**GOLD, SILVER TRADE LOWER**

Mumbai: Gold and silver prices traded lower on Tuesday, declining up to nearly 2 per cent after the US military launched fresh strikes on southern Iran. On the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCE), gold futures (June 5) were trading 0.61 per cent or Rs 971 lower at Rs 1,58,110 at around 10:25 am. The yellow metal touched an intraday low of Rs 1,58,000, down 0.67 per cent or over Rs 1,000 from the previous close of Rs 1,59,081. It also recorded an intraday high of Rs 1,58,789, down 0.18 per cent or Rs 292. On the other hand, silver futures (July 3) also witnessed selling pressure, slipping nearly 2 per cent or over Rs 5,000 to hit an intraday low of Rs 2,71,972 so far.

## CM Revanth orders timely salaries for panchayat staff

HYDERABAD (TSIT):

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed officials to ensure that salaries of nearly 50,000 Gram Panchayat employees across the state are credited on the first day of every month without delay.

During a high-level review meeting with senior officials of the Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department, the Chief Minister said Panchayat employees should receive salaries on par with IAS officers and other government staff. He announced that the state government would allocate a special fund of Rs.50 crore every month exclusively for salary payments to Panchayat employees.

The Chief Minister also instructed officials to ensure timely salary payments for outsourcing and contract employees working in various government departments. He warned that delays in salary disbursement would not be tolerated. In another key decision, Revanth Reddy agreed to restore provisions related to the finan-



cial autonomy of Gram Panchayats that were removed during the previous government's tenure.

As part of the proposed amendment to Section 70(3) of the Telangana Panchayat Raj Act, 2018, the Chief Minister directed officials to amend rules allowing Gram Panchayats to deposit their Own Source Revenue (OSR) into bank accounts instead of treasury accounts. The move is aimed at strengthening local self-governance and improving financial independence.

The Chief Minister also issued directions to reform the pension distribution

system in the state. He instructed officials to discontinue the existing method of pension delivery through the postal department and instead transfer pensions directly into beneficiaries' bank accounts. Emphasising transparency and accountability, Revanth Reddy directed officials to streamline the pension system using Voter ID, Aadhaar and SEEEPC data to ensure benefits reach only eligible beneficiaries.

He further instructed officials to give top priority to single women in the allocation of newly sanctioned pensions.

## India, US ink pact on critical minerals to break China's monopoly

NEW DELHI (TSIT):

India and the US on Tuesday signed a strategic agreement to deepen cooperation in critical minerals and rare earths which constitute key materials for making semiconductors, electric vehicles, solar panels and high-tech defence products.

The pact comes in the backdrop of growing global concerns on China's dominance over these critical inputs which gives the communist giant the power to disrupt global supply chains.

The agreement was signed during the Quad Foreign Ministers' meeting here, in the presence of External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar and US Secretary of State, Marco Rubio. He said the framework aims to deepen cooperation across the entire critical minerals and rare earth supply chain, including mining, processing, recycling and related investment.



Rubio pointed out that the agreement has been signed because India and the US "have a strategic and shared interest in the fact that vibrant innovation economies such as ours cannot afford to leave the foundational materials of these industries vulnerable to single source monopolies that could deny us these things, not just in a time of conflict, but as a lever-

"I have spoken often during my time here over the last few days about the strategic alliance between the United States and India and how important that is for our national interest in the United States. And today is a tangible example of it. We are two countries that have strategic interests in ensuring reliable long-term access to critical minerals and supply chains that are important for our innovation economy," he explained.

He observed that the groundwork for the agreement was laid for the 4th of February, when India participated in the Critical Minerals Forum hosted in Washington, DC. He also referred to India signing the Pax Silica Declaration, which is a United States-led strategic coalition aimed at building secure, resilient, and trusted supply chains for artificial intelligence (AI), semiconductors, and critical minerals.

## AP CM directs officials to introduce farm-to-home model to benefit farmers

VIJAYAWADA (TSIT):

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has directed the officials to implement the Farm-to-Home model to benefit farmers by ensuring agricultural produce reaches consumers directly at their doorstep.

The Chief Minister said the initiative, particularly for fruits and vegetables, should be implemented through Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) to reduce marketing costs and improve direct access between farmers and consumers. He noted that the strategy would help make agricultural produce more affordable and accessible through efficient home delivery systems.

Addressing a review meeting on the agriculture, allied sectors and six primary sector missions, the Chief Minister instructed the officials to assess the likely impact of El Niño on the State and prepare region-wise crop



natural farming.

Naidu further instructed the officials to write to the Centre for support under the NMNF (National Mission on Natural Farming) scheme and called for exclusive counters for naturally grown produce in Rythu Bazaars and private markets.

The Chief Minister emphasised the need to prioritise irrigation for crops in regions including the Krishna and Godavari deltas. Naidu instructed officials to assess the extent to which pesticide use has been reduced and promote micronutrients while reducing dependency on chemical fertilisers.

Observing that ongoing geopolitical tensions could impact fertiliser availability, the Chief Minister stressed encouraging farmers toward natural farming. He directed agricultural universities to prepare action plans enabling professors and students to undertake field-level studies on natural farming.

He stressed the need to promote natural farming across various regions and adopt suitable cultivation methods such as PMDS-Half Moon systems in water-scarce areas.

Despite adverse climatic conditions caused by El Niño, the Chief Minister directed officials to ensure farmers do not incur losses and receive Minimum Support Price (MSP) for their crops. He also called for greater cooperation from the Centre to strengthen natural farming initiatives in Andhra Pradesh and suggested leveraging the expertise of farmers who have already succeeded in

## India slams China-Pakistan joint statement on J-K, rejects projects in PoK

NEW DELHI (TSIT)

India on Tuesday mounted a sharp diplomatic rebuttal to a joint statement issued by China and Pakistan, categorically rejecting references to Jammu and Kashmir and strongly opposing renewed Chinese backing for projects under the "so-called" China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) in Pakistan-occupied territories.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh "have been, are and will always remain integral and inalienable parts of India", asserting that no other country had the "locus standi" to comment on the matter.

The strong response came after Beijing and Islamabad, in a joint statement issued during Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's visit to China, reiterated support for deeper cooperation under CPEC and referred to the Kashmir issue while calling for enhanced "trans-boundary water resources cooperation".

Reacting to the development, MEA spokesperson

Randhir Jaiswal said India "categorically rejects unwarranted references" to Jammu and Kashmir in the China-Pakistan statement. India also reiterated its longstanding objection to CPEC projects passing through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), saying such initiatives violated India's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

"As regards the so-called China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects, some of which are in India's sovereign territory, we resolutely oppose and reject any moves by other countries to reinforce or legitimise Pakistan's illegal and forcible occupation of these territories," Jaiswal said.

## Top Maoist leader, wife surrender before Telangana Police



HYDERABAD (TSIT):

In a major setback to the banned Communist Party of India (Maoist), senior Maoist leader Pasunoori Narahari and his wife Medara Danamma surrendered before Telangana Police on Tuesday. Director General of Police C. V. Anand presented the surrendered Maoist leaders before the media in Hyderabad.

Police said Narahari, also known by aliases Vishwanath and Salai Da, served as secretary of the Bihar-Jharkhand Special Area Committee (BJSAC), while Danamma, also known as Latha, Poonam and Joba, was a State Committee Member.

The DGP stated that with their surrender, the last surviving Eastern Regional Bureau of the Maoist organisation is nearing collapse. A native of Hanumakonda district in Telangana, 64-year-old Narahari

joined the Radical Students Union during his college days before formally joining CPI (ML) People's War in 1982 under the influence of late Maoist leader Puli Anjiah.

Police said Narahari played a key role in Maoist operations and possessed expertise in manufacturing and maintaining firearms, mortars, rockets, rocket-propelled grenades and booby traps.

He reportedly trained cadres in weapons production and maintenance while handling senior technical and organisational responsibilities.

Danamma, a native of Guntur district, joined the Maoist movement after marrying Narahari in 1988. She worked in the Technical Department teams in Chhattisgarh and Nagpur and later served in various leadership roles within the Bihar-Jharkhand Special Area Committee.

## CM Siddaramaiah meets Cong high command in Delhi amid K'taka leadership change buzz

NEW DELHI/BENGALURU (TSIT):

The high-voltage meeting over the speculated leadership change in Karnataka is underway at Indira Bhavan in Delhi on Tuesday, with Chief Minister Siddaramaiah attending it. Meanwhile, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's office has released photographs showing Siddaramaiah and Deputy Chief Minister Shivakumar engaged in a deep discussion at Indira Bhavan in Delhi. The development has further fuelled speculations.

Sources stated that Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge, General Secretaries K.C. Venugopal



and Karnataka in-charge Randeep Singh Surjewala are participating in the meeting with Siddaramaiah.

Sources further stated that after concluding discussions with Siddaramaiah, the leaders will hold a separate meeting with Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar. The out-

come of the meeting is being keenly awaited. Deputy Chief Minister Shivakumar is considered a strong contender for the Chief Minister's post. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has repeatedly expressed his desire to complete the full term and has also stated that he will abide by the decision of the

party high command. Ministers and legislators belonging to Siddaramaiah's camp have demanded that, in the event of a leadership change, state Home Minister G. Parameshwara, who hails from the Dalit community, should be made the Chief Minister.

Party President Mallikarjun Kharge has also stated that he was under pressure from state leaders, party workers and national leaders to become the Chief Minister. All eyes are now on the developments. Meanwhile, Deputy CM D.K. Shivakumar smiled when asked by media persons whether he would be the next Chief Minister of Karnataka.

Before arriving at Indira Bhavan, Siddaramaiah had breakfast at Karnataka Bhavan in Delhi along with Ministers G. Parameshwara, Satish Jarkiholi, H.C. Mahadevappa, Byrathi Suresh, K.J. George, and M.B. Patil, as well as senior Congress leader and Haryana in-charge B.K. Hariprasad and legal adviser Ponnanna, among other prominent leaders. PWD Minister Satish Jarkiholi, reacting to the developments, said, "There has been confusion in the party for the past six months, and we are confident that it will be cleared soon. We have not received any call from the high command, and we have come along with Chief Minister Siddaramaiah.

## Indian pilgrims reach Arafat as Haj rituals begins in Saudi Arabia

As millions of pilgrims assemble at Saudi Arabia's Arafat on Tuesday for the core ritual of Haj, all Indian pilgrims had reached the holy site comfortably and in a timely manner to take part in the prayers.

