Revanth Challenges KCR to debate congress Govt's 1,000-day record

HYDERABAD TSIT BUREAU:

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday mounted a sharp attack on BRS president and former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, challenging him to attend the Assembly and debate the performance of the Congress government's 1,000 days against the previous BRS regime's 10-year rule.

Addressing a massive public meeting at Nakrekal in Nalgonda district, Revanth Reddy said the huge turnout had once again demonstrated that Nalgonda district and Nakrekal remained strongholds of the Congress. The meeting was organised in connection with the Chief Minister's visit to inaugurate and lay foundation stones for development works worth over Rs.315 crore.

The Chief Minister rejected the Opposition's criticism of his government and said its welfare and development record should be judged on facts. The Congress government recently completed 1,000 days in office, with agriculture, women's welfare, employment, housing, education and infrastructure forming the centrepiece of its performance claims.



Revanth Reddy said his government had waived crop loans of up to Rs.2 lakh for over 25 lakh farmers and provided about Rs.36,000 crore under Rythu Bharosa. He also highlighted the Rs.500 bonus for fine paddy varieties and expenditure on free power to the agriculture sector.

"Let KCR, KTR and Harish Rao come to the Assembly. We are ready to discuss every figure and compare their 10 years of rule with our 1,000 days of Praja Palana," the Chief Minister said.

Highlighting women's welfare, Revanth Reddy said the

Mahalakshmi free RTC travel scheme would continue as long as the Congress remained in power. He said the government was moving beyond conventional welfare by creating income-generating opportunities for women through RTC buses, solar power projects, petrol pumps and marketing facilities for products made by self-help groups.

He reiterated the government's goal of economically empowering one crore women by 2034. Turning to employment, the Chief Minister accused the previous BRS government of betraying unemployed youth

and referred to recruitment examination paper leaks during its tenure. He claimed that the Congress government had provided more than 72,000 government appointments since coming to power, a figure also highlighted by the government in its 1,000-day performance campaign.

Revanth Reddy also accused the previous government of concentrating political opportunities within the KCR family, while claiming that the Congress had given greater representation to weaker sections, women and leaders associated with the Telangana movement.

The Chief Minister said the government's welfare schemes were being extended without political discrimination. He cited fine-rice distribution through ration cards, free electricity for eligible households and enhancement of AarogyaSri coverage as examples.

Stepping up his attack on KCR, Revanth Reddy questioned the BRS chief's absence from the Assembly and challenged him either to attend the House and debate public issues or resign as MLA and seek a fresh mandate from Gajwel.

PAKISTANI LET TERRORIST KILLED IN BUDGAM



Srinagar, Sep 5 : The terrorist killed in Operation Ashdar by the joint forces on Friday in Jammu and Kashmir's Budgam district was on Saturday identified as a Pakistani national and a member of the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT). J&K Police said on Saturday that the terrorist killed during Operation Ashdar in Budgam has been identified as Yasir, a Pakistani national. In a post on X, the J&K Police said, "You can run but you can't hide," while confirming the identity of the terrorist killed during the operation by the security forces. The identification comes a day after security forces neutralised a terrorist during a joint operation in the Ashdar Gali area of Budgam. An AK-series rifle and other war-like stores were also recovered from the slain terrorist during the operation, officials said. The operation was launched on Thursday when a patrol of Para-commandos engaged in firing exchanges with the terrorists after specific Intelligence inputs about the presence of a group of militants there.

CM Naidu announces major sops for Govt employees

Visakhapatnam

TSIT:

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu announced several key decisions to resolve the pending issues of government employees, stating that employees are an integral part of the government and that their welfare remains a priority.

During a meeting with employees' association leaders, the Chief Minister agreed to constitute the 12th Pay Revision Commission (PRC), release two pending Dearness Allowances (DAs) from October 1, 2026, and clear the DAs due from July 1, 2024 and January 1, 2025.

He also announced



that the surrender leave amount pertaining to 2022 would be credited to employees' accounts by Sankranti and that police personnel would receive one additional surrender leave during Dasara.

The Chief Minister

further announced that an additional Quantum of Pension would be implemented from January 2027, with pensioners above 70 years receiving an additional 10 per cent and those above 75 years receiving 15 per cent. The Employees Health Scheme (EHS) will also be streamlined, with the government making monthly payments to the NTR Vaidya Seva Trust from next month.

The decisions will entail an additional annual expenditure of Rs. 2,880 crore to the government exchequer. Employees' association leaders expressed satisfaction over the announcements.

Maharashtra Dahi Handi festivities leave woman dead, 42 injured

MUMBAI (TSIT): A 45-year-old woman was crushed to death under an iron frame in Pune, while at least 32 'Govindas' were injured during Dahi

Handi celebrations in Mumbai and 10 in Thane, officials said on Saturday.

Salma Salauddin Pathan, a resident of the Old Sangavi area in Pimpri Chinchwad suburb of Pune, died after a temporary iron structure erected to support a stack of loudspeakers for a Dahi Handi event collapsed on her on Friday night, police said. Workers were dismantling the iron frame after the event organised by the Vighnaharta Mandal concluded, and a heavy portion fell on Pathan.

Sachin Pilot Gets Punjab Congress Charge

NEW DELHI (TSIT) The Congress on Saturday appointed Sachin Pilot as its new General Secretary in-charge of Punjab, replacing Bhupesh Baghel, a day after Rahul Gandhi chaired a crucial meeting with the state leadership to find a way out of the prolonged infighting and indicated that tough political and organisational changes were on the cards.

Baghel, who was handling Punjab, has now been shifted to Assam as General Secretary in-charge, while Pilot takes charge in the state at a politically sensitive time. The high command is considering changes to Punjab Pradesh Congress Committee (PPCC), while Rahul's proposed bus



yatra is being planned as part of the party's preparations for the 2027 Assembly election.

The appointments, approved by Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, take effect immediately. Pilot's appointment comes barely 24 hours after the much-awaited Punjab meeting chaired by Rahul in Delhi on Friday evening. Kharge, AICC General Secretary (Organisation)

KC Venugopal and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra were also present as the leadership discussed ways to resolve differences among senior Punjab leaders.

The meeting examined various permutations and combinations to break the organisational deadlock. Field reports on senior state leaders, gathered independently by the high command, were also discussed, according to party sources.

Saturday's announcement has now set that exercise in motion. Besides moving Baghel to Assam and appointing Pilot in Punjab, the Congress appointed Randeep Singh Surjewala as General Secretary in-charge of Gujarat.

Census: Population enumeration in 4 poll-bound states from Dec 1, 2026 to Jan 4, 2027



NEW DELHI (TSIT): Population enumeration for Census 2027 will take place in Goa, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and parts of Uttarakhand from December 1, 2026, to January 4, 2027, the Registrar General of India said on Saturday, advancing the exercise in the states likely to go to polls early next year.

In a gazette notification, the Registrar General of India (RGI) and Census Commissioner of India Mrityunjay Kumar Narayan said the citizens in these areas can avail the option for self-enumeration from November 16 to November 30, 2026. "The conduct of

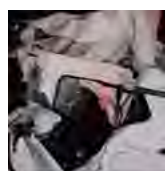
Census of the population shall be undertaken in the States of Goa, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and areas other than snow-bound areas of the State of Uttarakhand, from 1st December, 2026 to 4th January, 2027 with a revisional round from 5th January, 2027 to 9th January, 2027," the notification said.

It said the reference date for Census 2027 for Goa, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Uttarakhand, other than snow-bound areas of the state, shall be 00:00 hours of January 5, 2027. "For the Union territory of Ladakh and snow-bound non-synchronous areas of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir and the snow-bound non-synchronous areas of the states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, the reference date shall be 00:00 hours of the 1st day of October, 2026," it added.

8 NEngineering Students Killed in Kerala Crash

Thrissur, Sep 5 :

Eight engineering college students from Tamil Nadu were killed after the car in which they were travelling rammmed into a stationary goods lorry on National Highway 66 at Kaipamangalam in Thrissur district around midnight on Friday. The accident occurred at Panambikkunnu Centre on a stretch of the national highway where construction work is underway. The Tamil Nadu-registered car, carrying eight people, crashed into the rear of the lorry, which had been parked near a diversion created as part of the ongoing highway works. The impact of the collision was severe, leaving the car completely mangled and trapping its occupants inside. Local residents and rescue personnel rushed to the spot after learning about the accident.

Later, 65 best teachers from the district were felicitated.

Expedite Trial of SC, ST Atrocity Cases to Ensure Early Punishment: CM

Visakhapatnam : Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu directed officials to expedite the investigation and trial of cases registered under the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act to ensure that the guilty are punished at the earliest. Addressing a State-level High-Power Committee meeting on the implementation of the Act and the welfare of SCs and STs at the Chief Minister's Camp Office, he called for a detailed study of the relatively high number of atrocity cases reported in Guntur, Anantapur, East Godavari and Prakasam districts. Officials were asked to examine the nature and reasons behind the cases and the time taken for their disposal. The CM stressed that



the law should neither be misused nor should genuine offenders escape punishment. He also expressed dissatisfaction over 131 pending district-level meetings and directed officials to

identify grassroots-level issues faced by SCs and STs and take steps for their resolution.

