Won't tolerate
demographic changes
in West Bengal, Tripura,
Bihar: Amit Shah



AGARTALA (TSIT): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said the government will not tolerate demographic changes in West Bengal, Tripura and Bihar, asserting that the Centre is taking steps to bridge gaps in guarding the country's borders. Shah, addressing BSP personnel at Lankamura Border Outpost in Tripura, also said that the government's "smart border" project is in the final stage. "Demographic changes in West Bengal, Tripura and Bihar will not be tolerated... The Centre is making all efforts to bridge the gaps in guarding international borders," the home minister said. "The concept of 'smart border' will be implemented in seven to eight places of the country as a pilot project. I request the Union home secretary and the director general of the BSF to visit border areas, and hold talks," he said. The new security grid will include cutting-edge tech, local administration and border sentinels, Shah said.

Portfolio decision in high command's hands: Shivakumar

BENGALURU (TSIT):

Karnataka Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar said on Friday that he had promised senior Minister Ramalinga Reddy the Bengaluru Development portfolio after becoming Chief Minister.

However, he maintained that the decision on portfolio allocation rests with the party's high command. Speaking to the media regarding Reddy's resignation from the ministerial post on Friday, Shivakumar acknowledged the assurance he had given, saying he had told Reddy he would be allotted the Bengaluru Development portfolio. He added that the final decision to allot the Water Resources ministry was taken by the party high command,



which has now allocated the Bengaluru Development portfolio to Krishna Byre Gowda. "I had tried my best and also made efforts in this regard. Let us see what has happened. I will go and speak to him," Shivakumar said. He further said the Water Resources portfolio is also an important department, but Reddy has expressed that he prefers a Bengaluru-based role, as he has built his political career in the city and wants to continue working there.

AI-171 crash probe: Pilots' body flags aircraft messages, engine shutdown logic; seeks fresh technical review

NEW DELHI (TSIT)

Questions over unexplained technical signals, possible electrical disturbances and engine shutdown mechanisms have resurfaced in the AI-171 crash investigation, with Federation of Indian Pilots (FIP) asking Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) to closely examine ACARS (aircraft communications addressing and reporting system) maintenance messages, FADEC fail-safe systems and previously



flagged discrepancies before technical causes are set aside.

In a detailed letter sent to AAIB on Friday, FIP president Capt CS Randhawa referred to newly obtained technical material, including ACARS maintenance

messages reportedly transmitted after take-off, publicly available documents relating to Full Authority Digital Engine Control (FADEC) systems, and previously highlighted concerns around RAT deployment chronology

and said these issues required closer examination as part of the ongoing investigation.

The pilots' body said the submission places on record "ACARS maintenance messages transmitted before after the aircraft got airborne, a design feature in the FADEC that permits auto shutdown of both engines", while linking these issues with earlier concerns regarding electrical disturbances, simulator validation requests and flight-data timelines.

Annamalai quits BJP, Nitin Nabin accepts resignation

BJP National President Nitin Nabin on Friday accepted the resignation submitted by former Tamil Nadu BJP state president K. Annamalai from the primary membership of the party. This was confirmed by Arun Singh, National General Secretary and Headquarters In-charge of the party in a press release.

Revanth challenges KCR to debate BRS, Congress Performance

Telangana Chief Minister A.Revanth Reddy on Friday threw an open challenge to former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhara Rao to participate in a debate on the performance of the 10-year BRS rule and the two-and-a-half-year Congress government in the State Assembly. Addressing a massive public meeting under the "Praja Palana - Pragati Pranalika" programme in Jadcherla, Revanth Reddy said the Congress government was ready to discuss governance, development and welfare initiatives and even apologise if proven wrong.

Chief Minister launched a scathing attack on the previous BRS regime, accusing it of failing to complete major irrigation projects, including the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme. He alleged that loans raised in the name of irrigation projects were misused and that the people of



Palamuru received little benefit despite the expenditure of thousands of crores of rupees.

Revanth Reddy also criticized Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis over the Godavari river water issue, accusing him of playing a "hide-and-seek" game. He said Telangana would continue to press for its rightful share of river waters and vowed to complete the Tummidihatti Barrage despite all obstacles. Highlighting the neglect of the erstwhile Mahabubnagar district during the BRS rule, the Chief Minister said not a single major project was completed

in the region during the previous government's tenure. He recalled that people of Palamuru had overwhelmingly supported KCR and the BRS but were left without irrigation water and development.

Stating that the Congress government is committed to transforming the region, Revanth Reddy said his administration aims to provide irrigation water to 26 lakh acres through the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme. He assured that the government would secure approval for 90 TMC of water for the project and release funds through a special "Green

Channel" mechanism to expedite completion of pending works.

The Chief Minister claimed that while the previous government spent nearly Rs.1 lakh crore on the Kaleshwaram project, it failed to adequately compensate or rehabilitate affected families in Palamuru. In contrast, he said, the Congress government had spent Rs.8,000 crore in the district during the last 30 months on irrigation and development works.

Predicting a political setback for the BRS in the region, Revanth Reddy said the people of Palamuru would ensure the party fails to win even a single Assembly seat in future elections. Reiterating his confidence in the Congress party's future, he declared, "Aur Ek Baar, Congress Sarkar," asserting that Congress would return to power in 2029 and continue governing Telangana until 2034. Chief Minister also highlighted several welfare

initiatives undertaken by the Congress government, including the sanction of 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses, distribution of 15 lakh ration cards, provision of 200 units of free electricity to 50 lakh families and free bus travel for women. He said the government had spent over Rs.10,000 crore on the women's travel scheme alone.

Emphasising the importance of education, Revanth Reddy said the government was developing an education hub in Kodangal and creating opportunities for students in the region to pursue higher education without migrating elsewhere. He urged parents to ensure that their children receive quality education, describing it as the most effective tool for social and economic progress. The Chief Minister asserted that the Congress government remains committed to welfare, irrigation development and inclusive growth across Telangana, particularly in the long-neglected Palamuru region.

'Surat gifted me garbage':

PM Modi turns city's cleanliness drive into message on civic responsibility

SURAT (TSIT):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday praised a city-wide cleanliness campaign in Surat involving more than one lakh people, describing the collected waste as the "most valuable gift" he had received during his visit. Speaking at a public gathering on the World Environment Day, PM Modi said residents had transformed a routine sanitation exercise into a civic movement that reflected the city's commitment to public participation and community responsibility. "You welcomed me, presented various mementoes and gifts. But even more valuable than all these gifts is the priceless gift that Surat has given me. Surat has gifted me garbage," he added. The Prime Minister was referring to a five-day cleanliness campaign conducted ahead of his visit, in which more than one lakh residents reportedly participated. "For me, this is a huge gift," he said, thanking those involved in the initiative. Prime Minister Modi said many people expected visiting leaders to receive ceremonial honours and expensive gifts, but Surat's decision to present the outcome of a cleanliness cam-

paign sent a more meaningful message. "People usually think that a Prime Minister should receive grand gifts during a welcome. But you are taking pride in gifting garbage," he added. According to Prime Minister Modi, the significance of the campaign lay not only in the waste collected but in the scale of public participation. He noted that involvement by more



than one lakh residents effectively represented the participation of more than one lakh families. "This is not merely a cleanliness campaign. It is a cultural festival for a healthy future," he said. The Prime Minister linked the campaign to Surat's long-standing reputation as one of India's cleanest cities.

Top-ranking student's suicide raises questions on welfare systems in corporate colleges

The death of a 17-year-old intermediate student who had secured an exceptional 466 out of 470 marks in his first-year examinations has triggered fresh concerns about student welfare and mental health support systems in Telangana's corporate colleges.

Student, who was residing in the hostel of a Sri Chaitanya campus at Koheda on the outskirts of Hyderabad, was found dead on Wednesday. Police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the incident.

What has particularly shocked fellow students, parents and educators is the fact that the teenager was among the institution's top performers. Having scored 466 marks out of 470 in the first-year examinations, he was expected to begin his second year with strong academic prospects.



democratic prospects.

The apparent contradiction between outstanding academic achievement and the decision to take an extreme step has raised questions about the pressures faced by students in highly competitive educational environments.

Educationists point out that academic performance cannot be the sole indicator of a student's mental and emotional state. They argue that residential colleges have a heightened duty of care, requiring regular counselling, emotional support mechanisms and close monitoring of stu-

dents living away from their families.

The incident has once again brought into focus the accountability of corporate colleges, where intense competition and high expectations often define campus life. Parents' groups and child rights advocates have repeatedly called for mandatory mental health audits, regular interaction between counsellors and students, and greater transparency in hostel management practices.

As investigators seek to determine what led to the tragedy, one question remains unanswered: what drove a student who had achieved near-perfect academic success to take such a drastic step just as a promising second year was about to begin? Until that question is answered, the tragedy is likely to intensify scrutiny of student welfare systems and institutional responsibility in residential educational campuses across the state.

Indian markets trade higher ahead of RBI policy decision

NEW DELHI (TSIT):

Indian equity markets traded higher in the morning session on Friday ahead of a key central bank policy decision as investors awaited cues on how the central bank plans to address inflation and currency pressures amid elevated energy prices driven by geopolitical tensions in West Asia.

Sensex jumped as much as 0.48 per cent or 357 points to 74,717.57, hitting an intra-day high in early trade. Similarly, Nifty was trading 0.42 per cent or 100 points higher at 23,516.

Sector-wise, among the major gainers, the Nifty Media index jumped 1.81 per cent, followed by the Nifty Financial Services index, which rose 0.97 per cent.

