ECI ENABLES POSTAL VOTING FOR SENIORS, PWDS, AND SERVICE VOTERS

New Delhi, Mar 19: The Election Commission of India has issued directives enabling senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PwDs), service voters, and voters on election duty to cast their votes via postal ballots in the forthcoming Assembly elections across four states and one Union Territory.

Under Section 60(c) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, electors above 85 years of age and PwDs flagged in the electoral rolls may exercise this facility. Postal ballots must reach the concerned Returning Officers by 8 a.m. on the counting day, May 4, 2026. Eligible voters can apply using Form-12 D, submitted to their RO through booth-level officers within five days of election notification.

CM Revanth Announces Single Window Policy for Film Production Presents Gaddar Film Awards



Hyderabad TSIT BUREAU: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy announced that the Telangana government will soon introduce a single-window online policy to grant all necessary permissions for film production, making Hyderabad a more attractive destination for filmmakers.

Speaking at the Gaddar Film Awards presentation ceremony held in Hyderabad, the Chief Minister said the government is committed to transforming the city into a global hub for film production. He emphasized that Hyderabad is one of the safest cities in the world and assured investors of full support, especially in the backdrop of the current Middle East crisis.

Highlighting the growing global interest, the CM noted



that Netflix has already established its GCC centre in Hyderabad, signaling the arrival of international film production activity. He stated that countries like Japan, South Korea, and the United States would be invited to collaborate and invest, further expanding the film ecosystem in the state.

Revanth Reddy underlined that the government is encour-

aging the film industry on par with IT and Pharma sectors, aiming to make it a major contributor to the economy and employment generation.

The Chief Minister also presented the Gaddar Film Awards, instituted to promote and recognize emerging talent in the industry. Paying tribute to revolutionary balladeer Gaddar, he said the awards would inspire young artists and create opportunities for them to showcase their skills.

Recalling the contributions of stalwarts like N.T. Rama Rao (NTR), Akkineni Nageswara Rao (ANR), D. PM Modi, French President Macron discuss West Asia situation, need for de-escalation

New Delhi (TSIT): Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to French President Emmanuel Macron on Thursday regarding the situation in West Asia and the urgent need for de-escalation and return to dialogue and diplomacy.

The telephonic conversation between both leaders comes amid the ongoing conflict in West Asia, which erupted after the US-Israeli strikes on Iran on February 28, which killed Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and top military officials. In response, Iran launched drone and missile attacks targeting the US and Israeli facilities, regional capitals and allied forces in West Asia.

Over the past few days, PM Modi has also spoken with the leaders of Kuwait, UAE, Israel, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Jordan,



Bahrain, Oman and Qatar as India remains in touch with the governments of the region as well as other key partners over the ongoing conflict in Iran and the Gulf region.

On Wednesday, PM Modi held a telephonic conversation with Kuwait Crown Prince Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah and discussed the evolving situation in West Asia and shared concerns over recent developments.

PM Modi reiterated India's condemnation of attacks on Kuwait's sovereignty and territorial integrity. He also thanked Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah for

continued support and ensuring the safety and well-being of the Indian community in Kuwait. "Spoke with HH Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah, Crown Prince of Kuwait and conveyed greetings on the upcoming festival of Eid. We exchanged views on the evolving situation in West Asia and shared concerns over recent developments. Reiterated India's condemnation of attacks on Kuwait's sovereignty and territorial integrity. Ensuring safe and free navigation through the Strait of Hormuz remains our foremost priority," PM Modi posted on X.

Iran strikes gulf energy sites, oil surges past \$119 as markets roil

New Delhi (TSIT) As Teheran hit oil infrastructure in Gulf nations on Thursday in retaliation to earlier Israeli strikes on Iran's South Pars gas field, energy markets went into an overdrive with the benchmark Brent crude prices jumped to over USD 119 a barrel before settling down to around USD 114 a barrel. The Indian basket or the average price at which India imports crude also shot up to USD 114.08 a barrel as against USD 69 a barrel last month, as desperate Indian buyers contracted purchase of crude from Russia's shadow fleet which lies in the Baltic and in the Indian Ocean which after selling at a discount for most months last year is now trading at a premium.

With oil on the boil, India's Rupee traded at a new low of Rs 93.25 at close of Thursday's trading against the dollar as



Indian importers faced with higher prices bought more dollars and as nervous foreign investors sold off stock bringing the Sensex down by 2,496.89 points.

Oil prices started shooting skywards after news spread early Thursday that Iran targeted energy infrastructure across the Gulf, including Qatar's Ras Laffan LNG facility and the Habshan gas facility and Bab field in the United Arab Emirates. These attacks were apparently in retaliation to Wednesday night's Israeli strikes on Iran's South Pars gas field. Qatar's state-owned energy company, QatarEnergy, confirmed that several of its liquefied natural gas (LNG) facilities were hit by missile attacks in the early hours of Thursday.

India buying LPG from US too in bid to plug gap in Middle East imports

New Delhi, March 19 (TSIT): Amid concerns over LPG shortage, the government on Thursday said that India is diversifying LPG procurement and buying liquefied petroleum gas from the US as well to plug the supply chain disruptions caused by the Middle East conflict. Addressing the daily briefing, Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry's Joint Secretary, Marketing and Oil refinery, Sujata Sharma, said: "Due to the ongoing war, the situation remains a matter of concern. However, there is no dry-out reported at any LPG distributorship. Online bookings have further increased to 94 per cent..."

CM Revanth Reaffirms Commitment to Farmers' Welfare at Ugadi Celebrations

Hyderabad TSIT BUREAU: Chief Minister A.Revanth Reddy on Thursday reiterated that the Telangana Government is committed to transforming the farming community into the "King" of all professions by making agriculture a profitable and sustainable occupation.

Participating in the "Sri Parabhava Nama" Ugadi celebrations in Hyderabad, the Chief Minister announced that the new Telugu year has been dedicated to farmers' welfare. He emphasized that the government is taking proactive steps to strengthen agriculture and ensure prosperity for farmers across the state.

Highlighting key initiatives, the Chief Minister said that the Rythu Bharosa financial assistance will be released on March 22, with funds directly deposited into farmers' bank accounts. He noted that the government has already spent Rs.18,000 crore under the scheme to support the agricultural community.

Revanth Reddy also pointed out that Telangana farmers currently have the lowest



debt burden in the country, attributing this to the government's decision to waive farm loans up to Rs.2 lakh, providing significant relief to debt-ridden farmers. He added that nearly 70 percent of families in Telangana depend on agriculture, underscoring the sector's importance. Addressing longstanding land issues, the Chief Minister said the government has introduced Bhu Bharati to resolve land ownership problems, replacing

the earlier Dharani portal, which had caused hardships for farmers. Chief Minister further assured that the government remains highly vigilant against natural calamities and is taking necessary measures to safeguard farmers and their livelihoods.

On the occasion of Ugadi, Revanth Reddy prayed for peace, prosperity, and protection from natural disasters for the people of Telangana, reiterating the government's vision to position the state as

Mamata accuses EC of 'targeting' Bengal, calls actions 'undeclared emergency'

New Delhi/Kolkata, Mar 19 (TSIT) West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday launched a sharp attack on the Election Commission of India, alleging unprecedented interference and bias against the state ahead of upcoming elections.

In a message posted on her WhatsApp channel, Banerjee claimed that the Commission had "singled out and targeted Bengal" in a manner that was "deeply alarming." She alleged that more than 50 senior officials, including the Chief Secretary, Home Secretary, Director General of Police and several top-ranking officers, had been "summarily and arbitrarily removed" even before the formal election notification.

"This is not an administra-

tive action; rather, this is political interference of the highest order," she said.

The Chief Minister further described the developments as part of a broader pattern of institutional politicisation. "The systematic politicisation of institutions meant to remain impartial is a direct assault on the Constitution," Banerjee said, adding that the Commission's conduct reflected "a clear bias and an uncomfortable submission to political interests."

Her remarks come amid heightened political tensions in the state, with the ruling All India Trinamool Congress frequently accusing the opposition Bharatiya Janata Party of attempting to influence administrative processes in West Bengal. Banerjee also raised



concerns over the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, calling the process "deeply flawed" and alleging that it had contributed to public anxiety. She claimed that supplementary electoral rolls had not yet been published "in clear disregard of the Hon'ble Supreme Court's directions," leaving

citizens uncertain. "Why is the BJP so desperate? Why this relentless targeting of Bengal and its people?" she asked, accusing the party of attempting to force citizens "to stand in queues and prove their own citizenship" decades after independence. The Chief Minister also questioned what she described as contradic-

tions in the Commission's actions, alleging that officers removed from their posts were subsequently reassigned as election observers within hours. She cited instances where senior police officials in key urban centres such as Siliguri and Bidhannagar were appointed as observers without immediate replacements, which she said left "vital urban centres effectively headless."

"This is not governance. It reflects chaos, confusion and sheer incompetence being passed off as authority," Banerjee said. Escalating her criticism, Banerjee described the situation as "nothing short of an undeclared emergency and an unprolongated form of president's rule," alleging a "deliberate design to seize control of

West Bengal through coercion and institutional manipulation." She also expressed solidarity with state government officials, saying they were being targeted "simply for serving the state with honesty and commitment." "Bengal has never bowed to intimidation and it never will," she asserted. "Bengal will fight, Bengal will resist and Bengal will decisively defeat every attempt to impose a divisive and destructive agenda on its soil." The Election Commission has not yet publicly responded to the allegations. The controversy adds to an already charged political atmosphere as the state moves closer to the next electoral cycle, with questions around administrative neutrality and electoral processes likely to remain at the forefront of the debate.

TELANGANA GOVT SEEKS 22,700 CRORE LOAN FOR RABI PADDY PROCUREMENT



Hyderabad: The Telangana government has empanelled the Telangana State Cooperative Marketing Federation Ltd (TG MARKFED) as an additional agency to procure 95 lakh tonne paddy from farmers in the Rabi marketing season 2025-26. A government order was issued to that effect by K Surendra Mohan, Agricultural Production Commissioner

(APC) and Secretary to the government, Agriculture and Cooperation Department, on Wednesday, March 18.

A loan, amounting to Rs 22,700 crore, is being sought from the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) for paddy procurement through TG MARKFED, without linking it to the existing outstanding loans and other

loans of the agency. The loan is being secured with the state government acting as the guarantor, permitting TG MARKFED to obtain it. The Managing Director of TG MARKFED has been authorised to transfer the obtained loan amount into the account of the Vice-Chairman and Managing Director of the Telangana Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd (TGCSCL).

Telangana's third DISCOM files for distribution license on Ugadi

Hyderabad: The third DISCOM of the state, named the Telangana Rythu Power Distribution Company Limited (TGRPDCL), submitted a formal application to the Telangana Electricity Regulatory Commission (ERC) on Thursday, March 19, seeking a distribution license to begin power supply operations. TGRPDCL Chairman and Managing Director Musharraf Faruqi said that submitting the application on the day of Ugadi, which marks the Telugu New Year, reflects the government's commitment to a fresh, farmer-centric approach. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) had granted formal approval for the incorporation of TGRPDCL on March 18.

