Hyderabad, 3 held

Hyderabad, Aug 4 : The Hyderabad Food Adulteration Surveillance Team (H-FAST) of the (Police) Commissioner's Task Force seized 25 tonnes of spices containing dangerous chemicals and arrested three accused. Police Commissioner V. C. Sajjanar said on Tuesday that H-FAST, in joint coordination with the Food Safety Department of Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC), conducted a major enforcement drive against certain spice trading and processing establishments across the Hyderabad Commissionerate limits. The special crackdown was aimed to curb use of harmful-to-human chemicals as adulterants, eliminating misbranding, ensuring strict adherence to food safety standards, and protecting public health. During the operation, carried out based on credible information from the public, enforcement teams inspected 13 business establishments and independent business locations which were actively engaged in the procurement, processing, and wholesale or retail trading of spices and also indulging in certain offences affecting human health.

LS approves
Appropriation Bill amid
Opposition din

New Delhi (TSIT) : The Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 2026, which seeks to authorise expenditure from the Consolidated Fund of India towards excess spending incurred during the financial year ended on March 31, 2023, was passed in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday by a voice vote, amid protests from the Opposition. Amid the chaos, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman introduced the Taxation and Other Laws (Amendment) Bill in the House for consideration. The Bill seeks to amend the Payment and Settlement Systems Act, 2007, the Income-tax Act, 2025, and the Finance Act, 2026. The Lok Sabha was adjourned for the day on Tuesday, amid persistent protests and an ongoing deadlock over opposition-led issues. Proceedings were disrupted multiple times due to opposition sloganeering and protests before the Lower House was adjourned. It will reconvene on Wednesday at 11 am. There were multiple adjournments in both the Houses of Parliament amid noisy protests by the Opposition over various issues on Tuesday. Opposition MPs staged protests at the Parliament premises over multiple issues, including the embezzlement of Ram Mandir donations, police action on protesters during the Parliament March on July 20 in the national capital, and the Cauvery water dispute.

Govt likely to question
Meta Executives on CSAM,
WhatsApp usernames

New Delhi, Aug 4 : The Centre is expected to meet senior executives from Meta on August 5 to seek explanations on a range of concerns, including the handling of child sexual abuse material (CSAM), risks associated with WhatsApp usernames, and the treatment of verified and prominent accounts across its platforms, it was announced on Tuesday. Speaking on the sidelines of the launch of Voice of India, an independent multimodal artificial intelligence evaluation platform developed jointly by A4Bharat and Josh Talks AI, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology Secretary S Krishnan said the meeting would cover several issues that have recently raised concerns within the government. Among the key topics likely to be discussed is Meta's handling of child sexual abuse material (CSAM).

CM Revanth orders tight security
for police recruitment process

HYDERABAD, TSIT BUREAU :

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed senior officials to conduct the recruitment process for 7,437 police posts in a transparent, secure, and foolproof manner.

Chief Minister convened an emergency review meeting with DGP C.V. Anand and senior officials after intelligence agencies alerted the government that certain political groups and vested interests were allegedly attempting to disrupt the recruitment process.

Revanth Reddy instructed officials to strictly adhere to all recruitment rules and ensure there is no scope for irregularities at any stage. He emphasised heightened vigilance during the preparation, printing, transportation, and handling of question papers, as well as the overall examination process.

The Chief Minister also directed officials to

strengthen security arrangements at examination centres and maintain close surveillance on coaching centres. He instructed the police to prevent misinformation and false propaganda related to the recruitment process on social media and other platforms.

Further, he asked the Cyber Crime Wing to keep a close watch on fraudsters, fake websites, and social media accounts that may attempt to deceive job aspirants by promising government jobs. The Chief Minister ordered the Cyber Security and Intelligence wings to remain on high alert until the recruitment process is completed to ensure free, fair, and transparent examinations. The meeting was attended by Principal Secretary V. Sheshadri, DGP C.V. Anand, Home Department Principal Secretary Shikha Goel, Telangana State Level Police Recruitment Board Chairman V.V. Srinivasa Rao, Hyderabad Police Commissioner C.V. Anand, and other senior officials.

Naidu said the recent inauguration of the Bhogapuram International Airport reflected growing public confidence in the government and would serve as a major growth engine for North Andhra. He noted that Andhra Pradesh's GDP growth declined from 13.5 per cent during 2014-19 to 10.3 per cent during 2019-24, resulting in an estimated loss of Rs.6.94 lakh crore, while liabilities had risen to Rs.9.74 lakh crore.

Bankipur result more about
BJP's defeat than our victory:
Prashant Kishor

PATNA (TSIT) :

Jan Suraj Party founder Prashant Kishor on Tuesday said that the outcome of the Bankipur by-election should be viewed more as a rejection of the BJP than merely a victory for his party, claiming that its voters had sent a strong message to the BJP leadership regarding governance and leadership in Bihar.

Speaking to IANS after his by-election victory, Kishor said: "One should focus more on the BJP's defeat than on the victory in this election. The people of Bihar, especially the voters of Bankipur, have sent a message to the BJP and its leadership. They were given an opportunity to form a government with a massive majority and should not squander that mandate. They should not entrust the leadership of the government to the wrong person."



He said that Bihar requires capable leadership that can address key issues such as education, employment, and migration. "The people of Bihar want progress. For years, the BJP has sought votes by invoking the fear of 'Jungle Raj,' and they have received public support on that basis.

However, if someone associated with that very 'Jungle Raj' is brought into power after being draped in saffron, the people will not accept it. BJP supporters have now voted against the party for this reason," he said.

Govt Acts Against
1.83 Lakh Telecom
Resources, Blacklists
263 Senders

New Delhi (TSIT) : The government on Tuesday said that action was taken against 183,000 telecom resources, along with blacklisting of 263 senders in the first quarter this fiscal (Q1 FY 27), as part of the enforcement action against Unsolicited Commercial Communications (UCC).

Enforcement targeted multiple layers – outgoing barring, long-term disconnection, sender blacklisting across all operators and SMS header blocking – to curb repeat violations, according to the Ministry of Communications.



Against 730.82 billion total calls originated in the telecom network in the country in Q1 FY27, total UCC complaints stood at 1.085 million -- approximately 1.5 complaints per million calls.

The TRAI DND App accounted for 89 per cent of all UCC complaints received by the Access Providers, said the Ministry. Notably, AI-based spam detection flagged 24.43 billion suspected spam calls/SMSs, enabling consumers to exercise choice of either ignoring such communication or picking such communications with caution. Over 243,000 warning notifications were issued to the suspected senders within one week of commencement of the sending warning notifications, the ministry informed.

No plans to seek Udhayanidhi's remand, says TN govt

Madras HC directs police to release him on bail after questioning

CHENNAI (TSIT) :

After the State government submitted that it had no intention of seeking Leader of the Opposition Udhayanidhi Stalin's judicial remand over his objectionable comment against actor Trisha while attacking Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay, the Madras High Court on Tuesday directed the Thanjavur police to release him today (August 4) itself on station bail after questioning.

Appearing for the Thanjavur police, Advocate General Vijay Narayan informed Justice GK

Ilanthiraiyan that Udhayanidhi had been arrested and taken to Thanjavur, but that the police did not intend to remand him in judicial custody. The police only intended to question him and release him on station bail.

The Advocate General added that the State's only intention was to protect the interests of women. The court observed that since the petition was one for anticipatory bail, it would not be maintainable after the arrest. However, the court added, it could grant bail considering the materials placed before it.



Recording Advocate General Narayan's submissions, the court directed the police to question Udhayanidhi and release him on station bail on the same day. The FIR stems from an



objectionable speech delivered by the Leader of the Opposition at a public meeting that the DMK conducted in Thanjavur on August 3 in connection with the Cauvery water-sharing dispute.

During his speech, Udhayanidhi picked cue from a comment from one among the audience and made a comment loaded with double entendre against actor Trisha Krishnan and Chief Minister Vijay.

Following this, S Bairavi, the TVK's Central District Women's Wing Organiser for Thanjavur, filed a complaint at the Thanjavur East Police Station. Based on this, the police registered a case against Udhayanidhi under Sections 196, 192, 352, 79, 296(b), 61 and 351(2) of the

Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, along with Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act and Section 67 of the Information Technology Act, and arrested him.

Meanwhile, Udhayanidhi filed an anticipatory bail petition before the High Court, claiming that his speech was a political one on the Cauvery water issue, protected under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution, and that his remark referred only to the water dispute with Karnataka.

DMHO Reviews Healthcare Services at Srirangavaram PHC

RECALLS HIS EARLIER TENURE AS MEDICAL OFFICER AT THE CENTRE

Hyderabad City TSIT: Medchal District Medical and Health Officer (DMHO) Dr. K. Anand visited the Srirangavaram Primary Health Centre (PHC) on Tuesday and conducted a comprehensive review of the implementation of healthcare services at the facility. During the inspection, Dr. Anand examined outpatient (OP) services, maternal and child healthcare, immunisation programmes, availability of medicines, laboratory services, maintenance of records, attendance registers, sanitation, biomedical waste management, pharmacy operations, and the overall infrastructure of the health centre, in accordance with the National Health Mission (NHM) guidelines. He also interacted with patients to assess the quality of healthcare being provided and issued instructions to the staff to further improve service delivery. Later, Dr. Anand held a review meeting with the Medical Officer and healthcare staff, during which officials brought to his notice several administrative and infrastructure-related issues affecting the functioning of the PHC. Responding positively, the DMHO assured them that necessary steps would be taken to address the concerns at the earliest. On the occasion, the staff recalled that Dr. Anand had earlier served as the Medical Officer at the same Srirangavaram PHC before taking charge as the District Medical and Health Officer.



