Long-term policy support key to meeting India's renewable energy goals, say experts

Long-term policy frameworks, particularly for hybrid renewables energy, along with a thrust on adoption of technologies and incentive-driven manufacturing, will help the country meet its renewable energy goals, experts said.Experts also believed decarbonisation will continue to be a priority for the industry.Sharing his views, Piyush Goyal, CEO and Co-founder of Volks Energie, said there are certain areas which are essential not only for meeting



climate commitments, but also for powering India's industrial growth, enhancing energy security, and ensuring affordable electricity for consumers.  
"Accelerating grid upgrades and storage adoption must be treated as national priorities as India's future energy mix depends on both. Further, incentivising domestic manufacturing of inverters, batteries, and critical components will reduce import dependencies and build supply-chain resilience," Goyal said.Manish Dabkara, CMD of carbon credits firm EKI Energy Services, said emerging technologies, including green hydrogen, advanced storage chemistries, and smart grid systems have the potential to address intermittency and ramping flexibility challenges."Stable, long-term policy frameworks particularly for hybrid renewables, offshore wind, and green hydrogen will be critical in attracting sustained private and global capital flows," he noted.Gaurav Moda, Partner and Energy Sector Leader, EY-Parthenon India, said that accelerating renewables, efficiency-led decarbonisation, and digital adoption are delivering measurable returns, while renewed momentum in nuclear energy point to a more integrated and commercially grounded phase of the energy transition.

# Gold set for a 50-year best, silver breaks records: Where should money go in 2026

**The revised allowances will come into effect from January 1 and apply across multiple categories, including domestic layover, night operations, deadhead travel and a newly introduced tail-swap allowance.**

Gold and silver prices have cooled off in the last few days of 2025, but the bigger picture remains unchanged. Both metals are heading towards one of their strongest years on record as 2025 draws to a close.  
After months of sharp gains, some investors are locking in profits, leading to short-term weakness in gold and silver. Even so, prices remain far higher than where they began the year.Gold was trading near \$4,334 an ounce, down slightly from recent levels. The yellow metal had

touched a lifetime high of \$4,549 last week.US gold futures for February delivery were also lower at around \$4,346 an ounce. The fall came as the US dollar strengthened, which often puts pressure on gold prices because it becomes costlier for buyers using other currencies.  
**GOLD SET FOR BEST GAINS IN 50 YEARS**  
Gold has risen about 66% so far in 2025, putting it on course for its strongest yearly performance since the late 1970s. This rally has not been driven by one single factor. Instead, several global developments have come together.  
Lower interest rates in the US have made gold more attractive, as it does not pay interest. Expectations that rates will stay low for longer have also helped.Ongoing global conflicts, worries around government debt, and heavy buying by central banks have further supported prices. At the same time, investment demand through exchange-traded funds has picked up steadily through the year.  
Minutes from the US Federal Reserve's



December meeting showed that the decision to cut rates was not simple and involved long discussions on risks to the economy.The Fed's next meeting is scheduled for January 27 and 28, and markets expect no immediate change in rates. This environment continues to favour gold as a store of value.  
**SILVER OUTSHINES GOLD WITH RECORD-BREAKING GAINS**  
Silver has been the standout performer among precious metals in 2025. Prices fell to around \$74.41 an ounce in the latest session, after touching a record high of \$83.62 earlier in the week. Even after this

fall, silver has gained about 157% this year, far more than gold.  
This sharp rise has been driven by strong industrial demand and tight supply. Silver is now seen as a critical mineral in the US, which has lifted its importance.  
Demand from clean energy, electronics and electric vehicles has remained strong, while supplies have struggled to keep up. Low inventories have added to the pressure, pushing prices higher for much of the year.  
**PLATINUM AND PALLADIUM ALSO ENDSTRONGYEAR**  
Other precious metals have also posted impressive gains in 2025. Platinum slipped to about \$2,123 an ounce after touching a lifetime high of \$2,478 earlier this week.Despite the recent fall, platinum is still up around 135% for the year. Its rise has been supported by tight supply, higher investor interest and policy changes in Europe related to combustion engines.  
Palladium was trading near \$1,584 an ounce, down on the day but still up roughly 74% for the year.

