Four students bag AIR 1; 26 score 100 percentile

New Delhi, April 20: Four male students shared the All India Rank 1 and 26 candidates scored 100 percentile in the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Main 2026 national-level engineering entrance exam as the National Testing Agency (NTA) declared the result on Monday. Kabeer Chhillar, Pasala Mohith, Chandra Sekhar and Aditya Gupta were the four AIR 1 students who scored a perfect 300-on-300 to corner AIR 1, NTA sources said, adding that Mallavarapu Aasna from Telangana was the best performing girl student. There are no girls among the 26 students with 100 percentile. A total of 16,04,854 unique candidates registered for the exam across both sessions.

100 ENTITIES ONBOARD TO USE AADHAAR-BASED OFFLINE VERIFICATION: GOVERNMENT

New Delhi, April 20: In a significant push towards privacy-first digital services, the government on Monday said that at least 100 entities have been onboarded as Offline Verification Seeking Entities (OVSEs) within just three months of the rollout of Aadhaar-based offline verification. The milestone, achieved by the Unique Identification Authority of India, marks a major step in enabling secure, consent-driven and paperless identity verification using Aadhaar without requiring real-time access to central databases. "These entities span a wide range of sectors, including central and state government departments, fintech firms, hospitality and event management companies, educational and examination bodies, as well as background and workforce verification organisations," the Ministry of Electronics & IT said. "Their integration into the ecosystem is expected to streamline service delivery, cut down processing time, and reduce reliance on physical documents," the ministry added. The Aadhaar offline verification system allows users to share limited and necessary identity data through methods such as QR code-based verification and digitally signed documents. This ensures that individuals retain control over their personal information.

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CM Revanth seeks CBI probe into Kaleshwaram, targets KCR and Harish Rao

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy launched a sharp attack on BRS leaders over alleged irregularities in the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, asserting that those responsible would not be spared and that his government is committed to repairs and accountability.

Addressing a media conference, he traced Telangana's irrigation history, recalling that Jalagam Vengala Rao had signed an agreement with Maharashtra in 1975 to utilize Godavari waters. He also referred to the Pranahita Chevella Project, launched in 2009 under Y. S. Rajasekhara Reddy with an estimated cost of Rs.38,063 crore.

Revanth Reddy alleged that former CM K. Chandrashekar Rao scrapped the project and redesigned it as Kaleshwaram, escalating costs to near-



ly Rs.1.5 lakh crore. He said the Medigadda Barrage, built in 2016 and inaugurated in 2019, was projected as an engineering marvel for political gain. However, the 2023 collapse of the Medigadda structure exposed "hidden truths," he alleged, adding that a report by the National Dam Safety Authority submitted on November 1, 2023, was ignored during the previous regime. The Chief Minister said the P.C. Ghose Committee had submitted a detailed

report on irregularities, following which the state urged the Centre for a Central Bureau of Investigation probe. He criticized the Union government for inaction despite earlier demands, including those by Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy. Revanth Reddy alleged that despite massive spending, the project failed to irrigate even one lakh acres. He affirmed that his government would repair the system and ensure water supply, noting that a high-level technical review had already been conducted.

Targeting BRS leaders, he accused them of diverting attention and claimed that T. Harish

Rao made a "secret trip" to Delhi to avoid a probe, demanding transparency on his meetings. Reiterating his stance, the Chief Minister said strict action would be taken against those involved in irregularities while ensuring the project is restored. He also highlighted the Sripada Yellampalli Project as a "lifeline" for the region, noting its contribution to agricultural output.

PM Modi's snack moment sends jhalmuri searches to two-decade-high

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's brief 'snack break' during election campaigning in poll-bound West Bengal on April 19 has taken social media by storm, with photos and videos of him relishing a local street snack and interacting with a vendor drawing massive engagement. PM Modi's visit to a jhalmuri stall has clocked more than 100 million views within 24 hours of being shared on Instagram, and garnered over 90 million views on Facebook Reels. The metrics, gathered from his personal handles, indicate strong public interest in the Prime Minister's 'jhalmuri moment' in the poll-bound state.

The Prime Minister addressed four back-to-back rallies in West Bengal on Sunday -- in Purulia, Jhargram, Medinipur, and Bishnupur. During his visit to Jhargram, he stopped at a small shop and tried jhalmuri, a popular and crunchy street snack from the state.

Photos and videos shared from the Prime Minister's personal social media accounts quickly went viral, with users widely sharing and comment-



ing on his interaction with the vendor and local residents. Interestingly, Google search interest for the street snack 'jhalmuri' has reached its highest level in the past 22 years, according to available internet data.

In the video clip, the Prime Minister is seen enjoying jhalmuri at the local stall, interacting with residents, and sharing smiles, creating a moment of informal outreach amid the campaign trail.

The Prime Minister was also seen offering to pay. The vendor initially declined but later accepted the payment after his

insistence. When the vendor asked if he wanted onions in the snack, the Prime Minister responded with a light-hearted remark: "Haan, pyaaz khaate hain. Dimag nahi khaate bass" (Yes, I eat onions, I just don't eat brains).

The viral video also sparked a wave of reactions on social media, with many users discussing his relatable behaviour and witty humour. The breaking of protocol by Prime Minister to visit a local shop was also seen as risky and dangerous reach out, by some others.

'Bias needs proof, not perception': Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma rejects Kejriwal's recusal plea



New Delhi (TSIT)

The courtroom fell silent as Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma began dictating her order, a pause that underscored the weight of what lay before her. This was not merely about deciding a legal dispute, she said, but about confronting a direct challenge to judicial independence itself. Refusing to step aside from hearing the Delhi excise policy case, the judge dismissed all recusal applications moved by Arvind Kejriwal and other accused, holding that the pleas were driven by perception, not proof. At the centre of the controversy, she remarked, was an unusual situation: instead of the court judging a litigant, the litigant had sought to place the judge and the institution in the

dock. Recusal not a matter of convenience, but of law

Justice Sharma made it clear that stepping aside would have been the easier option. Her first instinct, she said, was to withdraw without hearing the applications after her impartiality and dignity were questioned. Yet, she chose to proceed with the hearing to ensure fairness and transparency.

The court underlined that judicial impartiality is presumed and must be rebutted with concrete material. "Apprehension alone cannot replace evidence," the judge indicated, pointing to contradictions in the applicants' submissions, on one hand asserting faith in her integrity, and on the other seeking her removal.

She cautioned that recusal cannot be reduced to a tool in the hands of litigants. If accepted on such grounds, it would open the floodgates for forum shopping and weaken the justice delivery system.

The judge firmly rejected reliance on statements attributed to Union Minister Amit Shah, observing that courts cannot be influenced by political commentary. Public statements by politicians, she noted, are beyond judicial control and cannot determine whether a judge hears a case.

CM Naidu Slams DMK, congress at Coimbatore rally; accuses them of betraying Women Over Reservation Bill

Coimbatore (TSIT)

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu launched a scathing attack on the DMK, Congress, and their INDIA bloc allies during an election campaign press conference in Coimbatore on [date], accusing them of betraying women by opposing key legislative reforms.

Expressing strong displeasure, Naidu asserted that by opposing the Women's Reservation Bill and the Delimitation Bill, parties like the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and Indian National Congress had effectively "defeated women."

He claimed that the bills, introduced by the central government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi with good intentions, were derailed for political reasons, and accused the opposition bloc of prioritizing politics over the welfare of women and the development of southern states.

Naidu questioned whether the DMK wants injustice toward southern states or believes women do not need reservations. He warned that according to 2027 Census projections, southern states could face significant disadvantages, and said women awaiting reservations have been disappointed due to the actions of parties like the



Addressing the media, Naidu made several key remarks:

- Blocking the Women's Reservation Bill amounts to a betrayal of women by the Congress-led DMK alliance.
- Tamil Nadu, once considered a progressive state, is now lagging economically and has witnessed multiple scams.
- The DMK must explain why it opposed the Women's Reservation Bill.
- The party allegedly obstructed due benefits meant for southern states.
- If parliamentary seats were set to increase by 50%, there should have been no objection.
- Leaders like himself have fought for decades to secure reservations for women.
- The Prime Minister intended to implement these reservations by the 2029 elections.
- The proposed Delimitation Bill would have increased seats for states like Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Telangana, and Karnataka.
- Due to the DMK's stance, both women and southern states have suffered losses.

DMK. He further alleged that the political strategies of

Congress and DMK have resulted in setbacks for women.

Highlighting development initiatives, Naidu recalled the Telugu Ganga project, undertaken to supply water to Tamil Nadu, and emphasized ongoing river interlinking efforts within Andhra Pradesh. He added that a Ganga-Cauvery river linkage could resolve water scarcity issues across the country. Calling for accountability, the Chief Minister stressed that every government must adopt transparent and responsible governance practices.

Ensure 200+ to stop BJP at bay: CM Stalin to BLAs

CHENNAI (TSIT): Chief Minister and DMK president MK Stalin on Monday exuded confidence that the DMK-led Secular Progressive Alliance (SPA) would return to power and form a "Dravidian Model 2.0" government after the Assembly election. Addressing around 75,000 booth-level agents through a virtual meeting, Stalin said



the alliance was best positioned to counter what he described as external political pressure on the State. "Only a strong government can safeguard Tamil Nadu's rights. Unless we secure adequate strength in the Assembly, forces from Delhi cannot be kept at bay," he said. Alleging that Opposition parties were apprehensive of defeat, Stalin instructed booth agents to remain vigilant and report any irregularities to the party's central war room.

