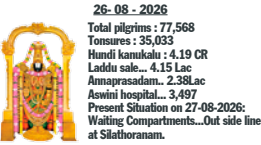

Two pilots die as plane on training flight crashes

New Delhi: A trainee pilot and flying instructor were killed in a plane crash near Ganga Barrage, approximately 5 nautical miles from Kanpur Civil Airport, on Thursday, according to a statement issued by the Ministry of Civil Aviation. The Tecnam P2006T twin-engine aircraft, bearing registration VT-NBV and operated by M/s Garg Aviation Ltd., Kanpur, was on a training flight in the local flying area of Kanpur Civil Airport. There were two persons on board, a trainee pilot and an instructor.

PMJDY accounts cross 59 crore mark

New Delhi (TSIT): The total number of PM Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) bank accounts for the poor across the country have crossed the 59 crore mark with deposits of Rs 3.17 lakh crore as the scheme completes 12 years since its launch on August 28, 2014, according to a statement issued by the Finance Ministry on Thursday. Under PMJDY, 78 per cent of the accounts have been opened in rural or semi-urban areas, and approximately 56 per cent of accounts are owned by women, depicting the priority of the scheme, which was to bring the underprivileged living in far-flung areas of the country into the formal financial sector.

CM Revanth Reddy inspects development works at Hyderabad's Mir Alam Tank



Hyderabad (TSIT) : Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Thursday conducted a surprise inspection of the ongoing development works at Mir Alam Tank, as part of the state government's vision to transform the area into a major tourist attraction in Hyderabad.

During the inspection, the Chief Minister reviewed the works in detail and directed officials to develop the area with distinctive, world-class designs and tourist-friendly amenities.

According to the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), he reviewed the plans presented through a photo exhibition and offered several suggestions to

enhance the overall development. Travelling around the tank in an open-top jeep, the Chief Minister inspected the ongoing works and also reviewed the construction of the suspension bridge being built across Mir Alam Tank. He went up with the help of a heavy crane to see the suspension bridge being constructed over the tank.

The Chief Minister directed the officials to complete all works within the stipulated timeline. He asked them to take steps to prevent sewage from entering the tank. The officials were also directed to widen the canal to facilitate the smooth flow of floodwater into the Musi River.

Cong leader Randeep Surjewala alleges Rs 36,000-cr 'sugar scam', targets BJP Govt



New Delhi (TSIT) Senior Congress leader Randeep Singh Surjewala on Thursday attacked the Modi government over the steep rise in sugar prices, alleging a "Rs 36,000-crore sugar price scam" that has left ordinary consumers paying the price while hoarders and black-marketeers profit. Surjewala said sugar prices had surged from around Rs 45 per kg to Rs 70-Rs 75 per kg in August alone, turning the sweetness of the festive season into a bitter experience for households. Addressing a press conference here, Surjewala claimed that around 12 million tonnes of sugar would be consumed between July August and November, with festival-season monthly consumption rising to nearly three million tonnes.

No shortage of onion in country, retail sale at Rs 35 a kg begins: Consumer Affairs Secretary



New Delhi, Aug 27 : There is no onion shortage in the country, the government said on Thursday, as it started the retail sale of onions at Rs 35 per kg from its price stabilisation buffer to provide relief to consumers. Consumer Affairs Secretary Nidhi Khare flagged off the onion distribution campaign from Krishi Bhawan here. Initially, onions will be sold at Rs 35 per kg through outlets and mobile vans operated by the NCCF, the NAFED, and the Kendriya Bhandars. Speaking to the media, Khare said that every year, the govern-

ment makes efforts to ensure that consumers get onions at subsidised rates through retail intervention whenever prices rise. She said the government remains committed to protecting consumers from sudden spikes in onion prices. "There is neither any shortage in onion production nor in its availability across the country," she noted. Khare said that onion exports this year are also at almost the same level as last year. According to her, the government intervenes in the market from time to time to keep prices under control and provide relief to consumers.

Nepal PM Balen Shah faces test as flash floods kill 162



New Delhi (TSIT): Barely five months into his tenure, Nepal's Prime Minister Balendra "Balen" Shah is facing his most formidable test of governance after a catastrophic flash flood tore through three districts bordering Tibet. Shah personally visited Nuwakot to assess the devastation. At the same time, Foreign Minister Shisir Khanal, speaking at the NDTV World Adviksha Summit in Kathmandu, outlined the Prime Minister's leadership style and crisis response. Khanal portrayed Shah as a results-driven leader, impatient for swift outcomes and determined to make public services accessible without bureaucratic hurdles. "He wants results, and he wants them fast. He's very focused on deliverables," Khanal said, adding that Shah trusts his ministers, delegates responsibility, and expects tangible achievements rather than micromanagement.

AP Govt Ensures 24/7 Monitoring for Safe Return of Pilgrims Stranded in Nepal



Amaravati (TSIT): The Andhra Pradesh Government has intensified efforts to ensure the safety and safe return of Telugu pilgrims stranded in Nepal following sudden floods in several parts of the country. Acting on the directions of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, IT and Real-Time Governance (RTG) Minister Nara Lokesh instructed officials to monitor the situation

round the clock and coordinate with all concerned agencies.

Several pilgrims from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana had travelled to Nepal for the Kailash Mansarovar pilgrimage, and some were reportedly stranded due to flood conditions. The RTGS team was directed to establish contact with the pilgrims, verify their locations and continuously monitor their safety.

RTG Department Secretary Katamneni Bhaskar and CEO Prakhar Jain coordinated with AP Bhavan in New Delhi and APNRT officials to track the situation and provide regular updates to the Chief Minister's Office and IT Minister.

A group of pilgrims from Tirupati was traced and confirmed safe at a hotel in Kathmandu. Officials are also collecting and verifying details of other pilgrims stranded in different parts of Nepal and coordinating assistance through various agencies. Based on RTGS updates, AP Bhavan officials have initiated coordination with the Ministry of External Affairs, Indian Embassy, Nepal authorities and other concerned organisations to facilitate evacuation and safe return of the pilgrims.

288 Indians Uncontactable After Nepal Floods, 21 Rescued: MEA

New Delhi (TSIT):

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Thursday that 288 Indian nationals remain out of contact following the flash floods in Nepal as India continues to make all efforts to reach out to the missing people through the Nepalese authorities. Addressing a special media briefing on Nepal disaster in New Delhi, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated that Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to his Nepalese counterpart Balendra Shah on Wednesday and expressed India's solidarity with the Himalayan nation, offering all possible humanitarian assistance.

Sharing details about the Indian nationals who remain out of touch, Jaiswal said, "As per information currently available, there are 288 Indian nationals who remain uncontactable. These include 73 Indian nationals who are working on the Trishuli-1 Power Project. Our Embassy in Kathmandu is in touch



with project head to get more details about these people as you well understand that communication lines in that area, they are totally disrupted and therefore it has been difficult to get in touch with people on the ground.

"So, the first group of 73 people who are working on Trishuli-1 Power Project, then two separate groups of 37 and 49 Indian nationals from Tamil Nadu who travelled for Kailash Mansarovar Yatra through Samrat and Fly Everest travels, these are two separate travel agents. Then, a group of 32 Indian nationals from West Bengal who travelled with the help of Samrat travels in

Timure which is in Rasuwa district where this particular disaster has happened. Then, a group of 61 Indian nationals from different states who travelled through Richa Tours and then a group of 33 Indian nationals from Kerala. So, these are five major groups who comprise by and large, the 288 people that we are talking about. We are making all efforts to reach out to our people through the Nepalese authorities. We will have more updates for you on this particular matter and we will try to keep you updated as soon as possible," he added. Jaiswal said that 21 Indian nationals have been rescued so far in Nepal.

From Coma to World Champion: Gautam Yadav Inspires Next Generation of Para-Taekwondo Athletes

Husnabad, August 27: International Para-Taekwondo athlete and coach Ellavula Gautam Yadav has transformed his life journey from a severe road accident survivor to a World Championship medalist and is now dedicated to creating champions for the next generation.

A native of Warangal, Gautam began his Taekwondo journey at the age of 12 and underwent training at the Sports Authority of India (SAI) centre in Kurnool. Since 2006, he has participated in several state and national-level competitions, including School Games Nationals, South Zone Championships, Senior Nationals and All India Inter-University tournaments, while completing his B.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering.

He later entered coaching and earned certification from the National Institute of Sports (NIS), Kerala,



along with the World Taekwondo Asia Coach License. He served as a coach at JNTU Hyderabad and Kakatiya University, training athletes for national-level competitions.

In 2020, Gautam suffered a life-changing road accident and underwent extensive treatment, rehabilitation and physiotherapy. Refusing to give up, he returned to sports through Para-Taekwondo and achieved remarkable success on the international stage.His achievements

include a gold medal at the 2024 World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Championship in Bahrain, gold at the 2024 KTA Online International Para Taekwondo Championship in England, silver at the 2025 Asian Para Taekwondo Championship in Malaysia and gold at the 2026 India Taekwondo Open National Championship in Pune.Currently, through SMA Taekwondo, Gautam trains and mentors Para-Taekwondo athletes. Athletes under his guidance have won two international medals and 17 national-level medals.

Gautam has appealed to the government to establish free rehabilitation centres for spinal cord injury survivors, provide financial support to international para-athletes, include para-sports under employment schemes and formulate a comprehensive para-sports policy covering training, rehabilitation and job security.

Officials Identify Rs.17.25 Crore Assets During Action Against Illegal Rice Mills in Wanaparth



Wanaparth: Officials have intensified action against rice mills operating in violation of government regulations in Wanaparth district and identified assets worth around Rs.17.25 crore during inspections.

Joint inspections were conducted at Saibaba Rice Mill in Kothakota mandal and Chamundi Rice Mills in Mosar village of Peddamandadi mandal by officials from Revenue, NALA, Pollution Control Board, Civil Supplies, Ground Water, Fire, Factories and Power departments.

