Bengal hotel fire: Death toll rises to 7, owner arrested

Kolkata.: The death toll in the hotel fire at Tarapith in West Bengal's Birbhum district on Monday rose to seven, confirmed the police, adding that the owner of the building has been arrested. Birbhum District Police Superintendent Vidit Raj Bundesh confirmed that the toll has risen and that Kalyan Paul, the owner of the hotel named 'Bideshini', has been arrested. The police are investigating whether the hotel's firefighting system was in proper condition and whether all the fire safety-related rules were followed.

7 killed in stampede at Ashok Dham temple in Bihar's Lakhisarai

Lakhisarai, Aug 17: At least seven people were killed, and more than 12 were injured in a stampede outside the Ashok Dham Temple in Bihar's Lakhisarai district on Monday. The incident triggered chaos at the temple premises as a large number of devotees had gathered to offer prayers and perform rituals on the third Monday of the holy month of Sawan. An electric wire reportedly fell, triggering panic among the crowd. Rumours then spread among the devotees, causing panic. Many devotees rushed in different directions in an attempt to escape. A stampede ensued, leaving several devotees trapped and crushed under one another.

73 lac voters deleted from Telangana electoral rolls, Hyderabad records highest

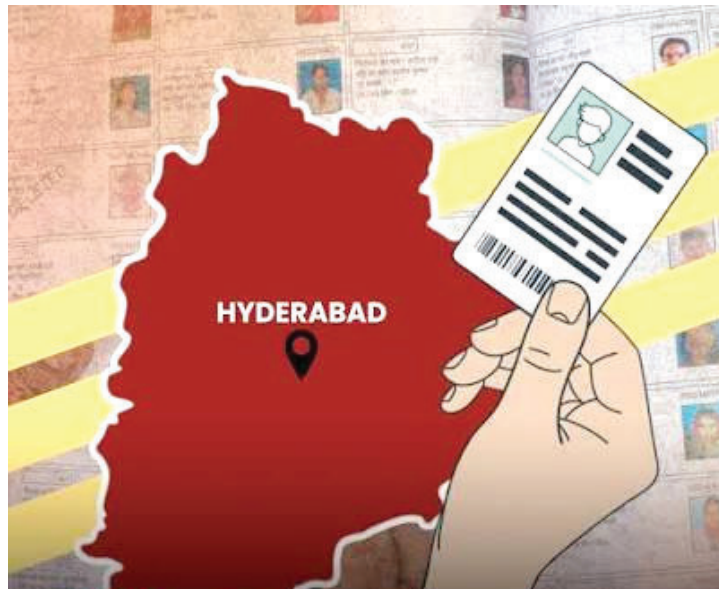
FROM THE VOTER LIST OF HYDERABAD, 19,41,444 NAMES HAVE BEEN DELETED.

Hyderabad (TSIT):

The ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls has resulted in the deletion of 73,39,235 names across Telangana, with Hyderabad recording the highest number of deletions at 19,41,444.

The deleted names have been categorised under ASDD — Absent, Shifted, Duplication and Death. In Hyderabad, 1,56,392 voters were marked deceased, 2,99,850 were untraceable, 13,45,333 had permanently shifted, 99,264 were found to be already enrolled, while 40,605 were removed for other reasons.

Among Hyderabad constituencies, Jubilee Hills recorded the highest number of deletions at 1,79,510, followed by Yakutpura with 1,54,982 and Chandrayangutta with 1,48,869. Charminar recorded the lowest number at 94,174. In percentage terms,



Musheerabad had the highest deletion rate at 45.17%, followed by Malakpet at 44.76%.

Rangareddy district recorded the second-highest number of deletions at 12,87,091, followed by Medchal-Malkajgiri with

10,71,566. Yadadri-Bhuvanagiri recorded the lowest number at 26,121.

The figures may change during the claims and objections period, as voters whose names have been left out can submit Form 6 to seek inclusion in the electoral rolls.

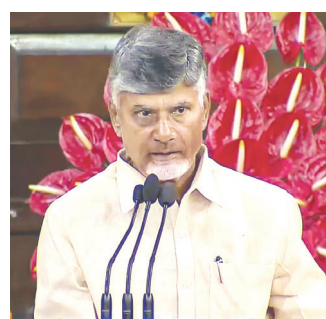
No deviation in Mega DSC recruitment process: CM Naidu

■ Recruitment details placed online; YSRCP indulging in "hit-and-run" politics, says Chief Minister

Visakhapatnam (TSIT):

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Monday asserted that there was no deviation in the Mega DSC teacher recruitment process and that all stages of the selection were conducted transparently. He accused the YSRCP of spreading misinformation through what he described as "hit-and-run" politics and challenged the Opposition to debate the issue in the Legislative Assembly. Speaking in the Assembly, Naidu said education and skill development had always been priorities for the Telugu Desam Party. He recalled various initiatives undertaken during successive TDP governments, including residential schools, women's universities, expansion of educational institutions and measures to improve academic standards.

The Chief Minister said the previous government had not undertaken teacher recruitment for five years, while the present coalition government completed the recruitment of



15,941 teachers through the Mega DSC within 148 days of assuming office.

He said the recruitment process, including the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET), DSC notifications, reservation procedures and examinations, was conducted in a transparent manner. Examinations covering 13 subjects were conducted through the Computer-Based Test (CBT) system at 154 centres, with around 42,000 questions selected as part of the examination process.

Naidu said candidates were selected strictly according to merit-cum-roster principles. Zonal and State-level commit-

tees, along with an appellate authority, were constituted to address grievances and ensure fairness in the recruitment process.

He also said the sports quota was implemented in accordance with Central Government guidelines and maintained that no deviation had occurred from the procedures specified in the recruitment notification.

The Chief Minister alleged that repeated accusations and legal cases were being used to create obstacles to the recruitment process. He criticised the Opposition for raising allegations outside the Assembly rather than participating in legislative debates.

"Come to the Assembly and debate the issue," Naidu said, challenging the YSRCP to present its concerns on the floor of the House. He maintained that the government was accountable to the people and would continue to strengthen transparency in recruitment examinations and introduce further reforms in the education sector.

UGC-NET retest: Student groups in Delhi demand NTA be scrapped

New Delhi (TSIT):

Several student organisations held protests in the national capital on Monday, August 17, against the National Testing Agency's decision to re-conduct the UGC-NET examinations for three subjects, demanding that the NTA be scrapped as its "repeated lapses" have put students' academic and career plans at risk. The protests came amid continuing criticism of the NTA over examination-related irregularities. The NTA has ordered fresh examinations for candidates who appeared for the English, Commerce and Sociology papers in June this year after an expert committee found factual, typographical, translation and language-related errors in the question papers. The All India Students' Association (AISA) held a demonstration at the NTA headquarters at Okhla Industrial Estate. It demanded the complete abolition of the testing agency, alleging that the cancellation of the three papers was yet another instance of systemic mismanagement and lack of accountability.

TN govt takes property registration fully online for first sales

Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay launched the system at the Secretariat on Monday. Under the first phase, first-sale documents for plots in layouts and first-sale flats can be registered only online.

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu has ushered in a change in property registration, making online, presence-less registration mandatory from Monday for first-sale plots and flats, aimed at cutting visits to sub-registrar offices and improving transparency.

Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay launched the system at the Secretariat on Monday. Under the first phase, first-sale documents for plots in layouts and first-sale flats can be registered only online.

The move, announced earlier by Commercial Taxes and Registration Minister D Logesh Tamilselvan, is part of the department's transition to



the STAR 3.0 ecosystem. "The move is intended to improve transparency, reduce physical interface with registration offices," Logesh said. Builders, developers and applicants can create a login on the Registration Department portal and submit documents without visiting a sub-registrar office.

Executants, claimants and witnesses have to upload Aadhaar details and complete biometric authentication through fingerprint or iris verification.

The department said registering officers will process applications within 24 hours, either registering them, returning them for correction or

rejecting them. Documents returned for rectification can be resubmitted within 30 days. Registered documents will carry the sub-registrar's digital signature and remain downloadable through the user account for 60 days. Each page will also bear a QR code containing registration details, while a dynamic five-colour endorsement and digital verification mechanism are intended to guard against forgery.

