Five drug peddlers held during raids

Hyderabad, April 7: Hyderabad Narcotics Enforcement Wing (H-NEW) arrested four drug peddlers and seized contraband substances during raids at three places, a top official said on Tuesday. HNEW conducted joint raids in coordination with Chilkalguda, Sanath Nagar, and Adibatla Police Stations. During the operations, they apprehended one interstate drug peddler, one local drug peddler and three sub-peddlers and seized various contraband substances, vehicles, mobile phones, and cash, all collectively worth Rs 63.65 lakh. In the first case, under the limits of the Chilkalguda police station, police arrested 18-year-old student Sai Nikhil Yadav and seized 115 grams of MDMA worth Rs 11.50 lakh. According to Vaibhav Gaikwad, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Task Force / H-NEW, Nikhil Yadav, during his college days, developed a habit of consuming drugs. To sustain his addiction and earn easy money.



BJP not a factor in Kerala Assembly polls, says Shashi Tharoor

Thiruvananthapuram (TSIT): Expressing strong confidence ahead of the Kerala Assembly elections, Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Tuesday asserted that the United Democratic Front (UDF) is headed for a "fairly clear-cut win", citing widespread anti-incumbency against the ruling Left Democratic Front (LDF) government and growing public desire for change.

Dismissing the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) prospects in the state, Tharoor termed it a "zero-seat party" in the Kerala Assembly at present. "If at all they manage to get one, two or even three seats, it will be nothing short of a miracle. They are not a factor in government formation," he said. Taking a swipe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his frequent rallies in Kerala, Tharoor said the BJP's national appeal does not translate into state-level gains. "People know he is not going to be the Chief Minister here. So whatever little gains the BJP may get in parliamentary elections are irrelevant when it comes to deciding who will govern Kerala," he remarked.

Kerala's Growth Due to UDF, Not LDF: CM Revanth

Telangana CM challenges SDG rankings, poverty claims, and governance issues...

Hyderabad (TSIT): Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday asserted that the achievements claimed by Kerala are largely the result of the earlier UDF governments and not solely due to the present LDF regime. In a strongly worded reply to Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, he questioned the claims made by the Kerala government and sought clarity on several pending issues.

Responding to a letter from Pinarayi Vijayan stating that he was not interested in engaging in a debate, CM Revanth Reddy said he intended to respond in a dignified manner but expressed concern over the use of objectionable language in the Kerala CM's communication. He maintained that he would continue to uphold decorum and extend due respect to Vijayan whenever he visits Telangana.

MISREPRESENTATION OF SDG RANKINGS
The Chief Minister criticized Vijayan for repeatedly citing the NITI Aayog SDG Index 2023-24 in a misleading manner against Telangana. He clarified that during that period, Telangana was under the previous BRS government and not the present "people's government." He

urged the Kerala CM to assess Telangana based on the performance over the last 28 months. progress, Revanth Reddy stated that the State's GSDP reached Rs.16.12 lakh crore in 2024-25, recording a growth rate of 10.7%, higher than the national average of 9.9%. He added that Telangana's per capita income has risen to 3.87 lakh,

placing the State ahead of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, and Kerala, as per RBI Handbook 2024-25.

QUESTION ON POVERTY ERADICATION CLAIMS

Referring to Vijayan's earlier claim that Kerala would eliminate extreme poverty by the end of 2025, the Telangana CM pointed out that as of April 2025, over 64,000 families are still receiving welfare benefits. He questioned whether the poverty eradication claim had actually been achieved and why the November 1, 2025 announcement had not materialized. Revanth Reddy also raised concerns over unresolved issues in Kerala, including the gold smuggling case. He questioned why the case,

allegedly involving individuals linked to the Chief Minister's office, remains unresolved despite documentary evidence.

He further sought answers regarding allegations of illegal diversion of 4.5 kg of gold from the Sabarimala temple, asking why the Kerala government has not clarified the issue.

The Chief Minister emphasized that Telangana is progressing with a clear vision under "Telangana Rising 2047." He said major initiatives such as the proposed Future City near Hyderabad and the National Industrial Corridor at Zaheerabad aim to transform the State into a \$1 trillion economy within the next decade.

Kerala heads into poll 'silence' amid charged triangular fight

The Congress-led UDF appears to have seized the momentum at the fag end of

the campaign, riding on what it projects as a growing undercurrent for change.

Feedback from across districts suggests that sections of the electorate are increasingly vocal about fatigue with the incumbent dispensation, with Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan personally leading an aggressive counter to retain control.

His campaign, however, has had to contend with a narrative that the opposition has successfully amplified, one centred on alleged administrative arrogance and disconnect. For the CPI(M)-led LDF, the stakes are unusually high.

A string of electoral set-backs, from the 2024 Lok Sabha polls to subsequent by-elections and the significant reverses in the December local body elections, has dented its aura of invincibility. Adding to its concerns is a steady trickle of defections. Veteran leaders such as G. Sudhakaran and Aisha Potti, along with influential Kannur figures like T.K. Govindan and V. Kunjikrishnan, shifting towards the UDF, have added to the perception of internal strain within the ruling front.

Indians in Iran advised to stay put for 48 hours as tensions rise

New Delhi (TSIT): As the West Asia crisis reaches a critical flashpoint following Washington's ultimatum to Tehran, India on Tuesday advised its nationals in Iran to stay wherever they are for the next 48 hours. In an urgent advisory, the Indian embassy in Iran urged Indians to remain indoors and strictly avoid military installations, power infrastructure and the upper floors of multi-storey buildings.

US President Donald Trump warned that a "whole civilisation will die tonight" if Iran does not meet his 8 pm Eastern Time deadline (5:30 am Indian time, Wednesday) to end its blockade of the Strait of Hormuz. "In continuation of previous advisories, Indian nationals who are still in Iran must stay where they are for the next 48 hours, avoiding all electric, military installations and upper floors of multi-storey buildings."

Trump warns Iran: Whole civilization will die tonight

Washington (TSIT) US President Donald Trump on Tuesday warned that "a whole civilization will die tonight, never to be brought back again" as he signalled a "complete and total regime change" in Iran, framing the unfolding crisis as one of the most consequential moments in modern global history. In a post on his social media platform, Trump struck a stark and urgent tone, suggesting both imminent destruction and the possibility of political transformation.

"A whole civilization will die tonight, never to be brought back again. I don't want that to happen, but it probably will," he wrote. He then pointed to what he described as a decisive shift in Iran's



leadership. "However, now that we have complete and total regime change, where different, smarter, and less radicalized minds prevail, maybe something revolutionarily wonderful can happen, who knows?" Trump said. The remarks come amid an escalating US-Iran confrontation that has intensified over the past several days, with military operations expanding

and diplomatic signals narrowing. Trump framed the moment as historic in scale. "We will find out tonight, one of the most important moments in the long and complex history of the World," he said. He also delivered a sweeping critique of Iran's leadership since the Islamic Revolution.

"47 years of extortion, corruption, and death, will finally end," Trump added. He closed his message with a direct appeal: "God Bless the Great People of Iran!" The statement follows a series of developments in recent days, including US military strikes on Iranian-linked targets and mounting pressure on Tehran over its control of key regional waterways and infrastructure.

Rahul alleges 'systemic exclusion' in public contracts, questions govt over data gaps

New Delhi (TSIT) Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday accused the Centre of enabling "systemic exclusion" of marginalised communities from major public contracts, claiming that the government lacks data on the participation of Dalit, Adivasi, and backward class entrepreneurs in large-scale public works. In a post on social media platform X, Gandhi said he had raised the issue in Parliament, seeking details on the allocation of Rs 16,500 crore worth of public works contracts awarded in the previous year. "I asked the government in Parliament — out of Rs 16,500 crore worth of public works contracts awarded last year, how many were given to businesses owned by Dalits, Adivasis, and backward classes?" he wrote.

Amit Shah Slams Kharage's 'Poisonous Snake' Remark, Warns of Poll Repercussions

Guwahati/New Delhi (TSIT): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday criticised Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge's "poisonous snake" jibe at the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and RSS, stating that the grand old party was stooping to abysmal levels to "put India to shame".