In addition, healthcare-related indices remained strong, with Nifty Healthcare and Nifty Pharma gaining up to 0.82 per cent, while Nifty Realty added 0.71 per cent. On the other hand, Nifty Oil & Gas slipped marginally by 0.06 per cent, while Nifty Metal declined 0.60 per cent. IT



and FMCG stocks were largely steady, while PSU banks and private banks posted marginal gains.

Among individual stocks, Wipro, Tata Steel, Trent, Hindalco Industries and Coal India were among the top losers on the Nifty index.

Analysts said there were mild positive indications for the market. "There are signs of weakness in the AI trade in the US, South Korea and Taiwan and rotation away from tech stocks, but it is too early to say whether this will sustain," they said.

If the Reserve Bank of India decides to act with a 25 bps rate hike, banking stocks could see sharp gains as lenders benefit from higher interest rates, experts said. However, they added that a rate hike would be negative for interest-sensitive segments such as automobiles and real estate.

RBI keeps repo rate unchanged at 5.25 percent

NEW DELHI (TSIT):

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday kept the benchmark repo rate unchanged at 5.25 per cent, with Governor Sanjay Malhotra asserting that the Indian economy remains resilient and is better prepared than in the past to deal with rising global uncertainties, supply chain disruptions and geopolitical tensions. Announcing the decisions of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), the Governor said the global economy has been facing heightened uncertainty in recent months due to disruptions in key trade routes, volatility in financial markets and cautious business sentiment.

He noted that the ongoing geopolitical situation in West Asia has led to higher energy prices and supply chain disruptions, creating challenges for economies across the world. "Let me at the outset emphasise that the Indian economy entered this episode of global turbulence with much better fundamentals than in pre-



vious similar episodes. While we remain confident to withstand these shocks with minimum pain, it is important to not only confront and address these challenges but also take them as an opportunity to further enhance resilience," the Governor said.

The six-member MPC unanimously voted to retain the repo rate at 5.25 per cent. Consequently, the Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate remains at 5.0 per cent, while the Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate and the Bank Rate remain at 5.5 per cent. The committee also decided to continue with the neutral stance.

Explaining the rationale behind the decision, the Governor said the committee felt it would be prudent to wait for greater

clarity regarding the duration and intensity of the ongoing geopolitical conflict and its impact on inflation and growth.

While inflation risks have increased, the central bank believes that policy flexibility is necessary amid evolving global conditions. The RBI noted that inflation has remained below the target despite external shocks. Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation stood at 3.4 per cent in March and 3.5 per cent in April 2026. However, the central bank warned that rising crude oil prices, higher input costs and weather-related risks could exert upward pressure on prices in the coming months.

The Governor said the baseline projections indicate inflation may move closer to the upper tolerance band during the third quarter of the current financial year before easing thereafter. He also cautioned that second-round effects through wages and inflation expectations remain a possibility and would require close monitoring.

DCM Pawan Kalyan Launches
Mega Seed Ball Initiative on
World Environment Day

Mamata retains Abhishek Banerjee as Trinamool
general secy, appoints two deputies



Kolkata, June 5 : Former West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee - the Trinamool Congress supremo - on Friday announced her decision to retain her nephew and the party Lok Sabha member, Abhishek Banerjee, as the party's general secretary. However, she also appointed the party's Rajya Sabha members, Derek O'Brien and Dola Sen as deputy general secretaries, which according to political observers, means that Abhishek Banerjee would no more be able to unani-

mously adopt organisational decisions henceforth. At the same time, on Friday, the state unit of Trinamool Congress in West Bengal had been thoroughly reconstituted. The erstwhile state president of the party in West Bengal and veteran party leader, Subrata Bakshi, who had been seeking relief from the post for quite some time because of age-related ailments, has been relieved, and instead the former West Bengal Minister of State for

Finance (independent charge), Chandrima Bhattacharya had been appointed in that post. Party Lok Sabha member, Sajda Ahmed, party Rajya Sabha member, Mamata Bala Thakur and the party legislator, Nay Bandyopadhyay and senior party leader, Swait Khondkar, have been appointed the vice-presidents of the state unit of Trinamool Congress in West Bengal. Babar Ali, Pulak Roy, Ashima Patra, Aroop Biswas and Rajib Banerjee have been appointed as the state general secretaries, out of them Patra is an existing Trinamool Congress legislator. Jyotipriyo Mullick, Dr Rana Chatterjee, Bidish Bose, Trinankur Bhattacharjee, Jaya Dutta, Tapas Chatterjee, Vasundhara Goswamy and Goutam Deb have been appointed as the executive members of the state committee of Trinamool Congress in West Bengal.

KTR demands probe into Rs 1,600
crore 'coal scam' in Singareni

Hyderabad, June 5 : Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) working president K.T. Rama Rao on Friday demanded an immediate and comprehensive investigation into the alleged disappearance of nearly 40 lakh tonnes of coal worth approximately Rs 1,600 crore from Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCL). In a letter addressed to Union Coal Minister G. Kishan Reddy, he questioned how such a massive quantity of coal, officially shown in Singareni's stock records, could have vanished without accountability. KTR, as the BRS leader is popularly known, alleged that coal that should have been available in stockyards was illegally diverted and sold, causing a loss of nearly Rs 1,600 crore to the public sector undertaking. He demanded that the Union Government immediately ascertain the where-



abouts of the missing coal and bring those responsible to justice. He stated that ever since the Congress government assumed office in Telangana, Singareni has become synonymous with a series of scandals. From the Naini coal mine tender controversy to several other alleged irregularities, KTR said there has been no meaningful response from the Centre despite repeated demands from BRS. According to KTR, official records on the Singareni website indicated the availability of

approximately 40 lakh tonnes of coal across multiple mines, including Mandamarri, Srirampur, Ramagundam-I, Ramagundam-II, Bhupalpally, Yellandu and Sathupalli. However, physical verification reportedly revealed that the coal stocks were not available at the designated locations. He pointed out that despite records showing payment of coal cess and income tax on these stocks, the actual coal was allegedly missing from the ground. KTR questioned who was responsi-

ble for this discrepancy and why neither officials from the Union Coal Ministry nor the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) had conducted inspections so far. "The coal of Singareni belongs to the people of Telangana. Both the State and Central Governments are collectively endangering the future of this institution," KTR said. He further alleged that if there is no tacit understanding between Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Union Minister Kishan Reddy, the Centre should immediately order a thorough investigation and take stringent action against those responsible. Demanding transparency, KTR called upon the Union Government to send an all-party delegation to the concerned mines and stockyards for on-ground verification. He said such an exercise would expose the large-scale irregularities alleged-

edly taking place in Singareni. Referring to the earlier Naini coal mine tender controversy, KTR alleged that the Congress government introduced conditions such as mandatory site-visit certificates to favour select bidders. He claimed that despite BRS exposing the issue, no meaningful action had been taken against those involved. KTR also raised concerns regarding alleged irregularities in solar power tenders, diesel procurement, explosive purchases, diversion of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds and the alleged misuse of Singareni funds for non-core activities. He accused both the Congress and the BJP of protecting those involved in various irregularities and demanded a judicial inquiry headed by a sitting judge into the Rs 1,600 crore coal scam.

I will speak to Ramalinga Reddy about his resignation: CM Shivakumar

Bengaluru: Karnataka Chief Minister D. K. Shivakumar on Thursday said he would personally speak to senior Congress leader Ramalinga Reddy regarding his resignation and address the concerns raised by him.

Water Resources Ministry, but he wishes to work in the urban region.” Shivakumar

said.Responding to questions about resignations by some party workers and activists, the Chief

Minister stressed the importance of maintaining discipline within the party. “Whatever the situation, discipline is very important,” he remarked.

Earlier in the day, Shivakumar visited the temple of Annamma Devi, regarded as the guardian deity of Bengaluru. After offering prayers, he said he had sought blessings for good rainfall, a prosperous agricultural season, peace, and overall development in the state.

He also noted that while Annamma Devi is considered Bengaluru's village deity, Chamundi is revered as the state's guardian deity. The Chief Minister said he had begun his official work after seeking the blessings of the deities.

66 Complaints Received During Phone-in Programme; Commissioner Directs Officials for Prompt Resolution – Pommala Sunil Kumar

Bengaluru : A Phone-in Programme was organized today from 7:00 AM at the office of the Commissioner, Bengaluru North City Corporation, located on Amruthahalli Main Road, with the objective of listening to citizens' grievances and ensuring their prompt resolution. During the programme, BNCC Commissioner Pommala Sunil Kumar personally heard various complaints raised by citizens and directed the concerned officials to examine the issues on priority and take immediate steps for their resolution.

A total of 56 calls were received, resulting in the registration of 66 complaints. The majority of the grievances were related to road maintenance and



solid waste management. Complaints pertaining to forest-related issues, veterinary services, e-Khata services, electrical works,

public health, and maintenance of parks and playgrounds were also received.

As a significant number of complaints were related to road maintenance and solid waste management, the Commissioner instructed the concerned officials to conduct site inspections and initiate urgent remedial measures.

Progress of the Phone-in Programme

Since the launch of the Phone-in Programme on September 26, 2025, BNCC has received a total of 1,704 calls, resulting in the registration of 2,182 complaints.

Out of these, 1,675 complaints have been resolved. Eight complaints are currently under progress, while 113 complaints pertain to other departments and agencies outside

BNCC's jurisdiction. Thirty-two complaints have been reopened for further action, and officials have been directed to ensure the early disposal of the 348 pending complaints, including those received.

