### Insurance Employees' Association Extends Solidarity to SBI Staff Federation Strike

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) All India Insurance Employees' Association has extended its full fraternal support and solidarity to the nationwide strike and agitational programmes being organised by All India State Bank of India Staff Federation on May 25 and 26 against anti-worker policies and unjust practices affecting bank employees. In a letter



addressed to AISBISF General Secretary L. Chandrasekhar, AIEA General Secretary Shreekanth Mishra stated that the issues raised by bank employees were not confined to the banking sector alone, but reflected wider concerns relating to workers' rights, job security, dignity of labour and democratic trade union functioning across the financial sector and public services. The association expressed strong support for the demands of SBI employees, including recruitment of messengers and armed guards to address the shortage of subordinate staff, opposition to outsourcing of regular jobs, withdrawal of the discontinuation of inter-circle transfers for employees recruited after 2019.

Venkateswar as a Member representing the Rayalaseema Region. The Board will function with Shri Dola Veeranjanya Swamy, Minister for Differently Aabled, Senior Citizens & Transgender Welfare, as Chairperson and Smt. A. Suryakumari, Secretary, Department of Women, Children, Differently Aabled & Senior Citizens Welfare, as Member Secretary.

### AP PGCET-2026 Results Released 93.29% PASS PERCENTAGE RECORDED



The South India Times, Visakhapatnam: The results of AP PGCET-2026 entrance examination conducted for admissions into M.Tech and M.Pharmacy courses across the state were released on Thursday by state education minister Nara Lokesh. Announcing the results through Twitter, the minister congratulated the students who qualified in the examination. He stated that the results can also be accessed through the Higher Education Council website as well as through WhatsApp number 9552300009. Andhra University Vice-Chancellor Prof. G.P. Rajasekhar released the detailed results at his office. He stated that a total of 12,012 candidates had applied for the entrance examination, out of which 9,990 candidates appeared for the test. Among them, 9,320 candidates qualified, registering a pass percentage of 93.29 percent. AP PGCET Convener Prof. P. Mallikarjuna Rao said that the examinations in 13 subjects were successfully conducted from April 28 to 30. The Vice-Chancellor congratulated the officials for conducting the examinations peacefully and efficiently. Registrar Prof. K. Rambabu participated in the programme.

Addressing a press conference, he said that as part of modernising pharmacy education in tune with emerging industry requirements, subjects such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), Machine Learning, Pharmaceutical Automation and Python programming will be introduced into the B. Pharmacy curriculum from the 2026-27 academic year.



with the approval of the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), will now be taught with updated and advanced technological components as per PCI guidelines. He added that state-of-the-art computer laboratories are being established in the School of Pharmacy to support the new curriculum. Highlighting the institution's academic achievements, he said that among more than 5,000 pharmacy colleges across the coun-

try, GITAM School of Pharmacy secured the 33rd rank in the NIRF rankings announced by the Union Ministry of Education in recognition of its teaching and research standards. He further noted that the institution had also achieved a global ranking of 1001.

Prof. Srinivas said that nearly 35 pharmaceutical companies from across the country had conducted campus recruitment

drives at GITAM to recruit pharmacy students. He added that research activities are being carried out at the School of Pharmacy in collaboration with premier central research institutions. He informed that admissions are currently open for B. Pharmacy and M. Pharmacy programmes in specialisations including P h a r m a c e u t i c s , P h a r m a c o l o g y , P h a r m a c e u t i c a l

Chemistry and Pharmaceutical Quality Assurance.

Students who have passed Intermediate with BiPC or MPC subjects securing at least 50 per cent marks are eligible for admission into B. Pharmacy through the GITAM Admission Test (GAT-2026), he said, adding that admissions will also be offered based on EAMCET ranks. Scholarships will be provided to meritorious students, and opportunities for admission into M. Pharmacy will also be available for B.Pharmacy graduates. Students seeking admission into pharmacy courses may apply online through the official GITAM website. Prof. Annapurna, Head of Admissions Anish Kumar, L. Srinivas and others were present at the press conference.

He said that National Dengue Day, observed every year on May 16, is being conducted this year with the slogan "Community Participation for Dengue Control - Check, Clean, Cover." Speaking on the occasion, he stated that dengue spreads through the bite of the Aedes mosquito and advised people to immediately undergo tests at nearby government hospitals if they experience symptoms such as high fever, severe headache, pain behind the eyes, muscle and joint



pains, vomiting, and red rashes on the skin. He urged the public to prevent water stagnation in and around their houses and ensure that coolers, refrigerator trays, flower vases, discarded tyres, coconut shells and other containers do not become breeding grounds for mosquitoes. He further said that

rallies, group meetings, and awareness programmes would be organised on May 16 with the cooperation of Panchayat, Municipal, Education and Anganwadi departments. District Malaria Officer Varaprasad Reddy, Assistant Malaria Officers and malaria staff participated in the programme.

### Special Trains Introduced to Clear Summer Rush

The South India Times, Visakhapatnam : In view of the heavy passenger rush during the summer season, Indian Railways has announced special train services between Visakhapatnam and SMVT Bengaluru. According to railway officials, Train No. 08581 Visakhapatnam - SMVT Bengaluru Weekly Special Express will depart from Visakhapatnam at 3:20 PM every Friday from May 22 to June 26, 2026, and will reach Bengaluru at 1:50 PM the following day. In the return direction, Train No. 08582 SMVT Bengaluru - Visakhapatnam Weekly Special Express will leave SMVT Bengaluru at 3:50 PM every Saturday from May 23 to June 27, 2026, and arrive in Visakhapatnam at 1:30 PM the next day. A total of six trips will be operated under this special service. The trains will halt at Duvvada, Anakapalle, Elamanchilli, Samalkot, Rajahmundry, Eluru, Vijayawada, Ongole, Nellore, Gudur, Renigunta and Jolarpettai stations.



Railways has also decided to operate a one-way special train between Kacheguda and Visakhapatnam to ease additional passenger congestion. Train No. 07810 will depart from Kacheguda at 8:45 PM on Friday, May 15, 2026, and reach Visakhapatnam at 9:30 AM the following day. The train will stop at Malkajgiri, Charlapalli, Kazipet, Warangal, Rayanapadu, Eluru, Rajahmundry and Samalkot stations. Senior Divisional Commercial Manager K. Pawan Kumar appealed to passengers to make use of these special train services.

### Rs.1.57 Crore Sanctioned for Water Works in Nagalapuram

Tirupati (TSIT)The government has sanctioned Rs.1.57 crore for 68 water conservation works under the Jaladhara-Jalaharati programme in Nagalapuram Mandal to improve irrigation and groundwater levels. The works include restoration of feeder canals, field canals, village tanks, check dams, recharge structures, and water ponds, benefiting 3,612 acres across several panchayats. Special desilting works are also being taken up in Rajulakandrigram Panchayat under MGNREGA, where workers are restoring canals to improve water flow into tanks and support agriculture. Officials said the programme would help increase groundwater levels, provide irrigation benefits.

**NIA files 7,500-page chargesheet in Red Fort car bomb blast case that killed 11**

New Delhi (TSIT): The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a massive 7,500-page chargesheet against ten accused in connection with the deadly car bomb explosion near the Red Fort area in Delhi that claimed 11 lives last year, officials said on Thursday. The high-intensity Vehicle-Borne Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED) blast took place on November 10 last year and had also left several people injured besides causing extensive damage to property. According to the NIA, all ten accused, including the alleged mastermind Dr Umer Un Nabi, who is now deceased, were linked to Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind (AGuH), an offshoot of Al-Qaida in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS). The chargesheet was filed before the NIA special court at Patiala House Courts in New Delhi. The Ministry of Home Affairs had designated AQIS and its affiliated organisations as terrorist outfits in June 2018.

**Gadkari chooses bus over convoy, pushes fuel conservation drive**

New Delhi (TSIT): Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari on Thursday opted to travel by bus instead of using his official convoy while inspecting the Sant Dnyaneshwar Maharaj Palkhi Marg project, reinforcing Prime Minister Narendra Modi's message on conserving fuel amid ongoing global instability. During the inspection visit, Gadkari said the country must focus on reducing dependence on conventional fuels and accelerate the transition toward cleaner energy alternatives. He noted that he has been advocating sustainable mobility and alternative fuels for nearly two decades. The minister highlighted that since 2004, efforts have been underway to promote fuels such as ethanol, methanol, biodiesel, LNG, and green hydrogen.



## CM Revanth slams centre over NEET-UG Cancellation

Hyderabad TSIT BUREAU:

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy strongly criticised the Union Government over the cancellation of NEET-UG 2026, describing the decision as "authoritarian and arbitrary" and accusing the Narendra Modi-led government of repeatedly failing to protect the integrity of the country's examination system. Chief Minister said the unilateral cancellation of NEET-UG 2026 has pushed nearly two crore students and their families into anxiety and uncertainty. He alleged that as many as 93 examination paper leaks had taken place during Prime Minister's tenure, exposing serious systemic failures in the conduct of public examinations across the country.

Revanth Reddy compared the NEET cancellation to the demonetisation decision, stating that both had shocked the nation and severely affected ordinary people. He said the Centre's "thoughtless and negligent" approach has jeopardised the future of lakhs of students who spent years preparing for competi-



tive examinations under intense pressure. Chief Minister expressed concern over the financial and emotional burden borne by parents, many of whom allegedly took loans or sold jewellery to support their children's NEET preparation. He said the cancellation had shattered the aspirations of hard-working students due to the Centre's inability to prevent paper leaks and examination irregularities.

