SC ALLOWS FIRST PASSIVE EUTHANASIA, PERMITS WITHDRAWAL OF LIFE SUPPORT FOR MAN

New Delhi, March 11: The Supreme Court on Wednesday allowed a 31-year-old man from Ghaziabad who has been in a comatose condition for almost 13 years passive euthanasia by withdrawing his life support. In terms of its 2018 Common Cause judgment (as modified in 2023) recognising the fundamental right to die with dignity, a bench comprising justices JB Pardiwala and KV Viswanathan allowed the withdrawal of life support for a 32-year-old Harish Rana. Rana has remained in an irreversible permanent vegetative state for the past 13 years after falling from a building. His brain injury left him in a condition of Persistent Vegetative State (PSV) with 100 per cent quadriplegia. According to medical reports, his medical condition has not improved in the past 13 years. He is sustaining life only on Clinically Administered Nutrition (CAN) administered through surgically installed PEG tubes. The bench passed the order on a miscellaneous application of the father seeking to remove all life-sustaining treatment from his son.

CM Revanth reviews road development plans with R&B officials



HYDERABAD TSIT BUREAU:

Chief Minister A.Revath Reddy held a review meeting with senior officials of the Roads and Buildings Department to discuss road infrastructure development plans in the state in line with the Vision 2047 document. Meeting was attended by R&B Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, Special Chief Secretary (R&B) Vikas Raj, Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister Srinivasa Raju, Enc Mohan Naik and other senior officials.

During the meeting, the Chief Minister directed officials to prepare comprehensive plans for road development in accordance with the proposed Road Sector Policy-2047. He emphasized that the road network should be strengthened so that people can reach any part of the state from Hyderabad within a fixed and reasonable time.

Revath Reddy also instructed officials to identify and develop connectivity roads required to transform Hyderabad into a traffic-free city. He asked officials to take necessary steps to begin road development works in the areas that have already been identified.

WEST ASIA CRISIS:

2 INDIANS DEAD, 778 SEAFARERS ABOARD 28 INDIAN SHIPS STUCK IN PERSIAN GULF, SAYS GOVT

New Delhi (TSIT) Amid escalating tensions in West Asia, the government on Wednesday said that 778 Indian seafarers are currently aboard 28 Indian-flagged vessels operating in the Persian Gulf region, even as New Delhi stepped up monitoring and security measures to safeguard maritime personnel and trade.

Addressing a special inter-ministerial briefing, Rajesh Kumar Sinha, Special Secretary in the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, said 24 of the vessels are operating west of the Strait of Hormuz with 677 Indian seafarers on board, while four vessels east of the strategic chokepoint carry 101 Indian crew members.

Security agencies, ship managers and recruitment firms are coordinating closely with Indian embassies and local authorities to ensure the safety of the seafarers and provide medical assistance if required,

he said. Advisories issued by the Directorate General of Shipping on February 28 have directed Indian-flagged vessels and seafarers to adopt enhanced security protocols and strict reporting procedures, including submission of crew details to authorities.

Sinha said that port operations across India remain stable despite the regional tensions. Ports have been asked to extend all assistance to exporters and shipping operators to ensure continuity of external trade. Major ports are conducting round-the-clock monitoring of vessel movements, real-time assessment of developments in the region and regular reporting on cargo and ship status. Dedicated 24-hour control rooms have also been set up both in the ministry and in the Directorate General of Shipping to coordinate responses and maintain contact with ship owners, operators and families of seafarers.


tion, projection and control, and explained how singers can effectively render ragas within the appropriate tonal range.

Promote Organ Donation, Early Screening to Fight Kidney Disease: Dr. K. Anantha Rao

Kurmoor (TSIT): On the occasion of World Kidney Day, Dr. K. Anantha Rao, Consultant Nephrologist and Transplant Physician at KIMS Hospitals, Kurmoor, emphasized the importance of early detection, organ donation, and sustainable kidney care. This year's theme, "Caring for People, Protecting the Planet," highlights patient-centred treatment while promoting environmentally responsible healthcare.



Dr. Rao said nearly 12 crore people in India are affected by Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD). About two lakh patients progress to End-Stage Kidney Disease every year, requiring dialysis or kidney transplantation. However, only about 30 percent receive treatment, while nearly 1.5 lakh people die annually due to lack of timely care. He noted that dialysis, though life-saving, consumes large amounts of water, electricity and medical disposables, creating a significant environmental footprint. Promoting kidney transplantation and organ donation can reduce long-term resource consumption and biomedical waste. Dr. Rao also highlighted the Jeevandan Deceased Donor Transplant Program run by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, which has improved access to organ transplantation in the state. He stressed that controlling Diabetes and Hypertension, along with regular screening through blood pressure checks, urine tests, and serum creatinine tests, can help detect kidney disease early. Dr. Rao said KIMS Hospitals, Kurmoor, actively conducts community screening camps and runs a successful kidney transplant program, having performed more than 80 kidney transplants so far, the only such program in the Rayalaseema region.

Dr. Rao urged people to adopt healthy lifestyles, avoid unnecessary medications and undergo regular health check-ups to safeguard kidney health and improve overall quality of life. Diabetes, Hypertension, obesity, smoking, family history of kidney disease and long-term use of certain painkillers or nephrotoxic medicines. Dr. Rao said kidney disease can often be detected

Lesson for those spreading mud against govt



Khammam (TSIT) : Those indulging in false propaganda and attempting to malign the State government will face consequences, Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka warned on Wednesday. He was speaking at a programme held at the Khammam Collectorate where land pattas and Indiramma houses were distributed to Velugumatla Bhoodan victims. Mr. Vikramarka said Chief Minister Revanth Reddy had taken a compassionate decision to provide house sites and Indiramma houses to the Velugumatla Bhoodan victims so that poor families could live with dignity. He said the houses would be formally inaugurated by the Chief Minister on December 9, the birth anniversary of Sonia Gandhi. He alleged that certain groups had exploited poor people in the past under the guise of helping them and collected money from them. Strict action would be taken against such groups involved in exploiting the poor, he said. Mr.

Vikramarka also blamed the previous government for alleged irregularities in the Bhoodan lands due to negligence.
The Deputy Chief Minister said many poor families had been living for years without basic amenities such as drinking water, electricity and proper roads. The government was now taking steps to provide these facilities along with permanent housing. As many as 311 beneficiaries in the Bhoodan lands would receive house sites and construction of Indiramma houses would begin from Thursday, he said, adding that the area would be developed as a model colony. Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said the government was committed to resolving issues faced by the poor and ensuring that eligible beneficiaries receive housing benefits without delay.

THUDI MEGHA REDDY: PARTY WORKERS KEY TO STRENGTHENING CONGRESS

Thudi Megha Reddy, MLA of Wanaparthy, said party workers must take responsibility to strengthen the Congress at all levels. He spoke at mandal committee formation meetings in Revalli and Gopalpet mandals. Leaders said the Congress government has sanctioned two agricultural market yards for the constituency and approved several single-window societies to support farmers. They stressed that village and booth-level committees will play a key role in strengthening the party. Party leaders urged workers to work unitedly from village level and help expand the party's base ahead of upcoming elections.

Centre Must Respond to LPG, Urea Issues: MP Vamshi Krishna.

Mancherial , March 11, TSIT : Peddapalli MP Gaddam Vamshi Krishna urged the Central Government to respond immediately to the growing issues related to LPG and urea supply, as well as the slowdown affecting several industries in the country. He said the Centre must take prompt steps to address the hardships being faced by common people and farmers. The MP expressed concern that sectors such as automobiles, textiles, hotels and restaurants are witnessing a slowdown, which could result in large-scale job losses. He also noted that the future of gig workers associated with app-based services such as Zomato and Zepto could be affected if the crisis in these sectors continues. Referring to the urea supply issues faced last year, Vamshi Krishna said farmers, particularly in Telangana, had suffered due to mismanagement. He warned that if the current LPG and LNG supply problems persist, they could also impact the availability of urea in the coming months. He called upon the Central Government and Prime Minister Narendra Modi to take immediate corrective measures. The MP also strongly condemned the remarks made by TDP leader Lavu Sri Krishna Devarayalu on the formation of Telangana. He said Telangana State was achieved after years of struggle and sacrifices, and comments that insult the sentiments of the people of Telangana were unacceptable.