No plans yet to attend next round of talks with US: Iran

Tehran (TSIT)

Citing "contradictory actions" from Washington, Iran on Monday made it clear that it has not made any decision yet on participating in the next round of negotiations with the US. "So far, we have not made any decisions regarding the next round of negotiations," said Esmail Baqaei, spokesperson for the Iranian Foreign Ministry, while speaking to reporters at a weekly press conference in Tehran. The spokesperson criticised the United States, accusing Washington of engaging in con-



tradictory actions while claiming to pursue diplomacy. He mentioned that since the very beginning of the ceasefire, "bad faith and constant complaints" were faced by Iran from Washington. He clarified that the US initially claimed that Lebanon was not part of the ceasefire, despite contrary assertions.

Can't rule out BJP getting two-thirds majority: Rajnath Singh ahead of Bengal polls

Nanooor (TSIT):

With the West Bengal Assembly elections just days away, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Monday expressed confidence that the BJP will secure a clear majority, adding that the possibility of a two-thirds majority cannot be ruled out. Speaking to reporters, Singh said that West Bengal has witnessed an atmosphere of fear, violence, and alleged atrocities over the past 15 years. He noted that the people of the state have given three



consecutive terms to the Trinamool Congress, adding that such a long tenure should

have resulted in substantial development.

"There are many states in the country that have shown remarkable progress within just five to eight years. Earlier, West Bengal contributed around 10 per cent, but under the Trinamool Congress, it has declined to nearly five per cent," he said. Appealing to voters, Singh urged the people of West Bengal to opt for change. He also sought to reassure women voters, stating that the Women's Reservation Bill

would be implemented to ensure 33 per cent representation for women. "I cannot predict the exact number of seats we will win, but I am confident that the BJP will secure a clear majority. I also cannot rule out the possibility of the party achieving a two-thirds majority," he added.

He further alleged that the Women's Reservation Bill has been opposed by the Trinamool Congress, Congress, and other opposition parties, and claimed that women would respond to this in the elections.

Dry grain before procurement: Collector Hymavathi



Husnabad: Siddipet District Collector K. Hymavathi urged farmers to dry paddy in their fields before bringing it to procurement centres to meet prescribed moisture standards. During an inspection at the Agricultural Market Committee in Husnabad, she checked moisture levels and interacted with farmers about their issues. She noted that simultaneous procurement of maize and paddy has led to space constraints in the market yard. To ease congestion, the Collector advised farmers to ensure proper drying before transport and suggested using nearby IKP centres at Potharam (S) and Arepalli as alternatives. She also directed officials to take necessary steps to prevent space-related problems and ensure smooth procurement operations.

Ensure Students' Meals Are Hygienic and Tasty: Additional Collector Bhaskara Rao

Speed up tourism projects, make them accessible Minister Jupally Krishna Rao



Hyderabad TSIT: Tourism, Culture and Archaeology Minister Jupally Krishna Rao on Monday directed officials to expedite all ongoing tourism projects and complete them within stipulated timelines to make them accessible to the public. Minister chaired a review meeting at the Telangana Tourism Development Corporation (TGTDC) office in Himayatnagar along with TGTDC Chairman Patel Ramesh Reddy. He reviewed the progress of projects being implemented under the state government, centrally sponsored schemes and Public-Private Partnership (PPP) mode. Officials presented detailed updates on the progress of works being taken up at an estimated cost of Rs 274.93 crore across various districts. The minister instructed that each project should have a clear monthly timeline and be completed within deadlines. Key issues discussed included preparation of DPRs for new projects, construction of cottages,

works under central schemes like Swadesh Darshan and PRASAD, development of boating facilities, tribal tourism, maintenance of Haritha Hotels, transport connectivity and infrastructure development. Jupally Krishna Rao directed officials to prepare proposals for additional cottages near the Ramappa Temple and to introduce modern boats in place of traditional ones wherever necessary. He also suggested deploying an additional boat at Somasila and examining the feasibility of setting up cantilever glass view points at suitable locations. Emphasizing heritage conservation, the minister said providing better infrastructure would increase tourist footfall and boost revenue. He assured that necessary funds would be arranged for restoration of historical structures.

NAIDU'S BIRTHDAY MARKED BY STATEWIDE FREE MEAL DRIVE; Rs.76 Lakh Donation Feeds Thousands at Anna Canteens

Amaravati/Vijayawada: (TSIT) The birthday of Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu was celebrated with great enthusiasm across the state on Monday, with a major focus on welfare initiatives benefiting the poor. On the occasion, his wife Nara Bhuvaneshwari donated Rs.76 lakh to cover the operational expenses of Anna Canteens for a day. Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister emphasized that Anna Canteens were established to ensure access to hygienic and dignified meals for the underprivileged. He expressed satisfac-



tion over the cleanliness and management of the Patamata canteen and highlighted that people can access quality food at just Rs.5. Naidu pointed out that daily wage workers, auto drivers, and the urban poor often spend up to Rs.100 for a meal outside, making subsidized canteens a vital support system. He also appreciated the role of ISKCON Foundation for supplying nutritious and tasty food through a centralized

kitchen system. The Chief Minister noted that while 269 Anna Canteens are currently operational, 62 were recently inaugurated and five more are ready to be launched soon. Praising his wife's gesture, Naidu said her donation set an inspiring example, calling Annadanam (food donation) the most sacred form of charity. He urged citizens to voluntarily contribute—whether for a meal or a day—to

support the initiative and transform it into a people's movement. "No one in the state should go hungry. Andhra Pradesh has always been an 'Annapurna'—a state that feeds the nation," he said, adding that the government seeks public participation not out of compulsion, but to build a culture of compassion. He also linked the initiative to the P4 model, encouraging the top 10% of society to support the bottom 20%, thereby reducing economic disparities and strengthening democracy. Reflecting on past policies, Naidu criticized the previous administration for shutting down Anna Canteens, questioning their approach toward welfare. "If feeding the poor was opposed, people must reflect on such governance," he remarked. Concluding his address, the Chief Minister expressed deep satisfaction at seeing the happiness of beneficiaries and reiterated his vision: "In a state like Andhra Pradesh, no one should sleep hungry."

DINAKAR BACKS CENTRE'S BILLS ON WOMEN'S RESERVATION AND DELIMITATION, SLAMS OPPOSITION

Amaravati: Lanka Dinakar, Chairman for the implementation of the Twenty-Point Programme (Viksit Bharat – Swarna Andhra Pradesh), has expressed gratitude to Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu for supporting the bills introduced by the Central Government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He stated that these measures aim to safeguard the interests of Andhra Pradesh and southern India in matters of women's reservation and delimitation. 84-Year-Old Liver Cancer Patient with Cardiac Risks Successfully Treated via Minimally Invasive Surgery in Bengaluru

Bengaluru: In a significant medical achievement, an 84-year-old man diagnosed with intrahepatic cholangiocarcinoma - a rare form of liver cancer - has been successfully treated using a minimally invasive laparoscopic procedure, despite being considered high-risk due to his advanced age and multiple comorbidities.



The elderly patient had presented with persistent abdominal discomfort and loss of appetite. Further evaluation revealed a 4 cm tumour in the liver. The case was further complicated by the patient's existing health conditions, including diabetes, hypertension, a previous heart attack, and dependence on blood thin-

ners for his cardiac health. Given his fragile cardiac profile and advanced age, conventional open surgery posed significant risks. Following a detailed assessment and multidisciplinary planning, the surgical team at SPARSH Hospital, Yelahanka, opted for a Laparoscopic Left Lateral Hepatectomy. This minimally

invasive approach allowed removal of the tumour through small incisions, significantly reducing surgical trauma and blood loss.

Dr. Raghavendra Babu, Senior Consultant - Gastrointestinal and HPB Surgery, GI Oncology & Liver Transplantation at SPARSH Hospital, Yelahanka, said, "Treating liver cancer in an elderly patient with a significant cardiac history and multiple comorbidities required a highly cautious and well-planned surgical approach. In this case, the laparoscopic technique helped reduce operative stress and supported faster recovery, demonstrating how minimally invasive surgery can play an important

role in managing complex cases safely." The procedure was completed successfully, and the patient showed encouraging recovery soon after surgery. He was started on an oral diet on the same day of the procedure, and his post-operative recovery remained stable and uneventful. He was discharged within just two days - a remarkable outcome that highlights the potential value of minimally invasive liver surgery in selected elderly and high-risk patients. This case underscores the growing role of advanced laparoscopic techniques in managing complex liver conditions, particularly among elderly patients where reduced surgical stress and faster recovery are especially critical.

EDITORIAL

Lights, Camera, Sarkar

The neon-lit history of Tamil Nadu politics isn't written in ink; it is etched in celluloid and projected at 24 frames per second. The silver screen has never been just entertainment. It has been the primary incubator for political power for over 50 years. The celluloid screen is where a man's mythology is manufactured before it is tested at the ballot box. The journey from reel life to real life, from the cinema hall to the secretariat is the climactic career arc. Joseph Vijay Chandrasekhar, "Thalapathy," the Commander is the newest debutante switching roles as the state heads to the polls on April 23, 2026. Public attention will measure his bid to be a real-life Jana Nayagan; this is Vijay's riskiest production. It is moot whether Vijay is the new Enga Veettu Pillai the state has yearned for or another Puli whose roar fades after the show.