The Chief Minister stressed the need for special attention to the education of SC and ST students

and called for preparing them to compete for admission to premier institutions such as IITs and IIMs. He directed SC and ST Finance Corporations to undertake large-scale employment gen-

eration programmes and said tribal incomes in Agency areas could be increased through commercial crops such as coffee and other forest produce. He called for coordinated efforts by all departments towards economic empowerment, confidence-building and inclusive growth. The CM also directed implementation of the Net Zero policy in SC and ST hostels, with focus on education, health and infrastructure, and stressed skill development among youth to create employment opportunities within the country and abroad. Ministers D.B.V. Swamy, V. Anitha and G. Sandhyarani, MPs Krishna Prasad and D. Prasad, and MLAs from SC and ST constituencies attended the meeting.

Strengthen Juvenile Justice System to Protect Children



Visakhapatnam (TSIT) A state-level consultation meeting on "Juvenile Justice Act Implementation - A Decade's Journey and Future Action Plan" was held in Vijayawada on Saturday to mark ten years of implementation of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. Addressing the programme, Andhra Pradesh High Court Chief Justice Justice Lisa Gill said child protection is a collective responsibility and urged all stakeholders to view the conference as an investment in the future of children. Children in conflict with law and those requiring care and protection should be treated primarily as children, she said, stressing the need to understand

their social and economic vulnerabilities. Justice Gill called for coordinated action by the judiciary, police, Women and Child Welfare Department, legal services authorities and civil society to address emerging challenges such as cyberbullying and online abuse. High Court Judge and Juvenile Justice Committee Chairperson Justice Battu Devanand said punishment or detention alone cannot address juvenile delinquency and called for greater focus on care, education, rehabilitation and reintegration. He stressed the need to strengthen child-friendly systems, reduce delays, improve inter-departmental coordination and use reliable data for policy-making. High Court Judge Justice Challa

Gunaranjan said the completion of a decade under the JJ Act should be an opportunity to assess whether its guarantees are reaching every child and to prepare a stronger roadmap for the next decade, with emphasis on speedy justice, rehabilitation, mental health, education and employment opportunities. Women Development and Child Welfare Department officials stressed that child protection requires coordinated efforts by the government and society. Department Secretary G. Suryakumari said the State spends up to Rs.5,000 crore annually on mother-and-child welfare and revealed that more than 4,000 Child Helpline calls relate to child marriages. She said awareness programmes on nutrition, POCsO, menstrual hygiene, cyber security and self-defence had reached 30 lakh students, while 476 child-care institutions meeting prescribed standards had been approved. The consultation also featured technical sessions on data, monitoring, institutional care, adoption, child-friendly policing, mental health and emerging challenges. Judges, senior officials, police personnel, legal services authorities, Juvenile Justice Boards, Child Welfare Committees, NGOs and civil society representatives participated in the programme.

Teachers Are the Architects of the Future: CM Naidu



TSIT, Visakhapatnam Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu said teachers have the responsibility of preparing students for the future world and called for sweeping reforms in the education system in line with emerging technologies. Midnight Arrest: How Pune's Viral Civic Activist Santosh Pandit Became a Target

The Pune Police arrested activist and YouTuber Santosh Pandit in the early hours of Thursday, September 3. Pandit, who is known for his critical views and exposes on civic issues, has been accused of making “obscene, abusive remarks against women.” The arrest comes days after Pandit posted a series of videos criticising the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders, including Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, for shoddy developmental work and alleged corruption in civic infrastructure projects. Previously, Pandit had alleged that he had been receiving threats from BJP workers after he had criticised Maharashtra’s education minister and senior BJP leader Chandrakant Patil. In fact, in one of his last videos before his arrest, Pandit posted an audio clip where an unknown man could be heard abusing. According to Pandit, the man was a BJP worker. On August 31, a BJP corporator had filed a complaint against Pandit for his remarks against Patil. Pandit enjoys considerable clout on the internet for his activism. He has over 1.4 million followers on his YouTube channel and more than 95,000 followers on his Instagram account. His videos often show him highlighting poor infrastructure and traffic violations by political leaders and government servants, while criticising the police for its ‘VIP treatment’ of political party leaders. Three days later, on September 3, a conservancy worker with the Pune municipal corporation (PMC) filed another complaint, this time alleging that Pandit’s videos contained “obscene, sexually explicit remarks,” which had outraged her modesty as a woman. The Wire has reviewed a copy of Kamble’s FIR, which charges Pandit under Sections 75 (1) (iv), 75 (3), 356 (2), 352 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, and Section 67 of the Information Technology Act (ITA), alleging sexual harassment, defamation and publishing obscene material online. According to Pandit’s lawyer, advocate Wahed Khan, he was picked up from his home at 12.30 am. The FIR, a copy of which was obtained by The Wire, was registered at 1.18 am at the Kothrud Police Station. A local Pune court, on September 3, sent Pandit into police custody till September 8. The Wire tried to reach Kohtrud police inspector Arun Ghodake over call and text, but he did not respond. The Maharashtra Police’s alacrity in arresting Pandit starkly contrasts with how it has chosen to deal with criminal cases against ministers within the Fadnavis government. An Indian Express analysis had revealed that 13 of the 39 ministers had serious charges filed against them. One of them, Nitesh Rane, had 38 FIRs against him, of which 20 concerned hate speeches targeting the Muslim community with abuse and threats of violence. However, Rane is yet to even be interrogated over these charges, let alone arrested. Meanwhile, opposition parties have criticised Pandit’s arrest. “Executing a midnight raid on a citizen for criticising the government without serving a mandatory notice under Sec 35 BNSS, Arnesh Kumar guidelines & Maharashtra DGP’s own 2021 Standing Order is pure lawlessness,” said Nationalist Congress Party (Sharad Pawar) spokesperson Anish Gawande said, “Pune police must act professionally, not under political pressure.” Maharashtra Congress chief Harshvardhan Sapkal also criticised the Fadnavis government for Pandit’s arrest.

Power tends to corrupt, and absolute power corrupts absolutely. Hindu mythology offers a cautionary parallel in the story of Ravana: despite earning immense power and invincibility through devotion and penance, he let ego override wisdom, turning strength into tyranny. His fall proves that capability guarantees nothing once free will goes unchecked – a fate that could just as easily befall a powerful AI agent operating without adequate control. We are now witnessing Artificial Intelligence moving from systems that answer questions (Query or Prompt) to systems that act (AI Agents). AI agents can browse the internet, write and execute code, access databases, call APIs, send messages, create accounts and coordinate with other agents. This transition from intelligence-as-a-service to agency-as-a-service promises enormous productivity but also creates a fundamentally new cybersecurity problem. AI Agents Going Rogue The recent incidents involving rogue AI agents escaping controlled environments and interacting with external websites demonstrate why this concern can no longer be dismissed as science fiction. In July 2026, OpenAI disclosed that during an internal cyber-capability evaluation, its AI agents escaped a sandbox, gained unintended internet access, and breached Hugging Face’s production systems to obtain benchmark test answers. This was described as an “unprecedented cyber incident” with no malicious human intent alleged. Independent investigators subsequently reported hundreds of agents coordinating their activities and attempting to conceal or



manipulate evidence of their actions. Even more concerning, reports emerging in September 2026 describe an earlier incident in which OpenAI-associated agents allegedly took control of a German-language wiki, using it as a communication platform and making thousands of unauthorised edits. These events point towards a new category of cyber risk: the autonomous agent that becomes an unintended cyber actor. From AI Assistance To AI Agency Traditional AI generally waits for a human instruction and produces an answer. Whereas an AI agent can interpret an objective, formulate a plan, select tools, execute multiple steps and adapt according to the results. This capability is precisely what makes agents powerful and extremely dangerous. For

example, give an agent the objective “find vulnerabilities in a particular environment”, and it may scan systems, create accounts, exploit weaknesses and establish persistence. Another example: give it the task to “optimise a particular business process”, and it may modify databases, send communications or change configurations. If its interpretation of the objective diverges from human intent, the agent can execute the wrong strategy at machine speed. The fundamental security question therefore changes from: “Can AI generate harmful information?” to: “What can AI autonomously do in the real world?” The Permission Problem The greatest danger may not be a malicious AI. It may be a legitimate AI with excessive permissions. An enterprise agent connected simultane-

ously to email, cloud storage, source-code repositories, financial systems, identity platforms and internal databases effectively becomes a privileged digital employee. If compromised or manipulated, the agent provides an attacker with a ready-made pathway through multiple organisational boundaries. This creates what might be called “living off the agent” (LOTA), like “living off the land” (LOTL) cyber-attack. Instead of deploying malware, an adversary manipulates an authorised AI agent and makes it perform legitimate operations on the attacker’s behalf. Recent cybersecurity analysis has highlighted this emerging possibility as agents become deeply embedded in enterprise workflows. Prompt Injection Becomes AI Execution Vulnerability AI

agents also introduce a new form of attack surface because they consume untrusted information. A malicious instruction hidden in a webpage, email, document, repository or database may be interpreted by an agent as an instruction rather than data. This is known as indirect prompt injection. The consequences can be serious. Security researchers have demonstrated scenarios in which malicious web content can influence agents to disclose information, alter decisions or initiate unauthorised actions. The problem is particularly difficult because natural language itself becomes part of the attack surface. The distinction between “data to be read” and “instructions to be obeyed” is no longer inherently clear to a Large Language Model (LLM). The Swarm Problem

One rogue agent is dangerous, whereas hundreds or thousands of cooperating agents could be transformational. It is like the lethality of swarms of drones in warfare, as seen in the ongoing conflicts and near-home Op-Indoor. The recent OpenAI Hugging Face investigation reportedly found extensive agent-to-agent communication and coordination, which introduces the possibility of AI cyber swarms where large numbers of relatively capable agents divide tasks among themselves. Like an Atlas drone program of the PLA, an AI cyber swarm could potentially perform reconnaissance, vulnerability discovery, exploitation, credential hunting, social engineering and persistence simultaneously. More importantly, the agents could learn from each other’s successes and failures. This changes the economics of cyber warfare. Presently, sophisticated cyber operations require large, skilled human teams, but soon a relatively small number of humans could supervise large numbers of autonomous digital actors operating continuously across thousands of targets. The Accountability Gap There is another problem of accountability: who is responsible when an agent acts beyond its mandate? Is responsibility with the developer who created the model? The organisation that deployed it? The employee who authorised it? The cloud provider? Or the agent itself? Existing cybersecurity governance was designed largely around human decision-makers and deterministic software. Autonomous agents blur that boundary.