During the inspection of Chamundi Rice Mills in Mosar, officials identified assets worth Rs.13.33 crore

and decided to demolish the mill structures on August 27 after issuing legal notices and orders.

At another rice mill in Kothakota mandal, officials identified assets worth Rs.3.92 crore. They alleged that the mill management attempted to obstruct the enforcement action, following which the borewell at the premises was seized.Officials stated that strict action will be taken against rice mills operating without valid permissions, violatingregulations or involved in illegal constructions. Further action will be initiated regarding pending dues, unauthorised structures and permit violations, they said.

Seethakka Pushes Mulugu Development

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₹ 1,437 Crore Infrastructure Push for Amaravati Capital Villages

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) The Amaravati Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA) has approved infrastructure works worth Rs.1,437 crore in 29 capital villages, including roads, underground drainage, drinking water pipelines and street lighting, Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister P. Narayana said on Thursday. Addressing the media after the 65th CRDA Authority meeting chaired by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu at the State Secretariat, he said Rs.596 crore had also been approved for the construction of a centralised public library, auditorium and



human resources buildings at Shakamuru. The Minister said drinking water supply in the capital villages would be enhanced from the existing 40 litres per person per day to 135 litres. The CRDA has also approved replacement of water pipelines to meet the increased requirement. With the earlier

Rs.904 crore already sanctioned, the total allocation for infrastructure in the 29 villages will reach Rs.1,437 crore.

The CRDA has decided to develop all roads in the capital villages as BT roads based on recommendations from experts, including CRRI, New Delhi and IIT Kharagpur. The authority also approved supply of 30 MLD drinking water to Mangalagiri town at Rs.10 per kilolitre, while future demand is estimated at 80 MLD. The Minister said 42 acres had been identified at Pitchikalapalem, Tulluru, Mandadam and Kuragallu for mixed-use development, with permission granted to invite

RFPs. An 8.5-acre site was approved for a National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology deemed university, while an MoU with IOCL for green-energy infrastructure was also approved. Land between the proposed Inner Ring Road and railway lines passing through Kanteru and Tadikonda and the capital region has been permitted to be brought under land pooling. Narayana clarified that loan waiver benefits for newly pooled lands would apply only to farmers who had availed agricultural loans before January 6, 2026, subject to a waiver of up to Rs.1 lakh.

El Nino Less of a Threat to State Than Jagan, Says Minister Atchannaidu



TSIT, Visakhapatnam State Minister Kinjarapu Atchannaidu launched a sharp attack on former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, alleging that the previous YSRCP government had caused greater damage to

Andhra Pradesh than natural calamities. Addressing a press conference at the TDP office in Visakhapatnam, he said the people should remain cautious against a repetition of the 2019 electoral outcome, claiming that such a develop-

ment would harm the State rather than any individual or political party. Referring to irrigation, he said the previous TDP government had spent around Rs.64,000 crore on the sector, while the present coalition government had spent Rs.13,500 crore in the last two-and-a-half years to put Rayalaseema projects back on track. He said steps were being taken to launch the Polavaram project before the Godavari Pushkarams and announced that Godavari water would be brought to North Andhra on September 3.

APCPDCL Takes Major Step Towards Renewable Energy



Visakhapatnam (TSIT) The Andhra Pradesh Central Power Distribution Corporation Limited (APCPDCL) has taken another major step towards promoting renewable energy by commissioning a 3 MW solar power plant at N.N. (Nehru Nagar) Thanda in Palnadu district. Commissioned by APCPDCL CMD P. Pullareddy, the plant is being recognised as the first solar power plant in Andhra Pradesh to be connected to the grid under the

PM-KUSUM scheme. The power generated will be connected to the 33/11 kV substation and supplied during daytime to agricultural pump sets, providing farmers with a more reliable and stable power supply while increasing the use of renewable energy. APCPDCL is implementing the Feeder-Level Solarisation programme under Component-C of PM-KUSUM on a priority basis to provide daytime solar power to agricultural feeders. At present, solarisa-

tion works are underway for around 65,000 agricultural pump sets, with a total capacity of 191.5 MW being developed across four districts under the corporation's jurisdiction.

Speaking on the occasion, CMD P. Pullareddy said the commissioning of the N.N. Thanda plant was a matter of pride and marked another important step towards meeting agricultural power requirements through renewable energy. The capacity being developed includes 17 MW in Bapatla, 23 MW in NTR, 42.5 MW in Palnadu and 109 MW in the erstwhile Prakasam district. He congratulated Director (Projects & HR) T.V.S.N. Murthy, the APCPDCL team, Palnadu Power Ventures Private Limited and all officials, employees and partner organisations involved in completing the project on time.

CM Chandrababu Expresses Shock Over Chilakaluripet Road Accident

AP Introduces Uniform Three-Level Mechanism for Building Supervisory Checks

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) The Andhra Pradesh Government has introduced a uniform three-level mechanism for supervisory checks of buildings and processing of Occupancy Certificates across Nagar Panchayats, Municipalities, Municipal Corporations and Urban Development Authorities. The reform is aimed at reducing procedural delays, fixing clear responsibility at each stage and ensuring faster delivery of building-related services without diluting regulatory oversight. Under the revised system, building files will move through Level-1, Level-2 and Level-3, with Level-3 continuing as the confirming authority for the respective site-area category. Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister P. Narayana said



the measure was intended to simplify procedures, eliminate avoidable layers of scrutiny and ensure that citizens receive Occupancy Certificates within the prescribed timelines. He stressed that administrative reforms should lead to faster and more efficient public service delivery while retaining essential regulatory checks. The revised mechanism covers six site-area categories, from buildings up

to 100 square metres to those above 4,000 square metres, excluding high-rise buildings. The same three-level structure will also be followed for Occupancy Certificates, while the next higher-level officer will exercise powers wherever the prescribed cadre post is unavailable. Principal Secretary, Municipal Administration and Urban Development, S. Suresh Kumar, said the reform seeks to strike a balance between speed, accountability and supervisory rigour. The Government expects the rationalisation to reduce file movement, establish uniform procedures across urban local bodies and development authorities, and ensure timely completion of inspections and Occupancy Certificates without compromising regulatory scrutiny.

RTGS Intensifies Monitoring of Telugu Pilgrims Stranded in Nepal Floods

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) The Andhra Pradesh Government has intensified efforts to trace and assist Telugu pilgrims stranded in Nepal following floods in several areas. Acting on the directions of Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu, Minister for Real Time Governance and IT Nara Lokesh is overseeing the coordinated response through the Real Time Governance Society (RTGS). RTGS teams are maintaining round-the-clock monitoring of the situation, particularly along the Nepal-Tibet route used by Kailash Mansarovar pilgrims. RTG Secretary Bhaskar Katamneni and RTGS CEO Prakhar Jain have directed officials to collect,



verify and cross-check information regarding the safety and whereabouts of Andhra Pradesh residents

and pilgrims. The verified updates are being shared with Andhra Pradesh Bhavan in New Delhi to

facilitate further assistance, rescue and evacuation measures. The floods have affected

important transit and acclimatisation points, including Syapru Besi, BC and Timure, making communication and movement difficult. RTGS is tracking every available lead and coordinating with AP Bhavan and other concerned agencies, including the Ministry of External Affairs, Indian and Nepalese authorities. A dedicated control room has also been established at Andhra Pradesh Bhavan, New Delhi, to coordinate assistance to affected Andhra Pradesh residents. The State Government said monitoring and coordination would continue until the safety and whereabouts of all affected Telugu pilgrims and residents are established.

Centre of Excellence for Intensive NEET, IIT-JEE Coaching for ST Students

TSIT: Visakhapatnam The Andhra Pradesh Government has established a Centre of Excellence at Residential School (RS-B), Marikavalasa, Visakhapatnam, to provide intensive residential coaching to Scheduled Tribe (ST) students preparing for NEET and IIT-JEE examinations. The initiative, taken through the Andhra Pradesh Tribal Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society, aims to improve the representation of talented ST students in premier institutions such as IITs, NITs, AIIMS, Government Medical Colleges and other Institutions of National Importance. The Centre has an intake of 600



Intermediate students, including 300 boys and 300 girls, with all 600 students selected through a merit-based process. The selected students are being shifted to the Centre, while arrangements for accommodation, diet and other administrative requirements have been completed. The Government has sanctioned special funds on a priority basis for infrastructure, furniture,

the required facilities are made available at the earliest. The Centre of Excellence is being positioned as a flagship initiative to provide quality education and intensive competitive-examination coaching to talented ST students, with the broader objective of ensuring equal opportunities and enabling them to successfully compete for admission to leading national institutions.

Komatireddy Directs Speedy Completion of NH-65 Flyovers

Hyderabad, TSIT: Roads & Buildings and Cinematography Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy on Thursday directed officials to expedite the completion of flyovers being constructed at 17 identified black spots on the Hyderabad-Vijayawada NH-65, stressing that road widening and safety works must be taken up on priority to prevent recurring accidents.

Reviewing the progress of various Roads & Buildings and National Highway projects at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Telangana State Secretariat, the Minister expressed concern over the loss of thousands of lives in accidents on the Hyderabad-Vijayawada highway.

He sought details from officials about the recent bus accident near Kodad and other road mishaps, as well as reports of missing railings at certain stretches of the highway.

Officials informed the Minister that almost all the flyovers being constructed at the 17 black spots were in the final stages. The



Peddakaparthi flyover has already been opened to traffic, while the flyover near the Eenadu office in Suryapet is ready for traffic movement.

Komatireddy directed officials to complete the Chitaly flyover by Dasara and ensure that the remaining flyovers are ready by the end of December. He said traffic should be able to use all the

flyovers by Sankranti.

The Minister also instructed NHAI officials to strengthen safety measures, including installation of railings to prevent stray animals from entering the highway and implementation of other necessary road-safety interventions.

Stressing the need for early widening of NH-65 to reduce acci-

dents, Komatireddy said he and Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy had already met Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari several times seeking approval for the proposed 6+2 lane expansion of the Hyderabad-Vijayawada highway.

