CM Revanth orders faster land acquisition for Musi project



Hyderabad, TSIT : Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday directed officials to accelerate land acquisition for the Musi project and formulate a clear policy on land pooling to ensure smooth implementation of the ambitious development initiative. Chief Minister held a high-level review on the Musi project at the Bodhi Pavilion of the MCR HRD Institute.

He instructed officials to prepare a comprehensive and legally sound policy for acquisition of lands falling under Full Tank Level (FTL), buffer zones and assigned land categories. Officials should take adequate precautions to ensure that the project does not face legal complications during implementation, he said. Revanth Reddy directed the authorities to call for tenders for Phase-II of the Musi project at the earliest and maintain momentum in executing the works. The Chief Minister also asked municipal commissioners to focus on mobilising

loans at the lowest possible interest rates for development projects. He directed officials to conduct a weekly review of Transferable Development Rights (TDR) to expedite pending matters. During the review, Revanth Reddy instructed officials to immediately call tenders for development works at the Omkareshwara Swamy Temple at Manchirevula. He also asked officials to give greater publicity to the Kotwalguda Birds Park to increase public awareness and attract more visitors. CM Secretary Manik Raj, HMDA Commissioner Sarfaraz Ahmad, GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan, Malkajgiri Municipal Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, Cyberabad Municipal Commissioner Srijana, Ranga Reddy District Collector Narayana Reddy, Medchal Collector Manu Choudhary, MRDCL Managing Director E.V. Narasimha Reddy, Joint Managing Director Gouthami and other senior officials attended the review meeting.

Stone-pelting, lathi-charge, water cannons mark students' protest over BPSC exams

Patna (TSIT): A protest by thousands of students demanding reforms in Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) examinations turned violent on Tuesday as clashes broke out between agitators and police personnel in Patna. The protestors pelted stones, while police used water cannons and resorted to lathi-charge to disperse the crowd.

The protesters, mostly aspirants preparing for the Teachers' Recruitment Examinations to be conducted by BPSC next month, had announced a 'Mukhyamantri Awasth Gherao' programme to press for their demand that the written examination process should be conducted in a single stage instead of the existing preliminary and mains system.

A section of the protesters also demanded the cancellation of the Combined Competitive Examination conducted by the commission earlier this year, alleging irregularities in the examination process.

The protest march began from Gandhi Maidan and was joined by activists from Left organisations, including the Students' Federation of India



(SFI) and Democratic Youth Federation of India (DYFI). The procession was planned towards the Chief Minister's residence, with heavy security arrangements deployed along the nearly five-kilometre route.

Police officials said repeated appeals were made to protesters to maintain peace and assured that a delegation would be allowed to meet authorities to submit their demands. However, tensions escalated when protesters attempted to break barricades at J.P. Golambar and Dak Bungalow crossing, one of Patna's busiest junctions.

Police used water cannons to control the crowd, but

protesters continued their march. Videos circulated on social media showed clashes between police and demonstrators, including incidents of stone-pelting and lathi-charge. Several protesters were detained, while some people reportedly sustained injuries during the confrontation.

Patna Senior Superintendent of Police Kartikeya Sharma said the situation was brought under control and traffic movement was being restored. He said police would review CCTV footage to identify those involved in violence and take action against anti-social elements.

ED seizes Rs 3.8 crore cash in fake GST invoice case

Lucknow, Aug 25: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has seized Rs 3.8 crore in unaccounted cash during searches at 11 premises in Uttar Pradesh and Haryana in connection with an alleged GST fraud that caused a loss of Rs 27.02 crore to the government, an official said on Tuesday. The ED's Lucknow Zonal Office conducted the searches on Monday under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. Besides the cash, the agency seized incriminating documents and digital devices during the searches.

5 of family end life in Srisaillam rest house due to financial distress

Amaravati, Aug 25: In a tragic incident, five members of a family allegedly died by suicide at a rest house in the temple town of Srisaillam, Andhra Pradesh, police said on Tuesday. The deceased have been identified as Pallapu Sudhakar (50), his sisters Gogula Adilakshmi (36), Malleshwari (45), and Sridevi (33), along with Malleshwari's 15-year-old son, Manikantha. All five victims hailed from Battalipalli in Sri Sathya Sai district. According to the police, the family had arrived at Srisaillam in an auto-rickshaw on July 28 and checked into room number 11 at Vaddera Sataram, a lodge for devotees visiting the Sri Mallikarjuna Swamy temple, paying a daily rent of Rs 29.

JeM headquarters in Bahawalpur rebuilt after Operation

New Delhi (TSIT): The headquarters of UN-designated terrorist group Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) in Pakistan's Bahawalpur, which was damaged in India's Operation Sindoor strikes last year, has reportedly been rebuilt, according to media reports citing intelligence inputs. The Markaz Subhanallah facility, which sustained extensive damage during the strikes, has reportedly been refurbished with new plaster, paint and polished marble, the reports said.

