25 VULTURES DIED DUE TO PESTICIDES IN DUDHWA FOREST

Uttar Pradesh forest department has ordered a high-level probe into the death of 25 vultures. Dudhwa forest buffer zone last month reportedly due to poisoning by a pesticide. The principal chief conservator of forests, Uttar



Pradesh has ordered a high-level field investigation by a two-member team of senior forest officials, including Sanjay Pathak (presently posted at NTCA) and DPO Bahraich, Sundaresh. Recent Lab reports from the Indian Veterinary Research Institute 9 (IVRI), Bareilly, confirmed that the 25 vultures died in the area surrounding the Dudhwa National Park from poisoning by "carbofuran", a highly toxic pesticide commonly known by the brand name "Furadan". Initial investigations pointed to the vultures dying after nibbling at the carcasses of the stray dogs. Recovery of some poisonous cooked rice from the spot indicated that the dogs died after consuming the rice and the vultures died due to secondary poisoning after consuming the dogs' carcasses. The lab examination report, analysed the viscera of vultures and dogs. A senior forest official of Dudhwa said that a highly toxic pesticide 'Carbofuran' in the carcasses and food samples collected from the site. Now the department will carry out an awareness programme among the villagers to apprise them about the lethal impacts of such highly toxic pesticides on human health, wildlife and also on the crops. Other required proceedings in the matter would also be ensured. The incident occurred on April 7 in an agricultural field in Semrai village, which falls under the Bhira forest range of the Dudhwa buffer zone. While 25 vultures died, five unconscious vultures were successfully treated and released back into the wild once they were fit to fly. Being an endangered bird species of

Rahul reiterates demand to sack Dharmendra Pradhan over NEET paper leak

New Delhi (TSIT)

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, on Sunday reiterated his demand for the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan over the NEET-UG 2026 exam paper leak, accusing the BJP-led Centre of not taking accountability for such "repeated" instances. Taking to X, LoP Gandhi referred to the alleged irregularities in the NEET-UG 2024 examination and claimed that despite the CBI's investigation and formation of a committee, the exam was not cancelled at that time.

"NEET 2024: Paper leaked. Exam not cancelled. Minister did not resign. CBI set up an investigation. A committee was formed", he wrote. Significantly, the Supreme Court had refused to cancel the 2024 NEET-UG exam due to insufficient evidence of "systemic" leak.

Gandhi drew similarities between the NEET-UG 2026 cancellation and subsequent re-examination, with the 2024 instance. "NEET 2026: Paper leaked. Exam cancelled.

Minister still did not resign. CBI is investigating again. Another committee will be formed," he said. Moreover, Gandhi questioned Prime Minister Narendra Modi for maintaining silence on the issue and asked why the Education Minister is not tendering his resignation despite repeated paper leaks. "Mr. Modi, the country is

asking you some questions - answer them! Why aren't you dismissing the Education Minister who keeps failing repeatedly?" "Why are paper leaks happening repeatedly? Why are you silent time and again on this 'exam paper dis-

cussion?" he asked further. A day before, Gandhi released a video statement in which he claimed that the NEET question paper had been circulated two days before the examination.

Targeting the Education Minister, LoP Gandhi had said: "The whole country knows that the paper was distributed two days before the exam. India's Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan says he has nothing to do with it. You have damaged the very core idea of India." He had alleged that there is a nexus involving the RSS, BJP, and individuals appointed in educational institutions, claiming the system was being used for profiteering at the cost of students' futures.

The Congress leader had further attacked the process of appointing Vice-Chancellors in universities, claiming ideological affiliation had replaced merit and academic competence. The re-examination of NEET-UG 2026 is scheduled to be held on June 21.

Heatwave warning for Telangana for next 7 days

Hyderabad (TSIT):

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a heatwave warning for the next seven days in parts of Telangana. The Hyderabad Meteorological Centre has forecast a gradual rise in the maximum temperature by 2-3 degrees Celsius during the next three days in Telangana.

Some districts are likely to see maximum temperatures crossing 45 degrees Celsius between May 19 and May 24. Heatwave conditions are very likely to prevail at isolated pockets in Adilabad, Komuram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Nirmal, Nizamabad, Jagtial, and Rajanna Sircilla districts on May 18. The maximum temperature in these districts may cross 45 degrees Celsius.

Parts of Telangana experienced heatwave conditions on Sunday, too. According to the Telangana Development Planning Society, the highest temperature of 45.7 degrees Celsius was recorded in Bheemgal mandal in Nizamabad district. Mosra mandal in the same district recorded 45.5



degrees Celsius. Heatwave conditions also prevailed in a couple of mandals of Nirmal district. Dasturabad recorded a maximum temperature of 45.3 while Tanur experienced 45.1 degrees Celsius.

Kollur in Banswada mandal of Kamareddy district saw a maximum temperature of 45.2 degrees Celsius. Sixteen out of 33 districts in the state recorded a maximum temperature of 42 degrees Celsius or above.

The average maximum temperature in the state was 40.8 degrees Celsius.

In the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) limits, the average maximum temperature was 40.4 degrees Celsius. The highest temperature of 42.3 degrees Celsius was recorded in the Goshamahal circle.

India, Netherlands Elevate Ties to Strategic Partnership With Ambitious 2030 Roadmap

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Dutch Prime Minister Rob Jetten have unveiled an expansive five-year roadmap to elevate India-Netherlands relations into a full-fledged Strategic Partnership, signalling a major deepening of cooperation across semiconductors, critical minerals, defense, clean energy, maritime connectivity, water management, healthcare, education, and emerging technologies.

The "Roadmap of India-Netherlands Strategic Partnership 2026-2030," adopted on Saturday (Netherlands time) during Modi's visit to The Hague, lays out time-bound initiatives and institutional mechanisms aimed at transforming bilateral engagement into a comprehensive strategic framework at a time of shifting global supply chains and growing geopolitical focus on resilient economic and technological partnerships.

The roadmap institutionalises annual reviews by the two countries' foreign ministers and calls for regular high-level political engagement between heads of government, cabinet ministers, and senior officials. Both countries also agreed to



intensify coordination across ministries to expand cooperation in sectors identified as strategically important.

A major focus of the partnership is economic cooperation and technology collaboration, particularly in semiconductors and high-tech manufacturing. In one of the most significant announcements of the visit, India's Tata Electronics and Dutch semiconductor equipment giant ASML signed an agreement to support India's first front-end semiconductor fabrication facility in Dholera, Gujarat.

The two sides described the semiconductor partnership as central to building "trusted and

resilient supply chains" and pledged to strengthen cooperation in artificial intelligence, photonics, cybersecurity, quantum technologies, and advanced electronics. The roadmap also seeks to connect the Dutch Semicon Competence Centre with the Indian Semiconductor Mission to support industries, startups, SMEs, and suppliers through talent development and research collaboration.

Prime Minister Modi, while interacting with leading Dutch business executives alongside Jetten, welcomed the growing interest of Dutch firms in India's economic expansion and manufacturing ambitions.

The Agony of a Woman Employee Beyond Words..!

"WHO WILL TAKE CARE OF MY CHILDREN, SIR?" — A MOTHER'S CRY OF DESPAIR

A shocking case of alleged financial exploitation, mental harassment, and workplace intimidation involving a woman government employee in Mahabubabad has become a major topic of discussion across the district. After losing her husband and taking up a government job to secure the future of her two young children, the woman now says she is trapped in a life filled with debt, humiliation, fear, and emotional trauma. "I went out intending to end my life... but I survived because my children cried and stopped me," she says through tears. A Family Destroyed by Tragedy

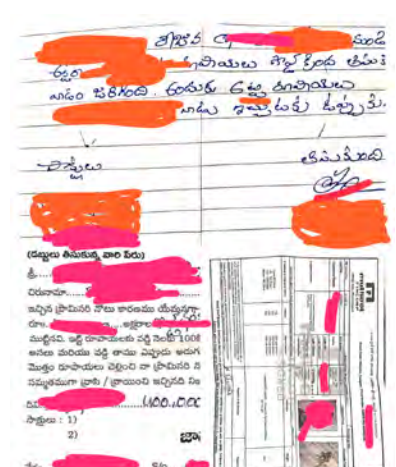
Lakshmi (name changed), a native of Mahabubabad district, got married in 2010. For a few years, life moved on normally. But in 2019, her husband died while undergoing treatment for fever and jaundice, leaving the family shattered overnight. With two small children to raise and no financial support, she gathered the courage to join a government department in a lower-level position.

Her only hope was simple: "If I have a job, I can educate my children and give them a future." But according to her,

the same job that was supposed to provide security eventually became a source of fear and suffering.

"Won't You Help Me as a Colleague?" — The Beginning of the Alleged Exploitation The victim alleges that a senior assistant working in the same office initially approached her with sympathy and kindness. He allegedly told her: "There are health problems in our family..."

"I urgently need some money..." "I'll return it once I receive next month's salary..." "Trusting him, and already living under the fear and pressure of a new government job, she says she began helping financially. She further alleges that threats such as: "I'll issue memos against you..." "I'll place you under show-cause notice..." left her terrified and emotionally vulnerable. A Mother Who Pawned Even Her Mangalsutra According to the woman, she first pawned a one-tola gold chain and gave him 50,000. Later, she says she pawned her rings, earrings, mangalsutra, and another gold chain one after another to arrange more money. The gold she had saved for her children's future... The mangalsutra that symbolized her married



life... Everything slowly disappeared into debt. She now claims to be burdened with nearly 8 lakh in loans. "There were days when I couldn't even buy medicine for my children's fever..." "We didn't have money even for food at home..." "Calls from finance companies are terrifying us..." she says while breaking down

emotionally. "Go Die Anywhere..." — Words That Pushed Her Toward Suicide When she reportedly asked for her money back, she alleges that she was insulted and humiliated. According to her, he told her: "Go die anywhere you want..." She also alleges that when she threatened to inform family members, she was warned: "If you tell anyone, I'll kill you." The woman further claims that he once tried to physically assault her in front of others by grabbing her throat. The humiliation, debt burden, workplace pressure, and emotional trauma together allegedly pushed her into severe depression and suicidal thoughts. Her Children's Tears Stopped Her At one point, unable to bear the pain anymore, she decided to end her life. But as she walked out with that intention, her two young children reportedly ran toward her crying: "Amma... That single moment changed her mind. If I die, what will happen to my children?" she asked herself — and chose to live again. It is a moment that deeply moves anyone who hears her story. Harassment Even After Hospitalization? The woman alleges that even

after she was hospitalized due to health complications, the harassment did not stop. She claims that unknown numbers repeatedly called her, people visited her house unexpectedly, and she was subjected to continued psychological pressure. Since then, she says she has been suffering from severe headaches, dizziness, and fainting spells. Even now, she alleges that threats continue:

"If you don't listen to me, I won't mark your attendance..." "I'll stop your salary..." With her children studying in a private school, she says she is no longer able to pay their fees. Time for Authorities to Respond The case has raised serious questions in public circles: How can society remain silent when a woman employee is allegedly battling workplace fear, financial exploitation, mental harassment, crushing debt, and suicidal thoughts — all while trying to raise two children alone? Residents and social organizations are demanding immediate intervention from the District Collector, Superintendent of Police, Women's Commission, and employee unions. Women's groups and public organizations are calling for immediate protection for the

victim A fair and impartial investigation into the allegations Confidential inquiry through women's committees Financial assistance for the struggling family Educational support for the children Review of whether Internal Complaints Committees (ICC) in government offices are functioning properly? At Least Give Justice for My Children..." "I'm not asking for myself, sir... Please give justice at least for the sake of my children..." Those words, spoken through tears, reflect not just one woman's pain — but the silent suffering of many women employees who continue to endure harassment behind closed doors. A job is supposed to provide dignity and security. But when fear, exploitation, and abuse enter the workplace, the emotional destruction can be devastating. Whatever the final truth of the allegations may be, many social activists say that no woman would publicly speak with such visible mental anguish unless the suffering was severe. Today, one mother's tears are forcing society to ask difficult questions. And one child's silent pain echoes louder than anything else: "Our mother is crying... what mistake did we make?"

allegedly confessed to carrying out the thefts after arriving in Shadnagar on a stolen Honda Shine bike from the Medchal area and targeting locked houses in GHR Colony. Police said the trio sold part of the stolen gold and silver ornaments to an unidentified person near the Shadnagar RTC Bus Stand for Rs. 40,000 and shared the money among themselves, while the remaining valuables were hidden for later sale. The accused also confessed to burglary cases in Fortune Colony, New Raghavendra Colony on CSK Road in Shadnagar, besides another theft case in Medchal, police said. Police recovered Rs. 20,000 cash, the Honda Shine bike, two mobile phones, silver anklets, silver chains, gold earrings and other valuables from the accused.

