Telangana Congress bans milk, water ablations during party events

Hyderabad (TSIT): Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) has banned milk and water ablations during party programmes, party sources said on Thursday. The ruling party has also banned garlanding leaders with JCBs and bulldozers. State Congress Chief Mahesh Kumar Goud has issued instructions to the party cadres not to perform 'palaabhishekam' (milk ablations) and 'jalabhishekam' (water ablations) under any circumstances at any Congress party programme, irrespective of the occasion or venue. He said that such programmes go against the principles of the Congress party. He warned that those violating the party directions would face disciplinary action. TPCC Vice-President T. Kumar Rao on Thursday issued a circular in this regard. It states that the decisions have been taken in accordance with the directions of AICC In-Charge for Telangana, Meenakshi Natrajan.

India, EU come together to create semi conductor behemoth

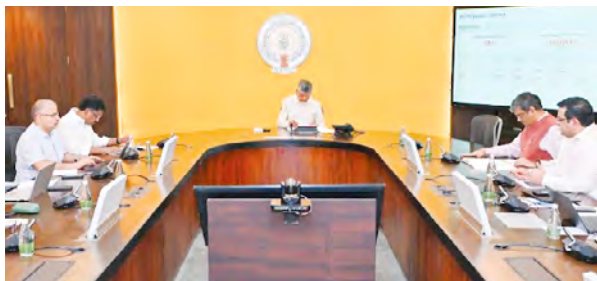

CS Sanjay Jaju Calls for Faster School Admissions Better Public Services



Hyderabad, July 16 (TSIT): Chief Secretary Sanjay Jaju on Thursday directed District Collectors to intensify efforts to increase student enrolment in government schools, expedite drinking water infrastructure works and strengthen preparedness to prevent seasonal diseases across Telangana.

Reviewing the Education Department through a video conference with District Collectors Chief Secretary instructed officials to closely monitor admissions in government and local body schools, pre-

primary sections, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) and Telangana Model Schools for the 2026-27 academic year. He asked Collectors to conduct daily reviews, ensure timely recruitment of teachers and staff, complete procurement of learning materials and furniture, and update all student data in the UDISE portal without delay.

Jaju also directed officials to fill all vacant seats in KGBVs and Telangana Model Schools and work with public representatives, teachers and parents to boost enrolment. He reviewed the progress of

Young India Integrated Residential Schools and instructed authorities to speed up construction works. He further directed that all centralized kitchens be completed by September 30 to provide nutritious meals to students.

Reviewing drinking water projects, the Chief Secretary asked officials to accelerate pending works under the AMRUT 2.0 scheme, including pipelines, overhead tanks and distribution networks, while ensuring uninterrupted supply of safe drinking water in both urban and rural areas.

Telangana MLC's son among three allegedly caught consuming drugs

Hyderabad (TSIT) : Son of a Member of Telangana Legislative Council and two other youth were caught for allegedly consuming drugs but the MLC denied that his son consumed drugs or he was arrested.

Bharat Raj Reddy, Abhishek and Yuniti were reportedly caught



during a police raid in Mangalhat area on Wednesday night. The raid was reportedly conducted following a tip-off that a group was allegedly involved in purchase and consumption of marijuana

and hash oil. While three persons were apprehended during the raid, four others managed to escape. Police have seized 24 grams of hash oil and 22 grams of marijuana. The trio were taken to Mangalhat Police Station, where their blood samples were collected. They were subsequently shifted to Osmania General Hospital for medical examination. Police registered a case and launched further investigation.

Speaking at the District Vigilance and Monitoring Committee meeting chaired by District Collector Hemanta Keshav

Patil on Thursday, the MP said there should be no compromise on the welfare, safety and social justice of SCs and STs. He instructed officials to complete investigations without delay and ensure victims receive compensation and legal assistance as per norms.

The committee reviewed cases registered under the Protection of Civil Rights Act and the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act across the district. Superintendent of Police Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil said atrocity cases are being investigated on priority with strict legal action against the accused.

JAC SEEKS WOMEN'S QUOTA

Hyderabad: The Women's Reservation Joint Action Committee (JAC) on Thursday urged TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud to support the immediate implementation of 33% reservation for women in Parliament and State Legislative Assemblies without linking it to the census or delimitation process. A delegation of women's organisations submitted a memorandum requesting the Congress party to bring a constitutional amendment during the upcoming Monsoon Session of Parliament.

Congress Distorting Facts on Sitarama Project

khammam town (TSIT); Former minister Puvvada Ajay Kumar accused the Congress government of making false claims about the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project while ignoring the work carried out during the previous BRS regime.

Responding to the remarks made by Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on the project, Ajay alleged that the Indira Sagar and Rajiv Sagar projects launched during the Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy government were marred by corruption and financial irregularities. He claimed that public funds were misused in the name of

the Jalayagnam programme through mobilisation advances, leaving the projects incomplete. Ajay said that after the formation of Telangana, the K. Chandrashekar Rao government redesigned the project as the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project with the objective of providing irrigation to nearly 10 lakh acres by utilising Godavari waters. He claimed that the BRS government spent around 9,000 crore and completed major components, including over 100 km of main canals, pump houses, pipelines, transmission systems and installation of high-capacity motors.

Seetakka urges farmers to grow alternative crops

Mulugu, July 16: Panchayat Raj, Rural Water Supply and Women & Child Welfare Minister Danasari Anasuya (Seetakka) called for the protection of forests and urged farmers to cultivate alternative crops instead of paddy in view of the current monsoon conditions. The Minister inaugurated a scientific beekeeping training programme for women self-help groups at Gonnepalli village in Tadwai mandal on Thursday under the



Indira Mahila Shakti Livelihood Programme. District Collector Borkhade Hemant Sahadeva Rao, SP Sudhir Ramnath Kekan, DFO Vikas Meena and ITDA Project Officer Naveen Vatsal Topppo were present.

Seetakka said forests are vital for human survival and highlighted the health benefits of forest produce such as natural honey and traditional leaf plates. She urged farmers to cultivate pulses, green gram and maize, saying these crops would have better market demand. She also said the government is providing interest-free loans to women self-help groups to strengthen livelihoods and promote rural entrepreneurship.

She directed BLOs and monitoring officers to ensure the SIR programme is carried out in a transparent, accurate and efficient manner while meeting all targets on schedule.

DGP calls for AI-led fight against cyber crime

Hyderabad: Director General of Police C.V. Anand has described cyber crime as Telangana's biggest policing challenge and called for greater use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and advanced technologies to combat digital fraud.

Reviewing the functioning of the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) on Thursday, the DGP said cyber frauds are causing severe financial losses to families and urged police to strengthen technology-driven investigations. He inspected the Cyber Lab, Security Operations Centre, Digital Forensic Unit and other wings, besides witnessing a demonstration of the AI-powered Cyber Call Centre. Officials informed



him that Telangana recorded a 20 per cent reduction in financial losses due to cyber fraud in 2025, while the amount frozen in fraudsters' bank accounts increased to Rs.279 crore. The State also ranked first in India with 21,639 cyber-crime FIRs registered. The DGP urged citizens to report cyber fraud immediately through the 1930 helpline or the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal and avoid sharing banking credentials with strangers.

TRP backs Wangchuk's protest

Jogulamba Gadwal (TSIT): The Telangana Rajyadhikara Party (TRP), Jogulamba Gadwal district unit, has extended its support to the peaceful democratic protest led by educationist and environmental activist Sonam Wangchuk and appealed to students, youth and citizens to participate in the proposed 'Chalo Sansad' march in New Delhi on July 20.



Addressing a press conference, TRP District President Morugu Veeresh said the party

was supporting the movement under the guidance of State President Teenmaar Mallana. He said democratic governments should respond to people's concerns through dialogue and constitutional means.

Veeresh urged the Union Government to hold discussions with Wangchuk and other representatives over their demands, including constitutional safeguards for

Ladakh and environmental protection. He also expressed support for demands seeking greater transparency in competitive examinations and accountability over alleged examination irregularities.