Cong calls Centre's caste Enumeration framework 'flawed', seeks fresh questionnaire

New Delhi (TSIT) The Congress on Tuesday mounted a fresh attack on the Centre over the proposed methodology for caste enumeration in the upcoming census, with Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh calling the exercise a "deception" and a "whitewash" rather than a genuine caste census.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters, Ramesh said the methodology proposed by the government



was fundamentally flawed and would fail to generate the accurate and comprehensive data

needed to formulate policies aimed at ensuring social justice.

Drawing attention to the census notification issued on August 14, Ramesh said it contained 40 questions, with only one question concerning caste, placed at number 10. He described the approach as "self-sabotage" and questioned how a serious nationwide caste census could be conducted through what the Congress considers an inadequately designed format.

"The government's current efforts towards a caste census

are just a whitewash," Ramesh said, demanding a credible, transparent and scientifically designed enumeration exercise.

The Congress leader also accused the Centre of failing to consult opposition parties and state governments on the structure and methodology of the census. He said the existing notification should be withdrawn and replaced with a comprehensive questionnaire prepared after consultations with political parties, experts, state governments and the public.

Goyal pitches India as trusted destination for data centres, cites USD 200 bn investment commitments

TOKYO (TSIT): Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Tuesday pitched India as a compelling destination for data centres, saying the country can work with Japanese companies to develop the sector and has already received investment commitments of about USD 200 billion from large hyperscalers globally. During his meeting with Japanese Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Akazawa Ryosei, Goyal said the partnership could be summarised around four pillars - increasing trade, strengthening technology cooperation, boosting invest-



ments and promoting tourism. "Data centres are another area where India provides a very compelling case, a destination as a trusted partner. We can work

together to promote data centres in India. We already have a commitment of about USD 200 billion from large hyperscalers from across the world," he said.

GOVT TO SELL ONIONS IN DELHI AT RS 35/KG, MUCH LOWER THAN MKT RATE

NEW DELHI (TSIT): (Aug 25) The government will sell onions at Rs 35 per kg in the national capital, a deep discount of around 36 per cent from the prevailing average retail prices, as it looks to provide relief to the common man from high rates. The Centre is procuring onions from the key-producing state of Maharashtra, where it has maintained buffer stock to deal with any price rise. The first consignment of 800 tonnes will reach the national capital on Wednesday via 'Kanda Express' train.

H1N1 rise: Children, elderly people at most risk, doctors warn

NEW DELHI (TSIT): As H1N1 cases rise in the national capital, doctors and health experts have pointed out that children, elderly people, pregnant women and those with chronic illnesses are the most vulnerable to severe infection.

Delhi has recorded over 2,300 Influenza-A cases this year, including more than 1,777 H1N1 cases till Friday, with 114 H1N1 cases reported on Thursday alone, according to health department data.

Delhi suffers bird hit at Patna airport, all passengers safe. "The rise in H1N1 cases has brought preventive vaccination back into the conversation," said Dr Bharat Gopal, senior director, respiratory and sleep medicine, Medanta Mediclinic, Defence Colony and Medanta-The Medicity.

More people have been enquiring about seasonal influenza vaccination, particularly high-risk individuals and families with children or elderly members, he said. Dr Bibhu Anand, physician at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, said, "The swine flu test is easily available in



almost all hospitals and diagnostic centres." Testing at private hospitals generally costs between Rs 1,500 and Rs 5,000, while a full respiratory BioFire panel can cost between Rs 9,000 and Rs 15,000.

In government hospitals, the cost is "almost negligible," he said. Dr Anand also said that multiplex PCR testing can be done only at restricted laboratories and the decision to test should be based on the patient's symp-

toms, clinical presentation and the treating physician's assessment. The increase in cases is being reflected in the number of patients seeking medical consultation at hospitals across Delhi-NCR. "The number of patients has increased by around five to six in the past week, translating into a 22-25 per cent rise," said Dr Aakashneel Bhattacharya, consultant, infectious disease, Paras Health, Gurugram.

At Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute, around eight to 10 patients with flu-like symptoms are coming to the clinic daily, while two to three patients with more

serious flu illness are being admitted, said Dr Arvind Aggarwal, director, internal medicine. At Apollo Spectra Hospital, Dr Ali Sher, senior consultant, internal medicine, said the hospital has seen an increase in patients seeking consultation for flu-like symptoms in recent weeks, some with serious respiratory complaints.

The latest figures show a sharp year-on-year rise in H1N1 infections. Delhi recorded 1,777 cases till August 20, against 229 during the corresponding period last year, representing an increase of more than six times, Dr Gopal said.

Commonly reported symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, headache, body ache, chills, fatigue, runny nose and nasal congestion. Some patients, particularly children, may also experience nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea. Doctors said most patients with uncomplicated influenza can be treated on an outpatient basis and do not require hospitalisation. Admission is generally considered when patients develop pneumonia, breathing difficulties, reduced oxygen saturation, persistent high fever or worsening of an existing medical condition.