Extending his wishes to all those performing Haj, Indian Ambassador to the Saudi Arabia, Suhel Ajaz Khan, said, "Today is the day of Arafat. It is the most important day of the core Haj, where the entire pilgrimage moves from the tent city of Mina to Arafat and spends the day here in Arafat



in prayer before they move to their next destination of Muzdalifah after the sunset." "All Indian pilgrims have moved from Mina to Arafat in a timely manner, in a very comfortable manner, and they are all now accommodated in their tents in Arafat. We had moved pilgrims by both the buses and the trains.

## Telangana Government on High Alert Against Ebola; No Cases Reported in State

Hyderabad TSIT: Health Minister Damodar Raja narasimha on Tuesday clarified that no Ebola cases have been reported in the state so far and that no person with Ebola symptoms has been identified. He urged the public not to panic, assuring that the government was maintaining the highest level of vigilance to prevent the entry of the virus into Telangana.

Minister stated that the state government has taken stringent precautionary measures at airports and strengthened the healthcare system to effectively handle any emergency situation in the interest of public health.

The Minister conducted a high-level review meeting on Ebola prevention, preparedness, and precautionary measures in the wake of the spread of the Ebola virus in certain African countries.

Review meeting was held at the Aarogyasri Trust office in Hyderabad and was attended by Health Department Principal Secretary Christina Z. Chongthu, Health and Family Welfare Commissioner Sangeetha Satyanarayana, Director of Public Health Ravinder Naik, Director of Medical Education Narendra Kumar, Telangana Vaidya Vidhana Parishad Commissioner Ajay



Kumar, Srikanth Reddy and other senior officials. Officials informed Minister that there are currently no Ebola cases in Telangana and that all precautionary measures have been implemented as per the guidelines issued by the Central Government.

Special screening and thermal scanning are being conducted at the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Shamshabad for passengers arriving from Ebola-affected countries such as the Democratic Republic of Congo, Uganda, and South Sudan. A dedicated team comprising doctors, health inspectors, field staff, and paramedical personnel has been deployed at the airport for continuous monitoring. Officials said

108 ambulance services have been kept on 24-hour standby for emergencies. A special 10-bed isolation ward has been established at Gandhi Hospital, and Dr. Sunil Kumar, HOD of General Medicine, has been appointed as the nodal officer for Ebola management. Samples of suspected patients, if any, will be sent to the National Institute of Virology (NIV), Pune for testing.

Passengers arriving from Ebola-affected countries are being placed under 21-day home self-isolation and are being monitored by district surveillance teams. Officials informed that as of May 25, a total of 58 passengers had arrived in Hyderabad from Ebola-affected countries, and none of them had shown

any symptoms. All have been classified under Category-I and placed under 21-day home isolation.

During the review, Minister Damodar Rajanarasimha directed officials to maintain continuous surveillance without any negligence. He instructed that any passenger showing symptoms should be immediately shifted to the isolation ward at Gandhi Hospital.

Minister also directed all government hospitals to remain alert and ensure strict implementation of infection control protocols. He stressed the need for strong coordination among airport authorities, district surveillance teams, and hospitals to prevent any possible spread of the virus.

## BJP Using Fabricated Cases to Silence Women's Voices Rekha Boyalapalli

Hyderabad TSIT: Telangana Pradesh Mahila Congress (TPMC) Vice President Rekha Boyalapalli on Tuesday strongly condemned the BJP-led Central Government for allegedly filing politically motivated and fabricated cases against All India Mahila Congress (AIMC) President Alka Lamba.



Addressing a press conference at Gandhi Bhavan in Hyderabad, Rekha Boyalapalli said the BJP government was resorting to "cowardly tactics" to divert public attention from its failures and the increasing crimes against women across the country.

She stated that Alka Lamba had emerged as a strong voice demanding the immediate implementation of the Women's Reservation Bill and accused the Centre of misusing state machinery to harass opposition leaders raising issues concerning women's rights and dignity. Launching a sharp attack on the BJP, Rekha Boyalapalli questioned the ruling party's stand on several incidents involving crimes against women, including the incidents in Manipur, Hathras, and the Bilkiis Bano case. She alleged that the BJP government had repeatedly failed to ensure justice for victims and instead pro-

tected those accused in several sensitive cases.

She also referred to incidents involving Prajwal Revanna, the Unnao and Kathua cases, and the protests by India's Olympic wrestlers at Jantar Mantar, stating that the BJP government had consistently failed to stand with victims. Rekha Boyalapalli asserted that the Telangana Mahila Congress would not be intimidated by what she described as false cases and political threats. She announced that the Congress party would fight the issue both legally and politically, extending full support to AIMC President Alka Lamba. She further said that every Mahila Congress worker in Telangana stood firmly with Alka Lamba and vowed to continue raising their voice against injustice and attacks on women leaders.

Hyderabad TSIT: Telangana Government has decided to organise the concluding celebrations of the prestigious 99-day "Praja Palana Pragati Pranalika" programme in a grand manner across the State from June 2 to June 12. The decision was taken at a high-level Cabinet Sub-Committee meeting chaired by Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka at the Secretariat on Tuesday. ## Centre's "Scant Concern" for Farmers Exposed as Telangana Scales Up Record Paddy Procurement Uttam

Hyderabad TSIT : Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy stated today that the Union Government's approach towards paddy procurement was "demonstrative of scant concern for farmers" despite Telangana handling one of the country's largest grain procurement operations.

During an informal media interaction, Uttam Kumar Reddy said the Congress government in Telangana was procuring paddy on a scale unmatched by most BJP-ruled states while the Centre was "failing to discharge its responsibility" towards farmers.

He said Telangana had already procured nearly 54 lakh metric tonnes of paddy and was targeting procurement of around 70 lakh metric tonnes during the ongoing Yasangi season through an extensive network of 8,575 procurement centres spread across the State. "The entire paddy procured by the State must be lifted by the Centre at the declared MSP. The Union Government cannot evade its responsibility after announcing Minimum Support Price," the Minister asserted.

Accusing BJP leaders of indulging in political criticism while ignoring



ground realities, Uttam Kumar Reddy said Telangana was purchasing more paddy than several BJP-governed states put together.

"Before criticising Telangana, BRS leaders should first check how much procurement happened during their ten-year rule. Even compared to previous regime, this government has procured more paddy and ensured faster payments to farmers," he said.

Minister claimed the State government was ensuring procurement till the "last grain" and depositing payments into farmers' bank accounts within 48 hours. He also highlighted the financial burden being borne by the State government due to delays and gaps in Central support. According to him, Telangana had already spent nearly Rs 9,000 crore

towards procurement payments this season by May-end and would cross around Rs 11,500 crore if MSP-linked dues were fully accounted for.

Taking a political swipe at the BJP, Uttam Kumar Reddy questioned the rationale behind Central leaders undertaking political tours in Telangana while allegedly remaining indifferent to procurement responsibilities. "The Centre is neglecting farmers while Telangana is standing firmly with them. BJP leaders must explain how much paddy their own states are procuring compared to Telangana," he said. The Minister reiterated that the Congress government remained committed to protecting farmer interests despite logistical pressures, mounting arrivals and financial stress on the State exchequer.

## Surveyor Caught Accepting Bribe by ACB in Jogulamba Gadwal

Jogulamba Gadwal: A surveyor working in Waddepally mandal of Jogulamba Gadwal district was caught red-handed by Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) officials while allegedly accepting a bribe from a farmer for conducting a land survey. According to official sources, Waddepally Mandal Surveyor Brahmaiah allegedly demanded Rs.20,000 from a farmer to survey four acres of agricultural land, reportedly charging Rs.5,000 per acre. The accused had allegedly already collected an advance amount of Rs.5,000 and insisted that



the remaining amount be paid before completing the survey work.

Unable to bear the alleged harassment, the farmer approached ACB officials and lodged a complaint. Acting on the information, a team led by Balakrishna conducted a

trap operation and allegedly caught the surveyor while accepting Rs.10,000 from the complainant. Officials registered a case and shifted the accused to judicial remand, DSP Balakrishna confirmed.

Reacting to the incident, Morugu Veeresh expressed concern over alleged corruption in land survey services across the district. He alleged that survey works in several mandals were not being carried out without payment of bribes and that farmers were being forced to visit government offices for months and sometimes years to resolve their issues.

WARANGAL, May 26, TSIT: As part of the women's week celebrations, the "Child Marriage Free Telangana" programme was grandly organized at Parvatigiri MPDO office. According to police, the deceased, Sayini Kumar (40), a farmer from Gudipet village in Hajipur mandal, frequently quarrelled with his wife Sayini Bharati over her alleged extramarital relationship with Lagishetti Surender. Police said Kumar, who was allegedly addicted to alcohol, often assaulted his wife after learning about the relationship.

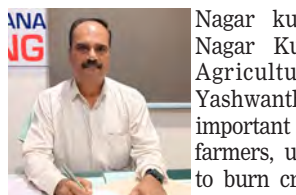
Investigators also found that Kumar had borrowed Rs.60,000 from Ram Mallesh and failed to repay the amount, leading to repeated disputes. Police said Bharati and Surender allegedly conspired to eliminate Kumar, considering him an obstacle to their relationship. They reportedly purchased multiple insur-

ance policies in Kumar’s name before planning the murder. As part of the conspiracy, the accused allegedly struck a Rs.10 lakh deal with Ram Mallesh to carry out the murder and stage it as a road accident. An advance payment of Rs.2 lakh was reportedly made.

According to the investigation, on May 22, the accused allegedly took Kumar to the outskirts of Mulkalla village, made him consume excessive alcohol, and attacked him with an iron hammer. Believing he had died, they allegedly placed his body and motorcycle on the road to make the

incident appear as an accident. The arrested accused were identified as Ram Mallesh (A1), Sriram Kumar (A2), Sayini Bharati (A3), and Lagishetti Surender (A4). Police seized a motorcycle, mobile phones, cash, the hammer allegedly used in the murder, and insurance policy documents from the accused. Officials said the case was solved quickly using technical evidence and surveillance. Senior officers appreciated Mancherial Rural Circle Inspector G. Ravinder, SI Kiran Kumar and the police team involved in the investigation.