Apple Swift Student Challenge: GITAM Deemed to be University Student Among Global Top 50 Winners

The South India Times, Visakhapatnam : Manas Malla, a fourth-year Computer Science and Engineering student from GITAM Deemed to be University, has achieved global recognition by emerging as one of the top 50 winners worldwide in the prestigious Apple Swift Student Challenge 2026 conducted by tech giant Apple. His innovative offline AI and Augmented Reality-based personalized learning application, "STEMQuest," earned him the opportunity to attend the Worldwide Developers Conference at Apple Park in the United States, where he will interact directly with Apple engineers and developers. Designed as a friendly and supportive virtual tutor, STEMQuest aims to make learning more engaging, stress-free, and inclusive for students. The application uses AI-powered storytelling, facial tracking technology, and personalized learning techniques to understand students' emotions and learning patterns instead of relying solely on traditional quizzes and tests. Speaking about the inspiration behind the project, Manas said the idea emerged from his observations of academic pressure faced by students in India. He explained that the plat-



form was built to create a more empathetic learning environment where students can learn concepts through interactive storytelling and visual experiences rather than fear-driven classroom methods. The project received encouragement during his participation in the Startup Mahakumbh held in New Delhi, where he had the opportunity to share his vision with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. According to Manas, the Prime Minister's encouragement motivated him to further develop the idea into a full-fledged digital platform.

STEMQuest supports multiple Indian languages and regional dialects and is designed to function even on low-cost smartphones without requiring a continuous internet connection. The platform also

includes accessibility features such as voice-based interaction for visually impaired users, keyboard communication for hearing-impaired students, and high-contrast display support. Manas credited the mentors at GITAM Venture Development Centre, including Vikas Srivastav and Monica Sri Goud, for supporting him throughout the journey. He also highlighted that the project evolved significantly after receiving recognition and a Rs.2 lakh grant from IIT Hyderabad. During his visit to the United States, Manas will participate in sessions with Apple experts working on technologies such as SwiftUI, Core Data, and on-device AI models. He will also receive a one-year Apple Developer Membership and access to the Apple Developer ecosystem.

TTD Forest Department excels in Forest Wealth Conservation

Extensive measures for restoration of native species

Tirumala The Forest Department of TTD has been protecting the rich forest wealth of Seshachalam Hills since 1980, maintaining ecological balance while catering to the spiritual needs of millions of devotees.

By safeguarding the forest areas spread across the sacred Seshachalam Hill ranges in the Eastern Ghats, the department is playing a crucial role in biodiversity conservation.

The TTD Forest Department oversees a total forest area of 2,719 hectares. According to the latest India State of Forest Report (ISFR), an impressive 89.40% forest cover has been recorded under TTD limits, placing it among the leading institutions in the country in terms of green cover. Nearly 2,431 hectares are under forest vegetation, significantly contributing to carbon storage, climate regulation, and biodiversity conservation.

The TTD Forest Department functions under the supervision of the Deputy Conservator of Forests. There are four forest ranges in total — two in Tirumala and two in Tirupati — each headed by a Forest Range Officer. At the field level, Deputy Range Officers, Forest Section Officers, and supporting staff coordinate forest protection activities. As part of forest protection measures, 24-hour flying squad teams continuously patrol the forest areas to curb illegal tree felling and poaching activities. To prevent forest fires, special fire lines are being maintained, and trained teams respond swiftly to ensure effective fire control mea-



asures. Every year, around 26.5 kilometers of fire lines are being maintained. Native Plantation Drive across 576 Hectares: As a part of biodiversity conservation efforts, TTD has undertaken a major initiative to restore native vegetation in place of exotic Acacia plantations. Under this programme, native species such as Peepal, Banyan, Cluster Fig, Indian Medlar, Champak, Mango, Sandalwood, Red Sanders, Gooseberry, and Jamun are being planted in phases across 576 hectares. So far, works have been completed in 22 hectares. Quality Saplings through Special Nurseries: Special nurseries are being maintained in all four forest ranges under TTD to raise native species,

ornamental plants, and medicinal plants. These nurseries supply quality saplings required for forest restoration programmes. Measures for protection of Wildlife: The forests of Seshachalam are home to several wildlife species including elephants, leopards, bears, and snakes. The TTD Forest Department has been taking special measures to reduce human-wildlife conflict and rescue of injured animals. Keeping in view the severe summer conditions, saucer pits (special water pits) are being arranged in forest areas and regularly filled with water to quench the thirst of wild animals. This initiative helps prevent animals from venturing into human habitations in search of water.

In addition, three snake rescue teams are being kept on constant alert in the queue line premises to mitigate human-snake conflict. To ensure the safety of devotees, the department also undertakes identification and removal of dangerous trees, clearing of fallen trees after storms, and regular trimming of tree branches along roadsides. Forest Department in Temple Kaikaryams: The TTD Forest Department also supplies sandalwood logs, firewood, Darbha grass, and other materials required for temple rituals. It also maintains road dividers, gardens, and greenery development programmes in Tirumala and Tirupati. The department currently maintains 24 kilometers of road dividers and 25 gardens. Medicinal plants culture: Special focus is being laid on the conservation of rare and medicinal plant species. TTD is also supplying raw materials required for the preparation of Ayurvedic medicines. At present, the TTD Forest Department is implementing several key projects including Pavitra Vanam, Divya Oushadha Vanam, Palamaneru Timber Plantation in collaboration with the Wildlife Institute of India for mitigation of wildlife conflicts, and other programmes to enhance greenery on the hills. The primary objective of the TTD Forest Department is to preserve the sacred forest wealth and pass on this invaluable natural heritage to future generations.

BJP LAUNCHES 'MERA BHARAT, MERA YOGDAN' CAMPAIGN TO PROMOTE FUEL AND ENERGY CONSERVATION

New Delhi, May 17: The Bharatiya Janata Party has launched a nationwide awareness campaign titled "Mera Bharat, Mera Yogdan" following an appeal by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to reduce fuel consumption amid global energy concerns linked to ongoing conflict in West Asia.



The campaign aims to encourage citizens to adopt energy-efficient habits, reduce dependence on fuel, and prioritise national interest by embracing simpler and more sustainable lifestyles.

As part of the initiative, party leaders and workers are expected to integrate the message into organisational programmes and public outreach activities, reinforcing the importance of conservation in daily life.

Citizens are being encouraged to limit non-essential consumption patterns, including postponing luxury purchases such as gold, avoiding unnecessary foreign travel, and supporting indigenous "Swadeshi" products. The campaign also highlights behavioural changes already being adopted by several political leaders and government representa-

tives, including the use of public transport, metro systems, and electric vehicles, as well as reductions in convoy sizes to save fuel. In several NDA-ruled states, leaders have reportedly scaled down official convoys and increased reliance on shared or sustainable transport options, aligning with the Prime Minister's appeal.

The initiative further promotes carpooling, increased use of public transportation, and the adoption of virtual meetings and hybrid work models, including limited work-from-home arrangements to reduce travel-related energy consumption.

A key target under the campaign is to reduce fuel and electricity usage in party offices by up to 50 percent through effi-

ciency measures and behavioural changes.

Citizens are also encouraged to cut edible oil consumption by 10 percent and support a shift towards organic and natural farming practices by reducing reliance on chemical fertilisers.

The campaign emphasises simplicity in public events, including limiting attendance at receptions and reducing the size of official convoys, as part of a broader push for resource conservation. The nationwide initiative comes amid heightened global concerns over energy supply stability due to geopolitical tensions and the ongoing conflict in West Asia, which has impacted global fuel markets and heightened discussions around energy security.

PM MODI TO VISIT SWEDEN TODAY DURING THIRD LEG OF ONGOING FIVE-NATION TOUR

New Delhi, May 17: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on the third leg of his five-nation tour as he travels to Gothenburg, Sweden, on Sunday at the invitation of Swedish Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson.

visit (on May 17-18) is expected to further deepen India-Sweden ties across trade, innovation, green technologies and emerging sectors. According to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), "Prime Minister had earlier visited Sweden in 2018 for the first-ever India-Nordic Summit."

During the visit, Prime Minister Modi will hold bilateral talks with Prime Minister Kristersson to review the full spectrum of India-Sweden relations and identify new oppor-

tunities for cooperation in key sectors. The MEA stated that the leaders will "explore new avenues of cooperation to enhance bilateral trade, which has reached USD 7.75 billion (2025), and Swedish FDI into India which has reached USD 2.825 billion (2000-2025)." The discussions are expected to focus on collaboration in green transition, artificial intelligence, emerging technologies, startups, resilient supply chains, defence manufacturing, space cooperation, climate action and strengthening people-to-people ties. Sweden is regarded as one of Europe's leading innovation-driven economies, and both countries are looking to expand strategic cooperation in future-oriented sectors.



Kerala cabinet formation nears final stage as new govt readies for swearing-in



Thiruvananthapuram, May 17: The final round of discussions on cabinet formation for the incoming government led by chief minister-designate V D Satheesan is expected to conclude on Sunday, ahead of the swearing-in ceremony scheduled for Monday.

According to officials and political sources, the final list of ministers will be submitted to the Governor around 2 p.m. on Sunday, with intensive consultations continuing between alliance partners and senior leadership throughout the day.

Congress representative and Kerala in-charge Deepa Dasmunshi confirmed that discussions are progressing and a final decision on cabinet composition is expected later

in the day. The new government is expected to have a 21-member cabinet, including the Chief Minister. Early indications suggest that the Congress will hold 11 ministerial positions, including key portfolios.

Several senior Congress leaders are likely to be inducted into the cabinet, with names such as Ramesh Chennithala, Sunny Joseph, K. Muraleedharan, Thiruvanchoor Radhakrishnan, A.P. Anil Kumar, P.C. Vishnunath, M. Liju, Chandry Oommen, and Bindu Krishna reportedly in contention.

Sources indicate that Satheesan may retain the Finance portfolio, while final allocation of departments will be confirmed after official approval of the cabinet list. Coalition partner Indian Union Muslim League (Indian Union Muslim League) is expected to secure five ministerial positions. Leaders such as P.K. Kunhalikutty, K.M. Shaji, N. Shamsuddeen, and Parakkal Abdulla are among those under consideration. However, internal differences have reportedly emerged within the IUMU over the possible inclusion of P.K. Basheer, with some sections opposing his elevation. The final cabinet announcement is expected to clarify the power-sharing structure within the newly formed UDF-led government ahead of the official swearing-in ceremony on Monday.

President Droupadi Murmu Promulgates Amendment Ordinance

New Delhi, May 17: President Droupadi Murmu has promulgated the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Amendment Ordinance, 2026, increasing the sanctioned strength of judges in the Supreme Court of India from 33 to 37, excluding the Chief Justice of India.