## Hindustan copper share price tanks 3%: What's behind the fall

**Copper prices have risen sharply this year due to supply disruptions at key global mines and strong demand from sectors such as electrification, renewable energy and artificial intelligence-led infrastructure.**

Shares of Hindustan Copper fell nearly 3% in Tuesday's trade as investors chose to book profits after the stock's sharp rise in recent weeks.The fall came even as the broader outlook for copper remains strong, supported by global demand and supply challenges.  
Hindustan Copper was trading around Rs 515 in intraday trade after slipping as much as 3.3% during the session but recovered to trade at Rs 529.80 down 0.78% as of 10:20 am.Market

participants said the decline was largely driven by year-end profit booking and a mild correction in global copper prices, rather than any company-specific bad news.  
**WHY DID HINDUSTAN COPPER**



**SHARES FALL TODAY?**  
Copper prices eased by more than 1% as traders locked in gains at the end of the year. This had a direct impact on copper-linked stocks, including Hindustan Copper, which has been one of the biggest beneficiaries of the metal's rally in 2025.Copper prices have risen sharply this year due to supply disruptions at key global mines

and strong demand from sectors such as electrification, renewable energy and artificial intelligence-led infrastructure.However, after such a strong run, some cooling off was expected in the short term.  
Experts tracking the stock said the recent fall looks like a pause rather than a trend reversal, especially given the scale of gains already seen.Despite today's fall, Hindustan Copper has delivered very strong returns across time frames. The stock has gained more than 26% in the last five trading sessions. Over the past one month, it is up around 56%.  
Looking at a longer period, the share price has jumped nearly 89.49% in the last six months. On a yearly basis, the stock has risen about 113.71%, making it one of the top performers among metal stocks.This sharp rise is one of the key reasons why investors may be choosing to lock in profits, especially as the calendar year comes to an end.

## FAIFA Raises Alarm Over Sharp Price Hike of Finished Goods: Warns of Severe Impact on Farmers

**2nd January 2026:** Federation of All India Farmer Associations (FAIFA), a non-profit organization representing the cause of millions of farmers and farmworkers of commercial crops across the states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Gujarat, etc. has reacted sharply to the Ministry of Finance notification of the Chewing Tobacco, Jarda Scented Tobacco and Gutkha Packing Machines (Capacity Determination and Collection of Duty) Rules, 2026 that has imposed an excise duty of ₹2,050-8,500 per 1,000 sticks, depending on cigarette length, effective 1 February. FAIFA has expressed concern that such a steep hike in taxes, as against the Government statements around the revenue neutral transition from Compensation Cess regime to alternative regime, would make domestic manufacturers to raise prices of finished goods, which will lead to a drop in sales, hurting farmers supplies in return. This could cause a glut in the tobacco crop market in the near term. Already, India's tobacco tax regime is openly discriminatory against FCV tobacco growers hailing from the



states of Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka. FCV tobacco farmers are already suffering under the burden of extremely high taxation rate on cigarettes (using FCV tobacco) which were on per kg basis more than 50 times higher than for bidis and more than 30 times higher than for Chewing tobacco. Further, while FCV tobacco attracts more than 76 in tax per dose in the finished product, other tobacco forms used in bidis and chewing products are taxed at less than one paisa per dose. Such extreme disparity punishes the

most regulated and compliant farmers. The current steep excise hike is further widening this fiscal discrimination and will crush FCV growers and distort the entire tobacco economy. Mr. Murali Babu, President, FAIFA, said: "While announcing GST 2.0 on 4 September 2025, Government had assured that in the case of tobacco products, GST would be charged at 40% of the retail sales price, while the overall incidence of tax would be kept unchanged. The farming community across India has been holding on to

this assurance of revenue neutrality and had welcomed the government's decision to rationalise GST by restructuring rates and doing away with the 12% slab, which helped reduce prices. We are shocked to see that the promise has not been kept, and instead a sharp increase in taxes has been notified, at the cost of farmers livelihoods." Appealing to the government, FAIFA leaders stressed that India's legal cigarette prices are already among the least affordable globally when measured against per capita income, as reflected in World Health Organization's affordability index. Current steep increase will render legal products unaffordable to a huge section of consumers, accelerating consumer migration to illegal channels. FAIFA has urged the Government to roll-back the notified excise rates and revise them to revenue-neutral rates, to disincentivise smuggling, and support domestic agriculture. A stable taxation framework, FAIFA noted, is necessary to sustain farmer incomes, protect employment across the value chain, and align economic policy with long-term public health goals.

