Governor's address historic reflects Telangana's Vision says CM Revanth

Hyderabad TSIT BUREAU: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday described the Governor's address to the joint session of the Legislature as "historic," stating it reflects the people's aspirations and the government's vision for the state's development. Speaking in the Assembly, CM Reddy said the Governor's speech outlined a comprehensive roadmap to transform Telangana into a \$1 trillion economy by 2034 and a \$3 trillion economy by 2047. He thanked Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla for presenting the visionary plan.

Taking a dig at the opposition, the Chief Minister expressed disappointment over the absence of the Leader of the Opposition, K. Chandrashekar Rao, despite significant occasions. He alleged that feudal attitudes persist among some leaders and pointed out that Rao had received over Rs.1 crore in salaries and allowances since December 2023 without attending Assembly proceedings.

Highlighting the government's focus, CM Reddy stressed the need to prepare

for the emerging "AI tsunami" and mentioned forward-looking policies in the Telangana Rising 2047 Vision document.

He also announced tax exemptions for EV purchases and plans to retrofit autos into electric vehicles free of cost. On encroachments, he accused the previous government of inconsistency and proposed a fact-finding committee to examine illegal constructions in Musi and Uppal Bhagayat.

INDIAN NAVY BOLSTERS PRESENCE NEAR GULF OF OMAN, ESCORTS INDIAN VESSELS

New Delhi (TSIT): Amid escalating tensions in West Asia, the Indian Navy has significantly increased its warship deployment near the Gulf of Oman and is actively escorting Indian-flagged vessels from the Strait of Hormuz to ensure their safe passage.

Government sources confirmed that Indian-flagged tankers continue to navigate the strategically vital Strait of Hormuz under naval escort. Vessels including Shivalik, Nanda Devi, and Jag Ladki have already arrived safely at Indian ports.

The enhanced deployment is part of the Navy's "mission-based deployment" framework, operational since 2017. While at least one warship has been stationed near the Gulf of Oman since then, the current security situation has prompted a substantial increase in presence. The number of warships was initially raised from one to three and has been increased further, though the exact count remains undisclosed.

ACB nabs excise inspector, seizes Rs 20 lakh in benami bribery case

Karimnagar: ACB officials arrested Karimnagar Urban Excise Inspector Gundeti Ramu and his accomplice, teacher Jakkani Venu, on Tuesday night for allegedly collecting bribes through benami transactions. Ramu, who previously served as Vemulawada SHO, allegedly received monthly bribes



from jaggery traders via UPI transfers to Venu's accounts between 2019 and 2024. The money was later routed to their relatives. Searches at Ramu's residence led to the seizure of Rs 20 lakh unaccounted cash. Both were produced before the ACB special court.

EDITORIAL

The Key Templates That Defined India's Op Sindoor

Operation Sindoor, the 88-hour 'mini-war' between India and Pakistan in May last year, came to redefine modern aerial conflict in ways that are now evident in the ongoing war being fought in the Middle East.

While my recently published book, *The Sky Warriors: Operation Sindoor Redefined*, focuses on first-person accounts of the Indian Air Force's (IAF) war fighters between May 7 and May 10 last year, the conflict itself can be seen through the prism of five key templates that this article lists, along with small excerpts from the book.

Air combat fought between fighter jets or by surface-to-air missile systems targeting fighters is increasingly premised on ultra-long-range weapons. Air-to-air or surface-to-air engagements, which could reliably take place at ranges no more than 100 km in the last decade, are now being fought at ranges beyond 400 km. During Op Sindoor, Russian-built S-400 surface-to-air missile systems operated by the IAF from Adampur proved to be decisive in engaging Pakistani airborne targets, in the process swinging the conflict decisively in India's favour.

On October 7, shortly after the IAF and Indian Army struck terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, Group Captain Animesh Patni, who went on to be honoured with a Vir Chakra, helmed one of the firing units of the S-400. With missiles flying across the international border, Patni knew he could be called into action in minutes. He was. Patni was ordered to fire. Weapons free, engage targets. It was a scenario that he had trained for time and time again, but always with his formidable weapons system in safe mode - the missiles would not leave their launchers. The radars and systems would simulate incoming threats. And kills would not be real. But this was the real deal."

In *The Sky Warriors*, I describe just how Patni and the officers and men under his command ended up bringing down a PAF Airborne Early Warning or Electronic Warning aircraft at a range of more than 400 km. No Air Force is believed to have shot down an enemy aircraft at this range.

The Vital Role of Integrated Electronic Warfare (EW)

Operation Sindoor demonstrated that modern air warfare is all about managing the electromagnetic spectrum - the strategic control of radio, radar, and infrared waves to ensure your own communications and sensors work while simultaneously blinding, jamming, or "listening" to those of the adversary. Aircraft equipped with advanced internal EW suites, such as the Rafale's SPECTRA system, were able to operate within highly contested "bubbles" by jamming enemy fire-control radars and spoofing incoming missiles. In the book, I write in detail about the role of SPECTRA in protecting IAF Rafales from enemy air-to-air and surface-to-air missiles.

Group Captain Ranjeet Singh Sidhu, the Commanding Officer of a Rafale squadron who was awarded the Vir Chakra, played a key role in the IAF's attack missions.

"SPECTRA is one of the world's most advanced electronic warning suites. It ended up being a huge advantage, Pakistani radars and missiles tried to lock onto Rafales, but SPECTRA defeated them repeatedly. Yes, the adversary fired a lot of missiles, but they were defeated successfully. [It] was giving us indications [of inbound Pakistani missiles]." The basic point: electronic warfare, in all its forms, is no longer a support function. It is a primary survival tool.

Sensor Fusion and Data Link Resiliency One of the most significant technical takeaways of Operation Sindoor was the success of Sensor Fusion. Pilots who could see a unified "god's eye view" compiled from their own radar,IRST (Infra-Red Search and Track), and off-board data from Airborne Warning and ground-based sensors are likely to have performed significantly better under pressure. In a dense combat environment, processed, fused intelligence is a massive enabler, an asset, one that saves lives.

WORKPLACE, WOMEN'S HEALTH AND MENSTRUAL LEAVE

(Does a mandatory leave policy empower women or risk limiting their...)

Menstruation is a natural biological process in women's lives, but for a long time, it was shrouded in social embarrassment, silence, and neglect. In modern times, as discussions about gender equality, inclusiveness, and sensitive workplace policies have intensified, the concept of "compulsory menstrual leave" has also become central to the discussion. Many countries and institutions have adopted policies to provide women with special leave during menstruation, allowing them to rest during times of physical discomfort and mental stress. However, the important question is whether such mandatory policies actually promote equality in the workplace, or inadvertently reinforce gender discrimination in employment. In this context, a critical analysis of this issue is necessary. First, it's important to understand that many women experience physical pain, fatigue, dizziness, or even mental stress due to hormonal changes during menstruation. This can make it difficult for them to continue working at the workplace. The primary objective of the mandatory menstrual leave policy is to protect the health and dignity of women. This policy recognizes that women have different biological needs and should be accommodated accordingly in the workplace. In this regard, this policy embodies gender sensitivity and promotes empathy and respect for women.