The department expects the shift to reduce footfall at registration offices. Tamilselvan estimated that online registration could cut the crowd by about 30 per cent, while saving citizens time and travel costs.

Madras HC orders magistrate inquiry into alleged police torture death in Madurai

MADURAI: The Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court on Monday ordered a magistrate inquiry into a woman's allegation that her husband was assaulted by police personnel at Chinthamani police station before his death and directed a three-member team of senior forensic doctors to conduct his post-mortem. The court also appointed an advocate commissioner to inspect whether CCTV cameras were installed at the police station and whether any cameras had been removed. The court passed the order on a petition filed by Ayyammal, wife of the deceased Paramasivam, who alleged that police personnel assaulted her husband at Chinthamani police station on July 19 after the couple went there in connection with a complaint over a dispute with their neighbours.

Integrity can help eradicate corruption at grassroots level: Bank of India

Chevella: Corruption can be eradicated at the grassroots level through ethical practices, integrity and public awareness, Bank of India (BOI) Chevella Branch Manager Raviteja said.

The Chevella branch, under the Hyderabad Zone, organised a Vigilance Awareness Seminar on Monday in accordance with Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) guidelines. The programme was held on the theme "Probity for Prosperity".

Addressing the gathering, Raviteja urged citizens to actively contribute to building a corruption-free society. Vigilance Officer Satish explained preventive vigilance measures and ways to prevent banking frauds, with a special focus on cyber safety. He cautioned the public against allowing third parties to use their bank accounts for transactions, warning that such accounts could be misused



as "mule accounts" and may lead to serious legal consequences. He also advised customers to keep banking details and OTPs confidential and remain alert to phishing emails, fraudulent websites and online scams. Local public representatives, bank customers and village residents participated in the seminar and raised questions during the interac-

tive session. Following the programme, bank officials, staff and villagers jointly conducted a Swachh Bharat cleanliness drive on local streets. The branch manager said the awareness programme was organised as part of the bank's efforts to strengthen vigilance and promote responsible banking practices in rural areas.

Rubber prices surge in Tamil Nadu to Rs 275 per kg after 15 years

CHENNAI: Rubber prices have climbed high after 15 years, at Rs 275 per kg, bringing cheer to farmers in Tamil Nadu's Kanniyakumari district, one of the major rubber-producing regions in the country.

According to a Daily Thanthi report, rubber prices had last touched a peak of Rs 255 per kg in 2010, before falling below Rs 200. The latest increase has raised hopes among farmers that prices will remain at the higher level. How much rubber is cultivated in Kanniyakumari?

Kerala and Kanniyakumari district in Tamil Nadu are among the leading rubber-producing regions in India. Rubber is cultivated across around 25,000 hectares in Kanniyakumari district.

Why have rubber prices increased?

The rise in rubber prices has been attributed to increased sales in the global automobile industry, a rise in crude oil prices due to the war and higher production costs in major rubber-producing countries, including Thailand, Malaysia and India.



Can quitting sugar sharpen your jawline? Here's what doctors say

Margao: Nearly half of Goa's adult population is overweight or obese, while diabetes and hypertension have emerged as major health concerns, according to the National Family Health Survey (NFHS-6) 2023-24. The findings point to a growing burden of lifestyle-related diseases in the coastal State, even as Goa continues to perform strongly on several maternal and child health indicators.

The survey, released by the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, found that 43.6 per cent of men and 45.1 per cent of women in Goa have a Body Mass Index (BMI) of 25 kg/m² or above, placing them in the overweight or obese category. The figures are considerably higher than the national averages of 27.3 per cent among men and 30.7 per cent among women.

The latest data also show a significant increase compared with the previous NFHS-5 survey conducted in 2019-21. At that time, 32.6 per cent of men and 36.1 per cent of women in Goa were classified as overweight or obese. The increase highlights the growing prevalence of obesity and the associated risks of cardiovascular diseases, diabetes and other non-communicable illnesses.

Diabetes-related indicators have also emerged as a serious concern. The survey found that 32.1 per cent of men and 27.5 per cent of women in Goa either had elevated blood sugar levels or were taking medication to control diabetes. These proportions are substantially higher than the national averages of 20.9 per cent among men and 17.8 per cent among women.

Goa recorded the highest prevalence of elevated blood sugar among men in the country, narrowly ahead of Kerala. Compared with the previous survey, the proportion of men with high blood sugar increased by around eight percentage points, while the corresponding figure for women rose by nearly seven percentage points. The trend underlines the need for greater focus on prevention, early diagnosis, regular screening and lifestyle modification. Hypertension was another major health concern highlighted by the survey. Around 27.5 per cent of men and 26.2 per cent of women in Goa either had elevated blood pressure or were taking medication for the condi-



tion. Both figures were higher than the respective national averages, indicating a substantial burden of high blood pressure among the State's adult population.

The survey also recorded a high prevalence of caesarean deliveries in Goa. As many as 46.2 per cent of births in the State took place through C-section procedures, compared with the national average of 27.2 per cent. The proportion was particularly high in private healthcare facilities, where 69.7 per cent of deliveries were reported to be through caesarean section.

Despite the concerns over lifestyle diseases and rising C-section rates, Goa continued to perform well on several maternal and child health indicators. Institutional deliveries remained exceptionally high at 99.6 per cent. The survey also found that 92.1 per cent of mothers underwent antenatal check-ups during the first trimester of pregnancy, indicating strong access to maternal healthcare services. Child immunisation coverage also showed improvement. Full vaccination coverage among children aged between 12

and 23 months increased to 93.8 per cent. At the same time, child nutrition indicators recorded encouraging progress. The proportion of children under five years who were stunted declined substantially, from 25.8 per cent in NFHS-5 to 19.4 per cent in NFHS-6.

The findings also point to significant demographic changes in Goa. People aged 60 years and above now account for 17.2 per cent of the State's population, compared with 14.2 per cent in the previous survey. The growing share of senior citizens reflects Goa's ageing population and is likely to increase demand for geriatric care, chronic disease management and other age-related health services.

On social indicators, the survey reported an increase in the proportion of ever-married women who reported experiencing spousal violence. The figure rose to 11.3 per cent from 8.3 per cent recorded in the previous survey, highlighting the need for continued efforts to strengthen awareness, support services and protection mechanisms for women.

At the same time, alcohol consump-

tion among men declined considerably. The proportion of men reporting alcohol use fell from 36.8 per cent in the previous survey to 22.4 per cent, indicating a notable change in consumption patterns.

Goa's total fertility rate was recorded at 1.6 children per woman, remaining below the replacement level of 2.1. The figure reflects the State's changing demographic profile, marked by lower fertility and a steadily ageing population.

Overall, the NFHS-6 findings present a mixed picture of Goa's health and social development. While the State has achieved high levels of institutional deliveries, antenatal care and child immunisation, the rapid rise in overweight and obesity, diabetes and hypertension poses a growing public health challenge. The findings underline the importance of preventive healthcare, healthier lifestyles, regular screening and stronger management of non-communicable diseases alongside continued investment in maternal, child and elderly healthcare.

EDITORIAL

GEN Z IS NOT A MOVEMENT

Madagascar saw a crowd of disillusioned citizens grow throughout the months of September and October 2025. The anger over electricity and water shortages widened into accusations of corruption, poor governance, poverty and failing public services. After weeks of protests, president Andry Rajoelina fled the country. On October 17, Colonel Michael Randrianirina swore in as the head of state. The entire magnitude of the protest was reduced to “a Gen Z uprising”. A convenient enough label to print, broadcast and turn into a headline. And, the same narrative has started taking root in India.

The recent NEET examination leak and the wider failures within the education system brought people to Jantar Mantar in New Delhi. The immediate demand was accountability over examination irregularities and the resignation of Union education minister Dharmendra Pradhan. After 35 days of an indefinite protest, Pradhan resigned, and the protest acquired a new identity: "Gen Z".