NO SCOPE FOR ERRORS IN ELECTORAL ROLL
REVISION: COLLECTOR HEMANTA KESHAV PATIL

The South India Times // NAGARKURNOOL : District Collector Hemanta Keshav Patil directed officials to meticulously verify the Anomalies and No Mapping cases identified during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and ensure that there are no errors in the details of eligible voters. The Collector conducted a surprise inspection of Polling Booth No. 179 at Peddammundunur mandal headquarters on Tuesday. During the inspection, he enquired with BLO Jyothi about the Anomalies and No Mapping cases identified as part of the SIR process. The BLO informed the Collector that notices had been issued to 160 persons under the Anomalies category, of which 120 had already received notices. The remaining 40 notices would be served by Tuesday evening. She also informed him that notices issued to



all seven persons under the No Mapping category had been served. The Collector subsequently examined the details of a voter, Hussain Basha, who had received a notice under the Anomalies category as the age difference recorded between his two daughters was less than nine months. The Collector advised the voter to submit a birth certificate or SSC certificate relating to his age and family details to the BLO and make the necessary corrections. Collector Hemanta Keshav Patil instructed officials to ensure that every person who receives a notice under the SIR process is properly informed. He directed them to thoroughly verify the documents submitted by voters as per the prescribed rules and accurately update the details. He stressed that field-level verification should be carried out comprehensively to prevent errors in the electoral roll revision process and ensure that the details of every eligible voter are correctly recorded.

Centre Blocked CM's US Visit: Jagga Reddy

Sangareddy, August 25 (TSIT): Congress leader Jagga Reddy alleged that the BJP-led Central government obstructed Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's proposed US visit and demanded an explanation from the Centre.

Addressing the media at Gandhi Bhavan, he accused the BRS government of restricting people's right to protest by removing Dharna Chowk, while claiming the Congress restored democratic freedoms. Jagga Reddy highlighted welfare schemes including loan waivers, free bus travel and smart ration cards. He questioned the BJP over objections to Revanth Reddy's visit while referring to Prime Minister Modi's earlier Pakistan visit.

Cotton MSP Fixed at Rs.8,867: Collector



Nalgonda, August 25 (TSIT): District Collector B. Chandrasekhar directed officials to ensure smooth cotton procurement without causing inconvenience to farmers. He said the government has increased the cotton support price to Rs.8,867 per quintal this year, Rs.557 higher than last year. With cotton cultivation spread across 2.4 lakh hectares, around 14 lakh quintals of produce is expected. Procurement is likely to begin in October through 31 ginning mills. Rice Mill Booked Over CMR Default

Mahabubabad, August 25 (TSIT): A case has been registered against Mahadeva Agro Industries in Kesamudram mandal for alleged default in Custom Milled Rice (CMR) delivery during the Kharif 2023-24 season. Telangana minister, Planning Board Vice-Chairman likely to face axe over indiscipline

Hyderabad, Aug 25 : Telangana Forest and Endowments Minister Konda Surekha and Planning Board Vice-Chairman G. Chinna Reddy are likely to face the axe as the Disciplinary Committee of the state Congress unit has recommended strict action against them for indiscipline. The Disciplinary Committee, in its report submitted to the state unit, is understood to have recommended that the party drop Surekha from the Cabinet and also remove Chinna Reddy from his post.

The action was recommended against Surekha and Chinna Reddy for their remarks considered damaging to the party and its leadership.

Chinna Reddy, a senior leader, enjoys the Cabinet rank in his capacity as the



Vice-Chairman of the Planning Board. Disciplinary Committee Chairman Mallu Ravi and Vice-Chairman Shyam Mohan on Tuesday submitted the report to state party President Mahesh Kumar Goud, and he has forwarded the report to AICC in-charge for Telangana, Meenakshi Natrajan.

Party sources said the AICC leadership will take

a final decision on the action to be taken against the two leaders.

The Disciplinary Panel reportedly observed that Surekha should have condemned the remarks made by her daughter Konda Sushmita against Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. The report also mentioned that this was not the first time that she violated party discipline.

In her reply to the show-

cause notice issued by the Disciplinary Committee, Surekha had distanced herself from the comments made by Sushmita at an event at Parkala in Warangal district.

The minister stated in her reply that she should not be held politically responsible for remarks made against the Chief Minister, and that those were personal views of her daughter.

She had urged the Disciplinary Committee to withdraw the notice issued to her.

Chinna Reddy had also urged the Disciplinary Committee to withdraw the notice issued to him. He said in his reply that the comments made by him recently were only an expression of the grievances of long-standing party leaders and workers.

