## AP CM proposes 90 days action plan to adopt Singapore's best administrative practices

Vijayawada (TSIT)

Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has stated that Singapore's governance systems have earned the trust of its people and proposed that Andhra Pradesh adopt some of Singapore's best administrative practices by developing one district as a model. The Chief Minister directed the officials to prepare a 90-day action plan for implementing Singapore-inspired governance practices and to closely monitor its execution.

Addressing the Collectors conference at the Secretariat in Amaravati capital region on Thursday, the Chief Minister mentioned that the decisions would have a long-term impact on the people of the state. Referring to regional disparities, he observed that although both Parvathipuram and Alluri districts are tribal regions, Alluri district has achieved higher GSDP due to value addition in coffee cultivation.

He emphasised the need to focus on development and accelerate progress through innovation. The Chief Minister highlighted that the service sector must expand further and pointed out that

He noted that several districts possess rare earth mineral resources and said that establishing processing plants

## 11 Indian ships exit Strait of Hormuz, 13 still await clearance

New Delhi (TSIT)

India on Thursday said that 11 Indian ships have successfully exited the Strait of Hormuz, while 13 vessels remain in the Persian Gulf as New Delhi continues talks with Tehran to facilitate their safe passage amid heightened regional tensions. "We have seen forward movement and, as a result of diplomatic engagement and conversations with the Iranian side, 11 Indian ships have so far exited the Strait of Hormuz. Thirteen ships continue to remain in the Persian Gulf, and we are in touch with the Iranian authorities to ensure that the remaining vessels are also able to cross the Strait of Hormuz and reach India, which is their destination," Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said during a media briefing.

Responding to questions regarding Iranian vessels and maritime access, Jaiswal said ships from other countries do not require permission to operate in international waters.

"If ships of other countries want to ply in international waters, no permission is required... But to your specific question about whether they want to come into Indian waters, this is something that the Ministry of Shipping or the relevant technical authorities would be able to answer," he said.

## Indian military warns Pakistan on Op Sindoor anniversary

JAIPUR (TSIT): No terror sanctuary across the Line of Control is safe, and India will target every terrorist infrastructure at a time and manner of its choosing, the Indian military said on Thursday, sending a clear warning to Pakistan on the first anniversary of Operation Sindoor. Detailing what is now considered India's most significant combat mission in five decades, the then heads of military operations for the three services elaborated on the strategic successes of the massive tri-services campaign during a media briefing here. They asserted that the window for military action against cross-border terrorism remains firmly open. "No sanctuary across the Line of Control is safe. We will hit everything. We will go after everything and that has been made clear in the new normal that the prime minister said last year.

## TN govt formation battle may reach court as Governor says Vijay's TVK lacks majority



New Delhi (TSIT)

A cliffhanger is emerging in Tamil Nadu, with no party yet invited to form the government despite three days having passed since Joseph Vijay's TVK emerged as the single largest party with 108 seats in the 234-member Assembly.

Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar met Vijay on Thursday and

explained that his party had not presented the numbers required to prove a majority and take the oath as chief minister. Vijay had staked his claim to form the government during a meeting with the governor on Wednesday, but the governor remained unconvinced about his numbers.

Vijay needs the support of 118 MLAs and, so far, has received public

backing only from Congress, which has five MLAs. The Left parties, VCK and IUML, which have two MLAs each, have not yet formally extended support to Vijay and remain engaged in talks. TVK, meanwhile, may move court on the grounds that the Sarkaria Commission had, in 1988, laid down guidelines for governors to act in cases of a hung Assembly. Under those guidelines, the governor may first invite the largest pre-poll coalition, followed by the single largest party, to form the government and prove its majority on the floor of the House.

TVK is the single largest party in this case and could therefore stake a claim to form the government, since no pre-poll coalition has the required numbers.

## Amit Shah: The strategist who redrew Bengal's electoral map

New Delhi: On May 4, when BJP finally managed to paint Bengal in saffron, the party's stunning victory came wrapped in the quiet efficiency of a plan executed almost exactly as designed. An occurrence rare in Indian politics and rarer in the eastern state which historically has defied all pan-India trends and gone its own way much to the consternation of leaders from Delhi. At the centre of that plan stood Amit Shah, whose imprint on the Bharatiya Janata Party's 2026 breakthrough was at once methodical and deeply personal in style and outcomes.

"He worked with consistency, built up a core team, oversaw the structure which would deliver us results and kept interacting with us at the ground level to make changes wherever necessary," said a top Kolkata-based BJP functionary, who had a ring side view of how the plan unfolded over the last several months. Since the heydays of Hindu Mahasabha when Syama Prasad Mookerjee fought elections from Bengal, the right-wing organisation's ambitions in Bengal had been thwarted by the state's stubborn political culture.

First the Left-off-Centre Congress, then the Marxists and finally the Left democrats in the Trinamool Congress under Mamata Banerjee appeared to have entranced the populace with a blend of welfare politics, regional pride and wily organisational agility.

However, what Shah recognised, and acted upon, was that the BJP's earlier approach, reliant on defectors and headline-grabbing momentum, had reached its limits. He also recognised that local cultural sensibilities had to be worked into the plan to make it yield dividend.

The recalibration began not in Kolkata but in Delhi, in a series of strategy sessions that resembled corporate briefings more than political conclaves. BJP leaders made their way to households to eat 'mach-bhaat', to woo the 'mache-bhaate' Bengali populace and break the oft repeated myth that the party was against non-vegetarianism.

Constituencies were broken down into data points; voting histories were parsed with forensic attention. Shah's team mapped each seat with an almost technocratic precision, identifying not only winnability but the micro-issues that could tilt out-



comes, a factory closure here, a law-and-order grievance there, an undercurrent of discontent among government employees.

Key lieutenants who included Bhubender Yadav were deployed with defined mandates, overseeing the electoral machinery. More Bengali-speaking leaders and workers from Tripura, Assam and elsewhere were press-ganged to reinforce coordination on the ground.

Their roles, however, were tightly choreographed within a command structure that remained firmly centralised. Late into the night, reviews were conducted, feedback loops tightened, and adjustments made. The campaign was run less like a mass movement than a disciplined corporate blitzkrieg.

Call centres with Bengali speaking workers were set up in Delhi to launch massive social media messaging campaigns. Yet data alone does not win elections in Bengal, where politics is as much about symbolism as it is about arithmetic. Shah's campaign therefore extended beyond spreadsheets into the realm of cultural signalling.

"His visits to Gangesagar and the Kapil Muni Ashram in April were not incidental. They were calibrated gestures, aimed at embedding the BJP within the state's cultural landscape rather than presenting it as an external force," BJP insiders pointed out. On the ground, the shift was equally pronounced. Party workers were instructed to build from the booth upwards, emphasising local leadership rather than parachuting in high-profile leaders from outside.

"The issues our workers foregrounded were carefully chosen - ranging from concerns over women's safety, anxieties about industrial stagnation, to a growing fatigue with the corruption visible in the state and party administration under the incumbent government," BJP officials said. Amit Shah himself became a constant presence, traversing districts with a relentlessness that blurred the line between strategist and campaigner.

Rallies and roadshows were not merely displays of strength but instruments of calibration, each appearance feeding back into the campaign's central nervous system.

Promises were sharpened accordingly from the implementation of the Seventh Pay Commission for state employees to a hard line on law and order with a freer hand to the police. For the politically important Matua community who were hit by the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls, camps were set up to ensure they would either be enrolled for the next round of polls or be given citizenship certificates. The hard work paid off with BJP managing to win a resounding 206 seats in a 293-member assembly, marking the end of a 15-year rule that once seemed unassailable. Politically, it seemed to prove BJP's theory that even the Bengali electorate, often seen as uniquely resistant to national currents, could be persuaded by a campaign that spoke simultaneously to local grievances and broader national narratives. The question that arises from this victory is can this model be sustained.

