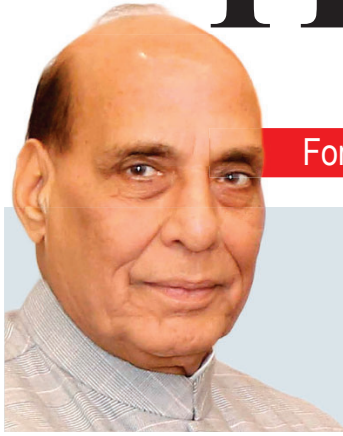

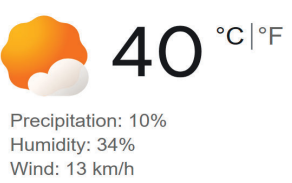

**HARKARA VENUGOPAL MEETS CONGRESS PRESIDENT KHARGE DISCUSSES SSA NANDED**

## India to become trusted electronics supply partner: Vaishnav



Visakhapatnam (TSIT)

India is poised to emerge as major trusted value chain and supply chain partner to the world in electronic manufacturing, driven by strong policy support and visionary leadership, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said on Tuesday. Vaishnav highlighted that India has already emerged as a leader in IT services and is now rapidly advancing in electronics manufacturing. He noted that India has made significant strides in mobile manufacturing, with mobile phones becoming one of the country's top export items. Nearly 50 per cent of domestic electronic demand is now being met through local production. Under the Semiconductor Mission, commercial

production has already begun in India.

The Minister emphasised that India is becoming a trusted partner in semiconductor and electronics production and called upon global technology companies, including Google, to manufacture their servers, GPUs and chips within the country.

Addressing the gathering after the ground-breaking ceremony of Google Cloud India AI Hub in Visakhapatnam in the presence of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, senior officials and industry leaders, Vaishnav lauded the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, emphasising the need for the country to emerge as a global hub in key technology sectors such as Semiconductors, Quantum, Space, and Artificial intelligence.

The project, with an estimated investment of \$15 billion, is being developed in partnership with Adani ConneX and Airtel Nxtra, and will include a 1 GW hyperscale AI data centre in Visakhapatnam. The state government has allocated around 600 acres of land in Turluvada, Rambilli and Adavivaram areas for the project. Describing the project as transformative, the Minister said that Visakhapatnam will evolve into AI Patnam (AI City), driven by cutting-edge infrastructure and global investments. He also thanked Google for laying three subsea cables from Visakhapatnam, connecting global digital routes via Australia, the Middle East, Europe, Africa and the United States.

## Trump not satisfied with Iran's new peace proposal

Washington (TSIT)

US President Donald Trump is not satisfied with Iran's latest peace proposal, which seeks to reopen the Strait of Hormuz and end the US naval blockade of Iran's ports, while leaving its nuclear program for later negotiations, US media reported, citing several White House officials. The president discussed Iran's proposal with his top national security officials at a meeting in the White House Situation Room on Monday afternoon, said the reports.



One of the people attending the meeting said Trump was not likely to accept the proposal, which was delivered to the United States over the last few days, reports Xinhua news agency, quoting CNN. A US official told The New York Times that accepting the proposal could appear to deny Trump a victory since the president has repeatedly insisted that Iran cannot have nuclear weapons. In an interview with Fox News on Monday, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said Iran's new proposal "is better than what we thought they were going to submit," but stressed any deal must bar Tehran from developing a nuclear weapon.



## PM Modi inaugurates 6 cricket academies in Northeast

New Delhi (TSIT)

The Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday inaugurated six modern indoor cricket academies across North-East India. This initiative aims to improve the game's infrastructure and harness the region's sporting potential.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) developed these facilities, which were unveiled virtually during a state event in Gangtok. The academies are located in Rangpo (Sikkim), Doimukh (Arunachal Pradesh), Imphal (Manipur), Madankurkhang (Meghalaya), Aizawl (Mizoram), and Dimapur (Nagaland). They create a high-performance cricket network throughout the North-East.

The inauguration ceremony included Jay Shah and BCCI office-bearers, while regional



administrators joined online. Shah conceived the project during his time as BCCI Secretary, and the foundation stone was laid in May 2024. These academies are designed as high-performance centres.

They include indoor practice pitches, high-tech gyms, temperature-controlled swimming pools, as well as dedicated training and administrative spaces. The facilities allow for year-round training and reduce the need for players to travel outside the region, particularly during the lengthy monsoon season.

## IMD issues yellow alert, thunderstorms & heatwave to hit multiple districts

**Kerala (TSIT)** Light to moderate rain across Kerala on Tuesday brought relief from intense summer heat, but the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has warned that thunderstorms, strong winds, and high temperatures will continue to affect several parts of the state.

In its latest Kerala weather update, the IMD said thunderstorms with moderate rainfall and gusty winds reaching up to 50 kmph are likely in isolated areas of Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, Ernakulam, and Thrissur districts. These areas have been placed under an orange alert for the next few hours. A yellow alert has been issued for Alappuzha, Kottayam, Idukki, Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Kannur, and Kasaragod districts, where light rainfall accompanied by winds of up to 40 kmph is expected. Residents have been advised to remain cautious due to the possibility of lightning and sudden weather changes. According to the



IMD's five-day Kerala rain forecast, all 14 districts are likely to receive light to moderate rainfall in the coming days, with isolated heavy rainfall in select regions. Kannur and Kasaragod are expected to see heavier showers on April 30, followed by Pathanamthitta, Idukki, and Wayanad on May 1. On May 2, Alappuzha, Kottayam, and Ernakulam districts may receive moderate to heavy rainfall. Despite the rain activity, a heatwave-like situation continues across parts of Kerala. The IMD has issued a yellow alert for high temperatures, with Palakkad likely to record maximum

temperatures of up to 40°C.

Kollam and Kozhikode may see temperatures around 38°C, while several districts including Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Thrissur, Malappuram, Kannur, and Kasaragod are expected to experience highs near 37°C. Thiruvananthapuram is likely to record around 36°C. Meteorologists noted that temperatures remain 3-4°C above normal, and combined with high humidity, this is expected to result in hot and uncomfortable conditions, especially in non-hilly areas.

## India urges restoration of safe maritime passage via Hormuz, condemns attacks on shipping at UN

New York, April 28 : At a UN Security Council open debate, India on Monday called for the immediate restoration of safe and unimpeded maritime passage through the Strait of Hormuz, warning that recent attacks on commercial shipping in the vital waterway threaten global peace, energy security, and economic stability. Delivering India's statement at the UN Security Council's high-level open debate on "The Safety and Protection of Waterways in the Maritime Domain" under the agenda of maintaining international peace and security, Indian representative Yojna Patel underscored that safeguarding critical maritime routes is vital for global trade and stability.

Calling for renewed international cooperation to protect waterways, Ambassador Yojna Patel said such incidents are "unacceptable" and have already resulted in the loss of Indian seafarers' lives, underscoring the human cost of rising maritime insecurity.

Yojna Patel stressed that critical sea lanes like the Strait of Hormuz carry a substantial share of global energy supplies and trade, and any disruption has far-reaching consequences for international stability.

"Any threat to critical waterways has far-reaching implications for international peace and security, given that the bulk of global energy supplies and trade flows through these routes," Patel said. She emphasised that freedom of navigation and



lawful commerce through vital chokepoints like the Strait of Hormuz must be fully respected in accordance with international law, urging the immediate restoration of safe and unimpeded maritime passage. India has reaffirmed its commitment to a free, open and rules-based maritime order, strongly backing adherence to international law, particularly the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), as the cornerstone for ensuring freedom of navigation and secure global trade.

India reiterated that maritime security remains central to global economic prosperity and stability. As one of the world's largest suppliers of seafarers, accounting for nearly 13 percent of the global workforce, India expressed deep concern over the safety and welfare of seafarers.

"Any disruption or obstruction of

vital waterways directly impacts global trade, energy flows and humanitarian supply chains," Patel said, adding that ensuring secure and open seas is essential for long-term global peace and inclusive growth. Highlighting India's proactive role, the envoy recalled that New Delhi had convened the first-ever UN Security Council open debate on maritime security in August 2021, laying the groundwork for a more coordinated global approach to maritime challenges.

India outlined key priorities to address the current crisis, including ensuring navigational safety, maintaining supply chains, especially humanitarian ones, enhancing maritime situational awareness, and strengthening communication mechanisms for seafarers.

As part of its response, India's Directorate General of Shipping has operationalised a 24/7 helpline for seafarers of all nationalities, which has already handled thousands of distress calls and communications.

Further, India called on member states to increase coordination with the Information Fusion Centre - Indian Ocean Region (IFC-IOR), a New Delhi-based hub that facilitates real-time maritime information sharing. With liaison officers from 36 countries and links to international frameworks such as the Djibouti Code of Conduct, the centre plays a critical role in ensuring maritime domain awareness and supporting safe navigation.

## CV ANAND APPOINTED NEW DGP OF TELANGANA

Hyderabad TSIT BUREAU:

The Government of Telangana has appointed senior IPS officer C.V. Anand as the Director General of Police (Head of Police Force), marking a key leadership change in the State police administration. A 1991-batch IPS officer, Anand has been transferred from his position as Special Chief Secretary to Government, Home Department, and will assume charge as the State's top police official.

