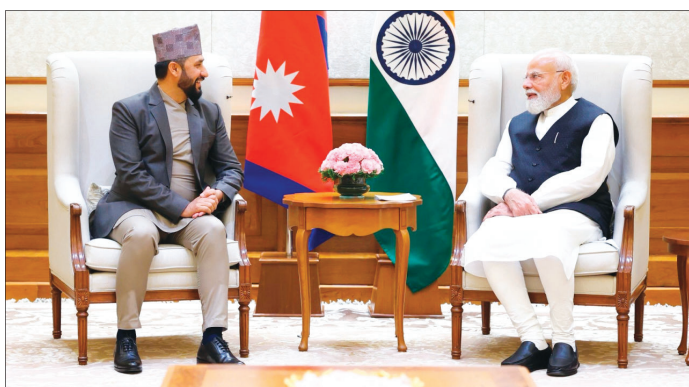
**FIVE CHILDREN DROWN IN**  
**WATER FILLED EXCAVATION**  
**PIT IN MADHUBANI**

Patna, Jun 3: A tragic incident in Bihar's Madhubani district claimed the lives of five children after a group of seven youngsters drowned while bathing in a deep water-filled excavation pit on Wednesday. The accident occurred in the Raghepura-Yadupatti Chaur area of Benipatti, near Kerwar village under Patona police station limits, where soil had earlier been excavated using a JCB machine, leaving behind a large pit that later filled with water. According to police officials, all the children involved were aged between 12 and 15 years. Around noon, they had gone to the site to bathe, unaware of the depth of the stagnant water. Several of them report-edly slipped into deeper sec-tions and began drowning, while attempts by others to res-cue them also turned fatal.

**21 KILLED, SEVERAL INJURED**  
**IN MAJOR FIRE AT DELHI**  
**RESTAURANT; PM ANNOUNCES**

New Delhi, Jun 3: At least 21 people lost their lives and several others sustained injuries after a massive fire broke out at a restaurant in South Delhi's Malviya Nagar area on Wednesday morning. The blaze engulfed the multi-storied Lemon Green Restaurant located in the Hauz Rani area, triggering a large-scale rescue operation. Officials said many of those who died were foreign nationals, though their identities are yet to be officially confirmed. According to the Delhi Fire Service (DFS), a distress call was received at around 9.45 am, following which multiple firefighting and rescue teams were rushed to the spot. Officials said the fire is believed to have started around 8.50 am. Firefighters rescued 37 people trapped inside the basement of the building and shifted them to nearby hospitals in CATS ambulances.

## Telangana, South Africa to boost ties in pharma,

**Skilled workforce; Deputy Prez Mashatile invites Indian firms to invest**



HYDERABAD (TSIT):

Deputy President of South Africa Paul Mashatile, meeting Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Wednesday, set the stage for deeper cooperation in pharmaceuticals, medical tourism, and skilled workforce development between India and South Africa, with both sides eyeing stronger trade and investment links. Mashatile, who is

currently on a working visit in India, met Revanth Reddy in Hyderabad along with a high-level delegation to explore developments in pharma and ICT.

During the meeting, the South African Deputy President emphasised South Africa's interest in having Indian pharmaceutical companies invest in the country, noting that access to affordable medicines is a primary focus

under Pretoria's universal healthcare push.

"Chief Minister, universal access to healthcare is a priority for South Africa, and access to affordable medicines is a primary area of focus. The manufacture of affordable pharmaceuticals in the country is important to achieve this goal," Mashatile said.

He added that establishing pharma firms in South Africa also provides "a platform from which Indian companies can enjoy preferential market access into the rest of Africa through the African Continental Free Trade Area."

Both sides agreed to cooperate in education, medical tourism and investments, with an aim to strengthen educational exchanges and attract investments for mutual benefit, according to a release from the Chief Minister's Office.

## Shivakumar sworn in as Karnataka's 25th CM

Karnataka Congress President D.K. Shivakumar was sworn in as the 25th Chief Minister of Karnataka on Wednesday at a grand ceremony held at the Glass House within the Lok Bhavan premises in Bengaluru.

Amid loud slogans from supporters, Shivakumar walked to the dais and first paid floral tributes to the portrait of Sri Veera Gangadhara Swamiji, popularly known as Ajjayya, Nonavinakere Ajja, or Veera Gangadhara Ajja. After offering his respects, he proceeded to the podium to take the oath of office and the oath of secrecy.

Shivakumar took the oath while holding a copy of the Constitution and invoked the name of Veera Gangadhara Ajja, the revered seer whom he regards as his spiritual guide. The swearing-in ceremony commenced with the rendition of Vande Mataram. This was followed by the National Anthem performed by the Karnataka State Police Band. The state anthem was also played during the



proceedings.

Chief Secretary to the Government of Karnataka, Shalini Rajneesh, welcomed the dignitaries and guests attending the ceremony. Before the formal proceedings began, Shivakumar felicitated outgoing Chief Minister Siddaramaiah by draping a shawl over his shoulders.

Several prominent national and state leaders attended the event, including Chief Justice of the Karnataka High Court Vibhu Bakhru, AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, Congress

leader V.D. Satheesan from Kerala, AICC General Secretary K.C. Venugopal, AICC General Secretary Randeep Singh Surjewala

and other senior Congress leaders. At the start of the ceremony, Chief Secretary Shalini Rajneesh sought the permission of Governor Thaaarchand Gehlot to proceed with the swearing-in. ## 1 cr people to join Yoga Andhra 2026: CM Naidu

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has announced that the State Government will organize Yoga Andhra 2026 on a massive scale from June 7 to June 20 to mark the 12th International Day of Yoga, with a target of engaging one crore people in yoga activities across the state.

Addressing the media in Amaravati on Wednesday, the Chief Minister said yoga should become a daily habit in every household and evolve into a people's movement for building a healthier Andhra Pradesh. He emphasized that yoga is India's invaluable gift to the world and remains one of the most effective tools for addressing modern challenges such as stress, anxiety, and lifestyle-related health disorders.

"Yoga is a comprehensive wellness practice that promotes physical fitness, mental peace, and spiritual growth," he said. The Chief Minister announced that the flagship Yoga Andhra 2026 event will be held in Amaravati, where nearly 25,000 participants are expected to perform yoga on the Krishna River West Bypass Bridge. He added that the government is working to integrate yoga into educational institutions to encourage healthy habits among children and create a stronger and healthier future generation. Highlighting the success of Yoga



Andhra 2025, organized in Visakhapatnam in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chandrababu Naidu said the programme earned national and international recognition.

The event secured two Guinness World Records, 21 World Book of Records recognitions, and a Skoch Award. According to the Chief Minister, last year's programme witnessed registrations from 2.44 crore people, while certificates were issued to 1.91 crore participants. Yoga activities were conducted at 1.33 lakh venues across the state with the support of 1.53 lakh trainers. To encourage wider participation this year, the government has designed district-specific themes targeting different sections of society. Special programmes will be organized for police personnel in NTR district,

farmers in Konaseema district, and various community groups across the state. Yoga events will be conducted at all district headquarters.

In a unique initiative to promote Yoga Tourism, the government will organize special yoga sessions at 56 prominent tourist destinations. Historic and spiritual sites such as Undavalli Caves and Srisailem will host yoga programmes, combining wellness activities with tourism promotion. The Chief Minister said Yoga Andhra forms a key component of the State's Swarna Andhra 2047 Vision, which aims to improve public health and wellness outcomes. The long-term goals include training 10 lakh certified yoga practitioners, expanding the network to 2.5 lakh yoga instructors, and encouraging one crore people to practice yoga regularly throughout the year.

**Expelled leader Ritabrata Banerjee LoP with support of**  
**58 rebel MLAs, WB Assembly Speaker accepts claim**

KOLKATA (TSIT):

The TMC on Wednesday suffered its first split in its 28-year history as 58 rebel MLAs elected expelled leader Ritabrata Banerjee as Leader of Opposition, wresting control of its legislature party, and secured recognition from the Assembly Speaker, plunging Mamata Banerjee's outfit into its gravest internal crisis since its inception.

Within hours, a rattled TMC leadership dissolved all party committees and frontal organisations across West Bengal in what appeared to be an attempt to regain political control amid a fast-esca-



lating power struggle.

The dramatic rebellion, unfolding within two months of the party's crushing defeat in the assembly elections, exposed a deep rupture between the organisation and its elected legislators, raising questions over leadership, succession and the future direction of the party that has dominated Bengal politics for more than a decade. The rebel camp, led by Ritabrata Banerjee and fellow expelled

MLA Sandipan Saha, submitted letters of support from 58 legislators before Speaker Rathindra Bose, comfortably crossing the two-thirds threshold required under the anti-defection law for recognition as a separate bloc.

"Our claim has been accepted by the Speaker," Ritabrata Banerjee told reporters after meeting the Speaker. Claiming legitimacy through numbers, he asserted that the dissidents now represented the real Trinamool Congress in the Assembly. "The TMC legislative party is a team of 58 MLAs who won on the TMC symbol.