The Commissioner stated that the Phone-in Programme, conducted every Friday, has been receiving encouraging public participation and has emerged as an effective platform for addressing citizens' grievances directly. He reiterated BNCC's commitment to ensuring prompt response and resolution of public issues. The programme was attended by Superintending Engineers, Executive Engineers and officials from various departments.

Congress Rebellion Erupts Even Before New Poster Release: Opposition Leader R. Ashok

DISSATISFACTION AMONG ALL MINISTERS, CM GOES BACK ON HIS WORD

Bengaluru : Even before the release of the new poster for CM D.K. Shivakumar's old film, a rebellion has begun within the Congress party. Just three days after the oath-taking ceremony, the party has split into three factions, said Opposition Leader R. Ashok.

Speaking to reporters, he said: CM D.K. Shivakumar had promised the Bengaluru Urban Development Department to Ramalinga Reddy, but has now gone back on his word. That is why he has resigned. There is nothing wrong in a senior leader like Ramalinga Reddy, who has vast experience in Bengaluru, asking for it. However, CMD K. Shivakumar has already shown his habit of breaking promises given at the very



beginning. He had promised to make Satish Jarkiholi the KPCC President. H.K. Patil has also expressed displeasure over this. The government is now in no position to

give proper replies to the Opposition in the Assembly. A capable ruling party has vanished and everything has become zero. We no longer know with whom we should hold discussions. CM D.K. Shivakumar has no control over his cabinet, he said. In the meantime, K.H. Muniyappa has also expressed his dissatisfaction. Everyone is saying that injustice has been done in the allocation of portfolios. With just one-and-a-half years left for the elections, the rebellion has already started and it is going to turn into a volcano. It is not known how many more ministers will issue such threats. Along with this, new guarantees have been announced. Rs.3,000 crore in pending pensions has to be paid. In such a situation, it is

impossible to launch new schemes, he said.

CM D.K. Shivakumar is only indulging in showmanship. He talks about ‘Brand Bengaluru’ and making it a world-class city, but has done nothing in three years. Bengaluru has now become a city of potholes and garbage. Everyone is laughing at the formation of a ‘Rowdy Suppression Squad’. Is it possible for B.K. Hariprasad and D.K. Shivakumar to control rowdies? No one will believe this. D.K. Shivakumar has become CM only to collect money for Rahul Gandhi. With so much chaos, a mid-term election is certain. Even if the 2028 election is held, there will be no unity in the Congress, he said.

Criminal Case Against Educational Institution That Started Admissions Against Government Orders: Warning from School Education Department Officials

Bengaluru: The School Education Department has warned that a criminal case will be filed against the Jamia Mohammadiya Mansoor Educational Institution in Thanisandra if it does not immediately stop the admission process for Classes 6 to 8 for the academic year 2026-27, which was allegedly started without government approval and in disregard of court orders.In this regard, the School Education Department has issued a second notice to the institution, expressing concern over repeated violations of rules and directing it to immediately halt the admission process.

A complaint had been filed with the Education Department by Abdul Rahim against the institution's management. Based on the complaint, the Block Education Officer (BEO) of K.R. Puram issued the notice.The notice states that The Al Jamia Mohammadi Education Society, owned



from Mumbai, has illegally published advertisements inviting admissions for Classes 6 to 8 under the State Syllabus. Under Sections 30 and 31 of the Education Act and Rule 36, schools conducting the State curriculum must obtain registration and official recognition before operating.

However, it was found that under the name Jamia Mohammadiya Mansoor, admissions were being conducted for both religious education and State syllabus education from June without obtaining the necessary permissions from the department as required under the

Education Act and rules.

The department has ordered the institution to immediately withdraw the advertisement. Failing this, the institution will be treated as an unauthorized school, and criminal proceedings will be initiated against the management and administrative authorities in accordance with the law, the notice states.In his complaint, Abdul Rahim also alleged that the management is not respecting the orders of the High Court. He requested that the madrasa be shut down and that the future of innocent children be protected.

*Panic In Silicon Valley:
Why 15,000 Indians Fled
US Last Year - With More
On Their Way*

A US-based Indian tech engineer's post on Reddit went viral late last month, in which the user claimed to have applied for more than 1,500 jobs over the previous few months without receiving a single call. The data engineer, who's been on an H-1B visa for the past three years, wrote, "Unfortunately, my current company has decided not to renew my H-1B application." This prompted other Indians in similar situations in the US to share their experiences and confirm how widespread and serious the job issue has become for Indian professionals there.

Each year, the US issues 85,000 three-year H-1B visas to foreign nationals, and the vast majority have gone to Indians. This visa - a work permit for highly skilled professionals - can be renewed for a further three years at the employer's request, leading to a green card and, eventually, US citizenship. In 2025, about 78% of H-1B visas went to Indians, up seven percentage points from 2024. Most top leaders in America's tech industry have taken this route, including the world's richest man, Elon Musk, Microsoft Chief Satya Nadella, Google's CEO, Sundar Pichai, and Jayshree Ullas, the CEO of cloud networking company Arista Networks. One can't blame young Indian professionals for aspiring to follow in the footsteps of these tech icons. But many young and mid-level engineers and other professionals are now facing a difficult period of job uncertainty, driven by the Trump administration's tough immigration policies, tech giants' growing embrace of AI, corporate restructuring, and a weakening economy. Hundreds of Indian tech engineers have already lost their jobs, and many more are at risk, with disastrous consequences for their families in the US and their dependents in India. More than 15,000 Indian tech professionals returned home from the US in 2025, and 7,300 have already returned this year, according to the tech hiring and consulting firm Xpheno. The company told NDTV that the situation is worsening and that recent H-1B visa moves in the US could result in the number of returnees surpassing the number of Indian tech professionals moving to the US. Indian techies are "stepping away from the American dream", the company added.

Trump Shocker

In September 2025, President Trump stunned the tech world and lakhs of Indians by announcing a 50-fold increase in the H-1B visa fee to \$100,000. He claimed the new fee was necessary to prevent abuse of the programme, saying that some American companies were undercutting US workers' wages by hiring lower-paid foreign workers. This has been a common complaint among members of Trump's MAGA base, who accuse Indians of taking American jobs. Trump insisted that the \$100,000 fee would compel US companies to hire Americans rather than foreigners. While the steep hike may help some companies hire locally, most foreigners, such as Indians, are hired for their superior skills. This has created resentment and envy among some Americans. But there is evidence that Indians help boost Americans' job prospects. A 2024 study by the non-profit IZA Institute of Labor Economics in the US found that H-1B workers actually "help firms increase their employment.

How long will the husband continue to use the rights of Sarpanchs and Councillors?

Democracy in India is deeply rooted not only in Parliament, the Legislative Assembly, and larger political forums, but also in the local institutions of villages, towns, and cities. Panchayats and municipal bodies are the smallest but most vibrant units of democracy, where the public participates in governance through their direct representatives. To increase women's participation in these institutions, the Constitution provided for reservations so that they are not confined to the domestic sphere but can play an active role in the decision-making process. However, the harsh reality today is that in many places, women Sarpanchs and women Councillors are merely nominal representatives, while their husbands or male family members handle the actual work. This situation gives rise to terms like "Sarpanch Pati" and "Councillor Pati."

This question is not merely a formality, but one that touches the very essence of democracy. When a woman is elected to office, it is backed by public trust, constitutional rights, and political participation. If someone else makes decisions, participates in meetings, or performs administrative duties in her place, it is an affront to the mandate given by the voters. Allowing a man to exercise power in the name of a female representative not only violates democratic norms but also undermines the very spirit of the reservation policy. The 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendments gave a new dimension to local self-governance in India. These amendments ensured reservation for women in Panchayats and municipal bodies. The objective was to ensure that women were not merely visible in Panchayats as a number, but

rather participated in leadership, administration, planning, and policy implementation. This brought millions of women into local politics, many of whom demonstrated exceptional ability, sensitivity, and public relations skills. Many women Sarpanchs accomplished remarkable work in areas such as water, sanitation, education, health, and social justice. This also proved that, given the opportunity, women are in no way inferior to men. Yet, it is also true that the broader social structure remains patriarchal. In villages, especially in many areas of North India, women lack sufficient social acceptance to participate freely in public life. Even with education, they often refrain from making decisions due to traditional pressures, family control, and fear. In some places, after marriage, the political identity of a female representative virtually disappears, and her husband takes her place. As a result, her constitutional rights remain on paper, but in practice, those rights are transferred to the male members of the family. This is a matter of serious concern for a democratic system.

The root of the problem is not merely personal, but also social and institutional. In many families, the mindset has developed that the position of a female representative is essentially a "family position" to be held by the husband or father-in-law. People who think this way forget that an elected position is held by an individual, not a family. Legally, the officeholder is the one elected by the people. If someone else begins making decisions on their behalf, it violates the concept of representative governance. This not only limits women's freedom but also sends a negative message to future generations of female leaders.

The Haryana State Information Commission's comments on this issue are particularly significant. The Commission clearly stated that it is wrong for women Sarpanchs' husbands to participate in government meetings or administrative work in their place. This statement not only reflects administrative rigidity, but also points to the fact that women's reservation still needs to be implemented seriously. If the powers of elected representatives are being

delegated to someone else, then what is the meaning of the electoral process? The Commission's comments have brought back into the national discourse the debate: are we truly empowering women, or merely using their name?