Referring to Congress party's "The Paper Leak Decade" white paper, Revanth Reddy claimed that since 2014, at least 93 paper leak incidents involving central and state-level examinations had affect-

ed nearly two crore students nationwide. He alleged that BJP-ruled states had emerged as major centres for examination leaks, with Gujarat alone witnessing 14 major incidents.

The Chief Minister also recalled that several major national examinations, including NEET-UG, UGC-NET, CSIR-NET and NEET-PG, were cancelled in 2024 following allegations of irregularities. He further pointed out that the Uttar Pradesh Police Constable examination, attended by nearly 48 lakh candidates, was also cancelled within days due to question paper leaks.

Despite the enactment of the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act in February 2024, Revanth Reddy alleged that the Centre delayed its notification until June 2024, allowing major scandals to surface in the meantime. Assuring support to students and parents, the Telangana Chief Minister said the State Government would stand firmly with every affected student and family in the wake of the NEET-UG cancellation.

## Pakistan will face unprecedented consequences if it targets India: Rajnath

Jaipur (TSIT)

Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday issued a stern warning to Pakistan, stating that any hostile act against India would invite consequences "never witnessed before".

Reaffirming India's policy of "zero tolerance" against terrorism, he said the country would respond decisively to any threat to its sovereignty and security. Rajnath Singh said India's national security policy has undergone a historic and comprehensive transformation over the past decade under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

He said India has adopted a policy of "zero tolerance" against terrorism and conveyed a strong message to the world that any hostile act against the country would invite decisive consequences.

"India has sent a clear message to the world that we maintain a policy of 'zero tolerance' against terrorism. If Pakistan attempts to cast an evil eye on us, then what has never happened before will inevitably occur," he added. The Defence Minister was addressing the unveiling ceremony of the statue of Shri Rao Dudaaji in Merta, Nagaur district, on Thursday. He said Rajasthan has always inspired the nation through its

traditions of sacrifice, courage and patriotism, noting that families across the state proudly contribute soldiers to the armed forces. Referring to Rao Dudaaji as a symbol of valour and righteousness, he said his life continues to inspire younger generations with ideals of courage, commitment and devotion to justice and dharma. Rajnath Singh said India's armed forces have demonstrated exceptional military capability through the 2016 surgical strikes, the 2019 Balakot airstrikes and, most recently, through "Operation Sindoor".

Referring to the Pahalagam terror attack, he said the nation responded firmly and made it clear that India does not provoke

others, but will respond decisively when challenged. "If Indian citizens are attacked, we will retaliate even across borders. No boundary can stop India from defending its people," he asserted. Emphasising women empowerment, the Defence Minister said respect for women is deeply rooted in Indian civilisation. He highlighted initiatives such as "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao" and the Nari Shakti Vandan Amendment Act aimed at strengthening women's representation and safety.

Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma, speaking on the occasion, said that under the guidance of the Prime Minister and the leadership of the Defence Minister, rapid modernisation of the armed forces has strengthened India's self-reliance in the defence sector. He praised the role of the Indian Army during "Operation Sindoor" and said Rajasthan's brave heroes continue to inspire the nation with their legacy of sacrifice and patriotism. The Chief Minister said the state government is committed to preserving and promoting Rajasthan's glorious cultural and historical heritage for future generations.

## EC announces staggered rollout of SIR phase 3 in 16 states, 3 UTs

NEW DELHI (TSIT):

The Election Commission on Thursday announced the rollout of phase 3 of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in 16 states and three Union Territories involving 36.73 crore voters in a phased manner beginning May 30. The states and UTs where the SIR will be carried out are Delhi, Odisha, Mizoram, Sikkim, Manipur, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh, Telangana, Punjab, Karnataka, Meghalaya, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Nagaland, Tripura, Dadar and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu. Punjab, Jharkhand, Karnataka and Telangana are opposition-ruled among the states where the SIR exercise will be held.

Over 3.94 lakh booth level officers (BLOs) will go house-to-house of 36.73 crore electors during the latest poll roll revision exercise. They will be assisted by 3.42 lakh booth level agents (BLAs) appointed by political parties during the enumeration phase. The schedule for the SIR in Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh will be announced later keeping in view weather conditions in snow-bound areas, the EC said in a statement. Once phase 3 is completed, the entire country will be covered except



Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

The schedule of SIR phase 3 has been fixed keeping in view the common field machinery with the ongoing house listing of the ongoing Census exercise. The final electoral rolls of the 16 states and three UTs will be published on different dates this year, beginning with Odisha, Sikkim, Mizoram and Manipur on September 6 and ending with Tripura on December 23. The final poll roll of Delhi, along with those of Karnataka, Meghalaya, Maharashtra and Jharkhand, will be out on October 7. The SIR has already been conducted in Bihar, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Puducherry, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep. A "special revision" was conducted in Assam. In his message on the latest phase of SIR, Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar said, "I appeal to all electors to enthusiastically participate in phase 3 of the SIR and fill their enumeration forms."

## KJS India Expands Manufacturing Presence with New Unit in Telangana

Chinese President Xi Jinping has described the emerging phase of relations with the United States as a "new era" of more stable and managed competition, while issuing a pointed warning over Taiwan, calling it the most sensitive and dangerous issue in bilateral ties. The remarks came as Xi and US President Donald Trump opened a landmark bilateral summit at the Great Hall of the People in Beijing,



their first face-to-face meeting in China since 2017, setting the tone for discussions expected to focus on strategic rivalry, trade, and regional security.

## Storm fury kills 74 across UP; Prayagraj worst hit as rain, strong winds wreak havoc

Lucknow (TSIT)

At least 74 people lost their lives and hundreds were injured after a powerful storm accompanied by heavy rain and hail lashed several parts of Uttar Pradesh on Wednesday, leaving widespread destruction across the state.

The sudden storm, with wind speeds reportedly reaching up to 100 kmph, uprooted trees, damaged houses, brought down electricity poles and disrupted normal life in dozens of districts.

Prayagraj emerged as the worst-affected district, recording 17 deaths across five tehsils. Officials



said the victims included five women, four children and eight men. The storm also killed around 20 livestock and damaged at least 16 houses in the district.

Several tragic incidents were reported from different parts of the state. In Unnao, a 70-year-old

farmer, identified as Ram Ashray, died after being crushed by a falling mango tree. In another incident, nine-year-old Ansh lost his life when a eucalyptus tree collapsed in Asiwani.

Other severely affected districts included Bhadohi, where 10 people

died, Fatehpur with eight deaths, and Badaun with six fatalities.

The storm caused massive disruption to electricity supply after hundreds of power poles and trees were uprooted. Roads were blocked in many areas, vehicles were damaged and several localities were remained cut off immediately after the storm.

The India Meteorological Department has issued a Yellow Alert for 38 districts, including Lucknow, Prayagraj, Jaunpur and Banda, warning of continued heavy rainfall, lightning and strong winds reaching up to 60 kmph in the coming hours.

## Telangana to Procure Every Grain Produced by Farmers Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy

Hyderabad TSIT: Telangana Roads, Buildings and Cinematography Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy on Thursday reaffirmed the State Government's commitment to protecting farmers' interests and ensuring hassle-free paddy procurement across Telangana, stating that every grain produced by farmers would be purchased at Minimum Support Price (MSP).

Along with Civil Supplies and Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and District In-charge Minister Adhuri Laxman Kumar, the Minister inspected the paddy procurement centre at Chetla Chennaram village in Nalgonda district and interacted directly with farmers. The Ministers reviewed paddy arrivals, stocks already shifted to rice mills, pending quantities and the timeline for completion of procurement. Officials were directed to accelerate procurement operations on a war footing, increase the availability of lorries and ensure immediate transportation of procured paddy to rice mills. Later, a high-level review meeting on paddy procurement in the erstwhile Nalgonda district was held at



Udayaditya Bhavan in the Collectorate premises.

Addressing the meeting, Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said Telangana is the only State in the country procuring the entire paddy produce cultivated by farmers. He stated that the State Government had mobilised nearly Rs.22,000 crore for the procurement programme to ensure farmers do not incur losses. "Farmers are the providers of food to the nation. Let us work two extra hours if necessary to ensure they do not face inconvenience," the Minister told officials. Minister instructed authorities to appoint one dedicated officer for every rice mill and complete procurement operations at all centres before May 25. He said paddy production

in Telangana had increased significantly due to expansion of irrigation facilities and farmer-friendly policies. Acknowledging challenges such as shortage of hamalis and transportation delays because of record paddy arrivals during the Yasanti season, he assured that the government was addressing the issues on priority. Minister Komatireddy said that following a video conference with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, the government had prepared an action plan to complete the procurement process within ten days. Officials were instructed to increase transport vehicles to ensure uninterrupted movement of paddy from procurement centres to rice mills. He also assured that immediate payments would

be made to farmers for procured grain and reiterated that no farmer should panic as the government would purchase every last grain produced in the State.

Highlighting the Congress government's contribution to agriculture, the Minister said major irrigation projects such as Sriram Sagar Project, Nagarjuna Sagar Dam and Srisaillam Dam were constructed during Congress regimes, laying a strong foundation for agricultural growth in Telangana.