**Cabinet approves Rs 10,000-cr ATF price stabilisation**  
**fund to shield airlines from fuel cost volatility**

New Delhi, Jun 3 (UNI) In a major relief measure for the aviation sector grappling with soaring fuel costs amid the ongoing West Asia crisis, the union Cabinet on Wednesday approved a one-time budgetary support package of up to Rs 10,000 crore for Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) to facilitate Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) price stabilisation for scheduled Indian airlines. Announcing the decision after a Cabinet meeting, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said the government had approved the creation of a Price Stabilisation Fund that would provide interest-free advances to OMCs, enabling them to offer more predictable fuel prices to Indian carriers operating both domestic and international services. "The union Cabinet has approved one-time budgetary support not exceeding Rs 10,000 crore for Oil Marketing Companies to provide ATF price stabilisation support to Scheduled Indian Airlines for their domestic and international operations," Vaishnav told reporters. According to the Cabinet decision, the assistance will be routed through the Demands for Grants of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas and will be provided as an interest-free advance to OMCs. "The support is aimed at mitigating the impact of extraordinary fuel price volatility triggered by geopolitical tensions in West Asia, which have sharply increased global ATF prices and placed severe financial pressure on airlines. Under the approved mechanism, OMCs will be compensated whenever the prevail-

ing Import Parity Price (IPP) of ATF exceeds a benchmark price fixed under the scheme. The compensation will be drawn from the approved corpus, helping shield both airlines and fuel suppliers from sudden price shocks.

The government said the arrangement includes a recovery and true-up mechanism. Once international ATF prices decline, the differential amount will be recovered from OMCs and returned to the Consolidated Fund of India. The process will continue until the entire support amount is fully recovered and settled. The scheme will be available to all willing scheduled Indian airlines and will cover both domestic and international operations. A key feature of the mechanism is the introduction of a fixed-price arrangement for ATF supplies, giving airlines greater certainty in fuel expenditure and reducing exposure to abrupt price spikes. As part of the arrangement, participating airlines will sign a memorandum of understanding with OMCs, with the Ministries of Civil Aviation and Petroleum and Natural Gas acting as signatories. Airlines opting into the scheme will procure ATF exclusively from OMCs for a period of up to three years, subject to annual review or until the advance amount is fully recovered, whichever is earlier. A monitoring committee comprising representatives of the Ministry of Civil Aviation, Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas and the Department of Expenditure will oversee implementation, verify claims, conduct reconciliations and supervise settlements.

# Andhra minister Lokesh in Russia to explore collaboration in AI, quantum computing

Amaravati, June 3 : Andhra Pradesh is exploring opportunities for collaboration with Russia in Artificial Intelligence, quantum computing, and digital innovation as state minister Nara Lokesh began his visit to Russia on Wednesday.

As part of Andhra Pradesh's efforts to build global technology partnerships, Minister for Education, IT and Electronics, Nara Lokesh, held discussions with Albert Yefimov, Senior Vice President of Sberbank, one of Russia's leading financial and technology institutions.

The meeting provided an opportunity to understand Russia's progress in sov-



ern artificial intelligence, digital platforms, advanced computing and technology-led innovation.

Discussions covered emerging areas including generative AI, digital public infrastructure, cybersecurity, fintech, quantum computing, workforce skilling and technology applications in public ser-

ices. Sberbank representatives presented an overview of the bank's technology ecosystem, including its GigaChat large language model, AI research initiatives and digital solutions deployed across banking and public-facing services.

Minister Lokesh highlighted Andhra Pradesh's

ambition to emerge as a leading AI and technology hub and expressed interest in exploring areas where global best practices and technological innovations could support the state's digital transformation agenda.

According to an official release here, the discussions also touched upon the growing role of artificial intelligence in healthcare, including early disease detection, diagnostics, medical research, hospital operations and citizen-facing health services. Both sides exchanged views on how AI-driven solutions could improve healthcare accessibility and outcomes at scale. The meeting also explored developments in

quantum computing and advanced research ecosystems. Lokesh noted Andhra Pradesh's interest in emerging technologies and discussed possibilities for future engagement between research institutions, technology companies and innovation ecosystems in areas related to quantum technologies.

The two sides exchanged views on technology education and workforce development models. Discussions included global approaches to coding education, AI skills development and industry-oriented training programmes aimed at preparing young professionals for the digital economy. The meeting also cov-

ered broader opportunities to strengthen economic engagement between India and Russia, including facilitating business linkages, supporting exporters and leveraging technology to improve cross-border trade ecosystems. Albert Yefimov shared insights into Sberbank's operations in India and its ongoing engagement with Indian businesses and institutions. Both sides agreed to remain in touch and explore areas of mutual interest as opportunities emerge. During his Russia visit, Lokesh will engage global technology leaders, research institutions and industry stakeholders across emerging sectors.

## Alampur Farmers Raise Irrigation Concerns Ahead of CM Revanth Reddy's Gadwal Visit

# Sampath Kumar Assures Permanent Solution to RDS Issues in Alampur

He stated that the Congress gov-



ernment, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, is making sincere efforts to address long-pending developmental issues in the constituency. He said projects such as the Vallur and Mallamma Kunta reservoirs, which were allegedly left incomplete by the previous BRS govern-

ment, would be completed to provide a permanent solution to irrigation challenges in the RDS ayacut area. Sampath Kumar criticized former TRS leaders, alleging that they had secured electoral victories by making promises but failed to address the concerns of the peo-

## Farmers Urged to Be Vigilant While Purchasing Seeds : District Agriculture Officer Yashwanth Rao



The South India Times // Nagar Kurnool District Agriculture Officer Yashwanth Rao has advised farmers to exercise caution while purchasing seeds and strictly follow the provisions of the Seed Act, 1966. He emphasized that cotton farmers should buy seeds

only from licensed dealers and always obtain a purchase bill.

During inspections of seed shops, including Sairam Traders and Anand Kisan, he instructed farmers to check important details on seed packets such as the company name, hybrid variety, lot

number, germination percentage, packing date, and expiry date. Only properly sealed seed packets should be purchased.

The officer also warned farmers against using unauthorized cotton seed varieties like BG-III/HTBT. He advised them to preserve a seed sample from each packet and conduct a germination test before sowing. Farmers should retain seed packets, tags, and purchase bills until harvest and report any seed quality issues or counterfeit seed sales to the Agriculture Department immediately. He further recommended sowing seeds only after adequate rainfall and sufficient soil moisture is available.

## Warangal Police Commissioner Directs Counseling for Land Dispute Rowdy Sheeters



Warangal, June 3, TSIT: Warangal Police Commissioner Sanpreet Singh has instructed police station officials to provide "counseling" for rowdy sheeters involved in land dispute cases, aiming to curb harassment and promote peaceful settlements.

During his visit to KUC Police Station on Wednesday, Commissioner Singh was welcomed by Central Zone DCP Dara Kavitha, ACP Narsimha Rao, and Inspector Ravikumar. He first inspected the station premises, case property rooms, seized vehicles, and the Balamitra Police Station sports ground. The Commissioner reviewed records of active rowdy sheeters and suspects, inquiring about their current activities and

behavior. He emphasized that special counseling should be offered to individuals who engage in fights, threats, or intimidate the public, and directed officers to remain vigilant without showing sympathy towards habitual offenders.

He also urged police officials to conduct community awareness programs addressing local social disorders, cyber crimes, drug abuse, and traffic rules in schools and colleges. Station inspectors were instructed to proactively gather information and maintain strict control over crimes in their designated areas.

The programme was attended by SIs Naveen Kumar, Kalyan Kumar, and Rajamouli, who will assist in implementing the counseling and awareness initiatives.

### Southwest monsoon to enter Karnataka on Jun 4; IMD forecasts heavy rain, thunderstorms

Bengaluru, Jun 3: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has finally brought good news for people awaiting the monsoon. After a prolonged wait, the southwest monsoon is set to make its onset over the Kerala coast on June 4, marking the official beginning of the rainy season across the country.

Kerala is expected to receive the first impact of the monsoon, with the IMD forecasting heavy rainfall ranging from 7 cm to 20 cm in several parts of the state over the next six to seven days. Moisture-laden winds over the Arabian Sea have strengthened considerably and are expected to trigger widespread rainfall not only in Kerala but also in parts of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. Apart from rain, the IMD has warned of strong winds blowing at speeds of 40

to 50 kmph across peninsular south India over the next few days. The region is also likely to witness intense thunderstorms accompanied by lightning. With nearly half of India's agricultural land dependent on rainfall, the onset of the monsoon is considered crucial for the country's economy. The rains are expected to replenish reservoirs and support hydro-power generation. However, the weather department has advised the public to exercise caution during outdoor activities amid the possibility of severe weather conditions. Weather experts are closely monitoring the progress of the monsoon across the country in the coming weeks. Timely rainfall is expected to bring relief and optimism to farmers.