Temple renovation works to be completed before Pushkarams

Bhadrachalam (TSIT): The renovation and development works of the Sri Seetha Ramachandra Swamy Temple should be completed before the Godavari Pushkarams next year, maintaining quality standards and the stipulated schedule, said District Collector Ankit. The Collector, along with Sub-Collector Mrinal Shrestha, inspected the ongoing works on Tuesday and directed officials to complete the Uttara Dwara Darshanam works by Mukkoti Ekadashi. He asked them to deploy additional manpower and machinery, if necessary, to speed up the works.

TRP Alleges Agriculture
Dept Targeting Farmers,
Not Fertiliser Dealers

Jogulamba Gadwal, Aug. 4: TRP District President Morugu Veeresh alleged that the Agriculture Department is unfairly targeting farmers instead of taking action against fertiliser dealers involved in the sale of fake fertilisers.

Addressing a press conference, he criticised officials for raiding farmer Uppari Mohan Sagar's residence in Mandoddi village and seizing 47 bags of DAP fertiliser, claiming they were suspected to be fake. He questioned why the department failed to act when the farmer had earlier lodged complaints against dealers selling fertilisers at inflated prices.

Hyderabad Hospital Gives New Life to 8-Month-Old African Baby with Rare Heart Defect

Hyderabad, Aug. 4: An 8-month-old baby girl from Africa is recovering well after undergoing a complex heart surgery at Medicovert Hospitals, Financial District.

Baby Maiza was born with multiple heart defects that prevented normal blood flow to her lungs. She had low oxygen levels, struggled to feed, and frequently experienced breathlessness.

A team led by Dr. Amol Gupta, Senior Consultant – Pediatric Cardiac Surgeon, successfully performed a Bidirectional Glenn procedure on July 14. The surgery rerouted blood flow



directly to the lungs, improving oxygen supply and reducing strain on the baby's heart. Remarkably, the infant breathed on her own soon after surgery without prolonged ventilator support. She is now being discharged in stable condition. Dr. Gupta advised parents not to ignore warning signs in infants such as

bluish lips, fast breathing, poor feeding, or failure to gain weight, stressing that early diagnosis can be life-saving. The successful outcome highlights Hyderabad's growing reputation as a destination for world-class pediatric cardiac care, with the hospital attracting patients from several countries.

Free Vascular Health Camp on Thursday

Hyderabad (TSIT): In observance of National Vascular Day, CARE Hospitals, Banjara Hills, will offer a free Vascular Health Check on Thursday, August 6, 2026, aiming to promote early detection of often-overlooked circulatory disorders. Physicians stress that timely intervention can prevent disability, preserve mobility, and reduce the risk of limb-threatening complications. Ahead of National Vascular Day, Dr. P. C. Gupta urged the public to take warning signs seriously. "Many people believe leg pain while walking is simply part of ageing, but it can be an early warning sign of blocked arteries. Similarly, persistent swelling, cold feet or wounds that do not heal should never be ignored," he said. "Early diagnosis enables timely treatment and, in many cases, helps prevent serious complications." Dr. Gupta further identified high-risk groups, including individuals with diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, smokers, and adults above 50 years of age.

Criticising the previous YSRCP government, he said it failed to conduct a Mega DSC during its five-year tenure and therefore had no moral right to comment on the present process. He added that the government has released a Job Calendar for 10,060 posts, with appointments to be made in four phases.

The Minister challenged YSRCP leaders to an open debate on the recruitment process if they had any genuine concerns and asserted that misleading campaigns would not affect the recruitment.

Centre to Establish Rs.100-Crore Yoga Research Institute Near Guntur

100-Bed Hospital to Offer Integrated Healthcare; Project Expected to be Operational by 2028

VISAKHAPATNAM (TSIT) The Centre has given the go-ahead for the establishment of a Central Research Institute of Yoga and Naturopathy (CRIYN) at Nadimpalem in Prathipadu mandal near Guntur. The institute will be set up over 15.03 acres at an estimated cost of Rs.100 crore, State Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav announced on Tuesday. The Minister said an official team from the Ministry of AYUSH inspected the proposed site and approved it for the project. The State Government will complete



land development, road connectivity, drainage and other basic infrastructure within the next three months before handing over the site to the Centre. Construction will then be taken up by the Central

Government, with the institute expected to become operational in 2028.

The institute will be established under the Central Council for Research in Yoga and Naturopathy (CCRYN), an

autonomous body under the Ministry of AYUSH. It will serve as a premier national centre for scientific research in yoga and naturopathy, while also providing training for healthcare professionals and promoting evidence-based traditional healthcare practices. A 100-bed Yoga and Naturopathy Hospital will also be built on the campus to provide integrated treatment for lifestyle diseases and chronic health conditions. The project will include advanced research laboratories, specialised treatment

units, training centres and other modern infrastructure.

The Minister said similar institutes are already functioning in Jhajjar (Haryana), Nagamangala (Karnataka) and Dibrugarh (Assam), while facilities are under construction at Raipur (Chhattisgarh) and Jatni (Odisha). The proposed institute in Andhra Pradesh is expected to strengthen the State's role as a national hub for yoga, naturopathy research, healthcare and professional training.

Students Protest Over Poor Quality Food at Andhra University Hostel

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) Students of the Andhra University Arts Boys' Hostel staged a protest on Tuesday alleging that poor-quality food was being served in the hostel mess. The demonstration was triggered after students claimed that the egg curry served for lunch emitted a foul smell and that meals had been prepared using rotten tomatoes and other sub-standard vegetables. Carrying the contaminated food, the students staged a protest in front of the Vice-Chancellor's office, demanding immediate action against those responsible. The protest was led by SFI Andhra University Unit Vice-President Tarun.

The students said that despite paying their mess charges regularly every month, they were not being provided with hygienic and nutritious food. They also alleged that



although a complaint regarding the same issue had been submitted to the

District Collector last week, no action had been taken by the authorities. Following the protest, the Principal and the Hostel Warden inspected the food served in the mess and assured the students that action would be taken against the staff responsible for preparing the substandard food.

They also promised to suspend those found responsible and ensure that clean and quality food is served to hostel residents in the future. Speaking on the occasion, SFI District Secretary G. Ajay said that it is the responsibility of the university administration to provide quality food and basic amenities to hostel students. He demanded that all pending hostel-related issues be resolved without delay and warned that the SFI would intensify its agitation if the authorities failed to address the students' grievances.

Speed Up Jal Jeevan Mission Works in Water-Scarce Areas: Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) Deputy Chief Minister and Minister for Panchayat Raj, Rural Development and Rural Water Supply Pawan Kalyan has directed officials to accelerate the implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission works in areas facing acute drinking water scarcity, with special focus on the coastal belt of the erstwhile East and West Godavari districts. Reviewing the progress of the Amarajeelvi Jaladhara Mega Water Grid Projects, the deputy Chief minister said the schemes are expected to provide a permanent drinking water solution to nearly 33 lakh people in the two districts. He instructed officials to ensure that all major infrastructure works



are completed within the stipulated time frame and commissioned without delay.

Officials informed the meeting that works worth Rs.3,050 crore are progressing as planned. In the erstwhile East Godavari district, a Rs.1,650-crore Mega Water Grid Project is being implemented to supply safe drinking water to around 20 lakh people across

ten Assembly constituencies. Construction of intake wells, access bridges and water treatment plants is under way, while 182 kilometres of pipeline have already been completed. In the erstwhile West Godavari district, a Rs.1,400-crore project is being executed to provide drinking water to about 13.5 lakh people. Key components, including the intake well, access bridge and water treatment facilities, are under construction. Officials said that over 400 kilometres of pipeline have been laid under the two projects.

Pawan Kalyan directed officials to give priority to water-scarce villages, expedite pending clearances by coordinating with the Roads & Buildings

Department, National Highways Authority, Panchayat Raj Department and the Forest Department wherever required, and closely monitor progress through Project Monitoring Units established at the district level. Emphasising that there should be no compromise on construction quality, the deputy Chief minister said he would soon undertake field inspections of Jal Jeevan Mission works across the State and personally review quality standards. He reiterated the State Government's commitment to achieving Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of providing safe and clean drinking water to every household.

South Coast Railway GM Reviews Monsoon Safety Preparedness

Directs Officials to Install Robust Barricades at Stations and Work Sites

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) South Coast Railway General Manager Sandeep Mathur has directed railway officials to strictly enforce safety protocols at railway stations, yards and construction sites across the zone in view of the ongoing monsoon season.

Chairing a safety review meeting on Tuesday with Principal Heads of Departments (PHODs) of the zone and Divisional Railway Managers (DRMs) of all four divisions, the General Manager stressed the need for proactive measures to ensure the safety of passengers, railway employees and the public. He instructed officials to closely monitor vulnerable locations during the monsoon, ensure efficient drainage to prevent waterlogging and respond promptly to safety



issues arising from heavy rainfall, strong winds and other adverse weather conditions.

Mathur also directed that sturdy barricades be installed at all railway construction and maintenance sites to prevent unauthorized entry by passengers, railway staff or members of the public. He emphasized that the barricades should be clearly visible, structurally strong and properly maintained, particularly in areas with heavy passenger move-

ment. Officials were further instructed to safely segregate construction zones from passenger movement areas at railway stations and provide adequate lighting, warning signage and other essential safety arrangements. Special attention, he said, should be given to platforms, circulating areas, station entry points and locations vulnerable to waterlogging or slippery conditions during the rainy season.