History is replete with many film stars aspiring to aspire. Does Vijay have it? The gold standard for the transition from films to politics is MGR - the celluloid giant who turned films into a political laboratory. MG Ramachandran - MGR, Makkal Thilagam, "Darling of the People" evangelised as he acted. The films, the script and the dialogues were verily aspiration wrapped in ideology, ambition in motion. In Enga Veettu Pillai, he said, "Once I take oath the poor will not suffer," and Tamil Nadu roared in approval. He was the labourer-messiah of the poor in Rickshaw Karan, the wandering king of Nadodi Manan who delivered justice - a manifesto disguised in a double role. He was always the sub-altern avatar, the mama's boy, the lady's saviour. By the time he completed his two-decade internship in the DMK, he was ready to step out of the reels and into real life. He and his 80,000 fan clubs wrote a new script in 1972 forming the AIADMK.

His protege, Jayalalitha, learnt at his feet and rose from his leading lady to propagandist secretary to heir-at-large. Jayalalitha leveraged resilience from Adimai Penn, to survive a brutal and public inheritance battle after MGR's death. Her rise is an all-time masterclass on capitalising opportunity in grief. Her grasp of politics and gravitas in administration enabled her to take the seat of chief minister five times. Every welfare idea of hers - Amma canteen or Amma medicine - is a legend and has been dubbed in other states. Vijayakanth, "Captain," had political acumen and challenged the status quo. Displaying innate screen sense he arrived at his party's launch in MGR's old van, positioning himself as the dark-skinned avatar of MGR. He had done the tutorials, paid obeisance to mass misery. Ramanaa, Rajadhi Raja portrayed the patriotic, anti-corruption hero who takes on a broken system with bare hands. In real life he had the potential to disrupt the duopoly of DMK-ADMK but his party, the DMDK which won 29 seats in 2011 lacked the cadre and organisation to leverage his halo.

The lesson from history is clear: the screen character must morph into the street character, bleed and blend into the landscape and yet retain the messianic presence. The transition is not easy nor is it automatic. For years folks would quote Rajnikanth "Naan late-aa vandhalum, latest-aa varuvein". (Even if I come late, I will come as the latest) from his hit Baba to argue, insist that the mega star would join politics and that hope has faded with the credits.

Like Rajnikanth aka Shivaji Gaekwad, Vijay has been auditioning for the role, seen with folks from the national parties and strategists of the regional parties. The superstar brings with him an arsenal none of his predecessors could imagine. Vijay arrives with an army of Gen Z (and a chunk of millennial fans) who have watched and whistled as he broke systems on screen. Unlike Kamal Hassan, whose appeal was limited to the cerebral types, Vijay straddles mass not class, rural and urban appeal. However, he has rarely been heard before his debut this year to speak on issues or take a stand. Vijay and his team would like the voters to believe that he has spoken through his films. Mersal attacked GST and healthcare inequity, and the outrage only made it more popular. Sarkar mobilised the "common man" against dynastic corruption; its hero returns NRI wealth and demands accountability. Master placed an idealist inside a broken institution and asked whether a flawed man could still be the right man. Kaththi was an agrarian crisis wrapped in a mass entertainer. Bigil used women's football as a metaphor for collective dignity against caste and entitlement. There is a clear attempt, at least in the titles, to forge a broad coalition. Vijay consciously promoted the concept of whistle revolution, egging folks to blow the whistle on wrongdoing, a kind of vigilante reformer through his films, for some time before he put up the first posters and founded the TVK. His party shadow-marketed and tested his ideas; his fan clubs won over a hundred seats in local body polls. If private polls are to be believed Vijay and the TVK are a draw among the 30 to 45 age band, those who have voted for and experienced both Dravidian parties and who ostensibly are looking for a third alternative. The fact that his draw survives his and his party's missteps - including the stampede in Karur - is a worry for both the AIADMK and DMK fronts. Typical of Tamil Nadu assessments of Vijay's prospects are tags based on his hit or flop films; it ranges from being tagged as the next Prashant Kishore-led Jan Suraj to a super disrupter like Vijayakanth and DMDK. Pollsters are divided on who the TVK will damage more - the anti-incumbency votes which AIADMK is wooing or the minority and youth votes DMK is betting on.

Vijay is challenged by a gap on his CV which cannot be upskilled - the lack of an active internship and the absence of an ideological north star is a glaring vulnerability. MGR had Dravidian foundationalism as his political DNA. Jayalalitha apprenticed under MGR for over a decade before she bid for and seized the throne. Vijayakanth confronted and then collaborated with the Dravidian parties, Kamal Hasan tried the lateral entry. Vijay is attempting to crash through the barricades. He has played footsie with the Congress during the GST drama, then with the AIADMK folks and again with Congress. In Tamil Nadu, politicians cannot wait for the dialogue to be written when confronted with questions such as Cauvery waters or imposition of Hindi. His positioning, secular social justice, may offend nobody but could end up inspiring none either given the hard binaries holding Tamil Nadu politics.

Pakistan's Ever-Running Saudi 'Lifeline' Has Its Limits

Pakistan's announcement of Saudi Arabia extending a fresh financial aid of an additional USD 3 billion is being framed as a geopolitical achievement, and with good reason. The funds arrived with a decision to extend an existing USD 5 billion deposit for an expanded term, thus replacing the annual rollover arrangement. The breakthrough reportedly followed a series of high-level engagements, including a meeting between Pakistan's Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb, the governor of the State Bank, Pakistan's envoy to the US, and Saudi Arabia's foreign minister on the sidelines of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank Spring Meetings in Washington. The loan is expected to help Pakistan achieve its target of taking its reserves to USD 18 billion by the end of the fiscal year.

THE TIMING

The Pakistani minister acknowledged that the financial aid came at a critical juncture for Pakistan's external financial requirements, as it will reinforce foreign exchange reserves and support external accounts. This also comes amid strict obligations under the current International Monetary Fund (IMF)-supported loan programme. The announcement comes at a time when Pakistan was due to repay a total of USD 3.5 billion in debt to the UAE by the end of April, after the Gulf nation ended its rollover support; Pakistan's reserves stood at USD 16.4 billion as of March 27. In January, while addressing exporters and businessmen in Islamabad,



Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had said, "seeking foreign loans had forced Pakistan to 'bow' its head and make compromises at the cost of self-respect". "How should I describe the way we requested loans from friendly countries? The friendly countries didn't disappoint us. But the one who goes to seek a loan has their head bowed. When you go seeking loans, you pay the price at the cost of your self-respect... You have to compromise... Sometimes, an undue demand may come up, and you have to implement it even when there is no reason to fulfil it." The timing of the recent announcement is not incidental, with Pakistan's economic

relieve arriving as the country finds itself playing an unusually key role as a mediator in the West Asian conflict between Iran and the US and Israel. The combination of its Islamic credentials, ties with stakeholders, and Pakistan army chief Field Marshal Asim Munir's cultivation of a personal rapport with US President Donald Trump has opened a space for Pakistan to function as an interlocutor.

MEDIATION FOR PERSONAL GAINS?

While the durable influence of this mediation and its optics is yet to play out, the outcome attempts to convert cur-

rent strategic positioning into domestic gains. That said, to treat this announcement as a consequential movement in the longer arc of the Saudi Arabia-Pakistan relationship would be short-sighted.

Historically, Pakistan has served as a security partner to Saudi Arabia in return for the Kingdom's financial assistance in times of acute balance-of-payments situations. For instance, Pakistan stationed approximately 10,000 Pakistani troops in Saudi Arabia in return for USD 1 billion in economic aid. Saudi Arabia further offered concessional loans to Pakistan to fortify its military in the late 1970s. The immediate gains

for Pakistan are clear. Saudi Arabia's recent support acts as a short-term stabiliser for an economically fragile Pakistan. It further reinforces Pakistan's standing as a state that retains strategic relevance despite internal weaknesses. Internationally, Pakistan is punching above its economic weight by leveraging its strategic assets to compensate for its structural issues.

THE RENTIER MODEL

That said, Pakistan's utility as a security provider to Saudi Arabia as an interlocutor in the West Asian conflict will not translate into long-term resilience. The vicious cycle of external dependence, with

recurring financial inflows rather than facilitating structural reforms, is unlikely to alter Pakistan's deep-rooted reality. However, this will not prevent Pakistan's significance from diminishing for Saudi Arabia, especially amid insecurities among the Gulf countries towards the US's ability to provide security guarantees.

Pakistan's geostrategic location and its rentier state model have worked favourably. Added to this is its status as the Muslim world's only nuclear power and religious linkages. Additionally, its significant labour force also remains crucial to Gulf economies.

While security and economic relationships have historically persisted, tectonic shifts in the geopolitical landscape will sustain a gap between what Pakistan seeks from its Gulf partners and their willingness to offer it in an interest-driven foreign policy environment. In the context of Pakistan's dispute with India, Saudi Arabia is unlikely to take a partisan stand on the Kashmir conflict - this was seen in the Kingdom's mediatory role in the recent Pakistan-Taliban conflict

STUCK IN A LOOP

As such, the latest development is less of a transformative moment and more a continuation of an established system. It highlights Pakistan's sustained relevance in West Asia; it also underscores structural shortcomings of its financial, governance, and bureaucratic infrastructure. Even as the country gains geopolitical momentum, its economic weaknesses will limit its strategic potential.