FROM DEMOGRAPHIC TO POLITICAL IDENTITY

People began showering praises and criticism on the generation for successfully demanding a response from a very mute government. Ministers, academics, singers, actors, sports personalities and every section of society that had maintained strict silence over 12 years had mustered up a social media post. An entire generation was treated as the long-awaited saviour for the masses and a threat to those in power. The successes and the pitfalls of the protest were thrust upon a made-up label. The right and the left started analysing the generation. Articles and videos began pouring in. Experts were called in to opine. And, somewhere along the way, the cause that brought people to the streets was pushed to the margins and the spectacle of the protest took centre stage. It is a curious transformation. The demand for accountability reduced simply to be an outcry of a demographic. Protesters tried to cast the politicians' attention towards the education system, but the politicians diverted their attention towards decoding Gen Z. The parliamentarians have already long been performing in the assembly for a viral 15-second Instagram reel, but after 20 July, even the prime minister became an overnight influencer. A few words have been recognised as "Gen Z lingo" and the ministers have started using them in parliamentary proceedings. Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP Bansuri Swaraj saying, "Modi ji clocked it", Congress MP Deependar Singh Hooda saying, "Vastegunahuiyan" and "kuchhu-puchhu", or Shiv Sena MP Shrikant Shinde saying "MIA", "FOMO" and "delulu", all feel like desperate attempts at youth outreach. Words that already do not possess much meaning are being recorded in government databases, and used during discussions about paper leaks, that took the lives of many. A protest about education became a conversation about Instagram reels, slang, morality, clothes and the supposedly mysterious habits of Gen Z. Was the joke new? The role of humour in a protest has been accredited to Gen Z, and the temptation to label it as such stems from forgetting how old the laughter of resistance is. Humour never belonged to one generation. Whenever power has demanded to be taken seriously, people have mocked it. Satire as a form of resistance has been utilised for centuries.

Havelis of Barwa: Living testimony to history, art and cultural heritage

Dr. Satyawan Saurabh and Dr. Priyanka Saurabh, a renowned researcher and literary couple from Barwa, have been tirelessly studying, documenting, and documenting the village's cultural heritage for the past two decades. They have attempted to connect Barwa's old mansions, murals, ponds, wells, and architectural remains with local memories and oral history. Their articles on the mansions have been used as references by several PhD researchers. Their aim has been not only to describe these historical structures but also to understand Barwa's social, cultural, and economic history through them. Their writing and documentation have contributed to elevating Barwa's heritage from local discourse to a broader literary, cultural, and research focus.) The village of Barwa in southwest Haryana transcends a simple rural settlement, becoming a living heritage site with its havelis, murals, ponds, and folk memories. Its architectural tradition reflects layers of folk art, social history, Rajasthani influences, and rural prosperity, giving it a unique place on Haryana's cultural map.

Barwa village, nestled in the dry, scorching land of south-west Haryana, is not just a rural settlement but a living document of memories, architecture, folk art and social history, preserved even today by its mansions, ponds, wells, umbrellas and murals. Located in the Siwani area of Bhiwani district, this village, with its historical buildings and painted walls, can be counted among those rare heritage settlements where the buildings are not just structures of brick and stone but become silent witnesses telling the story of time.

Barwa's most prominent landmark is its old mansions. Nearly a dozen historic mansions are considered particularly noteworthy, though



local estimates suggest even higher numbers. The mansions associated with Seth Parshuram, Seth Humukhchand, Lala Sohanlal, and Seth Lakshmeshchand hold particular architectural and mural significance. These buildings showcase the use of lakhori bricks, lime, wood, heavy and sturdy doors, carved windows, interior courtyards, and chhatris. Their architectural language reflects the shared cultural traditions of Haryana and Rajasthan.

The Thakur's Garhi, also known as Bransa Bhawan, is considered a key center of Barwa's historical identity. According to local tradition, the ancestors of Thakur Bagh Singh, belonging to the Tanwar Rajput clan, migrated from the Jeetpura region of Rajputana approximately six centuries ago and established their social roots in the region. Local accounts place the construction of the cur-

rent Garhi around 1938. According to a popular local legend, construction was initiated during a period of rainfall shortage and agricultural crisis, providing employment to the villagers. In this sense, the Garhi may have been not only a symbol of power, prosperity, and social prestige, but also a structure integral to the local economy of the time.

The fort's massive main gate, sturdy iron plates, wooden structures, large living quarters, storage spaces, and elephant stables reflect its grandeur. Despite the ravages of time, its structure still offers glimpses of Barwa's past architectural prowess and feudal lifestyle.

The true uniqueness of these mansions is reflected in the murals adorning their walls and ceilings. These paintings depict the Radha-Krishna Rasleela, Vishnu-Lakshmi, Sherawali Mata, kings and queens, horses, elephants,

chariots, soldiers, animals, birds, and numerous scenes from folk life. Some exhibit Shekhawati-style decoration, others Rajasthani and Kota influences, while others reflect Mughal and Nathdwara traditions. The blend of these styles points to the cultural exchange that occurred within the region. The paintings in Seth Parashuram's mansion are particularly noteworthy. According to local accounts, artisans were brought from Pilani to decorate it. Along with religious narratives, scenes depicting kings and queens, chariot processions, music, animals, birds, and social life are also found here. The red, yellow, blue, and green colors used in these paintings reveal the color sensibility and aesthetic sense of the artists of the time. These paintings are not merely decorative elements, but visual documents of the religious consciousness,

social structure, and cultural imagination of that era. The depiction of an elephant, a king, and a queen at the main entrance of Seth H u k u m c h a n d - L a l a Sohanlal's mansion is a particular attraction.

The elephant is depicted in a decorated state, and scenes from royal life are engraved on it. Paintings depicting Vishnu-Lakshmi, Sherawali Mata, and Radha-Krishna are also found in the mansion. These paintings reflect influences of Rajasthani, Mughal, and Kota styles. Lakshmichand's paintings at Kathare are also significant for their breadth of subject matter. They depict scenes of chariot processions, maids, horsemen, and gods and goddesses. One depicts Lord Krishna braiding Radha's hair. This scene connects religious narratives with human empathy, love, and folk beauty. The paintings

display a blend of Rajasthani and Mughal influences in the depiction of clothing, jewelry, crowns, and vehicles.

An important aspect of Barwa's pictorial language is its time-sensitivity. Not only are gods and goddesses and mythological events depicted, but scenes from the British era, including trains, postmen, soldiers, and the British era, also appear on the walls. The train's depiction includes the engine, coaches, passengers, and even a signalman. This suggests that local artists were also documenting the changing technology and social order around them through their paintings. Thus, Barwa's mural tradition also documents the dialogue between tradition and modernity.

Kesar Talab is an important center of Barwa's cultural heritage. According to local folklore, social circumstances surrounding Seth Parshuram's sister Kesar inspired the pond to be paved and made available for public use. Over time, the pond became more than just a water source, but also a part of local memory and community life. The umbrellas and painted structures surrounding the pond clearly illustrate the connection between water culture and folk life. The paintings depicting Radha-Krishna's Raasleela, musical instruments, peacocks, parrots, and other birds reflect the rich tradition of folk art.

Barwa's cultural identity has also been linked to Haryana folk cinema. According to available accounts, some scenes from the famous Haryana films "Chandrawal" and "Bairi" were filmed in the village's ponds, wells, and traditional surroundings. This reveals the visual uniqueness of Barwa's architecture and rural surroundings. Cinema also indirectly played a role in bringing this heritage to wider recognition.