## Police form teams to trace Suwendu aide's killers

KOLKATA (TSIT):

The police have been examining CCTV footage and have formed multiple special investigating teams to trace those involved in the killing of BJP leader Suwendu Adhikari's close aide Chandranath Rath, a senior officer said on



Thursday. The police are also probing whether contract killers were engaged to murder Rath, who was shot dead in his car by bike-borne gunmen in the middle of a road at Madhyamgram in North 24 Parganas district on Wednesday night.

A forensic team visited the

spot on Thursday morning and collected samples, while officers of the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) also joined the probe, he said. "Going by the circumstantial evidence, it seems that the murder was pre-planned.

Investigators are examining CCTV footage from the crime spot and nearby areas, while multiple police teams have been formed to trace the assailants," the officer said.

"We are also examining videos taken using mobile phones by witnesses who also helped in taking Rath, his driver and the other person inside the SUV to the nearby hospital," he stated. Since the crime took place some time after rain on Wednesday night, not many people were present on the roads leading to Rath's residential complex. "We have spoken to those people who were seen in the CCTV footage," he said.

## Mamata Banerjee hasn't lost Bengal polls: Akhilesh Yadav

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav on Thursday met Trinamool Congress supremo Mamata Banerjee at her residence in Kalinghat and extended his moral support to her following her party's electoral setback in the West Bengal Assembly elections. During the meeting, Yadav told her, "Didi, you have not lost", and alleged electoral fraud by the Bharatiya Janata

Party and the Election Commission of India in West Bengal.

The meeting was also attended by Trinamool Congress Member of Parliament Abhishek Banerjee, who welcomed Yadav to Mamata Banerjee's house. Speaking to media persons after the meeting, Yadav said that Opposition leaders must collectively stand against alleged electoral fraud. "I have just met Didi (Mamata Banerjee).

# Shashi Tharoor moves Delhi HC seeking protection of personality rights

New Delhi, May 7: Congress MP Shashi Tharoor has approached the Delhi High Court seeking protection of his personality and publicity rights against the alleged misuse of his name, likeness and identity across digital platforms, including through AI-generated and morphed content.

As per the cause list published on the official website of the Delhi High Court, the matter is scheduled to be heard on Friday by a single-judge Bench of Justice Mini Pushkarna.

Tharoor has reportedly sought relief against several defendants, including unidentified persons impleaded as John Doe parties, alleging unauthorised use and commercial exploitation of his persona.

The plea is also stated to seek the removal of deepfake and AI-morphed content allegedly circulating online using his identity without consent.

The development comes amid a



growing number of personality rights disputes before the Delhi High Court involving allegations of AI-generated impersonation, deepfakes, fake endorsements and unauthorised commercial exploitation of celebrity identities.

Earlier in the day, the Delhi High Court said that it would pass an interim order protecting the

personality and publicity rights of entrepreneur and Shark Tank India judge Aman Gupta in a suit alleging widespread unauthorised commercial exploitation of his identity across digital platforms.

A single-judge Bench of Justice Tushar Rao Gedela indicated that it would pass an interim order after hearing submissions made

on behalf of Gupta, co-founder of electronics brand boAt Lifestyle. The suit alleged circulation of fake endorsements, AI-generated impersonations, unauthorised merchandise, fraudulent event-booking services and objectionable online content linked to Gupta's identity.

The Shashi Tharoor case adds to a growing list of high-profile personalities invoking their personality and publicity rights before the Delhi High Court.

In recent months, former cricketer and current head coach Gautam Gambhir, former cricket captain Sunil Gavaskar, spiritual leader Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, actors Arjun Kapoor, Allu Arjun, Nagarjuna, Kajol, Aishwarya Rai Bachchan, and Abhishek Bachchan, singer Jubin Nautiyal, filmmaker Karan Johar, and podcaster Raj Shamani have secured court protection against the unauthorised use of their identity, likeness, or AI-generated imitations.

# Andhra local body polls soon: Chandrababu Naidu

Amaravati, May 7: Local body elections in Andhra Pradesh would be conducted soon, announced Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday.

Addressing the conference of the district Collectors at the State Secretariat here, he said the local body polls would be held soon.

He reviewed the performance of various departments and the implementation of programmes at the field level. Discussions were held on education, healthcare, and the grounding of investments, among other subjects.

He directed the district Collectors to encourage the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises sector, as the increasing number of industries create significant opportunities for ancillary industries.

He emphasised that Micro, Small and Medium



Enterprises should play a vital role in the industrial ecosystem evolving around major investments coming into the state.

The Chief Minister said that any issues faced by companies coming forward to invest in the state, particularly related to land allocation, should be resolved immediately.

He stressed that products from various districts should evolve into pan-India and global brands, similar to the successful branding of Araku Coffee.

The Chief Minister noted that the arrival of

the Google Cloud Artificial Intelligence Hub in Andhra Pradesh had attracted the Carrier Air Conditioning company to the state.

He said the company would supply bulk chillers required for data centres and quantum computing facilities. He stated that a Quantum Reference facility has already been established in Amaravati and that once the Quantum Computing Centre becomes operational, an ecosystem for manufacturing the required equipment would also emerge.

# STALIN MEETS NEWLY ELECTED DMK LEGISLATORS AS TAMIL NADU FACES POLITICAL UNCERTAINTY

Chennai, May 7: DMK president M.K. Stalin on Thursday chaired a crucial meeting of the party's newly elected MLAs at Anna Arivalayam in Chennai as the party prepared to assume the role of the Opposition amid continuing uncertainty over government formation in Tamil Nadu. The meeting was attended by all victorious DMK legislators and focused on the evolving political situation in the state, the party's legislative strategy, and the future course of action following the Assembly election verdict.

The post-election political landscape in Tamil Nadu has witnessed dramatic realignments. In the recently concluded Assembly elections, the DMK-led alliance secured 73 seats.

However, the Congress, which had won five seats as part of the alliance, later shifted its support to the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) led by actor-politician C. Joseph Vijay.

The TVK emerged as the single largest formation with 108 seats in the 234-member Assembly.

Amid the rapidly changing political scenario, the TVK has also been attempting to rally support from smaller parties. Sources said the party has initiated discussions with the Communist Party of India (CPI), the Communist Party of India-Marxist (CPI-M), and the Indian Union Muslim League



(IUML), each of which has four MLAs in the new Assembly. Their support is being considered significant in the ongoing political calculations as parties continue exploring possible alignments. Despite these efforts, the DMK alliance, which now effectively commands the support of 68 MLAs following the Congress exit, appears set to occupy the Opposition benches in the Assembly.

The election results also dealt a personal setback to Stalin, who lost the Kolathur Assembly constituency to TVK candidate V.S. Babu by a margin of nearly 10,000 votes. The defeat marked one of the biggest political setbacks for

the DMK leadership in recent years.

However, Udhayanidhi Stalin retained the Chepauk-Triplicane constituency, strengthening his position within the party. Political observers believe he is now likely to be elected leader of the DMK Legislature Party, a move that could pave the way for him to become the Leader of the Opposition in the Assembly. Meanwhile, Stalin is learnt to have assured party legislators that the DMK would not interfere in the ongoing efforts by the TVK to secure the support of 113 MLAs required to form the next government in Tamil Nadu.