What Data Can See, And What It Cannot, In Children's Lives



Across education systems today, data plays an increasingly central role in decision-making. It helps governments track progress, identify gaps, allocate resources, and strengthen programmes at scale. Used thoughtfully, data can illuminate patterns that would otherwise remain invisible. It can support accountability and improve outcomes for millions of children. But there is a distinction we must hold carefully. Data can show us trends. It cannot show us a whole child. This matters because children's development does not unfold in neat, linear ways. It moves through bursts, pauses, regressions, leaps, and moments that resist measurement altogether. A child may appear disengaged in one environment and deeply curious in another. A learner marked "behind" in one metric may be thriving in ways that the metric does not capture. When systems rely heavily on measurable indicators, they inevitably privilege what can be counted. Attendance, completion rates, assessment scores, timelines. These are important. But they are not complete descriptions of learning or development. They do not tell us whether a child feels safe. They do not reveal whether curiosity is growing. They cannot capture the tone of a caregiver's voice or the steadiness of an adult's presence. One example shared in a recent discussion illustrates this clearly. A child was assumed to be struggling with colouring tasks. Only later did a caregiver notice that the child disliked the sensation of paint on their hands. The issue was not ability. It was sensory experience. No dashboard would have detected that without an adult paying close attention and interpreting what they saw. This is where human judgment remains indispensable. Monitoring systems are powerful tools. They can strengthen delivery and reveal where support is needed. But they should not be asked to do what they are not designed to do. When data is treated as a complete picture rather than a partial one, it can lead to premature conclusions, especially when applied early in a child's life. Labels assigned too quickly, "not ready," "delayed," "behind", can follow children in ways that shape expectations long before their capacities have had time to unfold.

4 suicides at National Institute of Technology Kurukshetra

(Why are students breaking up?)

Prestigious Indian technical education institutions, once known as "dream factories," are now becoming factories of mental stress for many young people. The suicides of four students within just two months at the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra, Haryana, have shocked the entire nation. This is not just the end of four lives, but the failure of a system that is destroying talent instead of nurturing it. These incidents, which occurred between February and April 2026, are not isolated incidents but indicate a dangerous chain—one incident follows another, as despair spreads from one person to the next. Diksha Dubey's suicide note—"I could not achieve anything"—is not just the anguish of one student, but a reflection of a mindset in which achieving something has become the ultimate goal of life. In India, exams like JEE Mains and JEE Advanced have long been considered the key to success. Millions of students work tirelessly for years to crack these exams and gain admission to institutions like the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra. But ironically, admission to an institution, considered a life's greatest achievement, becomes a battleground for many students. Once there, students must not only excel academically but also face the pressure of proving themselves on every front. The 75% attendance rule, constant assignments and proj-



ects, the stress of semester exams, and the uncertainty of placements—all of these add up to an invisible but heavy burden on students' minds. This pressure isn't just academic, but also psychological and social. When a student who has been at the top of their school or coaching class suddenly finds themselves among hundreds of talented students, their self-image is affected. Where they once considered themselves "the best," they now feel "average" or, at times, "weak." This change is mentally very difficult for many students. They are unable to accept their failures and gradually become victims of self-doubt and inferiority complex. The role of the family is also crucial in this entire crisis. In Indian society, education is linked to social prestige. Parents have high expectations for their children, and this expectation often inadvertently turns into pressure. National Crime Records Bureau data shows that family pressure is a major factor in suicides among youth. This pressure is especially acute

for students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Their parents spend a significant portion of their limited income on their education and expect success in return. Therefore, if a student fails to perform as expected for any reason, they feel they have let down not only themselves but their entire family. Social media has further complicated this situation. Today's youth are constantly surrounded by glimpses of others' "success" and "happy lives." The glitz and glamour displayed on Instagram, YouTube, and other platforms creates a world far removed from reality. However, students begin to compare themselves to others, believing it to be real. When they feel they fall short of this "ideal life," dissatisfaction and frustration grow within them. French sociologist Emile Durkheim viewed suicide not just as an individual problem, but as a social one. His theory of "anomic suicide" suggests that when societal norms and expectations become unclear or unbalanced, individuals begin to feel isolated. This

same situation is evident in many technical institutions today. Students are placed in an environment where high expectations are placed on them, but they lack adequate emotional or social support. As a result, they begin to break down internally. This problem is even more acute for students from rural backgrounds. They are suddenly thrust into an environment where the language, lifestyle, and social behavior are all different. They find it difficult to connect with those around them. This isolation gradually turns into loneliness, and loneliness can become a major threat to mental health. Many students are unable to share their problems with anyone because they feel that doing so is a sign of weakness. For female students, this struggle occurs on many levels. They have to balance academics with safety, social expectations, and self-reliance. Often, they are made to feel like they have to "prove" themselves, not only as students but also as women. This dual pressure further impacts their mental health.

DMK's Political Expediency Sacrifices Southern Interests: H.D. Kumaraswamy

New Delhi : Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy has alleged that the political expediency of the DMK has come at the cost of the larger interests of southern states. Addressing a press conference at his official residence in New Delhi, he stated that the DMK, after initially expressing support for key Constitutional Amendment Bills, subsequently reversed its position, thereby depriving southern states of a significant and beneficial opportunity. He further remarked that both the DMK and the Congress have been

creating unwarranted confusion and apprehension among the public on the issue. Referring to a recent meeting convened by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, he noted that leaders of the DMK were adequately briefed on the Women's Reservation Bill and delimitation proposals, and that there had been no immediate opposition at the time. He pointed out that Tamil Nadu Chief Minister Shri M.K. Stalin had even suggested convening a Parliamentary session in June to pass these Bills, which indicated tacit approval. However, he alleged that the DMK

later withdrew support due to political considerations. Union Minister Kumaraswamy asserted that claims of injustice to southern states arising from these amendments are unfounded. On the contrary, he argued that the DMK's reversal has itself caused disadvantage to the region. He questioned why Chief Ministers of Karnataka, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh did not raise objections if the proposals were indeed detrimental, noting that N. Chandrababu Naidu had, in fact, extended open support. Highlighting the

Centre's approach, he explained that the proposals aimed to ensure equitable representation by increasing Lok Sabha seats across all states by approximately 50%, thereby safeguarding the interests of states that have performed well in population control and policy implementation. He stated that Union Home Minister Amit Shah had presented these details comprehensively in Parliament, leaving no scope for ambiguity. Despite this, he alleged that the Congress, driven by political motives, misled its allies and the public, thereby derailing a significant reform.

Chikkaballapur MP Dr.K. Sudhakar Seeks Urgent Centre Intervention to address Crisis Faced by Bangalore Rose Onion Farmers



New Delhi : Chikkaballapur MP Dr. K. Sudhakar has drawn the attention of the Union Government to the severe market crisis faced by farmers cultivating the Bangalore Rose Onion (GI Tag) in the region.

In the wake of ongoing geopolitical disruptions in the Gulf region leading to significant supply chain constraints, export channels for this export-oriented crop have been adversely affected. This has resulted in a sharp

decline in prices—from Rs.1,200-Rs.1,500 per bag to below Rs.100—causing acute financial distress to farmers. Large quantities of perishable produce remain unsold, further aggravating the situation.

Dr. Sudhakar has written to the Union Minister for Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, seeking immediate intervention through appropriate market support mechanisms, including procurement measures to prevent

distress sales and protect farmer interests.

In a separate communication to the Union Minister for Commerce & Industry, Piyush Goyal, he has requested urgent steps to facilitate access to alternative export markets, along with necessary logistical support and export incentives to restore the viability of this crop.

He has also urged the promotion of processing infrastructure in the region, including dehydration and pickling units under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY), to reduce long-term dependence on raw exports. Emphasising the need for timely and coordinated action, Dr. Sudhakar has expressed confidence that the Union Government will extend the necessary support to safeguard the livelihoods of farmers and stabilise the market.

We Are Brothers Fighting to Protect Pride of South India: DCM D K Shivakumar to TN voters

Krishnagiri (TSIT): Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, described the people of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu as brothers fighting together to protect the pride of South India. DEATH TOLL RISES TO 25 IN VIRUDHUNAGAR FIRECRACKER FACTORY EXPLOSION



VIRUDHUNAGAR: The death toll has climbed to 25 in the devastating explosion at a firecracker manufacturing unit in Kattinarpatti near Virudhunagar in Tamil Nadu, officials said on Monday. The blast occurred on Sunday at the Vanaja Firecracker Factory, owned by Muthu Manickam of Govindanallur, which was operating with a valid Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO) licence.

According to initial reports, more than 30 workers were present inside the facility at the time of the incident, engaged in routine firecracker production activities. Officials said the explosion was triggered by friction during the manufacturing process, leading to a sudden ignition of explosive materials. The impact was so intense that at least four rooms of the factory were completely destroyed. The sound of the explosion was reportedly heard up to 10 kilometres away, underscoring the magnitude of the blast.

Earlier on Sunday, 23 charred bodies were recovered from the scene.