### FARMERS URGED NOT TO BURN CROP RESIDUE: DISTRICT AGRICULTURE OFFICER YASHWANTH RAO



Nagar kurnool (TSIT) Nagar Kurnool District Agriculture Officer Yashwanth Rao issued important instructions to farmers, urging them not to burn crop residue and stubble from paddy, maize, and other crops. He warned that burning agricultural waste is a punishable offence under law. Officials stated that burning crop residue causes severe environmental damage. Dense smoke from stubble burning can lead to road accidents and also increase the risk of respiratory illnesses. The Agriculture Department explained that burning crop waste damages soil fertility and reduces essential nutrients in the land. Farmers were advised to incorporate crop residue into the soil using rotavator or mulcher machines. Officials said that mixing crop residue into the soil helps convert it into organic manure, improves soil fertility, and reduces cultivation costs for farmers. The department also warned that strict action would be taken against those violating the rules by burning crop waste. Under NGT Sections 19, 37, and 39, offenders may face fines as well as imprisonment. Farmers were appealed to cooperate in environmental protection and adopt eco-friendly agricultural practices.

He assured the villagers that he would make all efforts to prevent the establishment of the dump yard. Villagers also raised slogans at the camp office demanding withdrawal of the proposal.

# Kavitha meets Telangana Governor, represents issues of land evictees

Hyderabad (TSIT): Telangana Rakshana Samithi (TRS) President K. Kavitha on Tuesday met Telangana Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla and sought justice for those displaced by land acquisition by the state government at various places. Kavitha, along with Dharma Samaj Party President Visharadan Maharaj and some affected people, submitted a petition to the Governor, requesting that house sites be provided to all those whose homes were demolished in Velugumatla in Khammam district. They also demanded that the land acquisition notice issued for setting up an Industrial Park in Kadlapur of Parigi Mandal be cancelled. They also urged him to address the issues of the change in the Regional Ring Road (RRR) alignment and land acquisition problems. Two representatives each from Velugumatla, Kadlapur, and RRR areas were part of the delegation that met the Governor. Kavitha told media persons after meeting the Governor at Lok Bhavan



that he responded positively. She hoped that justice would be served. She slammed the government headed by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for demolishing the houses of women. She stated that the Chief Minister is spreading lies, claiming to have turned these

people into millionaires after merely distributing sarees worth one hundred rupees. Describing Revanth Reddy as a "ruthless" Chief Minister, she stated that the Congress government is a "wicked" administration. Kavitha and others shared the plight of the victims

with the Governor. They apprised the Governor of the house demolitions in Velugumatla in Khammam, the changes made to the RRR alignment, land acquisition in Rayagiri, and the ongoing attempts to acquire land in Kadlapur under the guise of

establishing an industrial park. She said the TRS and the Dharma Samaj Party have been fighting on behalf of the victims of land acquisition for the industrial park in Parigi, the house demolitions in Velugumatla and the persons displaced by the RRR project. "As a result of our struggle, the government has agreed to allocate land to the victims in Velugumatla at the very same location. The government has also halted the land acquisition processes intended for the Parigi industrial park and the RRR project. All these represent partial victories for us. To achieve complete success, the involvement of the Central government is essential. That is precisely why we met with the Governor and explained these issues to him," Kavitha said. She hoped that the Governor would call for a report on all these matters and respond to them in a positive and constructive manner. Kavitha said that if justice is not delivered to the victims, they will once again take up the path of agitation.

## Azinomotu monosodium glucomate should be controlled when it is high in food

Hyderabad TSIT : Dr. Pallepada Damodar, President of Consumers' Conference of Southern States, said that the use of Azinomoto in food should be controlled. On Tuesday, he met Dr C Shivaleela, Director, Food Adulteration Prevention Department, Hyderabad, and said that in the latest research conducted by ICMR and National Institute of Nutrition scientists, 18 to 24-year-old college students are consuming ultra-processed foods excessively. He said that they are getting affected by fatal diseases at a young age, youths are getting used to fast foods like biryani, fried chicken and burger just because of the taste, low price and easy online delivery system. Dr. Pallepada Damodar explained to the director that Azinomoto (China salt) is being used to make the taste more palatable, and in this process the youth are suffering from cancer, diabetes and heart pain. According to the ICMR report, if clinical tests were conducted on 311 college students, it was found that 12.5% of the youth had high blood pressure and thus there was a possibility of heart attack. Dr. Pallepada Damodar asked the director to control Azinomotu Monosodium Glucomate which is high in food items. National General



Secretary of the Consumers' Council director Sambaraju Chakrapani said that online food suppliers like Swiggy and Zomato are selling fast food biryani mostly to the youth, and fast food hotels are deceiving the consumers with unapproved colors, nasi type of spices, cooking oils that are used repeatedly, and rotten meat. It was explained to the director that due to the packing and supply of hot food items in unauthorized black plastic boxes, cancer, celiac disease, diabetes, and hormone imbalances are caused by plastic leaching. Therefore, according to the Labeling and Display Regulations 2020, action is not sought against fast food hotels and their affiliates Swiggy and Zomato.

## Srinivas University reports 100 patents at Research Conclave attended by 1,000 participants

## Medicover Treats Rare Adrenal Gland Cancer in 32-Year-Old International Patient

Hyderabad, 26 May, 2026: Medicover Cancer Institute has successfully treated a rare and aggressive case of adrenocortical carcinoma (ACC) in a 32-year-old international patient from Somalia, who now shows no evidence of disease on follow-up imaging — underscoring the institute's capability in complex, multidisciplinary cancer care. The patient initially presented with abdominal pain, vomiting, fever and loss of appetite. Advanced imaging, including a PET-CT scan, revealed a large tumour in the right suprarenal (adrenal) region that involved adjacent organs. After a detailed evaluation, the patient underwent a major en bloc surgical procedure — a radical right adrenalectomy with right nephrectomy and right hepatectomy — to remove the tumour along with the involved kidney and a portion of the liver. Histopathology and immunohistochemistry confirmed adrenocortical carcinoma, a rare malignancy arising from the outer layer (cortex) of the adrenal gland. The patient subsequently received six cycles of the EDP chemotherapy regimen — etoposide, doxorubicin and cisplatin — under the care of Dr. A. Venugopal, Senior Consultant Medical &



Hemato-Oncologist at Medicover Cancer Institute. The multidisciplinary team involved in the successful management of this complex case also included Dr. A V Ravi Kumar, Senior Consultant Urologist and Andrologist, and Dr. Kishore Reddy, Liver Transplant Surgeon. The patient tolerated chemotherapy well and was discharged in stable condition. A repeat PET-CT scan after completion of treatment showed no evidence of residual tumour, and the patient remains on structured follow-up. "Adrenocortical carcinoma is one of the rarer and more aggressive cancers we encounter, and a case in someone this young is unusual," said Dr. A. Venugopal. "What made the difference here was early, accu-

rate diagnosis, a coordinated surgical and medical oncology effort, and expert pathology review. With cancers like this, long-term follow-up with imaging and hormonal monitoring is essential, because the risk of recurrence is real — which is why we describe the patient as being in complete remission and continue to monitor closely." About Adrenocortical Carcinoma (ACC) ACC is a rare and aggressive cancer arising from the adrenal cortex, with an estimated incidence of just 1-2 cases per million people per year. It is more common in women and is usually diagnosed between the ages of 40 and 50, making this a notably young patient. ACC may present with abdominal pain, hormonal disturbances or

weight loss, or may be found incidentally during imaging. Because of its aggressive nature, early diagnosis and multidisciplinary management are critical. Surgery remains the cornerstone of treatment for localised disease, while advanced cases require systemic chemotherapy. Lifelong follow-up with imaging and hormonal evaluation is essential given the risk of recurrence. ## KVIC Records Historic Rs.1.87 Lakh Crore Turnover in FY 2025-26

*A New Sunni Bloc Is Taking Shape, And Pak May Be Its Biggest Winner*

At a recent press briefing to commemorate the first anniversary of Operation Sindoor, Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai, the Deputy Chief of Army Staff, publicly identified Turkey as a direct adversary, referring to Turkish military support to Pakistan during Operation Sindoor. Militarily, at least, India perceives Turkey to be a threat of almost the same magnitude as Pakistan. This military support, in fact, led to a major downturn in bilateral relationships, which included the government cancelling contracts to Turkish firms and a downturn in Indian tourism to Turkey. Now, ironically, the war between Israel-US and Iran has led to the ascendance of two of India's major adversaries - Pakistan and Türkiye. Already locked in a close embrace militarily, they are now ideologically pushing for an Islamic NATO. Recent reports that Pakistan's Defence Minister, Khawaja Muhammad Asif, told a local news outlet that Turkey and Qatar could join the defence pact signed last year between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia, have caused a stir, setting off speculation about an Islamic NATO taking shape. A Concept Long On The Cards To be fair, the term 'Islamic NATO' is not new. It has been around for more than a decade, when the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia announced the formation of an Islamic Military Counter Terrorism Coalition (IMCTC) to fight "terrorism". This was in 2015. A year before that, the Saudis had astonished the international community with their decision to militarily intervene in Yemen, whose capital, Sanaa, had fallen to Iranian-backed Houthi rebels. This marked a paradigm shift in Saudi politics as the Kingdom had usually kept a low profile until then, preferring to leverage its elevated position in the Muslim world and its oil wealth, pulling strings behind the scenes. The Arab Spring put paid to that. Along with the ascendancy of its main and traditional rival, Iran, it also engendered Sunni terror groups, such as the Islamic State. A perceived indifference on the part of the Obama administration to these threats convinced the Saudis that they needed to act. Since Pakistan had initially refused to perform its duties as the traditional Saudi client state, the Kingdom had to convince the Muslim world to take collective action. Though Yemen produced a stalemate, a number of countries, mostly all members of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), joined in. In January 2017, the former Chief of Army Staff of Pakistan, General Raheel Sharif, was named the IMCTC's first commander. However, intra-Arab rivalry, a downturn in Saudi-Turkish relations, and the refusal of military support by some member states, such as Bangladesh, hamstrung the coalition from taking any action.

**Why The Sudden Revival Of Interest**  
Talks around an Islamic NATO have now once again been revived, beginning with sudden Israeli strikes on Qatar last year, allegedly targeting Hamas leaders. The strikes highlighted the vulnerabilities of the regional countries, already grappling with both Iran's Shiite emboldenment and Sunni terrorism, to the new threat of Israeli unilateralism. Moreover, Qatar hosted the US's largest overseas military base and had been designated a "major non-NATO ally".