South Coast Railway's Visakhapatnam Division Receives Carbon Footprint Saving Certificate for Sustainable Waste Management

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) The Visakhapatnam Division of South Coast Railway has been awarded the Carbon Footprint Saving Certificate in recognition of its outstanding efforts in sustainable waste management during the financial year 2025-26. The certification was presented by M/s ScrapQ Hub Private Limited in acknowledgement of the division's significant contribution to environmental conservation.

The certificate was handed over to Divisional Railway Manager Lalit Bohra and was issued in the name of the Senior Divisional Mechanical Engineer (Sr. DME), Waltair Division.

Between April 2025 and March 2026, the division scientifically segregated and sent 97,295 kilograms of recyclable waste for recycling, preventing



it from reaching landfills. According to the internationally recognised U.S. EPA's Waste Reduction Model (WARM) methodology, this initiative resulted in a reduction of 300.25 metric tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e) emissions.

Officials said the environmental impact of the initiative is equivalent to removing 105 passenger vehicles from the road for one year, saving approxi-

mately 127,888 litres of petrol, or growing 8,004 trees for a period of ten years. The recognition reflects the Visakhapatnam Division's continued commitment to sustainable waste management, the circular economy, and the Government of India's flagship environmental initiatives, including the Swachh Bharat Mission, Mission LiFE, and the country's Net Zero 2070 goals, officials added.

Amaravati Being Built as a Pride of the Telugu People; First Phase to be Completed by 2028: Ministers

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) Andhra Pradesh Ministers Anagani Satya Prasad, P. Narayana and S. Savitha said that Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu is developing Amaravati as a capital city that will be a matter of pride for the Telugu people, with the first phase of construction scheduled for completion by August 2028. The ministers inspected the ongoing capital city works on Tuesday, reviewing the construction of Ministers' residences, MLAs' and MLCs' residential towers, the Secretariat complex and the iconic Heads of Departments (HoD) Towers. They also assessed the facilities provided in the completed residential quarters.

Speaking to the media, Minister Anagani Satya Prasad alleged that the YSR Congress Party had earlier carried out a misinformation campaign by describing Amaravati as merely "graphics." He said the ongoing construction work clearly demonstrates the reality on the ground. Referring to remarks made by YSRCP President Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy on education, the minister said Jagan should refrain from commenting on the subject and asserted that there was no comparison between him and Education Minister Nara Lokesh, highlighting Lokesh's academic background and reforms in the education sector. He also defended the government's Mega DSC recruitment initiative and urged the opposition to stop making what he termed false allegations.

Minister S. Savitha said the construction of residential quarters for Ministers,



MLAs and MLCs has been completed and that the facilities would be handed over to the General Administration Department (GAD) on August 15. She stated that the Secretariat, High Court, Legislative Assembly and other iconic government buildings are targeted for completion by 2028. Major road works in the capital region are progressing rapidly, she added, with the objective of providing all key government services at one location through the Secretariat and HoD complexes. Savitha said that just as Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu had earlier developed Hyderabad's Hitec City and Cyberabad, he would also complete Amaravati as a world-class Greenfield capital that would remain in the hearts of the people.

Criticising the previous YSRCP government, Savitha alleged that its tenure was marked by destruction, while the present government is focused on development. She also accused the opposition of creating disturbances in the State in the name of protests. Municipal Administration Minister P. Narayana and senior officials also participated in the inspection.

Vizag Development Vision Unveiled at Moscow International Transport Summit - GVMC Signs Memorandum of Cooperation with Moscow Government

Visakhapatnam (TSIT) Visakhapatnam's development vision was showcased on the global stage at the 5th International Transport Summit held in Moscow, Russia. Visakhapatnam Member of Parliament M. Sriharat presented the city's long-term development roadmap and highlighted the urban development initiatives being implemented by the Government of Andhra Pradesh before international delegates, according to GVMC Commissioner Ketan Garg. On the sidelines of the summit, the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) and the Government of Moscow signed a Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) to strengthen collaboration in urban mobility, transport infrastructure and smart city development. Following the signing ceremony,



the delegation met Maksim Liksutov, Deputy Mayor of Moscow and Head of the Department of Transport and Road Infrastructure Development, and exchanged greetings.

*The Panic In Rawalpindi:
Why Pakistani Generals
Suddenly Sound So Afraid*

Some really curious events are taking place in Pakistan, unusual even for that volatile country. First, there was Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi's lecture on the virtual collapse of government and references to the dangers of 'cockroach' protests. Then came the formidable Director-General of Inter Services Public Relations (DG-ISPR), who delivered a two-hour briefing, most of it in English and with figures galore. That was clearly also aimed at foreign audiences, even as his own country virtually collapsed in an orgy of violence. All of this was echoed by others, including prominent journalists, with dire warnings about the dangers from frustrations among the youth. Apparently, a certain insect emerging next door had come to epitomise the fears of the elite in Pakistan.

The Interior Minister's Advice

First, the unusual - and probably unworkable - suggestions from an Interior Minister who apparently wants to 'reform' the country bottom-up, so as to improve governance and appease the youth. That's odd, coming from a former Punjab Chief Minister who led the 2024 midnight crack-down on protesters from the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI). The incident left four dead and more than 90 injured. There are also allegations of serious corruption, to the tune of millions. Whatever the truth, he hardly has a reputation for model governance. Referring to the 'Cockroach Janata Party' protests in Delhi, he warned, quite rightly as it happens, that Pakistani youth were no longer to be pacified with free laptops and the like, but wanted structural change. His solution was to create more administrative units for better governance. For instance, the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) has long been demanding that Karachi be designated a province separate from Sindh. This is strongly opposed by the PPP, which rules Sindh. Both are also allies of the PML-N government at the Centre. Similarly, the PPP and the PTI have also long called for a South Punjab province, which was opposed by the PML-N. Naqvi also knows well that such a move for new administrative units requires constitutional changes, which can only be done through a two-thirds majority in the House, which the PML-N doesn't have. But it could, if the army says so. Nothing on that yet, but Naqvi was criticised heavily. Interestingly, Naqvi was addressing a group of top businesspersons at the Pakistan Economic Summit 2026, and he quipped that it was, after all, they who were running the country, with their funding worth millions for political parties. He should know. He has been there, done that.

DG ISPR Hits A Poor Six

Then there was the far more controversial and potentially dangerous marathon briefing by Lt Gen Ahmed Sharif Choudhry, the DG-ISPR. The objective of his lecture was to blame everyone else - primarily India - for the violence in Balochistan. That blame-game included very obviously lip-synced videos of girls alleging abduction and threats to become suicide bombers, and a clip of a local alleging that all those involved were 'Fitna al Hindustan' terrorists. Another set of allegations was against the Taliban, who are accused, ironically, of being entirely different from Pakistanis in their culture. Pity they didn't remember the three decades that they armed the Afghans.

Inside The Cabinet Drama That Has Shaken The Congress In Karnataka

Even after getting a lion's share of the berths on offer for his supporters in the expanded DK Shivakumar Cabinet on Monday, former Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's decision to 'boycott' the swearing-in ceremony because of a perceived 'insult' over the appointment of a woman candidate not chosen by him, clearly indicates that the Congress government in Karnataka will have tumultuous days ahead of the state elections in May 2028. Coming exactly two months after he took over as Chief Minister from a reluctant-to-leave Siddaramaiah, Shivakumar's attempt to stem the unrest among legislators and have a full-fledged Cabinet received an unexpected jolt hours before the swearing-in. Siddaramaiah's 'tantrums' over Gayathri Shathgowda, an MLC, being named in the Cabinet list not only delayed the ceremony by one hour, but her name being pulled out at the last minute also caused embarrassment to the party. It appears that Siddaramaiah wanted Basavaraj Shivannavar from Bagalkot to join the Cabinet on the Kuruba 'quota', but the party high command instead chose Gayathri without consulting him. Not only this meant defying Siddaramaiah's 'prerogative' to name a person from his community, but he was also upset that Gayathri had been chosen ahead of his nominee, Umashri, for the women's slot. The party has named Umashri for the Council Deputy Chairperson's post, but neither Umashri nor Siddaramaiah is happy with that. In another episode, Mankala Vaidya, the lone nominee



from Uttara Kannada district, was replaced - hours before the swearing-in - by SS Mallikarjun, a party dynast from Davanagere whose father was a treasurer of the Congress party for decades, while the wife is currently a Lok Sabha member. The son is also an MLA. Mallikarjun claimed that DK Shivakumar had telephoned him, asking him to join the Cabinet; he claimed did not know anything about the last-minute change. Congress sources say that when Shivakumar received the list of ministers from the party headquarters in Delhi, he was shocked to see that his staunch supporter, HC Balakrishna, the Magadi M.L.A., was not on it. After he protested the exclusion, Balakrishna replaced M Krishnappa, a big-time realtor and a former minister from Bengaluru. Even after all this, there's

one close associate, Lakshmi Hebbalkar, whom Shivakumar has not been able to accommodate and who is now reportedly sulking. Questions About The 'List' Considering that in a caste-ridden and region-sensitive state like Karnataka Cabinet compositions are always tricky, the Congress leadership had held a series of meetings with Shivakumar, Siddaramaiah, and BK Hariprasad, the newly appointed Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) president. They were asked to submit their respective lists of names to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, who hails from Karnataka and has intimate knowledge of state politics. The lists were vetted by the party general secretary, KC Venugopal, and AICC's Karnataka in-charge, Randeep

Surjewala, and shown to Rahul Gandhi before being released.