## Mangaluru: Residents raise alarm after JCB hits exposed HPCL LPG pipeline during desilting drive

Mangaluru, June 3: A potentially major disaster was narrowly averted in Kandavara village after an HPCL LPG pipeline was found dangerously exposed during desilting work in a public drainage canal near Bailupete Mosque, raising serious questions over the safety standards followed in the installation of underground fuel pipelines.

The incident came to light during voluntary desilting work undertaken in a large public drainage canal that carries rainwater into the Phalguni River. The canal, which had become heavily silted over the years, was being cleaned using a JCB excavator at the personal expense of local resident

Harish Shetty of Ethamogaru Doddamane.

During the operation, the excavator reportedly struck the HPCL LPG pipeline, exposing a section of the gas line. Residents were shocked to discover that the pipeline had been laid at a depth of barely two-and-a-half feet below the surface, describing it as a serious threat to public safety.

According to locals, a nearby GAIL gas pipeline runs at a depth of nearly 10 feet, while a Petronet diesel pipeline in the same area has also been laid much deeper underground. They contend that the inadequate depth of the HPCL pipeline was the primary reason the line was struck during the



desilting work.

Expressing concern over the risk posed by the pipeline, Harish Shetty urged the company to relocate it to a safer depth of at least 10 feet and provide

additional protection through a concrete covering. "The pipeline's current position is extremely risky. Proper safety measures must be implemented before another accident

occurs," he said.

The drainage canal falls within the jurisdiction of Adyapady Panchayat and serves as a major water channel for three villages. Local leaders criticised private companies for executing infrastructure projects without adequately consulting farmers, residents and local governing bodies. Former Kandavara Grama Panchayat president Vijaya G. Suvarna and former Panchayat member Jeevan Malli warned that negligence in implementing safety standards for highly inflammable products such as LPG and petroleum could have catastrophic consequences. They demanded immediate corrective action and cautioned that

public protests would be inevitable if the issue remained unresolved.

Following complaints from Panchayat members and residents, HPCL Safety Officer Nayan Pal visited the site and held discussions with local stakeholders. He said the pipeline had been installed around 10 years ago and acknowledged that geographical conditions in the area had changed over time. "We will immediately undertake repairs to the damaged section of the pipeline. I will also submit a report to senior officials recommending deeper installation of the pipeline and the provision of a concrete protective layer above it," Pal assured residents.

plained about improper door-to-door garbage collection, which has led to an increase in public garbage "black spots." Additionally, citizens highlighted that the waste collection autos do not arrive on time and that fewer autos are operating than the officially

designated number. After listening to the public grievances, the MLA and the Commissioner issued strict directives to the officials and contractors. Mandatory Auto Deployment per Ward; Attendance at Doorsteps Compulsory Every ward must

be assigned the designated number of waste-collection autos without fail. Garbage collection must take place every day between 6:00 AM and 9:00 AM. Autos must visit every household daily for waste collection and mark their attendance at the residents' doorsteps. If an auto fails to arrive, citizens can call the contractor directly. To facilitate this, the telephone numbers of the auto driver and the contractor must be prominently displayed on every vehicle, the MLA stated. Deployment of Volunteers to address public grievances, the MLA announced that citizens would be deployed as volunteers to monitor the movement of these autos. Daily attendance logs of the autos will be sent to the MLA's office for verification. Deduct

Bills of Contractors Deploying Fewer Autos Solid waste management contractors must deploy the full quota of autos assigned to their respective wards. Officials were strictly instructed to deduct payments and cut the bills of contractors if they are found operating fewer autos than stipulated in their agreement.

Blacklisting of Errant Contractors

The Commissioner issued a one-week ultimatum to the solid waste management contractors, stating that the garbage issues in all wards must be completely resolved within this timeframe. If complaints from the public persist after one week, such contractors will be blacklisted. Chief Engineer Basavaraj Kabade, DGM Tanuja, local leaders, and others were present at the meeting.

*Can India Find A Way To Shape US-Iran War, Without Actually Playing Mediator?*

India's role in the West Asia mediation efforts continues to be discussed in diplomatic circles, sparking debates ranging from claims that Pakistan's presence at the table reflects poorly on India's foreign policy, to the opposite view that India has been right to stay out. The question of whether India should have offered to mediate misses the more important point: New Delhi's choice to stay out was not a sign of fragility; it was a strategic choice. In conflicts of this scale and complexity, mediation is a high-risk, low-reward enterprise that demands, at the very least, credible leverage over all sides. Prudence, however, does not come without costs. As an independent nation, India's foreign policy has been anchored in the idea of strategic autonomy, the principle that decisions must serve national interests rather than those of any alliance. In a world of multilateralism defined by blocs, this approach created room for manoeuvre; it paved the path for India to build relationships across divides and engage competing powers at the same time, without being boxed in. Just as importantly, it kept New Delhi out of conflicts that did not directly serve its interests. In this sense, strategic autonomy was never just passive neutrality; it was an active effort to improve flexibility while reducing constraints.

### A New Paradigm

But the world has changed faster than the doctrine of strategic autonomy that has been guiding it. The management of today's crises no longer relies on stable alliances or slow-moving diplomacy. Instead, crises now move quickly, often faster than formal diplomacy can respond to them. Different actors become involved as events unfold, but the actual influence tends to rest with those who are physically present and politically engaged in the spaces where negotiations are taking shape. The global standing of a nation may shape its credibility to lead, but when a crisis erupts, leverage accrues to those whose role becomes operationally necessary to the outcome. Distance, which once created leverage, now risks creating exclusion. Strategic autonomy continues to protect sovereignty, but it may no longer automatically translate into influence, particularly at moments when outcomes are being decided in real time. This approach is also clear in how India defines its role during crises. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh recently stated that any cross-border "misadventure" would lead to an "unprecedented and decisive" response. He also mentioned that operations like Operation Sindoor are still active. This emphasis is telling; India's role continues to be defined by deterrence and response.

### A Paradox For India

However, there is a paradox that India now confronts. Even with its deep investments in West Asia - economically, politically, demographically and strategically - it remains only lightly involved in the mediation process of West Asia. The decision to avoid mediation has insulated New Delhi from the immediate risks of overreach.

# Trump Has New Plans For How America Deals With China

At last week's Shangri-La Dialogue, US Secretary of War Pete Hegseth articulated a vision of the Indo-Pacific that reflects the emerging contours of the Trump administration's strategic approach: a combination of hard-edged realism, burden-sharing, and sustained competition with China under the rubric of "peace through strength". While much of the speech reaffirmed long-standing American concerns about the regional balance of power, its emphasis on transactional partnerships and allied responsibility offered important clues about the future direction of US defence policy. On China, Hegseth's remarks underscored Washington's growing alarm over Beijing's rapid military modernisation and expanding regional footprint. Characterising China's buildup as unprecedented in scale, he reiterated the American objective of preserving a favourable balance of power in the Indo-Pacific - one in which no single state can establish regional hegemony. Significantly, however, the speech also reflected a degree of strategic pragmatism. While reaffirming deterrence by denial, particularly along the first island chain, Hegseth acknowledged recent improvements in US-China relations and emphasised the importance of engagement mechanisms designed to reduce the risks of miscalculation. The message was clear: competition with China remains the organising principle of American strategy, but it need not preclude dialogue or crisis management.

### India's Role

Perhaps the most consequential aspect of the speech was its treatment of India. Hegseth described India as a "critical anchor" in maintaining strategic equilibrium in South Asia, framing New Delhi's rise as a positive development for regional stability. By highlighting India's military modernisation, expanding industrial base, and growing logistical capabilities in the Indian Ocean, Washington signalled its desire to move the bilateral relationship beyond political symbolism toward greater operational relevance. References to defence co-production, industrial collaboration, and joint exercises such as "TIGER TRIUMPH" suggest



that the United States increasingly views India as a pivotal contributor to regional security rather than merely a diplomatic partner. More broadly, the speech reaffirmed that the Indo-Pacific remains central to American strategic thinking. Hegseth repeatedly emphasised that the United States is a Pacific power with enduring interests in the region. Yet, this commitment was accompanied by a clear expectation that allies and partners must shoulder a larger share of the burden. The recurring theme that "we need partners, not protectorates" reflects a distinctly Trumpian approach to alliance management. Security partnerships, in this conception, are expected to be reciprocal rather than open-ended commitments. States that invest more in their own defence and contribute meaningfully to collective security can expect greater access to American military technology, intelligence sharing, and defence cooperation.

### More Military

The speech also reflected an impatience with declaratory policy unaccompanied by military capability. Hegseth's call for "more ships, more submarines, and more combat power" underscored a broader shift towards tangible military preparedness as the foundation of deterrence. This focus on capability over rhetoric aligns closely with the strategic priorities likely to shape the forthcoming National Defence Strategy. Taken together, these themes point toward several emerging trends in US defence policy.