EDITORIAL

Paradoxical Statecraft: Sharp Tongue, Weak Knees

On the final day of the Raisina Dialogue 2026, external affairs minister S. Jaishankar delivered a resounding rebuttal to US deputy secretary of state Christopher Landau's warning that Washington wouldn't allow India to rise economically like China. Jaishankar asserted: "India's rise will be determined solely by India. It will be defined by our strength, not by the mistakes of others." He further emphasised the emergence of multipolarity, stating: "Multipolarity is now a permanent reality. The world is unlikely to revert to a system where a few powers dictate major agreements and expect the rest to simply comply." Earlier that day, foreign secretary Vikram Misri questioned the legitimacy of a rules-based international order that excluded India's participation, prompting a pointed question: "India supports a rules-based order, but did we have a role in shaping those rules?" Misri also advocated for moving beyond shared values, suggesting that countries could compete in one domain while cooperating in another. Together, these statements challenge the multilateral dominance of the US and the West and propose that countries don't necessarily need to be strategic allies to function cooperatively. They implicitly reject the US's framing of the relationship as one where India must choose between aligning with Washington and pursuing its own interests. At a time when Modi's foreign policy faces scrutiny even from some of his supporters, these statements serve as a bold assertion of Indian strategic autonomy. However, there's a significant contradiction. The twelve months preceding these statements paint a very different picture. In Washington, India conceded to US pressure while in Delhi, India firmly refused. The capitulation began even before Trump initiated the tariff war and weaponised trade, dominating conversations. Prime minister Narendra Modi presented a list of concessions when he met the newly inaugurated Trump in February 2025. Before any tariffs were imposed, India offered to reduce duties on some American exports and suggested purchasing more US energy and defence products. India remained silent on Trump's demonstrative decision to deport illegal immigrants in chains, which was filmed for maximum embarrassment. Modi remained silent. Washington acknowledged Delhi's submission and praised the partnership. Trump called Modi a great leader and Modi declared that MAGA plus MIGA equals mega - a mega partnership for prosperity. However, within weeks, Trump imposed a 25% reciprocal tariff on Indian goods in April 2025 as part of his 'Liberation Day' executive order regardless. When the tariff was doubled to 50% as India was importing Russian oil, India labelled it 'unfair unjustified and unreasonable'. However, it did not take retaliatory action nor initiate a formal multilateral challenge. India simply absorbed the blow meekly. In May, following the Pahalgam attacks, India launched Operation Sindoor. However, this response was abruptly and unceremoniously extinguished by Trump's unilateral announcement of a ceasefire on social media. Trump claimed credit for mediation, but India denied the claim. Modi failed to respond to the repeated barbs of a dictated ceasefire. The strategic autonomy, so eloquently articulated at the Raisina Dialogues, was lacking. At the Raisina, Misri asked if India had a hand in shaping the rules. The US Trade deal answers this question: NO. In the US-India Joint Statement on the Framework for Trade Agreement, India almost unquestioningly accepted the rules set by the US regarding tariffs, data, agricultural product access, pharmaceutical trade and all industrial products.

'We Protect America, Not Vice Versa': Inside Gulf's Growing Frustration With Trump

Soon after Operation Epic Fury began, the Deputy Foreign Minister of Iran, Saeed Khatibzade, who was visiting India to participate in the Raisina Dialogue, announced that Iran and the Gulf states had been engaged in back-channel talks when the joint Israel-US attacks on Iran began. The messaging was clear. The assaults were, in part, to sabotage these talks; they began also when Iran had been negotiating with the US over its nuclear programme through Omani mediation. For decades after the 1979 Islamic Revolution in Iran - which, by the way, the Arabs have always called an "Iranian revolution", dismissing claims of it being "Islamic" - the security architecture of the Gulf countries has been developed as a counter to Iran and to pre-empt its export of the 'revolution' to their lands. The primary fear has been the toppling of the monarchies in these countries. Saudi Arabia, for instance, had admitted that it had invested millions in exporting Wahhabism across the world, primarily as a counter to the Shiite political Islam that Iran was exporting.

The Birth Of The Carter Doctrine
Intra-Gulf relations were transferred, as were the relations between the Gulf countries and the US. America's reliance on Iran and Saudi Arabia, the two largest energy powerhouses in the region, was replaced by the Carter Doctrine. In 1980, the then US President, Jimmy Carter, unveiled it in his State of the Union address, which declared that the US would use military force to defend its interests in the Persian Gulf.

In 1981, the Gulf monarchies joined forces to form the Gulf Cooperation Council. Since then, the security architecture of the region has been anchored in the Carter Doctrine, which made the US the net security provider in the region. While the Shiite threat remained, with Iran forming its axis of resistance through the creation of proxies like Hezbollah in Lebanon, Hamas in Gaza, Houthis in Yemen, and, much later, the Hashed al Shabi, or armed Shiite militias in Iraq, yet another threat arose over the last decade.

The Arab Spring, which brought back political Islam on the Arab map and led to the rise of Sunni militants such as ISIS - which even launched attacks on facilities such



as Saudi Aramco - shook the GCC. The perceived US disinterest in the region following its pivot to Asia, together with its endorsement of the Arab Spring, led to Arab capitals rethinking their security doctrine.

The Abraham Accords

Israel capitalised fully on this window of opportunity that had opened up against common goals. It had long been trying to cultivate ties with the Arab and Muslim world. However, while it had been successful in the Muslim world, it could establish ties with only two Arab countries - Egypt and Jordan. Intense back-channel talks and lobbying by the first Trump Administration resulted in the path-breaking Abraham Accords in 2020, where a range of Arab countries, beginning with GCC heavyweight UAE, then Bahrain, and then Morocco, normalised ties and established diplomatic relations with Israel. While Saudi Arabia, as Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, was more circumspect, it did engage in unofficial relations with Israel. The common threat that underpinned these Accords was Iran.

Therefore, a normalisation of the ties between GCC states and Iran would hardly have been looked upon benignly by Israel, or, for that matter, even by the US under a second Trump administration.

Questioning It All Now

In spite of their security arrange-

ments with the US, the GCC countries have, during the current crisis, come to terms with the fact that this arrangement has been counterproductive for them. For one, Iran has retaliated by targeting not just Israel but also US bases in the Gulf as well as civilian infrastructure, where US military personnel have a presence with their drones and missiles. As Israel bombed Iran's oil storage refineries and sites, Iran struck energy infrastructures in the GCC, including Shaybah oilfields in Saudi Arabia and its most important refinery, Ras Tanura, and Qatar Energy's facilities at Ras Laffan, which made the world's largest LNG producer halt production entirely. GCC stocks have plummeted, trade and tourism have come to a grinding halt, and the image of the region as an oasis for global business and money now lies tainted. Worldwide, oil prices have spiked to more than \$100 a barrel for the first time since 2022. On the other hand, the GCC has also come to face the bitter truth that the US prioritised Israel's security over the Gulf's safety. As Israel's air defence system was overwhelmed with Iran's barrage of drones and missiles, the US began moving its air defence systems from the GCC to Israel.

'Step-Fatherly' Treatment For Middle East?

Ironically, while Israel is not an immediate neighbour of Iran, most GCC states are. They have been in the line of fire and had anticipated this. In spite of this, they were not

taken into confidence or informed in advance of the joint Israel-US assault on Iran, leaving them susceptible to the very threat they had long anticipated. Moreover, while Israel received mostly military aid and grants, the GCC pays for its security arrangements with the US but still doesn't have many of the US technologies that Israel has been given access to. Transactions run into billions of dollars; just a year ago, President Trump had agreed to arms sales of \$142 billion dollars to Saudi Arabia.

'We Constantly Informed You'

Inevitably, the pushback has begun. The GCC states have publicly announced that they would not allow their territories to be used for launching attacks. On Iran, they also know that part of its military doctrine is guided by the fact that US bases in the region, in the case of any attacks on Iran, become legitimate targets. The UAE's ambassador to the UN stated, plainly, "We have constantly informed [you] that our territories would not be used for any attacks against Iran. Yet, we are being targeted, frankly, in a very unwarranted manner." Similarly, influential UAE billionaire Khalaf Ahmad Al Habtoor has stated, "The truth is that hasty American decisions are what embroiled the region in a war whose peoples were not party to its decision-making, and its local allies were not consulted before it was launched."

