### YSRCP ACCUSES NAIDU LED GOVT. OF MUZZLING OPPOSITION'S VOICE

Vijayawada (TSIT) The Opposition in Andhra Pradesh, the YSR Congress Party has flayed the Naidu headed coalition government for gagging the voice of dissent and using the police as a tool to settle political scores.

Speaking to the media here on Saturday, Party General Secretary Ponnavolu Sudhakar Reddy alleged the state is slipping into autocracy, with the government putting down dissent in every form using coercive methods, while the voice of dissent is not making it to the mainstream media.

"For raising simple questions about corruption in a temple at Sri Kalahasti, the construction cost of Amaravati, or the extravagance of the state government, cases were booked against individuals and letters were written by authorities to block their social media accounts," he lashed out.

This amounted to throttling the fundamental right to freedom of expression, he slammed and asked the media to highlight such issues, as social

media platforms are being watched with a magnifying glass and letters are being written either to remove posts or block the accounts of those questioning the government on various issues.

"Self-promotion, marginalization of dissent, and media control have been the methodology adopted by the government to shut down dissent, and it is using the police as a tool to execute its policy," he charged.

Ponnavolu Sudhakar Reddy lambasted that marginalization of dissent and media control lead to highly authoritarian governance, and democracy would go for a toss. "Such rule will not last long, and people will turn against it, as proven by many examples in history," he said. The matter was also raised as a serious concern by former Chief Minister and YSRCP President Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy on the X platform in a detailed manner, Sudhakar Reddy stated.

### VMRDA Master Plan to Receive Approval Soon

Expansion Master Plan to be Completed by October: Minister P. Narayana



Visakhapatnam (TSIT) M u n i c i p a l Administration Minister P. Narayana stated that 95 percent of the issues related to the VMRDA Master Plan have already been resolved and that the master plan will soon receive approval. He was speaking at a media conference held after a review meeting conducted at the VMRDA office on Saturday morning in the presence of local legislators. The Minister said that out of the total 6,836 square kilometer area under VMRDA limits, 4,325.65 square kilometers have already been brought under the master plan and all discussions regarding it have been completed. He explained that the master plan for the remaining 2,455.48 square kilometer expansion area is currently in the draft stage and will be finalized by October this year. Minister Narayana stated that among the 3,720 objections received during the first phase notification, 717 unique objections were identified and resolved. These mainly related to road width, road expansion, new roads, road removal, and other related issues. He further said that out of the 1,236 objections received in

the second phase notification, 337 unique objections were examined. These included road alignments, changes in road width, land use changes, new roads, and road removals.

The Minister revealed that the government is examining a proposal to establish a semi-ring road from Rampalli to Bhogapuram. For this project, land pooling will be undertaken with farmers, after which layouts will be developed along the corridor and plots will be allotted to the farmers. He further informed that out of the 15 connectivity roads being jointly undertaken by VMRDA and GVMC, three have already been completed and the remaining works will be completed within the next two months. He also said that metro re-survey works are currently in progress and metro works will begin immediately after their completion. MSME Minister Kondapalli Srinivas, MLAs Konathala Ramakrishna, Palla Srinivasa Rao, Vishnu Kumar Raju, Kaliseti Appala Naidu, Vamsi Krishna Srinivas Yadav, VMRDA Chairman M. V. Pranav Gopal, Metropolitan Commissioner N. Tej Bharat and others participated in the meeting.

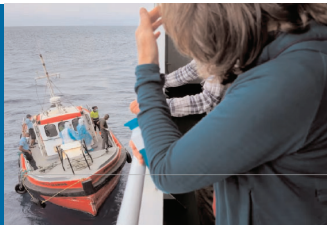

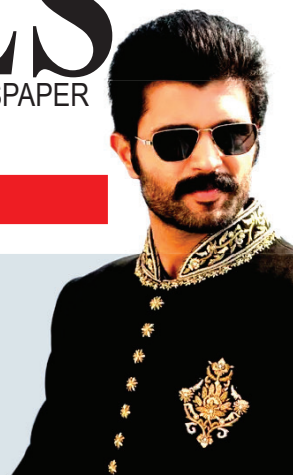

**PM to Dedicate Rs.1,535 Crore Railway Projects in Telangana**



Hyderabad (TSIT BUREAU):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will dedicate major railway infrastructure projects worth around Rs.1,535 crore in Telangana on May 10, aiming to enhance rail connectivity, operational efficiency, and freight movement across the region. The projects include multiple sections of the Kazipet-Vijayawada multi-tracking project covering 118 kilometres along the busy Grand Trunk railway corridor, a key route for both passenger and cargo traffic. The upgrades are expected to facilitate faster train operations, reduce congestion, improve punctuality, and significantly boost freight transportation. In addition, the Kazipet Rail Under Rail Bypass will be inaugurated, which will decongest the busy Kazipet Junction by allowing simultaneous train movements towards Hyderabad, Balharshah, and Vijayawada. Officials said the bypass will streamline operations, reduce delays, and strengthen Telangana's rail network. Railway authorities stated that the projects will contribute to economic growth, industrial expansion, and logistics development in the state by improving overall rail infrastructure and efficiency.

## Hyderabad to get 'traffic free city' makeover: Revanth



Hyderabad TSIT Bureau:

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday outlined an ambitious plan to transform Hyderabad into a "Traffic Free City" through a comprehensive network of underpasses, elevated corridors, surface roads, multi-level parking complexes, and a multi-modal transport system.

Addressing the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Urban Affairs and Housing, CM Revanth emphasized that merely widening roads would not solve the city's congestion. Instead, a

multi-pronged transportation model and improved public transport infrastructure are being adopted to ensure smoother traffic movement.

The Chief Minister presented a futuristic regional development model, dividing Telangana into three economic zones: Core Urban Region Economy (CURE) for services within the ORR, Peri-Urban Region Economy (PURE) as a manufacturing hub, and Rural Agriculture Region Economy (RARE) focusing on agriculture beyond the RRR. He also highlighted the "Telangana Rising 2047" vision, aiming for a \$1 trillion econo-

my by 2034 and \$3 trillion by 2047. Environmental initiatives include electric buses for RTC and conversion of auto-rickshaws to electric vehicles in the CURE region. Detailed plans for drinking water, urban development, and the Musi River Rejuvenation Project were presented.

Committee members praised the government's initiatives, especially the Musi River project, and commended efforts in women empowerment and visionary urban planning. CM Revanth sought the Centre's support for infrastructure projects to realize Hyderabad's transformation.

## Suvendu Adhikari takes oath as Bengal's first BJP chief minister amid saffron spectacle at Brigade

In a historic political transition, Suvendu Adhikari took oath as the first BJP Chief Minister of West Bengal, ending 15 years of Trinamool Congress rule. The oath-taking ceremony was held at Brigade Parade Ground, a venue symbolic of Bengal's shifting political landscape, at exactly 11:32 am on Rabindra Jayanti, the birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore.

Governor R. N. Ravi administered the oath in Bengali. Adhikari, 55, wore a saffron kurta and white pyjama, and took the oath in the name of God in front of a crowd that included Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, BJP president Nitin Nabin, and chief ministers from nearly 20 BJP-ruled states. The ceremony showcased Bengali culture with



floral tributes to Tagore, portraits of Syama Prasad Mookerjee and Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar, Purulia Chhau dancers, and folk performances. PM Modi performed a full sashtanga pranam before the public, earning loud cheers from supporters.

Alongside Adhikari, five ministers — Dilip

Ghosh, Agnimitra Paul, Ashok Kirtaniya, Khudiram Tudu, and Nisith Pramanik — were sworn into the new cabinet. Leaders from the NDA and BJP, including Yogi Adityanath, Himanta Biswa Sarma, N. Chandrababu Naidu, Devendra Fadnavis, Smriti Irani, and actor-

politician Mithun Chakraborty, attended the event. The BJP secured 207 of 293 seats, marking the party's first-ever government in West Bengal. Supporters celebrated the political shift as the beginning of a "Sonar Bangla" era, expressing hope for change and improved governance in the state.

## India successfully tests Agni missile with multiple payloads



New Delhi (TSIT):

The Advanced Agni missile with Multiple Independently Targeted Re-Entry Vehicle (MIRV) system, capable of hitting different targets spread over a large area, was successfully flight-tested over the Indian Ocean Region, a DRDO official said on Saturday.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh complimented the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), the Indian Army, and industry on the successful flight test conducted on Friday.

"This will add an incredible capability to the country's defence preparedness against the growing threat perceptions," he said. The successful flight trial of the Advanced Agni missile with MIRV was conducted from Dr

APJ Abdul Kalam Island, Odisha, said an official statement. The missile was flight-tested with multiple payloads, targeting different targets spatially distributed across the Indian Ocean Region, it said.

Telemetry and tracking were carried out by multiple ground- and ship-based stations. These systems tracked the entire missile trajectory from lift-off to the impact of all payloads. Flight data confirmed that all mission objectives were met during the trial, the statement said.

"With this successful trial, India once again demonstrated the capability to target multiple strategic targets using a single missile system. This missile is developed by DRDO laboratories with the support of industries across the country," it said.

## Vijay meets Governor for 4th time to stake claim for govt formation in TN

Chennai (TSIT)

In a major political development in Tamil Nadu, the Viduthala Chiruthaigal Katchi (VCK) on Saturday extended its support to the Vijay-led Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), enabling the party to cross the majority mark of 118 MLAs required to form the government in the state. Following the development, TVK chief C. Joseph Vijay met Governor-in-Charge Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar to formally stake a claim to form the next government.