All agricultural electricity connections in the state, along



with lift irrigation schemes, Central Public Water Supply (CPWS)/Mission Bhagiratha water supply systems, Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) connections and municipal water supply connections under the Low Tension VI-B category will come under the jurisdiction of the new DISCOM, which is slated to start operations from April 1.

On March 11, the Telangana

government transferred 51 engineers and specialised staff members from the existing Southern and Northern DISCOMs to the new TGRPDCL corporate office.

Musharraf Faruqi has been appointed as Chairman and Managing Director, while V Tirupati Reddy, P Krishna Reddy, V Mohan Rao and Dr N Narasimhulu have been appointed to the Board of Directors.

THUNDERSTORMS WITH LIGHTNING LIKELY IN TELANGANA OVER NEXT 48 HOURS: MET

Hyderabad, March 19 (TSIT) Thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds (30-40 kmph) are likely to occur at isolated places across several districts of Telangana over the next 48 hours, the Meteorological Centre said on Thursday.



According to the daily weather report, such conditions are expected in districts including Adilabad, Komaram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Nirmal, Nizamabad, Jagtial, Peddapalli, Jayashankar Bhupalpally, Mulugu, Bhadradi Kothagudem, Mahabubabad, Warangal, and

Hanumakonda during the next 24 hours.

Similar weather is likely to prevail on Friday in Komaram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Peddapalli, Jayashankar Bhupalpally, Mulugu, Bhadradi Kothagudem, Khammam, Nalgonda, Suryapet,

Mahabubabad, Warangal, Hanumakonda, Jangaon, and Yadadri Bhuvanagiri districts.

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers are also likely at isolated places across the state during this period.

Maximum temperatures are expected to

remain 2-4°C below normal for the next three days, followed by a rise to 2-4°C above normal over the subsequent three days. Dry weather conditions are likely to prevail across Telangana from March 21 to 25. Meanwhile, as per reports, a hailstorm occurred at isolated places in Jogulamba Gadwal district, while rain was recorded at one or two places in the state during the past 24 hours.

The highest maximum temperature of 33°C was recorded at Khammam, while the lowest minimum temperature of 14.8°C was recorded at Medak, the report added.

Youth Congress State President Shiva Charan Reddy arrested amid tension in LB Nagar

Hyderabad, Mar 19 (TSIT) Tension prevailed in LB Nagar on Thursday as Youth Congress State President Jakkidi Shiva Charan Reddy was arrested during a protest linked to the party's 'Drugs Test White Challenge'.

Responding to a call given by the Youth Congress state leadership, Congress leaders gathered at the Ambedkar statue junction in LB Nagar, expressing readiness to undergo drug testing as part of the campaign.

Addressing the gathering, Shiva Charan Reddy alleged that LB Nagar MLA Sudheer Reddy attempted to disrupt the programme and accused BRS leaders of creating disturbances to divert attention from the issue.

He questioned why a confrontation was being provoked when Congress leaders were willing to undergo tests voluntarily.

He demanded that the MLA and his supporters also participate in the drug test and uphold the spirit of the 'White Challenge'.

He further stated that the Youth Congress would continue its efforts to support initiatives aimed at making Telangana a drug-free state and oppose any attempts to undermine it.

Several Congress leaders and Youth Congress activists, including Jakkidi Prabhakar Reddy, Darapelli Rajasekhara Reddy, Gurram Shyam Charan Reddy, Yarala Ram Reddy, and others, participated in the programme in large numbers.

Hyderabad Police Launch H-FAST Unit to crack down on food adulteration

Hyderabad, Mar 19 (TSIT) The Hyderabad Food Adulteration Surveillance Team (H-FAST) has been launched to strengthen enforcement against food adulteration and ensure public safety. The initiative has been set up under the leadership of Hyderabad Police Commissioner V C Sajjanar in coordination with Food Safety Officers.

The unit was inaugurated by IPS officer Gaikwad Vaibhav Raghunath, marking the rollout of an intelligence-driven mechanism to detect and act against unsafe food practices.

H-FAST comprises 28 personnel, including Inspectors, Sub-Inspectors, and supporting staff, who will focus on surveillance, detection, and prosecution in food adulteration cases. The team will

conduct raids in coordination with Food Safety officials to ensure effective enforcement.

Officials said a dedicated toll-free number—8712661212—has been introduced for the public to report cases of food adulteration. Citizens can also lodge complaints through H-FAST's official social media platforms for quicker response.

Emphasising that food adulteration poses a serious threat to public health, authorities said a zero-tolerance policy will be followed and strict legal action will be taken against violators. The public has been urged to stay alert and report any suspicious food-related activities, according to a police statement on Thursday.

Traffic restrictions in Hyderabad for Jummat-ul-Vida prayers

Hyderabad, March 19 : Hyderabad police have imposed traffic restrictions around historic Mecca Masjid on the occasion of Jummat-ul-Vida (last Friday of Ramzan) prayers. The roads around Charminar will be closed to all vehicular traffic from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Friday (March 20).

The main roads from Charminar towards Madina, Murgu Chowk, and Shalibanda will be closed to all vehicular traffic. Joint Commissioner of Police has announced that traffic will be diverted at various points in the Charminar zone. Traffic from the Nayapul side towards the Charminar will be diverted at the Madina junction towards City College. Vehicles in the Nagulchinta / Shalibanda areas towards Charminar will be diverted at Himmatpura Junction towards Hari Bowli and at the Volga Hotel T Junction (Khilwat side).

Traffic from Chowk Maidan towards Charminar will be diverted to the Kotla Alijah or Moghalpura side.

The traffic from the Moosabowli areas towards Charminar will be diverted at Motigalli towards



Khilwath ground, Rajesh Medical Hall, Shalibanda, and Fathe Darwaza Road. Traffic from the Etebar Chowk area towards Gulzarhouse will be diverted at Etebar Chowk towards Mandi Miralam Market or Bibi Bazar. Traffic from Mitti Ka Sher will not be allowed towards Gulzar House; it will be diverted from Mitti-ke-Sher Junction towards Ghansi Bazaar to reach High Court Road / Khilwath.

Road Transport Corporation (RTC) buses going towards Charminar will be terminated at Afzalgunj Bus Stop, while the RTC buses going to districts via Nayapool, Madina from MGBS, Imlibun will proceed via Chaderghat Rotary,

Nalgonda X - Chanchalguda - Saidabad T Junction - IS Sadan - DMRL Junction - Midhani Junction - MBNR Fly over - Bandlaguda - towards Aramghar. The police also announced parking points at six locations within the South Zone traffic limits for devotees coming to Mecca Masjid from various parts of the city.

The police have also announced traffic restrictions in the Secunderabad Zone in view of last Friday's prayers at the Jama Masjid. The Subhash Road in Secunderabad (between Mahankali L&O PS and Old Ramgopalpet PS Junction on the MG road) will be closed for vehicular traffic from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Traffic will be diverted from Rocha

Bazar towards Ranigunj and Paradise junction. Traffic coming from Bata X Roads towards Subhash Road will be diverted at Mahankali L&O P.S. towards the lane to the left of the Mahankali L&O P.S. and towards Lala temple.

Thousands of people offer Jummat-ul-Vida prayers at Mecca Masjid, Jama Masjid, Secunderabad and other major mosques in the twin cities. The Telangana government has declared an optional holiday on account of Jummat-ul-Vida. The General Administration Department issued orders to this effect following a request from the Chief Executive Officer, Telangana State Waqf Board.

Delhi HC to decide K. Kavitha's application for Telangana Praja Jagruti registration

New Delhi, March 19 : The Delhi High Court, on Thursday, directed the Election Commission of India (ECI) to expeditiously decide an application filed by a former Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader K. Kavitha seeking registration of her proposed political outfit 'Telangana Praja Jagruti'. A single-judge bench of Justice Amit Bansal passed the direction while dealing with a writ petition moved by K. Kavitha in her capacity as President of the proposed party, alleging inaction on the part of the poll body in processing her application under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

According to the plea, the Telangana Praja Jagruti was formally constituted on January 19, 2026, in a duly convened general body meeting, where its constitution was adopted and office bearers were authorised to apply for registration.

It said that a comprehensive application was submitted to the ECI on January 23, along with all required documents, including the party constitution, notarised affidavits, a membership list of 151 members, certified



minutes of the meeting, alternative names, and the prescribed fee. The application was acknowledged by the ECI on January 27.

However, the petition alleged that no steps have been taken by the ECI towards scrutiny of the application or initiation of the statutory process. "Despite a lapse of reasonable time, respondent number 1 has not undertaken scrutiny, publication of public notice,

or afforded an opportunity of hearing under Section 29A(7). The application remains pending without explanation," the plea said.

Highlighting the urgency, K. Kavitha submitted that Telangana is in the middle of ongoing and impending local body elections, including those to municipal corporations and Zilla Parishad Territorial Constituencies/Mandal Parishad Territorial

Constituencies, and that the delay has adversely impacted her party's ability to participate.

"The delay is arbitrary, unreasonable, and violative of Articles 14 and 19(1)(c) of the Constitution of India... The continued inaction effectively disables the petitioner from participating in the imminent electoral processes under its party name and symbol, causing grave and irreparable prejudice," the petition noted. Taking note of the submissions, the Delhi High Court directed the ECI to take an expeditious decision on the application and disposed of the petition. Earlier, former BRS leader Kavitha had announced plans to float a new political party, saying that it would carry 'Telangana' in its name and position itself as a major Opposition force in the state.

She had also indicated her intent to contest the upcoming Assembly elections, with Siddipet or Bodhan among her preferred constituencies.

K. Kavitha, daughter of former Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhara Reddy, had quit the BRS last year following differences with the party leadership.

India's Rs 5 trillion gold hoard fuels boom in fast-growing gold loan market, draws global investors

New Delhi, March 19 : Indian households are sitting on an enormous reserve of gold, and that wealth is now quietly reshaping the country's lending market, a report has said. According to a

gold - around 90 per cent - still lies idle, it is increasingly being used as collateral to raise quick loans.

Gold-backed lending has emerged as one of the fastest-growing segments in India's retail credit

ened rules around unsecured lending in late 2023, limiting easy access to such credit for many borrowers.

As a result, more people are turning to gold loans. These loans are easier to

have surged significantly, increasing the value borrowers can unlock against their jewellery.

Data from the RBI shows that gold loans more than doubled in just one year, reaching Rs 4 trillion in January from Rs 1.75 trillion a year earlier.

This makes gold loans the fastest-growing retail credit category in India, after home and vehicle loans.

However, the actual size of the gold loan market is believed to be much larger. Experts estimate it to be around Rs 14 trillion, as RBI data does not fully capture lending by non-banking financial companies (NBFCs).

These NBFCs account for nearly half of the gold loan market. The rapid growth of gold loans is also drawing global attention. Private equity firm Bain Capital is planning to acquire up to a 41.7 per cent stake in Manappuram Finance, a deal recently approved by the RBI. Meanwhile, Japan's financial giant Mitsubishi UFJ Financial Group has acquired a 20 per cent stake in Shriram Finance, which is also expanding its gold loan business.