Addressing a mega election rally in Patharkandi of Assam's Sribhumi district, the Home Minister said that Rahul Gandhi-led Congress was becoming a threat to the nation and termed the 'venomous' language as a danger to democracy. "On April 9, people of Assam should give a befitting reply to the Congress party. You will have to ensure that it is reduced to the margins in upcoming polls," Amit Shah said, evoking loud cheers and support from the crowd. HM Shah also stated that the BJP gov-



ernment in Assam has already identified infiltrators and vowed that they would be "removed one by one". The controversy over "poisonous snake" emanated from Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge's remarks, who, while addressing a public rally in Kerala, likened the BJP and RSS to "poisonous snake" and said that it should be crushed. Kharge's remark drew strong condemnation from the BJP, which took umbrage at the vitriolic remarks.

Kejriwal appears in HC seeking recusal of judge; SG slams 'theatrics', 'contemptuous' allegations

NEW DELHI: Former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday appeared in person in the Delhi High Court seeking recusal of Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma from hearing the CBI petition challenging the discharge of the AAP convenor and all other accused in the liquor policy case.

Justice Sharma took Kejriwal's application for her recusal on record and listed it for hearing on April 13, after she was informed that a plea for transfer of the case to another HC bench filed before the apex court has been withdrawn.

The court recorded that besides Kejriwal, the applications for recusal of the judge were also filed by AAP leaders Manish Sisodia and Durgesh Pathak.

In its order, the court also granted time till April 10 to Kejriwal and others to file their response on the main CBI plea as a "last and final opportunity".

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the CBI, argued that the court was not a forum for theatrics and Kejriwal should discharge his lawyer if he wanted to appear in person in the case.

This is not the first instance of the AAP leader himself making submissions in a court proceeding.

On March 28, 2024, when the trial court extended his custody with the Enforcement Directorate in the related case, Kejriwal directly addressed the trial judge, questioning whether there was enough material to arrest a sitting chief minister. He was permitted by the trial judge to make verbal submissions despite being represented by a senior counsel.

On Monday, Mehta strongly objected to the recusal application and said Kejriwal's allegations against the "institution" were frivolous and contemptuous.

"Some people in this country make a career out of making baseless allegations against everyone. That will have to be taken seriously. It is an allegation against the institution, and we will have to support that institution," Mehta said.



He also informed that a total of seven discharged accused have filed applications seeking the judge's recusal as part of a "well thought out design". "If anyone else wants to file the application, please do it, so that I can decide it once and for all," Justice Sharma said. Kejriwal asserted that he would argue the recusal application himself and would exercise his "legal rights" on the aspect of being represented by a lawyer subsequently.

Union Minister Kirti Vardhan Singh to represent India at inauguration of Myanmar's new president

NEW DELHI: Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh will represent India at the inauguration of Myanmar's new president Min Aung Hlaing at a ceremony in Nay Pyi Taw on April 10.

Singh will undertake a four-day visit to Myanmar beginning Wednesday to join the event as well as to attend bilateral engagements, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

Myanmar's parliament paved the way last week for Senior General Min Aung Hlaing to assume the presidency, following a general election that excluded major opposition parties.

The elections were held in December and January after years of protests against the ruling military-junta that seized power in a coup on February 1, 2021 overthrowing the democratically elected gov-



ernment of Aung San Suu Kyi.

Min Aung Hlaing was effectively running Myanmar for last five months helming the military rule.

"At the invitation of the Government of Myanmar (GoM), the Minister of State for External Affairs and Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Kirti Vardhan Singh, will visit Myanmar from April 8-11 to attend the inauguration ceremony of the new President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar on April 10 in Nay Pyi Taw," the MEA said in a statement. "During his visit, Singh is also expected to meet with concerned GoM dignitaries in Nay Pyi Taw, attend bilateral engagements related to ongoing trade, economic and developmental assistance initiatives, and interact with members of the Indian diaspora and Friends of India in Yangon," it said.

Sathankulam custodial deaths: Nine police personnel sentenced to death by court

MADURAI: In a landmark judgment, a court here on Monday handed the death penalty to nine police personnel in the sensational 2020 Sathankulam custodial death case.

Father-son duo P Jayaraj and J Bennix were allegedly assaulted by the convicted policemen in Sathankulam, Thoothukudi district, for allegedly keeping their mobile shop open in violation of COVID-19 norms.

First Additional District and Sessions Judge G Muthukumarann classified the case as the rarest of rare, observing that those entrusted with protecting the public had committed a crime that shook the collective conscience of society.

The court sentenced all nine convicted police personnel to death for the murders of Jayaraj and Bennix. The convicts include former inspector S Sridhar, former sub-inspectors Balakrishnan and Raghav Ganesh, and head constables Murugan and Saamidurai.

In addition to the capital punishment, the court imposed a combined fine of Rs 1.40 crore on the convicts to be paid as compensation to the victims' family.

While pronouncing the quantum of sentence, the judge said the police are meant to protect the common man, and when they become the perpetrators of such brutality, the law must act as a deterrent.

It also noted that by killing both the father and the son at once, the police had uprooted the very foundation of a family.

The judge stressed that the punishment must be severe enough to ensure such horrors never recur.

The tragedy dates back to June 2020, when Jayaraj and Bennix were picked up for allegedly keeping their mobile phone shop open beyond permitted hours. They were subjected to extreme physical assault while in custody, leading to their deaths at a hospital days later.

Rekha Gupta, BJP leaders celebrate party's 47th Foundation Day in Delhi

NEW DELHI: Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, along with senior leaders of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), on Monday celebrated the party's 47th Foundation Day in Delhi with a flag-hoisting ceremony and speeches highlighting its organisational growth and ideological roots.

The event, held at the state party office, was attended by National General Secretary Arun Singh, Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva, along with party workers and office-bearers. Similar programmes were organised across district offices in the capital.

Speaking at the occasion, Gupta said that the BJP functioned as a "medium of national service" and that its cadre continued to work towards making India a global leader.

She also took a swipe at opposition parties, contrasting what she described as the BJP's focus on governance with "power politics" elsewhere.

Addressing party workers, Singh described the BJP as the "world's largest democratic organisation" and said its growth was rooted in the "sacrifice, dedication and struggle" of its cadre. He urged workers

to renew their commitment to public service and nation-building.

Sachdeva said the party's journey from the Bharatiya Jana Sangh to its current position reflected continuity in ideology. He credited leaders such as Syama Prasad Mookerjee, Deendayal Upadhyaya, and Atal Bihari Vajpayee for shaping the party's foundations, and said it was now being carried forward under Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He added that party workers were strengthening their resolve towards governance and public service.

SC orders CBI inquiry into award of contracts to firms linked to Arunachal CM's kin

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday directed the CBI to register within two weeks a preliminary enquiry into allegations of preferential allotment of contracts for public works in Arunachal Pradesh to firms allegedly owned or related to the family members of Chief Minister Pema Khandu.

Observing that the State and its instrumentalities cannot confer benefits according to the "whims of any political or administrative functionary", the apex court said it was a fit case where an "independent investigation" was necessary.

A bench headed by Justice Vikram Nath said where a case concerns the integrity of public procurement and involves allegations of conflict of interest at the highest levels, an investigation must not only be fair but also must appear fair.

"Accordingly, we deem it appropriate that CBI shall register a preliminary enquiry forthwith and shall conduct a time-bound investigation into the award and execution of the public works contracts and work orders which form the subject matter of this writ petition and the affidavits filed in these proceedings," the bench, also comprising Justices Sandeep Mehta and N V Anjaria, said.

During the hearing in the matter, the apex court was told that government contracts and work orders worth around Rs 1,270 crore were awarded in the last 10 years in Arunachal Pradesh to four firms related to the family members of Khandu.

In its verdict, the bench said the preliminary enquiry and consequential investigation, if any, shall cover the award and execution of public works contracts and work orders in Arunachal Pradesh from January 1, 2015 to De-

ember 31, 2025, including the works and compilations placed on record in the proceedings before it.

The bench delivered its verdict on a plea filed by NGOs Save Mon Region Federation and Voluntary Arunachal Sena seeking a CBI or SIT probe into the matter.

"The record discloses repeated resort to non-tender methods in relation to public works, repeated absence of recorded reasons explaining why competition was dispensed with, and repeated non-production of vouchers and tender-related documentation in relation to projects of substantial value," the bench said.