Reaffirming the party's solidarity, he appealed to citizens to participate peacefully in the Parliament march and strengthen the democratic movement.

DLSA promotes free legal aid



Mahabubabad TSIT District Correspondent Balne Suman July 16: The District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Mahabubabad, on Thursday urged people, particularly farmers and rural residents, to make use of the free legal services available to them.Speaking at a legal awareness camp held at Beruwada village in Kesamudram mandal, DLSA panel lawyers Y. Chennamalla Reddy and V. Raj Krishna stressed that everyone is equal before the law and advised farmers to keep their land records updated, preserve purchase bills for seeds and fertilizers, and utilise government-backed debt conversion schemes to escape high-interest private loans.

All Pending Projects to Be Completed on Priority

Khammam (TSIT): Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka said the Telangana government is committed to completing all pending irrigation projects on a war footing to ensure timely supply of irrigation water to farmers. He assured that funds required for land acquisition and contractors' bills would be released without delay to expedite the works.Bhatti, along with irrigation minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and revenue minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, inspected the ongoing tunnel works of the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project in Khammam district. Addressing the media later, the Deputy Chief Minister alleged that the previous BRS government had inflated project costs in the name of redesigning irrigation schemes, leading to large-scale waste of public money. He said the Congress government was rectifying those decisions and implementing the Sitarama



project in a more practical and beneficial manner. Bhatti recalled that the Indira Sagar and Rajiv Sagar projects, initiated during the Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy government to provide irrigation to nearly four lakh acres, were substantially completed before being redesigned into the Sitarama project. He alleged that the redesign increased the estimated project cost to nearly Rs.24,000 crore. He said the government had sanctioned Rs.100 crore for the Rajiv Link Canal to connect it with the NSP canal and Wyra reservoir. The Juhurupadu tunnel works are also being expedited to link the Munneru river with the Paleru, Wyra and Lankasagar reservoirs, enabling faster irrigation to Sattupalli and adjoining areas.The Deputy Chief Minister said the government had already released about Rs.1,000 crore towards project bills and approved the release of another Rs.135 crore required for land acquisition. He directed the collectors of Khammam and Bhadradi Kothagudem districts to expedite the land acquisition process and submit proposals without delay.

Collector Reviews SIR Enumeration Process in Shameerpet

Hyderabad TSIT : Medchal-Malkajgiri District Collector Mikkilineni Manu Choudhary on Thursday reviewed the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls in Shameerpet and directed Booth Level Officers (BLOs) to expedite the distribution and collection of enumeration forms while ensuring eligible voters receive the necessary assistance. During his inspection, the Collector interacted directly with BLOs and reviewed the progress of the enumeration exercise. He enquired about the total number of enumerations forms allotted to each BLO, the number of forms distributed to voters and the number of completed forms collected so far. The Collector also examined the digitisation process of the completed enu-



meration forms and instructed officials to ensure that the forms are uploaded without delay. He emphasised that timely digitisation is essential for the smooth and transparent completion of the Special Intensive Revision process. Manu Choudhary directed the BLOs to extend all necessary assistance to voters while filling out the enumeration forms and ensure that no eligible elector faces difficulty during the revision process. He stressed the importance of carrying out the exercise with accuracy, transparency and without the stipulated timeline.

New industries boost jobs in Medchal

Hyderabad: Telangana's industry-friendly policies have accelerated industrial growth in Medchal-Malkajgiri district, attracting investments and generating employment, according to District Industries Centre (DIC) General Manager D. Vinay Kumar. In an exclusive interview with The South India Times, he said the district has attracted investments of Rs.2,787.01 crore since April 2025, leading to the establishment of 456 new industries and creating employment for 11,258 people. Vinay Kumar said proposals for 783 more industries, involving investments of Rs.12,523 crore, are under consideration and are expected to generate nearly 46,356 jobs. He attributed the growth to Telangana's investor-friendly policies, faster



approvals and proactive government support. He said Medchal-Malkajgiri has emerged as a major industrial hub with clusters at Jeedimetla, Balanagar, Cherlapally, Uppal and other locations, housing engineering, pharmaceutical, electronics, food processing and manufacturing units. The district administration is also facilitating land availability to attract further investments and create more employment opportunities.

DMHO inspects central drug store

12 COVID Cases Reported in the State; Four Deaths Recorded

Visakhapatnam : COVID-19 cases are being reported sporadically across the state, and there is no need for the public to panic, said Medical and Health Department Secretary and Commissioner of Health and Family Welfare, Veera Pandiyan. He stated that a total of 12 COVID-19 cases have been reported in the state between June 26 and July 16. Of these, four patients died, and all of them had pre-existing serious health conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, kidney ailments, and other severe diseases. The first COVID-19 case of this year was reported in Kadapa district on June 26. Subsequently, 11 more cases were detected between July 1 and July 16. Of the total cases, Kadapa district recorded the highest number with eight cases, followed by Guntur with two cases, and Visakhapatnam and Kakinada with one case each. Officials clarified that these cases were reported from different areas and that there has

been no clustering of cases in any one location. Between June 26 and July 15, COVID-19 tests were conducted on 67 individuals across the state, of whom 11 tested positive. Another case was confirmed in a person from Kakinada district through a test conducted at Christian Medical College (CMC), Vellore, Tamil Nadu. Among those who tested positive for COVID-19, three persons from Kadapa district and one person from Kakinada district died. At present, three individuals are in home isolation, while two are undergoing treatment in hospitals. Another three patients have recovered and been discharged. To identify the genetic characteristics of the virus, five samples were sent on July 9 to the National Institute of Virology (NIV), Pune, for genome sequencing, Veera Pandiyan said. He added that doctors and hospital staff across the state have been alerted. Across the country, 339 COVID-19 cases have been recorded since July 1.

Minority Residential School Students Shine at National Taekwondo Championship

Rare kidney-tumour condition treated in a 6 yrs old kid

'FUSED KIDNEY' SAVED THROUGH KEYHOLE SURGERY FOR COMPLEX KIDNEY TUMOUR

Hyderabad, July 16th, 2026: In a remarkable demonstration of advanced paediatric urological surgery, doctors at the Asian Institute of Nephrology and Urology (AINU), Hyderabad, successfully removed a kidney tumour from a six-year-old boy, native of Hyderabad, born with one of the rarest congenital kidney abnormalities _ a crossed fused ectopic kidney _ using a highly specialised minimally invasive laparoscopic procedure. The surgery preserved the child's healthy kidney tissue and function despite the exceptionally complex anatomy.

The child was brought to AINU after passing blood in his urine for two days. Detailed investigations revealed a tumour arising in a crossed fused ectopic kidney, an uncommon congenital condition in which both kidneys are fused together and located on the same side of the body. Such anomalies are extremely rare and present a formidable surgical challenge because the kidneys possess distorted collecting systems and an



unpredictable network of blood vessels, making conventional surgical approaches risky.

To overcome these challenges, the surgical team employed advanced three-dimensional imaging before the procedure to meticulously map the child's unique vascular anatomy and plan a customised surgical strategy. During surgery, laparoscopic intraoperative ultrasound was used to accurately identify the exact location, depth and margins of the tumour within the fused kidney.

The cutting-edge imaging technologies allowed

surgeons to selectively control only the tumour-feeding blood vessels and remove the tumour through tiny keyhole incisions while preserving blood flow to the remaining healthy kidney. The tumour was excised completely with clear surgical margins, the child experienced no major complications, retained normal kidney function and made a smooth recovery before being discharged in good health.

Commenting on the rare condition and the surgery, Dr. Syed Md. Ghouse, Director - Robotics and Minimal Access Urology,

AINU, who led the surgical team said, " Operating on a tumour in a crossed fused ectopic kidney is among the most demanding procedures in paediatric urology because every patient's anatomy is unique and conventional surgical landmarks are absent. Success in such cases depends on meticulous planning and the intelligent use of advanced technologies. Three-dimensional reconstruction, intraoperative ultrasound and ICG fluorescence imaging allowed us to precisely identify the tumour and preserve the healthy kidney, giving the child the best possible long-term outcome while avoiding the trauma of open surgery."