“Development of Telangana is our sole objective and we have no reservations in approaching anyone for the State’s interests,” the Minister said.

He said the State government would once again approach Nitin Gadkari along with Union Ministers representing Telangana and, if necessary, take up the matter with the Prime Minister.

Komatireddy said the Centre would also be urged to expedite the NH-65 expansion, proposed bullet train projects and other pending NHAI projects in Telangana.

R&B Engineer-in-Chief Linga Reddy, Chief Engineers Vasanth Naik and Dharma Reddy, along with NH officials, attended the review meeting.

EDITORIAL

Toxic Knows Exactly What It Is Doing To Its Hero. And You May Have Missed It

In Geetu Mohandas' *Toxic*, a hyperstylised manic dream that unfolds as a series of montages, one scene is allowed to breathe. The male lead is sitting with the woman he fancies. He has just been told off for being self-involved. So, he asks, "Do you think I am a bad guy?" "No," she replies. "I think you are toxic." For a film titled after an adjective, popularised by social media as both a terrible and enticing attribute, the narrative is expected to draw out its lure. Mohandas does that till she doesn't, introducing a jolting subversion to a genre that has been allowed to thrive by impunity. Indian cinema is no stranger to toxic men. In the Hindi film industry, however, the shift was sudden. Shah Rukh Khan's character in *Yash Chopra's Darr* (1993) could be regarded as an early prototype. As Rahul Mehra, the actor played a stalker who would stop at nothing to get the woman he is obsessed with. It is an exceedingly unlikely character, offset with a tragic backstory (Rahul is a loner, and the only person who presumably understood him was his dead mother), and the portrayal. In Khan's hands, the fixation took the shape of unchecked love. Although the film reserved punishment for the excess (he dies), Darr brought troubled men to a middle-ground of sorts where they were no longer abject villains, deserving of apathy, but anti-heroes whose heroism was misled but not absent.

TOXIC MEN'S 'COMING OF AGE'

The script changed with Sandeep Reddy Vanga's Kabir Singh (2019), the contentious Hindi-language remake of his Telugu film, Arjun Reddy (2017). The problematic man now had the centre stage; there was a thoughtfulness to his character that was hitherto granted to protagonists. Singh was a doctor, in love with a junior. He is obsessive, uncouth, sexist. In one moment, he threatens a woman that he would undress her with a knife. And yet, by the end, he is rewarded with a happily-ever-after with the girl he loved. This marked a shift, and the unprecedented success of the film (Kabir Singh grossed more than Rs 300 crore worldwide) made toxic men a mainstream phenomenon, acceptable and aspirational in their flaws. Vanga followed this up with *Animal* (2023), a more disputed film with an even more obnoxious central character. Ranvijay Singh (Ranbir Kapoor) is a man-child who desires only one thing: love and attention from his father. He gets increasingly odious in the pursuit, transmuting into an immoral entity, a beast of sorts. And yet, the supposed purity of his intent is meant to thaw the misgivings others feel for him. Vanga, however, makes a tiny adjustment at the end, where Ranvijay is abandoned by his family, and yet, as the closing credits promise a second part and more bloodshed, it becomes evident that seeking penance for the protagonist is never the goal of this film or the maker. The carnage was the appeal, the mayhem was the point. In the last couple of years, toxic men, armoured with regressive values, have become a fixture in films across languages. *KGF* (Kannada; 2018), *The Family Star* (Telugu; 2024), *Saamy Square* (Tamil; 2018) are some examples. In that sense, Mohandas' *Toxic*, till the longest time, unfolds not just as a fabric cut from the same cloth but as evidence of the unending realms that exist in the fold.

'No Calls, People Scanning Banks For Bodies': Nepal Journalist Describes Flood Aftermath

Just four days back, on Saturday, I had returned to Kathmandu from a trekking pilgrimage to Lake Gosainkunda (4,400 m) located some 120 km north of Kathmandu (1,300 m). Crossing innumerable bends along the mountain highway, surrounded by lush green vegetation and sparkling white waterfalls, I had started my uphill trek from a hillside Tamang village of Thulo Syabru. Just below Thulo Syabru (2,500 m) lay the bustling riverside town of Syabru Bensi, gateway to the Nepal-China border some 30 km away, and the site of the Langtang hydroelectric plant. Four days later, I was shell-shocked. It was painful to see horrific images of the collateral damage in Syabru Bensi, Langtang, and scores of other human settlements, right from Gyirong dry port on the Tibet border to Syabru Bensi and Betrabati in Rasuwa - plus Nuwakot, Dhading, Gorkha, and Chitwan districts downstream. Located just a couple of hours' drive away from Kathmandu or Chitwan, Rasuwa is famous for its scenic Himalayan peaks, such as Langtang Lirung, with Ganesh Himal piercing the sky right across the valley to the west. The ice and snow melting from these peaks trickle down into valleys below, forming serene snow-fed rivers that gradually swell and get bigger as they flow further downstream. Among others, the area is inhabited by the indigenous Tamang, Ghale Sherpa people, who are famous for their hardy physical attributes and exceptional mountaineering skills. A key highway linking Kathmandu and several other towns of southern Nepal with Tibet passes through Syabru Bensi and reaches Rasuwagadi right across Gyirong county, in Tibet, China. Over the last few years, Rasuwagadi emerged as a popular route not just for Nepal-China



cross-border trade and commerce but also for the Kailash Mansarovar pilgrimage. Most of the indigenous people in Rasuwa resemble Tibetan folks and follow Tibetan-Buddhism, taking pride in their rich culture and tradition. The disastrous flash flood that rapidly gushed down into the area, destroying everything in its wake, has left the banks of one of Nepal's biggest river systems, the Sapta Gandaki, flowing down the very heart of Nepal, in ruins. Soon after Wednesday's catastrophic flash flood, and right up to this moment on Thursday evening, it has been impossible to get through to officials posted in Rasuwa, or hoteliers and locals elsewhere in Rasuwa. The mobile telecommunication networks haven't been restored as yet, let alone power supplies and highways that remain destroyed as a result of tsunami-like flash flooding. The death toll has climbed to 359 in Nepal itself - at the time of writing this - with nearly 1,300 still missing. Shakti Maya Tamang, a

journalist in Nuwakot, described the August 26 flooding as a "never-seen-before" disaster. Others call it the second-biggest natural disaster after the April-May 2015 earthquakes that claimed the lives of 9,000 people across central Nepal. Initially, several Nepali experts guessed that a glacial lake outburst flood (GLOF) might have triggered the apocalyptic flash flood that has left a trail of destruction across central Nepal, right from the Himalayas to the river valley and plains. A similar flash flood had hit the border town a year ago, too. That claimed the lives of 18 people, besides causing other damage. Although Chinese scientists haven't yet publicised their version of the trigger factor, Nepali experts are now almost certain that a glacial collapse on the western slope of Mount Langtang Lirung might have caused the flash flood and subsequent cascading hazards. The Nepali government on Thursday decided to expedite scientific studies of all glacial lakes at risk of flooding. Arun

Bhakta Shrestha is one such expert. In a LinkedIn post, the senior specialist on climate, cryosphere, and risk management at Kathmandu-based International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) asked if the two devastating floods in the same region in 14 months were a "coincidence or pattern". Initially, a small earthquake in the region was blamed for the disaster. Later, that was ruled out. But Shrestha concludes that the flash flood was triggered by a glacial collapse on the North Face of Mount Langtang Lirung. Experts recall a similar disaster, possibly a similar glacial collapse on the mountain's South Face, which obliterated an entire village in Langtang, Rasuwa, during the devastating earthquake on April 25, 2015. This time around, Shrestha writes, "A rock and ice avalanche detached from a glacier north of Langtang Lirung and dammed the Lhende Khola, a tributary of the Bhoté Koshi River on the Nepal-China

border. The impounded water subsequently broke through, releasing a sudden, high-energy flood that has devastated Timure, Syabrubesi, and downstream settlements along the Trishuli, damaging homes, bridges, roads, and hydropower infrastructure." As the area also saw a similar but slightly smaller disaster 14 months ago, he notes that "a second major event on the Lhende (basin) in 14 months is not a coincidental repeat, it points to an unstable catchment that needs sustained monitoring, not one-off assessment after each disaster". Meanwhile, experts are concerned that since the debris dam has not emptied out completely, there could be more flash floods down the road. Shrestha says, "Efforts are underway to obtain satellite imagery to assess the remaining blockage. Until that is confirmed, downstream communities and infrastructure remain at risk." Since glacial collapsed floods have become a new normal across the

Himalayas, experts are stressing the need to take better care of river banks, especially while planning towns and infrastructure. Shrestha writes: "Events like this are a stark illustration of why climate and glacial hazard risk needs to be built into infrastructure planning as a live, evolving variable rather than a historical baseline. Cascading hazards originating far upstream, often across an international border, can strike with very little lead time." Meanwhile, my heart breaks to see the next of kin of people killed or missing in the catastrophic flood, walking downstream, closely scanning the Bhoté Koshi (called Trishuli downstream) river banks looking for their loved ones - dead or alive. As of Thursday evening, it was still impossible to get through to mobile phones in Dhunche, the district headquarters, or the flood-ravaged towns of Syabru Bensi or Timure, near the border, where over 400 international tourists are still unaccounted for.