### Three Shifts In Policy

First, alliance relationships are becoming increasingly conditional and performance-based. The expectation that countries such as Japan, South Korea, and Australia expand defence spending reflects Washington's growing concern about the sustainability of traditional security arrangements in an era of intensifying great-power competition. Second, China remains the pacing challenge for the US military, but American strategy appears increasingly calibrated to avoid unnecessary escalation. The combination of robust deterrence measures and selective diplomatic engagement suggests an effort to manage competition

without allowing it to spiral into direct confrontation. In this sense, the administration appears to be pursuing a strategy of strategic firmness coupled with tactical flexibility. Third, Hegseth's remarks reinforced the importance of networked security architectures such as the Quad, AUKUS, and a range of bilateral partnerships. Rather than serving as substitutes for American power, these arrangements are intended to multiply its effectiveness and enhance its sustainability. Integrated deterrence is thus increasingly dependent on the capabilities and contributions of regional partners.

For India, the implications are particularly significant. Few statements from Trump 2.0 have so explicitly positioned India as a central pillar of the regional balance against China. The emphasis on India's role in the Indian Ocean and its growing logistical and industrial capacities suggests that Washington sees New Delhi as an indispensable contributor to Indo-Pacific stability. Importantly, this evolving partnership remains compatible with India's preference for strategic autonomy, allowing it to deepen cooperation with the

United States without entering into a formal alliance framework.

### Shared Responsibility

At a broader level, the speech reflects an American recognition that sustaining regional primacy will require greater burden-sharing and more efficient allocation of resources. The challenge for Washington will be to ensure that transactionalism strengthens rather than weakens alliance cohesion. If allies respond positively by expanding capabilities and assuming greater responsibilities, deterrence could be enhanced. If not, tensions over expectations and commitments may emerge.

For Beijing, the message was equally nuanced. The reaffirmation of deterrence and concerns about military expansion conveyed continued American resolve, while the emphasis on improved relations and the rejection of regime-change ambitions signalled a willingness to maintain channels for cooperation where possible. Competition, in other words, remains the defining feature of the relationship, but not necessarily confrontation. Ultimately, Hegseth's address outlined a more hard-nosed and less ideological vision of American strategy in the Indo-Pacific. The objectives remain largely consistent with previous administrations: preventing Chinese hegemony, preserving a favourable balance of power, and sustaining US influence in the region. What distinguishes this approach is its emphasis on reciprocity, burden-sharing, and measurable outcomes. It is strategic continuity in terms of ends, but a distinctly Trumpian departure in terms of means. Yet, there are also potential limitations to this approach. An excessive emphasis on transactionalism risks underestimating the less tangible but equally important foundations of alliance politics-strategic reassurance, long-term credibility, and the normative influence that has traditionally underpinned American leadership. While burden-sharing is a legitimate objective, successful alliances ultimately depend not only on capabilities but also on confidence in sustained commitments.

## THE CHINA SHOCK 2.0 MAY ALREADY BE HERE

Across Europe, Latin America, and large parts of the developing world, governments are confronting a new economic dilemma. Chinese electric vehicles are flooding export markets despite tariffs. Solar manufacturers outside China are collapsing under impossible price competition. Steel, batteries, industrial chemicals, and clean-energy components are all beginning to exhibit the same pattern: excess Chinese supply meeting a world economy increasingly unable, and unwilling, to absorb it. At first glance, this resembles a conventional trade conflict. But it is something deeper. What is now surfacing across global markets is the outward spillover of structural pressures building within the Chinese economy for years. For decades, China's growth model rested on a simple but extraordinarily powerful arrangement. Household consumption remained suppressed, while investment and exports carried the burden of economic expansion. That formula delivered one of the fastest industrial transformations in modern history. It built ports, factories, highways, supply chains, and manufacturing ecosystems at a scale no economy had previously achieved. An Unresolved Problem But the same model also produced an imbalance that China never fully resolved. Household consumption in China remains stuck at roughly 35 to 40% of GDP, extraordinarily low for an economy of its size. By comparison, household consumption accounts for roughly 68% of GDP in the United States, close to 60% in India,



and 50-55% in mature East Asian economies such as Japan and South Korea. Even when government consumption is included, total consumption in China accounts for only around 54% of GDP. Investment alone still contributes roughly 43%. These are not ordinary macroeconomic ratios. They describe an economy structurally dependent on capital formation rather than household demand. For years, the imbalance remained manageable because investment itself generated rapid growth. Infrastructure expansion, urbanisation, and property development created employment, rising incomes, and local-government revenues simultaneously. Exports, meanwhile, absorbed excess industrial production externally. Drowning In Debt That arrangement is now weakening on multiple fronts at once. According to the IMF's 2025 Article IV consultation, China's total non-financial

sector debt has climbed to roughly 313% of GDP and is projected to reach 323% by 2026. More revealingly, the IMF's broader measure of "augmented debt", which includes Local Government Financing Vehicles and off-balance-sheet liabilities, is projected to rise to 135.3% of GDP by 2026. The problem is no longer merely the scale of debt. It is the declining efficiency of debt itself. In the early 2000s, China's Incremental Capital Output Ratio remained relatively healthy, meaning investment still generated strong returns in growth. That relationship has deteriorated sharply. The economy now requires vastly larger injections of credit to produce the same unit of output. More investment is generating progressively less demand. Real estate once concealed many of these contradictions. At its peak, the property sector accounted for nearly a quarter of China's GDP when upstream and downstream

sectors were included. More importantly, real estate became the primary store of household wealth, accounting for roughly 70% of household assets. The Growing Property Crisis This is what makes China's property slowdown so economically dangerous. Falling property values are not simply weakening construction activity. They are eroding household balance sheets themselves. The result increasingly resembles the dynamics of a balance-sheet recession where households, firms, and local governments simultaneously become more cautious, indebted, and reluctant to spend. The collapse in land sales has intensified the problem further. For years, local governments relied heavily on land transfers to finance infrastructure spending and service debt linked to Local Government Financing Vehicles. That mechanism has now weakened dramatically, severing one of the central feedback loops that sustained China's investment-heavy growth model. The broader macroeconomic signals are becoming increasingly difficult to ignore. Core inflation averaged just 0.5% in 2024, while the IMF estimates China continues to operate with a negative output gap of roughly -1%. Producer-price deflation has persisted through prolonged periods, revealing the extent of excess industrial capacity. At the same time, the demographic foundations of the old model are deteriorating rapidly. China's fertility rate now hovers near 1.0, far below replacement levels.

## EDUCATION AT THE CROSSROADS OF COACHING CULTURE

In India, education has been considered a medium of knowledge, culture, and social change for centuries. Teachers have enjoyed special respect in society because they not only impart subject knowledge but also shape the personality and character of students. However, changes in the field of education over the past few decades have significantly impacted this idealistic concept. In particular, the increasing number of competitive examinations, the attraction to government jobs, and the pursuit of better careers have transformed the coaching industry into a huge economic sector. Today, in many cities across the country, coaching institutes have established a parallel system within the education system, the impact of which is visible on schools, students, parents, and even policymakers. In recent years, the proliferation of social media and digital platforms has further accelerated this trend. Many teachers and coaching institutes are reaching millions of students through YouTube, Instagram, and other mediums. This isn't inherently bad. Technology has made education more accessible and played a vital role in providing quality content to students in remote areas. The problem arises when the purpose of education shifts from knowledge acquisition to personal brand building, promotion, and business expansion. Recently, senior journalist Anjana Om Kashyap's jibe at a YouTube teacher during a popular TV debate

sparked widespread discussion on social media. Opinions on this incident may vary. Some consider it a sharp journalistic comment, while others see it as disrespectful to teachers. However, this controversy has raised an important question: has the field of education become increasingly publicized and commercialized? Is an environment being created to influence students and parents in which coaching is presented as a prerequisite for success? The reality is that many parents today believe that their children cannot succeed in any competitive exam without coaching. This belief has gradually become so ingrained that the usefulness of school education is being questioned. Many families, putting a heavy financial burden on their families, send their children to expensive coaching classes. Thousands of students from small towns and rural areas migrate to cities considered coaching hubs. In this process, family savings, children's mental health, and social life are all affected. This situation isn't just a result of students' mindsets. It also reflects some genuine challenges within the education system. There's often a disconnect between the curriculum taught in schools and the requirements of competitive exams. Many competitive exams require topics outside the school curriculum, specialized reasoning skills, or exam-specific strategies. As a result, students and parents feel that school education alone is insufficient. The coaching industry capitalizes on this perception and presents itself as the key to success. However, it must be acknowledged that not all coaching institutes can be viewed with the same prism. Many institutes and teachers are sincerely providing quality guidance to students. They have provided opportunities to students who otherwise would not have access to better resources. Online education has made study materials accessible to millions of young people at low costs. Therefore, it would not be appropriate to portray the entire coaching sector negatively. The problem lies in the trend where public-