Why A 'Bangladesh' Proposal By Turkish Media Should Worry India

Soon after the Mecca pact between Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, and Turkey was signed, Turkish media Yeni Safak published a piece about the prospects of Bangladesh joining the pact. Without a byline, the article took full cognisance of India's discomfort at such a proposition but insisted that it would move Bangladesh "beyond bilateral asymmetry (with India)", which would signal a "mature, independent, foreign policy". "Pakistan and Türkiye would welcome this as a natural expansion of Islamic defence cooperation, while India would recalibrate its traditional approach to its eastern neighbour". The Bangladesh Angle Now, while not too much should be read into a media piece, Yeni Safak is not just another Turkish publication. It is an Islamist one, and close to the current ruling dispensation in Turkey. One of its most defining features in recent times has been its overwhelming focus on India, highlighting some of the most insignificant events in the country that give Turkey the opportunity to ridicule it. Suffice it to say that in this pursuit, it does not spare India's leadership. Since 2024, the publication has become one of the most ardent supporters of Bangladesh's engineered uprising and is virulently anti-Hasina, only a logical extension of its anti-India stance. Given this background, Yeni Safak's article cannot be entirely dismissed as absurd. In fact, it is quite plausible that Turkey may try to get Bangladesh to join the pact, as its leaders have said that the deal is open to



other interested countries. Turkey is also trying hard to develop defence relations with Bangladesh, along the lines of its defence ties with Pakistan. And this is where India should be wary. The Mecca defence deal will be an enabler for Turkey, which is becoming an increasingly big security challenge for India. India Need Not Worry About The Saudis The pact itself need not worry India much. The greatest cohesive element in it, Saudi Arabia, has over the years developed close relations with India, which it is not about to erode, especially now. Bilateral relations between the two nations stand on their own merit. With the Saudis preparing for a post-oil economy and Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's ambitious domestic project for the Kingdom needs India. The Saudis have also committed to investing USD 100 billion in the country. At least 40 Indian companies have established headquarters in Saudi Arabia. Besides, India is one of the major Saudi energy importers, something that matters more than ever, what with the Iran conflict and now its Iranian

surrogates tightening their chokehold on the main shipping arteries for Saudi exports. Bilateral relations between India and Saudi Arabia even involve defence, with both sides regularly conducting joint military exercises. The Saudis would not want to jeopardise this crucial relationship - certainly not for Pakistan. In fact, last September, soon after the Saudi-Pakistan Mutual Defence Agreement was signed, a senior Saudi official told Reuters that the agreement was "a culmination of years of discussions". He said,

"This is not a response to specific countries or specific events ... Our relationship with India is more robust than it has ever been. We will continue to grow this relationship and seek to contribute to regional peace in whichever way we can." The Saudis did not invoke any NATO-type obligation when Pakistan began a border conflict with Afghanistan soon after the pact was signed, nor did Pakistan enter a combat role when Iran launched attacks on Saudi territory and vital infrastructure in the current Middle East con-

dict. There is also no hint of either Pakistan or Turkey starting any joint military intervention against the Houthis, who launched audacious attacks on Saudi Arabia. In fact, clarity seems to be lacking in exactly what would constitute "an attack" on one party to merit other joining in defensive roles. This much, then, can, therefore, be considered more posturing than resolve. However, defence cooperation in bankrolling defence innovation, R&D, and production, is a given. At least Turkey will make sure it is, because this is where it has an upper hand. Turkey Has The Biggest Win Turkey's military industrial complex is a formidable one and has been supported by Europe for decades now. The country's defence doctrine is anchored in pursuing a policy that will help it achieve autonomy in defence requirements and, subsequently, become a global defence exporter. But the Turkish economy is struggling, with inflation, price rise, and a plummeting lira. The Mecca pact is, therefore, a lifeline for Turkey in more ways than one. First, it opens up avenues for increasing the export of Turkish-manufactured weaponry to both Saudi Arabia and Pakistan, ensuring cash inflows to its economy. Second, it will open up access to Saudi resources and investments for Turkish defence manufacturing and critical infrastructure. This will shape a new alternative to Western aid, primarily US arms supplies. In this context, the development of TAI KAAN fighter jets is of particular significance.

4,800 Indians Removed, 51,000 ICE Arrests: What's Happening In Trump's America?

Last week, Venkata Vasamsetty, a long-term US green card holder, was arrested by the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), three months after a judge dismissed efforts to remove her from the country. Vasamsetty, who's been lawful permanent resident in the US since 2013, hasn't committed any crime, as is the case with most victims of ICE. The agency wants to remove her because she stayed in India for a few months in 2022 to visit her ailing father, and later contracted Covid. ICE accuses her of abandoning her permanent residency, a charge she denies. Two weeks earlier, the agency arrested another US resident, Pritesh Walia, a jazz musician. He has now been released on bond. Vasamsetty is also hoping to be freed on bond. But this is not the end of their troubles. The threat of deportation remains. Vasamsetty and Walia are among the growing number of Indians affected by ICE's operations, part of US President Donald Trump's immigration crackdown. The US has deported more than 4,800 Indian nationals since Trump took office. As many as 1,273 have been deported already in the first half of this year, and 3,567 were sent back last year, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). Last year's figures were the highest in 16 years, but this year's total could be even more. Nationally, ICE arrested 51,000 people in July, a new monthly record. Trump has set



record of 2,000 arrests a day. According to Markwayne Mullin, Secretary of US Homeland Security, ICE made an average of 4,200 arrests in the first week of August. So, many more Indians could be arrested and deported in the rest of this year. Indians Are The Most Targeted Group. Although the largest number of arrests and deportations by the US involve nationals of Latin American and Caribbean countries, Indians now top such lists among Asians, according to Stop AAPI Hate, an American NGO that tracks and analyses data on Asian and Pacific Island nations and campaigns against ICE. Between January 2025 and March 2026, almost 28% of the 14,402 Asians arrested were Indians. During the same period, 6,218 Asians were deported; Indians again occupied the top spot, with a 28% share of removals. Stop AAPI Hate told this author that in their analysis of the latest data, which they have not

yet released, they found that "Indian people remain the most targeted by ICE, with the highest number of arrests, detentions, and deportations out of all A/Pis (Asian and Pacific Islanders)". Indians are the third-largest foreign-born group in the United States, after Mexicans and Chinese, and there have been numerous cases of immigration and ID fraud involving them. Earlier this month, US authorities filed a case to revoke the American citizenship of India-born Harinder Singh after it was found that he had used a false identity and concealed his earlier immigration history. However, the growing targeting of Indians by US immigration officials is not due to a surge in such cases. "A broader trend we also see is that the growth of the Indian population in the US, as well as the growing prominence of Indian leaders in politics, business, etc., has spurred a hateful backlash that is being further fuelled by bigoted poli-

cies and rhetoric under the Trump administration," says Stop AAPI Hate. How ICE Became Trump's Most Feared Arm ICE was formed as part of the US Homeland Security Act of 2002, a response to the 9/11 attacks in 2001. But the agency has never been as controversial as it has been since Trump began his second term as president 18 months ago. Mass deportation was Trump's main election promise, and his administration has granted ICE unprecedented powers and near-immunity to carry out immigration crackdowns and deportations. ICE agents can stop, detain, and arrest people they suspect of being in the US illegally, which is a civil offence. But since last year, they have frequently been accused of overstepping their powers and acting as if they were pursuing hardened criminals. ICE officers have kidnapped people, broken into cars to arrest suspects, and deported people even in violation of court orders.



Stock markets decline in early trade amid rising crude oil prices

Mumbai: Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty drifted lower in early trade on Monday, August 17, amid rising crude oil prices and persistent geopolitical tensions in West Asia. The 30-share BSE Sensex declined 284.85 points to 77,717.05 during initial trading. The 50-share NSE Nifty dipped 69.25 points to 24,297.05. From the Sensex pack, Infosys, Tata Consultancy Services, HCL Tech, Tech Mahindra, Hindustan Unilever and State Bank of India were the biggest laggards. Bharat Electronics and Titan were the only winners. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, traded 0.43 per cent higher at USD 88.86 per barrel. "Crude oil remains the principal concern, with Brent holding near USD 88 a barrel after renewed US warnings against Iran pushed prices higher on Friday, keeping the geopolitical risk premium firmly embedded in energy



markets," Hariselman Radhakrishnan, Founder & CEO of HST Wealth, a research analyst firm, said. In Asian markets, Japan's Nikkei 225, Shanghai's SSE Composite index and Hong Kong's Hang Seng index traded higher. US markets ended lower on Friday. "Indian equity markets are expected to remain range-bound with a cautious bias as persistent geopolitical tensions in the Middle East continue to restrain risk

appetite," Ponnudi R, CEO of Enrich Money, an online trading and wealth-tech firm, said. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth Rs 508.12 crore on Friday, according to exchange data. On Friday, the Sensex was down 70.71 points, or 0.09 per cent, to settle at 78,009.25. The Nifty dipped 29.85 points, or 0.12 per cent, to end at 24,366. The 30-share BSE Sensex declined 284.85 points to 77,717.05 during initial trading.