Notably, Vijay has met the Governor for the fourth time in as many days. Tamil Nadu went to the polls for all 234 Assembly constituencies in a single phase on April 23. The election witnessed a fierce four-cor-

nered contest involving the DMK, AIADMK, Naam Tamilar Katchi (NTK), and TVK.

The results, declared

on May 4, saw TVK emerge as the single-largest party with 108 seats, though it initially fell short of the majority mark in the Assembly.

After the results, intense political negotiations began in Chennai, with TVK initiating talks with several parties and independent legislators to gather support for government formation.

## Rahul, Kharge to take final call on Kerala Chief Minister

New Delhi (TSIT):

Suspense over the Congress' choice for the next Chief Minister of Kerala continued on Saturday after nearly three hours of high-level deliberations at Congress President Mallikarjuna Kharge's residence here.

Senior party sources said the final decision would be taken by Congress President Kharge and senior party leader Rahul Gandhi, while an official announcement would be made "in due course". AICC general secretary in charge of Kerala Deepa Dasmunshi said. The meeting was attended by key Kerala



Congress leaders, including V.D. Satheesan, K.C. Venugopal and Ramesh Chennithala, and focused on finalising the leadership transition following the party's strong performance in the state.

However, despite prolonged discussions and back-to-back consultations, the party refrained from announcing a deci-

sion, indicating that further internal deliberations could take place.

Speaking to reporters after the closed-door meeting, Dasmunshi said: "The name will be announced in due course. We have time till May 23, so the announcement can happen any time before that."

She reiterated that the party leadership was carefully evaluating all aspects before formalising its decision. Addressing reporters outside Kharge's residence, V.D. Satheesan expressed concern over protests reported from parts of Kerala earlier in the day.

## Shivakumar denies Tamil Nadu MLAs visited Eagleton resort

Bengaluru (TSIT):

Deputy Chief Minister and State Congress President, D.K. Shivakumar, said that reports claiming that Tamil Nadu party MLAs had arrived at the Eagleton Resort on the outskirts of Bengaluru were false. He said he was not aware of any such development and added that if there had been any such development, he himself would have informed about it.

He further stated that the Eagleton Resort is currently closed for repairs and that all reports in this regard are false.

Speaking to reporters in Bengaluru, he said, "I don't know where they have gone. Some say they have gone to Hyderabad, while others claim they



have arrived in Bengaluru. I saw such reports on television, but I am not aware of it. The party high command has not spoken to me yet regarding the matter. It would be a different matter if the high command had discussed it with me."

"Whatever stand the party takes, I will abide by it," he said. "It is the party's decision. I have left it to the party. They asked me to go for campaigning, and I went for campaigning.

## Indian seafarer killed after ship catches fire, sinks near Strait of Hormuz

Dubai/New Delhi (TSIT):

An Indian seafarer lost his life while four others sustained burn injuries after a wooden dhow carrying 18 Indian crew members capsized near the Strait of Hormuz following a fire onboard, official sources confirmed on Saturday.

The incident took place on Friday in the strategically sensitive Strait of Hormuz region, where tensions linked to the ongoing Iran-US conflict continue to escalate, and reports of drone activity in the area have heightened security concerns. According to sources, the wooden dhow was transporting general cargo when the fire broke out. Authorities are still



trying to determine the exact cause of the blaze that led to the vessel capsizing.

Providing details of the incident, a government source said, "A wooden Dhow, carrying general cargo, with 18 Indian crew capsized yesterday close to the Strait of Hormuz after it caught fire. The exact cause of the fire is being ascertained. The crew members were rescued by a vessel which was passing by. In

this incident, one Indian on the dhow died while four received burn injuries. The injured are receiving medical treatment in Dubai and are safe." The source further stated that officials from the Indian Consulate had met the rescued Indian nationals on Friday night and were coordinating with the dhow owner while extending all possible support and assistance to the crew members and their families.

## Crop Diversification Essential for Telangana's Agricultural Sustainability: Minister Tummala



Hyderabad TSIT: Farmer Commission Chairman Kodanda Reddy and members on Saturday submitted a comprehensive report on crop diversification in Telangana to Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao at the Secretariat. The report highlighted the urgent need to encourage cultivation of horticulture crops, pulses, millets, and oilseeds over the next three years. The Minister emphasised that crop diversification should focus on crops with strong market demand to ensure remunerative prices for farmers. He instructed officials to formulate plans keeping in view both domestic requirements and market opportunities.

Tummala also stated that while oil palm cultivation has newly expanded to 45,000 acres this year, the government should target 1 lakh acres under oil

Agriculture and Horticulture Department officials to prepare an action plan to shift at least 13 lakh acres towards horticulture crops, pulses, millets, and oilseeds over the next three years. The Minister emphasised that crop diversification should focus on crops with strong market demand to ensure remunerative prices for farmers. He instructed officials to formulate plans keeping in view both domestic requirements and market opportunities.

Tummala also stated that while oil palm cultivation has newly expanded to 45,000 acres this year, the government should target 1 lakh acres under oil

palm cultivation next year through a structured action plan. Minister further opined that amendments were necessary in the Central Seed Act, pointing out that the law lacks clarity on compensation to farmers affected by fake or spurious seeds. He demanded that States should also be given adequate powers along with the Centre in seed regulation and monitoring. Reviewing preparations for the upcoming Kharif season, Tummala directed Agriculture Department officials to maintain adequate buffer stocks of urea in the State by the end of May, as sowing operations are likely to begin in the first week of June.

## PM Modi's Public Meeting Arrangements Reviewed at Parade Grounds

Hyderabad (TSIT) Union Minister G.Kishan Reddy along with BJP Telangana State President N. Ramchander Rao inspected the arrangements for the public meeting of Prime Minister Narendra Modi scheduled to be held tomorrow at Parade Grounds. The leaders reviewed the stage setup, seating arrangements, security measures, public entry and exit points, parking facilities, and other logistical preparations being made for the Prime Minister's visit. Officials and party leaders concerned briefed them on the arrangements being undertaken to ensure the smooth conduct of the massive public gathering. Kishan Reddy expressed satisfaction over the ongoing preparations and instructed party cadres and organizers to coordinate effectively for the successful conduct of the programme. He stated that large numbers of people from across Telangana are expected to attend the public meeting.



## Strict Action Warned Against Drying Grain on Roads in Mahabubnagar

Mahabubnagar (TSIT): DSP Venkateswarlu has issued a warning to farmers and traders against drying grain on roads, citing a high risk of road accidents. The statement, issued on the orders of District SP Darawat Janaki, emphasized that legal action will be taken if such practices lead to accidents. Officials noted that grain spread on roads creates serious hazards, especially at night, when low visibility increases the chances of vehicles losing control. Beyond traffic disruption, the practice endangers lives. Farmers have been advised to use designated pits or locations provided by the Department of Agriculture for drying grain. DSP Venkateswarlu urged everyone to act responsibly and prioritize public safety.



## MAJOR FIRE IN AIZA SPARKS RENEWED DEMAND FOR PERMANENT FIRE STATION

Jogulamba Gadwal, May 9, 2026: Over ten haystacks were destroyed in a major fire on Saturday near Durgaamma Temple in Durga Nagar Colony, Ward No. 10, Aiza town, under Alampur Assembly Constituency. The incident caused heavy property losses worth several lakhs of rupees, leaving local farmers and residents devastated.



According to witnesses, the fire spread rapidly, consuming multiple haystacks before locals rushed to control the flames. The accident once again highlighted the absence of emergency fire services in Aiza, prompting criticism from residents and political leaders alike.

Reacting to the incident, TRP Jogulamba Gadwal District President Morugu Veeresh demanded the immediate establishment of a permanent Fire Station in Aiza

municipality. He pointed out that despite repeated appeals over decades, successive governments have failed to provide basic emergency infrastructure.

Veeresh emphasized that Aiza, which meets the criteria for a Revenue Division upgrade, still lacks a local Fire Station. Currently, fire engines must come from Gadwal town, nearly 30 kilometers

away, causing critical delays during emergencies. He highlighted that residents often struggle for hours to control fires before help arrives.

The TRP leader urged the State Government to sanction and establish a full-fledged Fire Station in Aiza immediately to prevent future tragedies and ensure timely emergency response for citizens.

## Applications to be resolved within three months

Khammam (TSIT): Every application received during Praja Darbar programmes would be resolved within three months under a concrete action plan prepared by the government, Telangana Revenue, Housing and Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said. The Minister participated in the Praja Darbar held at the Tirumalayapalem Mandal Parishad office on Saturday along with District Collector T.S. Diwakara and Additional Collector P. Srinivasa Reddy. Addressing the gathering, the Minister said around 14,700 applications had been received so far in Praja Darbar meetings across the Paleru constituency, mostly related to Indiramma houses, land issues, pensions and free electricity. Applications that could be resolved immediately were being cleared on the spot, while the remaining petitions would be disposed of within three months, he said. He said the government had sanctioned 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses within the first year and announced that the second phase of house sanctions would begin from the end of May. Criticising flaws in the Dharani portal introduced by the previous government, the Minister said the 'Bhu Bharati' initiative had been launched to resolve land-related issues and assured justice to poor families in Sada Bainama applications.

## BRS Leader Krishank Alleges Political Targeting by Congress Government

Sangareddy, May 9, 2026 (TSIT): Manne Krishank, BRS Social Media Convener, was released from Kandi Central Jail on Saturday after being lodged for 16 days in connection with multiple cases. Speaking to the media, he alleged that 34 cases were filed against him solely for questioning the government, calling them politically motivated and not based on public complaints.