HEAPS OF GARBAGE, CITIES OF DISEASE

We're aware of the importance of keeping our homes clean, but as soon as we step outside, our sense of responsibility vanishes. Many people have developed the habit of throwing household items on the roadside, in drains, in vacant lots, or in public places. Plastic bags, polythene, vegetable peels, fruit scraps, and leftover food are routinely thrown out in the open. But this seemingly simple act of carelessness is gradually becoming a serious threat to people's health and the environment. Throwing garbage in the open causes it to rot and smell. The problem isn't just an "inconvenience." Accumulation of garbage creates filth and attracts flies, mosquitoes, stray animals, and other pests. Plastic and other waste can clog drains, leading to waterlogging during the rainy season. Lack of drainage creates breeding grounds for mosquitoes and increases the risk of disease. Negligence can lead to health problems for the entire neighborhood. The worst part is that people in society have come to take this for granted. We see piles of garbage on the roadside, cover our noses for a moment, and move on. Very few people think about where this garbage comes from. In reality, behind every waste is someone's convenience and negligence. If someone never throws away

garbage in their home, why doesn't they throw it in the dustbin outside? Why do the streets become garbage dumps when we're away from home? This is more than just cleanliness—it's a matter of civic duty and social conduct. The use of plastic and polythene has further exacerbated the situation. Plastic does not degrade easily and persists in the environment for a long time. If discarded, it can clog drains and block water flow. Organic waste stored in plastic bags continues to rot and emit foul odors, creating unsanitary conditions. Stray animals may also ingest plastic, posing a health risk. Therefore, indiscriminate and careless disposal of plastic pollutes society, animals, and the environment. There's no misconception about the link between waste and disease. Open trash bins breed flies and other parasites, spreading diseases. Stagnant and stagnant water can become breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Households within walking distance of unattended garbage can be at increased risk of infections and other health problems. This monsoon season, the situation could worsen, as rainy weather can spread garbage and contaminants to surrounding areas. But it's unfair to say that the problem lies solely with municipalities. Local governments play a vital role in providing the following services to the community: garbage collection, waste

disposal, sewer maintenance, and public spaces cleanliness. Citizens also play an equally important role in this process. They should be responsible when disposing of waste, avoid littering, limit unnecessary plastic use, and separate wet and dry waste. However, deploying more sanitation workers won't solve the problem if residents continue to litter in public spaces. The need now is to move beyond treating cleanliness as a government campaign. The effectiveness of cleanliness campaigns is clearly linked to incorporating cleanliness into daily life. Children should receive lectures on cleanliness in schools, and they should also adopt practical measures to maintain cleanliness, including waste segregation, proper disposal, and minimizing the use of single-use plastic. Local monitoring systems can be made aware of the importance of collective responsibility towards their environment. While rules and punishments may be necessary, behavior change will not occur unless they recognize the importance of responsible behavior. The politics of waste is also reflected in the political discourse on sanitation in the public sphere. Sanitation, garbage collection, drainage, and civic infrastructure are major political issues during elections. However, once the elec-

tions are over, these concerns are easily forgotten. Garbage piles up again, drains become clogged, and foul smells become commonplace again. "This cycle continues because administrative accountability is often inconsistent and public participation is low." It's important to understand that garbage isn't just a municipal problem. It's a reflection of our daily routines, priorities, and sense of collective responsibility. Only when we start treating public streets as our responsibility as our own backyards will we begin to make a difference. Clean streets not only look beautiful, but also symbolize a healthier and more responsible society. People need hospitals and medicines when they get sick, but it's better to prevent harmful situations in the first place. The problem with garbage is that we need to understand that it's not your problem. The secret to cleanliness lies not in grand announcements or government campaigns, but in a small, personal decision: Don't litter on the street—put it in the dustbin. By changing this small habit, we can improve these neighborhoods, our cities, and public health. Sanitation isn't the responsibility of any one person; it's not the responsibility of any one department, any one government, or any group of employees. It's the responsibility of all of us, and it must start with each one of us.

PRAYERS WOVEN INTO THE THREADS OF RAKHI

The sweetness of the siblinghood, changing times and the greater responsibility associated with Raksha Bandhan. Raksha Bandhan is a festival of Indian culture which is the most intimate one. It's not just a day for tying rakhi around a brother's wrist and giving him some sweets, it's a day of love, trust, memories and lifelong friendship between siblings. The rakhi is just a single thread inside of which lie many feelings, from childhood times, to love in the here and now, to hopes for a better future. Tying of a rakhi by a sister is not only a request for protection, but also a symbol of their bond. She is praying for his happiness, well being, health and success in silence. The brother in turn takes over the duty of supporting his sister at life's various stages. Brother/Sister relationships are sometimes characterized by sibling rivalry early on and then progress to one of the most intimate emotional connections in life. When it comes to children, it's about the little moments of arguing over toys, sweets, or anything else that eventually turn into treasured memories. As siblings grow older, they get busy with their studies, job search, marriage and family. Others move to other cities, or other countries. While there may be more distance between the two, there may also be more emotional connection as well. Raksha Bandhan is to make it easier to remember and re-discover that connection. The significance of Raksha Bandhan should be understood in a

wider perspective too in the ever-changing social context today. The family is becoming smaller and spread across the locality has taken the place of joint families. Brothers and sisters can be separated by a long distance and might not have any chance to meet during the course of the year. In such times the rakhi is not just a thread that reaches the wrist; it is an emotional thread that traverses distances. The sentiment with the rakhi is the same whether it is received by mail or the celebration is done via a video call—the prayer for the well-being and happiness of a loved one. But with change, there must be rethinking of what is meant by a brother's responsibility towards his sister. Protection doesn't simply mean to stand by her side in an emergency. This is also about valuing her dignity, freedom, choices and rights. To say that a sister's freedom has to be limited in order to be protected is not protection, it is control. A good brother is one that believes in his sister's capabilities, he encourages her to study, take care of her career, carry out her ambitions and make her own decisions about her life. Females of today are proving their capabilities in fields of education, science, administration, politics, etc., armed services, sports, business, arts and in all other fields. One of the things a brother can give his sister in this world is confidence. This is what he should do, stand on him/her shoulders and recognize her accomplishments as her own and her family's. It's not just about tying a rakhi and wish-

ing for long life to the brother; the responsibility of a sister should not be restricted to that. Brother-sister relationship is one of caring, supporting and sensitivity. A sister can be a brother's emotional support if he has a problem, and a brother can be a sister's when she has a problem. Emotional aid may sometimes be more beneficial than monetary help in the tribulations of life. Families are able to stay in touch via the phone and social media but not much time is spent in meaningful conversation. Relationships cannot be maintained by messages, pictures and emojis, festivals remind us. They need time, listening, understanding and sharing in their joys and sorrows. The rakhi thread also has a special emotional value for persons who have lost their brothers or sisters. For some it is a day of laughter and celebration, for some it is a day of memories, silent tears. Sisters whose brothers are serving far from home, including those on the borders of the nation, have a special mix of feelings of affection and patriotism. Similarly, brothers and sisters who are separated by circumstances may not meet, but the rakhi tells them not to worry as they don't need to

forget their love for one another. Sadly, consumerism is becoming more dominant in festivals these days as well. The value of rakhi, the gifts exchanged and the rivalry to celebrate can often be more of an obstacle than a blessing. Love is a beautiful thing, it can be expressed in the most elegant ways through gifts, but the worth of a relationship is not in the gift. The respect, trust, time and emotional support of her brother is more valuable to her than an expensive gift. Similarly, a sister's love and support in times of trouble is invaluable to a brother. It is important that an atmosphere is established all year long where each girl is safe, independent and respected. Women's respect should be started in the family which slowly turns into a social value. Children need to learn the importance of equality, empathy, consent and respect from an early age as core values of healthy relationships. Raksha Bandhan, in this way, isn't simply a day upon which you tie a thread on your brother's wrist. It's a chance to comprehend and meet relationship requirements. It helps us to understand that love isn't a state of possession, but of trust; protection isn't a state of control, but a state of respect; and a relationship isn't held together by blood, but by empathy, understanding, and mutual support. But, a rakhi is more than just a thread tied around a wrist, right? It brings childhood playfulness, mumma's morals, sister's prayer, brother's promise and the family's hopes for happiness.

Nalgonda: The National Highway Task Force has decided to intensify highway patrolling, remove encroachments and take preventive measures to reduce road accidents on the Hyderabad-Vijayawada National Highway.

A review meeting of the Task Force was held at the District Collector's office conference hall on Thursday under the chairmanship of Additional Collector (Local Bodies) in-charge Prem Karan Reddy, following the recent road accident in Suryapet district.

Officials discussed increasing public awareness about road safety, traffic signboards, parking areas and safe driving practices. The Task Force directed that dhabas, hotels, tea stalls, pan



shops and other establishments set up by encroaching road areas should be shifted away from the highway. Officials were instructed to remove illegal structures with the help of cranes if notices are ignored.

The meeting also decided to arrange ambulances and cranes at every 30-40 km stretch of the highway for quick

emergency response during accidents.

Drivers will be educated about the risks of continuous driving, especially during early morning hours, and advised to take breaks every two hours. Officials stressed that

vehicles should not exceed the speed limit of 80 kmph and warned that strict action would be taken against violations of traffic rules.District Revenue Officer Dasharatha, along with officials from R&B, National Highways, Medical and Health, Police and other departments, participated in the meeting.

Centralised Kitchen in Mancherla to Provide Nutritious Breakfast to 48,000 Students

Mancherla, August 27: A state-of-the-art Centralised Community Kitchen, established under the Telangana government's School Breakfast Programme, will be inaugurated at the Medical Godown premises in Mancherla on August 31. Mancherla MLA Kokkiralra Prem Sagar Rao will attend the inauguration as chief guest.

The facility, established with the Hare Krishna Movement Charitable Foundation (HKMCF) as the implementation partner and



financial support from Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) through its CSR funds, will provide hygienically prepared and nutritious breakfast to more than

48,000 students across Mancherla, Peddapalli and Jagtial districts.

The kitchen will cater to 42,450 students from 691 government schools and 6,654 students from 13 junior colleges across 17 mandals. The facility has been developed in an 8,000-square-foot government-provided shed with modern food processing and cooking equipment.

The automated kitchen can prepare 5,600 idlis, 2,000 dosas and 3,600 puris per hour. It is also equipped with a food laboratory, milk processing unit, vegetable washing and cutting system, RO water plant, boiler plant and central gas bank to maintain quality and hygiene standards.

The breakfast menu has been designed based on National Institute of Nutrition guidelines and includes items such as idli, dosa, puri, upma, millet idli and bonda along with suitable accompaniments.