Many argue that rural women are often uneducated, inexperienced, or under social pressure, so their husbands take over administrative tasks. This argument may be partially correct, but it is not a solution to the problem. It is not fair to take away a woman's rights because of her weakness. If a woman is uneducated, she should be educated. If she lacks administrative experience, she should be trained. If there is social pressure, society and the administration should provide her with protection and support. The solution to the problem is not power transfer, but empowerment.

This is where the role of the state and society becomes crucial. The government must ensure that elected women representatives are properly educated on procedures, financial management, laws, Gram Sabha operations, development plans, and grievance redressal. Simply holding elections and leaving it at that is not enough. If women receive regular training, guidance, and institutional support, they can confidently lead. Training programs for women Sarpanchs have been conducted in several states, and these have yielded positive results. This clearly demonstrates that women are capable of leadership; they simply need the opportunity and the environment.

But administrative measures alone will not suffice. Until societal thinking changes, the culture of "Sarpanch Pati" (Sarpanch Pati) and "Parshad Pati" (Councilor's Husband) will persist. In villages and small towns, political power is often associated with male dominance. Women hold positions, but are not allowed to have the final say in decisions. Sometimes, even though they are present in meetings, it is their husband who speaks. Sometimes, even officials find it more convenient to communicate with their husbands rather than with female representatives. This convenience is detrimental to democracy, as it implicitly legitimizes wrongdoing.

Political representation isn't just about sitting on a chair. It involves understanding public issues, setting priorities, equitably distributing resources, and maintaining accountability. When a man replaces a female representative, the woman's political identity is diminished. The long-term impact is that the perception in society that women are unsuitable for leadership is reinforced. The reality is that women can provide more sensitive, practical, and public-oriented leadership. Numerous studies and local experiences show that women's leadership often increases transparency and social concerns. It must also be remembered that women's reservation is not the result of any mercy or grace. It is a constitutional measure to balance historical injustice. For centuries, women were excluded from politics, public life, and property-related decisions. They were confined to the confines of family and home. Reservation is an attempt to mitigate this inequality. Therefore, if male control continues in the name of reservation, it is tantamount to perpetuating historical injustice. In fact, the culture of "Sarpanch Pati" undermines the achievement of reservation.

In this context, it is also essential that the presence of elected women representatives be accepted as mandatory in meetings with elected women representatives. The administration should establish a clear rule that no one can participate in any government proceedings, meetings, documentation, or decision-making in place of the representative. This is not just a matter of discipline, but of constitutional decorum. If officials themselves adhere to this rule, bad practices will be weakened. Furthermore, accountability should be fixed for the absence of public representatives, to curb the practice of nominal participation. Women's empowerment doesn't come merely from speeches, slogans, or symbolic ceremonies. It is realized when women have the freedom to make decisions, speak out, express dissent, and lead. If a woman sarpanch can decide on her village's plans, roads, water supply, schools, and sanitation, she can become not just a representative but an agent of change. This change is strengthened when society

recognizes her rights. The family's role should be supportive, not controlling. The husband can be supportive, but not a representative.

The need today is to empower women representatives not just to win elections, but to empower them with skills in the actual processes of governance. Special capacity-building programs, legal literacy campaigns, digital training, and financial management education should be mandatory for women leaders in panchayats and municipal bodies. Simultaneously, a gender-equal mindset must be fostered in society. Schools, colleges, the media, and local forums should consistently convey the message that women's leadership is the norm, not the exception. The media also has a responsibility on this issue. When newspapers and news channels use terms like "Sarpanch Pati," they not only describe a practice but also highlight a social ill. Instead of superficial reporting, the media should engage in responsible discussion on this issue. They should show how women can become active in administration, the obstacles they face, and the policy reforms needed. This will shape public opinion and increase the likelihood of reform.

Ultimately, this question isn't just about women, but about the quality of democracy itself. If elected positions are held by unelected individuals, what meaning does the will of the people hold? If the rights of women representatives continue to be held by men, the constitutional declaration of equality will remain merely on paper. Therefore, the time has come to strictly curb the practices of "Sarpanch Pati" and "Parshad Pati." Women must have real power, not just nominal power. Only then will panchayats, municipal bodies, and local governments become truly democratic. The true test of democracy lies not in election results, but in the independent functioning of elected representatives. Only when women Sarpanchs exercise their rights, when women councillors express their views, and when the administration communicates directly with them, can we say that women's empowerment has truly taken shape in India.

Partnerships That Deliver:

India and Denmark's Collaboration on Environment in Action

In global development, partnerships are often spoken of as enablers. In practice, they tend to follow policy, supporting programmes that are already defined. The India-Denmark Green Strategic Partnership offers a different proposition: what if partnerships are not downstream of policy, but foundational to how it is shaped, delivered and sustained? As the world marks World Environment Day 2026, this question is particularly relevant for the water sector, where the gap between infrastructure creation and long-term service delivery continues to challenge even the most ambitious programmes.

At its core, the India and Denmark partnership is not organised around projects, but around systems thinking. It brings together Denmark's experience of managing water as a regulated, efficiency-driven public service with India's scale and urgency of delivery. Crucially, it is designed to operate across levels like policy, institutions and implementation, rather than being confined to any one layer. This architecture matters because water governance failures rarely stem from a single point of weakness. They emerge from fragmentation: between planning and execution, between infrastructure and maintenance, and between users and providers.

The partnership attempts to close these gaps.



Through institutions such as the Danish Environmental Protection Agency, Denmark contributes more than technical inputs. It brings a regulatory and operational perspective where service delivery is continuously monitored, efficiency is measured, and sustainability is embedded in decision-making. These are precisely the dimensions that become critical once large-scale infrastructure has been created. Equally important is the role of the United Nations Office for Project Services, which acts not as an external implementer, but as a bridge between global knowledge and local systems. Its work lies in translating high-level principles into institutional practices, adapting them to the realities of village-level governance, resource constraints and varying state capacities. This dual structure, global expertise combined with grounded implementation, gives the partnership its operational depth. It is

within this enabling framework that India's Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) can be better understood, not simply as a national scheme, but as a platform where partnership-led approaches are being applied at scale. JJM's achievements in expanding rural water access are widely recognised. But its longer-term significance lies in how it has been designed: decentralised planning, community-managed systems, and an explicit focus on service delivery rather than one-time asset creation. These design choices align closely with the principles underpinning the India-Denmark partnership, and it is this alignment that allows the partnership to add value beyond incremental support. For instance, knowledge exchanges under the partnership, on groundwater management, energy efficiency, water quality monitoring and data use, are not standalone activities. They feed directly into how water systems are

planned and operated within the Jal Jeevan Mission. Similarly, peer-to-peer engagements between Indian states and Danish utilities are helping shift the focus from building infrastructure to managing services over time. The real test of this alignment, however, lies in implementation. Here, collaboration between UNOPS India and the Government of Denmark plays a critical role in providing implementation support to specific areas under the Green Strategic Partnership. By working through Gram Panchayats and Village Water and Sanitation Committees, it strengthens the very institutions responsible for sustaining water systems. This includes supporting Village Action Plans, building operational capacities, and introducing structured approaches to monitoring and maintenance. What emerges is not a parallel system, but a reinforcement of existing ones.

Malviya Nagar fire tragedy:

Accountability and reform, not compensation, will save lives



A massive fire broke out in a hotel in Malviya Nagar, Delhi, on June 3, 2026, shocking the entire nation. The tragic incident, which claimed the lives of twenty-one people and injured many more, stunned not only the capital but the entire nation. People were seen jumping from high-rise buildings to escape the flames. The scenes broadcast on social media and the news media were deeply traumatic for any sensitive individual. This was not just an accident; it was a horrific testament to the failure of the system designed to ensure the safety of citizens. Every major accident is followed by a few days of mourning, condolences, investigations, and announcements of compensation. Then, the matter gradually fades from public memory. But the Malviya Nagar tragedy is not something to be simply condoled and forgotten. It points to deep structural flaws that have become more dangerous with the rapid urbanization of India's metropolitan cities. This accident forces us to ask—are our buildings truly safe? Are fire safety regulations limited to paper only? And is the role of the administration limited to distributing relief after an accident? In the event of a fire in any multi-story building, the most important elements are safe exits, firefighting equipment, and timely rescue. If people inside a building have to jump from win-

dows and balconies to save their lives, it indicates a complete failure of the security system. Fire not only destroys the building, it also exposes the reality of safety claims and administrative preparedness. This is what happened in the Malviya Nagar incident. According to preliminary information, several foreign nationals were also staying at the hotel. This fact makes the tragedy even more serious. India's capital welcomes tourists, businessmen, and investors from around the world. If security standards in the capital are so poor that even foreign nationals feel unsafe, it not only represents a failure of the local administration but also a question mark on the country's international image. A modern metropolis is not defined solely by tall buildings and glitzy hotels, but by the security and disaster management systems in place.

Following the incident, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta expressed condolences and announced financial assistance for the deceased and injured. Such condolences are necessary, and the families of the victims deserve support in this time of crisis. But it is equally true that compensation cannot bring back a lost life. Financial assistance cannot lessen the intensity of grief. A family member, a child's father, a parent's child, or a person's spouse cannot be replaced by a single sum of money. Therefore, the real question is not one of compensation, but of prevention. The Delhi Police filing an FIR against the hotel owner under sections related to culpable homicide not amounting to murder indicates that investigating agencies are not treating this incident as a mere accident. If safety regulations were ignored, fire safety standards were not followed, or building construction rules were violated, this is not merely an administrative error but criminal negligence. Fixing responsibility in such cases is crucial, as in the

absence of accountability, rules become mere formalities.