Krishank criticized the Congress government for indulging in petty politics and claimed it lacks vision for Telangana's development. He stated that the people are suffering under an inexperienced administration. The BRS leader asserted that he was target-



ed after raising concerns about alleged corruption in Anganwadi mobile phone procurement and tree felling on a university campus. He also alleged that the police sought access to his phone,

email, and Wi-Fi passwords, questioning why law enforcement focuses on political opponents instead of tackling genuine crimes. Krishank reaffirmed his commitment as a

Telangana movement activist and vowed to continue questioning the government on public issues, emphasizing that holding authorities accountable is a democratic right.

## Hyderabad puts India on aerospace map as Skyroot becomes sector's first unicorn

A rocket company that started at a Hyderabad co-working space has done what no aerospace firm in India has managed before. Skyroot Aerospace crossed a \$1 billion valuation this week, becoming the first aerospace company in the country to enter the unicorn club. The milestone arrived on the back of a \$60 million funding round, taking its total capital raised to \$160 million.

No Indian aerospace startup had achieved this before. Not in the seven decades since independence. Not through the years of policy reform. Skyroot, founded in 2018, got there in seven years.

Who backed it and why it matters

The round was co-led by Singapore's sovereign wealth fund GIC and Sherpa Ventures, the Silicon Valley firm run by Ram Shriram, the investor who put money into Google before most people had heard of it. Shriram now joins Skyroot's board. Funds managed by BlackRock, one of the world's largest asset managers, also participated. So did Playbook Partners, Shangvi Family Office, the founders of Greenko Group, and existing investor Arkam Ventures.

These are not speculative bets from venture funds chasing themes. GIC manages Singapore's foreign reserves. BlackRock manages money

for pension funds and sovereign institutions across the world. Their presence in this round signals that Skyroot has cleared a threshold of credibility that most Indian deep-tech startups never reach.

The founders and where they came from Pawan Kumar Chandana and Naga Bharath Daka both worked at ISRO before leaving to start Skyroot in 2018. They understood rockets not from textbooks but from years of building systems inside India's national space programme.

They chose Hyderabad as their base, a decision that proved consequential. The city gave them proximity to ISRO's facilities, access to a defence and aerospace manufacturing supply chain that had quietly built up over decades, and a pool of engineers trained in hardware-intensive disciplines. They incubated the company at T-Hub, the government-backed innovation platform on the IIIT campus in Gachibowli. T-Hub gave them early infrastructure, connections, and a launchpad of a different kind before they ever got close to a real one.

How Hyderabad shaped company

Hyderabad's role in Skyroot's rise runs deeper than real estate and office space. The city houses ISRO's



National Remote Sensing Centre and has long supported a cluster of aerospace and defence suppliers. Companies like DRDO, Bharat Dynamics, and a network of precision engineering firms operate out of the city, creating a manufacturing ecosystem that Skyroot could draw on as it scaled.

Telangana's state government also moved early to support the company. BRS Working President K T Rama

Rao pointed to T-Hub's incubation of Skyroot as evidence of what government-backed innovation platforms can achieve when they back the right bets early. He described the unicorn milestone as a validation of Telangana's decade-long push to position Hyderabad as a hub not just for software services but for frontier technologies and hardware startups.

"This success belongs to the

entire ecosystem cultivated in Telangana," he said.

Hyderabad has spent years attracting global technology and defence companies. Skyroot's rise now signals something more significant: the city can produce companies that do not just serve the aerospace industry but lead it.

What Skyroot has already done

In November 2022, Skyroot flew Vikram-S, a suborbital

rocket developed entirely by a private Indian company. The flight worked. It reached space. That made Skyroot the first Indian private company to launch a rocket beyond the atmosphere, a moment that rewrote what was considered possible in the country's space sector. The flight also came at a significant policy moment. The Indian government had opened the space sector to private companies in 2020, allowing startups to access ISRO's launch and test facilities for the first time. Skyroot was the first private firm to sign such an agreement with ISRO. The Vikram-S flight demonstrated that the policy reform had teeth.

What comes next Vikram-1, India's first privately developed orbital-class rocket, now sits weeks away from its maiden flight. The mission will attempt to place satellites into orbit. That capability separates a handful of countries and companies from the rest of the world. If Vikram-1 succeeds, Skyroot joins that group.

The new capital will fund higher launch frequency for Vikram-1, expand Skyroot's Hyderabad manufacturing base, and accelerate development of Vikram-2, a one-tonne-class vehicle powered by an advanced cryogenic upper stage. Vikram-2 targets heavier payloads and positions

Skyroot to compete for a broader range of commercial contracts. Chandana, speaking after the funding announcement, said the ability to launch rockets independently sits at the centre of everything. "This will promote more and more investments in India," he said.

Shriram, who backed the company from its early days, framed it in larger terms. "Access to space is one of the key challenges of our time. Skyroot is building the foundational infrastructure for that future." Market Skyroot is chasing

The global small satellite launch market is expanding fast. Hundreds of satellites now need to reach low Earth orbit every year, serving communications, earth observation, navigation, and defence applications. Demand for dedicated, affordable, on-demand launches has never been higher. The market today is dominated by US and European players. SpaceX's Falcon 9 and Rocket Lab's Electron have carved out significant shares. India has ISRO's PSLV, which carries a strong track record but operates on a government schedule that commercial operators cannot always align with. Skyroot aims to fill that gap. A private Indian launch provider operating on commercial timelines, at competitive prices, with a rocket built and flown out of Hyderabad.

Why is son of Union Minister for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay not being booked and investigated as every other POCSO crime perpetrator?" he lashed out at the Telangana Police. "The minor girl attempted suicide twice! They have been roaming for justice for three months. Now you are victim-shaming her?" the former minister wondered whether Bandi Sanjay and his son were being given any "special exemptions" under the law.

## Harish Rao questions Hyderabad CP over ex-IPS officer's wife's murder

Hyderabad (TSIT): Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) MLA T Harish Rao on Saturday, May 9, questioned Hyderabad Commissioner of Police VC Sajjanar regarding a security lapse after a former IPS officer's wife was murdered by her domestic help on Friday, May 8. "If the wife of a DG rank IPS officer is not safe, then who is?" Rao asked, expressing concern over the culprits still being on the run. He also noted that the commissioner had cautioned people against hiring Nepalese nationals. He attacked the Telangana police, saying that it could not prevent the attack on BRS MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy's office in Karimnagar by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) workers.

The former Telangana minister referred to Malkajgiri Commissioner



ner Krishank was arrested for reporting a person who was spreading misinformation on social media. "Krishank has been in jail for 20 days for reporting a person. What are you doing?" Rao asked. Speaking of the NCRB report on crimes against children, Rao said that Telangana's performance in the law and order sector has deteriorated and held chief minister A Revanth Reddy responsible for the lapse.

Rao's remarks come a day after former IPS officer Vinay Ranjan Ray's wife was murdered at their residence by their domestic help. The deceased was identified as Tanuja Ranjan. The incident occurred at the IPS officers' residential quarters at Jubilee Hills. The preliminary investigation suggests that this murder was carried out by a Nepalese gang. Addressing the media, Hyderabad Commissioner of Police, VC Sajjanar, said that the murder occurred at 2:00 am on Friday. "The incident occurred when Vinay Ranjan was out of the station. His wife was staying alone on the ground floor while the children were on the first floor," he said. Sajjanar said that Ray hired Kalpana one year ago to look after his mother.

## TMC's battle against BJP to continue: Abhishek Banerjee

Kolkata, May 9 : As Suwendu Adhikari took oath as the ninth Chief Minister of West Bengal on Saturday afternoon, Trinamool Congress general secretary and the party's Lok Sabha member, Abhishek Banerjee, claimed that his party's struggle and movement against BJP would continue.

He said this was despite the BJP's victory in the recently concluded West Bengal Assembly elections through an allegedly rigged process.

"We have fought an extremely difficult election where nearly 30 lakh genuine voters were allegedly disenfranchised from the electoral rolls. Throughout this entire process, we witnessed what we believe was deeply partisan conduct by several government agencies as well as the Election Commission of India," Banerjee observed in a social media statement issued on Saturday.

Targeting the Election Commission



of India (ECI), Banerjee said that the democratic institutions that were meant to function impartially appeared compromised, raising serious concerns about the fairness, credibility and transparency of the electoral process in West Bengal.

"From the counting process to allegations surrounding the handling and movement of EVMs, mismatch of control units, several disturbing incidents

have left millions of people questioning whether the true mandate of the people has been respected. I have already demanded the release of CCTV FOOTAGE FROM THE COUNTING CENTRES and a transparent counting of VVPAT slips so that the truth can come before the people and every doubt can be addressed openly and honestly," his statement read.

According to him,

since democracy could only survive when electoral institutions inspire trust and confidence among citizens, what was witnessed in the recently concluded West Bengal elections was shaking the trust of the people in these institutions.

"At the same time, reports of post-poll violence, attacks on party offices, intimidation of our party workers and threats against supporters are deeply

alarming and unacceptable in a democratic society. Many dedicated Trinamool workers and supporters who fought tirelessly on the ground have allegedly faced targeted attacks and have been forced to flee their homes out of fear and insecurity. No political worker in a democracy should ever have to choose between their safety and their political beliefs," Banerjee said.

He concluded his statement claiming that he and his colleagues in Trinamool Congress would continue to stand firmly with the people of West Bengal and with every Trinamool worker who fought tooth and nail against what his party believed was a compromised electoral machinery. "Under the guidance and leadership of Mamata Banerjee, our fight for democracy, constitutional values and the rights and dignity of the people will continue without fear and without compromise," he added.

EDITORIAL

West Bengal: Mission Accomplished

In a ruthlessly crafted mission, with the Election Commission of India (ECI) and the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) being close collaborators, the Trinamool Congress (TMC) government has been laid low in west Bengal.