Additionally, mandatory menstrual leave is an attempt to break the long-standing silence in workplaces, where menstruation was considered



something to be hidden or shamed. When organizations formally acknowledge this topic, it also sends a positive message at the social level that menstruation is not a weakness but a natural process. This gives women the courage to speak openly about their problems and can create a more humane and sensitive workplace environment. Some experts also believe that such policies can indirectly increase productivity in the workplace. When employees get the rest they need, they recover and work better. If a woman experiences severe pain or discomfort during menstruation and still has to work, her performance may be affected. In such cases, short-term leave can help her regain physical and mental balance. Thus, health-sensitive policies can also prove beneficial for organizations in the long run. However, it's important to consider these arguments in favor of this policy as well as its potential negative impacts. Many critics believe that

mandatory menstrual leave policies may inadvertently promote gender discrimination in employment. If an organization feels that female employees will have to take extra leave each month, it may prioritize male candidates when hiring. Especially in the private sector, where productivity and time management are highly valued, employers may begin to view women as an "additional liability." This perspective also argues that mandatory leave policies may portray women as "less competent" or "less reliable" employees. It may create the impression that women will be unavailable for work for a certain number of days each month, which could negatively impact employers' perceptions of them. As a result, women may have fewer opportunities for higher positions, leadership roles, or important projects. Thus, a policy designed to benefit women may inadvertently hinder their professional development. Another important criticism

is that not all women experience menstruation in the same way. Some women experience extreme pain during this time, while others can function normally. If leave were made mandatory, it would apply even to women who don't need it. This could send the message that every woman is unable to work during menstruation, which is not true. Therefore, many experts believe that the term "mandatory" itself could be problematic. Furthermore, it is argued that providing special leave only for women in workplaces could contradict the principle of equality. The fundamental idea of gender equality is that all employees receive equal opportunities and equal respect. Privileging one group could lead to resentment or a sense of inequality among others. While this argument may not be entirely justified, as equality does not always mean "equal treatment" but also "just treatment," it is still important to consider this perspective in policymaking.

Experiences from several countries also complicate this debate. In some places, despite having a menstrual leave policy in place, women have reduced their use because they fear it may create negative stereotypes. This illustrates that simply having a policy isn't enough; the culture and mindset of the workplace are equally important. If the organization's environment isn't sensitive and supportive, employees may hesitate to take advantage of the available benefits. In this context, some experts advocate for a "flexible and optional policy" rather than "mandatory menstrual leave." They believe that employees should be given the freedom to take leave according to their physical condition. For example, general medical leave or flexible work schedules could allow female employees to work from home or take time off when needed. Such arrangements respect individual needs and can also mitigate the problems arising from mandatory leave.

Debt Trap To Youth Exodus, The Big Crises Ailing Kerala

As Kerala moves quickly towards the 2026 Assembly elections - more quickly than anyone expected, since the Election Commission started the state by announcing polls at three weeks' notice - it has become apparent that this is a 'do or die' moment for the future of Kerala.

Today, Kerala needs change. And it is not an option but a necessity if the State is to survive as a viable economy. The current administration has failed the people of Kerala across the board. One can identify ten crises under which the state is reeling: 1. A Crippling Financial Crisis The government has pushed Kerala into a massive debt trap, borrowing money before the end of the year just to pay routine salaries and pensions. Today, our state spends more money on servicing its debt than on actual development projects. The state is currently trying to run the economy by relying solely on liquor taxes, lotteries, and remittances.

2. The Exodus of Our Youth We have created a highly educated young population, but we have failed to build an economy that can employ them. Because there are no jobs available, our brightest young minds are voting with their feet and fleeing abroad.

3. The Cost of Living Crisis The daily life of the aam admi has become unbearable. Instead of expanding the economy, the government burdens the public (which already pays the highest property taxes, stamp duties and other local levies in the country) with extra taxes and cesses, trapping us in a cycle where stability is maintained at the cost of affordability and progress is abandoned in the effort to make ends meet.

4. Agricultural Distress



Our farmers are in distress. Despite Kerala being one of the world's hottest hotspots of biodiversity, our agricultural backbone is ignored, spices languish, fruit and vegetable farmers can barely make ends meet and procurement payments are delayed for months.

5. A Hostile Environment for Investors

Our state is plagued by ideological politicians, rent-seeking officials, and militant trade unions that thwart progress. We have failed to completely abolish extortion-based practices like nokkukooli (by which union members extort payment for standing and watching your own labour) or ban the coercive practice of hartals.

6. The Collapsing State of Public Healthcare While Kerala has an enviable reputation nationwide for its public health system, the COVID-19 pandemic revealed our deep vulnerabilities. Today, our public healthcare system is faltering thanks to under-funding and neglect, failing to provide resilient systems that protect the most vulnerable.

7. Betrayal in the Cooperative Sector The cooperative banking sector was built on the deep

trust of ordinary people. Recent scams have wiped out the life savings of poor families, breaking the backbone of our rural economy.

8. Decline in Higher Education

Our universities are failing to prepare students for the 21st century. Merit is ignored in the blatant promotion of political interests, and our education system lacks the critical thinking and technological innovation needed for the 21st-century world.

9. Failing Civic Infrastructure and Everyday Crises

We face urgent, everyday crises that the government ignores. Our fragile ecology is threatened by unchecked quarrying and sand mining, as well as reckless, unplanned construction. We are also facing a severe drug crisis among our youth and deadly fatalities from an unchecked stray dog menace.

10. Neglect of Social Welfare

A welfare-only model cannot survive without wealth creation. Because the state has no money, welfare pensions are delayed for months, forcing our most vulnerable to beg for what is rightfully theirs (and which is not

enough to begin with). The list is daunting, but the imminent state election means that an alternative is at hand. Though I am not a candidate myself, I have agreed to take on the co-chairmanship of the Congress Campaign Committee - not just to point out problems but to present a vision for 'Kerala 2.0' that will inspire the jaded electorate, and particularly younger voters, to vote for change.

For too long, we have unwisely compared ourselves to massive industrial states like Tamil Nadu or Maharashtra and lamented our inability to emulate them. Our future does not lie in competing for heavy smokestack industries. We must look across the seas and learn from small, successful states like Singapore, the Netherlands, and Costa Rica - countries with similar challenges of size and population density that have found creative solutions to their own development challenges and become models of success. The UDF manifesto is yet to be finalised, but here are five possible responses to the ten crises outlined above: 1. Building an Innovation and Weightless Economy: We must transform our remittance economy into an innovation economy.