The fact that the final list of names typed on the AICC letterhead reached media outlets around the same time as the Chief Minister's office - and much before being sent to the Lok Bhavan (formerly, Raj Bhavan) for the Governor's approval - has kicked up a row. The opposition BJP and the JD(S) have accused the Congress of taking away the Chief Minister's right to name his cabinet and reducing him to a 'rubber stamp'. The leader of the Opposition, R Ashok, has questioned the Congress party's 'ethical standards' in choosing the nominees for the posts of Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the Assembly, and also Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Legislative Council, when

this is the 'mandatory duty' of the legislators. It appears that with less than two years to go for assembly polls, the Congress high command tried to micro-manage the Cabinet formation by getting caste combinations right and giving a major slice of power to numerically strong and influential communities. The 'Ahinda' group led by Siddaramaiah has garnered nearly 60% of the berths, while the Lingayats, scheduled castes, and OBCs have seven representations each. The Vokkaligas have six, the Muslim minorities four, and the Scheduled Tribes three. The Congress is also not unaware of the risk of the JD(S) reclaiming some of its former members, and has thus tried to accommodate at least five of them currently in the party.

Rein In The Discontent

Even so, while the election arithmetic may have been aimed at arriving at a 'winning combination', the ground situation betrays a vast amount of discontent among the legislators, which is bound to have an impact on the final outcome. The Congress has 136 MLAs across the state. Despite that, due to a skewed selection, seven districts have gone without any representation, while Bengaluru urban and rural have nine faces. Yashwanatreyygouda Patil from Indi and Sangamesh from Bhadavati have resigned as MLAs to protest against their exclusion from the cabinet. A few more disgruntled MLAs may or may not join the list of deserters in the days to come, though whether this immediately threatens the stability of the Shivakumar government remains to be seen. Nonetheless, the sea of discontent over the exclusion of many seniors from the cabinet, such as HK Patil, Dinesh Gundu Rao, HC Mahadevappa, TB Jayachandra, CS Nadagouda, Tanveer Sait, Shivananda Patil, BR Patil, RB Thimapura, S h a r a n a b a s a p p a Dharshanapur, and others, is rising and could soon trigger a washout if it boils over as the polls approach. It is important to remember that Siddaramaiah is still smarting at the "humiliation" of being abruptly asked to step down as Chief Minister. Not one to take such things lightly, it won't be surprising if he keeps his doors open to all those who are willing to walk with him. His boycott of the swearing-in is just the first signal.

Did the Three Assembly By-election Seats Send a Political Message?

In Indian democracy, by-elections are often viewed merely as a process to fill vacant seats, yet the reality is far more significant. Often, a by-election heralds major political shifts to come. The recent results from the Bankipur (Bihar), Datia (Madhya Pradesh), and Manjalpur (Gujarat) assembly seats have signaled exactly this. Among these three seats, the victory of Prashant Kishor—founder of 'Jan Suraj'—in Bankipur, the Congress party's success in Datia, and the BJP's win in Manjalpur have introduced new discourses into Indian politics. The results have also made it clear that voters are no longer satisfied with traditional political equations alone; instead, they are seriously evaluating factors such as local leadership, credibility, and alternative politics. Of these elections, the Bankipur seat in Bihar garnered the most attention, as Prashant Kishor—an election strategist turned politician—secured his first assembly election victory. This was not merely the win of a single candidate but the first major success for the brand of alternative politics he has been advocating for years. Bankipur has long been considered a BJP stronghold. A victory for a relatively new party like 'Jan Suraj' in such a region demonstrates that with a strong organization, a candidate with personal credibility, and a public ready for change, even established political parties can be challenged. Reports indicate that the BJP faced an unexpected

defeat in this stronghold. A defining characteristic of Prashant Kishor's political journey is that, despite having devised election strategies for various parties over the years, he chose to anchor his own political agenda in systemic change, education, employment, and administrative reform. Critics may dismiss this as idealistic politics, but the people of Bankipur have sent a message that if a leader remains consistently engaged with the public and maintains credibility, a political foothold can be established. This result is particularly significant in the context of Bihar's politics, where direct contests between the NDA and the Mahagathbandhan have long been the norm. The success of Jan Suraj has strengthened the prospects of a third alternative within this bipolar political landscape, potentially compelling both major alliances to rethink their strategies in the future. On the other hand, the Congress party's victory in the Datia constituency of Madhya Pradesh has demonstrated that, despite the BJP's robust organizational structure, the opposition has not been completely wiped out. While the BJP's influence in Madhya Pradesh politics has appeared to grow steadily over the past few years, the voters of Datia sent a clear message to the ruling party that ignoring local issues can come at a political cost. For the Congress, this victory represents not merely the gain of a single seat but also a morale booster for its party workers. Having faced a series of electoral challenges in recent years, the Congress

can view such results as an opportunity to revitalize its organization. If the party succeeds in strengthening its local leadership and effectively championing public issues, it could put up a stronger performance in future elections. However, the Congress must avoid complacency; mistaking success in a single by-election for a broad mandate would be a political blunder. The party needs to realize that voters do not extend support based solely on opposition to the ruling party; they also seek a positive alternative. Meanwhile, the BJP's victory in the Manjalpur constituency of Gujarat demonstrated that the party retains its organizational edge in its traditional strongholds. Although the BJP lost two seats, by retaining Manjalpur, it sought to convey that its support base remains intact. Acknowledging the results, the BJP leadership has also called for introspection regarding the outcomes in Bankipur and Datia. Viewed collectively, these results reveal that the Indian electorate no longer exhibits uniform political behavior. In Bihar, voters gave a chance to a new alternative; in Madhya Pradesh, they backed the opposition; and in Gujarat, they maintained their faith in the ruling party. This serves as a testament to the maturity of Indian democracy. These results also present several challenges for the BJP. Over the last decade, the party has achieved consistent electoral success driven by a strong organization, effective election management, and popular leadership. However,

these by-elections indicate that organizational strength alone is not enough; sensitivity towards local grievances, candidate selection, and regional issues is equally crucial. The results, particularly in Bihar, could influence future political equations for the BJP. If Prashant Kishor succeeds in transforming this success into a broad-based mass movement, the state's politics could shift into a three-way contest. This could alter the electoral arithmetic of traditional alliances. Meanwhile, these results offer several lessons for the opposition as well. The opposition has long been seeking a strategy to counter the BJP's formidable electoral machinery. These by-elections demonstrated that the ruling party can be challenged if there is strong local leadership, an active organization, and a focus on genuine public issues. Another significant takeaway is that voters now clearly distinguish between national and local issues. The notion that a party supported in the Lok Sabha elections will inevitably triumph in Assembly or by-elections appears to be weakening; voters are making decisions based on different criteria in each election. Prashant Kishor's victory has also added a new dimension to the debate regarding electoral strategy versus genuine mass leadership. While he was previously viewed primarily as a successful election strategist, his biggest challenge now—as an elected legislator—will be to translate his promises into action. The public will now expect solutions from him, not just criticism.

Kanwar Yatra and the issue of unemployed youth: The gap between faith and opportunity

Every year during the holy month of Shravan, the streets of North India are filled with saffron as millions of Kanwariyas participate in the Kanwar Yatra. They walk hundreds of kilometers carrying sacred Ganga water from pilgrimage sites like Haridwar and Gangotri to offer it to Lord Shiva. This is a remarkable example of devotion, discipline, tolerance, and collective faith. These pilgrims comprise a significant number of young people. Their enthusiasm and physical strength are a testament to the immense energy of India's youth. However, a major question arises with these young pilgrims: how many of them look for jobs during the rest of the year and try to build a stable future? This isn't an insult to religious faith. Rather, it's a way to raise awareness about one of India's most pressing socio-economic issues. Faith nourishes the mind, and employment provides dignity, security, and purpose. Asking young people to choose between the two isn't the nation's problem. Rather, the problem is cultivating an environment where faith and opportunity coexist harmoniously. India has a large youth population. This demographic dividend is seen as a strength of the country. Every year, millions of young people graduate from schools, colleges, and universities with hopes and dreams of gainful employment. They prepare for competitive exams, apply for numerous jobs, and await recruitment notifications. A large number of people have degrees but either do not have jobs or work part-time. This is

not just an economic problem, but can also have psychological and social implications. Unemployment can undermine self-confidence, delay economic independence, increase pressure on families, and in some cases, lead to despair and frustration. The Kanwar Yatra is associated with this generation, one of the youngest. These people come from villages, towns, and cities. They include students, children of farmers, daily wage laborers, young professionals, and unemployed graduates. Their participation in the pilgrimage symbolizes their faith and culture. Therefore, to say that unemployment motivates people to engage in religious activities or that religious pilgrimages cause unemployment would be simplistic and unfair. These assumptions are inaccurate because they do not take into account the complexity of social behavior and economic realities. However, this presents an interesting paradox. The determination and perseverance displayed by young people walking hundreds of kilometers under challenging conditions is exemplary, and they also possess the discipline, endurance, and commitment essential for the development of any nation. If equal opportunities are available in the areas of education, innovation, entrepreneurship, manufacturing, scientific research, and employment, this vast human resource could be one of the biggest drivers for India's economy. Not only are there not enough jobs available, but there's also a huge gap between what's taught in schools and what workers expect. Even for

graduates with the necessary skills, employment opportunities are often limited, and industries face a shortage of skilled workers. This contradiction reflects the mismatch between human resource needs and the education system. Therefore, schools must focus on skills, critical thinking, digital literacy, and industry-oriented training, not just academic knowledge. The central and state governments have launched numerous initiatives and policies to promote skill development, self-employment, the startup ecosystem, manufacturing, and entrepreneurship. These efforts have resulted in new opportunities for many young people. However, given India's large youth population, much remains to be done. Policies alone are not enough to address this problem. But society also has a duty. In many families, getting a government job remains the primary criterion for success. In the modern economy, many alternatives to government employment exist, and all should be considered. New sectors of the economy are creating jobs, especially entrepreneurship, digital services, renewable energy, agribusiness, tourism, creative industries, and technology-based companies. Teens should be encouraged to consider these opportunities, not just "normal" ones. The media also plays a crucial role in shaping public discourse. Reporting on the Kanwar Yatra is typically done either in terms of its religious grandeur or in the context of specific issues. Social issues related to youth participation are rarely addressed. Instead of sidelining the idea of faith and action, public

appeals should focus on the fact that the commitment and dedication displayed by these organizations or pilgrimages can be channeled into social work, environmental protection, disaster relief, blood donation drives, and nation-building initiatives. In Indian civilization, karma and spirituality have never been in opposition to each other. Rather, it has been a celebration of the balance between purity and duty. Meditation, discipline, simplicity, and inner strength are all symbolized by Lord Shiva. His teachings remind devotees that spiritual growth always accompanies responsible action. Governments cannot solve the problem of unemployment. Industries must invest and create employment opportunities. School curricula need to be restructured to suit changing market needs. OIL PRICES FALL ON HOPES STRAIT OF HORMUZ COULD REOPEN