Speaking about the procedure *Dr. Mallikarjuna C, Managing Director, Chief Consultant Urologist & Robotic Surgeon, AINU said, "Managing tumours in a fused kidney is exceptionally complex due to the abnormal anatomy and shared blood supply. Using advanced keyhole surgical techniques, we

were able to precisely remove the tumour while preserving maximum kidney function—something that is critical, especially in such rare cases." Doctors at AINU said the successful outcome highlights how modern minimally invasive surgery, when combined with surgical expertise, can safely treat even the rarest and most anatomically challenging paediatric kidney tumours while preserving organ function.

The case also reinforces the growing role of precision-guided surgery in improving outcomes for children with complex congenital urological disorders. A rare 'fused kidney' with a complex tumour was successfully treated using advanced keyhole surgery by a multidisciplinary team comprising Dr. Syed Md. Ghouse, Director - Robotic & Minimal Access Urological Surgery; Dr. Mallikarjuna C, Managing Director & Chief Consultant Urologist and Robotic Surgeon; and Dr. Rajesh Kumar Reddy Adapala, Consultant Uro-Oncologist.

EDITORIAL

Why Britain Is Finding It So Hard To Deport A Pakistani 'Grooming Gang' Leader

This could almost be the plot of a political thriller. Britain's home secretary, herself of Pakistani origin, wants one of the country's most notorious grooming gang ringleaders deported after he completed a 22-year prison sentence recently. But Pakistan, his country of origin, is refusing to take him back.

Britain is in a bit of a fix. A legal loophole has so far prevented Shabir Ahmed's deportation. The government now wants to change the law. But even if Parliament closes that loophole, what if Pakistan still refuses to accept him? Now the plot thickens. What happens when a country decides that a convicted foreign criminal should no longer remain within its borders, but the country of origin refuses to take one of its own nationals back? You might say Britain can change its own laws. That's easy and it's being proposed. But changing another country's mind is much harder. The British parliament may discover that rewriting legislation is the easy part. Persuading Pakistan to cooperate could prove far more difficult. For now, Britain has been left looking after a man nobody wants. The justice system has punished him. The government wants to deport him. Society abhors him. Yet the country Britain wants to send him to is refusing to take him back.

A String Of Lapses

A quick word about the background. Popularly known here in the media as the Rochdale case, of which Shabir Ahmed's case is a part, is one of the darkest chapters in Britain's grooming gangs scandal. Over the past two decades, investigations in towns including Rochdale, Rotherham, Oxford, Telford, and Newcastle uncovered organised groups that sexually exploited and trafficked vulnerable girls, often over many years.

Successive inquiries exposed shocking failures by police, councils, and social services. Time and again, authorities were accused of ignoring victims or failing to intervene despite repeated warning signs. While the majority of the most notorious gangs involved men of Pakistani heritage, the government has cautioned against treating child sexual exploitation as a crime linked to any one ethnic group. The Home Office found offenders came from a range of ethnic backgrounds, including local White folks. At the same time, the organised nature of many of the Pakistani-origin gangs has fuelled a continuing political debate over whether fears of being labelled racist prevented the authorities from acting sooner.

The Shabir Ahmed Story

Whatever the official figures may say, perception matters in politics. Today, many people associate Britain's grooming gangs primarily with offenders of Pakistani origin. Whether that perception is entirely fair or not is almost beside the point. It has shaped public opinion and political debate. Earlier this year, even Elon Musk entered the controversy, accusing the British establishment of going soft on the grooming gangs because of the ethnic background of some of those involved.

Most content creators are unable to generate a sustainable and respectable income from their content. Therefore, considering social media as a guaranteed career path can be a financially risky decision. This doesn't mean that social media is bad or that building a career on it is wrong. The problem arises when young people, without any prior skills, education, or professional qualifications, risk their future solely on the hope of going viral. Achieving internet fame and achieving long-term financial success are two different things. A video that is being watched by millions today may find itself attracted to a new audience in a few months. The cycle of popularity in the digital world changes at a very rapid pace. The biggest challenge of social media is its uncertainty. Your future here depends not only on your talent, but also on the platform's algorithms, advertising policies, copyright rules, technological changes, and changing audience preferences. A small algorithmic change can suddenly reduce the reach of an account with millions of followers. A policy change can eliminate a major source of income. A technical error or account suspension can undo years of hard work. Such uncertainty cannot provide the basis for long-term financial security for anyone. In contrast, the world of real skills is much more stable. A doctor's medical qualifications, a teacher's knowledge, an engineer's technical ability, a lawyer's legal experience, a farmer's agricultural expertise, or the professional skills of a plumber, electrician, or machine operator are not dependent on any social media platform. Technology may change over time, but the

need for real skills remains. This is why the fundamental structure of society remains based on education, science, medicine, agriculture, industry, and technological prowess, not just digital popularity. Today, many young people are spending more time creating Reels, tracking trends, and increasing their followers than studying. Even in schools and colleges, it's often seen that students are more concerned with their social media profiles than preparing for exams. This trend is worry-

ing, as tion, discipline, patience, and consistent practice, whereas social media creates expectations for immediate results. It's also true that content creation itself is a valuable skill. Video editing, storytelling, camera operation, graphic design, digital marketing, and communication skills are all useful skills today. If a young person systematically learns these skills and integrates them into a profession, business, or expertise, social media can become a highly effective platform. For example, a doctor can share health information, a teacher can provide online education, a farmer can explain modern agricultural techniques, and an engineer can offer technological solutions. In these cases, social media becomes not a career but an extension of it. The problem arises when the medium itself becomes the purpose. A mobile camera is merely a tool, not a profession in itself. Just as a pen is not a writer, a camera is no guarantee of success. Success depends on the knowledge, experience, and value that one conveys to their audience. Popularity will not be sustainable if there is no genuine expertise behind the content. Today, India has one of the world's youngest populations. This demographic strength can only be leveraged if young people have access to quality education, technical training, professional skills, and the ability to innovate. If large numbers of young people, driven by dreams of digital fame, forego the process of acquiring real skills, it will impact not only their personal lives but also the country's productivity and economic growth. The government, educational institutions, and families all play a vital role in

this direction. Schools and colleges should place greater emphasis on digital literacy, as well as career counseling, financial awareness, and skill development. It's essential to educate young people that social media is an opportunity, but not the only path to success. Families should also provide balanced guidance to children by understanding their interests rather than imposing only traditional career paths on them. It's also important to keep in mind that the future job market is rapidly changing. Artificial intelligence, automation, and new technologies are transforming many traditional jobs. In these times, those who possess continuous learning and the ability to adapt to new technologies while possessing basic skills will be most valuable. WHEN EARNINGS BECOME MORE IMPORTANT THAN RELATIONSHIPS

In Indian society, the family has been not merely a collection of blood relations, but a vibrant institution of trust, sacrifice, partnership, and mutual responsibility. The greatest strength of this institution was that it encompassed both rights and duties. As times changed, education expanded, and women's participation expanded beyond the confines of the home, reaching education, administration, medicine, justice, the military, science, and industry. Economic independence gave women new confidence, the ability to make decisions, and social respect. This change was not only necessary but also a significant step towards a just society. But every social change brings with it new challenges. Today, as both husband and wife earn, the question of sharing responsibilities alongside financial sharing has become more important than ever. Unfortunately, this balance appears to be deteriorating in many families. In some cases, there is an overemphasis on rights, while in others, duties are neglected. As a result, relationships are losing the ease and closeness that once characterized joint families. For a long time, in Indian society, the man was considered the economic pillar of the family. His wife, children, and par-

ents were considered to have a moral right to his earnings. He considered his income not personal property but the family's capital. On the other hand, women's contributions were more visible in domestic labor, child rearing, and family management. In modern times, circumstances have changed. Women are contributing as much financially as men by working hard. Therefore, the natural expectation was that economic responsibilities would be shared equally. However, in practice, the picture is often not so simple. Today, in many families, it's common knowledge that the husband's income is still considered the primary source of income, while the wife's income is considered a means of personal savings, personal investment, or personal independence. This isn't the case in every family, but where it exists, it causes dissatisfaction. If the husband bears every major household expense, but the wife's income is kept separate from family responsibilities, the principle of equality remains incomplete. Similarly, if the husband expects the wife to work, manage the household, and yet lack independence in financial decisions, this is also unjust. The problem isn't one party's, but one of double standards. Equality doesn't just mean equal rights. It also means equal responsibility. If both earn, they should share responsibility for the family's needs, future plans, children's education, elderly care, and emergencies. Financial partnership means not only combining income, but also building trust. The other aspect of the problem is psychological.