Jio Reintroduces Rs 299 Prime Membership Plan After Airtel Rejig



Reliance Jio has reintroduced its Rs 299 Prime membership plan, days after Bharti Airtel discontinued its popular Rs 299 prepaid offering and raised the entry price of its unlimited plans to Rs 349. Jio said the Rs 299 Prime membership will remain available to existing prepaid and postpaid customers, with the price guaranteed until Sept. 5, 2027. The membership will also provide subscribers with dedicated priority customer support. The move comes as telecom operators continue to rationalise their prepaid portfolios and seek to improve average revenue per user (ARPU). Airtel's decision to withdraw its Rs 299 base plan, which offered 1GB of daily data for 28 days, effectively lifted the entry-level unlimited plan price by 16.7% to Rs 349. The new plan also offers 1.5GB of

data per day. Analysts at Centrum Broking described Airtel's latest changes as one of its biggest single-day prepaid portfolio cleanups in recent years, calling it part of a broader tariff rationalisation exercise. Several less-popular plans across 56-day and 90-day validity periods were also discontinued. Jio's decision to retain the Rs 299 price point could help it position the membership as a value proposition as the industry moves toward higher tariffs. The company's move also comes against the backdrop of stronger subscriber monetisation across the sector. Notably, Airtel had reported an 11.5% sequential rise in consolidated net profit to Rs 8,167 crore for the June quarter, while revenue from operations increased 5.7% to Rs 58,539 crore.

Vedanta Power Reaffirms Commitment to India's Energy Security on Independence Day

Airtel Payments Bank on Monday announced a leadership transition, with Shabnam Sinha, who brings more than three decades of experience across development finance and financial services, including a stint with the World Bank, set to succeed Sunil Bharti Mittal as chairperson from Oct. 1, 2026, subject to Reserve Bank of India approval. Mittal will step down as non-executive chairman and leave the bank's board effective Sept. 30, bringing an end to his tenure that began in April 2016. Sinha, currently an independent director on the bank's board, will serve as chairperson for a three-year term. During Mittal's tenure, Airtel Payments Bank expanded its presence across consumer and enterprise banking and emerged

as India's largest payments bank by revenue, according to the company. The bank now has more than 121 million monthly active users and nearly 30 million bank account customers. Its banking network spans more than 500,000 banking points across the country, reaching three out of four villages, the company said. Airtel Payments Bank has also positioned itself as India's second-largest mobile bank and UPI Autopay player. Sinha currently chairs the board's Special Committee for Monitoring Frauds and is a member of its Risk Management and IT Committees. PAYTM BLOCK DEAL:

Resilient Asset Management To Sell Up To Rs 4,900-Crore Stake; Floor Price Fixed

Paytm shares will be in focus on Tuesday as Resilient Asset Management is set to sell a stake of up to 5% in One97 Communications, the parent company of Paytm, through block deals, according to sources. The proposed stake sale is expected to be worth up to Rs 4,900 crore, with the transaction set to take place on Tuesday. The floor price for the block deal has been fixed at Rs 1,535 per share, representing a 3% discount to Paytm's current market price. The base deal size comprises around 19.2 million shares, while an additional 12.4 million shares could be sold through a greenshoe option. The overall transaction could therefore cover up to 5% of Paytm's equity. Goldman Sachs is acting as the banker for the transaction. The proposed sale comes after a strong run in Paytm shares, with investors



closely watching the company's shareholder structure and potential changes in promoter-linked holdings. Resilient Asset Management held a 10.2% stake in Paytm as of the quarter ended June, according to the shareholding data. Resilient had acquired a 10.2% stake in Paytm from Antfin in 2023 against optionally convertible debentures, or OCDs. The proposed transaction could significantly reduce Resilient's holding if the

full 5% stake is sold. Paytm Q1 Results The parent company of Paytm reported a 8.1% jump in its consolidated revenue for the first quarter of fiscal 2026-27 to Rs 2,448 crore sequentially, compared to Rs 2,264 crore, according to an exchange filing. The firm's net profit saw a 20% increase to Rs 220 quarter-on-quarter from Rs 184 crore. Its earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation (Ebitda) increased by 54% to Rs

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203, compared to the previous quarter's Rs 132 crore. The Ebitda margin expanded to 8.3% from 5.8% in the quarter prior. The company has clocked a profit for the fifth straight quarter. Paytm Share Price Today Paytm shares closed 1.42% lower at Rs 1,580.20 per share on Monday. FERRARI'S FIRST EVER ELECTRIC CAR SOLD FOR RECORD \$40M



Ferrari's first ever electric car has fetched \$40m (£29.5m) in a charity sale, setting a record for a new vehicle sold at auction. The sale of the Ferrari Luce - brainchild of the British iPhone designer Sir Jony Ive - raised more than 35 times the usual price of the car at the event at RM Sotheby's in California. The Luce faced a backlash when it was launched in May. Some commentators said it strayed from the marque's traditional designs and lost part of the brand's identity by being battery-powered and having five seats. Sotheby's said all proceeds of the sale will be donated to the Ferrari Foundation's educational programmes.

Sotheby's did not name the buyer of the custom Luce which features a unique finish and bespoke parts. The BBC has contacted the auction house and Ferrari for comment. The unveiling of the Luce was seen as one of the biggest launches of a new car in recent years. It marked the prancing horse's first entry into the electric vehicle (EV) market - a sector dominated by Elon Musk's Tesla and China's carmakers. Italian President Sergio Mattarella and Pope Leo were invited to view the luxury brand's new vehicle. But Ferrari's share price dropped the day after the Luce's launch, following backlash over the car. Among those criticising



the car were Italy's deputy prime minister Matteo Salvini and former Ferrari chairman Luca Cordero di Montezemolo, who said the car was "risking the destruction of a legend". Ferrari's chief design officer Flavio Manzoni said in an interview in May that critics are part of the innovation process and that he believed people would come to appreciate the Luce. The company has not disclosed its target for Luce sales but, according to a Financial Times report, it has hit this year's goal thanks to strong demand from China. Sotheby's said in a statement that the auctioned vehicle marked an "unbeatable opportunity" to own the first production car

of the Luce. The car has special wheels, customised brakes and a white finish. The charity sale marks a "tangible expression of innovation, responsibility, and long-term vision for future generations," Sotheby's said. Ferraris often attract some of the highest prices at car auctions. A bespoke Ferrari Daytona SP3 supercar raised \$26m for the carmaker's education initiatives at an auction in 2025. At the time it set an auction record for the highest-price paid for a new car. The current record for the highest price paid at auction was an ultra-rare 1955 Mercedes-Benz 300 SLR Uhlenhaut Coupé, which was sold for \$142m in 2022.

Trump envoy Kushner meets Netanyahu after Hamas talks on peace plan



A meeting between Donald Trump's Middle East envoy Jared Kushner and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has ended, the premier's spokesperson has told the BBC. Kushner arrived in Israel on Sunday night after holding rare talks with Hamas to discuss the implementation of the US-backed Gaza peace plan. Last week, Israel rejected Trump's 15-point plan for peace, which also calls for Israeli troops to withdraw and for Gaza to be rebuilt under a new civilian Palestinian administration. The rejection came after the president's Board of Peace said it had reached an agreement for the "complete disarmament" of Hamas and other armed groups in Gaza last month. Trump leads the Board of Peace, which was created as an international organisation originally intended to bring peace to Gaza, but later expanded to include conflicts worldwide. According to Israeli media reports, Board of Peace envoys Nickolay Mladenov and Tony Blair are also meeting Netanyahu on Monday, with the aim of

advancing Trump's plan. In a phone interview with Fox News on Monday, Trump is reported to have said that Hamas "are giving up their guns" and that Israel should not be carrying out strikes in Gaza. The US outlet did not elaborate further on his comments. Many Israelis remain sceptical that Hamas is ready to disarm. The US-led Board of Peace wants to show that the peace plan for Gaza can still move forward - despite Netanyahu's firm rejection of a new roadmap. Hamas has agreed to give up its weapons in exchange for a phased Israeli troop withdrawal. But Israel has insisted that Hamas must fully disarm before any Israeli pullout. It also wants any weapons that Hamas gives up to be destroyed, rather than stored by a Palestinian technocratic committee, so that Hamas cannot reclaim them. In addition, there is opposition to Turkey and Qatar being involved in checks on whether Hamas is meeting its requirements under the deal. Pushing Netanyahu to change his position will be an uphill struggle.