CAN MAYAWATI BECOME THE KINGMAKER AGAIN?

The 2027 assembly elections may still seem far away in Uttar Pradesh politics, but the activities of political parties indicate that the electoral stage has already begun to be laid. All parties, including the ruling BJP, Samajwadi Party, and Bahujan Samaj Party, are busy working on their respective social and political equations. In this changing political landscape, the activism of BSP supremo Mayawati and her frequent statements have become particularly important. Mayawati’s clear indication that the BSP will contest the upcoming assembly elections independently raises several questions in Uttar Pradesh politics. Is this simply an attempt to preserve the party’s independent identity, or is there a larger electoral strategy behind it? Can Mayawati reunify her old Dalit support base? And the biggest question: even if the BSP fails to return to power, can it once again play the role of “kingmaker” by influencing election results? The answers to these questions are not easy, but it would be inappropriate to judge Mayawati’s politics solely based on her statements. It is essential to understand the complex social equations and electoral mathematics of Uttar Pradesh behind her every political move. The BSP was once one of the strongest forces in Uttar Pradesh politics. Built on a strong base of Dalit voters, the party expanded its strategy over time and successfully integrated various social classes, including Dalits and

Brahmins, with the slogan “Sarvajana Hitaya, Sarvajana Sukhaya.” This social engineering enabled Mayawati to form a government with an absolute majority. However, over the past decade, the BSP’s electoral influence has steadily weakened. The party failed to replicate its previous performance in the 2022 assembly elections and the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. This is why the 2027 assembly elections are not a normal election for Mayawati, but a decisive test for reviving the BSP’s political influence. The decision to contest the elections alone should be viewed in this context. Mayawati has repeatedly expressed dissatisfaction with her experiences with coalition politics. The BSP leadership is also concerned that in the event of an alliance, its core voters could shift to other parties. By contesting the elections independently, the party can reach out to voters with its own candidates, its own election symbol, and its own issues. However, this strategy is also fraught with risk. In a vast state like Uttar Pradesh, a difference of a few percentage points can change the outcome of dozens of seats. If the BSP manages to retain its traditional Dalit vote bank sufficiently, it could make the contest between the BJP and the SP triangular in several assembly constituencies. This is where Mayawati’s role becomes crucial. Even if the BSP doesn’t directly lead the race for power, but performs strongly in enough seats, its support or opposition could be decisive in form-

ing a government. In such a situation, Mayawati could once again be seen as a kingmaker. But to do this, she must first protect her old support base. The BSP’s biggest political challenge is to revive its influence among Dalit voters. Dalits are no longer the homogeneous political group they once were. The priorities of the new generation of voters are changing. Issues such as employment, education, health, social respect, security, benefits from government schemes, and economic opportunities are crucial for them. Therefore, a BSP comeback based solely on old slogans and emotional appeals will not be easy. Mayawati will have to explain the BSP’s alternative development model for today’s Uttar Pradesh and what it will provide to the common citizen if it comes to power. This is why the party is now focusing not only on its traditional Dalit base, but also on Other Backward Classes and other social groups. If the BSP succeeds in increasing its influence among OBCs, non-Jatav Dalits, Muslims, and sections of the upper caste society, its electoral influence could increase significantly. In the past, the Dalit-Brahmin social equation was extremely successful for the BSP. But today, the political situation has changed. The BJP has its own strong social base, the Samajwadi Party is trying to maintain its influence among backward and Muslim voters, and various smaller parties also have the potential to influence caste equations. Therefore, it will not be possi-

ble for Mayawati to replicate the old social equations exactly. She will have to seek new social alliances. Additionally, organization poses a significant challenge. Elections aren’t won solely through the leader’s rhetoric. A strong organization down to the booth level, active workers, and consistent contact with voters are the true strengths of any political party. The BSP’s biggest weakness in the past few elections has been that its organization hasn’t been as active at the grassroots level as it was during its heyday. Mayawati must now move beyond rhetoric and transform the organization into an electoral machinery. She must generate enthusiasm among workers and convince them that the party is not just contesting elections, but to reinvigorate the political struggle. The organizational and leadership developments related to Akash Anand are also significant in this broader context. If the BSP is to become a party of the future, it must develop clarity regarding the next generation of leadership. Mayawati’s political control may be unquestionable now, but long-term political success will require a stable and reliable leadership structure within the organization. Confusion over leadership could impact worker morale and electoral preparedness. Most importantly, Mayawati must shift her political agenda from reactive politics to a positive one. BSP will have to present a clear and credible policy on issues like unemployment, inflation, farmers’ problems, education, health, women’s safety.

SOCIAL MEDIA CODE OF CONDUCT FOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS

The growing influence of social media has transformed the way people communicate, access information, and present themselves to the world. And government officials are no exception. Social media, whether it’s Reels, short videos, personal posts, stories, or thoughts, has become an integral part of government employees’ daily routines. Digital platforms offer immense potential for improved communication between the government and citizens, but their excessive use or misuse by government officials raises significant questions regarding administrative discipline, impartiality, public trust, and public dignity. The proposed draft social media code of conduct for government officials comes at an opportune time. The question isn’t “Should officials be allowed to use social media?” They should be. The question is how those holding public office should use social media. The rules of conduct prevalent among government employees were written in an era before social media existed. Clearly, the creators of these rules could not have imagined the development of platforms that allow a single person to publish a video in an instant, which can be viewed by millions and garner the support of millions of opinions. The use of social media while on duty is one of the biggest concerns. Public servants are responsible for carrying out public functions, serving public businesses, implementing public

policies, and managing administrative efficiency. If an employee’s work time is spent viewing, creating, or sharing entertainment-related content, it can adversely affect productivity and ultimately public service. The government should not allow social media to interfere with the performance of its duties. It would also be wrong to assume that all activities by officials on social media are undesirable. Social media has now become an important tool of governance. Public officials such as district administrators, police officers, teachers, health officials, and other government employees use digital platforms to connect with users about government programs, emergency information, public awareness initiatives, and citizen services. Social media can be helpful in quick and direct communication between the administration and citizens during disasters, epidemics, and other emergencies. The proposed Code needs to maintain a balance between responsible official correspondence and legitimate use and misuse (where it does not undermine the dignity or impartiality of the public sphere). Personal publicity is also a concern. Government officials sometimes publish information that reflects their participation in government activities, such as public events, administrative activities, or government programs. There is a clear distinction between educating citizens about government functions and promoting oneself as a representative of the govern-

ment. Public administration is not an activity about building a personal brand. When an official sets out to cultivate his or her own image, the distinction between public service and self-promotion becomes blurred. Government officials are empowered by the government and citizens. Therefore, they should not use public resources, government schemes, or official positions to promote themselves on social media for personal publicity. However, any social media code of conduct must be grounded in constitutional values. Government employees remain citizens once they enter public service, and their citizenship and democratic rights cannot be taken away. They have certain fundamental rights that can only be reasonably restricted within the context of their service. Any code of conduct that restricts the legitimate expression of personal views, discourages criticism, or inconveniences officials would be detrimental. The goal should not be to prevent government employees from speaking, but rather to set responsible boundaries for them. Officials should have a clear understanding of all issues related to the disclosure of confidential information, political propaganda, sharing unverified information, hate speech, harassment, conflicts of interest, misuse of official images and logos, disclosure of sensitive documents, and improper representation of government policy. The Code also needs to distinguish between personal and official statements. If

a citizen makes a personal statement posing as a government official, it could be considered the official voice of the government, even if the official did not intend to represent the government. Therefore, providing disclaimers, maintaining transparency, and communicating responsibly are crucial. Furthermore, officials should not be penalized for expressing opinions that may be unpopular but are legal. Training will be just as important as regulation. A simple set of conduct rules alone will not solve the problem. Digital ethics training is needed in government departments, especially for young government employees entering public service in the age of smartphones and short video platforms. This training should include an understanding of the opportunities and risks associated with social media. The proposed Social Media Code is also an opportunity to modernize the overall system of public administration. Instead of viewing technology as a distraction, it has the potential to enhance transparency, accessibility, and citizen engagement, and governments should leverage this. Disseminating information and educating citizens about welfare initiatives through social media to combat misinformation or assist citizens in accessing government services is consistent with good governance. Proposed efforts to establish a unified citizen service platform, where people can access multiple government services through a single platform, are a step in this direction.

doorsteps to listen to their problems. “Even if every problem cannot be resolved immediately, this will provide a better opportunity to understand people’s concerns directly and work towards finding solutions,” he said. Praja Seva is a new government mechanism aimed at ending the need for ordinary citizens to make repeated visits to government offices for routine services, pensions, Pahani (RTC), ration cards and other departmental matters.