Oil prices fell to a three-week low on Tuesday as senior US officials raised hopes of a deal with Iran to reopen the key Strait of Hormuz waterway. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent both announced talks had progressed to allow shipments to potentially resume as soon as this week. The cost of a barrel of Brent crude, the global benchmark for oil prices, fell by almost 5% to under \$80 on the news of supply disruptions potentially being eased. But the failure of previous negotiations in recent months to de-escalate the conflict between the US and Iran has led to a volatile oil market, with drivers ultimately being hit by higher fuel prices at the pumps. On Tuesday, along with the drop in Brent crude, US West Texas Intermediate prices were down more than 5%, to \$76 a barrel. Both contracts dropped to their lowest levels since 13 July. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said there had been progress made in discussions on getting more ships through the Strait with Iran and Oman. "There's been progress made in those talks, but not finality yet. We're hoping that will happen very



shortly," he told reporters at the State Department. Bessent said a deal to reopen the Strait of Hormuz could be agreed as soon as Tuesday or Wednesday. There was a "chance we may have a deal today or tomorrow to open the strait and move towards a more normalized position in this conflict," he told CNBC. "It would be freedom of movement," he added, when asked whether Iran would be allowed to charge for ships passing through. While senior figures in the US government have announced talks have been pro-

gressing, no details of what a potential deal may look like have been released. The Strait of Hormuz has been a central point in negotiations between the US and Iran. Before the conflict began in late February, the waterway handled about one-fifth of global daily oil and liquefied natural gas supplies. The disruption has sent prices at the pumps up across the world. In the UK petrol prices are now at levels seen at the start of the conflict, with the average cost of a litre of petrol hitting £1.60, according to the RAC motoring group. In the

US, gasoline prices are on average above \$4 a gallon, according to the AAA. Diesel is almost \$5.40 a gallon. Qatar, which is one of the key mediators between Washington and Tehran, said it was continuing efforts with other mediators to try to achieve a diplomatic resolution to the war, but admitted no direct talks were currently planned. On Monday, President Donald Trump warned Iran faced its "last chance" to agree a deal to allow commercial shipping to resume in the Strait. He said he had called off "massive" strikes on the country for talks to resume. But Iran has said it was not negotiating with the US - and had no plans to do so - and is instead talking to Oman. The government will continue its efforts to strengthen domestic revenue mobilisation, enhance energy security through diversification of crude oil import sources and expansion of strategic petroleum reserves, promote alternative and cleaner fuels, and improve energy efficiency, which will reduce the economy's vulnerability to external energy shocks while supporting sustainable and resilient economic growth, the minister said.

AVERAGE COST OF DATA BREACH IN INDIA HITS RECORD RS 25.5 CR: IBM



Hyderabad: The average cost of a data breach in India has hit an all-time high of Rs 25.5 crore in 2026, a rise of nearly 16 per cent from Rs 22 crore last year, according to IBM's annual Cost of a Data Breach Report released on Monday, August 3. The report, conducted by the Ponemon Institute and analysed by IBM, is based on breaches experienced by 602 organisations globally between March 2025 and February 2026. The average breach in India also grew in scale, with 39,500 records compromised on average, up from 38,200 in 2025. Phishing, including voice and SMS phishing, was the most common initial attack vector in India, accounting for 19 per cent of malicious breaches, followed by drive-by compromise at 16 per cent and supply chain compromise at 15 per cent. The report also found that 26 per cent of malicious breaches in India were artificial

intelligence (AI)-generated, underlining how AI is reshaping the threat landscape by enabling attacks to become faster, more sophisticated and increasingly scalable. "India's accelerating AI adoption is creating immense opportunities for innovation, but it is also enabling cyber threats to evolve rapidly," said Gaurav Agarwal, Vice President, Technology, IBM India and South Asia. "Today, most organisations apply AI in limited ways, often focused on detection. To keep pace, AI with agentic capabilities must be embedded across the full security lifecycle — from detection and analysis to prioritisation and remediation," he said. Despite the growing threat, 68 per cent of Indian organisations surveyed reported limited or no use of AI and security automation, a gap the report says is directly reflected in breach costs and response times.

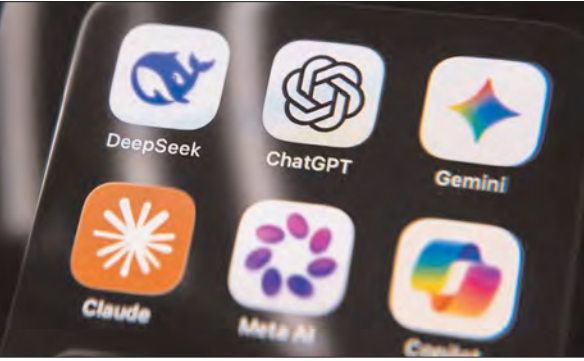

Tokenomics: Why making AI pay is tricky



If you have used a free version of ChatGPT or any of its AI rivals, then you are obviously getting a good deal. Firms like Microsoft, Google and Anthropic have invested hundreds of billions of dollars in developing Large Language Models (LLMs) the tech behind those services. So getting, ChatGPT, Claude or Gemini to help with your speech or holiday plans is a bargain. But, naturally, those firms want to recoup their investment, so they offer paid-for versions of their AI, which have extra features for tasks like coding or billing. Meanwhile, third party firms are building and selling services based on AI agents, usually based on an LLM, which are trained to do specific tasks. But setting a price for those services is surprisingly difficult. "Trying to tie someone into a cost model for the next 12 months, two years, three

years, it doesn't make any sense, honestly, because we don't know," says Simon Gooch at Saviynt, an identity management company which is incorporating agentic AI into its services. That's because of rapidly changing economics around tokens, the building blocks of LLMs and agentic AI. When a user asks an LLM, like ChatGPT or Anthropic's Claude to answer a question, generate software code, or automate a process, that prompt is broken down into mathematical chunks called tokens, which can be processed by the model. The LLM's response also comes in the form of tokens, which are converted back into text, software code, or a set of commands to automate a process. The problem is this process is not entirely predictable. Subtle variations in the prompt can produce different answers.

What will happen when a SpaceX rocket collides with the Moon?

The Moon has endured countless blows over millions of years. Asteroids and meteors have given the satellite its signature pockmarked surface and network of craters. More recently, it has also experienced impacts from the plucky little probes and landers that Earthbound space agencies have sent hurtling its way. Now on Wednesday, scientists expect the Moon will experience yet another collision, this time from a drifting SpaceX rocket that has been travelling at around 2.43 kilometres per second, or about 5,400mph. The upper stage (section) of one of SpaceX's Falcon 9 rockets will "impact" the Moon on 5 August, according to NASA's Centre for Near-Earth Object Studies (CNEOS). The US space agency reached the conclusion after independent astronomers, using public data, noted that a portion of the rocket from a January 2025 launch was on an accidental collision course with the Moon. "There is no danger to Earth," said spokesperson Jimi Russell. "Nasa will continue to track the booster



for training purposes, as well as later observe the impact site for scientific purposes." SpaceX launched this specific Falcon 9 rocket as part of a US and Japanese mission to carry a pair of lunar landers and scientific equipment to the Moon last year. Part of the Falcon 9 is reusable and designed to return back to Earth for its next mission. But parts of the rocket are shed in space and remain there, stuck in orbit unless they eventually collide with another celestial body. The piece in question is the

upper stage of the rocket, and is about the size of a five-storey building, with a weight on Earth of at least 4,000kg (8,800 lbs). Astronomer Bill Gray, who first discovered the trajectory, says the object will land near the Einstein Crater, which is on the part of the Moon that receives daylight and is visible from Earth. He predicts it will create a crater more than 17m (56ft) in diameter. The impending collision - predicted to happen at about 02:35 EDT (06:35 GMT) on Wednesday - is

expected to captivate astronomers, both amateur and professional. "It's something really huge smashing into the Moon. It's not remotely dangerous, we can just watch the show," says Dr Matt Bothwell, public astronomer at the University of Cambridge. "It's going to impact and its going to send up a huge plume of dust, maybe 50km into the air or more, and that's going to spread sideways over time," Bothwell said. Given the Moon's lack of atmosphere and far weaker gravitational pull, the moment of impact will be "more impressive than any [similar] explosion on Earth", Bothwell said. Nothing will slow the object down, like the atmosphere would do here on Earth - and nothing will prevent the estimated million kilograms in debris from rocketing up into space. While the impact will not be visible from Earth with the naked eye, people with access to a sophisticated telescope may be able to see a flash radiating off the Moon's surface, Bothwell said.