Money not only provides comfort, it also gives confidence. But if this confidence turns into arrogance, it creates distance in relationships. Sometimes, it is seen that those with higher incomes begin to feel more empowered to make decisions. This tendency has been seen in men and is now visible in some women as well. Therefore, it would not be correct to say that financial arrogance is a problem of only one gender. The arrogance of wealth changes the person, not their gender. Today, in social media and public discourse, male-female relationships are often presented as a conflict. One side asserts its rights, while the other laments the injustices it has suffered. In this tug-of-war, family, communication, and partnership are left behind. Any ideology that aims to establish balance should be welcomed. However, if its interpretation limits rights to the exclusion of duties, it is natural for imbalance to arise in society. It's also true that millions of women today spend their entire income on their families. Along with their jobs, they also shoulder the responsibilities of home, children, and the elderly. There are many families where husbands and wives share their earnings without any accounting and make decisions together. Therefore, blaming any one group is neither fair nor factual. The aim of social analysis should not be to make accusations, but to understand trends and find solutions. The problem becomes serious when financial transparency between husband and wife disappears. When income, savings, invest-

ments, and expenses become separate worlds, suspicion begins to creep into the relationship. Financial secrecy sometimes turns into emotional distance. Marriage is a partnership, not a business contract. Trust is its greatest asset. The greatest irony of modern life is that conveniences have increased, but satisfaction has decreased. Incomes have risen, but communication has diminished. Independence has increased, but partnerships have weakened. In the past, families lived together even with limited resources because decisions were made collectively. Today, resources are plentiful, but a mindset of "mine" and "yours" often divides relationships. Here's another important question. Is domestic labor less valuable than economic income? If the wife manages the home and the husband earns outside, is the husband the sole breadwinner of the family? Absolutely not. Similarly, if the wife also works, is it appropriate to leave all the household responsibilities to her? The answer to this is also no. A family will remain balanced only when both economic and domestic labor are equally respected. This changing environment is also affecting children. When they see their parents embroiled in economic competition, their own definitions of relationships begin to shift. They learn a language of rights rather than cooperation. This is a matter of concern for future generations. Family not only creates the present, it also shapes the future. What is the solution? The solution lies not in blaming one party, but in strengthening family communication.

Why Was A Russian Doomsday Plane In Iran Recently? Inside The 'Tu-214PU'

Russia dispatched a Tupolev Tu-214PU airborne command post, often referred to as a "doomsday plane", to Tehran's Imam Khomeini International Airport. A Tu-214PU aircraft took off from Moscow and landed in Tehran at around 10:10 am (IST) on July 13. The deployment coincided with escalating US and Israeli airstrikes on Iranian military infrastructure after the collapse of a regional ceasefire. The heavily modified Tupolev Tu-214 is operated by the Rossiya Special Flight Squadron and contains advanced, hardened communication and command systems. It enables senior officials to coordinate state affairs and military operations from the air in high-threat environments. The arrival is widely interpreted as a signal of high-level crisis diplomacy and tightening strategic cooperation between Moscow and Tehran. Analysts and commentators have pointed out that while this move doesn't mean Russian troops are entering the fight, it's a massive power signal to Washington, that Russia remains closely aligned with Iran and is prepared to support coordination at a high level. During the ongoing Ukraine war, at least on five occasions, President Putin or his foreign minister has used the 'N' word. Putin's nuclear sabre-rattling has been part of the Russian escalate-to-deescalate strategy that he himself was the author of as a young official. In late 2022, Putin even ordered a drill of Russia's strategic deterrence forces, which included intercontinental ballistic missiles



(ICBMs), submarines, and heavy bombers, the entire Russian nuclear triad. Interestingly, both the US and Russia have special airborne presidential command posts to manage major hostilities, especially a nuclear war. These are appropriately called the "Doomsday" airborne command and control aircraft. Doomsday aircraft are essentially large transport aircraft fitted with special, long-range communication equipment, along with some other security features. Russian Doomsday Aircraft "Maxdome" The Russian President's "Doomsday" aircraft is a specially configured Ilyushin Il-80 "Maxdome", which is also referred to as "Flying Kremlin". Interestingly, it was seen flying low over Moscow in early May 2022 during a rehearsal for Victory Day celebrations. Given the repeated threats of nuclear weapon use in the early days of the Ukraine war, such a flypast raised concerns in the strategic community. Earlier, Russian

President Putin had said that he won't "brag" about nuclear weapons but will use them "if necessary". The Maxdome had last participated in such a flypast in 2010. The Il-80 Maxdome is a modified Ilyushin Il-86 airliner converted into an airborne command-and-control centre and a presidential office in the sky. The aircraft reportedly made its first flight in 1985 and was inducted in 1987. Four were built, and three are still in service. Such aircraft are required for cases when the ground-based command infrastructure may be destroyed in the event of nuclear war or a major disaster. The Il-80 aircraft has no windows, except cockpit windcreens and direct-view side panels. This is meant to protect the sensitive electronic equipment and the people inside from nuclear radiation and the ensuing electromagnetic pulse. There is only the upper deck forward door on the left and the aft door on the right. There is only one air-stair door, instead of the normal three.

Even the aft cockpit windows are blocked with baffles. Like the E-4B, the aircraft has a dorsal SATCOM canoe, believed to house advanced satellite communications equipment and a trailing wire antenna mounted in the lower aft fuselage for very low frequency (VLF) radio transmission and reception. These could be for communication with ballistic missile submarines. The aircraft can be refuelled in flight. Il-96-400M Russia's next doomsday plane would be the Il-96-400M. It is an upgraded version of the four-engine civil airliner. The plane is currently under development by Russia's United Aircraft Corporation (UAC). Designated under "Project Zveno-3S", at least one prototype airframe has been completed and is being converted to replace the aging fleet of Ilyushin Il-80 aircraft. The flight range of the new aircraft will be double that of its predecessor, and it will communicate effectively with strategic nuclear forces within roughly 6,000 kilometres.

CM Revanth inaugurates lithium-ion cell plant in Mahabubnagar

Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Wednesday, July 15, inaugurated Amara Raja Advanced Cell Technologies' Customer Qualification Plant in Mahabubnagar district. With an initial capacity of 60 MWh, the facility will manufacture lithium-ion cells that customers can test and validate ahead of commercial production, Amara Raja said in a release. Built with an investment of Rs 500 crore, the facility forms part of the company's broader Rs 9,500 crore, 16 GWh Gigafactory programme, it said. The facility will manufacture lithium-ion cells in cylindrical and prismatic formats, using multiple chemistries, for qualification and approval by Original Equipment Manufacturers customers across the industry, the release said. Cells from the facility are expected to be supplied to customers for validation beginning in August 2026, it



added. Together with the advanced research and engineering centre, ePositive Energy Labs, and the upcoming Giga 1 manufacturing facility, the Customer Qualification Plant brings Amara Raja close to completing the first phase of its Giga Corridor investment in Telangana, the release said. Lithium-ion cells are used, among other applications, to power portable consumer electronics and electric vehicles. "As the world reconfigures energy supply chains

around resilience, security and advanced manufacturing, India's ability to develop, validate and manufacture advanced battery technologies will shape its role in the global energy transition," Jayadev Galla, Co-founder and Chairman, Amara Raja, said. "Our CQP is a significant step towards creating these capabilities and laying the foundation for a trusted, world-class energy ecosystem," he added. Describing Amara Raja as a "glocal" organisation,

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy said it was "trying to compete globally with local talent". He praised the company for drawing inspirations from countries such as China, Japan, Germany and South Korea while competing with China in the electric vehicle sector. Highlighting that the "Telangana Rising 2047" growth story was unstoppable, he said the state government was improving infrastructure to attract more investments.