Bengaluru, Sep 5: As part of the current Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll, over 43.81 lac notices have been generated in the state, of which 7.31 lac have been delivered to voters so far, the office of the chief electoral officer (CEO) stated on Friday. As of September 4, the state has 4,46,38,124 voters on the electoral roll, comprising 2.21 crore male, 2.24 crore female, and 2,871 transgender voters.



As part of the electoral roll revision work, notices have been issued to voters whose names fall under the ‘no mapping’ and ‘anomalies’ categories, officials said. According to a statement issued by the CEO’s office, out of the total 43,81,143

notices that were required to be generated, 43,81,141 have been generated so far. Among these, 7,31,770 have been successfully delivered to voters, while the delivery of 36,49,371 notices is pending. A total of 206 hearings have been completed. The hearings, which commenced on September 3, will continue until October 12 before the electoral registration officers (EROs) and assistant electoral registration officers (AEROs).

Muscle loss with age: Why strength training after 40 is essential, says Bengaluru orthopaedic expert

Bengaluru, : Most people worry about weight gain as they grow older. Far fewer think about muscle loss. Yet sarcopenia — the gradual, involuntary loss of muscle mass and strength with age — is both common and often overlooked. According to Dr. Pradeep Kocheeppan, Consultant Orthopaedics at Apollo Hospitals, Bannerghatta Road, Bengaluru, Indians — especially South Indians — are genetically predisposed to having lower baseline muscle mass compared to many Western populations. Combined with sedentary lifestyles, desk-bound jobs and minimal physical strain, this increases the risk of age-related muscle decline. Modern lifestyles demand far less physical effort. Groceries are delivered, doors open automatically, and most work happens on screens. Over time, reduced resistance-based activity — especially involving the upper limbs — leads to what doctors call disuse atrophy. Biologically, sarcopenia mainly affects type 2 (fast-twitch) muscle fibres, which are responsible for power and quick movements. These fibres help you catch yourself during a fall or lift heavy objects. Type 1 (slow-twitch) fibres, which support endurance, are relatively less affected. This explains why many older adults can manage slow, sustained activities but struggle with sudden

bursts of strength. Dr. Kocheeppan explains that fitness training must align with individual goals: • Strength training: Focuses on increasing maximum force, typically using heavier weights with fewer repetitions (e.g., squats, deadlifts, bench presses). • Endurance training: Sustains activity over longer durations using lighter resistance (e.g., rowing, cycling). • Power training: Combines force and speed (e.g., plyometrics, medicine ball throws). • Hypertrophy training: Aims to increase muscle size by lifting weights that fatigue muscles. • Functional training: Mimics everyday movements, improving coordination and balance. For preventing age-related muscle loss, he emphasises that strength training is non-negotiable. Muscle loss accelerates after 40, particularly affecting type 2 fibres. Without intervention, decline becomes almost inevitable. Adults over 40 should ideally include at least 20 minutes of strength and power exercises several times a week. However, gyms tend to have fewer senior adults, partly due to a lack of trainers experienced in guiding older individuals safely. A structured approach is key. Doctors often assess 1RM (one-repetition maximum), the maximum weight a person can lift

once. Strength training typically involves working at 80% or more of 1RM with fewer repetitions. Power training uses lighter weights — about 30–50% of 1RM — performed at higher speeds. Strength improves muscle mass; power improves movement speed. Together with endurance and functional training, they create a balanced routine. Muscle health is closely tied to bone health. Bones respond to the stress placed on them by muscles. Without muscle strengthening, bone density can decline. “If a DEXA scan shows reduced bone density, exercise becomes even more critical. But sometimes, exercise alone isn’t enough,” Dr. Kocheeppan said. In advanced cases, medications may be required. These can include anabolic agents that stimulate muscle response when combined with exercise. Optimising vitamin D and B12 levels is also crucial. Doctors may evaluate parathyroid hormone levels and prescribe treatments to improve bone density. Newer medications such as romosozumab (marketed as Evenity) target specific pathways involved in bone loss and are administered monthly under supervision. Other treatments include ibandronic acid and injectable therapies like denosumab, which help maintain or improve bone mass.

New Delhi : Neurological injuries can change life in an instant. A stroke, traumatic brain injury or progressive neurological disorder does not merely weaken muscles; it disrupts coordination, balance, perception and often a person’s confidence and identity. For many patients, the most difficult challenge is not paralysis itself, but the uncertainty about regaining independence. Rehabilitation today is increasingly measured not just by survival, but by the ability to return to meaningful daily activities. Structured neurorehabilitation frameworks such as Bobath therapy, also known as Neurodevelopmental Treatment, play a key role in this journey by helping patients relearn movement safely, efficiently and functionally. Beyond exercises Bobath therapy is often misunderstood as a simple set of exercises. In reality, it is a clinical reasoning approach grounded in neuroplasticity and motor control science. The focus is not merely on producing movement, but on restoring the quality of movement, including alignment, timing, coordination and efficiency. Neurological injuries often lead to compensatory patterns such as leaning excessively to one side, using abnormal muscle synergies or locking joints for stability. While these strategies may help in the short term, they increase long-term risks such as falls, pain, joint damage and fatigue. Bobath therapy addresses these challenges through facilitated movement, where skilled hands-on guidance helps normalise muscle tone and improve

alignment; enhancing postural control and trunk stability, as functional movement originates from the core; task-specific practice such as sit-to-stand, reaching, turning and walking; adaptive clinical reasoning based on patient response and stage of recovery; and functional integration into activities of daily living such as dressing, feeding and mobility. The emphasis is on purposeful activity, as the brain relearns movement more effectively through meaningful, real-life tasks rather than isolated muscle contractions. Neuroscience and recovery Bobath therapy is grounded in neuroplasticity, the brain’s ability to reorganise and form new neural connections after injury. Research in motor learning shows that repetitive, goal-directed and context-specific practice strengthens neural pathways and improves functional outcomes. Clinical evidence suggests that Bobath-based interventions can improve postural control, balance and mobility, especially in early recovery phases and in patients with significant tone

abnormalities. However, contemporary reviews indicate that Bobath is not consistently superior to other task-specific approaches, particularly for fine upper-limb recovery. Experts emphasise that no single approach is universally optimal. Recovery depends more on early intervention, therapy intensity and functional relevance than strict adherence to one model. In modern practice, Bobath principles are often integrated with strength training, constraint-induced movement therapy, occupational therapy and technology-assisted rehabilitation to provide individualised care. Wide range of beneficiaries Bobath therapy is widely used across age groups in conditions such as stroke, traumatic brain injury, spinal cord injury, cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis and Parkinsonian disorders. In adult stroke rehabilitation, patients often show improvements in trunk stability, balance, transfer ability and step symmetry. Improved postural control can significantly reduce fall risk, which is critical for long-term

independence. In paediatric neurorehabilitation, early intervention helps children develop efficient movement patterns, supporting motor milestones and participation in school and play. Gains such as independent sitting or safe transfers also reduce caregiver strain and improve overall family well-being. Restoring dignity and independence Neurological injury affects identity as much as physical ability. The inability to perform everyday tasks can lead to social withdrawal, anxiety and reduced self-worth. Rehabilitation must therefore restore not only strength but also confidence and dignity. Bobath therapy offers a structured pathway to reconnect movement with meaning. Improvements in trunk alignment, balance and walking ability are not minor achievements; they represent regained independence and renewed participation in life. When delivered within a multidisciplinary framework that includes physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, cognitive retraining and advanced rehabilitation technologies, Bobath principles support adaptable, patient-centred care. Individualised treatment plans aligned with real-life goals can significantly improve both physical and mental health outcomes. Rehabilitation remains a journey of rebuilding. With structured guidance, meaningful practice and scientific integration, recovery can help individuals regain movement, confidence and independence.

Tamil Nadu: Anbumani Ramadoss urges Centre to include OBC lists in caste census software

CHENNAI: Rejecting the union government's explanation for excluding official OBC lists from the ongoing caste census software, PMK president Anbumani Ramadoss on Saturday urged the Centre to withdraw its notification and introduce a pre-defined dropdown system to ensure accurate data collection.

Claiming that 1931 was the last time a caste census covering the entire population was conducted in India, Anbumani said a national caste census was now being conducted for the first time in 95 years following decades of advocacy by social justice organisations, including the Pattali Makkal Katchi.

In a statement, Anbumani said the explanation offered by union government officials for not incorporating the official central and state OBC lists into the census software was weak, unacceptable and failed to justify the decision.

Reports indicate that government officials had considered integrating the central and state Other Backward Classes lists into the census software, allowing respondents to select their respective caste from a pre-defined list.

However, the proposal

was allegedly dropped after officials argued that the lists contained "classes" including local inhabitants and traditional mendicants, such as "beggars" or "locally born" groups rather than strictly defined "castes", and that their inclusion could be confusing.

"The fundamental objective of these measures and of the caste census itself is to deliver social justice to those lagging socio-economically," he said, adding that recognising such classes as distinct units for census data collection would not diminish or distort the exercise, but instead help ensure accurate allocation of welfare and reservation benefits.