The decision is aimed at addressing the rising pendency of cases and improving the speed of justice delivery in the country's highest judicial institution. The development was announced by Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Law and Justice Arjun Ram

Meghwal through a post on X, where he confirmed that the President had approved the ordinance to amend the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1956. According to the government, the expansion

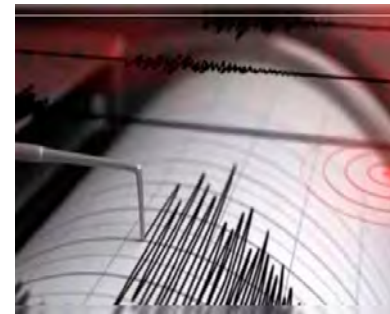
in judicial strength is intended to reduce delays in hearings and enhance the efficiency of case disposal, given the increasing workload on the apex court. The ordinance follows a recent decision by the

Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, which had approved a proposal to introduce the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Amendment Bill, 2026 in Parliament to add four additional judges.

The Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1956 has been amended multiple times over the decades to reflect changing judicial requirements. The last such revision took place in 2019, when the sanctioned strength was increased from 30 to 33 judges (excluding the Chief Justice of India).

Midnight tremors and loud explosive sound trigger panic across Madhya Pradesh towns

Bhopal/Betul, May 17: A series of unexpected seismic tremors coupled with a mysterious loud explosion-like sound created fear and confusion across several parts of Madhya Pradesh late Saturday night, officials confirmed. According to preliminary information from the National Center for Seismology, earthquake activity measuring 3.91 on the Richter scale was recorded in regions including Betul, Pandhurna, and Multai. Tremors were reportedly felt at multiple intervals — around 9:30 p.m., 9:41 p.m., 9:43 p.m., and again at 10:17 p.m. While the earlier tremors caused concern among residents, panic intensified later in the night after a stronger disturbance struck certain localities around 11:24 p.m. Eyewitnesses described hearing a sudden deafening



sound moments before the ground began shaking. Residents said the noise resembled a massive blast and was followed by intense vibrations that shook homes and rattled household objects for several seconds. The unexpected tremors forced many people to rush out of their houses in fear of building collapse

or a larger disaster. Families gathered in open spaces as confusion spread through neighbourhoods, with many residents visibly distressed by the late-night incident. People from different parts of the affected towns reported experiencing the same sequence — a loud booming sound followed immediately by noticeable seismic movement. Several residents said the tremors were strong enough to make walls vibrate and utensils shake inside homes. As panic spread, phone networks became active with residents contacting relatives, friends, and neighbours to confirm their safety and gather information about the situation. Soon after the incident, social media platforms were flooded with videos and firsthand accounts from Multai and nearby areas.

Case filed over posters targeting Rahul, Priyanka in Wayanad



Wayanad, May 17: Police have registered a case over posters targeting senior Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra appeared on the walls of the Congress office and nearby areas in Wayanad earlier this week.

According to officials, the case was registered at the Kalpetta police station based on a complaint filed by Congress MLA T Siddique.

The First Information Report (FIR) stated that the posters surfaced on May 13 on the compound wall of the Wayanad District Congress Committee (DCC) office and adjoining areas amid uncertainty over the selection of Kerala's next chief minister. The posters reportedly warned that Wayanad could become the "next Amethi" for the Congress, referring to Rahul Gandhi's defeat from the Amethi Lok Sabha constituency in 2019. One poster read: "Mr

Rahul and Priyanka Forget Wayanad... You won't win again from here." Another stated: "Mr Rahul, KC might be your bag bearer but people of Kerala never forgive you." The posters were later removed by Congress workers. Police said a case has been registered under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the Kerala Police Act. CCTV footage retrieved from the area allegedly showed a man pasting the posters, and efforts are underway to identify him. The development comes days after the Congress-led United Democratic Front (UDF) secured a decisive victory in the Kerala Assembly elections, winning 102 of the 140 seats. However, the Congress leadership initially faced difficulty in finalising the chief ministerial candidate, with names such as VD Satheesan, Ramesh Chennithala and KC

Venugopal under consideration. Reports suggested that the party high command favoured Venugopal for the post due to his close association with Rahul Gandhi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, while party workers largely supported Satheesan and Chennithala.

The suspense ended this week after the Congress officially announced VD Satheesan as the next Chief Minister of Kerala. His swearing-in ceremony is scheduled to take place on May 18 in the presence of senior party leaders.

"I am humbled by the trust placed in me by the party and the people. They entrusted me with a huge responsibility, and I am very thankful to team UDF and the workers. I dedicate my CMship to the people of Kerala," Satheesan said after being chosen for the top post.

Delhi advises private firms to adopt 2-day WFH for fuel saving

New Delhi, May 17: The Delhi Government has advised private companies and organisations in the national capital to implement a two-day work-from-home policy every week and encourage employees to use public transport and carpooling as part of fuel conservation measures amid prevailing global uncertainties. The advisory, issued by the Delhi labour department on Sunday, also suggested staggered office timings to reduce peak-hour traffic congestion and minimise fuel consumption in the city.

However, private establishments engaged in essential and emergency services, including hospitals, health institutions, electricity, water supply, sanitation and municipal services, have been exempted from the advisory.

The move comes days after Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta launched the 90-day 'Mera Bharat, Mera Yogdan' fuel-saving campaign. The campaign mandates two-day work-from-home arrangements for Delhi government employees and promotes the use of public transport. The Chief Minister had stated that the private sector would also be encouraged to support the fuel-saving initiative in response to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's appeal for prudent use of resources.

According to the labour department, commuting to and from offices is among the biggest contributors to daily fuel consumption in Delhi. The advisory noted that work-from-home arrangements had already proven effective during the COVID-19 pandemic and GRAP-related restrictions.

"In order to contribute to national fuel conservation efforts, all employers of industrial establishments, factories, shops and commercial establishments in Delhi, including IT and IT Enabled Services (ITES), are strongly encouraged to implement a minimum of two days of work-from-home per week," the advisory stated. Department also recommended replacing physical meetings with virtual sessions, reducing the use of official vehicles for non-essential travel, and strengthening IT infrastructure to facilitate smooth work-from-home operations.

Private organisations have additionally been urged to sensitise employees about the importance of fuel conservation and encourage conscious commuting practices, including the use of public transport, carpooling, and non-motorised travel options. The advisory also called on organisations to support the domestic economy by promoting the purchase of Indian-made products.

Trump's Beijing Summit Leaves The Rest Asking: Who Will Stop China Now?

The most-watched summit meeting has ended. Trump had arrived in Beijing with a phalanx of businessmen, with just three of them having a combined net worth of over \$1 trillion. That was unsurprising, given the nature of the Trump presidency, famed for its deal-making and emphasis on trade. But none of that enthused China. Unlike his 2017 visit as an honoured guest, with an unprecedented state dinner in the 'forbidden city', this visit had no great pomp and ceremony attached to it. Major issues on the table were well known, but the devil lay in the details. Critics observed that the US President went to Beijing on a weak wicket, given the Iran war and his low popularity ratings.

Weighing Up The Opponent

Even before the visit commenced, the first task for officials on both sides was to assess the strength of the leadership at the table, in terms of a winning hand or a poor one. The agenda points would have been fixed long ago and likely centred around trade, particularly Artificial Intelligence, Taiwan, and the Iran war, in some order of priority for Trump. What mattered was how many cards each assessed the other as holding. First, China would have assessed the US presidency from the considerable drop in Trump's poll approvals, which, at 6% negative, is a lot and hinges mainly on inflation, the highest in two years. Xi, on the other hand, has no poll approvals to worry about publicly, but his recent 'purges' of over 100 senior military officials, among them two top generals - Zhang Youxia, and the chief of the Joint Staff Department, Liu Zhentli - on alleged corruption charges, would have been seen as a minus point. This was touted as a move to end patronage networks and strengthen the imperturbable Xi. But given past ingresses of the US Central Intelligence Agency - not to mention a new video that seeks to tap into unease within the army, especially the middle ranks - the possibility of some of them at least being compromised remains. The reverse also holds true. Very recently, a Southern California Mayor pleaded guilty to being a Chinese agent. The Federal Bureau of Investigation provides a copious list of arrests on such charges - four were in April alone. Fantastically, Trump remarked that both countries spied on each other, an admission that no other president would ever have made. Then there's the flip side. The Trump administration has had its own 'purges', firing some 43% of his 'A' team, including senior-level officers in his office and at least a dozen top cabinet-level officers, who were either forced to resign or shown the door. So, on that count of personal popularity and system degradation, the score remains 1-1.

THE BEIJING SPECTACLE AND THE RECALIBRATION OF GLOBAL POWER

A striking image recently rippled through digital communication networks globally, capturing the attention of foreign policy observers and laymen alike. It depicts the President of the United States bending noticeably low, his spine curved in a posture that borders on deference, to take the firmly extended hand of Chinese President Xi Jinping. In an era dominated by hyper-realistic deepfakes and algorithmic manipulation, the image may well have been doctored - an artificial artifact designed to provoke the denizens of WhatsApp University. Yet, its viral currency stems from a deeper, psychological truth. The photograph conveys a potent conceptual narrative: Donald Trump travelling east as a diplomatic supplicant, executing a high-stakes charm offensive to court the favour of the Middle Kingdom, while Xi receives him with immaculate, imperial fanfare, offering immense theatrical hospitality but yielding absolutely no structural or geopolitical concessions. Beneath the curated optics of the Great Hall of the People, Beijing drew its red lines with absolute clarity, leaving little doubt that the global architecture is undergoing a profound and permanent architectural shift.

That Band Of CEOs

What the international community witnessed in Beijing was, fundamentally, a grand spectacle of statecraft. It was a production punctuated occasionally by transactional commercialism - packaged announcements of Boeing jet purchases and massive bulk orders of American soybeans - designed primarily to provide the American president with tangible domestic trophies to carry home on the weekend. Yet, even these commercial breakthroughs felt archival, functioning as superficial emblems of an older, mercantilist era. The retinue of marquee American chief executive officers who trailed the



president through the crimson corridors of power did not resemble independent, hard-nosed global dealmakers. Instead, they performed a role more akin to modern factotums and courtiers, a corporate vanguard deployed to validate Trump's presence and add a veneer of industrial might to a deeply personalised executive pilgrimage. The images broadcast to the world by Beijing from the Trump visit were meticulously produced, controlled, and distributed by Chinese state media apparatuses, reflecting an unmistakable, classical power aesthetic: a composed, serene, and immovably anchored Xi receiving a restless Western head of state who sought validation without receiving the structural kowtow. Both leaders were performing deftly for their respective domestic audiences, orchestrating a media event with a remarkably brief political half-life. The Thucydides Trap, Reimagined

Yet, beneath the glittering theatre of the summit, a far more durable and historic reality is quietly taking shape. For over a decade, the

transatlantic foreign policy establishment has lived under the dark shadow of the "Thucydides Trap" - the fatalistic realist construct, popularised by academic seminars, asserting that any rising revisionist power must inevitably collide in conflict, and probably warfare, with a dominant status-quo hegemon. Today, with Xi's China showing little appetite for armed conflict, that terrifying framework looks less like an iron law of history and more like a rigid, theoretical abstraction. Indeed, the common deployment of the Thucydides metaphor rests on a fundamental misreading of ancient history. The Spartans and Athenians did not exist in a permanent state of total kinetic warfare; rather, they coexisted across centuries of Greek civilisation, establishing complex networks of deterrence, trade, and regional accommodation. The Peloponnesian War was a tragic, bounded interlude, not the permanent organising structure of the ancient Mediterranean world.