Police in Hyderabad rescue two children kidnapped from labour camp

Hyderabad, Aug 25 : Hyderabad Police have rescued two children kidnapped from a labour camp in Kondapur, Hyderabad. Police said they successfully detected the kidnapping case within four hours of receiving the complaint and safely rescued two children aged below 4 years.Ch. Srinivas, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Serilingampally Zone, said a complaint was received at Gachibowli Police Station at 2 a.m. on Tuesday (August 25) from David Murmu, a resident of Labour Camp, Kondapur. The complainant stated that his daughter, Pramila Murmu, and another labourer's daughter, Sangeeta Hemaram, were playing in the labour camp on the evening of

Monday. The complainant noticed that one Chaku Soren, who was residing in the same labour camp, allegedly took both the children from the camp and fled from the location. Based on the complaint, a case was registered, and immediate efforts were initiated to trace and rescue the children.The DCP said special teams were immediately formed and information regarding the accused and the missing children was circulated to various police stations and railway authorities. One police team was deployed to check railway stations and other possible transit points. Alerts were sent to Railway Police Station, L & O Police Stations to check trains going towards Kolkata.

Boy's anxiety symptoms revealed rare heart rhythm disorder

Hyderabad, August 25, 2026: A 12-year-old boy's recurring episodes of racing heartbeat and dizziness, initially suspected to be anxiety, were found to be caused by a rare electrical abnormality in his heart. Doctors at Medicoever Hospitals, Hitech City, successfully treated the condition using advanced high-density 3D electrical mapping technology.

The child had been experiencing sudden heart palpitations and dizziness for several months, affecting his daily activities and confidence. Although he had earlier undergone catheter ablation for an arrhythmia, the symptoms returned, leading to another emergency visit.

A detailed evaluation by the electrophysiology



team revealed that the issue was not anxiety or a routine rhythm disorder. Using high-density 3D mapping, doctors identified an uncommon abnormal electrical circuit in the right upper chamber of the heart, which is rarely seen in children of his age.

The team performed a repeat catheter ablation

procedure, precisely targeting multiple points of the faulty circuit to stop the abnormal rhythm. The procedure lasted over two hours, and the boy recovered well, returning home the following day.Over the next few months, his medications were gradually stopped, and he returned to normal activities,

including school and sports. Nearly a year later, he remains symptom-free.

Dr. Kumar Narayanan, Senior Consultant Cardiologist and Electrophysiologist at Medicoever Hospitals, said that racing heartbeats and dizziness in children should not always be dismissed as anxiety, as rhythm disorders can occur at any age. He highlighted that advanced mapping technologies are helping doctors diagnose and treat complex heart rhythm problems more effectively.

Doctors advised parents to seek medical evaluation if children experience repeated palpitations, dizziness or chest discomfort, as many rhythm disorders can be successfully treated.

Farewell accorded to Justice V. Gopala Krishna Rao

10 crore devotees expected; 4,932 works taken up at a cost of Rs.4,026 crore



TSIT, Visakhapatnam. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has directed officials to organise the 2027 Godavari Pushkaram on a grand scale by blending spirituality with nature worship and ensuring world-class facilities for devotees. Reviewing the arrangements at the Secretariat on Tuesday, he said the Pushkarams would be held for 12 days from June 26 to July 7, 2027, with an estimated 8 to 10 crore devotees expected to take holy dips. A total of 4,932 works costing Rs.4,026 crore are being taken up, with Rs.899 crore already allocated. As many as 440 bathing ghats will be made available, including 259 existing ghats being upgraded and 181 new ghats being constructed. The Chief Minister stressed that there should be no compromise on sanitation, drinking water, medical facilities, accommodation, transport and safety. He also called for developing a temple tourism circuit covering important spiritual destinations such as Pithapuram, the Pancharama temples, Dwaraka Tirumala, Annavaram, Vadapalli and Antavadi, besides encouraging homestays and expe-

ditioning approvals for new hotels.

Several recruitment notifications are expected to be issued during September and October. The calendar includes vacancies in Group-I and Group-II services, Police, Fire, Prisons, Forest, Animal Husbandry, Excise, Engineering, Power and other departments. The Minister



said 2,991 teacher posts would also be filled through the DSC recruitment process. He urged unemployed youth to make the best use of the opportunities, work hard and prepare seriously for competitive examinations to secure government jobs. He called upon those who obtain government employment to serve the people and the state with dedication and commitment. The Minister said the government's objective was to turn the aspirations of the state's youth into reality and provide them with a secure and bright future.

Suzlon Projects to Strengthen Andhra Pradesh's Renewable Energy Sector



Visakhapatnam (TSIT) : Andhra Pradesh is aiming to emerge as a leading renewable energy hub with a target of developing 175 GW of renewable energy capacity, Minister for Education and IT Nara Lokesh said. Speaking at a public meeting after laying the foundation stone for Suzlon Wind Energy projects at Huliker in Kanekallu mandal of Rayadurg constituency, he said Suzlon's renewed partnership with Andhra Pradesh would mark a new chapter in the state's clean energy journey. Suzlon has been associated with Andhra Pradesh for more than two decades and has helped build a strong wind energy ecosystem. Its Anantapur unit has an annual manufacturing capacity of around 1,260 MW and provides direct employment to about 1,200 people, with more than 70 per cent being locals. The new projects will add 1,325 MW of renewable energy capacity, attract investments of around Rs.10,000 crore and create more than 4,000 direct and indirect jobs. Suzlon already has

around 1,600 MW of installed capacity in the state, while another 2,700 MW is under development and construction. Lokesh said the state is focusing on integrating solar, wind and energy storage technologies to meet the growing power demand from industries and data centres. With Andhra Pradesh developing a major data-centre ecosystem, renewable energy will play a crucial role in meeting future energy requirements. Lokesh said the government is developing 22 industrial clusters across sectors including renewable energy, data centres, electronics, pharmaceuticals, automobiles, chemicals, fisheries and manufacturing to create complete industrial ecosystems rather than bringing individual companies in isolation. As part of the partnership between the Andhra Pradesh Government and Suzlon, around 12,000 youth, including 25 per cent women, will receive skill development training for green energy jobs through centres at Uravakonda and Vijayawada.