ECI Directs Andhra Officials to Ensure Transparent and Error-Free Voter Rolls

Vijayawada, August 27: Election officials across Andhra Pradesh have been instructed to maintain quality, transparency and accuracy during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and work towards preparing an error-free voter list. Election Commission of India (ECI) Senior Deputy Election Commissioner Dr. Pawan Kumar Sharma reviewed the progress of the SIR process in Andhra Pradesh at a meeting held at the NTR District Collectorate in Vijayawada on Thursday. He appreciated the state's efforts and urged officials to continue



coordinated work until the final electoral roll is published on October 3.

Andhra Pradesh Chief Electoral Officer Vivek Yadav and Additional CEO S. Dilli Rao participated in the review meeting along with district collectors and Electoral Registration Officers

(EROs).

Dr. Sharma informed that 43,71,397 notices have been distributed across the state so far, while field verification has been completed for 16,23,774 notices. He directed districts lagging behind in verification to speed up the process without compromising on

transparency and SIR guidelines.

The Kurnool district administration was appreciated for recording the lowest pending verification rate of 15.18 per cent.

Emphasising the importance of coordination among EROs, AEROs, Booth Level Officers (BLOs), Booth Level Agents (BLAs) and political party representatives, Dr. Sharma instructed officials to address voter concerns promptly and provide assistance to elderly, sick and other voters unable to attend verification.

He also directed AEROs

Kamineni Hospitals issues monsoon health advisory amid rise in viral fevers and flu cases

Hyderabad, August 27: Kamineni Hospitals has issued a monsoon health advisory following a rise in cases of viral fevers, influenza-like illnesses (ILI) and acute febrile conditions across Hyderabad. Doctors at the hospital's LB Nagar and King Koti facilities have advised people to avoid self-medication, especially unnecessary antibiotic use, and urged those with fever lasting beyond 72 hours to undergo timely diagnostic tests.

While Hyderabad has reported comparatively lower dengue cases this year, doctors cautioned that early symptoms of dengue, H1N1 influenza and other viral infections often overlap, making medical evaluation essential. Senior physicians stressed the importance of early blood tests and proper diagnosis instead of assuming that fever will subside on its own.

Dr. M. Swamy, HoD and Senior Consultant Physician at Kamineni Hospitals, said seasonal viral infections are increasing during the



monsoon period and urged families to remain cautious. He advised the public to avoid sharing bank details, OTPs? (removed as irrelevant) and focus on health precautions such as timely testing and preventive care.

Dr. Hari Kishan warned that unnecessary antibiotic consumption for viral fevers is ineffective and contributes to antimicrobial resistance. He also highlighted the importance of influenza vaccination, particularly for vulnerable groups.

Doctors advised children below five years, senior citizens, pregnant women and people with underlying health condi-

tions to take extra precautions. Warning signs such as severe abdominal pain, repeated vomiting, bleeding, breathlessness, reduced urine output, confusion or extreme weakness require immediate medical attention.

Kamineni Hospitals also urged residents to prevent mosquito breeding by clearing stagnant water regularly and follow respiratory hygiene measures, including handwashing and mask usage in crowded places. The hospital's emergency and diagnostic departments remain equipped with round-the-clock testing facilities for viral and vector-borne infections.

Late PS Gowrisankar Raja, headmaster of Eluvapalli Panchayat Union Primary School, was selected for the award in recognition of his exceptional courage and sacrifice.

On March 5, 2025, during the lunch break, Class III student Nithin accidentally slipped into a farm pond located near the school. On seeing the boy struggling in the water, Gowrisankar Raja attempted to rescue him.



However, despite his efforts, both the eight-year-old boy and the headmaster died in the incident.

The Sarvottam Jeevan Raksha Award is given by the Centre for acts of exceptional bravery in saving lives. Nominations are received from State governments every year, following which the awardees are selected

and announced by the President.

At the Secretariat on Thursday, Chief Minister Vijay presented the award medal and certificate to K. Sirisha, wife of the deceased headmaster. The award was presented in recognition of Gowrisankar Raja's bravery, courage and supreme sacrifice while attempting to save the schoolboy.

Nepal flood: 49-member Tamil Nadu pilgrimage group go missing, kin seek urgent intervention

CHENNAI: Families of six pilgrims from Kancheepuram are in distress after losing contact with them for more than 24 hours following the deadly flash flood in Nepal. They were part of a 49-member group on a spiritual trip and were reportedly at the immigration office when floodwaters swept through the building. Their families have submitted petitions to Kancheepuram Collector Sneha, seeking immediate steps to trace and rescue the pilgrims.

The Tamil Nadu government said that 103 people from Tamil Nadu had travelled to Nepal for the Kailash Yatra.

49-member Tamil Nadu pilgrimage group go missing in Nepal flood. The group, comprising 22 men and 27 women, left for the pilgrimage on August 14 through Mahadev Kailash Yatra, a spiritual tourism and travel company based in Radhanagar, Chromepet, Chennai. The pilgrims were from several parts of Tamil Nadu, including Chennai's Chromepet, Perambur, Alwarpet, Singaperumal Koil, Kancheepuram,



Tiruvannamalai, Madurai, Virudhunagar, Theni, Namakkal, Erode, Karur, Tiruchy, Salem and Coimbatore.

The group reportedly travelled from Chennai airport to Nepal via Delhi on August 14. They were scheduled to complete the pilgrimage and return to Chennai on Thursday, August 27. After completing their pilgrimage, the group was reportedly travelling towards the Nepal border through the China border route. They were said to be

undergoing immigration formalities at an immigration office when a sudden flash flood reportedly swept through the area and completely damaged the building. Following the incident, communication with the 49 pilgrims was reportedly lost. Their families have been unable to ascertain their whereabouts or condition. Seven members of the group are from Chromepet: Sathya Narayanan, Vikraman, Manjula, Velavendhan, Rajalakshmi, Amudha and Kishore. Sathya

Narayanan, the son of the travel company's owner, was reportedly leading the group.

The six pilgrims from Kancheepuram have been identified as Meenakshi, Latha Bhanumathi, Saraswathi, Chandran, Gopal and Arunachalam.

Meenakshi and Chandran reportedly spoke to their families in Kancheepuram around 6 am on Wednesday, saying that they were travelling towards Nepal. However, no further communication has been received from them after reports of the flash flood.

With the pilgrims expected to return to Chennai on Thursday, their families are now deeply worried after being unable to contact them for more than 24 hours. They have urged the Centre and Tamil Nadu government to take immediate steps to trace and rescue the 49-member group. The families of the six Kancheepuram pilgrims have also submitted petitions to District Collector Sneha, seeking urgent intervention to locate their relatives and ensure their safety.

TN Minister Aadhav accepts AIADMK's demand to implement Tambaram-Chengalpattu elevated corridor

CHENNAI: Minister for Highways and Public Works Aadhav Arjuna said that the government would take up the Tambaram-Chengalpattu elevated corridor project to tackle traffic congestion on the Grand Southern Trunk (GST) Road.

The announcement followed a demand raised by AIADMK floor leader Edappadi K Palaniswami during Question Hour on Thursday. He asked the Minister whether the government would implement the Tambaram-Chengalpattu elevated corridor project, which had



been proposed during the AIADMK regime. Replying to him, Minister Aadhav said the government had already announced an eight-lane road project from Chennai to Kanniyakumari. Explaining the traffic

congestion in the suburban areas surrounding Chennai, he said travel time from Chengalpattu to Chennai Airport had increased to nearly three hours due to heavy traffic.

"The same situation is being witnessed while travelling from Tiruvallur through Poonamallee. The elevated corridor between Tambaram and Chengalpattu will be implemented after detailed discussions with the Union government. A meeting with the Union government is scheduled for next month," he assured.

Tamil Nadu: Auto fare revision after 13 years, Rs 60 minimum sought

CHENNAI: A demand to revise auto fares in the State is slowly moving towards a decision after a 13-year gap, with auto drivers' unions seeking a minimum fare of Rs 60 and a revised fare structure at a Transport Department consultation on Thursday (August 27).

The unions also urged the state government to ban bike taxis and develop a separate government app for auto services.

Auto meter fares have not been revised in the state for 13 years. The unions have held several protests seeking a fare revision.



In 2022, the Madras High Court directed the government to revise meter fares in line with rising prices and monitor them regularly, while ensuring that the revision did not affect the public or drivers.

As part of the latest move, a committee com-

prising two joint transport commissioners and two deputy transport commissioners held consultations with representatives of various auto drivers' unions at the Transport Commissioner's office in Guindy, Chennai, in two sessions on Thursday.

Representatives who attended included Tamil Nadu Auto Thozhilalar Sammelanam (CITU) state working president S Balasubramaniam, HMS Auto Workers' Union working president M Subramaniam Pillai and AIUTUC Auto Workers' Union state general secretary Mariappan.

Tirunelveli halwa gets costlier as sugar prices soar



CHENNAI: Tirunelveli's iconic halwa is set to become more expensive as a sharp rise in sugar prices pushes up production costs, said a Daily Thanthi report. Sugar prices have increased from around Rs 50 per kg last month to Rs 75, citing supply shortage and increased consumption. No sugar shortage in India, prices to ease in coming days following govt's measures: ISMA

A popular sweet shop in Tirunelveli Junction has raised the price of halwa by Rs 20, from Rs 320 to Rs 340 per kg. Prices of other sweets, mixtures and savoury items have also been increased by Rs 20, while chips now cost Rs 380 per kg.

Other popular halwa shops are already selling the sweet at Rs 340 per kg, while the famous Iruttukadai halwa in Tirunelveli Town is priced at Rs 440 per kg. Shop owners said they are considering another hike of up to Rs 40 per kg and are likely

to announce the revised prices within a day or two.

Sugar continued its upward march, rising by about Re 1 per kg to nearly Rs 64 on Tuesday in the retail market as recent government measures to curtail the surge take effect. As per the data compiled by the Department of Consumer Affairs (Price Monitoring Division), the all-India average rate of sugar stood at Rs 63.97 per kg on August 25, a 31 per cent increase from Rs 48.81 per kg a month back.