Tatiana Schlossbery, a climate journalist and granddaughter of former US President John F Kennedy, passed away at 35. Tatiana was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukaemia in 2024, after her second child was born. She underwent chemotherapy and bone marrow transplant treatments following the diagnosis. Tatiana is well-known for her book "Inconspicuous Consumption: The Environmental Impact You Don't Know You Have", released in 2019. The book explores the climate crisis and its solutions. It also empowers readers to make informed choices as consumers in relation to the well-being of the environment. She had also written pieces concerning climate change in the New York Times. A social media post by her family, shared by the John F Kennedy Library Foundation, reads, "Our beautiful Tatiana passed away this morning (December 30). She will always be in our hearts." Notably, Tatiana lost her grandfather, President Kennedy, to an assassination in 1963, and her uncle, John F Kennedy Jr, to a plane crash in 1999.

CIA behind strike at Venezuelan dock that Trump claims was used by drug smugglers, say sources

WASHINGTON . (Agency)

The CIA was behind a drone strike last week at a docking area believed to have been used by Venezuelan drug cartels, according to two people familiar with details of the operation who requested anonymity to discuss the classified matter. The first known direct operation on Venezuelan soil since the US began strikes in September marks a significant escalation in the administration's months-long pressure campaign on Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro's government. The strike has not been acknowledged by Venezuelan officials. US President Donald Trump first made reference to the operation in an interview Friday with John Catsimatidis on WABC radio in New York, saying the US had knocked out some type of "big facility where ships come from." In an exchange with reporters Monday as he hosted Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at his Mar-a-Lago resort, Trump added that the operation targeted a "dock area where they load the boats up with drugs." But the president declined to comment when asked whether the attack was conducted by the military or the CIA. The CIA and White House officials also declined to offer further comment on the matter. Col. Allie Weiskopf, a spokesperson for Special Operations Command, which oversees US operations in the Caribbean, said in a statement that "Special Operations did not support this operation to include intel support."

Thieves drill into German bank vault, make off with about 30mn euros in cash, valuables

BERLIN. (Agency)

Robbers used a large drill to break into a German savings bank's vault room and steal cash, gold and jewelry worth some 30 million euros (\$35 million), police said Tuesday. The heist in the western city of Gelsenkirchen saw the thieves break into more than 3,000 safe deposit boxes, they said. While the criminals remained at large, hundreds of distressed bank customers massed outside the branch on Tuesday demanding information, but were kept at bay by police. According to police, the robbers drilled their way into the underground vault room of the Sparkasse savings bank from a parking garage. Investigators suspect the gang spent much of the weekend inside, breaking open the deposit boxes.



The break-in came to light after a fire alarm was triggered in the early hours of Monday and emergency services discovered the hole. Witnesses reported seeing several men carrying large bags in the stairwell of the parking garage during the night from Saturday to Sunday. Footage from security cameras has also shown a black Audi RS 6 leaving the parking garage early Monday morning, with masked persons inside. The car's license plate had been stolen earlier in the city of Hanover, police said. A police spokesman told AFP that the break-in was "indeed very professionally executed", likening it to the heist movie "Ocean's Eleven".