Meanwhile, more than 12 injured individuals are cur-

rently undergoing treatment at the Virudhunagar Government Medical College Hospital; among them, two women succumbed to their injuries on Monday morning despite medical treatment. The deceased have been identified as Panchavarnam and Pechiammal.

Death toll rises to 25 in Virudhunagar firecracker factory explosion

Tamil Nadu: At least 23 killed in massive explosion at Virudhunagar firecracker unit. Based on a complaint filed by Vanitha, the administrative officer of the Kattinarpatti facility, the Vachakarapatti police have registered a case against Easwari and her husband, Muthumanickam (the couple who operated the factory), under four different sections of the law.

Four special police teams have been formed to search for the couple, who are currently absconding. As of now, with the death toll standing at 25, 21 bodies have been identified, and the post-mortem examinations for them have been completed. The process of identifying the remaining four bodies is currently underway.

Patchy approach won't work, offer permanent solutions: Fishers



TIRUCHY: They are not asking for doles but solutions; not gifts, but support; not attention-grabbing announcements but sensible steps to save their lives and facilitate livelihood. For the thousands of fishermen spread across the coastal region of Tamil Nadu, the upcoming Assembly election in Tamil Nadu, which has coincided with the 61-day annual fishing ban period this year, is a time to raise their voice - and also to make sure that they are heard.

As per the Tamil Nadu Marine Fishing Regulation Act 1983, fishing is banned for 61 days every year during the breeding season to protect marine wealth and ensure its sustainability. Tamil Nadu Marine Fishing Regulation Act enforces this ban every year from April 15 to June 14 in the East Coast and from June 1 to July 31 in Kanniyakumari district. Most of the 14 coastal districts in the State fall under the first period of the ban, during which fishing by mechanised boats and trawlers is prohibited.

While the science behind

the ban is clear, the fishermen here do not agree with the schedule. A Rajamanickam, president of Thanjavur Mechanised Boat Owners Association said they have been appealing to successive governments to change the ban period to October-November, which is not conducive for breeding.

"Citing breeding season, the authorities enforce the ban during the summer months. However, the actual breeding season is during the monsoon, between November and December. Salinity and temperature are high in April and May, which affects fish breeding," he explained the rationale behind the demand to change the ban period. Fishers from across the State have submitted representations to various governments in this regard. "Even when they come seeking votes, no party is willing to give an assurance on this long-pending demand. They only talk about monetary assistance during the ban. But that would help us only temporarily," Rajamanickam said.

AI study of Reddit posts reveals possible new side effects of weight loss drugs

GLP-1 receptor agonists are popular weight loss drugs that help manage obesity and type 2 diabetes. There is a growing demand Trusted Source for GLP-1-based therapies, with research suggesting roughly 1 in 8 U.S. adults Trusted Source report having ever used GLP-1 medication, with 6% currently using such drugs.

Common side effects of GLP-1 drugs are those of a gastrointestinal nature, such as nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and constipation. Research suggests these adverse events may occur in 40 to 85% of people. Health experts advise that people can make dietary adjustments to help reduce Trusted Source these side effects.

Although many of these side effects are mild to moderate in severity and generally resolve shortly, adverse events remain a common cause of discontinuing the drug.

While these side effects are well-documented, many people also often report anecdotal adverse events while using GLP-1 drugs.

Now, a new study published in Nature Health Trusted Source used AI to analyze social media posts and uncovered patient-reported side effects linked to these medications that may not yet be fully captured in clinical trials.

Key GLP-1 findings from social media data

Led by researchers from the University of Pennsylvania, the study examined more than 400,000 Reddit posts from nearly 70,000 users discussing GLP-1 receptor agonists, including semaglutide and tirzepatide.

The analysis identified two main symptom categories that may warrant further investigation. These included reproductive symptoms, including irregu-



lar menstrual cycles and unexpected bleeding, and temperature-related issues, such as chills, hot flashes, and feeling unusually cold. Additionally, fatigue emerged as a frequently discussed symptom, despite being less prominent in clinical trial data. Commonly recognized side effects, such as gastrointestinal symptoms, were also widely reported, lending credibility to the approach.

"Some of the side effects we found, like nausea, are well known, and that shows the method is picking up a real signal," said senior author Sharath Chandra Guntuku in a press release. "The underreported symptoms are leads that came from patients themselves, unprompted, and clinicians could potentially pay attention to them." The study highlights a growing field, sometimes referred to as computational social listening, where AI tools analyze large volumes of online content to identify health trends.

Historically, this approach has been limited by the difficulty of interpreting how individuals describe symptoms in their own words. Mapping these descriptions to standardized medical ter-

minology can be time consuming. However, recent advances in large language models make it possible to process such data at scale, enabling researchers to analyze patterns across hundreds of thousands of posts more efficiently and consistently.

Surprising GLP-1 side effects
Commenting on which newly identified symptoms were the most surprising, Neil Sehgal, MD, MS, the study's first author and a doctoral student advised by Guntuku and Lyle Ungar, PhD, told Medical News Today: "When you consider that we're looking at a mixed-gender sample on Reddit, and that Reddit skews male, the true rate among women taking these medications could potentially be higher," Sehgal said. "Fatigue was also the second most commonly reported symptom overall, but has not been reported in clinical trials. This gap between what patients are self-reporting online and what gets captured in trials is really what motivated this whole line of work," he added.

Why clinical trials may miss some symptoms

Clinical trials remain the gold standard for identifying drug

safety issues. However, they may not always capture the full range of patient experiences.

Typically, trials are designed to detect the most serious or common adverse effects. As such, they may overlook symptoms that individuals find bothersome but less dangerous, or that occur less frequently.

"Clinical trials generally identify the most dangerous side effects of drugs," adds co-author Ungar. "But they can fail to find what symptoms patients are most concerned about; even though social media is not necessarily representative, a large collection of posts may reflect additional concerns."

Still, the researchers emphasize that these findings do not prove causation. They highlight that the study only shows that users reported these symptoms while taking the medications, not that the GLP-1 drugs directly caused them.

The research team suggests there may be plausible biological reasons behind some of the reported symptoms.

GLP-1 drugs are thought to act on the hypothalamus, a region of the brain that regulates hormones, body temperature, and

energy balance. Therefore, this could potentially explain reports of menstrual problems and temperature fluctuations.

However, more rigorous, controlled studies are necessary to determine whether GLP-1 medications are truly responsible.

Why negative Reddit posts don't paint the whole picture

The study authors caution that Reddit users are not representative of the general population. The platform tends to skew younger, more male, and more U.S.-based than the broader population of people taking GLP-1 medications. As a result, the findings may not reflect the experiences of all individuals.

"The most important challenge is understanding what we've actually found. There are a few things that make that tricky," Sehgal told MNT. "Second, we can't say anything about causality. When someone reports a menstrual irregularity while taking one of these drugs, we don't know if the drug caused it," Sehgal continued.

"The way I'd summarize all of this is that our findings are best thought of as signals worth investigating further, not conclusions. We're pointing in directions that we think deserve more rigorous follow-up, not closing the case on anything," he concluded.

Additionally, one of the study authors reports receiving an investigator-initiated grant, on behalf of the University of Pennsylvania, from Novo Nordisk and receiving consulting fees from Currax Pharmaceuticals, LLC.

The research team hopes their findings will encourage clinicians and regulators to pay closer attention to patient-reported experiences shared online. They also hope to expand future studies beyond Reddit to include other platforms and more diverse populations, as well as non-English-language data.

What is DNA and how does it impact health?

How is DNA structured?

DNA is a two-stranded molecule that appears twisted, giving it a unique shape referred to as the double helix. Each of the two strands is a long sequence of nucleotides. These are the individual units of DNA, and they are made of:

- a phosphate molecule
- a sugar molecule called deoxyribose, containing five carbons
- a nitrogen-containing region

There are four types of nitrogen-containing regions called bases, including Trusted Source:

- adenine (A)
- cytosine (C)
- guanine (G)
- thymine (T)

The order of these four bases forms the genetic code, which is the instructions for life. The bases of the two strands of DNA are stuck together to create a ladder-like shape. Within the ladder, A sticks to T, and G sticks to C to create the "rungs." The length of the ladder forms through the sugar and phosphate groups.

What is a gene?

Each length of DNA that codes for a specific protein is called a gene. For instance, one gene codes for the protein insulin, the hormone that helps control blood sugar levels. Humans have around 20,000 genes Trusted Source, although estimates vary. It is believed that only about 1% of DNA is made up of protein-coding genes. Scientists know less about the function of the remaining 99% of DNA but believe them to be involved in regulating transcription and translation. Chromosome 1 is the largest and contains around 2,800 genes Trusted Source. The smallest is chromosome 22 with around 750 genes.

How does DNA work?

Most DNA lives in cell nuclei, and some exists in mitochondria, which are the powerhouses of cells. Because humans have so much DNA and the nuclei are so small, DNA needs to be packaged incredibly neatly. Strands of DNA loop, coil, and wrap around proteins called Trusted Source histones. In this coiled state, the DNA is called chromatin.