This Poll Season, Mamata Banerjee's Hindu Outreach Goes The Extra Mile



West Bengal Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee has been on an overdrive for about a year, to announce and inaugurate temples in various corners of the state, amid BJP allegations that she is "appeasing" the minority Muslim community. Banerjee - a devotee of goddess Kali - holds an annual Kali Puja for decades at her home, barely a couple of kilometers away from the famous Kali temple in Kalighat. But she never played up her personal religious credentials in the political arena before the BJP landed in a big way on Bengal's battleground in 2019. Now she seems to have decided to play up the Bengali-Hindu sentiment on the political stage to counter the BJP brand of "Hindutva" in a bipolar political state. She had trodden this path for the 2021 assembly polls, reciting from the "Chandi" (invocation of Durga) on stage at election campaigns, to counter BJP's Hindutva push with "Jai Sri Ram" slogans and Hanuman Jayanti rallies that lack a Bengali cultural identity to it. Now, in the run up to the 2026 assembly polls where she is seeking a fourth straight term as Chief Minister, she has decided to showcase her temple building spree and development of traditional Hindu religious sites and events. The first big splash

came last year when her government built a Jagannath temple in Digha, modelled after the famous temple in Puri in Odisha. Inaugurated on April 30 by the chief minister, the temple was also the first of its kind since the roughly Rs 250-crore project was implemented by the state government's housing corporation (HIDCO), sparking a controversy on whether public money should be used to build religious structures. The footfall since has been overwhelming - a factor the ruling Trinamool Congress thinks could be to the party's advantage. Digha is in East Midnapore district, where BJP's Suwendu Adhikari - who defeated Mamata from Nandigram, in 2021, after shifting to the BJP - holds a lot of cards. In December 2025, a grand Mahakal temple in Siliguri has been announced for which a trust has been formed. The Chief Minister also inaugurated a bridge project in Gangasagar that will connect the little islands at the delta where pilgrims gather for the auspicious Makar Sankranti in January. The foundation stone for a Rs 262 crore "Durga Angan" project in New Town, Kolkata, was also laid by the Chief Minister, who at the time had dismissed any allegation of appeasement politics, saying it was a tribute to UNESCO's recognition of

Durga Puja as a cultural heritage. The 17-acre complex will have temples, museums and cultural spaces. If the Durga Angan and Gangasagar projects are large scale, Banerjee also inaugurated a local temple of goddess Bagalamukhi in Kalighat, close to her home. A new temple complex has come up where a non-descript tiny temple of the goddess stood, and mostly devotees from the neighborhood offered prayers. Banerjee is a worshipper of "Ma Bagala" since childhood. While the Chief Minister has pledged the state's 27 per cent minority Muslim population with government schemes and stipends for minority students and developing religious sites, she is being extra cautious this round to establish that it is not by overlooking the interests of the majority Hindu community. To prove the point, she has raised her government's grants to the 40,000 Durga Puja committees across the state from Rs 85,000 to Rs 1.10 lakh recently. Durga Puja is the state's biggest religious-cultural festival. As a political veteran, Banerjee is reaching out to her core Bengali-Hindu voters amid attempts by her rivals - outfits like Humayun Kabir's JUP or the ISF or even Assaduddin Owasi's AIMIM - to split the minority votes.

Nitish Kumar, And The Great Bihar Promise That Never Came

The politics of dour men is often workmanlike, yet effective when they acquire power. Take PV Narasimha Rao, for instance. Until he became Prime Minister, he was barely acknowledged as a charismatic leader, but finished his political innings as arguably one of the most wily and consequential politicians independent India had seen. So was his political protege, Manmohan Singh. At one of the lowest points in his career as a politician and the last press conference as Prime Minister, Singh famously quipped: "History will be kinder to me than the contemporary media or, for that matter, the Opposition in the Parliament." Those were prescient words by a man content to remain in others' shadow most of his political life but managed to irrevocably change India's destiny. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar could be clubbed with such men in the way he played the game of politics, but falls well short in his achievements. Kumar has indicated he is hanging up his more than 20-year-old chief ministerial boots and has filed to contest the Rajya Sabha elections. Victory is almost certain as the numbers are on his side. Unlike Rao and Singh, however, Nitish will not be remembered for his impact but the promise he wasted.

Ace Of The Pack

Nitish was easily eclipsed by charismatic socialist colleagues such as Laloo Prasad Yadav and Ram Vilas Paswan in the early years. By the time he won his first election in 1985, Yadav and Paswan were veterans of legislative affairs. Belonging to the numerically weak Kurmi caste, he did not have the backing of a large community vote bank such as the Yadavs for Laloo and Paswans' for Ram Vilas. Nor was he a rousing speaker. His relevance was always tied to the mercy of a larger, stronger political ally than his own stature. Alliance and compromise kept him in power even as he created maneuvering space in coalitions



by holding on to a bare minimum set of values rooted in socialism and secularism. When he partnered with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), he didn't let the party's Hindutva politics permeate deeply in Bihar. As a Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) ally, he kept the Yadavs, accustomed to getting their way, on a tight leash. But over the years, his political formula evolved into an unabashed pursuit of power combined with undiluted populism. It gained him the nickname 'Paltu Ram', or flip-flopper, but helped him emerge as a leader with a loyal vote base. Over time, Nitish engineered a grassroots coalition of non-Yadav backward communities, Pasmanda Muslims, Bhumihars, and women cutting across caste and religion, which made him a winner in his own right. If he could not rule Bihar on his own, nobody else could either.

Bicycle Man

Soon after becoming Bihar's Chief Minister in 2005, Nitish's initiatives to gift bicycles to high school girl students to keep them in school is now part of political lore and a global case study in development economics emulated as far as Africa. The success of the scheme and the political dividends it paid Nitish were keenly watched by rivals and paved the way for women's empowerment, becoming central to every future election strategy and

development plan. In that first term (technically the second because he was CM for a week in 2000), Kumar focused on improving law and order in the state, earning him his other nickname, Sushasan Babu (the good governor). He set up fast-track courts, which convicted over 50,000 criminals between 2006 and 2010. A state known for rampant kidnappings and murders was suddenly safe for women to walk even at night. In 2006, Bihar became the first state to reserve half the seats in local governance bodies for women. It was also one of the early-bird states to have a separate gender budget, from 2008-09. Yet, Nitish's party, Janata Dal (United), fielded only 13 women in the 101 seats it contested in the 2025 assembly elections. Between 2005 and 2010, Nitish picked the low-hanging fruits of governance and administrative presence in a state lounging at the bottom of the national rankings for socio-economic development. The bicycle scheme saw girls' enrolment and attendance improving, while better policing made streets relatively safer for them. A state notorious for a lack of roads saw rapidly improving connectivity, although much of it was through a centre-funded rural roads project. Nitish's cynicism was on display when he gave a party ticket to strongman Anant Singh even as his police locked up sundry criminals.

BUTTER FOR TAMIL NADU, LIME FOR US": M. B. PATIL EXPRESSES DISPLEASURE AGAINST CENTRE

Bengaluru: The Narendra Modi-led Central Government has declared Madurai Airport in Tamil Nadu as an international airport but has not taken a similar decision regarding Hubballi and Belagavi airports in Karnataka. This reflects a discriminatory approach and is not acceptable, Infrastructure Development Minister M. B. Patil said on Wednesday. "How can it be butter for them and lime for us?" he questioned. Speaking on the issue, he said the Central Government may have taken this decision keeping the upcoming Tamil Nadu elections in mind. However, its indifferent attitude towards

Karnataka's demand is questionable, he remarked. A letter had been written on June 24, 2025, to Union Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu, requesting that Hubballi and Belagavi airports be upgraded to international status, as this would greatly benefit the North Karnataka region. In this context, Union Minister and Dharwad MP Pralhad Joshi, Belagavi MP Jagadish Shettar, and Haveri MP Basavaraj Bommai should raise their voices and stand firmly for the interests of the State, he urged. At least one of the two airports—Hubballi or Belagavi—should be declared an international airport, he said. If both are upgraded, it would be even more welcome. The Central Government must recognise the State's requirement, Patil added.

eight years will be similar to the planting four crore trees."

Citing that he inaugurated the rural road connectivity project, which covers 370 km under the Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana, the PM assured that each road was not just a piece of infrastructure but will also provide patients with better access to healthcare, students with comfortable travel to schools and colleges, and farmers with easy travel to different markets. "Above all, each road lifts the rural economy and improves ease of living," he said.