For some time now, a growing concern has been echoing in cities and villages across the country—the rising prices of petrol and diesel. This concern isn't limited to motorists; it impacts every citizen who consumes everyday goods and services. When petrol becomes more expensive, the impact goes beyond just the petrol pump; it reaches transportation, food, construction materials, agricultural costs, and household budgets. Therefore, it's not enough to consider the rise in petrol prices merely an economic phenomenon. It's also a social, political, and policy issue, involving the government, the market, and citizens.

In a developing country like India, energy is not only the foundation of economic activity but also a vital force for social dynamism and development. The country's vast transportation system, agriculture, industrial production, and service sectors rely heavily on petroleum products. Therefore, when petrol prices rise, their impact is felt in almost every sector of the economy. This is why rising petrol prices always become a topic of public discussion and political debate.

To understand petrol and diesel prices, it's first important to understand that India imports the majority of its oil needs. The country buys more than 80 percent of its total crude oil needs from abroad. This means that fluctuations in the international market directly impact Indian consumers' pockets. If global crude oil prices rise, India has to pay more, and this ultimately reflects in retail prices.

The global oil market isn't solely influenced by economic factors. Geopolitical factors also play a significant role. Factors such as tensions in West Asia, security of sea lanes, production policies of major oil-producing countries, and the Russia-Ukraine conflict all influence oil prices. The impact of any regional conflict or supply crisis is reflected in the international market within days. This poses a significant challenge for an import-dependent country like India, as the domestic market cannot be completely isolated from these conditions.

While the international market is an important factor, the full truth about petrol prices isn't limited to that. Taxes also play a significant role in the retail prices of petrol and diesel in India. The final price of petrol includes the cost of crude oil, as well as central government excise duty, state government value-added tax (VAT), transportation costs, and dealer commissions. This is why petrol prices vary across states.

Oil taxes are a significant source of revenue for governments. Revenue from these taxes is used to finance road construction, infrastructure, health, education, and various social welfare programs. However, these taxes also impose additional financial burdens on ordinary citizens. When oil prices rise internationally and the tax structure offers no relief, consumers face a double whammy. This situation often leads to political debate.

The most direct impact of rising petrol prices is seen on the transportation sector. Taxi drivers, auto drivers, truck owners, bus operators, and millions of delivery service providers face rising costs. They generally have two options: either absorb the increased costs themselves or pass them on to consumers by raising fares and service charges. In most cases, the latter option is adopted, resulting in higher prices for goods and services.

This is where the widespread impact of inflation begins. When freight costs increase, vegetables, fruits, milk, grains, medicines, con-

struction materials, and other consumer goods also become more expensive. This phenomenon is called cost-push inflation in economics. It particularly affects the middle and lower income groups, as their incomes are limited while expenses constantly rise.

The impact of petrol and diesel prices is even more profound in rural India. Agriculture still relies heavily on diesel-powered machinery and equipment. Tractors, irrigation pumps, harvesting machines, and the transportation of agricultural produce all require fuel. When diesel prices rise, agricultural costs increase. Small and marginal farmers, whose incomes are already limited, bear the brunt of these rising costs.

Additionally, the cost of transporting agricultural products to market also increases. Farmers often cannot determine the price of their produce and must rely on middlemen or wholesalers. The pressure of rising transportation costs can further reduce farmers' incomes.

Consequently, the rural economy faces a dual impact—increasing production costs and reducing profits.

The urban middle class is also not immune to this inflation. Today's urban life has become increasingly dependent on digital services, online shopping, food delivery, and private transportation. However, transportation costs are a crucial factor in all these services. Whether ordering food online or purchasing goods from an e-commerce platform, the vehicle delivering it ultimately relies on fuel. Therefore, rising petrol prices gradually increase consumers' daily expenses.

While discussing rising petrol prices, an important question arises as to how self-sufficient India is in terms of energy security. In recent years, the government has made efforts to develop strategic oil reserves and diversify energy sources. This may provide some relief from supply constraints, but it is not a long-term solution. As long as the country remains heavily dependent on imported oil, global market volatility will continue to

impact the domestic economy. This is where the question of energy independence comes into play. Energy independence means not only increasing domestic oil production but also strengthening alternative energy sources. Solar energy, wind power, green hydrogen, biofuels, and electric transportation systems can play a significant role in this direction. India has made significant progress in the field of renewable energy, but there is still a long way to go.

Transportation policy is also an important part of this discussion. A robust, accessible, and reliable public transportation system can reduce reliance on private vehicles. Alternatives like metros, bus rapid transit, suburban rail, and protected bicycle lanes can not only reduce fuel consumption but also mitigate pollution and traffic congestion. Unfortunately, such facilities are still lacking in many cities and most rural areas.

Policy promotion of electric vehicles is also important in this context. Electric vehicles are considered the future option to reduce dependence on petrol and diesel. While their adoption is growing, challenges such as charging infrastructure, battery costs, and access in rural areas remain. If governments increase investment in this sector and develop the necessary infrastructure, dependence on oil can be significantly reduced in the coming years.

Petrol prices also have an environmental dimension. Excessive use of fossil fuels is a major contributor to climate change and air pollution. Rising fuel prices sometimes drive people to alternative modes of transportation, but this is only possible if those options are truly available and convenient. Environmental goals cannot be achieved simply by raising prices; they require a comprehensive and coordinated policy.

Petrol prices have always been a politically sensitive issue. Opposition parties often frame rising prices as a failure of the government, while governments cite global conditions and market forces.

The reality lies somewhere in between. It's true that no single country can have complete control over international oil prices, but it's equally true that governments play a crucial role in areas such as tax policy, energy investment, and transportation reform.

Therefore, the debate on petrol prices should not be limited to blame games. What is needed is an integrated approach to energy policy, tax structures, transportation systems, and environmental goals. If policymaking is limited only to immediate political gains or revenue needs, long-term solutions will not emerge.

The role of citizens is also crucial in this process. Energy conservation, shared transportation, the use of public transport, the adoption of fuel-efficient vehicles, and reducing unnecessary fuel consumption are steps that can have a positive impact at the individual level. While these measures cannot control gasoline prices, they can mitigate the impact of rising costs to some extent.

Ultimately, rising petrol prices are not just an economic problem. They raise a host of questions, including energy security, tax policy, social justice, environmental balance, and political accountability. If India is to effectively address this challenge in the future, it must move beyond short-term relief measures and develop a long-term energy strategy. Energy independence, robust public transport, a transparent tax structure, and investment in renewable energy are the paths that can make the country relatively immune to recurring fuel price crises.

Rising petrol prices remind us that the discussion on inflation shouldn't be limited to prices alone. The underlying energy policy, economic structure, and development model need to be considered equally seriously. Until this comprehensive approach becomes part of policy and public discourse, each new price hike will raise the same question: who is responsible for high petrol prices, and what is the last-ing solution

RISING PETROL PRICES

Inflation, energy security and the challenge of policy-making

A renaissance of tradition, health and the environment amidst modern lifestyles

There was a time when wooden cots were an integral part of life in Indian homes, courtyards, community halls, and fields. From morning tea to nighttime sleep, the cot was not just a piece of furniture but the center of social, cultural, and family life. But as the influence of modernity increased, urbanization gained momentum, and new types of beds, sofa-cum-beds, and expensive mattresses began to appear on the market, the cot gradually began to disappear from homes. It was considered archaic, rural, and a symbol of backwardness. But the wheel of time is turning once again. Today, people are returning to the wooden cot. This return is not just a return to a traditional object, but also a symbol of changing attitudes towards life, awareness of health, and the search for balance with nature.

The cot has a long history in Indian society. It is also known by names like charpai, manji, or khatiya. This structure, made of a sturdy wooden frame and woven with ropes or strips, formed the foundation of Indian life for centuries. Cots were the hallmark of village community gatherings. Family elders made decisions while sitting on cots, farmers rested on them after a hard day's work, and children grew up playing and playing on them. It was not only a means of rest but also a platform for social dialogue. Even today, discussions held on cots in rural India are considered the most

spontaneous and natural expression of democratic dialogue.

The past few decades have seen significant lifestyle changes. People have embraced modern furniture as a symbol of progress and prosperity. Large beds, thick mattresses, and attractively designed furniture have become essential household items. Advertisements have also convinced people that comfort lies only in expensive mattresses and modern beds. As a result, the cot gradually faded from use. But now, as people face health problems, increased stress, and the adverse effects of a sedentary lifestyle, they are beginning to reconsider traditional options they once abandoned.

The biggest reason for the popularity of wooden cots is their health benefits. Modern lifestyles have rapidly increased back pain, neck pain, and spinal problems. Sleeping on overly soft mattresses has proven uncomfortable for many. In contrast, the frame of a cot provides balanced support. The cot, woven from ropes, distributes body weight evenly, reducing unnecessary pressure on the spine. Even today, many elderly people in rural areas appear to be in good physical condition due to years of sleeping on cots. Although each person's health needs vary, cots are considered a natural and balanced means of rest.

In India, where the climate is hot, the usefulness of a cot is even greater. Foam and spring mattresses often trap body heat, increasing discomfort

in summer. In contrast, a cot allows for airflow both above and below the bed. This natural ventilation cools the body and improves sleep quality. This feature of a cot becomes especially important in an era of increasing electricity consumption and dependence on air conditioners.

The importance of cots is also increasing from an environmental perspective. Today, the world is talking about sustainable development and environmental protection. The modern furniture industry widely uses plastic, synthetic foam, and chemicals, which have adverse environmental impacts. In contrast, cots made from wood and natural ropes are relatively eco-friendly. They last longer, are easily repaired, and most of their parts can be recycled or decomposed naturally. At a time when people are becoming more sensitive to the environment, cots are seen as a sustainable option.

One reason for the return of the khat is economic. The prices of expensive furniture and branded mattresses are constantly rising. On the other hand, khats made by local artisans are relatively inexpensive and durable. Khats are still available at low cost in rural and semi-urban areas. They can last for years and can be refurbished by replacing the ropes when needed. Thus, the khat is not only a cultural heritage but also an economically viable option. Interestingly, the return of the khat isn't limited to rural areas. Even in larger cities, people are embracing it

in new forms. Interior designers have begun reimagining the traditional khat with a modern aesthetic. Many homes today feature khats as both decorative and functional pieces in balconies, gardens, terraces, or living spaces. Resorts, cafes, and homestays are also incorporating khats into their premises to offer customers a desi and traditional experience. This demonstrates how blending tradition and modernity is possible.