But the fault can't lie solely with the building owner. We also need to examine where the inspection officials were. Were fire safety certificates renewed in a timely manner? Did any inspections uncover deficiencies? If so, why wasn't action taken? If not, were the inspections conducted properly? Answers to these questions are essential not only for this case, but for understanding the functioning of the entire city administration.

Most of India's metropolitan cities today grapple with the problem of haphazard urbanization. Narrow streets, illegal construction, overcrowding, parking chaos, and disregard for safety standards have become common sights in almost every city. These shortcomings go unnoticed as long as everything remains normal. But as soon as a disaster strikes, these shortcomings prove fatal. The difficulties faced by fire engines in navigating the narrow streets of Malviya Nagar once again highlighted the serious lack of coordination between urban planning and disaster management.

Delhi is not alone. Mumbai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad, and other metropolitan cities face similar challenges. Many buildings either lack fire extinguishers or have not been inspected for years. Emergency exits are often blocked. Many commercial establishments compromise safety standards to maximize profits. Sadly, even the administration often remains indifferent to these violations.

Fire safety isn't just a technical matter of building construction; it's fundamental to protecting civilian life. In developed countries, violating fire safety regulations is considered a serious offense. Regular inspections, mandatory mock drills, and strict penalties are enforced. India also has regulations, but the problem lies in their effective implementation.

RBI maintains repo rate at 5.25 pc, flags global risks

Mumbai: The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) on Friday unanimously decided to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 5.25 per cent, in line with the expectations from economists. The Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate was set at 5 per cent, while the Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate and the bank rate stood at 5.5 per cent. Announcing the decision of the second bi-monthly monetary policy meeting for FY27, held from June 3-June 5, RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra said the MPC had undertaken a detailed assessment of evolving macroeconomic and financial conditions before voting unanimously to leave the policy repo rate under the Liquidity Adjustment Facility (LAF) unchanged at 5.25 per cent. Malhotra said while the economy remains resilient, incipient stress in certain segments exists and there are considerable risks surrounding both inflation and growth assessments.

GDP growth forecast
The RBI revised its real GDP growth forecast for FY27 to 6.6 per cent, down from the earlier



projection of 6.9 per cent, reflecting the impact of heightened global uncertainty, geopolitical tensions, supply chain disruptions, and rising energy prices. The governor also expressed confidence that services exports will remain resilient despite global uncertainties and highlighted that the government has taken measures to help the economy cope with external shocks. He said external factors continue to pose downside risks to the growth outlook amid elevated geopolitical tensions and global uncertainty. On the inflation front, he noted that fuel inflation remained muted in March and April, while core inflation was stable at 3.7 per

cent during the two months. On inflation, the governor said CPI inflation remains low at present, though baseline projections indicate that inflation could move closer to the upper tolerance band in the third quarter. He cautioned that the outlook remains clouded by the forecast of a sub-normal monsoon and the possible emergence of El Nino conditions.

On private consumption
The RBI governor also said that private consumption remains supportive of growth, aided by resilient discretionary spending, while merchandise exports have continued to register growth despite the ongoing geopoliti-

cal conflict. However, he noted that the impact of rising cost pressures is becoming increasingly visible across sectors. The six-member MPC unanimously voted to keep the repo rate unchanged, while Governor Sanjay Malhotra highlighted global uncertainties linked to the Iran conflict. The Reserve Bank of India's decision to keep the repo rate unchanged at 5.25% reflects a cautious approach toward inflation and liquidity management. For the Indian crypto market, this signals stability rather than a fresh catalyst for risk-taking. When borrowing costs remain elevated and liquidity is tightly managed, retail investors typically become more selective with their investments, prioritizing capital preservation over aggressive speculation. As a result, crypto participation often shifts from short-term trading toward disciplined accumulation through long-term holding strategies.

Historically, lower interest rates have encouraged flows into risk assets such as equities and cryptocurrencies by reducing returns from traditional savings products.

However, India's crypto market operates within a unique framework shaped by stringent taxation and evolving regulations. This means monetary policy alone is not the primary driver of adoption. Instead, investor confidence increasingly depends on regulatory clarity, compliance standards, and long-term innovation. Going forward, the ecosystem is likely to mature through greater institutional participation, stronger investor education, and the gradual integration of blockchain-based financial infrastructure. "RBI's Monetary Policy announcements are broadly on expected lines. Given the global conditions, the Central Bank has acted with prudence to wait and assess economic impact before taking concrete rate actions. At the same time, a host of measures announced to boost forex inflow, including liberalisation of norms and expanding the universe of specified securities for FPI investment in government securities, raising the limit for investments by NRIs in equity instruments, along with tax relief measures for foreign investors announced overnight.

MG MOTOR INDIA INSTALLS 1,000 EV CHARGERS AT OVER 470 SITES



Mumbai: JSW MG Motor India on Friday said it has installed 1,000 community chargers under the 'MG Charge initiative' at more than 470 sites across the country, making it the first original equipment maker to build electric vehicle community charging infrastructure at this scale. The installations span residential societies, condominiums, hospitals, campuses, hotels and industrial parks, the company said. It views India's sustainability journey as one that can be driven by multiple technologies, the company added. The carmaker also said it is preparing an aggressive product lineup for the current calendar year, with

three new energy vehicles (NEVs) slated for launch, including the introduction of plug-in hybrid technology. JSW MG Motor India utilises more than 78 per cent renewable energy at its manufacturing plant in Halol, Gujarat, in line with the central government's vision, it said. The plant meets nearly 95 per cent of its total power requirements through renewable energy sources, the company said. The charging points have been deployed at residential societies, hospitals, educational campuses, hotels, industrial parks and other community locations under the company's charging network initiative. The automaker also said

its electric vehicles have cumulatively covered more than 290 crore kilometres on Indian roads, which it estimates has helped avoid around 4.17 lakh metric tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions. Separately, the company said it plans to introduce three new energy vehicles (NEVs) in calendar year 2026, including models equipped with plug-in hybrid technology. At its manufacturing facility in Halol, Gujarat, the company said renewable sources account for nearly 95 per cent of total power consumption, while more than 78 per cent of the energy used at the plant comes from renewable sources.

India's Q4 GDP expands 7.8 pc, taking full year growth to 7.7 pc

New Delhi: India's economy grew at a higher pace of 7.7 per cent during 2025-26 as compared to 7.1 per cent in 2024-25, according to government data released on Friday. In the January-March period of the 2025-26 fiscal year, the gross domestic product (GDP) is estimated to grow 7.8 per cent, the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MoSPI) said. "Real GDP or GDP at Constant Prices is estimated to attain a level of Rs 323.12 lakh crore in the 2025-26, against the First Revised Estimate (FRE) of GDP for 2024-25 of Rs 299.89 lakh crore," it said. Nominal GDP, or GDP at current prices, has been estimated to attain a level of Rs 346.36 lakh crore in 2025-26, against Rs 318.07 lakh crore in 2024-25, showing a growth rate of 8.9 per cent. India can return to 7 pc growth path in FY28 on macro stability, supply measures: CEA

economic activity. "We have no reason to second-guess them (RBI forecast) at this point, because there are both possibilities on the upside and on the downside with respect to the numbers that they have presented," he said here. "So, even if the growth were to slip below 7 per cent as the RBI forecast suggests...macro stability measures and supply assurances will bring us back to a 7 per cent plus growth track in FY28 or as soon as external

conditions improve," he said. He further said it is a hope based on the assumption that the pre-February 28 condition is restored before FY28. "The good news is that the nominal GDP growth will be significantly higher than the number which the budget estimates used, which is 10.1 per cent for the current financial year," he said. Overall trade deficit widened in FY26 With regard to the overall trade deficit, Nageswaran said it widened in FY26, and a similar trend with potentially wider deficits is possible in FY27. The evolving West Asia crisis represents both a significant supply shock and a potential demand shock, he said. However, he said, most high-frequency indicators up to April 2026 suggest that domestic demand and overall economic activity in India have remained relatively resilient so far, with emerging signs of stress. Supply-side price pressures are beginning to emerge in wholesale inflation, he said.