The appointment was formalised through a Government Order issued by the General Administration (Special B) Department, following due process of empanelment conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) in accordance with established



guidelines. C.V. Anand will hold the post in the apex scale, drawing a fixed pay of Rs.2,25,000.

The orders were issued in the name of the Governor of Telangana and authenticated by Chief Secretary K. Ramakrishna Rao.

## Shivakumar set to become CM by May 15: K'taka Congress MLA

As the leadership tussle in Karnataka has come to the forefront following the conclusion of voting in Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and Assam,



Congress MLA Iqbal Hussain on Tuesday said in Ramanagara that Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar would "surely" become the Chief Minister by May 15. Notably, Shivakumar

celebrates his 64th birthday on that day.

Speaking to reporters, Hussain, a staunch supporter of Shivakumar, said that he had earlier made statements on two occasions about

Shivakumar becoming the Chief Minister and had given two or three dates. He now announced a final date, May 15, and stated that Shivakumar would become the Chief Minister on that day.

## US-Iran confrontation becoming more and more akin to Cold War

Washington/Tehran, Apr 28 : The confrontation between the US and Iran is turning increasingly into a prolonged, uneasy standoff - one defined less by open war-fare, and more by economic pressure, naval manoeuvres, and intermittent diplomatic signals, likening itself closely to a Cold War. Furthermore, there is growing concern that the situation could evolve into a "no war, no deal" situation, with the on-ground scenario indicating that US forces may be



forced to remain in bulk in the region for the foreseeable future, while the Strait of Hormuz would continue to stay largely restricted, and the naval blockade would continue as both sides wait for the

other to blink, reports Axios. For President Donald Trump, the stakes are not just strategic but political, as his ratings are hitting all time lows, all the while midterm elections are looming, a

drawn-out crisis risks keeping the price rise at all-time highs, with no resolution in sight. Inside the administration, there is no single line. Advisors describe a president weighing two paths - escalate with further military action, or double down on economic pressure in the hope it forces Iran back to the table on US terms. Secretary of State Marco Rubio has publicly backed the latter, arguing that sanctions and the blockade are already biting and could be intensified further.

## Special buses for May Day weekend, Chitra Pournami fest in Tiruvannamalai

CHENNAI: The managing director of State Express Transport Corporation on Tuesday announced that special bus services will be operated across Tamil Nadu for the expected surge in passenger traffic during the continuous holiday period from April 30 to May 2, covering Thursday, May Day on Friday, and the weekend.

The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporations have planned to operate additional special buses alongside regular services.

From Kilbakkam, 475 special buses will be operated on April 30 to destinations including Tiruchy, Kumbakonam, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Nagercoil, K a n n i y a k u m a r i, Thoothukudi, Coimbatore, Salem, Erode and Tirupur. On May 1 and 2, around 315 buses will be operated each day on these routes.

From Koyambedu, 85 buses will be operated on April 30 to Tiruvannamalai,



N a g a p a t t i n a m, Velankanni, Hosur and Bengaluru. On May 1 and May 2, around 75 buses will be operated each day.

From Madhavaram, 14 buses will be operated daily between April 30 and May 2. In addition, 200 special buses will be operated from cities such as Bengaluru, Tirupur, Erode and Coimbatore to various destinations. To facilitate return travel after the holidays, 615 special buses will be operated on May 3 from various parts of the State to

Chennai and Bengaluru, based on demand.

For the Chitra Pournami festival at Tiruvannamalai, special buses will be operated from 9.50 pm on April 30 to 11.07 pm on May 1 for devotees travelling from Chennai and other parts of the State. From Kilbakkam, 548 buses will be operated on April 30 (Thursday), 565 on May 1 (Friday), and 35 on May 2. From Madhavaram, 186 buses will be operated on April 30 and 174 on May 1. From Adyar, 55 buses will

be operated on April 30 and 50 on May 1. Additional services will also be operated from Koyambedu.

In total, 11,823 special buses will be operated from Chennai and other places to Tiruvannamalai during the period, in addition to regular services.

The State Express Transport Corporation will operate 40 AC sleeper and seater buses from Kilbakkam to Tiruvannamalai on May 1. Services will also be operated from Madurai, Salem, Coimbatore, Tirunelveli, Nagercoil, Tenkasi, Thoothukudi and Bengaluru. Passengers undertaking long-distance travel have been advised to book tickets in advance through the official website or mobile application to avoid last-minute congestion. Officials have been deployed at all bus terminals to monitor operations and ensure smooth travel arrangements.

## No shortage of fuel, LPG in Tamil Nadu, say oil companies



CHENNAI (TSIT): Oil marketing companies have said that there was no shortage of petrol, diesel or LPG across Tamil Nadu and Puducherry, urging the public not to resort to panic buying.

In a statement, VC Asokan, state level co-ordinator for the oil industry, said that fuel stocks were adequate at retail outlets of Indian Oil Corporation, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited.

## Provide birds water: Environ activists on awareness campaign

TIRUCHY: In an initiative to provide water to birds as the temperature is soaring high, the environmental activists created awareness among the people and distributed clay basins to every household in Tiruchy on Tuesday.

According to the environmental activist KC Neelamegam, several bird species are extinct due to environmental problems and currently, the temperature has been increasing day by day. The animals and birds are struggling for water, and it is time that the people should keep water in front of their houses, which would help the animals and birds during this hot summer. He also said, due to the high temperature, minor ponds



and lakes which support as a water resource for the birds and animals have been depleting.

"In order to maintain the food chain naturally, it is necessary to protect birds, and so we need to keep water for them during this summer,"

Neelamegam said.

On Tuesday, a group of environmental activists led by Neelamegam distributed clay basins to households at the Ponnalaipatti residential area in Tiruchy.

He appealed to people to keep water in the clay

basins, which would help the birds to quench their thirst and control their body temperature. Neelamegam appealed to the people to keep water on their terraces or outside the windows, which would be visible to the birds.

## Desilt C, D canals to ensure water reach tail-end regions, appeal ryots

TIRUCHY: Delta farmers who claimed that the officials concentrate only on the A and B canals for desilting and appealed to the officials to ensure proper desilting works in the C and D channels too, as the summer cultivation has commenced in full swing across the Delta region.

The Delta farmers said that a fund of Rs 200 crore has been sanctioned for the desilt works

across the region for the current year, and the water resources department has commenced the works. However, they concentrate only on the A and B canals and neglect the C and D canals, which are mostly branch canals of the A and B.

They said that the government has already released a Government Order to ensure the desilting works in the C and D canals, which would

help water reach the villages, particularly in the tail-end areas in the region.

The officials cite the reason for the delay in commencement of desilt works in the C and D canals as the fact that the Model Code of Conduct in place, and they need to obtain special permission, as the fact which was possible only after the MCC was lifted. But we have already commenced the

summer crop cultivation as the samba procurement is almost over," said Swamimalai Sundara Vimalnathan, Secretary, Tamil Nadu Cauvery Farmers Protection Association. Vimalnathan said that the Election Commission has already relaxed certain election norms, and the desilting works are a basic need for the farmers, which would ensure water for irrigation.

## EDUCATIONISTS STRESS THAT INSTEAD OF BANNING SMARTPHONES, SCHOOLS SHOULD GUIDE STUDENTS ON PROPER USAGE

A debate about the use of technology in schools — and, in particular, students' use of smartphones — has been raging in the education system for years. The approaches range from the purists, who see them as the source of all evil in education and reject their use outright, to those who have fallen under their spell and see them as the be all and end all in providing all-embracing education around the clock. Then there is the third, most commonsensical group, which would like to mobilize the benefits and reduce the harmful byproducts that come with the overuse of digital technology, especially in an unregulated manner. Tilting toward the view of the first school of thought, England's Department for Education last month issued a new "mobile phones in schools guidance," which encourages headteachers to prohibit the use of mobile phones throughout the school day, including at break times. This is, in my view, a draconian decision that relinquishes the responsibility of the education system to guide and educate children from a very young age in the best practices for using their mobile phone, from both the pedagogical and social behavioral aspects, instead of banishing them.

It is not only England that bans smartphones in schools, but other countries including France, Finland, the Netherlands and even China, which is the world's largest mobile phone manufacturer. In Italy, for instance, teachers collect students' smartphones at the beginning of the day to ensure that those itchy fingers deprived of screen time do not cave into temptation. Completely separating activities inside school from those outside it creates an unnatural separation. Few would dispute that technology, and not only smartphones, has changed the dynamic in the classroom, such as how learners acquire their knowledge, the relationship between teachers and students and the seemingly inexorable shortening of attention spans.

As with all other technologies, there are disadvantages to smartphones that can affect children's development and make it more difficult for them



to become lifelong learners. Their social skills can also be hindered, especially when there is more interaction with technology than with humans, and there are also genuine concerns about the ugly phenomenon of cyberbullying. However, to ban smartphones outright is to apply the wrong remedy to a genuine problem. The answer is to educate young people in how to use their phones effectively and with due consideration for others, because we do not expect smartphones to disappear from everyday life anytime soon. For many years, education systems have either avoided social issues or barred them at the school gates, instead of developing programs that help young people from an early age to deal with these issues in a thoughtful and constructive way. This could be about politics, personal relationships, controversial social issues or more generally about growing up into a responsible adult who can make informed judgments without falling into the black hole of excess. Last year, UNESCO called for a global ban on smartphones in classrooms, even though its own director-general, Audrey Azoulay, admitted that the potential of the digital revolution is immeasurable and the challenge is to regulate its use — and she is right on both accounts.