New Delhi, March 19 : Instances of cyber fraud related to LPG bookings have been reported from some states as fraudsters are attempting to exploit the situation by sending malicious files such as "GAS BILL UPDATE APK" via messaging

statement said.

Meanwhile, the Centre has advised States and Union Territories to further strengthen administrative and logistical arrangements to ensure uninterrupted LPG distribution.

Instructions of the Centre are being communicated to all concerned authorities for immediate implementation. Citizens are advised to rely on official sources and avoid rumours. Consumers are requested to avoid panic bookings, use digital booking platforms, and avoid visiting LPG distributors, as home delivery continues. The government continues to prioritise uninterrupted LPG supply and PNG expansion, particularly for households and priority sectors such as hospitals and educational institutions.

The measures include enhanced refinery production, revised booking intervals of 25 days in urban areas and up to 45 days in rural areas, and prioritised allocation.

Alternative fuel options like kerosene and coal have been offered to ease pressure on LPG demand. The Ministry of Environment has already advised the State Pollution Control Board to permit the use of kerosene and coal as alternative fuel.

The Ministry of Coal has already issued an order to Coal India and Singareni Coaleries to allot higher quantities to states for distributing coal to small, medium, and other consumers. States have been advised to facilitate the new PNG connections for both domestic and commercial consumers. A proposal for a 10 per cent additional allocation of commercial LPG has been made to the states, facilitating and expediting the process, the statement added.

Ahmedabad crime branch busts Rs 2.38 Crore fake currency racket

Ahmedabad/Surat, Mar 19: The Ahmedabad Crime Branch has dismantled a major counterfeit currency operation, seizing Rs 2.38 crore in fake Rs 500 notes and arresting seven people, including a woman, involved in producing and distributing the forged notes.

Acting on intelligence, officers intercepted a white Toyota Fortuner near Torrent Power, Amraiwadi on Wednesday night. Inside the vehicle, bundles of fake notes hidden in a black bag were discovered, and all occupants were taken into custody. The arrested have been identified as Mukesh Thummar, Ashok Mavani, Ramesh Bhalar, Divyesh Rana, Pradeep 'Guru' Jotangia (who runs a yoga foundation), Bharat Kakadiya from Surat, and a woman from Katargam. Investigation revealed



that the group had been manufacturing counterfeit currency at a Surat residential premises over the past four to six months. The site, disguised as a stationery unit, was equipped with printers, paper cut-

ting machines, and other equipment, producing high-quality notes that were difficult to distinguish from genuine currency. Following the arrests, a joint raid by Ahmedabad and Surat

Crime Branch teams recovered additional counterfeit notes, printing equipment, laptops, mobile phones, and security thread paper mimicking RBI markings. In Ahmedabad, 42,000 notes worth about Rs 2.10 crore were seized along with the vehicle and cash of Rs 1.2 lac, while Surat authorities recovered Rs 28 lakh in fake notes and equipment.

Authorities said the gang sourced specialized security thread paper from China via online platforms like Alibaba, with payments made using cryptocurrency. They also employed digital tools, including AI platforms such as ChatGPT and graphic design software, to refine the notes' appearance. The operation reportedly began with small-scale circulation in local shops before expanding to

larger volumes. Police estimate around Rs 10 lac of counterfeit currency may already have entered circulation. The group had intended to supply notes at a commission of 20-25%, transporting consignments from Surat to Ahmedabad using a vehicle with a government department plate to avoid suspicion.

Two suspects, including a contact with Chinese suppliers, remain at large. Officials are tracing interstate and international links, financial transactions connected to the Pradeep Yog Foundation, and properties associated with the accused.

All seized materials are being sent for forensic examination, and the Reserve Bank of India has been notified. A case has been registered at the DCB Police Station, with investigations ongoing.

Calcutta High Court denies bail to Sheikh Shahjahan in ED assault case

Kolkata, Mar 19: A single-judge bench of the Calcutta High Court on Thursday dismissed the bail plea of Sheikh Shahjahan, the suspended Trinamool Congress leader from Sandeshkhali in North 24 Parganas, who is a key accused in the January 2024 attack on Enforcement Directorate officials. The case stems from a violent incident in which officials of the Enforcement Directorate, along with personnel from the Central Armed Police Forces, were allegedly assaulted by Shahjahan's ????ers while attempting to carry out a raid at his residence. The operation was linked to an alleged multi-crore public distribution system (PDS) scam in the state.

Subsequently, Shahjahan also faced additional charges, including illegal land acquisition in Sandeshkhali, conver-



sion of agricultural land into fish farms using saline water, and serious allegations of sexual assault involving local women.

He was first taken into custody by the West Bengal Police before being handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation, which is currently probing the case.

During the hearing before Justice Suvara Ghosh, counsel representing the CBI opposed the bail application, arguing that Shahjahan could influence witnesses and tamper with evidence if released. The agency further alleged that even while in custody, he had

attempted to intimidate key witnesses and orchestrate attacks through associates who remain at large.

Accepting these submissions, the court rejected the bail plea. However, it clarified that Shahjahan may file a fresh application in the future depending on the progress of the investigation and emergence of new evidence.

Following the initial incident, leaders of the Trinamool Congress, including Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, had initially defended him. However, after sustained protests led by women in Sandeshkhali throughout much of 2024, the party

NIA charges ninth accused in Gurugram club bombing case

New Delhi, Mar 19: The National Investigation Agency on Thursday filed a supplementary chargesheet against another accused in the 2024 Gurugram club bombing case, taking the total number of chargesheeted individuals to nine.

The ?????, identified as Ramdutt, has been linked to Canada-based designated terrorist Satinderjit Singh alias Goldy Brar. According to the agency, he maintained connections with Brar's close aide Rohit Godara and foreign-based gangster Randeep Malik.

The chargesheet was filed before the NIA Special Court in Panchkula under provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. Investigators described Ramdutt as a key facilitator within a larger terror network.

Probe findings indicate that he provided a safe hideout near the Chambal region to another accused involved in carrying out



the attacks. The bombings targeted the Warehouse Club and Human Club in Sector-29, Gurugram, on December 10, 2024.

The NIA had earlier chargesheeted Goldy Brar and seven others in 2025. In a subsequent development in December 2025, three more accused—Vijay, Ajit Sehrawat, and Vinay—were also chargesheeted under relevant laws, including the Explosive Substances Act and the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

According to investiga-

tors, the case has exposed a wider conspiracy involving operatives working under the direction of handlers based abroad, with links to the banned outfit Babbar Khalsa International.


The agency, which took over the investigation shortly after the attacks, is continuing efforts to identify additional conspirators and track financial networks supporting the operation, as part of a broader crackdown on terror syndicates operating in the region.

Rail accidents drop nearly 90% as safety measures strengthen: Govt

New Delhi, Mar 19: Train accidents on Indian Railways have declined sharply over the past decade, with consequential accidents falling by nearly 90 per cent, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw informed Parliament.

In a written reply in the Lok Sabha, the minister said the number of such accidents has dropped from 135 in 2014-15 to just 14 in 2025-26 (up to February 28), highlighting a significant improvement in operational safety.

Data shared by the government showed that between 2004-05 and 2013-14, Indian Railways recorded 1,711 consequential accidents, resulting in 904 deaths and 3,155 injuries. This number reduced to 678 accidents during 2014-15 to 2023-24, with 748 fatalities and 2,087 injuries. In recent years, the trend has continued downward. In 2024-25, 31 accidents were reported, leading to 18 deaths and 92 injuries, while in 2025-26 so far, 14 accidents have resulted in 16 deaths and 28



injuries. The minister attributed this improvement to sustained investments and safety-focused initiatives,

including better track maintenance, modern signalling systems, and technological upgrades. Spending on safety

has seen a major increase, rising from Rs 39,200 crore in 2013-14 to Rs 1,17,693 crore in 2025-26, with a further allocation of Rs 1,20,389 crore planned for 2026-27.

To reduce human error, electronic interlocking systems have been installed at 6,665 stations, while over 10,153 level crossings are now equipped with interlocking. Additionally, track circuiting systems—used to detect train presence—have been implemented at 6,669 stations.

Vaishnaw also highlighted the rollout of Kavach, an indigenous automatic train protection system adopted nationally in 2020. The latest version has already been deployed across 1,452 route kilometres, including high-density corridors like Delhi-Mumbai and Delhi-Howrah. He emphasised that continued focus on technology and infrastructure upgrades will further strengthen safety and help reduce accidents across the rail network.

The Day IAF Broke PAF's Back: 'The Sky Warriors: Operation Sindoor Unveiled'

In the high-octane world of aerial combat literature, Vishnu Som's book *The Sky Warriors: Operation Sindoor Unveiled* is a bone-rattling roar of an afterburner take-off. It offers a cockpit-eye view of Operation Sindoor - the 2025 Indian heavy-hammer response to Pakistan following the Pahalgam terrorist attack. The *Sky Warriors* is both a technical and operational post-game analysis of this high-intensity clash, delivering a narrative that is as much a white paper on modern SEAD (Suppression of Enemy Air Defence) as it is a gripping and sharply written combat chronicle. Som recounts the 2025 air war with definitive knowledge and insider accounts, deconstructing it with the precision of a Tom Clancy thriller. For tech enthusiasts, the book is a goldmine. You're not just reading about systems, you're inside them. We're talking BVR radar locks, BrahMos launch sequences, and the cold logic of S-400 engagement envelopes. Pakistan's air defence lay in shambles, its fighter fleet was reduced to ineffective patrols, and the IAF's Integrated Air Defence Ground System (IADGS) stood as an impenetrable shield.

With runways cratered, assets destroyed both in the air and on the ground, and logistics and command nodes under severe pressure, Pakistan's DGMO ultimately sought a ceasefire, averting further irreversible degradation of PAF capabilities.

The air warriors, Som profiles, men and women in blue, going beyond the call of duty, embody a brand of quiet, lethal professionalism that should inspire national pride. The book highlights Cold Start precision and the sheer grit of pilots who stared down an escalation matrix and didn't blink. You feel the tension of pilots managing "Master Caution" alarms in hostile skies, the discipline of split-second decisions under strict Rules of Engagement (ROE), and the seamless coordination between cockpit and command centres. Som presents warfare at its most precise-and most human.

The *Sky Warriors* isn't just another military account. It is fast-paced, gripping, and deeply relevant in a world where air dominance defines geopolitical power. It's not just a record of conflict; it's a tribute to the technical and operational evolution of the Indian Air Force, which captures the new normal for India.

The *Sky Warriors* is an essential pick for casual readers and enthusiasts alike, a high-Mach dive into the present and future of air combat. If you want to understand how modern wars are truly won, or simply experience a narrative that never lets go, this book is a must-read.

The Curious Reason 2 Iran 'Proxies' Haven't Joined The War Against Israel

On March 16, the internet was abuzz with the footage of an Iranian-backed militia infiltrating the US Embassy in Baghdad, using a first-person view (FPV) drone for a reconnaissance mission. It was released by the Popular Mobilisation Forces (PMF) and showed the drone - likely controlled via fibre-optic cable to bypass electronic jamming - flying unchallenged through the heavily fortified complex for nearly two minutes.