ty, personality cults, and unrealistic claims take center stage over education. In the age of social media, some teachers have established themselves as brands. Their videos, posts, and advertisements are constantly presented to students. Success stories are highlighted, while the number of students who fail is less discussed. It is often given the impression that joining a particular teacher or coaching institute guarantees success. However, the reality is that success in any exam depends on many factors—a student's hard work, family support, mental state, study resources, and time management are among them. Another worrying aspect is the growing personality-centric culture in education. Some teachers seem more focused on self-promotion than on their subject or institution. Huge billboards, constant advertising, social media campaigns, and the resources spent on personal image-building raise the question: is the student the center of education, or the teacher's brand? The goal of education should be the dissemination of knowledge, not the blind imitation of a personality. The comparison of Hindi-medium and English-medium coaching culture has also been a topic of discussion. It's often suggested that some Hindi-medium teachers rely heavily on publicity, while English-medium institutions prioritize institutional recognition. While this distinction isn't entirely accurate, it's clear that the trend toward personal branding through social media is more pronounced in certain areas. This also impacts students, who become more influenced by popularity and follower counts than the quality of content. The role of the government and education regulators is also crucial in this entire scenario. If school education is strong enough to provide basic preparation for competitive exams, excessive reliance on coaching will naturally decrease. The National Education Policy has made efforts to make school education more skill-based and practical, but the impact of these reforms will take time to be felt on a widespread scale.

# Iran's inflation hits World War II levels, deepening economic pain

Dubai: Year-on-year inflation in Iran reached a level in May unseen since World War II, underlining the economic pain average Iranians face as the Islamic Republic worries about the war with Israel and the United States restarting. A report Monday by Iran's Central Bank represents the first official acknowledgement of what Iranians shopping, paying for a taxi or visiting a medical clinic already know: The rial currency is battered by the war and uncertainty around it resuming. Meanwhile, longtime problems of economic mismanagement and government corruption also appear to be dragging down Iran's oil-backed economy as it remains under a US naval blockade. Economic pressure in the past has sparked nationwide protests, something Iran's theocracy has been trying to avoid since a crackdown on demonstrators in January killed over 7,000 people, according to activists' estimates. But even as hard-liners hold gun-handling workshops and organise marriages under the shadow of a ballistic missile to bolster spirits, experts note that new



demonstrations could emerge if people find themselves priced out of feeding their families. "I have no doubt that if Trump leaves (Iran without a formal peace deal)... most probably, we will see something like January by the end of summer because of the economic and social situations," analyst Mohsen Jalilvand said in a video published by Iran's Farar news website. "We will definitely have higher prices" Iran's Central Bank said the consumer price index, which measures a basket of goods and services, reached 77.2 per cent in May com-

pared to the year before. It added that the rate is 8.5 per cent higher than in April. Inflation in daily and general needs — like medicine, taxi fares, tobacco and communication fees — rose 113.8 per cent from the year before. Iran only saw worse inflation in 1942 during World War II, sparked by the British and Soviets invading the country and taking over its railway, disrupting food supplies. The lack of food, worsened by a poor harvest, sparked hyperinflation and a famine. Hunger and a typhus outbreak killed many. A private economic

think tank in Iran, the Bamdad Institute of Economic Studies, described the current figures as "an unprecedented rate since World War II." Iran's Central Bank did not acknowledge the significance of the figures. Airstrikes this year have greatly damaged Iranian businesses and its oil industry. Meanwhile, the US blockade has been targeting Iranian crude oil shipments trying to reach the international market, a key source of hard revenue. Tax revenues have been depressed by businesses

struggling even after the fighting paused. The rial, which traded at 32,000 to USD 1 in 2015, now trades at over 1.7 million to USD 1. "We will definitely have higher prices," Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian warned in May. "We are fighting, and we must accept this hardship."

## PAST ECONOMIC WOES HAVE LED TO PROTESTS

In 2017 and 2018, rising food prices sparked demonstrations that killed over 20 people and saw hundreds arrested. An increase in government-subsidised gasoline prices caused protests that saw over 300 people reportedly killed. Then came the protests over the rial at the start of this year, the most intense demonstrations to shake the Islamic Republic since its 1979 revolution and the chaotic years that followed. Tehran-based economist Saeed Leilaz, speaking to The Associated Press, warned that annual inflation in Iran could reach 80 per cent. "Iran's society cannot tolerate above 25 per cent annual inflation, he said.

# Stock markets tumble in early trade; Sensex tanks 700 points

Mumbai: Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty tumbled in early trade on Wednesday, June 3, amid uncertainty related to US-Iran negotiations, fresh spike in crude oil prices and persistent foreign fund outflows. The 30-share BSE Sensex tanked 699.74 points to 73,959.48 in early trade. The 50-share NSE Nifty dropped 177.40 points to 23,302.50. From the 30-Sensex firms, Tata Consultancy Services, Tech Mahindra, Infosys, HCL Tech, ITC and Eternal were among the biggest laggards. IT stocks fell sharply amid profit-taking after rallying in the past few days. Meanwhile, Maruti, Adani Ports, Asian Paints and Bharti Airtel were the gainers from the blue-chip pack. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, traded 0.89 per cent higher at USD 96.85 per barrel. "The mild escalation in the West Asia conflict has again pushed up Brent crude price to close to USD 97 indicating no respite to India from the energy shock," VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Investments Limited, said. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 8,362.92 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data. "At present, investor sentiment remains cautious and



highly sensitive to incoming developments. The lack of tangible progress in US-Iran negotiations, elevated crude oil prices and continued foreign fund outflows continue to reinforce a risk-off environment," Ponnudi R, CEO of Enrich Money, an online trading and wealth-tech firm, said. Meanwhile, the US Trade Representative has proposed slapping 12.5 per cent additional duties on 54 countries, including India, for failing to prohibit the import of goods produced with forced labour. The action follows investigations launched against 60 countries over what the USTR described as their failure to impose and effectively enforce bans on imports made with forced labour. "The failure of our most important trading partners to address the importation of goods made with forced

labour is unacceptable. This creates a dynamic where American workers are forced to compete globally on an uneven playing field," US Trade Representative Ambassador Jamieson Greer said in a statement. In Asian markets, Japan's Nikkei 225 index and Shanghai's SSE Composite index quoted higher, while Hong Kong's Hang Seng index traded lower. US markets ended in positive territory on Tuesday. "Overnight, the S&P 500 closed at a fresh record high, while Japan's Nikkei scaled new lifetime highs, reflecting continued confidence in global growth and technology-led earnings momentum," Hariprasad K, Research Analyst and Founder, Livelong Wealth, said. Vijayakumar said that the bull run in semiconductor giants South Korea and Taiwan continues unabated.

# INDIA FACES FRESH US TARIFF THREAT OVER FORCED LABOUR VIOLATIONS

Hyderabad: The United States has named India among 54 economies it says have failed to prohibit imports of goods produced using forced labour, proposing additional duties of up to 12.5 per cent, even as trade officials from both countries are meeting in New Delhi to advance a bilateral trade agreement. The Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) released findings from 60 investigations conducted under Section 301 of the US Trade Act of 1974. India figures in a list of economies that, Washington says, lack adequate measures to prevent the entry of goods made through forced labour.



mechanism for textiles and apparel would allow specified import volumes from select economies at a lower Section 301 rate. US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer said the failure of trading partners to act on forced-labour imports was creating an uneven playing field for American workers. The other 53 economies named alongside India include China, Japan, the United Kingdom, Australia, Brazil, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), South Korea, Vietnam and Bangladesh, among others. A separate group of

six economies — Canada, Mexico, Indonesia, Ecuador and Pakistan — was cited for failing to effectively enforce existing prohibitions. Trade talks continue despite headwinds. The USTR action comes as a US trade delegation is in New Delhi for a three-day round of discussions aimed at finalising the first phase of a bilateral trade agreement (BTA). Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal said on Monday, June 1, that most of the agreement was in place. "Mostly everything is finalised. As you know, US Ambassador Sergio

Gor said that 99 per cent of the things have been finalised. Discussions are going on about small issues, commas and full stops," he said, adding that India and the US would sign the first tranche of the BTA "as soon as possible." However, the deal is unlikely to be concluded before there is clarity on the tariff structure the Trump administration plans to adopt once the temporary 10 per cent levy lapses next month. India faces two ongoing Section 301 probes, one on alleged overcapacity in sectors such as solar modules, steel and aluminium, and the other on forced-labour-linked imports. The two sides had reached an interim arrangement in early February, but a subsequent US court ruling disrupted the tariff plan, slowing progress. # King told me Post Office scandal was 'dreadful', says oldest victim