Chinese warships and coastguard vessels are withdrawing from waters around Taiwan, the island's coastguard said on Wednesday, with Beijing's military drills appearing to be "over." China launched missiles and deployed dozens of fighter jets, navy ships and coastguard vessels around the island on Monday and Tuesday in live-fire drills aimed at simulating a blockade of the Taiwan's key ports and assaults on maritime targets. Taipei, which slammed the two-day war games as "highly

provocative and reckless," said the manoeuvre failed to impose a blockade on the island. Communist China has never ruled democratic Taiwan, but Beijing claims the island of 23 million people is part of its territory and has threatened to use force to annex it. "The warships and coastguard vessels are withdrawing, but a few are still lingering outside the 24-nautical-mile line," Hsieh Ching-chin, deputy director-general of Taiwan's coastguard, told AFP, indicating the "drills should be over." Taiwan's coastguard has maintained a deployment of 11 ships at sea because China Coast Guard vessels "haven't completely left the area yet" and "we can't let our guard down," he said. Beijing has not yet publicly declared the drills to be finished. Taiwan's President Lai Ching-te warned on Wednesday that Chinese drills targeting the island "are not an isolated incident" and pose "significant risks" to the region. "China's authoritarian expansion and

escalating coercion pose significant risks to regional stability and also impact global shipping, trade and peace," Lai said at a promotion and rank conferment ceremony for military officers in Taipei. China's show



of force follows a bumper round of arms sales to Taipei by the United States, Taiwan's main security backer, and comments from Japan's prime minister that the use of force against Taiwan could warrant a military response from Tokyo. There has been a chorus of international

criticism of China's drills. Japan said Wednesday that China's military exercises "increase tensions" across the Taiwan Strait, and that it had expressed its "concerns" to Beijing. Australia's foreign ministry also condemned on Wednesday China's "destabilising" military drills around Taiwan, saying it had raised concerns with Beijing counterparts. Beijing slammed criticism of its exercises as "irresponsible." "These countries and institutions are turning a blind eye to the separatist forces in Taiwan attempting to achieve independence through military means," foreign ministry spokesman Lin Jian told a news briefing Wednesday. "Yet, they are making irresponsible criticisms of China's necessary and just actions to defend its national sovereignty and territorial integrity, distorting facts and confusing right and wrong, which is utterly hypocritical."

Envoys of Quad countries hold rare publicised meeting at US Embassy in Beijing

The relations among the four countries — the United States, Australia, India, and Japan — continue to be stable and strong," he said and posted a photo of

Mali and Burkina Faso said late Tuesday they would ban US citizens from entering their countries in retaliation for US President Donald Trump's decision to ban Malian and Burkina Faso citizens from entering the United States. The announcements, made in separate statements by the foreign ministers of the two West African countries, marked the latest twist in the frosty relationship between West African military governments and the US. On Dec. 16, Trump expanded earlier travel restrictions to 20 more countries, including Mali, Burkina Faso and Niger, which are run by

A forgotten chapter: The stories of Allied POWs in Nagasaki during the atomic bombing

Hundreds of prisoners of war from Allied countries were held at brutal Japanese camps in Nagasaki when the United States dropped an atomic bomb 80 years ago.

Their presence during the Aug. 9, 1945, bombing is little known, and family and researchers have been collecting and publishing testimonies to tell the stories of these often unrecognized victims. In September, dozens of relatives of Dutch POWs and descendants of Japanese bombing survivors came together to commemorate both those who were abused at the camps and the tens of thousands of Japanese who were killed that day. The dead included at least eight captives at one of the Nagasaki camps.

Descendants and survivors reckon with a painful past Andre Schram, who represented the Dutch families at the Nagasaki memorial, unveiled in 2015, is the son of a sailor who was among nearly 1,500 POWs held at the Fukuoka No. 2 Branch Camp for three years and forced to work at the Kawanami shipyard.

Many of the prisoners were Dutch service members captured by the Japanese in Indonesia, transported to Nagasaki on so-called "hell ships," kept at two major camps — No. 2 and No. 14 — and used as slave labor.

About 150,000 Allied prisoners were held in dozens of camps across Asia during the war, including 36,000 sent to Japan to make up for labor shortage as Japanese men were drafted and deployed to battlefields across Asia, according to the POW Research Network Japan.

There were also prisoners from the United States, Britain and Australia in Nagasaki. None died from the atomic blast at the No. 2 Camp, but more than 70 earlier died of malnutrition, overwork and illness.