On its heels came another announcement by a group calling itself Kata'ib Hezbollah, demanding that every "foreign soldier" leave the country. Its security chief said, "Iraq's instability is due to the malicious American presence, and security will not be achieved until the last foreign soldier leaves Iraqi territory." The group, which Washington has designated as a "terrorist organisation", is part of the same umbrella organisation known as the PMF, or, as they call themselves, the Islamic Resistance in Iraq, which has been claiming daily attacks on US interests in Iraq and the region.

The Long Shadow War These incidents spotlight the role of the proxies that Iran has created, funded, and supported over the years to fight its shadow war with Israel and the US. These include Hamas in Gaza, Hezbollah in Lebanon, the Houthis in Yemen, and the more recent PMF or the AL Hashd al Shabi in Iraq. There have been other groups such as Islamic Jihad in Gaza, and Shiite groups in Syria and in Lebanon, but they are now defunct or have become bit players. The PMF has a relatively recent history. These Shiite militia groups appeared as late as 2014, to



fight the Islamic State (ISIS) when the Iraqi army proved too inept, weak and corruption-riddled to do so, and Mosul, the second-largest Iraqi city, quickly fell to ISIS. Many of them, trained by the elite Quds force of Iran's Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), and thereafter closely aligned with Iran, won the real battle against the ISIS, which won them both authority and goodwill from the population. Later, they were absorbed into the Iraqi armed forces. However, those that remained closely aligned with Iran, like the Kata'ib Hezbollah, continue to be a law unto themselves, causing friction both within the umbrella movement as well as with the Iraqi state. These groups have always demanded the withdrawal of US troops from the country. Since the start of the US-Israel war on Iran, according to reports, airstrikes on Iran-aligned armed groups in Iraq, largely believed to be carried out by the US and Israel, have killed and wounded tens of

Iraqis. Meanwhile, US bases in Iraqi Kurdistan and the American embassy in Baghdad have sustained multiple drone and missile attacks. Amid repeated attacks on US interests in the country, Washington has ordered all of its nationals to immediately leave Iraq.

The Hezbollah's Assault

Similarly, Iran's other major proxy, the Hezbollah in Lebanon, has opened up a second front, targeting northern Israel. Israel, in turn, has also been bombing Hezbollah strongholds. In fact, Hezbollah has been Iran's most faithful proxy group, created in 1982 in Lebanon to fight Israel's presence in Lebanon, as well as, more covertly, preserve the Shia identity and rights in Lebanon's fragmented polity. What distinguishes Hezbollah is that it is a political party in Lebanon with seats in its parliament and also commands its own private army, which has proved its mettle, at least till now. In

2000, it was Hezbollah that forced an Israeli withdrawal from Southern Lebanon, which is a Shia stronghold. Similarly, in 2006, in the Israel-Hezbollah war, the militia was able to stop Israel from crossing over. Hezbollah also played a pivotal role in battling ISIS and other jihadist groups during the Syrian Civil War. When war broke out between Israel and Hamas in October 2023, Hezbollah opened up a second front targeting northern Israel. However, this time Israel retaliated aggressively, including through ground invasions, such that the group was significantly degraded and downsized and its senior leadership decapitated.

Nevertheless, the Hezbollah has joined in this time around, on behalf of Iran, saying it was avenging the killing of the erstwhile Supreme Leader of Iran, Ali Khamenei. Israel, though, has inflicted heavy damages and casualties: more than 800 Lebanese are reported killed and a mil-

lion displaced in this round of conflict, according to Lebanese government estimates. Given the disproportionate balance of power and the damage inflicted, the Lebanese government has wanted to ban Hezbollah. Meanwhile, Israel is preparing a ground assault in Southern Lebanon.

The Hamas's Silence

The real surprise, however, has been the non-engagement by Iran's other two major proxies - Hamas and the Houthis. Hamas has not only been inactive - something understandable, given that Israel has crippled it, rendering it almost non-existent militarily - but it has even gone a step further and called upon Iran to refrain from attacking Gulf countries. This is possibly because Hamas is also heavily dependent on Qatar, which is sheltering many of the group's operatives on its territory and whose funding kept Hamas in control in Gaza till the war began in October 2023.

India Talks About Science, But Its Institutions Don't Support It

In 1976, the 42nd Amendment did something few constitutions have attempted. It made scientific temper a civic obligation. Article 51A(h) placed on every Indian citizen the duty to "develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform." The clause was quietly radical - not because it mandated knowledge, but because it framed a way of thinking as essential to democratic citizenship. Nearly fifty years on, that framing deserves serious examination, not as a tribute to constitutional foresight, but as a measure of how far institutional reality has drifted from it. The numbers are the obvious starting point. India's gross expenditure on research and development has remained stubbornly below 0.7% of GDP for over a decade. The global average stands at 1.8%. South Korea spends 4.9%. Even among middle-income economies, India is an outlier. The private sector, which typically drives R&D dynamism as economies mature, contributes only about 36% of India's total research expenditure - compared to 70-80% in China, the United States and Germany. This is not a talent gap. India produces more STEM graduates than almost any country on earth. It is a structural gap, rooted in how research institutions are governed and the incentives under which they operate. That governance problem runs deeper than budgets. Public research institutions function under tight regulatory control, with limited academic and financial autonomy. The contrast with Germany's Max Planck and Fraunhofer Institutes, which combine clear public mandates with significant operational independence,



is instructive. The Anusandhan National Research Foundation, operationalised in 2024 with considerable fanfare, has not yet resolved the persistent problem of research grant disbursement delays. Projects stall not because scientists are absent but because administrative systems are slow. The infrastructure for inquiry exists; the institutional conditions for it are often absent. The quality of research outputs compounds these concerns. India now ranks third globally in life sciences paper retractions, behind only China and the United States, a pattern that reflects the distorted incentives of an ecosystem that rewards publication volume over rigour. The National Institutional Ranking Framework has recently begun penalising universities with high retraction rates, which is a welcome corrective. But fixing the signal without changing the underlying incentive structure is unlikely to produce lasting improvement. What has received less attention is the constitutional dimension of this failure. Article 51A(h) places the duty of developing a scientific temper on citizens, but the constitutional logic implies a reciprocal obligation on the

state. A citizen cannot reasonably be expected to develop a spirit of inquiry in a university system that penalises questioning, or in a research environment where independent thought is structurally constrained. The duty the constitution assigns to individuals is only fulfillable if institutions make it possible. That precondition has not been consistently met. The non-justiciability of Fundamental Duties is a known feature of Indian constitutional design. Article 51A cannot be enforced through courts and no institution is formally accountable for its implementation. This produces a specific kind of policy vacuum: there is no body tasked with assessing the institutional conditions for scientific temper, no benchmarking framework, no periodic review of whether the state is creating the environment the clause demands. The contrast with Fundamental Rights, which carry justiciability, remedies and decades of jurisprudence best illustrates this asymmetry. The comparative picture offers some direction. Countries that have meaningfully narrowed their science-society gap, including Finland, South Korea and Taiwan, have done so primarily

through institutional investment rather than communication campaigns. Research autonomy, doctoral pipeline support, stable long-term funding and governance frameworks that insulate scientific institutions from short-cycle pressures: these are the common denominators. India's challenge is less a shortage of institutions than a shortage of institutional urgency, the sense that science governance is a first-order policy priority rather than a residual one. None of this requires locating blame. It requires locating the problem accurately. The science-society disconnect in India is not primarily a public awareness problem, solvable through outreach or curriculum reform. It is a governance problem - one of institutional design, incentive structures and accountability frameworks. Article 51A(h) named the aspiration in 1976. The work of building the institutional architecture capable of realising it remains, fifty years later, substantially unfinished. No Partners, No Power? The Shrinking Circle Of Vijay's TVK

In politics, timing is everything. And in Tamil Nadu, timing without alliances is often nothing. By insisting that he will neither join an alliance nor play second fiddle - but only lead one - Vijay may well have missed the political bus even before his electoral journey truly began. The arithmetic is unforgiving. With the 2026 elections approaching, it is increasingly clear that no major party is willing to come under the banner of his Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK). The only theoretical pathway - poaching allies from the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam which has won 3 consecutive elections - was always a long shot. That window now appears firmly shut. What makes this more striking is the scale of the opportunity that slipped away. Vijay entered politics at the peak of his cinematic career, commanding a rare, almost unmatched following among youth and women. Not since MG Ramachandran, who won 3 successive elections, has a star carried such momentum into the political arena. That alone should have made him the nucleus of a formidable alliance. Instead, hesitation - and perhaps overconfidence - seems to have defined his early political moves. Rather than actively reaching out and stitching together a coalition, Vijay appeared to wait, expecting others to gravitate towards him. In Tamil Nadu's deeply networked alliance culture, that was a misreading of political reality. Ironically, he had the right pitch. TVK's promise of a "share in power" was a direct appeal to smaller parties long frustrated by the dominance of the two Dravidian majors - the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra



Kazhagam - both of which have consistently resisted coalition-style governance. This was Vijay's opening. Consider the Viduthalai Chiruthaigal Katchi. A vocal advocate of power-sharing, it could have been the first domino. But alliances are built on trust and initiative. For VCK, a long-time DMK ally, the risk of "blinking first" was too high. Vijay needed to make that move easier - he didn't. The Indian National Congress too briefly hovered around the idea of a new alignment. A Congress-TVK tie-up could have been transformative - giving TVK structure and Congress relevance in a state where it has long ceded ground. Instead,

Congress used the possibility of a new alliance as leverage, extracting a better deal from the DMK and moving on. Even the opposition All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam, led by Edappadi K Palaniswami, briefly signalled interest. The optics - TVK flags at AIADMK events - hinted at a potential convergence. A tie-up could have echoed the successful AIADMK-Vijayakanth's DMK experiment that once reshaped the opposition space. But that moment passed, as AIADMK recalibrated and revived ties with the BJP. Perhaps the most telling gap was the failure to engage with DMDK. With Premalatha Vijayakanth

now aligning with the DMK, even that door has closed. The result is stark. A party that could have been the fulcrum of a new political formation risks becoming a holding space for the politically displaced. The groundswell of support Vijay generated remains real - but in electoral politics, sentiment without structure rarely translates into seats. As nomination deadlines approach, Vijay's political instincts face their first real stress test. But the larger question lingers: in a state where alliances are everything, has Vijay already missed his moment? Or is the support for TVK exponentially growing, set to defy alliance arithmetic?