Live And Let Live

What is actually emerging from the smoke of the 21st-century trade wars is not an inevitable military apocalypse, but a pragmatically managed, highly segmented spheres-of-influence settlement. Rather than fighting to the death for absolute global hegemony, Washington and Beijing are learning to partition the global commons based on their respective comparative advantages. The United States retains (at least for now) its structural dominance in pioneering high technology - commanding the software architectures, artificial intelligence frontiers, and the unmatched liquidity of Western financial markets. China, conversely, has consolidated its position as the world's foremost manufacturer and its pre-eminent physical trader, controlling the supply chains that undergird global material life. It is a division of labour born of mutual vulnerability and strategic exhaustion: a digital and financial empire in the West balancing a manufacturing and logistical colossus in the East. Within this emerging bilateral matrix, Taiwan remains the one

genuine, highly volatile flashpoint - a geographic and technological node capable of disrupting the entire global peace. Yet even here, a realistic, cold-blooded recalibration appears underway, conveyed by the American president's own characteristically transactional rhetoric during his stay in Beijing. By publicly reflecting on the brutal, immutable mathematics of distance - noting that the island of Taiwan is merely 59 miles from the Chinese mainland while remaining a vast 9,500 miles away from the American coast - Trump signalled an embrace of geographic realism over ideological commitment. This raw calculation reveals a changing strategic calculus. As the United States aggressively "onshores" its advanced semiconductor manufacturing capabilities and builds secure domestic chip foundries within its own borders, the foundational economic rationale for defending Taiwan begins to dissipate. Once the high-tech supply chains are structurally insulated, the old, ambiguous treaty commitments of the mid-20th century risk being quietly minimised, reinterpreted, or forgotten altogether. This geopolitical containment of risk is further stabilised by a mutual recognition of military limitations. The Chinese leadership has consistently demonstrated a remarkable lack of appetite for overt, destabilising kinetic conflict, preferring the patient, asymmetric methods of economic coercion, maritime encirclement, and institutional capture. Concurrently, the American political establishment is learning the hard way that its overstretched empire cannot easily sustain or finance far-flung, prolonged military engagements in the terrifying context of modern electronic, drone-saturated, and hypersonic warfare. Even Iran, a much less formidable foe than China, has been able to hold off the ravages of the American imperium.

Women's dreams cannot be imprisoned

The recent observation by the Supreme Court of India is not merely a legal observation, but a historic message challenging the deeply ingrained mindset in Indian society that often limits a woman's identity after marriage to her husband, family, and domestic responsibilities. This is why, even today, in many families, girls' education is not taken as seriously as that of boys. If a woman is highly ambitious, prioritizes her career, or wants to make



her own life decisions, she is often criticized as "anti-family" or "too modern." This mindset not only violates women's rights but also limits society's progress. Expecting women to give up their careers or compromise after marriage has been considered normal in Indian society. If the husband's job requires a change of city, the wife is expected to give up her career without question. If balancing family and work is difficult, the responsibility for sacrifice is often placed on the woman. After motherhood, women are burdened with so much domestic responsibilities that millions are forced to leave their jobs despite their abilities and talents. This situation is not only unfair on an individual level but also detrimental to national development. A country that fails to fully utilize the talents of half its population can never reach its full potential. The Supreme Court's observations also reinforce the fundamental spirit of the Indian Constitution. Article 14 of the Constitution guarantees equality to all citizens. Article 15 prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, and Article 21 guarantees every individual the right to live with dignity. Expecting a woman to abandon her dreams and career simply because she is

married is contrary to these constitutional values. The Court has made it clear that marriage cannot be a means of eliminating a woman's independent identity. A wife is not a subordinate person, but an independent citizen with equal rights. Today, Indian women are achieving remarkable successes in every field. From space to fighter aircraft, from the judiciary to the startup world, women are demonstrating their potential. PV Sindhu, Mirabai Chanu, Saina Nehwal, Falguni Nayyar, Nirmala Sitharaman, Gita Gopinath, and many others have proven that given the opportunity, women can excel in any field. Ironically, despite these achievements, traditional thinking about women's roles in society has not completely disappeared. Even today, in many educated families, it is believed that a wife's success should not "exceed" her husband's. Women's economic independence and self-reliance are often seen as a challenge to male ego. This is why problems like gender discrimination, pay disparity, and mental stress still exist in the workplace. Women's economic independence is a crucial foundation for the true progress of any society. When women are financially inde-

pendent, they are able to make their own decisions with greater freedom and confidence. Economic independence also empowers them to speak out against domestic violence, mental harassment, and unequal treatment. Therefore, a career is not just a means of earning income, but also a symbol of dignity and self-reliance. If a woman is forced to sacrifice her career in the name of marriage, her freedom is actually being limited. The Supreme Court's observations reject this thinking and make it clear that a woman's career is not a "hobby," but a constitutional and human right. However, judicial observations alone cannot bring about complete change in society. Real change will come only when families change their mindset. Even today, women are often burdened with the sole responsibility of household chores and childrearing. Men's domestic involvement is limited, while working women are expected to juggle every household responsibility alongside their jobs. This dual burden impacts women's mental and physical health. If husbands and wives share household responsibilities equally, women can pursue their careers and dreams without guilt.

Biggest Takeaway From BRICS Meet? Nobody Knows What It Is Anymore



The 2026 BRICS Foreign Ministers' Meeting in New Delhi exposed the growing internal contradictions of an expanded BRICS at a moment of acute geopolitical instability. Convened under the theme "Building for Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation and Sustainability", the meeting was intended to consolidate momentum ahead of the BRICS Leaders' Summit scheduled for September 2026. Instead, the escalating US-Israel confrontation with Iran transformed the gathering into a revealing display of the strategic fissures increasingly shaping the bloc. The clearest indication of these divisions was the inability of BRICS foreign ministers to agree on a full joint statement. In its place emerged a Chair's Statement and outcome document that reflected consensus on broad developmental priorities while carefully sidestepping irreconcilable disagreements over the Middle East crisis. The absence of a unified declaration was not merely procedural; it underscored the widening divergence in

how BRICS members interpret security, sovereignty, regional order, and relations with the West. The Iran-UAE Showdown The emphasis on protecting maritime commerce and energy routes, especially through the Strait of Hormuz, revealed underlying anxieties among member states whose economic interests are directly threatened by regional escalation. At the centre of the discord stood Iran and the UAE, whose competing regional calculations brought into sharp focus the limitations of BRICS cohesion. Iran sought to use the platform to rally political backing against the United States and Israel, framing the conflict as an attack on the sovereignty of a BRICS member and, by extension, on the broader non-Western order. Tehran pushed for explicit condemnation of what it described as "unlawful aggression" and attempted to portray BRICS as a potential counterweight to Western strategic pressure. Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi adopted a confrontational tone during the discussions. He

described Iran as a "victim of illegal expansionism and warmongering" and urged BRICS to resist "Western hegemony and the sense of impunity that the US believes it is entitled to". Calling for a far more assertive collective response, Araghchi declared: "Iran therefore calls upon BRICS member states and all responsible members of the international community to explicitly condemn violations of international law by the United States and Israel." His remarks reflected Tehran's broader effort to transform BRICS from a developmental coalition into a more overtly political and anti-Western platform. The UAE, however, approached the crisis from an entirely different security perspective. Abu Dhabi viewed the escalation not through the prism of anti-Western resistance but through immediate concerns over Gulf stability, energy infrastructure, maritime security, and the risk of Iranian retaliation spilling across the region. Tensions became especial-

ly visible when Araghchi later accused the UAE of being "directly involved in the aggression against my country", further exposing the depth of mistrust between the two BRICS members. For the UAE and several other Gulf-oriented actors, heightened confrontation threatened both economic stability and domestic security. This divergence made consensus virtually impossible and demonstrated how BRICS expansion has imported regional rivalries directly into the organisation's internal dynamics. A Structural Fault Line The Iran-UAE divide highlighted a deeper structural contradiction within BRICS expansion. The grouping has sought to project itself as the institutional voice of the Global South, yet many of its members remain regional competitors with conflicting threat perceptions and incompatible geopolitical priorities. The inclusion of Middle Eastern rivals within the same forum has amplified these contradictions rather than diluted them.

Mangaluru gets green signal for HC circuit bench, CM assures full infra support: MLC Ivan D'Souza

Mangaluru, May 16: The long-pending demand for a high court circuit bench in Mangaluru has received a green signal from the state government, with chief minister Siddaramaiah assuring the chief justice through a letter that the government is ready to provide all necessary infrastructure, said MLC Ivan D'Souza.



Addressing a press conference on Saturday at his office in the Mangaluru City Corporation premises, he said the chief minister has conveyed readiness to extend all basic facilities required for the proposed bench. He also presented a copy of the letter addressed to the chief justice.

He said a delegation of the chief justice of the high court is expected to visit Mangaluru either by the end of May or in the first week of June to inspect the available infrastructure, as indicated in the chief minister's communication. "With the government expressing readiness, nearly 80% of the groundwork for the circuit bench is already

complete," he said. Ivan D'Souza expressed confidence that the circuit bench could begin functioning by October. He said the 50,000 sq ft building of the old deputy commissioner's office near State Bank in Mangaluru is suitable for the initial functioning of the bench. A site has also been identified in the area where IAS officers' quarters exist for providing residential facilities for judges. He said all administrative and office infrastructure required for smooth functioning would be ensured. He added that discussions had been held with the deputy commissioner, and renovation of the old DC office building along with residential facilities for judges would be taken up through the Public Works Department (PWD).

Bantwal: Copious summer rains revive parched Dakshina

Bantwal, May 17: After weeks of anxiety over rapidly depleting water levels and fears of a looming drinking water crisis, the Nethravathi River — regarded as the lifeline of Dakshina Kannada district — has witnessed a dramatic revival following continuous rainfall in the ghat and foothill regions over the past few days.

Only weeks ago, the harsh summer heat had reduced several stretches of the river to near-dry conditions. From the downstream side of the Jakribettu Dam to the Panemangaluru new bridge, vast patches of sand and exposed rock formations had emerged as water levels receded alarmingly.

The sharp fall in inflow had triggered serious concern not only in Bantwal but also across areas under the Mangaluru City Corporation limits, with fears mounting over a potential shortage of drinking water for Mangaluru city. Amid the worsening situation, Rajesh Nayak, MLA representing Bantwal, had directed officials to exercise utmost caution in the supply and consumption of drinking water. The district administration too had stepped in with urgent measures to prevent a full-blown water crisis in Mangaluru.

The deputy commissioner's office issued instructions to release water up to six metres from the AMR Dam towards the Thumbe Dam to ensure adequate storage during the peak summer period. Authorities were also

instructed not to divert the remaining water stored in the AMR reservoir for any purpose other than drinking water needs. Mangaluru city depends heavily on the vented dam at Thumbe across the Nethravathi River for its water supply. The dam has a maximum storage capacity of 10.41 million cubic metres (MCM).

According to official data recorded on April 21, 2026, the water level stood at 4.71 metres at Thumbe Dam and 18.62 metres at AMR Dam — enough to meet the city's drinking water requirements for only about 22 days.

Rains bring relief
The situation, however, has changed dramatically over the last three to four days.

Steady rainfall across the Western Ghats and adjoining foothill regions has substantially increased inflow into the river system. In line with the district administration's directions, water was also released from the Shambhoor AMR Dam, further rejuvenating the river. The Jakribettu Dam has now filled to capacity, with surplus water being released downstream. The Thumbe Dam too has reached full levels, transforming the once-parched Nethravathi into a flowing, vibrant water body once again. What was recently a riverbed dotted with exposed boulders and dry sandbanks has now turned into a fully replenished stretch of water, restoring both ecological balance and public confidence.