In a shameful first, 2.7 million voters came to be disenfranchised because their "logical discrepancies" - a device never used before by the Election Commission - could not be sorted out for want of time. What that unprecedented breach of the Constitutional injunction that "free and fair" elections cannot be said to have been held should even a single eligible voter be prevented from casting her vote does to the republican order is for residual democrats to ponder.

Imagine that the total difference of votes cast for the BJP and the TMC has been three million or so. What might have happened had the 2.7 million disenfranchised voters actually voted is for all to wonder at, especially in view of the seats that were lost or won by less than 5,000 votes.

A travesty of an electoral process if there ever was one. The felling of the feisty Mamata Banerjee has brought cheer equally to the Left and the Right. Long viewed as an unpedigreed usurper who had the temerity in 2011 to rudely bring down the 34-year-old Left front regime - high priests of theory and iron-clad organisation notwithstanding - by, of all things, mobilising the farming community against industrialists who were eyeing to acquire agricultural land to set up manufacturing units, leading to an episode of police firing on agitating peasantry with many fatalities resulting, the vandalism visited now on a statue of Lenin seems less consequential than the ignominious exit of Banerjee, the bete noir.

That Left cadres have for some time now been openly raising the slogan "pehle Ram, phir Vaam" (first the party of Ram, meaning the BJP, then the Left) is not exactly the best kept secret of recent West Bengal politics. Therefore, it is just as well that the Mamata party has been brought low, even if by the fascist right-wing that has played the communal card to the hilt.

Never before have Bengalis been so nakedly appeased as Hindus as during the campaign run by the Modi-Shah combine. Even the memory of the constitutional/electoral imperative that no appeals may be made to religious or other identity markers during electoral campaigns has now been lost to the ECI, the executive, and wretchedly, vast sections of the populace as well. Mamata, conversely, has been arraigned for molly-coddling Muslims in the name of secularism. Indeed, the erstwhile TMC leader-turned-BJP frontrunner, Suwendu Adhikari, has loudly let it be known that since only Hindus voted for him, there was no call on him to look after Muslim issues.

It is another matter that his party did not put up a single Muslim candidate. The least attention to Muslim problems is no longer to be viewed as the State's constitutional duty to protect and preserve minority interest within a still-secular Constitution.

Indeed, the fall of West Bengal has brought nearer the coveted Sanatan goal of forging a unitary state - a sort of one-party right wing parallel to the Chinese model, dumping the principle of federalism as anathema to national unity. Peninsular India still remains rather cussed in its refusal to prostrate to the unitary idea, but West Bengal has shown that the captive State now has all the wherewithal to breach the Deccan in time to come.

When that happens, the argument and the ground would have been made available to formally effect the transformation of the State into a majoritarian theocracy, with civilisational oneness crushing the decrepit pluralisms of old. There remains though one thorn in the side of this unitary project - like it or not, the Indian National Congress. The animal refuses to embrace the extinction so often pronounced and prophesied by the loud mouths of the right-wing.

Admirably, Rahul Gandhi, giving proof of a sagacious political vision, has rebuked the local unit of the party in West Bengal for their petty gloating over Mamata's defeat, rectifying some of his own negative observations of earlier days. Conversely, Mamata has lost no time in acknowledging the gesture and reciprocating the sentiment, vowing to work to strengthen the INDIA bloc.

It is to be hoped by all those still wedded to the ideal of a pluralist, multiparty democracy, underpinned by staunchly independent institutions, that not only the TMC but other factions as well who once were part of the Indian National Congress, will see the pit that awaits Indian Constitutional democracy, and forge a new unity across the republic that may acquire the clout to build a people's movement forged not just on lung power but a deeply considered conjoint understanding of how a manifesto of a people's charter may be drawn up, and what organisational mechanisms may be conjointly put in place across northern and central India to unravel the depredations wrought by a rampaging right-wing that now needs the Constitution only as a facade till brought down. The need for a thoroughly analysed and assimilated alternate politics

Mamata and all other elements of the secular-democratic INDIA bloc will need to understand that the return to a collectivity cannot just be a Pavlovian response to political adversity, but a thoroughly analysed and assimilated alternate politics that has the substance to defeat the right-wing in the hearts and minds of the common citizenry. Now that both the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and the Left front in Kerala have been ousted, it will be for them and parties like the Samajwadi party and the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) in Bihar to hold hands with the Congress to salvage the centre before worrying about their pocket-boroughs as their chief myopic concerns. There is a new youthful generation of Indians gone quite American in foregrounding money before emancipatory or enlightened social and political ideas. In a grand capitalist phrase, the corporate media calls them the "aspirational class". Surely, a nation's educational system cannot be geared merely to feeding the aspiration for higher incomes to the exclusion of ethical, altruistic orientations of mind. And surely, our pride in civilisational values can hardly square with a world view which regards the acquisition of private wealth as the acme of developmental nationalism.

Corporate media houses and the ubiquitous barrage of commercial messages, made poisonously addictive through digital instruments, are now a formidable Epsteinian reality, and the task of retrieving an ethical state and polity are stupendously intractable.

HUMANITY DESCENDING INTO THE GUTTER

Indian cities today appear divided into two images. One is of gleaming roads, smart city projects, sprawling malls, and cleanliness campaigns, while the other is of heaps of garbage, stinking drains, overflowing sewers, and people wading through them. Unfortunately, society often avoids seeing the second image, because it reveals not just filth but also the truth about our social character. The very people who are responsible for cleaning cities are still facing the most humiliation, insecurity, and neglect. This is not just an administrative failure, but the result of a casteist mentality that has, for thousands of years, considered certain people to be "cleaners of dirt."

It's ironic that in a society where cleanliness is equated with God, the very same person who cleans doesn't receive equal status. The very hands that keep cities clean are not respected by people at the doorsteps of their homes. The Constitution guaranteed equality, laws criminalized untouchability, but the filth of caste, deeply embedded in society's minds, remains ingrained. This is why sanitation workers still overwhelmingly belong to a single caste. It's the biggest

social paradox of modern India that a country that reached the moon still forces its own citizens to clean gutters with their bare hands.

Every year, news comes from different parts of the country about the deaths of sanitation workers due to toxic gas while cleaning sewers. The media briefly discusses the matter, the administration expresses grief, politicians announce compensation, and then the matter is over. But life never returns to normal for those families. The death of a worker is not just the death of one person, but the end of an entire family's hopes, their children's future, and their livelihood. The saddest thing is that society has almost accepted these deaths as "normal," as if they are not accidents but their predestined fate.

The question is, why do humans still have to descend into sewers? Can't machines do this work in this age of technology? The truth is that machines exist, technology exists, and resources exist, but the lives of sanitation workers have never been considered a priority. The lives of poor laborers are cheap for this system. This is why people are forced into toxic sewers without safety equipment. Often, contractors and officials know this is illegal, yet it continues because the victims are not influential individuals.

If a senior official, doctor, or government employee dies prematurely, the entire system swings into action. Financial assistance is provided to the family, government jobs are provided, messages from leaders arrive, and condolences are expressed. This should be the case, because every human life

is precious. But why does this same sensitivity disappear when a sanitation worker dies in a sewer? Why are the tears of his wife and children considered less precious? Why is society not as disturbed by his death? The answer isn't merely economic or administrative, but social. The casteist mindset ingrained in our minds for centuries has "normalized" the suffering of sanitation workers.

In fact, the filth in our minds is more dangerous than the filth on the streets. The municipal corporation can remove the garbage from the streets, but mental garbage will only be removed by changing the mindset of generations. We have turned cleanliness into a caste, not a job. We have convinced some people that they were born to clean up filth. This thinking is the biggest threat to both democracy and humanity. In any civilized society, no profession is determined by birth, but in India, caste has determined a person's identity, respect, and even employment.

It's also ironic that a country that has launched campaigns like "Clean India" has failed to ensure the safety of sanitation workers. It's easy to grab a broom for a photo op, but it takes serious political will to change the lives of those who descend into sewers. Even today, in many municipalities, sewer cleaning is entirely dependent on contractors. To save costs, contractors don't provide safety equipment, forcing workers into the pit of death. When accidents occur, the blame is passed on to others. Rarely does any official or contractor face severe punishment. This impunity perpetuates these deaths.

It's also worth noting that sani-

tation workers face not only economic injustice but also social humiliation. They clean cities, but are often forced to live in slums. Their children face discrimination in schools. In many places, people still hesitate to eat with them. What kind of society is this that wants cleanliness but refuses to respect the people who do it?

We must understand that sanitation is no small task. Doctors save bodies, teachers build futures, and sanitation workers protect society from disease. If sanitation workers stopped working one day, life in cities would come to a standstill. Epidemics would spread, and stench and infection would make life difficult. Yet, the lowest respect and highest risk are associated with that very profession. This is not only a social failure, but also a moral bankruptcy.

The problem won't be solved by mere speeches. First and foremost, complete mechanization of sewer and gutter cleaning is essential.

Forcing any human being to expose themselves to toxic gases is a direct violation of human rights. Governments must seriously invest in modern machinery, robotic technology, and safety equipment. Furthermore, if a sanitation worker dies, the relevant officials and contractors should be charged with culpable homicide. This cycle will not stop until accountability is established.

Additionally, the families of sanitation workers must receive respectable compensation. The government cannot absolve itself of its responsibility by simply handing out a few lakh rupees. Assistance of at least one

crore rupees, a government job for one family member, and a guarantee of education and housing for the children should be provided. Because those who lost their lives were not just laborers, but a vital part of the system that keeps society healthy.