Social media has also played a significant role in increasing the popularity of the khat. Today, themes like "sustainable living," "slow life," "desi lifestyle," and "return to the roots" are gaining popularity among young people. People share photos of the khat in their homes and farmhouses. Many young people, who once considered the khat a village-only item, now see it as a part of their lifestyle and identity.

This change indicates that the new generation is viewing its cultural heritage from a new perspective.

The khat holds no less cultural significance. It is frequently mentioned in Indian literature, folk songs, and films. It has been a symbol of rural life, intimacy, and togetherness. When family members sat together on the khat and conversed, communication evolved naturally. Today, in the digital age, where people are often preoccupied with mobile screens even while living in the same home, communal seating spaces like the khat can once again become a medium for social closeness.

The Great Chinese 'Miracle' Is Quickly Turning Into A Debt Nightmare

China will overtake the US to become the world's largest economy by 2028, a British think tank predicted in December 2020, after the first Covid wave. The Centre for Economics and Business Research said China's "skilful" management of the pandemic would boost its relative growth compared with the US and Europe in the coming years. Five years later, the think tank said China is unlikely to overtake the US economy for another 15 years. Other analysts doubt that Beijing will ever achieve that, given the structural problems and roadblocks facing its economy. The latest economic data released in Beijing last week confirms that the world's second-largest economy has lost momentum. Industrial production rose by just 4.1% year-on-year in April, the weakest since mid-2023. Retail sales grew by just 0.2%, the worst since the country's economy reopened after the pandemic in December 2022. Fixed asset investment contracted by 1.6% in the first four months of this year, driven by a 13.7% year on year decline in property development. Property investment in China has nearly halved since its pandemic-era peak in 2021. The real estate bubble burst soon after the pandemic ended, depleting the savings of millions of ordinary Chinese. This has severely hit demand for consumer products, as people are stuck with loans on flats they can't sell. After buying a house, owning a



car used to be another major investment for Chinese people, but most can't afford one now. Earlier in May, China's car makers reported a 25.5% year-on-year decline in passenger car sales, marking the sixth consecutive month of year-on-year declines. China's electric car giant, BYD, has built up a large stock of unsold cars. Its profits in the first quarter of this year were down 55%, to a three-year low.

**The Broken Model**  
China has made significant economic progress and has become a superpower as a result of the reforms initiated by Deng Xiaoping in 1980 and later carried forward by his successors, making the country the world's factory. This helped lift tens of millions of people out of poverty and created millions of jobs. The current leader, Xi Jinping, has

focused on self-reliance and innovation in high technology to make China the global leader in many fields, including shipbuilding, solar panels, wind turbines, robotics and electric vehicles. It is also a world leader in AI and semiconductors. But China's growth story is based on exports, an economic model that now appears broken.

Demand for its products at home has shrunk because people can't afford them, even though they're cheap. Domestic consumption drives more than 80% of growth in the US and UK, and about 70% in India. China's share last year was just 52%; this year, it must be even lower. In February, the IMF said that "domestic demand has been subdued, in part because the protracted property slump, combined with a weak social safety net, hurt consumers' willingness to spend".

The IMF cut China's 2026 growth rate to 4.5% from 5% last year. In March, the Chinese government also set its annual growth target to a range of 4.5%-5%, the lowest goal since 1991.

But China is still building new factories and plants for export, continuing to make the world dependent on Chinese products. Last year, its trade deficit hit \$1.19 trillion, fuelling more resentment against Beijing and prompting countries around the world to demand that China increase imports. If the war in Iran leads to a global recession, as is likely, demand for Chinese products will fall, hurting its plants and industries. Overcapacity in factories has already caused deflation, where prices continue to drop, discouraging customers from buying in the hope that goods will be even cheaper later.

Karnataka to revise guarantee scheme beneficiary lists, ineligible persons to lose benefits

Bengaluru, May 26: The state government has taken a significant decision to revise the beneficiary lists for its ambitious guarantee schemes, Gruha Lakshmi and Gruha Jyothi. The matter was discussed extensively during a special SIR meeting held recently, where the government decided to comprehensively verify the eligibility of current beneficiaries. The move aims to prevent unnecessary financial burden on the state exchequer and ensure that the benefits reach only the genuinely deserving poor.



The primary goal is to enforce transparency. Several instances have been reported where funds under the Gruha Lakshmi scheme were being transferred to the accounts of deceased individuals. Currently, there are over 1 crore 24 lac beneficiaries under the Gruha Lakshmi scheme across the state. The government has taken note of several technical

glitches and rule violations within such a massive database. Incidentally, while the government has reserved funds for these major guarantee schemes, reports indicate that no grants have been allocated for the Yuva Nidhi scheme this time. The lack of strict verification has led to the misuse of public funds. It has come to light that income taxpayers are also

reaping the benefits of the Gruha Lakshmi and Gruha Jyothi schemes. As the core objective of these initiatives is to provide financial assistance exclusively to the economically backward sections, the government is considering strictly excluding taxpayers from this bracket. Additionally, anomalies such as two individuals from the same household receiving Gruha Lakshmi funds have been detected, prompting the government to review the situation and initiate appropriate action. To identify these irregularities and weed out ineligible beneficiaries from the database, a comprehensive review is being planned under the leadership of chief minister Siddaramaiah and deputy chief minister D K Shivakumar.

New Delhi: The Karnataka government has formally initiated action on the complaint submitted by Dr. Bhargav Mallappa, Chairman of the Akhila Sevak Samaj Sangh, regarding alleged unauthorised mobile surveillance and suspicious digital monitoring activities. In official communications issued from the Chief Minister's Secretariat and the Office of the Home Minister on May 25, 2026, Karnataka authorities acknowledged receipt of Dr. Mallappa's petition and directed senior police and cyber crime officials to examine the matter and take action as per established procedures. A note issued by M. Shanthappa, Officer on Special Duty to the Chief Minister, forwarded the representation to the Commissioner of Police, Bengaluru City, requesting review of the petition and necessary action under the rules. Separately, a commu-



nication from Dr. Channabasappa K., Private Secretary to the Home Minister, instructed the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Crime-2 Division, Bengaluru City, to look into the complaint. The letter specifically referred to requests for technical verification by the Cyber Crime Cell and an urgent cyber forensic investigation into the alleged activities.

## VIJAY WRITES TO PM MODI SEEKING REJECTION OF KARNATAKA'S MEKEDATU DAM PROJECT

Chennai, May 26 : Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay, on Monday, wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, urging the Union government to reject Karnataka's proposed Mekedatu reservoir project across the Cauvery river, stating that the move would violate Supreme Court orders and threaten the interests of lakhs of farmers dependent on Cauvery water.

In his letter, Vijay expressed strong concern over Karnataka's reported decision to conduct a "Bhoomi Puja" for the Mekedatu project. He said public statements made by Karnataka's Deputy Chief Minister regard-



ing the project had created anxiety among farmers in Tamil Nadu, whose livelihoods are closely linked to the Cauvery River water.

The Chief Minister pointed out that the Cauvery water dispute had witnessed nearly three decades of legal battles before reaching a resolution, and that the Supreme Court's judg-

ment dated February 16, 2018, is currently being implemented.

He noted that the Mekedatu project was not among the projects approved under the final award of the Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal (CWDIT), a position that was subsequently upheld by the apex court. Vijay stressed that the Cauvery basin is already catego-

rised as a water-deficient basin and that available water resources have already been allocated among the basin states based on 50 per cent dependability. Therefore, he argued, there is no scope for creating additional major reservoirs or undertaking fresh projects across the river or its tributaries.

The Chief Minister also stated that Karnataka's proposal for a 67.16 TMC storage reservoir near the Tamil Nadu border could potentially disrupt water flows from uncontrolled catchment areas, which form a crucial component of water allocation to Tamil Nadu. Citing the Supreme Court's ruling, Vijay said upper riparian states cannot undertake activities that affect scheduled water deliveries to downstream states.

## Tamil Nadu government cracks whip on opaque tenders, orders online process

CHENNAI: Seeking to enhance transparency in urban governance and curb discretionary practices in civic administration, the State government on Monday directed all urban local bodies to strictly adhere to tender transparency requirements, discontinue restrictive bidding conditions, and implement fully online, time-bound building plan approval systems across the State.

The fresh instructions, issued by the Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department to the Greater Chennai Corporation, the Directorate of Municipal Administration, and the Directorate of Town Panchayats, are being viewed as a major adminis-



trative push to standardise civic procurement procedures and reduce human intervention in approval mechanisms.

Stressing the need for transparency and fairness in public procurement, the government directed all tender-inviting authorities

to strictly adhere to the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Act, 1998, and the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Rules, 2000, while floating civic contracts.

In a significant direction aimed at ensuring a level playing field in bid-

ding, the government instructed civic bodies not to insist on documents such as "site certificate", "machinery availability certificate" or similar endorsements issued by engineers of the tender-inviting authority as qualifying criteria for contractors. The order indicated that such practices could undermine fair competition in the tendering process.

The communication from the MAWS secretary, Gagandeep Singh Bedi, further mandated that all tender-related clarifications and interactions with bidders should be conducted only through online platforms in order to maintain transparency and ensure a traceable process.

## Tamil Nadu schools to reopen on June 4 for Classes 1 to 12

CHENNAI: The Tamil Nadu government on Tuesday announced that all schools across the state will uniformly reopen for Classes 1 to 12 on June 4 for the 2026-27 academic year. School Education Minister Raj Mohan announced that all government, government-aided, matriculation and private schools across Tamil Nadu would reopen on June 4, following directions from Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay.

According to a press release, schools were earlier scheduled to reopen on June 1 for Classes 4 to 12 and on June 4 for Classes 1 to 3.

However, the government said requests were received from parents, teachers and various stakeholders seeking a common reopening date for all classes to avoid inconvenience for families with children studying in differ-



ent standards. The government also cited prevailing weather conditions, including pre-monsoon activity, intermittent rain-

fall, humidity and heat conditions expected during the first week of June, as factors behind the decision.