Oil prices rise after Trump says Iranian ship seized

Tehran: Global oil prices have jumped after US President Donald Trump said its navy had intercepted and seized an Iranian cargo ship. The Brent crude benchmark oil price jumped 5% to around \$95 (£70) a barrel, reversing the slump on Friday when Iran said the Strait of Hormuz would be "completely open" to commercial vessels for the remainder of the ceasefire. On Saturday, Iran said it was closing the strait again and that any ship that approached it would be targeted. The waterway is of key importance as usually about 20% of the world's oil and liquefied natural gas passes through it. Energy markets have seen wild swings since the US and Israel attacked Iran on 28 February and Tehran responded with threats to target shipping in the strait. Trump has said his representatives will be in Pakistan on Monday for negotiations. A White House official said Vice-President JD Vance would lead the US delegation. But Iran's state media said



Tehran had "no plans for now to participate" in the talks, although Iranian officials have not clarified the country's position yet. "Oil markets continue to gyrate in response to oscillating social media posts by the US and Iran, rather than the realities on the ground which remain challenging for oil flows to resume in a rapid fashion", analyst Saul Kavonic from financial services firm MST Marquee told the BBC. "This is all part of negotiations, physically playing out in real time on the Strait of Hormuz." Shanti Kelemen, co-chief investment officer at Investment Management, said there was "a bit of fatigue" in the market given the "chopping and changing" in the situation. "I think the market stopped believing the words, and will look more towards the actions," she told the BBC. The Strait of Hormuz remained closed on Sunday, a day after the Islamic Revolution Guard Corps (IRGC) said it was ending a temporary reopening over the US blockade, which it said violated the terms of their ceasefire agreement. Iran said it would stay closed until the US ended its naval blockade. Trump had said on Friday that the naval blockade would continue until a deal was agreed by the two countries. Stock markets were mixed on Monday. In

Europe, the FTSE 100 index of the biggest firms listed in the London fell 0.7%, while Germany's Dax and France's Cac 40 were both down more than 1%. However, Asian markets had risen earlier, with Japan's Nikkei index closing up 0.6% and South Korea's Kospi climbing 0.4%. Energy prices have seen volatile trading since the start of the Iran war. Brent crude, a benchmark for oil futures prices, was trading at around \$70 per barrel before the conflict. On 9 March it reached almost \$120. Futures contracts are an agreement to buy or sell assets at a set price on a specified date in the future. The Brent futures contract currently being quoted is for crude oil to be delivered in June. The conflict has triggered a global energy crisis with prices rising sharply, while some countries are facing fuel shortages. Asia has been hit particularly hard as the region relies on shipments that usually pass through the Strait of Hormuz for around 90% of its energy needs.

Mumbai: Indian equity benchmarks ended little changed after a topsy-turvy trade on Monday amid weak global cues over renewed tensions in the middle east. The NSE Nifty 50 and the BSE Sensex ended marginally higher at 24,364 and 78,520.30 respectively. Tensions between the US and Iran increased after attacks on commercial ships near the Strait of Hormuz. The US said its Navy fired on an Iranian container ship in the Gulf of Oman and later took custody of the vessel after it attempted to cross a naval blockade. The action followed an earlier tanker attack in the Strait of Hormuz, where ships were hit during the weekend. Meanwhile, Crude oil prices climbed on Monday. West Texas Intermediate futures rose nearly 7% to \$89.53 a barrel, while Brent crude gained 6.2% to \$96.05 a barrel. Elsewhere, US index futures traded lower, indicating a weak start for Wall Street. Dow Jones futures fell 358 points, or 0.72%. S&P 500 futures declined 0.58%, while Nasdaq-100 futures slipped 0.53%. Indian benchmark indices ended little changed



after a volatile session on Monday as weak global cues and renewed Middle East tensions kept sentiment cautious. The Nifty 50 closed marginally higher at 24,364, while the Sensex ended at 78,520.30. Markets tracked rising tensions between the US and Iran after attacks on commercial ships near the Strait of Hormuz. Crude prices climbed sharply, with WTI up nearly 7% and Brent gaining 6.2%. US futures also traded lower, pointing to a weak Wall Street start. The Nifty 50 ended lower by over 0.1% and closed below the 24,350 mark. Jio Financial and Hindalco were the top losers in the index, both falling more than 2.25%. Broader markets underperformed the benchmark. Nifty MidCap 150 ended down 0.3%, while Nifty SmallCap 250 fell over 0.5%. PI Industries, Godfrey Phillips, IEX and GMDC were among the key losers. Sectoral trends were mixed. Nifty Media and Nifty PSU Bank rose more than 0.5%, led by Zee Entertainment, Bank of Maharashtra and SBI. Mumbai: The shares of Bank of Maharashtra rose over 5% on Monday to hit nearly two-month high after it announced its fourth quarter results. However, it pared the gains to trade over 3% higher. The state-owned bank posted 34.9% rise in net profit to Rs 2,014 crore for the fourth quarter ended March 2026 with rising interest income. The Pune-based lender had posted a net profit of Rs 1,493 crore in the January-March period a year ago, Bank of Maharashtra said in a regulatory filing. The net interest income—the difference of interest earned and interest paid—for the quarter grew 18.9% to Rs 3,702 crore in the fourth quarter of as against Rs 3,116 crore in the same period of the last fiscal. Bank of Maharashtra's asset quality also improved during the quarter under review, with the gross non-per-



forming assets ratio at 1.45% of gross loans by the end of March 2026 from 1.6% in the previous quarter. In absolute terms, the gross NPA was at Rs 4,245.97 crore from Rs 4,387.79 crore in the previous quarter. The net NPA ratio fell 10 basis points to 0.1% from 0.2% in the preceding quarter. In absolute terms, the net NPA fell to Rs 383.74 crore from Rs 412.29 crore. As a result, the bank's provision and contingencies

declined to Rs 617 crore as against Rs 983 crore in the same period a year ago. At the same time, Net Interest Margin (NIM) of the bank advanced to 3.91% from 3.86%. The bank in addition said that it will raise capital up to Rs 7,500 crore through equity and debt. It will also raise Rs 10,000 crore through long-term Infra Bonds in fiscal 2027.

The bank also plans to raise \$500 million through Foreign Currency bonds in this financial year. Bank of Maharashtra Share Price Today The Bank of Maharashtra shares rose as much as 5.8% to Rs 76.95 apiece, this is the highest level since Feb. 27. However it ended 2.87% higher at Rs 74.82 per share. The shares rose 20.58% year-to-date and 54.59% in the last 12 months. All five analysts tracking the company maintain a 'buy' rating according to Bloomberg data. The average 12-month consensus price target stands at Rs 83.33 indicating an upside of 11.4%.

Tehran says 'no plans' for new talks after US seizes Iranian cargo ship

Tehran: Pakistan's federal interior minister Mohsin Naqvi has met Iran's ambassador Reza Amiri Moghadam to review preparations for the second phase of the Islamabad talks, the Ministry of Interior says. While Iran has not yet confirmed its participation in new talks, Naqvi says arrangements have been finalised, with "foolproof security" in place for visiting delegations. He also briefed the ambassador on his recent visit to Iran. The minister says a negotiated settlement between the US and Iran is essential for lasting regional stability. According to the ministry, Moghadam has welcomed Pakistan's "positive and constructive role" in efforts to ease tensions. Senior Islamabad officials, including the chief commissioner, inspector general of police, and deputy commissioner, attended the meeting. Iran is "certainly not optimistic" over its dealings with the United



States, but it is "realistic", the spokesman for the Iranian foreign ministry says. "To the extent that one could say there is a certain degree of pessimism... and this is entirely reasonable," Esmail Baghaei tells a press conference in Iran. "Being pessimistic about the enemy is the same as being wise." His remarks come as the US sends a delegation to Pakistan for fresh talks, but Iran is yet to con-

firm it is participating. Following the declaration of Lebanon's ten-day ceasefire with Israel, "huge numbers of people" returned to their homes in southern Lebanon over the weekend, UN Humanitarian Chief Tom Fletcher told the Today programme earlier. The latest pictures show people navigating the destruction caused by Israeli strikes. There are currently two ceasefires in place

in the Middle East - one agreed between the leaders of Lebanon and Israel, and another between the US and Iran. Iran and US This two-week ceasefire between Iran and the US is due to end on Wednesday. Iran's military headquarters accused the US of a "violation of the ceasefire" after the US Navy fired at and took control of an Iranian-flagged cargo ship in the Gulf of Oman. It is unclear whether

a second round of negotiations slated to take place in Pakistan today will go ahead. The US delegation is led by Vice President JD Vance, and an Iranian spokesperson says they have "no plans" to attend the negotiations. Lebanon and Israel This ceasefire, which came into effect on Friday, 16 April and will last ten days, was agreed by Lebanese President Joseph Aoun and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. The two countries requested that the US continues to facilitate further direct talks. According to details from the US State Department, Lebanon must take "meaningful steps" to prevent Hezbollah and all other "rogue non-state armed groups" from carrying out attacks against Israeli targets. Hezbollah has also signalled a willingness to participate but said it must include "no freedom of movement for Israeli forces". Lebanese President Joseph Aoun says upcoming negotiations with

Israel are "separate" from US-Iran peace talks, or "any other negotiations". In a statement on X, Aoun says Lebanon will be represented in upcoming talks by a delegation led by Simon Karam, the former Lebanese ambassador to the US, and that "no one from Lebanon will participate in this mission or replace him". He says the objectives of the talks are to "halt hostile actions", end Israel's "occupation of the southern areas" of Lebanon and to deploy Lebanon's army up to the "internationally recognized southern borders". US President Donald Trump has "expressed full understanding" of Lebanon's demands, says Aoun, and has assisted in setting up the upcoming negotiations. "I am full of hope that we will be able to save Lebanon," he adds. Despite the announcement of a ceasefire between the two countries, Israel's Benjamin Netanyahu has said Israeli troops would remain stationed 10km-deep (6.2 miles) into southern Lebanon.