Performer is Hindu, not Christian: Pambada community refutes allegations over Daiva ritual in Bolur

Mangaluru, Mar 18: Amid controversy surrounding a recent Daiva Nartana (spirit dance) ritual in Bolur, members of the Pambada community have strongly refuted allegations that the performer belonged to the Christian faith, asserting instead that he is a Hindu with valid caste credentials.

a press conference, Daiva performer Suraj Chippar clarified that the accusations made earlier by Dr Rathi during a media interaction on March 13 were baseless. "It was alleged that a person born to a Christian woman performed the ritual, which traditionally belongs to communities like Pambada and Panara. However, we possess official caste certificates proving that Sushanth Bangera, who performed the ritual, is a Hindu and belongs to the Pambada community," he stated. Responding to

claims regarding Sushanth's family background, community member Ganesh Pambada explained that while it is true that he had married a Christian woman, she had embraced Hindu customs and traditions after marriage. "Once a woman adopts the traditions and practices of her husband's religion, she becomes part of the community. Targeting her on these grounds is unjust," he said. He further added that their son, Sushanth, was born and raised following Hindu traditions, with all legal documents, including caste certification, duly in place.

Ganesh emphasized that the ritual conducted at the Jarandaya Daivasthana in Bolur was carried out with complete devotion and in accordance with traditional practices. "There has been no disrespect to the customs or dignity of the

Pambada community. The ritual was performed flawlessly, without any lapses, and brought no harm or inconvenience to anyone," he noted.

Highlighting his experience, Ganesh stated that he has been performing Daiva Nartana for over 31 years across several regions, including Kumble, Vittla, Koliyur, Manjeshwar, and Harekala. "I have always upheld the sanctity of the tradition and will continue to offer my services wherever devotees invite me," he said. Meanwhile, Sushanth Bangera expressed distress over the allegations, stating that being labelled as a Christian had caused him personal and professional harm. Illegal cattle slaughter racket busted in Kasaba Bengre; 9 cattle rescued, 205 kg

Mangaluru, Mar 19: In a major crackdown, Panambur police conducted a raid on an illegal cattle slaughter unit operating in Kasaba Bengre and seized nine live cattle along with 205 kg of meat meant for sale.

Acting on credible information about unlawful slaughter activities, police raided a shed located near Badria Juma Masjid in Kasaba Bengre, on the banks of the Phalguni river, behind a house

belonging to a person identified as Ahmed. It is learnt that a group of four to five individuals had been illegally slaughtering cattle at the spot.

During the operation, police rescued nine cattle that had been tied up for slaughter and confiscated 205 kg of processed meat along with equipment used for the illegal activity. The accused have been identified as Kabir alias Peth Kabir of Kasaba Bengre, Badru alias Badruddin of

Jokatte, and three others. All the accused fled the scene before the police arrived. A special team has been formed to trace and apprehend them, officials said.

The raid was carried out under the guidance of ACP Shrikant and PI Saleem Abbas, with PSI Shrikala and staff from Panambur police station leading the operation. A case has been registered at Panambur police station, and further investigation is underway.

Harnessing Biosorption: Turning Brewery Waste Into a Water Purification Powerhouse

A filter made from brewery waste yeast encapsulated in hydrogels can quickly absorb lead from contaminated water.



Breweries generate and discard thousands of tons of surplus yeast every year. Researchers from MIT and Georgia Tech have now come up with a way to repurpose that yeast for extracting lead from polluted water. Using a process known as biosorption, the yeast efficiently absorbs trace and larger amounts of lead and other heavy metals from water. The researchers have successfully packaged the yeast in hydrogel capsules, forming a filter that removes lead from water. These encapsulated yeast cells can easily be removed from the water, making it safe for consumption.

Effective and Sustainable Technology We have the hydrogel surrounding the free yeast that exists in the center, and this is porous enough to let water come in, interact with yeast as if they were freely moving in water, and then come out clean," says Patricia Stathatou. She is a former postdoc at the MIT Center for Bits and Atoms, who is now a

research scientist at Georgia Tech and an incoming assistant professor at Georgia Tech's School of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering. "The fact that the yeast themselves are bio-based, benign, and biodegradable is a significant advantage over traditional technologies."

The researchers envision that this process could be used to filter drinking water coming out of a faucet in homes, or scaled up to treat large quantities of water at treatment plants.

MIT graduate student Devashish Gokhale and Stathatou are the lead authors of the study, which was published on May 15 in the journal RSC Sustainability. Patrick Doyle, the Robert T. Haslam Professor of Chemical Engineering at MIT, is the senior author of the paper, and Christos Athanasiou, an assistant professor of aerospace engineering at Georgia Tech and a former visiting scholar at MIT, is also an author.

The new study builds on work that Stathatou

and Athanasiou began in 2021, when Athanasiou was a visiting scholar at MIT's Center for Bits and Atoms. That year, they calculated that waste yeast discarded from a single brewery in Boston would be enough to treat the city's entire water supply.

Through biosorption, a process that is not fully understood, yeast cells can bind to and absorb heavy metal ions, even at challenging initial concentrations below 1 part per million. The MIT team found that this process could effectively decontaminate water with low concentrations of lead. However, one key obstacle remained, which was how to remove yeast from the water after they absorb the lead. In a serendipitous coincidence, Stathatou and Athanasiou happened to present their research at the AIChE Annual Meeting in Boston in 2021, where Gokhale, a student in Doyle's lab, was presenting his own research on using hydrogels to capture micropollutants in water. The two sets of researchers decided to join forces and explore whether the yeast-based strategy could be easier to scale up if the yeast were encapsulated in hydrogels developed by Gokhale and Doyle. "What we decided to do was make these hollow capsules - something like a multivitamin pill, but instead of filling them up with vitamins, we fill them up with yeast cells," Gokhale says. "These capsules are porous, so the water can go into the capsules and the yeast are able to bind all of that lead, but the yeast themselves can't escape into the water." The capsules are made from a polymer called polyethylene glycol (PEG), which is widely used in medical applications. To form the capsules, the researchers suspend freeze-dried yeast in water, then mix them with the polymer subunits. When UV light is shone on the mixture, the polymers link together to form capsules with yeast trapped inside.

Humanitarian sector must be prepared for cyberattack threat

The growing sophistication of cyberwarfare has resulted in a notable escalation in recent years. Cyberattacks have evolved beyond mere disruptions of digital systems and now have the potential to cause real-world harm with devastating consequences. This may be a paradigm shift in the landscape of modern conflict. As our reliance on digital technologies continues to expand across various sectors, so does the potential for cyber threats and attacks.

Last month, a hacking group known as "Gonjeshke Darande" (Predatory Sparrow) claimed responsibility for a cyberattack that knocked out the majority of gas stations across Iran, leading to long queues. Almost 70 percent of the country's gas stations experienced service disruptions, according to Iranian state TV. The disruption was attributed to a "software problem" and the public was advised against rushing to those stations that were still operational. Already this year, the global landscape has been marred by a series of more than 15 major cyberattacks spanning diverse sectors and affecting numerous countries. These incidents underscore the pervasive and evolving nature of cyber threats in our interconnected world. From critical infrastructure to financial institutions, government entities to private enterprises, the targets have been varied, highlighting the indiscriminate reach of malicious actors in the digital realm. Nation states, nonstate actors and even individuals are increasingly leveraging advanced cyber capabilities

in order to achieve financial, political and strategic objectives.

The humanitarian challenges stemming from cyberattacks have unfortunately emerged as a pressing concern, as hospitals, power grids, financial institutions and critical infrastructure are no longer immune to the reach of such adversaries. As the world becomes increasingly reliant on technology for essential services, communication and commerce, the vulnerabilities exposed by malicious cyber activities pose profound threats to humanity's well-being.

This is why it is important to look at the intricate web of humanitarian challenges associated with cyberattacks by delving into the implications for individuals, communities and global organizations and ways to tackle this issue.

First of all, it is critical to point out that the infrastructure that is essential for the functioning of societies has increasingly become a target - and is susceptible - to cyber threats. The interconnectivity of systems controlling energy, water supply, transport and healthcare leaves these sectors vulnerable to malicious cyber activities. Disruptions in these areas can have cascading effects, jeopardizing the delivery of vital services and posing significant challenges for humanitarian organizations responding to crises. As humanitarian organizations collect and store vast amounts of sensitive data, the risk of data breaches looms large. More fundamentally, the healthcare sector, a core pillar of humanitarian efforts.

No Habeas corpus relief if wife elopes voluntarily, says Madras High Court

MADURAI: The Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court recently observed that no remedy under a habeas corpus petition shall be available for the disappearance of a wife who actually eloped with another man.

The petitioner, S Murugan, residing in Tenkasi district, approached the Court seeking issuance of a writ of habeas corpus to direct the police authorities to produce his wife Bhavani (23), along with their two children aged 3½ and 2 years, and to set them at liberty. He contended that his wife had gone missing with the children on March 6, 2026, and alleged inaction on the part of the police despite a complaint and registration of a woman missing case.

The Bench comprising Justices N Anand Venkatesh and P Dhanabal



observed that the woman appeared to have voluntarily left with a third person due to a personal relationship, and therefore, no coercive direction could be issued to secure her custody through a habeas corpus petition.

However, the Court expressed serious concern over the welfare of the two minor children, noting that their interests required immediate

attention. It directed the police to trace the woman and children and produce them before the Judicial Magistrate, Alangulam, at the earliest. The Magistrate was instructed to record the woman's statement and interact with the children to ascertain their welfare before taking appropriate action in accordance with the law.

Artificial reefs deployed off Rameswaram to boost fish breeding

RAMESWARAM: Work has begun to deploy artificial coral reefs in the sea off Rameswaram and other parts of Ramanathapuram district to enhance fish breeding, under a State-funded project worth Rs 43 crore. Fisheries officials said around 26,000 artificial reef units will be placed at 145 locations across 29 coastal villages, including Rameswaram, Thangachimadam and Mandapam, over the next two months. The structures are being transported from the Pamban Kunthukal deep-sea fish-

ing harbour, where they were manufactured, and loaded onto boats using cranes before being lowered into the sea. The project aims to improve fish breeding by creating habitats where fish can lay eggs and grow, officials said. Ramanathapuram district, which has one of the longest coastlines in Tamil Nadu, supports over 30,000 fishermen and more than 10,000 fishing boats. Officials said fish availability has declined due to factors including the use of banned nets and environmental changes.

Leaving Kids in Cars Can Be Dangerous



Leaving a child alone in a car is fraught with danger. If the car is locked with all the windows closed, the child runs the risk of suffering severe heat stroke, as cars heat up very quickly and children are extremely susceptible to heat. If you keep the engine idling, with the key in the ignition and the air-conditioner running, your child can get kidnapped, or your car may get stolen, along with the child. A couple in Kerala learnt this the hard way when their car got stolen, along with their toddler in the backseat, in January this year. On their way to a relative's house in Kozhikode, the couple stopped at a bakery. Their child was sleeping at the back, so they left the car engine idling to keep the air-conditioning on and stepped out to buy a few items. To their horror, their car was stolen, along with the child at the back! Fortunately for them, it all ended on a happy note — the thief was caught and the child, abandoned after two hours on the roadside, was picked up safe and sound! There was an almost identical incident in Delhi last June.

Here, the couple left their two kids — an 11-year-old girl and her three-year-old brother — in the car, with the AC running, while they went into a confectionery shop in East Delhi. When they returned, they found their car stolen, along with the children. After a three-hour police chase involving 20 police vehicles, the culprits abandoned the vehicle and the children too.