"Some people once mocked Telangana and underestimated its potential. Today, Telangana stands as the number one State in paddy production in the country," he remarked. The Minister further stated that efforts were underway to complete the Srisaillam Left Bank Canal project soon, which would help bring additional agricultural land under cultivation.

Legislative Council Chairman Gutha Sukender Reddy said nearly 67 percent of procurement had already been completed in Nalgonda district and appealed to millers and transport agencies to cooperate with the government for smooth procurement operations.

He said the government had already provided over 70,000 jobs to unemployed youth and more employment opportunities would be announced soon.

Over-Confidence  
Without Numbers

Rahul Gandhi's recent assertion at a rally in Gurugram, that the Congress alone can defeat the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), is puzzling. Not only does it betray a blissful misreading of the outcome of the recent round of five assembly elections, but it also suggests that Rahul hasn't quite grasped the gravity of the upcoming political and electoral challenges the Congress must overcome before he can position his party as the sole viable opposition force. The eight-day delay in choosing V D Satheesan as the new Kerala chief minister illustrates the sloth that pervades the party's political responses. Even so, it would be churlish to begrudge Rahul Gandhi and the Congress their moment of joy. They have ended a nearly two-year-long drought of assembly victories by reclaiming Kerala from the Left with a handsome margin. Rahul Gandhi also made an adroit manoeuvre in Tamil Nadu, which is likely to see the Congress back in government in the state after 59 years. He signed on to a long-term partnership with actor Vijay and his TVK, hoping to ride on the back of their stunning electoral performance to regain relevance in a state once dominated by the Congress till the Dravidian parties swept it into a political wilderness in 1967.

Taking Chances

The decision to dump DMK, a loyal ally for 23 years, will have its own repercussions within the Opposition INDIA bloc. But Rahul Gandhi, buoyed perhaps by his Kerala victory, seems to have decided to take his chances and go with the flow. However, these gains must be juxtaposed with the verdicts from Assam and West Bengal. In Assam, the BJP posted a third consecutive victory and its best-ever performance to win a three-fourths majority with its alliance partners. The Congress managed just 21 seats and had to swallow the humiliating defeat of its state president and chief ministerial face, Gaurav Gogoi. But it is the BJP's phenomenal storming of the West Bengal citadel that should set alarm bells ringing in the Congress and send it scurrying to the drawing board to chalk out future strategies. Apart from strategic defections in the ruling Trinamool Congress party's strongholds through a contentious Special Intensive Review of electoral rolls by the Election Commission and the overwhelming presence of nearly half the country's paramilitary forces for the duration of the election, the BJP successfully trumped Bengal's famed cultural and regional sub-nationalism with an emotive paradigm that few thought would overwhelm the state.

One Person In Gandhi Family Is Smiling Over Satheesan's Kerala Win - Despite Rahul

After what seemed like a lifetime in the political timeline of Kerala, the Congress has chosen VD Satheesan as the state's next Chief Minister. Satheesan's elevation is, first and foremost, a political lesson of immense significance for every aspirant to high office across parties. The establishment may have had its preferences. The arithmetic within the system may have appeared to favour others. Yet, what ultimately prevailed was sustained political capital earned through relentless groundwork, public credibility, and organic acceptability among cadres and citizens alike. For five years, Satheesan invested in the ground. In the end, even the high command had to concede to the weight of public sentiment conveyed by those who truly understood the pulse of Kerala. That is why this is not just Satheesan's victory. It is also KC Venugopal's defeat. More importantly, it is a major face loss for Rahul Gandhi. Venugopal was no ordinary contender. He was the AICC general secretary in charge of organisation, widely regarded as one of the most powerful figures in today's Congress, and seen as Rahul Gandhi's preferred choice for Kerala. Reports indicated that a substantial bloc of newly elected Congress MLAs backed him; one account put the number at 47 out of 63. Yet, despite that institutional heft, and despite Rahul's apparent preference, he could not cross the final line. Satheesan did. When Kamal Nath became Chief Minister in Madhya Pradesh, Digvijaya Singh was seen as having played a part; when Ashok Gehlot edged ahead in Rajasthan, Ahmed Patel's influence mattered; in Chhattisgarh, Bhupesh Baghel refused to yield to the alleged two-and-a-half-year power-sharing



arrangement; in Karnataka, Siddaramaiah has continued to resist recurring pressure over leadership change. Against that background, Kerala stands out. Here, it was not a regional strongman defying Delhi, but Rahul Gandhi's own preferred man - Venugopal himself, supposedly among the most powerful men in the party - failing to secure the office he wanted. The question many Congressmen will ask is stark: if Rahul Gandhi and KC Venugopal together could not deliver Kerala, who will fear their displeasure now?

How Kerala Forced Delhi To Retreat

After the UDF's emphatic victory - 102 seats in a 140-member Assembly, with the Congress winning 63 - the party should have moved swiftly to install a government. Instead, it spent 10 bruising days unable to settle the leadership question. What ought to have been a moment of consolidation became an exhibition of hesitation. The delay deepened the contrast between the two principal claimants. Venugopal had organisational clout, Delhi access, and legislative numbers projected in his favour. Satheesan had the political

In the opening hours of Donald Trump's first day of meetings in China, Xi Jinping appears to be sending a clear message: let's address the hard stuff upfront. Central to Xi's messaging was the warning that the "Taiwan question" remains fundamental to the future of Sino-US ties. At the same time, Xi emphasised the possibility of Washington and Beijing evolving into economic partners rather than strategic rivals. And in his outreach to American CEOs, he signalled China's willingness to further open its economy to US businesses. These almost perfunctory messages are along expected lines, and most don't expect much to come out of Trump's maiden visit to China during his second term. The real intrigue regarding this trip stems from the domestic and global political circumstances Trump finds himself in. As he boarded the Air Force 1 to Beijing, the general perception was that a significantly weakened American leader was meeting his Chinese counterpart. "The question is, is this perception accurate? And if yes, does it give Xi greater leverage? Let's consider Trump's position across three different parameters. On the broad question of geopolitics and the US's position in the world as the preeminent power, America has taken an undeniable beating. The summit with Xi was originally scheduled to take place in April, but Trump postponed it to May with the hope that he could end the war in Iran before taking the trip to Beijing. But that didn't happen; the Strait of Hormuz continues to be closed, and Washington and Tehran are arguably as close to a deal as they were before this war started. More than the actual outcome of the war, what seems to be looming in the background is the supposed reputational hit the US will suffer from



initiating this stalemate of a war. Standard international relations speak suggests that historically, empires die when they overstretch. However, neither this war will end the US's superpower status, nor has any of the US's previous reckless outings in Iran, Afghanistan or Vietnam. On the question of reputational ramifications, the verdict so far seems to be a bit mixed. While the US Central Command's inability to retain its dominance over Hormuz is striking, it might be a stretch to extrapolate from it. After all, Hormuz is arguably the trickiest of chokepoints. More structurally, the fact that no other country has the capacity to even pretend to be a security partner (or guarantor) to such a vast number of countries makes Washington distinctly indispensable. When it comes to Trump's economic performance, while the US markets seem to be scaling new heights, a closer look paints a

much darker picture. According to research by UBS, just 42 stocks are responsible for the S&P 500's total returns. This number generally hovers around 100. Rapid economic growth and booming markets - driven by the AI boom - seem increasingly schizophrenic in the face of rising inflationary pressure from the tariff and energy shocks. The US just recorded its highest wholesale inflation reading since 2022, with producer prices rising 6.1%. Its ramifications are being felt across the economy. "Higher energy and food costs, combined with SNAP and Medicaid cuts, are pressuring the bottom-income quintile," noted a recent research note by Goldman Sachs. It shows how even the US middle class is beginning to see a fall in its disposable income. Another report by the Financial Times shows that the prices for petrol have risen to \$4.55 a gallon, from \$1.9 on the eve of the war. Meanwhile, diesel, which fuels the US industry and trans-

portation, has hiked to \$5.66, close to the all-time high of \$5.82. Expectedly, this is affecting Americans unevenly. While the top third of US income earners have been unaffected, the bottom third have reduced their consumption by 7%. Additionally, the hit to the US fiscal math is also significant. Before the war commenced, the US Federal Reserve was expected to cut interest rates. It was precisely to cut rates that Trump brought in his handpicked choice as the next Fed Chair, Kevin Warsh. As inflationary pressure begins to creep up, the Fed might have to seriously contemplate a rising rate. For Trump, rate cuts seem mostly off the table before the midterm elections later this year. Lastly, what does this mean for Trump politically, especially given the lingering midterms? Trump rose to power by positioning himself as the messiah of large swathes of the US population that had been left out during

the decades of US-led hyperglobalisation. During the 2024 polls, Trump was highly popular among the lower-middle- and middle-income Americans. These will be the most hit sections by the rising costs. Besides, the MAGA consensus was all about staying away from mindless wars. How the protracted Iran war will affect Trump's popularity among his MAGA base also remains to be seen. Now add to it China's stranglehold over a large portion of merchandise goods and its growing willingness to weaponise its dominance over critical inputs and rare earth magnets, and Trump's relatively weak hand vis-à-vis Xi makes itself obvious. "Trump arrives in Beijing as an unpopular leader in a weakened position. But Xi may be satisfied with incremental gains for now. He can afford to play a long game," argued Gideon Rachman in the Financial Times. However, it is precisely this "long game" being played by China that requires some unpacking. There are primarily two components here. First, China's dominance over global supply chains has now reached unprecedented levels, as was evident in its \$1.2 trillions goods surplus in 2025. But much like the US, headline numbers hide the real story. The Chinese model is built on severe financial repression, which suppresses household savings and consumption, and directs the financial surplus to industries in the form of cheap credit. Following the 2020 real estate crash, the surplus money was rapidly directed to a plethora of industries - batteries to electronic vehicles to solar - in the form of staggering central and local government subsidies. These are precisely the sectors that are now flooding global markets with cheap exports and account for China's gargantuan trade surplus.