Trump says US to reduce military drills with South Korea after it stayed out of Iran war

President Donald Trump has said the US will "substantially reduce" joint military exercises with South Korea, citing his "very good relationship" with North Korea's leader Kim Jong Un. He also noted on Truth Social that South Korea had recently declined to join the US in the "denuclearisation" of Iran. "These exercises are not only costly, with much of these costs paid for by the United States of America (as usual), but send a signal that is totally inappropriate and hostile," Trump posted. Seoul said it was reviewing Trump's comments, adding it hoped a favourable relationship between Washington and Pyongyang could lead to meaningful talks. Pyongyang has not yet commented. Earlier, South Korea said the drills with



the US would proceed "as scheduled". It comes after North Korea this month conducted ballistic missile tests banned by the United Nations. Trump said in his social media post on Sunday that it was "too late to cancel", as the US and South Korea were due to start their annual military exercises on Monday. He added: "While somewhat unrelated (?), I recently asked the

presidential Blue House said it would continue diplomatic consultations on US-Korea military cooperation related to the Strait of Hormuz, while discussing details on joint military drills with the United States. Experts suggest the walking back of joint military exercises could carry a high cost with relatively little benefit. "US-South Korea combined defence exercises are essential for military forces to be ready and capable of doing their jobs," said Leif-Eric Easley, a professor at Ewha University in Seoul. "Scaling them back can damage alliance coordination, slow the process of South Korea taking on greater responsibility for its own defence, and weaken deterrence against possible conflicts in Asia.

Two dead and hundreds evacuated after twin fires break out on Greek island



Two people died and hundreds were evacuated after two fires broke out "almost simultaneously" on a Greek island near Athens on Sunday afternoon, officials said. About 200 firefighters were deployed to keep the twin fires from converging on the island of Salamina, which was under a high wildfire risk on Sunday. The first blaze was reported at 14:40 local time (11:40 GMT) near the island's south coast and spread rapidly due to high winds, followed by a separate fire some 20 minutes later in the east. Their cause is not yet known. One of the fires had been brought under control and evacuations completed by Sunday evening, Greek media report, with 500 people having left the island by sea. The first blaze broke out in a forested residential area in Peristeria, a southern city on the island, fire official Vasilios Vathrakoyannis said in a statement. Firefighters attending the blaze found two bodies at the scene, he said. The city's mayor told Greek media they were believed to have been a couple. Officials continued to battle scattered blazes there late on Sunday, while the second fire which began in the eastern town of Selinia was said to have "no active front". Two coast guard vessels and a fire department vessel will remain in the area for surveillance and assistance. At least 10 other people suffered burns or showed "symptoms of smoke

inhalation", five of whom had been taken for treatment locally, Greek Health Minister Adonis Georgiades said on X. A number of aircraft and 50 fire engines, assisted by water tankers and construction machinery, were deployed to try and tackle the two fires. Salamina Deputy Mayor Thodoris Zannis earlier said this was to keep the fires from burning over a mountain on the island and meeting to form a single blaze. Five patrol boats and several other private vessels were sent to the area for assistance. Salamina sits just west of Athens and has some 37,000 residents, many of them elderly. Firefighters across Europe have been facing a series of wildfires this weekend, including officers in Belgium spending a third day beating back flames in the country's largest nature reserve, Hautes Fagnes. The wildfire - described as the largest in the country's recent history - has more than doubled in size in 24 hours. Meanwhile, at least one person died and dozens were injured in a wildfire that tore through Croatia's coastline overnight on Friday. It was described by Croatia's fire chief Slavko Tukacovic as "one of the worst" blazes in the country's history and saw around 1,200 residents and tourists evacuated. The EU's climate monitoring service, Copernicus, has confirmed that western Europe experienced its hottest June-to-July period on record.

Top Zambian opposition figures arrested days after presidential vote

Security forces in Zambia have seized weapons and arrested 11 people, including senior opposition figures, allegedly involved in an insurrection plot, the government has said. The leading opposition candidate in last Thursday's presidential election, Brian Mundubile, was also found at the scene of the raid in the capital, Lusaka, according to the country's top civil servant Patrick Kangwa. In an interview with the BBC, Mundubile dismissed the accusations as "total fabrications", alleging security forces staged an assassination attempt on his life during a raid at his home on Friday. With results from more than half of the constituencies announced, he is trailing incumbent Hakainde Hichilema. Hichilema, who is running for a second five-year term, has 62% of the votes. Mundubile, one of 13 challengers, has 36%. But the 55-year-old opposition leader had earlier claimed victory and alleged, without sharing the evidence, that there had been voting irregularities.



Giving details about the raid, Kangwa said the individuals arrested were connected to "military plans involving foreign nationals and illegal military training camps". He added that they posed "a serious threat to state security" and held "high-grade military weapons", ammunition and other materials intended for use in an armed insurrection. He alleged that shots were fired at law enforcement officers leading to an exchange of fire. Mundubile however told the BBC that there was no militia at his home. "It's unfortunate that senior government officials would present themselves before the entire nation to make such

falsehoods," he told BBC Focus on Africa. According to Kangwa, among those arrested were Patrick Mwansa, the husband of Tasila Lungu, the daughter of former Zambian President Edgar Lungu, and other politicians. The suspects are being held in custody at various police stations in Lusaka. Mundubile described the raid to the BBC saying armed personnel knocked down the gate with an armoured vehicle, broke doors and windows and opened fire. "They were basically shooting indiscriminately. They directed two shots towards me. Like I've always said, it was just by God's grace that I survived.

"So they came in to kill us," he said. Mundubile said former minister Mutotwe Kafwaya was shot while he and his wife were present. He said Kafwaya, whose whereabouts remain unknown, was bleeding and he urged the officers to take him to hospital. Mundubile said his family remains traumatised. "My children saw their uncle... bleeding profusely and being dragged like an animal... 80 soldiers coming into the house, shooting indiscriminately and breaking doors and windows down is not an experience anybody would want to go through." He said he and his family had not returned home since Friday and felt unsafe. On the day following the election, he maintained that his campaign's parallel vote tabulation showed him in the lead and repeated allegations of irregularities, without providing detailed evidence. The authorities denied the claims of vote rigging and in preliminary statements observers described election day as largely peaceful and orderly.

MOVIE THAT WENT VIRAL FOR TERRIBLE ANIMATION BECOMES CHINA BOX OFFICE HIT



It's so bad, it's become a box office hit. Niu Lai, a low-budget animation film about a cow in a dream sequence has seen a huge jump in ticket sales after going viral for its confusing plot and terrible graphics. It grossed just 7,705 yuan (\$1,140, £343) in the first 10 days after its release, but has now made more than 11.4 million yuan, according to movie tracking site Mao Yan. That means it is holding ground against Hollywood blockbusters like The Odyssey and Spider Man: Brand New Day. "You may regret for 80 minutes if you watch it, but if you don't, you'll regret it for life," one popular social media post about the film said. Other

social media users have hailed the movie as the antidote to the AI slop that is taking over social media algorithms. They are sharing clips praising Niu Lai's "hand-crafted" method - a reference to the poor animation quality - as "proof" that its creators did not use AI. "That's some serious craftsmanship," a Weibo user wrote. Another social media user called it "pure handmade" and the biggest "dark horse" of the summer movie season. Others say they are rooting for the movie because they desperately hope for a "bullish" stock market - a reference to the fact that the words "bull" and "cow" share the same character in Chinese.