It said such circumstances raise legitimate concerns not merely of administrative irregularity but of "possible abuse of public office", manipulation of procurement processes, and concealment or destruction of official records, matters which require probe by an independent agency vested with statutory powers of criminal investigation. The bench noted that the petitioners have alleged that a significant cluster of such awards has accrued to respondent numbers four to six (Pema Khandu, Rinchin Drema and Tsering Tashi) or to firms and individuals related to them, raising a serious question of conflict of interest and abuse of public office.

It said these are not matters that can be left to be answered by broad affidavits or by statistical summaries.

"They require a structured investigation into the decision-making process, the manner of selection of contractors, the justification for deviations from tender-based procurement and the integrity and custody of public records," the bench said.

Govt scales up digital outreach for pensioners, generates record 1.91 crore certificates

NEW DELHI: In a major push to digitise pension services and expand last-mile delivery, the government's Digital Life Certificate (DLC) Campaign 4.0 has generated a record 1.91 crore certificates in 2025-26, driven by large-scale adoption of face authentication and doorstep services.

The campaign, led by the Department of Pensions and Pensioners' Welfare (DoPPW), is being seen as the biggest nationwide outreach for pensioners, covering 2,000 cities and districts and organising around 75,000 camps during November 2025.

A key highlight was the surge in use of face authentication technology, which accounted for over 1.16 crore DLCs nearly 60 per cent of total submissions marking a 220-fold jump from the previous edition. The feature enabled el-

derly and infirm pensioners to complete verification without biometric hurdles.

To strengthen last-mile access, about 1.8 lakh postmen and Dak Sevaks were deployed to provide doorstep services, particularly benefiting super senior citizens, the sick and differently-abled. Over 14 lakh certificates were submitted by pensioners aged 80 and above.

Launched in November 2025 by Minister of State Dr Jitendra Singh, DLC Campaign 4.0 adopted a "whole-of-government" approach, bringing together 19 banks, India Post Payments Bank, UIDAI, MeitY, EPFO, Railways, Defence, Telecom and 57 pensioners' welfare associations.

More than 1,400 nodal officers monitored operations on the ground, while a national DLC portal enabled real-time tracking and targeted outreach in

underserved areas.

Banks emerged as key drivers of the campaign, with the State Bank of India alone generating nearly 26 lakh certificates. Pension disbursing banks collectively achieved over 63 per cent of their targets, supported by camps across 300 cities. Maharashtra led the tally with 25.86 lakh DLCs, followed by Uttar Pradesh (15.93 lakh), Tamil Nadu (15.31 lakh), and Karnataka (13.08 lakh), reflecting strong coordination and awareness drives.

Among departments, Defence topped with 32.92 lakh certificates, followed by Central Civil (9.57 lakh), Railways (6.91 lakh) and Telecom (4.67 lakh).

The campaign also bundled services such as health check-ups, Aadhaar updation and grievance redressal at camp sites, turning DLC centres into integrated welfare hubs.

India enters second stage of nuclear programme with PFBR criticality at Kalpakkam

CHENNAI: India's nuclear power programme reached a significant milestone on Monday, with the 500 MWe Prototype Fast Breeder Reactor (PFBR) at Kalpakkam attaining first criticality at 8.26 pm, marking the beginning of a controlled and sustained nuclear fission chain reaction and strengthening the country's long-term energy security plans.

DMK rejects Mamata's allegations on officers transfers. The indigenously designed and built reactor has been developed by Bharatiya Nabhiya Vidyut Nigam Limited at the Kalpakkam Nuclear Complex in Tamil Nadu. With this achievement, India has formally entered the second stage of its three-stage nuclear power programme, a vision conceived by Homi Jehangir Bhabha.

Once fully operational, India will become only the second country after Russia to operate a commercial fast breeder reactor, underlining the global significance of the development. The milestone reflects decades of scientific effort led by the Department of Atomic Energy and strengthens India's transition towards reliable, low-carbon energy.



It also aligns with the country's net zero target for 2070 announced by Narendra Modi. India enters second stage of nuclear programme with PFBR criticality at Kalpakkam

India's nuclear strategy is built around optimal utilisation of its limited uranium resources and vast thorium reserves through a closed fuel cycle.

In the first stage, Pressurised Heavy Water Reactors use natural uranium to generate electricity, producing plutonium as spent fuel. This plutonium forms the basis of the second stage, where Fast Breeder Reactors generate more fuel than they consume. The PFBR marks the beginning of this second stage. It is designed to breed Uranium-233 from thorium,

paving the way for the third stage, which will rely on thorium-based reactors for long-term energy security.

PFBR technology and design

The PFBR represents decades of indigenous research led by the Atomic Research Centre for Atomic Research. It uses uranium-plutonium mixed oxide fuel derived from reprocessed spent fuel of earlier reactors. Its core is surrounded by a blanket of Uranium-238, which is converted into Plutonium-239 using fast neutrons, enabling the reactor to produce more fuel than it consumes.

The design also allows for future use of Thorium-232 in the blanket to generate Uranium-233, forming a bridge to the third stage of the programme.

Woman alleges ostracisation, Madras HC directs Collector, SP to probe

CHENNAI: The Madras High Court directed the Collector and Superintendent of Police of Krishnagiri district to conduct an inquiry into allegations of social ostracisation faced by a woman's family in a village. The petitioner, P Revathi, a resident of Pillankuppam village in Krishnagiri, submitted that one R Krishnan from the same

village, who possesses the land adjacent to her land, demanded a pathway to access his land for the past several years. After Revathi refused to give her land to Krishnan for pathway, the issue was taken before a village panchayat. The petitioner alleged that the village heads, Munirathnam and Venkateshan, passed illegal orders, which were announced

by 'thandora' all over the village in 2022. As per the orders issued by the village heads, Revathi was not allowed to take water from public water sources, purchase groceries from local shops or access tea shops. Her worship rights were also curtailed, she said. Other villagers were prohibited from participating in the petitioner's family functions.

DMK rejects Mamata's allegations on officers transfers

CHENNAI: The DMK on Tuesday rejected allegations made by West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, asserting that transfer of officials during election time is a routine process and not a matter of concern. Responding to Mamata Banerjee's remarks, DMK MP Thamizhachi Thangapandian said such transfers are part of the Election Commission's standard procedures to ensure free and fair polls. "Transfer of



officials during elections is normal. Even the Tamil Nadu DGP has been transferred. We have always followed the law and rules," she said. Banerjee had alleged a "secret relationship" between the DMK and the BJP, a charge strongly denied by the DMK leader. On April 12, multiple Beach-Tambaram services scheduled late in the night, including those departing at 11 pm, 11.20 pm, 11.40 pm and 11.59 pm, will be fully cancelled. Corresponding return services from Tambaram, including departures at 10.20 pm,



11 pm and 11.40 pm, will also remain cancelled. An early morning service departing Beach station at 4.15 am is also cancelled.

Partial cancellations have also been announced on April 12. A service between Beach and Chengalpattu departing at 3.55 am will not run between Beach and Tambaram. Uplifting: Migratory birds are arriving in larger numbers in Punjab's wetlands

Much to the relief of ornithologists and bird-watchers, winged visitors have come in swarms. Every winter, Punjab's wetlands welcome winged guests from as far away as Central Asia and Africa. From breeding to resting and refuelling, thousands of migratory birds rely on the wetlands and the flora and fauna these support. Photos by the writer



It's a much-anticipated ritual at Punjab's wetlands that never fails to spring a surprise. Every year, the Punjab Wildlife Department documents sightings of migratory birds from as far away as Central Asia and Africa. As climate change and global warming affect wildlife patterns, careful consideration is given to the absence and presence of the avian guests. This time around, it has been a productive and uplifting outing for the department staff, ornithologists, bird-watchers and enthusiasts alike. Much to their relief and delight, the migratory birds, including several rare ones, have come in swarms. According to the Union Ministry of Environment and Forests, Punjab has 1,143 mapped wetlands, with an area of roughly around 90,000 hectares. There are 89 Ramsar sites in India; it ranks third globally in the number of such sites.

Nangal wildlife sanctuary, taking the number to six.