As Chief Minister, VD Satheesan Will Now Have To Learn To Dance To Many Congress Tunes

During the culmination of the massive Puduyuga Yatra - led by the then Leader of the Opposition and now Chief Minister-designate, V.D. Satheesan - Rahul Gandhi had remarked, "All these leaders dance well, but they need to dance well together." It was a pointed reminder of the necessity for unity in Kerala. Indeed, the only way the UDF could have squandered this election was through internal friction, and they all danced together to a fascinating mandate. The "dance together" advice is still important for Satheesan, as he has been chosen as the next Kerala Chief Minister by the Congress high command and soon will be chosen by the Congress Legislative Party after a tough power-struggle dance with the High Command. Satheesan's case was strong. He led the charge from Kerala's northern tip to its southern coast from February 6 to March 7, with the Puduyuga Yatra projecting his position as the face of the Congress campaign. As the LoP who took the fight directly to Pinarayi Vijayan for the last five years, he made himself a clear alternative. He had, and still has, the categorical trust and support of the IUMML, the UDF's most powerful ally, and is clearly the most dominant public face of the UDF. In contrast to Satheesan's public-facing role, KC Venugopal (KCV) operated as the party's primary decision-maker. Leveraging his proximity to Rahul Gandhi, KCV acted as the master strategist, handpicking candidates and keeping the campaign on track. By choosing not to contest the assembly polls, he avoided sending mixed signals to the electorate. As the central power axis in Kerala, KCV deserves credit for



maintaining party discipline and stepping back from the limelight to prevent any optics of friction. Meanwhile, Ramesh Chennithala, the quintessential Nehru-Gandhi loyalist, served as the campaign committee chief. Though he made a pitch for the top job, many view him as past his prime following the 2021 failure. His only realistic path to the Chief Minister's post this time was as a "consensus candidate" if the rivalry between KCV and Satheesan reached a total deadlock. The Congress High Command faced a dilemma: choose a loyalist like KCV, who would strictly follow the leadership's diktat, or appoint Satheesan, a powerful public figure who often marches - or dances - to his own beat. The main dynamic seems to have been VDS's refusal to budge. He apparently said he will resign from the assembly and not be part of a government under anyone else. This would have

been a disaster. Letting him go would have led to enormous instability and a massive public backlash - the party couldn't afford that after such a stupendous victory. The other dynamic was the categorical support of the biggest ally, the IUMML, which has 22 MLAs. In fact, the BJP has seized on the IUMML's support, accusing the Congress of buckling under the pressure of the League to appoint Satheesan. While this may be a standard political allegation, it appears the BJP is deliberately framing Congress as a "minority-driven" entity, a narrative the party has peddled nationally repeatedly. By doing so, they aim to consolidate a Hindu vote bank in Kerala, seeking an opening in the vacuum left by the LDF's crushing defeat. Leaving political allegations aside, Satheesan is widely regarded as a firmly secular ideologue who views the UDF as a broad social coalition. Unlike many of his prede-

cessors, he has not appealed powerful communal or caste-based interest groups, such as the NSS or SNDP. While this reinforces his secular credentials, it also means he will likely face stiff opposition from these influential lobbies that are used to having a say in the state's governance. Fearing a repeat of the leadership "civil wars" seen in Karnataka, the Congress High Command realised that sidelining Satheesan would trigger a massive public backlash and immediate instability. This decision is one for categorical clarity and dispelling any confusion. Kerala will hope this will be the case for five full years. KCV, as a confidante of the Gandhis, was deemed easier to placate. Interestingly, his initial contention for the post suggests he had the High Command's blessing; he likely wouldn't have challenged Satheesan without a green light from Delhi. VD Satheesan is known for a streak of authoritarianism. A wildlife enthusiast who has scaled all the peaks of the Western Ghats and a voracious reader, he is a bit of a loner who writes his own scripts. This independent "rebel" streak is precisely what worries the High Command; they are loath to lose control over Thiruvananthapuram the way they have over Bengaluru. As Satheesan takes the oath of office, his greatest challenge will be inclusivity. To succeed, he must accommodate the loyalists of both KCV and Chennithala in key positions. He may be the Chief Minister, but he must remain "first among equals" in a large, convoluted dance troupe. To lead Kerala, Satheesan must finally learn to dance together and to dance many tunes between Delhi and Thiruvananthapuram.

## Kumaraswamy Opposes Bidadi Township Project



Bengaluru : Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy launched a sharp attack on the Siddaramaiah Government, stating that "running a real-estate business is not the job of a State Government," and demanded that the Bidadi Township Project, which farmers are opposing, be immediately scrapped.

Addressing a press conference at the party's State office, the Union Minister said that farmers are sitting on the streets declaring that they will not part

ty for this brokerage," Kumaraswamy alleged. He further charged that the State Government is directly involved in a "land racket" by attempting to acquire fertile horticultural land belonging to farmers from eight villages for real-estate purposes. ## BWSSB's Robotic Tech Prevents Road Digging at 399 Sites, Spares Bengaluru Commuters Traffic Nightmare



BENGALURU : In a major relief for the city's daily commuters, the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) has successfully deployed advanced robotic technology to inspect underground pipelines, averting disruptive road excavations at 399 locations over the past six months.

The state-of-the-art initiative, officially launched by Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar last November, was introduced to address pipeline leaks and sewerage faults without paralyzing city traffic. By sending robotic units directly into the underground networks, the board surveyed over 32 kilometers of infrastructure, identifying and repairing critical faults without tearing up the asphalt.

"We understand how frustrating road excavations can be for motorists and the public in a metropolis like Bengaluru," said Dr. Ram Prasath Manohar, Chairman of

BWSSB. "Previously, digging up entire stretches of roads was inevitable to detect pipeline leaks or sewerage faults, leading to massive traffic jams. Following the directives of the Deputy Chief Minister, we deployed this robotic technology. These machines travel inside the pipelines and accurately pinpoint faults without the need for surface digging, saving the public from immense hardship." Key Operational Milestones (November 2025 - May 2026): - Extensive Subsurface Survey: BWSSB's robotic units traversed a staggering 32,661 meters (32.66 km) inside the city's pipeline network to conduct precise, scientific inspections.

- Pinpoint Fault Detection: The non-invasive inspections accurately identified 394 specific defects, allowing engineers to execute targeted repairs with minimal damage to road infrastructure.

## Karnataka Governor Thawar Chand Gehlot to Inaugurate "PanIIT Bangalore Summit 2026", India's Flagship AI & Deep Tech Leadership Summit

Bengaluru : PanIIT Bangalore Summit 2026, presented by the Government of Karnataka and convened by PanIIT Alumni India Association, will be inaugurated by Governor of Karnataka, Thawar Chand Gehlot on May 16 at Taj Yeshwantpur, Bengaluru. Positioned as India's flagship AI and deep-tech leadership summit, the event will bring together 2,000+ delegates, including 250+ founders, 120+ investors, and participants from across the global IIT ecosystem of 500,000+ alumni across 23 IITs.

The summit, under the theme "Sovereignty in Technology," comes at a time when India's position in the global innovation economy is under sharper scrutiny. The concept note says India produces nearly 16% of global AI talent but spends just 0.7% of GDP on R&D, creating a gap between the depth of its talent and its ownership of technology. It argues that while India continues to supply skilled engineers to the world's leading technology powers, the country must now build stronger capabilities in foundational technologies, infrastructure, and scientific research.

Bengaluru, the host city, is central to that conversation. The concept note describes Karnataka and Bengaluru as the epicentre of India's technology



ambitions, citing the state's position among India's top GDP-contributing states and Bengaluru's role as the country's leading hub for venture capital investment. It traces the city's technology journey through multiple waves, beginning with public-sector and strategic institutions such as HAL, NAL, BHEL and DRDO, followed by the rise of IT services leaders such as Infosys, TCS, HCL and Wipro, the consumer-tech wave, and the product and SaaS wave. The current phase, it says, is the fifth wave: deep technology, artificial intelligence and scientific innovation. The summit has been designed as a platform for execution rather than discussion alone. According to the materials, the programme will include high-level plenaries, deep-dive panels and parallel tracks across AI, defence, semiconductors, energy, mobility and healthcare. A curated pitch-a-thon will connect high-potential startups with 200+ venture capitalists.

## CM Vijay's district level law and order, drug menace review on cards

CHENNAI: Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay is learnt to have initiated preparations for a comprehensive review meeting with district Collectors, SPs and senior officials to assess the State's law and order situation, intensify the crackdown on narcotics and streamline the functioning of Tasmac liquor outlets across the State.