In the second part of Aditya Dhar's spy action thriller, viewers will see Hamza become the 'King of Lyari' after the death of Rehman Dakait (Akshay Khanna). *Dhurandhar 2: Film Exhibitors Bet Big On The Ranveer Singh-Starrer* With packed houses for the paid previews, the success of part one still buzzing, and its release coinciding with Eid and Gudi Padwa holidays, *Dhurandhar: The Revenge* is set for a bumper opening, with industry insiders and trade pundits looking at the Aditya Dhar film setting box office records. The Ranveer Singh-starrer, which comes soon after *Dhurandhar*, releases in cinemas on Thursday, and more than 15 lakh tickets have already been sold. This includes the paid previews, which begin from 5.30 pm on Wednesday.

During the paid previews, they displayed the message: "Due to a delay in receiving the Dolby Vision files, we are unable to screen the film in Dolby Vision format. The current screening will be in 4K projection with Dolby Atmos sound." Amid confusion over show cancellations and delays, filmmaker Aditya Dhar has addressed audiences with an official statement regarding the release of *Dhurandhar 2*. Taking to X, Dhar shared that the film holds deep emotional value for the team. He wrote, "To our dear *Dhurandhar* family, *Dhurandhar* is not just a film for us - it is something we have lived with, nurtured, and dreamed of sharing with each and every one of you, together, at the same moment, in every language." "Most of our Hindi shows across India are running as scheduled from 5 pm onwards. All of our Tamil and Telugu shows will commence from 9 pm onwards. However due to unforeseen technical difficulties, our Malayalam and Kannada shows will begin from tomorrow morning," Dhar added. "If the dubbed version you have tickets for is not currently playing at your cinema, you will have an option for refund or to watch the Hindi version with subtitles. Instead, we truly apologise for the inconvenience. Your love for this film means the world to us, and we cannot wait to share it with you. Team Jio Studios and B62 Studios," the director concluded. A few hours ahead of the release, director Aditya Dhar shared a long note on Instagram, expressing gratitude to audiences and making a heartfelt appeal to protect the film's viewing experience by avoiding spoilers. In his caption, the filmmaker also urged viewers to stay in their seats until the end credits roll. In Delhi NCR, *Dhurandhar 2* is facing last-minute exhibition issues.

Karnataka Seeks Early Approval for Rs.3,052 Crore Projects Under PMKSY and RRR; Centre Responds Positively



New Delhi / Bengaluru : Karnataka has sought expedited approval for irrigation projects worth Rs.3,052 crore under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) and Repair, Renovation and Restoration (RRR) schemes, with the Union Government indicating a positive response, said Minor Irrigation, Science and Technology Minister N.S. Boseraju. During his visit to New Delhi, the Minister submitted a memorandum to Union Minister of State for Jal Shakti V. Somanna, urging early clearance of proposals that are currently pending at various stages within the Ministry. "The State Government has already committed its 40% share of funding in the budget, while the remaining 60% is expected from the Centre. We have requested early approvals to fast-track implementation, and the response from the Union Minister has been encouraging," Boseraju said. Push for Airport Development and Regional Connectivity In a parallel development, Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar, along with Minister Boseraju, held discussions with Union Civil Aviation Minister Kinjarapu Ram Mohan Naidu on key aviation infrastructure projects in Karnataka.

Flooding on Outer Ring Road Largely Resolved Through Comprehensive Lake Development: Chief Commissioner Maheshwar Rao

Bengaluru: The persistent flooding issues on the Outer Ring Road, particularly in the Hebbal-Nagawara region, are set to be largely resolved with the comprehensive development of Hebbal and Nagawara lakes. Chief Commissioner Maheshwar Rao, after inspecting the ongoing works, directed officials to expedite and complete the projects at the earliest.



The development works, being carried out under the Bengaluru North City Corporation limits, aim to address the severe waterlogging that leads to heavy traffic congestion on the Outer Ring Road during the monsoon. Rao noted that innovative wetlands are being developed over 16 acres each in both lakes, designed to store water up to a depth of about 1.5 meters. This will enhance water storage

capacity and ensure that silt and waste are retained within the wetland area, which can be periodically removed to maintain clean lake water.

Flooding Issue Largely Resolved:

At Hebbal Lake, the construction of inlets and wetlands will significantly reduce flooding in Bhadrappa Layout and surrounding Outer Ring Road areas. Similarly, at Nagawara Lake, the wetland

development will help address waterlogging at Veerannapalya Junction and nearby Outer Ring Road stretches.

Adoption of Nature-Based Solutions:

Officials were instructed to implement nature-based solutions to improve water quality in the lakes. Plantation of species capable of absorbing and purifying wastewater is being planned in the wetland areas.

Clear Pending Bills Immediately, Directs BNCC Commissioner Pommala Sunil Kumar

Bengaluru : Commissioner Pommala Sunil Kumar has directed officials to take immediate steps to clear all pending bills under the Bengaluru North City Corporation (BNCC). He emphasized that timely payments would strengthen coordination, trust, and efficiency between the Corporation and its contractors, agencies, and suppliers.



The Commissioner chaired a high-level meeting at his office to review the status of pending bill payments. Officials from various divisions presented detailed reports on outstanding bills related to their respective departments. Discussions were held regarding payments to outsourced staff, contractor bills, and other financial liabilities. The Commissioner instructed concerned officials to clear all dues on a priority basis.

Directions on GAIL Gas Applications:

A separate meeting was also held with officials from GAIL Gas regarding road cutting and related works. It was noted that the agency had submitted 58 applications seeking permission for road cutting. The Commissioner directed that for roads less than one year old or newly constructed, the date of completion must be recorded before considering permission. He categorically stated that permission will not be


granted for road cutting on white-topping roads. The remaining applications were reviewed, and instructions were issued for their expedited disposal as per rules.

DKM Shivakumar Urges Centre to Review Building Height Limits Around Bengaluru Airports

New Delhi: In a move aimed at easing congestion and unlocking the city's development potential, Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar has appealed to the Union Aviation Minister to review and increase the height restrictions for buildings around Kempe Gowda International Airport, Jakkur aerodrome, Yelahanka Air base, and HAL airport.



Speaking to reporters after meeting Union Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu in New Delhi, Shivakumar highlighted the disparity between Bengaluru and other metropolitan cities.

"Hyderabad, Mumbai, and other cities have higher building height limits. We are seeking parity for Bengaluru. Builders are hesitating to purchase

Premium FAR due to these limitations, which is becoming a hindrance for the city's development," he said.

The Deputy Chief Minister expressed optimism after the discussion, noting that the Union Minister assured he would take up the matter with the Defence Minister. "Our officials have had discussions with HAL. I will also meet the Defence Minister personally to push for this, as it is crucial for Bengaluru's growth," Shivakumar added. He was accompanied by Minister Bose Raju and the Government's Special Representative in Delhi, T.B. Jayachandra.

Meeting with Recognized Political Parties on Voter List and Election Preparedness

Bengaluru: A meeting was held with representatives of recognized political parties under the chairmanship of Dr. Rajendra K V, Commissioner of Bengaluru West City Corporation and Additional District Election Officer (ADEO), regarding voter list revision and election preparedness. During the meeting, discussions were held with representatives of recognized political parties on matters related to the preparation of the voter list. The Commissioner instructed the Electoral Registration Officers to take necessary actions in accordance with the standards prescribed by the State Election Commission.