Prime Minister Modi recalled his visit to Gangaikonda Cholapuram for the Aadi Thiruvathirai festival and the celebration

of 1,000 years of the construction of the grand temple by Emperor Rajendra Chola. "It is a UNESCO-recognised site that attracts tourists from across the world, but the existing highway passes very close to the temple, causing safety concerns to pilgrims and tourists. So, a new bypass has been planned and vehicles will now be diverted away from the temple. This means better safety for everyone," he said. The PM also assured that the Centre is fully committed to the welfare of the people of Tamil Nadu, and the NDA government is working on the state's welfare. He said work on the projects inaugurated in Madurai a few days back will continue.

Apart from inaugurating eight modernised and redeveloped railway stations under the Amrit Bharat programme in Madurai, the prime minister said he had flagged off several new trains, which would connect Nagercoil, Coimbatore, Rameshwaram, Tirunelveli, Mayiladuthurai and Karaikudi with other regions and boost tourism and generate jobs.

Bring back Tamils stuck in warzone: NTK chief Seeman

CHENNAI: Taking note of the worsening situation due to the ongoing war in the Persian Gulf, the Union government should take immediate steps to safely repatriate Tamil fishermen and workers stranded in Iran, Israel, and Gulf countries and reunite them with their families, Naam Tamilar Katchi (NTK) chief coordinator Seeman urged on Wednesday.

In a statement, Seeman said it was a "historic tragedy" that fishermen from the State are forced to travel to foreign countries for

fishing-related work. Highlighting the plight of the fishermen's families, who are unable to contact their loved ones, he said they were left in tears worrying about the safety of their family members. This, he said, was extremely distressing.

He called upon the Union government to immediately intervene and ensure that the stranded fishermen and also other Tamil people who are working in Iran, Israel and Gulf nations were safely brought back to their

homeland and reunited with their families.

Seeman also urged the Tamil Nadu government to speed up efforts to rescue the stranded Tamils through the Department for Welfare of Non-Resident Tamils and coordinate with Indian embassies in the countries concerned to facilitate their return.

He further demanded that both the Union and State governments should bear the entire travel expenses required to bring the Tamil people back home at the earliest.

Jumbo tramples 65-year-old daily wager to death in Erode

COIMBATORE: A Tamil Nadu Electricity Board employee, his wife who was undergoing treatment for breast cancer, and their minor daughter were found dead at their house in Thambu Nagar here on Saturday night, with police suspecting suicide. The deceased were identified as Kamalesh (42), a junior engineer at a Tangedco substation in Kathirnaickenpalayam under the Thoppampatti division; his wife Ilakkiya (38); and their daughter Yakshita Angel (10), a Class 5 student of a private school in the area. Police said Ilakkiya had been suffering from breast cancer for the past three years and was undergoing treatment. As her condition did not improve and she was reportedly in severe pain, she is said to have shared her distress with her husband. Investigators said the couple had informed relatives that they were "going to join the Lord" before allegedly consuming potassium cyanide along with their daughter on the night of February 1, according to a Daily Thanthi report. Relatives who later visited the house found the three lying dead and alerted the police.

Hidden belly fat may raise kidney disease risk even in slim people

New Delhi, Mar 11: Doctors are increasingly warning that being thin does not always mean being healthy, as growing evidence shows that people with normal body weight can still develop serious metabolic diseases due to hidden internal fat.

Health experts say a rising number of patients, particularly in South Asia, are being diagnosed with metabolic disorders despite having a normal Body Mass Index. The problem is often linked to visceral fat, a type of fat that accumulates deep inside the abdomen around vital organs.

Visceral fat forms a layer around organs such as the liver, pancreas and kidneys. Unlike fat stored under the skin, it acts as a metabolically active tissue that releases inflammatory chemicals and disrupts normal organ function. This condition is often described as the "thin-fat" phenotype, where individuals appear slim but have higher internal fat and reduced muscle mass.

Doctors say the accumulation of visceral fat can lead to metabolic changes that eventually damage the kidneys. It contributes to insulin resistance, chronic inflammation and high blood pressure — all of which can gradually affect the kidneys' microscopic filtering units and lead to Chronic Kidney Disease. One of the major concerns, experts note, is that early kidney damage usually develops without noticeable symptoms. Many people only become aware of declining kidney function when the disease has already progressed to advanced stages.

South Asians are considered particularly vulnerable due to genetic and lifestyle factors. Studies show that people from the region tend to accumulate more visceral fat even when their body weight appears normal.

Medical experts say BMI standards for Asian populations differ slightly from global benchmarks. For Asians, a BMI between 18.5 and 22.9 kg/m² is considered nor-



mal, 23 to 24.9 kg/m² is classified as overweight and 25 kg/m² or higher is considered obese. Because metabolic complications often occur at lower body fat levels in Asian populations, diseases such as Type 2 Diabetes, fatty liver disease and kidney damage can develop earlier.

Lifestyle patterns also play a role. Diets high in refined carbohydrates but low in protein, combined with sedentary habits, can worsen body composition. Many people maintain a stable weight but lose muscle mass and gain internal fat, a trend increasingly observed among younger urban populations.

Doctors emphasise that BMI alone may not be sufficient to assess metabolic health. They rec-

ommend additional measures such as waist circumference, waist-to-height ratio and body composition analysis to better detect visceral fat.

Routine health screenings are also crucial, especially for individuals with a family history of metabolic disorders. Early signs of kidney stress may appear as slightly elevated creatinine levels or small amounts of protein in urine before symptoms become evident. Experts say reducing visceral fat requires lifestyle changes focused on improving metabolic health rather than simply losing weight. Regular physical activity, particularly resistance training and muscle-strengthening exercises, can improve insulin sensitivity and increase muscle mass.

A balanced diet rich in whole grains, protein sources, vegetables, fruits and healthy fats can also help reduce inflammation and support metabolic function. Limiting refined sugars, processed foods and excessive salt intake is equally important for protecting kidney health. Adequate hydration, good sleep and effective stress management further contribute to maintaining metabolic balance. Health specialists say the growing recognition of the "skinny but unhealthy" phenomenon highlights the need to look beyond body weight when assessing disease risk. They stress that long-term kidney health depends more on metabolic fitness and healthy lifestyle habits than on numbers shown on the weighing scale.

Nipah, bird flu outbreaks highlight common public mistakes during viral scares

Recent public health alerts in India, including the Nipah virus outbreak in West Bengal and the avian influenza (bird flu) outbreak in Bihar, have once again underlined how swiftly viral infections can emerge and spread. While health authorities activate containment measures, experts say individual behaviour often determines whether transmission accelerates or is brought under control.

Medical professionals warn that during viral outbreaks, fear and misinformation frequently spread faster than the virus itself. This panic-driven response leads people to make dangerous mistakes such as ignoring early symptoms, self-medicating without advice, and relying on unverified social media remedies. Such actions not only increase personal risk but also endanger vulnerable groups and add pressure on healthcare systems.

Dr Dip Narayan Mukherjee, Consultant - Microbiology and Infectious Diseases at CK Birla Hospitals, CMRI, said outbreaks test not just immunity but collective discipline. He stressed that understanding common behavioural errors and avoiding them is crucial, especially during high-risk outbreaks like Nipah and bird flu, which carry significant fatality rates.

One of the most critical mistakes, according to Dr Mukherjee, is ignoring early symptoms. Mild fever, sore throat, fatigue or body ache are often dismissed as seasonal illnesses, delaying medical consultation and isolation. In infections such as Nipah, early symptoms may appear mild but can rapidly progress to severe neurological complications. The World Health Organization (WHO) has consistently emphasised that early detection and isolation are key to limiting transmission and improving outcomes.

Another major concern is inconsistent use of preventive measures. People may follow precautions in public places but relax them in homes, offices or social gatherings. Health agencies like the WHO and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) stress that hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette and mask use, when advised, must be practiced consistently across all settings to be effective. Self-medication has also emerged as a serious issue during outbreaks. Dr Mukherjee cau-



tioned against the use of antibiotics, steroids or unproven home remedies without medical supervision, noting that antibiotics have no role in treating viral infections. The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has repeatedly warned that misuse of antibiotics fuels antimicrobial resistance, while inappropriate steroid use can weaken immunity and worsen outcomes in viral infections.

Misinformation circulating on social media further complicates outbreak responses. Health authorities have observed that unverified claims and so-called miracle cures undermine evidence-based public health measures. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has advised citizens to rely only on official advisories and qualified healthcare professionals. Experts also point to neglect of isolation as a major risk factor. Many people continue attending work or social events despite being symptomatic, often due to professional or social pressure. In high-risk infections like Nipah, even brief exposure can have serious consequences. The WHO has reiterated that staying home when unwell is a public health responsibility. Improper use of masks and disinfectants is another concern. Reusing disposable masks, wearing them incorrectly or excessive use of disinfectants without proper ventilation can reduce protection and cause health issues, particularly respiratory irritation.