96 US unicorns founded by India-born entrepreneurs: Study

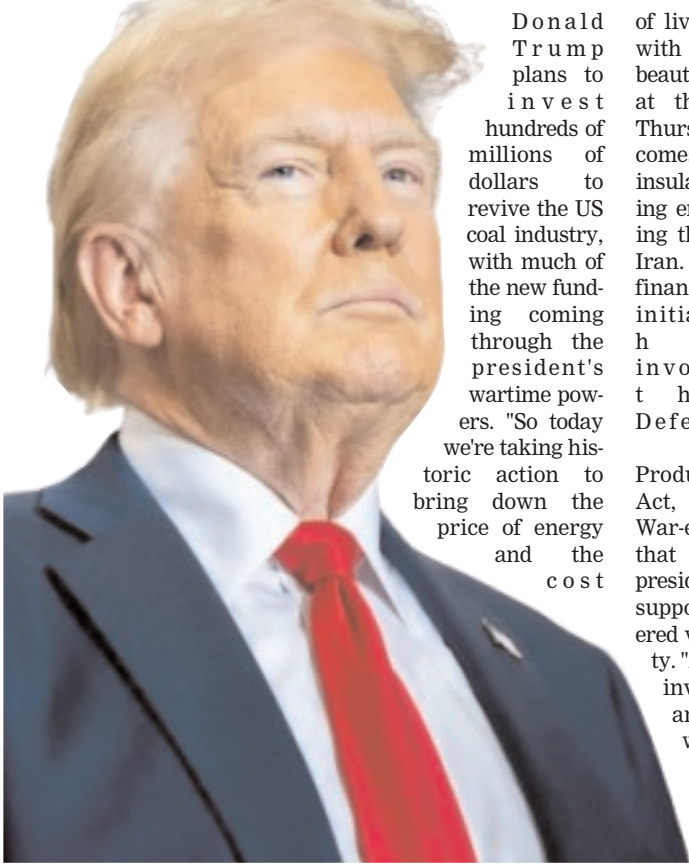
Washington: Indian-born entrepreneurs account for the largest group of immigrant founders of billion-dollar companies, or unicorns, in the US, according to a new study by the National Foundation for American Policy (NFAP). The US-based non-profit organisation found that 96 American unicorns were founded or co-founded by entrepreneurs of Indian origin. Among them is Perplexity AI, co-founded by Aravind Srinivas, which ranks 12th with a valuation of USD 20 billion. According to the study, India tops the list of countries of origin for immigrant founders of US unicorns with 96 companies, followed by Israel (60 unicorns), the United Kingdom (47), China (41), Canada (30), Russia (23), France (21), Germany (18), Ukraine (16), Australia (14), Pakistan (10), and Romania (10). The NFAP study, titled "Immigrants and US Billion-dollar Companies" and authored by Stuart



Anderson, found that immigrants have founded or co-founded 59 per cent (455 of 775) of America's privately held startup unicorns. The research found that the privately held US billion-dollar startups with immigrant founders have created an average of 833 jobs per company. Approximately two-thirds (66 per cent) of unicorns were founded or co-founded by immigrants or the children of immigrants. Nearly 80 per cent of US unicorns have either an immigrant founder or an immigrant in a key leadership role, such as CEO or vice

president of engineering. The NFAP study found that at least 15 immigrants, including Elon Musk, have founded two or more unicorns. Six Indian-origin founders - Mohit Aron, Jyoti Bansal, Ashutosh Garg, Arvind Jain, Sachin Nayyar, and Ajeet Singh - have made it to the coveted list. Lebanese-born entrepreneur Noubar Afeyan has founded five companies that achieved valuations of USD 1 billion or more, including Moderna, Indigo Ag, Generate Biomedicines, Tessera Therapeutics, and Lila Sciences.

Trump announces \$700m coal investment using wartime powers



Donald Trump plans to invest hundreds of millions of dollars to revive the US coal industry, with much of the new funding coming through the president's wartime powers. "So today we're taking historic action to bring down the price of energy and the cost

of living for all Americans with the power of clean, beautiful coal," Trump said at the White House on Thursday. The investment comes as Trump seeks to insulate Americans from rising energy costs following the war with Iran. To finance the initiative, he invoked the Defense

Production Act, a Cold War-era law that grants the president broad authority to support industries considered vital to national security. "As a result of the \$700m investment that I'm announcing today, we will protect 14 coal plants and 42 coalmines, a tremendous number, and build two new coal

plants and one massive new export terminal," Trump said. The president said \$500m (£372m) of federal funds will go towards saving 14 existing coal plants and opening a new export terminal in California. The Department of Energy will grant a further \$200m to build new coal plants in Alaska and West Virginia, the first new plants in the US since 2013. Trump said that the construction of a coal export terminal in Oakland, California will create more than 1,400 jobs, with the total package supporting around 14,000. The coal plants getting Trump's investment are in Kentucky, North Carolina, Indiana, Tennessee, Arkansas, Arizona, Oklahoma, North Dakota, Wisconsin and West

Virginia. The president argued that successful countries rely on coal before criticising what he called "failure countries" for investing in renewable energy sources such as wind power. Trump said his coal investment plans would save American consumers \$50bn in new energy generation costs which otherwise would have been passed on in higher bills. The war with Iran and the closure of the Strait of Hormuz, a critical shipping route that carries around a fifth of global oil and gas supplies, have pushed energy prices higher, driving up costs for consumers. The average price of a gallon of petrol in the US stood at \$4.24 on Thursday, according to the AAA motoring group. That is up from \$2.98 on the day the US and Israel began striking Iran. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), overall energy prices for consumers rose by 17.9% in the year to April.



Ukraine strikes cargo ships and admits Romania drone blast as Putin prepares for key speech

Ukraine says it has struck five ships carrying illegal cargo in the Sea of Azov and in coastal waters of Russian-occupied territories. The Ukrainian drone forces commander said the vessels were involved in "stealing" Ukrainian grain, as well as transferring military cargo and fuel. The strikes come as Russian President Vladimir Putin prepares to speak at a major economic forum in St Petersburg, a day after Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky offered face-to-face talks with the Russian leader on ending the war. Meanwhile, Ukraine has confirmed one of its naval drones exploded off Romania's coast on Friday. No injuries were reported in the blast. Zelensky wrote alongside his latest offer of peace talks that Russians had become tired of Ukrainian drone and missile attacks, petrol shortages and rising prices that the war, now in its fourth year, had brought. Ukraine has repeatedly targeted military and energy



infrastructure within Russia in a bid to limit its war-fighting capability. Putin's arrival in St Petersburg comes a day after Kyiv had launched a drone attack on the outskirts of the city. Azerbaijan's foreign ministry confirmed five of its citizens had been killed in attacks on two of the vessels in the Sea of Azov. It did not specify who had been behind the attacks and noted that the ships did not belong to

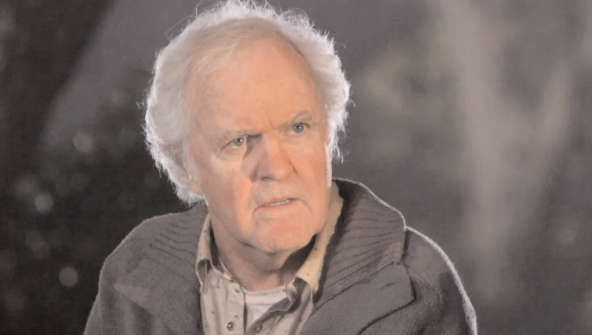
Azerbaijan. Earlier, Robert Brovdi, Ukraine's drone commander, announced that five "illegally loitering vessels" had been struck overnight in the ports of Mariupol, Berdyansk and in the coastal waters of what Ukraine calls the "temporarily occupied territories" - parts of the country that Russia currently controls. He said the names of the five ships, which included cargo vessels and tankers,

were painted over and their radars were turned off "with the aim of quietly stealing Ukrainian grain", as well as "transferring military cargo and fuel". The Azeri foreign ministry named two of the ships as the Nastra and the Circon. Brovdi did not mention any deaths. In Ukraine, at least 13 people have been killed and more than 70 others have been injured in the past day, according to local offi-

cials. Among them are four people who died after Russian drones struck a dairy factory outside the Ukrainian capital, Kyiv, according to the regional head, and a 35-year-old woman in a drone attack on a petrol station in Kherson, local officials said. Meanwhile, a naval drone exploded in the Romanian Black Sea port of Constanta on Friday. The country's defence ministry said the drone had self-detonated near an oil terminal without causing any casualties, although authorities have said it caused considerable damage to a ship and warehouses. Adrian Teodor Picoiu, Constanta's top official, told G4Media that "information from the Ukrainian side" was that the drone was part of a group of five, with a second one exploding in Ukraine. Ukraine later confirmed one of its naval drones had been involved, saying it had been knocked off course by Russian electronic interference. Moscow has yet to comment.

The remaining three drones were unaccounted for but officials said there was no further risk. No reason has yet been offered for why the drones would be in Romanian waters. Romanian President Nicusor Dan wrote on X that it was the second "significant security incident this week", after a stray mine was discovered on a beach near the village of Vama Veche, more than 50km (31 miles) north of Constanta. It also comes a week after two people were injured when a drone hit a Romanian apartment block in the eastern city of Galati - close to the border with Ukraine. Romanian officials said they had confirmed it was a Russian drone but Moscow said "accusations" of its involvement were "unsubstantiated". Zelensky told Putin in an open letter that it would be "wrong to simply wait" until the war in Europe became the focus of US attention once more, adding peace could only come "through direct engagement".

US ACTOR JAMES HANDY STABBED TO DEATH, WITH GIRLFRIEND'S SON ARRESTED



US actor James Handy, known for his roles in films including Jumanji and Top Gun: Maverick, has been stabbed to death at his home in Los Angeles, police have said. Handy, who was 81, was found unconscious in the front garden of his home in Tarzana, California, on Wednesday with several stab wounds to the chest. Michael Gledhill, 44, the son of Handy's girlfriend, has been arrested on suspicion of murder, the Los Angeles Police Department said. Officers responded to a report of "unknown trouble" after a caller dialled 911 and told police: "I am the son of man, I just killed the man of sin."

Handy was born in New York and appeared in a string of films and TV shows over six decades, often as a supporting character or for a small number of episodes. Despite rarely being the leading star, Handy racked up a long string of credits, including NYPD Blue, K-9, Law & Order, CSI: NY, Logan, Alias, Castle, NCIS, The West Wing, Arachnophobia, The X Files and Murder, She Wrote. His most recent film role was 2022's Top Gun: Maverick, in which he played Jimmy, a bartender who works with the character played by Jennifer Connelly, Tom Cruise's love interest.