The Commissioner informed that the list containing details of all polling stations will be provided to political parties. He also stated that the objections submitted by political party representatives will be examined as per rules and appropriate action will be taken. Further steps will be carried out in accordance with the guidelines of the State Election Commission. On this occasion, representatives of recognized political parties, Joint Commissioners Sangappa and Aarthi Anand, Assistant Commissioners M. Srinivas and Ramadas, along with all Electoral Registration Officers of the Corporation, were present.

Complete Drain Development Works Before Monsoon: Chief Commissioner Maheshwar Rao



Bengaluru: Chief Commissioner Maheshwar Rao has directed officials to expedite and complete the development of stormwater drains (rajakaluves) across the city before the onset of the monsoon. He emphasized the adoption of nature-based solutions to prevent sewage from entering lakes and to ensure sustainable water management.

Rao made these remarks during an inspection of stormwater drain development works being carried out under the jurisdiction of Bengaluru North City Corporation. The projects are being funded with Rs.175 crore under the National Disaster Mitigation Fund (NDMF) and Rs.2000 crore under the World Bank-assisted Karnataka Water Security and Resilience Programme

Revolution in Animal Waste Management: BSCC Considers Collaboration with 'Vedan' NGO: Commissioner K.N. Ramesh



Bengaluru: In a significant move toward improving city sanitation and public health, Shri K.N. Ramesh, Commissioner of the Bengaluru South City Corporation, held a meeting to prepare a scientific roadmap for systematic animal waste management in collaboration with the NGO 'Vedan'.

During the meeting, representatives from Vedan presented their project through a demonstration. They stated that the primary objective of this initiative is to eliminate the

problem of unscientific waste disposal by meat vendors and establish a well-equipped, hygienic collection system.

Data-Driven Sanitation System

To prevent the haphazard disposal of animal meat waste, an extensive field-level analysis has been conducted under this project. The key highlights of the roadmap are:

Identification of Waste Generation Points: Vedan has surveyed meat and animal product outlets across the zone to map out

waste generation hotspots.

Scientific Auto-Collection Routes: Based on survey data, dedicated auto-collection routes have been designed, specifying precise arrival times and vehicle stoppage durations for each location.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs): A clear framework has been established for meat vendors, defining specific timings and designated transfer points to hand over waste safely. Impact on City Health: By transitioning from an unorganized system to a scientific "Auto-at-Doorstep" model, the Corporation aims to prevent environmental pollution and foul odors caused by unscientific disposal. This planned measure will streamline the collection process without obstructing traffic and enhance overall cleanliness across the Bengaluru South City Corporation limits.

Ensure Proper Connectivity to Shoulder Drains to Prevent Water Stagnation on Roads - Lokhande Snehal Sudhakar



Bengaluru: Additional Commissioner (Development) Lokhande Snehal Sudhakar visited and conducted a comprehensive inspection of ongoing road and infrastructure works across major roads, sub-arterial roads, and ward-level roads within the Bengaluru East City Corporation limits. The inspection focused on progress, quality, and pre-monsoon preparedness, and necessary technical directions were issued to the officials.

Key Locations and Status of Works

HAL Main Road to Outer Ring Road Stretch - Under the Chief Minister's Infrastructure Development Programme (CMIDP), comprehensive development works including road improvement, drainage system

paths and ensure safe and obstruction-free pedestrian movement.

Drainage and Desilting Works-After clearing encroachments, desilting of drains should be taken up immediately, and proper gradient should be ensured for smooth flow of rainwater.

Road Shoulders and Drain Connectivity-To prevent water stagnation on roads, officials were directed to ensure proper connectivity of rainwater to shoulder drains and to install gratings on roadside drains to prevent solid waste from entering the drainage system.

Solid Waste Management-The waste transfer point near Doddanekkundi Circle was found to be causing environmental and public health concerns due to leachate issues. Officials were instructed to relocate the transfer station immediately.

Focus on Comprehensive Development

The Additional Commissioner stated that the Bengaluru East City Corporation is committed to improving road quality, strengthening drainage systems, ensuring pedestrian safety, and enhancing pre-monsoon preparedness across its jurisdiction. During the inspection, Executive Engineers, Assistant Executive Engineers, Assistant Engineers, and other concerned officials were present.

Safety First: Pedestrian Foot Overbridge on Kempegowda Road Closed for Repairs

Bengaluru: In the interest of public safety, the pedestrian foot overbridge near Kandaya Bhavan on Kempegowda Road (in front of Kaveri Bhavan) has been prohibited for public use until further orders. The decision follows a Close Down Order issued by the Commissioner of the Bengaluru Central City Corporation after the structure was found to be in a deteriorated condition. The foot overbridge was constructed in 2012 under the Public-Private



Partnership Design, Build, Finance, Operate and Transfer (PPP-DBFOT) model by M/s Rajdeep Buildcon Private Limited, which has been

responsible for its maintenance. However, recent inspections revealed that

the structure is currently unfit for use, prompting authorities to take immediate action to prevent any untoward incidents.

Officials have urged the public and pedestrians to avoid using the bridge and cooperate with the authorities in the interest of their own safety. The civic body has assured that necessary action will be taken as per rules to repair the foot overbridge and reopen it for public use in the coming days.

Vijay likely to contest from Perambur, turns seat into key battleground

CHENNAI: Actor-turned-politician Vijay is likely to contest from the Perambur Assembly constituency, a move that has already transformed the North Chennai seat into a high-voltage political battleground ahead of the upcoming elections. According to a Maalaimalar report, with groundwork already under way, cadres of Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) have begun election preparations, including setting up a campaign office near Kannadasan Nagar. Senior party leaders are expected to spearhead the campaign in the coming days.



Vijay's decision is said to be based on the party's strong membership presence in the constituency and its favourable demographic profile, including a sizeable Christian voter base. Party functionaries have also reportedly urged

him to choose Perambur. The development has pushed Perambur into the VIP constituency bracket, prompting election authorities and police to plan enhanced security mea-

asures. Perambur, one of the 16 Assembly constituencies in Chennai district, is the largest by electorate size, with around 2.21 lakh voters. The constituency includes an estimated 30,000 Christian voters and over 10,000 Muslim voters, along with significant populations of Dalits, Vanniyars, Nadars, and Naidus. Currently represented by DMK MLA RD Sekar, the constituency has been contested by the party in the last two Assembly elections, though it was earlier allotted to Left parties. The DMK has begun preparatory work, identifying locations in Kodungaiyur's MR Nagar and on SIDCO Main

Road for campaign offices, with Sekar likely to be fielded again.