Dharminder Sharma, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and head of the Forest Force, says spotting raptors like the Red-headed Falcon, Peregrine Falcon, Eurasian Hobby and Eastern Imperial Eagle at Harike and Keshpur-Miani shows that the Punjab wetlands continue to attract birds from far-off areas. "It indicates that our wetlands have a good prey base for these raptors. The preservation of wildlife, especially migratory birds, remains the top priority of the department," he adds. "Birds from as far away as Siberia have turned up, which is a rare phenomenon."

Gitanjali Kanwar, Senior Coordinator, Aquatic Biodiversity, World Wildlife Fund-India, says the turnout of water birds in Punjab's wetlands continues to be "decently good" despite challenges at the global level. "Flocks of rare birds like Northern Lapwing and Black-tailed Godwit were sighted at Harike. Species like Jerdon's Babbler, Rufous-vented Prinia and Short-eared Owls have also been spotted," she adds.

Red-headed Falcon mostly preys on small birds and usually hunts in pairs. Photo by the writer "There's been a marginal increase in the number of water

birds (resident and migratory) in Punjab's wetlands. The winter season has been very brief this year and rare waterbirds and species of high conservation significance have been spotted. These include the flamingos in Harike, flocks of Northern Lapwing and raptors like Steppe and Eastern Imperial Eagle in Keshpur-Miani and Shalappattan wetlands. The Nangal wetland, like every year, had Black-necked Grebes," says Kanwar.

Punjab Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Satender Sagar claims the recent sighting of the Bar-headed Goose is a welcome sign for the state's wetlands as this goose species breeds in Central Asia in colonies of thousands near mountain lakes and during winter in South Asia. "The unique thing about this bird is that it flies very high, and even crosses the Himalayas to visit Punjab, flying over difficult terrains and extreme altitudes," says Sagar, excited about the frequent sightings at Punjab wetlands. Amid the positive news, a note of caution comes from Jaskaran Sandhu, former member of the Punjab State Board for Wildlife. "Global warming is changing weather patterns and affecting bird migration. Delayed winter,

pollution and shrinking water bodies are all affecting migration of birds across the globe. It's a challenge we must never lose sight of," he says.

"Many bird species migrate in order to survive. However, migration is a perilous journey. Only a small number of birds are actually threatened by natural events while human activities are the source for most dangers," says Maj AP Singh (retd), another former member of the Punjab State Board for Wildlife. An avid bird-watcher, with an experience of more than 40 years, he adds that the loss of habitats due to pollution or encroachment for settlement, agriculture, grazing, etc, is the main threat migratory birds face. "They are dependent on finding suitable breeding and wintering grounds as well as stopover sites, along their flyways, where they can rest and feed. The loss of any of these sites during their annual cycle could have a dramatic impact on the birds' chances of survival. Poaching remains another threat." Pallas's Gull in flight. The pale, deep-chested, long-winged gull chiefly feeds on fish (particularly dead), insects and small mammals.

As per the initial sightings by the Wildlife Department and the World Wildlife Fund, the migratory birds that have been spotted include the Spot-billed Duck, Ruddy Shelduck, Mallard, Northern Pintail, Comb Duck, Coot, Dabchick, Northern Shoveler, Lesser Whistling Duck, Domicile Crane, Greater Flamingo, Ferruginous Pochard, Peregrine Falcon, Long-eared Owl, Common Pochard, Woolly-necked Stork, Eurasian Coot, Gadwall, Greylag Geese, Little Cormorant, Pied Avocet, Great Cormorant, Common Teal, Black-tailed Godwit, Steppe Gull and Brown-headed Gull. Records from Harike show sightings of Bonelli's Eagle, Hen Harrier, Peregrine Falcon, Red-headed Falcon, Cotton Pygmy Goose, Northern Lapwing and Greater-crested Grebe. May 10 is World Migratory Bird Day, but it's a good time to remem-

'Holy' Orders? Why US Fighters Are Now Being Told Iran Is 'God's War'

The daring rescue of a downed American airman deep inside Iran over the weekend was cast by the US President and his team in strikingly biblical terms. Donald Trump described it as an "Easter miracle", while officials noted the pilot transmitted the message "God is good" after activating his beacon. Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth highlighted that the airman spent hours concealed in a cave before being rescued over Easter weekend - a comparison that invited an unmistakable parallel to resurrection imagery. Hegseth went further, urging Americans to pray for victory "in the name of Jesus Christ", while reports from within the ranks suggested that some personnel were told the conflict formed part of "God's plan". Religious references, once peripheral, are now moving closer to the centre of the rhetoric surrounding the war on Iran.

Against that backdrop, Trump's threat that he would "send Iran back to the Stone Age" reads less like conventional deterrence and more like civilisational language. Is it the language of modern diplomacy? It is the one that echoes eras when wars were framed as moral struggles between faiths. That mix of threat, moral superiority and religious symbolism is increasingly shaping the tone of the ongoing conflict. Look beneath the missiles and bombs, and a familiar, older script begins to emerge. For the US, it carries echoes of 'evangelical' conviction and apocalyptic imagination. For Israel, it draws on Jewish history, scripture and destiny. For Iran, it has long been framed in the language of Islamic resistance, even 'jihad'. The common thread is their shared Abrahamic lineage and a history where theology and geopolitics have often intertwined.

Trump's War Secretary, Pete Hegseth, told Americans to take a knee and pray for victory "in the name of Jesus Christ"; a non-commissioned officer described being told the conflict is part of "God's plan" and that the President was "anointed by Jesus to light the signal fire in Iran". Already, the Military Religious Freedom Foundation has received over 200 complaints from active-duty personnel.

A Holy Mission?

I am often asked by my Hindu Indian friends why the followers of Middle Eastern religions seem perpetually locked in cycles of conflict. By Middle Eastern, they mean Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Together, they belong to the Abrahamic family. Why, they ask, do these societies slip so easily into the language of 'destiny', 'prophecy', 'jihad' and 'final battles'? Why do war cries sound like scripture? Perhaps the answer lies not in any single moment but in the way history, belief and power overlap in this region, shaping how conflicts are both fought and explained. A month into the US-Israel war against Iran, there appears to be no immediate end in sight. What is becoming increasingly visible, however, is not just the scale of military engagement but the language accompanying it. American and Israeli officials have repeatedly used rhetoric that frames the campaign in moral, even theological terms. The Council on American-Islamic Relations has warned that such language is "dangerous" and "anti-Muslim". Reports from a US watchdog group suggest that some American troops were told the war could be linked to biblical end times. Senior officials have not shied away from such stark language. Secretary of State Marco Rubio described Iran as being run by "religious fanatic lunatics". At a Pentagon briefing, Hegseth went further, saying, "Crazy regimes like Iran, hell-bent on prophetic Islamic delusions, cannot have nuclear weapons," before invoking scripture: "Blessed be the Lord, my rock, who trains my hands for war." Individually, such remarks may appear rhetorical excess. Taken together, they form a pattern. A narrative architecture where war is not simply justified but moralised, even sanctified. The tone shifts subtly from strategy to destiny.

LITERATURE BECOMES 'CONTENT' IN REEL CULTURE

So-called poets are promoting a presentation primarily focused on attraction, using superficial or artificial lines as a guise of literature. While poetry should be a genuine expression of emotions, it is often reduced to a mere means of attracting attention. This not only compromises the credibility of poetry, but also marginalizes serious and meaningful literary endeavors. When presenting a serious subject like literature, a balance and decency are required. Unfortunately, this balance is often lost in the pursuit of mere attention, compromising the seriousness of the literature. The digital age has given unprecedented speed and breadth to forms of expression. Today, every person has a platform at their fingertips—a platform where they can instantly reach millions. This democratization is a significant achievement in itself. But with every power comes a responsibility. Unfortunately, this balance of responsibility often seems to be disturbed, especially when the objective becomes popularity rather than expression.

Reel culture is a prime example of this imbalance. The race to create impact in a few seconds of video has made expression quick, concise, and often superficial. Literature, which fundamentally demands patience,



depth, and contemplation, is finding itself at odds in this culture of instant consumption. Incomplete lines, out-of-context quotes, and artificial expressions—all of these are turning literature into a "product" whose sole purpose is to attract attention. Today, "going viral" has become the yardstick for success. This mindset has affected the creative process. Writers now write based on whether their content will immediately resonate with people, rather than

whether the idea is meaningful to society. As a result, flashiness has replaced depth, and performance has replaced empathy. This trend is not only unfair to literature but also impacts the intellectual level of society. The primary purpose of literature is not merely entertainment. It is a mirror of society, reflecting its realities and exposing its contradictions. Kabir attacked social evils through his couplets, Tulsidas conveyed the message of faith and dignity,

Premchand exposed the reality of society, and Mahadevi Verma gave words to the subtleties of emotion. The works of all these authors have stood the test of time because they possessed depth, honesty, and social commitment.