# TWO BAGS CONTAINING CASH THROWN FROM NINTH FLOOR OF MOHALI FLAT IN ED RAID

Chandigarh, May 7: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday carried out raids at a flat near Kharar in Punjab's Mohali district where two bags allegedly containing cash were reportedly thrown from a ninth floor of the house during the operation, officials said. The ED officials added that the raid was carried out in the flat of an IT professional, Nitin Gohal, in Western Towers and during the search operation two bags allegedly containing cash bundles were thrown within the building premises. He is considered close to an aide of Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann. Morning walkers reportedly found currency notes scattered around the complex and notified the authorities. ED officials later confiscated the bags and continued with the search operation. They said 12 locations in Mohali and Chandigarh were raided, including premises of builders and housing projects as well as that of Gohal.

# ADLURI LAXMAN KUMAR CRACKS DOWN ON LONG-TERM DEPUTATIONS IN GURUKULS

Hyderabad TSIT: In a decisive move to strengthen classroom teaching in Gurukul institutions, Welfare Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar directed the cancellation of long-standing deputations of teaching staff working at the Head Office and administrative wings of the Telangana Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society (TGSWREIS).

Acting on the Minister's directions, TGSWREIS Secretary (FAC) Sharada issued orders on Thursday repatriating nearly 16 teaching personnel from various cadres back to their parent institutions.

The decision was taken following growing concerns over shortage of teachers in Gurukul schools, which reportedly affected classroom instruction and academic activities. At the same time, several teachers had been continuing on OD deputation at the Head Office for extended periods, drawing criticism from teachers' unions and employee associations.

Sources said Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar conducted a comprehensive review after receiving multiple representations from stakeholders and instructed officials to ensure that teaching staff return to classrooms where their services are most needed. The government believes that with examinations and competitive academic schedules approaching, the availability of qualified teachers in educational institutions is crucial for improving academic performance and maintaining quality standards in Gurukul schools. The move is being seen as part of the State government's broader effort to improve educational standards, ensure accountability and provide uninterrupted teaching for students studying in residential welfare institutions. Teachers' unions and employee associations welcomed the decision, stating that the cancellation of prolonged deputations would help address staff shortages and strengthen the academic environment in Gurukul institutions. Education stakeholders and parents also appreciated the initiative, observing that the government had prioritised the future and academic welfare of students through timely intervention.

## Fake certificate racket probe widens in Jogulamba Gadwal district

Jogulamba Gadwal, May 6 (TSIT): A major investigation into an alleged fake certificate and counterfeit stamp racket linked to Sri Lakshmi Narasimha Printer Press in Ieeja town of Jogulamba Gadwal district has reportedly



expanded to several villages across Ieeja and Gattu mandals. According to official sources, the matter came to light after a complaint was submitted during the district Collector's Prajavani grievance

programme. Acting on directions from the Tahsildar, Revenue Inspector officials, along with GPO staff and police personnel, conducted inspections at the printing press premises in Ieeja town.

During the raid, officials allegedly discovered fake certificates, counterfeit seals, and other suspicious materials. Based on the findings, a formal complaint was lodged at the Ieeja Police Station against the operator of the print-

ing press. Police have reportedly been conducting an intensive investigation for the past four days.

Sources said the inquiry has now widened beyond Ieeja town, with authorities examining the alleged involvement of several middlemen and facilitators from different villages in Ieeja and Gattu mandals. Officials indicated that more names could surface as the investigation progresses.

Authorities suspect that certain agents maintained links with the printing press operator and may have played a role in facilitating illegal documentation activities. Police and revenue officials stated that a detailed investigation is underway and assured that strict legal action would be taken against all those found involved, irrespective of their background or influence.

## Telangana aspirations remain unfulfilled, says Prof. Kodandaram



Sangareddy, May 6 (TSIT): M. Kodandaram, President of Telangana Jana Samithi, said the aspirations of the Telangana movement remain unfulfilled and stressed that the party will continue its fight for a corruption-free and democratic Telangana.

Addressing the fourth plenary meeting of the party in Sangareddy on Thursday, Kodandaram said Telangana Jana Samithi played a significant role in the Telangana statehood movement and has consistently fought for the self-respect and rights of Telangana people. ## VMRDA Speeds Up Major Road Projects Amid Bitumen Shortage

700 Metric Tonnes of Bitumen Imported from Chennai; Boyapalem-Kapuluppada Road to be Completed in 24 Hours

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) Amid a severe shortage of bitumen caused by the prevailing international war-like situation involving Iran, Israel, and the United States, the Visakhapatnam Metropolitan Region Development Authority (VMRDA) has taken special measures to ensure that major infrastructure road projects are completed without delay. VMRDA Metropolitan Commissioner Shri N. Tej Bharat, IAS, stated that about 700 metric tonnes of bitumen had been imported from Chennai to accelerate the pending road works. He said the shortage of bitumen had significantly affected road construction activities across the Visakhapatnam region.



Bharat held continuous discussions with petroleum company officials and arranged the supply through Indian Oil Corporation, Chennai. The remaining BT works of the N e r e d l a v a l a s a - Kothavalasa road project, which is already 80 percent complete, and the Boyapalem-Kapuluppada major layout road, which has reached 72 percent completion, were formally

launched on Thursday by the Commissioner. Speaking on the occasion, he said a total of 945 metric tonnes of bitumen was required for the completion of both roads, of which nearly 700 metric tonnes had already been procured from Chennai. To speed up the works that had stalled due to the shortage, VMRDA has deployed two pavers, four road rollers, and nearly 20

tipplers, working continuously round the clock. Inspired by the rapid execution model adopted in the Amaravati National Highway works, the Boyapalem-Kapuluppada road will be completed within 24 hours, by the morning of May 8, he said. He further stated that plans had been prepared to complete the Tallavalasa-Kothavalasa road works in a single day on May 11.

## 150 KW Solar Rooftop Plant Inaugurated at DCIL Office

Significant Savings in Power Costs Along with Environmental Protection

The South India Times, Visakhapatnam: A 150-kilowatt capacity Solar Rooftop Plant was inaugurated on Thursday at the headquarters of Dredging Corporation of India Limited (DCIL). The plant was official-

ly inaugurated by DCIL Managing Director & CEO Captain S. Divakar. Officials stated that the project, implemented under the Central Government's 'PM Surya Ghar Yojana', marks a significant step towards environmentally friendly initiatives by the organization. The solar



plant is expected to generate around 750 units of clean electricity per day, approximately 22,500 units per month, and nearly 2.7 lakh units annually. DCIL stated that the project would help save around Rs. 2.5 lakh per month and nearly Rs.

30 lakh annually in electricity expenses. The project is expected to play a crucial role in reducing dependence on conventional power consumption. Officials further stated that the project would help reduce carbon dioxide emissions by around 220 to 240 tonnes annually.

This is said to be equivalent to planting more than 10,000 trees or removing nearly 50 passenger vehicles from the roads. The project is said to be among the first initiatives undertaken in line with the guidelines of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways. NTPC Vidyut Vyapar Nigam Limited acted as

the implementation partner, while Ledure Lightings Limited completed the project in record time. It may be recalled that Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal had inaugurated the project during the Golden Jubilee celebrations of DCIL on March 29.

## SBI Employees Prepare for Two-Day Nationwide Strike

Protest Programmes Intensified Seeking Resolution of Pending Demands



The South India Times, Visakhapatnam: Employees of the State Bank of India, under the banner of the All India State Bank of India Staff Federation, are set to launch nationwide protests demanding the resolution of their long-pending issues. Federation Executive Member A. Sushma announced this during a media conference held at Visakh Tarak Bhavan in Siripuram on Thursday evening. She stated that an all-India bank strike will be observed for two days on May 25 and 26, and that a detailed schedule of protest programmes has already been released. The federation has raised sev-

eral key demands, including recruitment of messengers, filling up armed guard vacancies, implementation of the old pension scheme, and providing inter-circle transfer facilities to employees recruited after 2019.