Andre Schram's father, Johan Willem Schram, returned to the Netherlands four months after the war ended, but only near the end of his life did he tell his son about being treated like a slave. Japanese officials have apologized multiple times for wartime atrocities, "but Johan, like many other victims, had doubts about their sincerity," his son said. He felt Japan and the Netherlands treated him and other prisoners of war with disrespect. He never wanted anything to do with Japan again," Andre Schram wrote in "Johan's Story," a booklet about the Netherlands' colonial rule of the Dutch East Indies, the war with Japan and the aftermath, based on his research after his father died in 1993. Peter Klok said his father, Leendert Klok, also a Dutch POW at the camp, told him that Japanese civilians at the shipyard were friendly and helped him find parts to repair his watch. Military police later beat him for seeking help. Klok called the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki awful, but said Japan must reflect on its atrocities.

Zohran Mamdani is set to be sworn in as mayor as NYC rings in the New Year

Zohran Mamdani will become mayor of New York City as the clock ticks over into 2026 — but the celebrations are set to last through New Year's Day. The Democrat's team is planning two separate swearing-in ceremonies Thursday — a small, private one with his family in an old subway station around midnight, followed by a large event in the afternoon that will include a public block party outside City Hall. As a new mayor's term begins immediately with the new year, it has been

customary for the city's incoming leaders to hold two events. Outgoing mayor Eric Adams held his initial swearing-in at Times Square shortly after the famous ball drop, while Adams' predecessor, Bill de Blasio, took his first oath at home in Brooklyn.

For his part, Mamdani will take his initial oath at the former City Hall subway station in Manhattan — one of the city's original stops on its subterranean transit system, known for its tiled arches and vaulted ceilings. New York Attorney General Letitia James, a political ally and notable foe of US President Donald Trump, will administer the oath of office.

The old City Hall stop was designed as the flagship station of the city's first subway line, but was decommissioned in 1945. These days, outside of occasional guided historical tours, locals can usually only catch a glimpse of it by staying on the 6 train after its last stop downtown when it turns around to head north. In a statement, Mamdani's office said the choice to be sworn in at the station reflected his "commitment to the working people who

keep our city running every day."

"When Old City Hall Station first opened in 1904 — one of New York's 28 original subway stations — it was a physical monument to a city that dared to be both



beautiful and build great things that would transform working peoples' lives," Mamdani said. "That ambition need not be a memory confined only to our past, nor must it be isolated only to the tunnels beneath City Hall: it will be the purpose of the administration fortunate enough to

serve New Yorkers from the building above," he said. On Thursday afternoon, Mamdani will be sworn in again, this time by US Sen. Bernie Sanders, one of his political heroes, on the steps of City Hall in a ceremony scheduled to kick off at 1 p.m. US Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, another political ally, will deliver opening remarks. Mamdani's transition formed an inaugural committee that includes actor John Turturro, playwright Cole Escola and writer Colson Whitehead, as well as advocates, small business owners and campaign workers who the incoming mayor's office says have "provided perspective, guidance, and cultural sensibility" for the ceremony.

The public swearing-in will be accompanied by a block party along a stretch of Broadway leading up to City Hall. Mamdani's office expects thousands of people to attend and says there will be performances, music and interfaith elements.

Ashes hero Travis Head makes crucial BBL call ahead of T20 World Cup 2026

Superstar Australian cricketer Travis Head has hinted at missing the ongoing season of the Big Bash League (BBL) amid concerns over burnout. The left-handed opener said he wants to stay fresh for next year's T20 World Cup, which begins on February 7, especially after playing a major role in Australia retaining the Ashes urn.Describing the ongoing Ashes battle as emotionally draining, Head said he needs a break before what promises to be another demanding season of cricket next year. The 32-year-old has already endured a busy home summer, featuring in the white-ball series against India before playing a Sheffield Shield match as preparation for the Ashes. Head has been in belligerent form in the Ashes, hitting two decisive hundreds, including the whirlwind 123 in the series opener in Perth.When asked about turning out for the Adelaide Strikers in the BBL, Head told News Corp: "Probably unlikely with the emotional drain of an Ashes series, and what's coming up in terms of the World Cup.The emotional drain of actually being in an Ashes series and playing is always