In contrast, a large segment of society today views literature as merely a medium of presentation. Performance is increasingly prioritized over the beauty of the words. Poems presented on Reels are often neither original nor deeply meaningful. They are created solely to captivate viewers for a moment and prompt a "like" or "share." Another worrying aspect of reel culture is the decline in decency of expression. The quality of language, clarity of diction, and dignity of presentation—all these elements are crucial components of any literary expression. But when these are ignored, the form of the literature becomes distorted. Sometimes, the situation is so severe that the essence of the original work is completely altered. The debate over costumes and visual presentation has also intensified. It must be acknowledged that freedom of expression is a right of every individual, but every right comes with dignity and responsibility. When presenting a serious subject like literature, a balance and decency are required. Unfortunately, this balance is often lost in the mere attempt to grab the audience's attention, compromising the seriousness of the literature. However, it's equally important not to view this situation from a simplistic perspective. Social media has provided a platform for many talented creators who previously couldn't access the traditional publishing system. Today, even people from small towns and villages are sharing their work and gaining recognition. This is a positive change that cannot be denied. In fact, the problem isn't the medium itself, but rather its use. Reels can also be an effective medium if used to present meaningful literature.

155 Aircraft For One Man - And Other Mysteries About US' Iran Rescue Op

US President Donald Trump's press interaction on April 6, Easter Monday, was awaited with great anticipation, with possibilities of announcements ranging from a possible ceasefire or a declaration of victory or even a reiteration of his threat to bomb Iran to the 'Stone Age' by knocking out its power plants and bridges. Flanked by the CIA Chief, the Secretary of War and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, he, however, chose to focus primarily on the massive operation launched to rescue the American officer from the downed F-15 Eagle aircraft, giving minute details of how the operation unfolded and how the US military lived up to its motto of never to leave any personnel behind enemy lines. Yes, he did reiterate his threat of bombing Iran, saying that "the entire country can be taken out in one night", with some analysts saying that this was perhaps a veiled threat at a possible nuclear strike into Iran. The developments in the war zone in Iran, especially related to the downing of the F-15 aircraft and the subsequent rescue, however, raise serious questions. One, how did Iran successfully target the F-15 when its air defences had been completely destroyed? Two, why did a rescue mission require a package of more than 100 aircraft to support it? Why was the extraction site so near to the Isfahan nuclear site? Also, while examining the whole event, it is important to understand the configuration and role of the F-15 Eagle fighter aircraft. The Shooting Down Of The Eagle



The entire episode owes its origin to the shooting down of an American F-15 Eagle on April 2; the aircraft was on a deep strike mission in Northwestern Iran (per-

haps in Isfahan province) when it was shot by an Iranian missile. Initially, Iran claimed to have scored a hit on the stealth fighter F-35, but the debris later confirmed that it was an F-15E Strike Eagle from the Fighter Squadron deployed from RAF Lakenheath in the UK. This was the first time in 20 years that an American-manned fighter aircraft was shot down in enemy territory. When the fighter came down, both occupants, the pilot and the Weapon Systems Officer (WSO), ejected safely. As they ejected from the fast-moving aircraft at an interval of a few seconds, they landed in separate locations, kilometres apart, in hostile and mountainous terrain. The pilot was rescued in the next few hours in broad daylight by the US special operations forces, who located him first and launched a rescue mission with a full package, including two HH-60W Jolly Green II combat rescue helicopters.

The extraction was, however, not easy. Facing direct fire from Iranian ground forces, one Blackhawk helicopter, which was carrying the recovered pilot, was shot, and a few crew members on the helicopter, too, were wounded by the missile strike. But the helicopter managed to fly out of Iran into friendly territory, with all members, including the rescued pilot, safe. During this mission, another US aircraft, an A-10 Warthog, which specialises in providing close ground support, was hit by Iranian fire. Once again, the pilot managed to fly the aircraft back into Kuwaiti airspace before ejecting safely. The A-10, however, crashed. The Rescue of the WSO It is the rescue of the second officer that is shrouded in mystery and the details of which have posed questions. As per the official version, the WSO, a Colonel-ranked officer, landed 20-30 kilometres away from the pilot and, despite being seriously injured, evaded Iranian forces and tracked for over 30 kilometres overnight, climbing mountainous features of altitude up to 1,700 metres, before being rescued in a daring mission. Detailing the mission himself during the press briefing on April 6, President Trump said that 21 aircraft were deployed to help with the search-and-rescue in the first wave, flying for hours under "very, very heavy enemy fire". The WSO was "bleeding profusely" but was able to climb and contact US forces to com-

Pak's 'Global Power' Act Is Fooling No One - Least Of All Its Gulf 'Creditors'

Pakistan's repeated attempts to project itself as a rising global power continue to collapse under scrutiny, revealing a stark gap between narrative and reality. Structural constraints - economic dependence, geopolitical limitations, and strategic inconsistencies - puncture Islamabad's grand narrative that it is emerging as a significant player on the global stage. This narrative has been amplified through sections of international media, projecting Pakistan as a hub of global diplomacy, capable even of mediating complex conflicts such as the ongoing US-Israel-Iran war.

While Islamabad did attempt to position itself in such a role by proposing a ceasefire framework and engaging in diplomatic outreach, these efforts have quickly unravelled. Crucially, the initiative lacked meaningful participation from key stakeholders: Iran showed little willingness to engage on Pakistan's terms, and no direct negotiations between Washington and Tehran materialised. As a result, the much-publicised diplomatic push failed to gain traction, producing neither a concrete agreement nor a credible roadmap for conflict resolution. The meeting in Islamabad with Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Turkey aimed at de-escalating the crisis, thus amounted to little more than a symbolic exercise, underscoring Pakistan's limited capacity to influence outcomes in high-stakes geopolitical crises.

An Old Pattern

This is not a new phenomenon. Previously, a similar narrative was aggressively promoted - that Pakistan's JF-17 fighter jets were experiencing a surge in global demand; in fact, Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif went so far as to assert that the country would no longer require IMF loans or external borrowing, confidently



stating that "we may not need IMF loans in the next six months" based on anticipated revenues from defence exports, particularly the Chinese-origin JF-17 aircraft. This assertion, like others before it, proved hollow. Before that, there was yet another claim: that Pakistan had discovered massive oil reserves in the Arabian Sea. That, too, proved to be misleading. Even Donald Trump, while recently backing this narrative, remarked that Pakistan has "massive oil reserves" and that it could one day even "sell oil to India".

Debt Comes Calling

Time and again, such narratives are floated to project Pakistan as an emerging power, but within days, they collapse under scrutiny. The pattern reflects a deeper issue. There has been a consistent habit of manufacturing exaggerated claims about Pakistan's global standing, when the fact remains that the country is structurally, economically, and geopolitically constrained. Its decision-making is not entirely autonomous and is shaped and influenced by external actors, such as Washington, Beijing, Riyadh, Abu Dhabi, and institutions like the IMF, on which it remains heavily dependent. A country that

survives on loans and IMF bailout packages cannot claim complete strategic independence. There were also claims that Pakistan is performing a "master balancing act" in West Asia - that it is maintaining close ties with all sides amid ongoing regional conflicts. Surprisingly, some voices in India even suggested that India should learn from Pakistan's approach. But recent developments expose the ground reality. Reports indicate that the UAE has demanded repayment of around \$3.5 billion, a clear sign of deep frustration with Pakistan's stance during the ongoing regional tensions. The UAE reportedly believes that at a time when it has faced severe challenges in the Middle East crisis - including being among the hardest hit by Iranian missile and drone strikes - its ally Pakistan has failed to extend even basic support and has instead chosen to remain diplomatically evasive toward Iran. Pakistan has now reportedly decided to repay its entire \$3.5 billion debt to the UAE by the end of April. Similarly, Saudi Arabia is also reportedly seeking repayment of its financial support and has asked Islamabad to immediately repay a \$6.3 billion loan, signalling deep frustration in

a relationship long portrayed as ironclad. This is particularly significant in light of a mutual defence understanding between the two countries, under which an attack on one is effectively treated as an attack on both. Contrary to that commitment, Pakistan, instead of standing firmly with Riyadh during the Iran crisis, has chosen to project itself as a 'mediator'.