One may find it hard to believe, but there are innumerable instances of parents, and in some cases a grandparent, leaving behind a sleeping child in the car by mistake. There are also cases of parents leaving a child behind in the car while going on a short errand, believing the car to be a safe place. With the windows up and the car locked, the temperature inside the car goes up so quickly that a child is unable to withstand it. In May last year, a couple from Kota district, Rajasthan, lost their three-year-old daughter to vehicular hyperthermia. The parents were going to a wedding with their two daughters and when the father stopped the car in front of the venue, his wife and the elder

daughter exited. The father presumed that all three had left and so parked and locked the car and went in, leaving the sleeping child behind. By the time they realised that three-year-old Gorvika was missing and went to get her, it was too late.

In another tragic incident on October 30, three-year-old Vartika became a victim of heat stroke in a locked car in Meerut. In this case, it was not her parents, but a colleague of her father who took her for a ride in the car and then left her in the parked car, planning to return shortly. The heat inside the car killed the child. There are several websites that help you calculate the temperature inside a car at different ambient temperatures. When the outside temperature is 30°C, for example, the temperature inside a car goes up to almost 50°C (48.89 °C, to be precise) in just 30 minutes! In 15 minutes, it hovers over 43°C. Eighty per cent of the temperature rise, it is estimated, occurs within the first half an hour. A study published in March 2009 in the International Journal of Meteorology reveals that even on

cloudy days with lower ambient air temperatures, the temperatures inside a car can reach dangerous levels.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in the United States says that a child's body temperature rises three to five times faster than an adult's and heat stroke occurs when the body temperature reaches 104°F (40°C). A child can die when it reaches 107°F (41.6°C).

Cars seem to hold a special attraction for children when it comes to playtime and that's how many of them enter the vehicle and get trapped when the doors automatically get locked. In Kochi, Kerala, two-year-old Rithick got inside his father's car parked in front of the house and locked himself up by pressing the lock button on the key. The parents did not have the spare key and eventually had to call the Fire and Rescue Services to get the child out — the entire process took 45 minutes early in the morning and the child was traumatised inside.

There was a similar incident in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, in July. Here, the parents were lucky but there are many unfortunate cases where the children are found too late. In November, four siblings, aged 2-7 years, died in a car in Radadiya village in Gujarat's Amreli district. The parents had gone to work on a farm and the children got into the car of the farm owner and were unable to get out when the doors automatically locked. By the time they were found, all had succumbed to heat stroke. Earlier, in May, a three-year-old girl in Bhadradi Kothagudem district in Telangana met the same fate when she accidentally got locked inside a car parked in front of her house. The same month, six-year-old Kaunen and his four-year-old cousin Abdullah, playing in the compound of their house in Raebareli district in Uttar Pradesh, got into a parked SUV and got locked. Heat stroke claimed their lives. A month prior to that, two children reported missing by their parents in Central Mumbai were found dead in an abandoned car parked in Antop Hill. So, never leave a child alone in a car, even for a short time, and if you are the forgetful type, keep a paper reminding you of the child at the back, pasted on the windshield!

India's Love for Pistachios

More than three decades back, I was busy researching Indian aphrodisiac recipes. My good friend, a peerless food impresario, sprang a surprise when he disclosed that he was in possession of the heirloom recipe from the rural kitchens of Patiala — Pistiyan da salan. He had been 'gifted' this recipe by a food-loving scion of the princely family. When we got heritage chef Mohammad Farooq to cook it for us, it turned out to be exquisite. It was creamy chicken curry with the gravy having hardly a hint of the emerald tint. It tasted rich and had, perhaps, served the patrons in urgent need of tonic restorative food well. Chef Farooq's exertions made us realise that, to mix metaphors, this was not everyone's 'cup of tea'. Years passed by, and we had almost forgotten about the magical properties of the pistachio when we suddenly encountered the recipe of 'pista gosht' in Chef Nishant Choubey's forthcoming cookbook, 'Stay With the Indus'. This time, the nut was favouring not the murg, but a mutton chop.

Pista has always occupied the top spot in Indian imagination. Above cashewnuts, walnuts, and even almonds. Imported from Afghanistan, it had great scarcity value. Thin slivers were used to garnish phirni, kulfi and burfi. This was before liberalisation of imports that made access to all kinds of nuts easy.

Memory is still green of the 'piste ki launjee' that was crafted with unalloyed pista. It is seldom seen at the desi sweetshop counters these days, though, at times, served

in lieu of pralines and petit-fours.

We are glad that pistachios are enjoying a well-deserved revival. Chef Parvinder Bali, who directs the School of European Pastry and Culinary Arts in Gurugram, treated us to an absolutely out-of-this-world 'pista gelato' when we visited his pastry studio — that in itself is a work of art. Chef Bali informed us that the best pistachios are imported from Turkey, and this is what Chef Nishant seconds. 'Pista-crust mutton chops' do not claim any aphrodisiac properties but would have easily found a place in any princely dastarkhwan — Awadhi, Patialashahi or Hyderabad. Try it out before the weather changes, and you start worrying about its garam taseer! Prepare a crust for lamb chops by mixing chopped pistachios, jalapenos, chopped capers, green olives, parsley and breadcrumb.

Marinate lamb chops with salt, pepper, olive oil, minced garlic, minced ginger, turmeric powder and garam masala for at least two hours. Cook these in a pre-heated oven at 220°C for 10-12 minutes, and let these rest.

Meanwhile, roast the pumpkin at 180°C for 10 minutes with some chopped garlic, turmeric powder and olive oil. Take it out of the oven. Mash it well. Spice it up with cumin powder, red chilli powder and cilantro. Take a separate pan and cook the prunes in red wine vinegar and sugar on low flame for 3-4 minutes, stirring continuously.

Spread the crust on a flat tray and place the chops in it, turning once or twice to coat evenly. Serve with warm mash and cooked prunes.

Bank of England 'ready to act' as it warns Iran war 'shock' will push up inflation

The Bank of England "stands ready to act" to keep interest rates at a level to control inflation, its governor Andrew Bailey has said. His comments came as the Bank announced it was leaving its key rate unchanged at 3.75%. Until the conflict in the Middle East began a rate cut had been expected. The Bank said prices would rise more quickly due to the "new shock to the economy" and now expects inflation to be close to 3.5% in March. All members of the rate-setting committee voted to hold rates and "assess how events unfold". They also discussed whether a rate rise could be needed, although Bailey suggested markets were "getting ahead" of themselves in assuming several rises this year. Before the US-Israel attack on Iran, economists had expected inflation and interest rates to fall further this year. Some had pencilled in a rate cut for March. But the committee decided to hold, in the first unanimous vote for four-and-a-half years. The conflict has pushed up the price of oil and gas sharply, with




attacks on energy infrastructure in the last 24 hours adding further upward pressure. That has raised the prospect of another pick-up in inflation. "War in the Middle East has pushed up energy prices. You can already see that at the petrol pump and, if it lasts, it will feed into higher household energy bills later in the year," said Bailey. The only way to address higher energy prices was by restoring safe passage for shipping in the Gulf, he said. But he

emphasised the focus of the Bank's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) was on the wider knock-on impact on prices. "Whatever happens, our job is to make sure inflation gets back to its 2% target," said Bailey. Inflation in January stood at 3%. The language at recent meetings of the MPC has centred around a reduction in borrowing costs. At February's meeting members were split, with four backing a cut and five, including the Bank's govern-

nor, voting to hold rates steady. Notes from this meeting showed the debate has been turned on its head, with the committee all backing a hold in rates. They also discussed whether a rate rise could be required in the coming months, something which financial markets now think could be the next move. Following the Bank's latest decision and comments, traders are predicting there could be two hikes before the end of the year, taking rates to 4.25%.

HDFC BANK SAYS 'BAFFLED' AT CHAIRMAN'S ETHICS CONCERN THAT MADE HIM QUIT

New Delhi/Mumbai: HDFC Bank's non-executive chairman Atanu Chakraborty abruptly resigned, citing differences over "values and ethics" - a ground that the management of the country's second-largest lender said was baffling, as the former bureaucrat offered no specific instance despite repeated requests. Keki Mistry, a veteran of the HDFC Bank Group, was appointed as the interim chairman, following the resignation, said there may have been "relationship issues" between Chakraborty and the executive leadership, but found no "substantive" concerns behind the departure. Mistry emphasised that the bank's operations and governance remain stable. This is the first time that the part-time chairman of HDFC Bank left mid-way, raising concerns over its functioning. "Certain happenings and practices within the bank, that I have observed over the last two years, are not in congruence with my personal values and ethics. This is the basis of my aforementioned decision," he said in his resignation letter dated March 17. In a letter addressed to the Chairman of Governance, Nomination, Remuneration Committee (NRC) HK Bhanwala, Chakraborty said, "There are no



other material reasons for my resignation other than those stated above". In a late evening Wednesday filing, HDFC Bank said Chakraborty has on March 18, 2026, tendered his resignation as the Part-time Chairman and Independent Director of the Bank with immediate effect. It is to be noted that Chakraborty was appointed part-time chairman effective May 5, 2021, almost a year after retirement as Economic Affairs Secretary. His term was extended for another three years in 2024 till May 4, 2027. Chakraborty, a 1985 batch IAS officer of Gujarat cadre, retired as Secretary of the Department of Economic Affairs in April 2020. Prior to that, he was

Secretary of the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM). Both departments come under the Finance Ministry. Chakraborty became chairman during the reverse merger process of the bank with the parent entity HDFC Ltd, a leading mortgage firm in the country. The merger of HDFC Ltd with HDFC Bank became effective on July 1, 2023, creating a financial behemoth with a combined balance sheet of over Rs 18 lakh crore. Taking note of the exit, the RBI said there were no material concerns on record as regards the bank's conduct or governance. "HDFC Bank is a Domestically Systemically Important

Bank (D-SIB) with sound financials, a professionally run board and a competent management team. Basis our periodical assessment, there are no material concerns on record as regards its conduct or governance," the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said in a statement. The statement emphasised that the bank remains well-capitalised and its financial position remains satisfactory with sufficient liquidity. Shares of HDFC Bank dived over 5 per cent on Thursday following the exit of the bank's chairman. The blue-chip stock tumbled 5.13 per cent to settle at Rs 799.70 on the BSE, trimming some of its sharp early losses. During the day, it tanked 8.41 per cent to Rs 772 - its 52-week low. However, the finance ministry said the bank is a "strong institution with strong fundamentals". Financial Services Secretary M Nagaraju said the RBI has already issued a statement in this regard. "HDFC Bank is a strong institution with strong fundamentals," he said. Addressing reporters about the surprise move, HDFC Bank MD and CEO Sashidhar Jagdishan noted that a majority of the board members said they are "baffled" by Chakraborty's move because he did not offer any specific concerns that he is alluding to in the resignation letter.