tough. So I think it's important to go into a World Cup fresh."Head has not appeared for the Adelaide Strikers since the 2022–23 season of the Big Bash League. The star batter has regularly skipped Australia's premier domestic T20 competition in recent years to prioritise international commitments and the Indian Premier League since returning to the tournament in 2024. Head has been an integral member of the SunRisers Hyderabad setup, forming a devastating opening partnership with Abhishek Sharma. He scored 567 runs at a staggering strike rate of 191.59 when SRH reached the final in 2024, followed by another prolific season in 2025.The BBL, which got underway on December 14, has once again been without several of Australia's leading Test stars due to the Ashes.

Magnus Carlsen now a 20-time world champion, ends 2025 with Rapid and Blitz double

World No. 1 Magnus Carlsen showcased his endgame genius once again as he added a record-extending ninth World Blitz title to the Rapid gold medal he had won two days earlier. Carlsen defeated Uzbek GM Nodirbek Abdusattorov in a hard-fought final of the World Blitz Championship in Doha on Tuesday, December 30. The Norwegian took home a €70,000 prize, securing his 20th world championship title overall across all three time controls. The triumph also marked the fifth time he has claimed the rare double crown as both the World Rapid and World Blitz champion.Carlsen refused to settle for a draw in the title showdown against the



young Abdusattorov and produced a stunning, unexpected pawn move in the fourth game of the clash to seal a 2.5–1.5 victory and extend his reign in Blitz chess.After the first three games, both players were locked at 1.5 points apiece. The victory was all the more sweet and fulfilling for the Norwegian, who had endured a string of losses during the qualifying (Swiss round) and struggled to secure a place in the knockout semifinals.A draw in Round 19 against Abdusattorov saw both Carlsen, on 13.5 points, and the Uzbek, on 13 points, clinch the final two semifinal spots on Tuesday, finishing behind sole leader Arjun Erigaisi, who topped the standings with 15 points, and American GM Fabiano Caruana, who followed with 14 points.Carlsen then went on to defeat Caruana 3–1 to book his place in the final, while an impeccable Abdusattorov handed Erigaisi a crushing 2.5–0.5 defeat in the semifinals, as the Indian settled for a second bronze medal after finishing third in the Rapid event.Meanwhile, the two bronze medals are a remarkable achievement for the 22-year-old Erigaisi, who will return home stronger and more resolute from the experience.

Arsenal end 2025 on top, Man United stumble against bottom-placed Wolves

**Premier League 2025-26: Arsenal delivered a commanding 4-1 win against Aston Villa to end 2025 at the top of the table. Meanwhile, Manchester United struggled to a 1-1 draw with bottom-placed Wolves on Tuesday night.**

Arsenal delivered a resounding message in the Premier League title race on Tuesday night, demolishing third-placed Aston Villa 4–1 at the Emirates Stadium to end 2025 firmly at the top of the table. The Gunners had trailed Villa in momentum—Villa came into the game on an 11-match winning run across competitions—but Arsenal's performance turned heads and highlighted their title credentials.The scoring burst came after a tight first half: Gabriel Magalhes opened the scoring early in the second half with a well-

timed finish, before Martin Zubimendi doubled the lead minutes later, adding impetus to Arsenal's charge. Leandro Trossard's composed strike made it 3–0, and substitute Gabriel Jesus added a fourth just minutes after entering the pitch—a goal that underlined both Arsenal's depth and attacking fluidity. Villa managed a late consolation through Ollie Watkins, but it was little more than a footnote to a dominant evening for the hosts.The significance of the win goes well beyond the scoreline. Arsenal extended their lead to five points at the summit, topping the Premier League as the calendar year closed—five points clear of second-placed Manchester City and six ahead of Villa. Crucially, this result came against one of the division's most in-form sides, signaling not just consistency but the sort of performance that transforms title ambition into genuine momentum.For Villa, the loss halts their streak and sees them slip further behind a charging Arsenal, but Unai Emery's side remain firmly in the hunt for a top-four finish. Still, the emphatic nature of Arsenal's victory will likely resonate across the title race discussions over the winter

period.While Arsenal were celebrating, Manchester United endured another frustrating evening at Old Trafford, drawing 1–1 with bottom-placed Wolverhampton



Wanderers. What should have been a straightforward home victory instead quickly became a statistic United will want to forget, days after a 1-0 win over Newcastle.The result was particularly embarrassing given Wolves' position; the Midlands side are at rock-bottom of the Premier League and had managed only a handful of points all season. That they could take a point from Old Trafford not only denied United valuable ground in the race for

Champions League qualification but also sparked discontent from supporters, with boos heard at full time.