K'taka gets 1,122 new govt medical seats; big boost for NEET aspirants: Min Dr Sharan Prakash Patil



Bengaluru, May 17: In a major boost for NEET aspirants amid rising concerns over examination irregularities reported across the country, Karnataka has been allotted 1,122 additional government medical seats, medical education minister Dr Sharan Prakash R Patil said.

Addressing a press conference at Vidhana Soudha, the minister said the enhanced seat availability would significantly benefit students aspiring for medical education and marks a major milestone in the state's medical education expansion.

He said Karnataka has secured a record number of

additional seats, noting that the sanction of over 1,000 medical seats to a single state at one time is unprecedented. "This reflects Karnataka's strong position in medical education," he said.

The minister said the newly sanctioned seats will be distributed across several government medical colleges, including those in Koppal, Gadag, Chamarajanagar, Karwar, and other districts.

He informed that the approvals were formally cleared on May 15 by the central government and the union health and family welfare department. Karnataka will receive a total allocation

of Rs 1,090 crore, including Rs 495 crore for undergraduate (UG) medical seats and Rs 541 crore for postgraduate (PG) seats.

Dr Patil urged students to make full use of the expanded opportunities in the state's medical education system, saying Karnataka now offers significantly greater scope for those aspiring to build careers in medicine.

He also detailed the state's medical education capacity, stating that Karnataka has 72 medical colleges, including private and deemed universities. The current intake includes 13,945 UG seats and 7,727 PG seats, he added.

The dengue awareness program was held in collaboration with Satish, Divisional Technical Engineer of BMTC. On this occasion, more than a hundred workshop staff were given comprehensive health education on dengue fever.

Larva Survey Demonstration

On this occasion, Senior Health Inspector Srishaila Kannal made the workshop staff aware about the life cycle of mosquitoes through a demonstration of live larvae. He provided practical information on identifying mosquito breeding sites and methods of controlling them.

An intensive larval survey was conducted in various solid waste materials including water drums, buckets, and tires used for fire extinguishing in the workshop premises. This survey was carried out with the cooperation of Health Inspector Kiran, and the larval killing chemical solution ABATE was sprayed in the areas where larval breeding was found.

Therefore, the department has closed the school and clearly stated that students should not be admitted for the academic year 2026-27. On May 13, the School Education Department had issued its final order. Accordingly, strict instructions were given to the management not to carry out admissions. Student academic records were ordered to be transferred online to the schools where students would continue their education.

Clean raw canals immediately to ensure smooth flow of rainwater: Lokhande Snehal Sudhakar

Bengaluru: Additional Commissioner (Development) Lokhande Snehal Sudhakar has instructed to clear all raw and concrete rainwater canals in Kalkere and Hoysala city limits of silt, soil, waste and plants before the monsoon season and make arrangements for smooth flow of rainwater in the canals.

During the operation, special priority was given to ensuring that there was no obstruction to public traffic, maintaining public health and cleanliness, waste management, animal welfare and maintaining law and order. Despite prior instructions from the corporation officials, several temporary sheds that were constructed without permission were removed with the help of JCB machines.

Tamil Nadu: TTV Dhinakaran reiterates horse-trading by TVK

CHENNAI: AMMK General Secretary TTV Dhinakaran has alleged that the ruling Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) had engaged in "horse-trading" to secure political support after the recent Assembly elections. Dredging underway at Kumari jetty as low sea levels disrupt boat rides to Vivekananda Rock, Valluvar Statue Addressing reporters in Tiruchirappalli, Dhinakaran said that if the AMMK MLA who joined TVK was given a ministerial post, his party would demand a CBI inquiry into the matter. Dhinakaran alleged that TVK's political strategy amounted to outright "horse-trading." "Vijay says he will act at horse speed, but he has bought the horse through bargaining," Dhinakaran said sarcastically, referring to the Tamil Nadu chief minister and the leader of the TVK party. Dhinakaran also took aim at Mannargudi MLA Kamaraj, alleging that the latter's statements would backfire and claiming he knew who had recorded a video of Kamaraj signing

documents inside a car. The lone MLA of the Amma Makkal Munnetra Kazhagam (AMMK), S Kamaraj, was expelled from the party after he announced support to the ruling TVK Government led by Chief Minister Vijay in the State Assembly. He also maintained that only the leader of a political party has the authority to appoint the legislative whip. Claiming that several complaints had already surfaced against newly appointed TVK ministers, Dhinakaran said that "governance cannot be run through reels" and said people would soon understand the ground reality. Appealing for unity among followers of former Chief Minister J. Jayalalithaa, he said all AIADMK cadres should stand together to protect the party. Nagercoil residents protest Tasmac outlet in residential area Further, he said that the people of Tamil Nadu had protected democracy by giving more seats to opposition parties in the recently concluded elections. He said it would be appropriate to assess the



TVK government only after three months in office. Defending the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK), Dhinakaran asserted that no one could destroy the party and recalled that internal disturbances had existed since the days of M G Ramachandran. Despite the present turmoil, he claimed AIADMK would emerge stronger and perform well in the next Parliamentary elec-

tion. Further, he criticised the Congress party's exit from the DMK alliance, he alleged that the move was motivated by a desire for ministerial positions. He added that the Communist parties and VCK had not demanded ministerial berths and said their "self-respect would have been questioned" if they had done so. Dhinakaran alleged that TVK had "poached" an MLA elected on behalf

of AMMK. Referring to the actor-politician and chief minister Vijay, he questioned how AIADMK MLAs could support someone who had previously criticised AIADMK as a corrupt party. He reiterated that AMMK would continue to remain in the National Democratic Alliance (NDA). According to Dhinakaran, several parties had supported TVK, fearing another election, which he termed "against

political ethics and morality." He claimed the stability of the TVK government was already under threat. Warning legislators against supporting TVK for positions, Dhinakaran said history would not forgive them if they backed the ruling party for personal gain. He also alleged that K A Sengottaiyan who was a legislator with the AIADMK for nine times before joining the TVK was acting as an "agent" of TVK to weaken AIADMK. Sengottaiyan is the current Finance Minister of Tamil Nadu in Vijay's cabinet of ministers. Meanwhile, commenting on the internal crisis within AIADMK, Dhinakaran stated that BJP leaders were unhappy over the ongoing factional disputes in the party. Vijay-led TVK government won the floor test in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly with 144 votes in favour. The TVK government received support from Congress, CPI, CPI(M), VCK, IUML and expelled AMMK MLA Kamaraj during the trust vote.

Dredging underway at Kumari jetty as low sea levels disrupt boat rides to Vivekananda Rock, Valluvar Statue

KANNIYAKUMARI: The Poompuhar Shipping Corporation has begun removing sand deposits tourists to the Vivekananda Rock Memorial and the 133-foot Thiruvalluvar stat-



ue, both located on separate rocks off the Kannyiakumari coast. Thousands of domestic and foreign tourists visit the two monuments by boat every day. In addition, two modern luxury boats, Thiruvalluvar and Thamirabarani, are available for sea rides from Kannyiakumari to Vattakottai. All five boats are stationed at the Poompuhar Shipping Corporation boat jetty in Kannyiakumari. During periods when the sea level drops and the sea recedes, the boats reportedly touch the seabed, affecting their movement. Following this, the corporation took up work to remove the sand deposits from the jetty. MADURAI: Makkal Needhi Maiam president and actor Kamal Haasan said on Monday that newcomers in politics could not be underestimated and that the new government led by Chief Minister Vijay should be given six months before being assessed. Dredging underway at Kumari jetty as low sea levels disrupt boat rides to Vivekananda Rock, Valluvar Statue Speaking to reporters at the Madurai airport after arriving from Chennai, Kamal said people had voted the new government to power and should also monitor its functioning. "The new government should be given six months. They should be given time. Being new does not mean they are new to politics. When independent India was formed, everyone was new. Newcomers cannot be under-



estimated. At the same time, one should not expect too much from them. We should wait and see what happens," he said. Asked about the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam, led by Vijay, forming the government, Kamal said predictions could not be made within two or six days. "The people should monitor them, and we will also monitor them," he stated.

On Dravidian politics, Kamal said that, according to him, if a Tamil-speaking person from Tamil Nadu started a party, it was a Dravidian party. On the three-language policy issue, he said Tamil Nadu could not be compelled by anyone. Nagercoil residents protest Tasmac outlet in residential area Referring to actor Rajinikanth's reported remark that Vijay's victo-

ry was a surprise mixed with happiness, and that he might have felt jealous had Kamal become the Chief Minister, Kamal said he and Rajinikanth had always competed with each other but had never been jealous. "We compete with each other, but there has never been jealousy between us. We are in the film industry. Even if we had played cricket, we would have competed in the same way," he said. Asked about Chief Minister Vijay not meeting Edappadi K Palaniswami, Kamal said he was watching it the same way the people were watching it. Kamal said he was in Madurai to attend the launch event of the film Seyon. "Whenever I come to Madurai, the affection of the people here never reduces. It is the same this time too," he said.

Nagercoil residents protest Tasmac outlet in residential area

CHENNAI: An argument erupted between the public opposing a Tasmac in Nagercoil and the visitors to the outlet on Monday. One of the outlets in Nagercoil is located in the Puthukudiyiruppu area in Vadasery. The outlet has two entrances - one on the omnibus stand side and the other in the residential area of Puthukudiyiruppu. Citing public nuisance caused by the liquor outlet, the residents staged a protest on Monday by locking the gates on the Puthukudiyiruppu entrance of the Tasmac. They also stopped the customers, as the shop opens at noon. This led to tension between both groups. The protest followed the State government's order to close liquor shops located within 500 metres of educational institutions, temples and bus stands. According to residents, 18 liquor shops in the Kannyiakumari district are set to be closed under the order. Residents alleged that instead of closing the



Puthukudiyiruppu outlet, authorities had shut only the entrance near the bus stand and made the entrance in the residential area the main access point. They said this would increase the movement of liquor buyers through the residential locality. As tension escalated, police personnel led by Vadasery inspector Mohan were deployed at the spot to prevent any untoward incident. He held talks with the protesters and

said the police could send a recommendation to close a liquor outlet if there was a law and order issue. "In this case, steps will be taken to send a recommendation stating that the Puthukudiyiruppu liquor shop is causing inconvenience to the public and could create a law and order issue. Until then, this entrance will not be opened," he said. Following the assurance, the residents withdrew their protest.

Doctors warn silent hypertension often leads to severe organ damage due to neglect

Medical experts have raised concerns over the growing neglect of regular blood pressure monitoring, warning that untreated or poorly managed hypertension can silently damage vital organs such as the heart, brain, eyes, and kidneys without showing obvious early symptoms. Doctors say a major challenge is that many patients either skip routine BP checks or discontinue medication on their own, often under the false belief that long-term use of antihypertensive drugs can harm the kidneys. Highlighting the risks, consultant physician Vinayak Bhat cited a case of a 65-year-old patient with hypertension and high cholesterol who stopped medication for a month and later suffered a stroke, resulting in partial paralysis. The patient was fortunately treated in time, which helped reverse some of the neurological damage. Dr Bhat said misconceptions about BP medicines remain widespread, especially the belief that they cause kidney failure. He explained that such misunderstandings often lead patients to stop



treatment, only to later develop serious complications that are wrongly attributed to the medication rather than uncontrolled blood pressure. Nephrologist Shital Lengade shared another case involving a 29-year-old banker who ignored frequent headaches and stopped follow-ups after a short course of treatment. Months later, he was diagnosed with severe kidney damage after developing symptoms such as swelling, breathlessness, and loss of appetite. His condition, linked to dangerously high blood pressure readings, had already caused significant kidney impairment before treatment was resumed. Dr Lengade explained that hypertension and kidney disease are closely interconnected, with high blood pressure

being one of the leading causes of kidney failure globally, second only to diabetes. He added that the relationship is bidirectional, as kidney disease can also trigger or worsen hypertension. Cardiologist Antonio Rodrigues warned that uncontrolled hypertension significantly increases the risk of cardiovascular disease, including heart attacks and irreversible cardiac damage. He stressed that most patients remain asymptomatic even while internal organ damage progresses silently. Experts noted that only about 40 percent of hypertensive patients experience mild symptoms such as headaches, neck pain, dizziness, or shortness of breath, while the majority show no warning signs until complications arise.