The union is also seeking solutions to the issues faced by temporary employees, improved facilities for women staff, enhancement of tenant subsidy, and better humanitarian coordination within the bank administration. Other demands include implementation of the Career Progression Scheme, revisions in special increment benefits as per the 10th Bipartite Settlement, pay-

ment of pending conveyance charges from 2024, and reforms in the bank's medical reimbursement scheme. The federation also demanded justice for pensioners, resolution of issues in the HRMS system, and reduction of cross-selling pressure on employees.

Federation District Vice-President Satish said that various forms of agitation have been underway since May 2 as part of the movement to achieve their demands. These include submission of strike notices, wearing badges, lunch-hour protests, social media campaigns, dharnas, silent protests, and submission of memorandums to Members of Parliament and the Union Finance Minister.

He further stated that a candlelight rally will be organized on May 24, followed by the nationwide strike on May 25 and 26. Union leaders warned that if the pending issues are not resolved immediately by the government and bank management, the agitation would be intensified further.

## Andhra University Withdraws 2023 Faculty Recruitment Notifications

## EDITORIAL

*One Year Of Op Sindoor: Why 'Round 2' Will Be A Different Beast Entirely*

A unique military operation in global military history marks its first anniversary. 'Operation Sindoor' followed fundamental military doctrines astutely, in keeping objectives steady, clear and based on the reality of a nuclear environment. While these principles still apply, warfare and international relations have changed beyond recognition in the last year. Another Operation Sindoor, though highly likely, would have to be framed and executed in quite a different milieu, since both sides have built upon their experiences to hone their own capabilities and doctrines. The key for the next round may be flexibility, and learning some very hard lessons on what the world is like now. The Uniqueness of Sindoor

Sindoor will remain unique in the annals of warfare for three reasons.

First, it was just 88-hours long and ended at a time of our choosing. Consider Ukraine, Iran and other wars.

Second, it hit pause at each stage, allowing Pakistan to step back if it chose to, thus knitting diplomacy firmly into operations. Third, the political leadership held tightly on to the reins, allowing the operation to expand judiciously and calling a stop when it was judged that enough punishment had been delivered. Clarity of purpose was, therefore, across the board, which was to show Pakistan that India would no longer be blackmailed by nuclear threats into 'restraint', even while exercising operational restraint throughout the operation, so as to remain under the nuclear threshold.

That last point was vital. The lessons of the Balakot strike, for instance, which led to the capture of Wg Cdr Abhinandan Varthaman, were learned well. There was to be no crossing of the border. Complete air superiority meant that neither would Pakistan break this rule. It stopped in time, too. That's interesting and needs further study. Understanding the enemy is the foremost requirement in war planning.

### The Wide Reach Of Pak Terrorism

In terms of the future, one constant is that Pakistan's terrorist sponsorship continues, as apparent in at least five major modules interdicted in India in April alone. A key one among them had Bangladesh roots, while another was smuggling weapons from India. All our borders are again of concern, with Nepal now openly anti-India, and Bangladesh's new Prime Minister, Tarique Rehman, facing strong internal headwinds from multiple sources. Then there are other multiple groups that seem to be acting independently. Recent arrests of another duo of doctors planning a ricin attack, apparently on the basis of Islamic State handlers, is an indication, as are reports of the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan's (TTP) penetration into Bangladesh.

The next major terror attack could thus come from almost anywhere, with a twin threat of causing not just carnage but also damage to bilateral relations. That means a far more intensive intelligence collaboration or aggressive penetration with neighbours. This is a deliberately engineered cocktail, intended to make it difficult for India to provide 'proof of a terrorist attack, a narrative that was successful post-Pahalgam, even within some sections in India. More diffusion is, therefore, a certainty.

### The Arms Come Flowing In

A somewhat new aspect is that the Pakistan army is now fully in power. No doubts about that as the Field Marshal holds talks and flies internationally in his expensive, private jet. Decision-making will now be far more discreet, with only a loud-voiced and unreliable Defence Minister's constant threats serving as a measure. Data show that arms imports by Pakistan grew by 66%, with China supplying 80% of weapons, up from 73% in 2016-20. Add to that the induction of new stealth fighter J-35 jets, whose delivery is expected to be fast-tracked to mid-year. This will be a concern for the Indian Air Force.

Then there is the marked increase in space assets, with three launches so far, and a hyperspectral satellite last year, all from China. This is a constellation that would deliver on Muni's threat to attack even the furthest point in India, both in the South and the Northeast. This is China making sure that not only is India forced to increase its defence budget, but also that Delhi is 'kept in place' in the subcontinent. Remember that prior to the Pahalgam attack as well, Chinese satellite imagery was possibly given to Pakistan, while during the conflict, a continuous stream of imagery helped. This pattern still holds. Then there is the fact that two months after the end of Operation Sindoor, the Pakistanis announced the formation of the Strategic Rocket Force, which will have conventional rockets from the Nuclear Command. Point to note for the future: in today's wars, missile use is the norm rather than the exception - count some 650 missiles by Iran and probably double that by the US, and an estimated 9,600 missiles of various types by Russia (not including attack drones), along with Ukraine's veritable storm of drones and some 500-plus Western-supplied missiles. As both wars progress, it's the drones that are causing the most damage. Future emphasis is thus not just on ballistic missile defence but, most vitally, on short-range, slow-flying drones. The point is that with today's 'no-rules' order in force, forget a 'condemnation' for any country that fires missiles. That's history.

### And, Trump

The most critical is the stance of not just the United States, but also much of Europe, now praising the Pakistani army for its 'mediation' efforts. After Operation Sindoor, while US Vice-President JD Vance very sensibly said that the US would be engaged diplomatically but not intervene between two nuclear powers, President Trump took complete credit for ending the war. True, there were certainly phones buzzing, once Pakistan - as usual - announced that it was convening its Nuclear Command Authority (in the event, however, the meeting was never held, and Pakistan reached out for a ceasefire). What the extent of US pressure was is unclear, much like whether the Pakistani armed forces themselves stepped back after they found their sky virtually unprotected. The point is that a US role this time might be very different. That could include, for instance, a quiet go-ahead until Indian cities are hit,

# WHY DISTANCE FROM IN-LAWS AND HOLD ON HUSBAND

(STOP POLITICIZING MARRIAGE, IT'S TIME FOR PARTNERSHIP)