Do not get me wrong, in all my years of teaching, I have not found that the introduction of technology was the answer to improving the quality of education. At best, it is a partial one. Moreover, there is nothing more irritating in the modern classroom than students obvi-

ously using their smartphones and looking at apps or websites, including social media, unrelated to the topic being discussed in class. With time, I have become able to tell when this was the case according to students' facial expressions and body language. Hence, it would be foolish to argue that smartphones and other online devices are not a distraction. The answer is to educate young people in how to use their phones effectively and with due consideration for others. Yet there are ways to change the balance between the genuine concerns about their use in class and the opportunities to enhance students' school experience by making them active and proactive learners while using technology. The days of what, in education theory, was known as "chalk and talk" or "mug and jug" learning, which saw the teacher as the jug standing in front of the class pouring knowledge into students (the mugs), have long gone. This idea of a one-way flow of knowledge and information from the teacher to the students is no longer relevant, especially in a world where learners are exposed to infinite sources of information, some of great value and others baseless and potentially harmful.

It makes the task of the educator complex and more challenging, but a major feature of the digital revolution is its ability to help students of all ages, and according to their developmental level, to harness this vast world of information in the palm of their hands in the best possible way and ensure they take ownership of this process.

Completely separating activities inside school from those outside it creates an unnatural separation and distorts the relationship between home and school, teachers and parents and the school and the wider society. The downside of young learners with their eyes constantly focused on their phones is indisputable. Attention spans shorten, they are easily distracted by notification pings and there is a real danger of them becoming accustomed to abridged explanations and argumentations. In my experience, this does not make them less critical thinkers but more disorganized in their critical thinking, as they find it difficult to separate the wheat from the chaff — and there is plenty of chaff in cyberspace — which is where good educational programs should come to the rescue. Understandably, cyberbullying is also a key concern and should not be tolerated, but for that there are guidelines and policies, as with real-world bullying, and those who are caught engaging in such behavior should be disciplined and, in certain cases, prosecuted. As always, hard cases make a bad law and, in this case, banning smartphones altogether from the school day is a hard case. More research is needed to establish the short- and long-term impacts of using smartphones in education.

No educator would like to raise a generation that does not interact in person with their peers and teachers and, hence, becomes devoid of social skills and is increasingly solitary, instead of active and interactive members of their societies. But smartphones are here to stay and, instead of students waiting all day to see what they "missed" in their cyberspace life, it would become an educational moment if they were to have limited time with their smartphones and be guided in how to use them without becoming addicted to them or indulging in antisocial behavior. Banning smartphones completely from school is just another case of the education system failing to fulfill its duty to deal with knotty issues in society instead of helping young people to develop into mature, constructive and considerate adults and citizens.

## Opting for animal vs plant protein may affect sleep quality differently



Good quality sleep is essential for staying physically and mentally healthy. An adult should aim to get 7-8 hours of quality sleep a night for maximum benefit, but many people struggle to achieve this. Studies investigating the effect of diet on sleep quality have not drawn firm conclusions, but suggest that a healthy diet, such as the Mediterranean diet, could improve sleep in some people. Now, a study has found that plant proteins may improve sleep quality, while animal proteins can have the opposite effect.

People need to sleep to stay healthy, and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends Trusted Source that adults get a minimum of 7 hours of quality sleep a night. During sleep Trusted Source, a person's blood pressure and heart rate fall, their metabolism changes, their hormones are balanced, they breathe less often and less deeply, and their learning and memory is enhanced. Inadequate, or poor quality sleep increases the risk Trusted Source of chronic diseases, obesity, an impaired immune system and problems with memory and thinking.

To improve sleep quality doctors advise: going to bed and waking up at the same time every day, including weekends developing a relaxing bedtime routine ensuring the bedroom is dark, quiet, not too warm, and the bed is comfortable to stop using electronic devices 2 hours before bedtime avoiding caffeine, nicotine, and alcohol exercising regularly managing stress, using relaxation techniques if necessary. Several studies Trusted Source have investigated whether diet may affect sleep quality, but have found little conclusive evidence. Now, researchers in Ireland and the United States have examined whether protein affects sleep quality. They found that while overall protein intake had no effect, protein from plant sources may improve the quality of a person's sleep, while protein from animal sources can impair sleep quality. The study appears in

The European Journal of Clinical Nutrition Trusted Source. Kelsey Costa, M.S., R.D.N., a registered dietitian nutritionist and founder of Dietitian Insights, not involved in this study, explained to Medical News Today: "The lack of association between total protein intake and sleep quality, juxtaposed with the weak association observed for plant protein intake, underscores a nuanced understanding of how different types of proteins might influence sleep." Looking at the link between sleep and protein sources researchers collected data from three different cohorts of U.S. health professionals: the Nurses' Health Study (NHS) and NHS2 — both in women — and the Health Professionals Follow-up Study (HPFS), which only included men. They analyzed data from 83,338 women and 14,796 men from the three cohorts.

They assessed dietary intake using a validated food-frequency questionnaire that included more than 130 different food items. Participants had to report their consumption of each food from "never or less than once per month" to "more than six times per day", based on standard U.S. food portion sizes. The researchers then calculated intake of different types of protein — total, animal, dairy and plant — as percentages of total energy consumption. In all three cohorts, participants completed the Pittsburgh Sleep Quality Index, or a similar survey that assessed sleep time/duration, sleep latency (the amount of time taken to fall asleep), sleep efficiency Trusted Source (the ratio of total sleep time to total time in bed), sleep disturbance, subjective sleep quality, sleep medication use, and daytime dysfunction due to sleep problems. They completed this just once during the study period.

Plant protein may improve sleep quality. Total protein intake had no effect on sleep quality in any of the three cohorts. However, when the researchers looked at the different categories of protein, they found some small differences.

## SET UP EAST-WEST FREIGHT CORRIDOR: CM NAIDU

Chandrababu Naidu emphasized that robust railway connectivity is essential to transform the state into a major logistics hub. He urged the Railway Ministry to introduce dedicated container reefer trains to transport agricultural, horticultural, and aqua products efficiently without compromising quality. The Chief Minister, along with Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, visited the temporary office of the South Coastal Railway Zone in Visakhapatnam. A high-level review meeting was held with senior officials

of South Central, East Coast, and South Coastal Railway zones to assess the progress of railway projects and operational plans of the new zone. Officials made detailed presentations on ongoing and proposed works. Naidu requested the issuance of a Gazette notification to operationalize the South Coastal Railway Zone from June 1, 2026. Responding positively, the Union Minister assured that the notification would be issued soon. To strengthen the efficiency of the new zone, the Chief Minister proposed the merger of key railway sections such as Araku-Kothavalasa and Kurnool-Dhone. He noted that low rail route density in the state is hindering

industrial growth and logistics expansion. He also stressed the need to develop new railway lines in the Rayalaseema region and enhance connectivity to major and upcoming ports such as Mulapeta, Machilipatnam, and Ramayapatnam. Linking these ports with hinterland regions across states like Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and Karnataka would significantly boost cargo movement, he said. The Chief Minister further highlighted the importance of developing cold chain infrastructure and dedicated freight corridors to support agri and aqua exports. Establishing an East-West Rail Freight Corridor

would reduce transit time and logistics costs, thereby improving competitiveness. **FOCUS ON PORT CONNECTIVITY:** Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw stated that enhancing rail connectivity to ports in Andhra Pradesh would be given top priority. He briefed the Chief Minister on ongoing railway projects, proposed new lines, doubling works, and electrification initiatives in the state. Senior railway officials, State Transport Department Special Chief Secretary M.T. Krishnababu, Minister Dola Bala Veeranjanya Swamy, MP Bharat, and several MLAs attended the review meeting.

# Comprehensive plan for Indira Mahila Dairy



Khammam (TSIT): District Collector TS Divakar has directed officials to implement a comprehensive plan to ensure the success of the Indira Mahila Dairy project in the district. He reviewed the programme on Tuesday at the Collectorate along with Additional Collector P. Srija and officials from various departments. The Collector suggested adopting the Vijay Dairy model and following a systematic approach in implementing the project. He also proposed involving representatives of Vijay Dairy in the governing structure to enhance efficiency and provide better support to women self-help groups. At present, Vijay Dairy collects around 6,000 litres of milk per day in the district. The Collector said the target is to distribute cattle to about 40,000 beneficiaries in phases under the Indira Mahila Dairy and increase milk procurement to 80,000 litres per day. He instructed that cattle procurement should be done with the consent of beneficiaries and issues related to guidelines must be resolved promptly. Officials were also asked to utilise MGNREGS funds for construction of cattle sheds and organise training programmes, including guidance under the Indira Mahila Dairy. Divakar emphasised the need to ensure timely release of subsidies by coordinating with the Lead District Manager (LDM) and to facilitate opening of bank accounts for beneficiaries. He also stressed reducing dependence on milk sourced from other states by strengthening local production and procurement systems. Additional Collector Dr P. Srija briefed the Collector on implementation modalities of the project. Officials from DRDO, Tribal Welfare, BC, SC and Minority Welfare departments, along with MPDOs and others, attended the meeting.