The AIADMK has also initiated groundwork and is expected to set up its election offices shortly. Traditionally witnessing direct contests between the DMK and AIADMK, the constituency is now headed for a multi-cornered fight, with TVK and Naam Tamilar Katchi entering the fray. Perambur, comprising seven wards, is already witnessing intensified political activity, as parties fan out to mobilise voters and firm up strategies in what is shaping up to be a closely watched electoral contest.

Dharmapuri devotee on way to Rameswaram temple killed in head-on collision

RAMANATHAPURAM: A devotee from Dharmapuri died, and 12 others were injured after a car and a van collided head-on near Uchipuli on Wednesday.



Nine members of a family from Dharmapuri were travelling in a car to the Rameswaram temple. The accident occurred on the NH between Uchipuli and Mandapam near Kuppanivalasai when their car collided with a van coming from the opposite direction. The van was carrying devotees from Mumbai who were return-

ing after visiting the temple and heading towards Bengaluru. Murugesan (50) from Dharmapuri, who sustained severe injuries, died during treatment. Others injured in the

car, including his relative Muniyappan and driver Guru, were admitted to the Ramanathapuram GH. Four people travelling in the van sustained minor injuries.

Plea in Madras High Court seeks recall of order quashing case against TVK's Aadhav Arjuna



CHENNAI: A petition has been filed before the Madras High Court seeking the recall of the order quashing criminal proceedings against TVK general secretary (election campaign management) Aadhav Arjuna, who was accused of posting content on social media allegedly inciting violence.



persons and left more than 100 people injured, Aadhav Arjuna put up a post on a social media platform stating that just like the youth and Gen-Z in Sri Lanka and Nepal came together to create a revolution, a youth uprising would happen in Tamil Nadu, too, to overthrow the government. Though he deleted the post after facing flak, including for the insensitivity of putting up the post so close to one of the worst tragedies in the recent days, a case was

registered against him on multiple counts, including for allegedly inciting violence. Subsequently, Aadhav Arjuna approached the Madras High Court seeking the quashing of the FIR. By an order passed in November 2025, the court noted that the post did not target any community or call for violence. Accordingly, the criminal proceedings were quashed.

Aggrieved by the order, the de facto complainant, an LIC agent named Shanmugam, has now filed a petition before the court seeking the recall of the quashing order, raising the question of its maintainability. When the matter was listed before him, Justice AD Jagadish Chandira held that the petition was maintainable and directed the Registry to number the petition and list it for further hearing.

Gave proper answers on Karur tragedy as witness, says Senthilbalaji

CHENNAI: DMK leader and former Minister V Senthilbalaji said he has provided "proper answers" to all queries raised by the CBI during an interrogation in New Delhi regarding the stampede that occurred in Karur in 2025.



Forty-one people lost their lives, and several were injured in the stampede during the TVK rally that took place on September 27, 2025.

Speaking to reporters at the Chennai airport on the night of March 17, upon his return from Delhi, Balaji clarified that he appeared before the central agency as a witness.

"The questions were primarily regarding the tragic incidents that took place in Karur on September 27, 2025. As someone present on the ground during that

period, I have answered all their questions appropriately," Balaji said.

When pressed for details regarding the nature of the questions or the specific answers provided, he declined to elaborate, citing the ongoing nature of the investigation. "It would not be appropriate to disclose the specific questions and answers shared before an investigative body in the public domain," he added. Balaji informed that he reached the CBI office at 10.15 am on March 17, ahead of the scheduled 10.30 am appointment, and the session concluded around 5 pm.

Kerala man among four arrested with 100 kg of ganja in Coimbatore

COIMBATORE (TSIT): In a major crackdown, Coimbatore city police on Wednesday arrested four persons and seized 100 kg of ganja stored in a godown for distribution.



Acting on a tip-off, a police team raided a warehouse on the Kunyamuthur - Idayarpalayam Road and discovered multiple packs of ganja concealed in one of the rooms, ready for supply. The authorities apprehended Nawfal (53) from Kerala, and three locals, Abbas (37), Benny Jacob (36), and Ruben

Marshal (29) from Coimbatore. Probe revealed that the seized contraband was intended for distribution among college students and other retailers in the city. Police confirmed that two more suspects, reportedly involved in the smuggling network, remain at large, and a search is on.

Pioneering CRISPR Gene Editing Trial: 79% of Participants See Improvement

CRISPR gene editing shows potential in treating blindness, with 79% of trial participants experiencing improved vision. About 79% of clinical trial participants experienced measurable improvement after receiving experimental, CRISPR-based gene editing that is designed to fix a rare form of blindness, according to a paper published today (May 6) in the New England Journal of Medicine.



"This trial shows CRISPR gene editing has exciting potential to treat inherited retinal degeneration," said Mark Pennesi, M.D., Ph.D., a corresponding author on the paper, an ophthalmologist and Oregon Health & Science University's lead scientist for the Phase 1/2 BRILLIANCE trial and a corresponding author on the paper.

"There is nothing more rewarding to a physician than hearing a patient describe how their vision has improved after a treatment. One of our trial participants has shared several examples, including being able to find their phone after misplacing it and knowing that their coffee machine is working by seeing its small lights. While these types of tasks might seem trivial to those who are normally sighted, such improvements can have a huge impact on quality of life for those with low vision." The trial evaluated the safety and effectiveness of EDIT-101, an experimental gene editing treatment that uses CRISPR technology and was developed by Editas Medicine. The experimental treatment was specifically designed to edit a mutation in the CEP290 gene, which provides instructions to create a protein that is critical for sight. People with this mutation have a rare condition that is commonly called Leber Congenital Amaurosis, or LCA, Type 10, for which there is no treatment available. LCA's various types occur in a total of about 2 or 3 out of 100,000 newborns. The OHSU Casey Eye Institute treated the trial's first participant in early 2020. That procedure also marked the first time that CRISPR had been used to edit genes within the human body, which is also called in vivo gene editing. Today's paper describes the study's findings through February 2023, and details how the trial's 14 participants - 12 adults of whom were adults, while two were children - responded to receiving EDIT-101 in one eye. Key results include:

11 participants, or about 79%, showed improvement in at least one of four measured outcomes. 6 participants, or about 43%, showed improvement in two or more outcomes. 6 participants, or about 43%, reported improved vision-related quality of life.

4 participants, or about 29%, had clinically meaningful improvement in visual acuity, or how well they could identify objects or letters on a chart. There were no treatment-related

serious adverse events. Most adverse events were mild or moderate, and all have since been resolved. Four specific outcomes were used to evaluate the experimental treatment's effectiveness: visual acuity, as described above; how well participants saw colored points of light while looking into a specialized device, which scientists call a full-field test; how well participants navigated a research maze with physical objects and varying amounts of light; how much participants reported experiencing improved quality of life. This is the first time that the trial's results have been published in a peer-reviewed scientific journal. Previously, interim results had been shared through conference presentations by investigators and in press releases issued by the trial sponsor.