Qatar calls energy plant strikes 'dangerous escalation' and says Iran must stop attacks

It adds to other US efforts to boost oil supplies, including the suspension of sanctions on Russian oil and the contribution of 172 million barrels of oil to a global release of oil reserves. Bessent has previously said the US is also allowing Iranian oil tankers through, despite the conflict. How much of an impact it will have on prices is unclear. Asked about concerns that the US is funding its enemies, Bessent says the US would be "using the Iranian barrels against the Iranians" to keep prices down for the next 10-14 days. Britain will "step up" defensive support for Gulf states after Iran attacked energy sites across the region, Defence Secretary John Healey says. He adds that Tehran's attacks overnight are a "serious escalation" which threaten to "further

destabilise the region". "We can see the impact here on the cost of living, the price of fuel, so it's important that we do everything we can with a lot of other countries that need to be involved in trying to reopen those straits", Healey tells PA news agency. The best way of taking the pressure off world oil prices, he says, is "to see a de-escalation and an end to the conflict". Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi says the attack on Qatar's Ras Laffan energy complex only employed a "FRACTION of our power". "The ONLY reason for restraint was respect for requested de-escalation," he writes on X. In an apparent threat to the US, Israel and Gulf nations, he goes on to say there will be "ZERO restraint" if Iranian infrastructure is struck again. He also says any end to the war "must address damage" to Iran's civilian sites. The jump in gas prices today comes as no surprise.

SOUTH AFRICANS SAY CRIMINAL GANGS ARE EXPLOITING THE WATER CRISIS



In the Johannesburg suburb of Greenside, a large group of protesters of all ages and backgrounds are waving placards and banging empty plastic bottles together. "We want water, we want water!" they chant. Northern Johannesburg is known for its lush leafy suburbs. But after years of intermittent water shortages in South Africa, residents say they are fed up. Some have had no running water for over a month. "Our pipes have been bone-dry with no water coming through at all," says Colin Regesky. "It's not very healthy because everyone can get sick with

no running water. And also according to the constitution it's our right to have water." Another protester, Jenny Gillies, has lived in the area for 40 years. "I am here today because it is an actual disgrace," she says. "We are reduced to begging and protesting for water." From 2022 to early 2024, Johannesburg, South Africa's economic hub, suffered crippling electricity shortages, which were managed via a process known as load shedding. Blackouts lasting up to eight hours a day severely disrupted the lives of ordinary South Africans and businesses.

DR Congo and Rwanda agree to ease tensions after talks in US



The Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda have agreed to take "concrete steps" to ease tensions amid a stalled peace process, after talks hosted by the US in Washington. Conflict in eastern DR Congo has continued despite the two countries signing a peace deal with US President Donald Trump last year. The pledge to ease tensions comes after the US earlier this month sanctioned the Rwandan Defence Forces and four senior officials and accused Rwanda of directly supporting the M23 rebel group, blaming it for escalating the conflict. A joint statement by DR Congo, Rwanda and the US says they have "agreed to a series of coordinated steps to de-escalate tensions and advance progress on the ground". They pledged to respect each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity, while Rwanda would disengage its forces and lift "defensive measures... in defined areas in DR Congo's territory", the statement says. While DR Congo would intensify "time-bound" efforts to neutralise the Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda (FDLR), an armed group that includes some Rwandan ethnic Hutus involved in the

1994 Rwandan genocide and remains active in eastern DR Congo. Rwanda describes the FDLR as a "genocidal militia" and says its continued existence in eastern DR Congo threatens its own territory. It has repeatedly denied supporting M23 despite overwhelming evidence, saying its military presence is a defensive measure against threats against its security by armed groups in DR Congo. Fighting has persisted in eastern DR Congo despite the US-brokered peace deal in December aimed at ending the long-running conflict. Days after the signing ceremony, the M23 entered the Congolese city of Uvira near the Burundi border in the biggest escalation of the conflict in months. It later pulled out under US pressure, although it still controls large parts of eastern DR Congo, including the region's two biggest cities, Goma and Bukavu. Earlier this month, while announcing the Rwandan sanctions, the US said that despite the M23's withdrawal, its continued presence near the Burundian border and Rwandan military support to them carried "the risk of escalating the conflict into a broader regional war".

Kevin Spacey and accusers settle before civil trial

Kevin Spacey has agreed an out-of-court settlement with three men who had sued the actor after accusing him of sexual assault. The civil cases had been due to go to trial at the High Court later this year, but those proceedings have now been frozen following the settlement. The men alleged that Spacey assaulted them between 2000 and 2013. The Oscar winner, 66, denies all allegations of wrongdoing. He was separately cleared of nine sexual offence charges at a criminal trial in 2023. Two of the men who accused the Oscar-winning star during the criminal trial also filed civil legal cases at the High Court. One man, known only as LNP, alleged that Spacey "deliberately assaulted" him on



about 12 occasions between 2000 and 2005. Another, referred to as GHI, says he met Spacey through a workshop at London's Old Vic theatre and claimed he "suffered psychiatric damage and financial loss" as a result of an assault in 2008. Spacey was artistic director of the Old Vic between 2004 and 2013. The third man, Ruari Cannon, has waived his right to anonymity.

Are US and Israel in lockstep in Iran war? Deciphering Trump's post after gas field attacks

US President Donald Trump has issued a typically strongly worded statement in the wake of attacks on a major gas field shared by Iran and Qatar on Wednesday. Israel hit Iran's South Pars - part of the world's largest natural gas field - and Tehran retaliated by striking an energy complex in Qatar. The attacks led to a spike in energy prices, and fuelled Trump's wrath. On his Truth Social media platform, Trump threatened Iran again and said he didn't know about Israel's plans for the attack. So what does the language used by the US president tell us about the course of the war and the extent to which the US and Israel are aligned on its strategy and goals? Let's break it down. The president says the US



"knew nothing about this particular attack". This flies in the face of multiple newspaper reports in Israel in the aftermath of the attack. The attack "was co-ordinated in advance with the United States and... agreed upon between Prime Minister [Benjamin] Netanyahu and US President Trump," the centrist paper Yedioth

Ahronoth reported. Right-wing paper Israel Hayom goes further, saying "President Trump discussed the upcoming Israeli strike in [Iran's coastal city of] Asaluyeh with leaders of three Persian Gulf states over the weekend". As is often the case with the president's assertions, it is not easy to know where the truth lies. His choice of

words to describe the Israeli attack is also telling. "Out of anger," he says, Israel "violently lashed out" against the gas field. This is the sort of language used to describe some of Iran's wilder retaliations - not a carefully considered military operation by a close ally. Is Trump suggesting that Israel acted unwisely? Israel will make "no more attacks" on gas field The president's use of capitals is notorious, but in this lengthy post, he resorts to all caps just once. "NO MORE ATTACKS WILL BE MADE BY ISRAEL" pertaining to this extremely important and valuable South Pars Field," he writes, "unless Iran unwisely decides to attack a very innocent, in this case Qatar."

CHAD WARNS SUDAN IT WILL RETALIATE AFTER DRONE STRIKE ON MOURNERS KILLS 17

Chad's president has ordered the military to retaliate against future attacks from Sudan following a drone attack that killed at least 17 people and injured several other people attending a funeral. Wearing military uniform, President Idris Mahamat Déby convened an emergency security meeting on Wednesday evening, where he ordered the military to be on high alert. He also ordered a "total closure" of the border with Sudan. He described the attack targeting the border town of Tiné as "outrageous and a blatant aggression" against Chad's territorial integrity. He said that it had hap-



pened despite warnings to the two sides battling each other in Sudan and a previous closure of the border. Last month, Chad closed its border with Sudan "until further notice" to stop repeated incursions by Sudanese armed groups. It however allowed "except-

tional exemptions" on humanitarian grounds, with prior authorisation from relevant authorities. Residents of Tiné said the victims of Wednesday's attack were mourners, with one quoted by the Reuters news agency as saying they had gathered at a house for

a funeral ceremony that involved reading the Koran. The attack drew condemnation from several quarters, including from the National Assembly and MPs from the ruling party. "The government bows with deep dismay to the memory of the victims and extends its deepest condolences to the bereaved families," a statement by the government spokesman said. The spokesman said Chad had now "strengthened the posture of its defence and security forces" and was ready to pursue its rights inside Sudanese territory "in strict compliance with the rules of international law".

Japan PM to hold 'difficult' talks with Trump as Iran conflict looms large



Japan's Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi is on her way to what she expects will be a "very difficult" meeting with US leader Donald Trump, days after his calls for allies to help secure the war-stricken Strait of Hormuz went largely unanswered. Takaichi told parliament hours before her departure that she would "do everything to maximise [Japan's] national interest". The three-day visit to Washington was a chance to talk trade and deepen the US-Japan alliance ahead of Trump's diplomatic trip to China, which has now been postponed because of the war. But now it is the topic of the war that will likely overshadow the meeting, which is shaping up to be a test of Takaichi's friendship with Trump. The trip was scheduled back in October, a week after Takaichi took office, when Tokyo rolled out the red carpet for Trump and the two leaders heaped compliments on each other, heralding a new "golden age" in bilateral ties. As of a few weeks ago, the upcoming meeting looked set to be a success, with Takaichi "fresh off a

dominant election victory and with a new round of investment projects in the US", Emma Chanlett-Avery, director for political and security affairs at the Asia Society Policy Institute, told the BBC. But while Takaichi "had intended to build on the warmth of her first meeting with Trump and press upon him Japan's concerns about Chinese aggression ahead of Trump's [then scheduled] meeting with Xi", recent events have complicated things, said Chanlett-Avery. Earlier this week, Trump posted on his Truth Social platform a call for some countries to help secure the vital strait. He had pointed to Japan's and other Asian economies' dependence on fuel from the Middle East as reason for them to get involved. "We get less than 1% of our oil from the [Strait of Hormuz] and some countries get much more... We want them to come and help us," he wrote. But after receiving a lukewarm response, he retracted his request, saying in a later post that the US did "NOT NEED THE HELP OF ANYONE!".

Cyprus leader calls for frank discussion on 'colonial' UK bases



The UK's two military bases on Cyprus are a "colonial consequence" on the island and talks on their status and future need to take place, Cypriot President Nikos Christodoulides has told the BBC. "When the situation is over in the Middle East we are going to have an open and frank discussion with the British government," he said as he arrived for an EU leaders' summit in Brussels. Under the 1960 treaty establishing Cypriot independence from Britain, the UK

was given sovereignty of bases at Akrotiri and Dhekelia. However, RAF Akrotiri was targeted by drones this month shortly after the start of the US-Israeli war with Iran and the UK has faced some criticism for its response to the attack. The drones are thought to have been fired from Lebanon by Iranian-backed group Hezbollah and protesters have complained that the British bases on the island have made Cyprus a target.