*Why One Of World's Wealthiest Countries Is Being Offered A 'Bailout' By Trump*

In 2024, the United States extended a \$20 billion swap arrangement to Argentina during a turbulent period in that country. The move helped stabilise the Argentine currency, the peso, prevented a sharp devaluation and restored confidence in financial markets. The principle is to provide temporary access to dollars, calm the system and withdraw support once stability returns. It is not at all a tool designed for reassurance or rescue. Wealthy Gulf nations, including the United Arab Emirates (UAE), are asking Washington for a similar swap arrangement amid the war in West Asia. Not in aid, but in access to US dollars. It would have been unthinkable that oil-rich Gulf states, which have carefully built a reputation as investment magnets, would seek US financial assistance - not in the form of loans, but by requesting billions of dollars in exchange for dirhams until the impact of the Iran war subsides. US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent has revealed, what was being quietly discussed behind the scenes, that "many" American allies in the Gulf and Asia want what are known as currency swap lines. It is not hard to understand why these rich countries need America's help. But, in times of crises, even wealthy nations can find themselves knocking on America's door.

The OPEC Bombshell

The UAE on Tuesday dropped a bombshell, announcing it will walk out of OPEC and OPEC+ on May 1. The move comes against the backdrop of the Iran war, which has disrupted flows through the Strait of Hormuz and shaken global energy markets and amid its ongoing talks with the US over currency swap lines. It clearly means national survival now outweighs continuing to be part of the oil cartel. With energy prices already quite high, Abu Dhabi wants maximum flexibility to pump more if routes reopen, reroute flows, or deploy supply in line with its own security and economic interests rather than collective quotas. Its engagement with Washington on currency swaps points to a deeper shift, aligning more closely with the US financial and security umbrella as regional risks intensify. In effect, the UAE is hedging on two fronts: breaking free from OPEC+ constraints in oil while securing dollar liquidity in finance. It means that in a war-torn market, agility and alliances matter more than bloc loyalty. Saudi Arabia will be watching with unease.

For now, let's focus on the dollar question. The war on Iran is no longer a story of missiles and military strategy. It is slowly turning into a story about the global scramble for US dollars. The conflict has, as we know already, disrupted one of the most critical arteries of the global economy: the Strait of Hormuz. This narrow stretch of water carries over 20% share of the world's oil and gas traffic.

Gulf's Concerns Are America's Too

For Gulf economies, this is not a distant concern. It is existential. Their financial systems are deeply tied to oil income, and their oil exports are priced in US dollars. The system that took shape in the 1970s has made US treasuries and the dollar the most attractive destinations for countries to park their surplus capital. When that income is choked, everything else begins to strain: government spending, banking liquidity, and currency stability, etc. The UAE seems to be telling Washington: our dollar reserves are being depleted fast (by as much as \$120 billion and counting), and the pressure is building because we are unable to export in US dollars at pre-war levels. If this continues, we will be left with little choice but to shift trade into the Chinese Yuan, a currency the US is actively trying to contain. The UAE has also reportedly told the US that it was the who started the war, a conflict that the UAE did not want. In response, Washington is signalling willingness, but stopping short of commitment, keeping the door open, while making it clear that access to dollar lifelines is a privilege, not a right.

So, this is not just the Gulf's problem. It is very much America's as well. If the US wants to preserve the dominance of the dollar, it has a clear interest in stepping in to support its Gulf allies. And this is what the Trump administration has been mulling.

What Is A Currency Swap Line?

A currency swap line is essentially an agreement between two central banks, mostly involving the US, that allows one country to access US dollars in exchange for its own currency. It is like a financial safety valve. If a country such as the UAE needs dollars urgently, its central bank can temporarily swap the dirham with the US Federal Reserve and receive dollars in return. Later, the transaction is reversed at a pre-agreed rate. No permanent transfer. No aid. You can say it is just liquidity on demand. But that liquidity can make all the difference, because, in a crisis, the problem is often not wealth, it is access. A country may have assets, reserves and long-term strength, but if it cannot quickly obtain dollars to meet immediate needs, panic can spread.

Swap lines prevent that panic.

Why Dollars Matter So Much

To understand the urgency of the Gulf's requests, we must grasp a simple truth: in the age we live in, the US dollar is the backbone of the global economy. As mentioned earlier, oil is priced in dollars. International trade is settled in dollars. Governments hold reserves in dollars. Financial markets run on dollars. The dollar is not just a currency. It is the system itself. For Gulf countries, this dependence is even deeper. Their currencies, including the UAE's dirham, are often pegged to the dollar. That means their stability depends directly on maintaining enough dollar reserves. If those reserves begin to dwindle, the consequences can be severe. A currency peg can break. Inflation can rise. Confidence can collapse.

This is why Scott Bessent framed swap lines not as a favour, but as a stabilising tool: a way to "maintain order in dollar funding markets" and prevent chaotic sell-offs of US assets. Imagine this: if countries cannot get dollars easily, they may start selling their prime assets, US bonds, in a rush. That could cause an earthquake in the world's largest economy.

One country, one curriculum: Crisis of federalism or education revolution?

"History is not for those who stop. One country, one curriculum... The opposition to loot in the name of education must continue." This sentence aptly captures the biggest debate currently underway in the Indian education system. The idea of "one country, one curriculum" proposed under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has become a subject of heated debate across the country. As of April 2026, states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal are opposing it, considering it an attack on their constitutional autonomy, while the central government is calling it a historic step towards establishing quality, equality, and uniformity in education. This begs the question: is this initiative truly a revolution in education reform, or an attempt to pressure the federal structure? The National Education Policy 2020 outlined a comprehensive overhaul of the Indian education system. Replacing the 34-year-old 1986 policy, it introduced a new structure—5+3+3+4—that makes education from elementary to secondary levels more flexible and inclusive. It defines basic education for children ages 3 to 8, primary for ages 8 to 11, upper primary for ages 11 to 14, and secondary education for ages 14 to 18. It prioritizes education in the mother tongue, multilingualism, vocational training, and digital literacy. The fundamental foundation of "One Nation, One



Curriculum" is the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), which aims to establish a minimum educational standard across the country. However, it provides up to 30 percent flexibility to allow states to make modifications to suit their cultural and regional needs. However, opposing states believe this flexibility is merely symbolic and is an attempt to impose a centralized curriculum. According to the Constitution, education is a subject on the Concurrent List, meaning both the central and state governments have a role in it. States allege that the central government is exerting pressure by withholding funds under various schemes, such as the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan. Tamil Nadu is a prime example, where thousands of crores of rupees have been withheld. The state government has protested this, calling it an attack on its policy independence. A major aspect of this controversy

concerns linguistic and cultural identity. Many states in South India view Hindi as an "imposed language," while the central government maintains that the three-language formula does not mandate any one language. Nevertheless, there are concerns that a uniform curriculum will lead to the neglect of regional languages and literature. For example, the rich cultural heritage of Tamil Nadu or the literary contributions of Bengal may be limited by a standardized curriculum. The central government argues that this policy will reduce inequalities in education. Currently, India's education system exhibits significant disparities—while private schools offer high-quality education, government schools suffer from poor results due to a lack of resources. The "One Nation, One Curriculum" initiative aims to ensure uniform quality, ensuring equal opportunities for every child in the country.

Additionally, the policy emphasizes skill-based education. Subjects like coding, artificial intelligence, and data science are proposed to be integrated from the elementary level, keeping in mind future needs. This initiative is considered crucial to India's global competitiveness. However, critics also call it "loot in the name of education." They say it will increase the privatization of education and boost the coaching industry. Cities like Kota already have a large coaching market, and a uniform examination system (like CUET) could further strengthen it. Meanwhile, the central government believes that a unified entrance exam will increase transparency and reduce corruption. Historically, education reforms in India have always been associated with controversy. From Macaulay's education policy during the British era to the Kothari Commission, every change has

sparked debate. But it is also true that progress is impossible without reform. International examples also make it clear that both uniformity and decentralization have their advantages and disadvantages. Countries like Finland have achieved excellent results by adopting a uniform education system, while countries like the United States have perpetuated inequality due to a decentralized system. India must adopt a balanced model that suits its diversity and population. At the political level, this issue is no longer limited to education. It has become a question of power balance between the central government and the states. While some states are adopting it and moving forward, others are challenging it to protect their rights. Looking ahead, India faces significant challenges. A robust and modern education system is essential to compete in the digital age. If the conflict between the state and the central government continues, students will be the biggest losers. Dialogue, cooperation, and balance are essential for improving education. Ultimately, it's important to understand that "one nation, one curriculum" is not just a policy, but a vision—an effort to provide a common educational foundation for the entire country. However, its implementation must be democratic and consensus-based. In a diverse country like India, any education model can only succeed if it balances local needs and national goals. The central government must increase dialogue with the states and understand their concerns, while the states must also adopt an open approach to change. If we look at this issue beyond politics, it becomes clear that the purpose of education is not merely to impart knowledge, but to create capable and informed citizens. And this goal will only be achieved if we move forward together.