To reduce risks during outbreaks, doctors recommend early symptom recognition, timely medical consultation, consistent hygiene practices, avoiding self-medication, responsible use of masks, strict adherence to isolation guidelines and special care for vulnerable populations. Adequate sleep, proper nutrition and stress management are also vital in sup-

G7 welcomes potential record release of oil reserves as prices surge

G7 nations have said they would support the collective release of oil from their reserves to tackle soaring prices since the start of the US-Israel war with Iran. The group of countries has been meeting with the International Energy Agency (IEA), which is reported to be readying its biggest ever intervention in the oil market on Wednesday afternoon. The conflict has caused oil exports through the vital Strait of Hormuz - which carries a fifth of global oil supplies - to virtually stop and production in the region to slump. Prices have jumped since the conflict started but stabilised following reports that oil could be released from countries' stockpiles though some experts say the move would only be a short-term solution. According to reports, the IEA could release 300 to 400 million barrels of oil - more than double the amount it released following Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in early 2022. However, the reported figure would only amount to around three or four days' worth of global supply or roughly a fortnight's worth of what would normally be shipped out of the Strait of



Hormuz. Following a meeting with the IEA on Wednesday, G7 energy ministers said: "In principle, we support the implementation of proactive measures to address the situation, including the use of strategic reserves." All IEA member countries are required to keep 90 days' worth of their nation's oil use in reserve in case of global disruption. The oil itself is not in a single place. For example, producers like Shell and BP keep stocks at terminals and refineries around the UK and can earmark stocks held elsewhere as counting towards their reserves. When it is released, it does

not mean a sudden flood of new oil starts moving. Instead, producers will make more available in the market for refineries to order, though energy analysts have told the BBC that there is a shortage of refining capacity. The other issue with releasing reserves is that it is not something you can do again. The impact of the US and Israel's war in Iran is starting to hit home - no matter where you live. As the conflict blocks oil, gas, and other exports from the Gulf region, and producers start to cut output, the supply shock has sent prices soaring. This has rattled financial markets. However,

it is also affecting people's day-to-day lives, with prices for petrol and diesel at the pump already rising. And the effects could get wider still with the possibility that everything from food prices to holidays could become pricier. Analysts have also raised the possibility of an economic downturn, with some countries more at risk than others. "This is essentially the biggest supply shock at least in modern global oil market history," said Hunter Kornfeind, senior macro energy analyst of Rapid Energy Group. Motorists across the world are feeling this at the pump.

In the US, average petrol prices have risen above \$3.50 (£2.60) per US gallon, from about \$2.92 a month ago, while diesel had risen from \$3.66 to \$4.78 over the same period, according to the American Automobile Association. In the UK, the most recent data from the RAC motoring organisation shows that since the war began, average UK petrol prices have risen by 4.95p to 137.78p a litre. Diesel has increased by 9.43p to 151.81p. There is normally a time lag, with movements in oil markets taking about a fortnight to feed in to fuel prices. Meanwhile, the Gulf is where Europe gets around half of its jet fuel from. The disruption has caused the continent's benchmark jet fuel price to almost double to its highest level since the wake of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Fuel typically makes up 20-40% of airlines' operating costs. This means flights could become more expensive, while any shortage of fuel could mean some flight cancellations. However, the impact might not be equal across the board. Many European airlines use contracts to get their fuel at fixed or capped prices for months, or even years, in advance.

Sensex, Nifty tumble over 1 pc during afternoon session



Mumbai: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty were trading sharply lower during afternoon session on Wednesday, March 11, after a day's breather as investors' sentiment remained cautious amid the ongoing tensions in West Asia and sustained foreign fund outflows. Besides, selling in blue-chip bank stocks also drove the markets lower. The 30-share BSE Sensex tumbled 1,045.15 points or 1.33 per cent to 77,160.83. The 50-share NSE Nifty tanked 290 points or 1.19 per cent to 23,971.60. From the 30-Sensex firms, Bajaj Finance, Axis Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra, Bajaj Finserv, Bharti Airtel and HDFC Bank were among the major laggards. Sun Pharma, NTPC, Adani Ports and Power Grid were

among the gainers. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, dipped 0.06 per cent to USD 87.75 per barrel. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 4,672.64 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data. Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs), however bought stocks worth Rs 6,333.26 crore. "Although equity markets staged a technical rebound on Tuesday, the underlying sentiment remains cautious as the deepening crisis in the Middle East begins to influence global financial markets through higher energy prices, disruptions to key shipping routes, and shifting investor risk appetite," Ponnudi R, CEO of Enrich Money, an online trading

and wealth tech firm, said. From an equity market standpoint, geopolitical disruptions of this nature tend to trigger sharp bouts of volatility as global investors rotate toward safer assets and reduce exposure to risk-sensitive markets, he added. In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi and Japan's Nikkei 225 traded over 1 per cent higher. Shanghai's SSE Composite index and Hong Kong's Hang Seng index were also quoting in positive territory. The US market ended flat on Tuesday. On Tuesday, the Sensex jumped 639.82 points or 0.82 per cent to settle at 78,205.98. The Nifty climbed 233.55 points or 0.97 per cent to end at 24,261.60. The 30-share BSE Sensex tumbled 1,045.15 points or 1.33 per cent to 77,160.83.

91% of Indian Sales Professionals Say AI Agents Are Mission-Critical to Business Success

Hyderabad, 11 March 2026: Salesforce, the world's #1 AI CRM*, today announced findings from its latest State of Sales report, revealing that 91% of Indian sales professionals say AI agents are essential to driving business success. As sales teams kick off 2026 with ambitious new quotas, they're turning to AI - especially agents - to hit their numbers. The survey reveals AI as the top tactic to drive company growth this year. The data also reveals why: Sales teams are increasingly stretched between changing customer demands and limited bandwidth to meet them. The real drag on productivity, the research suggests, isn't effort or skill; it's administrative bottlenecks.

Detailed Findings: Sellers are doubling down on AI agents and deploying them across the entire sales cycle. AI adoption in sales is already mainstream: 90% of Indian sales organizations

currently use some form of AI for tasks like prospecting, forecasting, lead scoring, or drafting emails. Indian sellers using AI report meaningful value: 94% say AI deepens customer understanding, and 89% say it makes their job less stressful. AI agent adoption is accelerating quickly: 54% of Indian sellers say they've used agents, and nearly 43% plan to by 2027. Once fully implemented, Indian sellers expect agents to cut prospect research time by 35% and email drafting by 38%, giving sales teams meaningful time back in their day. Top-performing sellers are 1.7 times more likely to use prospecting AI agents for outreach than underperformers. 58% of Indian sales reps point to cold calling as the worst part of their job, yet a strong pipeline requires more contacts and more engagement than teams can deliver on their own.



Despite devoting nearly one full day of their workweek to prospecting efforts, 61% of Indian sellers say they lack bandwidth to do adequate cold outreach. Cargo ship catches fire in Strait of Hormuz after three vessels hit by 'unknown projectiles'

Iran says it won't allow 'a single litre of oil' to pass through Strait of Hormuz. Iran says its policy for reciprocal strikes "has ended", a spokesman for Tehran's Khatam al-Anbiya military command headquarters says in a statement. Tehran's policy now will be "strike upon strike," spokesman Ebrahim Zolfaqari says. Tehran will "not allow even a single litre of oil" to pass through the Strait of Hormuz to reach the US, Israel and their partners, Zolfaqari adds. "Any vessel or tanker bound to them will be a legitimate target." "Get ready for the oil barrel to be at \$200 because the oil price depends on the regional security which you have destabilised," the spokesman adds. Germany's economy minister appears to have confirmed plans for the International Energy Agency (IEA) to make the biggest release of oil reserves in its history. She said the 32 members have been asked to release 400m barrels collectively. That's a



significant chunk because it's about a third of the total these governments hold. Katherina Reiche said her country would contribute to what she called "an instrument for dealing with supply shortages" and that it was "clear that there must be a visible signal to the market to curb high risk premiums and speculative gains with such a significant step". This global effort to calm energy markets comes after oil prices have

been particularly volatile in recent days, sending shockwaves through the global economy. They remain significantly ahead of where they were before the Iran war started - as I write this, a barrel of benchmark Brent Crude is trading at over \$91 (£68). Earlier, Japan, which has one of the biggest reserves, said it was planning to release 15 days' worth of private-sector oil reserves and one month's worth of

state oil reserves, according to Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi. She said "rather than wait for formal IEA approval of a coordinated international reserve release, Japan will act first to ease global energy market supply and demand, releasing reserves as early as the 16th of this month". Meanwhile Austria's energy minister says they "will support a decision in principle". All are members of the IEA which is

reported to be announcing a decision on a release in the coming hours but hasn't responded to my enquiries. Israel has announced a "wide-scale wave" of attacks against Iran and further attacks against Beirut while Iran continues to strike neighbouring countries in the Gulf region. Strait of Hormuz Thailand's navy says it is assisting after a Thai-flagged cargo ship was attacked in the Strait of Hormuz, with 20 of the 23 crew members already rescued by Oman's navy. The UK Maritime Trade Operations (UKMTO) has reports that, in total, three cargo vessels have been hit by unknown projectiles in the strait today. Overnight the US military said it destroyed 16 mine-laying Iranian ships in the strait. Continued airstrikes Israel has announced a further "wide-scale wave" of strikes against both Beirut and Iran after confirming that it struck targets in the Dahieh suburb Beirut earlier on Wednesday. BBC reporter