The oldest surviving victim of the Post Office scandal has said the King told her it was a "dreadful thing" and "should never have happened". Betty Brown said King Charles III made the comment as she received her OBE at Windsor Castle on Tuesday. The 93-year-old said she asked His Majesty to talk to the prime minister about ensuring those responsible for hundreds of sub-postmasters being wrongfully prosecuted would be investigated by the police and brought to justice. She described meeting the monarch and receiving the honour as "lovely", adding she "never ever dreamt that this would happen". "The reason that I'm here is very sad and I don't forget that. All the heart ache of the families that this has destroyed, the heart ache of children left with nothing, that still hurts, it'll always hurt," she added. She has dedicated the honour to "all the sub postmasters that we have lost". Mrs Brown was one of hundreds of sub-postmasters wrongfully accused of stealing or false accounting between 1999 and 2015 after a faulty IT system called Horizon made it



look like money was missing from branch accounts. The scandal has been described as one of the widest miscarriages of justice in the British legal history. The pensioner was forced out of her County Durham Post Office in 2003 - despite her late husband Oswald having paid more than £50,000 of their savings to cover non-existent shortfalls. They had run the branch together since 1985. Mrs Brown was appointed Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) for her services to justice after campaigning for sub-postmasters affected by the scandal. She told the BBC the King was "very knowledgeable all about Horizon". "I said to

was "an appalling injustice" and that it was "considering requests for further funding". Mrs Brown said she was "honoured and humbled" to be made an OBE, adding she had finally "been heard by the system" and was "pleased that the public are still learning about this". "A lot of them think we've had compensation, we haven't had a penny compensation. We've had what they call redress, which means they've given back the money to us that they stole from us," she said. Mrs Brown was one of the original 555 victims who took part in the landmark group legal action led by Sir Alan against the Post Office. Her branch had been one of the most successful in the region but eventually she had to sell it at a loss. Talking about what happened, she previously said it "absolutely destroyed my whole life". Both Mrs Brown and Sir Alan Bates were part of the Group Litigation Order compensation scheme, and those claimants were offered the option of taking a fixed sum of £75,000 or pursuing their own settlement.

# US AND IRAN LAUNCH NEW STRIKES, AS KUWAIT SAYS AIRPORT HIT BY IRANIAN DRONES

The US military has said it launched "self-defence" strikes on Iran overnight, and shot down ballistic missiles and drones fired at ships and Gulf countries. The strikes on Qeshm Island, in the Strait of Hormuz, were "in response to attempted attacks by Iran across the Middle East", US Central Command (Centcom) said. Centcom said Iran had fired two missiles at Kuwait and three at Bahrain, all of which broke apart or were intercepted. Iran said it had attacked US bases and helicopters in a "regional country" using missiles and drones in retaliation. One person was killed in Kuwait and more than 60 injured when drones hit buildings including its international airport, officials said. Kuwait's defence ministry spokesman, Brig Gen Saud Abdulaziz Al-Otaibi, called the attack "criminal Iranian aggression", while the Kuwaiti foreign min-



istry later said infrastructure including diplomatic missions had been damaged. Centcom said the strike on Qeshm Island had targeted an Iranian military ground control station. It said the US also shot down three attack drones that had been launched by Iran toward "civilian mariners that were rightfully transiting regional waters". Centcom had earlier said it had struck and "disabled" an unladen oil tanker that was sailing

towards Iran, as part of the US naval blockade on the Strait of Hormuz, which began on 13 April. A US aircraft fired a Hellfire missile into the engine room of the Botswana-flagged M/T vessel, after its crew "ignored repeated warnings", it said. Iran's Islamic Revolution Guard Corps (IRGC) said "disrupting the security of the Strait of Hormuz will carry a heavy price for the aggressive US military". A foreign ministry statement said the leaders of Kuwait

and Bahrain had "direct and unmistakable responsibility" for "last night's acts of aggression", according to the AFP news agency, as it condemned the US for the strikes. Iran has repeatedly attacked targets in Bahrain and Kuwait, where US military bases are located. The attacks happened as ceasefire negotiations between the US and Iran stalled, with a deal to end the war failing to advance over the weekend. US President

Donald Trump this week told his critics to "sit back and relax", saying that Iran "really wants to make a deal, and it will be a good one for the USA". US media earlier reported that Trump had requested edits to the terms of a potential peace deal, after meeting with senior aides to discuss extending the framework of a ceasefire. The changes related to the Strait of Hormuz and the removal of highly enriched uranium from Iran, the BBC's US news partner CBS News reported - as well as a framework to reopen negotiations on Iran's nuclear programme. On Monday, Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Esmail Baghaei denied this had been on the table, adding that Washington was "constantly changing its views and putting forward new or contradictory demands". In an interview aired on Wednesday, Trump said Iran had "already agreed" to not have a nuclear

weapon. Trump said Iran's supreme leader, Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei, was "involved" in the talks. "We seem to be getting along quite well," Trump told the Pod Force One podcast. Asked if he would like to meet him, he said: "I'd like to meet him. We probably will meet at some point, depending on how it all works out." US Secretary of State Marco Rubio told Congress on Tuesday that negotiators had not offered Iran sanctions relief in exchange for reopening the strait. "Right now, everything that's been discussed with them is that ... any sanctions relief is condition-based, which means it has to be in return for the reason why those sanctions were put in place in the first place, which is their nuclear programme," he said. "The war is over," he said in another tense exchange with a senator, as lawmakers on the committee questioned the US strategy for ending the conflict.

## Shell pumped oil through Nigeria pipeline for years despite pollution evidence, documents show



British multinational Shell continued operating a major oil pipeline in Nigeria for years even though it knew it was causing widespread pollution - despite a warning from its own staff and its own technical standards, internal documents obtained by the BBC show. The files, including emails and presentations, reveal that a senior Shell executive cautioned as early as 2008 about the risks of continuing to pump millions of barrels of unrefined fuel through one of the company's main pipelines in Africa's biggest oil producer while it was subject to massive and destructive uncontrolled theft and infrastructure fail-

ures. Across Nigeria's oil-rich southern Niger Delta, decades of oil spills have left a landscape deeply scarred, with wetlands increasingly coated in crude and contaminated sediment. The BBC obtained the internal documents after Shell disclosed them as part of ongoing legal proceedings in the UK brought by communities living around the creeks and mangroves of the Niger Delta, who want Shell to be liable for the pollution caused by more than 100 leaks stemming from theft and illegal refining of oil between 2011 and 2013 that have damaged their health, environment and livelihoods.

## Seven killed after drone hits bus in Russia-controlled part of Ukraine



Seven people have been killed and 11 others injured after a drone hit a passenger bus travelling through a Russia-controlled part of Ukraine, an official said. Denis Pushilin, the Kremlin-installed leader of Ukraine's eastern Donetsk region, said the bus was struck in the early hours of Wednesday as it was travelling between Moscow and Simferopol, in Russian-occupied Crimea. Black smoke could also be seen rising over St Petersburg on Wednesday morning, with Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky confirming the city's oil terminal had been hit. The attack comes as the city hosts the annual International Economic Forum, an event designed to showcase Russia to the world. The strikes come a day after a massive Russian assault on cities across Ukraine killed at least 22 people, including several women and children. On the drone which hit the bus in Donetsk, Pushilin said: "In Yenakiyev, a UAV attacked a Moscow-Simferopol coach; according to preliminary

reports, seven civilians were killed." He added the 11 injured people were receiving medical care. Russian investigators said they had opened a criminal case into what they described as a "terrorist attack" on civilians. Svetlana Petrenko, spokesperson for the Russian Investigative Committee, said authorities were working to establish the identities of those responsible for the strike. Fifty-three people had been registered to travel on the bus, Reuters reports, however, none of the victims' identities have been released yet. Andriy Kovalenko, the head of the Ukrainian government's centre for combating disinformation, has talked about a "parallel reality" created by Russian state propaganda, while not explicitly denying claims that the strike took place. "Russia attacks civilians with drones all the time... of course, when everyone is talking about this, when there is evidence of such actions by the Russians, they use their main propaganda tool: creating a parallel reality."

## Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass advances to run-off in race to run California's biggest city

Incumbent Democratic Mayor Karen Bass has advanced to November's run-off election to determine who will run California's largest city, Los Angeles. With votes still being counted late on Tuesday night, Bass was first to go through, according to a projection by the BBC's US partner CBS News, but it remains unclear who she may face. It could be either her fellow Democrat, city council member Nithya Raman, or the Republican newcomer and reality television star Spencer Pratt. The winner will lead the second-largest city in the US, grappling with issues like homelessness and affordable housing as Los Angeles gears up to host the 2028 Olympics. The



election was one of many primaries across California, Iowa, New Jersey and New Mexico on Tuesday that will shape the midterm elections that will happen across the country in November. Meanwhile, votes were still being counted late on Tuesday in the California governor's primary race, where the top two contenders will likewise move forward to the November general election.