But even laws and compensation will remain incomplete until society changes its mindset. Schools, universities, and social organizations must launch serious awareness campaigns against casteism. Children must be taught that no work is small, and a person's dignity is not diminished by their profession. Until sanitation workers receive equal respect, the dream of a "Clean India" will remain unfulfilled.

Today, the need is not just to clean cities, but to cleanse the soul of society. We must look within ourselves and ask why the death of a sanitation worker doesn't disturb us as much as the death of a senior official does. Why are jobs still divided on the basis of caste? And why, despite claiming modernity, we remain mentally centuries behind.

The true identity of a nation isn't determined by its tall buildings, wide roads, and economic growth, but by how it treats its most vulnerable and hardworking citizens. If sanitation workers continue to die in sewers and society remains silent, it's not just their defeat, but the defeat of democracy as a whole.

We must acknowledge that the real filth lies not in the garbage heaps, but in the mindset that divides people along caste lines. The day this mental filth is cleared, India will truly be worthy of being called a clean, civilized, and humane nation.

Gen Z Is Not Apathetic, Democracy Has Failed Them

Lately, it has become fashionable to diagnose the younger generation with every political defect imaginable. They are labelled as impatient, intolerant, distracted, ideologically shallow, seduced by algorithms and incapable of sustained civic engagement. If they protest, they are reckless. If they withdraw, they are apathetic. If they distrust institutions, they are cynics. Such judgments are often confidently delivered by those who built, inherited or presided over the very systems now losing credibility. Perhaps, the real question is not what has gone wrong with the youth, but what has gone wrong with democracy. To understand the political mood of the Generation Z, or Gen Z, one must first understand the world in which they came of age. They did not inherit the post-war optimism that shaped earlier political imaginations, nor did they grow up in an era where prosperity seemed expandable, institutions appeared stable or progress felt inevitable. Instead, most young people have spent their formative years amid democratic backsliding, intensifying inequality, broken promises on climate change, perpetual wars, polarised societies, a once-in-a-century pandemic and an acute cost-of-living crisis, making even ordinary aspirations feel remote. Now, they confront the added anxiety of automation and artificial intelligence (AI) reshaping the labour markets, before even entering them fully. They were taught the language of rights, inclusion and sustainability, while watching governments repeatedly fail to honour these very commitments. They grew up learning about the ideals of the

United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals while witnessing a world unable, or unwilling, to meet them. Previous generations inherited treaties, welfare compacts and the promise of a better future. Today's youth have inherited the rhetoric of those promises, but little of their substance. It is therefore misleading to describe young people as 'politically indifferent,' as many are not indifferent at all, merely unconvinced. Recent research supports this distinction. A 2025 study by Protect Democracy and the Centre for Information and Research on Civic Learning and Engagement (CIRCLE), examining how the Gen Z views democratic life, identified three broad tendencies observed among young citizens. The first group values democracy in principle but participates only passively. The second remains detached, expressing frustration through minimal engagement. While the third is actively dissatisfied, eager for change, yet vulnerable to more radical or anti-system responses if no meaningful avenue for reform becomes available. This evidence does not suggest youthful irrationality, rather a looming legitimacy crisis. Hannah Arendt argued that political power is not a possession governments hold by default. Power exists when people act together, continuously renewing public authority through participation, and vanishes when they disperse. Once popular participation withers, institutions may retain force, procedure and spectacle, but they lose their vitality. Consent becomes thinner, trust becomes more fragile and democratic systems get hollow.

Vijay Gets Math Right, But Trust Deficit Can Be His Government's Achilles' Heel

Actor-turned-politician Vijay has moved closer to achieving his goal - becoming the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu. Yes, you can hear a collective sigh of relief among supporters of the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) all over the state.

After twists and turns that would put a Kollywood pot-boiler to shame, TVK chief Vijay can finally show the 120 MLAs-elect in his support to Tamil Nadu Governor Rajendra Arlekar. The extension of support by the VCK and a change of heart by the IUML helped Vijay cross the finish line after much huffing and puffing. On Friday evening, Vijay's request for an invite to be sworn in as chief minister had been turned down because his numbers were two short of the majority mark of 118. That is because the VCK had postponed its decision to Saturday, while the IUML refused to extend support. Meanwhile, the AMMK accused the TVK of forging the signature of its lone MLA from Mannargudi to make it seem he was extending support. That is an allegation that could still queer the pitch for the TVK. Vijay would do well to keep his fingers crossed and his legal arguments ready. But through Friday night and early hours of Saturday, one man - Thol Thirumavalavan of the VCK - kept the TVK waiting. The inordinate delay led to speculation that some hard bargaining was taking place behind closed doors, even though the VCK denied any demands were made and said it was because one of its two MLAs was not in Chennai. Its letter of support said "unconditional support" but the nature of cabinet formation and early decisions would shed light on what the VCK has got in return for its support. After all, there is nothing called a free lunch in pol-



itics. Will Vijay now provide a stable government? Highly unlikely. To understand what Tamil Nadu politics may look like in the next few months - and why it will be marked by trust deficit - it is important to understand what unfolded behind the scenes. After Vijay's initial two attempts to convince Lok Bhavan about his numbers failed, the TVK began serious attempts to get the DMK allies - the CPI, CPM, VCK and IUML, all four parties with two MLAs each - on board. In fact, 'proper attempts' would be the right phrase because, according to VCK general secretary Sinthanai Selvan, the TVK in the post-results phase had sent messages over WhatsApp seeking support instead of Vijay personally reaching out to Thirumavalavan. "How are we supposed to understand seeking support through a WhatsApp message?" he asked. The indignation was justified. This time, Vijay personally called up Thirumavalavan to seek his support. Having learnt an important lesson that Gen-Z mode of communication is frowned upon by traditional politicians, the TVK also received help from the Congress top leadership that had a vested interest in making the coalition arrange-

ment work. The Congress had received flak for deserting the DMK and had been labelled as "backstabbers". Chairperson of the DMK Parliamentary party, Kanimozhi, even shot off a letter to the Lok Sabha Speaker, informing him that the DMK MPs no longer wanted to be seated alongside the Congress MPs in the House. If Vijay fell short, the Congress too would have been left with egg on its face. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi worked the phones to reach out to Thirumavalavan, the IUML leadership, which is part of the UDF in Kerala, and leaders of the two Left parties. All four were part of the DMK-led Secular Progressive Alliance (SPA) with the Congress in Tamil Nadu. Stalin was reportedly reluctant to see the four alliance partners go because once the Congress + Left + VCK + IUML supported the TVK, it would give Vijay the reputation of being anti-BJP, a tag the DMK wanted exclusively for itself. The movement of VCK and the IUML could result in a loss of the Dalit and minority votes that otherwise accrue to the DMK. The developments over the last 48 hours, when the prospect of an alternative in the form of an

AIADMK-led government supported by the DMK from the outside gained traction, proved decisive in determining which way the four parties would go. According to CPM general secretary MA Baby, the DMK wanted the two Left parties to support the AIADMK-led formation. The CPI and CPM refused. They realised that if they did not jump ship, they would be indirectly aiding in the formation of such a government. Particularly when the PMK, whose presence is anathema to the VCK, would be part of such a formation. A DMK-AIADMK political arrangement, it was also felt, would not be stable in the long run. The parties, therefore, went back into a huddle to do a SWOT analysis of the decision to support a Vijay-led coalition. The parties had good reasons to consider the offer favourably. The TVK offer was like a lifeline to the two Left parties, still nursing the wounds of their humiliating defeat in Kerala. The "outside support" to the TVK government allows the CPI and CPM to be part of the power structure in a big state like Tamil Nadu. The VCK chief had reason to worry about the erosion in his Dalit vote bank. 28 SC MLAs were elected on the TVK ticket - four of them in general constituencies.

# Global oil stockpiles deplete at record pace due to Iran war disruptions

The world has burned through oil inventories at a record speed as the Iran war throttles flows from the Persian Gulf, eating into the very buffer that protects against supply shocks. The rapidly shrinking stockpiles mean that the risk of even more extreme price spikes and shortages is getting ever-closer, leaving governments and industries with fewer options to cushion the impact of the loss of more than a billion barrels of supply, two months into the near-closure of the Strait of Hormuz. The sharp depletion will also mean the market stays vulnerable for longer to future disruptions even after the conflict ends. Morgan Stanley estimates global oil stockpiles dropped by about 4.8 million barrels a day between March 1 and April 25 — far exceeding the previous peak for a quarterly drawdown in data compiled by the International Energy Agency. Crude accounts for almost 60% of the decline, and refined fuels the rest. Crucially, the system also requires a minimum level of oil, which means that the “operational minimum” is reached long before the inventories actually hit zero, said Natasha Kaneva, JPMorgan Chase &



Co.'s head of global commodities research. “Inventories are acting as the shock absorber of the global oil system,” she said. But “not every barrel can be drawn.” There are some signs that the drawdown may have slowed slightly in recent days, according to Goldman Sachs Group Inc., which pointed to weaker demand from China, the world's top oil importer — leaving more available for other buyers. Still, global visible oil stocks are already close to their lowest since 2018, the bank said. Estimating global inventories involves both art and science. A large part are

strategic caches of crude and fuel controlled by governments, either directly or by requiring the industry to maintain a level of reserves that can be released when needed, or a combination of the two. But there's also a huge amount in commercial stockpiles — the inventories of oil producers, refiners, traders and distributors held as part of normal business operations. The most immediate points of stress are in a handful of fuel-import-reliant countries in Asia, with traders pointing to Indonesia, Vietnam, Pakistan and the Philippines as the biggest worries, potentially hitting

critical levels of supplies in as little as a month. Larger economies in the region, particularly China remain comfortable for now. However, European jet-fuel stocks are also depleting fast just as summer vacations approach, and some analysts predict they could hit critical levels as soon as June. Operational Minimum JPMorgan's Kaneva warns that inventories in the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development could reach “operational stress levels” early next month, if the strait doesn't reopen, and then “operational minimum” floors by September.