The proposed meeting, expected to be held shortly, comes amid the government's sharpened focus on policing, crime prevention and administrative monitoring following Vijay's assumption of office. Highly placed sources said the Chief Minister is expected to hold extensive deliberations with Collectors and Superintendents of Police on district-wise law and order conditions, the rise in narcotics-related offences, and the enforcement measures being undertaken to curb criminal activities.



Since taking charge, Vijay has consistently stressed the need for strict policing and coordinated administrative action to combat the spread of drugs and ensure public safety. The government had announced a series of early initiatives, including the "Singappen" rapid response force aimed at women's safety and the formation of a dedicated anti-narcotic

task force police stations to strengthen surveillance against narcotics circulation.

Officials said the forthcoming review is likely to focus on the effectiveness of police action in sensitive districts, preventive measures taken against organised crime and the status of investigations into major criminal incidents. The Chief Minister is also expected to seek detailed reports

on the steps taken by district administrations to monitor illicit activities and maintain public order, particularly in urban and semi-urban pockets where enforcement agencies have flagged growing concerns about narcotics movement. Apart from crime control measures, the meeting is likely to take stock of the regulation of liquor sales through Tasmac outlets, including crowd management, monitoring mechanisms and compliance-related issues.

Sources indicated that Vijay may issue fresh directives on preventive policing, stronger intelligence coordination and faster administrative response systems to improve governance delivery at the district level. The meeting is also expected to include a broader review of the implementation of flagship government schemes and administrative performance across departments.

## New government launches Singappen Special Task Force in Salem

COIMBATORE: In a significant step aimed at enhancing women's safety in public spaces, the 'Singappen Special Task Force' was launched in Salem on Thursday.

The initiative, introduced under the direction of Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay, focuses on improving rapid response systems and preventive policing for crimes against women. The task force was formally launched by Salem City Police Commissioner Anil Kumar Giri.

As part of the initiative, a specially equipped patrol vehicle fitted with modern surveillance cameras and communication systems has been introduced to enable real-time monitoring and better field coordination during emergencies.

The newly formed unit comprises a team of women police personnel, including a sub-inspector, two special sub-inspectors and two head constables, who will be responsible for patrol-



ling and responding to distress calls related to women's safety.

Commissioner Anil Kumar Giri said the task force has been designed to ensure faster response to emergency calls and complaints involving women,

enabling swift intervention and timely action. He added that the unit will also identify and continuously monitor vulnerable and crime-prone areas to create a safer public environment for women. Officials said the task force will focus on

intensified surveillance in high-footfall locations such as bus stands, railway stations, educational institutions and IT hubs. Police authorities further stated that strict action will be taken against unlawful activities targeting women.

## Chennai: Phase I, extension metro stations get 55 new escalators

CHENNAI: The much-awaited additional escalator facility in phase I stations has finally been added by the Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL).

On passenger demand, a total of 55 escalators have been added across 27 existing phase I and extension stations of CMRL to enhance comfort. With the recent addition of 55 new escalators to the existing 226, the total number of escalators installed across the

CMRL phase I network has now reached 281.

Five escalators have been added each in Tirumangalam and Anna Nagar East stations, four in Vadapalani, three each in Thousand Lights, Anna Nagar Tower and Government Estate (3) and two each in AG-DMS, Ekkattuthangal, Guindy, Thyagaraja College, Wimco Nagar Depot, Central, Washermenpet, LIC, Nehru Park,

Airport, Ashok Nagar and Egmore. One escalator was added at Nandanam, St Thomas Mount, Little Mount, High Court, Mannadi, Teynampet and Tondiarpet stations. "The task of execution and installation of the escalators was a real challenge because the work had to be done mostly outside revenue hours and without adversely impacting accessibility to the existing facilities," said the CMRL official

## Both diet and regular sodas are linked to liver disease, new study finds

Diet versions of beverages are often hailed as healthier than the sugar-sweetened original versions. Research is ongoing regarding the potential dangers of sugar-sweetened and artificially sweetened drinks.

Recent study results identified a link between drinking higher amounts of sugar-sweetened beverages and low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages and an increased risk for metabolic dysfunction-associated steatotic liver disease (MASLD).

Metabolic dysfunction-associated steatotic liver disease (MASLD) Trusted Source involves a buildup of fat in the liver that did not result from drinking alcohol. People with this condition have a possible risk for more significant liver problems or other conditions like cardiovascular disease. A recent study focused on how sugar-sweetened and low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages related to liver health. Based on analysis of over 103,000 participants, higher consumption of both beverage types was linked to a higher risk for MASLD.

Additionally, low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages were linked to a greater risk for liver-related mortality. While the study hasn't been published yet, the findings shed light on the potential risks of these beverages, particularly low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages. The study results were presented at UEG Week 2025, the annual congress of United European Gastroenterology. They are yet to appear in a peer-reviewed journal.

Drinking more than 1 can of any soda daily linked to liver problems

This study was a prospective cohort study where researchers used data from the UK Biobank. Researchers examined data from 103,251 participants who did not have baseline liver disease. The median follow-up was a little over 10 years, and during this time "949 participants developed MASLD, and 103 died from liver-related causes."

Participants reported on their consumption of sugar-sweetened and low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages. Researchers were also able to consider participants' liver fat content based on MRI data. Re-



searchers looked at the associations between drinking these beverages and someone's risk for MASLD. They also looked at liver-related mortality and liver-fat content and their association with the related beverages.

Consuming more than 330 grams (g), or about 1 can, of drinks from either beverage category daily was associated with a higher risk for developing MASLD.

Sugar-sweetened beverages were associated with about a 50% greater risk for MASLD, and low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages were associated with 60% greater risk. The results also found that consuming either beverage type was linked to liver fat content.

At the same time, drinking low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages was associated with an increased risk for liver-related mortality, but sugar-sweetened beverages did not have a significant association. The researchers also found that the association between low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages and liver-related mortality was dose-dependent; drinking more was linked to a higher risk. Swapping soda for water helps lower liver disease risk

When looking at substituting beverages, researchers found that switching out 330 g of either beverage type daily for water helped to

decrease risk for MASLD.

The effect was a little larger when switching out sugar-sweetened beverages for water, which decreased MASLD risk by 14.7%.

Researchers found that switching out the beverage types for each other did not change the risk for MASLD. The findings highlight the potential danger of both beverages, but particularly low or non-sugar-sweetened beverages, on liver outcomes. Study author Lihe Liu, a graduate student in the Department of Gastroenterology at the First Affiliated Hospital of Soochow University in Suzhou, China, explained to Medical News Today that: "The full study has not been published in a peer-reviewed journal yet, which makes it challenging to know the full limitations of the research. However, beverage intake was something reported by participants, which may not have been their true intake. The data also does not establish that consumption of these beverages causes liver problems. It's also unclear what covariates researchers adjusted for in their analyses. The UK Biobank is has its own limitations too, including the fact that it includes primarily white participants, and they tend to be healthier than the United Kingdom's general population. For this reason, additional follow-up re-

search will be helpful.

While more research is required, the findings do give another reason for avoiding drinks like soda and their diet counterparts. It also highlights that opting for water instead may help to decrease MASLD risk.

"Our findings indicate that both sugary and artificially sweetened drinks may carry risks for liver health. Clinically, this highlights the need to guide people toward healthier beverage choices, with water remaining the safest and healthiest option," Liu explained to MNT. Registered dietitian nutritionist Karen Z. Berg, MS, RD, CSO, CDN, who was not involved in this research, advised that: "Many people have the misconception that diet drinks are healthier for you than regular drinks, but this study demonstrates how both are positively associated with MASLD. I highly encourage all patients to stick with water, or carbonated water, for the best health outcomes. Just because something says 'zero calories' or 'less sugar' [it] does not automatically equate with [being] healthier. There are a lot of chemicals that go into those beverages to give them the flavors people crave. Plain water, fruit infused water (homemade), unsweetened homemade iced tea, or seltzer [are] the way to go."

## Could just 1 course of radiotherapy help treat osteoarthritis pain?

Osteoarthritis is the leading cause of disability among adults, and its management involves physical therapy, painkillers, corticosteroid injections, and surgery. A significant number of people with osteoarthritis do not respond to nonoperative treatments or show a decline in responsiveness over time, leaving surgery as the final option. Radiation therapy is a noninvasive alternative for the management of osteoarthritis, but high-quality data from clinical trials on its effectiveness is limited.

A recent randomized controlled clinical trial demonstrated that a single course of low-dose radiation therapy was more effective in reducing pain and improving mobility in individuals with mild to moderate knee osteoarthritis at 4 months after treatment than the control group that did not receive radiation therapy.

These results suggest that low-dose radiation therapy could help delay or prevent surgical interventions in individuals with osteoarthritis.