Sabarimala-Linked Case Before Top Court Bench Impacts Other Religions Too

When the doors of Sabarimala were opened for all women, a question rang across the corridors of the Supreme Court and the country: Will the courts open gates of all religious institutions to women? There are many mosques that restrict the entry of women, also temples where women are not allowed in the sanctum sanctorum while men can. The ideal answer to this question would be yes, open the gates of all religious institutions to all individuals belonging to the faith or denomination, to men and women equally. The Centre, however, has argued before the nine-judge Supreme Court Bench that this shall be antithesis to plurality within faiths and denominations and disproportionate judicial interference in religious institutions. A court should not interfere in any religious practices, the Centre has argued. The moment a country realises something is a religious practice, it must not adjudicate upon the correctness or the essentiality of the practice. The denial of entry to women of child-bearing age in Sabarimala temple is part of 'diversity' within religion, the Centre maintained, citing instances of temples where men are not allowed. But the matter before the nine judges is bigger than Sabarimala. Two crucial petitions have been tagged with this matter. The first pertains to the Dawoodi Bohra community and the other is about the rights of Parsi women. The case of Parsi women was an appeal against the Gujarat High Court order where it was held that a Parsi woman loses her religious identity when she marries outside the community. The Dawoodi Bohra matter was a Public Interest Litigation before the Supreme Court. In both cases, the communi-



ties claimed immunity from judicial review citing denominational autonomy. The challenge to Muslim practices like polygamy and Nikah Halala is not before the bench directly but the judgment will have ramifications for all pending petitions where rights to equality and dignity of women are infringed upon by community or customary practices. The Case Of Dawoodi Bohra Women Female Genital Mutilation, as defined by the World Health Organisation, comprises procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia, or other injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons. It is usually performed on girls between the age of three years and 15 years and occasionally on adult women. "The practice has no health benefits for women and can result in severe bleeding. Other problems surface later, including trouble urinating, cysts, menstrual difficulties, infections, complications during childbirth and increased risk of newborn deaths. According to available data from 31 countries where FGM is practiced - including western, eastern, and north-eastern regions of Africa, and some countries in the Middle East

and Asia - more than 230 million girls and women alive today have been subjected to the practice. More than 4 million girls are estimated to be at risk of FGM annually and the matter is of global concern. In India, it is mostly practiced within the Dawoodi Bohra Community. The Bohras are a small, close-knit, prosperous sect of Shia Ismaili Muslims based primarily in Gujarat. The community has a diaspora population in many countries, including the US, Canada, Australia and in countries of Europe and Africa. The Bohra population has been estimated to be about 1.5 million total worldwide. There are several sects within it - Dawoodi, Suleimani and Alvi, with the Dawoodi Bohras being the largest group. The community has submitted before the Supreme Court that their practice is of female circumcision or Khafd, and should not be termed mutilation since it comprises only a nick and not removal of any part of the genitalia. The Indian Medical guidelines do not permit this procedure, which has added risks - being conducted in unhygienic conditions by quacks or unauthorised personnel. Various resolutions of the United Nations term FGM as

violative of right to life, dignity and health. The Case Of Parsi Women Within the Parsi community, a clear asymmetry has long existed. A Parsi man who marries outside the faith does not lose his right to enter the fire temple or to participate in the funeral rites of his parents at a Parsi crematorium. The position of women, however, has been markedly different. The case of Goolrukh Gupta brings this disparity into focus. It raises a fundamental question: does a Parsi woman forfeit her religious identity upon marrying under the Special Marriage Act? Traditionally, Parsi women who marry non-Parsis have faced the prospect of excommunication, effectively losing their religious identity and being denied access to fire temples (Agiaries) and Parsi burial grounds. These practices stem from conservative interpretations of Zoroastrian doctrine, which tend to impose stricter consequences on women than on men, who typically retain their religious identity despite marrying outside the community. In 2012, the Gujarat High Court held that a Parsi woman's religious identity ceases upon such a marriage. This ruling has since been challenged before the Supreme Court.

# UNITED ARAB EMIRATES TO QUIT OIL CARTEL OPEC

**UAE:** The United Arab Emirates (UAE) is quitting the Opec and Opec+ groups of major oil producing nations next month after nearly 60 years of membership. The UAE said its decision would help it meet growing global energy demand in the long term after recent investments to boost its production capacity. It is seen as a blow to the cartel, with one analyst describing the exit as "the beginning of the end of Opec". The Gulf state's energy minister said being a country with no obligation under the groups would give it more flexibility. Opec was formed in 1960 by five countries - Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and Venezuela - to defend the interests of major oil exporters by coordinating production to ensure steady revenue for its members. The number of countries in the cartel has fluctuated over the years, but in addition to the five founding members it also includes Algeria, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Libya, Nigeria and the Republic of the Congo. The UAE joined in 1967, and its departure will leave the cartel with 11 mem-



bers. There are an additional 10 non-Opec members in the wider Opec+ alliance. The UAE's departure represents a win for US President Donald Trump, who has previously attacked Opec for "ripping off the rest of the world". In January he asked Saudi Arabia and other Opec nations to "bring down the cost of oil" and doubled-down on his threat to use tariffs. And Saul Kavonic, head of energy research at MST Financial, said it was "the beginning of the end" for the alliance. "With the UAE leaving, Opec loses about 15% of its capacity and one of its

most compliant members." The UAE's decision came as the World Bank warned the war in the Middle East has caused the biggest loss of oil supply on record. Energy prices will rise by about a quarter on average as a result this year, it said, while it could take six months for shipping through the key Strait of Hormuz to return to pre-war levels. "The poorest people, who spend the highest share of their income on food and fuels, will be hit the hardest," said the World Bank's chief economist Indermit Gill. The UAE's decision to leave Opec will

not have an immediate impact on global energy supply, due to the ongoing closure of the Strait of Hormuz, but could lead to a longer-term boost in output. The country has invested heavily in boosting its production capacity and has wanted for a long time to pump more oil, economists said. David Oxley, chief climate and commodities economist at Capital Economics, said its departure could lead to lower oil prices but higher volatility on the market in the coming decades. He added that while the UAE is small, the implications could

be major if other member states leave, or countries such as Russia and Saudi Arabia decide to ramp up production as a result. Dr Carole Nakhle, chief executive of Crystol Energy and secretary general of the Arab Energy Club, told the BBC the UAE's decision "has been a long time in the making". "Abu Dhabi has pursued ambitious production capacity growth, yet often felt constrained by group quotas, especially amid uneven compliance by some members," she said. Nakhle added that Iran's actions as an Opec member were likely to have reinforced the UAE's decision. According to the latest figures from Opec, the UAE produced 2.9 million barrels of oil a day in 2024. Saudi Arabia, Opec's de facto leader, produced nine million barrels of oil. "Saudi Arabia will struggle to keep the rest of Opec together, and effectively have to do most of the heavy lifting regarding internal compliance and market management on its own," Kavonic said, adding other Opec members could follow suit. "This presents a fundamental geopolitical reshaping of the Middle East and oil markets," he added.

# UAE says it will leave OPEC effective May 1

**Dubai:** The United Arab Emirates announced Tuesday that it will leave the oil cartel OPEC and its wider OPEC+ group effective May 1, a move rumoured for some time as the Emirates chafed under production restrictions and had increasingly frosty relations with neighbouring Saudi Arabia.

the announcement via its state-run WAM news agency. "This decision reflects the UAE's long-term strategic and economic vision and evolving energy profile, including accelerated investment in domestic energy production, and reinforces its commitment to a responsible, reliable, and forward-looking role in global energy markets," the UAE said. "Following its exit, the UAE will continue to act responsibly, bringing additional production to market in a gradual and measured manner, aligned with demand and market conditions," the country added. Saudi Arabia has long been considered a heavyweight of OPEC, an oil cartel based in Vienna that has seen some of its market power wane as the United States increased its production of crude oil in recent years. Saudi Arabia and the UAE have increasingly competed over economic issues and regional politics, particularly in the Red Sea area. The two countries had joined together in a coalition to fight against Yemen's Iran-backed Houthi rebels in 2015. However, that coalition broke down into recriminations in late December, when Saudi Arabia bombed what it described as a weapons shipment bound for Yemeni separatists backed by the UAE. Saudi broadcasters, long based in Dubai, the economic hub of the UAE, have pulled back to the kingdom in recent months as tensions rose.