## Measles resurgence risk rises across Asia, health experts warn

A new 2026 health assessment has warned of a rising risk of measles resurgence across Asia, driven mainly by gaps in childhood vaccination coverage and weakened immunisation systems following the COVID-19 period.

Health experts said the disease, which was once largely under control in many countries, is again spreading in several regions of South and Southeast Asia due to incomplete vaccine coverage, particularly among young children. Millions of children missed routine immunisation during the pandemic years, while many have still not received catch-up doses, creating pockets of vulnerability where the virus can spread rapidly.

The report highlighted that measles cases have increased significantly in multiple Asian countries over the past few years, with outbreaks mainly affecting rural and underserved communities. Children under the age of five remain the most vulnerable, with severe complications such as pneumonia, brain inflammation, dehydration and, in some cases, death continuing to be reported in outbreak areas.



Experts also pointed out that vaccination coverage in many regions remains below the 95 per cent threshold required to

maintain herd immunity, allowing the virus to circulate more easily. Along with disruptions in health services, officials also

cite vaccine hesitancy and misinformation as key factors contributing to declining immunisation rates in certain areas.

Global health agencies, including the World Health Organization, have urged countries to urgently strengthen routine immunisation programmes, carry out large-scale catch-up vaccination drives and improve surveillance systems to detect outbreaks at an early stage. They have also stressed the need for targeted outreach in high-risk districts and stronger public awareness campaigns to counter misinformation.

Doctors warned that measles is one of the most contagious viral diseases, and even small immunity gaps can trigger large outbreaks, especially in densely populated regions. They emphasised that the current resurgence is not due to vaccine failure, but due to uneven vaccine access and missed childhood doses. Health authorities are now pushing for coordinated regional action to prevent further spread, warning that without immediate intervention, outbreaks could expand further across Asia in the coming years.

## Char Dham Yatra: SDRF, NDRF intensify rescue ops, medical support amid heavy rush at Kedarnath

Kedarnath, May 26 : Amid the continuously rising number of pilgrims visiting Kedarnath Dham during the ongoing Char Dham Yatra, teams from the district administration, District Disaster Response Force (DDRF), State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) remain actively engaged in rescue and medical assistance operations to ensure the safety of devotees.

On Tuesday morning, two ailing pilgrims were safely shifted to the Kedarnath helipad through a coordinated rescue operation and later airlifted to higher medical centres for advanced treatment.

In the first incident, Arvind Kumar, a 66-year-old resident of Gaya in Bihar, was transported from Vivekananda Hospital to the Kedarnath helipad at around 8:05 A.M. by a joint team of SDRF, DDRF, and NDRF personnel after he complained of a fracture in his left arm. Following initial medical attention, he was referred to a higher medical centre through helicopter services for further treatment.

In another case, Lalita, a 70-year-old resident of Latur in Maharashtra, was shifted from Vivekananda Hospital to the helipad at around 9:10 A.M. after she reportedly experienced rapid heartbeat, breathing difficulty, and fever. Acting swiftly, the rescue teams coordinated with the district administration and arranged for her to be airlifted to a higher medical facility for advanced treatment. Officials said that throughout the Kedarnath pilgrimage season, rescue and emergency response teams remain deployed round-the-clock to handle medical emergencies and provide immediate assistance to devotees undertaking the difficult Himalayan pilgrimage. Authorities have intensified arrangements

this year due to the massive influx of pilgrims visiting the Char Dham shrines.

Meanwhile, the pilgrimage to Badrinath Dham in Uttarakhand has witnessed an unprecedented surge in the number of devotees this year. Within just one month of the opening of the temple gates, more than 5.56 lakh devotees have visited the shrine and offered prayers to Lord Badri Vishal, breaking all previous records.

According to officials, the scale of the rush can be understood from the fact that over 60,000 devotees visited Badrinath in the last two days alone. Around 33,000 pilgrims reached the temple on Friday, while more than 32,000 devotees visited on Saturday. The previous record for the highest number of pilgrims visiting Badrinath within a month was set in 2019, when nearly 5.50 lakh devotees arrived at the shrine. The latest figures have surpassed that record after almost six years. In comparison, nearly 4.50 lakh pilgrims had visited Badrinath during the same period in 2023.

Officials described the record turnout as a reflection of the unwavering faith and devotion of pilgrims towards Lord Badrinath and the Char Dham pilgrimage.

The Char Dham Yatra is considered one of the most sacred pilgrimages in Hinduism and holds immense spiritual significance for devotees. The yatra includes visits to four revered Himalayan shrines — Yamunotri, Gangotri, Kedarnath, and Badrinath — all located in the mountainous regions of Uttarakhand. According to Hindu beliefs, these shrines are associated with four major deities and natural elements. Yamunotri is dedicated to Goddess Yamuna, Gangotri to Goddess Ganga, Kedarnath to Lord Shiva, and Badrinath to Lord Vishnu.



## Spain detects new hantavirus case among cruise ship passengers under quarantine

Spain's Ministry of Health has confirmed a new positive case of hantavirus among a group of Spanish nationals who were passengers aboard the cruise ship MV Hondius during an outbreak reported in April while the vessel was crossing the Atlantic Ocean. The infected individual is among 14 Spanish passengers who were evacuated from Tenerife on May 10 in a controlled medical operation and later placed under preventive quarantine at the Gomez Ulla Central Defence Hospital in Madrid. According to the Health Ministry, the latest case was

identified during routine PCR testing carried out as part of ongoing monitoring and isolation protocols.

Officials stated that the patient is currently asymptomatic and has been transferred to the hospital's High-Level Isolation Unit (UATAN), where specialised medical care and strict biosafety measures are being maintained.

Authorities emphasised that the newly detected case does not increase the risk to the general public and does not require any changes to the current epidemiological control measures already in place. This is the second hanta-

virus infection confirmed among the quarantined Spanish passengers since their arrival in Madrid. The first patient, who had developed symptoms earlier, is reportedly recovering well.

According to the World Health Organization, hantaviruses are zoonotic viruses commonly carried by rodents and can occasionally spread to humans. Infections may cause severe illness and can sometimes prove fatal, depending on the strain and geographic region. In the Americas, hantavirus infections are associated with Hantavirus Cardiopulmonary Syndrome (HCPS), a serious con-

dition affecting the lungs and heart. In Europe and Asia, the virus is more commonly linked to Haemorrhagic Fever with Renal Syndrome (HFRS), which impacts the kidneys and blood vessels. Health experts note that there is currently no specific cure for hantavirus infections. Treatment mainly focuses on early supportive care, close monitoring and management of complications involving the respiratory, cardiac and renal systems. Preventive measures largely depend on reducing human exposure to infected rodents and contaminated environments.

# FERRARI UNVEILS FIRST FULLY ELECTRIC CAR

Luxury sports car maker Ferrari has unveiled its first fully electric car - the \$640,000 (€474,320) Luce. The new model departs from the look of typical Ferraris as the Italian brand's first ever five-seater, created in collaboration with the LoveFrom agency founded by former Apple design chief Sir Jony Ive. Responses on social media to the launch have ranged from describing it as "straight to the junkyard trash" to an "absolute masterclass in design". Supercar rivals like Lamborghini and Porsche have scaled back on their EV plans due to poor demand and intense competition from Chinese brands. Ferrari chief executive Benedetto Vigna said in Rome that the Luce, Italian for "light", has taken half a decade to develop. Ferrari plans to roll out the electric vehicle (EV) after previously ruling out such a move, opting instead to make hybrid cars that are powered by both petrol and electricity. The Luce runs with a Ferrari-made electric motor on each wheel, helping the car to hit 60mph (96km/h) in around 2.5 seconds.



The firm said that all of the components are made in-house, so that the car can be repaired by the company well into the future, protecting the Luce's resale value. The shift by motor industry giants to EVs has faced major obstacles in recent years. Carmakers including Ford and Volkswagen have doubled down on petrol cars, especially in the US, due to poor demand and regulatory changes under President Donald Trump,

who has cut incentives for EV buyers. The launch of Jaguar's electric concept car was heavily criticised for abandoning the British brand's classic styling. Ferrari's unveiling of Luce has faced similar criticism. One account on X said: "Ferrari just killed their brand just like Jaguar did. This is straight to the junkyard trash." "What is going on with European Luxury car manufacturers First Jaguar and now Ferrari",

another account posted. But not all commentators were felt negatively about the new car, with one post saying: "Absolute masterclass in design. Ferrari just unveiled the breathtaking LUCE concept, and it is a total game changer." Ferrari's chief design officer Flavio Manzoni said in an interview with YouTuber Cleo Abram that critics are part of the innovation process. He acknowledged the concept of an electric

Ferrari with a new design is "polarising" but believes people will appreciate it in months to come. Ferrari has also said it will continue offer petrol and hybrid cars along with its all-electric vehicle. Meanwhile, Ferrari's direct competitors have rolled back their EV ambitions. Lamborghini abandoned its plans to launch all-electric cars, pivoting to hybrid models instead, citing low demand for high-end luxury EVs. Germany's Porsche has scaled back its EV plans due to weak demand, caught between poor sales in China and tariffs in the US. Western carmakers have also faced intense competition from Chinese carmakers, which are able to produce vehicles faster and more cheaply. Ferrari is Europe's most valuable carmaker. It relies on selling highly exclusive cars - a strategy that has helped to shield Ferrari from much of the pressure faced by rivals. Yet Ferrari's shares have dropped by more than 25% over the past year, mirroring a wider slump across luxury brands as inflation around the world has shaken demand for high-end goods.