## Israel strikes southern Lebanon but partial truce with Hezbollah appears to hold

Israel continued its attacks in southern Lebanon on Tuesday, but did not strike Beirut following a partial ceasefire agreement with the Iran-backed armed group Hezbollah. Lebanon said that, under an agreement announced by US President Donald Trump late on Monday, Israeli forces would not bomb the capital in exchange for Hezbollah not attacking Israel. It came after Iran said Israeli action in Lebanon jeopardised talks on a deal to end its war with the US. Following the ceasefire announcement, the Israeli military said it had intercepted two projectiles fired into northern Israel. Hezbollah said it had attacked Israeli forces in southern Lebanon, where officials reported deadly Israeli strikes. The Lebanese health ministry also



said four people had been killed and 127 injured when Israeli air strikes hit buildings next to Jabal Amel hospital in the city of Tyre on Monday afternoon. Thirty-nine hospital staff were among the injured, with four in a critical condition. What remained in the area outside the hospital on Tuesday was utter devastation. Chunks of concrete and twisted metal were scattered across the area. The beeping of

## Ukrainian drones hit St Petersburg as Putin's flagship economic forum opens

Ukraine has carried out a strike on the outskirts of Russia's St Petersburg, hours before the opening of a major economic forum designed to attract foreign investment into the country. As dawn broke black plumes of smoke rose over Russia's second city, where Vladimir Putin is due to address the financial event on Friday. Thousands of guests from 130 countries are due to attend, including a low-key US delegation. Local authorities said air defences shot down 59 drones overnight and that three different districts of St Petersburg had been hit, although no one was killed. Kremlin



spokesman Dmitry Peskov said Moscow would respond to the strikes. "Our responses will be systemic in nature," he said on Wednesday. Mobile internet was disrupted and St Petersburg's Pulkovo Airport was temporarily

closed, while some regions of nearby Latvia and Estonia also issued air raid alerts. Hours later, Volodymyr Zelensky confirmed Ukrainian drones had hit several locations in Russia, including the oil terminal and a naval base in the near-

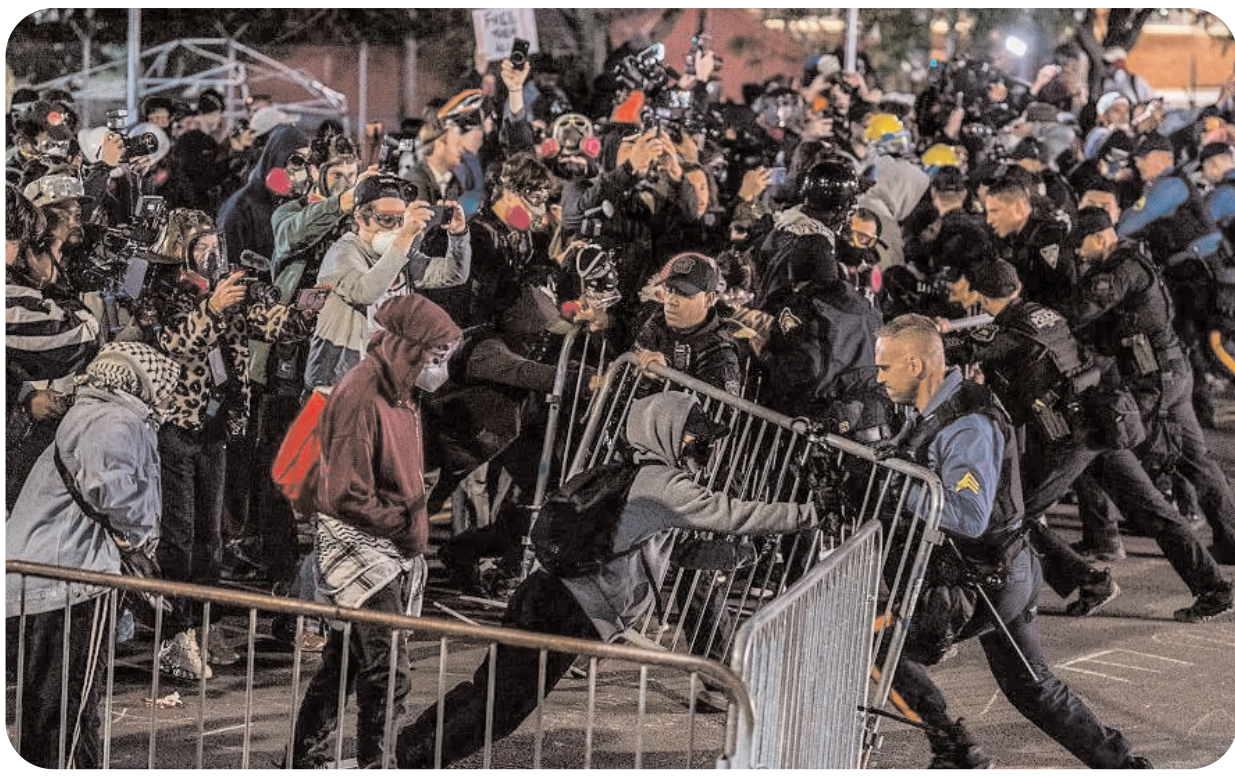
by town of Kronstadt. "The Ukrainian plan of long-range sanctions is being implemented exactly as it is needed to bring peace closer," Zelensky wrote on social media, using a euphemism for long-distance strikes on Russia. Kronstadt is the main outpost of the Russian Navy's Baltic Fleet. Unverified videos posted on social media by Ukrainian military figures showed drones heading for docked military ships, with the video cutting off before impact. Robert Brovdi, the commander of Ukraine's unmanned systems, said on Telegram that the corvette Boikiy was struck.

## Putin remains uncompromising on Ukraine, but is public discourse on war changing in Russia?



If Vladimir Putin's Russia had an official slogan, what would it be? "Russia is what it is, and we're not ashamed of showing it," Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov once told me in an interview. That fits. But I recently heard an updated version from veteran pop and folk singer Nadezhda Babkina. After receiving an award from President Putin, Babkina told an audience in the Kremlin: "Russia will never surrender thanks to our remarkable, multi-ethnic genetic code... that holds us all together. 'Anyone who doesn't like that,' she added, 'can go and poison themselves.' In many ways, the line 'they can go and poison themselves' encapsulates Russia in 2026 - unapologetic, unrepentant and uncompromising. Like Vladimir Putin himself. Since ordering the mass invasion of Ukraine, the Kremlin leader has displayed no regret, no remorse over his decision to attack Russia's neighbour - and no intention of ceasing hostilities. This week Russia launched another massive

missile and drone strike across Ukraine. The attack came on the eve of the annual St Petersburg International Economic Forum, an event designed to showcase Russia to the world. High-profile Western investors and politicians have long stopped coming. But the organisers say that delegations from more than 130 countries and territories will attend. For a country seeking foreign investment, more than four years of war with its neighbour doesn't seem the best advertisement. But, as we have established, "Russia is what it is". Forum or no forum, the attacks on Ukraine continue. President Putin's public position on the war is unwavering. He continues to demand that Ukraine cede control to Russia of the entire Donbas region. Vladimir Putin has not changed. But one thing in the Kremlin has. And that is to do with Donald Trump. Last year Russian officials appeared confident that the US president would help deliver a Ukraine peace deal on Moscow's terms.

Celine Dion has said she is "heartbroken" by the death of R&B singer Peabo Bryson, with whom she sang the hit theme from 1991 Disney film Beauty and the Beast. "His incredible voice and his kind spirit embodied the beauty of song and performance," Dion said. The pair won a Grammy Award for their duet on the beloved movie's title song, and Bryson repeated that feat the following year for his performance of another classic Disney

theme, A Whole New World from Aladdin with Regina Belle. Bryson died at the age of 75 on Tuesday surrounded by family and loved ones, his family said. A cause of death has not been released publicly, but Bryson suffered a stroke over the weekend and had been receiving medical care. The veteran R&B singer was the voice behind hits that spanned from the 1970s to 2010s, including Feel the Fire, I'm So Into You, Can You Stop the Rain.