Telangana flags off UK-bound shipments under India-UK trade agreement

Hyderabad: The Union government on Wednesday, July 15, flagged off UK-bound export consignments from Telangana, marking the launch of the India-UK trade pact. India and the UK operationalised a free trade agreement under which a host of domestic goods will enter the British market at zero duty. Export flag-off events were organised at Nizamabad and Hyderabad to mark the entry into force of the India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA). Flagging off the consignments at the Inland Container Depot (ICD) here, Telangana government's Special Secretary, Department of Industries and Commerce, Krishna Aditya, said the agreement marks a significant milestone in India-UK economic relations and will substantially improve market access for Indian



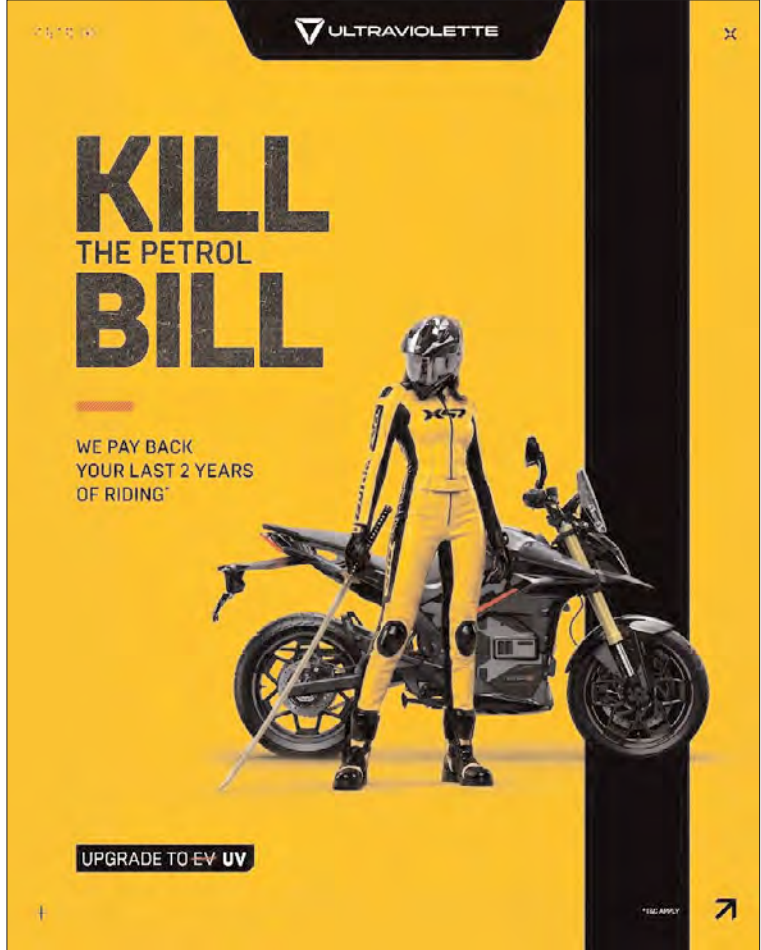
exporters, an official release said. He said the reduction of tariffs on a large number of products would enhance the competitiveness of exports from Telangana and create new opportunities for export-oriented industries. of products and significantly enhance export opportunities for Indian businesses in the UK market. WIPRO ADRS SLIP INTO RED AS IT FIRM PROJECTS UP TO 1.5% DEGROWTH IN Q2

The American Depository Receipts of Wipro Ltd. slipped after the company released its first quarter earnings report for the financial year 2027 on Thursday. Wipro ADRs traded 0.28% lower at \$1.83 as of 9:55 a.m. EST. Earlier in the day, the Indian IT giant posted a sequential 4.3% decline in its consolidated bottom-line for the quarter under review, while revenue only went up marginally. The profit decline was slightly higher than street expectations. Analysts' on Bloomberg expected Wipro's profit to come in at \$3,466 crore, 1% lower than the previous quarter. Further, the management has forecasted an up to 1.5% degrowth in its IT services revenue. For the second quarter of FY27, Wipro expects revenue from its IT Services business to be in the range of \$2.57 billion to \$2.63 billion. The company has guided for IT services



growth of -1.5% to +0.5% on a sequential basis. Earnings before interest and taxes declined 8.4% to Rs 3,829 crore from Rs 4,181 crore and margin narrowed 160 basis points to 15.6% from 17.2%. On the operational front, Wipro's total bookings declined 2.4% quarter-on-quarter in constant currency to \$3.37 billion. IT services revenue fell 1.4% sequentially to \$2.62 billion, while the IT services operating margin stood at 16% in the first quarter. The company's trailing 12-month attrition stood at 13.9% at the end of the

quarter and total headcount stood at 2.43 Lakh In Q1. Wipro CEO and Managing Director Srini Pallia said AI disruption is expanding the addressable market rather than shrinking it, while adding that the company's deal pipeline remains healthy. He said the technology and communications vertical continued to show momentum, with the BFSI segment also expected to gather pace in the second quarter. However, the energy and manufacturing verticals remained soft.

Tech Mahindra Q1 Attrition Slips To 11.8%; IT Headcount Falls Below 75,000



Tech Mahindra Ltd.'s attrition during the three-month period ended June 30, 2026 slipped to 11.8%, according to the disclosure made by the IT major on Thursday. This marks a decline as compared to the attrition rate of 12.1% in the preceding quarter. The rate of attrition has improved even significantly as compared to the year-ago quarter, when it stood at 12.6%. In terms of headcount, the overall staff employed by Tech Mahindra fell by 688 employees to 146,760. The IT headcount, comprising of employees linked to the company's core operations, slipped below 75,000

in the April-June period. The count in this segment, as of June 30, stood at 74,689, as compared to 75,377 as of March 31. The overall IT staff count has dwindled by 5,298 employees when compared to the year-ago period. In the year-ago period, the company had employed 79,987 persons in its IT division, the press release showed. In the business processing services (BPS) segment, Tech Mahindra's employee count slipped by 250. It stood at 64,080 as of June 30, as compared to 64,330 on March 31. In the sales and support division, the headcount has increased from 7,916 to 7,991.

'Unverified Speculation': OnePlus Dismisses Reports Of Quitting Indian Market

A Bloomberg report story claimed that OnePlus intended to shut down operations in the US and Europe as soon as possible. The report also added that by 2027, a global closure is expected to extend to India, the company's biggest overseas market. It is believed that Oppo seeks a global overhaul of its many sub-brands across the globe, which include OnePlus and Realme. Over the years, industry observers have debated speculations of the blurring lines between OnePlus and Oppo, which was eventually proven once OnePlus became a sub-brand of Oppo. As part of the changes, OnePlus told NDTV Profit that it will replace its OxygenOS software with Oppo's ColorOS. OxygenOS has long been a key differentiator for OnePlus, thanks to its clean, near-stock Android experience. The company said the move is aimed at streamlining software development while making better use of shared engineering and research-and-development resources across Oppo and OnePlus. Bloomberg also claimed that by this year, OnePlus will start to wind down its activities in



the US and Europe. OnePlus is expected to completely withdraw from the international market by 2027, operating solely in China. Each brand will have distinct duties in different markets as part of Oppo's reorganisation initiatives. OnePlus will withdraw from international competition in order to concentrate solely on China. Realme will completely withdraw from the intensely competitive Chinese market, focusing instead on the Nordic area and other global markets. Oppo will emerge as the main flagship brand, growing its market share and concentrating its efforts mostly on Central Europe. The purported reorganisation is thought to be an

attempt to avoid internal cannibalisation, simplify supply chains, and reduce overhead expenses as needed. Oppo's R&D facilities are shared by OnePlus and Realme for their products, including the proprietary Android software that is based on Oppo's ColorOS. India has been an important market for OnePlus since its founding, despite the seemingly minor consequences of a global market withdrawal. OnePlus, which operated as a distinct brand for nearly 10 years, established itself in the high-end smartphone market with its "flagship killer" approach before branching out into the midrange and low-cost markets with the Nord series handsets.