# Elections winding down, oil at USD 120: Is India going to increase fuel prices?

**Hyderabad:** The government has said it clearly and more than once that there is no plan to raise petrol or diesel prices. But with Assembly elections in West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Assam, Kerala and Puducherry drawing to a close and global crude hovering near USD 120 a barrel, that assurance is doing little to the growing speculation. Sujata Sharma, Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, sought to calm nerves at an inter-ministerial briefing last week. "LPG, petroleum and diesel are available in sufficient amount and the prices have not increased, so please do not panic," she said, adding that the government had taken steps to ensure supply continuity despite disruptions caused by the West Asia crisis. **Numbers tell a different story** The reassurance, however, is contrary to what oil companies are actually absorbing. With India's crude basket trading at around USD



110 per barrel, under-recoveries for oil marketing companies (OMC) - the gap between what they pay and what they can charge - are estimated at Rs 18 to Rs 20 per litre for petrol and diesel, even after the Rs 10 per litre excise duty cut the government announced in March earlier. Emkay Global Financial Services, in a recent note, said the situation was unsustainable over the medium term and expected an initial retail price hike of Rs 10 per litre. The brokerage said that even this would not fully cover OMC losses, and that a steeper increase would risk inflation. **Kotak**

Institutional Equities estimated in a report cited by CNBCTV18 that petrol and diesel prices could rise by Rs 25 to Rs 28 per litre, with OMCs collectively absorbing an additional burden of Rs 27,000 crore every month at the current price. **Election factor** Analysts note that the timing of any revision is as much political as it is economic. Polling concludes on April 29, with vote counting scheduled for May 4, which has become the reference point about when prices might increase. Fuel prices in India have historically remained static during

major election cycles, and the current freeze is widely seen through that lens. The Ministry of Petroleum has dismissed this, saying claims of a post-poll hike are misleading and aimed at creating unnecessary anxiety. It pointed out that India is among the few countries that has not revised fuel prices in four years despite sustained global volatility. What the global picture looks like Underpinning all of this is the disruption to supplies through the Strait of Hormuz, through which roughly a fifth of the world's crude oil passes. The prolonged closure has sent crude surging, with prices now sitting close to USD 120 per barrel. At this level, domestic retail prices, frozen since 2022, will increasingly be difficult to sustain. Petrol prices in major cities currently range close to Rs 100 per litre. A hike of Rs 25 to Rs 28 would push them past Rs 120, which is an unprecedented level, with cascading effects on transport, logistics and household budgets.

# Indian airlines warn of shutdown risk amid soaring ATF costs, seek urgent govt relief

**Mumbai:** Air India, IndiGo and SpiceJet have told the government that the country's airline industry is under extreme stress and on the verge of "stopping operations", as they sought revision in ATF pricing and financial support. The West Asia turmoil has pushed up oil prices, and airspace restrictions have increased airlines' operating costs, especially on long-haul routes. Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) accounts for around 40 per cent of a carrier's operational expenses. Against this backdrop, the Federation of Indian Airlines (FIA) has written to the civil aviation ministry, seeking steps to extend the same fuel pricing mechanism uniformly across both domestic and international operations as was done in the past with the establishment of the crack band. With an unprecedented rise in jet fuel prices and exorbitant crack/differential between crude and ATF, the federation said the operation of



airlines is being challenged in totality. "... any ad hoc pricing (domestic vs international) and/or irrational increase in the price of ATF will result in unsurmountable losses for airlines and will lead to grounding of aircraft, resulting in cancellation of flights," the federation, which represents Air India, IndiGo and SpiceJet, said. "In order to survive, sustain and continue operation, we request your urgent intervention for immediate and meaningful financial support to tide over the current situation," it said in a letter on

April 26. Also, the airlines have sought temporary deferment of excise duty on ATF, which is at 11 per cent. "With the abnormal increase in ATF prices from the pre-crisis period, adding rupee depreciation to the increased prices, the 11 per cent excise duty also increases manifold for the airlines and adds to the ATF price as a big impact on airlines," they said. Last month, the government limited the hike in ATF price to Rs 15 per litre for domestic operations, but for international operations, the price rose by Rs 73 per litre.

# ELON MUSK, SAM ALTMAN MOVE COURT IN HIGH-STAKES SHOWDOWN OVER AI

**Oakland:** Technology tycoons Elon Musk and Sam Altman are poised to face off in a high-stakes trial revolving around the alleged betrayal, deceit and unbridled ambition that blurred the bickering billionaires' oneshared vision for the development of artificial intelligence. The trial, which began on Monday, April 27, with jury selection, centres on the 2015 birth of ChatGPT maker OpenAI as a non-profit startup primarily funded by Musk before evolving into a capitalistic venture now valued at USD 82 billion. The trial's outcome could sway the balance of power in AI, a breakthrough technology that is increasingly being feared as a potential job killer and an existential threat to humanity's survival. Those perceived risks are among the reasons that Musk, the world's richest person, cites for filing an August 2024 lawsuit that will now be decided by a jury and US District Judge Yvonne Gonzalez Rogers in Oakland, California. The civil lawsuit accuses Altman, OpenAI's CEO, and his top lieutenant, Greg Brockman, of double-crossing Musk by straying from the San Francisco company's founding mission to be an altruistic steward of a revolutionary technology. The lawsuit alleges they shifted



into a moneymaking mode behind his back. OpenAI has brushed off Musk's allegations as an unfounded case of sour grapes that's aimed at undercutting its rapid growth and bolstering Musk's own xAI, which he launched in 2023 as a competitor. Trial promises clashing testimony from two tech titans Musk, who invested about USD 38 million in OpenAI from December 2015 through May 2017, initially was seeking more than USD 100 billion in damages. But any damages now are likely to be much smaller after a series of pre-trial rulings that went against Musk. Musk has since abandoned a bid for damages for himself and

instead is seeking an unspecified amount of money to be paid to fund the altruistic efforts of OpenAI's charitable arm. The money would be paid primarily by OpenAI's for-profit operations and Microsoft, which became the company's biggest investor after Musk cut off his funding. Musk's lawsuit also seeks Altman's ouster from OpenAI's board. Musk's decision to stop funding the company contributed to a bitter falling out between the former allies. Musk says he was responding to deceptive conduct that OpenAI's board picked up on when it fired Altman as CEO in 2023, before he got his job back days later. But the

trial also carries risks for Musk, who last month was held liable by another jury for defrauding investors during his USD 44 billion takeover of Twitter in 2022. Any damaging details about Musk and his business tactics could be particularly hurtful now because his rocket ship maker, SpaceX, plans to go public this summer in an initial public offering that could make him the world's first trillionaire. However, it turns out, the trial is expected to provide riveting theatre, with contrasting testimony from two of technology's most influential and polarising figures in the 54-year-old Musk and the 41-year-old Altman. "Part of this is about whether a jury believes the people who will testify and whether they are credible," Gonzalez Rogers said during a court hearing earlier this year while explaining why she believes the case merited a trial. The judge will make the final decision on the case, with the jury serving in an advisory role. Evidence has included glimpses of the AI race's early days Musk, whose estimated fortune stands at about USD 780 billion, has long been hailed as a visionary for his roles creating digital payment pioneer PayPal, electric automaker Tesla and rocket ship maker SpaceX.

# Suspect charged with attempted assassination of Trump at Washington dinner

A California man has been charged with attempting to assassinate US President Donald Trump after trying to storm a gala event with weapons on Saturday night. Cole Tomas Allen, 31, was also charged with two firearms offences when he appeared in court in Washington DC on Monday. He did not enter a plea. He was carrying a semi-automatic handgun, a pump-action shotgun and three knives as he charged past a security checkpoint at the White House Correspondents' Association dinner on Saturday, say prosecutors. The incident has sparked a White House security review. A Secret Service agent was shot but not seriously wounded during the attack at a hotel. The accused faces life in prison if found guilty. Dressed in a blue jumpsuit with a nametag, the suspect appeared calm at Monday's court appearance in the nation's capital. He



was softly spoken as he answered almost every question from the judge with either "yes, your honour" or "no, your honour". He stated his age and said he had a master's degree. Three US marshals stood behind him, and one was at his side, while the federal prosecutor handling the case, US Attorney for Washington Jeanine

Pirro, looked on. During Saturday night's incident, Trump, Vice-President JD Vance, cabinet members and other White House officials were rushed from the Washington Hilton hotel ballroom after gunfire rang out. The suspect allegedly rushed through a security checkpoint one floor above the basement venue. "One Secret

Service officer was shot in the chest, but was wearing a ballistic vest that worked," Acting Attorney General Todd Blanche told a news conference on Monday. "This heroic officer who was hit fired five times at Allen, who was not shot but fell to the ground and was promptly arrested." It is not clear whether the Secret Service

agent was shot by the suspect, or was caught in cross-fire from other law enforcement. The agent has been released from the hospital. Attempting to assassinate the president carries a potential life sentence. The other charges - transportation of a firearm between states to commit a felony and discharging a firearm in a crime of violence - both have maximum sentences of 10 years. The suspect is due to appear in court again on Thursday. The court heard that the accused crossed multiple state lines in order to try to kill Trump. The suspect left his home in the city of Torrance in the Los Angeles area on 21 April, travelling by train to Chicago, said officials. On 24 April, he left Chicago, and arrived in Washington where he checked into the Hilton on the eve of the gala. The suspect studied at the prestigious California Institute of Technology, and worshipped

at the Pasadena United Reformed Church in the Los Angeles area. Federal campaign finance records show he donated \$25 to a Democratic Party political action committee in support of Kamala Harris for president in 2024. According to an affidavit, the accused sent an email to his family shortly before the attack that said, "Administration officials... are targets, prioritized from highest-ranking to lowest". "I would still go through most everyone here to get to the targets if it were absolutely necessary," he allegedly added. He was remanded in custody and prosecutors said more charges could be filed. The accused has not been cooperating with investigators, law enforcement sources told the BBC's US partner CBS. As US investigators look into the third alleged assassination attempt against Trump, security officials are reviewing the president's protection protocols.