Alice Cuddy was at the scene of an Israeli strike in southern Lebanon which left a four-storey building ablaze, while Carine Torbey reports from a strike in central Beirut. Four people have been injured after two drones fell near Dubai International Airport, while the UAE, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Oman have all reported Iranian attacks. Oil prices Sources tell the BBC that the UK is prepared to support a coordinated release of collective Energy Agency oil reserves as prices remain volatile due to the conflict. It comes as energy ministers in the G7 say they have given support "in principle" for the use of strategic energy reserves. In the UK, Prime Minister's Questions is under way and the focus is on the war in Iran, with Keir Starmer asked about the knock-on impact on the British public and whether British troops will get involved.

AT LEAST SIX DEAD IN SWITZERLAND BUS FIRE



At least six people have been killed and others injured after a bus caught fire in a town in western Switzerland, according to police. The incident took place at around 18:25 local time (19:25 GMT) on Tuesday in the centre of Kerzers - known in French as Chiètres - in Fribourg canton, about 20km (12 miles) from the capital, Bern. At least three people were taken to hospital, police said, and there were reports that a rescuer was also hurt. The cause of the fire is not yet known but local police said the fire was believed to have been started deliberately. There have been reports that a person doused themselves

in gasoline but the authorities said they could not immediately confirm this. While the act is thought to be intentional, there is no evidence it was terror related, a spokesperson for Fribourg police told Swiss national broadcaster RTS on Wednesday. Romain Collaud, a local politician, also confirmed to RTS that "we have no indication that suggests we might be dealing with a terrorist attack". Video posted by local media shows a bus in flames, and a local resident described seeing a thick column of smoke. The bus involved had reportedly travelled from the Düringen municipality, 17km south of Kerzers.

MUGABE'S SON DROPS BAIL REQUEST - WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO THE FAMILY AFTER LOSING POWER



The arrest in South Africa of the youngest son of Zimbabwe's former President, Robert Mugabe, has brought renewed attention to the former first family and their controversies over the years. Bellarmine Mugabe, who appeared in court on Wednesday for a bail hearing, is accused of attempted murder, among other charges, after a 23-year-old man was shot and injured at a property in an upmarket suburb of Johannesburg. He has not commented on the charges but in an unexpected move, he abandoned his request for bail and agreed to plea negotiations with South African prosecutors. He is charged alongside his bodyguard. Their lawyer Sinenhlanhla Mnguni said it was "premature to say... whether we will plead guilty to anything at this stage". The matter returns to court next Tuesday. His father led Zimbabwe for 37 years before being forced out of power at the age of 93 in 2017. He died two years later. The long-serving president and his second wife Grace had three children together: Bona Mugabe - now 37 Robert Mugabe Jr - now 33 Bellarmine Mugabe

- now 28. Grace also had a son from an earlier marriage: Russell Goreraza - now in his early 40s. Managing editor of Zimbabwean privately owned NewsHawks website, Dumisani Muleya, told the BBC that the Mugabe family had "lived a life of privilege" and that the children "grew up in that environment where they were protected from the broader realities of the Zimbabwean political and socio-economic situation". The family had amassed a vast personal fortune, including \$10m (£7.5m) in cash, four houses, 10 cars, a farm and an orchard among other assets. These details emerged three months after Robert Mugabe's death in a legal letter submitted to the high court in Zimbabwe by his daughter Bona. At the time, a lawyer for the family, Terrence Hussein, told the BBC that none of the properties were under the former leader's name. In 2013, Grace denied that her husband was accumulating wealth while in office, saying her husband did not earn as much as people thought as he was a civil servant. "The allowance I get is just a pittance.


GEORGIA RACE TO REPLACE MARJORIE TAYLOR GREENE HEADS TO A RUNOFF

The special election to replace former Georgia Congresswoman Marjorie Taylor Greene is projected to head to a runoff after none of the candidates secured a majority of the votes on Tuesday night. Republican Clay Fuller, who received President Donald Trump's endorsement, is projected to face Democrat Shawn Harris to represent Georgia's 14th congressional district, according to a projection by the BBC's US partner CBS. The two candidates beat out a crowded field of 17 candidates for the runoff slots. Trump gave Fuller his "complete and total endorsement" in a Truth Social post and while holding a rally in Rome, Georgia, last month. Tuesday's election served as an early test of Trump's power to shape the upcoming

midterm elections in November. "For those of you who questioned how important Donald J Trump is to this country, to Georgia 14, and the state of Georgia, you see what this man means to this community, what he means to the people in this country, and what he means to the MAGA movement," Fuller, a former district attorney, said on Tuesday night. The runoff election will be held 7 April. Whoever wins the seat will serve out the rest of Greene's term, which ends in January, but they must begin campaigning again immediately to win their own full term in Congress in the midterms. Harris, the Democrat, received the most votes on Tuesday night, likely due to the fact that the Republican base splintered among many candidates.

JEFFREY EPSTEIN HAD TWO KEY AIDES - WHY DO THEY STILL CONTROL HIS MONEY AND SECRETS?

When the FBI raided Jeffrey Epstein's New York mansion in July 2019, on the day he was arrested for child sex trafficking, agents forced open a large safe to find diamonds, bundles of cash, passports, binders of CDs and hard drives. But an issue with the warrant meant they could not leave with the items. And when they returned with a new one, the safe had been emptied while they were gone - according to FBI documents. Richard Kahn, Epstein's accountant and bookkeeper since 2005, had told the mansion's staff to pack two suitcases with the contents of the safe and deliver them to his home, agents wrote. After the FBI spoke to Kahn's then lawyer, Kahn agreed to hand over the suitcases untouched, but he did not want agents coming to



his house and declined to say who had told him to remove the items. However, a source close to the investigation into Epstein told us that he was not aware of Kahn ever being interviewed or investigated in relation to the paedophile financier's criminal investigation. Kahn's current lawyer told BBC News that his client had fully co-operated with the FBI's requests. Kahn, and Epstein's long-

part of its investigation into Epstein's network, the congressional committee has subpoenaed - summoned - the pair to testify. Kahn is appearing on Wednesday 11 March, while Indyke is due to testify on Thursday 19 March. We have spoken to people associated with investigations linked to Epstein, looked through papers from multiple court cases, and analysed the most recent material released in the Epstein files by the US Department of Justice - to try to uncover more about the role the two men are alleged to have played in Epstein's life and continue to play after his death. Epstein appointed Indyke and Kahn as co-executors in August 2019, just two days before he died in jail awaiting trial for sex-trafficking minors.

LARGE PARTS OF DRESDEN EVACUATED AFTER 250KG WW2 BOMB FOUND

Much of the centre of the German city of Dresden has been evacuated, after the discovery of a large unexploded British World War Two bomb. The 250kg (551lb) device was discovered near the former Carola Bridge, which collapsed in the Elbe River in 2024. The fire brigade in Dresden says this is the city's largest evacuation to date for such an incident, affecting around 18,000 residents, tourists and commuters. Much of the old town has been cordoned off, including some of the city's most famous buildings - the iconic Frauenkirche Lutheran church, the



Residenzschloss Palace and the Semper Opera. The police headquarters, Saxony's state parliament, several ministries, retirement and nursing homes, daycare centres and other social institutions are also located in the evacuated area. The authorities are

providing emergency accommodation at the Dresden Exhibition Centre from 07:00 (06:00 GMT), while additional buses and trams will be running to this location. It is not clear how long it will take to defuse the bomb. Dresden was attacked by

British aircraft on 13 February 1945. In the days that followed, the British and their US allies dropped nearly 4,000 tons of bombs in the assault on the city. The ensuing firestorm killed 25,000 people and ravaged the city centre, once known as the Jewel Box because of its Baroque and Rococo architecture. Four other bombs were found during demolition work on the Carola Bridge last year. The attack on Dresden is one of the most controversial Allied acts of World War Two. Some say it was strategically justified. Others argue it was a war crime.