Zelensky proposes face-to-face talks in open letter to Putin



Volodymyr Zelensky has called for a face-to-face meeting between himself and Vladimir Putin in a renewed bid to end the war in Ukraine. The Ukrainian leader wrote in an open letter to the Russian president that it would be "wrong to simply wait" until the war in Europe became the focus of US attention once more, adding that peace could only come "through direct engagement between" Ukraine and Russia. He also called for a full ceasefire for the duration of proposed negotiations - something Putin ruled out earlier on Thursday.

US President Donald Trump said on Thursday he thought "it would be great" if the two leaders met. The Kremlin confirmed it had received the letter. The tone of the letter was defiant, even mocking, drawing attention to Ukraine's recent strikes on Russian territory. Zelensky stated that "after 26 years in power, age is beginning to take its toll" on Putin. The letter also provided an invi-

Ex-wife of Dubai ruler's nephew in custody, prosecutors say

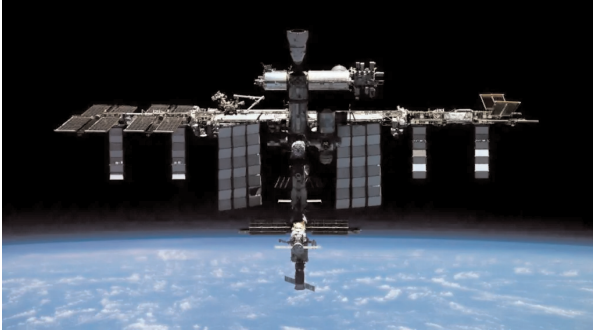


The ex-wife of a nephew of the ruler of Dubai has been taken into custody, authorities have said, as a custody battle over their three young daughters deepens. Dubai Public Prosecution told the BBC that Zenab Javadli was detained following a complaint made by the father of her three children - her former husband, Sheikh Saeed bin Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Javadli's family and friends had lost contact with her since Tuesday night and had raised the alarm over her

whereabouts. For almost two days, no news was received as to where Javadli or her children had gone. For months, she had barely left the house as she believed security officers were waiting to take her children from her and put her under arrest. According to Dubai Public Prosecution, her ex-husband has alleged she abducted the children during a court-approved visitation session. Last year, he lodged a complaint with the police accusing her of kidnapping their daughters. That was after the children changed hands between their parents several times, with each accusing the other of kidnap. Javadli - a former international gymnast - has also been facing potential arrest for e-crimes - online offences - in the UAE after she livestreamed one of the show-downs last year.

Astronauts on International Space Station told to shelter as repairs under way to fix air leaks

Nasa has directed five of the seven astronauts currently aboard the ISS to shelter inside the docked SpaceX Crew Dragon "Freedom" spacecraft — designated as a "safe haven" — while two Russian cosmonauts attempt an urgent repair. The trigger is a worsening air leak in the Russian segment of the station, specifically in the Zvezda service module's transfer tunnel, known as the PrK. This is not the first time the station has had to deal with this problem — the cracks responsible have persisted on and off for around six years. However, following the arrival of a Russian cargo ship last month, the Russian Space Agency Roscosmos noticed a fresh slow pressure drop in the tunnel, prompting the decision to move beyond patchwork fixes and attempt a



more extensive repair operation today. Here's the full statement from Nasa spokeswoman Bethany Stevens, released a short while ago: "The Zvezda service module transfer tunnel, known as PrK, has suffered from cracks and leaks for some time, and has been mitigated by Roscosmos as much as possible to date. "The cracks have always been a concern that NASA watches very closely.

NASA and Roscosmos have been working to determine the root cause of the cracks, and Roscosmos manages the issue through operational mitigation measures and periodic partial-repair efforts.?" "Following new leaks, Roscosmos has elected to proceed with a more extensive repair operation on Friday, June 5. "Out of an abundance of caution, NASA has directed all four of the agency's SpaceX

Crew-12 members and NASA astronaut Chris Williams to assume an elevated safety posture in the Dragon spacecraft while the repair is underway.?" "We continue to work with our Russian counterparts, along with the rest of the international community that supports the space station, to arrive at a more permanent resolution." Astronauts aboard the International Space Station have been told to shelter on their spacecraft as repair work is carried out to fix new air leaks, Nasa says. "Out of an abundance of caution, Nasa has directed all four of the agency's SpaceX Crew-12 members and Nasa astronaut Chris Williams to assume an elevated safety posture in the Dragon spacecraft while the repair is under way," the space agency says.

FURY IN FRANCE AFTER CHILD MURDER SUSPECT'S CRIMINAL RECORD RELEASED

There is fury in France over the murder of an 11-year-old girl after it emerged the principal suspect had been identified several times in the past as a potential child molester. Lyhanna disappeared after school a week ago in the Gers area of southwest France. A body, presumed to be hers, was found on farmland near the town of Fleurance on Thursday. A 41-year-old man named as Jérôme B has been in custody since Monday. He is the father of a friend of Lyhanna, and two witnesses said they saw the girl in his car on the afternoon of her disappearance. Amid the shock and grief, the affair took a politi-



cal turn as details of Jérôme B's police record were released by officials. He had been named in four separate cases involving young girls in recent years. Two were closed for lack of evidence, and in a third he was dismissed from his job as a

maintenance worker at a secondary school for "inappropriate behaviour" towards a teenager. But the fourth affair has lit a fuse leading to the highest reaches of the justice system. Jérôme B was the object of a complaint last August from the mother of

10-year-old Rosa, who said she had been raped by him on several occasions, according to the state prosecutor in the town of Auch. But shockingly, even though medical examination substantiated Rosa's claims, not once in the nine months since her family went to police had Jérôme B been questioned by investigators. The slowness of the French justice system is legendary. In this case, the delays were aggravated by the case having to be transferred from one jurisdiction to another. But the French are appalled that none of the several alarm signals about Jérôme B were heeded by the authorities.

US journalist pleads guilty to working as China's agent



A US journalist who had been living and working in China for over a decade has pleaded guilty in a US court to working as an illegal agent for the People's Republic of China (PRC). Thomas Weir Pauken II, 50, "admitted to being part of a conspiracy to obtain sensitive information from the US government" for China, US Assistant Attorney General for National Security John A. Eisenberg said. Court filings show that Pauken had been living in China since 2010 and had worked for several media organisations there, including China Central Television and Xinhua News. According to court documents, Pauken worked "at the direction and control of people he knew worked for the PRC" from at least 2019 until February this year. Among the people Pauken worked with is a person identified as "Cathy", whom the US Department of Justice (DOJ) said provided him with "taskings, including meeting with potential intelligence assets". Pauken and "Cathy" were introduced by a man employed as a speechwriter for Chinese President Xi

Jinping during the "Trump-China trade wars" in 2017, court filings show. The DOJ said that the US journalist received at least \$100,000 (£73,000) from "Cathy" for his work. Pauken was also instructed to travel several times between 2019 and 2025 to meet with people in the US who could provide him with information to pass on to the PRC. The American journalist "gathered intelligence on his American targets and reported it back to his Chinese intelligence handlers," said Assistant Director Roman Rozhavsky of the FBI's Counterintelligence and Espionage Division. Rozhavsky added that the case was an example of "the lengths to which the Chinese Communist Party will go to undermine our democratic institutions and degrade our political freedoms". Pauken worked with two other people in China, identified as "William" and "Richard", who told the US journalist that reports he filed for them were being sent to Japan. Pauken also sold a group of people from Wuhan information about the US DoJ and information about technology.

SINGER FALLY IPUPA'S PRIDE AT BEING GIVEN MAJOR DR CONGO HONOUR

One of Africa's biggest music stars says he feels "immense pride and deep emotion" after being given one of the Democratic Republic of Congo's most prestigious awards. Fally Ipupa kick-started his career working with fellow Congolese heavyweight Koffi Olomide three decades ago and today boasts millions of fans across the globe. Known for his versatility, his output spans group hits as part of Talent Latent and Quartier Latin International, as well eight solo albums. His highest honour yet came on Tuesday, when the 48-year-old became a knight of the National Order of the Leopard. This title is only awarded by the Congolese president to the most



esteemed public figures. While there was no televised ceremony, Fally Ipupa's new status was announced the following day on state TV by a government spokeswoman who called him a "worthy son of the nation". 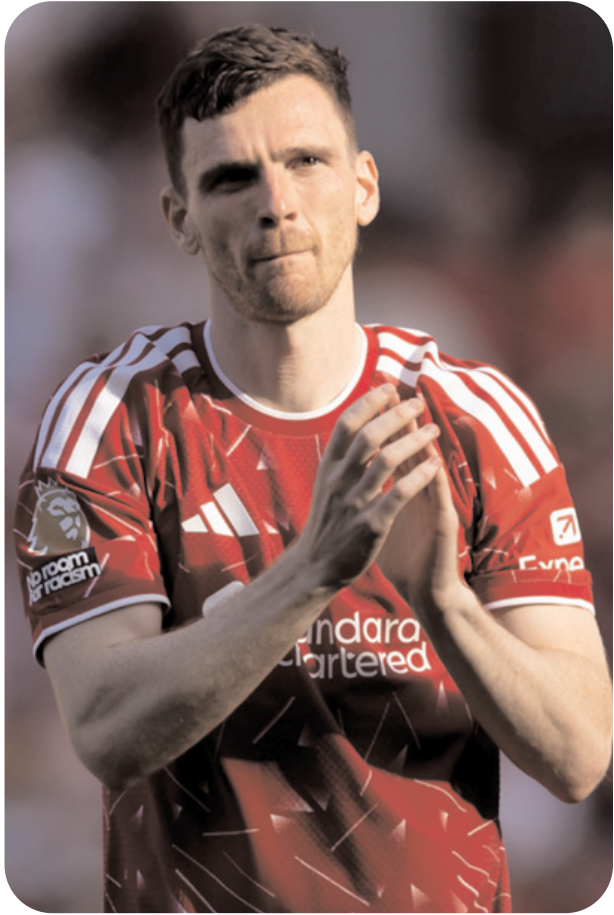