## MAN ADMITS PLOTTING ATTACK ON TAYLOR SWIFT CONCERT IN VIENNA



A 21-year-old Austrian man has admitted plotting a jihadist attack on a Taylor Swift concert in Vienna in August 2024. The man, named only as Beran A, also admitted to being part of a terrorist organisation, although he denied other charges including involvement in planning an attack in the Islamic holy city of Mecca in Saudi Arabia. The state prosecutor told the court in Wiener Neustadt near Vienna that police had found an almost completed bomb during a search of the man's house. Beran A was arrested after a tip-off from the CIA just before Swift's opening concert in Vienna

in 2024. As a result, all three sold-out gigs by the US superstar singer at Vienna's Ernst Happel Stadium were cancelled. More than 195,000 people in total had been expected to attend. Thousands of disappointed fans roamed the streets of the city, singing and exchanging Taylor Swift-themed friendship bracelets. Beran A was brought into the courtroom, wearing a blue shirt and handcuffs, to face charges of terrorism and other offences. He went on trial with another 21-year-old man, named as Arda K, who is accused of being part of an Islamic State cell with him.

## Rescuers race to free survivors trapped inside train after fatal Indonesia crash



Rescuers are racing to try and free people trapped inside a train involved in a fatal collision outside the Indonesian capital Jakarta on Monday. At least 15 people were killed and dozens injured in the accident which took place when a stationary passenger train was hit from behind by a long-distance commuter train running on the same track. Local media ran footage of passengers on medical trolleys near Bekasi Timur Station, with other images showing rescuers trying to free people from the train wreckage. There are still victims who are alive "but they're pinned by train material", Mohammad Syafil, who leads Indonesia's search and rescue agency, told reporters early on Tuesday. "There are some victims who are alive to this minute and we're hoping to extricate them," he said. "We need to involve personnel with certain skills to perform a measured extrication." Bobby Rasyidin, the president director of state-owned railway operator KAI, said on Tuesday that 84 people are being treated for their injuries in nearby hospitals. The accident

involved one taxi and three commuter trains. It started at about 20:00 on Monday, when one of the commuter trains hit the taxi, which was lying across the middle of the rail crossing. A second train was forced to stop at the station because of this collision. Nearly an hour later, the third train, a long-distance commuter train, then crashed into a women-only carriage on the second train, while pulling into the station. Some people screamed "hysterically" as the trains collided, one passenger told the BBC's Indonesia service. Other eyewitnesses said they saw "many victims" injured in the crash. Jakarta Police Chief Insp Gen Asep Edi Suheri said six or seven people remained trapped inside the carriages. Medical expenses for the injured and funeral expenses for the deceased will be fully covered by KAI and insurance, authorities say, adding that the Bekasi Timur Station will be closed to commuters for the rest of Tuesday. Indonesia's public transport network in general has a high accident rate, due in part to ageing infrastructure and poor maintenance.

## JAPAN AIRLINES TRIALS HUMANOID ROBOTS AS GROUND HANDLERS



Japan Airlines (JAL) will start using humanoid robots in ground handling tasks at Tokyo's Haneda airport from May, in a two-year trial it said is aimed at easing employees' workload. For a start, the Chinese-made robots will be deployed to load and unload cargo containers, JAL and GMO AI & Robotics, its partner in the project, said in a demon-

stration to the media on Monday. Japan's aviation industry is wrestling with a labour crunch brought on by an increase in inbound tourism and a declining working-age population, said JAL, which employs some 4,000 ground handling staff. The carrier hopes that these robots can also be used to clean cabins and operate ground support equipment in future.

## US political violence generates a familiar cycle - this time it's in overdrive

For many in the ballroom at the White House Correspondents' Association dinner on Saturday night, the scene was painfully familiar. Shots fired, confusion and panic, and a sense that the normal order of things had been violently interrupted. Erika Kirk, whose husband, the conservative activist Charlie Kirk, was shot and killed last September, was in tears. Congressman Steve Scalise, majority leader in the House of Representatives who suffered life-threatening injuries in a shooting at a baseball practice with Republican teammates in 2017, was escorted out by security. So was Health Secretary Robert F Kennedy Jr, who lost his father and uncle to assassin's bullets. Many journalists in attendance had been at the



2024 rally in Butler, Pennsylvania, where an assailant opened fire on Donald Trump, grazing his ear, before being killed by a Secret Service sniper. In modern America, it seems, political violence has become an ever-present storm, that can strike anywhere, at any moment. Saturday night was the third time that Trump has been directly targeted - after

the Butler attack and another attempt in 2024 at his Palm Beach golf resort. In a separate incident, the Secret Service killed an armed man trying to enter Trump's Mar-a-Lago club, although the president was not in Florida at the time. These incidents have become frequent enough that there is almost a routine to them. Trump, reflective, calls for unity and a cooling of political

rhetoric. News coverage speculates about a "new tone" from the president. Ultimately, partisan divisions reassert themselves - often with Trump leading the way. That cycle is in overdrive this week. On Saturday night, Trump called for unity. "His many detractors should grant that his comments late Saturday at a White House press briefing hit the right notes of gratitude and comity," a Wall Street Journal editorial observed. On Sunday evening, in a sit-down with CBS' 60 Minutes programme, Trump blamed Democrats for creating an atmosphere that encouraged the shooting, then derided interviewer Norah O'Donnell as "a disgrace" and "horrible" after she asked about the manifesto written by the alleged assailant.

## Russian superyacht sails through Strait of Hormuz despite blockade

A superyacht linked to one of Russian President Vladimir Putin's key allies has sailed through the Strait of Hormuz, despite the ongoing blockade of the critical shipping channel. The 142m-long (465 ft) multi-deck luxury boat, named Nord, is linked to sanctioned Russian billionaire Alexei Mordashov. It travelled from Dubai to Muscat, Oman, over the weekend - one of few private vessels to transit through the strait in recent months. Iran held high-level talks with Russia this week as its stand-off with the US over the strait's re-opening continues. Approximately one-fifth of global crude oil and liquefied natural gas (LNG) supplies



normally pass through the waterway. Mordashov, who has close ties to Putin, is not listed as the formal owner of the Russian-flagged boat. However, Nord's records indicate it was registered to a firm owned by his wife in 2022. Nord, estimated to be worth more than \$500m (£370m), left

Dubai on Friday night and arrived at Al Mouj - a marina in Oman's capital - on Sunday morning, according to data on the Marine Traffic platform. The route shown on the tracker has been used by vessels crossing with agreement from Iran. It is not clear whether Nord gained permis-

sion from Iran to sail through the route. Mordashov made his fortune largely through his steel and mining company Severstal - the largest such firm in Russia. With an estimated net worth of about \$37bn (£27bn), he is the richest Russian national listed by the US business magazine Forbes. Iran has severely restricted shipping through the Strait of Hormuz in response to US and Israeli strikes that began on 28 February. Earlier this month, Tehran warned that any vessel that approaches the strait would be targeted. The US then announced that its forces would intercept or turn back vessels travelling to or from Iran's ports.

## Jimmy Kimmel rejects White House criticism over Melania widow joke



Late-night host Jimmy Kimmel has defended a joke in which he called Melania Trump an "expectant widow" just days before a shooting incident at the White House Correspondents' Dinner. The first lady described a Kimmel sketch which aired last Thursday as "hateful and violent", and the White House urged his network, ABC, to fire the comedian. Three days later, a gunman opened fire at the White House Correspondents' dinner in Washington DC, which Donald Trump attended with Melania. Authorities have said the gunman's attack may have targeted members of the Trump administration. Kimmel said the original joke was a "light roast" about the 23-year age difference between the president and his wife. "I agree that hateful and violent rhetoric is something we should reject, I think a great place to start to dial that back is having a conversation with your husband about it." On Monday, Melania wrote in a post on X that "people like Kimmel shouldn't have the oppor-

tunity to enter our homes each evening to spread hate". "His monologue about my family isn't comedy - his words are corrosive and deepens the political sickness within America... How many times will ABC's leadership enable Kimmel's atrocious behavior at the expense of our community?" President Trump also said he appreciated that so many people were "incensed by Kimmel's" remarks, claiming they were a "call to violence", in a post on Truth Social on Monday afternoon. "[T]his is something far beyond the pale. Jimmy Kimmel should be immediately fired by Disney and ABC," he added. The BBC has contacted ABC for comment. Kimmel was taken off air last September after he made comments about the shooting of conservative influencer Charlie Kirk. In a monologue, Kimmel said the "Maga gang" - a reference to Trump's followers - was trying to "score political points" from the murder of Kirk. His show was reinstated a week later.