The average rate is 38 per cent higher than the year-ago level, when sugar was available at Rs 46.31 per kg.

The data showed that the maximum selling price on Monday was Rs 76 per kg, while the modal rate was Rs 65 per kg. The government and sugar industry bodies said ex-mill rates have fallen in the past few days. However, the impact is yet to be seen at the retail level.

Mekedatu plan not for Bengaluru water, experts say

CHENNAI: Karnataka's claim that the proposed Mekedatu dam is meant to meet Bengaluru's drinking water needs is not supported by field-level findings, which indicate no drinking water shortage in the city, the Tamil Nadu Sectoral Experts Federation said on Thursday, asserting that the state is instead planning to expand its irrigation area.

The experts said this was why talks between the chief ministers of Tamil Nadu and Karnataka would not resolve the Cauvery water-sharing dispute and could instead work against Tamil Nadu's interests. Retired senior Public Works

Department engineer A Veerappan, hydrology expert S Janakarajan, State Platform for Common School System general secretary Prince Gajendrababu, advocate Vetriselvan of Poovulagin Nanbargal and Electricity Department Engineers' Association coordinator S Gandhi made the remarks at a press conference.

The federation said Karnataka's proposal to construct the Mekedatu dam, along with plans for a new dam at Rasimanal and to raise the height of the Mettur reservoir by 10 feet, were among the key issues concerning Tamil Nadu.

In a first, TN CM Vijay sits along with ministers in Assembly

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay on Thursday (August 27) made heads turn in the state Assembly when he casually moved from his chair in the House and sat besides ministers in the front row, marking a major departure from a long-standing tradition vis-à-vis seating.

Normally, the chief minister occupies a separate and spacious chair close to the Speaker's Chair and the ministers are seated separately,

next to him, as per their seniority, in the front row. The facing row is occupied by the Leader of the Opposition and leaders of the Legislature parties based on their numerical strength in the 234-member House with their respective party members behind.

In the afternoon session, Vijay casually moved from his chair, located on the right side of Speaker J C D Prabhakar and sat between Ministers K A Sengottaiyan (also Leader

of the House) and Aadhav Arjuna. According to a source, in the past no chief minister sat on the seat meant for ministers.

Normally, the ministers or legislators change their positions for a brief while to speak with their colleagues. But this perhaps is the first time a chief minister has shifted from his official chair to have a word with his colleagues. Earlier in the day, Leader of the Opposition Udhayanidhi Stalin pointed out that the department secretaries should be

asked to be present in the House when important issues are raised in the House by the members. "The Speaker mentioned that then chief minister spoke about the Karur (stampede) incident during the previous DMK regime. Then our leader and CM (M K Stalin) was present in the House and so were the chief secretary and department secretaries. Now, both the chief minister and department secretaries are not present in the House," Udhayanidhi said.

Monsoon eye care: Why styes may become more common during rainy season

New Delhi, Aug 27: The monsoon brings relief from soaring temperatures, but the damp and humid conditions can also increase the risk of certain eye problems, including painful styes. Sweat, dust, pollution, allergens and frequent touching or rubbing of the eyes can irritate the delicate eyelid area. Blocked oil glands around the eyelids can then trigger inflammation and infection.

Dr Bhanu Prakash M, senior consultant cataract, cornea and refractive surgeon at Yashoda Hospitals, said humidity itself does not directly cause styes. However, monsoon conditions can make eyelid infections more likely due to increased perspiration, dust and organic debris, as well as contact with contaminated water or shared towels.

Dr Vivek Singh, senior cataract and refractive surgeon at Maxivision Super Speciality Eye



Hospital, Kukatpally, said warm and damp conditions can encourage bacterial growth. Sweat around the face and eyes, along with touching the eyes with unclean hands or a damp handkerchief, can transfer germs to the eyelids.

The eyelids contain tiny oil-producing glands that help maintain a stable tear film. Dr Bhanu explained that when these glands become

blocked, oil and bacteria can accumulate, potentially leading to inflammation in the form of a sty or chalazion. Poor eyelid hygiene and frequent rubbing can increase the risk. Monsoon conditions can also expose the eyes to greater amounts of dust, pollution and allergens. This may result in redness, itching and watering. Rubbing itchy eyes can push dust and bacte-

ria further into the sensitive tissues around the eyelids.

People with certain underlying conditions may be more prone to recurring styes. Oily skin and rosacea can lead to thicker gland secretions and blockages, while chronic blepharitis can harbour bacteria around the eyelids. Allergies may also contribute by causing repeated rubbing and inflammation.

If a sty develops, experts strongly advise against squeezing, popping or puncturing it. Such attempts can worsen the infection or spread bacteria into surrounding tissues. Contact lens users should also avoid wearing lenses until the sty has healed, while eye makeup should be avoided during the infection.

Maintaining good hygiene can help reduce the risk during the rainy season. People should wash their hands before touching their eyes, avoid rubbing them and keep the face and eyelids clean. Towels, pillowcases and eye makeup should not be shared, as this can facilitate the spread of infection.

Contact lens users should wash their hands before handling lenses and follow proper cleaning practices. Those experiencing persistent, severe or recurrent eye problems should seek advice from an eye-care professional.

1 calf dies, 33 cattle infected with lumpy skin disease in Hamirpur

Hamirpur, Aug 26: One calf has died and 33 cattle have tested positive for lumpy skin disease in Himachal Pradesh's Hamirpur district, prompting the Department of Animal Husbandry to intensify surveillance and treatment measures.

At least 34 cases have been reported from different parts of the district over the past four to five days. Officials have stepped up monitoring in affected areas and dispatched vaccines to veterinary hospitals and other centres to prevent further spread of the disease.

The calf died in the Barsar area, while Nadaun reported the highest number of infections with 12 cases. Bhoranj and Sujampur have recorded two cases each, while symptoms have also been detected among cattle in other parts of the district.

Lumpy skin disease is a contagious viral infection that primarily affects cattle and water buffalo.



Caused by the Capripox virus, it spreads mainly through mosquitoes, flies and ticks. The disease can cause high fever, firm nodules on the skin, discharge from the eyes and nose and a significant decline in milk production. Dr Satish, Assistant Director (Project), Department of Animal Husbandry, Hamirpur, advised livestock owners to remain vigilant and regularly examine their animals. He urged them to immediately contact a veterinarian if they notice unusual lumps, fever or weakness.

The department has

received around 13,500 doses of vaccine to tackle the disease, which have been distributed to veterinary hospitals and other relevant centres.

Officials said around 16,000 animals were vaccinated against lumpy skin disease in Hamirpur last year. A large-scale vaccination campaign was also undertaken in 2023 following a significant outbreak.

With fresh cases being reported, the department is continuing surveillance, treatment and vaccination efforts across the district.



MORE THAN 350 KILLED IN NEPAL AS RISING LAKE RAISES FEAR OF NEW FLOOD

A second or third wave of deadly flash flooding could arrive in Nepal later today as the country scrambles to respond to a catastrophe that has killed more than 350 people. Basanta Raj Adhikari, the director of the Centre for Disaster Studies at the Tribhuvan University in Nepal, told the BBC that there is a risk that conditions worsen today or tomorrow, including landslides. The warning came as the Nepalese disaster authority said a river appeared to have been blocked, creating a lake at the site of the flooding that they assessed was at risk of a potentially disastrous breach. The situation on the ground has complicated rescue efforts, with nearly 1,400 people still unaccounted for, including almost 650 foreigners and 33 British tourists swept up in Wednesday's floods. Have you been affected by the floods? We are looking to

hear from people who have been affected by the flash floods in Nepal. The president of the Nepal Centre for Disaster Management said the disaster came at them like a "tsunami from the sky". "It's such a huge debris, and everything on the way was completely washed out," said Bishal Nath Upreti. "Villages along the almost 40 to 50 kilometres were completely wiped out." King Charles said he and the Queen were "heartbroken" and sent their "most profound sympathy" to those affected by the "devastating" flash floods in Nepal where dozens of British nationals are among the hundreds missing and feared dead. The King said in his written message: "My wife and I are heartbroken to hear of the devastating flooding that has struck the Nepal-China border. "Many in the United Kingdom have strong, deep and personal

ties to this part of the world. "We send our most profound sympathy to all those who have so tragically

lost their loved ones and we feel deeply for the many families awaiting anxiously the news of friends and relations. "Our hearts go out also to the families of all the police and Armed Forces personnel

"Our special thoughts and prayers remain with all those affected and, as always, the United King Nepali man recalls how he clung to mango tree for survival during deadly flash floods: 'I would 'have washed away to death' Bibek Kumal, a 24-year-old Nepali labourer, was digging a 1.5m (5ft) deep toilet pit beside a newly constructed house on Wednesday when he heard a distinct hissing sound. Seconds later, a torrent of mud, water and rock tore through the site, sweeping him and everything nearby away. Working in Bidur, downstream from the severely impacted Rasuwa district near Nepal's border with Tibet, Mr Kumal was warned by four co-workers standing above who shouted at him to run. By the time he managed to scramble out, his colleagues had already fled.

Tanzania's VP expelled from ruling party for indiscipline and his successor named



Emmanuel Nchimbi has been expelled from Tanzania's ruling Chama Cha Mapinduzi (CCM) party for indiscipline following his decision earlier this week to resign as the country's vice-president after 10 months in the job. The 54-year-old has made some controversial remarks in recent weeks - including urging Tanzanians to "fight for a new constitution" - pointing to a possible fallout with President Samia Suluhu Hassan. He was Samia's running mate in last October's disputed presidential election, which saw hundreds killed in post-poll unrest. Energy Minister Deogratius Ndejembu, 43, has been nom-

inated as his replacement and his name will now be presented to parliament for approval. The decisions were taken at an extraordinary meeting of the CCM, chaired by President Samia. The party did not give details about the indiscipline allegations against Nchimbi, whose resignation takes effect at the end of next week. Nchimbi, who shared his brief resignation letter on his Instagram account on Tuesday morning, is the first vice-president to step down in Tanzania's history. He said he would retire from public life as he had "become convinced, without doubt, that the president wants changes".