That's the point when the world hits the bare minimum amounts of oil needed for pipelines, storage tanks and export terminals to function properly. The US, which has become the supplier of last resort to the world, has already drawn down domestic inventories of crude and fuels to below historical averages as exports surge. US crude stocks, including the nation's Strategic Petroleum Reserve, have dropped for the last four straight weeks, according to government data. US distillate stockpiles were at their lowest point since 2005 at the end of last week, while gasoline stockpiles were hovering near their lowest seasonal levels since 2014. While America's oil drillers have started to turn the taps on, executives have warned that inventories are likely to keep falling in the short-term. Even if the waterway reopens, Gulf output and shipping is unlikely to return to normal levels any time soon, meaning fuel users could have to dig even deeper into storage tanks. The conflict has already sent physical crude and key fuel prices surging, threatening higher inflation and intensifying the risk of a global recession.

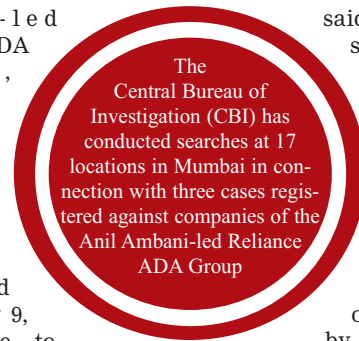
# CBI RAIDS 17 MUMBAI LOCATIONS IN RELIANCE ADA GROUP CASES



The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has conducted searches at 17 locations in Mumbai in connection with three cases registered against companies of the Anil Ambani-led Reliance ADA Group, according to an official statement issued on Saturday. The searches, carried out on May 9, 2026, relate to cases against Reliance Telecom Ltd., Reliance Commercial Finance Ltd. and Reliance Home Finance Ltd., along with their directors. According to the agency,

the raids were conducted at the residential premises of the companies' directors as well as offices of intermediary entities allegedly used for diversion of bank funds. The CBI said the searches were conducted on warrants issued on May 8 by the Special Judge for CBI cases in Mumbai. The agency said it seized incriminating documents during the operation. Investigators also found that multiple intermediary

companies were allegedly operating from the same address, the statement added. The investigation is ongoing. The agency said it had registered seven cases over the past few months against companies linked to the Anil Ambani-led Reliance Group based on complaints filed by various public sector banks and Life Insurance Corporation of India over alleged fraud involving thousands of crores of rupees. According to the CBI, the total alleged loss in these cases stands at Rs 27,337 crore. Earlier, the agency had conducted searches at 14 locations soon after the registration of the cases. The CBI also said two senior executives of Reliance Communications - D. Vishwanath, Joint President overseeing the group's banking operations, and Anil Kalya, Vice President - were arrested on April 20, 2026. The agency alleged that Kalya had actively assisted Vishwanath in handling banking operations and fund utilisation. Both executives are currently in judicial custody.



# Royal Enfield announces Rs 2,200 Cr AP plant amid Kolar showroom Kannada row

**Bengaluru:** Leading two-wheeler manufacturer Royal Enfield has announced plans to establish a massive new manufacturing facility in Andhra Pradesh with an estimated investment of Rs 2,200 crore, a move expected to generate more than 5,000 direct and indirect jobs. Significantly, the announcement comes on the same day that a Royal Enfield showroom in Karnataka's Kolar district came under attack from Kannada activists over a signboard-related dispute. Though the two developments are unrelated, the timing has triggered discussions about Karnataka potentially missing out on another major industrial investment opportunity. Royal Enfield, which already operates a major manufacturing base in Tamil Nadu, had reportedly been exploring options for setting up a second large-scale production unit outside the state for several years. According to reports, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu personally approved the project through the State



Investment Promotion Board (SIPB). The upcoming plant will be established at Satyavedu in Tirupati district, close to the Andhra Pradesh-Tamil Nadu border. The new facility will mark Royal Enfield's first major production unit outside Tamil Nadu since the company began operations in India in the 1950s. The project is expected to be implemented in two phases with a total investment of around Rs 2,200 crore. Officials said the plant would have an annual production capacity of nearly nine lakh units once fully operational. In addition to

boosting manufacturing output, the project is expected to create employment opportunities for more than 5,000 people in the region. The Andhra Pradesh government has reportedly allocated around 267 acres of land for the project. Along with the manufacturing facility, a dedicated vendor park will also be developed to support component suppliers and improve logistics efficiency. The vendor ecosystem is expected to reduce transportation costs and speed up production processes. As per the proposed timeline, the first phase of the project is likely to be completed by

2029, while the second phase is expected to be operational by 2032. The new facility is aimed at meeting the growing domestic and international demand for Royal Enfield motorcycles. Meanwhile, in Karnataka, members of the Karnataka Nadu Nudi Swabhimani Vedike staged a protest at a Royal Enfield showroom in Kolar over alleged non-compliance with Kannada signboard regulations. Activists reportedly entered the showroom premises, questioned officials over the prominence of Kannada on display boards and issued a warning notice.

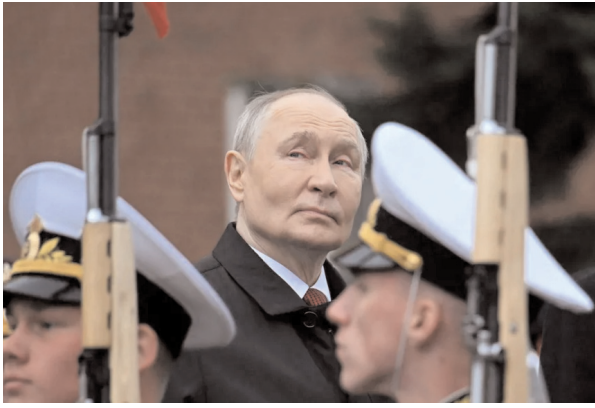

# PUTIN DENOUNCES NATO AT SCALED BACK VICTORY DAY PARADE



Vladimir Putin has used his annual Victory Day speech in Moscow's Red Square to justify his war in Ukraine and denounce Nato. Speaking in front of hundreds of military personnel, the Russian president said he was fighting a "just" war and called Ukraine an "aggressive force" that is being "armed and supported by the whole bloc of Nato". His remarks come amid muted celebrations across Russia to mark the nation's biggest national holiday, commemo-

rating the Soviet Union's victory over Nazi Germany. Ahead of the celebrations, curtailed for security reasons amid fears of Ukrainian attack, Russia and Ukraine agreed to observe a three-day ceasefire, announced by US President Donald Trump on Friday. Following the parade, Russia's defence ministry accused Ukraine of breaking the ceasefire, without providing details. Ukraine did not immediately comment. For the first time in years, no armoured vehi-



cles or ballistic missiles featured in Moscow's Victory Day parade. But under tightened security, military personnel marched in droves across Red Square. Addressing the crowd, Putin started his speech by commemorating the sacrifices of Soviet soldiers during World War Two. "The great feat of the generation of victors inspires the soldiers carrying out the goals of the special military operation today," he said, referring to the war in Ukraine which has been

going on for more than four years. "They are confronting an aggressive force armed and supported by the whole bloc of Nato. And despite this, our heroes move forward." The Russian leader went on to celebrate the citizens of Russia, making reference to the contributions of workers to its war effort, including scientists, inventors, military correspondents, doctors and teachers. "No matter how military tactics change, the future of the country is being provided for



by the people," he said. Immediately after the speech, cannons fired successive rounds before music was played by a military brass band. Foreign guests in attendance included Belarus's leader Alexander Lukashenko, Malaysia's King Sultan Ibrahim and Uzbekistan's President Shavkat Mirziyoyev. Slovak Prime Minister Robert Fico, the only representative of the EU to attend, was also pictured meeting Putin at the Kremlin ahead of the parade.

Markedly fewer world leaders turned up compared to last year's 80th anniversary parade, which featured 27 leaders including China's President Xi Jinping and Brazil's Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva. Russian TV viewers were shown a broadcast of soldiers on the front lines after Putin's speech. Following the ceremony in Red Square, Putin laid flowers at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier before attending a reception at the Kremlin.

## Farage's Reform UK wins big in local elections, splintering two-party system and piling pressure on Starmer



London — The hard-right Reform UK party led by Nigel Farage has surged in England's local elections while the governing Labour Party has slumped, deepening doubts about Prime Minister Keir Starmer's ability to govern and further splintering Britain's traditional two-party political system. Results announced early Friday showed that the Reform party of Farage — a chief architect of Brexit and an ally of US President Donald Trump — had gained more than 600

seats, while Labour had lost more than 450. The Conservative Party — the other half of the duopoly that has dominated British politics for more than a century — lost nearly 300 seats. "Labour are being wiped out by Reform in many of their most traditional areas, and what you're going to see later on today is the Conservative Party being wiped out in their heartlands," Farage told reporters Friday morning, as some councils were still counting the votes.