China's Concerns

China, often described as Pakistan's "all-weather friend", has also begun to display some unease. During a recent visit to China, Ishaq Dar, Pakistan's Foreign Minister, sought Beijing's backing for Islamabad's self-styled mediation efforts. To this, according to some Pakistani analysts, Pakistan was advised by Chinese officials to first resolve contradictions in its own regional policies - particularly its actions in Afghanistan. Beijing is reportedly concerned that Pakistan's contradictory approach jeopardises China's strategic interests in Afghanistan, including security concerns in Xinjiang, access to Afghanistan's mineral resources, and broader economic and connectivity ambitions under the Belt and Road Initiative.

IRAN 'STOPS NEGOTIATIONS' WITH US;

Pakistan Role Under Cloud As Tehran Snaps 'Indirect Channels'

Iran has reportedly severed all diplomatic and indirect channels of communication with the United States, signalling a sharp escalation in tensions and casting doubt over ongoing mediation efforts, including those involving Pakistan. According to Tehran Times, all message exchanges between the two sides have been suspended, effectively shutting down backchannel diplomacy at a critical juncture. "Any and all message exchanges have also been suspended." Also Read: 'Iran Will Respond By 8 PM Tonight': JD Vance Hopeful Of Truce Even As Trump Ups War Rhetoric The development comes in the backdrop of increasingly aggressive rhetoric from Washington, with Trump claiming a "whole civilisation may die tonight". US Vice President JD Vance reiterated that the "ball is in Iran's court," expressing confidence that a response would be received by the set deadline, even as he warned that the US still has "tools in its toolkit" that it has not yet deployed. While maintaining hope for negotiations, Vance



acknowledged delays in communication and stressed that talks would continue until the deadline expires. However, Iran's latest move suggests a breakdown in even indirect engagement. Iranian state-linked media also cited a statement from the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), warning that Tehran would respond decisively to any US attack on civilian infrastructure. The statement further cautioned that retaliation could extend beyond the region, targeting critical

energy interests of the US and its allies. In a stark message, he also spoke of potential "complete and total regime change," describing the moment as pivotal in global history. The

US President issued another threat to Iran on Tuesday as his deadline to open the Strait of Hormuz looms. "A whole civilization will die tonight, never to be brought back again", he said, in a post on his Truth Social platform. He warned that US stands by its Tuesday deadline to wipe out Iran. "I don't want that to happen, but it probably will. However, now that we have Complete and Total Regime

Change, where different, smarter, and less radicalized minds prevail, maybe something revolutionarily wonderful can happen", he continued. "WHO KNOWS? We will find out tonight, one of the most important moments in the long and complex history of the World. 47 years of extortion, corruption, and death, will finally end. God Bless the Great People of Iran!". This comes after Trump on Monday hinted at a potentially big attack on Iran ahead of Tuesday's ceasefire deadline, amid the ongoing Middle East war. During his address to the media, Trump claimed that the whole country could be taken down in a single night, and that this night could be Tuesday night. "Iran can be taken down in one night, maybe tomorrow. Entire country of Iran can be taken down in one night", Trump stated on Monday.

Life Insurance Corporation of India is considering its first ever bonus share issue, the company informed in a regulatory filing on Tuesday. Accordingly, the Board of Directors is slated to meet on April 13 to mull issuance of bonus shares, as per the filing. "It is to inform that a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Life Insurance Corporation of India ("the Corporation") is scheduled to be held on Monday, April 13, 2026 to inter-alia consider and recommend a proposal for issue of Bonus shares," the filing stated. However, the proposal is subject to approval from the share-

holders of the Corporation and will be done in accordance with the applicable provisions. Further, LIC reiterated that the trading window for dealing in the equity shares of the Corporation is closed and said that it shall remain closed till 48 hours after the announcement of financial results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026. LIC Q3FY26 State-owned life insurer LIC reported a 17% jump in net profit at Rs 12,958 crore in the third quarter ended December 2025. The country's biggest insurer, Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC), earned a net profit of Rs

11,056 crore in the year-ago period. During the quarter, the net premium income of the insurer rose to Rs 1,25,613 crore from Rs 1,06,891 crore in the same period a year ago, LIC said in a regulatory filing. The total income also improved to Rs 2,33,984 crore in the latest December quarter compared to Rs 2,01,994 crore in the same period a year ago. LIC Share Price LIC's stock ended 0.23% lower at Rs 743.20 apiece on the NSE on Tuesday. This compared to a 0.68% advance in the Nifty index. The stock has fallen 13.07% year-to-date, and 3.13% in the last 12 months.

IDBI Stake Sale: Govt Not Inclined To Scrap Existing Bids; LIC Buyout Among Alternatives

The government is not in favour of scrapping existing bids for the disinvestment of IDBI Bank and is instead exploring ways to move forward with the current process, sources told NDTV Profit. The issue was discussed in a high-level meeting chaired by the Cabinet Secretary on Monday, where multiple options were deliberated to revive momentum in the long-pending stake sale. According to sources, the government is keen to

proceed with existing bids but is simultaneously re-evaluating key aspects of the transaction, particularly valuation. Departments involved in the process have pushed for factoring in the "unaffected" market price, essentially stripping out temporary volatility, to arrive at a fair valuation. LIC Buyout Option Under Consideration Among the options discussed, one possibility being explored is for Life Insurance Corporation of India to

acquire the government's proposed 30.48% stake in IDBI Bank. LIC is already the largest shareholder in the bank, holding a 49.24% stake, while the government owns 45.48%. The current disinvestment plan involves selling a combined 60.72% stake, including both government and LIC holdings, to a strategic buyer. Officials indicated that a final decision on the way forward is likely to be taken once market conditions stabilise. The recent

volatility, partly driven by global geopolitical tensions and rising crude prices, has weighed on valuations and investor sentiment. The government's approach suggests a balancing act—ensuring that the disinvestment process is not derailed while also safeguarding value for stakeholders. Shares of IDBI Bank closed 0.6% lower at Rs 69.64 on the NSE, compared to a 0.68% advance in Nifty 50. The stock is down 35% year-to-date.

Gold, Silver Falter As Iran War Enters Critical Phase: Will Bullion Prices Plunge?

Mixed signals on the Iran war are keeping non-yielding assets like gold and silver on edge. Till Monday, indications of a potential ceasefire and end to war had lifted buyer sentiment for these precious metals. On Tuesday, however, both gold and silver prices tumbled amid no clear resolution for the Middle East crisis, while crude oil prices continuing their climb. Gold

went as low as \$4616.92 an ounce in the spot market on Tuesday, 0.7% lower than its previous day close at \$4,650.56 an ounce. The MCX futures for the yellow metal, which had initially held steady around Rs 1.5 lakh per 10 grams, also slipped to Rs 1.49 lakh. Amid elevated volatility, the yellow metal is expected to find immediate support at \$4613.4 an ounce, according

to analysts at Kotak Securities. However, in the case of further downside, the support levels can slip to \$4575.5 and \$4452.9. On the flipside, with geopolitical cues in favour, gold spot gold prices may rise to find immediate resistance at \$4736.1 an ounce. Any further upmove will open up \$4774 and \$4896.7 levels for the precious metals, as per analysts.<

Trump says 'a whole civilisation will die tonight' if Iran doesn't make deal, as US hits Kharg Island