Marriage isn't a power struggle, but rather a relationship of trust, respect, and responsibility between two individuals. However, in our society, marriage is often transformed from a partnership into a game of control, where one party seeks to impose its traditions and the other adopts a rigid stance to protect its independence. This conflict eventually turns into conflict, distance, and distrust, leading people to blame the relationship as a whole. The real problem lies not in the relationship itself, but in the way we understand it. It's easy to dismiss the marital tensions we see today as merely a matter of women's perception, but that would be an incomplete analysis. Indian families have long placed the man in the role of decision-maker and the woman in the subservient role. Within this framework, the daughter-in-law was expected to accept, remain silent, conform, and unquestioningly follow family traditions. On the other hand, a new generation of women, with education, jobs, self-reliance, and self-respect, are challenging this role. They no longer want to be just "daughters-in-law"; they want to be respected as individuals. This is where the generational divide becomes clearly visible. In the past, marriage meant moving into the



husband's home and adapting to the same system, whether it was fair or not. Today's woman believes that even after marriage, she should retain her own individuality, her own family, her own thoughts, and her own boundaries. This demand is not wrong in itself. Every person has the right to live with dignity and self-respect. The problem begins when this right is mistaken for stubbornness or rebellion. On the other hand, many men also remain stuck in old patterns. They want their wives to completely integrate into their family, obey their parents' every word, follow every household tradition, and remain unquestioning under any circumstances. They forget that marriage is a union of two individuals, not a power of one over the other. When a man believes that his wife simply has to adjust, and only he has the power to change her, it creates an imbalance

in the relationship. This imbalance gradually turns into suspicion, bitterness, and distance. The relationship with in-laws remains sweet as long as there is respect. Respect doesn't just mean formal respect, but emotional acceptance. Expecting a daughter-in-law to abandon her parents, her values, her thoughts, and her priorities is actually a form of emotional pressure. It's one thing to acquire a new home after marriage, but it's quite another to sever old ties. A woman can be a daughter, a wife, and a daughter-in-law all at the same time. The problem arises when she is asked to remain only a daughter-in-law, and her other identities are neglected. Similarly, it's true that in some cases, wives turn the relationship into a struggle for control rather than a partnership. They try to control their husbands not through love, understanding, and communication, but through pres-

sure, complaints, and accusations. Such behavior also weakens the relationship. If one party in a marriage tries to dominate everything, the other either breaks down or becomes rigid in resistance. Therefore, it wouldn't be correct to say that the fault lies solely with men or solely with women. The problem lies with the mindset that turns marriage into a struggle for power balance rather than cooperation. In fact, many layers of marriage interact in Indian society. Love, tradition, caste, family, property, prestige, and social pressure all influence marriage. Expecting one person to accept everything without protest is unrealistic. Society is changing, education has increased, economic independence has grown, and access to information has also expanded. People no longer accept past decisions without question. This is why the need for communication within mar-

riage is greater than ever. Unfortunately, communication is often replaced by accusations, complaints, and emotional distance. In many homes, problems arise less from the husband and wife than from the family's intrusive role. In-laws, siblings, relatives, and society all join forces to voice their opinions about the couple's personal lives. Advice, comparisons, and interference on every small matter erode the relationship. When the husband doesn't stand by his wife, the wife feels she has no support left after marriage. And when the husband feels that because his wife has come to his home, he must completely submit to her, he loses sensitivity. This creates a distance between the two parties. The relationship becomes less loving and more strategic. It's also important to understand that freedom and independence are not the same thing. A woman speaking up for her dignity, making her own decisions, and protecting her self-respect isn't independence. However, if she sees conflict as the only solution to everything, there can be no peace in the relationship. Similarly, a man's responsibility to his family is essential, but unilaterally ruling over his wife in the name of responsibility is unfair. The relationship between husband and wife should be balanced by dignity, compassion, and respect. Until this balance is achieved, tensions will persist in the marriage. Society must accept that today's woman is no longer the silent and tolerant woman she once was. This change isn't bad. It's a sign of social progress. A woman who is educated, earns, and understands her rights won't compromise on everything. She also realizes that marriage doesn't mean surrender, but a shared life.

## From Confrontation to Consultation

The role played by RTC workers in the Telangana movement remains deeply etched in public memory. They were not mere participants but frontline contributors who sacrificed livelihoods, halted services, and risked personal security to support the cause of statehood. In the aftermath of Telangana's formation, there was a widespread expectation that their contributions would be honoured through job security, institutional strengthening, and welfare measures. However, those expectations remained largely unfulfilled during the previous regime. The discontent among RTC workers reached a peak during the 52-day strike in 2019. Far from being a routine labour protest, it was a movement rooted in dignity, livelihood security, and long-pending demands. The response of the then government was marked by rigidity. Declaring the strike illegal, refusing dialogue, and invoking the "self-dismissal" of nearly 48,000 employees created an atmosphere of fear and uncertainty. Reports of worker deaths, including alleged suicides, underscored the human cost of the crisis. Yet, a conciliatory approach was conspicuously absent.

The episode revealed a deeper structural issue: the failure to engage with labour concerns through democratic dialogue. Decisions such as delaying pay revisions, withholding retirement benefits, discontinuing union

recognition, and shelving the promise of RTC's merger into the government further eroded trust. For a workforce that had stood firmly behind the Telangana movement, this phase was widely perceived as a betrayal. In contrast, the current Congress government has adopted a markedly different approach. Under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, there has been a visible shift from confrontation to consultation. The government's handling of recent labour concerns reflects a willingness to engage, listen, and resolve through dialogue a fundamental principle of democratic governance.

Transport Minister Ponnampalapati Prabhakar's proactive intervention played a key role in resolving the latest strike within days. By facilitating discussions between management and worker unions, the government created space for negotiation and mutual understanding. The acknowledgment that long-pending issues cannot be resolved overnight, but require sustained engagement, reflects administrative maturity.

Concrete measures have further reinforced worker confidence. The government has agreed to an 11% fitment, initiated discussions on the long-pending merger issue through a committee, and restored the recognition of unions that were previously dissolved. Additionally, the clearance of pending dues, including Rs.280 crore in wage revision bonds and other allowances, signals a commitment to financial accountability. Equally significant has been the government's humane approach from engaging directly with workers to offering assurances on wages during strike periods and withdrawing cases filed earlier. Such gestures, though administrative in nature, carry symbolic weight in rebuilding trust.

## At The Edge Of The Map, A Bet On Power: Why India Is Building In Great Nicobar

On a map of global trade, the southern tip of India's Andaman and Nicobar archipelago looks like a remote outpost, forested, fragile, and far from the mainland. But to planners in New Delhi, Great Nicobar Island is something else entirely: a hinge point between the Indian Ocean and the Indo-Pacific, a vantage over the world's busiest sea lanes, and potentially, a lever of both economic and strategic power. India's proposed Great Nicobar project, a deep-sea transshipment port, international airport, power plant and township, has triggered sharp debate. Critics warn of ecological damage, seismic risks and questionable commercial viability. Proponents argue it is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to reposition India in global trade and maritime strategy. The truth lies in understanding what the project is and what it is not. A Location That Rewrites The Map The case for Great Nicobar begins not with engineering, but geography. Just north of the Indonesian archipelago, the island sits near the Six Degree Channel, a key maritime passage feeding into the Malacca Strait. This narrow corridor connects the Indian Ocean to the South China Sea and, by extension, to East Asia's manufacturing heartlands. The numbers underscore its importance: Roughly 40% of global trade passes through Malacca. Around \$5 trillion in goods flows annually. Nearly 80% of China's oil imports transit this route. For decades, India has observed this traffic from a distance. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands host the Andaman and Nicobar Command, the country's only integrated military command, but logistical limitations have constrained sustained operations. The Great Nicobar project aims to change that.