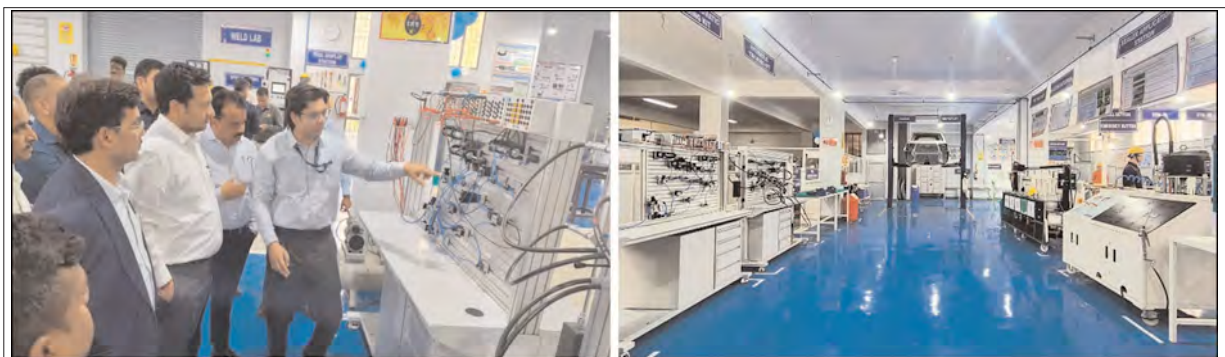

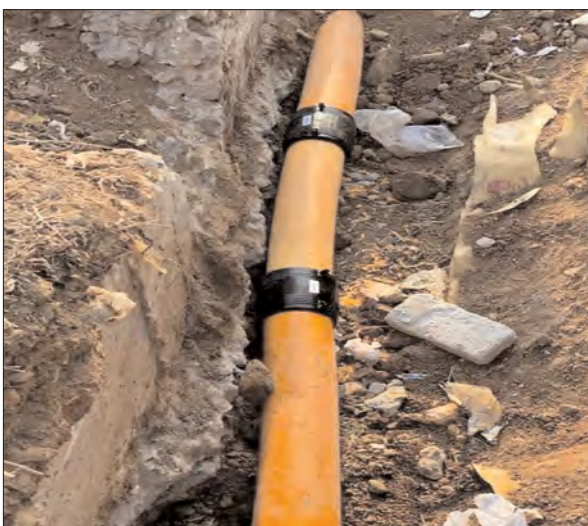

# IRAN CONDEMNS US STRIKES AS 'GROSS VIOLATION' OF CEASEFIRE

Iran says the US has committed a "gross violation" of the ceasefire with new air strikes it launched on the country. The US Central Command (Centcom) said Iranian missile sites and boats attempting to place mines had been targeted with what it called "self-defence strikes" in southern Iran on Monday. Iran's foreign ministry said it held the US responsible for the consequences of its "aggressive and unjustified actions" in the Hormozgan region, which has a coast along the Strait of Hormuz - the crucial waterway Iran has blocked causing a spike in world energy prices. It is unclear what impact the strikes will have on talks aimed to end the conflict. "Without a doubt, the Islamic Republic of Iran will not leave any evil unanswered and will not hesitate to defend the Iranian nation," the Iranian statement said. The US and Israel



started the war with Iran on 28 February with a wave of deadly attacks, including one which killed the country's supreme leader. After weeks of fighting, a ceasefire was agreed on 8 April and it has been largely observed ever since, barring one notable clash earlier in May. In its statement, Centcom said US forces "conducted

self-defence strikes in southern Iran today to protect our troops from threats posed by Iranian forces". It did not give details about the location of the strikes, but an official cited by the New York Times said they had targeted an area near Bandar Abbas - a southern port city and home of an Iranian naval base that sits

on the Strait of Hormuz. Iranian state media had earlier reported that local officials in Bandar Abbas were investigating after explosions were heard. Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) later said it had downed a US drone and fired at a fighter jet that entered Iranian airspace, though it did not spec-

ify when this happened. This takes place against the backdrop of talks aimed at extending the current ceasefire, with the eventual aim of bringing an end to the conflict. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio has said a deal from the talks is still possible, but it will "take a few days". One of the stumbling blocks reportedly cen-

tres on Tehran's request for the release of frozen Iranian funds held abroad. The peace talks have been mainly mediated by Pakistan. However, Iranian negotiators have been taking part in talks with Qatari mediators this week. An official briefed on the Doha visit told Reuters news agency that Iran's central bank governor had attended Monday's talks to discuss the frozen assets, with discussions focusing primarily on Iran's stockpile of highly enriched uranium, and the Strait of Hormuz. Iran has effectively blocked the vital shipping lane, through which around one fifth of the world's oil passes, since the US and Israel started the conflict on 28 February. US, Israel and many Western countries have accused Iran of enriching uranium in order to make a nuclear weapon. Iran says the programme is for peaceful purposes only.

## Senegal's sacked PM Sonko elected parliamentary Speaker in challenge to president

Senegal's former Prime Minister Ousmane Sonko, who was dramatically sacked on Friday by the president, has been elected Speaker of the national parliament setting up a possible source of conflict at the top of Senegalese politics. The West African nation's current crisis follows months of tension between Sonko and his one-time ally President Bassirou Diomaye Faye. Parliament's previous Speaker stepped down on Sunday to make way for the former prime minister, who is a popular figure and whose Pastef party has a majority of the seats in the National Assembly. On Monday, Faye appointed economist Ahmadou Al Aminou Lo to replace Sonko as prime minister. Relations between the president and his now-former prime minister had been deteriorating for months, with Sonko openly criticising Faye for his handling of Senegal's debt problems. "What is at stake



is the relationship between morality and politics," Sonko has since said, promising not to use his new position to "to fight against anyone" and instead ensure that parliament acts in Senegalese citizens' best interests. Yet Sonko has also said that his dismissal as prime minister does not mean his political career is over. Sonko's new role as Speaker - the second highest political position in the country - could limit President Faye's ability to manoeuvre if he fails to secure parliamentary support for his policies, analysts say.

## Netanyahu says Israel will intensify strikes against Hezbollah



Israel's military says it has begun a wave of strikes across Lebanon following an announcement by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu that his country will intensify its attacks on Hezbollah. The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) said it had launched strikes against Hezbollah in the eastern Bekaa Valley and other parts of the country. Hezbollah, a Shia Muslim armed group in Lebanon backed by Iran, said it had retaliated by carrying out 22 drone and rocket attacks and that its targets included Israeli soldiers, tanks, barracks and buildings. Earlier this month, Lebanon and Israel agreed to extend a 45-day ceasefire which began in mid-April, though attacks between Israel and Hezbollah have continued. On Tuesday morning, the IDF said it had "struck more than 100 Hezbollah infrastructure sites and terrorists". Twelve people are said to have been killed in an attack on the village of Mashghara in the Bekaa Valley, Lebanese local media reported. The IDF said several strikes were conducted "within seconds

against Hezbollah infrastructure sites [in Mashghara] where terrorists [sic] activity was identified". It added "the terrorists were eliminated" during the attack. The Israeli military has issued an evacuation order for the southern town of Nabatieh due to possible strikes. Hours earlier, in a video statement, Netanyahu said Israel was "at war with Hezbollah" and the military has been told to "deal them a crushing blow". Netanyahu said Israel's military offensive against Hezbollah had "eliminated... over 600 terrorists in the last few weeks". He continued: "But what this requires of us now is to increase the strikes, to increase the intensity." Two far-right Israeli ministers, Bezalel Smotrich and Itamar Ben Gvir, have called for an expansion of the military campaign, including into Beirut. Hezbollah said it had used drones and rockets to attack sites across southern Lebanon and northern Israel on Monday, in response to what it called Israel's "violation of the ceasefire".

## CHINA EXECUTES MAN FOR POISONING BILLIONAIRE GAMING TYCOON



Chinese authorities have executed a man for murdering his associate, billionaire gaming tycoon Lin Qi. In 2020, a disgruntled Xu Yao poisoned Lin for sidelining him shortly after he helped him land a Netflix deal, local media reported. Lin's Yoozoo Games holds the film adaptation rights for the Chinese science fiction trilogy which Netflix made

into the series 3 Body Problem. Xu was convicted in 2024 and his execution, which reportedly happened on 21 May, was confirmed on Tuesday by his company in a statement, adding "justice has ultimately been served". "We deeply mourn Mr. Lin and extend our heartfelt condolences to his family," the statement said. "As colleagues who fought alongside him.

## ELEVEN KILLED IN LEBANON VILLAGE AS ISRAEL INTENSIFIES STRIKES

Israel has launched an intensive wave of strikes across swathes of southern and eastern Lebanon, after vowing to step up its military action against Hezbollah. The Israeli military said it hit more than 100 Hezbollah infrastructure sites and fighters during what was one of the heaviest nights of bombardment since a US-brokered ceasefire began in mid-April. Strikes in the Bekaa Valley village of Mashghara killed 11 people, including two children, Lebanon's health ministry said. The military said it hit sites where "terrorist activity" was identified. It came after Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said he had given the instruction to "press the pedal even harder" in targeting Hezbollah. The ceasefire has been repeatedly violated



by both sides, threatening to derail the complex ongoing talks to end the war between the US, Israel and Iran. Israeli air and artillery strikes have continued daily, especially in the south of Lebanon, while Hezbollah has been launching rockets and drones at communities in northern Israel and Israeli troops occupying parts of southern Lebanon. On Monday night, Netanyahu

said in a video statement that Israel was going to increase the number and intensity of its strikes targeting Hezbollah in response to the Iran-backed Shia Muslim group's attacks, including those involving fibre-optic drones that can evade Israeli defences. "We will deal them a crushing blow," he vowed. The announcement prompted scenes of panic in Beirut's southern suburbs, a

Hezbollah stronghold, where residents were seen fleeing the area following the remarks. Thousands of cars lined the streets with families trying to escape for safety. Though the overnight strikes spared the capital, Israeli warplanes carried out wave after wave of strikes across Lebanon throughout the evening and into the early hours. The BBC counted dozens of attacks across nearly 50 locations. A man and his wife were killed in a strike on their home in the southern town of Arab Salim on Monday evening, and two other people were killed in the village of Kauthariyet El Rez, according to Lebanon's state-run National News Agency (NNA). Overnight, several homes in Mashghara were destroyed in Israeli strikes, according to NNA.

## Ebola needs swift response to prevent catastrophe - DR Congo governor

The military governor of the Democratic Republic of Congo's Ituri province, the epicentre of the current Ebola outbreak, has likened the struggle to contain the spread of the virus to a "war" for which they are lacking resources to fight. "People in affected areas are not receiving enough food," Johnny Luboya Nkashama told French broadcaster RFI, adding that "other diseases" and "overcrowding" are also issues. He called for a "swift response", including strengthening the capacity of staff to prevent Ituri "from descending into catastrophe". Officials say there are more than 900 suspected cases of Ebola, and 223 suspected deaths, since the outbreak was declared on 15 May.