BRITISH MAN CHARGED IN SINGAPORE TWO YEARS AFTER ALLEGED THEFT AT AIRPORT

Singapore has charged a British man for theft more than two years after he allegedly stole a denim jacket from a store at the airport shopping mall. The police were alerted to the theft in the evening of 14 August 2024 when a retail assistant at Singapore's Changi Airport realised a blue denim jacket was missing from a display mannequin. Surveillance footage showed a man removing the jacket, worth about S\$350 (£275; £202), from the mannequin and leaving the store without making payment. By the time the authorities established his identity, the man had departed Singapore. The 26-year-old was arrested on 15 August this year while in transit at the airport and was charged on

Tuesday. "The police take a serious stance of shop theft and will deal firmly with offenders in accordance with the law. "Offenders should not assume that they can evade detection simply by leaving Singapore after committing an offence," the Singapore Police Force said in a statement on Monday. In its statement the police also recounted a separate arrest of a 50-year-old Polish woman who had stolen two bottles of perfume from retail stores inside one of the airport's terminals on 11 June this year. She was arrested in the transit area shortly before she was scheduled to depart Singapore. The woman was charged with two counts of theft on Tuesday. Those convicted of theft in Singapore face up to seven years in jail.

China warns it will protect its interests after US widens sanctions against Iran

China has vowed to protect its interests after the US announced plans to widen economic sanctions against Iran and its trading partners, which include Beijing. Foreign ministry spokesman Lin Jian said China was firmly opposed to what it called "illegal unilateral sanctions" and would take "all necessary measures" to safeguard its rights. This came after US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent announced the new measures on Monday, warning any nation financially partnering with Iran would be isolated. China is the biggest buyer of Iranian oil, although the trade has declined under the US blockade of Iran's ports. Lin said: "Cooperation between China and Iran has always been con-



ducted within the framework of international law and should not be interfered with or disrupted." Bessent described the plans for sanctions as "the single greatest financial offensive ever" against Iran, warning banks and businesses would share in Iran's isolation if they refused to cut ties with the country. He declined to focus on specific nations, but said US President Donald Trump

would be phoning world leaders "with specific requests to cease their interactions with the regime". However, responding to a question about Chinese banks, Bessent said he wanted to make clear "no one was above the reach of US sanctions". The announcement comes ahead of planned talks between Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping next month. Washington is likely

to be wary of potential retaliation from Beijing, which processes the majority of the world's rare earths and other critical minerals, crucial in the manufacture of many high-tech products. Beijing has already tightened export controls on rare earths as part of previous trade negotiations with the US. China's response followed Iranian Economy Minister Ali Madanizadeh saying Tehran was "fully prepared" for the wider sanctions, which he said would lead to "another defeat" for the US. "The government is and was ready and has a two-year plan to manage these events," he told state television. "We also have our own tools and know how to play the game," he said, adding Tehran had been "waiting for these plans for a long time".

US firefighters say major blaze near Reno about a quarter contained

Texas: US fire crews have reported progress in their efforts to tackle a large wildfire menacing the city of Reno, Nevada - saying the blaze is about a quarter contained. The Hawk Fire, which began on Saturday, had spread over 15,000 acres by Monday, firefighters said. Evacuation orders remain in place for 23,000 people, though other residents have now been allowed to return to their homes. Tens of thousands of other residents have been told to be ready to leave at any moment. Officials are concerned that gusts of wind could drive the flames towards more homes. Unfavourable weather conditions are forecast for the next two days, meaning the fire could continue to burn during that timeframe. No deaths have been reported, though seven people have been injured. The fire, which was first reported on Saturday morning, spread in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada mountains near Reno due to those same windy and unpredictable weather conditions. The immediate "go now" evacuation zone and wider "get set" area - where people are being warned to prepare to evacuate - do not extend to the centre of Reno, but they do affect large urban areas and part of a highway. Large air tankers and helicopters have been flying over the affected area dropping water and fire retardants. In their update on

Monday afternoon, fire officials said the blaze had been at least 27% contained. Chief Richard Edwards, of the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District, said those injured were four civilians and three firefighters, who suffered minor burns. Edwards added that 32 homes had been destroyed and six damaged, and that those numbers were expected to increase. Shelters have been set up in the area to take in displaced residents. While firefighters have made progress, more than two-thirds of the fire's perimeter remains uncontained. The fire is thought to have been caused by humans. Edwards added on Monday that investigators did not yet know if the blaze was set intentionally. Scientists say that human-induced climate change makes the warm, dry conditions more likely that assist the rapid spread of wildfires. Reno's average temperature has gone up by over 4C since the 1970s, faster than any other big US city, according to Climate Central. Nevada's Governor Joe Lombardo earlier declared a state of emergency in surrounding Washoe County, and ordered the National Guard to join firefighting and law enforcement efforts. "This is an active and rapidly evolving situation and I urge everyone in the affected areas to remain vigilant and follow the direction of local officials," he said on Saturday.