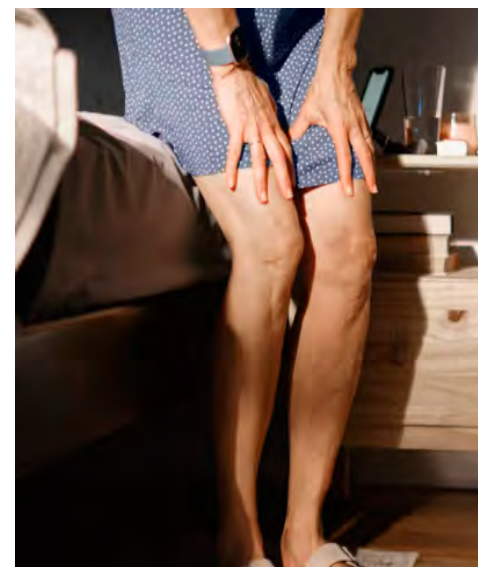
Osteoarthritis Trusted Source is the most common type of arthritis, affecting approximately 33 million Trusted Source individuals in the United States. The pain and stiffness associated with osteoarthritis can be debilitating, and treatment of this condition involves managing these symptoms.

The first line of treatment for osteoarthritis includes physical therapy and oral medications but procedures such as direct injection of medications into the joint and surgery are necessary in more severe cases. Radiation therapy or radiotherapy is an underutilized noninvasive treatment option for osteoarthritis, but data from clinical trials have been mixed.

Data from a randomized controlled clinical trial conducted in South Korea now show that individuals with mild-to-moderate knee osteoarthritis were more likely to experience improvement in pain and mobility at 4 months after receiving a single course of low-dose radiation therapy than their counterparts who received sham treatment.

How radiation therapy could help treat osteoarthritis

Osteoarthritis is characterized by the gradual degeneration of the joints, leading to pain, swelling, and reduced joint mobility. Osteoarthritis typically affects joints in the hands, hips, knees, and spine. Osteoarthritis cannot be reversed, and its treatment involves preventing disease progression and reducing pain and stiffness. These treatments include lifestyle modifications, physical therapy, and medications. Medications in the initial stages involve the use of oral or topical nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) Trusted Source. Direct injec-



tions of drugs such as corticosteroids into the joint are also used in more severe cases to help alleviate pain and inflammation. Long-term use of NSAIDs is associated with adverse effects, including increased risk of gastrointestinal issues and cardiovascular diseases. Moreover, a significant number of individuals do not respond to these treatments or show a decline in responsiveness over time. Surgery is the treatment of last resort in individuals who fail to respond to other treatments. Radiation therapy is a noninvasive alternative for the treatment of osteoarthritis that has been underutilized. Besides its use in cancer treatment, radiation therapy has been used for the treatment of benign musculoskeletal conditions.

Radiation therapy for cancer treatment involves the use of high doses of radiation to kill the cancer cells. In contrast to cancer treatment, radiation therapy for conditions like osteoarthritis involves the use of low doses of radiation.

Inflammation of the joints occurs at the onset of osteoarthritis, and this inflammatory environment leads to the degradation of the joint tissue by enzymes. Low doses of radiation, such as those used in osteoarthritis treatment, exhibit anti-inflammatory effects and also help reduce pain. While low-dose radiation therapy is used in the clinic for osteoarthritis in Europe, its use in clinics in the United States for osteoarthritis declined in the 1980s after the development of new medications. Moreover, there is limited data from randomized clinical trials on the effectiveness of low-dose radiation therapy for treating osteoarthritis, and the existing data are mixed. In the recent study, Kim and his colleagues examined the effectiveness of low-dose radiation therapy in treating individuals with mild to moderate arthritis in a recent randomized, sham-controlled clinical trial.

# US drops \$15,000 visa deposit for foreign fans with World Cup tickets

The bond would be refunded at the end of the visitor's stay. In a statement, FIFA said the announcement demonstrates the ongoing collaboration with the White House "to deliver a successful, record-breaking and unforgettable global event". "We are

While the requirement has now been suspended for football fans from the 50 affected countries, travellers from Iran and Haiti remain barred. But players and coaches from those countries are exempt for World Cup-related travel. Travellers from Ivory Coast and Senegal, both of which have qualified for the tournament, face partial restrictions under an expanded version of that travel ban.

Late last year, the US government also announced that tourists from dozens of countries could be required to provide a five-year social media history as a condition of entry - another immigration policy that could affect visitors coming to the US for the World Cup. Rights groups have warned travellers that such policies could lead to denied entry, arrest risks, expanded travel restrictions, social media screening, racial profiling and increased surveillance.

# Wholesale price inflation rises to 8.3 pc in April

New Delhi: Wholesale price inflation shot up to 8.30 per cent in April, from 3.88 per cent in March, led by a sharp spike in prices of fuel, power and crude petroleum. Wholesale price index (WPI)-based inflation in fuel and power jumped to 24.71 per cent in April, from 1.05 per cent in March. In crude petroleum, inflation was 88.06 per cent in April compared to 51.5 per cent in the previous month. The sharp rise in WPI inflation reflects the impact of the West Asia crisis and the effective blockade of the Strait of Hormuz through which the majority of the crude oil is imported to India. Inflation in food articles was 1.98 per cent in April, compared to 1.90 per cent in March. In non-food articles, inflation rose to 12.18 per cent during April, 11.5 per cent in the previous month, data released by the commerce and industry ministry showed. "Positive rate of inflation in April 2026 is primarily due to an increase in prices of mineral oils, crude petroleum & natural gas, basic metals, other manufacturing and non-food articles,



etc.," the ministry said in a statement. In the fuel and power basket, inflation in LPG was 10.92 per cent in April, against (-) 1.54 per cent in March, while in petrol it was 32.40 per cent, against 2.50 per cent in the previous month. In high-speed diesel, inflation was 25.19 per cent in April against 3.26 per cent in March. Despite a 50 per cent spike in global crude oil

prices, the government has so far held fuel pump and household LPG rates stable to shield households from the impact of the retail price rise of petrol, diesel and LPG. However, prices of commercial LPG cylinders have been raised. WPI-based inflation in fuel and power jumped to 24.71 per cent in April, from 1.05 per cent in March.

# HPCL Dealers Allege Forced Sale Of Expensive 'Power' Petrol Over Regular Fuel

In a letter addressed to HPCL's director-marketing, the Consortium of Indian Petroleum Dealers claimed that dealers in several regions were being forced to push premium petrol to consumers and that ordinary petrol

indents were allegedly being restricted unless converted into power petrol orders. The allegations assume significance at a time when Prime Minister Narendra Modi has appealed for austerity measures, including work-from-home practices and judicious fuel consumption to reduce unnecessary usage. The dealers' body said consumers have a fundamental right to choose their preferred fuel and asserted that retail outlets cannot compel motorists to purchase premium petrol. It also argued that denying

ordinary petrol, which is cheaper by around Rs 19 per litre, places an unfair financial burden on consumers. According to the letter reviewed by NDTV Profit, dealers further alleged that some HPCL regional offices were refusing to clear valid fuel indents unless retailers agreed to increase premium petrol orders. The consortium claimed such practices were creating "artificial constraints" despite public assurances from oil marketing companies that there was no fuel shortage. The CIPD also pointed out

that Indian Oil Corp. and Bharat Petroleum were allegedly continuing regular fuel supplies without similar restrictions in the same regions. Raising regulatory concerns, the dealers warned that any artificial restriction on ordinary petrol availability could amount to a violation of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955. The consortium sought HPCL's immediate intervention to ensure dealers are not coerced into selling specific fuel variants and that fuel indents are processed fairly.

# Honda makes its first annual loss in 70 years

Japanese car giant Honda made its first annual loss in 70 years as its investments in the electric vehicle (EV) market failed to pay off. Demand for EVs has not been as strong as the company forecast, with Honda reporting a total operating loss for the year ending March 2026 of ¥423bn (\$2.68bn; £1.99bn.). The firm said it was scrapping some of its EV production targets and would source parts from China, where prices are lower, to keep costs down. It cited changes in US policy as adding to its losses, including tax incentives having been taken away for US consumers purchasing EVs, and the imposition of tariffs. US consumers could previously receive up to \$7,500 (£5,500) in tax credits if they purchased a new EV, but this was scrapped by President Donald Trump in September 2025. His tariffs on imported cars and auto parts in 2025 also bruised profits at several major auto manufacturers, despite a reduction in the tariffs from 25% to 15%. Honda, which was first listed on the stock market in 1957, has grown over the years to become Japan's



second largest car firm. Analysts said its huge size and legacy nature make it difficult to adapt quickly to fast dips and rises in EV demand. Honda said it was now going to focus on growing its successful motorcycle business, its financial services and its hybrid vehicle manufacturing. It cited North America, Japan and India as "priority markets for its future growth" - although it suspended its plans to build EVs and batteries in Canada. Chief executive Toshihiro Mibe said Honda would scrap its

aims for EVs to make up a fifth of new car sales by 2030. He added that Honda was also scrapping its target for all of its vehicles to be EV by 2040. Honda expects ¥512bn in EV-related losses in the next financial year ending March 2027. Bleak milestone "It's a bleak milestone for Honda but not a surprising one," said Danni Hewson, head of financial analysis at AJ Bell. "Like many legacy automakers it gambled on motorists making a quick move to EVs - and lost as the world shifted." She said

that politics, the cost of living and competition from Chinese companies forced Honda to roll back EV plans and "swallow the costs". Hewson added that even though demand for EVs has risen in the last few months because of rising petrol costs from the US-Israel war with Iran, "companies like Honda are having to adapt on the fly which is tough for businesses of this scale". She said things could get tougher with more "twists and turns" on the horizon for the market.