Future Research Directions
In November 2022, trial sponsor Editas Medicine announced that it was pausing the trial's enrollment and would seek another partner to continue the experimental therapy's development. Pennesi and colleagues are exploring working with other commercial partners to conduct additional trials, in collaboration with Editas. The researchers hope future studies can examine ideal dosing, whether a treatment effect is more pronounced in certain age groups such as younger patients, and include refined endpoints to measure impacts on activities of daily living. "This research demonstrates that CRISPR gene therapy for inherited vision loss is worth continued pursuit in research and clinical trials," said Mass Eye & Ear ophthal-

mologist Eric Pierce, M.D., Ph.D., who is also a corresponding author. "While more research is needed to determine who may benefit most, we consider the early results promising. To hear from several participants how thrilled they were that they could finally see the food on their plates - that is a big deal. These were individuals who could not read any lines on an eye chart and who had no treatment options, which is the unfortunate reality for most people with inherited retinal disorders." "Our patients are the first congenitally blind children to be treated with gene editing, which significantly improved their daytime vision," said the paper's third corresponding author, Tomas S. Aleman, M.D., a pediatric ophthalmologist at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the University of Pennsylvania's Scheie Eye Institute. "Our hope is that the study will pave the road for treatments of younger children with similar conditions and further improvements in vision. This trial represents a landmark in the treatment of genetic disease, in specific genetic blindness, by offering important alternative treatment when traditional forms of therapy, such as gene augmentation, are not an option."

"The results from the BRILLIANCE trial provide proof of concept and important learnings for the development of new and innovative medicines for inherited retinal diseases. We've demonstrated that we can safely deliver a CRISPR-based gene editing therapeutic to the retina and have clinically meaningful outcomes," said Editas Medicine Chief Medical Officer Baisong Mei, M.D., Ph.D. Reference: "Gene-editing for CEP290-associated Retinal Degeneration" by Eric A. LPG CRUNCH: Amazon sees 15 pc demand growth on packaged foods

New Delhi: E-commerce major Amazon India has witnessed a significant surge in demand for convenient, ready-to-consume meals, with categories such as instant noodles, packaged meals, snacks, and beverages recording over 15 per cent growth on its platform, driven by concerns over the ongoing LPG shortage. The spike in demand is not limited to major urban centres but is broad-based, spanning metros like Hyderabad, Kolkata, and Chennai, as well as tier-2 and tier-3 cities such as Sonipat and Panaji, the company said. “Over the past few weeks, we have seen consistent growth in demand for convenient, ready-to-consume meal solutions that require minimal cooking time. Categories such as instant noodles, packaged meals, snacks and beverages are seeing over 15 per cent growth on Amazon.in,” an Amazon India spokesperson said. The demand is particularly pronounced on the company’s quick commerce vertical, Amazon Now. Sales of ready-to-eat and packaged foods on Amazon Now have increased



around 20 per cent month-on-month, driven by customers in select parts of Delhi-NCR, Mumbai, and Bengaluru who are increasingly relying on quick deliveries for immediate needs. Alongside the rise in quick-convenience shopping, the e-tailer reported sustained momentum in planned grocery purchases. Categories such as staples, oils, beverages, and dry fruits and nuts continue to see strong traction, Amazon said, and added that it reflects a balanced con-

sumer shift towards both instant convenience and essential stocking. To cater to this dual demand for immediate and planned grocery shopping, Amazon India has introduced a curated ‘Ready to Eat Store’ to consolidate high-quality meal solutions in one place. In a bid to ease pressure on cooking fuel availability, the central government on Wednesday promised to increase supplies of commercial LPG to states that fast-track the rollout of piped gas

networks. LPG consumption in India dropped 17.7 per cent in the first half of March on the back of supply disruptions due to war in West Asia, preliminary industry data showed. LPG consumption fell to 1.147 million tonne during the first fortnight of March, 17.3 per cent lower than 1.387 million tonne consumed in the same period last year and 26.3 per cent lower than 1.557 million tonne demand in the first half of February.

IRAN CONFIRMS INTELLIGENCE MINISTER KILLED IN ISRAELI STRIKE

Iranian media is reporting that no one was killed or injured as a result of attacks on the country's petrochemical complex on the South Pars gas field. The oil ministry says efforts to control the fire are still under way, according to the Tasnim news agency, which is affiliated with Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC). Tasnim also reports that the attack occurred earlier on Wednesday, blaming action "by Israel and the US". Qatar's foreign ministry spokesman, Majed Al Ansari, said earlier that the South Pars facilities were targeted by Israel. Iran's armed forces has warned it will take "decisive action" in response to attacks on its energy infrastructure, according to a statement carried on the IRGC-affiliated news agency Tasnim. As we've been reporting, Iran has said its facilities at the South Pars gas field have been targeted. "The enemy has attacked part of Iran's fuel and energy infrastruc-



ture in the south," the Iranian military says in a statement. "As previously warned, if the fuel, energy, gas, and economic infrastructures of our country are attacked by the American-Zionist enemy, in addition to a powerful counterattack against the enemy, we will severely strike the origin of that aggression as well. "We consider targeting the fuel, energy, and gas infrastructures of the countries of origin legitimate and will retaliate strongly at the earliest opportunity," it adds. Qatar's foreign ministry spokesman, Majed Al Ansari, says the South Pars facilities were targeted by Israel. As we've just reported, the Iranian President Mazoud Pezeshkian has confirmed the country's Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib has been killed. In a post on X, Pezeshkian says: "The cowardly assassination of my dear colleagues Esmail Khatib, Ali Larjani, and


Aziz Nasirzadeh, along with some members of their families and those accompanying team has left us mourning." The deaths of Larjani, Iran's top security official, and Nasirzadeh, the country's defence minister, have previously been confirmed. Iran's president has confirmed the Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib has been killed. Israel earlier said it had killed Khatib in a strike overnight. Qatar says strikes against Iranian facilities - which it

says were launched by Israel - linked to the world's largest natural gas field are "dangerous and irresponsible". Both Qatar and Iran operate facilities which extract from the same gas field, the Iranian side of which is known as South Pars. Iran says its petrochemical complex at the site has been hit. Qatar's foreign ministry spokesman, Majed Al Ansari, says strikes against energy infrastructure "constitutes a threat to global energy security". "We reiterate, as we have repeatedly emphasised, the necessity of avoiding the targeting of vital facilities," he says, calling on "all parties" to adhere to international law and work towards de-escalation. Israel says it has detected more missiles fired from Iran towards its territory, following a previous wave about two hours ago. The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) says air defence systems are in operation and those who need to shelter will receive alerts on their phone. Oil prices leapt to

more than \$108 a barrel following Iranian media reports that a facility on the world's largest natural gas field was struck. The Brent crude oil benchmark reached \$108.60 a barrel around 13:00 GMT - up by 5% on Tuesday's prices. It remains above \$107. The benchmark UK gas price also soared, rising by nearly 6% to 139p a therm. Both those price spikes are below highs seen earlier in the conflict. Iran has issued evacuation orders for five energy facilities in the Gulf. The IRGC-affiliated news agency Tasnim posted on Telegram an "urgent warning" for citizens and residents near to: The Samref refinery in Saudi Arabia The al-Jubail petrochemical complex and Masaid Holding Company in Saudi Arabia The al-Hosn gas field in the United Arab Emirates And the Ras Laffan refinery in Qatar The statement says: "These centres have become direct and legitimate targets and will be targeted in the coming hours.