Dr Bhat further observed that many patients fail to attend regular follow-ups because hypertension does not cause discomfort, leading to delayed detection of complications. Another expert, Dr Lengade, attributed the rising incidence of hypertension among younger individuals to sedentary lifestyles and high consumption of processed, salt-rich foods. Doctors have recommended that individuals above 35 years of age, and younger people with a family history of hypertension, should check their blood pressure at least once every six months, and those diagnosed with hypertension should also undergo regular kidney function tests to prevent long-term complications.

Ebola outbreak in DR Congo kills 80, Uganda reports imported case

The Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention has declared an Ebola outbreak in the eastern Ituri province of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, with 246 cases and 80 deaths reported so far, mainly in the gold-mining towns of Mongwalu and Rwampara. Africa CDC said preliminary laboratory tests conducted at the Institut National de Recherche Biomédicale in Kinshasa confirmed the Ebola virus in 13 out of 20 samples tested, while further analysis is underway to identify the strain. Of the reported fatalities, four were among confirmed cases. Additional suspected infections have also been reported in Bunia, the provincial capital. Health authorities warned that population movement, mining activity and urban settings in the affected areas could lead to wider transmission of the disease. Meanwhile, Uganda on Friday confirmed an imported Ebola case linked to DR Congo. According to Uganda's health ministry, a 59-year-old Congolese man admitted to a hospital in Kampala earlier this week died in intensive care on Thursday after testing positive for the virus. Officials said no



local transmission has been detected so far. Africa CDC executive director Dr Jean Kaseya said significant cross-border movement between affected regions and neighbouring countries made regional coordination essential. The agency has called for joint action involving DR Congo, Uganda, South Sudan and other partners to strengthen surveillance and containment measures. The Congolese government has not yet formally declared the outbreak but is expected to hold a media briefing shortly. Authorities have also initiated consultations with neighbouring countries

and international agencies regarding containment strategies. Ebola was first identified in 1976 in what is now DR Congo. The virus is believed to have originated in bats and spreads through direct contact with bodily fluids of infected individuals. It causes severe bleeding, organ failure and has an average fatality rate of around 50 per cent, according to the World Health Organization. Early symptoms include fever, fatigue, muscle pain, headache and sore throat, followed by vomiting, diarrhoea, rash and internal or external bleeding. While there is no proven cure, supportive

treatment can improve survival chances. Ituri province has remained volatile in recent years, with military rule imposed in 2021 amid prolonged violence involving armed groups, including the Islamic State-linked Allied Democratic Forces. DR Congo has witnessed 17 Ebola outbreaks since the virus was first discovered. The country's deadliest outbreak between 2018 and 2020 claimed nearly 2,300 lives, while another outbreak in Kasai province last year killed 45 people. Overall, Ebola has caused around 15,000 deaths across Africa over the past five decades.

Metro To Run Extra Trips Amid Govt's Appeal To Citizens To Cut Private Vehicle Usage

With plans to run 24 additional train trips every Monday, deploy extra security personnel, expand ticketing facilities and strengthen last-mile connectivity services, the DMRC announced a series of measures aimed at encouraging more people to shift from private vehicles to public transport across Delhi-NCR. The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on Sunday said it will introduce 24 additional train trips with the deployment of six extra trains every Monday from May 18, while similar arrangements may also be made on other days depending on passenger demand. The move comes as part of efforts to strengthen mass transit systems and improve urban mobility amid growing emphasis on energy security, environmental sustainability and reduced dependence on petroleum-based transport. According to the corporation, the additional services are aimed at handling a possible increase in passenger footfall and ensuring smooth and uninterrupted operations during peak travel periods. It said passenger demand will be monitored closely and further steps will be taken whenever required. To manage higher com-



muter volumes, the DMRC will also deploy additional security personnel, open extra ticket counters, activate spare door frame metal detectors and baggage scanners, and take steps to reduce waiting time at frisking points, it stated. Highlighting the metro network's role in integrated transport connectivity, the corporation said several metro stations are linked with railway stations, interstate bus terminals, airport terminals, Namo Bharat Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS), Noida Metro and Rapid Metro

Gurugram. The connectivity network enables commuters to move conveniently between multiple transport systems and reduces reliance on private vehicles, it added. The DMRC also underlined the metro network's accessibility to major commercial centres, government offices, educational institutions, corporate hubs and tourist destinations across Delhi-NCR. It said areas such as Connaught Place, Chandni Chowk, Cyber City, Hauz Khas, Nehru Place and key university campuses are

directly connected through the metro network, making daily commuting easier for office-goers, students and tourists. On last-mile connectivity, the DMRC said around 1 lakh passengers use services such as e-autos, e-rickshaws, bike taxis, cab aggregators and bicycle rentals daily across 160 metro stations, according to the DMRC. The DMRC 'Saarathi App' offers integrated journey planning and allows commuters to book metro tickets and last-mile transport services through a single platform, it added. The corpora-

tion also said that hydrogen-powered bus services have recently been introduced in the Central Vista area with support from Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. to improve last-mile connectivity between metro stations and government offices. In addition, around 1,500 Devi buses operated by the Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) are currently providing feeder services at 52 metro stations, with more buses expected to be added gradually, it mentioned. The DMRC further said parking facilities are available at 126 metro stations across Delhi-NCR under its 'park and ride' initiative to encourage commuters to combine personal and public transport. The metro network has also expanded digital ticketing systems, including QR code-based tickets, National Common Mobility Cards (NCMC), WhatsApp ticketing and integration with platforms such as Paytm, PhonePe, Amazon and IRCTC, as per the corporation. The DMRC added the measures are part of its broader commitment towards promoting sustainable and environmentally responsible urban transport solutions in the national capital region.

Prudential To Acquire 75% Stake In Bharti Life Insurance, Transaction Valued At Up To Rs 4,200 Crore

British insurance giant Prudential Plc will acquire three-fourth stake in the India-headquartered Bharti Life Insurance, according to a release issued on Sunday. Prudential "has agreed to buy 75% stake", Bharti Enterprises said, in the statement issued on the acquisition deal related to its insurance arm. The initial transaction is valued at Rs 3,500 crore, with a potential additional payout of Rs 700 crore, Prudential said in a separate release. The deal marks an entry of Prudential as controlling shareholder in Bharti Life Insurance. The transaction, however, is subject to regulatory approvals and other customary conditions. Through this acquisition, Prudential is expected to leverage Bharti Life platform to expand life and health insurance offerings in India amid rising demand and digital adoption. Sunil Bharti Mittal, Founder and Chairman, Bharti Enterprises, said, "We are delighted to welcome Prudential Plc as the controlling shareholder of Bharti Life, further accelerating its growth trajectory. Prudential's



experience and global scale, combined with Bharti's strong track record, create a formidable alliance to tap into the immense potential of India's life insurance sector. This partnership opens new opportunities for Bharti Life's employees and further reinforces the strategic relationship between India and the United Kingdom." SBI Is Turning Some Branch Staff Into Salespeople. CS Setty Explains Why

State Bank of India said it is redeploying branch staff into sales and upselling roles as more banking transactions move to digital channels, signalling how customer behaviour is changing across the country's largest lender. "A large number of transactions have moved to alternate channels. We are redeploying some of the workforce into sales and training our workforce in the branches for upselling," Chairman CS Setty said during the bank's post-results earnings call earlier this month. The comments underscore how digital banking is changing the role of physical branches in India. SBI said more customers are opening accounts online, using mobile banking platforms and buying multiple financial products through the bank's ecosystem instead of visiting branches for routine transactions. The lender said 66% of new savings accounts in FY26 originated through Yono, SBI's digital banking platform. The bank added that Yono crossed four crore registrations within three months of the launch of its



new version, taking its total user base to around 10 crore customers. Changing Branch Roles SBI said the shift to digital banking is allowing it to redeploy employees towards customer acquisition and cross-selling financial products. Setty said customers now use more services from the bank beyond deposits and loans. "There are customers who tell me that they take about eight to 10 different products from SBI," he said during the interaction. He added that the bank currently sees around three products per

customer on average and wants to raise that number to five over time. SBI executives said the bank is also tracking customer engagement at district and branch levels as it looks to expand market share and increase product penetration. The bank said transaction banking products, current accounts, mutual funds, insurance and lending products are becoming part of a wider relationship-driven model. Digital Shift Setty said SBI is focusing on simplifying operations and improving customer jour-

neys as banking activity increasingly shifts online. "We are simplifying the bank at scale through Project Saral," he said in his opening remarks, referring to the lender's process re-engineering initiative. He said the initiative aims to "simplify the customer journey and release capacity within the system to focus more on relationship building and business growth." SBI said it continues to expand digital adoption while reshaping how its branch network operates as customer expectations change.

INDIA BECOMES LARGEST MARKET FOR KITKAT GLOBALLY FOR NESTLE

New Delhi: India has emerged as the largest market globally for KitKat, the iconic chocolate-coated wafer bar of Swiss food and confectionery major Nestlé, driven by strong consumer penetration, product innovation and aggressive marketing investments, according to the company, India, which had been the second-largest market for the brand over the last 2-3 years, has now become its biggest market globally, underscoring India's growing importance for the iconic chocolate wafer brand sold in over 85 countries. "India is now the largest market for KitKat globally, and the brand has accelerated its market share growth over the last few years," Nestlé India Chairman and Managing Director Manish Tiwary said during a recent media interaction. KitKat has now become the second brand in Nestlé's portfolio, after Maggi, to emerge as the largest market globally. A decade ago, India was at number 10 globally for



KitKat. As part of Nestlé India's confectionery portfolio, KitKat contributed to strong momentum in FY26, with the confectionery product group delivering high double-digit growth in both value and volume, backed by robust underlying transaction growth across its key brands, he added. According to reports, Japan, Brazil, and Europe are among the other leading markets for KitKat. Nestlé India Director Confectionery and Cereals Jagatheesan Gopichandrar said KitKat's performance was driven by "strong increase in core penetration and also entry into new consumer

demand spaces" with innovations across mainstream and premium segments. "We entered into gifting with KitKat Celebreat and nibbling with KitKat pops. We accelerated the premium portfolio with the launch of KITKAT Delights range with variants including Salted Caramel and Hazelnut, alongside mainstream innovations such as KITKAT DUO and KitKat Lemon and Lime," he said. To further deepen consumer engagement, Nestlé India has significantly increased advertising spends and rolled out partnerships and campaigns aimed at strengthening brand relevance. The com-

pany also said investments in its visicooler programme (commercial glass-door refrigerator designed to store and display) have helped accelerate growth across urban and rural markets while supporting the rollout of new product innovations. Nestlé India, in its annual report for FY25, had said it had 3,950 million fingers of KitKat after doubling its market share and becoming the fastest-growing brand within the chocolate category in the country. While Maggi's business in India is also the largest market worldwide, where it sold 5+ billion serves. KitKat was created in the 1930s by the British confectionery company Rowntree's. It came under Nestlé's fold after the Swiss multinational acquired Rowntree's in 1988. However, in the US, KitKat is manufactured under licence by the Hershey Company. KitKat has now become the second brand in Nestlé's portfolio, after Maggi, to emerge as the largest market globally.