Trump officials threaten Kennedy Center demolition if court blocks renovations

The Trump administration has threatened to demolish the Kennedy Center if planned renovations for the performing arts venue are not allowed to be carried out, court documents show. Attorneys from the justice department have also asked for President Donald Trump's name to be put back on the building after it was removed in June following a court order. "An order blocking the Board from appropriately recognising President Trump," the lawyers argued, "will cause donors to flee, financial contributions to dry up, and structural rehabilitation to stop". The venue has been among the storied sites in Washington that Trump has sought to renovate since he returned to the White House in 2025. Trump's lawyers have argued that without the renovations the venue "will deteriorate further into an unsafe, decrepit structure that will be required to be taken down". They also called the venue "embar-



rassing to the Nation's Capital". After the "decrepit structure" is taken down, justice department attorney Brantley Mayers wrote, a determination of what to build on the site will follow, including the option of a large outdoor amphitheatre overlooking the Potomac River. The threat to demolish the building comes just weeks after the Kennedy Center board voted to add Trump's name back to the facade of the venue and to proceed with a two-year clo-

sure for proposed renovations. Many of the board members who voted are Trump allies who were appointed by the president. In late May, a US judge ruled that the president's name had been added to the venue unlawfully, as it cannot be renamed without congressional approval. The judge ordered that the name be removed, and so it was taken down in June. The case stemmed from a broader legal dispute over the renaming of the cultur-

al institution, which US law designates as a memorial to President John F Kennedy. It is the latest in series of projects that Trump has taken on since returning to Washington. He has been renovating the reflecting pool on the National Mall, he wants to construct a 250-foot victory arch, has demolished the White House East Wing to build a ballroom, and has added his name to institutions such as the Kennedy Center and US Institute of Peace.

US DRUG AGENCY APPROVES BREAKTHROUGH TREATMENT FOR PANCREATIC CANCER



The US Food and Drug Administration has approved a treatment for pancreatic cancer that, in clinical trials, nearly doubled the overall survival time for patients. The drug, daraxonrasib, sold under the brand name Rasonque and manufactured by Revolution Medicines, appears to be a breakthrough in treating one of the world's deadliest cancers. A late-stage clinical trial with 500 patients found those who took the daily pill had an average survival time of 13.2 months, compared to 6.6 months for those on chemotherapy. The FDA said the drug provided a "critical new option for patients facing an extraordinarily difficult and historically hard-to-treat cancer".

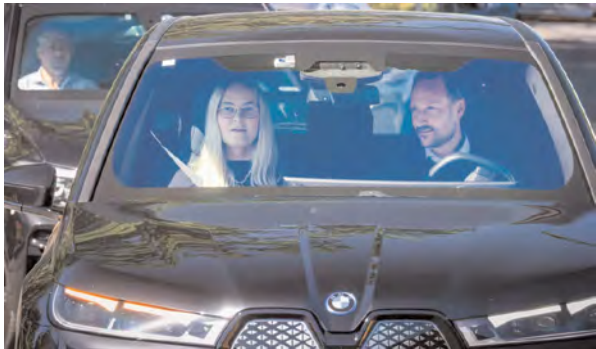
Daraxonrasib helps prevent the spread of cancer by locking onto and shutting off the mutated KRAS gene, which is in more than 90% of pancreatic tumours and spurs cancer growth. Each year, roughly 67,000 people in the US are diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, which has the highest mortality rate of all major cancers, according to the American Cancer Society. Pancreatic cancer is often spotted late and is notoriously difficult to treat. More than half of those with pancreatic cancer die within three months of diagnosis. In 2025, the FDA granted the drug a "Breakthrough Therapy" designation, given to treatments for serious conditions that warrant an expedited review.

NORWAY'S ROYAL FAMILY GATHERS AT KING HARALD'S BEDSIDE AS HIS CONDITION WORSENS

King Harald V of Norway is in an "extremely serious" condition in hospital, the country's royal household has said. His wife, Queen Sonja, and his son, Crown Prince Haakon, have cancelled all royal engagements and they have gathered at his bedside at Oslo University Hospital with other members of the royal family. The 89-year-old has been in hospital for over a week receiving treatment for a rare blood condition, haemolytic anaemia. Having been on the throne since 1991, King Harald is Europe's oldest head of state. Crown Prince Haakon, 53, the successor to the Norwegian throne, has been serving as regent while his father is on leave. King Harald has been treated in recent weeks with cor-



tisone for haemolytic anaemia, a condition that causes the number of red blood cells in the body to be reduced, and leads to fatigue and shortness of breath. Members of the royal family were seen arriving at the hospital on Thursday morning, including Haakon's wife, Crown Princess Mette-Marit and her son Marius Borg Hoiby. King Harald's sister,

Princess Astrid is also at the hospital, according to reports in Norwegian media. Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Store has cancelled a planned trip to Germany, where he was expected to meet Chancellor Friedrich Merz on Thursday. "The whole nation is with us as we send warm thoughts to the king and the rest of the royal family," he said in a statement.

Members of the public have also begun laying flowers in Palace Square, in front of the palace in Oslo. The king has had multiple health problems in recent years which have forced him to scale back his royal duties. He was fitted with a pace-maker in 2024 after falling ill on holiday in Malaysia. The Norwegian royal family has already faced a challenging year in 2026. Crown Princess Mette-Marit received a lung transplant in June after she had been diagnosed with a rare form of pulmonary fibrosis in 2018. The transplant came two days after Hoiby was sentenced to four years in prison after being convicted of two counts of rape. He had denied the most serious charges and is to appeal the sentence.

MS DHONI WANTED 25 PER CENT STAKE OF CSK? BLUNT VERDICT BY EX-KKR STAR ON REPORT

MS Dhoni and Chennai Super Kings (CSK) are almost synonymous. The World Cup-winning former India captain did not play a single match in IPL 2026, and yet he was one of the most discussed CSK figures throughout the entire season. Dhoni is 45, and while his playing role has diminished in recent years, he remains an inspirational figure within the CSK ranks. The IPL 2027 retention dates are not yet known, but before that, a story by Cricblogger claimed that Dhoni asked for a 25 per cent stake in CSK before reducing it to 20 per cent. He was then apparently offered a 5.5 per cent stake by the franchise. Former India player Aakash Chopra, who also played for Kolkata Knight Riders, said the claim was unrealistic and even called it a planted story. "There was talk of 1.7 to 1.8 billion when RCB were bought



just now. Chennai Super Kings is the same kind of franchise. You can do the valuation however you want, but this is the franchise that has five trophies and has multiple franchises outside India as well," Chopra said while speaking on his YouTube channel. "They have got a legacy and a lot going for them. Chennai Super Kings is a serious, serious brand. If it's worth 1.8 billion and Dhoni has asked for a 25 per cent stake in that, it is unrealistic. This isn't possible. No one gives 400 mil-

lion to anyone. In fact, you have to invest 400 million to get a 25 per cent stake. It is a bizarre number. Nobody is going to give anyone 25 per cent in an IPL team." Chopra went on to say that even a 5.5 per cent stake is a tall ask. "Then there was talk of 3.5 per cent and 5.5 per cent. I am saying that even if it's 5.5 per cent, just think about how much money it is. Two per cent, three per cent, or five per cent, that is an incredible amount of money," Chopra said. "I feel it is a planted story.

'Playgrounds More Important Than PlayStations': PM Narendra Modi's Message To India's Youth

Prime Minister Narendra Modi highlighted the importance of sports for a better society, family life and country's pride, encouraging the youngsters to prioritise 'playgrounds over playstations'. PM Modi was speaking to athletes during the 'Khelo India Dialogue' via video conferencing on Thursday. Speaking during the dialogue, PM Modi highlighted that in these times, while a timetable is being established for studies, sports is also finding its place there, and a sporting culture will be established in the nation when the sports period in schools will be considered a part of life rather than just co-curricular activities. Sports culture is established when schools do not consider spPrime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday delivered a reality check on Indian sports and sportspersons. In a virtual address to hundreds of athletes, stu-



dents and volunteers who gathered at various locations for the Khelo India Dialogue, PM Modi said India's Olympic performance can improve only if the country manages to increase its participation in those events in which it has not participated in the past. He added that his vision for sports is not merely about winning medals but making it an integral part of the nation-building process. Sports periods as a co-curricular activity, but as a way of

It will only happen when our youth will take this approach forward," he said. hear that, for a healthy society, a good family system, and a better work culture, the sportsman spirit is essential. And this spirit is very difficult to learn without going to the sports field. The Prime Minister also said that "those who play, they blossom" and pointing out that blossoming in sports is not only about winning on the field. "It signifies the blossoming of the individual and the family, as well as enhancing the nation's pride. When an athlete succeeds, that success is not theirs alone; it elevates the identity of their family, boosts the prestige of their school and college, and strengthens the recognition of their district and state. The world begins to identify that city or state by the athlete's name," he signed off. "In the Olympics, there are so many different sports. Indian teams don't even participate in half of them," PM Modi said, calling it a "bitter truth". In the 2024 Paris Olympics, India participated in 16 of the 32 sports that were part of the Games roster.