IRAN TARGETS MILITARY BASES AS US LAUNCHES WAVE OF STRIKES



Tehran has launched fresh attacks on US military bases in neighbouring Gulf states, while Washington continued to strike sites across Iran overnight. Tehran said it had struck targets in the region, including in Jordan, Kuwait and Bahrain, as a sixth day of renewed hostilities strained their preliminary deal to end the war. Meanwhile, the US military said it inflicted a six-hour wave of strikes in multiple locations to "degrade Iran's ability to threaten innocent mariners" in the Strait of Hormuz. The latest exchanges came after US President Donald Trump warned Iran it had "better behave" or face further military action should Iran not return to negotiations. On Tuesday, Trump threatened to target Iran's energy infrastructure if Tehran failed to return to talks. Iran's top negotiator, Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf, told state media Tehran had "no reason" to abide by any agreement that did not benefit the country. He added that Iran's national security

depended on maintaining what he described as "Iranian arrangements" in the Strait of Hormuz. In the latest attacks, the US targeted command centres, air defence sites, and coastal surveillance facilities across Iran - including in the port city of Bandar Abbas and Greater Tunb Island - US Central Command (Centcom) said. Explosions were heard across Iran and air defences were triggered in Tehran, Iranian state media reported. Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Esmail Baqaei said a children's cancer treatment centre in the western city of Ahvaz had been evacuated after strikes on a nearby location. BBC Verify has authenticated video footage of strikes on three coastal cities in Iran - Chabahar, Ahvaz and Bandar Abbas. Shortly after, US allies in the Gulf reported attacks. Kuwait's military said it intercepted drone attacks, while Bahrain's interior ministry told citizens to remain calm and head to the nearest safe place.

ITALIAN OFFICIALS HANDED JAIL TERMS FOR GENOA BRIDGE DISASTER THAT KILLED 43

The former head of Italy's motorway operator has been given a 12-year prison sentence over the collapse of Genoa's Morandi bridge in August 2018. Prosecutors had asked for a far longer jail term for Giovanni Castellucci, ex-chief executive of Autostrade per l'Italia (Aspi). Forty-three people died when the motorway bridge running through the city came down in a rain storm at the height of the holiday season, sending cars and lorries plummeting to the ground. Castellucci, who is already serving a six-year jail term for a 2013 road disaster, was one of 57 defendants on trial in Genoa. Another top motorway official, Michele Donferri Mitelli, has been given 11 years in jail. Emmanuel Diaz, whose brother Henry died in the



bridge collapse told Italian TV he was "very satisfied" with the verdict, while Egle Possetti, whose sister and her family were all killed, said she thought the 12-year term handed to Castellucci was "acceptable". Castellucci was not in court to hear the verdicts, read out by Judge Paolo Lepri. The former number two at the motorway operator, Paolo Berti, was handed a five-and-a-half-year jail

term, seven years less than prosecutors had sought. In total, prosecutors had asked for the 57 defendants to be given 400 years in jail for failing to maintain the viaduct, which was built by Riccardo Morandi in 1967. All the defendants had denied doing anything wrong. While prosecutors had argued that maintenance of the ageing structure had been repeatedly delayed and that warning

signs had been ignored, defence lawyers blamed the disaster on a design flaw, and the fact that a specific cable was encased in concrete. Among the defendants on trial were engineers from the maintenance firm Spea and former officials from both the transport ministry and the Aspi motorway operator's parent company Atlantia. Spea's former chief executive, Antonino Galatà, was given a five-and-a-half year prison term, while Mauro Coletta, the former top official in charge of the ministry's motorway directorate, received five years. On the eve of the trial, the current head of Aspi, Arrigo Giana, made his company's first public apology for the bridge collapse, saying that "the actions and decisions of some people left indelible scars".

'MOMENT OF JOY' AS UGANDA DISCHARGES LAST EBOLA PATIENT



The last patient being treated for Ebola in Uganda has been discharged from hospital, leaving the country with no active confirmed cases of the deadly disease. At a ceremony marking the occasion Health Minister Dr Chris Baryomunsi described it as "a moment of joy". The first case in this outbreak of the Bundibugyo species of the virus in Uganda was confirmed in May. The patient was a man who had travelled from neighbouring Democratic Republic of Congo, the outbreak's epicentre, for medical treatment. The authorities there are battling to contain the spread and the US has extended travel restrictions on US citizens who have been to DR Congo. In Uganda, a 42-day countdown has now begun before it can officially be declared Ebola-free, as long as no new infections emerge. "It demonstrates that with early detection, prompt treatment and a strong health system, Ebola can be defeated," the health minister said. Nevertheless, his ministry has urged people to "remain vigilant". "If you develop symptoms such as fever, vomiting, diarrhoea or unexplained bleeding, seek immediate medical care," it said in a statement on X. In all, Uganda recorded 20 confirmed cases, mostly among visitors from DR Congo, and two deaths. Uganda has experienced several Ebola outbreaks over the last two decades and now has

well established protocols to deal with the virus. These include isolation of suspected cases and contact tracing as well as targeted public health messages. There have been more than 2,000 confirmed infections and 796 deaths in DR Congo, according to government data. But it is thought that it could have been in the community undetected for months before the outbreak was officially declared two months ago. Earlier this week, a World Health Organization (WHO) official said the true number of infections could be four times larger than recorded. In response to the latest situation, the US has announced that citizens who have been in DR Congo and want to return home must spend 21 days in a third country before being allowed into America. Previously, they had been able to enter at select airports, where they were went through a screening process. The new rule could affect recruitment of US medics who want to work in Ebola-affected areas and the scale of operations, Franklin Graham, the CEO of an organisation that runs Ebola treatment centres, told the Reuters news agency. Ebola is caused by a virus which attacks the body's immune system and organs. It normally infects animals, typically fruit bats, but outbreaks among humans can sometimes start when people handle infected animals. It is spread through bodily fluids like blood.

Volunteer firefighter suspected of starting devastating France forest fire

A volunteer firefighter has been placed under formal investigation in France on suspicion of starting a fire in a forest south of Paris, officials say. He is one of at least six people questioned over the Fontainebleau fire that has burned more than 2,000 hectares (some 5,000 acres) and led to about 1,000 people being evacuated. Although the fire has been contained, it has not been fully extinguished. Visiting the area on Thursday, President Emmanuel Macron said there would be no leniency for arsonists. France - like many other European countries - has been experiencing a series of unusual heatwaves. Macron said there had not been so many fires in France since World War Two. Prosecutor Diane Ngomsik told AFP news agency that the volunteer firefighter, 18, had initially confessed to "setting fire to twigs with a lighter and petrol" before retracting it. BFMTV said a second 18-year old man had also been placed under formal investigation - a stage in French



criminal procedure which may lead to formal charges and a subsequent trial. The Fontainebleau forest blaze partially closed the country's main north-south motorway since it started last Sunday. President Macron said 10% of the forest had been burned, and hailed the fact that there had been no victims so far. The forest is home to the Palace and Park of Fontainebleau, a Unesco World Heritage site since 1981. France has registered nearly 11,000 fires since the beginning of the year. Climate change is driving up temperatures around the world, and Europe is the fastest warming continent,