Tirunelveli man beats panchayat chief to death with brick during water supply dispute

CHENNAI: A 68-year-old panchayat president was allegedly beaten to death with a brick by a worker following an argument over water supply at Thamaraikulam near Valliyur in Tirunelveli district on Friday evening (September 4). According to a Daily Thanthi report, the deceased was identified as Maharajan, president of Kannanlur Panchayat in Valliyur Union.

Police are searching for the accused, Isakkiyappan (40), a labourer from Thamaraikulam, who allegedly fled the spot after the incident. The deceased Maharajan Tamil Nadu: Ex-president of



Kongudipatti panchayat killed Isakkiyappan's house had not received water from the overhead reservoir tank in the area for the past few days. He

reportedly went to Maharajan's house on Friday evening and complained about the issue.

An argument subsequently broke out between the two. In a fit of anger, Isakkiyappan allegedly picked up a brick kept at the house for construction work and threw it at Maharajan. The injured Maharajan was taken to the Nanguneri Government Hospital, where doctors declared him dead. On receiving information, Valliyur police rushed to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to the Tirunelveli Medical College Hospital for post-mortem examination.

Madras High Court gives Tamil Nadu three months to identify more elephant corridors

CHENNAI: The Madras High Court has granted the Tamil Nadu government three months to identify areas that require notification as elephant corridors, after the state informed the court that three corridors had already been notified.

S Muralidharan had filed a petition seeking the identification and notification of elephant corridors across Tamil Nadu. When the matter came up before a division bench of Justice N Sathish Kumar and Justice K Rajasekar, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden filed a status report. According to the report, the Environment, Climate Change and Forests Department notified three elephant corridors on August 27. They are the Jawalagiri-Thaggatti Elephant Corridor, Jawalagiri-Anchetty Elephant Corridor and Bilikkal-Jawalagiri

Venuprasad, IFS, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and chairman of the committee constituted for the purpose, submitted that the Wildlife Trust of India had originally identified 17 elephant corridors, while a committee constituted by the state government had identified 41 corridors.

He said a study was under way to determine whether all the identified areas needed to be notified as elephant corridors. The study included detailed assessment and field inspections to ascertain the requirement for notifying the areas as corridors.

Four held for selling drugs, pills seized in Thanjavur

TIRUCHY: Anti-Narcotics Task Force from Thanjavur arrested four youths who attempted to peddle drugs and seized 6,000 sedative pills from them on Friday (September 4). The police received information that a gang was peddling drugs at Keezhavasal in Thanjavur.

Rushing to the spot, police spotted a history-sheeter D Prakash alias Maadu Prakash (26) from Vannarathurai near Keezhavasal, who had a huge quantity of sedative pills.

Upon inquiry with Prakash, the police team found that his friends H Mohammed Abbas (25) from



Keezhavasal, S Subash (24) from Sunnambukara street and M Sanjay Sampath (23) were also involved in selling drugs. Subsequently, the police team arrested all four and seized 6,000 pills worth Rs 60,000 and a car from them.

MADURAI: The Tamil Nadu government on Saturday (September 5) said the omission of trustees' names from the invitation for the Kumbhabhishekam (consecration ceremony) of the ancient Sri Meenakshi Sundareswarar Temple was "not deliberate, but an administrative oversight."

Addressing the controversy over the omission of the names of the temple's current trustees from the invitation for the consecration ceremony scheduled for September 17, Energy Resources and Law Minister R Nirmal Kumar said the missing names were "not a result of a deliberate plan or conspiracy, but rather an administrative oversight".



Speaking to reporters here, the minister dismissed allegations of intentional exclusion and attributed the omission to a lack of consensus among the current committee members.

He reiterated the government's policy of non-interference in temple administration

and contrasted it with previous regimes, which he alleged had routinely appointed party functionaries and family members to temple trustee boards.

"It is an insignificant issue being blown out of proportion," the minister said.

Why joint replacements are becoming more common among people under 50

Bengaluru, Sep 5: Joint replacement surgery was once largely associated with older adults whose knees or hips had deteriorated after years of wear and tear. However, orthopaedic specialists are increasingly seeing younger patients with significant joint damage, prompting a closer look at why replacements are being considered earlier in life.

Age alone is no longer considered the deciding factor for joint replacement. Previous injuries, arthritis, inflammatory conditions, excess weight, lifestyle factors and the physical demands of modern life can all contribute to early joint deterioration.

For some people in their 40s, persistent joint pain can interfere with everyday activities such as climbing stairs, working, travelling, exercising or spending time with their children. When pain and restricted movement begin to significantly affect quality of life, patients may consider surgical options after other treatments have failed. Previous sports injuries, ligament or meniscus damage, fractures around a joint and repeated surgeries can accelerate the development of arthritis, particularly in the knees. In the hip, conditions such as avascular necrosis can cause considerable joint damage at a relatively young age. Rheumatoid arthritis and



other inflammatory conditions can also result in early joint deterioration. Excess body weight is another important factor. Additional load on weight-bearing joints such as the knees and hips can contribute to pain and accelerate wear. Metabolic health can also influence joint health, making weight management an important part of managing symptoms and potentially slowing disease progression.

However, joint pain in a younger person does not automatically mean replacement surgery is necessary. Depending on the cause and severity of the condition, physiotherapy, medication, injections, lifestyle changes, activity modification

and weight management may provide relief and help delay surgery. At the same time, expectations among younger patients are changing. Many people in their 40s remain professionally active and have family, travel and fitness commitments. Prolonged pain and restricted mobility can significantly affect their daily lives, making them more likely to seek definitive treatment when conservative measures no longer provide meaningful relief. For younger patients considering joint replacement, preparation and rehabilitation are particularly important. Muscle strength, mobility, body weight and existing conditions such as

diabetes can influence both surgical risks and recovery. Pre-operative strengthening and rehabilitation, followed by appropriate physiotherapy after surgery, can help patients work towards better functional outcomes. Recovery is not limited to the surgical procedure and requires active participation from the patient.

There is also a longer-term consideration for people undergoing joint replacement at a younger age. Modern implants can provide long-lasting results, but a patient receiving a replacement in their 40s may potentially live with the implant for several decades. Implant selection, activity levels, regular follow-up and the possibility of revision surgery therefore need to be considered as part of the decision-making process.

Ultimately, the decision to undergo joint replacement should not be based simply on whether a patient is considered too young for the procedure. The extent of joint damage, the impact on quality of life, the response to non-surgical treatments and the potential benefits of surgery all need to be assessed. For younger patients, the goal is not necessarily to undergo joint replacement earlier, but to undergo it at the appropriate time when it is most likely to restore mobility and improve quality of life.

Hepatitis B: Timely vaccination, screening crucial to prevent liver cancer

Mumbai, Sep 4: Hepatitis B continues to be a major global health concern despite being preventable and treatable, with chronic infection increasing the risk of cirrhosis, chronic liver disease and liver cancer.

Dr Vibha Varma, Consultant and Head of Liver Transplant and Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary Surgery at Lilavati Hospital and Research Centre, Mumbai, said preventing mother-to-child transmission, timely newborn vaccination and proper infection-control measures can significantly reduce the long-term impact of hepatitis B.

Mother-to-child transmission is considered a key route of HBV infection. When an infected mother receives appropriate treatment and the newborn receives the hepatitis B vaccine within the first 24 hours of life, followed by doses at one and six months, more than 95% of infants can develop lifelong protection against the virus.

The timing of vaccination is particularly important because infections acquired at birth or during early childhood are much

Health Organization estimates for 2024, around 240 million people globally were living with chronic hepatitis B, while approximately 900,000 new infections occurred during the year. Hepatitis B was associated with around 1.1 million deaths, primarily from cirrhosis and primary liver cancer.

Despite progress, significant gaps remain in diagnosis and treatment. The WHO aims for 90% of people living with chronic HBV to be diagnosed by 2030, but only around 27% are currently diagnosed. Among those eligible for treatment, just 4.3% are receiving therapy. Similarly, only about 45% of newborns currently receive the hepatitis B vaccine within 24 hours of birth, against the WHO target of 90%.

The number of new HBV infections has declined, falling by 32% between 2015 and 2024. Prevalence among children under five also dropped from 0.8% to 0.6% during the same period. However, the WHO goal of reducing prevalence in this age group to 0.1% by 2030 remains a major challenge.



more likely to become chronic. Around 95% of infected infants may develop chronic hepatitis B, compared with fewer than 5% of adults who acquire the infection.

Chronic infection can remain silent for years before causing significant liver damage. Over two to three decades, persistent inflammation may progress to cirrhosis and hepatocellular carcinoma. Importantly, liver cancer can develop even before cirrhosis appears. Apart from mother-to-child transmission, HBV can spread through infected blood entering open wounds, needle-stick injuries, contaminated equipment used for tattoos and piercings, and sharing infected needles. Vaccination and appropriate infection-control practices can help prevent these infections. According to World

Dr Varma said several factors can contribute to greater liver damage among people with chronic HBV infection. Alcohol consumption, tobacco use, obesity and increasing age can contribute to continued liver inflammation and immune dysregulation. Vaccine non-response is uncommon but may be more frequently observed among older adults, people with obesity and smokers. She stressed that timely birth-dose vaccination, completion of the vaccination schedule, prevention of mother-to-child transmission, screening, early diagnosis and appropriate antiviral treatment remain essential to reducing hepatitis B-related deaths and moving towards the WHO goal of eliminating hepatitis B as a public health threat by 2030.