# CUBA CONSIDERS \$100M US AID OFFER AS ENERGY CRISIS WORSENS

The Cuban government says it is open to reviewing a US offer of \$100m (£74m) in aid, hours after rare protests over worsening power cuts erupted on the Communist-run island. Foreign Minister Bruno Rodriguez said on Thursday that Cuba was "ready to hear the details of the proposal and how it would be implemented". The shortages have been exacerbated by a US-imposed blockade of oil which has squeezed the country's supplies of essentials such as diesel and fuel oil. Hospitals have been unable to function normally, and schools and government offices have been forced to close. Tourism, an economic engine for Cuba, has also been impacted. Cuba has in the past relied on Venezuela and Mexico to supply oil to its refinery system. However, the two countries have largely cut off supplies since US President Donald Trump threatened tariffs on countries that send fuel to Cuba. On Wednesday, the US state department said it was renewing an offer to "provide generous assistance to the Cuban people". Last week, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio had said that Havana had rejected a previous US offer of humanitarian aid worth



\$100m (£74m), a claim Cuba denied. In its statement, the US state department repeated its offer but made it clear that the aid would have to be distributed "in coordination with the Catholic Church and other reliable independent humanitarian organisations", bypassing the Cuban government. It added that the decision now rested with the Cuban regime "to accept our offer of assistance or deny critical living-saving aid and ultimately be accountable to the Cuban people for standing in the way of critical assistance". In his response, Cuban Foreign Minister Rodriguez

said it was unclear whether the US aid offer would be in cash or in-kind assistance. He added that "the Cuban government does not, as a matter of practice, reject foreign aid offered in good faith and with genuine aims of cooperation, whether bilateral or multilateral". He added that the best way the US could help Cuba would be to "de-escalate energy, economic, commercial, and financial blockade measures, which have intensified as never before in recent months". Thursday's comments by Rodriguez follow a warning from the country's Energy Minister Vicente de la O Levy that

Cuba had completely run out of diesel and fuel oil. In an interview with state-run media, de la O Levy said there were limited amounts of gas available, but that Cuba's energy system was in a "critical" state due to the US-led blockade of oil. Cubans have been suffering from extensive blackouts, some of them nationwide, for months. On Wednesday, after the latest power cut affecting large parts of eastern Cuba, hundreds took to the streets in Havana, blocking roads with burning rubbish and shouting anti-government slogans. It marked the biggest single night of demonstrations in the city since Cuba's energy crisis began in January, Reuters reported. Residents of the San Miguel del Padrón neighbourhood could be heard shouting "turn on the lights", AFP news agency reported. Cuban President Miguel Diaz-Canel acknowledged the "particularly tense" situation across the island, which he blamed on the US. "This dramatic worsening has a single cause: the genocidal energy blockade to which the United States subjects our country, threatening irrational tariffs against any nation that supplies us with fuel.

# Flattery and fanfare as Trump welcomed to China - but thorny issues remain

Xi Jinping threw a grand welcome for Donald Trump on the first day of a visit that could reset ties between the rival superpowers. The military honour guard lined up outside the Great Hall of the People to welcome Trump, complete with a gun salute and a band playing the US national anthem. The president paused twice to say hello to schoolchildren cheering with Chinese and American flags. As he shook hands with Xi, he leaned in to pat him on the arm in what appeared to be a gesture of warmth. And he lavished praise on his host. "You're a great leader. I say it to everybody," he declared in what appeared to be unscripted remarks. Later, on his tour of the 15th Century Temple of Heaven, he remarked to reporters that China was beautiful. At the banquet this evening, he called the talks a "cherished" opportunity. It was a remarkable day given



Trump built up his political brand by talking tough on China. "We can't continue to allow China to rape our country, and that's what they're doing," he told a campaign rally in 2016. In 2020, he claimed China has "ripped off the United States like no one has ever done before", and described the Covid-19 pandemic as the "Chinese virus". Before

returning to power, he vowed to "make China pay". At the height of the trade war last year, the two sides had levied tariffs that crossed 100% on each other. A fragile truce followed but one of the main questions hanging over this visit is whether that will last, and what deal would take its place? The others are around Iran - can Beijing help bro-

ker a deal? - and Taiwan, the US ally and self-governed island that China claims as its territory. Beijing put on a spectacle designed to flatter Trump ahead of any deal to prove China's door is open to guests. However, soon after talks began, state media published comments from Xi making clear that tensions over Taiwan could prove challenging. But the meticu-

lous choreography was not just for the benefit of Trump and the 30 CEOs who accompanied him. It was also a show of strength, which Beijing knows will be beamed live across the US and the world. "We are witnessing a historical change," says John Delury, a senior fellow from the Centre on US-China Relations at the Asia Society. "I hesitate to put too much on this specific summit, but the inexorable rise of China to a place where it is legitimately rivaling the U.S. - that is now happening before our eyes. Beijing is now the second world capital." A show for everyone President Xi has been eager to portray himself as a stable global leader in contrast to a mercurial US president. Given the size of China's economy, a number of world leaders, including those from US allies such as Canada, the UK and Germany, have turned up, eager to do a deal with Beijing. China's trade

with the rest of the world has expanded since Trump's first term as it braced for exactly what he warned of: more tariffs. Last year, it flexed its economic and diplomatic muscle, responding to Trump with tit-for-tat tariffs and restricting the export of rare earth minerals essential for advanced manufacturing. Washington came to the table and tariffs were lowered. Xi will believe he has shown the US and the world just how dependent they are on Chinese manufacturing and technology. China now makes a third of the world's goods, processes more than 90% of its rare earth minerals and produces around 60 to 80% of all solar panels, wind turbines and electric vehicles. While concerns about its record on human rights, and its relationships with regimes like Moscow and Pyongyang persist, they seem to have been overshadowed as Trump shakes up the world order.

## LATVIAN PM RESIGNS AFTER ROW OVER STRAY UKRAINIAN DRONES



Latvian Prime Minister Evika Silina has resigned following a political crisis over Russian-bound Ukrainian drones straying into Latvian territory. She had fired her Defence Minister Andris Spruds last week after two drones crashed down in eastern Latvia, criticising his response and appointing a replacement. In protest, Spruds's Progressives party pulled their support for Silina's governing coalition, causing it to collapse months before a planned general election in October. "Seeing a strong candidate for the post of defence minister... political windbags have cho-

sen a crisis," Silina said on Thursday. "I am resigning but I am not giving up." The political fallout was triggered by the incursion of three drones into Latvian airspace on 7 May - the second such accident since the start of 2026. Both Latvia and Ukraine acknowledged that the drones may have been Ukrainian UAVs intended to target Russia whose signals had been jammed, leading them to stray into Latvia. One drone crashed on the ground while another struck an empty oil product storage facility near the town of Rezekne. The third flew in and out of Latvian airspace. There were no casualties or injuries - but local residents told media that the official response to the incident had been delayed and insufficient. "They said the cell broadcast alert system had not been activated for an hour after one of the drones crashed near Rezekne. Silina had said after the incident: 'Something went wrong. We cannot afford for this situation to continue.'

## Former Nigerian minister sentenced to 75 years in rare corruption verdict



Saleh Mamman, a former Nigerian power minister, has been sentenced to 75 years in prison for laundering 33.8bn naira (\$24.7m; £18.5m), a rare conviction against corrupt officials in the West African nation. Last week, Mamman was found guilty of 12 counts, including using private firms to funnel money linked to government-funded power plants. The 68-year-old was sentenced in absentia on Wednesday - according to the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC), Mamman has been "out of circulation" and "without trace" since his conviction. On Monday, the high court in the capital Abuja issued an arrest warrant for Mamman, who was power minister from 2015 to 2021. Mamman, who led the ministry of power under then President Muhammadu Buhari, has not publicly commented on his conviction. However just weeks before he was sentenced, the former minister announced plans to run for Taraba State governor in the 2027 elections, on behalf of Nigeria's ruling party. "Today marks a defining moment in my journey of service to our dear state. With a deep sense of responsibility and unwavering commitment, I have officially

obtained the Expression of Interest and Nomination Forms under the All Progressives Congress (APC) to contest for the governorship of Taraba State," he wrote on social media. Mamman led the ministry of power at a time when President Muhammadu Buhari's administration had promised to tackle corruption. Mamman was eventually sacked by Buhari in a cabinet reshuffle, after what the president called an "independent and critical self-review". During Mamman's sentencing on Wednesday, the high court ordered him to repay 22bn naira (\$16m; £12m). The case is part of a wider anti-corruption drive targeting former government officials. Other high-profile investigations by the EFCC have involved former Justice Minister Abubakar Malami and former Humanitarian Affairs Minister Sadiya Umar Farouq, who was recently declared wanted by the agency. They have both denied the allegations. Mamman's conviction has reignited public anger over Nigeria's long-running electricity crisis - especially as the former minister had promised he would improve matters.

## 'Floating armoury' ship reportedly seized by Iran



A vessel reportedly operating as a "floating armoury" in the Gulf of Oman has been seized by Iranian military personnel, according to the maritime risk management company Vanguard. The ship is now "bound for Iranian territorial waters", the UK's Maritime Trade Operations (UKMTO) organisation said. BBC Verify has checked ship-tracking data from MarineTraffic which

shows the vessel - identified by Vanguard as the Honduras-flagged Hui Chuan - last broadcast its location 70km (40 miles) north-east of Fujairah in the UAE on Wednesday. Hui Chuan's operators told Vanguard it was operating as a floating armoury which stores weapons for security firms who protect ships at sea from attack by pirates. BBC Verify cannot confirm what was on the ship or who it was used by.