Culture is increasingly shaping where Hyderabad residents choose to travel. Interest in culture-led travel is increasing amongst travellers from Hyderabad, with more than half (51%) now planning holidays primarily around cultural experiences, while a further 36% say culture enriches their trips even when it is not the main reason for travel. The shift is also translating into travel behaviour. Nearly all Hyderabad travellers (95%)

have travelled beyond Telangana for a cultural experience, while 87% say they are willing to travel outside their home state or to lesser-known destinations in search of authentic cultural experiences. Growing pride in India's heritage (49%) and the increasing popularity of food, craft and heritage trails (43%) are among the biggest factors fuelling this trend. When asked which Indian states offer the richest cultural experiences, Hyderabad residents ranked Telangana alongside Kerala (18%), followed closely by Andhra Pradesh (17%).

Festivals are becoming a powerful reason to travel
Major cultural celebrations are increasingly influencing

travel plans, with nearly three in four Hyderabad residents saying they would consider travelling specifically for a cultural or religious festival. Durga Puja (38%) and Diwali (37%) top the list of festivals people would travel for, followed by Kumbh Mela (33%), Pongal (33%), Bathukamma (32%), Navratri Garba (31%) and Bonalu (31%). The biggest motivations include experiencing celebrations that only happen once a year (31%) and immersing themselves in local traditions and spirituality (30%).

Hyderabad residents are looking beyond borders for cultural experiences
Interest extends overseas too. One in four (25%) have already taken an international culture-focused holiday, while another 37% say they would definitely like to do so, and 28% are open to the idea, taking overall interest in international cultural travel to 90%. Among the most sought-after cultural destinations, Japan (22%) ranks first, followed by Thailand and Vietnam (17%), France (16%) and the United Kingdom (15%).

Arson arrest made over largest of Washington state's wildfires



A man has been arrested on suspicion of arson over the largest of the wildfires that have forced more than 60,000 people to evacuate from the city of Spokane in Washington state. Three major fires have been burning around the north-western state's second-most-populous city since the weekend, with firefighters still working to contain the flames. Aaron Farinacci, 37, was allegedly seen kneeling near grass at the site of the fire and later found to have matches and a lighter, the Spokane County Sheriff said. More than 700 buildings in the area have been destroyed, and thousands of acres of land have been burned near Spokane, a city of some 230,000 people about 280 miles (450 km) east of Seattle.

Washington Governor Bob Ferguson said it was a "nightmare situation", adding: "This is likely the worst natural disaster in Spokane history." The city's mayor Lisa Brown said there was still "the potential for lives to be lost" and that it was too early to say when people

might be able to return home. No deaths or injuries have been confirmed. The destruction, however, has left local residents in shock and despair. "I shouldn't have been back here, but I had to see my house," Ken Anderson told NBC News, standing near the skeletal remains of his home. His wife, Lisa, said: "It seems like it's a nightmare that we are just gonna wake up from and it's all gonna be okay, but I don't think it's going to be okay." Online fundraisers for those affected by the wildfires tell similar stories. Jane Biernat, who is six-months pregnant with her second child, safely escaped the wildfire but lost "everything" when her apartment in Spokane burned down, according to a verified GoFundMe page set up by her family.

"In just a few minutes, their home, clothes, furniture, baby's belongings, and all their cherished memories were gone," the account said. "Without renters insurance, they are now faced with the daunting task of starting over from nothing."

EU COMMENDS SPAIN'S 'SWIFT RESPONSE' TO CEUTA MIGRANT CRISIS

The European Union has praised Spain's "swift response" to the migrant crisis in Ceuta, following a meeting of the bloc's interior ministers on Tuesday. Around 72,000 migrants crossed into the Spanish territory in North Africa between 30 and 31 July, Spain's Interior Minister Fernando Grande-Marlaska said. He added that an estimated 70,000 have since been returned to Morocco. At least 75 people died on the Spanish side of the border, while 11 deaths were reported in Morocco. Irish Justice Minister Jim O'Callaghan, who chaired Tuesday's meeting, said the EU stood in solidarity with Spain and that migration required "a united European response". The meeting had been



expected to draw some tension, following earlier criticism of Spain from several EU nations. On Thursday, Italy's right-wing Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni described the images from Ceuta as "shocking", writing on social media that such "uncontrolled immigration" was a security threat to Europe. Italy suspended the Schengen zone agreement

with Spain on free movement on Friday. Since the two countries do not share a land border, this would only apply, effectively, to flights - which appears simply to mean extra checks for passengers. The Schengen agreement eliminates border checks and now encompasses more than 450 million people and 29 countries in Europe. Finland and

Denmark backed Italy's move, while Czech Prime Minister Andrej Babiš urged a temporary suspension of Spain's Schengen membership. Italy, along with Denmark and 20 other nations, later sent a letter expressing their concern over the Ceuta migrant crisis, and calling for a meeting of EU ministers. In response, Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez said he had "serious concerns" about some European governments and pointed out that Ceuta was not part of the Schengen area. While most had shown "support and solidarity", he said other European governments had chosen to attack Spain, "driven by prejudice, fake news, ignorance, or political interest".

Bono, Eddie Vedder and Hozier among mourners at Glen Hansard's funeral



=Stars from the world of music including U2's Bono, Pearl Jam's lead singer Eddie Vedder, and Hozier, attended the funeral of Glen Hansard on Tuesday. The 56-year-old Oscar-winning Irish singer and songwriter died in a motorcycle crash in Dublin last week. Hansard, who shot to prominence in 1991 musical comedy film The Commitments, was long-time frontman of acclaimed rock band The Frames. News of his sudden death shocked the music world and fans alike, with tributes being paid from the likes of Ed Sheeran and Bruce Springsteen, who said he was "heartbroken". Many people also paid their respects at a public wake in the city on Monday. The funeral was held in St Patrick's Cathedral in Dublin on Tuesday and featured musical performances by friends and family. Mourners included Bono, Eddie Vedder, Hozier, The Edge, Steve Coogan, Imelda May, Paddy Casey, Declan O'Rourke, and Angeline Ball, who starred alongside Hansard in the BAFTA-winning comedy-drama The Commitments. Representatives of the President of Ireland Catherine Connolly and the Taoiseach (Irish PM) Micheál Martin were also among the mourners. At the start of the service, a guitar was brought up to the altar by Colm Mac Con Iomaire, a former Frames band member. Mac Con Iomaire went on to perform a song for those gathered alongside Liam Ó Maolai. Irish traditional musician Breandán Ó Beaglaioich said Hansard

"was so well known on the big stages of Ireland and all over the world". He described him as an "ordinary kind-hearted Ballymun man... a true Dub." Ó Beaglaioich also performed a song. Other musicians who performed at the funeral included Bono, Eddie Vedder, The Edge, Lisa O'Neil, Joseph Doyle, Damien Dempsey, and Michael Buckley. Glen Hansard's widow, the Finnish poet Maire Saari, thanked her late husband "for the life we shared, searching for truth and beauty side by side". Fighting back tears, she said they found that truth and beauty in their three-year-old son, Christy. "He cannot be here today, he is too young to witness or understand an event of such scale," she says. But she added: "The bright spirit he inherited from his father is with us." Irish superstar Bono recited U2's song A Beautiful Day as the recital ended he began to sing the song, urging the congregation to join in. U2's lead guitarist The Edge also attended the service and approached the microphone to join in the version of Beautiful Day as his band-mate Bono finished his recital. At the end of the service, the coffin left the church to a musical send-off, with mourners inside the building continuing to sing along to a rendition of Bob Dylan's Forever Young. Hansard's life was steeped in music, from first picking up a guitar as a teenager right until the final hours of his life, when he was performing in a traditional music session.

MASS FUNERAL IN GAZA FOR 112 PALESTINIANS KILLED IN 2023 ISRAELI STRIKE

Large crowds turned out in Gaza City for a mass funeral for 112 people, mostly women and children, who were killed in an Israeli strike on a residential block in late 2023, early in the Gaza war. The bodies - belonging to members of two extended families - have only recently been recovered from under the rubble in a two-week-long operation. Dramatic footage showed the remains lined up in rows, each victim covered with a Palestinian flag and some with a photo of the dead, before relatives carried them away. The funeral is said to be the biggest of its kind to have taken place in Gaza. "I think this is a feeling that was supposed [to be felt], a feeling of pain, grief and loss," said one mourner, Ali Abu Sharia. "After we managed to retrieve them and bury them, perhaps we can be partially relieved despite the pain of loss and all we're still living through." Forty children, 38 women and seven people with disabilities were listed among the dead from the Abu Sharia and Hassayna families, who



are one clan. They were killed when a residential block in the Sabra neighbourhood of Gaza City was attacked by Israel on 22 November 2023. It was a day of heavy bombardment, six weeks after the 7 October Hamas-led assault on southern Israel, which led to 1,200 people being killed and 251 being taken hostage. The BBC has asked the Israel Defense

Forces (IDF) for information on what was targeted but has not yet received a response. Since the start of the war, at least 73,377 people have been killed in Gaza, according to the Hamas-run health ministry, whose figures are considered reliable by the UN. In Gaza, the recovery work was carried out by the Civil Defence, which operates under the Hamas-run

interior ministry. Its efforts have been supported by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). "We provide material support - literally the gloves, shovels, protective equipment and body bags they use," said Patrick Griffiths, spokesperson for the ICRC. "We provide training, supporting them to do their work safely, in line with pro-

fessional practice ensuring the deceased are treated with dignity. And we've supported them by renting - for hundreds of hours - two of the only excavators available for this work in Gaza." It's not an answer any family wants to receive - confirmation that your loved one has been killed," Griffiths added. "But it's essential towards them receiving closure and being able to mourn their loss in their own way." Last month, the BBC filmed the start of the operation to uncover bodies in Sabra. A single bulldozer picked through the rubble and then more delicate work was done by hand. "This multi-storey building has been levelled. There were maybe more than 180 civilians inside. Most of them, around 90%, were killed," Civil Defence spokesman Mohammed Basel said at the time. "On that day [of the strikes], the Civil Defence crews couldn't get to the site because it needed co-ordination [with Israel via a third party such as the ICRC] and there was great danger in

reaching the area." Relatives of the dead were at the scene to guide the recovery crews during the recovery work. They said they had retrieved as many bodies as they could immediately after the attack and were relieved to be able to give others a proper burial. "It's a devastating and sad feeling that resonates with everyone who was here," said Nahed al-Hassayna, as he showed the BBC the rubble of his family's living room. "The kids - what did they do?" he asked, holding up the possessions of two of his young relatives. "This was a school backpack for Omar, and this was Ibrahim's shoe. Why? Why were they killed?" "I'm the sole survivor of my family," said Yousef Abu Sharia, standing nearby. "Today, I'm talking to you [as] the one who lost my mother, my father, my uncle and my cousins and all my family. I lost them under this rubble." It is believed that dozens more bodies are yet to be recovered at the site. Across the Gaza Strip, thousands more people are unaccounted for.