Ebola outbreak in DR Congo becomes deadliest in its history

The Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo is now the deadliest in its history, according to public health officials. A total of 2,325 people have been killed by the virus since it was declared on 15 May, surpassing the death toll of the country's 2018-2020 outbreak. The outbreak was already the fastest growing on record, UN humanitarian chief Tom Fletcher said last week, warning that "the epidemic is killing someone every 30 minutes". There is currently no approved vaccine available for the Bundibugyo species that has caused the current epidemic but several are in development, including one based on technology used to develop the AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine. DR Congo's Institute of Public Health on



Sunday said it had recorded 4,945 confirmed cases, including 101 in the previous 24 hours. Comparatively few cases have been identified outside the country: as of 12 August, 20 cases were confirmed in neighbouring Uganda, while two people were treated in Germany and one case was declared in France. However, the pace of the virus's transmission in

DR Congo, where it has spread to six of 26 provinces, has been described as "exceptional" by the World Health Organization. According to Reuters, it took close to five months for the world's deadliest outbreak of 2014-2016 in West Africa to reach 1,000 fatalities. The current outbreak reached 2,000 deaths in three months, though researchers say it may have

been spreading undetected since February. The outbreak is the 17th to have emerged in DR Congo since Ebola was discovered 50 years ago. Years of conflict and a highly mobile population have added to the country's challenges in controlling the spread of the disease. The WHO has said it hopes to reverse the spread of the disease within three months but warned that this meant bringing transmission under control and not ending the outbreak entirely. Ebola is a rare but deadly viral disease and the Bundibugyo species is even rarer, with only two known prior outbreaks. Symptoms of Ebola, which are similar to the flu or malaria, include fever, headache and tiredness, and can begin suddenly within two to 21 days of infection.

AYUSH SHETTY: INDIA'S BADMINTON STAR WHO STUNNED WORLD NO. 1 SHI YUQI AT BWF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

India's 21-year-old badminton star Ayush Shetty stunned defending champion and World No. 1 Shi Yuqi of China 21-14, 13-21, 21-19 in the BWF World Championships 2026 Round of 64 clash. The youngster, who hails from Karkala in Karnataka, looked in sensational form as he came up with brilliant smashes and terrific defence to pull off a stunning win in front of the home crowd in New Delhi. This was his first-ever win over Shi Yuqi after three successive losses, including a straight-game loss in the final of the Asia Badminton Championships earlier this year. Ayush was off to a flying start with a 21-14 win in the first game and although he dropped the second game, the youngster did not give up. He fought back brilliantly and was able to finish the match in style. Who is Ayush Shetty? Shetty found himself in the headlines earlier this year after he became the first Indian men's singles player to



reach the Badminton Asia Championships final in 61 years. While he was defeated by Shi Yuqi in the final, he pulled off a brilliant win over Kunlavut Vitidsarn in the semi-final. It was a result that truly announced his arrival on the global stage. He comes from the small town of Sanoor near Karkala in Karnataka and was introduced to badminton at the age of 8 by his father, who coached him in their backyard. The family later relocated to Bengaluru in order to provide proper training to Shetty and under the guid-

ance of coaches at the Prakash Padukone Badminton Academy, he honed his skills. Shetty's breakthrough came in 2025 when he won the US Open title after beating Brian Yang in straight games. It was his maiden BWF World Tour title. He followed it up with wins over top-10 players like Li Shi Feng and Chi Yu Jen at the Asia Championships. Earlier, he won the bronze medal at the 2023 World Junior Championships in Spokane, USA, won the Denmark Junior International in 2021.

Formula E To Match Formula 1 In Speed? Co-Founder Says Gen4 "Will Be Very Close"

Formula E is entering its Gen4 era with a clear ambition to close the performance gap with Formula One, with championship co-founder Alberto Longo believing the all-electric series could be running at near-F1 pace on several circuits by the end of the next four-season cycle. Formula E bid farewell to its Gen3 cars at the London E-Prix on Sunday, and CEO Jeff Dodds believes its rapid evolution could eventually see electric racing outpace Formula One. "What is fascinating in Formula E is to see the steps. Because every two-three years, we have a step in technology which is so big that it's even difficult to compare to the previous generation," Longo said. "It was difficult to compare Gen3 to Gen2. It will be very difficult to compare Gen3 to Gen4. Because we speak to another level in terms of racing level, technology." The Gen4 cars are expected to reach around 335 kmph, with lap times improving by six to 10 seconds at circuits through increased downforce, powertrain development and new tyres. Longo expects the performance gap with Formula One to



narrow substantially during Gen4's four-season cycle. "By the time we end Gen4, in the fourth season of Gen4, we will be very close to times of Formula 1 in many tracks," he said. CEO Dodds, who has worked in the Formula One ecosystem and describes himself as an F1 fan, believes Formula E's progress should not be measured simply by its proximity to the established championship. Formula E is only 12 years old, compared to F1's 76-year history, Dodds pointed out, and said the

younger championship had experienced "hyper-growth" while developing a fundamentally different proposition. "We don't need Formula 1 to fail for us to be successful or vice versa. We absolutely think there is room for both organisations to continue being incredibly successful," he said. Dodds believes Formula E's technological trajectory could eventually give it a performance advantage over combustion-powered racing. "We already accelerate much faster than a Formula 1 car. We are at

the infancy of the technology here at Formula E. The combustion engine's been around for 130 years, so that's been iterated to within an inch of its life," he said. "So over the next four, five, six, seven years, we are going to get to a point where the technology in Formula E can outpace a Formula 1 car. No question about that." At the heart of Formula E's argument is efficiency. Dodds said the most efficient F1 combustion engine operates at roughly 55 per cent efficiency, while Gen4 technology is expected to be in the region of 97-98 per cent. That, he argued, explains the absence of the traditional engine roar associated with motorsport. "When people say to me, it would be great if these cars sounded noisier, like a Formula 1 car. What you're asking me is to make a car sound like the past. To make it sound less efficient, less performant, less technologically innovative," Dodds said. "We're going to make our cars sound like this car. Our children... are likely to only exist driving a hybrid or an electric car. This needs to be a sound that they associate, not what my father associates with."

High On Confidence, Indian Women's Hockey Team Eyes World Cup Win Over South Africa

High on confidence after holding Olympic silver medallists and world No. 4 China to a draw, India will look to strengthen their bid for a top-two finish in Pool D when they face South Africa in their second Women's Hockey World Cup match on Tuesday. India, ranked ninth in the world, produced a disciplined display to secure a 2-2 draw against a fancied Chinese side in their tournament opener. The result has given them a valuable point and put them in a good position to qualify for the second round. England currently lead Pool D following their 4-0 win over South Africa, with China and India next in the standings, while South Africa are fourth. For the semifinal race the top two teams from each pool will be divided into two groups (E and F) of four teams each. Each team will play matches against the opponents they did not face in the first round. A team's result in the first round against the progressing team from its pool will



be carried forward in second round. It means that India and China will not play each other if they reach the second round and their one point each from the draw will be carried forward. For India, Tuesday's game is, therefore, an opportunity to put themselves firmly in control of their qualification hopes. A win over 18th-ranked South Africa would not only boost their chances of finishing

in the top two but also provide momentum ahead of their final pool game. "We don't have to worry about the other teams' positions, but we need to maintain this momentum in the upcoming matches while avoiding complacency," coach Sjoerd Marijne said after the China game. India showed plenty of promise in their opening match. Dragflicker Deepika converted a penalty

corner and also earned another, while World Cup debutants Sunelita Toppo, Ishika and Shilpi Dabas displayed composure well beyond their experience. Navneet Kaur, who was named Player of the Tournament at the World Cup Qualifiers, has also carried her impressive form into the tournament and will be one of India's key attacking threats. However, Marijne knows there is room for improvement, particularly in possession and ball retention. India controlled the opening quarter and went into half-time with a 2-1 lead, but their intensity dropped after the break. They sat deeper in the third quarter, allowing China to take control and eventually find the equaliser. "We scored a penalty corner and a field goal, but I'm not happy with the third quarter. We need to work on ball possession and ball retention. The team must have felt relieved after the draw in the first match," Marijne said.