## Warning of record global temperatures as chance of very strong El Niño grows

New forecasts show increasing confidence that the developing El Niño in the tropical Pacific Ocean could be one of the strongest on record with warnings of record global temperatures and huge humanitarian impacts. Parts of the Pacific have been warming rapidly with data this week showing sea surface temperatures around 0.5C above normal - one threshold used to suggest the onset of El Niño, a natural warming of the Pacific. It is expected to strengthen over the next few months, peaking potentially as a very strong - or so-called super El Niño - in the autumn. Scientists are concerned about the consequences it could have on global weather patterns, including the likelihood of 2027 being the warmest year on record. In their latest out-



look, the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) suggest El Niño will begin within the month. "They have increased the confidence to a two-in-three chance that it will be strong or even very strong by this winter. The rate of warming seen in the tropical Pacific over the last few weeks has been rapid. Nathaniel Johnson, a mete-

orologist at NOAA described it as a "rare occurrence" should it continue at the current pace - going from the La Niña (a similar cooling pattern) we saw in winter to a potentially strong El Niño, within a year. The Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) in Australia also forecasts El Niño using a slightly stricter criterion where sea surface temperatures in the tropical Pacific must exceed 0.8C

above average. They also look for indications that the trade winds in the western Pacific have reversed; signalling that the warming ocean is beginning to influence the atmosphere. Spring forecasts of El Niño have historically been quite poor, but forecasters have been much more confident than normal this year. While El Niño forms across the tropical Pacific, forecasters look at one region in particular called the Niño3.4, monitoring a three-monthly average of the sea surface temperature compared to the long-term average. A strong or 'super El Niño' is when that goes above 1.5C. Forecasts from the European Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecasts (ECMWF), NOAA and BoM are all pretty much aligned in their outcomes.

## Ukraine rescuers pull dead from rubble of Kyiv flats after massive Russian strikes

At least eight people have been killed, including a 12-year-old girl, in Kyiv after Russia launched a massive overnight drone and missile strikes on the Ukrainian capital and other regions, officials have said. The victims' bodies were pulled from the rubble of a partially destroyed apartment building in Kyiv, where rescuers are still searching for at least 20 people feared missing. Ukraine's emergency service DSNS said. It said 45 people, including two children, were injured. Friday has been declared a day of mourning in the city. It is the third day in a row Ukraine has reported deaths, as Moscow ramps up its assault after a three-day ceasefire expired on Monday.



The overnight barrage saw more than 670 drones and 56 missiles targeting the country, President Volodymyr Zelensky said. This is among the largest attacks Russia has mounted since the start of its full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022. The strikes hit more than 180 sites across Ukraine,

including more than 50 residential buildings, Zelensky added. He said a total of more than 1,560 Russian drones had targeted Ukrainian cities since Tuesday night, describing Moscow's assault as "definitely not the actions of those who believe the war is coming to an end" and urging allies to hold

Moscow accountable. After an urgent meeting with Ukraine's top military and security officials, Zelensky said a "significant number" of drones were shot down, with an "overall interception rate" of 93%. But the same figures for missiles stood at 73%, the Ukrainian leader said, admitting that the "key challenge" remained in how to defend against Russian ballistic missiles. He said the "priority number one" was to secure more deliveries of "anti-ballistic systems and missiles for them". Ukraine has repeatedly said it has a massive shortage of US-made Patriot missile systems which can effectively intercept Russian ballistics. Reacting to the latest Russian attacks.

## Court overturns Alex Murdaugh's murder convictions and orders new trial



A South Carolina court has overturned the 2023 murder convictions of Alex Murdaugh, a disgraced lawyer who was convicted of killing his wife and son. The state's supreme court on Wednesday ordered a new trial for Murdaugh over the June 2021 killings. Murdaugh has been in prison serving two life sentences for the murders of Maggie and Paul Murdaugh. He is also serving two additional 27- and 40-year sentences for state and federal financial crimes. Once a powerful lawyer, the 56-year-old and his legal troubles captivated a global audience and inspired documentaries, podcasts and book deals. The trial itself was also televised. In a 5-0 ruling, the South Carolina Supreme Court said Murdaugh deserved a new trial because the local county clerk had unfairly biased a jury against him. "Both the State and Murdaugh's defense skillfully presented their cases to the jury as the trial court deftly presided over this complicated and high-profile matter," the justices wrote. "However, their efforts were in vain because Colleton County Clerk of Court Rebecca Hill placed her fingers on the scales of

justice, thereby denying Murdaugh his right to a fair trial by an impartial jury." In a statement, South Carolina Attorney General Alan Wilson said his office would "aggressively seek to retry Alex Murdaugh for the murders of Maggie and Paul as soon as possible". Murdaugh's lawyers told US media that their client "has said from day one that he did not kill his wife and son". Last December, Hill pleaded guilty to charges of misconduct in office, obstruction of justice and perjury over accusations that she misused public funds as a clerk and shared sealed court information with a reporter, among other claims. Wednesday's ruling cites a number of comments that Hill allegedly made to jurors during the trial. One juror wrote in an affidavit that Hill made comments telling jurors to "watch [Murdaugh] closely", which she said influenced her decision to find Murdaugh guilty because she thought the clerk was implying he was. A jury found Murdaugh guilty of the murder of his wife and son - who were shot at close range near the family's dog kennels - after an extensive six-week long trial.

## US commerce secretary details 'off-putting' interaction with Epstein in testimony

A congressional panel investigating late sex offender Jeffrey Epstein has released transcripts of interviews with US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick and Ted Waitt, the billionaire co-founder of Gateway computers. Lutnick discussed having three interactions with Epstein - a neighbour of his in New York - which included a visit to the financier's home next door and a trip to his island in the Caribbean after he was thought to have cut ties with Epstein. Waitt testified about his years-long relationship with Ghislaine Maxwell, Epstein's convicted co-conspirator, and his concerns about her working for him. Neither Lutnick nor Waitt



have been accused of any wrongdoing by Epstein's victims. Lutnick appeared voluntarily on 6 May as part of the House Oversight Committee probe. He said he and his wife were invited to Epstein's New York home in 2005 but they left abruptly when he showed them his massage table and made a remark about the kinds of massages he enjoyed.

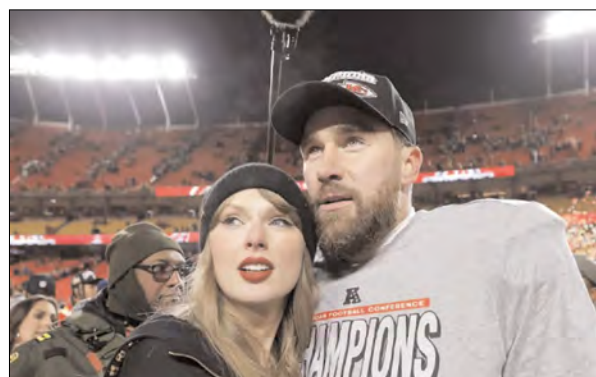

## IPL 2026 Side 's Entire Coaching staff Likely To Be Sacked After Disappointing Season: Report

Two teams in the IPL 2026 are already out of the playoffs race - Mumbai Indians and Lucknow Super Giants. While all the other teams are still in contention, it can be safely said that seventh-placed Delhi Capitals (10 points from 12 games) have only a mathematical chance of qualifying for the next stage. In the midst of this, a report has claimed that DC might be in for some wholesale changes following their big, disappointing season. The report by news agency PTI said Axar Patel is unlikely to remain captain next season, while the coaching staff will be changed too. Axar's numbers as captain and player make for poor reading. He has scored only 100 runs in nine innings at a strike-rate



of 112.50, with 56 coming in one innings and the remaining 44 aggregated across eight knocks, despite batting mostly in the top five. In 12 games, Axar has bowled only 36 overs, exactly three overs per game, and picked up 10 wickets at an economy rate of 8.08. While the economy rate looks respectable consider-

ing the punishment endured by fellow spinner Kuldeep Yadav, Axar has often under-bowled himself. With Delhi Capitals having an arrangement of equal owners - JSW and GMR split management responsibilities in alternate cycles - next season will see Parth Jindal and JSW taking charge of cricket operations.

"With Axar completely failing to prove his leadership worth and mostly being dependent on Hemang Badani and Venugopal Rao for decision-making, it will be a miracle if he retains captaincy next year. "The entire coaching staff is also unlikely to be retained," an IPL source tracking developments told PTI on conditions of anonymity. The decision to ignore a flamboyant batter like Abhishek Porel, not using an all-rounder like Madhav Tiwari consistently, and throwing an out-of-sync youngster like Sahil Parakh into the deep end expecting him to do a Vaibhav Suryavanshi have not gone unnoticed. Parakh undoubtedly has talent but remains a work in progress.

"Stephen Curry has internally told people with the Warriors that he wants to play at least 20 seasons in the NBA," said Brett Siegel, adding, "Will see what that means for an upcoming contract extension for him in August as he will be getting a new deal with the Warriors." Curry still has one year left on his current \$62.5 million contract, but August opens the door for fresh negotiations with Golden State.