Death of Ali Larjani deepens crisis at heart of Iran's leadership



The Israeli air strike which killed Iran's security chief, Ali Larjani, has removed one of the Islamic Republic's most experienced and influential policymakers at a critical moment. Larjani was not a military commander, but he was a central figure in shaping Iran's strategic decisions. As secretary of the Supreme National Security Council, he sat at the heart of decision-making on war, diplomacy, and national security. His voice carried weight across the system, particularly in managing Iran's confrontation with the United States and Israel. After the killing of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei on 28 February, Larjani struck a defiant tone, signalling that Iran was prepared for a long conflict. His death, now confirmed by state media, comes amid a broader campaign in which several senior Iranian officials and commanders have been killed within a matter of weeks. This pattern suggests a sustained effort to weaken Iran's leadership structure during wartime. Despite his hardline stance against the West, Larjani was often described inside Iran as a pragmatist. He combined ideological loyalty with a technocratic approach,

favouring calculated strategy over rhetoric. He remained deeply sceptical of engagement with Western powers, but he was also involved in key diplomatic efforts, including acting as an envoy in Iran's long-term co-operation agreement with China. At the time of his death, Larjani was in charge of managing three major crises. The first was the war itself. He argued that Iran should prepare for a prolonged struggle and expand the conflict across the region and beyond, including closure of the Strait of Hormuz. The second was a wave of domestic unrest, which began with economic grievances but quickly turned into wider protests seeking to topple the Islamic Republic. These were met with a crackdown that killed many thousands of protesters across the country. The third was Iran's nuclear programme and stalled indirect negotiations with Washington, both of which had already been disrupted by military strikes. His removal leaves these issues unresolved and transfers them to an as-yet-unknown successor facing an extremely fragile situation. While Iran has shown resilience,

Air strike hit Kabul rehab centre as patients ate dinner



Rescue teams are continuing to pull bodies from the smoking rubble of a drug rehabilitation centre in the Afghan capital, Kabul, which was hit on Monday night in a devastating Pakistani air strike. The attack on the Omid Addiction Treatment Hospital, which happened at about 21:00 local time (16:30 GMT), is the deadliest in recent violence between Pakistan and Afghanistan. The strike happened as resi-

dents broke their daily fast for the Muslim holy month of Ramadan. The death toll has continued to rise, and the Taliban government says it believes the number of people killed is about 400, although this figure has yet to be confirmed. Many people were also injured. Mohammad Shafee, a patient in his 20s, survived the attack. "I was in the kitchen helping to serve dinner when I heard a loud bang and ran for safety.

Total repression and air strikes bring unrelenting dread for Iranians

A woman stands on a rooftop listening to the sounds of the city below. There is only the dull hum of traffic tonight. But she knows how easily that can change. It is usually the dogs who notice the sound first and begin to bark furiously. The noise of aircraft. Then the ominous percussion of explosions. A ball of orange rising from an airstrike in a familiar neighbourhood. The BBC has obtained footage and interviews from Tehran which evoke a city of strained nerves, of constant waiting for the next blast and relentless fear of the state security apparatus. Baran - not her real name - is a businesswoman in her thirties. She is now too scared to go to work. "With the start of the drone attacks, no one dares to go



outside. If I open my door and step out, it is like gambling with my life." She lives alone but is in constant communication with her friends. "My friends and I message each other constantly asking where everyone is...and even when there is no sound the silence itself is terrifying. I am doing everything I can to stay alive and witness

whatever lies ahead." Like so many young Iranians, Baran saw her hopes of change devastated in recent months. Thousands of people were killed in a crackdown by regime forces in January after widespread demonstrations demanding change. "I cannot even remember how I used to live in the past without being reminded of the

loved one I lost during the protests," she says. "I fear tomorrow. I fear the person I will be tomorrow. Today, I survive somehow, but how will I get through tomorrow? That is the real question. Will I even live through tomorrow?" Now repression is total. Open dissent is impossible as the state's watchers are everywhere. Footage we obtained shows regime supporters driving through the city at night, flags flying from their cars - a message to any who might be tempted to protest. The official narrative is the only one allowed. State television broadcasts footage of demonstrations and funerals. Interviews with pro-regime officials and protestors offer repeated denunciations of America and Israel.

US JUDGE ORDERS TRUMP ADMINISTRATION TO REOPEN VOICE OF AMERICA

A judge in the US has ruled that the effective closure of the Voice of America (VOA) last year was "illegal" and that hundreds of its journalists should be reinstated. District Court Judge Royce Lamberth has given authorities one week to put the international broadcaster back on air. The VOA was set up during World War Two to counter Nazi propaganda. Just weeks after returning to office as president, Donald Trump issued an executive order to close the broadcaster which his officials accused of left-wing bias. Trump also ordered outlets such as Radio Free Europe and Radio Free Asia to be "eliminated to the max-



imum extent consistent with applicable law". The president appointed Kari Lake to head the US Agency for Global Media (USAGM) - the parent company that oversees and funds the VOA as well as Radio Free Europe and Radio Free Asia. Lake proceeded to sack more than

85% of the agency's employees - more than 1,000 staff at VOA alone - leaving just a handful of employees in their jobs. Most have been on paid administrative leave since last year, including Persian Service reporters who were called back to work after Israel attacked

Iran last June. Last week, Judge Lamberth ruled that Lake did not have authority to order the suspension of the USAGM workforce as she had not been confirmed by the US Senate. In Tuesday's ruling, the federal judge described the decision to sack the journalists as "arbitrary and capricious," adding that the government had not taken into account legislation that determines what languages and regions the VOA must serve. "Defendants have provided nothing approaching a principled basis for their decision," Lamberth wrote. Three VOA journalists had sued the Trump administration.