Iranian woman arrested in US for allegedly trafficking arms to Sudan

Tehran: US authorities have arrested an Iranian woman for trafficking arms to Sudan on behalf of her country, federal prosecutors have said. Shamin Mafi, 44, was arrested at Los Angeles airport on Saturday and is accused of "brokering the sale of drones, bombs, bomb fuses, and millions of rounds of ammunition manufactured by Iran and sold to Sudan", First Assistant US Attorney Bill Essayli said on X. The alleged sales were to Sudan's defence ministry, including a 60m (\$70m; £52m) drone contract, court documents show. Mafi, who has not yet commented on the allegations, is expected

to appear in court later on Monday. If convicted, she could face a jail sentence of up to 20 years. An FBI criminal complaint filed in court, a copy of which was obtained by the BBC, says Mafi coordinated a "Sudanese delegation's travel to Iran, received over 6m in payments, and issued payment receipts" for the drone deal. She submitted "a letter of intent" to Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) to broker the sale of 55,000 bomb fuses to Sudan's defence ministry, it adds. According to Essayli, Mafi is "an Iranian national who became a lawful permanent resident of the United States in 2016".

Rebel Wilson's claims against actress are 'malicious concoctions', Australian court hears

Cranberra: Claims by Rebel Wilson that a young Australian actress was sexually harassed by a producer but then hid it to better her career are "malicious concoctions", a Sydney court has heard on the first day of a defamation case against the Hollywood star. In 2024 and 2025, Wilson posted on Instagram that Charlotte MacInnes - who stars in Wilson's film The Deb - had felt "uncomfortable" after sharing a bath with one of its female producers. The Pitch Perfect star claimed MacInnes had retracted a complaint - which MacInnes denies making - in exchange for a major theatre role and a record deal. MacInnes says the allegations have tarnished her reputation for integrity and honesty, and is seeking damages. Lawyers for MacInnes have said she made no complaint to Wilson about the bath incident but that Wilson later used it as "leverage" in a dispute with producers about the film's budget and contracts. On the first day of the case, the court saw a series of

private texts between Wilson, the producer Amanda Ghost and MacInnes as well as detailed emails about the bath and alleged sexual harassment. The incident happened on 5 September 2023 when MacInnes and Ghost went for a late afternoon swim at Bondi Beach. Ghost had an allergic reaction to the water, known as cold urticaria, breaking out in red welts and shaking uncontrollably, the court heard. The pair went back to Ghost's beachside apartment with MacInnes running a hot bath for Ghost, who had got into a shower to warm up. Both later got into the bath - described by MacInnes' legal team as "oversized" - with both wearing their swimsuits. They "were not even touching at all", Sue Chrysanthou SC told the court. Ghost's assistant made hot drinks for the pair and sat with them in the bathroom for a short while. The next day, Wilson spoke to MacInnes who told her she felt uncomfortable about the bath incident, according to Wilson, who then raised it with Ghost.

Rumen Radev's party wins Bulgarian election

Bulgaria: Rumen Radev's Progressive Bulgaria (PB) party has won a landslide victory in Sunday's Bulgarian election - the eighth general election in five years. With almost 100% of the vote counted, his PB movement, only set up 4 months ago, won 44.7% and has secured a majority of 135 seats in the 240-seat parliament. It is the first time since 1997 that a single Bulgarian party has sufficient seats to govern alone. Ex-prime minister Boiko Borisov's GERB party came second with 13.4%, with the liberal PP-DB coalition third with 12.8%. The election was called after the previous government tried to push through a controversial budget in December, prompting mass protests which Radev, as president, support-



ed. "People rejected the self-satisfaction and arrogance of old parties and did not fall prey to lies and manipulation. I thank them for their trust," Radev said, in his victory speech. He promised to build "a strong Bulgaria in a strong Europe". "What Europe needs right now is critical thinking, pragmatic actions and good results, especially to build a new security architecture and ... recover its industrial power and competitiveness."

Tehran will never cede control of Strait of Hormuz: Senior Iranian politician

Tehran: "Never." That's when a senior Iranian lawmaker says they'll be ready to give up their control of the Strait of Hormuz. "It's our inalienable right," Ebrahim Azizi, a former commander in Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC), tells the BBC in Tehran. "Iran will decide the right of passage, including permissions for vessels to pass through the Strait." And he says that's about to become enshrined in law. "We are introducing a bill in parliament, based on article 110 of the constitution, which includes the environment, maritime safety and national security - and the armed forces will implement the law," says this member of



parliament who heads the Committee for National Security and Foreign Policy. As worry mounts about the closure of this strategic waterway causing growing economic shocks worldwide, it's becoming clear this is not a short-term crisis to be resolved in a day. War has handed Tehran what it sees as a new weapon - Azizi described

this highly strategic strait Iran has managed to weaponise during this conflict as "one of our assets to face the enemy". He's a key player in a parliament dominated by hardliners. Azizi also reflects the thinking among some of the senior decision-makers emerging in the new order born of this war, which has become increasingly militarised and

also dominated by hardliners, most of all the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), after a series of high-level assassinations in Israeli strikes. Tehran now sees its ability to control the passage of vital maritime traffic, including critical oil and gas tankers, not just as a bargaining chip in current negotiations, but as long-term leverage. "The first priority for Iran after the war is to restore deterrence and the Strait of Hormuz is among Iran's principal strategic leverages," explains Mohammad Eslemi, a research fellow at the University of Tehran. "Tehran is open to discussing how other nations can benefit from Iran's new framework for the strait, but control is the bottom line."

Man kills seven of his children, and an eighth child, in Louisiana mass shooting

Texas: A father has killed seven of his children and another child in Shreveport, Louisiana, in a mass shooting that police called a "domestic disturbance". Officers said the shooting began about 05:00 (10:00 GMT) on Sunday. After attacking the children at a property, the suspect drove away in a stolen car, police said. Officers then chased and killed him. Two adult women, including the children's mother, are in critical condition after they, too, were hurt by gunfire. And a ninth child was taken to hospital after jumping from the roof of the home while escaping. The suspect was identified as Shamar Elkins, Shreveport

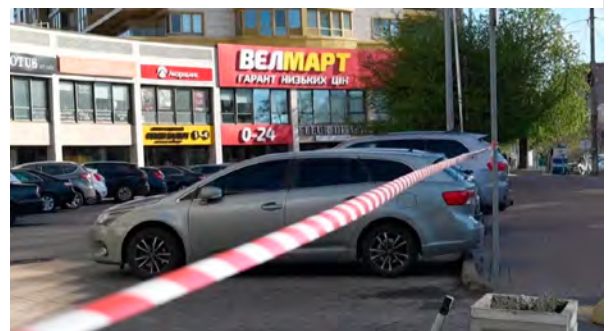


mayor's communications director told the BBC. "We do believe him to be the only individual that fired gunshots at these locations," said Shreveport Police Department spokesperson Chris Bordelon in a news conference earlier on Sunday. Officials have not yet suggest-

ed a motive on the gunman's part. The children, siblings and one cousin, were three boys and five girls. They were aged between three to 11, the Caddo Parish coroner's office said. Local police had earlier said on Sunday the children ranged in age from one to 14. The coroner's office said the

children were identified by their mothers as Jayla Elkins, 3, Shayla Elkins, 5, Kayla Pugh, 6, Layla Pugh, 7, Markaydon Pugh, 10, Sariah Snow, 11, Khedarrion Snow, 6, and Braylon Snow, 5. Neighbours described their shock to US media. Mack London, 71, told NBC News he had lived in the area for decades and that "nothing like this has ever happened on this street". The attack occurred across multiple locations. The father is alleged to have first shot a woman, before moving to a second location where he fired further shots at the children. One of the victims was able to run away to a nearby home and called the authorities, police said.

UKRAINE POLICE CHIEF RESIGNS AFTER OFFICERS ALLEGEDLY FLED DEADLY SHOOTING

Kyiv: The head of Ukraine's patrol police, Yevhen Zhukov, has resigned after two of his officers faced criticism for allegedly fleeing a deadly mass shooting in the capital, Kyiv. Six people died and 14 others were injured on Saturday after a man opened fire on people in the street in Kyiv's southern Holosiivskiy district before taking others hostage in a nearby supermarket. He was later killed in a shootout with police. Footage has since been shared online appearing to show officers leaving civilians and running away from the scene. Ukraine's Interior Minister Igor Klymenko said the officers in question had been suspended and that an investigation into their actions was under way. "Serve and protect" is not just a slogan. It must be supported by appropriate professional actions. Especially at critical moments, when people's lives depend on it," he wrote on Telegram. However, Klymenko cautioned: "It is not entirely correct to make generalisations about the entire police only by the actions of two employees." Zhukov told a news conference on Sunday that

the officers had "failed to assess the situation properly and left civilians in danger". He also said they acted "unprofessionally and unworthily". "As a combat officer, I have decided to submit my resignation from the position I currently hold," Zhukov said. The Ukrainian authorities say they are treating Saturday's shooting as a terrorist act but have not yet spoken about a motive. Klymenko described the man's mental state as "clearly unstable". Eight people remain in hospital, of whom one adult was in an "extremely serious condition" and three were in a serious condition, officials said. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky said in an update on Sunday that the two officers had been "at the scene of the crime, but did not stop the murderer, and fled on their own". He accused them of "inaction" and said a criminal case into the matter - which will also check their previous work - was being handled by Ukraine's national investigations bureau. "We are going through a war and every day, unfortunately, there are human losses from Russian strikes," Zelensky said.