Centurion Sonal Dinusha's Gritty Knock Helps Sri Lanka Draw Second Test; India Win Series 1-0

Centurion Sonal Dinusha's unending will en route an epic unbeaten 133 helped Sri Lanka enact a great jail break, battling persistent Indian bowlers, a fifth-day track and the weariness of following-on to eke out a memorable draw in the second and final Test in Colombo on Thursday. India won the two-match series 1-0, riding on their 165-run victory in the first Test at Galle, but Lanka can be proud of the way they fought back at the SSC ground. Dinusha, who faced 264 balls across 420 minutes, was Lanka's Superman with an invisible cape around him, registering his third hundred of the series which was also his fourth 50-plus score in as many innings this series. Dinusha faced as many as 722 balls and batted 1139 minutes over the course



of the two-match series. The 25-year-old also became the only third batter to score twin hundreds in a Test match where his team followed-on, joining India's Vijay Hazare and Zimbabwe's Andy Flower in

an elite club. This statistical marvel enabled Lanka to end their second innings at 429 for nine declared for an overall lead of 216 runs, and at that point the players shook their hands, signalling the stalemate. But the situation

was way different when Sri Lanka resumed the day at 229 for six, a mere 16 runs ahead. It seemed just a matter of time before the home side caved in. But the opposite happened as the Indians bowed to the spirit of the

Lankan batters - Dinusha, who reached hundred in 196 balls, and Keshara Nuwantha (46, 150b). The two milked 112 runs for the seventh wicket in 246 balls, which saw Lanka safely treading the first session without even losing a wicket. But India enjoyed a rare moment of delight in the initial part of the post-lunch passage, as Manav Suthar dislodged Nuwantha, whose edge was taken safely by Dhruv Jurel in the slip. Sri Lanka then mounted a mini fightback through Dinusha and Prabath Jayasuriya (2, 28b). The eighth wicket pair added only 25 runs but took 74 balls for it, pushing the clock further. Ravindra Jadeja fetched another breakthrough as he jettisoned Jayasuriya, inducing an edge from the batter for Jurel in the second slip.

AB De Villiers Issues Clarification After Facing Backlash For Rating Virat Kohli Over Sachin Tendulkar

South Africa's legendary cricketer and former captain, AB de Villiers, has issued a clarification after facing criticism for rating Virat Kohli over Sachin Tendulkar. The South African great had said that, in his opinion, Kohli was better than Tendulkar when it came to seam-friendly overseas conditions. He went on to suggest that Tendulkar was a pioneer for subcontinent batters, but Kohli surpassed him. The comments by de Villiers didn't go down well, with the former international facing criticism and a huge backlash on social media. "I think of someone like Sachin Tendulkar way back, who started that trend for India. Yet, he wasn't as strong as someone like Virat Kohli, who was even better. But Sachin was the first guy to show that, as a subcontinent batter, you can do well



in bouncy and seaming conditions. Virat took that forward and raised the bar. Because of that, there are quite a few players now like Rahul and Padikkal, who have started to up that trend and follow in the footsteps of a Virat and a Sachin," de Villiers had stated on his YouTube channel. After his views sparked controversy, the former South Africa captain came up with a clarification. "There was a bit of confusion with my Virat and Sachin comment.

Remember, it's my opinion. I'm not axing anyone. I'm telling you the way that I see it. Sachin was the first to take things forward for India, showing all the youngsters what it takes to perform consistently everywhere around the world. I said that Virat sort of showed that there is a different dynamic to Indian batting by being good on the short ball. He found a way to counter that," de Villiers said in another video on his YouTube channel.

Anaya Bangar Breaks Silence After Landmark Cricket Australia Decision

Anaya Bangar, the child of former India cricketer Sanjay Bangar, announced on social media that she will be eligible to participate in elite women's cricket in Australia from March 2027. Anaya shared pictures of the official statement from Cricket Australia (CA) and in the letter, CA said that the decision was based on the medical information provided. The Cricket Australia policy states that players competing in the women's category of elite cricket need to maintain a serum testosterone concentration below 10 nmol/L continuously for at least 12 months. Anaya will also have to maintain the eligibility requirements.

Shooter Suruchi Phogat Recalls Journey From Local Train Rides To Indian Jersey

When Suruchi Inder Singh Phogat first picked up a pistol at the Guru Dronacharya Shooting Academy in Bhiwani, she wasn't chasing world records. She was a 13-year-old from Sasoli village in Haryana's Jhajjar district, travelling there by local train with her father and brothers, with no jersey and no name in the sport. Seven years later, the 20-year-old is a junior world record holder, a multiple ISSF World Cup gold medalist, and one of India's brightest medal hopes heading into the Asian Games in Aichi-Nagoya, according to a release. Her journey, however, has been built on quiet transformation rather than instant stardom. "When I started shooting, nobody knew me. I was just a normal 13-year-old girl who didn't even have an Indian jersey. Today, wearing that jersey is something I'm genuinely proud of. For me, it represents how far I have come," Suruchi said, reflecting on the distance she has covered since those early days in Bhiwani. Shooting wasn't the sport she was destined for either. She found her way to it almost by circumstance and has never looked back since. "I'm actually thankful that I came into shooting. If I had chosen another sport, especially a team sport, maybe I wouldn't have reached this



far. Shooting gave me the chance to build something on my own, and I'm happy with where that has taken me." To the outside world, the sport can look deceptively simple, just a shooter standing still, taking aim. Suruchi insists that couldn't be further from the truth. "People look at shooting and think, 'What is so difficult? You just have to stand and shoot.' They don't see what is happening inside you. Controlling your thoughts, your breathing and your emotions while every shot matters, that is the real challenge."

INDIA'S RACING SENSATION ATIQA MIR GETS NEW BOOST



JK Tyre, longtime supporters of Indian motorsport, on Thursday signed 11-year-old racing sensation Atiqah Mir, reinforcing its long-standing commitment to invest in future champions. At such a young age, Atiqah has already made a strong mark on the international karting circuit, winning races in Europe and beating world class drivers older than her. Atiqah, the first Indian to be supported by the F1 Academy, is currently competing in different series in Europe and is the highest ranked female in FIA's International Karting Ranking in the OKNJ category (age 12-14). She joins an elite list of accomplished Indian drivers to be supported by JK Tyre, follow-

ing in the footsteps of Narain Karthikeyan and Karun Chandhok, the only two Indians who have reached the pinnacle of F1. Earlier this year, she became the first Indian to secure a podium in the European leg of the Champions of the Future Academy, before going on to deliver a dominant victory in Greece, where she became only the third driver in the series' history to sweep qualifying, heats and the final. More recently, Atiqah added another feather to her cap by becoming the youngest Indian to record two top 10 finishes in FIA European Karting Championship which is considered the 'Formula 1 of Karting.'

Serena And Venus Williams Will Play Doubles Together At The US Open 2026

Serena and Venus Williams are teaming up again at the U.S. Open. The sisters will play doubles at the tournament after receiving a wild card Wednesday into the event they won twice. Serena Williams returned to tennis this summer after a four-year absence, and the sisters were set to play at Wimbledon before Serena had to withdraw after injuring her knee in her singles loss. They played in the Cincinnati Open, losing in the first round. The Williams sisters won the 1999 and 2009 U.S. Open doubles titles and are 27-7 in their nine appear-

ances. They last played in 2022, losing in the first round in what was expected to be Serena's final match in Flushing Meadows. Serena, 44, played with Carlos Alcaraz in mixed doubles Tuesday, winning one match before losing in the quarterfinals. Venus, 46, is entered in the women's singles event. The Williams sisters teamed to win 14 Grand Slam doubles titles along with Olympic gold medals in 2000, 2008 and 2012. They shared the No. 1 ranking in women's doubles for eight weeks. Serena opted not to compete in singles at the U.S. Open,

where she won six of her 23 Grand Slam singles titles. But she felt good enough to accept wild cards into both doubles events. She and Venus won their first U.S. Open doubles title the same year the younger Williams won her first singles championship there. The height of their dominance as a team would come about a decade later. They won the Australian Open and Wimbledon in 2009, before picking up their second title in Flushing Meadows later that summer. They won in Australia again in 2010 and then picked up the French

Open title, making the sisters the holders of all four major trophies at the time. The first round of the women's doubles tournament begins Sept. 3. The Americans, who won the US Open doubles title in 1999 and 2009, last played together at a Grand Slam in New York in 2022, losing in the first round. The sisters planned to reunite at Wimbledon following Serena's return to competition during the grass-court season in June, but she withdrew after suffering a knee injury in her first-round singles match against Maya Joint.

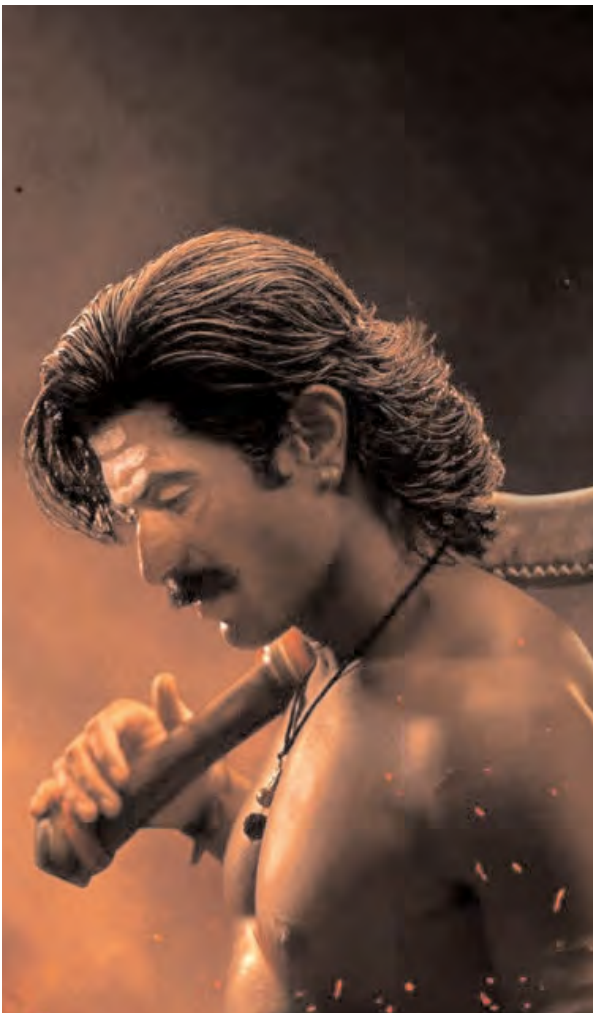