## Hungary's new PM sworn in after landslide victory over Orbán



Hungary's new prime minister, Péter Magyar, has been sworn in, almost a month after he steered his Tiszsa party to a landslide victory, sweeping away 16 years of rule by Viktor Orbán. Tiszsa holds 141 seats out of 199 in the new parliament — up from zero, a result of the party being founded just two years ago. Tens of thousands of people are expected to take part in a "celebration of freedom and democracy" outside parliament in Budapest, along the shores of the Danube. Magyar has told Hungarians to step through the "gateway of regime change". Orbán's Fidesz party crumbled from 135 to 52 seats, and shows signs of imploding. He and other key party figures have decided not to take their seats in parliament, and their political future is uncertain, beyond a vague commitment to "rebuild the national side". Each day brings new revelations or allegations of corruption against a party which has governed Hungary almost unchallenged since 2010. Magyar has promised a "change of system" as well as a change of government. It is not known whether Orbán will attend Saturday's open-

ing session of parliament, even as a simple guest. "The main priority is to set up the government... on the ruins of the previous one," Zoltán Tarr, incoming Minister for Social Relations and Culture, told the BBC. "We are ready to face a very grim economic situation. But at the moment, we just don't know the severity." A spending spree initiated by the Orbán government in the past eight months came on top of years in which state contracts and funds were channelled to business circles close to Fidesz. The budget deficit has already swollen close to the planned target for the whole year. The incoming government is at pains to show that it is morally stronger than Fidesz. One prominent businessman, György Wáberer, who switched from Fidesz to Tiszsa a week before the election, told a journalist he had donated €242,000 (280,000, \$331,000) to Tiszsa. Magyar promptly returned the money to him. When Magyar's brother-in-law, Márton Melléthei-Barna, was named justice minister, the new government was bitterly criticised on social media.

## Japanese council votes to remove unconscious mayor



A council in Japan has voted to remove its mayor who has been unconscious for several months. Kikuo Hatakeyama, 72, has served as the mayor of Hachirogata in north-east Japan since 2008, but fell ill in February and suffered a brain hemorrhage. The town assembly unanimously passed a no-confidence motion against the mayor meaning he will automatically lose his position on 19 May. Japan's national asso-

ciation of town and village assemblies says it's rare for a no-confidence motion to be filed against a mayor due to illness. The motion said removing Hatakeyama was a tough choice, but administratively necessary. His wife asked the town assembly last month to assess whether he could continue in his post, saying that it would be the best option for him to resign as mayor, according to the Japan Times.

## IRAN ACCUSES US OF 'RECKLESS MILITARY ADVENTURE'

Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi has accused the US of opting for a "reckless military adventure" every time a "diplomatic solution is on the table". Iranians would "never bow to pressure", Araghchi said in a post on X, a day after each side accused the other of launching attacks in the Strait of Hormuz and as the US fired on more Iranian vessels. Despite the clashes, Trump said the ceasefire was intact. It is meant to enable talks to end the war that the US and Israel launched in February. Iran was expected to respond to US proposals on Friday, according to US Secretary of State Marco Rubio. "I hope it's a serious offer, I really do," Rubio said during a visit to Italy. Iran has been controlling the Strait of Hormuz as well as attacking US allies in the Gulf in retaliation.



for the US and Israeli attacks. Some 20% of the world's oil and liquefied natural gas uses the crucial waterway whose blockage has sent prices soaring. Early this week, Trump launched — and then paused — a US military operation to help free some 2,000 vessels which have been stranded in the area since February. The US is also maintaining a naval blockade of Iranian ports in order to

entering Iran," the statement said. Centcom said US forces were preventing more than 70 tankers from entering or leaving Iranian ports. Later on Friday the US signalled its readiness to host a new round of Israel-Lebanon talks next week aimed at halting the clashes in Lebanon between Iranian-backed Hezbollah and Israeli forces. A spokesperson for the US State Department said the "intensive" talks on 14 and 15 May would aim to deliver "lasting security for Israel, and sovereignty and reconstruction for Lebanon". The US and Israel say any peace deal requires full disarmament of Hezbollah, but the Shia militant group rejects the talks, which began between the Israeli and Lebanese ambassadors in Washington last month.

## ANGER AND RESIGNATION IN TENERIFE AS HANTAVIRUS SHIP APPROACHES

As the MV Hondius cruise ship approaches Tenerife, the people of the Spanish island await it with a mixture of uncertainty and, in some cases, anger. The Spanish government has agreed with the World Health Organization (WHO) that the passengers of the vessel, which has seen an outbreak of the hantavirus, should be allowed to disembark there this weekend. It has travelled from Cape Verde, where three people were evacuated due to illness. On Friday, some Tenerife dock workers gathered outside the Canary Islands' parliament building in the town of Santa Cruz, to voice concerns that the imminent arrival could pose



a health risk for them. They blew whistles, sounded vuvuzelas and brandished banners. "We're unhappy at the idea of being allowed to work in a port without special safety measures or information when an infected boat is approaching," said Joana Batista, of a local port

workers' union, who was taking part. Some of her colleagues have threatened to block the arrival of the cruise ship if their demands are not met. "If the boat is going to stop here, then it can do so, but with the necessary measures in place," she said. "Local people need to be told how

this will affect them, how the passengers will be transported. We need reassurance above all." Nearby, watching the protest, was nutritionist María de la Luz Sedeño, who agreed with much of what the demonstrators were demanding and could barely contain her fury. "This is the last straw when it comes to everything the people of the Canary Islands have to put up with," she said — an apparent reference to the continuing arrival of thousands of undocumented migrants in boats from North and West Africa. For some Canary islanders, hosting migrants is a source of pride — while for others, like Sedeño, it is a cause of frustration.

## Hantavirus cases nearly doubled in Argentina in the past year. Experts say climate change is to blame



Hantavirus cases in Argentina have almost doubled in the past year, with the country recording 32 deaths alongside its highest number of infections since 2018. The rise comes as Argentine authorities race to trace the footsteps of a couple who traveled extensively in the country and later died amid an outbreak of the virus on the cruise ship MV Hondius. The vessel left port in Ushuaia, southern Argentina, on April 1 and is currently on its way to Spain's Canary Islands. It is expected to reach Tenerife's industrial port of Granadilla early Sunday morning. Experts blame climate change and habitat destruction for the rise in cases of the disease, which is usually caused by exposure to the urine or feces of infected rodents. The current season, which started in June 2025, has already seen 101 confirmed hantavirus cases, Argentina's health ministry said — compared with just 57 during the same period last season. Not only did the country record an unusually large number of cases this year, but it also

recorded one of the highest lethality rates of recent years, with the number of deaths marking an increase of 10 percentage points compared to the previous year. And those numbers exclude the outbreak on the cruise-ship MV Hondius, the origins of which remain unknown. While no cases of the hantavirus have been recorded in Ushuaia in recent decades, according to the ministry, the virus is endemic in some other areas of Argentina. Argentine authorities believe the couple visited various regions of the country as they crossed back and forth over the border with neighboring Chile on several occasions, and into Uruguay, before joining the cruise. Four geographic regions of Argentina are historically high-risk areas for contagion: Northwest (in the provinces of Salta, Jujuy, and Tucumán), Northeast (Misiones, Formosa, and Chaco), Center (Buenos Aires, Santa Fe, and Entre Ríos), and South (Neuquén, Río Negro, and Chubut).

## Australia's right-wing One Nation party scores historic parliamentary win

Australia's One Nation party has won its first-ever lower-house seat in what is being seen as an important test for the right-wing populist party. With most ballots counted, One-Nation candidate David Farrer has won an unassailable 60% of the primary vote in Farrer, a vast regional constituency in New South Wales. Independent candidate Michelle Milthorpe is far behind. The contest was triggered by the resignation of Sussan Ley, who quit when she was ousted as leader of the opposition conservative Liberal Party. While the result will not affect the Labor government's large majority, it is a clear sign that voters are moving away from traditional political parties in Australia. Saturday's poll was



the first federal test of One Nation's support after the party recorded the second-highest number of votes out of any political party in the South Australian state election in March. As news of the party's victory emerged, One Nation leader Pauline Hanson told supporters this was not just a win for Farrer, but a win for Australia, and

said the party was "coming after those other seats". Farrer — whose background is in agribusiness — told supporters One Nation had "reached the end of its beginning, we're going through the ceiling". "What are we doing tonight? We're like a mason, with a chisel, and a hammer and we're re-carving the letters into the Australian democra-

cy." Australia has a preferential voting system where voters rank candidates from their most to least preferred. The final tally is calculated as a challenge between two candidates after preferences are distributed to ensure that the winner is supported by a majority. One Nation had never won a federal lower house contest before Saturday's poll. In the late 1990s Hanson initially held her seat as an independent before losing her re-election bid. She has since returned to the parliament as a senator. During the campaign, Farrer said he had "lost a bit of faith" in the major parties. "They say one thing to your face and then go and do something else in parliament," he said.

## "FILMING FOR HIS YOUTUBE CHANNEL": BCCI THREATENS LEGAL ACTION ON EX-PLAYER

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) have made further crack-downs after implementing their stricter anti-corruption policies during IPL 2026. Their latest move is set to put players, broadcasters, officials and their family members under the scanner. According to reports anyone associated with the BCCI or any IPL team has been strictly prohibited to make videos in the ground, and could even face legal notices if caught doing so. This comes just a day after sources told NDTV that the BCCI had asked Punjab Kings (PBKS) pacer Arshdeep Singh to stop vlogging for social media. According to a Times of India report, some officials and broadcasters have already been reprimanded by the BCCI after they were seen filming videos near the players and match officials area (PMOA) during IPL 2026. "There have been a few



breaches by a few commentators. One former international cricketer was found making videos on his phone near the dugout in a tense situation of a match. The BCCI team acted swiftly and got him to stop the recording," BCCI sources said, as per the report. "There could be a case of sending legal notices to an ex-cricketer who was found filming for his YouTube channel. The board has clearly mentioned that anybody wearing BCCI and IPL official attire can't be seen filming at the ground," the sources added. The report further added that the BCCI is concerned about the "reel culture" among IPL teams and players. Immediate family members of players have also been told to refrain from posting videos and pictures during the IPL.