LOCKERBIE BOMBING TRIAL POSTPONED DAYS BEFORE IT WAS DUE TO START

Libya: The trial of a Libyan man over the Lockerbie bombing has been postponed for a third time, after new evidence on the 37-year-old case came to light three days ago. Jury selection was due to get under way in Washington DC on Wednesday but the BBC understands a new start date has been set for January next year. Lawyers acting for Abu Agila Mas'ud Kheir Al-Marimi said "newly discovered evidence" previously unknown to the defence and prosecutors from the US government emerged on Friday 21 August. Al-Marimi has denied building the bomb that destroyed Pan Am Flight 103 on 21 December 1988, killing 270 people. His lawyers told the court: "Constitutional and ethical obligations require the defence to investigate this development." They said they met Al-Marimi on Sunday and he agreed that they should ask for the postponement. The trial judge,



Dabney Friedrich, has agreed that the start date should be set aside, underlining the potential importance of the new evidence. She would have been extremely reluctant to allow an 11th hour postponement after months of preparation and marathon pre-trial legal battles. For the relatives of those who died and Al-Marimi himself, this latest delay means a verdict might not come until next spring. It is yet another stunning development in a saga that has witnessed countless twists and turns over nearly four decades. Pan Am 103

was flying from Heathrow to New York when the bomb exploded in its forward hold, breaking the plane apart at 31,000 feet. All 259 passengers and crew on board were killed. Another 11 people died in Lockerbie when the wreckage fell on their homes. Of the victims, 190 were American and 43 from the UK. Nearly four decades later, the bombing remains the worst terror attack and mass murder in British history. Al-Marimi has been in US custody since 2022 and was originally due to stand trial in May 2025. That date was set aside following a

joint request from the prosecution and defence, who cited the complexity of the case and Al-Marimi's ill health. The trial was pencilled in for April this year but was called off again, after the defence asked for more time to prepare. The Lockerbie bombing has been the subject of a joint Scottish-US investigation since December 1988. Prosecutors from the Crown Office and detectives from Police Scotland were due to travel to Washington to attend the case, and Scottish witnesses were expected to be among the first to give evidence at the trial. Laura Buchan, head of the Lockerbie investigation team at the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service said: "I recognise that this adjournment will be disappointing for the families and for those who have followed this case over many years. "As the matter remains before the court, it would not be appropriate to comment on the reasons for the adjournment.

French tourist dies in Death Valley after car gets stuck in mud

France: A French tourist has died in California's Death Valley after becoming stranded on the side of the road during 46.6C (116F) heat. Police found 68-year-old Pierre Michel Formosa recently following a brief search, with the National Park service saying he died while trying to seek help in the blistering heat when his car got stuck in mud. "This is a heartbreaking reminder of how quickly conditions here can turn dangerous," Death Valley National Park Superintendent Mike Reynolds said in a statement. Soaring temperatures across the United States have caused millions of people to sweat through record heat-

waves, leading to dozens of heat-related deaths. Formosa was driving through Death Valley with his French travelling companion last Monday when their vehicle became stuck in mud on West Side Road. The pair sought help by walking across the salt flats, before severe heat prevented the 68-year-old from continuing after 1.3 miles, according to the Death Valley National Park. The travelling companion managed to hail down a nearby driver, before rangers and police found Formosa later that afternoon where he was pronounced dead. "Death Valley is an extraordinary place, but its heat, distances, and remoteness can be dangerous, regardless of experience.

US-CANADA TRADE WAR ESCALATES AS TRUMP THREATENS TARIFF HIKE ON VEHICLES

Washington: President Donald Trump has threatened to hike US tariffs on automobiles originating in Canada, as the trade war between the two neighbours continues to heat up. Trump said on Monday that he will increase tariffs on Canadian cars and trucks, as well as auto parts, from 25% to 50% as of 1 January. It comes after US-Canada trade talks collapsed late last week, with each side accusing the other of making unreasonable last-minute demands. Late on Monday, Canada officials announced a news conference on Tuesday where they would outline how the country would respond to the trade war and work to "protect and support Canadian workers



and businesses during these challenging times". The news conference at 11:00 ET (16:00 BST) will include government leaders in business, finance and economic development. Earlier in the day, Prime Minister Mark Carney called Trump's latest levy threat unsurprising and accused the president of

wanting to destroy Canada's auto industry. He added that Canada is ready to resume talks only if the US comes with the "right attitude". The war of words followed several US and Canadian officials saying that talks were suspended with no set date to resume. Canada walked away from

trade negotiations late on Friday night, moments before a US-imposed deadline that would add a 50% levy on nearly \$20bn (£28bn; £14bn) of Canadian imports. The collapse in talks marked a significant change in tone from earlier in the week, when both sides appeared optimistic that a new US-Canada trade deal could be reached. Canadian officials have said the US introduced last-minute demands that were "unacceptable", including a clause limiting which countries Canada could sign trade deals with. US officials, meanwhile, said it was Canada that introduced last-minute changes. "They wanted more," US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer said in an interview with CNBC on Monday.