CARNEY INCHES CLOSER TO MAJORITY, AS FOURTH MP DEFECTS TO LIBERALS



A fourth MP of the current Canadian parliament has defected to join the Liberals, bringing Prime Minister Mark Carney closer to a majority in the House of Commons. Lori Idlout, a member of the left-leaning New Democrats (NDP), is joining the governing party. In a statement issued by the Liberals, she said she had undergone "much personal reflection and encouragement from my community, family, and supporters". Interim NDP leader Don Davies said he was "very disappointed", adding: "We believe that when someone rejects the decision of their electors and wants to join another party, they should put that decision to their voters." The Liberals said they were "deeply excited to welcome" Idlout. Idlout was first elected as an MP from the Canadian territory of Nunavut in 2021. She told the CBC in January that she had been asked to consider joining the Liberals but was not yet ready to make the move. Carney, who leads a minority government, has been closing in on a majority in recent months - largely helped by recent defections by three former Conservative members of parliament. In February, Matt Jeneroux, a

Conservative from Edmonton, joined the Liberal caucus. Two other Conservative MPs, Chris d'Entremont of Nova Scotia and Michael Ma of Ontario, had crossed the floor late last year to join Carney's government. Opposition Conservatives have accused the Liberals of using "pressure tactics" on their members. Over the weekend, Carney also announced three by-elections on 13 April - races that could secure the Liberals the majority government that they crave. Two of the by-elections will be held in Toronto, in constituencies that are considered Liberal strongholds. The third will be a closely-watched contest in Montreal that his party won by just one vote in the last election - a result that was nullified by the Supreme Court. If the Liberals win all three seats in April, following the addition of Idlout, they would secure 173 seats in the House of Commons, allowing the prime minister to likely avoid an election for three more years. In the federal election a year ago, the NDP won just seven seats after losing significant vote share to rival parties. The NDP will vote for a new leader later this month.



Ukraine says it has hit Russian 'missile component' plant

Zelensky sends drone teams to Middle East, touting Ukraine's expertise

Teams of Ukrainian military experts have been sent to Qatar, the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia to help them defend against drones being launched from Iran in retaliation for the massive US and Israeli air attacks. Others are also helping the US defend its military presence in Jordan, according to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky. In a video address, Zelensky said Ukraine had "the greatest experience in the world in countering attack drones" - a reference to expertise built up over the more than four years of attacks by Russia on its neighbour. Ukraine says the US and 10 more countries across the Middle East and Europe have asked for help countering the threat of



drones that have wrought much damage. There has been no comment by any of the countries concerned. Last week President Trump said he would take help from "any country" that offered it, including Ukraine. In his address, Zelensky said one of Ukraine's top officials, Rustem Umerov, secretary of the National Security and Defence Council, was on his way to the Gulf.



Jay Shah's Unnoticed Act With New Zealand Players After T20 World Cup Final Loss Earns Praise

ICC chairman Jay Shah, who earlier served as BCCI secretary, recently attended the T20 World Cup 2026 India vs New Zealand final in Ahmedabad. During his time with the BCCI, the Women's Premier League was launched, pay parity between men's and women's cricketers was introduced, record-breaking media rights deals for the IPL were signed, and domestic cricket witnessed massive upliftment. Jay Shah, after resigning from his post as BCCI secretary towards the end of 2024, took over as ICC chairman in December the same year. After the T20 World Cup final 2026, several videos of Jay Shah went viral in which he could be seen with Indian cricket legends MS Dhoni and Rohit Sharma. In fact, after India's win, Jay Shah and the side's skipper Suryakumar Yadav, along with coach Gautam Gambhir, went to a Hanuman temple in Ahmedabad and took the trophy along. But Jay Shah



did not interact only with the Indian players. In a recent viral video, Jay Shah can be seen meeting the New Zealand players. The act was appreciated by social media users. Coming to the match, NZ won the toss and elected to field first. However, a return-to-form, record-breaking fifty from Abhishek Sharma (52 in 21 balls, with six fours and three sixes) and his 98-run stand with Sanju Samson (89) made NZ regret the decision. Later, Samson stitched a century stand with Ishan Kishan (54 in 25

balls, with four boundaries and four sixes) to take India past the 200-run mark in the 16th over. After a brief slowdown, Shivam Dube (26* in eight balls, with three fours and two sixes) made some valuable runs to take India to 255/5, the highest total in T20WC finals. James Neesham (3/46) was the leading wicket-taker for NZ. In the run-chase of 256 runs, Axar Patel (3/23) and Jasprit Bumrah (4/15) reduced the Kiwis to 72/5, despite a half-century from Tim Seifert (52 in 26 balls,

with two fours and five sixes). Despite a brief partnership between Daryl Mitchell (17) and skipper Mitchell Santner (43 in 35 balls, with three fours and two sixes), India kept chipping in with wickets, and the Kiwis were bundled out for just 159 runs. The International Cricket Council (ICC) has issued a statement acknowledging the frustration of players, coaches, support staff, and families who remain stranded following the conclusion of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026. The governing body confirmed that ongoing disruptions across the Gulf region have severely impacted international air travel, delaying the safe return of teams to their home countries. According to the ICC, the crisis has led to airspace closures, missile warnings, re-routing constraints, and last-minute cancellations of both commercial and charter flights. These conditions, the ICC stressed, are entirely outside its control

and have made travel arrangements "significantly more complex and time-consuming" than usual. We understand that players, coaches, support staff and their families who have completed their ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026 campaigns are anxious to return home. That they have not yet been able to do so is a source of genuine frustration, and the International Cricket Council (ICC) shares that frustration. The delay is the direct result of the ongoing crisis across the Gulf region, which has caused widespread and continuing disruption to international air travel, including airspace closures, missile warnings, re-routing constraints, as well as the cancellation and rescheduling of both commercial and charter flights at short notice. These are conditions entirely outside the ICC's control, and they have made each travel solution significantly more complex and time-consuming than under normal circumstances.

SANJU SAMSON TO BECOME NEXT T20I CAPTAIN?

Mohammad Kaif believes that Sanju Samson can become the next Indian cricket team T20I captain after his brilliant performances in the T20 World Cup. Samson slammed three consecutive half-centuries, including two in the semifinal and final, to guide his team to a record third T20 World Cup title. The wicket-keeper batter, who has captained Rajasthan Royals in the Indian Premier League (IPL), was instrumental in his team's success and his redemption story has earned his praise from both fans as well as experts. Kaif said that Samson is a good fit because of his experience in the shortest format of the sport and the ex-India batter pointed out that his stint as a captain in the IPL can also help him a lot if he succeeds Suryakumar Yadav. "Tough to say right now as to who would become the next captain, but Samson could well be the one. I



mean, why not? A Captain must be someone who has seen the world. Implementing bowling changes, playing the perfect XI, and backing players out of form, as with Abhishek Sharma and Varun Chakaravathy. A captain would know that these things happen. They themselves have gone through this. They understand these little things," Kaif told Ravish Bisht in a

video. "So, I feel, Samson sure can be a candidate. However, if Surya keeps playing well then he can hold on to the position longer. If you're fit, you can play till 38-39. There's no problem. And in the shorter format, you need more experience. Someone who has captained remains forever valuable. If Surya decides to step down, Sanju can fill that position.