It would turn a remote island into a permanent, serviced node, a place where ships dock, aircraft refuel, and surveillance extends continuously over one of the world's most sensitive maritime chokepoints. "Presence," in maritime strategy, is not symbolic. It is sustained, supplied and visible. Much of the public debate has framed Great Nicobar as a commercial port competing with mainland facilities like Vizhinjam International Seaport. But that comparison misses the project's primary logic. Vizhinjam, located on India's southwest coast, is designed for efficiency, proximity to shipping lanes, strong hinterland connectivity, and rapid cargo movement inland. It is a commercial asset. Great Nicobar is something different: a forward operating platform. From this vantage, India can: Monitor shipping traffic entering and exiting Malacca Track naval movements in the eastern Indian Ocean. Respond rapidly to crises, from piracy to military escalation. Sustain long-duration maritime patrols it cannot, as some rhetoric suggests, "block" the strait, as international law, like UNCLOS (The United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea), protects transit passage. But modern power rarely relies on outright con-

trol. It rests on awareness, deterrence and readiness. The island's existing airstrip at INS Baaz already supports surveillance flights. Expanded infrastructure would extend that capability into a permanent operational presence. In strategic terms, the difference is stark: Without development - intermittent reach. With development - continuous influence. The China Factor No discussion of Great Nicobar can ignore China. Over the past two decades, Beijing has built a network of ports and facilities across the Indian Ocean, Gwadar in Pakistan, Hambantota in Sri Lanka, Kyaukpadaung in Myanmar and a military base in Djibouti. Analysts often describe this as a "string of pearls," designed to secure China's maritime lifelines. India's response has been more restrained, focusing on partnerships and selective infrastructure. Great Nicobar represents a shift: a move to anchor its own presence near a critical chokepoint. China itself has long worried about the "Malacca dilemma"; its dependence on a narrow passage vulnerable to disruption. While India cannot legally interdict this route, its ability to observe and operate near it introduces a layer of strategic uncertainty for any adversary. In peacetime, that

translates into influence. In crisis, into leverage. The Commercial Promise and Limits If the strategic case is compelling, the economic one is more complex. Today, India depends heavily on foreign ports for transshipment, the process of transferring cargo between large and smaller vessels. Government data indicates that about 75% of India's transshipment cargo is handled abroad, primarily in Colombo, Singapore and Port Klang. Direct losses are estimated at \$200-220 million annually, with larger indirect costs in logistics inefficiency. Great Nicobar aims to internalise a portion of this traffic. The planners envision: Phase 1 capacity: 4 million TEUs by around 2028. Ultimate capacity: 16 million TEUs. For context, India's major ports together handle roughly 13-14 million TEUs today. The project's location offers advantages: Natural deep draft (around 20 meters), accommodating large container ships. Proximity to Bay of Bengal markets. Minimal deviation for ships entering or exiting Malacca. Beyond container handling, revenue streams could include bunkering (fuel supply), ship repair, warehousing, and aviation services. Yet success is far from guaranteed. Global transshipment is a competitive.

## Alcoholic beverage industry seeks price hike amid rising costs from West Asia crisis

New Delhi: Alcoholic beverage makers have sought a reasonable price hike from state governments to deal with pressures arising out of rising can and bottle costs due to supply chain disruptions triggered by the West Asia crisis. Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC) and the Brewers Association of India (BAI) have urged states to allow revisions of IMFL (Indian Made Foreign Liquor), wine and beer products and provide interim relief measures to help manufacturers cope with rising production costs. BAI has asked state governments to allow suppliers a price increase of 15-20 per cent to partially offset the impact of rising input costs. In letters sent to state governments, BAI Director General Vinod Giri said the conflict has triggered a sharp increase in input costs across categories. "Glass bottle prices have risen by around 20 per cent, paper cartons have increased by almost 100 per cent, and materials such as LDPE, BOPP and adhesives have



become costlier by 20-25 per cent," Giri said. Severe shortage of commercial LNG supply has put glass bottle manufacturers under significant strain, and they too face partial or full shutdowns. "Supply of glass and cans may be severely strained in the coming months and even years," BAI said. Moreover, the beer industry, which is also facing issues with the supply of cans, sees it prolonging due to rising aluminium costs. "Aluminium supplies from the Middle East have been badly hit, and suppliers have warned that prolonged dis-

ruption risks not only put but also a shutdown of manufacturing plants," said Giri. Freight and logistics costs have also increased by around 10 per cent, while the depreciation of the rupee against the US dollar has further pushed up import costs, he added. As an interim relief measure, BAI has also sought a reduction in manufacturing levies by around Rs 3-5 per bulk litre to create a cushion against rising costs. BAI represents leading players from the brewing industry - United Breweries, ABInBev and Carlsberg - which

together account for around 85 per cent of the beer sold in the country. # Trump meets Brazil's President Lula at White House

Lula's motorcade has arrived at the White House, our correspondent who is there for the meeting tells us. The meeting between Trump and Lula will begin shortly. The US-Brazil relationship broke down significantly last year after Trump imposed a 50% tariff on most of Brazil's goods last year. This affected several key products, including coffee and beef, that Americans like to buy. Trump framed the tariffs as retaliation for the prosecution of his ally, right-wing former Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro. He had been accused - and later convicted - of attempting to stage a coup after losing the 2022 presidential election to current President Lula. The aim was to exert pressure on Brazilian authorities to back down on criminal proceedings against Bolsonaro. But in November, as prices rose at home, Trump reversed the tariffs. His broader tariffs were also overturned by the US Supreme Court in February. And in Brazil, Bolsonaro's legal troubles continue: he was sentenced to 27 years in prison and is

currently under house arrest due to ill health. President Trump and Brazilian President Lula are set to meet and speak soon. Last September, Lula told the BBC in an exclusive interview that he has "no relationship" with Donald Trump. It was just the latest in a war of words between the two leaders since Trump put a high tariff - 50% - on goods from Brazil in 2025. "The American people will pay for the mistakes President Trump is incurring in his relationship with Brazil," Lula said at the time. He also accused Trump of foreign interference and behaving like an "emperor". Trump has previously said that Lula can "call him anytime." But Lula insisted that members of the Trump Administration "do not want to talk". Part of the reason for Trump's high tariffs on Brazil was the trial and conviction of Lula's predecessor, the right-wing Jair Bolsonaro, who had a close relationship with Trump. He was found guilty of attempting a coup d'etat after he lost the 2022 election to Lula. "His



relationship is with Bolsonaro, not Brazil," Lula said of Trump. But after a brief meeting at the United Nations General Assembly in New York in September, relations seemed to thaw. They spoke on the phone the next month, a conversation both leaders described as positive and friendly. Trump said on his Truth Social platform that the call "was mostly focused on the economy, and trade, between our two countries". "We will be having further discussions, and will get

together in the not too distant future, both in Brazil and the United States." Today is that day - and it remains to be seen if the relations thaw further or not. President Trump is expected to greet Brazilian President Lula outside the White House in about half an hour, around 11:00e (15:00b). The two will then head inside for a bilateral meeting in the Oval Office, and we anticipate getting to hear each of the leaders speak and answer questions from

press. Before Lula departs, the two leaders will then have lunch together, outside of reporters' view, scheduled to start at 11:45e. This will be Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva's first time visiting Trump at the White House after a tense year. The two leaders briefly met during the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Summit in October. They also spoke on the phone earlier that month, a call described by both sides as friendly and positive as Brazil sought to reduce the 50% US tariff on some of its goods. Those tariffs played a large part in creating the tension that had overshadowed their relationship. Trump raised them last in response to the trial of Lula's predecessor, Jair Bolsonaro, who was found guilty of plotting a military coup. Lula had accused Trump of foreign interference and behaving like an "emperor". But Lula described the October phone meeting as an opportunity to restore friendly relations between "the two largest Western democracies" and

# China announces suspended death sentences for former defence ministers



Two former Chinese defence ministers have been handed suspended death sentences on corruption charges, according to state media. A military court on Thursday sentenced Wei Fenghe and Li Shangfu to death with a two-year reprieve. This means their death sentences will be commuted to life imprisonment after two years, without the possibility of sentence reduction or parole, Xinhua reports. Both men were found guilty of bribery, and all of their personal assets were confiscated. The announcement follows the recent

ousting of several top military figures in the country amid a sweeping anti corruption crackdown. Wei served as defence minister from 2018 to 2023 and was replaced by Li in March 2023. Li's tenure as defence minister was much shorter. He was dismissed in October 2023, two months after he suddenly disappeared from public life, sparking speculation of his removal. Reuters news agency quoted past reports in Xinhua which said that Li had been suspected of receiving "huge sums of money" in bribes as well as bribing others.