Mumbai: Sri Lanka ended Day 2 of their ongoing second Test against India on the worst-possible note, losing two wickets in just three overs before Stumps. The most agonising moment came on the final ball before play ended, as nightwatchman Prabath Jayasuriya was given out LBW off Manav Suthar's bowling. It was a close call by Pakistani umpire Ahsan Raza, as replays later showed that the ball was marginally clipping the off-stump.

Jayasuriya was left livid after his dismissal, and was seen throwing his gloves in anger after walking into the dressing room. The Sri Lankan batters also seemed upset that umpires Raza and Sharfuddoula Saikat had decided to keep the game going till 6 PM local time, despite diminishing light at the Sinhalese Sports Club in Colombo. The match was resumed at 5:35 PM local time after a second rain delay, but only three overs of play were possible. Ahead of the third over, the umpires

had checked the conditions with a light meter, and declared that it was okay for another over of play to take place. Speaking on the topic, reputed commentator Harsha Bhogle implied that he understood Jayasuriya and Sri Lanka's frustration, but that the decision of the umpires must be respected. "Can understand the frustration of the Sri Lankan batters but these are two high quality international panel umpires and we have to go with their judgement. India Great PR Sreejesh Asks 'Uncomfortable Question' After Hockey World Cup 2026 Exit: "Stop Hiding"

Mumbai: Legendary goalkeeper and two-time Olympic bronze medallist PR Sreejesh on Monday voiced his frustration over India's underwhelming showing at the FIH World Cup, saying there must be "accountability" and that the global event cannot be treated as a "dress rehearsal." The Indian men's team lost 3-5 to Argentina in Amstelveen on Monday, extinguishing their wafer-thin hopes of reaching the semifinals. The women's team, meanwhile, succumbed to the pressure of a must-win game and were knocked out of semifinal contention after being held to a goalless draw by Australia on Saturday. A member of India's bronze medal-winning teams at the 2020 Tokyo and 2024 Paris Olympics, Sreejesh said some-



one needs to ask the "difficult" and "uncomfortable" questions over the lacklustre performances. "...Here's the uncomfortable question: Are we building a team to PLAY good hockey, or a team capable of WINNING against the best

in the world?" Sreejesh, India's most successful hockey goalkeeper, wrote on 'X'. "Stop hiding behind 'learning', 'good hockey' and future tournaments. The World Cup is not a rehearsal. It is the World Cup. So who is going to ask the diffi-

cult questions? Who is going to demand accountability? And most importantly...Does anyone actually care?" he asked. The Indian men's team entered the World Cup on the back of an unimpressive Pro League campaign, finishing eighth

among nine teams. However, there were renewed hopes of a better showing after the coaches and players offered positive feedback on their preparations. He said the upcoming Asian Games in Aichi-Nagoya next month, where India are expected to challenge for a medal, should not be an excuse for taking the World Cup lightly. "Don't worry...the World Cup doesn't matter. The Asian Games are coming. Win a medal there, and then we can start dreaming about LA 2028 (Olympics). Apparently, that's enough to cover everything that went wrong at the World Cup," wrote Sreejesh. He also took a dig at women's chief coach Sjoerd Marjine for reportedly leaving the World Cup camp while it was in full swing, saying the players still fought hard and exceeded expectations.

'INDIA HAVE FALLEN BEHIND': RAHUL DRAVID'S BIG WTC REALITY CHECK

Mumbai: Eight Tests remain for India in their race to enter the World Test Championship final. In those matches, the Shubman Gill-led side needs around six wins. It's not a good position to be in, but India still have a chance. Former head coach Rahul Dravid says India have slightly "fallen behind" in the race to qualify for the World Test Championship final and, even though the performance in Sri Lanka right now is encouraging, it will not be easy for the team to get past New Zealand during an upcoming series. Currently placed fifth in the points table, two-time finalists India are locked in an uphill battle to win the majority of their remaining matches in the



World Test Championship 2025-2027 and move up. With the top two teams slated to play in the final next year, India, who are ranked fifth behind Bangladesh, will play two away Tests in New Zealand before taking on Australia in a five-Test series at home from January 2027. India will also play five ODIs and as many T20Is against the Kiwis. "I'm hoping they do.

It'll be a great run if India can qualify for the WTC final from here," Dravid, a team owner in the European T20 Premier League (ETPL), told JioStar when asked if India would be able to make the summit clash from here. "They've fallen behind a little bit, but the kind of quality that the Indian team has, you're not going to write them off at any stage.