WORLD'S OLDEST PRESIDENT RESHUFFLES ARMY AS HIS ABSENCE STOKES UNEASE

Cameroon's veteran leader Paul Biya - who has not been seen in public for nearly two months - has reshuffled the country's military amid growing concerns over his prolonged stay abroad. The 93-year-old president appointed officials to key positions within the army and promoted five colonels to the rank of brigadier general. One of the newly promoted brigadier generals is Raymond Jean Charles Beko'o Abondo, who was immediately reappointed as commander of the elite presidential guard - responsible for protecting Biya - a position he has occupied since 2013. Such shake-ups are not unusual under Biya's administration, particularly at times of intense public scrutiny or per-



ceived weakness. After an unexpected coup three years ago in neighbouring Gabon, which toppled the Bongo dynasty sending shockwaves across the continent, Cameroon immediately reshuffled its military leadership. Then, while running for a controversial eighth term in power at last year's presidential election, Biya reshuffled the top brass of the army. Again in

June this year, he promoted several members of the defence and security forces to higher ranks. The circumstances under which the latest changes were made have sparked debate, especially among social media users. Biya made the appointments in separate decrees on Monday from the Swiss city of Geneva, where he has been staying since leaving Cameroon on

7 June for what his team described as a "brief private stay". Many in Cameroon have criticised the lack of information about his activities and the uncertainty surrounding the duration of his foreign trip. After last year's election, he promised to name a new cabinet, but has yet to do so. A new post of vice-president that was created this April remains unfilled. During his nearly 60-day period abroad so far, he has signed several other decrees, including some authorising his government to sign loan agreements with international financial institutions. His absence sparked further speculation about his health, but the government has continually debunked reports that the head of state has been in hospital.

NEERAJ CHOPRA MOVES ON FROM CWG SILVER, SET TO CLASH WITH ARSHAD NADEEM, RUMESH PATHIRAGE AGAIN

After a silver medal in the Commonwealth Games (CWG) 2026, Neeraj Chopra has already set his sights on his next target. The 2-time Olympic medallist is gearing up to compete at the Lausanne Diamond League, also known as Athletissima, which is to be held on August 21. The Indian javelin star will face a formidable field of international athletes, with the competition for the top podium spot expected to get tougher, in comparison to the Glasgow Games. Leading the pack is Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathirage, the newly crowned Commonwealth Games champion and current world leader, who beat Neeraj to the gold medal with a massive 89.75-metre throw in the CWG Men's Javelin Throw final. The line-up features several other high-profile rivals, including Olympic champion Arshad Nadeem of Pakistan, reigning World champion Keshorn Walcott



of Trinidad and Tobago, and former World and Olympic winner Anderson Peters. They will be joined by Tokyo silver medallist Jakub Vadlejch, Germany's Julian Weber, and World Championship competitor Curtis Thompson. With five of these throwers having faced each other in the Commonwealth Games final only days prior, the event promises to be another thrilling high-stakes battle. Neeraj Chopra Happy Despite CWG 2026 Silver In

the men's javelin throw final, Neeraj opened with 80.97m before improving to 85.83m in his second attempt, which eventually stood as his best throw of the competition. His remaining valid throws measured 81.29m and 80.73m, while his final two attempts were fouls. "I am very happy. I am always happy whenever the national anthem is played. But it's ok [to win silver] as I did my personal best and my comeback is getting better," he said after the silver medal win.

BCCI PENSION SCHEME DETAILS, BENEFICIARIES, EXACT AMOUNT ONE RECEIVES



Ajinkya Rahane's retirement from international cricket once again brought to the fore the BCCI's unique initiative of providing pensions to former cricketers. Rahane, who played 85 Tests, 90 ODIs and 20 T20Is, is eligible for the highest pension bracket. A monthly pension for former cricketers is a scheme that is rarely heard of in the world of sports. However, the BCCI took this initiative over 20 years ago. When did the pension scheme start? According to a report in Cricinfo, the BCCI started the pension scheme in April 2004. The report quoted PTI

as stating that 174 former players and officials would receive a monthly pension of Rs 5,000. At that time, it was mandatory for a player to have played at least one Test match to be eligible for the monthly pension scheme. What is the current structure of the BCCI pension scheme? In June 2022, the BCCI announced an increase in the monthly pensions of former cricketers and umpires. Jay Shah, the then BCCI secretary, had said: "The welfare of our cricketers, be it former or present, is a top priority, and increasing pension amounts is a step in that direction.

'Prioritise Women Boxers': Akhil Kumar's Appeal To BFI Ahead Of 2028 Olympics

India's women pugilists are a stronger bet for an Olympic medal than their male counterparts and should be prioritised in the overall planning for the 2028 Los Angeles Games, says boxer-turned-police officer Akhil Kumar, lauding their record-shattering Commonwealth Games performance. In a telephonic interview to PTI, Akhil, who was the only Indian boxer to strike gold at the 2006 Commonwealth Games, said he was quite impressed with the country's performance in Glasgow where it finished with its best ever tally of seven gold medals in boxing, six of them coming from women. Women's boxing came into the CWG only in 2014 and featured just three categories - 51kg, 60kg and 75kg - to start with. This was two years after it entered the Olympics programme in the same three divisions. M C Mary Kom (2012, London) and Lovlina Borgohain (2021, Tokyo) have won Olympic medals for India in women's boxing. "They (the women boxers) are clearly delivering better results. The weight categories are also increasing, they deserve to be prioritised? Among the cur-



rent crop of male boxers, I don't really think there is anyone who can be an Olympic medallist at this stage. If there is a drastic improvement going forward, which I hope there is, I will change my view," the Haryana Police ACP said. "At this point, it's the women boxers who have the advantage. We have adapted to the expansion of the sport quite well and given how it has grown, I guess India is better positioned to deliver more than one Olympic medal in women's boxing in 2028," he added. The CWG programme in Glasgow featured seven weight categories for women, one more than last time. The men's event also comprised seven categories, achieving gender parity for the first time. The weight divisions were also

the ones that would be at the 2028 Los Angeles Olympics. The Indian women won medals in all seven categories, six gold and a silver. The men, on the other hand, managed two gold, and a silver. The competition in the women's event featured 70 boxers from 43 countries, 11 more than previous edition's 59 participants from 55 countries. The male competition, however, shrank to 131 from 43 countries instead of 172 from 55 nations in 2022. Asked to name the boxers who stood out during the competition, the former Asian champion and Olympic quarterfinalist said the gold-winning duo of Jaismine Lamboria (57kg) and Sakshi Chaudhary (51kg) displayed an all-round game which was also fairly gutsy.

Who Is Owais Yaqoob? The Fighter From Pulwama Making Waves In Global MMA

Indian sports fans who follow mixed martial arts (MMA) know that a rising star from Jammu & Kashmir is taking the combat sports world by storm. Owais Yaqoob is laying the foundation to become a household name in India, aiming to bring MMA to mainstream television sets across the country-an ambition bolstered by his recent statement victory over Delyan Georgiev, the training and sparring partner of world-renowned UFC champion Ilia Topuria, at BRAVE CF 107. For the unversed, Topuria, popularly known as "El Matador", is one of the most feared fighters in modern MMA history. He is famous for his ruthless boxing and undefeated run across the UFC's featherweight and lightweight divisions. By defeating a high-caliber training partner who help prepare a world champion like Topuria, Yaqoob sent a clear message that he belongs on the elite global stage. Hailing from a small village in Pulwama, Yaqoob has swiftly transformed from a regional prospect into



a fighter training alongside some of the biggest names in the sport. Born in 1998 in Murrn, a village in the Pulwama district of Jammu and Kashmir, Yaqoob began his athletic journey around 2012 when he picked up Taekwondo and kickboxing. He took to combat sports like a fish to water. His natural talent was undeniable, and through relentless dedication, he honed his skills to win over a dozen national medals across various

martial arts disciplines in India. However, as MMA gained global traction, Yaqoob transitioned to the cage, determined to prove himself on the global arena. Despite his rising trajectory, Yaqoob has remained committed to giving back to his community. In 2015, he established the Lion's Den Martial Arts Academy in Pulwama to support local youth. Over the years, the academy has trained over 200 young athletes, providing them with

a platform to hone their skills and find purpose through fitness and martial arts. In the years ahead, the academy promises to develop India's next generation of MMA talent. While Yaqoob made waves across the Indian sporting spectrum with his first-round stoppage of Georgiev at BRAVE CF 107, his journey had its share of early hurdles. He made his professional debut in 2023 at Matrix Fight Night (MFN) 11 in New Delhi-a tough outing where he lost via a third-round submission. Rather than letting the defeat stall his career, Yaqoob used it as fuel to address the glaring gap in his skill set: ground fighting and wrestling. To bridge this gap, he took a high-risk step by traveling to Dagestan, Russia-the world-renowned breeding ground for dominant wrestlers and world champions like Khabib Nurmagomedov and Islam Makhachev. The intensive training paid off. Yaqoob tightened his wrestling defense and takedown control, returning to the cage with renewed composure.