# Iran considering US proposal as Trump says war will be 'over quickly'



US President Donald Trump has predicted that the war in Iran will be "over quickly" and says that most people "understand" his goal of ending Tehran's nuclear ambitions. His comments come after Iran said a US proposal to end the war is "still being considered". US news outlet Axios reported that the White House believes it could be closing in on a 14-point memorandum of understanding with Iran, which could set a framework for more detailed nuclear negotiations. A senior member of Iran's parliament has dismissed it as a "wish list", while a foreign ministry spokesman said Tehran would share its views of a US proposal with Pakistani mediators. Pakistan's foreign minister said his country was "endeavouring to convert this ceasefire into a permanent end to this war". In its report, Axios describes the memorandum as a one-page, 14-point memo which could set a framework for more detailed nuclear negotiations. Among the provisions it lists are a suspension on Iranian nuclear enrichment, the lifting of

sanctions, and restoring free transit through the Strait of Hormuz. It cites two US officials and two other sources - all unnamed - whom it describes as briefed on the issues. These sources are reported as saying that many of the terms laid out in the memo would be contingent on a final agreement being reached. The Reuters news agency reported that two sources briefed on the mediation between the US and Iran had confirmed the information initially reported by Axios, but the proposal has not been publicly outlined. Speaking during a virtual campaign event on Wednesday evening, Trump told Republicans in the State of Georgia that he was optimistic that the war would end soon. He added that most people understood he was right to deny Iran the opportunity to have a nuclear weapon. Earlier in the day, the president said the US has had "very good talks with Iran in the last 24 hours" and that was deal is possible, emphasising that any hardship caused to Americans - because of high fuel prices - would be short term.

# South Africa condemns 'fake videos' of alleged xenophobic attacks



South Africa's government has condemned the circulation of what it called "fake videos and images" that have been described by some as recordings of attacks on foreign nationals in the country. The call comes as diplomatic tension has increased between South Africa and other African nations following accusations that xenophobic violence is on the rise once again in the country. Ghana's government has written to the African Union

(AU) asking the continental body to discuss the issue, which it says is a "serious risk to the safety and wellbeing" of Africans in South Africa. Nigeria has also raised the issue and has offered to repatriate its nationals amid fears of attacks. Kenya, Malawi, Lesotho and Zimbabwe have also warned its citizens in South Africa to be aware of possible attacks. South Africa responded to Ghana's message saying that it "had nothing to hide".

# RACE TO TRACE PASSENGERS WHO LEFT HANTAVIRUS CRUISE SHIP AT ISLAND

Health authorities are racing to trace dozens of people who disembarked from a hantavirus-hit cruise ship on the island of St Helena in the South Atlantic. The operator of the Dutch vessel said 29 passengers, of at least 12 different nationalities, left the MV Hondius on 24 April. The Dutch government gave a different figure of 40. A 69-year-old Dutch woman who later died in South Africa was among those. Two other people died on the ship, which set sail from southern Argentina a month ago. Their deaths are now under investigation. On Thursday, the World Health Organization (WHO) said five of eight suspected cases of hantavirus were now confirmed. But while it was serious, the WHO said it "assesses the public health risk as



low". The Dutch government said a Swiss national who has since been diagnosed with hantavirus was also one of those who left the cruise at the British Overseas Territory. Another three people - British, Dutch and German nationals - were evacuated from the vessel on Wednesday. The British man has been named as 56-year-old Martin Anstee and is in a stable condition.

with a population of about 4,400 and one hospital. Oceanwide Expeditions said in an update on Thursday that 30 people, including the body of one of the guests who died, had disembarked on 24 April. This included seven British people and six Americans, as well as guests from countries including Canada, Germany, Singapore, Turkey and Switzerland. It added that the first confirmed case of hantavirus was not reported until 4 May and that all guests who disembarked the ship have been contacted by it. Oceanwide Expeditions also said it remained in "close and continual discussion with relevant authorities regarding our exact point of arrival, quarantine and screening procedures for all guests".

# Three women linked to Islamic State arrested in Australia on return from Syria

Three women with links to the jihadist Islamic State (IS) group have been arrested on returning home to Australia following years in detention in Syria. All are Australian citizens. Police said they arrested two of them - Kawsar Abbas, 53, and Zeinab Ahmed, 31 - on arrival in Melbourne. Janai Safar, 32, was arrested after landing in Sydney. A fourth woman in the party, which includes nine children, was not arrested. The group are the subject of heated political debate in Australia, with the government saying it would give them no help to return. The children - thought to be aged from about six to their mid-teens - are to get psycho-

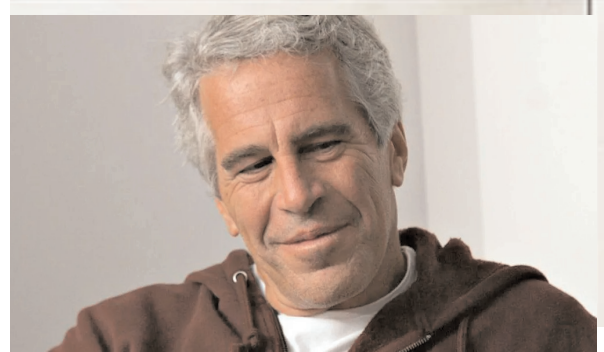


logical support and be assessed for possible radicalisation. Australia is one of a number of countries grappling with how to deal with the return of citizens - and their children - from Syria after the so-called Islamic State caliphate was destroyed in 2019. Tens of

thousands of foreigners, most of them under 18, have been held in life-threatening conditions in IS camps across Syria, human rights groups say. The group that arrived in Melbourne had been held in al-Roj camp since 2019. It included grandmother Kawsar Abbas and

her adult daughter Zeinab Ahmed, reportedly as well as another daughter Zahra Ahmed, and their eight children. Kawsar Abbas is married to Mohammad Ahmad, who ran a charity that Australian police suspect was used to send cash to IS. He denied the accusation in an interview with the national broadcaster ABC in 2019, after it tracked him down to a prison in Syria. Before the Qatar Airways flight carrying the women and children arrived from Doha late on Thursday afternoon, a group of about 15 men dressed predominantly in black had gathered in the international arrivals area of Melbourne airport.

# Fears of renewed Gaza war as Hamas disarmament talks stall

Ceasefire talks between Israel and Hamas have stalled, and Gaza risks sliding back into war. This week an Israeli air strike killed the son of Hamas's leader and chief negotiator Khalil al-Hayya, and Palestinian sources confirmed to the BBC that the two sides had reached a deadlock in negotiations. Israeli media reports suggest Israel is preparing to resume fighting in the Gaza Strip because of the impasse and Hamas's refusal to give up its weapons. "We understood, everyone understood that Hamas would not disarm, and they have followed through on their intentions," Michael Eisenberg, an adviser to the Israeli prime minister, told the



BBC, describing Hamas as "an unrepentant terrorist group". "Nobody in Israel wants to go back to war," he said, but added "all options are on the table right now." Citing unnamed security sources, Israel's Channel 12 News has reported that Washington may give Israel the "green light" to resume "operations". One of the

main options it says Israel is considering is to expand the so-called "Yellow Line" marking some 60% of Gaza that has remained under full Israeli military control during the ceasefire. Locals say this is already happening. Israel insists that Hamas's approach to disarmament is in breach of the ceasefire deal which came

into effect on 10 October. However, Hamas insists that Israel is violating the agreement by failing to meet its humanitarian commitments and continuing deadly attacks. On Wednesday, a Hamas statement called on "the US administration and the guarantor states of the Sharm el-Sheikh [ceasefire] agreement" to "move immediately" to stop Israel's "aggression against the innocent people in Gaza". This came after Israeli air strikes across the Palestinian territory killed at least six people - including a Hamas commander and Azzam al-Hayya, a son of Hamas's top negotiator, Khalil al-Hayya, who has been leading the indirect talks with Israel.