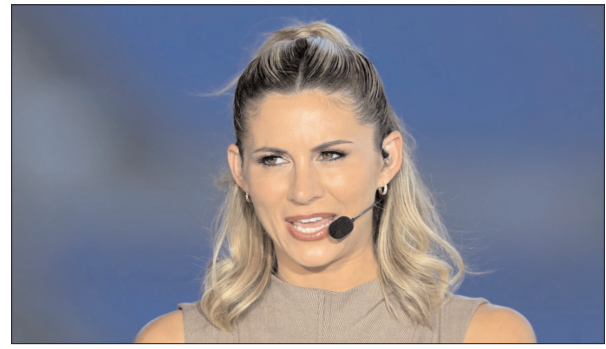

## DID SNEAKO PERMANENTLY GET BANNED FROM AUSTRALIA? STREAMER REVEALS REASON BEHIND SHOCKING LIFETIME BAN

Controversial streamer and internet personality Sneako is back in headlines again after confirming that he has officially received a lifetime ban from Australia. The creator, whose real name is Nicolas Kenn De Balinzhazy, addressed the situation during a livestream on May 8, 2026, after reports started spreading online that he had been deported from the country. According to Sneako, those reports were completely false, but he did confirm that Australian authorities revoked his visa and told him he could not return. The situation first started gaining traction on May 6, when reports claimed Australian Minister for Home Affairs Tony Burke had taken action against the streamer. During



his livestream, Sneako explained that the ban was not connected to any criminal charges or convictions. Instead, he claimed officials issued what he called a "character ban," meaning they believed his public image and online persona were not suitable for the country. The livestream quickly went viral, with clips spreading

across X, Kick communities, and YouTube commentary pages. Sneako says Australia banned him because his "character is not fit." While reacting to the reports, Sneako told viewers that he was never deported and was simply staying in Australia quietly before the ban happened. He claimed he had not even been streaming during his stay and was mostly filming vlogs and hanging around casually. During the livestream, Sneako explained that Australian authorities revoked his visa under what he described as a character-related decision. According to him, officials informed him that he could not return to the country again.

## BLASI WINS VUELTA FOR FIRST GRAND TOUR VICTORY



Spanish cyclist Paula Blasi triumphed at the women's Vuelta a Espana to claim her first Grand Tour victory. The 23-year-old UAE Team ADQ rider began the day second overall, behind the Netherlands' Anna van der Breggen of Team SD Worx-Protime. However, four-time Giro d'Italia champion Van der Breggen was dropped on the final vicious ascent, with slopes of up to 23%. Blasi then crossed the final stage line in second, behind Switzerland's Petra Stiasny of Human Powered Health at the summit of L'Angliru, to secure the title. The home win cements Blasi's status as an emerging talent after winning the Amstel Gold Race and performing impressively at La Fleche Wallonne and Liege-Bastogne-Liege. Blasi, who began cycling competitively in 2024 after an injury ended her athletics career, was asked by a reporter how she

would react if someone had previously told her she would win the Vuelta. "I would think you were joking," she said. The tour was decided four kilometres from the finish on the punishing slopes of L'Angliru, when French rider Marion Bunel attacked and Blasi kept pace, while Van der Breggen fell behind. One of cycling's most difficult climbs, it is the first time the Asturias road has featured in the women's Vuelta. "It was crazy," Blasi said of the climb after her victory. "The best thing I could do was not think about it. I knew it would be about 50 minutes and so I said, 'just keep going, keep on your pace.' But I started to see Anna [van der Breggen] struggling and I said 'let's go for it.'" Behind Blasi, 36-year-old Van der Breggen came second overall, with Team Visma Lease a Bike rider Bunel, 21, finishing third overall.

## Ailing Novak Djokovic Falls To Early Italian Open Exit Ahead Of Roland Garros



Novak Djokovic slumped to an early elimination from the Italian Open on Friday, crumbling to a second-round defeat at the hands of qualifier Dino Prizmic which leaves question marks about his physical condition ahead of Roland Garros. Tennis icon Djokovic was sent packing by big-hitting Croatian Prizmic, who claimed the biggest scalp of his young career with a stunning 2-6, 6-2, 6-4 win on centre court in Rome. Djokovic, a 24-time Grand Slam winner, was making his comeback from a shoulder

injury in the last big tournament before the French Open, which starts later this month. And the world number four was unsure as to whether he would be back to his best for the clay-court Grand Slam, simply saying "I hope so" when asked by reporters whether Paris would see the all-conquering "Nole" of old. "Let's see what happens," said Djokovic, who lamented persistent physical problems in the twilight of his stellar career. "I don't recall the last time in the last couple of years of preparation where I didn't have any physical issues coming into a tourna-

ment," said Djokovic. "It's always something, it's kind of a new reality that I have to deal with." Djokovic wore shoulder strappings in his first tournament since losing in the last 16 at Indian Wells in March, after pulling out of tournaments in Miami, Monte Carlo and Madrid. He hadn't previously been knocked out this early in a tournament since the Madrid Open last year, and he looked a long way from the player who has won six titles at the Foro Italico. He breezed into a one-set lead but then buckled under the weight of Prizmic's powerful hitting

which has led to the 20-year-old rising to a career-high world ranking of 79. Prizmic has beaten two top 10 players in a matter of weeks with sixth-ranked Ben Shelton succumbing in the second round in Madrid last month. Djokovic is Prizmic's idol, and a landmark win gives the young talent a match with either Ugo Humbert or Vit Kopriya and a chance to make the fourth round of a Masters 1000 event for the first time. "It was big moment for me. It was also big thing to share the court with a legend," said Prizmic. "So yeah today, I

mean, I played unbelievable. I'm very happy about my performance." Zverev, Swiatek through Earlier, Alexander Zverev eased into the third round after comfortably dealing with fellow German Daniel Altmaier in straight sets, 7-5, 6-3. The second seed is in good form having reached the final in Madrid last weekend and he is again on the other side of the draw to red-hot favourite Jannik Sinner. The 29-year-old has been beaten by Sinner in four Masters 100 events this year and will have his work cut out if he is to add to his 2017 and 2024 titles in Rome.

## VIJAY VARMA, TAMANNAH BHATIA CROSS PATHS AFTER ALLEGED BREAKUP

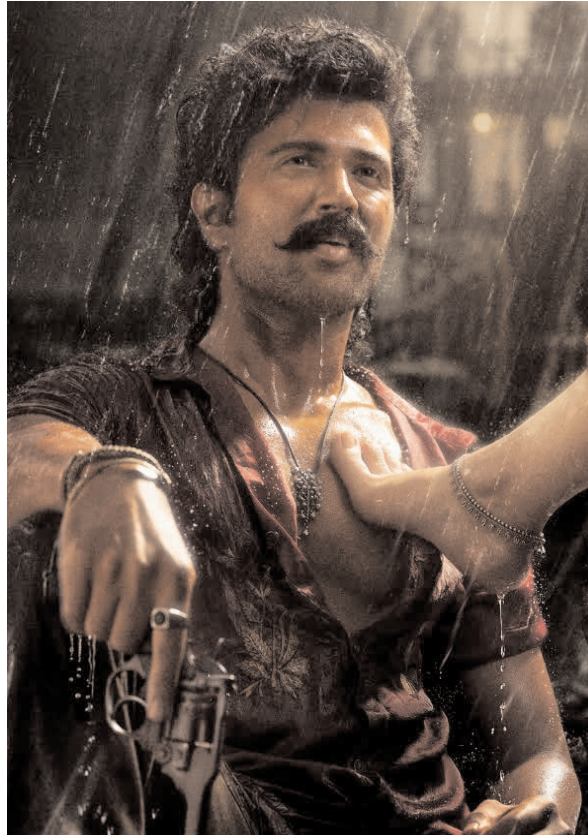

December 2027 as the potential release window for Kalki 2.

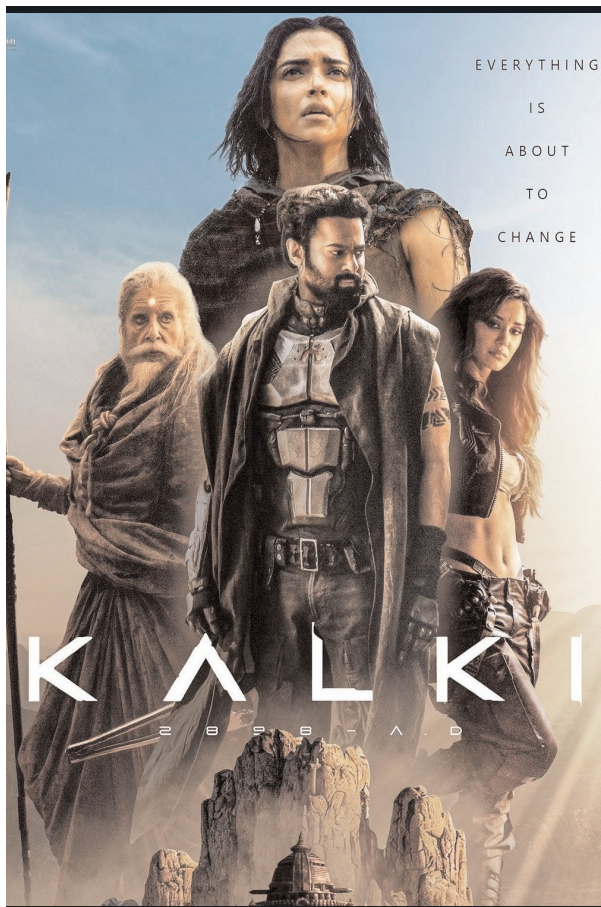
There are reports that Nag