Further explosions have been reported in Iran on Tuesday, as Trump's deadline to reopen the Strait of Hormuz looms. Here are some of the latest pictures from the Iranian capital: Two previously detained French nationals Cécile Kohler and Jacques Paris have been allowed to leave Iran. In a post on X, French President Emmanuel Macron thanks authorities for their support in mediation. Kohler and Paris were handed lengthy prison sentences by a court in Iran last year after being convicted of espionage. They were released from detention in November. They were arrested in May 2022 during a tourist trip. France previously accused Iran of holding Kohler and Paris arbitrarily and keeping them in conditions akin to torture. Iran denied the claims. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu says that Israel have struck railways and

bridges used by Iran. In a message shared on X, he says that "yesterday we destroyed transport aircraft and dozens of helicopters." "Today we attacked the train tracks and bridges used by the Revolutionary Guards." Meanwhile, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) says it has struck "eight bridge segments" that it claims were used by Iranian armed forces. The IDF says these strikes took place across cities, including Tehran, Karaj, Tabriz, Kashan, and Qom. This comes after earlier reports from Iranian state media that two people were killed following an attack on a bridge in Kashan, hours after Israel warned Iran's residents not to take trains "for the sake of your security". Donald Trump is never shy about using apocalyptic language in his social media posts - but even by his standards the threat that "a whole civilization will die tonight, never to be brought



back again" is brutal. He has set a deadline of 20:00 US Eastern Time for Iran to agree a deal - including reopening the Strait of Hormuz - or to face the destruction of much of its civilian infrastructure, including all its bridges and power plants. But the president has set similar deadlines in the past, only to back down and extend his time frame. His latest social media post suggests that he

intends to stick to his deadline this time. Referencing the possibility of a devastating attack on Iran, he writes: "I don't want that to happen, but it probably will." Negotiations are taking place, but do not appear to be going well. Trump also suggested in his Truth Social post that the new leadership in Iran may agree to a deal - saying "maybe something revolutionarily wonderful

can happen, WHO KNOWS?" But this latest post does not indicate that he is optimistic about reaching an agreement before his deadline tonight. Donald Trump has issued a fresh threat to Iran on Tuesday, warning that a "whole civilization will die tonight" ahead of this evening's looming deadline to reach a deal on the Strait of Hormuz. This is how things have moved on through Tuesday so far: "A whole civilization will die tonight" unless "smarter and less radicalized minds prevail", Donald Trump has warned Iran. "I don't want that to happen, but it probably will," he says Trump's threats come as we near a deadline he's imposed on the Iranian regime to reopen the Strait of Hormuz by 20:00 EDT Tuesday (00:00 GMT / 01:00 BST on Wednesday) Meanwhile, his Vice President JD Vance - speaking at a press conference in Budapest - says that it's up to

Earthset and a solar eclipse: Nasa releases first images from Moon fly-by



Nasa has released the first photographs taken by the Artemis II astronauts during their fly-by of the Moon. The first image, above, shows an 'Earthset' as the astronauts glimpsed our home planet peeking out beyond a cratered lunar landscape. The second photograph, below, shows the spectacular solar eclipse to which the astronauts were treated as the Moon blocked out the Sun. Nasa did not say which of the astronauts, who are on their return journey to Earth after the fly-by, took the photographs. The Earthset photo carried echoes of the famous Earthrise photograph taken by Bill Anders aboard Apollo 8 in 1968 in the moon fly-by that preceded the historic first human landing the following year. The view of a vulnerable blue planet against the background of the depths of space is still seen as one of the most iconic environmental photographs ever taken. The astronauts took the photos during a six-hour flyby, including a period of radio silence when their capsule was behind the Moon. Nasa said in its description that the Earthrise photograph was captured through the Orion spacecraft window at 18:41 Eastern Daylight Time (2341BST) on Monday.

JD Vance backs Orbán's re-election bid in Budapest visit and hits out at EU



Five days before Hungarians vote in elections that could bring down Viktor Orbán after 16 years in office, US Vice-President JD Vance has intervened in the campaign to give the Hungarian prime minister a ringing endorsement, while delivering another blistering attack on the EU. Standing beside Orbán, Vance said he was in Budapest "to help him in this campaign cycle" although he conceded the US would "work with whoever wins this election". Orbán's main rival Péter Magyar is well ahead in most opinion polls. The veteran prime minister is a key European ally of the Trump administration, as well as being Russian President Vladimir Putin's closest partner in the EU. After winning four elections in a row since 2010, Orbán faces the toughest

challenge in a political career going back almost 40 years. In a last-ditch bid to boost the prime minister before the 12 April vote, Vance and his wife Usha arrived in Budapest for the first top-level US visit to Hungary for 20 years. They were welcomed by Foreign Minister Péter Szijjártó, who said Orbán's friendship with President Donald Trump had created a "new golden age" in relations. Péter Magyar responded to the visit by welcoming Vance to Budapest, and posting on social media that when his party came to office it would consider the US as a prominent partner, both as a Nato ally and as an economic partner. Following talks with Orbán, Vance launched a bitter attack on the European Union and Ukraine.

ONE DEAD AS TRAIN TRAVELLING 99MPH COLLIDES WITH LORRY IN FRANCE



A train driver has died after his high-speed passenger train collided with a lorry at a level crossing in France while travelling at an estimated 160km/h (99mph). The incident took place shortly before 07:00 (05:00 GMT) on Tuesday morning between Béthune and Lens in the northern Pas-de-Calais region. Two people initially deemed to have sustained critical injuries following the crash were "doing well", while 13 others sustained minor injuries, local

authorities said. The driver of the lorry, which was carrying military equipment at the time, is in police custody, but officials said it was too early to determine the cause. An investigation into potential aggravated manslaughter is under way. The vehicle belonged to a commercial haulier and the driver was not a member of the military, officials said. The train had been travelling from Dunkirk to Paris when the collision occurred.

One gunman killed and two injured in shooting at Israeli consulate in Istanbul

A gunman was killed and two were injured in a shootout near the Israeli consulate in Istanbul, which Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan called a "heinous act of terrorism". Two policemen were "slightly injured" in the gun fight, Turkish Interior Minister Mustafa Ciftci said. Ciftci said the attackers had come to Istanbul from the city of Izmit by rental car and that two of them were brothers. In a statement on X, the interior ministry named the gunman killed as Yunus E.S., who it said was "connected to the terrorist organisation that exploits religion". That is understood to be a reference to the Islamic State group, though no group has said it was behind the attack. "We will



not allow the climate of trust in Turkey to be damaged by such vile and timed provocations as today's," Erdogan said. Police were initially quoted as saying two attackers had died, but local governor Davut Gul later clarified that only one had been killed. The two injured attackers were named as Onur Ç and Enes Ç, who the interior ministry said were brothers.

attackers had used rifles and pistols in the assault. He also said that no Israeli diplomatic personnel were in the consulate, which is located in Istanbul's main business district in the Besiktas area. The gunfight happened in broad daylight. Video on social media appears to capture the moment when one armed attacker was shot by police and fell to the ground. Reuters news agency quoted a witness at the scene as saying that gunfire sounds had been "loud" and continued to increase "for 15-20 minutes". Unverified videos circulating online showed several police vans and a heavy police presence around the building, which was cordoned off for several hours after the attempted attack.

VIETNAM'S LEADER TO LAM STRENGTHENS POWER IN UNANIMOUS ASSEMBLY VOTE

Vietnam's communist-dominated general assembly has elected To Lam, the party leader, to be the country's president and head of state, an unusual concentration of power in one person. He was elected unanimously by the 500 seat assembly which started sitting on Monday, following the Communist Party Congress in January, which makes all the big decisions about the country's future direction. This makes To Lam the most powerful leader in Vietnam in recent decades. To Lam rose over the last decade by serving as the powerful Minister for Public Security, enforcing a nationwide anti-corruption drive which saw many of his



potential rivals disgraced and purged. In 2024, he took over the jobs of both general secretary of the communist party and president temporarily, after the resignation of then-president Vo Van Thuong and the death of party boss Nguyen Phu Trong. There is reported to be opposition,

especially within the military, to To Lam keeping these two top jobs after the party congress. The Communist Party of Vietnam has always preferred collective leadership shared among the four most senior national positions, now expanded to five, known as the "five pillars".

However, To Lam has now secured enough backing to take the two top jobs for the next five years, inviting comparisons with China, where President Xi Jinping has also concentrated power in his hands. Xi congratulated To Lam in January, when he successfully retained his job as secretary general of Vietnam's communist party. Xi said at the time that he would work with To Lam to "carry forward the traditional friendship" between the two socialist neighbours. There is historical anti-Chinese sentiment expressed by the Vietnamese population, but relations between the two communist parties are close.