JAPAN TSUNAMI WARNINGS DOWNGRADED AS PEOPLE DESCRIBE 'LOW RUMBLING' AS EARTHQUAKE HIT

Tokyo: A 7.7 magnitude earthquake occurred off Sanriku, off Japan's northeast coast, at 16:52 (08:52 BST) local time and had a depth of 19km (11.8 miles). Its strength was revised up, after previously being recorded at 7.5 and 7.4. The Japanese Meteorological Agency warns of aftershocks that could continue throughout the week. A tourist in Japan told the BBC he experienced the building "swaying and everyone's phone sounded the emergency alarm". Following the quake, tsunami warnings were triggered, covering much of the northeast. All the warnings have been downgraded to advisories, but people are still advised to remain away from the coast



and large bodies of water. The first tsunami waves reached the Iwate prefecture, with one as high as 40cm recorded in Miyako port. The Japan Meteorological Agency initially forecast tsunami waves

of up to 3m (10ft) reaching the Pacific coast of Hokkaido and Iwate prefectures - footage shows waves swelling in Hokkaido. As for public services, around 100 households are without power, according

to the cabinet secretary, and some bullet train services have resumed after earlier cancellations, the operator announced. The East Japan Railway Company says its bullet train operations

between Tokyo and Hachinohe have resumed. The services between the capital and Morioka Station and Fukushima have also started back up again. Operations remain suspended between Morioka and Akita. There is currently no time scheduled for these services to resume. There are delays remaining between Fukushima and Shinjo. The operator said it had to suspend services due to the earthquake. The Japanese Meteorological Agency (JMA) says that the possibility of a large earthquake following today's 7.7 one is "relatively high". It has issued a subsequent earthquake advisory off the coasts of Hokkaido and Sanriku, but says that in such

cases, the probability of the larger earthquake is only about one in 100. This represents a roughly tenfold increase in risk compared to normal conditions when it's usually 0.1% or less. Japanese authorities say it is essential that people remain vigilant for about a week, and are advised to make preparations to evacuate and confirm what routes they would take to do so should the need arise. The JMA says that it's not guaranteed a large quake will happen again, adding that there is no need for advance evacuation. 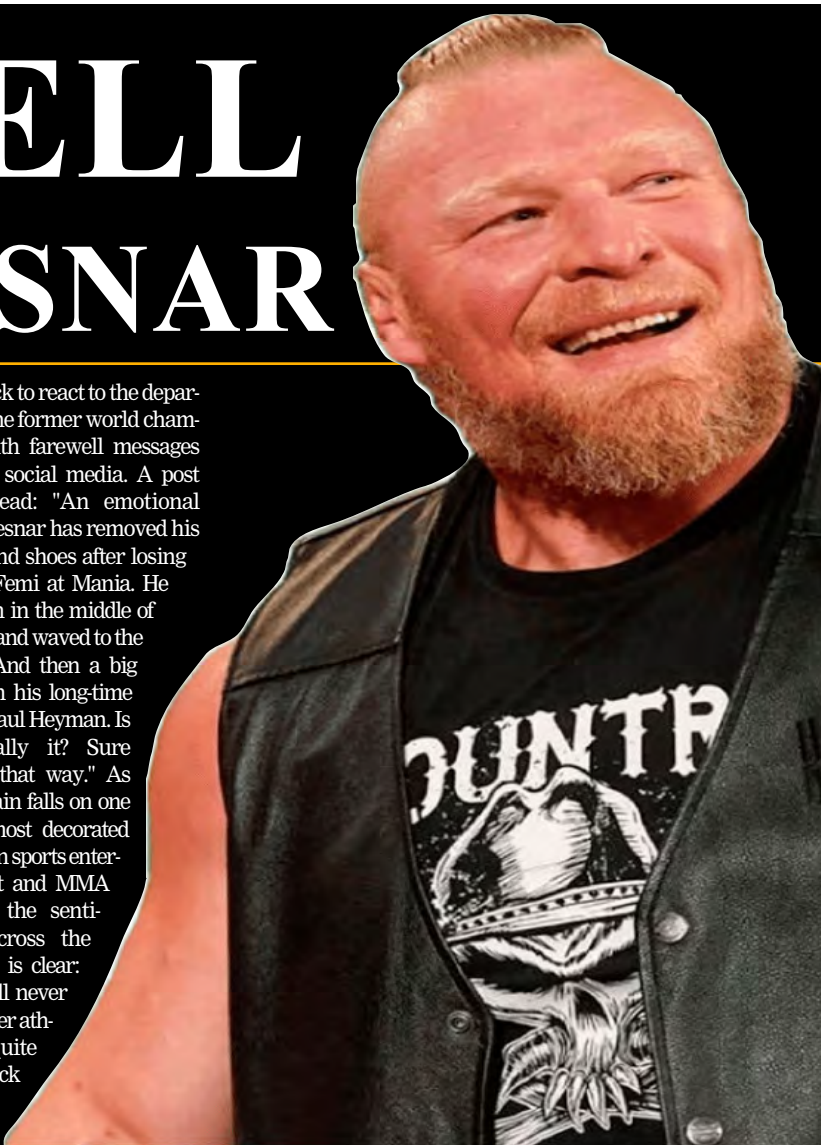
FAREWELL BROCK LESNAR

Brock Lesnar's battle with Oba Femi on the second night of WWE WrestleMania 42 turned out to be an emotional affair, a classic passing of the torch moment from the 'Beast Incarnate'. After what can only be described as an 'electric battle' between Lesnar and Oba Femi, the former removed his gloves and boots, signalling that his time in the ring had come to an end. The conclusion of the match transformed a high-octane encounter into a heavy, historic moment that marked the end for one of the company's biggest performers. Lesnar soaked in the applause as the crowd burst into deafening 'Thank you, Brock' and 'Thank you, Lesnar' chants. The entire chain of events fuelled immediate speculation about the wrestler's future, and the legendary Kurt Angle has confirmed what fans feared

was true. "Love you, my brother. There will only be one like you. Enjoy retirement, Brock," Kurt Angle wrote on X (formerly Twitter). In a sport where gestures often speak louder than words, Lesnar provided the ultimate signal of an end. The loss to the rising powerhouse, Oba Femi, saw Lesnar leaving his gear in the centre of the squared circle—a universal sign of retirement.

He signalled that the most dominant era in modern wrestling history has reached the end of the road. The moment became clearer when Brock's long-time associate and 'Wiseman', Paul Heyman, entered the ring. In a rare display of vulnerability for both men, they shared a heart-warming hug before making their way out of the ring together for what may be the final time. The wrestling world

was quick to react to the departure of the former world champion, with farewell messages flooding social media. A post on X read: "An emotional Brock Lesnar has removed his gloves and shoes after losing to Oba Femi at Mania. He put them in the middle of the ring and waved to the crowd. And then a big hug with his long-time friend, Paul Heyman. Is this really it? Sure seemed that way." As the curtain falls on one of the most decorated careers in sports entertainment and MMA history, the sentiment across the industry is clear: there will never be another athlete quite like Brock Lesnar.

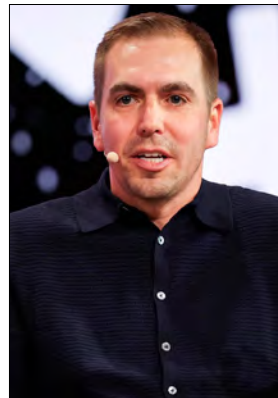

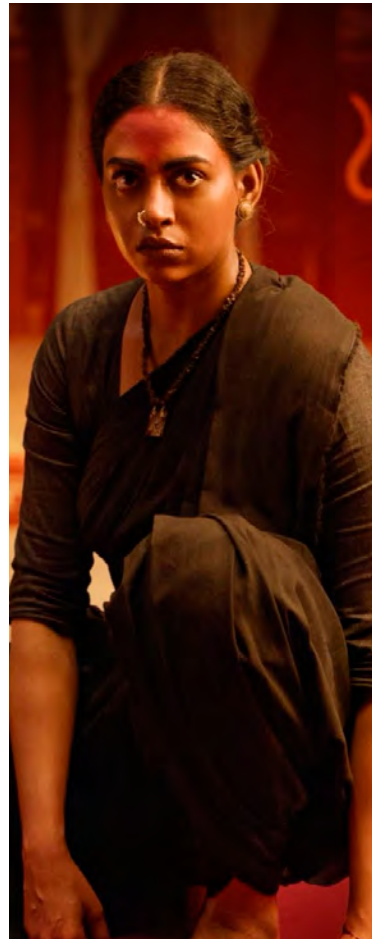