# Superdry co-founder James Holder jailed for rape

Superdry co-founder James Holder has been jailed for eight years for raping a woman in a "despicable piece of sexual violence". The 54-year-old, of Cheltenham, attacked the woman in her flat after a night out in 2022. His victim told Bristol Crown Court he had taken her "choice, dignity and body". Holder, who appeared via video link from prison, showed no emotion as he was sentenced by Recorder David Chidgey, who said the attack was "about your sense of entitlement and your sense of doing what you wanted and your causal disregard for the victim's absolute right to say what she wanted to do with her own body". Holder was



found guilty by a jury of seven men and five women at Gloucester Crown Court, sitting in Cirencester, on Friday. The fashion tycoon, who set up Superdry with Julian Dunkerton in 2003, was on an "impromptu night out" on 6 May 2022 which ended at the woman's flat, the court was told during his trial.

Rahul tried to play an inside-out shot off the spinner but completely misjudged it as Rituraj Gaikwad completed an easy catch. Manjrekar said that Rahul getting dismissed so cheaply is almost like a 'death warrant' for his side and added that in a time where openers score at very high strike rates, Rahul cannot play a knock like 12 off 12 balls. "It's almost like odd and even games, where sometimes he goes after the bowling straightaway, which is the KL Rahul you want. But then he feels like he has earned the right and becomes responsible for the rest of the batters to



come, and then plays an innings like that. Once you get out after getting to 12 off 12, you've signed the death warrant for your team. After those insipid first six overs, DC were done for the game," Manjrekar said on Instagram. "KL Rahul, after playing a brilliant innings in the previous match, got 12 off 12 balls in the first six overs. That's two overs at a strike rate of 100. When you have open-

ers going at 200, you can't have an opener scoring 12 off 12 in the hope that he'll explode later," he added. Rahul has been enjoying a good run of form in the ongoing IPL 2026 and he is third in the Orange Cap race. The veteran batter has slammed 445 runs in 10 matches at an average of 49.44 and a strike rate of 180.89. He has already scored one century and three half-centuries.

The social media users further claimed that the original version of the vlog was later edited and shortened in order to crop out the portions featuring the veteran spinner. The clips went viral on social media and sparked a massive conversation among users. There has been no statement from the player or franchise, and NDTV cannot independently verify the authenticity



of the video or the claims. Look at Yuzvendra Chahal, man. The ongoing IPL 2026 has already witnessed a major vaping controversy after Riyan Parag was found using a vape inside the Rajasthan Royals

Meanwhile, former India off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin termed Riyan Parag's vaping incident during an IPL match as something that could have been avoided, urging young players to be mindful of their actions in public spaces.

## How Kane goal could earn Germany extra Champions League spot



It seemed as if Harry Kane's stoppage-time goal for Bayern Munich on Wednesday was nothing more than a consolation - but it could mean so much more to the Bundesliga. The England captain netted in the 94th minute to earn a 1-1 semi-final second-leg draw against Paris St-Germain, but it was the Ligue 1 side who went through to the Champions League final 6-5 on aggregate. The draw could prove to be absolutely crucial in the battle to gain one of the two European Performance Spots (EPS) - the extra places in the Champions League based on each country's overall performance in Europe. The Premier League is way out in front and claimed one of the two places a month ago. But the battle for second has gone right down to the wire between the

Bundesliga and La Liga. Kane's goal earned Germany 0.142 points towards its coefficient score. That might not seem like much, but in such a close battle it could prove to be the difference. La Liga (21.781) sits in second going into the second legs of the Europa League and Conference League semi-finals on Thursday. The Bundesliga (21.357) is just 0.424 points behind. In real terms, that is a win and a draw. Going into Thursday's games, each league has one team left - Freiburg for Germany and Rayo Vallecano for Spain. Freiburg must overcome a 2-1 deficit at home to Braga, while Rayo Vallecano take a 1-0 lead to Strasbourg. This is how Kane's goal could help to decide it. If Freiburg beat Braga and go through to the final, they will add 0.428 to Germany's score.

## THE AI FITNESS INSTRUCTORS SELLING UNREAL GAINS

If you use social media you've probably seen them - polished fitness videos promising dramatic body transformations in weeks. They show chiselled physiques, striking before-and-after images and claims that you can look years younger by following a simple routine. The results often look too good to be true. In many cases, they are. A BBC investigation has uncovered misleading fitness adverts featuring AI-generated characters that breach UK advertising rules. Many adverts also failed to make clear that the people featured were not real. And why were they doing it To sell a subscrip-



tion to a fitness app. So how easy is it to tell whether the person giving fitness advice exists And does it matter 'Hard to tell who to believe' AI content has flooded social media feeds in the past couple of years, and videos promoting exercise and online fitness programmes are becoming increasingly common. Many of the adverts flagged to the Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) by the BBC featured AI-generated characters claiming to have followed workout programmes themselves.

They also show transformations experts say are scientifically implausible in such short timeframes. The videos promise users they can change their bodies in weeks, "look 20 years younger", or "lose 40lb in one month". Once users engage with exercise or fitness content, algorithms quickly flood their feeds with similar material. Prof Andy Miah, an AI expert from the University of Salford, says the trend is "huge" and those scrolling are drawn in because they are looking for advice. "People are looking for solutions to their health, their fitness, their looks," he says.

## Villa's Staniforth 'at ease' with decision to retire



Aston Villa midfielder Lucy Staniforth says she did not hesitate when making the decision to retire from football at the end of the season. The 33-year-old began her career at Sunderland in 2008 and has gone on to represent seven clubs - the most of any player in the Women's Super League. Staniforth also earned 17 England caps and was twice a losing FA Cup finalist, with Sunderland in 2009 and Bristol Academy in 2013. But having been plagued by injuries, she is ready for life after football.

**Q:** Were there challenges in working with a new cast

Although we had a lot of footage, we edited it sharply into a 90-minute Hollywood-style thriller. We didn’t even feel the need for an interval, but we included one because Indian audiences are accustomed to it. One specific climax scene, where a character is tied up like a mummy, took half a day to shoot and was quite challenging.

**Q:** The film is ready for release. Can you share details about the production journey

Mohan Vadlapatla: Honestly, the

release was slightly delayed because we opted for some reshoots. We also wanted a high-energy promo song choreographed by Bhanu Master. We actually shot two versions and scrapped them before finalizing the third version with him. We shot for three and a half days continuously at Sarathi Studios. Initially, we approached OTT platforms, but they suggested a post-theatrical release strategy. That is how the final shape of the film emerged.

**Q:** What was the main reason for the reshoots

Mohan Vadlapatla: I wasn’t fully satisfied with the first version of the “Who is the Killer” song. I wanted a top-tier choreographer, so we brought Bhanu Master on board. We also had singer Noel perform a rap portion, which turned out brilliantly.

**Q:** Did reshoots escalate the budget

Mohan Vadlapatla: Definitely. We worked through night shifts and used 10 different sets over three and a half days.