HYBRID MUTUAL FUNDS ATTRACT RS 1.55 LAKH CRORE IN FY26 ON DIVERSIFIED INVESTMENT APPEAL

Hybrid mutual fund schemes attracted inflows of Rs 1.55 lakh crore in 2025-26, a 29% increase over the preceding fiscal year, as investors increasingly turned to diversified investment strategies amid volatile market conditions. The category witnessed strong traction despite heightened geopolitical tensions, including the conflict in West Asia, as investors sought balanced investment solutions that could cushion market volatility. "Hybrid funds saw strong traction in FY26 as investors looked for balanced investment solutions during volatile times. Multi asset allocation funds, in particular, gained popularity due to their ability to deliver relatively stable performance across market cycles," Radhika Gupta, MD and CEO of Edelweiss Mutual Fund, told PTI. According to data from the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI), the number of hybrid fund folios rose to 1.9

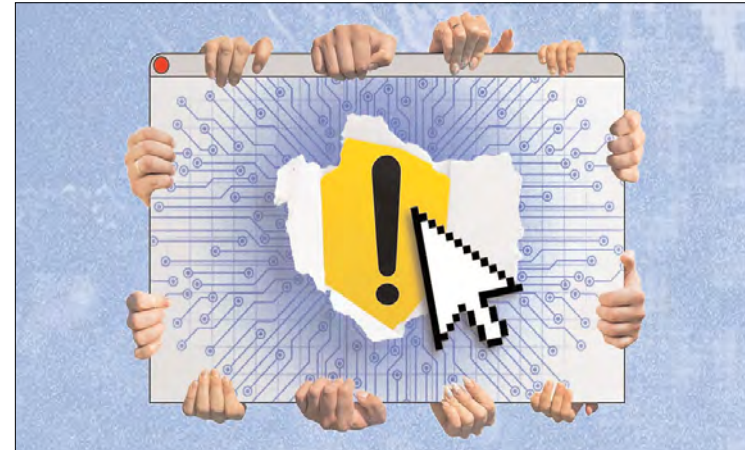


crore in March 2026 from 1.56 crore a year earlier, adding 34 lakh investor accounts. Assets under management (AUM) of hybrid schemes increased to Rs 10.35 lakh crore in March 2026 from Rs 8.83 lakh crore in March 2025, registering a growth of 17 per cent. "The growth in AUM reflects rising investor preference for diversified portfolios and asset allocation-led investing. Hybrid funds have increasingly become a core allocation for investors seeking participation in equities with relatively moderated risk," Gupta said. Equity markets remained volatile

during FY26 due to global uncertainties, including tariff concerns under US President Donald Trump, the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict and rising geopolitical tensions in West Asia. During the same period, gold outperformed equities in the short-term, benefiting hybrid categories that maintained exposure to the precious metal. "As a result, many hybrid funds were able to deliver relatively stable and higher near-term risk-adjusted performance compared to pure equity funds, which created recent bias in investors across this category.

Stop me if you've heard this one before: a tech company says it's built a new AI that's so powerful it's scary. Apparently, it's too dangerous to release into the world - the consequences would be catastrophic. Luckily for us, they are keeping it locked up for now. They just wanted you to know. That's exactly what AI company Anthropic is telling us about its latest model, Claude Myths. The company says Myths' ability to find cybersecurity bugs far surpasses human experts, and it could have world-altering consequences if similar technology lands in the wrong hands. "The fallout - for economies, public safety and national security - could be severe," Anthropic said in an early April blog post. Some breathless observers warned that Myths will soon force you to replace every piece of technology in your life, down to your Wi-Fi-enabled microwave, to protect from the digital madness. Some security experts doubt these claims, but let's set that aside. This isn't new. Executives at leading AI providers regularly issue warnings about how their industry's products may destroy humanity. Why do AI companies want you to be afraid of them? It's a strange way for any company to talk about its own work. You don't hear McDonald's announcing that it's created a burger so terrifyingly delicious that it would



be unethical to grill it for the public. Here's one theory. According to critics, it benefits AI companies to keep you fixated on apocalypse because it distracts from the very real damage they're already doing to the world. Tech leaders say they're just warning you about an inevitable future, and safety is a top priority whether it's now or later. But others argue what we're actually seeing is fear mongering, which exaggerates the potential of the technology and serves to boost stock prices. And it encourages a narrative that regulators must stand aside, because these AI companies are the only ones who can stop the bad guys and build this technology responsibly. "If you portray these technologies as

somehow almost supernatural in their danger, it makes us feel like we are powerless, like we are outmatched," says Shannon Vallor, a professor of the ethics of data and artificial intelligence at the University of Edinburgh in the UK. "As if the only people we could possibly look to would be the companies themselves." Somebody stop me An Anthropic spokesperson told me the company has been clear about these issues. They shared blog posts from other organisations supporting Myths' cyber capabilities, but said nothing to address the points in this article, aside from one comment I'll include below. This isn't the first time Anthropic chief Dario Amodei has worked on a tool that's been

declared too dangerous for the public by the company he worked for. In 2019, when Amodei was an executive at OpenAI, the company announced GPT-2. He and other company leaders said they just couldn't release GPT-2 because of "concerns about malicious applications of the technology". This was a tool far less sophisticated than ChatGPT. And months later, they released it anyway. (OpenAI CEO Sam Altman published a blog post which says the company embraces uncertainty, acknowledging that fears about GPT-2 were "misplaced".) Altman criticised Anthropic's "fear-based marketing" in a recent podcast interview. But his own "I've created a monster" playbook goes back years. "AI will probably most likely lead to the end of the world, but in the meantime, there'll be great companies," Altman said in 2015. Years later, Altman claimed he loses sleep wondering if he's "done something really bad by launching ChatGPT". If only someone warned him. Hundreds of tech leaders including Altman, Amodei, Bill Gates and Demis Hassabis, chief executive of Google DeepMind, endorsed a short statement in 2023 that said: "Mitigating the risk of extinction from AI should be a global priority alongside other societal-scale risks such as pandemics and nuclear war."

IRAN EYES A NEW SOURCE OF POWER DEEP BENEATH THE STRAIT OF HORMUZ

Emboldened by its successful wartime blockade of the Strait of Hormuz, Iran is turning to one of the hidden arteries in the global economy: subsea cables beneath the waterway that carry vast internet and financial traffic between Europe, Asia and the Persian Gulf. The Islamic Republic wants to charge the world's largest tech companies for using the subsea internet cables laid under the Strait of Hormuz, and state-linked media outlets have vaguely threatened that traffic could be disrupted if firms don't pay. Lawmakers in Tehran discussed a plan last week which could target submarine cables linking Arab countries to Europe and Asia. "We will impose fees on internet cables," Iranian military spokesperson Ebrahim Zolfaghari declared on X last week. Iran's Revolutionary Guards-linked media said Tehran's plan to extract revenue from the strait would require companies like



Google, Microsoft, Meta, and Amazon to comply with Iranian law while submarine cable companies would be required to pay licensing fees for cable passage, with repair and maintenance rights given exclusively to Iranian firms. It's also unclear how the regime could force tech giants to comply, as they are barred from making payments to Iran due to strict US

sanctions; as a result, the companies themselves may view Iran's statements as posturing rather than serious policy. Still, state-affiliated media outlets have issued veiled threats warning of damage to cables that could impact some of the trillions of dollars in global data transmission and affect worldwide internet connectivity. As fears grow that the

war could resume following US President Donald Trump's return from China, Iran is increasingly signaling that it has powerful tools at its disposal beyond military force. The move underscores the significance of the Strait of Hormuz beyond energy exports, as Tehran seeks to turn its geographic leverage into long-term economic and strategic power.

Subsea cables form the backbone of global connectivity, carrying the vast majority of the world's internet and data traffic. Targeting them would affect far more than internet speeds, threatening everything from banking systems, military communications and AI cloud infrastructure to remote work, online gaming and streaming services. Iran's threats are part of a strategy to demonstrate its leverage over the Strait of Hormuz and ensure the survival of the regime, a core objective for the Islamic Republic in this war, said Dina Esfandiari, Middle East lead at Bloomberg Economics. "It aims to impose such a hefty cost on the global economy that no-one will dare attack Iran again," she said. "Cascading digital catastrophe" Several major intercontinental subsea cables pass through the Strait of Hormuz. Because of long-standing security risks with Iran, international operators

have deliberately avoided Iranian waters, instead clustering the majority of the cables in a narrow band along the Omani side of the waterway, said Mostafa Ahmed, a senior researcher at the United Arab Emirates-based Habtoor Research Center, who published a paper on the effects of a large-scale attack on submarine communications infrastructure in the Gulf. However, two of those cables, Falcon and Gulf Bridge International (GBI), run through Iranian territorial waters, said Alan Mauldin, research director at TeleGeography, a telecom research firm. Iran has not explicitly said it will sabotage the cables, but it has repeatedly declared through officials, lawmakers and state-linked media of its intent to punish Washington's allies in the region. It appears to be the latest asymmetric warfare technique devised by the regime to attack its neighbors.

HOW WORRYING IS THE EBOLA OUTBREAK "IN DR CONGO?"



The outbreak of Ebola in the Democratic Republic of Congo is concerning. It has been spreading for weeks undetected in a part of the world where civil war makes getting on top of the virus difficult, and the species of Ebola involved is rare, so there are fewer tools to stop a virus that kills between a third and half of people infected. This is a critical moment in an outbreak where there is uncertainty about how far it has spread, but there are already almost 250 suspected cases and 80 deaths. Most Ebola outbreaks tend to be small, but specialists are haunted by the 2014-16 out-

break. Then, 28,600 people in West Africa were infected in the largest ever outbreak of the disease. The declaration of a public health emergency of international concern by the World Health Organization (WHO) does not mean we are in the early stages of a Covid-style pandemic. The risk Ebola poses to the whole world remains tiny. Even in the 2014-16 outbreak, there were only three cases in the UK and all were healthcare workers who had volunteered to help. "But it does reflect that the situation is complex enough to require international coordination.

TAIWAN INSISTS IT IS INDEPENDENT AFTER TRUMP WARNING



Taiwan has insisted it is a sovereign, independent nation, after US President Donald Trump cautioned it against formally declaring independence from China. Trump's remarks came after a two-day summit in Beijing, after which he said he had "made no commitment either way" about the self-governing island - which China claims as part of its territory and has not ruled out taking by force. After talks with Chinese President Xi Jinping, Trump also said he would soon decide whether to approve an \$11bn (\$8bn) package of weapons to be sold to Taiwan. The US administration is bound by law to provide Taiwan with a means of self-defence, but has frequently had to square this alliance with maintaining a diplomatic relationship with China. Taiwanese President Lai Ching-te has previously stated that Taiwan does not need to declare formal independence because it already sees itself as a sovereign nation. On Saturday, presidential spokesperson Karen Kuo said it was "self-evident" that Taiwan was "a sovereign, independent democratic country". She added, however, that Taiwan was com-

mitted to maintaining the status quo with China - in which Taiwan neither declares independence from China nor unites with it. Many Taiwanese consider themselves to be part of a separate nation, though most are in favour of maintaining their current status. Washington's established position is that it does not support Taiwanese independence, with continued ties with Beijing being contingent on its acceptance that there is only one Chinese government. In an interview with Fox News after meetings with President Xi, Trump reiterated that US policy on Taiwan had not changed, while making it clear he did not seek conflict with Beijing. "I'm not looking to have somebody go independent," he said. "You know, we're supposed to travel 9,500 miles (15,289km) to fight a war. I'm not looking for that. I want them to cool down." On the flight back to Washington, the US presidential spokesperson Karen Kuo said it was "self-evident" that Taiwan was "a sovereign, independent democratic country". Man drives car into pedestrians in Italy, injuring eight



A man drove his car into pedestrians in the northern Italian city of Modena on Saturday, injuring eight people, four seriously, officials said. They included a woman who had to have both her legs amputated. After the car came to a halt against a shop window, the driver emerged holding a knife and injured a passer-by who gave chase, before the suspect was overpowered. The suspect, 31, has been

identified by officials as an Italian national of Moroccan origin. Italy's Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, who cancelled a planned trip to Cyprus and described the incident as "extremely serious", visited the injured in hospital with President Sergio Mattarella on Sunday. She also met Luca Signorelli, the passer-by who intervened, and thanked him for his actions.