United took the lead through Joshua Zirkzee, whose effort deflected in and gave the hosts the advantage shortly before the half-hour mark. But the positivity was short-lived: Ladislav Krejci headed Wolves level just before half-time, ending United's hopes of a comfortable progress. In the second half, United dominated possession and saw a last-gasp effort ruled out for offside, but could not find a decisive breakthrough.

United manager Ruben Amorim did not

sugar-coat his assessment of the draw. Post-match, he pinpointed the team's lack of quality and fluidity in attack as key reasons they failed to put away a team struggling so massively on paper. Amorim highlighted the absence of key players—many away at the Africa Cup of Nations or sidelined through injury—as contributors to the disjointed display, but stressed that this should not be used as an excuse.That is normal, but we didn't use that excuse against Newcastle. We are not going to use it today (Dec 30).

Indian sports in 2025: Handshake rows, stampedes and controversies that shaped the year

Sports in India may have had many memorable highs, but it has also had their fair share of controversies. Isolated moments quickly escalated to a year that had many notable moments defined by public disputes, administrative lapses and moments that embarrassed India as a nation. From international fixtures clouded by political tensions to domestic events marred by chaos, sport repeatedly slipped out of control.These controversies were no mere social media scandals or fleeting cycles of outrage; they disrupted schedules, people's careers and also raised uncomfortable questions on how sport is run in India, where there has always been passion, but planning or the administrative side of things tends to have fallen short.

This was the year when the noise around the game proved louder than the game itself. Let us take a look at some of the biggest sporting controversies in India for 2025.

**BREAKDOWN OF INDIAN FOOTBALL**

Indian football's biggest worry in 2025 wasn't results on the pitch, but whether its

premier competition would survive at all. The future of the Indian Super League, long projected as the backbone of the sport's professional structure, drifted into uncertainty after its commercial and ownership framework unravelled. With no



clear bidders, unresolved contracts and mounting financial strain, the league's next season was left without firm timelines or guarantees.For clubs, the silence was crippling. Recruitment stalled, preseason planning froze, and players were left unsure if they would even have a competition to prepare for. Administrators offered reassurances, but clarity never followed. The instability also exposed how heavily

Indian football had come to rely on a single top-flight product, with little cushioning beneath it.As weeks passed without resolution, concern spread beyond boardrooms. Coaches warned of lost development time, fans feared regression, and the national ecosystem began to feel the strain. In 2025, Indian football wasn't battling opponents — it was battling uncertainty over whether its top tier could stay upright at all.

**WOMEN'S WORLD CUP MARRED BY SAFETY CONCERNS**

What should have been a routine day during a global tournament instead exposed an uncomfortable gap between hosting prestige and on-ground safety.

During the Women's World Cup in Indore, two members of the Australia women's cricket team were subjected to harassment while walking near their hotel, an incident that jolted players, officials and organisers alike. The brief encounter, involving a man on a motorcycle, was enough to trigger an alarm within the visiting camp and force an immediate police response.

For decades, India has fielded two senior national cricket teams—Men's and Women's. Yet, for much of that time, public attention, media coverage, and institutional support remained overwhelmingly skewed toward the men's side. The women's team, despite consistent performances and international success, was often relegated to the margins of public discourse.Rather than receiving the recognition they deserved, players from the women's team were frequently subjected to dismissive commentary and online ridicule. Social media narratives questioning the relevance of women's cricket—along with derogatory labels that trivialised their professionalism—became all too common, undermining both their achievements and credibility. The contrast in public reaction was stark. Landmark performances by male cricketers routinely sparked nationwide celebration, while equally impactful

contributions from leading women cricketers were met with comparatively muted acknowledgement. This imbalance highlighted a deeper issue: the women's



team was not only competing on the field but also fighting for visibility and respect in a sport where they had long proven their excellence.For years, this disparity defined the narrative around Indian women's cricket. However, 2025 has signalled a decisive turning point—a moment that

marks a profound shift in perception, recognition, and the broader cultural conversation surrounding the women's game.But 2025 has marked a seismic shift.