## Third Ukrainian strike hits Russian oil refinery and prompts evacuations

A major Russian oil refinery on the Black Sea has been hit for the third time this month by Ukrainian drones, causing a "massive fire" and forcing the evacuation of people living nearby, local officials have said. Earlier strikes in the past two weeks at the Tuapse refinery caused a big oil spill in the sea and residents reported "black" rain falling on the city and leaving an oily residue everywhere. Ukraine's military confirmed the latest drone strike, saying such refineries helped fund Russia's full-scale invasion launched in 2022. More than 160 firefighters were deployed to extinguish the blaze, Krasnodar regional governor Veniamin Kondratyev said on Tuesday. No casualties were reported. In a post on

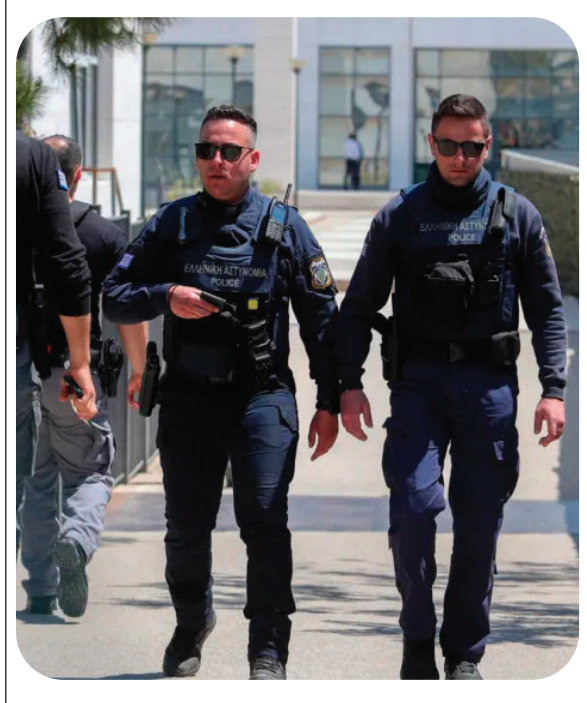


Telegram on Tuesday morning, Kondratyev said firefighters and other rescuers were working in "extremely difficult conditions", and he described their efforts as "true heroism". "Our top priority is preserving the lives and health of city residents and visitors," he added. The head of the local municipal district, Sergei Boyko, asked residents of nearby streets to

leave and reports said a temporary evacuation centre had been set up in a local school. Meanwhile, the regional crisis centre warned that "due to the severe fire, combustion products are being released into the atmosphere". Residents were urged to wear masks and rinse their nose, eyes and throat, as well as keep windows closed and

limit time outdoors. Anastasia Troyanova, a local correspondent for environmental news outlet Kedr, described "a huge cloud of black smoke over the town; it smells of burning". In Moscow, Russian President Vladimir Putin ordered the country's emergency minister to fly to Tuapse urgently to oversee firefighting and cleanup efforts. Putin's spokesman Dmitry Peskov said that Ukraine had struck oil storage facilities intended for export operations, accusing Kyiv of destabilising global energy markets. In a statement, Ukraine's military confirmed it had again hit the Tuapse refinery, as part of concerted efforts to "reduce the military-economic potential of the Russian aggressor".

## SUSPECTED GUNMAN AGED 89 HELD IN GREECE AFTER FIVE WOUNDED



The suspect, an 89-year-old man, was held in Greece after a shooting in a public square in Athens on Tuesday. Five people were wounded in the attack, which took place during a protest. The suspect was identified as a member of a far-right group. The incident has prompted a review of security measures in the area.



## "Mujhe Hara Do Ge?" PM Modi Joins Gangtok Children For Game Of Football



Unfolding another chapter from his visit to Gangtok, Prime Minister Narendra Modi played a friendly football match with local children on Tuesday. From kicking the ball around the park to interacting with school-going children, it was a sight to behold seeing the country's top leader enjoying the beautiful game with local youngsters. an hour, ACP Sanjay Singh decided to implement a green corridor and as a result, the ambulance carrying Ngidi was able to reach the hospital in just 11 minutes. ACP Sanjay Singh revealed how to get the know about the injury and what led to his instant reac-

tion. "I'm ACP Traffic of Centre District, and the Arun Jaitley Stadium comes under this jurisdiction. Whenever IPL matches take place, the overall jurisdiction lies with the DCP, and I also control a few things. I was outside the stadium, someone was watch-

ing the match on mobile, and then I was informed that someone had faced an injury inside the stadium and an ambulance had entered the field," Singh told Hindustan Times. "I thought if the ambulance entered the field, then the player had to be taken to the hospital. We had to give the route to the traffic guys. I went there, and the ambulance was near Gate No.2. The Delhi Capitals officials were inside the ambulance, wearing an oxygen mask. He wasn't moving, and panic gripped the people. I asked the driver, 'Where are you taking him?' It was then that he said that the plan was to take him to BLK Max Hospital in Rajender Nagar."

## Delhi Capitals Owner Sends Big Message After Humiliating Defeat Against RCB



Delhi Capitals co-owner Parth Jindal took to social media to react to his side's humiliating loss against Royal Challengers Bengaluru, in New Delhi on Monday. Josh Hazlewood took four wickets while Bhuvneshwar Kumar took three, as Delhi Capitals were bundled out for just 75. In reply, Virat Kohli and Devdutt Padikkal made short work of the run-chase, as RCB registered a brilliant nine-wicket win. This was DC's second loss in a row, following a match where Punjab Kings chased down a record 265-run target. "Stay together more than ever now @DelhiCapitals - really very tough to take but we must keep fighting and keep believing," Parth Jindal posted on X (formerly known as Twitter). Axar Patel didn't have much to answer when Delhi Capitals failed to defend 264 against Punjab Kings on Saturday and looked even more perplexed after his team crumbled to 75 versus Royal Challengers Bengaluru in

their second straight IPL surrender within a space of 48 hours. Delhi Capitals were reduced to 9 for 6 inside Powerplay overs with Bhuvneshwar Kumar getting appreciable swing and Josh Hazlewood executing short ball tactic to perfection. The result was season's lowest score and RCB cantered to a nine-wicket win. "Even I don't know what happened. That's why they say you have to be on your toes in cricket. We have to move on from this match," Axar said at post match presentation ceremony. The single that David Miller refused in a one-run defeat against Gujarat Titans did affect the tournament momentum for DC and Karun Nair dropping dolbies against Punjab Kings only made matters worse. "From today's point of view, you can say it did effect, but you can look back, if the catches were taken (Nair) or had we taken the single against GT, then momentum would have been with us."

## Elena Rybakina Bows Out Of Madrid Open, Aryna Sabalenka Reaches Quarters

Australian Open champion Elena Rybakina fell to a shock 7-6 (10/8), 6-4 defeat by Anastasia Potapova on Monday in the Madrid Open fourth round. Earlier world number one Aryna Sabalenka overcame Naomi Osaka 6-7 (1/7), 6-3, 6-2 in a gripping battle to reach the quarter-finals. Third seed Coco Gauff was eliminated in a three-set battle with Linda Noskova decided on a final set tie-break in an exciting fourth-round clash. In the third round of the men's draw, second seed Alexander Zverev won in straight sets against Terence Atmane and

Alexander Bockx earned a surprising win against world number five Felix Auger-Aliassime. In the day's late match Kazakhstan's Rybakina, the world number two, was shocked by her 56th-ranked opponent. Both players secured two breaks in the first set before Potapova edged Rybakina in the tie-break. In the second set Rybakina captured her fifth break point of a long fifth game to nose ahead but lost the eighth and 10th games as Potapova triumphed. "I'm speechless, I'm extremely happy, it was such a tough match and tough opponent," said Austria's Potapova. "My

team helped me today, they were there for me, big thanks to them." Sabalenka, who has claimed titles at Miami, Indian Wells and Brisbane this year, was tested by her Japanese opponent but came back from a set and a break down to triumph. "When (she) put me under pressure, I was able to pull out really incredible shots and incredible tennis. So I'm happy," said Sabalenka. The first set between the two four-time Grand Slam winners was tight, with only one break point forced, by Sabalenka, which Osaka saved to hold for 2-1. Osaka dominated in the tie-break, ripping into a 5-

0 lead and then triumphing when Sabalenka lashed a return wide. Reigning champion Sabalenka stepped up a gear in the second frame, although world number 15 Osaka dug deep to survive three break points and then managed to engineer a break for herself to take a 2-1 lead. However, the Belarusian immediately broke to love and then again in the eighth game, serving out to take the second set. Only Rybakina has beaten Sabalenka this year, in the Australian Open final, and the 27-year-old dominated in the third set, securing two breaks to triumph.

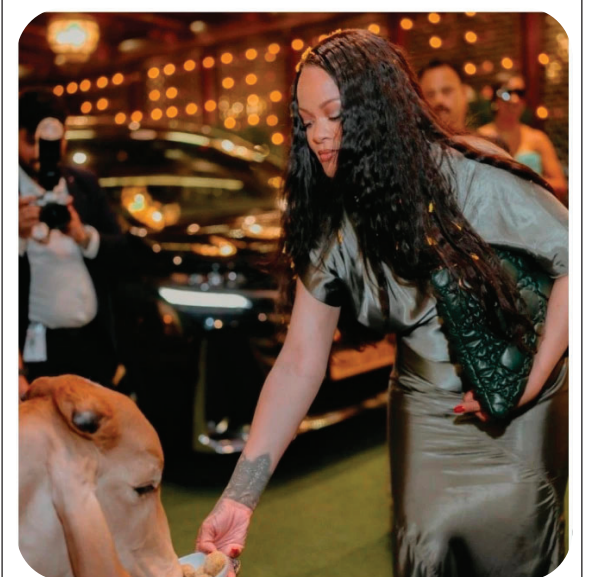
### Leak and Box Office Expectations