heating up twice as fast as the global average, according to the Copernicus climate service. This is causing increased summer heatwaves, greater pressure on Europe's water supply, and more intense wildfires. The record-breaking temperatures across Europe this summer have led to major wildfires, most notably in Spain where at least 13 people have been killed. And in the UK, firefighters have been battling to contain a "large-scale" wildfire that has spread across more than two miles (3.5km) of dry land in the Cairngorms National Park in north-east Scotland. The suspect, aged 18, initially

confessed to "setting fire to twigs with a lighter and petrol" before retracting his confession, prosecutor Diane Ngomsik told Agence France-Presse, confirming a report on BFMTV. In all, six people have been arrested as part of the investigation into the wildfires, which burned more than 2,000 hectares of the sprawling forest some 60 kilometers southeast of Paris. About 1,000 local residents were forced to leave their homes as the fires spread, and the main A6 motorway from the capital to the southeast was shut. The local authorities said on Tuesday evening that hundreds of firefighters had managed to contain the flames but the fires were not fully extinguished. France has been sweltering under another heatwave, with the high temperatures contributing to wildfires. Interior Minister Laurent Nuñez has said 32,000 hectares have been hit by fires since the start of this year - more than during the entire 2025 fire season.

TEENAGER ACCUSED OF CARRYING OUT SABOTAGE ACTIONS IN POLAND FOR RUSSIA



Prosecutors in Poland have charged an 18-year-old Ukrainian man with carrying out sabotage acts on behalf of Russian intelligence aimed at inciting tensions between Poland and Ukraine. The suspect, identified as Illia K, under Polish privacy laws, was charged with 47 criminal acts between November 2024 and August 2025, when he was arrested. The alleged sabotage included desecrating memorials to Polish victims of the UPA, the Ukrainian Insurgent Army that took part in the murder of tens of thousands of Poles during the Second World War known as the Volynia massacre. "The

aim was to incite ethnic tensions between Poland and Ukraine," Poland's Internal Security Agency (ABW) said in a statement. Prosecutors said that although the suspect himself had acted for financial rather than ideological reasons most of the alleged acts were "for the benefit of foreign intelligence". The ABW said in May that it had launched 48 espionage investigations last year, more than double the number in 2024. Russia's secret services had focused on discrediting Poland internationally and exploiting "historical ethnic antagonisms, mainly in Polish-Ukrainian relations", it said.



More than 800 Canadian wildfires burning as air quality alerts extend to US

CHILDREN AMONG DEAD AT ALGERIA FOSTER CARE HOME BLAZE - PRESIDENT

Eleven people have died in a fire at a foster care facility in Algiers, Algeria's capital city. The country's civil protection department said 19 others were injured in the blaze, which firefighters began to tackle at 03:30 local time (04:30 GMT) on Thursday. They were still attempting to extinguish the fire just over three hours later, when the authorities released an update on the situation. The civil protection department's statement did not specify the ages of those killed or injured, but in a statement Algeria's president said children were among the dead. The authorities have not said what caused the fire. Ten fire engines and 16 ambulances were deployed to the facility in Mohammadia, an eastern suburb of Algiers. Algeria



has been experiencing a heatwave for several days, and nearly 1,000 fires have been recorded in the space of a week, the AFP news agency has reported. On Thursday morning, the civil protection department said it had recorded 115 wildfires over the past 24 hours. Algerian President Abdelmadjid Tebboune expressed his condolences following the fire at the chil-

dren's home, calling the incident a "tragic loss". Prime Minister Sifi Ghrieb travelled to two hospitals in Algiers to visit individuals injured in Thursday's fire, state media reported. The report was accompanied by a picture of Ghrieb next to a child in a hospital bed. Amid the fire, five people with special needs were "taken into care and transported to a safe location", the authori-

ties said. Algeria has been sweltering under a heatwave for several days, and nearly 1,000 fires have been recorded in the space of a week. From July 8 to 15, the civil defence reported 932 fires, according to state media. Most had been extinguished but a small number were still burning. One municipal worker died battling a blaze in the northern province of Setif, a local mayor said Wednesday. The civil defence said it had mobilised more than 19,000 personnel and 700 trucks to battle forest fires, as well as six helicopters and 12 water-bombing aircraft. It has also evacuated some residents in the provinces of Bejaia, Guelma, Bouira and Mila, according to the APS state news agency.

Lionel Messi Beats 5 England Players, Triggers Chaos With Exceptional Dribbling

Lionel Messi played an instrumental role in Argentina's 2-1 comeback victory over England in the FIFA World Cup 2026 semi-final at Atlanta on Wednesday. The superstar didn't score a goal, but his brilliant assists decided the fate of La Albiceleste. Messi provided a pass to Enzo Fernandez, who scored the equaliser. After that, the 39-year-old football icon delivered a sensational cross to Lautaro Martinez for Argentina's winning goal in stoppage time. While the England players kept Messi heavily marked, with players surrounding him, the veteran still showed his brilliance on the ground multiple times. In one of the standout moments from the game, Messi beat five players in England's half with his dribbling skills. Such great was the run from Messi that Elliot Anderson had to commit a deliberate foul to stop him. With one more win, he'll be delivering



another World Cup trophy to Argentina. Messi didn't add to his tournament-leading goal total, but the 39-year-old assisted on two late strikes that carried La Albiceleste to another stunning comeback. Eight days after an improbable rally against Egypt in the round of 16, Messi returned to

Atlanta to produce another stellar moment in a career that might already be the best of anyone to play the sport. England were surely envisioning their first World Cup title since their only triumph six decades ago after a 55th-minute goal from Anthony Gordon. But Messi and his blue-clad

teammates, as they have shown over and over again, are never done. Now it's on to face Spain in the final on Sunday, with a chance of becoming the first repeat champion since Brazil in 1958 and 1962. In the 85th minute, with England hanging on for dear life, Messi played a short corner,

immediately received the return pass and spotted Enzo Fernandez lurking in the middle of the field, 25 yards from goal. Fernandez ripped a curling shot past goalkeeper Jordan Pickford to level the score. At that point, it seemed inevitable that Argentina would pull out the victory. And that's just what happened, with Messi again the orchestrator. Two minutes into stoppage time, he suddenly turned on the speed as he raced towards the byline, gaining enough space to send a pinpoint cross into the area at the back post. The ball cleared six English players, setting up Lautaro Fernandez to effortlessly head home the winning goal after slipping between two defenders. From there, it was just a matter of protecting the lead, which Argentina did comfortably. When the final whistle blew, Messi dropped to his knees in the middle of the field, pumping his fists.

Why KL Rahul Is Not Playing For India vs England In 2nd ODI

Wicketkeeper-batsman Ishan Kishan has replaced an ill KL Rahul in the playing eleven as England skipper Harry Brook won the toss and elected to bowl against India in the second ODI at Sophia Gardens on Thursday. Looking to bounce back from their defeat in the series opener at Edgbaston, England have made two changes to their side - bringing in fast bowlers Gus Atkinson and Saqib Mahmood in place of Josh Tongue and Liam Dawson. "It's a nice, even spread of grass. Hopefully, we can get a bit of seam movement and swing up front. We need to execute slightly better. I've always said we are never out of games, and I thought we put up a really good fight in the last game to take it that deep. It was an awesome effort from the guys, and we need some more of that," said England captain Harry Brook. India, who lead the three-match series 1-0, were forced to make the solitary change with Kishan don-



ning the wicketkeeping gloves in Rahul's absence. "KL Rahul was unavailable for selection due to illness," said the BCCI in an official update. India captain Shubman Gill said his side is seeking another near-perfect performance. "We'd have bowled first as well. We're doing well. We had a near-perfect game last time out; hopefully, we're going to have another good one. We started well, and it was great to see fast bowlers do well. Very good memories

Thomas Tuchel's Tactical Self-Destruction: How England Threw Away Their World Cup Final Dream