WHO DECLARES EBOLA OUTBREAK IN DR CONGO AN INTERNATIONAL EMERGENCY

The World Health Organization (WHO) has declared an Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo a public health emergency of international concern. The agency said the outbreak in DR Congo's eastern Ituri province, which has seen around 246 suspected cases and 80 deaths reported, does not meet the criteria of a pandemic emergency. But it warned it could potentially be "a much larger outbreak" than what is currently being detected and reported, with significant risk of local and regional spread. The current strain of Ebola is caused by the Bundibugyo virus, the health agency said, for which there are no approved drugs or vaccines. Early symptoms include fever, muscle pain, fatigue,



headache and sore throat, and are followed by vomiting, diarrhoea, a rash and bleeding. The WHO said there are now eight laboratory-confirmed cases of the virus, with other suspected cases and deaths across three health zones including Bunia the capital of Ituri province, and the gold-mining towns of Mongwalu and Rwampara. One case of the virus has been confirmed in

the capital Kinshasa, believed to be in a patient returning from Ituri. The WHO said that the virus has spread beyond DR Congo, with two confirmed cases reported in neighbouring Uganda. Ugandan officials said a 59-year-old man who died on Thursday had tested positive. In a statement, the Ugandan government said the patient who died was a Congolese citizen whose body has already been returned to DR Congo. A laboratory has also confirmed an Ebola case in the eastern city of Goma, currently controlled by the M23 rebels, the AFP news agency reported on Sunday. The WHO said the ongoing security situation and humanitarian crisis in DR Congo, combined with high population mobility, the urban location of the hotspot, and the large number of informal healthcare facilities in the region increased the risk of spread. Countries bordering the DR Congo are considered high risk due to trade and travel. The WHO advised that DR Congo and Uganda establish emergency operation centres to monitor, trace, and implement infection-prevention measures.

Trump-backed challenger defeats Republican senator who voted to convict president

A Trump-backed challenger has defeated a two-term Republican senator who voted to convict the president at his 2021 impeachment trial. Congresswoman Julia Letlow will advance to a runoff next month, ousting incumbent Bill Cassidy, who President Donald Trump branded a "disloyal disaster" ahead of Louisiana's high-stakes contest on Saturday. State treasurer John Fleming, another Trump-aligned candidate, also advanced to the Republican runoff for Louisiana's Senate seat. The top two candidates, Letlow and Fleming, will face off again in late June as neither won a simple majority. The candidate who wins the runoff



will then run against a Democratic candidate in the general election. Cassidy, 68, was one of seven Senate Republicans who voted to convict Trump when the president was impeached after the 6 January attack on the Capitol in 2021. Trump was acquitted after the Senate

voted 57-43, short of the two-thirds majority required. Of the seven Republicans who voted to convict him, only three still serve in the Senate: Lisa Murkowski of Alaska, who survived a primary challenge in 2022; Susan Collins of Maine; and Bill Cassidy. During his re-election cam-

paign, the Louisiana senator sought to repair his strained relationship with Trump. "I don't really think President Trump likes me that much, but we work really well together," Cassidy told reporters last week, pointing to several bills he sponsored that were later signed into law by the president. But Trump had made it clear he wanted Cassidy gone, and in January encouraged Letlow, 45, to challenge the senator. "I want to say thank you to a very special man - the best president this country has ever had, President Donald Trump," Letlow said in a speech after the late evening results. In his election night remarks, Cassidy did not mention Trump by name.

CANADIAN FROM HANTAVIRUS-HIT CRUISE SHIP TESTS POSITIVE



A Canadian who sailed on the cruise ship MV Hondius which was hit by a hantavirus outbreak in April has tested positive for the disease, officials in the province of British Columbia say. The individual, one of four people isolating on Vancouver Island after leaving the ship, had developed mild symptoms. The province's senior health officer said the four had not had any contact with the public since arriving in Canada. The case brings the total number of infections to 11, all among cruise passengers. Three people who travelled on the ship have died, with two confirmed to have had the virus. British Columbia health officer Bonnie Henry said the person's test came back as a presumptive positive on Friday, meaning that it still remains to be confirmed by a national microbiology lab. "Clearly, this is not what we hoped for, but it is what we planned for," she said, quoted by national broadcaster CBC. "I want to emphasise that hantavirus is a very different respiratory virus than the ones we've been dealing with - like

Covid, like influenza, like measles - and it remains one that we do not consider to have pandemic potential," Dr Henry added. Of the six Canadians who were on the Dutch ship, two are self-isolating at their home in Ontario. Two more couples are isolating on Vancouver Island, one from British Columbia and the other from Yukon. The person who tested positive is from Yukon. None of the other five have tested positive so far. The cruise ship, which set sail from Argentina on 1 April, docked in Tenerife, in Spain's Canary Islands, less than a week ago, allowing its passengers to leave and go into isolation. The ship is due to arrive in Rotterdam in the Netherlands on Monday, and remaining staff on board will disembark, its owner Oceanwide Expeditions said, adding that there were currently no symptomatic individuals on board. The WHO has recommended 42 days of isolation for each person. The Canadians were initially required to isolate for 21 days but Dr Henry said that timeline could now be adjusted.

Whale found dead near Danish island after German rescue operation



A humpback whale rescued after beaching itself in Germany has been found dead near a Danish island. The whale was first spotted stuck on a sandbank on 23 March, off the island of Poel on Germany's Baltic coast. It swam free in early May after a water-filled barge carried it into the North Sea. The operation was privately funded by two

German entrepreneurs and spurred intense public debate, with critics suggesting it would only cause the animal distress. A whale carcass was reportedly spotted on Thursday off the Danish island of Anholt, located between Denmark and Sweden. Authorities were not immediately able to confirm it was the same whale.

Ronda Rousey Defeats Gina Carano By Submission In Netflix Main Event

Ronda Rousey needed just 17 seconds to end the most anticipated women's MMA fight in years. The former UFC champion submitted Gina Carano with her signature armbar in the first round of the Netflix main event at the Intuit Dome in Inglewood, California, in what became an instant viral moment and a perfect storybook ending to her career. After the fight, Rousey confirmed her retirement from MMA for the second time. "There's no way I could've ended it better than this," she said. "I want to have some more babies, and I've got to get cooking." What Happened in the Fight From the opening bell, Rousey was vintage. She rushed Carano immediately, scored a takedown inside six seconds, advanced to mount, and rained down ground and pound before locking in the armbar at the 17-second mark. Carano briefly threatened with a guillotine choke but released it, and once Rousey advanced to mount, the fight was over almost instantly. Carano reflected on the finish with grace. "I wanted that to last longer," she



said. "I felt so good. I've never felt that good, but I haven't been here for 17 years. Getting in the cage was a victory. Fighting a legend was a victory." She did not rule out fighting again. The Historical Weight of the Night Carano lost 100 pounds over 20 months to make the 145-pound featherweight limit for the fight, a remarkable physical undertaking for a 44-year-old who had not competed since losing to Cris Cyborg in 2009. The fight marked a rare collision between two women who transformed the sport in entirely different eras. Rousey changed MMA forever during her UFC title run, making six consecutive title

defences before losses to Holly Holm in 2015 and Amanda Nunes in 2016 ended her championship reign. Carano had pioneered the sport years before Rousey arrived, competing in the first nationally televised women's MMA fight in 2007. What Comes Next Rousey has confirmed her retirement, closing the chapter definitively this time. For MVP and Netflix, the momentum from Saturday night is enormous. Francis Ngannou knocked out Philippe Lins on the same card and immediately called out Jon Jones, who was in attendance. Mike Perry defeated Nate Diaz via doctor's stoppage in a savage co-main event.

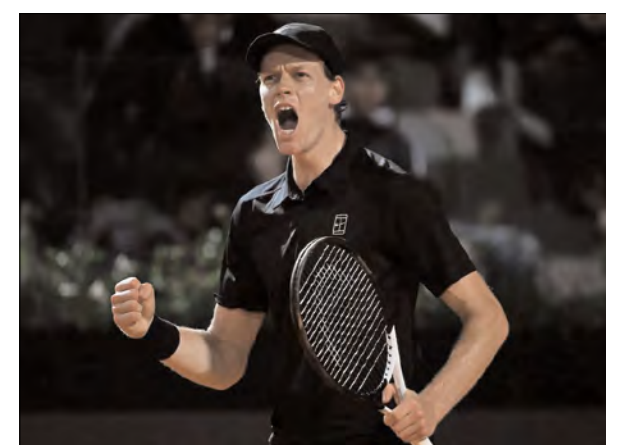

Medvedev looked like being blown away when Sinner rattled off the first four games before taking the first set in just 33 minutes. But any idea that another massacre was on

the cards went away when Medvedev won the first three games of the second set and began to get his racket to nearly everything Sinner, who began to show serious signs of tiredness, threw at him. Sinner drew level in the set but repeatedly had to lean on his racket between points and after winning game six was visibly out of breath in his seat, looking out on his feet as he conceded the second set. But Medvedev started to make mistakes of his own, hitting two consecutive double faults in giving up his serve in game three of the third set, as Sinner took control before the rain stopped play. Sinner is still favourite to become the first Italian to win the Rome title in five decades, ahead of a potential career Grand Slam at the French Open. Ruud rolls into final. Should he get to the final he will have to get past Ruud, who reached his first title decider since winning in Stockholm in October last year by dismantling Luciano Darderi 6-1, 6-1, another match interrupted by heavy rain.



Bruno Fernandes Ties Premier League Assist Record With 20th Of Season For Manchester United

Bruno Fernandes has tied the record for most assists in a single Premier League campaign. By setting up Bryan Mbeumo for United's third goal against Nottingham Forest on Sunday, Fernandes moved onto 20 assists — equal with the record held jointly by Thierry Henry (2002-03) and Kevin De Bruyne (2019-20). United has one game left in the league this season, at Brighton next weekend. Bruno Fernandes equalled the Premier League record for assists in a season as Manchester United won an entertaining five-goal encounter with Nottingham Forest. Fernandes' cross from the right was turned home by

Bryan Mbeumo to make it 3-1, taking the United skipper level with Thierry Henry and Kevin de Bruyne on 20 assists - with one game of the season remaining. On a day when Casemiro received a standing ovation on his Old Trafford farewell nine minutes from time, United got the result they needed to secure third place under Michael Carrick, who is still to be officially confirmed as permanent boss. Fernandes' achievement at least took some of the headlines away from yet another contentious VAR incident. Forest had only just cancelled out Luke Shaw's fifth-minute opener, through Morato's header, when Diogo

Dalot crossed for Mbeumo. The Cameroon forward appeared to control the ball between his upper arm and his side before having his shot deflected into the path of Matheus Cunha, who applied the first-time finish. Referee Michael Salisbury gave the goal but, rather than rule it out as expected after being sent to the screen by VAR Matthew Donohue, after numerous checks and to a cacophony of boos from both sets of fans over the time taken to reach a decision - he confirmed his initial decision, as the ball had deflected off Mbeumo's hip.