Norway prosecutor asks for seven years' jail for crown princess's son in rape trial



Prosecutors in the trial of Marius Borg Hoiby, son of Norwegian Crown Princess Mette-Marit, have requested a jail term of seven years and seven months, arguing he should be found guilty of 39 of the 40 charges he is accused of. The 29-year-old denies the most serious charges, which include four counts of rape as well as serious assault. The trial, which began in early February, is due to come to an end this week and the three judges will then retire to consider their verdicts. Hoiby was in court on Wednesday as the prosecution wrapped up its case. He was born before his mother married Norway's crown prince in 2001, and grew up within the royal family without being a member of it. He maintains that he had consensual sex with all four women before the alleged rapes took place. His defence lawyers were due to begin summing up their case later. The defendant has pleaded guilty to some of the lesser offences, which include a drugs charge, traffic offences and breaching a restraining order. He has partially admitted a charge of seri-

ously assaulting a woman in her flat but has denied charges of criminal abuse related to his ex-girlfriend Nora Haukland, with whom he maintained a close relationship. The trial at Oslo district court has lasted almost seven weeks and every day of evidence has been front-page news in Norway. Giving evidence last week, the crown princess's son complained of the immense pressure of media coverage of the trial and how he had become an object of hatred. "I'm not Marius any more, I'm a monster," he said. When the case began at the start of February, the crown princess was herself in the public spotlight over revelations surrounding contacts with late sex offender Jeffrey Epstein. Starting his summing-up on Monday, state prosecutor Sturla Henriksbo said Hoiby was "not a monster" and should be judged for what he had done, not for who he was. Going through the charges on Wednesday, Henriksbo and police attorney Andreas Kruszewski recommended the punishments they believed Hoiby should face.

Top US counterterrorism official resigns over Iran war, urging Trump to 'reverse course'

Donald Trump's top counterterrorism official has resigned over the war in Iran, urging the president to "reverse course". In a letter posted on X, National Counterterrorism Center Director Joe Kent said that Iran posed "no imminent threat" to the US and claimed the administration "started this war due to pressure from Israel and its powerful American lobby". The White House dismissed the letter, saying the president had "compelling evidence" that Iran was going to attack the US first. A US hate monitor accused Kent of "antisemitic tropes". With his departure, Kent is the most high-profile figure within the Trump administration to publicly criticise the US-Israeli attack on Iran. In the



Oval Office on Tuesday, Trump said Kent was a "nice guy", but "weak on security". He also said Kent's resignation letter had made him realise "it was a good thing that he's out". In the letter addressed to Trump, Kent alleged that "high-ranking Israeli officials" and influential US journalists had sown "misinformation" that led the president to undermine his "America First" platform.



Rajasthan Royals Unveil New Jersey Ahead Of IPL 2026

Rajasthan Royals unveiled their new jersey for the upcoming Indian Premier League (IPL) season on Wednesday in Jaipur. The winners of the inaugural IPL season in 2008, the Royals shared the news with an Instagram post. "New look, same Halla Bol. Jersey: RRevealed," the caption said. The newly appointed captain, Riyan Parag, was present at the event with destructive teenage batter Vaibhav Sooryavanshi and leg-spinner Ravi Bishnoi. They displayed their new jerseys for the IPL 2026 season at the event. Bishnoi, 25, was acquired by the Rajasthan Royals (RR) for Rs 7.2 crore at the mini auction in December last year. Born in Jodhpur, his move to the franchise is considered a homecoming as he initially started his journey as a net bowler for the team. The franchise is likely to travel to Guwahati on



March 26, 2026, for its season-opening match-up against CSK on March 30, as per the fixtures announced by the IPL Governing Council. Notably, the Rajasthan Royals were involved in one of the biggest trade-offs in

IPL history ahead of the IPL 2026 season. Sanju Samson, who had been the face of Rajasthan Royals for more than a decade, representing the franchise across 11 seasons, was traded to Chennai Super Kings (CSK) and will now

don the yellow colours. Rajasthan Royals, in turn, got Sam Curran and India's seasoned all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja, who were traded to the inaugural champions. Jadeja was part of the Rajasthan squad that lifted

the inaugural IPL trophy in 2008 under the captaincy of the late Australian spinner Shane Warne. The veteran all-rounder represented the franchise during the 2008 and 2009 seasons before moving to other teams in the years that followed.

Australia Legend Sends Massive Warning To KKR Over Rs 25.20 Crore Buy: 'Stuck'

Upon Cameron Green rests a lot of Kolkata Knight Riders fans' hopes. However, former Australian captain and India coach Greg Chappell has raised concerns over the decline in the all-rounder's batting form, saying he feels Green "is stuck in the crease, cannot move, and cannot use his reach and athleticism to score runs." Chappell's comments come ahead of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2026 season, where the young cricketer will represent Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) as one of their marquee players, signed for Rs 25.20 crore. However, despite his recent century in the Sheffield Shield against New South Wales, Chappell expressed worry about Green's form. As quoted by news agency ANI, Chappell said Green's bowling workload has impacted his batting, and while he can still become one of the finest all-rounders, it now depends on his decision-making, mental skill set and the quality of advice he is receiving. "Bowling has impacted his batting. He can still be one of the great all-rounders of the



game because he has the talent, but (it depends on) whether he has the decision-making, the mental skills to go with it, and whether he's getting the best advice on where he is going," Chappell said. "I saw a very athletic young batsman with a beautiful setup and able to move in any direction, and now I see a batsman who is stuck at the crease, who cannot move, cannot use his reach to score runs," he added. During the T20 World Cup, Green fizzled out under the pressure of proving himself not only as a worthy buy for KKR but also as one of the

leading figures of Australia's next generation. With 24 runs in three innings, two single-digit scores, and just one wicket, the 26-year-old all-rounder struggled badly. In the series against Pakistan prior to the World Cup, which Australia lost via a clean sweep, Green was their leading run-getter, scoring 93 runs in three innings at an average of 31.00, with a strike rate above 124 and a best score of 36. His Test batting numbers also look modest, with 1,736 runs in 37 Tests and 59 innings at an average of 32.75, including two centuries and seven fifties.

Senegal government alleges corruption over Afcon

The Senegalese government has called for an "independent international investigation" into "suspected corruption" at African football's governing body after it stripped Senegal of the 2025 Africa Cup of Nations title and awarded it to Morocco. Senegal beat Morocco 1-0 in January's final but the Confederation of African Football (Caf) overturned the result on Tuesday because Senegal's players walked off the pitch in protest when hosts Morocco were awarded a stoppage-time penalty. The players returned after a 17-minute delay, and Brahim Diaz's 'Panenka' penalty for Morocco was saved before Senegal's Pape Gueye scored an extra-time winner. Following an appeal by the Moroccan FA (FRMF), Caf ruled that Senegal had forfeited the match, with the "result being recorded as 3-0



in favour" of Morocco. In a statement the Senegalese government said the "unprecedented and exceptionally serious decision" was based on "a manifestly erroneous interpretation of the regulations, leading to a grossly illegal and deeply unjust decision". It said: "Senegal unequivocally rejects this unjustified attempt at dispossession." Earlier on Wednesday, the Senegalese Football

jury wasn't there to uphold the law, but to carry out an order. "We will stop at nothing. The law is on our side. The fight is far from over. Senegal will defend its rights to the very end." Some Senegal players have suggested they will not relinquish their winners' medals. "We know what we experienced that evening in Rabat. And no-one can take that away from us," Senegal and Everton midfielder Idrissa Gueye said on social media. The walk-off by Senegal prompted the International Football Association Board (Ifab), football's lawmaking body, to open a consultation on how to deal with situations when "players unilaterally decide to leave the field of play, or team officials instigate such action, as a means of protest against a referee's decision".