History has a cruel way of repeating itself for England. In the highly anticipated 2026 FIFA World Cup semi-final against Argentina in Atlanta, the Three Lions stood on the cusp of a spot in the final, but saw their dream being shattered just minutes later. For a long period, England had the defending champions exactly where they wanted them. The first half was a tense, cagey affair marked by relentless physical battles, resulting in a minuscule expected goals (xG) split of 0.05 for England and 0.03 for Argentina. The match erupted into life in the 55th minute when Anthony Gordon, the man who is set to join FC Barcelona in Spanish La Liga after the World Cup, met a beautiful



Morgan Rogers cross to put England 1-0 up, sending the stadium into absolute mayhem. Down 0-1, Argentina looked confused about their strategy. Aware of England's pace on the counter-attack, La Albiceleste knew that they couldn't shift to 5th gear

directly. With both of their centre-backs -- Lisandro Martinez and Cristian Romero carrying yellow cards -- Argentina couldn't get close to England attackers, as one reckless challenge would've seen them go down to 10 men and their chances of a comeback

would be blown. Yet, instead of exploiting this vulnerability, England chose to self-destruct. The crux of Argentina's late comeback lay in England's approach, as manager Thomas Tuchel pulled the handbrake and started to substitute his attackers with defenders. Thomas Tuchel Hit Self-Destruct In the 72nd minute, Tuchel made the baffling decision to substitute the energetic goalscorer Anthony Gordon for defender Ezri Konsa, shifting into an incredibly passive back-five formation. Instead of maintaining a high press or punishing the booked defenders, England opted to hang off their own crossbar, inviting wave after wave of Argentine pressure.

Indian cricket team fast bowler Gurnoor Brar was given a warning for breaching level one of the ICC Code Of Conduct during the first ODI encounter against England on Tuesday. The ICC said that Brar was found to have breached Article 2.9 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel. It relates to "throwing a ball at or near a player in an inappropriate and or dangerous manner during an international match". He was also handed one demerit point for the incident. The incident took place during the eighth over of the England innings when Brar picked up the ball off his own bowling and threw it towards England batter Ben Duckett. It was deemed to be



'inappropriate and dangerous' by the match referee. The charges were levelled by on-field umpires Kumar Dharmasena and Mike Burns, third umpire Sam Nogajski, and fourth umpire Russell Warren. Level 1 breaches carry a minimum

penalty of an official reprimand, a maximum penalty of 50 per cent of a player's match fee, and one or two demerit points. When a player reaches four or more demerit points within a 24-month period, they are converted into suspension points and

the player faces a ban. Two suspension points equate to a ban from one Test, two ODIs, or two T20Is, whichever comes first. These demerit points remain on a player's disciplinary record for a period of 24 months from their imposition, after which they are expunged. India took a 1-0 lead in the three-match series with a six-wicket win over England, where Brar picked two wickets for the visitors. The two teams will next face in the second ODI in Cardiff on Thursday. "Brar admitted the offence and accepted the sanction proposed by match referee Richie Richardson of the Emirates ICC Elite Panel of Match Referees, and as such, there was no need for a formal hearing," the ICC said on Thursday.

RECORD CROWD AS KERR RETURNS TO GOTHAM FC

Former Chelsea forward Sam Kerr began her second spell with Gotham FC in front of the largest ever crowd for a women's sporting event in New York City. Over 42,000 fans turned out at Citi Field for Gotham's 1-0 victory against Washington Spirit in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). Usually home to Major League Baseball team the New York Mets, the official attendance was announced as a sell-out 42,715. Kerr, who came on as a second-half substitute, played for Gotham between 2015 and 2017 when they were known as Sky Blue FC. "In many ways this is like a full circle moment when Sam Kerr coming here and being able to experience this on her first night," NWSL commissioner Jessica Berman said. American



midfielder Rose Lavelle scored the winner in the first half. Gotham's previous best attendance for a game was 15,560 in 2024 and the record crowd for a NWSL game remains the 63,000 who watched the Denver Summit play the Spirit at the NFL Denver Broncos' home Empower Field last March. Gotham recently announced they will move from Sports

Illustrated Stadium in New Jersey to Etihad Park in Queens, a ground they will share with MLS outfit New York City. The move is said to be designed to help Gotham become accessible to more fans. "We know that with investment, if you build it, they will come. And this is a proof point for that," Berman said. "My favourite thing about tonight is that it isn't transactional.

Harshit Rana Injury Related To Being 'Overweight'? Report Sparks Big Concern



Harshit Rana's hamstring injury in his first series after coming back from a knee surgery has raised concerns over his fitness regimen as top sources revealed that the burly fast bowler gained weight during his rehabilitation which probably contributed to the latest breakdown. According to sources, the 24-year-old Rana was found to be "overweight" on his comeback for the T20I leg of the UK tour and was eventually

ruled out due to the hamstring injury after playing just five T20 games -- two versus Ireland and three against England. "Rana reported a sudden onset of discomfort in his right hamstring during the third T20I against England at Trent Bridge. Subsequent scans revealed a Grade 1 hamstring injury," the BCCI had stated in the release which ruled him out of the three-match ODI series where he was supposed to play a very

vital role. However, what must be a worrying issue for both Gautam Gambhir's team management and the national selection committee is why the fast bowler added extra kilos on comeback which he should have been able to reduce during his knee rehabilitation and subsequent 'Return To Play' protocols at the Centre of Excellence in Bengaluru. "Harshit is a very important member of this team going into the 2027 World Cup. He is being looked at as a potential number eight batter along with his 140 click average speed.

She was trapped in a frustrating, repetitive cycle of rest and rehabilitation, while also grappling with the heavy mental toll that came with it. "It is easy to get demoralised in such a situation," said Deepika in a conversation with The Bridge, days after guiding India back to the FIH Pro League.

PV Sindhu Stuns World No. 5 Han Ye To Enter Japan Open Quarterfinals

Two-time Olympic medalist PV Sindhu produced one of her best performances of the season to out-class world No. 5 Han Yue of China in straight games and storm into the quarterfinals of the Japan Open Super 750 badminton tournament here on Thursday. The world No. 10 Indian needed just 35 minutes to register a commanding 21-16, 21-14 win over the higher-ranked Chinese shuttler in their second-round contest. After a sluggish start, the unseeded Sindhu found her rhythm midway through the opening game, striking the shuttle cleanly and dictating the rallies to take the lead. The former world champion then completely dominated the second game, racing to an 8-0 advantage

before comfortably sealing the contest. With the victory, Sindhu improved her head-to-head record against Han to 8-1.

The 31-year-old will next face familiar rival Nozomi Okuhara of Japan, who received a walkover after top seed An Se-young of South Korea withdrew from their second-round match. Sindhu is now India's lone survivor in the tournament after the mixed doubles pair of Tanisha Crasto and Dhruv Kapila bowed out in the pre-quarterfinals. The Indian duo fought hard before losing 20-22, 17-21 to top seeds Feng Yan Zhe and Huang Dong Ping of China in their round-of-16 clash in 47 minutes. Satwiksairaj Rankireddy's recurring shoulder

problem forced him and Chirag Shetty to retire from their Japan Open opener even as P V Sindhu eased into the women's singles second round with a straight-game win over Malaysia's Wong Ling Ching on Tuesday. The world No.4 Indian pair, who ended a two-year title drought by winning the Singapore Open but had to withdraw from Indonesia Open last month, retired after losing the opening game 19-21 to Denmark's Daniel Lundgaard and Mads Vestergaard. Chief doubles coach Tan Kim Her said the Indian duo will be skipping the China Open next week and focus on rehabilitation to get back to shape for the home World Championships in

August. "It still needs some time to recover. We have at least four weeks to get back in shape ahead of World Championships," Tan told PTL. Two-time Olympic-medalist Sindhu, who is currently world no. 10, produced a compact performance to notch up a 21-14 21-11 win over 37th-ranked Wong Ling Ching of Malaysia in the opening round of the BWF Super 750 event.