Waseem Bilal On Winning REIHL Season 3 And Ladakh's Next Wave Of Ice Hockey Talent

With the Royal Enfield Ice Hockey League Season 3 concluding in Ladakh earlier this winter, one of its standout performers - Humas Warriors' Assistant Captain Waseem Bilal - reflect on his journey in the sport, the intensity of the competition, and what winning the League has meant for players emerging from the region's growing ice hockey community. Q. Growing up in Drass, how did that shape you as a player? A. Growing up in Drass, the harsh winter is a way of life. It's extremely cold, and sometimes even reaching the rink feels like a training session in itself. Lacking fancy facilities or modern gear, we played on natural ice and adapted. You learn to



fall, get up, and keep going-it becomes second nature. For me, initially Ice hockey was something that gave excitement during long winters. We weren't chasing big dreams; we just wanted to play. But as I started competing elsewhere and facing new teams, I realised that with enough hard work, I

could reach their level. Ultimately, Drass made me strong mentally because if you can train in that cold, you can handle pressure in games also. Q. You made sacrifices to continue playing. How do you look at that now? A. At that time, I didn't think of it as a sacrifice. I just felt that if I really want-

ed to continue, I had to make a choice. Selling my bike was emotional because it was a gift from my father. But I knew I needed proper equipment if I wanted to compete seriously. Without that, I would always fall behind. Now, when I look back after winning the League, I don't see it as a sacrifice. I see it as a step I had to take to move forward. There were moments when it felt easier to step away. But something inside kept telling me to continue. The title is special, but more than that, the journey taught me resilience. That stays with you longer than any medal. Q. As Assistant Captain, what did you focus on this season? A. Leadership for me is mostly about consistency.

Gautam Gambhir's Befitting Reply To Kirti Azad's "Degrading" T20 World Cup Remarks

Not known to be a man who minces his words, India head coach Gautam Gambhir has hit back at cricketer-turned-politician Kirti Azad's criticism of the team's temple visit with the T20 World Cup trophy. Azad criticised the Indian team, Gambhir, and the International Cricket Council (ICC) chairman Jay Shah for visiting the Hanuman Temple in Ahmedabad soon after India beat New Zealand in the final to win the trophy. Gambhir hit back at Azad, saying that such remarks "degrade his own team and players, which should not be done." India's triumphant T20 World Cup squad, led by captain Suryakumar Yadav and coach Gambhir, visited a Hanuman temple in



Ahmedabad to offer prayers with the trophy. The gesture drew sharp criticism from 1983 World Cup winner and Trinamool Congress MP Kirti Azad, who questioned why the trophy was taken only to a temple and not to other places of worship, calling it discriminatory. Gambhir, known for his outspoken nature, defended the

team's choice and gave a strong response to Azad over the controversial remarks. "It is not even worth answering this question. Answering that question, it is a big moment for the entire country. If you ask me, then it's a huge moment for our whole country. I think it's important that we celebrate the World

Cup winner. That's why I said certain statements; there is no point picking up certain statements, because these statements will only dilute your achievement. If you want to dilute the achievements of those 15 players and their efforts, then tomorrow anyone can give any statement, and we start taking it seriously, which isn't fair to the boys," Gambhir said during a chat with ANI. He stressed that players should be allowed to celebrate in their own way without political or religious interference. "Imagine that the boys have gone through so much - the amount of pressure they've been under after losing one match in South Africa, the kind of pressures the boys were under.

HOW KINSKY'S HORROR NIGHT UNFOLDED BEFORE 17TH-MINUTE SUBSTITUTION

Tottenham replaced goalkeeper Antonin Kinsky in the 17th minute of their Champions League last-16 tie at Atletico Madrid after conceding three goals. The Czech Republic international, 22, endured a nightmare start and interim boss Igor Tudor quickly replaced him with Guglielmo Vicario. Italian Vicario has started the majority of Tottenham's games this season but was dropped for Tuesday's first-leg tie in Madrid after being criticised for poor performances. Vicario conceded five minutes after coming on as Atletico stormed into a 4-0 lead by the 22nd minute, before Pedro Porro reduced the deficit by half-time. But Spurs face an almighty task to turn it around in the second leg on 18 March after



losing 5-2. Tottenham signed Kinsky from Slavia Prague in a deal worth about £12.5m in January 2025. His first error - a slip - led to Marcos Llorente making it 1-0 in the sixth minute, before Antoine Griezmann added a second eight minutes later. Kinsky, who last started a game in October - the second of two Carabao Cup games this season - was also at fault

for Atletico's third goal, gifting the ball straight to Julian Alvarez to finish easily in the 15th minute. Kinsky had his head in his hands and was taken off less than two minutes later. He was not acknowledged by Tudor before he headed down the tunnel. BBC Sport's chief football writer Phil McNulty, who was at the match, said he was not sure he had "ever witnessed anything quite like this" after Spurs' series of mistakes was followed by Tudor's decision to take Kinsky off. BBC Sport's Spanish football reporter Elizabeth Conway, also at the match, said Kinsky was shown support by teammates Kevin Danso, Cristian Romero and Pedro Porro as he left the pitch.

IS TUDOR'S SPURS REIGN ALMOST UP AFTER ONLY FOUR GAMES?

If Igor Tudor's jaw-dropping removal of goalkeeper Antonin Kinsky after 17 calamitous minutes in Madrid was a brutal example of a mistake being rectified swiftly, then is it time for Tottenham Hotspur's hierarchy to consider doing the same? Interim head coach Tudor delivered the time-honoured blunt "no comment" when asked whether he deserved to keep his job after the 5-2 loss at Atletico Madrid, his fourth straight defeat. This situation, like Spurs' season, seems out of his control even after only 26 days in charge. In reality, the Croat's position is looking increasingly untenable, every scrap of evidence produced since he succeeded Thomas



Frank suggesting he is the wrong man in the wrong place. With their former manager Mauricio Pochettino watching on from the stands in Madrid, the Spurs power brokers must be pondering another emergency appointment as their season slipped further into crisis. In the emotional, atmospheric surroundings of the Metropolitan this was, in

a strictly sporting context, like being present at the scene of an accident. This was Spurs in microcosm with mistake piled upon mistake - the self-destruct button pressed with despairing regularity. And at the centre of it all was poor 22-year-old Kinsky, selected ahead of previous first-choice Guglielmo Vicario, but substituted in short order after two slips gifted goals to Marcos Llorente and Julian Alvarez. If the Spurs fans who travelled to Madrid - with neither hope nor expectation - thought this wretched season could not produce fresh horrors for them, one of the worst opening 23 minutes in the club's recent history soon put them straight.

'IT'S WILT, ME, THEN KOBE' - ADEBAYO SCORES 83 POINTS



Bam Adebayo scored 83 points - the second highest number in an NBA game - as the Miami Heat beat the Washington Wizards 150-129. The center said it was a "special moment" when he passed Kobe Bryant's 81-point tally, set in 2006. Wilt Chamberlain's record of 100 points has stood since 1962. Adebayo scored 36 of 43 free-throws - records for the most free-throws attempted and most free-throws made - at Kaseya Center in Miami. "It's Wilt, me, then Kobe, which sounds crazy," he said. The 28-year-old described it as a "special moment" and said he "really got emotional" when he realised the scale of his achievement. "I wish I could relive it twice," Adebayo said.

"To have this moment and share it with all them, it's a pretty emotional moment." TRUMP WILL WELCOME IRAN AT WORLD CUP - INFANTINO

US President Donald Trump has said Iran are "welcome" to take part in this summer's World Cup despite the countries being at war, according to FIFA president Gianni Infantino. Posting on Instagram, Infantino said he met with Trump on Tuesday to discuss preparations for the tournament, which is being hosted by the US, Canada and Mexico and gets under way on 11 June. Infantino said he and Trump "spoke about the current situation in Iran". Iran are scheduled to play three

matches in the US, but their participation has been in doubt since the US and Israel launched strikes on the country this month, killing Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. Iran responded by launching missiles and drones towards Israel and four Gulf Arab countries which host US military bases - Bahrain, Kuwait, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates. "During the discussions, President Trump reiterated that the Iranian team is, of course, welcome to compete in the tournament in the United

States," Infantino said. "We all need an event like the Fifa World Cup to bring people together now more than ever, and I sincerely thank the president of the United States for his support, as it shows once again that football unites the world." Iran are due to face New Zealand and Belgium in Los Angeles on 15 and 21 June respectively and Egypt in Seattle on 26 June. Trump last week told Politico, external "I really don't care" if Iran play in the World Cup. Following the outbreak of military action, Iran football federation president

Mehdi Taj has been quoted as saying: "What is certain is that after these attacks, it's hard to look at the World Cup with hope." Australia has granted six humanitarian visas to members of Iran's women's team over concerns about their safety. The remaining Iran players left Australia on Tuesday after the team's elimination from the AFC Asian Cup. Australia's Home Affairs Minister Tony Burke said seven people were granted asylum, but one woman later changed her mind and opted to return home.