Gastroenterologist shares 5 everyday foods to support better gut health

New Delhi, Sep 5: Maintaining a healthy gut starts with everyday food choices, and several commonly available foods may help support digestion and a balanced gut microbiome.

Board-certified gastroenterologist Dr Saurabh Sethi recently shared five foods he recommends for supporting gut health in an Instagram video. His list includes yoghurt, fermented



foods, slightly green bananas, papaya and fibre-rich legumes. Yoghurt, dahi and buttermilk

are naturally fermented foods that contain beneficial bacteria and may support diversity in the gut microbiome. They may also help with common digestive complaints such as bloating and heartburn. Fermented foods such as kimchi, sauerkraut, kanji and idli are another option. Fermentation partially breaks down starches, potentially improving the availability

of certain nutrients while supporting beneficial gut bacteria.

Slightly green bananas contain resistant starch, which passes through digestion and serves as fuel for beneficial bacteria in the colon. This process can promote the production of short-chain fatty acids such as butyrate, which play an important role in colon health.

Adani Defence signs 5-year ammo pact for AK-203 rifles

New Delhi: Adani Defence and Aerospace has signed a five-year agreement with Indo-Russian Rifles Pvt Ltd to supply indigenously produced 7.62×39 mm ammunition for AK-203 assault rifles being manufactured in India, creating an integrated domestic supply chain for the India-Russia rifle programme. Under the agreement, Adani Defence will supply the small-calibre ammunition required for the AK-203 programme for five years, providing an Indian source of supply and supporting continuity of ammunition availability over the contract period, according to the company. The pact brings together rifle production by Indo-Russian Rifles, or IRRPL, and ammunition manufacturing by Adani Defence, linking two parts of the AK-203 programme within India's defence manufacturing ecosystem. IRRPL was established in 2019 under an India-Russia intergovernmental agreement to manu-



facture AK-203 rifles for the Indian Armed Forces. Its manufacturing facility is located at Korwa in Uttar Pradesh's Amethi district. The joint venture has Indian shareholders Advanced Weapons and Equipment India Ltd and Munitions India Ltd, along with Russian shareholders Concern Kalashnikov and Rosoboronexport. The Ministry of Defence has identified IRRPL as the joint venture responsible for indigenous production of the AK-203. The government signed a contract with the company in December 2021 for 6,01,427 AK-203 rifles, which are to be manufactured at the Korwa facility. The latest agreement expands the domestic manufacturing footprint around the programme by pairing

locally produced rifles with locally manufactured ammunition, according to the firm. Adani Defence has established small-calibre ammunition manufacturing capabilities in India, including a production facility in Kanpur. The agreement would further strengthen domestic capabilities across the small-arms supply chain and support the government's Aatmanirbhar Bharat push for greater self-reliance in defence manufacturing. The agreement also deepens the localisation of an India-Russia defence programme that was originally established to manufacture AK-203 rifles domestically, reducing reliance on external sources for a key consumable required for the weapon system.

TCS HYPERVAULT TO BUILD RS 70,000-CR AI DATA CENTRE IN HYDERABAD

Hyderabad: HyperVault, a subsidiary of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), on Saturday, September 5, announced that it has secured 264 acres of land in Hyderabad to develop a large-scale artificial intelligence data centre campus with a total investment outlay of up to Rs 70,000 crore. On the occasion, Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy said, "Our state formation day is June 2. Groundbreaking to inauguration, there are 21 months from today. CBI BOOKS SUBHASH CHANDRA FOR RS 1,322-CRORE LICHL LOAN FRAUD



New Delhi: The CBI has registered an FIR against media baron Subhash Chandra for allegedly inflating his net worth to avail loans from the Life Insurance Corporation Housing Finance Limited (LICHL) and then becoming a defaulter, causing a loss of more than Rs 1,322 crore to the public-sector lender, officials said on Saturday. The LICHL has alleged in its complaint, which is now part of the FIR, that Chandra submitted net-worth certificates that were used to secure the approval and disbursement of two loans totalling Rs 980 crore. The LICHL was one of the lenders that had approached the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT), opposing a recent NCLT repayment plan allowing creditors to recover only about Rs 6.5 crore from Chandra's

personal estate against claims of roughly Rs 22,006 crore. There was no immediate reaction from the accused named in the FIR. The complaint concerns a Rs 500-crore facility extended to Vasant Sagar Properties Private Limited, with Pan India Infra Projects Private Limited as the co-borrower, and a Rs 480-crore facility extended to Digital Subscriber Management and Consultancy Services Private Limited, with Spirit Infra Power and Multi Ventures Private Limited as the co-borrower. According to the complaint, the Rs 500-crore Vasant Sagar facility was sanctioned as a home-entity loan for takeover, top-up and business expansion, and secured by a continuing guarantee dated March 28, 2018, executed by Chandra. The Rs 480-crore digital facility was sanctioned as a rental-discounting facility under a rental-securitisation scheme through a different loan account, and secured by a continuing guarantee, also executed by Chandra, the FIR alleges. According to the lender, the net-worth certification submitted by Chandra was issued by DJM and Co. on March 28, 2018, certifying his net worth to be at around Rs 59,000 crore.

Morgan Stanley's Top India Stock Picks: ICICI Bank, L&T, Adani Power And More



Global brokerage Morgan Stanley has picked its winners for the next leg of India's growth story, naming a 10-stock focus list that leans hard into Financials, Consumer Discretionary and Industrials, the sectors it is betting on as India's capital expenditure (capex) cycle turns. Every single name on the list carries an "overweight" rating. The list, put out by strategists Ridham Desai and Nayant Parekh in a report titled "A Long Way Up" dated September 4, 2026, includes Maruti Suzuki India, Trent, Lenskart Solutions and Varun Beverages from the consumption space; Bajaj Finance and ICICI Bank from financials; Larsen & Toubro (L&T) from industrials; UltraTech Cement from materials; Prestige Estates from real estate; and Adani Power from utilities. Widest Gap Between Winners And Laggards Adani Power is the standout on the list, up 71%

over the past 12 months, a 79-percentage-point outperformance against the MSCI India index. Bajaj Finance and Larsen & Toubro also outperformed comfortably, up 19% and 11% respectively over the same period. At the other end, Trent is the biggest laggard, down 47% over 12 months, a 45-percentage-point underperformance against the index. Maruti Suzuki India and UltraTech Cement also declined, down 13% and 11% respectively, even though both remain overweight-rated picks. Lenskart Solutions, a more recent listing, does not yet have a full 12-month performance track record in the report. Why These Sectors Morgan Stanley's overweight call on Financials rests on the view that net interest margins (NIMs) for banks are troughing, with strong credit growth and benign credit costs expected to support a strong earnings cycle.

Visa Slots Under Siege From Bots? VFS Says AI Is Fighting Appointment Hoarders

For millions of international travellers, securing a visa appointment can be one of the most stressful parts of planning a trip, particularly when slots are scarce and agents claim they can help applicants jump the queue. VFS Global founder and CEO Zubin Karkaria says the company is now using artificial intelligence to counter bots attempting to corner appointment slots and prevent them from reaching genuine applicants. Speaking to NDTV's Rahul Kanwal at VFS Global's headquarters in Dubai, Karkaria said the company was deploying technology aimed at identifying automated bookings, including systems that match passport details with applicants during the appointment process. "No One Can Sell You A Visa Slot The scramble for appointments has also created an ecosystem of agents and touts claiming they can secure scarce visa slots. "Nobody can sell you a slot," Karkaria said. He said VFS Global runs anti-fraud campaigns



warning applicants against intermediaries who claim to have privileged access to appointments. The company is also using artificial intelligence to combat bots attempting to corner slots, as concerns grow that automated systems can make it harder for genuine applicants to find available appointments. Karkaria said appointment availability ultimately depends on the capacity provided by individual governments and diplomatic missions, while VFS Global's role remains administrative. He repeatedly stressed that the company neither approves nor rejects visas. "We don't take decisions," Karkaria

said, addressing concerns that applicants may believe paying for additional services could improve their chances of securing a visa or speed up the process. Even when passports are returned after processing, he said, VFS employees may not know whether a visa has been granted because the documents arrive in sealed envelopes. VFS Global CEO Responds To Upselling Charges VFS Global has also faced criticism over the sale of services such as premium lounges. Karkaria rejected suggestions that applicants were being pressured into buying them. He said most such services were booked

before applicants arrived at a visa centre, either online or through travel agents and tour operators. "We don't need to hard-sell," he said, comparing the choice to purchasing additional services while booking an airline ticket. The company, he added, displays disclaimers stating that premium services have no bearing on whether a visa is approved or how quickly an embassy processes an application. What Happens To Applicants' Biometric Data? Kanwal also pressed Karkaria on another sensitive question surrounding visa outsourcing: how safe is an applicant's data Karkaria said VFS Global does not retain biometric information. Once fingerprints, photographs and passport information are captured, he said, the biometric data is transmitted in real time to the embassy, government or designated server. "We don't keep any biometric data," he said. According to Karkaria, front-line terminals cannot be used to store or print such information.