## Virat Kohli's Mic-Drop "Ek Bihari" Message To Vaibhav Sooryavanshi Breaks Internet

Virat Kohli, who led Royal Challengers Bengaluru's charge in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2026 final, had a heartwarming chat with Vaibhav Sooryavanshi—the player who set the entire tournament on fire after the title clash in Ahmedabad. Kohli, a multiple-time Orange Cap winner himself, watched the 15-year-old Sooryavanshi take home his maiden Orange Cap after amassing an incredible 776 runs this season. As a gruelling season filled with 200+ team totals and gigantic sixes came to a conclusion, Kohli offered some simple and straightforward advice to the Rajasthan Royals teenager. Sharing a video of the interaction at the Narendra Modi Stadium on Sunday, RCB highlighted how the veteran stalwart urged the teenage prodigy not to rest on his laurels but to strive for sustained excel-

lence. Since the start of the IPL season, Sooryavanshi has been the center of social media chatter. His explosive exploits in the 2026 season have even prompted some of India's finest former cricketers to call for his fast-tracked inclusion into the national T20I squad. Kohli, however, wants the young opening batter to block out the noise. "Yaha se upar jaana hai. Jo hua hai vo achi mehnat ki wajah se, belief ki wajah se hua hai. Abhi kaun kya bol raha hai, kaise bol raha hai.. (nahi sunna hai). Ek Bihari sab pe bhari, phir khatam game," Kohli said in the video. The message roughly translates to: "You have to go even higher from here. Whatever you have achieved is because of your hard work and self-belief. Do not pay attention to who is saying what or how they are saying it. One Bihari is heavy

on everyone, then the game is over." While Kohli took home the IPL trophy, as RCB defeated the Gujarat Titans in the final, Sooryavanshi bagged majority of the individual honours. The teenage opener hit 72 maximums, setting a new all-time record for a single IPL season. He struck 776 runs at an average of 48.50 accompanied by a staggering strike rate of 237.30. He became the first batter in any T20 tournament globally to score over 500 runs in the powerplay in a single season. In the 43-second clip, Kohli is seen reminding Sooryavanshi that everything he has achieved so far has come through hard work and belief, before urging the teenager to ignore the outside noise and keep aiming higher. "Yaha se upar jana hai. Jo huya hai woh achi mehnat aur belief ke wajah se huya. Kaun kya bol raha hai, kaise

bol raha hai... Ek Bihari sab pe bhaari. Khatam game (From here, you only go higher. Whatever has happened is because of your hard work and belief. Doesn't matter what people say or how they say it. A Bihari beats them all. End of story)," he said as Sooryavanshi listened to the India legend. RCB captioned the video with a special message for the 15-year-old. The best piece of advice the 15-year-old Vaibhav Sooryavanshi could get! And who better than Virat Kohli to help fuel his fire in the right direction. Onwards and upwards, Vaibhav!" This wasn't the first Kohli-Sooryavanshi moment to grab attention during IPL 2026. The former India captain had met the wonderkid after RCB's match against Rajasthan Royals in

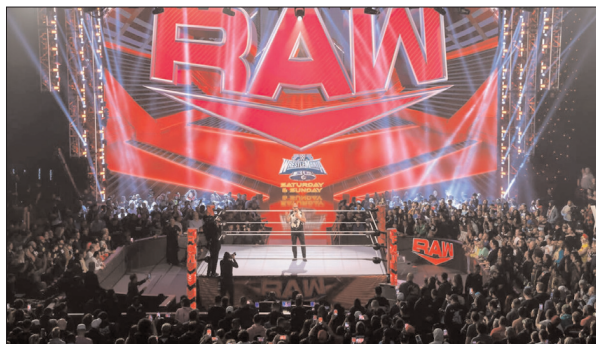

Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa delivered another stunning blow to hometown hero and world No. 1 Magnus Carlsen, defeating the Norwegian in classical chess for the second time at Norway Chess 2026 on Tuesday. The result didn't just boost Praggnanandhaa's bid to become the first Indian champion of the prestigious tournament but also made him the first Indian to have beaten Carlsen twice in classical games in the same tournament. He is also the first player to have beaten the World No. 1 twice in classical games this year. Carlsen could do little but accept the young Indian Grandmaster's excellence as he shook his hands and left the table with nothing but disappointment on his face. In the video, Carlsen could be seen shaking his head as he stood up



after losing the game. The Norwegian didn't take long before leaving the area, having seen Praggnanandhaa better him twice in this competition. Carlsen has endured an uncharacteristically turbulent campaign, suffering four classical defeats, including two at

the hands of the Indian prodigy, who has emerged as one of the biggest challengers to the Norwegian's long-standing dominance. At the top of the standings, American Grandmaster Wesley So continued his impressive run, defeating Germany's Vincent Keymer in the Armageddon tie-break to extend his lead to 14 points. France's Alireza Firouzja climbed to sole second on 13 points after outplaying reigning world champion D. Gukesh in their classical encounter. The defeat effectively ended Gukesh's hopes of lifting the Norway Chess crown. Stuck on eight points, the Indian can reach a maximum of only 14 points even if he wins his remaining two games in classical format, a tally unlikely to be enough to challenge for the title.

## French Open: Alexander Zverev Powers Into Semi-Finals, Marta Kostyuk To Face Mirra Andreeva



Alexander Zverev breezed past Rafael Jodar to stay on course for an elusive Grand Slam title at the French Open, where Marta Kostyuk and Mirra Andreeva will meet for a place in the women's final. Zverev, the highest-ranked player left in the men's draw, put an end to Spanish teenager Jodar's impressive Roland Garros debut, easing to a 7-6 (7/3), 6-1, 6-3 win on Tuesday. The 29-year-old Zverev is the clear favourite for a maiden Grand Slam title. He has finished runner-up on three occasions, including at the 2024 French Open. "I want to win the matches that are ahead of me, that is my goal, that is my aim," said Zverev, who has only dropped one set en route to the last four. It is the fifth time in six years he has made it to this stage in Paris. "I'm happy to be in the semi-finals for now," he added. Zverev will play the winner of the

night-time encounter between Brazilian sensation Joao Fonseca and Czech youngster Jakub Mensik. For Jodar, the grind of back-to-back five-setters appeared to take its toll as he struggled to cope after blowing a 5-2 lead in the opening set. The 19-year-old Jodar was featuring at just his second major. He was ranked 707th in the world this time last year, losing in the first and second rounds of second-tier Challenger events in the United States during the 2025 French Open. Both Fonseca and Mensik will be playing in their first Grand Slam quarter-final later on Tuesday. Fonseca, 19, backed up his third-round win over Novak Djokovic by beating two-time Roland Garros finalist Casper Ruud. He is the first Brazilian man to reach the French Open last eight since three-time champion Gustavo Kuerten.

## Pat Cummins' IPL Shocker, SRH Captain May Skip Entire 2027 Edition



Hyderabad captain Pat Cummins, who is Australia's Test skipper, may skip next year's Indian Premier League due to a tight international schedule. The Cummins-led SRH finished as the fourth-best team in the league after getting knocked out of the IPL 2026 Eliminator by Rajasthan Royals. Australia's next Test series is

against Bangladesh in August. "Something has got to give at some stage next year and it's not going to be Test matches or an ODI World Cup," Cummins told Sydney Morning Herald. "I will make a call a lot closer and work with the franchise to see what makes sense. Things can change. I've had a couple of injuries pop up, so I don't really want to lock in anything. The priorities for me are always the Test matches and that ODI World Cup. I dare

say if I play all of India, I need some sort of break before a pretty gruelling Ashes series." The workload of star pace trio - Cummins, Mitchell Starc and Josh Hazlewood is in focus. They could be rested alternatively during the four-Test series against New Zealand in December and January. "Yeah it's possible. I think we're fairly open-minded to anything, as we've seen over the last couple of years," Cummins said. "Whether it's a home Test or an away Test, we don't see them as that different. A Test match is a Test match. We're pretty realistic

that we're going to need more than three fast bowlers. I see a world where we're potentially winding some bowlers down, even say at the back end of an Indian series if they don't look like they're going to play, to give them an extra rest ahead of the Ashes. I've played one [Test] in the last 12 months, so I'm feeling a lot fresher than maybe some of the other guys, but these are big series. It's going to be a big push the next 18 months or so, but I think we'll look back on it hopefully and see it as one of the more rewarding periods of our career."

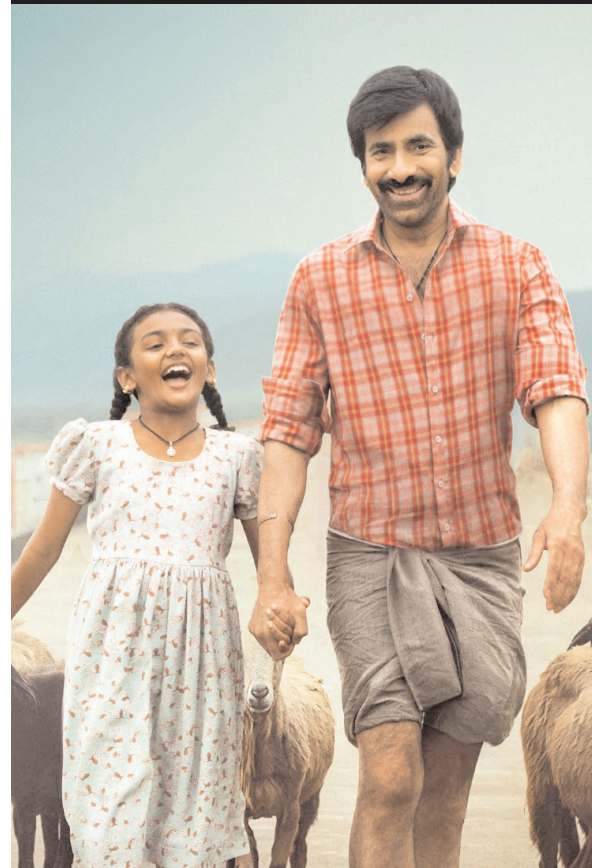