BHA STRATEGY TO TACKLE 'CONSISTENT PATTERN' OF RACISM

People from ethnically and culturally diverse backgrounds have reported a "consistent pattern" of racism while working in horse racing, according to research commissioned by the sport's governing body. The British Horseracing Authority (BHA) has launched a new equality, diversity and inclusion strategy to tackle issues faced by underrepresented groups in the sport. The new strategy draws from research into the experiences of women, LGBTQ+ individuals and ethnically and culturally diverse employees. "The strategy outlines a vision for a sport where everyone feels respected, valued and able to fulfil their potential," the BHA said. "It is based on evidence and the experiences of racing's workforce, many of whom have positive experiences, but not all." The BHA's research into underrepresented groups in racing highlighted "negative experiences, barriers to progression (which are often hidden), inconsistent support, and



a lack of trust in reporting systems". A study which focused on the Urban Equestrian Academy - a social enterprise aimed at providing people from inner-city and diverse backgrounds access to horses and equestrian - found that all 20 participants had reported experiencing racism. In the same study, all participants said that race had impacted their career progression. One

participant shared that they had thought about suicide "on a few occasions because of the way I was treated". Meanwhile, 40% (67) of respondents in a separate survey said they had experienced, witnessed, or had reported to them inappropriate or poor behaviour because of ethnicity or cultural background. Some reported verbal abuse including aggressive racist language

such as "dirty refugee" and "better off if you had been bombed". The new strategy also identified a significant underrepresentation in female jockeys, with only 25% of jockeys being women despite them making up 70% of racing school students and 50% of racing staff. Women also receive just 9% of rides and only 3% in top-tier races. "The strategy is rooted in evidence and shaped

by the lived experiences of people working in racing today, and we offer a huge thank you to those who have taken the time and shown the courage to share these with us," the BHA's head of diversity and inclusion, Rose Grissell, said. "Many have positive experiences, but not everyone does, and acknowledging that is an important step in supporting positive progress. "Our aim is to make inclusion part of everyday practice, not an optional extra." The BHA's new equality, diversity and inclusion strategy includes the following proposals: Strengthen leadership and accountability Build equitable practices to address bias and barriers Improve education and awareness to act inclusively Better support and celebrate an inclusive culture Engage new audiences and make the sport more accessible BHA chief executive Brant Dunshea said the new strategy was about ensuring the "long-term health and success" of horse racing.

Former India captain MS Dhoni's wife, Sakshi, on Wednesday took to Instagram to share a heartfelt birthday post for her father-in-law, Pan Singh Dhoni. Sakshi shared a picture of Pan Singh Dhoni on her Instagram story, in which he can be seen feeding a piece of cake to a boy. She also shared a heartfelt caption, describing Pan Singh's journey as nothing short of inspirational. "From a young boy who left his village alone with courage... to building a legacy that the whole nation respects - your journey is pure inspiration. The strength behind my Man's success and because of you he is what he is today. We love you. Happy Birthday," posted Sakshi. Recently, South African batting legend AB de Villiers suggested that Dhoni must bat at number



That's why I don't see

The 44-year-old Dhoni is at the fag end of his career, but de Villiers feels he still has the potential to make an impact with the bat. "We know he can be impactful with the bat, but if he's batting that low and not captaining, it feels like he's almost just making up for a spot for the wrong reasons. There's still a place for him, but he needs to bat higher, at least at six, maybe even at five or four at times," said the South Africa great.

FLOYD MAYWEATHER TO FIGHT MANNY PACQUIAO IN LAS VEGAS IN SEPTEMBER

Floyd Mayweather and Manny Pacquiao will meet in a long-awaited rematch of the highest-grossing clash in boxing history this September at the Sphere in Las Vegas, Netflix announced Monday. The bout between two of boxing's biggest names - who famously fought a blockbuster clash in 2015, and are now both in their late forties - comes days after Mayweather announced he is coming out of retirement. It will be broadcast live September 19 on Netflix, as the global streaming platform increasingly moves into live sports with glitzy one-off events. "Floyd and I gave the world what remains the biggest fight in boxing history. The fans



have waited long enough - they deserve this rematch," said Pacquiao, 47, in a joint statement. Mayweather beat fellow welterweight Pacquiao in their money-spinning 2015 "Fight of the Century," which generated a record 4.6 million pay-per-view buys but largely failed to live up to the hype.

Mayweather is believed to have earned an estimated \$300 million from the unanimous points victory over the Filipino icon, which remains the most lucrative fight in history and generated more than \$600 million revenue. Former multi-weight world champion Mayweather retired from

boxing in 2017, unbeaten in 50 bouts, though he has continued to fight in exhibitions since, including an upcoming clash this spring with Mike Tyson. Pacquiao, also a multiple world champion, retired for a four-year period from 2021 in which he unsuccessfully ran for the Philippine presidency. He came out of retirement last year. Rumors of a Mayweather-Pacquiao rematch have circulated for years, and speculation soared following Mayweather's announcement last week that he would return to the professional arena this year. "I already fought and beat Manny once. This time will be the same result," said Mayweather, in the statement.

BCCI Receives Huge Request From Ajit Agarkar After India's T20 World Cup Triumph

Indian cricket team chief selector Ajit Agarkar has requested the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to extend his tenure till the 2027 ODI World Cup, according to Times of India. Agarkar's contract was extended by a year just before IPL 2025 as a reward for India winning the 2025 Champions Trophy and 2024 T20 World Cup. The report claimed that discussions are underway regarding his request but nothing concrete has emerged as of now. Another former Indian cricket team player from the West Zone was reportedly the front-runner to succeed Agarkar but nothing has developed on that front as well. The request is believed to be well-timed as it came



just after the T20 World Cup 2026 triumph. Back in 2020-21, when the top selector's post had opened up, it was Chetan Sharma who had pipped him despite Agarkar being an applicant. When the opportunity finally came his way in mid-2023, he inherited a responsibility to rebuild trust in a selection process

has come not merely from the position he holds but from the nature of decisions he has been willing to take. Over the past three years, the Indian team has played four ICC finals (2023 ODI World Cup, 2024 T20 World Cup, 2025 Champions Trophy, 2026 T20 World Cup), winning two and losing one. It could be three wins overall if India wins on Sunday against New Zealand in the T20 World Cup final. Hearts manager McInnes rejects talk of regret

Manager Derek McInnes is refusing to talk about the fear of regret because he is convinced Heart of Midlothian will "have a special end to the season". Hearts' 1-0 defeat at Kilmarnock last weekend sparked questions about the long-time leaders' ability to claim the Scottish Premiership despite still being two points clear of Celtic at the top. Devlin and Shankland have been missing since January with ankle and hamstring injuries respectively but both are back in full training and are set to be



involved against Dundee on Saturday. "I don't want to talk about regrets because it's as if it's going to end up in disappointment," said McInnes. "I fully believe we are going to have a special end to the season and I'm totally committed to that. I see it, I think we can do it, I think we can be really strong right through the line. I want the players to play with confidence and not think about that, just go

and try and make the most of the opportunity that's there for us." McInnes admits he is tempted to start Devlin and Shankland against Dundee but will discuss their progress with Hearts' medical team to avoid potentially losing the players again to injury. "It was a significant blow when both lads went out of the team. With them coming back in, the players will get a boost and I think the support will get a boost," he said. "Lawrence, for me, was the best striker in the league up until he went out of the team and Cammy was arguably the best midfielder in the league, so it's good to have both boys back at such a crucial time. "Watching them training this week has been great, it looks as if they've not been away."

LIONEL MESSI SCRIPTS HISTORY



Argentine superstar Lionel Messi bagged the 900th goal of his glittering career on Wednesday but could not prevent Inter Miami from crashing out of the CONCACAF Champions Cup on away goals after a 1-1 draw with Nashville. Messi, 38, scored his milestone goal after just seven minutes to put Miami 1-0 up in the second leg of their last-16 clash in the regional club competition. But Nashville's Cristian Espinoza lashed in a 74th-minute equalizer to make it 1-1 on aggregate, and after holding Miami at bay for the remainder of the game, the visitors from Tennessee advanced to the quarter-finals on the away goals rule. Miami's exit was a bittersweet ending to what had promised to be a night of celebration after Messi's early opener in what was

the club's final game at their Chase Stadium home in Fort Lauderdale. Messi's strike took the Argentine's tally to 81 goals for the MLS champions following his move to Florida in 2023. The eight-time Ballon D'Or winner previously scored 672 goals for Spanish giants Barcelona, 32 for France's Paris Saint-Germain, and a further 115 international goals for Argentina. Goal number 900 came some 21 years after Messi's first goal in senior football, when he scored for Barcelona in a 2-0 win over Albacete in 2005 as a fresh-faced 17-year-old. Messi, widely regarded as the greatest player in football history, still has some way to go before he catches his great rival Cristiano Ronaldo, the 41-year-old Portuguese superstar who is on 965 career goals.

Football superstar Erling Haaland has become a strategic investor in Norway Chess and its newly launched Total Chess World Championship Tour (TCWCT). Norway Chess has taken a major step with the launch of TCWCT, which has been approved by the International Chess Federation (FIDE) for a minimum of 16 years. Together with Norwegian business leader Morten Borge, the Manchester City striker has established the company Chess Mates, which will be a significant owner of Norway Chess. "Chess is an incredible game. It sharpens your

mind, and there are clear similarities to football. You have to think quickly, trust your instincts, and think several moves ahead. Strategy and planning are everything", Haaland said in a media release. "I'm investing in Norway Chess because I believe the new Total Chess World Championship Tour can turn chess into an even bigger sport for spectators around the world. The team behind Norway Chess has already done an impressive job growing the event, and joining the project was too exciting to pass up," Haaland added. TCWCT will comprise four

tournaments each year, hosted by four different cities, and will crown a combined world champion across three disciplines - Fast Classic, Rapid, and Blitz chess. A pilot tournament is planned for autumn 2026, followed by a full championship season in 2027. Each season will consist of four events, and a minimum annual prize pool of USD 2.7 million. "We expect the new championship to become one of the most prestigious events in the global chess calendar. The fact that Erling is joining us as an investor says a great deal about the commercial potential of this tour," Kjell

Madland, CEO of Norway Chess said. Eze himself took home \$20,000 in May last year when he won the PogChamps amateur chess tournament. 

brutal action moments, he dominates every frame. Director Aditya Dhar once again creates a gripping cinematic world. Despite the long runtime, the film keeps you engaged with strong drama, twists, and high-stakes action. The second half, especially the pre-climax and climax, stands out with whistle-worthy moments. Arjun Rampal as Major Iqbal is a fierce antagonist and brings menace to the screen. R. Madhavan adds depth as the mastermind

behind the mission, while Sanjay Dutt leaves an impact despite limited screen time. Technically, the film shines with solid cinematography, large-scale action, and an engaging background score.

WHAT DOESN'T WORK

The film's length is a challenge. At nearly four hours, a few portions in the second half feel stretched. Some sequences could have been trimmed for a tighter narrative. The political commentary is

more direct this time and may not appeal to everyone. Also, the absence of a strong villain like the first part slightly reduces the tension in parts. The music, while decent, does not match the impact of the first film.

VERDICT

Dhurandhar: The Revenge is a larger, louder, and more intense sequel that delivers where it matters most. It may not fully match the freshness of the first part, but it compensates with scale, emotion, and powerful performances. If you enjoy action-packed spy dramas with strong patriotic themes, this is a theatrical experience worth watching.