ONE DECISION, JUST TWO RUNS: SHUBMAN GILL, GAUTAM GAMBHIR'S GALLE STRATEGY UNDER FIRE

India finished the second day of the first Test against Sri Lanka at Galle on 460/9. It was expected that India would declare at the overnight score to gain the maximum advantage of bowling in the first hour of the morning session. However, the Indian team management took a surprising call as they sent overnight unbeaten batters Kuldeep Yadav and Prasidh Krishna to start the proceedings. The move was a defensive one, and former India player Dodda Ganesh raised an important question. "Why would you bat on the third day morning with two tailenders? #SLvIND," Ganesh wrote on X. India were bowled out for 462 in their first innings on the third day of the opening Test

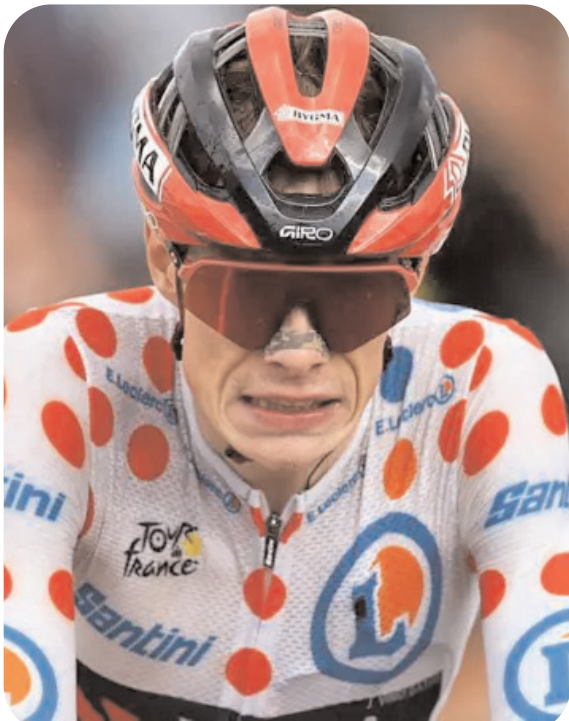


against Sri Lanka on Monday. Devdutt Padikkal top-scored for India with a mammoth knock of 167 that ended on Sunday. Resuming their innings at 460/9, India managed to add just two runs before the final wicket fell, with Asitha Fernando dismissing Prasidh Krishna. For Sri Lanka, Prabath Jayasuriya was the pick of

the bowlers, finishing with figures of 4/109. Keshara Nuwantha claimed 3/175, while Fernando took 2/63. India's total was built around Padikkal's outstanding knock of 167, which anchored their first-innings effort. On the second day of the Test, the first two sessions were washed out due to incessant rain.

Vingegaard out for rest of season with Tour injury

Two-time Tour de France winner Jonas Vingegaard will miss the rest of season as he continues his recovery from a broken collarbone sustained in this year's race. On stage 15, the 29-year-old Visma-lease a Bike rider was tackling a tight right-hand bend off a roundabout when his front wheel slid out, causing him to land on his shoulder. The injury required surgery and ruled the Dane out of challenging for a third Tour victory, with Tadej Pogacar going on to win a record equalling fifth yellow jersey. Vingegaard will be absent from September's UCI Road World Championships in Montreal, Canada, when Pogacar will go for a third straight world title.



Ricky Ponting Shows The Mirror To Australia After 'Embarrassing' Bangladesh Defeat

Former Australia captain Ricky Ponting has called for a change in the Test team after their recent loss to Bangladesh in Darwin on Sunday. Australia's batting has been facing growing scrutiny recently, and it all compounded when the Aussies were catapulted in their own backyard despite being at full strength as Bangladesh scripted a nine-wicket victory. Ponting advocated for injecting youngsters into the batting order and believed that there was enough evidence for a change. "This ends up being a very embarrassing defeat. I think it's inevitable they have to make a change. I was on the record at the end of last summer thinking that this was the ideal time to start to regenerate this team because of the performances from some of the



players," Ponting told Channel 7. Ponting stated that he would be the last one to call for a change, but looking at the performance, he thinks it is inevitable. "Look, I'm the last one I want to make change. As a captain or as a player, I wanted to keep the group together. It has to get to a bad point before I start saying you ought to leave somebody out. But there had been enough evidence for me

coming here to suggest that they weren't going to lose anything or much at all by starting that regeneration, by maybe bringing in another opener, by maybe bringing in someone at No.3. I think that that has to happen," he added. Meanwhile, former Australia bowler Trent Copeland emphasised that losing a Test to Bangladesh in Australia is 'unacceptable. "The players themselves will be, I'm sure, distraught with how this has gone," he told SEN. "I also think there is an element of them not sitting in this like the world is over either, but this is a completely unacceptable Test match result for Australia. When you are in your own conditions, I don't care about the preparation, I don't care who's playing for Australia even.

Aryna Sabalenka Squeezes Out A Win On Sixth Match Point In Cincinnati



Top seed Aryna Sabalenka fought through 62, 76 (7/2) against Talia Gibson on Sunday to join two other elites in the third round of the ATP-WTA Cincinnati Masters. The world number one needed six match points, Australia's Gibson saving five in the 12th game of the second set before Sabalenka managed a final winner to get the job done in just under two hours on a windswept Grandstand Court. "I'm super tired, this is crazy weather," the Belarusian said. "Talia played great tennis and was more aggressive in the second set. She put more pressure on my service games. I'm glad I stayed calm and pulled it out in straight sets." Sabalenka, who won the Cincinnati trophy in 2024, is looking for a solid build-up to the US Open, where she'll be seeking her first Grand Slam title of the year. She's won three titles in 2026, but none since Miami in March. She joined a pair of reigning Grand Slam champions in advancing, with Australian Open winner

Elena Rybakina and Roland Garros titleholder Mirra Andreeva also reaching the third round. Second seed Rybakina, coming off a runner-up finish to Iga Swiatek in Toronto, defeated Taylor Townsend 6-3, 6-4. Andreeva crushed Oleksandra Oliynykova with the loss of just one game, breaking five times and saving all seven break points against her own serve in a 65-minute 6-1, 6-0 rout. Rybakina said that she is concentrating on recovery after a tough Toronto run and was glad to get off to a low-stress start. "Today I'm happy with the serve," she said. "Definitely it helped me a lot. Last week in Toronto was very difficult. A lot of three set matches." Seventh seed Swiatek, the defending champion who bagged her first title of a rocky season in Toronto, hammered Emiliana Arango of Colombia 6-3, 6-0. Swiatek went down an early break but recovered quickly to prevail in 71 minutes over the player who ousted Venus Williams in the first round.

MAKHACHEV SECURES RECORD-SETTING WIN AGAINST MACHADO GARRY

Islam Makhachev (29-1 MMA) has successfully defended his UFC welterweight championship, defeating Ireland's Ian Machado Garry (17-2 MMA) via unanimous decision (49-46, 49-46, 48-47) while also setting an impressive record in the main event of UFC 330 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. With the victory on Saturday night, Russia's Makhachev etched his name in the UFC record books, extending his winning streak to 17 consecutive fights and surpassing UFC Hall of Famer Anderson Silva's historic 16-fight mark set from 2006 to

2013. Makhachev dictated the tempo throughout the 25-minute championship tilt, neutralising the challenger with suffocating top control and chain wrestling while mixing in dynamic striking, including a damaging second-round head kick. Machado Garry, bidding to become only the second undisputed UFC champion hailing from Ireland, stayed diligent in defensive scrambles on the mat to survive danger but could not mount enough offence to sway the judges' scorecards. "I have nothing but respect for Islam. ... He

?won. I have no complaints, no excuses," Machado Garry said inside the Octagon after the decision. "It's always hard," Makhachev said of grinding out the victory against the challenger in the championship rounds. In the co-main event, UFC women's strawweight champion Mackenzie Dern (17-5 MMA) successfully defended her title for the first time, using dominant grappling and relentless submission threats to defeat Canada's Gillian Robertson (17-9 MMA) via unanimous decision (49-46, 49-46, 48-47). Dern, a Phoenix native who

fights out of Southern California, controlled the pace on the mat across 25 minutes, constantly threatening ?transitions and clinching attacks against her fellow Brazilian jiu-jitsu standout. Dern's most dangerous moment came in the opening frame, nearly securing a buzzer-beating rear-naked choke just before the horn sounded. While Dern had voiced confidence throughout fight week that she would finish Robertson inside the distance, the champion was pleased with her complete five-round performance.