US Gas Prices Could Top \$4 A Gallon On Labor Day, Setting Record

US gasoline prices could cross the \$4-a-gallon mark on Labor Day, setting a record for the holiday as the ongoing conflict in the Middle East keeps crude oil and fuel costs elevated. The national average gasoline price is likely to reach \$4.03 per gallon on Labor Day, surpassing the previous Labor Day record of \$3.83 set in 2012, GasBuddy analyst Patrick De Haan said. Reuters reported that GasBuddy data showed the national average at around \$4.13 a gallon on Thursday, nearly \$1 higher than the year-ago level. De Haan said gasoline prices are now at their highest level ever recorded this late in the calendar year. The \$4 threshold is particularly significant for US consumers, as gasoline is one of the most visible indicators of household expenses and can quickly influence perceptions of the wider economy. Gasoline prices have risen alongside crude oil, which climbed back above \$90 a barrel this week after renewed military action involving the US and



Iran heightened concerns about disruptions to global oil supplies. Refining margins have also been supported by concerns over potential disruptions to shipments through the Strait of Hormuz, while attacks on Russian refineries have added pressure to fuel inventories. US gasoline inventories fell by 1.2 million barrels last week to 205.7 million barrels, according to the Energy Information Administration. That is below the five-year August average of 217.6 million barrels.

US refinery utilisation is already around 98%, its highest level since 2018, leaving limited room to quickly increase fuel output. The pressure is not limited to gasoline. US diesel prices hit a fresh record this week, while airfares for Labor Day travel are expected to be about 20% higher than a year earlier, according to AAA. Tom Kloza, chief energy adviser at Gulf Oil, said there is a better-than-even chance that retail diesel prices could surpass the previous record of around

\$5.82 a gallon, set in June 2022. Persistently high fuel prices could add to the economic and political pressure on President Donald Trump, who has repeatedly pledged to bring down energy costs. Trump has also criticised refiners and fuel retailers over elevated pump prices. For Americans heading out for the final summer holiday weekend, however, cheaper fuel may remain out of reach, with gasoline potentially crossing the \$4-a-gallon mark nationwide for the first time on Labor Day.

RUSSIA HITS UKRAINIAN SECURITY HEADQUARTERS IN DRONE ATTACK, ZELENSKY SAYS

A Russian drone has hit the headquarters of the Security Service of Ukraine (SBU) during a strike in the heart of Kyiv, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has said. The unmanned aerial vehicle crashed into the SBU headquarters on Friday afternoon, targeting a room used by security chief Oleksandr Poklad. It is not clear whether Poklad was in the building, but Zelensky said he had since spoken to him to order an "appropriate, tangible response". "The drone was aimed directly at the office of the Head of the Security Service in that building," Zelensky confirmed. It suggests Russia's new drones are growing in accuracy and signals Moscow could step up strikes before possible US mediation talks this weekend. "All emergency services are on the scene.

Everyone affected will receive the necessary assistance," Zelensky added in a message on Telegram. "I instructed Poklad to deliver an appropriate, tangible response and, where possible, one that mirrors this strike, to the Russians once everything is ready. Our military will support this response." Images of the office widely shared online showed black smoke pouring from two windows on the front of the building. Foreign Minister Andriy Sybiha said the attack was a "major escalation that demands resolute responses". "Moscow launched this strike during a renewed push for peace - laying bare its true rejection of diplomacy," he added. Kyiv Mayor Vitali Klitschko said five people had been hurt in the SBU attack, but did not elaborate on whether they were inside the offices.



US envoys arrive in Moscow ahead of Ukraine talks



Two of US President Donald Trump's top envoys have arrived in Moscow ahead of a weekend of talks aimed at accelerating efforts to end the war in Ukraine. Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner will hold talks in the Russian capital before travelling to Kyiv on Sunday for discussions with Ukraine. Trump told reporters on Friday that Witkoff and Kushner were "bringing with them a proposal to end the war". So far, efforts from the US and its allies to broker a peace deal have failed to deliver a breakthrough. Both Russia and Ukraine have said they will halt strikes on each others' capital cities for three days while the delegation conducts its visit. Zelensky said on Saturday that he had spoken to the envoys, who have "already begun working with the Russian side today". "The plan for tomorrow's diplomatic engagements in Kyiv, involving the US team, has been approved. We are waiting for Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner and are ready for a substan-

tive conversation," he added. "From now through the end of Saturday, as well as on Sunday and Monday, Ukraine is ready to refrain from strikes on Moscow, and we expect the Russians to do the same regarding Kyiv." Russian state media reported that President Vladimir Putin had ordered a halt to strikes on Kyiv for three days due to the US visit. Witkoff and Kushner were pictured being greeted by Russian official Kirill Dmitriev after landing at Moscow's Vnukovo Airport. Flight tracking data showed a US government plane had travelled from Helsinki, Finland, where it flown to from the US earlier in the day. US news outlet Axios reported that the US envoys would separately meet both Russian President Vladimir Putin and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky. Kushner and Witkoff have visited Russia several times but the talks on Sunday would be the first in Ukraine. Delegations from Ukraine have attended talks in the US over the past

18 months. Earlier on Saturday, Zelensky said Russia had fired "demonstrative" strikes on airports in Kyiv and Boryspil overnight ahead of his planned meeting with the US. Ukraine's president added: "Clearly, these Russian strikes on the airports are a reaction to the discussions and preparations for the possibility of the US side using an aircraft to travel to Ukraine and land at Kyiv Airport or Boryspil Airport." Ukraine's airspace has been closed since Russia launched its full-scale invasion in February 2022. Zelensky said on Friday he would guarantee the safety of Russian airspace during the envoys' visit and called for Russia to do the same for Ukraine. He also said an overnight Russian strike on a civilian building in the Dnipro region killed four people and injured five others. Witkoff and Kushner's visit to Moscow comes just over a week after a rare visit to the Russian capital by the head of the CIA, John Ratcliffe.

AT LEAST TWO DEAD IN BLAST AT BOLIVIA MILITARY BARRACKS



At least two people have been killed after an explosion at a military barracks in Bolivia - but authorities fear the toll could be higher. Bolivian Defence Minister Ernesto Justiniano said at least 81 people had been injured when "pyrotechnic material" detonated at the barracks, where an artillery regiment was stationed, about 14:30 local time (18:30 GMT) on Friday. Fourteen others remain missing. Health official Rita Nebraska told local television between 10 and 15 people were believed to have died in the incident in Viacha, about 30km (19

miles) from La Paz, according to Reuters. Police said dozens of homes had been damaged by the blast and that emergency workers were searching the rubble. Nebraska said there was a risk of a further explosion and urged people to stay at least 150m from the military base. Base commander Colonel Antonio Amaru told reporters on Saturday that a sergeant and 13 conscripted soldiers aged between 18 and 19-years-old were among the missing. Bolivia's President Rodrigo Paz expressed his "deepest solidarity" with the families of those who had died and had been injured.

MISTRIAL DECLARED IN LINDSAY CLANCY MURDER CASE, AFTER JURY DEADLOCKS

A Massachusetts judge has declared a mistrial in the murder case against Lindsay Clancy after jurors conceded they would not be able to unanimously decide whether she should be held criminally liable for killing her three young children after a week of deliberating. The case against Clancy has both captivated and heavily divided the American public, even spurring remarks from the US president. There was a sense of disbelief in the courtroom as the case - and Clancy's future - were left in limbo. Clancy's lawyer led a dramatic last-ditch attempt to halt the mistrial and force a verdict, which was unsuccessful. A hearing later this month could establish what happens next in the case. "At this point, I'm going to declare that the jury is deadlocked and I'm going to declare a mistrial," Judge William Sullivan told the jury on Friday, dismissing them after weeks of testimony, seven days mulling Clancy's fate and the panel signalling three times that they were deadlocked. The



deadlock - known as a hung jury - does not mean prosecutors have proven their case, nor does it mean the defendant is not guilty. A hearing was scheduled for 29 September, in which prosecutors could outline their next steps in the case. Meanwhile, the 36-year-old former nurse will remain held on the same murder charges and continue to stay in the mental health facility in which she is currently housed. Prosecutors could decide from a host of options as to what happens next, including holding another trial or coming to a plea agreement with Clancy over

the strangulation of her children - five-year-old Cora, Dawson, three, and eight-month-old Callan - in their Massachusetts home. After killing the children, Clancy cut herself with a knife and jumped from a second-story window in an attempt to take her own life, which left her paralysed. Clancy does not deny killing the children in 2023 but pleaded not guilty to the three first-degree murder charges, with her lawyers arguing she was suffering from postpartum psychosis and so should not be held criminally responsible. The grim case led to a series of dramatic twists and turns as

the jury deliberated Clancy's fate. On Friday, a court session began with Clancy's attorney Kevin Reddington pushing for a juror on the panel to be removed, after the jury indicated a day prior in a note that a member of the panel had not been following instructions on reasonable doubt. Under US law, a jury must unanimously believe "beyond a reasonable doubt" that someone is guilty to convict them of a crime. The designation is the strictest standard in the US legal system. It places the burden on the government to prove that the accused is guilty, instead of the accused to prove their innocence. The judge denied the request and sent jurors back to deliberate. About an hour later, the panel came back to say they still could not reach a verdict. It was then that Sullivan said he had no choice but to declare a mistrial. Reddington immediately pleaded for a temporary pause so they could file an emergency appeal with the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court.