Boxers Sachin Siwach, Preeti Pawar Eye Asian Games Gold After CWG 2026 Triumph



Indian pugilists Sachin Siwach and Preeti Pawar have their eyes set on Asian Games gold following their gold medal wins at the recently concluded Commonwealth Games 2026 in Glasgow.

The Indian boxing contingent, which pulled off the country's best CWG 2026 medal haul with seven gold medals and overall 10 medals, received a warm welcome at the Delhi Airport. Speaking to ANI, Sachin, who secured a gold medal in the men's 60 kg final, said that seeing the national flag hoisted after the gold medal win is a "different kind of happiness" and a reason why they all play sport. "When the national flag is hoisted, there is a different kind of happiness. This is what we play for. I want to bring gold from the Asian Games. I want to tell everyone to keep believing like this and keep encouraging us," said Siwach. Sachin staged a remarkable comeback to defeat Namibia's Tryagain Morning Ndevelo by a 3-2 split decision in a thrilling men's 60 kg final.

Ajit Agarkar Sends Clear Selection Message For Mohammed Shami Through Bumrah Replacement

Jasprit Bumrah might be India's marquee pacer across formats, but his inability to remain fit for extended periods has become a riddle the team management is struggling to solve. Although the pacer featured for India in the three-match ODI series against England, he was ruled out of the subsequent two-match Test series against Sri Lanka due to yet another injury. This situation prompted the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to name Aqib Nabi as his replacement. While many were happy to see Nabi rewarded for his hard work in domestic cricket, the decision also highlights the harsh reality of Mohammed Shami's current situation. Shami, who last featured for the Indian team in a T20I against England in 2025, has not played Tests for



the national side since 2023. His last ODI appearances for India came last year against New Zealand. While fitness concerns initially saw Shami sidelined, even consistent performances in domestic cricket over the last year have failed to revive his chances of a national recall. What Next For Mohammed Shami? When BCCI chief selector Ajit Agarkar was asked about Shami's potential return, he stated that the veteran pacer

lacks the fitness required to play Test cricket. However, it is worth noting that across his last seven Ranji Trophy matches, Shami bowled 1,383 deliveries and took 37 wickets at an average of 16.72. During this period, he bowled 50 maidens and registered three five-wicket hauls, including his career-best First-Class figures of 8 for 90. In that same Ranji Trophy campaign, Nabi stood out above the rest, taking 60 wickets at an average of 12.56.

Arshdeep Singh Says "Sorry" To R Ashwin, Promises To Message Him "Personally"



Star India pacer Arshdeep Singh recently appeared in an interview and picked five bowlers according to their skills and talents. He named the likes of Bhuvneshwar Kumar, Mohammed Shami, Kuldeep Yadav, Yuzvendra Chahal, and Ravichandran Ashwin. Arshdeep apologised to Ashwin for naming him as the last player on the list. In a light-hearted tone, the pacer also said that he would message the legendary spinner personally.

Arshdeep, who plays only white-ball cricket for India, is currently out of action as the team gears up to play a two-match Test series against Sri Lanka, starting August 15. "Bhuvi bhai is at the top because he is my personal favourite as well. I really like him, so I'm a little biased. I'll rate all the fast bowlers first. At number two, I'd go with Shami bhai because, as you know, he can seam the ball on any wicket. His bowling is excellent, and he presents the

seam perfectly," Arshdeep said on Krishnank Atrey's YouTube channel. "Third would be Kuldeep Yadav because he has a very rare skill set, a left-arm Chinaman. Then there's Yuji bhai, as we are teammates in the Punjab team, and his record is also excellent. He has taken so many wickets. I wouldn't want to rate Ash bhai last, but there were no positions left, so he comes in at number five. He is great, but Ash bhai was also my first captain in the IPL with Punjab. Sorry, Ash bhai, I'll personally message you," he added. Arshdeep was last seen in India's three-match ODI series against England, which the Shubman Gill-led side lost 2-1 after suffering a 27-run defeat in the deciding match. The left-arm pacer had a forgettable outing in that game, conceding 72 runs without taking a wicket.

PV Sindhu Seeded Ninth At BWF World Championships, Satwiksairaj Rankireddy/ Chirag Shetty Fifth



Two-time Olympic medallist Indian shuttler PV Sindhu was on Tuesday seeded ninth in women's singles, while the star men's doubles pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty has been handed the fifth seeding for the upcoming BWF World Championships to be played at the Indira Gandhi Stadium here from August 17-23. Sindhu is the current Japan Open champion, while Satwik and Chirag are the 2022 Asian Games gold medallists. India have two entries each in all the five categories of the championships with at least one seeded entry in four of the five categories. Apart from Sindhu and Satwik Chirag, former world championships bronze medallist Lakshya Sen has been seeded 14th in men's singles and the mixed doubles pairing of Dhruv Kapila and Tanisha Crasto are seeded 15th. While the players qualified for the prestigious champi-

onships based on their world rankings of April 28, 2026, the seedings were decided on the basis of world ranking on July 28, 2026. Men's singles world champion Shi Yuqi of China and South Korea's women's singles star An Se Young are the top seeds in their respective categories. Women's singles world champion Akane Yamaguchi of Japan is seeded second while the third and fourth spots have gone to Wang Zhi Yi and Chen Yufei of China. The draw for the championships will take place here on Wednesday and the final seedings could change in case any of the seeded players withdraw before that. South Korea's Kim Won Ho and Seo Seung Jae are at the top of the men's doubles seeding chart with China's Liu Sheng Shu and Tan Ning got the top billing in women's doubles. Their compatriots Feng Yan Zhe and Huang Dong Ping are seeded number one in mixed doubles.

UFC loses \$30m on Freedom 250 event at White House



UFC owners lost \$30m (£22m) staging the Freedom 250 event, which was attended by US President Donald Trump, at the White House in June. Despite the event's losses, which UFC expected, the organisation still saw an increase of revenue for the second quarter of 2026, parent company TKO Group Holdings said on Monday. An estimated 4,300 people including president Trump and Vice-President JD Vance were present for the invite-only event on the South Lawn of the presidential compound, which formed part of celebrations to mark 250 years of American independence. Tickets were not sold to the general public for the event, and initial costs were predicted to be more than \$60m (£44m). However, UFC was able to

recoup some money through sponsorships, media exposure and other partnerships. In May, reports suggested 'high-roller' guests would need to spend \$1.5m (£1.1m) for special access, and while UFC sources confirmed to BBC Sport the existence of such packages for the event, they did not confirm how much they cost. Trump has a long-standing friendship with UFC president Dana White and the event coincided with his 80th birthday. Andrew Schleimer, chief financial officer of TKO Group, told investors on Monday they incurred significantly higher than normal costs for Freedom 250, which they "partially offset with sold-out global partnerships inventory." He added: "Given the event's profile, which as anti-

pated, resulted in an approximate \$30m loss, our margins at UFC as well as on a consolidated basis were meaningfully impacted." Last year, TKO Group signed a \$7.7bn (£5.7bn), seven-year contract with Paramount for the US channel to become the new home of UFC starting in 2026, with the White House event shown exclusively on its subscription streaming platform Paramount+. The event attracted an average of 34 million viewers worldwide, making it one of the most watched mixed martial arts events of all time. TKO reported UFC's revenue increased 29% year over year to \$535.7m (£398.7m) for the second quarter of this year. This includes a \$64.7m (£48.2m) increase in media rights driven by the TV deal with Paramount.

Later, I told my family about my interest in cameras, and they bought me a small one. I didn't know anyone in the industry. I am a 100% outsider, a lot of people claim they are but they are somehow related to someone in the industry. I am not. I learned photography and

came here. I joined Mass Communication at St. Mary's College. There, my professor Amrit sir was also passionate about cinema. Because of him, I was exposed to world cinema, including French and English films. Later, I entered journalism and built contacts. I eventually narrated a violent story to Anurag anna from Chai Biscuit.

How did your entry into Chai Shots happen?
Anurag anna liked my story a lot. He said such a story wouldn't normally be produced in Telugu. Later, he called me again to discuss it. Around that time, I was in journalism and he had just started Chai Shots and asked me to join as a creative producer. I worked on several shows there, but I felt it was becoming too routine and not exciting anymore. That's when I

went straight to Anurag anna and said I will direct a crazy show for him. That's how Dhandha began.

How much was your involvement in the story of 'Dhandha'?
The original story was written by Vijay Kumar, but it had several issues. I rewrote it entirely and brought completeness to it. I made about 40% changes, including the backgrounds of Ganesh Thakur, Aravind, and Prakash Thakur. Later, Dora Sai Teja joined the project.

What about the appreciation 'Dhandha' is receiving?
So far, Dhandha hasn't received a single negative review. Everyone is praising its fresh making style and strong content. Many are talking about the music too. Not a single person has said the entire series is bad.