VUELTA STAGE THREE ABANDONED AFTER HAIL IN PYRENEES

The third stage of the Vuelta a Espana was abandoned on Monday because of severe weather and hailstorms in the French Pyrenees. A severe hailstorm hit as the riders scaled the Col de Mont-Louis with 15km (9.32 miles) remaining of the 174km ride from Gruissan to Font-Romeu. Overall race leader and favourite Tadej Pogacar was seen indicating to the main group to pull off the course and soon afterwards drenched riders took shelter in a nearby hotel. Shortly afterwards organisers announced the stage would not resume and there would be no winner or podium ceremony.



Ahmedabad To Host Commonwealth Cue Sports Championships

Ahmedabad : As one of the world's premier destinations for cue sports, India will host the second Commonwealth Cue Sports Championships from October 7-10 at the Veer Savarkar Sports Complex in Ahmedabad. The four-day event will see cueists from nearly 46 countries compete across five disciplines – billiards, snooker, heyball, 10-ball pool and blackball – in both categories (men and women), stated a release from Billiards and Snooker Federation of India on Tuesday. The championships will feature 16 players in each category in four disciplines, while billiards, which has been included in the programme this year, will be an eight-player draw in each section. The championships will be held under



the aegis of the World Confederation of Billiards Sports (WCBS) and the Billiards and Snooker Federation of India (BSFI), and organised by Apex Sports. "Ahmedabad is becoming an increasingly important city on the international sporting map, and hosting the Commonwealth Cue Sports Championships here is a significant opportunity for our sport and for India," said Ishaun Singh,

president of the World Pool Association (WPA). "With the city now preparing to host the 2030 Commonwealth Games, this event gives us an opportunity to build a strong connection with the sporting community and audiences here. India has an extraordinary history in cue sports, and from everything we have seen through our recent events," the world body chief added.

5 Players Excluded From India's Asian Games Squad Not Part Of AITA's Recommendation: SAI Source

Mumbai: The five tennis players excluded from the country's Asian Games squad did not feature in the long list sent to the IOA by the All India Tennis Association (AITA), a Sports Authority of India (SAI) source said on Tuesday, justifying the omission on the basis of their lower-than-prescribed international rankings. Manas Dhamne (men's singles), Vaishnavi Adkar (women's singles), Sahaja Yamalapalli (women's singles), Vaidehee Chaudhari (women's doubles) and Prarthana Thombare (women's doubles) were not included in the seven-member Indian squad as they did not meet the criteria of being inside the top-8 of continental standings. "Their names were not received by Sports Ministry in the final list shared by the IOA (Indian Olympic Association). In fact their names were not there in the long list sent by the All India Tennis Association (AITA) to the

IOA," the source told PTI. Their exclusion, the source said, is justified as their recent performances too did not reflect medal probability or potential for effective participation in the showpiece. The Ministry's selection mandate required individual athletes to be among top six in Asia for singles events and be ranked within the top eight in Asia for doubles over a 12-month evaluation window. This criteria was unveiled by the Sports Ministry in September last year. Their omission was heavily criticised by two-time Asian Games gold-medallist Rohan Bopanna, who said "a committee that never stood where they stood has decided their fate on paper, before a ball is struck." Sahaja (world rank 344) is the current India number one in women's singles and Vaishnavi (world rank 388) is national champion two. Prarthana is a former Asian Games bronze-medallist (2014), Vaidhahee is a two-time national champion and the 18-year-old Manas is a Challenger level finalist.

MERCEDES' UPGRADES & FERRARI TEAM ORDERS

Italy: Lando Norris beat championship leader Kimi Antonelli to claim his second win in a row with victory at the Dutch Grand Prix. Reigning world champion Norris moved up to fourth in the drivers' standings, 83 points adrift of Mercedes' Antonelli. Four-time world champion Max Verstappen suffered heartbreak at his final home race when he crashed out heavily in the opening stages. F1 correspondent Andrew Benson answers your questions after round 12 of the campaign in

Zandvoort. Is it fair to say the dominance of Mercedes is over? They haven't won a race since Spa-Francorchamps, and even then that victory wasn't consecutive. Are they focusing more now on scoring points than they are winning races? There has been a very obvious shift in competitiveness at the front as the Formula 1 season has progressed. Mercedes won the first six races of the season, but have won only two of the subsequent six. Mercedes took 10 consecutive poles in the first 10 races, but have been beaten by McLaren's Lando

Norris at the past two grands prix. And the fastest Mercedes was lower than second for the first time in Hungary, where Red Bull's Max Verstappen also lined up ahead of Kimi Antonelli. Over the season as a whole so far, the Mercedes is the fastest car in qualifying by an average of 0.316 seconds over Ferrari, with McLaren a further 0.041secs adrift. But what happens when you split that into the first six races and the next six? Until the Canadian Grand Prix in late May, Mercedes were 0.453secs a lap faster than the next fastest team, which was