The World Health Organization (WHO) said the disease may be spreading faster than originally thought and has declared a public health emergency of international concern. On Monday, WHO director-general Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, who is due to travel to DR Congo,

has said the Ebola outbreak is outpacing urgent efforts to scale up a response adding that responders were "playing catch-up". Ebola has also been reported in DR Congo's North and South Kivu provinces, as well as in neighbouring Uganda, where there have been seven confirmed cases.

Elaborating on what his province needs, Kashama explained "qualified personnel" should be deployed as soon as possible and "secure treatment centres" established. Angry relatives trying to claim the bodies of loved ones who had reportedly died of Ebola have targeted two treatment centres. "Our existing resources were dedicated to the war, and this second war that is now upon us demands even more," he said on RFI. Ituri has been under military rule since 2021, when the civilian authority was replaced by a military general in an attempt to neutralise dozens of armed groups which have operated in the area for many years.

## Russia threatens more Kyiv strikes and tells foreign nationals to leave



Russia has threatened to launch a fresh wave of "systematic strikes" against Kyiv, days after carrying out one of its largest attacks on the Ukrainian capital since the start of the war. The new strikes will target "decision-making centres and command posts", alongside drone manufacturing facilities in the city, Russia's foreign ministry said in a statement. Moscow has called for foreign nationals and diplomats to leave Kyiv "as soon as possible" and warned citizens to stay away from administrative and military buildings. Ukraine said Russia's threats were "nothing short of shameless blackmail" and urged allies to increase pressure on Moscow. With its warning to foreign nationals, Moscow is "effectively admitting that its shelling is aimed, among other things, at intimidating the foreign diplomatic corps", the statement continued. It said Russian strikes on Kyiv "have not ceased for virtually a single week" since the start of the war,

and the overall security threat posed by Moscow "remains the same as in previous years or months". Large-scale Russian strikes on Saturday night killed four and injured about 100 people in Kyiv and other areas, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said. Moscow said that barrage and threatened further strikes were in response to what it claims was a deliberate Ukrainian attack on a student dormitory in the town of Starobilsk on Friday, in which Russian officials said 21 people were killed. Ukraine's military said its forces had struck an elite Russian military drone unit in the area, in Russian-occupied eastern Ukraine, and had not targeted civilians. Russia has launched several waves of deadly missile and drone attacks on Kyiv since a brief ceasefire, that coincided with Moscow's annual Victory Day parade, expired earlier in May. Shortly after that, Russian strikes on Kyiv killed 24 people, including three children, in a block of flats.

## AUSTRALIA CONFIRMS FIRST DIPHTHERIA DEATH AMID WORST OUTBREAK IN DECADES



Australia has recorded its first diphtheria death in almost a decade as the country grapples with the worst outbreak of the vaccine-preventable disease in decades. In March, the Northern Territory (NT) declared an outbreak of diphtheria with cases also in Western Australia, South Australia and Queensland. Cases started rising in late-2025 with a sharp increase in February. This year, there

have been 245 cases, marking the largest outbreak in Australia since 1991, mainly in remote Indigenous communities. On Tuesday, NT's health minister said autopsy results from an overseas lab found diphtheria was the cause of a man's death in April at Royal Darwin Hospital, the first such case since 2018. In recent weeks, the government has ramped up vaccination efforts in areas most at risk and the number of new cases was now falling, health officials said on Tuesday. "Our government has taken this situation very seriously, and we are working hard to understand the causes and working to contain the situation," NT Health Minister Steve Edgington said.

Arshdeep Singh social media clean-up: India pacer Arshdeep Singh has cleared the majority of his Instagram posts following his IPL side Punjab Kings' elimination from the playoff race. Arshdeep had a tough outing in IPL 2026, claiming just 14 wickets in 14 matches and leaking over 10 runs per over as PBKS bowed out of the tournament after the league stage. However, the 27-year-old has caught the attention of fans on social media, with the pacer wiping a massive chunk of his grid. Notably, Arshdeep also removed his viral reel with star batter Virat Kohli, which had reportedly grossed over 15 million views. In the reel, which was posted in December last



year, Arshdeep joked with Kohli that if the target had been bigger, the former captain might have scored a third consecutive century. "Paaji, run kam reh gaye, century aaj pakki thi waise (Brother, the target wasn't big enough, otherwise a cen-

tury seemed certain)," Arshdeep had said. Kohli playfully responded, "Toss jeet gaye, nahi toh teri bhi pakki thi dew mein (Be thankful we won the toss, or you would have been hit for a century in the dew!)." While the exact reason behind Arshdeep's latest Instagram activity remains unclear, he currently has just 44 posts on his account - a tally significantly lower than it was a few days ago. Interestingly, this comes amid recent reports that videos involving PBKS players must now be produced and posted exclusively through the franchise's official social media handles. "The CEO will speak to the players after training tonight and read out the guidelines issued by the BCCI. There is no player in focus as such. The rules need to be respected and strictly followed," a team source told PTI.

## PADERBORN STRIKE LATE TO RELEGATE WOLFSBURG FROM BUNDESLIGA

Paderborn's Laurin Curda scored in extra-time to grab a 2-1 home win in the second relegation playoff leg on Monday and relegate 2009 Bundesliga champions Wolfsburg 2-1 on aggregate. The narrow win returns Paderborn to the Bundesliga after six seasons, while ending Wolfsburg's 29-year run in the top flight. Wolfsburg, who played all but 14 minutes with 10 men, became just the second top-flight team in the past 14 seasons to be relegated in the two-legged playoff. Wolfsburg coach Dieter Hecking, who won the German Cup with the side in 2015 and returned to try and beat the drop, told German TV he was "profoundly disappointed." "We tried absolutely everything - and the players invested everything they had - in an effort to keep the team in the league." Dzenan Pejcinovic gave Wolfsburg the lead early but two yellow cards inside three minutes to Joakim Maelue reduced the Wolves to 10 men. "Look, we could discuss it, but it's ultimately futile to do so, because the referee made his decision, even if we view that incident in a completely different light," Hecking said. Buoyed by their one-man advantage, Paderborn laid siege to the Wolfsburg goal and Filip Bibijca levelled things up just before the break with a far post header. The Wolves managed to keep the hosts at bay



and force extra-time but Curda broke through in the 99th minute to put his side on course for victory. The Volkswagen-owned Wolves, who reportedly have the fifth most expensive side in the Bundesliga, had hoped to challenge for a European spot this season but will now play in the Bundesliga 2 for the first time since 1997.

## ARYNA SABALENKA REGISTERS EASY WIN IN FRENCH OPEN. DANIIL MEDVEDEV LOSES IN 5 SETS



Top-ranked Aryna Sabalenka took advantage of the heat wave at the French Open to impose her attacking game in the first round Tuesday. Daniil Medvedev struggled, though, in a five-set loss to 97th-ranked Australian opponent Adam Walton. Sabalenka beat 50th-ranked Jessica Bouzas Maneiro 6-4, 6-2 on Court Philippe-Chatrier with an array of approaches to the net and volley put-aways. "That's the most enjoyable part of the game right now - that I'm able to come to the net to play points there," Sabalenka said. "I'm super proud that I was able to improve that part of the game." The unusually hot conditions at Roland Garros make net-rushing - usually better reserved for hard and grass courts - a viable option because the court is drying out quicker and playing faster. For a third consecutive day, the temperature in Paris was fore-

cast to rise to at least 32 degrees Celsius (90 Fahrenheit). "Let's hope that this is the perfect condition for me," Sabalenka said. "It suits my game really well." Sabalenka reached the final in Paris last year, losing to Coco Gauff. She has won the Australian Open and the U.S. Open on hard courts. Gauff was opening her title defense later against fellow American Taylor Townsend. Also advancing was 17th-seeded Iva Jovic, who beat good friend Alexandra Eala 6-4, 6-2. Walton, who received a wild card invitation from tournament organizers, beat Medvedev 6-2, 1-6, 6-1, 1-6, 6-4. Stefanos Tsitsipas, the 2021 runner-up to Novak Djokovic, was leading 6-2, 3-0 against Alexandre Muller when his French opponent retired. Muller wiped away tears as he left the court and later said he injured his right calf, three months after injuring his left calf.

## What next for heavyweight division after Usyk's win

Oleksandr Usyk came through a gritty contest to beat a game Rico Verhoeven and retain his heavyweight world titles. Usyk, 39, was pushed to his limits by Verhoeven at the Pyramids of Giza in Egypt, but ultimately delivered the goods with one second remaining in the 11th round. The Ukrainian had it all to lose against an opponent who had competed only once in boxing, although he carried a formidable record from kickboxing. Usyk, who extended his undefeated record to 25 wins, consistently said in the build-up to this bout that he still wanted to fight

on two more occasions before considering whether to hang up the gloves. With no shortage of challengers queuing up for a shot at one of Usyk's three belts - the WBA 'super', WBC and IBF - who could be next for the pound-for-pound great Usyk still holds three heavyweight belts but, with only a handful of fights left before retirement, there is a growing sense that he is no longer driven by collecting titles. Mandatory challengers are enforced on a rotating basis between sanctioning bodies, and next in line is WBC interim champion Agit Kabayel - widely viewed as the most



deserving contender yet to receive his opportunity. The unbeaten German has quietly built one of the strongest recent resumes in the division, stopping Arslanbek Makhmudov, Frank Sanchez and Zhilei

Zhang to make his case for a title shot. Yet there has been little indication that Usyk is interested in the fight. Meanwhile, on the undercard in Giza, Sanchez earned a stunning knockout win against Richard

Torrez Jr to become the leading contender for Usyk's IBF belt. The IBF is expected to order a mandatory title defence within six months once WBC obligations are clarified. Elsewhere, former cruiserweight rival Murat Gassiev - beaten by Usyk in their undisputed clash in 2018 - holds the WBA 'regular' title and also sits high in the sanctioning queue. Verhoeven emerged from his loss against generational great Usyk with a huge amount of credit. The kickboxing superstar, who reigned as the Glory heavyweight world champion for 12 years, clearly demon-

strated that he has the tools to hang with boxing's elite. Aged 37, time is not on Verhoeven's side, but there will undoubtedly be further opportunities. Fellow crossover star Francis Ngannou, who pushed Tyson Fury close and suffering a heavy knockout defeat against Anthony Joshua, has set the blueprint for Verhoeven. A rematch with Usyk has been touted, although it is unlikely to land next for Verhoeven, so options elsewhere will need to be explored. After years of negotiations, false starts and public callouts, Joshua v Fury finally appears without touching distance.