Formula 1 Confirm Las Vegas Grand Prix Till 2037

The Las Vegas Grand Prix has secured its place on the Formula One calendar at least until 2037 with a new 10-year contract extension. The deal was announced on Thursday in the run-up to the Monaco Grand Prix. The first race in the US gambling and entertainment capital was held in 2023 and has drawn hundreds of thousands of visitors every November. It has generated more than \$3 billion in economic impact for southern Nevada over its three editions, and images of single-seat racecars tearing down the neon-lit Las Vegas Strip have become iconic. "We are thrilled that Formula One will continue racing in Las Vegas for many years to come," F1 president and chief executive Stefano Domenicali said in a statement. "We



always believed that Las Vegas would become a cornerstone of our presence in the United States, and this extension, together with the success of recent years, reinforces our long-term

commitment to this important market." Max Verstappen has won two of the three Vegas Grands Prix, in 2023 and 2025. George Russell won a scintillating 2024 edition that

still saw Verstappen secure his fourth straight world driver's championship. The fourth edition is scheduled for November 19-21 and will be the 20th of 22 rounds of the 2026 season.

BCCI Sent Big Message By Ex-India Star On Picking New T20I Captain: 'Miles Ahead Of Contenders'

Former Indian cricket team batter Mohammad Kaif backed Shreyas Iyer to succeed Suryakumar Yadav as the next T20I captain. Media reports claimed that Suryakumar is also set to be replaced as the India T20I captain by Shreyas ahead of the series in Ireland and England. Kaif said that Shreyas was 'miles ahead' of the other contenders and also pointed at his partnership with head coach Gautam Gambhir during Kolkata Knight Riders' IPL 2024 title-winning campaign. "Gautam has worked before with Shreyas and won the trophy for KKR. Shreyas got Delhi and Punjab to the final. In terms of experience, Shreyas has led in the IPL, won the trophy and understands Gautam's pattern." "In



terms of that mutual understanding, Shreyas seems to be the frontrunner. He is miles ahead of the other contenders. He has even scored runs while being captain. You will find very few players who are captains and also score. There is no choice better than him," he said on YouTube. Shreyas has been quite impressive in the last two IPL seasons as he was

brilliant with the bat and also guided Punjab Kings to the final in 2025. Kaif said that removing a World Cup-winning captain like Suryakumar can lead to chaos in the team but in this kind of situation, appointing Shreyas does not feel like a big call. "When you are removing a World Cup-winning captain, there can be no bigger chaos than that. When

all these calls have been taken, this is not a big call," he stated. Kaif also said that Jasprit Bumrah would have been a deserving choice to replace Suryakumar as captain. "Jasprit Bumrah is deserving if you look at it. He has been in Surya's team, he has played for long and delivered. If he is ready for captaincy, he should be the first above all other names. He captained MI as well, and they won that game. He even gave a statement, which shows that he has that desire to captain. I don't know about his fitness and participation, but in that sense, no one should even be close to him, because he has been in the team and done well in different conditions," he said. "They have gone beyond Pandya.

TAYLOR TO FACE PILI IN CROKE PARK FAREWELL

Katie Taylor said fulfilling her long-held dream of fighting at Croke Park will be the "perfect way" to end her decorated career after it was confirmed she will face Flora Pili at the Dublin venue on 5 September. Taylor will bid to become a three-time undisputed champion against unbeaten French fighter Pili in what will be the first boxing event at the



since Muhammad Ali's victory over Al 'Blue' Lewis in July 1972. Taylor will defend her WBO, WBA, IBF and Ring Magazine titles and attempt to add the vacant WBC belt against mandatory challenger Pili, who boasts a 12-0 record.

Neeraj Chopra Left Behind As Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathirage Produces 92.62-Metre Stunner

Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathirage marked his arrival at the pinnacle of Asian athletics with a monstrous throw of 92.62 metres at the Wanda Diamond League meeting in Rome. The effort earned him a slot right between Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem and India's Neeraj Chopra in the list of Asian athletes to have covered the longest distance in the sport. Pathirage's effort was also the best throw in the world since the 2024 Olympic final. It earned him a clear victory over two-time world champion Anderson Peters, who was second with a throw of 83.91m, and world bronze medallist Curtis Thompson, who was third with 83.89m, according to World Athletics statistics. His effort fell just short of Pakistani Arshad Nadeem's Paris Olympics gold-winning throw of 92.97m



but went past Chinese Taipei's Chao-Tsun Cheng (91.36m) and Indian star Neeraj Chopra (90.23m) to produce the second best throw in Asia. Pathirage became only the fourth Asian and 28th overall to breach the coveted 90m mark. He came into Thursday's competition as the season leader in the world with his 89.37m throw in a domestic event in March. It was his first Diamond League title. The

Sri Lankan opened with 84.49 m, a mark that would have been good enough to win, before launching his second-round effort way beyond 90 metres. In the process, he became the first man in 2026, and the first Sri Lankan ever, to break the 90m barrier. His 92.62m throw added more than two metres to the meeting record of 90.34m set by Andreas Thorkildsen 20 years ago. The effort moved Pathirage to eighth on the

world all-time list and made him the second-best Asian thrower in history. "I tried my best today to set a national record, and I managed to improve it by three metres," said Pathirage after the win. "Even though I had only two valid attempts today, I am very stable mentally. It was very hot in Rabat, but the weather in Rome is good and felt like ideal conditions in which to throw far. Winning today felt like a Sri Lankan festival." The feat made the Sri Lankan only the fourth Asian to breach the 90m mark in the javelin. The others are Chinese Taipei's Cheng Chao-Tsun (PB 91.36m), India's former Olympic and world champion Neeraj Chopra (90.23m), and reigning Olympic champion Arshad Nadeem, who has breached the mark multiple times.

Qualifier Maja Chwalinska Sets Up French Open Final Clash With Mirra Andreeva



Maja Chwalinska made French Open history on Thursday as the world number 114 became the first qualifier in the professional era to reach the Roland Garros final, where she will take on Mirra Andreeva. The Pole downed Diana Shnaider 7-6 (7/4), 6-4 in the last four to join Russian 19-year-old Andreeva, a straight-sets winner over Marta Kostyuk, in Saturday's title-decider. Should she best Andreeva in the final, Chwalinska will become just the second woman to come through qualifying and win a Grand Slam final in any major since the Open era began, after Emma Raducanu's title run at the US Open in 2021. The 24-year-old said her run in the French capital was "like a dream", moments after beating 25th seed Shnaider, who a day before eliminated world number one Aryna Sabalenka. "I don't know what's going on, I just, I dunno what to say. I'm sorry, I'm just very happy," she added to raucous applause on Court Philippe Chatrier. Chwalinska, appearing in

her first main draw in Paris, has won nine matches across a three-week campaign at Roland Garros that started with three rounds of qualifying last month. She admitted that her physical state was "not great" in the aftermath of her two-hour-10-minute semi-final win. "I mean it's so challenging to play against the best players in the world day by day, but it's a Grand Slam so you just have to give your best day by day," she added. "But I'm not complaining at all!" Chwalinska had only won one match in her two previous Grand Slam appearances, at Wimbledon in 2022, and only just two tour-level matches on clay before Roland Garros. En route to the last four, Chwalinska started out by downing Olympic gold medallist Zheng Qinwen in the first round before felling 23rd seed Elise Mertens, former world number three Maria Sakkari, hometown hope Diane Parry and 22nd seed Anna Kalinskaya. Chwalinska is projected to climb to at least a career-high No. 21 in the rankings.

From T20I Exile To Captaincy: How Shreyas Iyer Completed His Mega Comeback

Iyer has emerged as the top contender to replace Suryakumar Yadav as the Indian cricket team T20I captain and if reports are to be believed, then the official announcement should come on Saturday. time that he played in a T20I match for India was back in December 2023. Since then, he was snubbed twice for T20 World Cups and did not even find a place in the Asia Cup squad. For KKR, he scored just 351 runs in 15 matches that season and although he completed a stunning journey after getting dropped from the BCCI central contracts in 2023, his exclusion showed that the selectors were just not convinced. A move to Punjab Kings followed ahead of IPL 2025 and the price tag of Rs 26.75 crore was probably a good indication of how much he was valued by the franchises. Shreyas did not disappoint as he slammed 604 runs and led by example as his team reached the final before losing to Royal Challengers Bengaluru. Selectors were once again put on high alert

but he once again found him in the rejection list when it came to Asia Cup 2025 as well as T20 World Cup 2026. BCCI chief selector Ajit Agarkar hinted that it was not the player's fault and he was once again overlooked in favour of T20I specialists. The Winds Of Change While Shreyas continued to show his good run of form, things were going downhill for Suryakumar Yadav. The explosive batter led India to the World Cup title in 2026 but the murmurs never ceased over his batting form. A poor show in the Asia Cup as well as the World Cup did not soothe the nerves and soon, fans as well as experts started having their doubts.