This year, things changed. India Women's Cricket has finally come into its own. 2025 will go down as the year that transformed the fortunes of these incredible athletes. It's the year when the players, who once faced endless mockery, could finally sleep with the quiet knowledge that their struggle had been worth it.The relentless effort, the tough journeys, and the battles—both on and off the field—have led them to a place where they can now proudly call themselves a force to be reckoned with.

2025 is the year when women's cricket in India was no longer an afterthought. It's the year the Indian women's team could stand tall, heads held high, and with the word "respect" finally associated with their name.

Australian great Damien Martyn in induced coma, battling for life against Meningitis

Harbhajan Singh has thrown his weight behindFormer Australian cricketer Damien Martyn is in an induced coma, fighting the life-threatening disease meningitis. Martyn was rushed to a hospital in Brisbane in serious condition after falling ill on December 26.

The 54-year-old is suffering from meningitis, a disease that causes inflammation of the membranes surrounding the brain and spinal cord and can lead to swelling of the brain.

Former Australia wicketkeeper-batter Adam Gilchrist, a close friend of Martyn, informed the public on behalf of his family that Martyn is receiving treatment in a hospital."He is getting the best of treatment, and (Martyn's partner) Amanda and his family know that many people are sending their prayers and best wishes," Gilchrist was quoted as saying by cricket.com.au.Cricket Australia CEO Todd Greenberg also sent his best wishes for



Martyn's speedy recovery.

"I'm saddened to hear of Damien's illness. The best wishes of everyone at Cricket Australia and in the wider cricket community are with him at this time," Greenberg said in a statement.Martyn made his debut in international cricket during a Test against the West Indies in Brisbane in 1992, scoring 36 and 15 in two innings. Over the course of his career, Martyn became known for his elegant strokeplay and went on to play 67 Tests and 208 ODIs for Australia.

**Martyn's illustrious career**

The right-handed batter was a vital part of Australia's middle order during their dominant era from the late 1990s to the 2000s. Martyn was also part of Australia's World Cup-winning campaigns in 1999 and 2003.

He played a key role in the 2003 World Cup triumph, scoring a vital 88\* (84) against India in the final. He was involved in a massive 234-run stand with Ricky Ponting (140\* off 121 balls) to help Australia post a huge total of 359/2 in their allotted 50 overs.

Karnataka are second in Group A, maintaining a 100% win record from three matches.Several big names have lit up the ongoing season of the Vijay Hazare Trophy, as star batters Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli also fulfilled their mandatory domestic commitments set by the BCCI. Wicketkeeper batter Rishabh Pant is also consistently featuring for Delhi and will play the entire season for his team.Kohli will return to play for Delhi for their January 6 fixture against Railways under Pant's captaincy. Opening batter Yashasvi Jaiswal also returned to play for Mumbai for their fourth fixture against Goa after being hospitalised with severe stomach cramps following Mumbai's Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy (SMAT) 2025 match against Rajasthan.

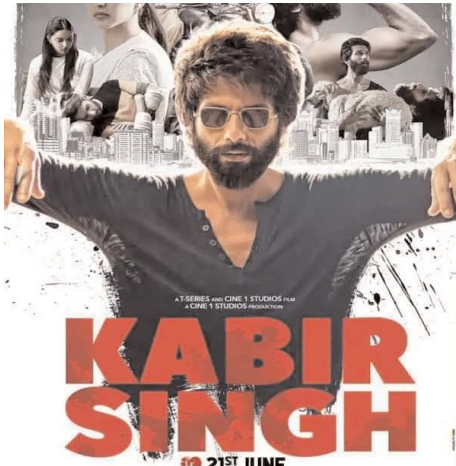