Chilean woman accused of Pinochet-era kidnaps loses extradition battle



A 72-year-old Chilean woman suspected of having kidnapped and tortured dissidents during the military rule of Gen Augusto Pinochet has lost her lengthy legal battle against being extradited from Australia. Adriana Rivas moved to Australia in 1978, where she worked as a nanny and a cleaner in the Sydney's Bondi suburb. Chile requested her extradition 12 years ago, alleging that before she emigrated to Australia she had been involved in the disappearance of seven people, which she denies. More than 40,000 people were politically persecuted and some 3,000 were killed during the Pinochet era, which lasted from 1973 to 1990. Rivas was first arrested during a visit to her home country in 2006 but returned to Australia while on bail. Chile filed an extradition request in 2014 and, on Monday, a federal judge dismissed her lawyers' arguments that the request was legally flawed. Rivas could try to appeal against the decision at the full federal court, Australian media reports, but it is unclear whether the grounds for such an appeal would be met. A

lawyer representing the relatives of the victims of the Pinochet regime said the families were "truly, truly delighted" by Monday's ruling. Barring another appeal, Rivas will be sent back to her home country to stand trial on charges of aggravated kidnapping. Rivas was the personal secretary for Chile's infamous secret police chief Manuel Contreras from 1973 to 1976. Rights activists have long alleged that she was personally involved in the kidnapping and torture of dissidents. They say that she became an active agent for the National Intelligence Directorate (Dina), the secret police force founded by Pinochet to hunt down his political opponents after he seized power in a military coup in September 1973. Dina agents abducted, tortured, killed and forcibly disappeared thousands of people before the agency was replaced by the equally brutal CNI, an army intelligence battalion. Rivas described her years at the Dina as "the best of my life" in a 2013 interview with Australian broadcaster SBS, but denied any wrongdoing.



Australia's most-decorated living soldier charged over alleged war crimes

Australia's most-decorated living soldier has been charged over allegations he committed war crimes in Afghanistan. Ben Roberts-Smith - who left the defence force in 2013 - was arrested at Sydney airport on Tuesday and will face court over five counts of the war crime of murder. He will spend the night in a cell, before a bail hearing on Wednesday. A defamation judgement in 2023 found the former corporal in Australia's Special Air Service Regiment (SAS) had killed several unarmed Afghans. The 47-year-old Victoria Cross recipient denies all wrongdoing, and has previously said the allegations against him - which

have not yet been assessed at a criminal standard - were "egregious" and "spiteful". The civil trial was the first time in history any court has examined claims of war crimes by Australian forces. Roberts-Smith argued the alleged killings occurred legally during combat or did not happen at all, and last year lost an appeal against the Federal Court finding. At a news conference in Sydney on Tuesday, the Australian Federal Police (AFP) confirmed a 47-year-old former soldier had been arrested and said he would be charged with killing unarmed detainees while serving in Afghanistan between 2009 and 2012.

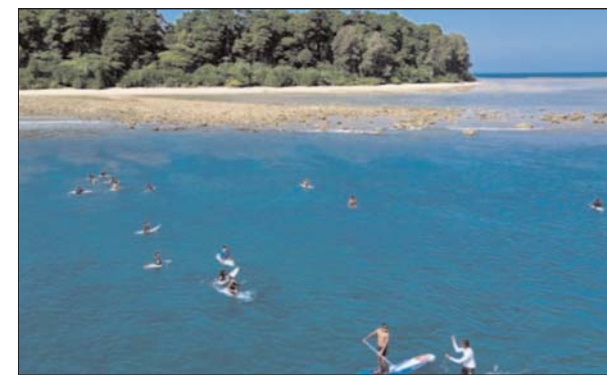

Arjun, who joined LSG ahead of the 2026 season following a stint with Mumbai Indians, has been working closely with coaching staff and senior players to refine his skills.

LALIT MODI SLAMS BCCI ON RS 2,400 CRORE IPL 'LOSS': "THIS IS NOT WHAT WE SOLD"



Former IPL commissioner Lalit Modi has made a significant revelation, claiming that the league is missing out on an additional revenue of Rs 2,400 crore by failing to adhere to the originally agreed format. Modi, who expressed delight at the league's soaring valuation after two franchises - Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) and Rajasthan Royals (RR) - were sold for a combined fee of approximately Rs 31,000 crore, wants the board to return to a full home-and-away format to recoup these perceived losses. According to Modi, every side was originally intended to play each other twice. With the league expanding to 10 teams in 2022, such a structure would result in a 90-match league phase followed by four knockout games. However, the IPL has continued to operate with only 74 matches by altering the home-and-away system. "For every game, the BCCI gets 50 per cent, and the remaining 50 per cent is distributed to teams. Consequently, teams are

now losing out on 20 games. It is a contractual obligation, given the fees they are paying, to provide them with home-and-away fixtures," he said in an interview with Sportstar. "The home-and-away format is where the value lies. If there is no space in the calendar, do not increase the number of teams. It is as simple as that. That is not what we sold. Has everybody signed off on this? I guarantee they have not," he added. "Why are they not playing home and away? There are excuses, but it is a contractual obligation and a commercial transaction for the teams." Modi believes the reduction in matches directly impacts the valuations of both the franchises and the league itself. "If there were 94 matches today on a home-and-away basis at Rs 118 crore per game, the media rights alone would be worth an extra Rs 2,400 crore. That is Rs 2,400 crore in additional revenue for the BCCI," he explained. "Of this, Rs 1,200 crore would have gone to the 10 teams, Rs 120 crore each, and team values would automatically have been higher."

'Lost My Career Because Of IPL': Kevin Pietersen Drops Major Bombshell

Former England captain Kevin Pietersen made an explosive allegation that his international career came to a premature end due to a dispute with authorities over his participation in the Indian Premier League (IPL). In an interview with YouTuber Ranveer Allahbadia, Pietersen alleged that the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) used the media to launch a "witch-hunt" against him during the early years of the IPL. The ECB barred centrally contracted players from participating in the inaugural edition of the tournament in

2008; Dimitri Mascarenhas was the only English player to feature that year. In 2009, England allowed players to participate within a limited three-week window. Pietersen joined Royal Challengers Bangalore (now Bengaluru) in 2009, and his decision to prioritize the league allegedly resulted in severe tensions

with the ECB. "I made big sacrifices. I lost my career. That's the reason why everybody in that establishment went against me," he said. "I was 33 when my England career finished, after 104 Test matches. I should have played 150-160 Tests and scored 12,000-13,000 runs. That's what I should have

achieved." "The ECB used The Telegraph to go after me... I don't want to go too deep into it. It was well-publicized, and I live a very happy, peaceful life now," Pietersen added. Pietersen finished his Test career with 8,181 runs, including 23 centuries and 35 half-centuries. While the former cricketer's career was allegedly impacted by his stance, Pietersen believes it helped future generations of England players gain the freedom to take part in franchise cricket. "I interviewed Jos Buttler a few days ago, and he also said thank you! Because of the sacrifices I made, these guys can enjoy the fruits now.

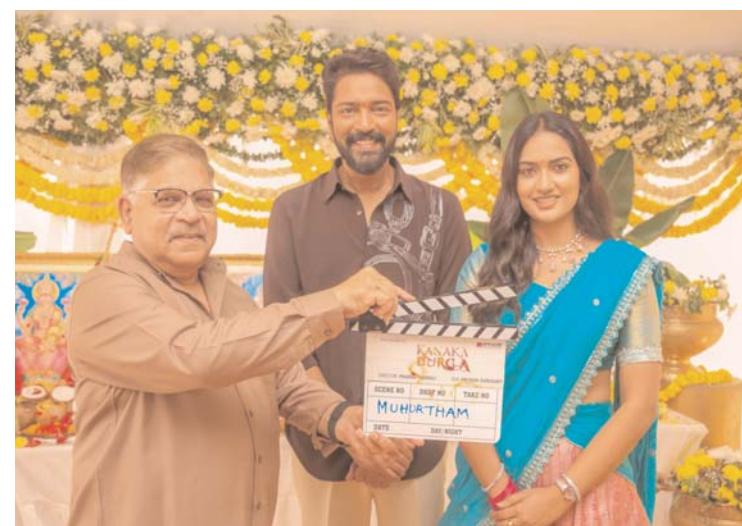