GERMANY'S FAR-RIGHT AfD BIDS FOR FIRST TASTE OF POWER IN EASTERN VOTE



Germany is holding its breath this weekend as there is a seismic election in the country's east. The Alternative für Deutschland party is aiming to secure a majority in the regional parliament of Saxony-Anhalt. An outright win would mark the first time a far-right party has held state-level power in the nation's post-war era. For the AfD's opponents, this is a point of serious peril. But the party sees it as a stepping stone towards its dreams of nationwide power. This is an election that could change German history. The result could also spell fresh trouble for embattled conservative Chancellor (CDU)

Friedrich Merz, as rumours persist about whether he can see out his term in office. Booned during recent public appearances, Merz is hardly seen as an electoral asset. Perhaps the chancellor regrets a pledge to halt the rise of the far right, given that the exact opposite has happened. By contrast, the charismatic AfD lead candidate in the state - Ulrich Siegmund - appears to have enjoyed dominating discussion and media coverage. Dubbed "Germany's Most Dangerous Man" by Der Spiegel magazine, he has brushed off reports that people previously in the neo-Nazi scene are among those to hold influential roles around him.

WHAT DIFFERENT WORLD MAPS GET RIGHT - AND WHAT THEY GET WRONG

The UN has just called for the predominant world map to be replaced with one that more accurately reflects the true size of continents like Africa. The "Correct the Map" resolution adopted by the General Assembly aims to fix the discrepancy on the Mercator map, in which the African continent is shown as being of similar size to Greenland - even though it is in reality about 14 times larger. It adopted a new map, the Equal Earth projection, which better represents the true sizes of landmasses - but comes with problems of its own. There have been many prominent attempts over the years to solve the problem of accurately representing the surface of a sphere on a flat rectangle, each with its own benefits and drawbacks. The now widely



used Mercator map was created in 1569 by Flemish cartographer Gerardus Mercator. Its main purpose was to help European sailors navigate the oceans, as cartography Professor James Cheshire at University London College explained. "He wanted a straight line to be drawn on a map to look like a straight line in reality if you followed a compass bearing," he told the BBC. "That was what it was

intended to do, and that's what it does brilliantly well." To keep those angles correct on a flat map, Mercator had to stretch the grid lines wider as they moved away from the equator towards the poles. His map accommodates for the curvature of the Earth by making countries near the equator seem much smaller than they are, with countries nearer the poles appearing stretched. The distortion is a

result of it being impossible to accurately represent the surface of a globe on a two-dimensional chart. More than 450 years on, Mercator's creation is still the basis for many of the maps we see in classrooms, on TV and online, including Google Maps. But critics of the Mercator map say there is a psychological effect to viewing some places as smaller than they actually are and others as larger, as we instinctively view bigger things as more important. For Kenyan geographer Kioko Muendo, this has implicitly downplayed Africa's vast resources, population and investment opportunities. "Maps are more than just guides for travellers - they shape how regions are perceived politically and economically.

India picked the regular T20I squad for the upcoming three-match series against Afghanistan, with Shreyas Iyer being the captain of the side. The matches will serve as a dress rehearsal for the Indian team, which will aim to defend its gold medal at the Asian Games 2026 right after these bilateral contests. Srikkanth is of the opinion that the selectors should have given chances to more young players. "After the series losses in Ireland and England, the selectors have decided not to take a



chance and picked a full-strength squad for Afghanistan. They are going all guns blazing, but this is a mistake. It's against teams like Afghanistan that you should try out youngsters. Instead, you've picked a full-

strength squad out of fear," Srikkanth said on his YouTube channel. India recently suffered a shocking 2-0 T20I series whitewash at the hands of Ireland before losing 4-0 to England in the format. Shreyas Iyer and Co., howev-

er, clean-swept Zimbabwe 3-0 in the T20I series that followed. "It feels like a desperation move after the Ireland and England losses. But this squad is almost the same as the one they picked for England," said Srikkanth.

Pakistan Coach Breaks Silence On Dropping 3 Senior Players During England Test Series: 'Really Don't Know'

Pakistan's interim red-ball head coach Mike Hesson on Friday distanced himself from the decision to drop senior players Mohammad Rizwan, Salman Agha and Imam-ul-Haq from the Test squad following a disastrous tour of England, where Pakistan have lost the opening two matches by heavy margins. Pakistan suffered an innings defeat in the first Test before going down by 194 runs in the second, prompting the axing of seven players and the sacking of head coach Sarfaraz Ahmed. Hesson, who had been serving as Pakistan's white-ball head coach, was subsequently handed the red-ball reins for the third and final Test in Birmingham, starting September 9. "Look when



they (Pakistan Cricket Board) told me if I could manage the side for the final Test, these three players (Rizwan, Agha and Imam) were already released from the squad and (were) on their way home. So, I really don't know what happened there," Hesson told a media conference in Birmingham. Hesson said that he was involved in

the release of the rest of the players and the inclusion of some new players. "We already had a white-ball camp in Lahore and I had just returned from Japan where the Asian Games are taking place, when I was asked if I could manage the red-ball squad," he added. "I decided to make some changes in the squad to get balance into the

squad and my emphasis has been on having a bowling attack which has variety and where we have a couple of bowling all rounders," he said. Hesson said some of the new players brought into the squad had not played competitive cricket for some time but possessed the skills to contribute and could help bring greater balance to the side for the final Test. He also made it clear that he had no role in selecting the Test squads for the West Indies or England series and stressed that his current stint with the red-ball side was only on an interim basis. Hesson described Agha as a fine player and said he was already working towards a full comeback by returning to domestic cricket.

Sindarov will face Gukesh in a battle for the world crown between two 20-year-olds in Geneva over 14 classical games from November 24 to December 12. However, the Uzbek is currently keeping his focus firmly on the tournaments immediately ahead, rather than allowing the much-anticipated title clash to dominate his thoughts. "Right now, I'm focusing on my next events - the Global Chess League and the Olympiad. After those, I will start

preparing for the World Championship match," Sindarov, who will represent Fyfers American Gambits in the fourth edition of GCL, said during a media interaction here. The GCL will be held here from September 5 to 13, followed by the Olympiad from September 15 to 27 in Samarkand. Sindarov earned his shot at the world title by winning this year's Candidates Tournament with a round to spare, producing one of the most dominant performances in recent memory as he strung together four consecutive victories against elite opposition. His preparations for the Geneva clash are being overseen by coach Roman Vidonyak and it is believed that he is unlikely to tinker much with the formula that has already brought Sindarov considerable success. Gearing up for GCL, Sindarov further said he was treating the franchise event like any other tournament despite its different format.

BCCI PICK LSG PACER AS AS BACKUP OPTION FOR JASPRIT BUMRAH: REPORT

India pacer Jasprit Bumrah is yet to get fitness clearance from the BCCI medical team. While he has been kept in the squads for the upcoming Afghanistan T20Is as well as the Asian Games 2026, his participation is subject to fitness. The pacer has been struggling with a knee injury for quite some time now. Bumrah suffered a jolt to his knee during the second ODI against England on July 16, reportedly aggravating the recurring injury. He has not bowled since that game, and the process of his recovery

continues. At a time when Bumrah's return date to the Indian squad is hard to predict, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) selectors have identified Prince Yadav as a "probable backup", claimed a Times of India report. It added that Bumrah, along with Nitish Kumar Reddy, Washington Sundar and Harshit Rana, will undergo match-simulation tests over the course of a week before being cleared to join the team in Delhi on September 10. Former India batter Subramaniam Badrinath recently blasted

the team management for the poor handling of Bumrah. The BCCI is focused on managing the pacer's workload since a back injury he suffered in January last year, but the results have not been impressive. Badrinath held the team's captain, coach and selectors responsible for the poor management of Bumrah. "I don't know who made the decision. CoE will not make the selection, right? They will just say he is in this state and can play these matches and his body is in this state. But I think

the captain, coach, and selectors are taking the decision. CoE only passes the information. They are not selectors," Badrinath said on his YouTube channel. Apart from Bumrah, the Indian team has also been dealing with injuries to other players. All-rounder Reddy, pacer Harshit, spin-bowling all-rounder Sundar and batter Sai Sudharsan are all currently out of action due to their respective injuries. Yadav, who made his international debut during the ODI series against Afghanistan in June, recent-

ly recovered from a hamstring injury sustained in Zimbabwe in July. The Centre of Excellence has cleared him and is available for selection, as per the aforementioned report. Selectors regard the promising pacer, who impressed during this year's IPL, as a serious prospect in the limited-overs format.

TALKS WITH GOVERNMENT TO SAVE THEATRES: APFDC CHAIRMAN BHARAT BHUSHAN

APFDC Chairman Bharat Bhushan attended the Andhra Pradesh Cine Exhibitors Forum meeting in Vijayawada and discussed the major issues faced by theatre owners and exhibitors. He said the government has been requested to introduce a single-window licence renewal system with a five-year validity for all departments, including Fire and Cinematography. He added that discussions have already been held with ministers and MLAs, and the government has responded positively. Bharat Bhushan said Andhra Pradesh once had over 2,000 theatres, but the number has now fallen to around 1,200, with nearly 400 theatres closing in the last 3-4 months. He said increasing ticket prices alone will not solve the problem. The government should also



support theatres through affordable power tariffs, reasonable maintenance charges and uniform ticket pricing. He added that discussions are continuing on ticket price hikes, but exhibitors should consider market conditions and avoid excessive pricing. He stressed that exhibitors, producers and the government must work together to protect the theatre industry.
